NEWS AND NOTES: UCF dominated Marshall just like the final indicates with 23-12 FD and 386-263 yd edges. They did only lead 14-7 at the half in a game that had a 1:08 delay. The teams did not go to the locker room at half, instead continuing play and UCF got a 70 yd KR to open the 3Q setting up an 18 yd TD drive then got a 42 yd IR TD on the 8th pl 3Q to lead 28-7...West Virginia only had a 15-13 FD edge vs USF. The key play of the game was deja vu all over again for BJ Daniels. Against Florida, USF was in complete control when they took over late in the 1H deep in their own terr and Daniels' int led to a UFTD which got the Gators back into the game. Against WV, they only trailed 10-3 and got the ball back at their own 14 with :51 left 1H. Daniels once again tried to throw downfield and was int'd this time returned to the 17 and WV got a TD on the next play which put them ahead by 14. It was probably the only way they were going to get ahead of the 10 point spread all game...Kansas St did only have a 3-0 edge vs Kansas in the 1Q and for the game both had 20 FD's but KSU had a 460-331 yd edge. KSU got a 25 yd TD drive after a fmbl, a 58 yd TD drive after KU was SOD and a 51/9pl drive for a TD after a 16 yd PR and led 31-0 at the half. It was 38-0 when KU had a 2&6 at the KSU13 and they fmbl'd and KSU ret'd it 85 yds for a TD. KU went 61/9pl but was int'd in the EZ. KSU fmbl'd with 6:02 left leading 52-0 and KU went 44/10pl for a TD, 52-7...Michigan St was playing their 3rd big game in 3 weeks after having knocked off Top 10 Wisconsin and undefeated 5-0 Michigan but Illinois was also on their 2nd straight road game after pulling a road upset vs Penn St. MSU trailed 6-3 at half but an int set up a FG. MSU then went 77/4pl for a TD, 68/10pl for a 32 yd FG, 45/9pl for an 18 yd FG then after an int, 53/8pl for a TD to wrap it up, 26-6. MSU did have just 294 yds of offense...Missouri dominated Texas A&M much like the score indicates. While A&M had 9 TO's the previous 2 games, they did not have any and the offense was inept in the 1H with just 113 yards as Missouri had a 267-113 yd edge. Missouri led 16-0 at the half and extended it to 30-3 before A&M got a TD with 8:37 left. A&M gained 58 yds on 10pl before being SOD at the MO13 with 3:22 left. It was the first time since 1967 that MO held a conf foe scoreless for 6 straight quarters...Purdue led 14-0 at the half and a key play happened in the 3Q. Minnesota got an int and was headed for the EZ for a TD but QB Henry knocked the ball out of LB Tinsley's hand, it hit the pylon and was ruled a TB. PU went 80/13pl for a TD and a 21-0 lead in their 28-17 win. PU did have a 393-279 yd edge and rumors circulated before the game that UM Coach Brewster would be fired if they lost (he was)...Pitt came in with 3 non-conf losses but was undefeated in the Big East and started their quest for a BE Title in a big way. They led SU 28-7 at the half with a 257-139 yd edge...Georgia dominated Vanderbilt just as the 43-0 score indicates. They just missed the largest MOV in series history which had been 45-0 in 1976. UGA missed a 31 yd FG with 10:54 left which would have given them that margin. The Bulldogs also had 2 TD's overturned by replay. UGA finished with 22-8 FD and 547-140 yd edges...Southern Miss finished with 25-10 FD and 515-269 yd edges vs Memphis. In the 1H they had 41 and 19 yd TD drives after fumbles to lead 24-6 at the half. UM got an 81 yd TD pass early 4Q but SM answered with a 59 yd TD run six plays later to make it 41-16 and coasted...East Carolina had its largest home crowd ever and jumped out to a 21-0 lead after 1Q vs NC State but NCSt battled back and took a 27-24 lead on a 37 yd FG with 3:03 left. EC tied it on a 24 yd FG with 1:04 left. In OT EC got a TD but missed the xp. NCSt on 3&12 from the EC17 was int'd in the EZ...Duke had 7 turnovers to Miami's 2 and both had 22 FD's. UM had 224 yds rushing and 224 yds passing and Jacory Harris who was doubtful for the game hit 17-34-224 for UM and they did lead 28-10 after 3Q's...UNLV had a 19-18 FD edge vs CSU but big plays and some desperation hurt them. CSU did finish with a 492-274 yd edge. Trailing 27-10 UNLV went for it on 4&1 at its own 29 with 1:40 left in the half and were SOD and CSU got a 29 yd TD pass on the next play. In the 3Q they went for it on 4&12 at the CSU36 then on 4&20 at the CSU33 and of course failed on both. CSÚ scored 10 pts in the final 10:42 to win 43-10...Boston College blew some opportunities vs Florida St and had some unfortunate spots of the ball on FSU's final drive. After 1 FD on 3&1 they got a favorable spot for a FD then on 4&1 with 2:15 left went for it and once again a favorable spot gave them a FD and they ran out the clock taking off the final 8:04 on the 13 play drive......Ball St jumped out to a 28-7 lead over EM thanks in part to a 92 yd

