NEWS AND NOTES

TICKETCITY BOWL - Northwestern raved about Evan Watkins' practices but he ended up splitting the QB duties with option QB Kain Colter who hit 3-6 but also rushed 18x for 105 yds. The game was not decided until NU's final play which was a Hail Mary that was int'd and ret'd to the TT35. The TicketCity Bowl was played at the Cotton Bowl - the site of more bowls than any stadium except the Rose Bowl. Attendance was 40,121 or well under half capacity. It was an 11:00 am KO on NY morning with temps in the 30's. TT RB Eric Stephens' 86 yd TD run was the 2nd longest for a bowl game in this stadium topped only by the 95 yd'r in the 1954 Cotton Bowl that was awarded when Alabama's Tommy Lewis stepped off the sideline to tkl Rice's Dicky Maegle. The first 3 poss were punts before TT got a 24 yd FG, 3-0. After a 17 yd punt by NU, TT went 60/8pl for a TD, 10-0. NU went 27/8pl but on 4&7 was SOD at the TT33. NU went 78/15pl for a TD but bobbled the snap on the xp, 10-6 (6:47). TT went 70/8pl for a TD, 17-6 (4:15) then went 76/11pl and got a 6 yd TD pass with :11 left in the half, 24-6. At half TT had a 300-158 yd edge. TT fmbld the 3Q opening KO but NU opted to go for a FG on 4&gl from the 1 on the 3Q's 8th play and the 18 yd FG made it 24-9. Stephens got the 86 yd TD run on the next play, 31-9. NU went 67/11pl for a TD and 2pt conv, 31-17. TT converted on 3&9 when the WR broke 3 tkls for a FD to the 29 to continue an 82/12pl TD drive, 38-17. TT tried an onside kick and NU rec'd at their 36. That let NU back in as they went 36/2pl for a TD, 38-24. TT went 3&out and NU went 67/12pl for a 4&4, 18 yd TD pass, 38-31 (10:33). TT went 69/10pl and on 3&8 an 11 yd TD pass with 7:13 left, 45-31. NU punted but on 3&9 a TT tipped pass was int'd and ret'd 39 yds for a TD, 45-38 (5:37). TT got 2 crucial first downs and punted on 4&7 with :25 left. NU got to their 42 and with :09 left, was int'd at the TT16 and ret'd 19 yds on the final play.

LIBERTY BOWL - It appeared weather would be a factor in the Georgia/UCF game but it did not rain until :30 were left. UGA's Richt handed the game to UCF on their first offensive series. UGA went 95/15pl and had a FD at the 12. On 3&2 they had a run that looked like a FD but it was marked short. He did not ask for a replay, did not try to gain the foot and instead got a 20 yd FG, basically telling UCF they could play with them all game. The FG put UGA up 3-0. UCF from its own 30 threw a pass that was int'd at the UGA17. 2 punts. Aaron Murray probably had his worst game of the season missing a lot of open rec's. UGA had the ball 3&6 at the UCF33 when he was int'd at the 18. UCF went on a 53/9pl drive but on 2&7 was int'd in the EZ with 3:19 left in the half and UGA got 2 FD but then Murray was int and ret'd 13 yds to the UGA32 with 1:27 left and UCF got a 22 yd FG to tie it at 3 with :33 left. UGA opened the 3Q with a solid 61/13pl drive but again settled for a FG, this one 41 yds, 6-3. 4 punts. UCF went 65/11pl and got a 10 yd TD run with 9:01 left to lead 10-6. 3 punts, the 3rd when UGA punted on 4&32 with 5:16 left. UCF got 1 FD & punted with 2:20 left and UGA converted on 4&8 and 4&5 and got to the UCF29 but on 4&19 their Hail Mary was knocked down in the EZ.

