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NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK 9, 2010

NEWS AND NOTES: The AP's #1 team in the country had fallen for 2 straight weeks but Oregon faced UCLA at home so there was no such pressure. Their quick strike offense dominated UCLA which was playing without starting QB Prince. UCLA's first 2 drives were solid but one resulted in an int at the 10 and the other was a 25 yd FG. Each drive was time consuming and Oregon basically used 2:00 drives all game and scored TD's on their first 4 poss which included a 4&6, 25 yd pass to the 16. The Ducks led 32-3 at the half with a 357-136 yd edge. UO did get a 6/pl TD drive after recovering a fmb! and later a 2/pl drive after rec another fmb! with 4:46 left. UCLA scored a TD with 1:53 left for the final 60-13 margin...Cincinnati's defense has 8 soph starters, the youngest D in the BCS. The BJ Daniels-led USF offense hadn't scored a TD in the last 2 games and while UC had 29-13 FD and 590-378 yd edges, USF had a couple of big plays incl a 70 yd TD pass and led by 2 scores for most of the 2H. UC QB Collaros was inj'd (check status) and Chazz Anderson came in for UC's final drive. USF led 24-16 when UC was SOD at the USF30 and on the next play USF got a 70 yd TD pass to lead 31-16. They also led 38-23. UC got a TD with 5:28 left and USF conservatively ran it 3x and punted. UC with Anderson in at QB got to the USF16 needing a TD and 2 pt for the tie but on 4&5 under heavy pressure, he threw incomplete...The situation greatly favored Ohio St last week. They were off a loss, were no longer playing with pressure of an unbeaten season so they could unleash the offense and were playing with legitimate revenge after losing only one B10 game the previous year and that was an upset loss to Purdue. As you would expect, the Buckeyes dominated. At the half they led 42-0 scoring TD's on 6 of their 8 poss as they punted once and were int'd at the PU16. OSU had a 415-47 yd edge. OSU went through the motions in the 2H with backup QB's Joe Bauserman and Kenny Guilton in but still added a TD on a 67/10pl drive with 7:24 left... Rutgers' top WR Mohamed Sanu, who was also the team's leading rusher and operates the team out of the Wildcat offense, only had 1 rush att due to inj. Chas Dodd, in his first true road start hit 8-19-62 with an int and Dion Lewis got on track with 130 yards rushing and 7.6 ypc. Of course RU was playing with a heavy heart for DL Eric LeGrand and we are hopeful that he is able to make a full recovery after his injury vs Army. Pitt had 24-12 FD and 513-203 yd edges. At the half it was 247-93 but RU blocked a punt for a TD to set up the tie. Pitt scored 3 TD's and 2 FG's on their first 5 poss of the 2H to lead 41-14 and RU got a garbage TD with 1:30 left...Ohio only had a 371-343 yd edge vs Miami but had a 6-2 TO edge. MU jumped out to a 7-0 lead but in the 1H would miss FG's of 45 and 25 yards and OU led 13-7 despite MU having a 183-177 yd edge. MU fmb!d early 3Q setting up a 48/1pl TD by OU. Trailing 27-13 MU was int'd at the OU40 then int'd at their own 25. The 2nd set up OU for a 25/5pl TD drive with 3:10 left. MU was SOD at the MU32...Indiana actually had 21-14 FD and 388-289 yd edges. At the half IN had a 227-164 yd edge but a fmb! at their own 23 set Illinois up for a 2pl TD and Indy was also int'd and ret'd 68 yards for a TD and after a 63/12pl drive settled for a 19 yd FG and trailed 27-10 at the half. Ill blk'd 2 Indy punts to open the 3Q and while they fmb!d after the first, they blk'd the 2nd for a safety to lead 29-10. IL closed the scoring with a 66 yd IR TD with :44 left...Penn St was off a loss and off a bye which helped their LB corps get healthier. Minnesota was playing their first game under interim HC Horton and with President Obama scheduled to make an on campus appearance, the home attendance was announced at 48,479. It was smallest crowd in 12 games at TCF Bank Stadium and even appeared smaller than that. PSU QB Rob Bolden who came in with a 2-6 ratio the previous 5, at one point hit 9 straight passes but was inj'd in the 2Q. They bypassed backup Kevin Newsome (flu) for 3rd string Matthew McGloin. McGloin's first pass was a 42 yd TD which made it 21-7. McGloin had an uneven game hitting 6-13-76 and was int'd on the next drive. PSU led 31-14 when UM got a TD with 5:01 left to pull within 12. PSU missed a 37 yd FG and UM did get to the PSU39 where they were SOD on 4&7...It was the Irish's most lopsided loss vs Navy since 1963. It was a Navy home game in an NFL Stadium but ND had a healthy amount of the crowd. ND was playing without their top 2 WR's, Theo Riddick and Michael Floyd and also one game earlier TE Kyle Rudolph was ruled OFY with inj. Two crucial int's and an SOD changed the game. ND on their opening poss had a 4&gl at the 1 but were SOD. Trailing 14-10 they were int'd at their 30 with 1:59 left in the half setting up a Navy 5pl drive with the TD coming with :14 left in the half to lead 21-10. ND was also int'd at the Navy 27 and the Mids went 73/10pl for a TD to lead 35-10. ND was SOD at the Navy29 in the 3Q and Dayne Crist was replaced by Tommy Rees and Rees led a 76/10pl TD drive with 6:12

left. Navy went 37/10pl ending the game at the ND35 and beat the Irish for the 3rd time in 4 years having lost the previous 43...Syracuse RB Delone Carter left the game in the 2Q with injury but backup Antwon Bailey rushed for 94 yds on 19 carries. WV finished with a 286-246 yd edge. WV jumped to leads of 7-3 and 14-10 and then rec'd a fmb!d KO and had a 1st&gl at the SU8 but was int'd at the goal line. Geno Smith came in with a 17-3 ratio completing 68% but hit just 20-37-178 yd with 3 int and 5 sks. He was int'd on the 3rd play setting

up an SU 28 yd FG. His 2nd int cost WV a chance to score and set up SU for a 19 yd FG. Smith was int'd a 3rd time in the 1H and ret'd 48 yds to the WV12 setting up a 22 yd FG. At the half WV had a 185-178 yd edge but trailed 19-14. The 2H was mostly punts and WV's got to the SU20 with plenty of time but Smith took a sack on 2nd & 10 and on 4&22 was sk'd again...Iowa St came in having allowed 52 and 68 points the previous 2 weeks. Texas lost their 2nd game as a big fav this year. After the game HC Paul Rhoads called their first ever win over Texas "historic" and ISU players were jubilant...In the 1H Marshall had a 186-167 yd edge was tied at 10. MU had the ball but were int'd at the EC46 with 3:30 left in the half. EC went 65/7pl for a TD then after another int with :36 left added a 40 yd FG to lead 20-10. EC got a TD and FG to open the 3Q and MU was SOD at the EC11. EC went 89/9pl for a TD to put it away, 37-10...There were some key plays in Iowa's loss to Wisconsin. Iowa had a great situational edge in the fact that UW was off their upset of Ohio St and they were at home. In the 1H Iowa had an xp blk'd and on a 30 yd FG att with 3:13 left in the half, they bobbled the snap and didn't get the kick off. UI led 13-10. The Hawkeyes led 27-24 when they got an int at the UW26 and had a chance to put the game away but settled for a 40 yd FG. UW's P ran up the middle and got a 17 yd run to the 43 as UI peeled back to cover the punt. UW later converted on 4&4 and got a TD with 1:06 left. The final crucial mistake came when UI got a FD at the UW39 with :12 left. The officials stopped the clock to move the chains, UI lined up at the LOS and all they had to do was spike the ball to save their last time-out. Instead, they called their final time-out needing a FG to win. A short pass for a 4 yd gain was tk'd inbounds and without the time-out the clock ran out...Nebraska's Taylor Martinez set a frosh record with 329 yards passing and threw a career high 5 TD's. This came after not having thrown more than 150 yards in his first 6 starts. OSU's Kendall Hunter rushed for 201 yards. Justin Blackmon had 157 yards in rec. In the 1H Oklahoma St actually had a 344-255 yd edge and led 27-24 when Nebraska got a TD with :55 left in the half. The 2H was controlled by NU...Boston College lost 3 defensive starters to inj vs Maryland. TO's also hurt them in the 1H. MD got drives of 38 and 22 yds for TD's following TO's as Antwine Perez had 2 int and a FR and led 21-7 at the half with a 117-110 yd edge. MD led 24-7 after 3Q's. BC got 2 TD's to pull within 24-21. On their final 2 drives they dropped a slant pass on 4&3 at the MD31 and after MD went for it on 4&1 at the BC35 with 1:50 left, BC was spotted inches short on 4&1 with 1:13 left. MD took a knee twice...Clemson had their 3rd crack at the Georgia Tech's option in 2 years and held GT to 242 rush yds, their lowest rush total of the season and about 100 below their season avg. CU controlled matters early as on their first 4 poss they got 2 TD's and settled for a 2 short FG's and missed one and led 17-0. CU led 24-6 when GT converted on 4&2 then on 4&6 got a 9 yd TD pass to make it 24-13. GT missed a FG with 11:04 left and CU went on a 7-36 drive of 64/15pl and settled for a 22 yd FG with 3:28 left to make it 27-13 and GT threw a desperation pass on its next play that was int'd...Colorado QB Tyler Hansen hit 9-10 passes for 62 yds but left with inj. Cody Hawkins still had CU in good shape hitting frosh Paul Richardson with 3 & 60 yd TD passes. Richardson became the first frosh in school history to have 2 TD's rec in the same game. CU led 24-14 but missed a 35 yd FG with 12:49 left and Texas Tech took its first lead of the game with a 36 yd FG with 2:08 left in their 27-24 win...Cam Newton is the clear-cut favorite to win the Heisman Trophy and had a big game vs LSU's excellent D. Auburn had a 526-243 yd edge. LSU was int'd at the AU14 but AU missed a 39 yd FG with 2:45 left 1H and LSU on 3&gl got a 2 yd Jefferson TD run to tie it at 10. Newton may have won the Heisman on a spectacular 49 yd TD run to make it 17-10 but LSU had a RB pass from Spencer Ware to Rueben Randle go 39 yds for a TD with 12:16 left to tie it. Three times LSU's punter pinnned AU at the 1. AU had the ball at their own 30 and with LSU's D keying on Newton, Onterio McCalebb took off 70 yds down the sideline for a TD with 5:05 left...Ark's Ryan Mallett hit 13-24-196 and the game vs Mississippi was delayed by weather twice. Mallett DNR after the 2nd delay. Arkansas had some big plays as they were outFD'd 21-16. Joe Adams got a 97 yd PR TD, the longest in school history, topping the record set by Ken Hatfield who had a 95 yd PR TD vs Tulsa in 1963. Arkansas led 24-3 early 3Q but Mississippi battled back to 24-17. On 2nd & 10, Davis got a 71 yd TD run to make it 31-17. UM got a TD with 9:04 left and UA answered with a TD with 7:15 left, 38-24. UM went 75/7pl but on 3&gl from the 3 fmb!d costing them a shot at the cover. UA punted with 1:06 left and UM got to the UA27 but their final pass was incomplete...UAB had a 24-18 FD edge vs Miss St but there were 6 key plays which cost them the game. The game was tied at 10 at the half but UAB had a 207-103 yd edge. The first key play happened when UAB had a 1st & gl at the 3 but settled for an 18 yd FG. UAB fmb!d the punt at their own 35 setting up an MSU TD early 2Q. MSU was pinned at its 1 when they got a 55 yd punt and illegal blk which changed the field position with UAB taking over at their 26 mid-2Q. In the 3Q UAB trailed 20-17 when they were SOD at the MSU31. UAB got a TD with 10:16 left, 24-23. There was a pers foul on the KO so MSU started at the UA42. The next key play happened when MSU on 4&4 got a 6 yd run for a FD which set up their go-ahead 39 yd FG with 6:53 left. MSU was trying to run the clock taking over with 5:31 left at their own 29 when another key play happened, a 51 yd run by Perkins on 2nd & 14. That set up a 28 yd FG with 1:48 left. UAB still had a shot but fmb!d the KO at their own 33 and on 3&2 MSU got a 10 yd QB run to escape with a 29-24 win.

