ROSE BOWL - TCU was the only undefeated team in the country that was not playing in the National Title game but they were excited to be playing in the Rose Bowl vs Wisc as they were the first non-AC team to play in the big game. Their win in this one moved the non-AQ's record to 4-1 SU in BCS bowls vs AQ teams. This game capped a very poor Jan. 1 for the Big Ten as they went 0-5 in bowl games. The Badgers did have a 385-301 yd edge but trailed the entire 2H. UW actually held the ball for all but 3 plays in the 2Q which helped them compile the yardage edge. This one looked like it would be a score fest as UW opened with a 55/8pl drive and settled for a 30 yd FG. TCU converted on 38.10 twice on a 77/10pl drive and got a 23 yd TD pass to lead 7-3. UW went 67/6pl for a TD, 10-7 (3:14 1Q). TCU43 went 57/5pl for a TD, 14-10 (1:6). UW went 55/3gl but missed a 39y dFG. TCU went 3 & out. UW on 489 faked a punt for a FD then converted on 38.8, 38.12 and got a 37 yd FG on the final play of the half at the end of a 14pl drive. At the half UW had 234-131 yd and 38-18 play edges thanks to the 2Q. TCU opened the 3Q with a 71/6pl TD drive. UW started at their 5 and got 4 FD's but punted. TCU got 3 FD's and punted 38 yds to the 3. The next 3 poses each team got 1 FD & punted. UW took over with 7:32 left. They went 77/10pl and got a 4 yd TD run with 2:00 left. On the 2 pt conv they had an open rec in the EZ but blitzing LB Carder tipped the 2 pt pass. TCU rec'd the onside kick and on 38.4 got a 5 yd run for a FD with 1:52 left and took a knee.

CAPITAL ONE BOWL - Alabama came in with 3 losses while the Spartans had just 1. Despite the fact Bama was #15 and Michigan St was #7, the Tide were a big favorite. They lived up to their billing by absolutely dominating MSU with a 546-171 yd edge in a game they led 28-0 at the half and 42-0 after 3Q's. It was the largest MOV for the Cap One Bowl (formerly Florida Citrus and Tangerine). The previous high was E Texas St's 33-0 win over Tenn Tech in 1953. There were a couple of big plays ear

an int at their own 40. LSU punted 58 yds for a TB but then Reid cut in front of the WR and raced 34 yds to the 2 with another int. LSU got a TD on 3&gl from the 2 with 1:27 left to go up 28-17. LSU opened the 3Q with a 67/5pl drive for a TD, 35-17. A&M went on a 13pl drive to the LSU29 but after a sk and delay, punted on 4&18. LSU missed a 44 yd FG after a 60/12pl drive and A&M went 73/13pl for a TD to get back to 35-24 early 4Q. LSU rec'd the onside kick and Jasper tied a bowl record 50 yd FG, 38-24. Mathieu, 2pl later got an int at the A&M28 and LSU got a 26 yd FG with 3:04 left, 41-24. Mathieu got an int which he ret'd 37 yds for a TD but a pers foul wiped it out. LSU got a FD to the 19 and took a knee. This was the 50th game between the 2 schools but the first since the 1995 season opener.