ALAMO BOWL - UA had 6 poss inside OSU terr in the 1H result in just 1 TD and UA had a 209-168 yd edge at the half yet trailed 23-7. For the game UA had a 25-17 FD edge and held the potent OSU offense to just 312 yds while rolling up 370 yds but lost by 26. UA fmbld a punt at their own 26 setting up a short OSU TD. UA was SOD at the OSU29 and on the next play, OSU got a 71/1pl TD pass, 14-0. UA went 63/8pl for a TD, 14-7. 2 punts. OSU went 30/9pl for a 40 yd FG, 17-7 (:06 1Q). UA went 33/7pl but was int'd and ret'd 62 yds for a TD and trailed 23-7 (12:33 2Q, xpng). UA went 45/9pl but was int'd at the 2. UA went 36/8pl but missed a 47 yd FG (2:26). UA went 43/9pl and on 3&10 got a FD to the 3 but it was called back for off pass interf and after a 13 yd gain, they didn't call time-out and ran out of time at the 41. UA took their 2nd 3Q poss for a 42 yd FG, 23-10. OSU went 71/11pl for a TD, 30-10 (5:16). UA was int'd and OSU, 8pl later, had a 50 yd FG, 33-10. UA went 54/17pl but missed a 34 yd FG. OSU went on a 10pl drive for a 44 yd FG with 5:53 left, 36-10. UA went 70/14pl but on 4&1 was SOD at the OSU10.

INDEPENDENCE BOWL - You would think a bowl game contested between 2 option teams who had the entire month to prep for each other would be a low scoring match and that is precisely what happened. There were some key plays as Air Force was SOD on 4th down 3x in the 1H and GT fmbld a pair of punts costing them 80 yds. After a 43 yd PR, AF got a 42 yd FG to lead 3-0. GT went 69/12pl for a TD, 7-3. AF was SOD at their own GT36 but GT on 4&6 was SOD at the AF32. AF went on an 11pl drive but was SOD at the GT26 on 4&5. AF went 56/9pl but was SOD on 4&1 at the GT20 (3:11). AF went 57/8pl and got a 41 yd FG on the final play of the half to pull within 7-6. AF had a 201-141 yd edge. GT opened the 3Q with a 77/18pl drive that ate up 8:35 but they fmbld at the AF5. GT fmbld a punt at the AF47 and 2 punts later GT fmbld another punt at their own 14 setting up an AF TD and 2 pt conv and the Falcons led 14-7 (13:24 4Q). AF went 71/18pl and missed a 37 yd FG with 1:48 left. GT went on a 13pl drive to the AF21 but on 3&3 was int'd at the 2.

TEXAS BOWL - It was Baylor's first bowl in 16 years. They opened with a solid drive but Griffin fmbld and it was ret'd 46 yds to the BU28. IL settled for a 38 yd FG. IL drove 57/11pl and settled for a 28 yd FG then went 65/7pl but settled for a 43 yd FG. Despite dominating they only led 9-0. IL went 86/7pl for a TD and Mikel LeShoure rushed for 184 yds and set 5 single season school records incl the single season rushing yards at 1,697 for IL. LeShoure's 5 yd TD run made it 16-0 (9:42 2Q). 2 punts. BU went 61/10pl but fmbld at the IL32 (1:39) and BU missed a 57 yd FG on the final play of the half. IL had a 252-150 yd edge. IL opened the 3Q with an 87/9pl drive for a TD. BU went 73/11pl for a TD, 24-7 (8:03 3Q). 3 punts. BU went 81/8pl and on 4&14 Griffin got a 39 yd TD pass to pull them within 24-14. They forced a punt but on 3&1 were stuffed and opted to punt with 10:15 left. IL went 66/7pl for a TD with 7:14 left to ice it. BU went on an 11pl drive but on 4&5 was SOD at the IL9 with 3:34 left. IL not only got 2 FD's but they got a 55 yd Scheelhaase TD run, 38-14. Scheelhaase completed all 13 of his passes in the 1H and IL had a 533-437 yd edge.