FRONTDOOR / BACKDOOR COVERS - The situation was great for Northwestern LW but they blew some opportunities. NU controlled the game leading 17-0 but MSU took over with 6:07 left in the half and got a TD with 2:49 left to get back in it, 17-7. In the 3Q MSU had the wind at their back and after NU's 32 yd punt, MSU drove 48/3pl for a TD. NU drove 80/15pl for a TD to lead 24-14 after 3Q's. MSU on 4&6 took a delay pen and on 4&11 with Fitzgerald calling for a punt safe, MSU faked it. Their P's pass was covered by NU's starting CB but he turned to the sidelines as he normally does on punt safes to avoid being hit in the back by the punt. The receiver hauled in a 21 yd pass to the 15 and the Spartans got a TD on the next play. MSU took over with 7:18 left after an NU punt. On 3&4 they gained 14 yds and on 4&1 got an 8 yd pass. The TD came on a tipped pass which was hauled in by Cunningham for a 28-27 lead with 2:00 left. A crucial pers foul on NU made it 1st & 25 so on 4&12 they fired incomplete from their 31. On 3&15 with a FD basically ending the game got a 25 yd TD run by Baker with 1:07 left putting them ahead of the spread for the only time in the game...Idaho dominated New Mexico St in the 1H. They scored on 5 of their first 6 poss and led 31-0, the last score coming with :48 left in the half. NMSU got a 17 yd TD pass with :07 left to make it 31-7 at the half. NMSU did miss a 43 yd FG in the 3Q and with 7:30 left in the game, trailing by 27, were stopped on 4&gl at the 1. NMSU fmbld a punt at their 25 and Idaho got a 47 yd FG for a 37-7 lead and NMS punted with just 1:10 left but Idaho fmbld the punt at their 28 and on 3&10 NMS got a 28 yd TD pass with :19 left for the backdoor

cover... South Carolina had 25-11 FD and 484-250 yd edges vs Vanderbilt but actually trailed 7-0 when they took over with 1:03 left 1H. They went 59/7pl and got a TD on a 15 yd pass with :12 left to tie it at 7. In the 3Q SC went 93/12pl to lead 14-7 then went 56/9pl and had a 26 yd FG blk'd. It was still a one score game when SC took over with 7:34 left at their 28 and on 2nd & 10 they got a 72 yd TD pass to Jeffery to get ahead of the spread, 21-7. VU opted to punt on 4&6 from its own 20 with 5:34 left and its last drive was SOD at the SC48 with 1:25 left after a 5 yd run on 4&10.

MISLEADING FINALS - Florida Atlantic got an 80 yd TD pass to Jean to make it 13-9 and then had a TD in the EZ overturned and settled for a 36 yd FG to lead 16-9 in the 4Q vs Arkansas St. ASU did drive 69/6pl for a TD but then with the score tied at 16, Ark St got a 37 yd IR TD, ret'd a fmb! to the 1 setting up a TD and after an int drove 34/4pl for a TD. Their 3 TD's came with a total of 39 yards offense making their 21 pt win very misleading...It was misleading that BYU and Wyoming put up 45 points. BYU had a 293-173 yd edge. In the 1H WY had 3 plays that gained positive yards and in fact had -18 yds offense in the 1H. Despite their woeful offensive performance, WY had 10 pts as they got a 55 yd IR TD and after recovering a fmb! at the BYU20, lost 7 yards and got a 44 yd FG and only trailed 16-10. WY's P twice used a rugby punts, but hit a WY players in the back and BYU recovered them the WY33 and WY24, the first setting up a TD. BYU finished with a 20-13 FD edge but didn't have the game clinched until late as WY on 4&10 at the BYU25 had a pass batted in the air and caught by an OL for a 6 yd loss.

KEY SELECTIONS

4★ TEXAS over Baylor - Visitor is 10-4 ATS. BU has dropped 12 straight to UT with the avg loss by 39 ppg. LY BU was down 40-0 after 3Q's being held to just 72 yds before a 14 pt/174 yd 4Q. BU covered here in '08 with Griffin at QB (45-21 +27) getting in the backdoor with a 40 yd TD run with 4:58 left. UT has been riding the emotional rollercoaster TY as after the upset win at Neb they returned home to lose to 20' pt dog ISU, 28-21. UT had 25-16 FD and 440-335 yd edges but settled for FG's of 21 and 23 yd when inside ISU's 5, missed a 37 yd FG and Gilbert threw int's at the ISU 20, 27 and 4 and fmbld at the Cyclones 46. Gilbert (#92 NCAA pass eff, 222, 60%, 6-8) has struggled along with an off which has had 11 TO's in their 3 losses. UT is #17 pass eff D allowing just 138 pass ypg (#2 NCAA). BU is bowl eligible for the 1st time S/95 after beating K St 47-42 with a 683-407 yd edge even though they all'd a TD with :15 left to let KSt in the backdoor. QB Griffin (297, 67%, 18-4, 384 rush) is #1 B12 tll off and pass eff. With D's keying in on Griffin RB Finley has exploded for 393 yd (9.8) L/2. UT is looking up at the Bears (who may still be celebrating) in the B12 standings for the 1st time ever.

FORECAST: TEXAS 41 Baylor 20

3★ UCF over E Carolina - UCF is off to its best start S/'98 after its convincing win at home vs Rice LW, a game in which they had substantial edges in both FD's (22-12) and yds (391-229). Despite Marshall having a 186-167 yd edge at HT LW vs EC, the Pirates took control in the 2H in the 27 pt victory (-12). EC did trail 7-0 LY but led 19-7 before all'g a late TD w/1:06 (UCF rec'd onside but was int'd on next play). Both tms hosted BCS foe NCSt with UCF being done in with a -5 TO deficit (308-239 yd edge) and the Pirates prevailing in OT despite blowing a 21-0 lead (496-476 yd edge). While UCF's 1-8 mark vs EC is the worst among any CUSA member, they are on a 15-3 ATS run and have a big edge on the defensive side of the ball (#24-91) all'g them to find some success here as they push for the CUSA East Title. UCF's offense will also come to life against a Pirates defense that has all'd 45 ppg on the road this year.

FORECAST: UCF 34 E Carolina 17

3★ USC over Oregon - USC comes into this meeting fresh off a bye (21-7 ATS) and in the belief that they could very well be undefeated along with UO here as they have lost 2 gms TY on last second FG's (Wash and Stan). In their matchup prior to the bye, USC outgained Cal 602-245 in the 34 pt win (-2). The UO off exploded yet again winning our Thurs Night Marquee vs UCLA posting 582 yds in the 47 pt (-26) victory. In LY's meeting in Eugene, USC suffered its 1st loss by over a TD S/'01 in the 47-20 defeat (-3) as UO put up 613 yds vs an overmatched USC def. While the fav is 7-2 ATS, a vengeful USC squad will be a HD for the 1st time S/'01 and with a 12-6 ATS record vs Top 10 foes, a 4th consec wk of the #1 team in the nation being upset could be in the forecast. Scary stepping in the Ducks way but USC showed their true colors by being tied with Stanford late in the 4Q and dominating Cal.

FORECAST: USC 38 Oregon 37

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Ohio St over MINNESOTA - OSU is 14-6 ATS in the series winning the L/6 by 26 ppg. The visitor is 10-4 ATS. OSU led 38-0 LY and Pryor avg 101 rush ypg (8.7) the L2Y vs UM. OSU is 11-0 SU at Minny (6-1 ATS) but this is their 1st visit to TCF Bank. OSU is 15-7 as an AF (0-2 TY). The Bucks avenged their only 2009 B10 loss LW flattening Purdue. OSU led 42-0 at HT and the Boilers didn't have 100 yds until their last pass (489-118 yd edge). Pryor (#11 NCAA pass eff, 222, 66%, 18-6, 408 rush) left early 3Q as OSU emptied the bench. The Bucks are #11 pass eff D but have just 10 sk (#104 NCAA). UM's Horton has lost his L/17 as a HC incl LW's 33-21 loss to PSU in his debut as the interim HC. The gm's turning point came mid2Q with UM trailing 14-7 as Weber was int'd in the EZ and ret'd 58 yd which set up a next play 42 yd TD pass for the Lions to take a 21-7 lead. Weber (245, 56%, 17-7) became the 5th B10 QB to pass 10,000 career yds and he has found a new #1 WR in McKnight (36, 15.1) who leads the league with 9 TD rec. UM's D is last in the B10 in rush (194, 5.5), scoring (32) and sks (3, last in NCAA) and OSU heads into the bye with momentum.

FORECAST: Ohio St 44 MINNESOTA 13

2★ Troy over ULM - The HT is 6-0 SU and has covered 5 in a row in the series. Troy lost its last trip here in '08 as a last play, 56 yd FG hit the crossbar, giving Troy its only SBC loss in the L/3Y as they are 17-1 SU and 12-6 ATS in SBC gms. Each has played ASU and MT with Troy beating both (35-28, -10', +55 yd vs ASU; 42-13, +3, +312 yd vs MT) and ULM losing both (34-20, +4, -83 yd vs ASU; 38-10, +12, -194 yd vs MT). Troy is off a bye after just getting by UL 31-24 as a 20' pt HF. Troy has the off (#44-112) and def (#83-106) edges. QB Robinson is avg 290 ypg (64%) with a 12-6 ratio, while RB Harris leads with 300 (6.8). ULM QB Browning is avg 216 ypg (62%) with an 8-7 ratio and leads with 210 yds rush (2.1). No team is more rested than the Trojans having played just one game in the last 24 days. ULM pulled come-from-behind wins vs FAU and WKU and while exposed vs MTSt there is still plenty of value here.