ORANGE BOWL - The Cardinal will finish in the Top 5 for the first time since their unbeaten 1940 team finished #2. This game came just 4 years after the team was 1-11 and hired Jim Harbaugh. VT punted to open the 3Q and SU went 59/9pl for a TD. After a 42 yd pass, VT was int'd on a deep pass at the SU3. SU got a 56 yd run by Taylor then a 41 yd TD pass to Fleener to make it 26-12 (5:49 3Q). VT punted and SU went 87/8pl with a 58 yd TD pass to Fleener, 33-12. SUGAR BOWL - The Big Ten needed a win in a bowl after going 0-5 on NY's Day. The story here was Ohio St had 5 key players who were susp'd for the first 5 games of 2011 but allowed to play in the bowl. Ironically, all 5 made key plays including the only non-starter of the group in DE Solomon Thomas who recorded a game saving int at the OSU18 with :58 left. OSU led the game commandingly, 28-10 at the half but had to hang on. Herron and Posey (2 other susp) each had a TD and Pryor hit 14-25-221. Arkansas dropped 6 passes which hurt them during the game. After a UA punt (2 dropped passes) OSU went 74/8pl for a TD, 7-0. UA went 51/5pl for a TD, 7-7. OSU went 68/7pl for a TD, 14-7 (7:17 1Q). 2 punts. UA on 4&1 were SOD at the OSU30. NO was a depleted team coming in playing without their top 2 RB's and a banged up D missing 2 starters. NO took their opening drive to the SEA8 and on 3&2 Brees could have run for the FD but opted to just toss it to Bush but Bush dropped the pass and NO settled for a FG. NO got an int and drove 35 yds for a TD, 10-0. Each team went on a long TD drive and NO led 17-7 with 13:38 left 2Q. Julius Jones became the first player in NFL Playoff history to score a TD vs a team that released him earlier in the year. SEA went 70/5pl for a TD, 17-14 and NO had the first punt of the game at 9:55 of the 2Q. Jones fmbl'd on the first play of their next drive at their own 18 and SEA got a 29 yd FG to tie it (7:03). After the Saints went 3 & out, SEA went 76/9pl including a 3&11 to open the drive. They were draining the clock as they didn't want to give NO any time to get the ball back when on 3&3 Hasselbeck took a shot and found Stokley behind the secondary for a 45 yd TD, the key play of the game, 24-17. NO went 77/11pl and got a 22 yd FG to pull within 24-20 at the half. SEA opened the 3Q with a 79/7pl drive and another deep pass went to Williams for a 38 yd TD and a stunning 31-20 lead. They converted 4 FD's to the IND19 but were int'd at the goal line and re'd 23 yds with: 45 left. At the half, the Jets had 8-7 FD and 153-147 yd edges. NYJ opened the 3Q with a strong 63/10pl drive and in the 2H kept it mostly on the ground and tied it at 7. IND went 45/9pl but on 3&1 ran for a loss of 1 and settled for a 47 yd FG, 10-7. NYJ then went 87/17pl. There were 5 passes out of the 17 and Tomlinson's 1 yd run put the Jets up 14-10 (9:59). IND went 67/13pl. On a 3&7 early in the drive, a handoff to Rhodes went 9 yds for a FD to the NYJ41. After getting a 3&8, 21 yd pass, this time on 3&7 from the NYJ15 they tried the Rhodes play again and were tkl'd for a 1 yd gain. They settled for a Vinatieri 32 yd FG and trailed by 2. NYJ took over with 4:37 left and went 3 & out. Earlier a NYJ player wiped out the IND P but it was ruled that he was pushed towards It appeared Peyton Manning would pull his magic off again and he went 48/8pl. The NYJ ret'd the KO to their 46 and after 1 FD, the Colts surprisingly called time-out with :29 left giving the Jets time to regroup. The Steelers own 19 division titles S/79 with 4 in the AFC North since realignment. Mike Tomlin's Steelers are 26-9 SU/19-15-1 ATS at home going 5-3 SU/ATS TY. PIT outgained foes by an avg of 47 ypg (6th) at home TY (+10 TO's) with a 23.1-16.6 avg score. Omitting BAL, PIT went 2-3 SU/ATS vs foes with a winning record TY with a +36 ypg avg (7th) being -1 TO's for a 21.2-20.6 avg score. Counting playoffs, Tomlin is 6-3 SU/ATS/O/U vs BAL with a 21-16 avg score. They split the series TY with BAL getting a 17-14 win vs PIT (2' pt AD) without Roethlisberger in Wk 4. With Roethlisberger, the Steelers came away with a 13-10 win as a 3 pt AD. BAL had a 10-6 lead with 3:00 left but Flacco was sk'd & fmbl'd & it was ret'd to the BAL9. PIT scored 3pl later & forced BAL to go 3&out then ran out the clock. BAL is 6-3 SU/ATS on the road TY where they have outgained foes by just 27 ypg (+1 TO's) with a 22-16 avg score. Not counting the PIT games BAL is 4-2 SU/3-2-1 ATS vs winning foes outgaining them by 90 ypg (+1 TO's) with a 26-20 avg score.

