NEWS AND NOTES: Rutgers lost their 5th straight game which coincides with a spinal injury that backup DT Eric LeGrand suffered on Oct. 16. Louisville dominated this one 28-0 late 2Q as UL needed a win to wrap up a bowl. RU was still alive for a bowl but gave up TD drives of 75, 64, 75 and 69 yds on ULs first 4 poss and the game was basically over at that point. UL lost starting QB Justin Burke early and Will Stein replaced him. BG went 3 & out a 4th time and WM went 65/7pl for a TD, this time after a 49 yd punt, 20-0. It was 27-0 at the half with WM's other TD coming after a fmbl'd KO at the BG13 (BG hadn't even had a FD). WM led 41-7 after 3Q's and brought backups in for the 4Q...Akron managed to avoid its first winless season since they moved to IA ball in 1987. Three plays later ASU got a 71 yd TD to go up by 11 and got a 99 yd KR TD then after an int drove 27 yds for a TD, 45-27 and UCLA was SOD on 4x5 at the ASU18 with 7:56 left as well...USF/Miami, Fla was an interesting game. The first 12 series of the game featured 12 punts and 3 FD's. UM got their first offensive drive going 42/901 but with 3:43 left in the half fmhl'd in punts and 3 FD's. BIG COMEBACKS TO STAY ALIVE FOR THE BCS TITLE GAME: Alabama failed to put Auburn away and it came back to bite them. At one point, the Crimson Tide had a 347-2 yd edge and a 24-0 lead. Alabama fmbl'd into the EZ for a TB with 12:22 left in the 2Q, settled for a 20 yd FG after having a 1st & gl at the 3 with 8:01 left and then had a 1st & gl at the 7 but with :54 left in the half, fmbl'd at the Aub12. That's 3 drives inside the Aub10 result in 3 points and Auburn got a late TD in the 1H to pull within 24-7 with the Tide having a commanding 18-5 FD and 379-87 yd edges. Cam Newton only threw for 216 yards and only rushed for 39 yards on 22 carries. Bama settled for another short FG of 32 yards after having the ball at the Aub7 with 1:05 left 3Q. CUSA CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

3★ UCF over Smu - Bright House Stadium, Orlando. The Knights host the CUSA Champ for the 2nd time in 4 yrs (3rd CUSA Title gm) and in '07 UCF dominated Tulsa (308-32 rush edge) en route to a berth in the Liberty Bowl. UCF went thru CUSA with a 7-1 SU (6-2 ATS) record and has now covered 13 of 16 non-bowl gms despite being led for most of the yr by true Fr QB Godfrey (200 ttl ypg, 67%, 22 ttl TD) and without LY's top rusher Harvey (1109, 4.2, 14 TD). RB Weaver (855, 4.8, 11 TD) as well as the UCF def (295 ypg all'd at home) have led to the team's success TY. Following their OT victory over EC on Fri (SMU blew 14 pt 4Q lead), the Mustangs earned their first CUSA Title game appearance putting B2B successful ssns together after finishing '07 and '08 with identical 1-11 records. QB Padron (270 ypg, 59%) leads the off along with CUSA's top rusher Zach Line (1297, 6.2). These 2 last met in '08 (HC Jones' 1st ssn) and despite SMU having a 351-126 yd edge, their 4-1 TO deficit cost them as they lost 31-17 (+14). The UCF crowd served as a huge 12th man in their last CUSA Title game at Bright House and judging by the way the Knights have gone thru this conf with relative ease so far TY, another trip to the Liberty Bowl may be in the offing here.

FORECAST: UCF 31 Smu 14

3★ WASH ST (+) over Washington - After LW's come-from-behind final play win vs a Cal team that did everything possible to give the game away, UW is a win away from bowl elig (P10 potentially just 4 tms in the postssn). The Cougars probably can't wait to get back on the field after a 2 week bye and their first conf win in 16 tries (covered 6 of L/7 gms), and a convincing one as they dominated Oreg St as a 24 pt dog while posting a 378-261 yd edge (QB Tuel 157 pass, 79 rush). Prior to WSU's win over OSU their last conf win came in the '08 Apple Cup, a game that UW led 10-0 at HT before WSU went 69/7pl for the tying 28 yd FG and then won in 2OT. LY's 30-0 WSU loss was their largest margin of defeat in the series S/'00 (51-3) and it was also the 1st time they had been shutout in the rivalry S/'64 (30-0, +24'). After 3 yrs of struggles under HC Wulff a 2 gm win streak to end the ssn would do wonders for the Cougars while UW plays with pressure seeking a bowl bid for the first time since 2002 in what could be Locker's last game.