FORECAST: Troy 41 ULM 20

2★ NEBRASKA over Missouri - LY MU was in control up 12-0 after 3Q's before a 4Q collapse. QB Gabbert was banged up in 2Q and NU scored 3 TD in 11 plays in just 3:22. Tigers are 1-15 in Lincoln but won its last in '08. The HT is 6-2 SU/ATS but NU is 1-9 ATS as a B12 HF. Into OSU: NU had all'd 21 or fewer pts an NCAA best 14 straight gms until LW's 51-41 shootout win as a 4★ LPS at OK St. After being benched vs UT QB Martinez responded with a career high 323 pass yd and 5 TD. Martinez avg 149 (59%) with a 8-3 ratio and has 870 rush yds (#9 NCAA). NU is #1 NCAA pass eff D with future NFL DC's at CB. MU is off its biggest win in program history knocking off #1 OU for their 1st 7-0 start S/'60. MU ret'd the opening KO 86 yd for a TD and took advantage of 3 Sooners TO's incl an int at the MU 12 and a fmbld at the MU 14 in the win. Despite inj QB Gabbert has been spectacular the L/2 avg 335 ypg (69%) with a 4-0 ratio. Surprisingly the Tigers are #5 NCAA in scoring D (13.1) with their best D player DE Smith returning LW after missing 3 (59 yd IR). Huskers are looking up in the standings at Missou but take out their old B8/B12 foe one last time.

THURSDAY, October 28th

Florida St at NC STATE - LY QB Ponder was not 100% (rib inj early in gm) but down by 4 led a 66/8pt TD drive with 1:36 for the win. FSU has won 3 straight over NCSt after dropping 4 of the prior 6. The key factor was ex-NCSt coach Amato who was an asst at Fla St prior and upset Bowden 4 of 6 yrs then ret'd to FSU as an asst for their win streak. Bowden struggled on these Thurs nite AG's but this is new HC Fisher's 1st shot. Defense was missing LY as the tms totaled 87 pts and 1,093 yds. NCSt is 6-2 as a home dog with 4 outright but FSU has covered their L/2 ACC AG's by 24 ppg.

FRIDAY, October 29th

W Virginia at CONNECTICUT - WV is 6-0 SU (5-1 ATS) vs UC winning by 23 ppg. WV is 13-5 SU/ATS on the BE road. LY UC had a 501-387 yd edge in the 1st gm after DB Howard's death but allowed a 56 yd Devine TD run w/2:10 left and lost 24-28 (+7). LW we went against UC and won a 3★ LPS on L'Ville (-3), a 26-0 winner. UC QB Box made his 1st career start LW (Endres dismissed) and hit just 4-12 for 35 yds with 1 int but gave way to Frazer (6-8, 52 yds) who started the 1st 4 gm. Two of the top RB's in the BE face off in UC's Todman (841, 6.0) and WV's Devine (626, 4.9). WV is off a 19-14 upset loss to Syr in which QB Smith (219 ypg, 66%, 15-5) was sk'd 5x and threw 3 int, the worst gm of his career. UC is 9-2 as a HD, but WV's #19 D is the best they've faced so far.

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SATURDAY, October 30th

CINCINNATI 34 Syracuse 20 - UC is 4-1 ATS (5-0 SU) vs SU and the only time they failed to cover was last time hosting the Orange as a 21' pt HF (won by 20). UC has won by 14+ the L/4Y vs SU. Syr has won just 3 BE road gms the L5Y (3-16) but has now won 2 in a row incl LW's 19-14 upset of WV. Syr had a 3-1 TO edge LW and settled for 4 FG's as top RB Carter (637, 5.3) left late 2Q with a bruised hip (CS). SU QB Nassib is avg 183 ypg (55%) with a 12-4 ratio. UC is off an upset loss to USF (38-30) but we had a Fri Nite Marquee Winner on the Over. UC's streak of 13 str BE wins ended as well as a streak of 14 str wins at Nippert Stadium despite 29-13 FD and 590-378 yd edges. UC QB Collaros (274 ypg, 62%, 20-4) suffered a leg inj late LW (CS).

SOUTHERN MISS 34 Uab 27 - SM is 9-1 SU (5-2 ATS run) in the series but lost outright LY as a 9' pt AF on a Thur Night (w/o QB Davis, RB Fletcher and WR Brown but still had a 345-245 yd edge). The Blazers have never won in Hattiesburg and come in to this matchup off their 2nd near upset of an SEC school TY as they had 24-18 FD edge (-24 yds), but fell short to Miss St 29-24 (UAB led in 4Q). A big issue for UAB so far TY is 1H scoring as they have put up just 52 pts through 7 gms (7 ppg) while SM has jumped out to some big leads TY incl 2 wks ago vs EC when they were up 20-0. The Eagles actually dropped that meeting with the Pirates for their 1st conf home loss S/'08 moving their CUSA ATS HG run to 6-2. They are off a bye here and have scored 40+ pts in each of their L/3 gms giving them the upper hand in this one.

ILLINOIS 27 Purdue 10 - LY the Illini scored a TD mid-3Q vs PU to cut it to 7, but in their L/5 drives they mustered just 42 yds on 26 plays. IL has now lost a series high 5 straight to Purdue each by 8+ pts and PU has a 138 ypg edge the L/6. These tms come in from opposite ends of the spectrum as IL beat Indy 43-13 in a misleading final as the Illini had IR TD's of 68 and 65 yds and 2 blk'd P's incl 1 for a safety despite being outgained 388-289 and outFD'd 21-14 as the Hoosiers were -4 TO's. IL QB Sheelhaase (129, 59%, 6-7, 333 rush) has yet to pass for over 151 yd vs an FBS tm TY in the run gm led by Leshoure (757, 5.3) has been enough. Vastly improved IL D is allowing 112 rush ypg (3.5) and just 17.7 ppg. The Boilers were ambushed in Columbus as the revenge minded Bucks DOMINATED the 1H leading 42-0 with a 415-47 yd edge. QB Henry (102, 52%, 2-4 ratio, 282 rush in L/4) lost his 1st gm as a starter. Boilers allow 132 rush ypg (3.5). IL is 3-9 ATS off a SU win but PU is in the 2nd gm of a B2B road trip.

Miami, FI 34 VIRGINIA 13 - The L/2Y UM has outgained UVA by a comb 496 yds. LY UM revenged its prev home game vs UVA (Orange Bowl finale) with a 52-17 blowout and the HT is 2-4 ATS. The 35 pt win LY was UM's biggest in ACC play S/'05. LW UM scored 30 straight to put UNC down 33-10, finishing with 26-10 FD and 442-289 yd edges and beating former HC Davis for the 1st time since at UNC. RB Berry (648 yd, 4.9) ran for his 4th str 100 yd gm and QB Harris (232 ypg, 54%, 14-10 ratio, but only 1 int L/2) moved in to 2nd place for career TD. Miami has huge edges on off (#30-84) and D (#1-77) and its #3 pass eff D is all'g just 150 ypg (50%) with a 12-10 ratio. LW UVA got 3 big plays: a 70 yd KR TD, a 56 yd TD pass from the P and an int ret'd to the 15 (TD repl later) to go up 45-21 early 4Q in their 48-21 win over EM. It was UVA's 1st win over an FBS foe TY and they finished with 22-15 FD and 451-354 yd edges but did allow an EM RB to run for his 1st 100 yd gm. QB Verica avg 213 ypg (58%) with an 8-6 ratio but has a 1-5 ratio vs ACC foes. UVA's D has struggled vs ACC competition all'g 490 ypg in their 3 matchups (0-3 SU/ATS).

PITTSBURGH 34 Louisville 20 - The visitor and the Cardinals are 7-2 ATS in this series but UL has dropped B2B gms being outscored in each by 25+ pts. UL QB Froman made his 1st career start LY vs Pitt (18-30-166, 0-0 ratio). UL is 5-12-1 ATS in BE road games. Pitt was tied 14-14 with Rutgers at the half LW, but went on to a 41-21 win with a 513-203 yd edge. RB Lewis (414, 4.5) had his 1st 100 yd gm of the yr LW and teams with Graham (645, 7.6). Pitt QB Sunseri is avg 221 ypg (67%) with a 12-4 ratio. UL was a 3★ LPS Winner for us LW with their 26-0 shutout (2nd shutout in 3 wks) of UL. UL held Conn RB Todman to a ssn low 80 yds and finished with a 355-195 yd edge. QB Froman is avg 222 ypg (61%) with an 11-4 ratio and RB Powell has 1,003 (7.1). Pitt is 4-1 as a BE HF while UL is 1-5-1 as a BE AD. With WV's loss LW, Pitt is in the driver's seat for the BE Title and they only have a bye on deck, but UL is playing better than expected under new HC Strong.

IOWA 30 Michigan 21 - The L/3 have come down to the final seconds incl LY's last play 48gl 7 yd TD pass by Iowa to stay undefeated for their 1st win in Spartan Stadium S/'95. Sixteen of the L/22 series matchups have been decided by 7 or less. Iowa has pulled the upset in 2 of the L/3Y and has covered L/4. The HT is 9-1 SU but the dog is 16-4 ATS. Iowa must bounce back from LW's disappointing 31-30 loss to rival Wisky as the Badgers got a 17 yd run on a fake P on 4&4 at their own 26 with 5:54 left to spark a 80/15pt TD drive scoring with 1:01 left. Iowa drove to the UW35 but failed to get OOB on the last play to all'g gm winning FG. QB Stanzani (247, 68%, 16-2) is #2 NCAA pass eff. RB Robinson (737, 4.9) is #18 NCAA rushing. Iowa was leading the NCAA in total D before allowing 435 ypg and 29.5 ppg L/2. MSU's 8-0 start is their best S/'66 as they rallied from a 17-0 deficit to beat NW thanks to their own fake P 21 yd pass on 4&11 at the NW36. The Cats also fmbld at 1&gl at the MSU1 in the 1H although MSU had a 457-385 yd edge. Underrated QB Cousins (244, 67%, 14-4) is #12 NCAA pass eff. RB duo of Baker (779, 6.8) and Bell (574, 6.5) have been slowed L/2 with a combined 121 yd (3.4). MSU has 20 TO's after having 14 all of LY. The Hawks are 8-1 ATS off a SU loss and bring the Spartans back down to earth.