Under OC Cameron BAL has established its approach to the season as they emphasize the pass until early Dec. Cameron noted that he does this to push Flacco's development as much as possible so when the weather turns bad he can field healthy RB's & a hot QB. After a rough 1st 2 gms, Flacco settled in & finished the year with a 24-5 ratio (7.82 ypa) going 137 str passes without an int. In the L/3 of reg ssn though he failed to hit 200 yds, avg 133 ypg (62%) with a 4-2 ratio. RB Rice has logged B2B seasons of 1,200 yds rush/500 yds rec. He joins WR's Boldin/Mason with 60+ rec's, but BAL did not have a 1,000 yd rec for the 1st time S/06. Boldin's 837 yds (13.1) are a career high & though they have three rec with 600+ receptions on the roster, the unit isn't especially fast. BAL has been fairly stable on the OL with the same starting combo for 13 of 16 TY all'g 1 sk for every 12.8 pass att. The truth is BAL has a good but not great D at this point with solid leadership (Lewis/Reed) that has made up for shortcomings in the secondary. Ngata is a dominant force on the DL who can play any spot up front for a unit that has given up 94 ypg (3.9) rush TY. BAL has had the advantage of a healthy Suggs after a down '09 & he's posted 11 sks for a D that earns 1 every 22 att. In the 1st 6 gms without FS Reed, BAL only had 3 int but with Reed who leads the team with 8, BAL pulled in 16 the rest of the way. BAL has our #12 ST's with a good year by Koch (39.2 net. 39 punts In20).

PIT opened 2010 3-1 SU/ATS without Roethlisberger thanks to some great defensive work which held foes to 289 ypg with a 21-12 avg (+7 TO's). With their QB, PIT outgained foes in 10 of 12 gms (NO/NE) in the reg ssn by 98 ypg (2nd overall) with a +9 TO mark (24-15 avg score). Thanks to the bye week & easy lead in gms vs CLE/MIA Roethlisberger finished with a 17-5 ratio not throwing more than 1 int in a game. PIT has been very balanced with a 348-398 run-pass mix since his return thanks to Mendenhall who is the team's first 1,200 yd rusher S/07. Mendenhall had 26% of PIT's offense TY with Moore being a standout 3rd Dn back again. Wallace has evolved into the primary rec option finishing 5th in rec yds & 2nd in ypc in the NFL. Ward is now the possession WR here with excellent blocking skills & Miller is the prototype balanced TE. PIT is used to dealing with a patchwork OL in recent years with only LT Adams & star rookie C Pouncey starting all 16 gms for a unit that gave up 1 sk every 12 att's with Roethlisberger. PIT missed being the #1 overall D by 84 yds but finished 1st vs the run (62.8, 3.0), sks by with 48 (1 every 12.4 att's) & pts all'd (232). PIT's DL is geared to occupy the opposing OL & allow the LB's to flow to the ball with DE Smith (triceps) being regarded as one of the top 5 of the last decade. PIT has long set the standard for 3-4 LB's with Woodley & Harrison again combining for 20 sks. After giving up a 22-12 ratio LY, PIT's #12 pass D is one of 3 to have more int than TD TY. PIT finished 18th in our STs rankings TY improving their coverage units from LY but the PR is weaker.

