NEWS AND NOTES - BOWL GAMES

ROSE BOWL - TCU was the only undefeated team in the country that was not playing in the National Title game but they were excited to be playing in the Rose Bowl vs Wisc as they were the first non-AQ team to play in the big game. Their win in this one moved the non-AQ's record to 4-1 SU in BCS bowls vs AQ teams. This game capped a very poor Jan. 1 for the Big Ten as they went 0-5 in bowl games. The Badgers did have a 385-301 yd edge but trailed the entire 2H. UW actually held the ball for all but 3 plays in the 2Q which helped them compile the yardage edge. This one looked like it would be a score fest as UW opened with a 55/8pl drive and settled for a 30 yd FG. TCU converted on 3&10 twice on a 77/10pl drive and got a 23 yd TD pass to lead 7-3. UW went 67/6pl for a TD, 10-7 (3:14 1Q). TCU43 went 57/5pl for a TD, 14-10 (:16). UW went 55/13pl but missed a 39 yd FG. TCU went 3 & out. UW on 4&9 faked a punt for a FD then converted on 3&8, 3&12 and got a 37 yd FG on the final play of the half at the end of a 14pl drive. At the half UW had 234-131 yd and 38-18 play edges thanks to the 2Q. TCU opened the 3Q with a 71/6pl TD drive. UW started at their 5 and got 4 FD's but punted. TCU got 3 FD's and punted 38 yds to the 3. The next 3 poss each team got 1 FD & punted. UW took over with 7:32 left. They went 77/10pl and got a 4 yd TD run with 2:00 left. On the 2 pt conv they had an open rec in the EZ but blitzing LB Carder tipped the 2 pt pass. TCU rec'd the onside kick and on 3&4 got a 5 yd run for a FD with 1:52 left and took a knee.

CAPITAL ONE BOWL - Alabama came in with 3 losses while the Spartans had just 1. Despite the fact Bama was #15 and Michigan St was #7, the Tide were a big favorite. They lived up to their billing by absolutely dominating MSU with a 546-171 yd edge in a game they led 28-0 at the half and 42-0 after 3Q's. It was the largest MOV for the Cap One Bowl (formerly Florida Citrus and Tangerine). The previous high was E Texas St's 33-0 win over Tenn Tech in 1953. There were a couple of big plays early in the game which helped turn this into a rout. The Tide's opening drive went 79/13pl. On 3&gl from the 1 Ingram bowled in for the TD. MSU went on a 12pl drive but on 3&18 were int'd at the Tide 15 and ret'd 23 yds. Bama went 62/8pl for a TD, 14-0. MSU went on a long drive and had a 1st & gl at the Bama7. On 3&gl from the 8 Cousins was sk'd & fmb'l'd. The ball got kicked and MSU fell on it back at the Bama38 and actually punted after their 1st & gl. That loss of 30 yds helped MSU finish with -48 yds rushing. Bama went 80/7pl and 44/3pl for TD's on their next 2 poss and led 28-0. Bama took their 1st 2H poss 79/4pl drive for a TD and there were 4 punts on the first 5 poss. Bama then turned it over to the backups with McCarron taking over with 6:09 left in the 3Q and bkp RB Lacy getting a 12 yd TD run with 1:09 left in the 3Q then a 62 yd TD run with 8:58 left in the game to make it 49-0. MSU barely avoided the shutout. On 4&3 WR/QB Nichol who came in for the final 2 series, hit a 49 yd TD pass with 5:45 left. Bama gained 37 yds on the final 9 plays.

COTTON BOWL - There was no doubt heading in that LSU had 2 distinct advantages over Texas A&M. One on defense and the other on ST. Amazingly, A&M ret'd the opening KO 69 yds to the LSU31. No team had even got past the LSU30 on their opening poss of a series all season long but A&M went 31/8pl for a TD to lead 7-0. In the game, A&M punted just twice. At half LSU led 28-17 but A&M had a 258-253 yd edge. LSU finished with a 446-373 yd edge and was taking a knee inside the A&M20 at the end of the game after having an IR TD called back. Ryan Tannehill came in with 127 consecutive passes without an int but threw 3 vs the ball hawking LSU D. LSU took its opening 58/11pl but on 3&7 from the 25 was int'd at the 2. A&M went 76/9pl and got a 39 yd FG to lead 10-0. LSU then went 80/8pl for a TD. A&M was sk'd forcing a 4&22 and their 52 yd FG bounced off the upright. LSU went 65/9pl for a TD, 14-10. A&M answered with a 78/7pl TD drive, 17-14 (7:44 2Q). LSU went 67/7pl for a TD then got an int at their own 40. LSU punted 58 yds for a TB but then Reid cut in front of the WR and raced 34 yds to the 2 with another int. LSU got a TD on 3&gl from the 2 with 1:27 left to go 28-17. LSU opened the 3Q with a 67/5pl drive for a TD, 35-17. A&M went on a 13pl drive to the LSU29 but after a sk and delay, punted on 4&18. LSU missed a 44 yd FG after a 60/12pl drive and A&M went 73/13pl for a TD to get back to 35-24 early 4Q. LSU rec'd the onside kick and Jasper tied a bowl record 50 yd FG, 38-24. Mathieu, 2pl later got an int at the A&M28 and LSU got a 26 yd FG with 3:04 left, 41-24. Mathieu got an int which he ret'd 37 yds for a TD but a pers foul wiped it out. LSU got a FD to the 19 and took a knee. This was the 50th game between the 2 schools but the first since the 1995 season opener.