Northwestern 31 INDIANA 27 - LY NU had the biggest comeback in school history scoring 26 unanswered after being down 28-3 mid-2Q capped by a 19 yd FG with :21 left to stun Indy. The HT is 8-1 SU and the L/6 have been decided by 4 ppg. NW is 6-16 ATS as a B10 fav (0-2 TY) and the dog is 6-1 ATS. Indy is off a misleading 43-13 loss at IL as the sloppy Hoosiers (388-289 yd and 21-14 FD edges) lost 5 TO's incl 2 IR TD and also had 2 P's blk'd incl 1 for a safety. B10's #1 passer QB Chappell (305, 66%, 17-6) has struggled on the conf road avg 190 (57%) with a 1-5 ratio thanks to a banged up OL and minus top RB Willis (OFY). IU is #112 pass eff D. NW led MSU 17-0 last week but couldn't seal the deal as the Cats fmbld away the ball away at 1&gl at the 1H and leading 24-14 early 4Q all'd 21 yd fake P pass for a FD as the Spartans outgained the Cats 264-106 in the 2H. QB Persa (#8 NCAA pass eff w/ 264, 76%, 10-3, 341 rush) accounts for 75% of the Cats offense and 67% of their TD's. NW is #31 pass eff D. The dog in NW gms is 17-3 ATS but Fitzgerald's tm is 6-2 ATS off a SU loss.

Clemson 20 BOSTON COLLEGE 17 - We won our Sept 5★ GOM with Clem over BC LY, 26-7. QB Tuggle was held to 4-20 pass and the team was held to 54 tll yds in a gm that lasted almost 5 hrs due to 2 lightning delays. Clemson is 2-0 SU/ATS under Swinney vs BC. LW BC battled back from a 24-7 3Q deficit but was SOD on their L/2 poss and fell 24-21 to MD despite 16-13 FD and 285-222 yd edges. The Eagles were -3 TO's and MD scored 2x's off those. True frosh QB Rettig hit 18-33 for 189 but had a 1-2 ratio. He has thrown for 284 yds (47%) in his 2 full gms as the str. RB Harris did put up 116 yds and now leads with 694 (4.7) and has all 3 of BC's rush TD's. He became the 1st Jr at BC (4th overall) with 3,000 career rush yds. They did lose 3 D str's vs MD (CS). CU snapped a 4 gm losing streak to GT with a 27-13 win LW as a 4★ winner on these pages. RB Ellington (642, 6.3, 10 TD) rushed for a career-high 166 and the CU D held GT 100 yds below their rush avg. After struggling for just 93 ypg vs UNC and MD, Clemson put 236 (6.2) on GT LW but now runs into a BC run D all'g just 86 ypg (2.6). Keep in mind, the dog in this series is on a 4-1 ATS run.

MARYLAND 34 Wake Forest 24 - MD was down 35-10 at HT LY and 42-17 after 3Q's vs WF as they gained 54% of their yds in the 4Q. The Terps are 1-3 vs WF but pulled a shutout in WF's last visit. LV MD built a 24-7 3Q lead and fought off a late BC rally in a 24-21 win despite being outFD'd 16-13 and outgained 285-222. SS Perez had a career day with 2 int and a FR helping the D hold BC to just 285 yds. QB O'Brien has assumed the starting role (Robinson will run option) and avg 196 ypg (56%) with a 9-3 ratio. MD won its first conf AG S/08 and snapped a 10 gm reg ssn road losing streak. MD is 10-2 ATS vs WF. WF is off a bye (4-8-1 ATS after bye) after a 52-21 loss to VT 2W ago. With his 241 yd performance vs the Hokies, RB Harris now leads with 430 (6.8). They have rotated thru QB's (inj's) and Price (723 yd, 54%, 6-3 ratio) and Jones (108, 50%, 0-0) comb to hit just 4-17 for 92 vs VT. The top rec, Givens has just 20 grabs but an outstanding 18.3 ypc. Entering TY, HC Fridge was one of the hottest seats after a 2-10 record LY, but his MD squad is just 1 win away from bowl elig and the HT has covered the L/2.

W MICHIGAN 27 N Illinois 24 - LY NI forced 4 WM TO's to help snap a 3 gm series losing streak winning 38-3 (-6). NI is 6-3 vs WM (avg win by 22 ppg and avg loss by 3 ppg). The HT is 8-3 ATS and WM is 3-1 SU vs NI but 1-3 ATS incl the last time here when WM led 29-19 but NI (+6) got a TD with :43 left for the cover. NI has the off edge (#50-78) and def edge (#60-84). We won a 4★ Small College Play on NI, as they beat CM 33-7 with a 10 pt HF and won a 3★ Small College Play on WM as they beat Akron 56-10 as a 7* pt AF with a 519-274 yd edge. NI beat Akron 50-14 as a 13* pt AF with a 520-257 yd edge. WM QB Carder is avg 277 ypg (62%) with a 15-9 ratio with 152 yds rush (2.9), while RB Winchester leads with just 201 (2.9). NI QB Harnish is avg 153 ypg (67%) with a 10-3 ratio with 526 yds rush (6.4), while RB Spann leads the MAC with 854 (5.3, 11 TD). NI is avg 5.7 ypc rushing while WM is allowing 4.6 ypc. WM has rival CM on deck while NI has a showdown with Toledo (only other undefeated tm in MAC play) on deck.

SOUTH CAROLINA 34 Tennessee 13 - LY UT turned 3 SC fumbles into TD's for a 31-13 win over #21 SC. While SC is just 2-5 SU they have outgained the Vols in each. The visitor is 10-2-1 ATS. Last time here SC was -6 and rolled to a 27-6 win. UT is off a 41-10 loss to AL in which they only trailed 13-10 at the half. UT RB Poole became the 1st RB to rush for 100+ yds on Bama's D since '07 with 117 LW (595, 5.5). QB Simms is avg 179 ypg (57%) with a 7-5 ratio. UT is 0-4 in the SEC and avg just 13.8 ppg, 271 ypg in SEC play. SC has had trouble putting teams away which led to their loss to UK 2 wks ago, and LW they were tied 7-7 at the half with Vandy but went on to a 21-7 win. SC RB Lattimore (538, 4.4) missed LW's gm with an ankle inj (CS). QB Garcia is avg 240 ypg (72%) with a 12-6 ratio and WR Jeffery leads the SEC with 49 (17.3). Spurrier's 18 pt loss to the Vols LY was the largest ever for him which makes this a legitimate revenge situation. UT is 0-4 as a DD dog TY and their lack of depth will show especially in the 2H.

ARKANSAS 38 Vanderbilt 17 - The last meeting was a 21-19 win by Ark (-5) in '06 in Nashville. Vandy has covered the last 2 they were decided by 2 and 4 pts. Ark has huge edges on off (#6-96), def (#34-73), but VU has the ST edge (#54-96). Ark is off its first win over former HC Nutt 38-24. UA RB Davis (407, 7.2) rushed for career-highs of 176 yds and 3 TD and QB Mallett (291 ypg, 67%, 15-7) ret'd from a concussion LW, but left in the 2H with an inj to his throwing shoulder (CS). Ark was outgained 512-464. Vandy is 9-3-1 ATS as an AD. At home LW they were tied 7-7 at the half with SC but were shutout in the 2H and SC won 21-7. VU QB Smith is avg just 144 ypg (52%, 5-4) and top rusher Norman has 395 (6.0). VU is #78 in our pass D rankings which means that Mallett could have a big week, but Ark needs to stay focused off their win over Ole Miss with ranked SC on deck.

MISS ST 30 Kentucky 23 - LY UK led 14-3 early but MSU RB Dixon set a school record with 252 rush yds (7.6) as MSU had a ssn high 493 yds and pulled out a 31-24 win (UK 308 yds). The visitor has won and covered the L/4 in this series (L/3 and 4 of 5 were upsets). We won a rare 5★ LPS on GA LW going against UK and the Bulldogs (-4) delivered a 44-31 win. GA conv 4 QB TO's into 17 pts and UK outgained GA 423-290 despite missing RB Locke (574, 5.3, out L/2, CS). QB Hartline is avg 268 ypg (67%) with a 17-4 ratio UK's #61 D is all g 4.7 ypc and the comparison of MSU's OL to UK's DL strongly favors MSU. MSU came out flat LW off their big win over UF but got past UAB 29-24 to clinch a bowl for the 1st time since '07. MSU QB Relf is only avg 102 ypg (55%) with a 6-3 ratio but has 428 rush (4.0). UK has come from behind in each of their L/4 but only has 1 win in that span. MSU is 6-2 ATS prior to a bye but only 2-9 ATS as a HF.

Auburn 37 MISSISSIPPI 30 - LY Aub got a 29 yd IR TD and had an int at the goal line to end UM's final chance to give Aub a 33-20 win ending a 3 gm losing streak. Aub OC Malzahng got some payback against his former boss Nutt who decided his off wouldn't work in the SEC (Ark OC in '06). UM is 4-23 vs AU and UM has been outgained in 10 str gms. Aub is now 1-7 ATS in this series and 1-4 ATS as an SEC AF. AU is off a 24-17 win over LSU to survive as the SEC's only undefeated tm. Aub rushed for 440 yds, the most ever by Aub vs another SEC tm. QB Newton is now the Heisman frontrunner avg 171 (65%) with a 13-5 ratio with 1,077 rush yds (6.9). UM is off Nutt's 1st loss to his former tm Ark 38-24 with QB Masoli having 425 tll yds (avg 180 ypg, 57%, 10-6, 400 rush, 5.3). Nutt is 8-0 ATS vs Top 10 tms and has upset #2, #1 (twice), #4 outright in that span. AU's playing for a 9th str wk while UM had a bye 3 wks ago.

IOWA ST 34 Kansas 24 - The visitor is 4-14-1 ATS but has covered the L/3. KU had a ssn high 34 FD and a B12 high 551 yds LY but escaped with a win as ISU missed a wide open WR in the EZ on its final drive (1:00 left) as KU won their 5th straight in the series. ISU had a 20-0 HT lead only to lose by 2 in '08. KU has been outscored 159-24 in B12 play, has just 6 sk (1 from DL) and has forced an NCAA worst 4 TO. The Jayhawks trailed A&M just 17-10 but roughing the passer gave the Ags a FD at the 50 and led to a TD. QB Webb was also int'd in the EZ and ret'd 83 yd to set up the Ags' next TD and the rout was on. Webb (shoulder) left the gm after the pick and opening day starter Pick (7-12 40 yd) left in the 4Q (concussion) so KU burned the JC Mecham's RS. After being rolled in their L/2 by a combined 120-27 ISU capitalized on UT's mistakes to get their 1st win over the Horns. UT QB Gilbert threw int's at the ISU 20, 27 and 4 and also fmb'l'd at the Cyclones 46 and almost threw 3 more picks as the Cyclones jumped out to a 28-6 3Q lead and held on. QB Arnaud (150, 57%, 10-8) has struggled but the now 100% Robinson (608, 5.1) had the most rush yds vs UT this yr (120). Both have struggling QB's and the B12's 2 worst D's but ISU has played a much tougher sked (#4-59) and needs this to get back into the bowl hunt.