KR TD and a 20 yd TD drive following a fumble. It was 28-14 at the half and BSU had 190 yds at half. They would have just 53 yds in the 2H allowing EM to finish with 26-16 FD and 490-243 yd edges. EM scored TD's on the first 2 drives of the 2H and got a TD with 4:48 left to take their first lead. Ball St got a TD with :34 left to force OT. 4★ CLEMSON over Georgia Tech - The dog is 18-3 ATS in this series. The home team is 3-8 ATS. Twelve of the L/15 have been decided by 5 or less. GT has now won 4 in a row SU and Johnson beat Swinney twice LY. The first was at home in the reg ssn, 30-27 (-5) and the 2nd was in the ACC Title game, 39-34 (E) and they had FD and ydg edges in both. This is Swinney's 3rd try at the GT option and GT avg 317 ypg rush (5.6) in '09 but in '08 here CU held them to 207 ypg (4.0). After scoring just 44 pts the L/10Q's, CU broke out a 31-7 win over MD, snapping a 3 gm losing streak. The Tigers were actually outgained 350-213 and outFD'd 18-13 but were helped by an 87 yd KRTD by Ellington and a 61 yd IRTD by Brewer. GA had a 4-0 TO deficit and WR Green was out with a shldr inj. GA's 487 yds of off were the most in a loss to an SEC tm in Richt's 9Y at GA. Last time here GA escaped 42-38 (-13). Richt's seat has cooled some after B2B blowout wins over SEC foes incl LW's 43-0 win over Vandy (547-140 yd edge) which gave us a 4★ LPS Winner. QB Murray is avg 236 ypg (62%) with a 12-3 ratio. RB Ealey rushed for career high 123 yds LW (369, 4.8 TY) UK is off a huge 31-28 come from behind (trailed 28-10 late 3Q) upset of #10 SC. UK QB Hartline is greatly improved over LY (256 ypg, 68%, 13-3). RB Locke (574, 5.3) DNP LW (shldr inj, CS). UK WR Cobb is one of the best athletes in the SEC (712 ttl yds). Hawks trailed 10-3 at HT LY but rallied to a 20-10 win as they held the Badgers to just 58 yds in the 2H. The Badgers are 2-6 ATS as an AD under Iowa alum HĆ Bielema. This is the last reg ssn matchup scheduled of this rivalry as the 2 will be in different divisions starting in 11. Despite 523-384 yd and 31-21 FD deficits opportunistic Iowa won in Ann Arbor for the 1st time S/'02 by taking advantage of 4 UM TO's which set up 14 pts. The Hawks also had a blk'd FG and the Wolves lost a fmbl at the lowa 15 as QB D-Robinson (shoulder) was KO'd in the 3Q. RB Clay (796, 5.9) became the 1st RB in 29 gms to run for 100 yd on OSU and is supported by super quick Fr White (560, 7.0). UW allows 115 rush ypg (3.6). Bielema was 0-4 vs Top 10 teams until LW and will find it difficult to focus on the Hawks after LW's big win. FORECAST: IOWA 33 Wisconsin 17 OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ OHIO ST over Purdue - OSU had 177 (62%) of their 287 vds come in the 4Q LY vs PU but their comeback fell short as their last drive was SOD at P38 w/2:16 left as Pryor was sk'd 5x and had 4 TO. The home tm and favorite are 8-3 ATS, PU is 2-17 SU and 6-18 ATS the L/6Y vs ranked opp (wins vs OSU LY and NW TY) but are 4-1-1 ATS vs OSU with 2 outright upsets. PU has moved to the read option under QB Henry who is 1 of the fastest Boilers and he has accounted for 399 yd and 5 TD in his 2 starts as PU has run for 200+ in 5 straight gms for the 1st time S/73. DE Kerrigán is #2 NCAA tfl and has terrorized Pryor the L/2Y with 15 tkl, 5 sk, 2 tfl, 2 FF and 1 FR. #1 OSU trailed Wisky 21-0 early 2Q before rallying but ultimately came up short vs the Badgers. UW sk'd a gimpy Pryor 4x and limited him to 212 yd (14-28 pass). OSU all'd a 100 yd rusher for the 1st time in 29 gms LW but are still #12 NCAA rush D (94, 3.0). OSU is a perfect 8-0 ATS the L/8 involving an opp they lost to the previous ssn ("revenge") and is 12-3 ATS off a SU loss vs Tressel