2★ WVIRGINIA over Rutgers - Rutgers has never won in Morgantown going 0-15 but in their L/2 trips they have lost by a total of 9 pts and the visitor is 6-1 ATS. LY the tms totaled 496 yds, 24 FD's with an IR TD and a KR TD and WV (+2') escaped with a 24-21 win. In 1987 we won our College GOY on WV (-13') over Rutgers, 37-13. RU was eliminated from bowl contention LW in their 40-13 loss to L'ville. WV is off a huge 35-10 win over rival Pitt which put them in contention for a BCS bid but still needs a win here combined with a Conn loss. WV used their Jumbo Back set with Alston and Clarke (both 225 lbs) in the backfield to help their production in the redzone LW and protect the QB and top rusher Devine (855, 4.5) only had 4 att (27 yds). QB Smith is avg 201 ypg (64%) with a 22-6 ratio. RU QB's have struggled TY with inj's and inconsistency and starter Dodd is only avg 150 ypg (55%) with a 9-7 ratio. RU has been outgained by 100 ypg in BE play while WV is outgaining BE foes by 85 ypg. WV has large edges on off (#51-98), def (#4-72) but RU has the ST edge (#27-57). RU is 10-4 ATS as an AD S/'06 (1-2 TY). WV is on a 4-1 run as a HF and after earlier losses to Syr and Conn put HC Stewart on the hotseat, a strong finish and possible a BCS bowl trip will ease tensions in Morgantown.

Arizona St at ARIZONA - The HT is just 4-13-1 ATS in the Territorial Cup (oldest traveling trophy) but ASU has dropped 2 consec in the series for the 1st time S/'97-'98 after they muffed a punt w/1:00 left all'g AZ to nail the GW 32 yd FG as time expired LY. AZ actually led by 5 at HT vs UO LW but was unable to hold on despite Foles' career-best 448 pass yd. ASU was trailing 17-0 vs UCLA and lost starting QB Threet (concussion), however bkup Osweiler came in and led the comeback 55-34 win (380 pass yd, 5 ttl TD, may start here). ASU has kept most AG's very tight TY losing to Wisky, OSU and USC by a comb 5 pts while AZ has been impressive at home all'g just 317 ypg while outscoring foes by a 31-18 avg. Get the Thursday Night Marquee Winner (see above). FRIDAY, December 3rd

Illinois 27 FRESNO ST 23 - LY in the 1st series meeting a FSU OL caught a deflected pass for a 2 pt conversion w/:02 left for the miracle 1 pt win. IL had a ssn high in pts (52), FD's (26) and yds (548) in the home loss. The Illini are 4-6 SU but 9-1 ATS in non-conf true road gms S/98. This is FSU's 2nd ever home gm vs a B10 tm as they missed 3 FG's and lost 13-10 (+2) to Wisky in '08 in Fresno's 'biggest home gm in school history'. Both tms are already bowl elig as FSU is off a last minute 23-20 win over Idaho in which they had a 371-210 yd edge. FSU had to overcome a 4-1 TO deficit as the Vandals had a 30 yd IR TD and an 84 yd KR TD but drove 60 yd for the GW TD with :14 left. QB Colburn (222, 61%, 18-9) has had an inconsistent Sr yr. Unheralded Rouse (1097, 5.7) is #13 NCAA rushing. The Dogs allow 140 rush ypg (4.1). IL is off a bye after its 48-27 thrashing of NW in Wrigley Field in which they had an incredible 519-183 rush edge. QB Scheelhaase's (138, 59%, 16-8, 684 rush) progress has spurred the run gm with NCAA's #8 rusher Leshoure (1371, 5.9) totalling a school record 330 yd vs NW. The Illini allow 138 rush ypg (4.0). The Bulldogs are 2-7 ATS as a HD but nearly upset Nevada in that role earlier TY.

MAC Champ appearance (0-1 SU/ATS), while Miami makes its 4th (1-2 SU/ATS). NI has won the L/5 in the series but is just 2-5 ATS incl failing to cover the L/3 (all as DD fav). LY NI led 17-0 in 1Q but it was just 20-16 in the 4Q, before RB Spann had a 40 yd TD run with :58 left as they tried to run out the clock. That put them right at the line (-11) but Miami scored a TD on the final play for the backdoor cover. NI had already won MAC West Crown but did not have a let down vs EM LW, winning 71-3, with a 646-160 yd edge. NI had its first ever undefeated MAC season (8-0) and its 9 gm win streak (8-1 ATS) is its longest since moving to IA ('66) and they're ranked for the 1st time S/'03. MU had its biggest turn-around season ever and an FBS best as they went from 1-11 to 8-4. On Tues, MU pulled the 23-3 upset (+7) of a dazed Temple team that had been KO'd of the MAC Champ race the prior wk. MU then had to wait until Fri and needed Ohio to lose to make it here. Vs 5 common opp NI is 5-0 SU/ATS while MU is 5-0 SU but 3-2 ATS. MU will be without QB Dysert (inj, out L/2) and bkup Boucher in 2 sts is avg 184 ypg (62%) with a 2-1 ratio. RB Merriweather leads with 736 (5.3) and has 8 of MU's 9 rush TD's. WR Robinson leads with 76 (10.6) while WR Harwell has 52 (13.8). NI QB Harnish is avg 177 ypg (66%) with a 17-5 ratio and is the #2 rusher (761, 6.4, 5). Spann leads the MAC with 1,239 (5.5) and 20 TD's. The top rec is Clark with 34 (13.1, 6). NI has a huge off edge (#19-99) and proves they are the MAC's most complete team.

Pittsburgh 33 CINCINNATI 27 - Pitt won the 1st 7 meetings in this series but has dropped the will treat this like a bowl week, they rank #109 pass eff L/2 (5-2 ATS). LY UC trailed 31-10 w/1:26 left in the 1H, but pulled out a 45-44 come-from-behind on a UH tm with edges all around (off #21-112, D #54 win, scoring the GW TD w/:33 left in a gm Pitt led by 2+ scores for the majority. The L/3 gms have the series 12-7 SU (5-2-1 ATS), have covered the L/3.