SUN BOWL - This was a very attractive matchup with Notre Dame vs Miami, FI and it sold out in 21 hrs, the fastest in the Sun Bowl's 77 yr history. The crowd of 54,021 set a Sun Bowl attendance record. When Miami plays in cold weather, they struggle. Two years ago they had an inept performance at GT and last year in the bowl vs Wisc they were clearly bothered by the cold. UM's players were dressed like it was 20° below zero even though it was 34° at KO. UM played like they wanted to get back to Florida ASAP. UM finished with a 422-397 yd edge but allowed ND to score TD's on 3 of their first 4 poss. Jacory Harris, who had great practices all week had another horrific performance in a big game hitting 4-7-37 with 3 int's. His 2nd int set up a 39/1pl TD drive for ND to make it 21-0. After Harris' 3rd int in 3 series, he was pulled and Morris hit 22-33-282 yds. Morris was int'd at the ND26 on the next poss and UM had a 4-0 TO deficit. ND got 40 and 50 yd FG's (latter with :27 left 1H) to lead 27-0 and UM got a 47 yd FG on the last play of the half, 27-3. ND opened the 3Q with a 63/15pl drive but settled for a 19 yd FG, 30-3. UM was SOD at the 50 and ND missed a 36 yd FG 8pl later. 2 punts. UM went 57/7pl for a 6 yd TD pass with 10:36 left and then went 98/8pl. They got a 42 yd TD pass with 4:01 left to pull within 30-17. ND on 3&11 got a 19 yd pass and a 26 yd run by Wood and the game went Over thanks to a 34 yd FG with 1:21 left. UM got to the ND12 but after intentional grounding their final play was a 2&31 incomplete pass.

INSIGHT BOWL - Iowa was playing without 2 susp'd players but Coker (replaced Robinson at RB) actually had a higher PS# out of HS and rushed for 403 in six games prior to the bowl. Coker had a big game with 219 yds rushing. Iowa opened with a 67/8pl TD drive. MO went 75/17pl for a 23 yd FG. 2 punts. Coker got a 62 yd TD run, 14-3. Iowa went 69/9pl and got a 34 yd FG and appeared in control leading 17-3 (7:28 2Q). MO converted on 3&9 and went 82/9pl for a TD with 4:51 left in the half. After Iowa punted with 2:42 left MO went 70/11pl but on 3&10 from the 14 was int'd on a tipped pass in the EZ with :28 left 1H. At half thanks to those final 2 drives MO had a 297-267 yd edge. MO opened the 3Q with a punt and Iowa went 93/10pl but settled for a 21 yd FG, 20-10 (7:03 3Q). MO went 77/8pl for a 7 yd TD run. Iowa was then int'd and MO went 57/9pl for a TD, 24-20. Iowa went on a 7pl drive but punted. MO punted. Iowa got to the MO48 but was int'd at the 31 with 8:25 left. MO went 40/6pl but then on FD from the Iowa29 was not only int'd but Hyde broke back across the field and ret'd it 72 yds for a TD with 5:32 left. MO went 38/10pl. On 4&6 a pass to WR Moe was orig ruled FD but replay showed the ball hit the ground and it was incomplete with 2:15 left. Iowa got 1 FD & on 3&3 a rollout pass to Reinsner saw him break toward the EZ. He was flipped in the air and it appeared the ball broke the plane but they marked him down at the 1 and Iowa took a knee.