FORECAST: OHIO ST 45 Purdue 10 2* LOUISVILLE over Connecticut - UC has won 3 str vs UL and has gone 4-1-1 ATS. The avg MOV in this series is 14 ppg and the HT is 3-1-1 ATS. LY UC turned 4 UL TO's into 24 pts and won 38-25 (-13) with UL not attempting the xp after a TD on the final play. Prior to LY UC was outgained in each gm by an avg of 157 ypg. UC is fresh off a bye (Edsall 12-8 ATS off bye) while UL is off a 35-27 loss to Cincy in which RB Powell had a career high 209 rush (898, 7.8). UL QB Froman is avg 226 ypg (61%, 10-4). UC RB Todman has 761 (6.2) and their #55 off has been more productive since QB Endres (157 ypg, 60%, 5-2 ratio) took over 3 gms ago. UC was picked by some to win the BE in the pressn but comes in just 3-3 (0-1 in BE) while the supposedly rebuilding UL has played better than expected with the exact same record as UC. 2★ Nebraska over OKLAHOMA ST - NU was down 38-0 after 3Q's vs OSU in the L/gm ('07) and 114 (34%) of their 335 yds along w/14 pts came in the 4Q. NU is just 1-5 ATS vs OSU in B12 play. Pelini is 6-2 ATS as an AF (2-0 TY). NU was upset by a rested Texas squad who tweaked its offense during the bye for their 9th loss in 10 B12 meetings. UT's D held QB Martinez (121, 57%, 3-3, 758 rush) to just 97 ttl yds before he was benched in the 3Q and the Huskers failed to score an off TD. NU is #1 NCAA pass eff D (117, 47%, 4-11 ratio) led by future NFL DC CB Amukamara. OSU jumped out to a 21-0 1Q lead over TT and didn't look back winning in Lubbock for the 1st time S/'44 with a 32-21 FD and 583-392 yd edges. Triplets QB Weeden (#12 NCAA pass eff 328, 69%, 19-8), B12 rush leader RB Hunter (830, 6.2) and NCAA rec yd and scoring leader WR Blackmon (57, 16.8, 12 TD) power our #16 offense. NU is 5-3 ATS off a SU loss under Pelini and the Blackshirts give the Cowboys who have faced only 1 D in the NCAA's top 87 in ttl D a reality check