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been decided by 7 pts or less. Pitt is off a devastating 35-10 loss to WV in which they lost their lead in the BE. Pitt had 20-13 FD and 362-360 yd edges but 2 TO's in the 1H resulted in 14 pts for WV. Pitt QB Sunseri is avg 211 ypg (66%) with a 15-7 ratio. RB's Graham (825, 6.3) and Lewis (695, 4.5) have split carries TY as each has had trouble with fmbls at times. UC's 38-17 loss to Conn LW knocked them out of the bowls for the 1st time S/'05. QB Collaros threw 4 int LW but is avg 279 ypg (59%) with a 25-11 ratio. RB Pead has 932 rush (6.8). UC has a small edge on off (#33-44) but Pitt has large edges on def (#26-74) and ST (#26-64). UC is 13-5 ATS as a HD S/'00 but Pitt is 5-1 as an AF. Pitt goes from facing the #4 def (WV) to Cincy's #74 D and should end a disappointing regular ssn on a high note.

USF 20 Connecticut 13 - The home tm is 5-1 ATS (6-1 SU) in this series but did not cover LY. These 2 BE schools are the farthest apart (1278 miles). USF HC Skip Holtz was the HC at UC from '94-'98 compiling a 33-23 record prior to the move to the FBS and was replaced by current UC HC Edsall. LY Conn hit a 42 yd FG on the last play and USF lost in the cold of Connecticut 29-27 (+7'). Conn has been the hottest tm in the BE in the 2H of the ssn (4 str wins SU/ATS) and after a 38-17 win over Cincy LW, the Huskies controls their own destiny in the BE race and can earn the school's 1st BCS bowl bid with a win here. RB Todman leads the BE in rushing with 1,481 (5.5). QB Frazer is only avg 121 ypg (54%) with a 5-3 ratio. USF is off a 23-20 upset of Miami in OT (+11) in which QB Daniels (136 ypg, 56%, 9-12 ratio) left at halftime (leg inj, CS) and bkup Eveld (8-15 for 120 LW) led USF to the win. UC is 6-13 ATS as a BE AD but is 4-1 ATS the L/2Y. UC is being outgained in BE play by 84 ypg while USF is outgaining BE foes by 73 ypg and with the tms being so far apart, weather could be a factor.

they failed to cover by a half pt (won 49-14, +35'). Since becoming WAĆ foes ('05), Boise is 5-0 SU and 4-1 ATS and has scored no less than 45 pts in any gm while outgaining USU by 254 ypg the L/4 and the Aggies have lost by 28, 25, 39 and 35 pts in their L/4 trips to Boise. USU is 5-1 SU/ ATS in ssn finales and has won and covered in the L/3, while BSU is 7-0 SU and 6-1 ATS in home finales S/'03 with the non-cover LY. USU comes in fresh off a bye. QB Borel is avg 188 ypg (55%) with an 8-11 ratio but his numbers are way down from LY (240 ypg, 58%, 17-4 as a Jr). BSU has huge edges on off (#6-101) and def (#7-98) but is coming off the toughest loss in program history after watching a 24-7 HT lead evaporate in a 34-31 (-14) OT loss at Nev LW, snapping a 24 gm win streak and in the process, crushing their BCS hopes. QB Moore leads the nation in pass eff (187.97) and is avg 297 ypg (71%) with a 30-5 ratio. The Broncos also rank in the NCAA's top 5 in ttl off (526 ypg) and ttl def (256 ypg). The game is on "The Blue" but will Boise respond by taking out their frustrations on the overmatched Aggies, or will they be suffering from a MAJOR hangover? Usc 30 UCLA 20 - These campuses are about 15 miles apart and they have played every yr S/36 (HT is 20-8 ATS). Despite no postssn TY the Trojans are actually playing their 13th gm of the ssn (trip to HI). USC would like nothing better than to knock off the rival Bruins, something they've done in 10 of the L/11 (7-4 ATS) incl LY's 28-7 victory, a gm in which former HC Carroll opted to throw deep for a TD after Neuheisel called a TO (USC was going to take a knee up 14 pts). Their domination of non-conf tms (19 str wins) ended LW however as they dropped a home contest vs ND despite having a 4-1 TO edge. Starting QB Barkley DNP (ankle) while bkup Mustain struggled hitting just 54% for 177 yds. Despite jumping out to a 17-0 lead LW, the Bruins def was unable to stop ASU after as they all'd a ssn-high 595 yds in the 55-34 defeat. In the loss, QB Brehaut put together the best game of his career passing for 321 yds with 4 ttl TD. USC has all'd just 11 ppg to UCLA the past 5 ssn's and should have Barkley back.