MILITARY BOWL - The key to this one was that ACC Coach of the Year Ralph Friedgen was in his final game and the team was very motivated to play for him. MD had a 478-343 yd edge. MD was int'd on a deep pass on the first play and EC started at their 30 but was SOD on 4&inches at the 50 and MD got a 45 yd TD pass 3pl later, 6-0 (xp blk'd, 10:35 1Q). EC was int'd at the MD27 then fmbld at their own 28. MD missed a 25 yd FG (13:02 2Q). MD, after a punt, started at the EC43 and after 2 FD's to the 7, settled for a 23 yd FG, 9-0. EC went 37/10pl. On 4&4 they fired incomplete but roughing the QB gave them a FD to the 22. They got a 37 yd FG, 9-3. MD went 66/6pl for a TD, 16-3 (2:57 2Q). EC fmbld at their own 48 but MD punted (:38). At half MD had a 202-127 yd edge. MD got a deflected int and ret'd it 34 yds to the EC1 setting up a TD, 23-3. 2 punts. EC got a 36 yd PR to the MD15 and then on 3&15 a 20 yd TD pass beat an all out blitz, 23-10 (9:51 3Q). MD went 69/11pl for a TD and EC 56/10pl for a 31 yd FG. The FG came 4pl after a 4&6, 31 yd pass to the 11, 30-13. Scott got a 61 yd TD run and finished with 200 yds on 13 carries. EC went 63/12pl but on 4&gl from the 2 had a delay and was tkld for a 2 yd loss back to the 9. On the next play, Scott got a 91 yd TD run, 44-13 (11:20). MD was int'd on a deep pass at the EC2 and then went 40/7pl for a 4 yd TD run with 4:41 left, 51-13. EC brought in backup QB Wornick and went 61/9pl getting a 14 yd TD pass with 1:43 left.

ARMED FORCES BOWL - Played on SMU's home field as TCU's Stadium was under renovation. SMU had a 413-229 yd edge for the game but lost thanks in part to a pair of missed FG's on a windy day. SMU got a 45 yd pass on their first play but then Padron, on 2&4 just dropped the ball. It was not stripped and McNary picked it up and ret'd it 55 yds for a TD and Army led 7-0. SMU went 53/10pl but missed a 35 yd FG. Army went 80/8pl for a TD on a 13 yd run, 13-0 (xp blk'd). SMU went 58/6pl getting to the Army22 but Padron was int'd. On the next drive SMU got a 37 yd pass but 2pl later was int'd at the Army34. 2 punts. Army went 24/9pl for a 44 yd FG, 16-0. SMU got to the Army36 but on 4&2 Padron was stuffed on an option with 1:09 left in the half. At the half SMU had a 215-130 yd edge but trailed 16-0. Army got 3 FD's and punted to open the 3Q and SMU went on a 92/13pl drive for a TD. SMU's next drive went 74/10pl and they got a 28 yd TD pass with 9:20 left. Army rec'd the KO at their 11 and punted 4pl later on 4&10 and SMU had the game in hand. SMU took over at their 38 and got 2 FD's to the Army34 but settled for a 47 yd FG and this time missed it wide left. At this point Army trailed in yardage 413-193. On 3&5 with 3:20 left Army got a 6 yd run. With 1:18 left on 3&4, Army got a 22 yd pass to the SMU31 where they took a knee.

The Colts let the Jets into LY's playoffs by resting starters in Wk 16. IND then beat the Jets soundly 30-17 as an 8 pt HF a month later in the AFC Championship game. Manning dismantled the Jets defense with 377 yds (67%) and 3 TD's. The Jets had a 17-13 lead at the half but IND scored 17 unanswered points holding Sanchez to 133 yds (40%) with an int in the 2H. The Jets went 2-4 SU/ATS vs foes with a winning record TY being outgained by 12 ypg (-2 TO's) with a 22-16 avg score. On the road TY they are 6-2 SU/5-3 ATS outgaining teams by 37 ypg (-3 TO's) with a 25-1-24.6 avg score. IND is 2-3 SU/4-1 ATS vs teams with a winning record outgaining them by 58 ypg (-8 TO's) with a 25-23 avg score. TY at home they are 6-2 SU/4-4 ATS outgaining teams by 37 ypg (+2 TO's) with a 27-22 avg score.