Navy had a 348-60 yd rush edge as ND was w/o leading rusher Allen (ankle inj, 448, 4.7 TY). ND has outgained Navy in each of the L/12Y by 128 ypg. Navy is off a 28-21 win over SMU which they trailed 14-0 at the half (outgained 375-337). QB Dobbs is avg 110 ypg (50%) with a 4-4 ratio and is the tm's #1 rusher (379, 2.9). ND is off a 44-20 win over WM and QB Crist is avg 265 ypg (59%) with a 14-5 ratio. ND has large edges on off (#33-77), def (#29-66) and ST (#26-110). ND is all'g 130 rush ypg (3.8) while Navy allows 160 pass ypg, 67% (#103 pass eff D). ND is 7-0 SU and 5-2 ATS S/00 in reg ssn neutral site gms. The rule in this series is to play against ND in South Bend and on ND when away from South Bend which results in a 15-1 ATS record!

VIRGINIA TECH 44 Duke 20 - In their 6 ACC matchups VT has outgained Duke in each (+227 ypg). LY VT only led 20-16 with under 10:00 left but Duke scored w/:25 left to make the final appear closer. Before Duke's last trip to Blacksburg (lost 14-3), they hadn't come within 24 pts of VT since joining the ACC. LW VT scored on 7 of its 1st 8 poss and put up the 2nd most 1H pts under Beamer in their 52-21 win over WF. QB Taylor had a record setting day throwing for 292 yds, 3 TD (tied career high) and now avg 189 ypg (62%) with a 12-3 ratio while leading the tm in rushing (480, 6.1). The Hokies have won and covered 5 str since the disastrous start to the season. The D did allow the most ever rush yds by a single RB (241) vs WF but VT finished with a 605-346 yd edge. Duke is off a 28-13 loss to Miami. The Devils went up early (3-0), but could not overcome 7 TO's (UM 14 pts off TO) incl 5 int by QB Renfree (now avg 270 ypg, 57%, 10-14 ratio). While Duke is 2-18 SU (13-17 ATS) on the ACC road, VT is 14-6 as a conf fav S/'05 and 9-0 SU (6-3 ATS) in this series w/3 shutouts.

MIAMI, FL 27 N Carolina 16 - UNC is 5-1 ATS vs UM. NC HC Davis has not lost to his former team as NC has pulled the upset each of the L/3Y. Last time here NC drove 56/7pl and scored the GW TD w/:46 left on a 14 yd TD pass (28-24, +7'). LY UM had a 435-329 yd edge but lost 33-24. The Canes are 6-15 ATS at home vs ACC foes and just 1-10 as a HF under Shannon. LW UM, behind a less than 100% QB Harris (shldr/groin), seemed flat in a 28-13 win over Duke. Harris comp under 50% for the 3rd str gm but, for the 1st time since the opener, did not throw an int. On the day UM finished with a 448-292 yd edge but the FD's were even despite forcing 7 TO's (incl 5 int, 1 IR TD). UM only managed 14 pts off the TO's. RB Berry did go over the 100 yd mark for the 3rd consec gm and leads with 539 (4.8). Hankerson is the top rec with 34 (15.9, 7 TD), NC is 8-4 as an AD under Davis. LW UNC set the tone early when WR Jones took a short slant 81 yds for a TD on the 1st pl and they rolled UVA 44-10, in their 1st win at Scott Stadium S/81. NC finished with a 479-335 yd edge but the FD's were even. QB Yates, one of the MIP QB in the country, hit 17-22 for 325 and is now avg 249 ypg (67%) with an 11-1 ratio.