Oregon 44 ÖREGON ST 23 - These 2 tms have comb for 2,035 yds over the L/2 ssns. Despite trailing by 5 at HT, UO did their typical 2H surge outscoring AZ by a 34-10 margin and remains just 1 win away from the BCS Title Game. OSU has now lost 3 of their last 4 after getting shutout for the first time S/02 as they were outgained 470-285 versus Stanford. The Beavers have had their Rose Bowl dreams shot down the L2Y vs the Ducks and now will be home for the holidays unless they pull the upset. Despite Oregon being held to a season low 324 yds in their last road game (at Cal) the offense is avg 543 ypg and continue to play at a fever pitch if they're ahead or behind. Tough to imagine OSU being able to slow them as they've faced 3 Top 10 teams getting outgained by 198 yds to TCU, 241 yds to Boise and 185 yds LW vs Stanford. The Ducks defense may be the most fired up unit as they will try to make a statement after allowing 506 yds LW incl a season high 448 yds passing. The Ducks book their 1st trip to the Title Game at the expense of their rivals.

IDAHO 41 San Jose St 27 - SJSt leads the series 12-8-1 (2-3-1 ATS) and has won 6 of the L/8. This has historically been a low-scoring series as they avg just 40 ppg combined while 5 of the L/6 have been decided by 8 or less. Since these two became WAC foes ('05), the Spartans are 4-1 SU (2-0 in the Kibbie Dome) and 2-2-1 ATS with the lone loss coming LY falling 29-25 (-5) on a TD with 1:10 to go. UI is 0-5 SU and 2-3 ATS in home finales since joining the WAC while SJSt is 3-9 SU and 5-6-1 ATS in ssn finales. The Spartans come into this one having lost 9 consec gms but 3 of the L/4 losses have been by a score or less, incl LW's 45-38 (+11') loss to LT. QB La Secla (213 ypg, 57%, 15-14 ratio) passed for a career-high 496 yds and 5 TD but also had 3 int incl one that ended the game. UI has the edge on off (#82-114) and def (#82-112) here but the Vandals saw their chances at B2B bowl gms for the first time in school history end as they fell 23-20 (+10') to Fresno LW. UI was outgained 227 to -5 in the 1H but only trailed 6-0 and took its first and only lead at 20-16 with 2:01 left, but the Bulldogs scored a TD with:14 remaining. QB Enderle is avg 255 ypg (57%) with a 21-16 ratio and was 20-35 for 197 yds LW but was sk'd 6x's. UI finds itself in the unusual role as a DD fav as the Vandals are just 1-1 ATS in the role in the L/8 yrs with both gms coming TY.

HAWAII 49 Univ 14 - LY UH all'd a 67/14pl drive (4:40 TOP) as the Rebs scored the winning TD w/:36 left (34-33, -7) in a gm that featured 8 lead changes. Despite splitting the L/4, UH has won the yardage battle in each by 155 ypg. UH is on an 8-1 SU/ATS run TY, outscoring foes 42-18. QB Moniz (#1 NCAA pass ypg) is avg an outstanding 354 ypg (66%) with a 32-10 ratio. The top rusher is Green (1032, 8.7, 16 of tm's 19 rush TD) who set a UH record with 327 rush yds vs NMSt LW. The top rec's are Salas (101, 15.7, 10, UH all-time leader rec yds) and Pilares (79, 14.5, 14) who are both over 1,000 yds. Since their NM win, UNLV is 1-7 SU (3-4 ATS) being outscored 42-17. QB Clayton avg 136 ypg (56%) with an 11-6 ratio. The top rusher is Cornett with just 510 (3.9) and 6 of the tm's 9 rush TD's and the top rec is Payne with just 34 (17.8) and 4 TD. While UNLV will treat this like a bowl week, they rank #109 pass eff D (212 ypg, 63%, 21-6 ratio) and now take on a UH tm with edges all around (off #21-112, D #54-115, ST #86-104). The Warriors, who lead the series 12-7 SU (5-2-1 ATS) have covered the L/3

Troy 33 FLORIDA ATL 30 - Troy is 6-1 SŬ (5-1 ATS) all-time vs FAU. LY FAU all'd a school rec'd 651 yds (QB Brown Troy schl rec'd 477 pass yds) vs Troy and in 6 FBS gms have been outgained in each by 82 ypg. FAU's loss LW to MT officially knocked them out of a bowl. Troy's win over WKU made them bowl elig and they could share the SBC Crown. Vs 8 common opp Troy is 5-3 SU but 2-6 ATS, while FAU is 4-4 SU and 2-5-1 ATS. Three of those wins were by 1 pt, incl a Hail Mary win vs UAB, while Troy lost to UAB by 1 on a Hail Mary. Troy QB Robinson is avg 274 ypg (62%) with a 21-15 ratio. RB Southland has 492 (5.2) and WR Jernigan leads with 70 rec (10.5). FAU QB Van Camp is avg 193 ypg (58%) with a 16-12 ratio. RB Morris leads with 882 (4.1) while WR Jean leads with 58 (16.1, 8). While these teams are close on def (FAU #100-109), Troy has a big off edge (#58-117). FAU is 8-1 SU in home finales but Troy did win their LTH 30-17 (-3').