After having the most rush att's in '09 (607), the Jets trimmed them to 534 TY as they opened the playbook to take advantage of Sanchez being in the system for the 2nd year and their FA pickups. The result was a mixed bag as Sanchez hit 54% comp (6.7 ypa) with a 12-20 ratio LY compared to 55% (6.5) with a 17-13 ratio TY. He has started to read D's better, but he has been inconsistent compounded by an inj to his throwing shoulder vs PIT. Tomlinson is an asset on 3rd Dns and in blitz pickup with Greene failing to make an impact there. LY the Jets had the #31 pass attack (149 ypg) but had a decent improvement TY finishing 22nd (209 ypg) but they haven't had a 1,000 yd receiver S/O'7. They have spread the ball around more as 4 players have 52 rec's with Edwards being the possession WR, Holmes the speed option and Keller being the safety outlet for Sanchez. The Jets have had the same OL for 13 gms TY but it's unknown if they'll get RT Woodley (knee) back. Ryan cut his teeth on D and after finishing 1st LY (+1 TO's) they were 3rd (+9 TO's) TY. The Jets are allowing an impressive 91 ypg (3.6) rush TY despite losing NT Jenkins in the opener. The muscle of the NY D is its LB unit with Scott setting the tone and Harris being a drastically underrated ILB. The Jets use a 3-man OLB rotation to stay fresh for pass rush situations with Thomas, Pace and Taylor combining for 16.5 sks with 20 being ideal for OLB's in a 3-4. LY the Jets were fearsome in pass D all'g 52% comp (5.4 ypa) with an outstanding 8-17 ratio. TY Revis hasn't been himself and they have given up more deep balls. They have all'd 51% comp (6.5) with a 24-12 ratio as offenses have had more tape to study. The Jets have our #4 ST's unit with P Weatherford having a strong year (50% punts In20) and Brad Smith (28.6) having a great year on KR's.

Manning had to deal with another season of inj's to his WR's but unlike LY he doesn't have the luxury of TE Clark while he groomed young WR's. As a result Manning threw for 17 int, his most S/O'2 while logging his 5th straight 4,000 yd season. He did have the benefit of another steady season from WR Wayne who has had three 100 rec's seasons in the L4Y to keep the offense moving. TE Tamme has a similar play style and athletic ability to Clark but is much less effective as a blk'r. Garcon finished 2nd in rec yds TY but he doesn't have same trust level as Collie did with Manning. IND's OL has contributed to the weak rush effort TY as they have used 5 different OL combos. IND's run game has come on strong the L3W though with a healthy Addai they have avg'd 149 ypg (5.1). IND's #20 D is designed to slow down teams not necessarily to stop them as long as Manning is at the helm. They are once again near the bottom in rush D rankings (25th 4.6) but Freeney/Mathis are still terrors with the pass rush (21 sks). The back 7 has been hit hard by inj's as only FS Bethea has started all 16 TY. IND did get great play out of rookie LB Angerer who has done well at SLB/MLB TY. IND's #13 pass defense isn't as good as its ranking as they are all'g 67% comp with a 22-10 ratio with an opp QBR tied with Manning's. IND doesn't invest in their ST's and are annually at the bottom of our rankings with TY being no different (#31).

PP gives the Jets the edge due to their big game vs BUF with the Colts struggling vs a weaker Div foe who has a history of playing them tough. PP gives the Jets a 61 yd edge in a call for an upset. However, IND is healthier at RB now which helps their play action while the Jets run game has worn down in the 2H of the year. Manning has seen Ryan's blitz packages before and Sanchez isn't 100% here. We disagree with PP here so No Play.