TEMPLE 38 Akron 10 - UA is 0-3 SU/ATS vs TU (36-14 avg score) being outgained by 91 ypg. LY UA led 17-7 before 49 unanswered by the Owls. UA is 3-15 SU in MAC road gms with 8 straight losses by an avg of 16 ppg. TU QB Gerardi (PS#173) in his first start (vs Buff) threw for 131 (60%) with a 3-2 ratio but led the Owls to a 42-0 romp (-7) over the Bulls with a 397-161 yd edge. He replaced QB Stewart who was avg just 105 ypg (53%) with a 4-5 ratio. TU's off is led by RB's Brown (613, 5.5) and Pierce (561, 5.2). UA QB Nicely is avg 131 ypg (48%) with a 3-8 ratio. The Zips off is led by RB's Allen (450, 4.5) and Burney (414, 4.5). TU has the off (#85-120) and def edges (#53-119) but is just 2-4 ATS as a DD fav incl their last home gm (beat BG 28-27 as a 20 pt HF).

KENT ST 24 Ball ST 17 - Ball ST is 15-5 SU/ATS in MAC road gms and is 5-2-1 ATS vs Kent ST. Last met in '08 (Ball HF -22, 41-20). BS has won 6 straight in Kent. Both teams blew early leads vs Toledo this ssn. KS led UT 21-7 at half but fell 34-21 as a 3* pt AD being outgained 396-275. Ball ST led UT 17-0 after 1Q but UT scored 31 straight before BS got the backdoor cover with a TD with :12 left (lost 31-24 as an 11* pt AD) and were outgained 446-357. KS rebounded to beat BG 30-6 as a 2 pt AF with a 351-135 yd edge. While both offenses are in our bottom 11, KS has a huge def edge (#38-112). KS QB Keith is avg 193 ypg (60%) with a 7-8 ratio, while RB Terry leads with 423 (3.4). BS QB's are avg 131 ypg (53%) with an 11-9 ratio while RB Williams leads with 425 (5.3). BS is avg 171 ypg rush (4.6) but KS is allowing just 65 ypg rush (2.0).

San Diego ST 34 WYOMING 17 - The home tm is 6-2-1 ATS but SDST is 8-4-1 ATS in the series. LTH WY (-5) won 35-10. Tough loss for SDST LY as they led 27-6 but WY drove for the GW GF w/:23 left & Lindley's Hail Mary fell inc. LW WY was down 16-0 after 1Q vs BYU. They pulled within 25-20 w/6:50 left and forced a BYU 3&out. QB Carter-Samuels (142 ypg, 63%, 5-5) drove WY to the BYU25 but his L/4 passes were broken up as WY was outFD'd 20-13 and outgained 298-173. SDST is off a 30-20 win over NM finishing with 22-16 FD and 384-303 yd edges and winning its 2nd of B2B AG's for the 1st time S/911. The off looked out of sorts with Lindley (270 ypg, 54%, 12-5) overthrowing 2 likely TD and the WR's being plagued by drops as Sampson (7 rec, 2 TD LW) had at least 3 alone. RB Hillman (819, 6.2, 11 TD) went out mid-3Q (hip, CS). WY's off avg just 197 yds in MWC play and now runs into a Rocky Long D that has LY's loss on its mind.

NOTRE DAME 44 Tulsa 38 - 1st meeting. TU has dropped 17 consec gms at BCS schools (5-15-1 ATS run) incl being outscored by a 110-28 clip over their L/2 (Okla +18 and Okla St +7). TU does have a much improved OL as they led CUSA in rush ypg (222, 5.4) while all'g just 9 sks through 7 gms (all'd 46 LY, 118th in NCAA). ND is 23-3 SU vs current CUSA tms with their last SU loss coming in '84 (SMU in Aloha Bowl). ND lost to Navy for the 3rd time in 4 yrs LW but this time Navy (just 2 passes in gm) made it look easy as they handed the Irish their most lopsided loss in this series S/63 (ND w/o WR's Floyd and Riddick, 1030 rec yds TY). While TU HC Graham is 1-5 ATS as an AD, they are fresh off a bye (5-1 ATS under Graham). On the opposite side this is ND's 9th straight gm (Irish 7-23 ATS wk prior to a bye) giving a potent TU offense a chance to keep this one close in South Bend.

MARSHALL 30 Utep 24 - With UTEP and MU being 1,600 miles away from each other there is no surprise that the HT is a perfect 3-0 SU/ATS with the avg MOV being 29 ppg. While MU had a 186-167 yd edge at HT LW vs EC, the Herd fell apart in the 2H as they were outscored 17-0 in the final 2 frames. Despite having the easiest sked in all of IA, UTEP has now stumbled for 2 consec wks at UAB and now at home to Tulane! While some of this could have been due to QB Vittatore playing on a bad ankle (102 yds, 48%, 1-2 ratio), the once stingy Miner D gave up 461 yds to a TU tm avg 328 coming in. LY MU only trailed 20-14 at half but all'd 5 TD drives of 80+ yds in the 52-21 (+2) defeat. While MU has struggled to move the ball on the ground over the L/3 wks (61 ypg, 2.5).

Smu 37 TULANE 30 - The HT has covered the L/2 outgaining the visitor by 127 ypg. LY TU rallied from a 17-7 HT deficit to lead 21-20 in the 4Q but all'd a TD w/5:23 left (L/2 drives ended on SOD and fmb'l). SMU's lead in the CUSA West diminished LW vs UH as SMU took a 25 pt loss despite having a 445-397 yd edge. TU's off has come together over the L/2 wks avg 494 yds for those contests after just 288 thru the 1st 5. While they were unable to beat Tulsa with the newly found off 2 wks ago (def all'd 538), they outgained UTEP 461-286 LW in the upset win in El Paso. The Wave is 3-10 ATS hosting CUSA West Div foes and just 6-13-1 as a HD but SMU has been a conf AF just once (TY vs Rice, did not cover) in the L/4Y.

C MICHIGAN 30 Bowling Green 24 - CM has covered 8 of the L/10 in this series. The Falcons have won 5 of the L/7 but are 2-5 ATS while CM has won the L/2 SU/ATS (in '06, '09). LY BG held CM's off in check most of the day and trailed just 14-10 at HT, but the Falcons squandered 4 trips inside the Chips' RZ (missed FG, int, fmb'l and SOD) resulting in a 24-10 loss (+9). BG entered the ssn knowing it would experience some growing pains, but LW it was very evident as BG didn't record 100 tll yd till the 4Q (135 for the gm) and was held to -10 rush yd in a 30-6 (-2) loss to KSU. From '06-'09, CM won 3 MAC titles, made 4 bowl trips and went a comb 30-4 vs MAC foes! The Chips find themselves in uncharted waters having already lost 4 MAC gms TY foll'g a 33-7 loss (+10) at NI LW. BG is 8-2 as an AD, but the Chips have covered 4 of the L/5. These are two of the winningest programs in MAC history but both teams have fallen on hard times TY as they both come into this one having lost 5 consec gms. Look for CM to snap their losing streak and keep BG reeling.

WASHINGTON 31 Stanford 30 - After going 1-15 vs the Huskies, Stanford has won 4 of 5 incl B2B upsets in Seattle. The HT is 9-5 ATS and LY on the Farm Stanford caught UW off its big upset of USC and had a 424-290 yd edge (34-14, -8) but both coaches agreed it was closer than the final. The Huskies continued their every other wk streak of dismal performances LW in Tucson as they were outgained 467-290 in the 30 pt defeat (-7). The Cardinal returned from bye LW at home vs WSU and while the score showed a 10 pt win for SU, WSU scored 21 meaningless pts in the 4Q incl the L/2 drives with SU's bkups in. While both tms knocked off USC on last second FG's, UW's may have been more impressive as it came on the road giving them their only win away from Husky Stadium in 14 tries. This should be the Huskies' week to put together a good outing. UW has the experience of playing the 2nd toughest sked in the nation giving them confidence here.

† Georgia 21 Florida 20 - Jacksonville. FL is 10-2 SU in this series and the team off a bye is 13-2 SU and 9-5-1 ATS (UF had bye advantage 13x in that span). GA was off a bye LY and broke out black helmets and pants but FL (-14) won 41-17 for their 17th win in the L/20 in this rivalry. UF is 15-1 (10-5-1 ATS) vs the "Big 3" (Tenn, UGA, FSU) under Meyer. The L/2Y UF has outscored GA by 60 pts but only outgained them by 63 yds. UGA has lost 3 in a row for the 1st time under Meyer but luckily had a bye to regroup (Meyer 9-2-1 ATS off bye). QB Brantley hasn't been a good fit for the off and is only avg 181 ypg (62%) with a 6-5 ratio. Top rusher Demps (450, 6.5) has been banged up but WR Rainey has been reinstated for this gm. After GA's 4 gm losing streak, GA has now won and covered 3 in a row including LW's 44-31 win over UK which delivered a 5★ LPS Winner for us. RB Ealey (526, 5.0) rushed for 4 TD before leaving late in the gm with inj (CS) but #2 RB King (228, 5.2) will be reinstated after 2 gm susp. QB Murray is avg 221 ypg (63%) with a 12-3 ratio.

Arizona 27 UCLA 13 - Both tms come into the Rose Bowl with questions at QB as the Bruins were w/o Prince LW vs Oregon (knee surg, out TW) while the Wildcats are missing Foles (267 ypg, 75%) who is expected to miss again here (knee, CS). With bkup QB Brehaut (159, 70%, 0-1 ratio), the Bruins had no answer for the speedy Ducks as they were outgained 582-290 in the 47 pt loss (+26). Arizona found success with their bkup on the other hand as QB Scott passed for 233 yds (82%) with a 2-0 ratio while rushing for 65 (9.3). The Wildcats have won 4 of the L/5 vs UCLA incl LY, a game in which AZ overcame 5 TO's to pull out the 14 pt victory (27-10 FD and 456-211 yd edges). The visitor is 1-6 ATS in the series and while the Cats have struggled in road trips to the state of CA going just 4-8 ATS, they are certainly in better hands than UCLA with their #2 QB.

KANSAS ST 42 Oklahoma ST 41 - Under Snyder KSU is 9-3-1 ATS (10-3 SU) in the series. In the last meeting in '07 OSU won 41-39 but failed to cover as a 2* AF. KSt got a 2 pt conv to lead with 1:10 left but OSU got a 26 yd FG with :02 left. The HT is 4-0 SU. KSU has gone 5-2 ATS w/a combined avg tll of 75 ppg. KSt (+6) rallied from a 47-28 4Q deficit but could not keep up with Baylor losing 47-42 as the Bears had a 683-407 yd edge. Surprisingly KSt QB Coffman (164, 66%, 8-4) is #4 B12 pass eff ahead of OU's Jones and MU's Gabbert thanks to NFL caliber RB Thomas (895, 5.4). KSt is #29 pass eff D but was shredded by BU's version of the Air Raid offense LW. OSU suffered their 1st loss TY to old nemesis Neb 51-41 as the D was filled by Martinez's for 435 tll yd and 5 TD as we had a LPS on the Huskers. OSU's triplets continue to put up big numbers: QB Weeden (#2 B12 pass eff, 321, 67%, 21-9), RB Hunter (#3 NCAA 1031, 6.4) and WR Blackmon (#1 NCAA w/ 1112, 17.9, 14 TD). OSU is 17-9-1 off a SU loss under Gundy and 8-3 ATS as an AF but KSt is 4-1 off a SU loss under Snyder the L/2Y with bounce backs by 87 and 100 pts.