BOSTON COLLEGE 17 Maryland 14 - The visitor has dropped 4 str ATS and MD is 0-2 SU in its 2 trips to Chestnut Hill losing by 15 ppg. Terrapins all'd just a 42 yd FG (gm winner) in the 2H LY to the Eagles after being SOD on the MD29 w/4:18 left, 19-17 (-6). LW BC forced 4 Fla St TO's and got a 43 yd IRTD to pull within 1 in the 3Q. BC actually went up early 4Q but FSU got a 42 yd TD on a reverse and held on. Despite being outgained 311-266 and outFD'd 19-9, BC only lost by 5 (+21') for their 1st ATS win TY (now 1-9 run). True Fr QB Rettig (ankle) ply'd the entire gm but only hit 9-24 for 95. BC rushed for over 100 for the 1st time since the opener. MD, who had been a thorn in Clem's side (won 3 of 4) fell 31-7 LW, despite QB O'Brien's career-high 302 yds. Their only TD came on a HB pass in the 2Q as despite having the FD and yd edges, ST's and D plays did the Terps in (87 yd KR TD, 61 yd IR TD). O'Brien has avg 241 (52%) with a 3-3 ratio in his 3 sts for the inj'd Robinson (0-1 LW, 1st action in 2W). BC has done well as a small fav (5-0 as 3 or less) but struggles when fav'd between 3'-9' (0-8).

E CAROLINA 34 Marshall 27 - Marshall has dropped 4 of 5 to EC incl an OT loss the last time here. The Herd comes in with a few extra days of rest after playing the previous Wed vs UCF, a game in which MU was held to 37 yds rush (1.9) and couldn't get anything going at QB as Anderson and Sullivan combined to hit just 46%. EC returns to CUSA action after hosting and coming out victorious over NCSt LW, a gamé in which they led 21-0 early but needed an int in OT to survive. LY MU trailed by 4 heading into the 4Q but threw 2 int's and was SOD on their L/3 poss in the 4 pt loss. EC may be drained after LW's effort and may overlook the 1-5 Herd.

Temple 23 BUFFALO 16 - TU has lost all 6 trips to Buffalo but won LY at home as the Owls held the Bulls out of the EZ until the 4Q (37-13, -3). In the tms 3 MAC gms UB has outgained TU in each (+140 ypg). Both lost to NI and needed to hold on to a final play vs BG. Against NI, TU was outgained 420-272 and lost 31-17 as a 3' pt AD, while UB was outgained 441-250 and lost 45-14 as a 14' pt AD. Against BG UB had 27-10 FD and 441-176 yd edges and won 28-26 as a 3 pt AD while TU was outFD'd 24-12 and outgained 323-307 and only won 28-27 as a 19' pt HF.TU QB Stewart threw a pick 6 in the 1Q vs BG and was benched as QB Gerardi (1st gm, PS#173) played the rest of the way throwing for 163 (60%) with a 2-0 ratio. TU RB's Brown and Pierce have comb for 959 yds (5.5). UB is allowing 3.8 ypc but gave up 281 (5.6) to NI which incl a late 90 yd rush TD (3.9 w/o).

Penn St 37 MINNESOTA 20 - PSU has outgained UM the L3Y by 198 ypg. The Lions are 8-1 ATS as an AF. This is PSU's 1st visit to TCF Bank but in their last visit to Minny they only won 28-27 in OT (-3) in '06. PSU is off a much needed bye after their worst home loss to an unranked tm (IL) in B10 play. PSU QB Bolden is #90 NCAA pass eff (196, 56%, 4-7 ratio) and he has just 2 TD pass since the opener. Royster (388, 5.0) is soon to be PSU's all-time runner but has run for 40 or fewer in 4 of 6 TY. PSU was without 11 regulars by gm's end vs IL but should see a handful return here. They are allowing their most rush ypg (146, 4.1) and ppg (18) S/03 when the Lions went 3-9. Amid rumors prior to the game that HC Brewster would be fired if he lost to Purdue, UM lost their 6th straight. PU led 21-0 in the 3Q and outran the Gophers 229-63. QB Weber (237, 56%, 14-6) actually has his best #'s since his rFr yr but has gotten little help from a run gm which avg 102 (3.4) vs BCS conf D's TY. UM is allowing 18-10 west 201 rush by 16 (5.6) and host the NCAA's fowest sky (3.9). Bit added to BSU here as B10 me a B10 worst 201 rush ypg (5.6) and has the NCAA's fewest sks (3). Big edge to PSU here as B10 tms are 4-0 ATS off a bye TY and Minny plays for an 8th straight week for interim HC/OC Horton.