It's not a surprise that PP forecasts another close game here as the L4 meetings have been decided by exactly 3 points each. All 6 of Flacco's playoff games have been on the road where he's avg'd 154 ypg (53%) w/a 3-6 ratio with LW being his 1st 200 yd passing effort. PP calls for 593 combined yds in a game where PIT is supposed to have a healthy Polamalu & DE Smith back. This is right around the line for side & total though which makes this a No Play.

NE only outgained foes by 13 ypg (15th) at home but led the NFL with +11 TO's (34-20 avg score). Vs winning tms (not incl Jets) NE went 6-0 SU/4-2 ATS being outgained by 15 ypg (10th) with an amazing +12 TO's (PIT #2, +5 TO's) with a 31-21 avg score. The HT is 4-0 SU/ATS in this series the L2Y. TY the Jets (-3) won the 1st gm 28-14 as Sanchez passed for 220 (70%) with a 3-0 ratio (TY's best). The Jets had a 196-80 yd edge in the 2H holding Brady to 69 yds (44%) with 2 int. In the rematch NE exploited a Jets D that had just lost FS Leonhard (shin) & Brady had the 12th 4-0 ratio gm of his career (326, 72%, outstanding 11.2 ypa). NE had a 405-301 yd edge holding Sanchez to 164 (52%) with 3 int. The Jets are now 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS on the road thanks to LW's win vs IND. They are also 2-3 SU/ATS vs winning foes (no NE) with a 7 ypg edge (-3 TO's) being outscored 23-21 ppg.

Tomlinson is an asset on 3rd Dn's & in blitz pickup with Greene failing to make an impact there. LY the Jets had the #31 pass attack (149 ypg) but had a decent improvement TY (22nd, 209 ypg) although they still haven't had a 1,000 yd rec S/07. They have spread the ball around more as 4 players have 52 rec's. The Jets have had the same OL for 13 gms TY & they get RT Woody (knee) back vs the Colts. Ryan cut his teeth on D & after finishing 1st LY (+1 TO), they were 3rd (+9 TO's) TY. NYJ are all'g an impressive 91 ypg (3.6) rush TY. The muscle of the D is its LB unit with Scott setting the tone & Harris being a drastically underrated ILB. The Jets use a 3-man OLB rotation to stay fresh for pass rush sit's with Thomas, Pace & Taylor comb for 16.5 sks (20 ideal for OLB's in 3-4). LY the Jets were fearsome in pass D all'g 52% (5.4 ypa) with an outstanding 8-17 ratio but TY Revis hansh't been himself. They've all'd 51% (6.5) with a 24-12 ratio as offenses have more tape to study. NYJ have our #5 ST's unit with P Weatherford having a strong year (50% punts In20) & Smith (28.6) having a great year on KR's.

with P Weatherford having a strong year (50% punts In20) & Smith (28.6) having a great year on KR's. NE quickly adapted its offense after releasing Moss, going for a more diffused Saints style. Since the CLE loss, NE has outgained foes 403-347 with a 37-16 avg score thanks to a +23 TO margin. Brady hasn't had an int since 10/17 with 8 str gms of a QBR of 107 or more. NE is often criticized for lacking a run game but they've finished 13th or better in each of the LSY (9th TY) without a feature back. Green-Ellis is NE's 1st 1,000 yd RB S/04 (Corey Dillon) & is the power back while former Jet Woodhead is an ideal fit as the 3rd Dn back. NE's 2 rookie TE's, Hernandez & Gronkowski, comb for 87 rec (12.7) which was just about what Moss had LY (83, 15.2). Welker remains an elite slot WR, Branch fit right back in after being reacquired from SEA & Tate has been a decent deep threat in limited snaps (ST's). NE's OL is built for the scheme & is better than its parts all'g 1 sk for every 19.7 att. NE's #25 D had its worst finish S/05 (26th) as it had one of the youngest secondaries in the NFL at the start of the yr & the DL has been decimated by inj's. The DL has been held together by one of the top 3 NT's in the NFL, Wilfork, & the solid play of Warren who has found a niche in NE's system. NE's pass rush is avg at best (16th) but 10 plyrs have 2 sks TY (1 sk every 17 att's). NE's #30 pass D is a mixed rating as foes are forced to pass more to keep up with Brady & they led the NFL with 25 int with a respectable 7.1 ypa. NE finished 10th in our ST's rankings TY thanks to their return units.