ORANGE BOWL - The Cardinal will finish in the Top 5 for the first time since their unbeaten 1940 team finished #2. This game came just 4 years after the team was 1-11 and hired Jim Harbaugh. Stanford had a commanding 534-288 yd edge. The final score made it look like this game was a mismatch but Virginia Tech played well in the 1H and had a 198-181 yd edge. Each team punted to open then Stanford was stopped on downs on a fake punt on 4&4 at the VT45. After a VT punt, Stanford went 86/4pl with a 60 yd TD pass by Stewart making it 7-0. Virginia Tech got 1 FD and punted and Stanford at their own 5 had a strange play. A pass was tipped and an OL in the EZ opted to catch the ball but went down for a safety, 7-2. After the free kick, Virginia Tech went 75/10pl. Taylor made an incredible play being chased by two DL and at the sidelines threw it into the EZ for an 11 yd TD pass and Virginia Tech led 9-7 (10:22 2Q). Stanford went 79/8pl with a 25 yd TD pass on 3&8, 13-9. VTech went 3 & out and Stanford was int'd at the VT46. VT got 1 FD but on 4&1 was stuffed at the SU30 (2:26 2Q). SU got 1 FD & punted with :47 left and VT, after 2 FD's on 2&10, got a 32 yd pass with :03 left and a 37 yd FG had them trailing 13-12 with a 198-181 yd edge. VT punted to open the 3Q and SU went 59/9pl for a TD. After a 42 yd pass, VT was int'd on a deep pass at the SU3. SU got a 56 yd run by Taylor then a 41 yd TD pass to Fleener to make it 26-12 (5:49 3Q). VT punted and SU went 87/8pl with a 58 yd TD pass to Fleener, 33-12. VT went on a 10pl drive and was at the SU33 when a chopblock and sack forced a 4&4 and a punt. Stanford got a 34 yd Taylor run and 2pl later a 38 yd TD pass to Fleener made it 40-12 (6:05). Stanford recorded 8 sacks.

SUGAR BOWL - The Big Ten needed a win in a bowl after going 0-5 on NY's Day. The story here was Ohio St had 5 key players who were susp'd for the first 5 games of 2011 but allowed to play in the bowl. Ironically, all 5 made key plays including the only non-starter of the group in DE Solomon Thomas who recorded a game saving int at the OSU18 with :58 left. OSU led the game commandingly, 28-10 at the half but had to hang on. Herron and Posey (2 other susp) each had a TD and Pryor hit 14-25-221. Arkansas dropped 6 passes which hurt them during the game. After a UA punt (2 dropped passes) OSU went 74/8pl for a TD, 7-0. UA went 51/5pl for a TD, 7-7. OSU went 68/7pl for a TD, 14-7 (7:17 1Q). 2 punts. UA on 4&1 were SOD at the OSU30. OSU lost AA CB Checkwa to inj and lost a couple other def players which hurt their coverage in the 2H as he DNR. OSU went 70/8pl and on 3&8 got a TD pass, 21-7. UA got 1 FD & punted and OSU went 49/8pl but missed a 50 yd FG (5:15 2Q). UA went 3&out and OSU went 68/6pl getting a TD with 1:59 left and led 28-7. UA on 4&15 got a 20 yd pass to the OSU24 with :16 left in the half and got a 20 yd FG with no time left, 28-10. OSU got 1 FD & punted go open the 3Q. UA went 52/11pl for a 46 yd FG, 28-13. OSU45 got 1 FD and nailed a 46 yd FG, 31-13. UA went 75/7pl and got a TD and 2pt conv with :58 left 3Q, 31-21. 2 punts. OSU was pinned at their 2 and Herron was hit at the 2 as progress was stopped. Amazingly after he was brought down in the EZ they ruled it a safety to make it 31-23. UA got 1 FD & nailed a 47 yd FG to get within 5. OSU made a gutsy call going for it on 4&1 at their own 38 and Herron dove over the line for the FD but fmb'l'd. It was the first fmb'l of his career. UA lost 6 yds and punted. OSU got 2 FD's and punted and UA blk'd the punt and rec'd at the OSU18 with 1:09 left but on 2&10 Thomas got the int dropping back into coverage.