PITTSBURGH 30 Rutgers 13 - The dog is 6-2 ATS with 4 outright upsets and the visitor has covered 4 in a row. In the last 2 trips to Pitt, Rutgers has upset the Panthers winning each game by DD's. LY RU QB Savage made his first start (23-39-248, 1-1 ratio), and Pitt (-6) won 24-17 which snapped its longest losing streak (4 gms) in this series and it was Wannstedt's first win over Rutgers. Pitt is off a dominating 45-14 win`at Syr'which delivered a Top Weekly LPS Winner for us. Pitt QB Sunseri threw for a career high 4 TD LW and is avg 205 ypg (66%) with a 9-3 ratio. RU is off an OT win over Army in which they trailed 17-3 after 3Q's. RU was outgained 404-250 LW and was held to -1 yds rushing. QB Dodd avg'd 287 ypg (61%) with a 4-1 ratio in his 2 sts (replacing inj'd Savage). DT LeGrand was paralyzed from the neck down after a collision vs Army. RU is 9-2 ATS as an AD, but Pitt is 3-1 as a BE HF and the Panthers continue their 8-2 ATS run vs BÉ opps.

This means the Chargers could be without 48% of its rec's (66) and 46% of its offense (1184 yds) here. We'll side with the healthier road team that has played à better quality of foes so far TY. FORECAST: New England (+) 31 SAN DIEGO 27

2★ Pittsburgh over MIAMI - This is the 4th meeting in 7 years with the Steelers improving to 4-0 SU and 3-1 ATS after beating MIA 30-24 as a 3 pt AF in the season finale LY. Henne left the game at the half with an eye injury. The Dolphins did play PIT pretty even in the 1H being outgained 201-176 and were only down 17-10. They were outrushed 202 (5.6) to 99 (4.0) on the day though. Both teams were in favorable spots LW with Roethlisberger getting a preseason worth of snaps vs CLE LW. While Roethlisberger was efficient (257 yds 59% 3-1) the coaching staff stayed true to its word and had a balanced attack (35 run/27 pass). MIA was in a great situation LW off a bye but were taken to OT by a GB team without 7 opening day starters. MIA only had a 22 yd edge but outrushed GB 150 (3.8) to 76 (3.6). Henne (231 yds 59% 2-1) wasn't as crisp was he should have been. MIA had an int, 3 punts, 2 FG and were SOD between their 1st and 2nd TD's. PIT's #1 rush defense has only given up one 20 yd run TY and their aggressive discipline play easily handled CLE's Wildcat attempts. PIT's #6 defense is back to playing tough physical football and will be the key to the win here.

KANSAS CITY 28 Jacksonville 13 - This is the 7th meeting in 10Y between these teams with the road team being 4-2 ATS. LY JAX beat KC 24-21 but failed to cover as a 6.5 pt HF. They did have a 426-301 yd edge and 12:26 TOP edge in the game by focusing on the run with 173 yds (4.2) vs 60 (4.3) for KC. This is a huge letdown spot for the Jags who are off their only scheduled primetime slot for 2010. JAX has only outgained 1 team TY (BUF by 75 yds), have been outgained 405-293 in the rest and Jones-Drew only has a single 100 yd rushing game (76 ypg 4.0 in rest). JAX is very vulnerable vs the pass (#29) giving up 282 ypg (67%) with a 12-4 ratio despite an improved pass rush (11 sacks TY vs 14 all 2009). For the 2nd straight week the Chiefs gave up long 4Q drives and saw the game slip away. They allowed drives of 70/9 and 80/9 vs HOU a week after letting IND go 71/12 to seal that game. Cassel has only passed for 210 yds once TY (150 ypg 57% 4-2 in rest) and is more of a game manager. KC is competing via the run game (#1, 165 ypg 4.9), special teams (#1 prior to LW) and disciplined play (23 penalties #2). While KC hasn't covered as a HF since the end of 2006 (0-6-1 ATS since) we'll side with the loud home crowd vs a Jags team travelling on a short week.