This is the 3rd road game in 4 Wks for the Jets vs NE who is not only off a bye week but playing in their 3rd home game in a 4 game span. The Jets beat a beat up Colts team without its starting RT that also IR'd its best CB before the game. 25 of their 37 2H plays were runs as Sanchez struggled in the 1H (84 yds 47% 0-1) consistently overthrowing receivers. Look for NE to focus on limiting the Jets rush attack while forcing Sanchez to throw & wear out his damaged shoulder. NE's reliance on TO free ball is a concern vs the Jets who are designed to beat Colts/Patriots/Saints systems. PP calls for the Patriots to win handily here at home & after LY's stunning loss to BAL in the playoffs we don't think they'll make that mistake again.

For the 1st time in franchise history the Falcons have 3 straight winning seasons thanks to Mike Smith with their 1st Div title since 2004 (4th overall). ATL's 20-4 SU mark at home (16-8 ATS) is 2nd to only NE & tied with BAL/IND since 2008. TY ATL outgained foes by 26 ypg (12th) with an impressive +12 TO's which is tied with NE for #1 while outscoring foes 28-19. This includes a 20-17 win as a 1.5 pt HF vs GB TY. GB had a large edge in yards (418-294) but ATL was content to control the tempo of the game with a balanced attack. Both OB's had solid games but the difference was ATL RB Turner whose 110 yds (4.8) along with a Rodgers fumble on the ATL 1 which changed the momentum of the game. ATL is 5-3 SU/4-4 ATS vs the other winning teams they faced TY being outgained by 40 ypg (+4 TO's) on the short end of a 22-21 avg score. GB is now 5-2 SU/ATS vs winning teams (no ATL) TY w/a 4-5 SU/5-4 ATS mark (1-8 O/U) on the road.

GB & NO are the only tms to finish in the top 10 on off in each of the L5Y. Rodgers is an elite QB ranking 4th in pass yds, pass TD & QBR since he took over as the st'r in '08. TY he was 78 yds short of being the 1st QB to throw for 4,000 in each of his 1st 3 yrs. He has had to cope with the loss of RB Grant (brkn ankle in opener) & TE Finley (knee, 5th gm) who was a huge loss for 3rd down pkgs. As a result GB used its run gm to set up the play action & serve as an extra pass protector. GB's off relies on YAC with the Pack having 1,757 before the ssn finale. GB has 5 plyrs in the top 100 for rec's with Jennings finishing in the top 10 rec yds (1st time in career). Unlike LY, GB has enjoyed stability on the OL as they've had the same lineup for 12 str after Bulaga was installed at RT. LY Rodgers was sacked once every 11 att, it's once every 15. GB has capitalized build was installed at N.1. Produger was sacked once every 17 att, its office every 13. After starting 1 gm LY, Raji has been a beast as he's the only DL with 16 sts & his 6.5 sks are the most by a NT S/90. Despite a nagging hamstring inj Matthews is the 1st in GB hist with 10+ sks in his 1st 2Y. However, GB is very thin at the other OLB spot having started 4 diff plyrs. GB has had good health in the secondary (#5 pass D) with 3 of 4 st'rs together for all 16. This will be the 4th time in 5 yrs that GB's ST's have finished 24th or lower in our rankings with the return units (7.9 PR, 20.1 KR) being the main culprit TY.