OKLAHOMA 45 Colorado 10 - In the last gm in '07 in Boulder CU pulled the outright upset 27-24 (+23) catching OU looking ahead to Texas. OU led 24-7 in the 3Q but CU rallied and got a 45 yd FG on the last play. OU is 2-5 SU hosting CU but is 3-0 ATS S/95. LY CU faced two Top 15 tms on the road and led both at half (2-0 ATS). OU became the latest victim of the #1 jinx as the Sooners all'd an 86 yd KR TD and turned the ball over twice inside the MO 15 while also missing a 30 yd FG in a 36-27 loss in Columbia. QB Jones is avg 299 (67%) with a 17-5 ratio and his fav target is WR Broyles (69, 11.7). RB Murray has 714 yd (4.4). Sooners are allowing 151 rush ypg (4.1). CU blew a 24-14 3Q lead as QB Hansen was inj'd in the 1H and was replaced by Hawkins (22-43 for 274 with 2-0 ratio). With a 24-17 4Q lead Hawkins drove 63/10pt but the Buffs missed a 35 yd FG and the Raiders drove 75/7p for a TD and 34/6p for the gm winning FG as CU went 3 and out. Hansen is not expected to return for this. CU is #73 pass eff D. OU is 15-7 ATS off a SU loss under Stoops and pounds the Buffs who have lost their L/15 (5-10 ATS) outside of the state of Colorado.

BUFFALO 23 Miami, Oh 20 - After opening up the series vs UB with 10 straight wins, Buffalo has dropped B2B games. Buffalo has covered 4 straight in this series and the home team is 5-2 ATS. Miami has a Thurs Nite game on deck while Miami has a bye. LY UB won 42-17 (-4). Miami entered LW 3-0 SU (2-1 ATS) in MAC play but ran into a surging Ohio tm and lost 34-13 as a 3 pt HD. MU was only outgained 371-343 but was -4 TO. UB fumbled the opening kickoff vs Temple and never recovered as they were outgained 397-161 and lost 42-0 as a 7 pt HD. True frosh QB Zordich (PS#217) made his first start throwing for just 98 yds (42%) with an 0-3 ratio. MU QB Dysert is avg 244 ypg (64.5%) but has only had a 10-10 ratio after tossing 4 LW while getting sacked 5 times. While it's easy to dismiss a Bulls squad that has been outgained by 191 and 236 yds the L/2 games, that came vs 2 of the MAC's top teams (NI & Temp). The situation favors UB at home for a second straight game vs a Miami squad on the road for the 3rd time in 4 weeks.

4★ SAN DIEGO over Tennessee - SD went into TEN LY on Christmas and thumped the Titans 42-17 as 3 pt AD. After punting on its first drive SD scored on 6 of its next 7 with a kneel down at the half. The Chargers logged 30-17 FD and 425-270 yd edges with RB Johnson earning 142 yds (6.8) of that. SD has a huge stat edge with the #1 and #1 units (-7 TO's) vs TEN's #23 and #15 units (+5 TO's). TEN had a slow 1H vs PHI being outgained by 105 yds but took advantage of PHI keying on RB Johnson (66 yds 2.8) in the 2H. TEN logged a 236-129 yd edge scoring 27 pts in the 4Q knocking Kolb back to the bench after the bye. TEN's defense has been chewed up on the road allowing 143 more yds, 18 more ypg rush yds (4.8 vs 3.5) and a 3-8 ratio (4-4 at home). They beat DAL and NYG teams who self destructed with penalties and KO'd a listless JAX team with QB issues. SD was very depleted in the receiving game LW and played NE to a standstill with a 363-179 yd edge. SD turned the ball over 4 times which NE converted into 10 pts for the difference. It's unknown if SD will get WR's Floyd or Naanee back (Gates 50 yds 12.5 LW) but SD spread the ball to 10 different receivers LW. At 2-5 SD is a much more desperate team will be getting good line value vs a TEN team that rallied behind Collins at home (Young - high ankle sprain) that now comes cross country looking ahead to a bye.

FORECAST: SAN DIEGO 31 Tennessee 17

3★ ARIZONA over Tampa Bay - This is only the 3rd meeting since realignment. These are bottom barrel statistical teams with ARZ's #32 and #27 units (-7 TO's) vs TB's #22 and #22 units (+6 TO's). Despite LW's loss to SEA the Cardinals are starting to show an up arrow while the Bucs are showing a down arrow. ARZ has been hampered by poor QB play and Hall may not play here after with Anderson coming off the bench. After being slowed by a knee injury, Wells combined with Hightower for 113 yds (5.7). Fitzgerald (17 rec 10.5 L3) is starting to round into form, #2 WR Breaston was a game time decision but should play with #3 WR Doucet (2 rec 16.5) playing LW. TB was in a great situation LW getting a young dome team on the road in the heat and humidity (90° heat index) off a huge upset win. The Bucs have been a nice surprise TY thanks to solid play by QB Freeman (210 ypg 59% 7-3) but are starting to be found out. TB struggles to run the ball (22nd) at 97 ypg (4.0), are 31st vs the run (158 ypg 5.3) and have just 5 sacks TY (32nd) with 1 sack per 36 att. We recognize the risk of TB with a possible backdoor cover here as 5 of Freeman's 7 wins have been 4Q comebacks. TB has had the benefit of 2 HG's to try and mask the loss of Ctr Faine but ARZ will be keying in on the backup here. LW's results gives solid line value here so we'll side with a more experienced overall home team vs a very young TB team here.

FORECAST: ARIZONA 24 Tampa Bay 16

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ ST LOUIS over Carolina - The Rams have dropped the L/3 meetings being outscored 62-20 and in their L/meeting here (2007) were outgained 387-238 including 186-76 rushing. Interesting dynamic with the Panthers getting their first win of the year LW after trailing 20-13 in the 4Q while STL was looking for just their 3rd road win in 3 yrs (now 2-19 SU L/21) but blew a 17-6 lead in the 1st pt loss to TB. After throwing for 308 yds (68%) with a 2-1 ratio LW it looks like the Panthers will go with QB Moore the rest of the season as they try to turn the corner. CAR clearly benefitted from playing a SF team that had a road trip to London on deck. The 49ers QB Smith went out on the first drive of the 2H and SF with backup Carr proceeded with just 22 total yds on their next 3 drives. Rams QB Bradford has been efficient TY despite injuries to the WR position. After having a 6-8 ratio in the first 5 gms Bradford has protected the ball better with a 3-0 ratio the L/2. The Panthers are 6-3 ATS in domes with plenty of experience due to ATL and NO but STL has won 3 straight SU/ATS TY at home with wins over much better competition in WAS, SEA and SD and get their 4th win on the season (just 3 the L/2 years combined) in a surprisingly higher scoring game.

FORECAST: ST LOUIS 30 Carolina 20

2★ Miami (+) over CINCINNATI - This is the 3rd meeting since realignment with the road team covering both. MIA is 12-3 ATS as an AD under Sparano while CIN is 0-6 ATS as a HF. CIN came off the bye looking to avenge a pair of B2B losses but were outgained 299-143 with 3 punts, a FG and missed FG to start. CIN went on to outgain ATL 326-153 in the 2H but 14 of their 22 3Q pts were off ATL TO's. While Palmer finally had an elite game (412 yds 72% 3-0) the defense was no help as it gave up 153 yds rushing (5.1) and failed to pull in a sack and have just 6 TY. MIA played even with a better PIT Def LW with Henne having a solid day (257 yds 64% 1-0) despite the Steelers shutting down the run game (64 yds 3.0). MIA did a great job shutting down PIT's run game (58 yds 2.1) but couldn't stop Roethlisberger (302 70% 2-0). MIA has been a tough team on the road TY as while they've only outgained teams by 5 ypg, they haven't made many mistakes with just 9 penalties and are +2 TO's for a 3-0 SU and ATS record. While Henne is young and growing into his role, MIA has an identity on both sides of the ball, are much better rushing the QB (17 sacks, 1 every 11 pass att's) and we'll side with a quality dog here.

Denver 23 San Francisco 20 - London, UK - This is the 4th straight in the NFL International Series with the doc covering 2 of 3. Each team has taken a different approach here with SF travelling immediately after the CAR game to adjust to the time difference. SF is also taking the attitude that this game has "the atmosphere and feel of a mini-Super Bowl." DEN however won't arrive until Friday and will only have a walk thru prior to the game. SF lost QB Smith (left shoulder sprain) after the first drive of the 2H and only had 20 yds offense on its next 4 drives combined. SF punted with a 7 pt lead with 4:40 left but went into a prevent defense hoping to limit CAR to a FG. SF gave up a 23 yd TD pass, was int'd which set up a 37 yd FG for CAR to win it. DEN simply didn't show up for LW's game vs OAK and was down 38-7 at the half being outgained in the 508-240 with just 50 offensive plays. DEN clearly has the better QB but doesn't have a pass rush with just 9 sacks (27th). DEN has been out rushed 163 (4.7) to 49 (2.5) while SF has been out rushed 106 (3.6) to 92 (4.1). Both teams have given up 25 ppg on the road and both teams were outcoached LW so we'll side with DEN in a higher scoring game as they have the better QB.