NEWS AND NOTES - NFL WILDCARD ROUND

New Orleans vs Seattle - For the first time ever a defending Super Bowl champ was up by 10 pts in a playoff game and lost. NO was a depleted team coming in playing without their top 2 RB's and a banged up D missing 2 starters. NO took their opening drive to the SEA8 and on 3&2 Brees could have run for the FD but opted to just toss it to Bush but Bush dropped the pass and NO settled for a FG. NO got an int and drove 35 yds for a TD, 10-0. Each team went on a long TD drive and NO led 17-7 with 13:38 left 2Q. Julius Jones became the first player in NFL Playoff history to score a TD vs a team that released him earlier in the year. SEA went 70/5pl for a TD, 17-14 and NO had the first punt of the game at 9:55 of the 2Q. Jones fmb'l'd on the first play of their next drive at their own 18 and SEA got a 29 yd FG to tie it (7:03). After the Saints went 3 & out, SEA went 76/9pl including a 3&11 to open the drive. They were draining the clock as they didn't want to give NO any time to get the ball back when on 3&3 Hasselbeck took a shot and found Stokley behind the secondary for a 45 yd TD, the key play of the game, 24-17. NO went 77/11pl and got a 22 yd FG to pull within 24-20 at the half. SEA opened the 3Q with a 79/7pl drive and another deep pass went to Williams for a 38 yd TD and a stunning 31-20 lead. The Saints got 1 FD & punted and SEA went 33/9pl for a 39 yd FG, 34-20 (5:27 3Q). Each team went 3 & out and NO went 87/12pl for a 4 yd TD run, 34-27. SEA went 3 & out and NO went 53/8pl. On 3&3 from the 4 the Saints passed for 1 yd and settled for a 21 yd FG, 34-30. SEA got 1 FD & punted pinning NO at the 6. NO got 1 FD & punted. SEA, trying to run the clock on 2nd & 10 handed it to Lynch who broke 17 tkls in one of the most incredible playoff runs and went 67 yds for the clinching TD to make it 41-30. NO drove 70/9pl getting a TD with 1:30 left. The 2 pt failed & the onside kick just floated back to the NO47 where it was easily caught. Hasselbeck threw for 4 TD's but the Saints had 32-19 FD and 474-415 yd edges. The loss drops NO's record to 0-4 in road playoff games.

NY Jets vs Indianapolis - IND finished the season with 18 players on IR after CB Haden was put on the list prior to the game as they were a very banged up team. It was a defensive struggle with the teams combining for 2 FD's on the first 6 poss. IND got 4 FD's on their next drive but punted from the NYJ40. NYJ got 2 FD's and punted with 8:09 left in the half. IND went 80/5pl with a 57 yd pass to Garcon making it 7-0. NYJ took over with 5:25 left at their own 21. They converted 4 FD's to the IND19 but were int'd at the goal line and ret'd 23 yds with :45 left. At the half, the Jets had 8-7 FD and 153-147 yd edges. NYJ opened the 3Q with a strong 63/10pl drive and in the 2H kept it mostly on the ground and tied it at 7. IND went 45/9pl but on 3&1 ran for a loss of 1 and settled for a 47 yd FG, 10-7. NYJ then went 87/17pl. There were 5 passes out of the 17 and Tomlinson's 1 yd run put the Jets up 14-10 (9:59). IND went 67/13pl. On a 3&7 early in the drive, a handoff to Rhodes went 9 yds for a FD to the NYJ41. After getting a 3&8, 21 yd pass, this time on 3&7 from the NYJ15 they tried the Rhodes play again and were tk'l'd for a 1 yd gain. They settled for a Vinatieri 32 yd FG and trailed by 2. NYJ took over with 4:37 left and went 3 & out. Earlier a NYJ player wiped out the IND P but it was ruled that he was pushed into the P, although replays didn't show a push. The Colts touched the P and he took a dive but the Colts rusher was pushed towards the P. They called a 5 yd pen and gave NYJ a FD. The Jets only took off additional :16 and punted on 4&5 after a deep pass was incomplete. It appeared Peyton Manning would pull his magic off again and he went 48/8pl. This time on 3&6 the pass was incomplete to White and they settled for a 50 yd FG which was good. The NYJ ret'd the KO to their 46 and after 1 FD, the Colts surprisingly called time-out with :29 left giving the Jets time to regroup. Sanchez convinced the coaches to attempt a long pass and hit Braylon Edwards for an 18 yd comp to the 14 making it a much easier FG for Nick Folk for the win.