FIÚ 30 Middle Tenn 20 - FIU claimed the SBC Title with their win LW over ASU (even with a loss would share crown). MT needs to win to be bowl elig and avoid a losing ssn. The HT is 5-0 SU (4-1 ATS) in the series winning by 17 ppg. LY's 385 rush yds marked the 4th best in MT history as they led 34-0. FIU scored the next 21 but MT held them scoreless in the 4Q (3 int, punt and SOD). FIU has outgained MT in both meetings in Miami ('05 and '08). Vs 7 common opp MT is 4-3 SU and 3-4 ATS while FIU is 6-1 SU and 4-3 ATS. MT QB Dasher has 16 TO's in his 7 gms since ret from a 4 gm susp and is avg 163 ypg (57%) with a 5-13 ratio (#2 rusher, 396, 3.5). RB Tanner leads with 779 (5.8, 9). WR Andrews leads with 29 rec (11.6). FIU QB Carroll is avg 213 ypg (61%) with a 14-13 ratio. RB's Perry (654, 4.7, 12) and Mallary (565, 5.5) are the top rushers. WR Hilton leads with 55 rec (14.7). FIU has the off (#78-96) and def (#60-97) edges and ends MT's season.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME † Auburn 38 South Carolina 34 - Georgia Dome, Atlanta. Aub is 7-1-1 SU vs SC with SC's only SU win over Aub in 1933. The last meeting was a 35-27 win by Aub (-3) on 9/25. In that gm, SC led 20-7 late 2Q and 27-21 early 4Q, but QB Garcia fmbl'd twice and then was pulled and bkup Shaw was int'd twice (all 4 TO's in the 4Q and resulting in 14 pts for Aub). Newton threw for 158, 2 TD and rushed for 176, 3 TD in the 1st matchup while Garcia threw for 235 with a 3-0 ratio but RB Lattimore was held to 33 rush yds. Aub did have 492-384 yd and 29-20 FD edges in the gm. SC finished their ssn strong with 3 str DD wins incl LW's 29-7 win over rival Clem (322-251 yd edge). SC QB Garcia is avg 221 ypg (66%) with an 18-9 ratio while RB Lattimore has 1,114 (4.8). Aub is off a come-from-behind win over rival AL in which they trailed 24-0 late 2Q but rebounded for a 28-27 win. QB Newton was held to 39 rush yds but threw for 216 and 3 TD and the D held AL to 69 rush yds (2.3). Aub has our #1 off (SC #22) led by Heisman favorite Newton (188 ypg, 68%, 24-6, 1336 rush, 5.9). SC has the edge on def (#12-34) but both tms have struggled in pass D with Aub (#76 pass eff D) all'g 377 yds to AL LW and SC down to a walk-on at one CB spot (#93 pass D). While this is SC's 1st trip to the SEC Title gm, it is Spurrier's 8th and he is 5-2 SU (4-2-1 ATS). Aub's last title trip was in 2004, a 38-28 win over Tenn when Chizik was the DC here. Spurrier has the experience factor in his favor and SC can stav in the gm as long as Garcia doesn't have another meltdown.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME † Virginia Tech 27 Florida St 24 - Bank of America Stadium, Charlotte. These two met in the inaugural ACC Champ gm, a 27-22 FSU upset (+14'). VT is 1-13 SU vs FSU S/75 and is on a 1-4 ATS run S/99 vs the Noles (7-7 S/76). FSU backed into this gm as they lost to NCSt on a Thurs night when Ponder fmbl'd the handoff at the NCSt4 with :54 left. They beat MD 2W ago, 30-16, and MD's win over NCSt gave FSU the Atlantic bid. The Noles snapped a 6 gm losing streak to Fla LW with a 31-7 win, finishing with 21-17 FD and 333-276 yd edges. VT wrapped up the Coastal crown 2W ago, and LW's 37-7 win over UVA (a 3★ CTOT Winner) was icing on the cake. After an 0-2 start to the ssn, VT is now the only tm in the FBS to have won 10 gms in each of the L/7Y. They are also the 1st to win every ACC gm S/99 (Fla St). Taylor avg 188 ypg (60%) with a 20-4 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 613 (5.2). VT uses a 3-headed monster at RB with Evans (748, 5.6, 10), Wilson (573, 5.9, 5) and Williams (428, 4.5, 9) comb for 24 of VT's 28 rush TD's (Taylor other 4). They run into the NCAA's #23 run D (129 ypg, 3.3) and FSU has our #23 pass eff D (218 ypg, 58%, 13-12). QB Ponder (185 ypg, 62%, 20-8) has not thrown an int in 3 of the L/4 and is avg 213 (65%, 8-1) in that span (DNP Clem). The top rusher is Thompson (686, 6.8) while the top rec's are Reed (53, 10.3, 2) and Haulstead (33, 15.2, 6). VT is #2 pass eff D all'g 192 ypg (49%, 14-20). TO's could make a diff here (FSU +2, VT #1 NCAA +16l) as the edges are close all around. This is the 1st time the ACC Champ gm is in Charlotte and VT will have the noticeable crowd edge.

4★ St Louis over ARIZONA - Last time here Arizona was 9-5 and St Louis was 1-13 and the Cardinals covered as a 14' pt fav, 31-10. These two opened up this season and St Louis was a 3' pt HD and led 13-10 when Anderson hit Fitzgerald with a 21 yd TD pass with 6:13 left in the game. Since that game the teams have headed in opposite directions with STL covering 8 of 10 and ARZ covering 2 of 9. We wrote LW about a young QB learning how to play on the road by playing mistake free and Bradford has done that in covers at TB and SF having a combined 536 yd passing (63%) with a mistake free 3-0 ratio. LW they expanded the playbook and allowed deeper throws and Bradford lived up to the expectations (308, 59%, 3-0) for his first NFL road win. While the Rams are playing B2B road games that is somewhat negated by the Cards having played on Monday night. Nothing pretty about Arizona's numbers as they've been OUTGAINED in every home game by an avg of 98 ypg. The Cardinals have decided to stick with interception machine Anderson and it's clear he's been instructed to not throw picks because he's hitting only 54% comp and has been sacked 13 times in the L3 games as he's holding on to the ball. The Rams D doesn't get much publicity but continues to improve and has 21 sacks the L6 games. Better offense and better defense give STL B2B road wins. FORECAST: St Louis 34 ARIZONA 24