DALLAS 34 Jacksonville 13 - DAL is off LW's huge MNF game vs the Giants and have B2B road games on deck with a SNF vs GB and rematch vs the Giants. HF's of 7 or more off MNF vs a team in its 2nd straight road game are 3-10 ATS. DAL however is the much more talented team with the #3 and #3 units but TO's (-5) and penalties (3 games of 11 or more) have done them in. DAL has outgained every foe TY (+593 yds), won the TOP battle in each game and are #1 in rush defense (101 ypg 4.2). JAX has the #26 and #30 units (-10 TO's) and were down to #4 QB Todd Bouman LW who made his first start in 5 years. Bouman did a solid job in the 1H (152 yds 58% 1 TD) for not throwing an NFL pass in 1750+ days. In the 2H KC made its adjustments and JAX was outgained 232-95

TEXAS A&M 38 Texas Tech 31 - RB's Gray and Michael each topped 120+ rush yds LY as the 52 pts were the most ever scored by A&M vs TT. The game was a shocker as A&M was off a 62-14 loss to KST the same team that TT beat 66-14 the week prior and TT was -21' at home. After the game then coach Leach blamed the loss on TT's "fat little girlfriends". A&M hasn't beaten TT in B2B S/93-94. The HT is 8-3 ATS (9-4 SU) and these schools combined to avg 70 ppg over the L/8. A&M beat KU 45-10 as HC Sherman went to a 2 QB system with backup Tannehill hitting 12-16 for 4 TT TD after embattled A&M career total offense leader Johnson started off the gm with a 17-3 lead. A&M's D is #7 pass eff D. TT rallied from a 24-14 3Q deficit at Colorado getting the gm winning 36 yd FG with 2:11 left. The Raiders dominated play from there on out with a 226-83 yd edge as CU missed a 35 yd FG with 12:49 left and was held to 2 straight 3 and outs as TT scored the go ahead pts. QB Potts is #1 NCAA passing (309,

being outscored 28-7. DD fav's are only 3-6 ATS TY but Garrard (concussion) could be returning vs a very desperate Cowboys team with nothing left to lose. JAX lacks the speed and talent at WR to challenge the #4 pass defense giving up a 7-2 ratio in man coverage. DAL is healthier with a better QB and skill position players vs a Jags secondary allowing a 16-4 ratio with an 8.9 ypa TY.

Washington 20 DETROIT 17 - Stafford is expected to restart his 2010 season after missing the L5 games with a shoulder injury. This is the 4th straight year these teams have met with the Lions ending their 19 game losing streak 19-14 as a 6.5 pt HD LY. DET dominated the 1H with 16-6 FD and 274-94 yd edges as the Redskins only had the ball for 8:00. Stafford was solid with 241 yds (58%) with a TD as DET held WAS to 65 yds (4.6) on the ground. While only 1-5 SU DET has proven to be a much tougher out TY (5-1 ATS) improving on both sides of the ball. LY the Lions were outgained by 93 ypg allowing 29 ppg. TY despite Stafford's injury, Johnson being beat up and cycling thru 5 different MLB's DET has improved to -25 ypg, with 23 ppg allowed. Their only non-cover was when MIN was just getting its passing game into step before its bye. WAS took advantage of a bad CHI OL LW forcing them to punt on 6 straight drives in the 1H. In the 2H they forced 6 TO's on 7 drives but only got 7 points. WAS has covered 4 straight thanks to an improved run game behind RB Torain that has avg'd 114 ypg (4.2). Both teams have play on spots at this point but with favorites off a SU win being 15-25-2 AT TY and DET at home having extra rest while WAS is looking to its bye we'll call for the road team by 3 here.

NY JETS 20 Green Bay 10 - The Jets are rested off their bye (7-1 ATS after) and are the leagues hottest team having won and covered 5 straight. While the streak is impressive it must be noted they've been outgained in 4 of 6 games TY incl the L2. Green Bay is off their SN matchup with MIN and prior they dropped 3 of 4 games all as a small favorite and all by a FG. While attrition is the main cause they've also lost the TO battle in 4 games winning it only once. The biggest loss from the offense is RB Grant (IR) and despite 157 rush yds vs WAS (thanks to 71 yd run) the Packers have not been able to use the run game to move the chains (3 rush FD's vs MIA). That has forced Rogers to throw without being able to use play action (only 57% L2W) while also missing an exp'd RB for pass blocking (9 sk allowed vs Was and MIA). The Jets will exploit that weakness as they're allowing 2.7 ypc at home and have held their last 3 foes to 42% completions. Jets have covered 10 of their last 12 games and while they've only allowed 12.3 ppg in that span they'll be hungry after allowing 20+ in 3 of the last 4.

KANSAS CITY 31 Buffalo 20 - This is the 7th meeting in 11 years with the Bills owning a 5-1 SU and ATS record. LW's results provide some solid value here. The Bills went all out LW for their first win of the year and stunned the Ravens with a 24-10 lead with a 257-164 yd edge. BUF finished with 506 yds which was more than double their YTD avg (251) prior to the game they were outscored 27-10 and lost in OT. Fitzpatrick has avg'd 242 yds (63%) with an 11-4 ratio TY but the defense has been the biggest culprit TY. Defensively BUF is last vs the run (175 ypg 4.8), 29th in sacks (8 or 1 every 8 att's) with a 14-1 ratio (1 TD every 11.9 att's). KC had very little film to break down on Bouman LW and had a tough time in the 1H dealing with him (152 yds 58% 1 TD). KC made solid 2H adjustments, outgaining JAX 237-95 with a 28-7 margin. KC has an almost 2-1 edge in the run game (177 5.0 to 90 3.7), has only allowed 5 sacks (1 every 31 att's) while pulling in 1 every 18.6 (12). Teams that went to OT as DD dogs are 2-7 ATS in their next game and BUF's mental state will be a question mark after playing a good team so well. KC would prefer to win with a ground and pound effort but have proven that they can take advantage of a bad defense the L2W's and do so again.

Seattle 23 OAKLAND 17 - In terms of yardage these teams are pretty even with SEA having the #27 and #19 units (+3 TO's) vs the Raiders #14 and #17 units (+1 TO's). SEA is 1-6 ATS away vs the AFC but OAK is 1-6 hosting an NFC team. SEA has big edges in the trenches, are playing much cleaner and with more energy than OAK. SEA is 16th in sacks allowed doing a solid job protecting Hasselbeck TY (1 every 15 att's) vs OAK (31st) who haven't started the same QB for 3 full games (1 every 11 att's). SEA is 7th in sacks by (1 every 13 att's) and are only allowing 96 ypg rushing (3.3). OAK is doing an solid job (#11) of pressuring the QB (1 every 13 att's) but their #28 run defense is in shambles with 139 ypg (5.0). OAK set a team record with 59 pts vs DEN and tallied an impressive 508-240 yd edge. Cable is only 1-8 ATS after winning SU as a dog and have yet to overcome their lack of consistency. SEA is not the lethargic team from 2008 and 2009 with a veteran QB who finally has a decent run game to balance out the offense with Lynch/Forsett (130 yds 3.9 combined LW). This is another favorable road situation for SEA vs a better than LY but inconsistent OAK team that is dead last in the NFL in home attendance only avg 42,964 TY.

NEW ENGLAND 27 Minnesota 24 - This looks to be the premier game of the week with Favre vs Brady and the return of Moss to NE. MIN is off LW's SNF game vs GB and this is their 3rd road game in 4 Wks since the bye. This game has strength vs strength with the Vikings #24 and #5 units (-5 TO's) vs the Patriots #19 and #29 units (+6 TO's). While Favre has had his issues TY (196 ypg 59% 6-7) as the WR unit and OL (1 sack every 11.5 att's) with each week the offense is improving. MIN's defense has been hit with injuries in the secondary but the #6 pass defense is only giving up a 6-4 ratio with a 5.9 ypa (TB is giving up 5.3 ypc rush by comparison). NE is off a tough OT game vs BAL and a long trip vs SD where they were outgained by 184 yds and a missed 40 yd FG from going to OT. Belichick is doing his best to personally guide the young back 7 thru 2010 as NE has been outgained in 3 games TY, (-78 ypg in those), the #30 pass defense is giving up 70 comp %, and have allowed 2 or more passing TD's in each game TY. They have struggled to get off the field on 3rd Dns (49%) and prior to LW were 28th as teams scored on 38% of their drives (MIN #4). Both teams are high profile public teams and we'll call for NE by 3 as we want to see how MIN does on SNF.

Pittsburgh at NEW ORLEANS - SNF - The NFL gave its fans a huge treat by putting the L2 Super Bowl winners together in a primetime matchup. PIT escaped with a win vs MIA LW as an inconclusive replay denied them the ATS win. NO was embarrassed by a team with a rookie QB for the 3rd time TY as they gave up 150 yds on trick plays. Despite being outFD'd 22-21, Navy finished with a 438-363 yd edge incl 367 rush yds. Dobbs is the #1 rusher (469, 3.1, 8) foid'd by Teich (439, 5.4, 2). LW Duke all'd VT to score on 8 of its 1st 9 poss and fell 44-7. The Devils were outFD'd 19-10 and outgained 491-208. Leading rusher Scott (350, 5.1) was held to just 25 yds and QB Renfree (248 ypg, 55%, 10-15) comp just 38% for 116 yds and took 2 sks. WR's Vernon (43, 14.5) and Varner (37, 12.3) comb for just 8 rec (7.8). Duke's D, which may be beat up after tough wks vs MIA and VT, all'd 372 tt yds to option Army and Navy comes in avg 378 but Duke is 15-4 ATS in the 2nd of B2B AG's.

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Toledo 35 E MICHIGAN 28 - The Rockets are 7-2-1 ATS vs the Eagles. UT is 6-12 ATS on the MAC road but are 2-0 SU/ATS TY. EM has been outgained in 10 of the L/11 meetings vs UT by an avg of 157 ypg. Toledo has won the L/3 vs EM by an avg of 47-22. UT beat Ohio 20-13 as a 9' pt AD with a 212-183 yd edge while EM lost 30-17 to Ohio as a 10 pt HD being outgained 412-374. Both teams beat Ball St (UT 31-24, 11' pt HF, +89 yd; EM 41-38 in OT, 14' pt AD, +247 yd). UT has the off (#87-101) and def (#82-120) edges. UT QB Dantin is avg 157 ypg (66%) with a 7-8 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 294 (2.9) but did leave LW with a shoulder inj (CS). RB Thomas leads with 465 (5.2). EM QB Gillett is avg 143 ypg (55%) with a 10-7 ratio and leads with 462 (4.2) rush while RB Priest had 462 (4.2). While the Rockets are certainly the more talented tm, you have to believe that they'll peek ahead to next Tuesday's game against the MAC's only other undefeated team.

NEVADA 45 Utah St 14 - The Pack is 2-6 ATS in this series and it's a high-scoring affair as they've avg 67 ppg over the L/13 with the winner scoring less than 30 pts just once. The visitor has won 8 of the L/10 SU (2-6 ATS). Since becoming WAC foes USU is 0-5 SU (3-2 ATS) being outgained by 136 ypg and the Aggies were outscored 86-17 in the two gms in Reno. LW the Aggies were dominated by Hawaii being outgained 605-181 in a 45-7 loss (+3'). QB Borel is avg 171 ypg (54%) with a 5-6 ratio (192 rush yd) and became just the 2nd Aggie QB to reach 7,000 career ttl off yds. UN is off a bye and the Pack will be hungry to get back on the field after their first loss. UN's #8 off will be going up against USU's #99 def as the Pack is #6 in the NCAA in ttl off (509 ypg) and #6 in rush ypg (289 ypg). QB Kaepernick is avg 211 ypg (68%) with a 10-5 ratio (669 rush yds, 6.9) and is #7 in the NCAA in ttl off (307 ypg), while RB Tava has 928 yds (6.6). Look for UN to get back to its winning ways here.