SEA has their 7th division title despite injuries and the most roster turnover in the NFL (only 21 of 53 players LW were on the team LY). SEA is the 15th team to have a sub-500 record after 11 games to make the playoffs and the 1st with a losing record. SEA dropped 5 straight games to a foe with a winning record after winning SU/ATS vs SD and CHI. In those L5 SEA has been outgained by a staggering 181 ypg (-6 TO's) with a 28-15 avg score. This includes a 34-19 loss as an 11 pt AD to NO earlier TY. Brees blasted the #27 pass defense with 382 yds (67%) with a 4-2 ratio. NO scored TD's on 5 of their 1st 6 drives (362 yds) while holding SEA to 3 FG's, 1 TD (230 yds). SEA is 5-3 SU/ATS at home TY being outgained by 66 ypg (29th) with -2 TO's and a 22.0-21.6 avg score. For 4 str yrs NO has ranked in the top 5 in pass off with the Payton/Brees tandem. They are 3-3 SU/3-3 ATS vs a foe with a winning rec'd TY outgaining winning tms by 45 ypg (-4 TO's) with a 22-18 score. On the road TY they are 6-2 SU but 3-5 ATS where they have outgained foes by 76 ypg (+1 TO) with a 27-20 score.

Despite not winning the NFC South TY NO is actually more efficient in terms of yds than LY's unit. LY NO was +46.1 ypg (+10.6 ppg) but TY they are +66.3 ypg (+4.8 ppg) with the big diff for 2010 being TO's. LY NO was 3rd (+11 TY), #2 NFL 39 takeaways) but foes adjusted their coverages vs the #6 off making life harder on Brees whose 22 int are a career high. Simply put D's are playing coverages deeper to minimize big plays (58 pb 20+ LY vs 47 TY) and Brees wasn't helped by a beat up run game for the 2nd yr in a row. NO spreads the ball around (8 players have 30 rec's TY) with Colston being the only plyr to have 1,000 yds since Brees took over in '06 doing it 4x's. Only IND has been more pass heavy (63%) TY as NO's RB by committee was hampered by inj to Thomas (ankle, out 9) and Bush (brkn leg, out 8). In the L3 with Thomas/Bush together NO rushed for 205 yd (3.4) combined behind an OL that started all 16 games together. Payton has gone on the record saying that TY's stop unit is the best he's had here (25th yds, 20th pts allowed LY) as they are 4th in yds and 7th in pts allowed. NO has 14 players with 1 sk TY (1 every 15 att) led by vastly underrated DT Ellis (6.0) as tms have focused on DE Smith (5.5) more TY. MLB Vilma is the D's leader (#1 tk) who has a knack of making big plays when needed the most. While the int are way down (26 LY vs 9 TY), NO has all'd a league best 13 passing TD with an excellent 6.6 ypa (#4 overall in pass D) despite missing both starting CB's (Greer 3 gms, Porter 4 gms) at one point but Jenkins versatility was showcased TY. NO has our #16 ST's unit as not having Bush on PR's (7.8) has hurt them and they also lost KR Roby (23.8) late in the yr. Hartley has made 15-16 FG since being benched with the GW 52 yd kick in ATL.

SEA cleared the slate of the Holmgren era in the offseason and gave Pete Carroll full control of the roster. Despite the win vs STL, SEA is 31st in rushing (89 ypg rush 3.7) with 6 100 yd rushing games TY. The real culprit has been injuries on the OL for 10 different combos with 3 games being the longest a set has been together. This has set up 1 sack every 15.5 att's allowed and placed a lot of pressure on an aging Hasselbeck who has been forced to press. In his 5 full games vs winning foes he's avg'd 236 ypg (62%) with a 5-5 ratio (7.0 ypa). He's also working with a receiving unit minus his top 3 WR's from LY (187 rec 11.6). Mike Williams is a great story as a comeback POY after getting a walk on tryout here. He is SEA's most consistent skill player when healthy with Obomanu being better served as a #4 WR. TE Carlson has been forced to block more which is why his stats have dropped. SEA was 2nd in rush def after 6 games (78 ypg 3.3) but losing DE Bryant (IR) and DT Cole (5 Wks) has them allowing almost twice as much (155 ypg 4.7) not inc LW. SEA's LB's have started all 16 games together but the scheme doesn't fit them and they have struggled with the DL issues.