3★ New Orleans over CINCINNATI - The Saints have a massive edge statistically here with the #3 and #14 units (+2 TO's) the L4W vs the Bengals #31 and #13 units (-8 TO's). Injuries on defense and lack of production by big name players have sent the Bengals season into a free fall. LW vs the Jets they only had 1 of their top 5 players in the secondary available due to injuries and even with the extra rest they will be just as vulnerable here. They played the Jets tough for a half with a 7-3 lead but failed to adjust at the half and were outscored 23-3 and outgained 141-34. CIN's DL has been a huge disappointment with only 12 sacks TY (1 every 31 att's), has only held 2 foes to under 100 yds rushing (132 ypg 4.6 minus CAR/IND) and has given up 29 ppg the L8W (1-6-1 ATS). NO is outgaining foes by 83 ypg on the road (4th best) with +6 TO's and is avg 28 ppg. OTHER SELECTIONS 2★ TAMPA BAY (+) over Atlanta - The Falcons are only 1-6 ATS vs TB including a 27-21 non-cover as a 9.5 pt HF in the 1st meeting. ATL had a 27-14 lead late in the 3Q but gave up an 89 yd KR losing the cover. TB's final drive went 89/12pl to the ATL 2 but were SOD with 2:44 left as ATL ran out the clock. ATL is off a big home win vs GB which could have playoff seeding implications. While they were outgained 418-294 their RB's set the tone of the game with a 117 (4.3) to 26 (2.2) edge when Rodgers 51 yds (4.3) are taken out. ATL needed a 47 yd FG with :09 left to escape with the win. This is only the 2nd home game in a 6 Wk span for TB who is 3-13 ATS at home. They are a respectable 27th and 8th (+0 TO's) the L4W and match up well vs ATL with the #17 and #12 units (+6 TO's). After shutting out SF on the road, TB continued to show their backdoor potential as they wrapped up a 77/13pl drive with TD for the cover vs BAL. While Freeman only had 162 yds passing, TB didn't turn the ball over and 7 different Bucs had a catch. After losing 4 straight the Broncos made the most out of the bye week as RB Moreno was finally healthy and DEN was able to employ a balanced offense. DEN had a 42-10 lead with a 366-168 yd edge after each teams 1st drive of the 2H. 300 of Cassel's 469 passing yds came in garbage time and Haley was so incensed that he refused to shake hands with McDaniels afterwards. After a long trip to SEA where the Chiefs slammed the Seahawks 42-24 with a 503-288 yd edge, KC returns home where they are 5-0 SU and 4-1 ATS. While they have only outgained foes by 39 ypg at home they have outrushed them 202 (5.6) to 95 (4.0) and are +5 TO's. While DEN has only been outgained by 15 ypg on the road TY they have been outrushed 156 (4.3) to 54 (3.0), are only converting 25% on 3rd Dns (46% at home), are -4 TO's and have been outscored by 8.8 ppg. KC will be very focused with their big loss just a few weeks ago vs a DEN team that is 2-17 SU in KC in December. FORECAST: KANSAS CITY 24 Deriver 10 **OTHER GAMES**

Houston at Philadelphia - The Eagles are looking like this years Cinderella team getting surprisingly good play out of the QB spot as well as getting teams at the right time on the schedule. PHI has sizeable stat edges here (#1 #9 +7 TO's) vs the Texans (#16 #27 -1 TO's). However they lost their #2 CB Hobbs (neck) vs the Giants and its unknown if #1 CB Samuel will play here. This is also the 4th game in 18 days

for PHI and they are getting a Texans team playing for Kubiak to come back for 2011. Call the Nothcoast Debit Card System for the winner on tonight's PPH Play for \$9. Updated after 3:00 pm ET! MINNESOTA 33 Buffalo 17 - MIN has the #11 and #13 units (-7 TO's) the L4W while BUF is #17 and #20 (-2 TO's). MIN is 7-2 ATS as a HF but BUF is 10-4 ATS as an AD despite their injury situations the L2Y. MIN has dominant matchup advantages here with their #10 run game (120 ypg 4.4) vs a Bills defense allowing 167 ypg (4.6) TY with 14 games of 150 yds rushing in the L27 games. MIN has been done in by Favre's TO's TY (17 Int) but they have outgained foes 345-287 at home and have the 4th best home défense. MIN got a win LW in Leslié Frazier's coaching debut vs WAS they played with much more energy and crispness and had both Rice and Harvin starting at WR for the 1st time TY. MIN stripped down the playbook and focused on the run game (137 yds 3.6) which kept the defense fresh as they made 13 plays behind the LOS on 52 snaps. The Bills come in off another game where the opposing team took them lightly and they rallied back vs PIT. BUF was manhandled by PIT LW in the 1H lucky to only be down 13-0. BUF was outFD 18-4 and outgained 225-51 with just 6 yds rushing (1.5). A 65 yd screen pass to RB Jackson with 3:45 left in the 3Q along with six 2H penalties by PIT gave the Bills the spark to send the game into OT. Look for MIN to play efficiently in Frazier's home debut and for Favre to be solid vs a BUF defense that is giving up a 13-2 ratio on the road TY.