Balance. Many coaches give lip service to it on offense but ATL's 54/46 pass to run ratio shows how dedicated they have been under OC Mike Mularkey. One of the NFL's next gen QB stars, Ryan has been at his best at home with a 15-3 ratio (99.1 QBR) as the dome's speed plays to the Falcons strengths. He's also worked with arguably the best WR in the NFL TY as White led the league in targets, catches & finished 2nd in yards accounting for 25.4% of ATL's offense. Despite a Hall of Fame career, this will only be Tony Gonzalez' 4th playoff game (0-3 SU) as he finished with the 4th most rec's by a TE TY. The rest of the receiving unit are in the supporting cast with Jenkins being the intermediate weapon, Douglas being the slot option & RB Snelling being the 3rd Dn back. After a down 2009, Turner rebounded by giving ATL the solid option AB Shelling being the 3d bill dax. After a down 2009, titrler rebooling by giving ALL the power run option finishing 3rd in rush yds TY with 26.7% of ATL's offense. He's also been helped out by an ATL OL that started all 16 reg season games together TY allowing 1 sack every 24.8 att's. ATL's #16 def ranking is its best finish since 2004 (14th). The Falcons defense is specifically designed to cope with passing teams like NO & is one of the faster units in the NFL overall. However they are very young & have a tendency to overpursue. While they were 10th vs the run their 4.63 ypc was 27th on the year. On the DL, Abraham regained his 2008 form thanks to some solid play by Biermann TY who is evolving into a tenacious speed rusher. After starting 4 different players at LCB & 2 at RCB LY the Falcons had their entire secondary together for 2010. Despite the #22 pass def ranking they did improve the ypa slightly (7.5 to solid 6.9) & pulled in 7 more int than LY with Robinson solidifying the unit. ATL B's are headed by MLB Lofton who is an excellent player who doesn't get much press due to the offense. ATL has our #6 special teams TY thanks to a great year by the return units (#9 PR/#6 KR).

Both teams are built to be contenders for the long haul thanks to good drafting/FA handling in recent years.

GB's offense is the same since Holmgren installed it with tweaks by coaches thru the years. The difference between this offense & the one in the last meeting is that they may have found a run game with rookie James Starks (123 yds 5.3 LW) to balance out their offense. ATL has the rest but GB has momentum & a more experienced back 7 here. PP calls for GB to pull another road upset here w/a slight yd edge (+36) & we agree here.

SEA is 31st in rush (89 ypg, 3.7) with six 100 yd rush gms TY. Omitting Lynch's amazing 67 yd TD run vs the Saints, SEA ran for just 84 more yds (3.5). The real culprit has been inj's on the OL for 10 diff combots.

with 3 gms being the longest a set has been together. This has led to allowing 1 sk for every 15.5 att's & placed a lot of pressure on an aging Hasselbeck who has been forced to press. In his 5 full gms vs winning foes he's avg'd 236 ypg (62%) with a 5-5 ratio (7.0 ypa). He's also working with a receiving unit minus his top 3 WR's from LY (187 rec, 11.6). FS Thomas has been solid as a rookie but Trufant (3 TD vs TB) & Milloy are not what they used to be. SEA does have an elite ST's

unit headed up by Washington who has 3 KR TD's TY.

Despite adding Martz as OC CHI avg'd just 289 ypg (327 ypg LY) while their scoring stayed at 20 ppg for a 2nd season. While Jay Cutler threw for 392 fewer yds TY his ratio improved from 27-26 to 23-16 with his QBR improving from 76.8 to 86.3. Matt Forte topped the 1,000 yd mark (1069) with three 100+ gms & he improved from 3.5 to 4.5 ypc as the Bears won all 5 gms when he rushed for 92+. Forte also tied for the team lead with 51 rec (10.7). In OC Martz's 1st yr we expected to see a significant increase in the passing #'s but that didn't occur. SEA had huge edges by being at home for the 2nd straight week vs a beat up NO defense that was sluggish. CHI now has the travel/rest edges here & they know what to expect from Carroll's system. PP likes CHI big here (+126 yds) & we side with them (CHI 4-1 ATS fav of 7 or more) as well but temper the grade due to the big line here.