GREEN BAY by 1 ✓'s

For the 1st time in franchise history the Falcons have 3 straight winning seasons thanks to Mike Smith with their 1st Div title since 2004 (4th overall). ATL's 20-4 SU mark at home (16-8 ATS) is 2nd to only NE & tied with BAL/IND since 2008. TY ATL outgained foes by 26 ypg (12th) with an impressive +12 TO's which is tied with NE for #1 while outscoring foes 28-19. This includes a 20-17 win as a 1.5 pt HF vs GB TY. GB has a large edge in yards (418-294) but ATL was content to control the tempo of the game with a balanced attack. Both QB's had solid games but the difference was ATL RB Turner whose 110 yds (4.8) along with a Rodgers fumble on the ATL 1 which changed the momentum of the game. ATL is 5-3 SU/4-4 ATS vs the other winning teams they faced TY being outgained by 40 ypg (+4 TO's) on the short end of a 22-21 avg score. GB is now 5-2 SU/ATS vs winning teams (NO ATL) TY w/a 4-5 SU/5-4 ATS mark (1-8 O/U) on the road.

GB & NO are the only tms to finish in the top 10 on off in each of the L5Y. Rodgers is an elite QB ranking 4th in pass yds, pass TD & QBR since he took over as the str in '08. TY he was 78 yds short of being the 1st QB to throw for 4,000 in each of his 1st 3 yrs. He has had to cope with the loss of RB Grant (brkn ankle in opener) & TE Finley (knee, 5th gm) who was a huge loss for 3rd down pkgs. As a result GB used its run gm to set up the play action & serve as an extra pass protector. GB's off relies on YAC with the Pack having 1,757 before the ssn finale. GB has 5 plyrs in the top 100 for rec's with Jennings finishing in the top 10 rec yds (1st time in career). Unlike LY, GB has enjoyed stability on the OL as they've had the same lineup for 12 str after Bulaga was installed at RT. LY Rodgers was sacked once every 11 att, it's once every 15. GB has capitalized on pts off takeaways (#2 w/11) which has helped them make up for a beat up front 7. After starting 1 gm LY, Raji has been a beast as he's the only DL with 16 sts & his 6.5 sks are the 2nd by a NT S/90. Despite a nagging hamstring inj Matthews is the 1st in GB hist with 10+ sks in his 1st 2Y. However, GB is very thin at the other OLB spot having started 4 diff plyrs. GB has had good health in the secondary (#5 pass D) with 3 of 4 str's together for all 16. This will be the 4th time in 5 yrs that GB's ST's have finished 24th or lower in our rankings with the return units (7.9 PR, 20.1 KR) being the main culprit TY.

Balance. Many coaches give lip service to it on offense but ATL's 54/46 pass to run ratio shows how dedicated they have been under OC Mike Mularkey. One of the NFL's next gen QB stars, Ryan has been at his best at home with a 15-3 ratio (99.1 QBR) as the dome's speed plays to the Falcons strengths. He's also worked with arguably the best WR in the NFL TY as White led the league in targets, catches & finished 2nd in yards accounting for 25.4% of ATL's offense. Despite a Hall of Fame career, this will only be Tony Gonzalez' 4th playoff game (0-3 SU) as he finished with the 4th most rec's by a TE TY. The rest of the receiving unit are in the supporting cast with Jenkins being the intermediate weapon, Douglas being the slot option & RB Snelling being the 3rd Dn back. After a down 2009, Turner rebounded by giving ATL the power run option finishing 3rd in rush yds TY with 26.7% of ATL's offense. He's also been helped out by an ATL OL that started all 16 reg season games together TY allowing 1 sack every 24.8 att's. ATL's #16 def ranking is its best finish since 2004 (14th). The Falcons defense is specifically designed to cope with passing teams like NO & is one of the faster units in the NFL overall. However they are very young & have a tendency to overpursue. While they were 10th vs the run their 4.63 ypc was 27th on the year. On the DL, Abraham regained his 2008 form thanks to some solid play by Biermann TY who is evolving into a tenacious speed rusher. After starting 4 different players at LCB & 2 at RCB LY the Falcons had their entire secondary together for 2010. Despite the #22 pass def ranking they did improve the ypa slightly (7.5 to solid 6.9) & pulled in 7 more int than LY with Robinson solidifying the unit. ATL's LB's are headed by MLB Lofton who is an excellent player who doesn't get much press due to the offense. ATL has our #6 special teams TY thanks to a great year by the return units (#9 PR/#6 KR).

Both teams are built to be contenders for the long haul thanks to good drafting/FA handling in recent years. GB's offense is the same since Holmgren installed it with tweaks by coaches thru the years. The difference between this offense & the one in the last meeting is that they may have found a run game with rookie James Starks (123 yds 5.3 LW) to balance out their offense. ATL has the rest but GB has momentum & a more experienced back 7 here. PP calls for GB to pull another road upset here w/a slight yd edge (+36) & we agree here.