MIAMI 24 Cleveland 23 - The Browns were in an uncomfortable role as nearly a DD Fav LW vs CAR and

barely escaped with a 1 pt win. CLE started Delhomme vs his former team with McCoy (ankle sprain) ailing and he was less than impressive with 1 of his 2 int being returned for a TD. He was only good enough to keep CAR honest as Hillis had 194 total yds (6.1) or 51% of the offense. They now travel vs a MIA team off a long trip to OAK that is just 1-10 ATS as a HF. Henne (knee sprain) started LW vs OAK and was very effective in his return with 307 yds (57%) with a 2-1 ratio. MIA has outgained foes by a respectable 40 ypg at home TY but have been outscored 26-18 thanks to bad spec teams play and TO's (-2). The big surprise is the lack of commitment to the run game by MIA at home TY where they have been outrushed 119 (3.9) to 74 (3.5) due to OL issues and the team pushing the pass attack with Marshall. They did outrush OAK 186 (3.8) to 16 (1.3) though. CLE is clearly overachieving with the talent on hand especially with the erratic

OB situation and are worth a look vs a MIA team that has a road game vs the Jets on deck.

Jacksonville 17 TENNESSEE 10 - The Titans own a 6-2 SU and ATS record vs the Jags and have won the L2 meetings by 17 and 27 points with a 377-289 avg yd edge. Despite being outscored by 54 pts on the year, the Jags have been playing good ball the L4W with the #7 and #22 units (-2 TO's). Injuries at WR and on the DL combined with a bad QB situation has seen the normally stout Titans fall to #30 and #29 (-5 TO's) the L4W. TEN was forced to start Rusty Smith LW vs a desperate Texans team and were taken apart. HOU sold out on the run holding TEN to 24 yds (2.0) as they didn't fear Smith who only had 138 yds (55%) with 3 int. TEN was outgained 346-162 with 80 of their yards coming on their final drive. Making matters tougher for TEN here is that their best CB Finnegan could be susp after instigating a fight with HOU WR Johnson. JAX was efficient offensively vs the Giants LW converting 10 of 16 3rd Dns

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as they ran for 207 yds (6.1) vs a def that has held foes to 100 yds or less 7 times TY. It's not unusual to see a physical TEN/JAX game but the Jaguars are healthier (only 2 starters on IR) and playing with

confidence with Jones-Drew avg 120 ypg (5.1) the L4W.

NY GIANTS 27 Washington 17 - The Giants are 6-2 ATS vs the Redskins with a 360-279 avg yd edge. The Giants were in a good situation LW vs JAX who were off 3 straight wins vs foes with a losing record and travelling for the 1st time in 3 Wks. NY marched down the field on their opening drive but a fumble on the JAX 3 had them settle for a FG and a TD pass in the 2Q was called back on a penalty. The defense looked worn out after chasing Vick on MNF as they gave up 207 yds rushing (6.1) and allowed JAX to convert 10 of 16 on 3rd Dns. Manning without Smith and Nicks (109 rec 12.1 combined TY) had decent stats (226 yds 58% 2 TD) but there was obvious communication issues with the receivers. Injuries at RB, OL and in the secondary caught up to the Redskins LW vs MIN. McNabb had decent numbers (211 yds 60% 1-1) but MIN didn't fear WAS's ability to go deep and kept the safeties up holding them to 29 yds rushing (2.2). This is a game that fits the Giants abilities right now with WAS only being able to pass (19 or less rush att 3 L4 games), only winning the yardage battle once TY (-84 ypg w/o TEN game), giving up 163 ypg rushing (5.2) and the Giants are the play.

Chicago 31 DETROIT 28 - The Lions lost their 7th straight Thanksgiving game collapsing in the 4Q giving

up 3 TĎ's while being outgained 158-92 with 74 of the Lions yards coming in their final drive. They are only 1-11 SU afterwards despite the extra rest but have covered 3 of the L4. A dubious officiating call kept the Lions from winning (14-19 loss) the season opener as a 6.5 pt AD. The Bears dominated the game statistically with a 463-168 yd edgé but on 4 drives inside the DET 15 settled for 2 FG's, fumbled and were SOD with 4 TO's total on the day. Offensively the Lions have an edge the L4W with the #14 offense vs CHI #28 offense but the Bears have a big edge with the #3 defense vs the Lions #19 stop unit. DET's lack of a run game (#29 3.6) has defenses playing deep, giving up yards (378 L3W) while limiting the big play (18.3 ppg). DET's defense is starting to crack giving up 131 ypg (4.5) rushing the L3W along with 68% comp and an 8-0 ratio. CHI offense has done a 180' turnaround the L4W avg 34 rush att's (3.7) with only 9 sacks vs 21 rush att's (3.2) minus the CAR game and 31 sacks. The Bears Cover-2 is the real deal only allowing 226 ypg the L4W, holding Vick to 44 yds (4.9) with an 8-16 ratio with a 6.2 ypa (2009 Jets 8-17 ratio 5.4 ypa). We'll call for this at the line for now in a higher scoring game and revisit it later.