NEW MEXICO ST 23 San Jose St 16 - SJSt leads the series 15-2 SU (8-3 ATS) and has won the L/6 SU (5-1 ATS). SJSt has won by an avg of 16 ppg with 4 of the 5 wins by DD's. The Aggies are actually 0-8 SU and 0-5 ATS at home in Las Cruces vs SJSt. These two are both struggling mightily on off and def. SJSt is #119 in the NCAA in ttl off (254 ypg) and NMST is #116 (269 ypg), while the Aggies are #118 (455 ypg) in the NCAA in ttl D and the Spartans are #107 (443 ypg). These two are also the NCAA's two lowest scoring tms (NMST 12 ppg, SJSt 10 ppg). However, SJSt has played a much tougher sked (#15-93). SJSt's La Secla is avg 156 ypg (60%) with a 4-8 ratio but passed for 292 yds and 2 TD LW, while NMST's Christian is avg 154 ypg (47%) with a 5-2 ratio but was only 8-29 for 134 yds (2 TD). SJSt is avg just 73 ypg rush (2.6) with 3 TD while all'g 203 ypg (5.3) with 23 TD so look for NMST to try and exploit it. Something has to give here as both tms are desperate for a conf win and this is the best shot for each at getting one.

COLORADO ST 33 New Mexico 16 - NM snapped a 14 gm reg season losing streak LY vs CSU. After recovering a fmb! at the NMS, the Lobos kicked a FG then starting at the CSU45, Porterie conv on 4&2 and Carrier got a 22 yd run to set up the GW FG. There have been 6 upsets in the series the L/7Y and NM is 6-3 ATS in the series with the DOG covering 10 STRAIGHT! Colo St was brought back to earth in a 59-6 loss to Utah LW. It was only 7-0 after the 1Q, but UT surprised CSU with an outside K in the 2Q and scored 42 unanswered. NM is off a 30-20 loss to SDSt being outgained 384-303 and outFD'd 22-16. It was, however, their 2nd cover in a row as after being outscored 263-61 their 1st 5 gms, they've lost the L/2 by a comb 12 pts. QB Holbrook ret'd after missing the L/4 but took a hard hit mid-4Q and fell to the turf grabbing his knee (CS). NM has no rusher over the 200 yd mark yet TY. Both have taken on UNLV, and LV's only win TY was over NM while CSU crushed them 43-10 2W ago, holding LV to just 274 ttl yds. Both have also been blown out by Utah.

California 27 OREGON ST 26 - The HT is surprisingly just 1-6 ATS but the Beavers are on a 3-0 SU/ATS run in the series incl LY when they won for a 5th consec time in Berkeley as OSU outgained Cal 436-239 as the Bears were more focused on their fallen star Jahvid Best who was taken off the field on a stretcher. The Bears rebounded from their beatdown at USC a few wks back by delivering a 33 pt win over ASU (ASU's 2 TD's came on punt blk and fmb! return). OSU is off its 2nd bye of the ssn (Riley 15-6 ATS off a bye) and has flourished come Oct as they have now gone 24-6 ATS after their 5th gm of the ssn although they did drop a 2OT heartbreaker to UW a few wks back. Oregon ST has allowed more than 450 yds on D in 5 of their 6 gms TY (27+ points in each) and that does not bode well against a Cal offense that has scored 50+ three times.

Houston 44 MEMPHIS 20 - UM is fresh off a bye and they are 11-4 ATS the wk after. The Tigers off is a major concern over recent wks as they have been outscored by a 48-9 avg since their near upset of UTEP 4 gms ago. UM moved to 2-2 on the yr since the inj to QB Keenum after their 25 pt road upset of SMU (+8'). UH is on its 3rd str AG and has been terrible as an AF going just 1-11 incl a loss to rival Rice a few wks back. They have however outgained UM in each of the L/3 by 181 ypg incl LY, a gm in which Keenum tossed 5 TD's (just 2+ Q's) leading 42-14 at HT (UH, -23, won 55-14, 689-344 yd edge).

Utah 34 AIR FORCE 24 - This has been a high scoring series as these 2 comb to avg 60 ppg the L/24. UT has won 3 of the L/4 but the avg win is by 5 ppg with none being decided by more than a TD. LY UT stuffed AF on 4&2 from the 7 in OT to preserve the win. AF is 8-2 ATS vs the Utes but 1-6 SU. Utah also has a huge game vs TCU on deck and in '08 they barely got past NM in a similar situation. They did return to their blowout ways with a 59-6 win vs Colo St LW. QB Wynn (365 ypg, 70%, 12-5 ratio) went over 300 yds for the 3rd time in his career (321) in a little over 3Q's of work. Wide (409, 5.5) and Asiata (393, 5.0) have comb for 12 rush TD. AF is off a 38-7 loss at TCU. It was tied at 7 after 1Q and despite all'g 312 yds, AF was only down 17-7 at half. The NCAA's #1 rush D held AF to just 184 rush yd on the day. AF's top rusher is Clark (686, 5.9) and QB Jefferson (111 pass ypg, 49%, 6-4) is #3 (#2 FB Tew is out). AF has all'd an avg of 478 ttl ypg the L/3W (307 1st 3, incl Okla) and faces a UT squad that has avg 557 ypg in the same span. The L/2 times Utah has traveled to AF, the Falcons have rushed 83x's for just 169 yds (2.0).

PENN ST 34 Michigan 27 - LY UM was held to a ssn low in pts (10) and yds (250) vs PSU. Despite B2B losses UM is 7-4 ATS (9-2 SU) in the series. UM needed the bye after losing 3 midssn All-B10 players in QB Robinson (shoulder), C Molk (ankle) and DT Martin (ankle) vs Iowa. Robinson (188, 68%, 9-5 ratio, #2 NCAA rusher-1096) is expected to return here. UM has all'd 496 ypg and 36 ppg in B10 play. Despite losing QB Bolden in the 2Q due to inj PSU beat Minny 33-21 despite being outgained 433-351 as the Lions had led 33-14 mid4Q. Walk-on #3 QB McGloin (6-13-76 with 2 TD) filled in for Bolden (CS) with #2 Newsome slowed by the flu. Royster (450, 5.1) needs 31 yd to become PSU's all time leading rusher. PSU did get back 3 LB and DE Stanley over the bye for a D which is allowing 144 rush ypg (4.0). PSU failed to designate this night contest as a "White House" game but Rich Rod's team is 2-7 ATS on the Big 10 road.

Tcu 41 UNLV 6 - TCU is 7-1 SU/ATS in this series (39-9 avg score L/6). In LY's shutout win TCU rushed for 390 (8.1), the most since they joined the MWC. QB Clayton avg 134 ypg (56%) with a 5-2 ratio. The top rusher is Cornett with just 237 (5.3). LW TCU ran away with a 38-7 win over AF behind RB Wesley (866, 7.0, 9) who had a career-high 209 rush yd and 2 TD. After all'g their 1st TD in all of Oct, the D stiffened and held AF to just 184 rush yds on the day. QB Dalton (205 ypg, 66%, 14-5 ratio) did toss his 1st int at home but TCU finished with 30-13 FD and 562-231 yd edges. TCU does have a huge showdown with undefeated Utah on deck, which will determine which MWC tm potentially busts the BCS.

HAWAII 44 Idaho 27 - UH has won 7 of the L/8 SU and is 5-1 ATS vs UI. The Warriors are 6-1 SU (3-0 ATS) vs the Vandals in Honolulu and have won by 32 ppg in the 6 wins (only loss was in '60). UI is 5-2 as an AD but UH has covered all 4 HG's TY. UI is playing its 4 AG in 5 wks and have alternated wins and losses each week. They're coming off a 37-14 win over NMSU as QB Enderle (296 ypg, 59%, 16-10 ratio) was 20-32 for 256 yds and 3 TD in the 1H LW. UH is 4-0 in WAC play for just the 3rd time and the Warriors have won their L/7 conf gms. UH is #9 in the NCAA in ttl off led by QB Moniz (#1 ttl off, 374 ypg) who is avg 365 ypg (65%) with a 22-6 ratio. UH has been utilizing the "Pistol" and RB Green has benefitted as he has 488 yd (6.9) and 10 TD and rushed for a career-high 172 and 4 TD LW. The Warriors' def has looked much improved TY and LW all'd just 181 ttl yds at USU (best def performance S/'05) and has 12 int its L/5 gms. UH has a huge game at Boise on deck but they can't overlook UI who has won outright 5 times as a dog in the last year and a half.

OHIO 37 Louisiana 23 - These two have met just once ('07). UL lost 31-23 but outgained OU 534-416. UL is 1-7 since the SBC was formed ('01) in non-conf, non-BCS AG's. OU has a Thurs night MAC gm on deck while UL has a non-conf gm. OU is off a 34-13 win over rival Mia as a 3 pt AF as they outgained MU 371-343 and now hold their own destiny in the MAC East. UL lost 54-21 LW becoming the 1st FBS tm to lose to WKU since they moved up to IA but was only outgained 409-351 (-3 TO). With an SEC tm on deck UL needs a win here to avoid a losing ssn. While UL has played the tougher sked (#73-116), OU has a big D edge (#71-114).

N Texas 24 WKU 23 - The HT has had a +108 ypg edge in their 3 meetings. LY WKU led 49-42 late 3Q (2x's had a 2 TD lead) but all'd 26 unanswered pts over the final 15:50 (NT 68-49, -13'). NT is 2-0 ATS in the series. NT fired HC Dodge over the bye week and will be led by first yr OC Canales for the balance of the ssn. Dodge's son QB Riley had surg (wrist) but is exp to be available (CS). A week after falling apart in the 4Q vs ULM, WKU couldn't be stopped as they ended the FBS's longest losing streak (26 gms) with a 54-21 win over UL as a 7 pt AD as they had 409-351 yd edge and were +3 TO. NT lost to UL 28-27 as a 4' pt HF despite a 378-351 yd edge as the would be game tying PAT was blocked. NT has a slight def edge (#103-116) but WKU has played a much tougher sked (#67-104).

FLORIDA ATL 24 Fiu 23 - The Owls are 4-0 SU/ATS vs instate rival FIU. Panthers are 0-13 SU and 1-9 ATS the week after a bye. This is the "Shula Bowl" as these two are 48 miles apart. LY it was tied at 14 into the 4Q but FIU was SOD twice both times all'g FAU to score TD's. Despite playing the tougher sked (#63-83) FIU has the offensive (#81-116) and D (#62-101) edges. FAU lost to NT 21-17 as a 10 pt HF being outgained 403-357. FIU beat NT 34-10 as a 5 pt AF with a 479-285 yd edge. FIU QB Carroll is avg 210 ypg (56%) with a 6-6 ratio with 3 RB's with 220+ rush yds. FAU QB VanCamp is avg 208 ypg (61%) with a 7-6 ratio, while RB Morris leads with 455 (4.1). Rutgers is off a 41-21 loss to Pitt with their off struggling due to inj's and poor QB play.