GREEN BAY 30 San Francisco 13 - The Packers beat the 49ers 30-24 LY but failed to cover as 6.5 pt HF's. The Packers had a 30-10 lead in the 4Q but SF got back in with 2 4Q TD's. GB ran out the final 5:00 to seal the win with a 484-284 yd edge. SF is in a bad spot off a MNF Div road game vs ARZ vs a GB team off a last second loss in ATL which had playoff seeding implications. GB outgained ATL 418-295 but their lack of a run game (Rodgers led team w/51 yds rushing) allowed the Falcons to dictate the tempo of the game. GB has the #13 and #2 units (+8 TO's) the L4W vs the 49ers #29 and #17 units (+2 TO's). GB also has a huge edge with Dom Capers and the #3 pass rush vs Troy Smith who has faced 3 deep pass rushes ranked 16th or worse in his 4 starts TY. GB has only allowed 195 ypg passing (61%) with a 6-10 ratio (5.72 ypa) at home TY. TB showed that if Smith is contained in the pocket behind a bad SF OL he struggles as he had 148 yds (52%) with an Int and 6 sacks. This is a steep line but look for Rodgers who has a 105.6 QBR at home (9.1 ypa) to take control of this game early vs a SF coming to a cold weather spot that has been outgained by 87 ypg on the road TY.

SAN DIEGO 37 Oakland 16 - The Raiders have covered 3 straight in the series pulling an outright upset in Wk 5 35-27 as a 6.5 pt HD. OAK got a quick 12-0 boost off of 2 blocked punts on SD's 1st 2 drives and had a 28-27 lead late 4Q with a 73/14pl drive. SD drove down the OAK 22 but Rivers was sacked/fumbled and OAK returned it 64 yds for the TD. SD had a 29-14 and 506-279 yd edge wasted. SD is off LW's SNF vs IND where Rivers had his entire receiving corps intact including WR Jackson and TE Gates for the 1st time TY. SD is outgaining foes by 171 yds at home which is 62 yds better than #2 NYG with a 33-17 avg score.
MIA followed PITs lead in beating OAK as they locked down their rush attack holding them to just 16 yds (1.3) and forcing the Raiders to beat them via the air. OAK simply doesn't have the receiving weapons to play from behind and 9 of OAK's 11 drives were for 30 yds or less being outgained 471-263. SD's defense has been very impressive at home where it only allows 59 ypg (3.2) foes are forced to abandon the run early on with a 5.5 ypa (58%) and with 20 of their 32 sacks happening. SD is still looking up at KC in the standings and if they lose to IND on SNF it'll only enhance their focus for Raiders week.

SEATTLE 21 Carolina 9 - Traveling across the country for a second straight away game is tough. It's even tougher as a 1-10 team that had a lead and lost it with 2:42 left. While Carolina did cover LW it was against a CLE team that is not used to being a favorite and while they did gain 326 yds (second best for the season) they only had 16 FD's. Seattle's offense has been hit or miss as in the L4W they gained 162, 490, 424 and only 288 yds LW. The Seahawks defense continues to struggle and in the L5W they've been mauled for 471 ypg but that was against 3 top 10 offenses in KC, NO and the NYG. Carolina's offense is the polar opposite and while the attrition is to fault for the putrid production the numbers are still surprisingly low as they've been held to under 280 yds in 8 of 11 games. The woes continue for John Fox and company as they've been outgained in every road game by an avg of 98 ypg and have been outFD'd by an avg of 22-14.

INDIANAPOLIS 31 Dallas 21 - The Cowboys travel with extra rest while the Colts are off a marquee

game vs the Chargers on Sunday Night. Dallas fought back from a 20-3 deficit vs New Orleans and finished with a 457-414 yd edge missing a 41 yd FG with :25 left. They've now covered 3 straight under new HC Garrett and that no quit attitude is what owner Jones is looking for. The Colts meanwhile continue to struggle finding healthy offensive players and despite being w/out their top 2 RB's (Addai & Hart) Manning still produced 467 yds of offense in the loss to NE. The Colts have become a force at Lucas Oil and prior to SN have won 17 straight meaningful games with the only loss LY when resting the starters. This year at home the defense has dominated holding opponents to 288 ypg and the speedy DE's have pressured opposing QB's as the D has totaled 11 sacks. Kitna has led his team to 205 yds at GB and 427 yds at the WYG in his 2 road starts but he's only produced ONE drive of over 7 plays and that was the final drive trailing GB 45-7. The dome noise is another new wrinkle and if the Colts happen to be off

B2B losses it makes this play even stronger.

Pittsburgh at BALTIMORE - The dog is 5-1 ATS with the Ravens beating PIT 17-14 as a 2 pt AD in the 1st meeting TY. PIT had over achieved with 3 straight wins without Roethlisberger and were looking forward to their bye. Despite a 320-210 yd edge PIT had a 14-10 lead late in the 4Q and stopped BAL twice on the PIT 2 with 2:44 left. PIT punted out of their EZ giving BAL the ball at the PIT 40 and 4 plays later gave up an 18 yd TD pass to lose. With both teams tied at 8-3 and facing 1 team with a winning record on the schedule this will be key in deciding the AFC North.