TENNESSEE 20 Philadelphia 13 - The Titans are 1-6 ATS after a MNF game but are 13-4 ATS vs the NFC (PHI 1-4 ATS vs AFC). The NFC East is widely regarded as being the toughest Div in the NFL but TEN is 2-0 SU and ATS vs them TY. Yards aren't everything as the Titans have shown being outgained 491-296 vs the Giants and Cowboys. They capitalized on sloppy play as both teams combined for 23 penalties (219 yds), -6 TO's, 8 sacks while giving up 160 yds (4.7) rushing and outscored by 13 ppg. TEN is also better than its 1-2 SU and ATS home record shows holding foes to 247 yds (87, 3.3 on the ground). PHI dominated ATL who was being built up as the best team in the NFC LW. After being dinged for checking down too much vs WAS (5.7 ypa) Kolb has been more aggressive in his L2 games with 290 yds (73%) with 4-1 for a 9.7 ypa. He will be without #1WR Jackson (19 rec, 20.8) who took his 2nd concussion in a year. PHI's #23 rush defense (116 ypg 4.2) without DT Bunkley (elbow) will be something the Titans #5 rush offense (138 ypg 4.6) will look to exploit. Young has only avg'd 131 ypg played up to LW's challenge but now face a more physical home team that relishes non-conf play.

(67%) with a 3-2 ratio at home TY he has faced OAK, PIT and DEN when they were all healthy. PHI CHICAGO 17 Washington 14 - WAS is primed for a letdown spot here after upsetting PHI, beating GB in OT and taking on the Colts on SNF LW. CHI was in a great situation LW at home getting SEA on the road off a bye where they usually struggle. CHI had 14 rushes vs 39 pass att's which exposed Cutler to 6 sacks and 9 QBH's. They drove into the SEA 16 three times in the 1H but settled for a TD and 2 FG's. The Bears were able to establish any drive as they were 0-12 on 3rd down conv LW and are a horrific 7 of 60 (12%) since week #2. While we expect Culter to improve from LW (17-39) after being KO'd the week prior the Martz offense continues to be a work in progress. The Redskins have been uneven on

their defensive sack production but they have gotten 9 sks vs the 2 pass off they've faced (HOU and GB). We'll call Chicago by FG and wait to see if there is an over-adjustment on the line.

NEW ORLEANS 31 Cleveland 6 - The Saints are clearly the dominant team statistically with the #7 and #7 units (-1 TO's) vs the Browns #24 and #23 units (-4 TO's). CLE will likely go with McCoy again who did better than expected vs PIT with 281 yds (70%) with 1-2 ratio with 1 int coming off a perfectly thrown pass that bounced off the WR's hands. Both WR/KR Cribbs and Massaguoi were KO'd of LW's game with concussions and their status is uncertain. CLE rallied after Cribbs was KO'd and were only outgained by 50 yds. They now face a NO team that finally got its groove back LW vs TB with a 475-277 yd edge. NO had a very balanced game (32 rush vs 32 pass) as NO gained 212 yds (6.6) on the ground. Brees now gets CLE's #23 pass def allowing an 11-4 ratio with a 8.0 ypa. CLE's offense centers around Hillis (69 yds, 3.1 L2W) and only 6 of McCoy's 23 completions were to a WR (59 yds 9.8). While NO is 1-6 ATS as a DD HF they have a vastly better QB situation, more speed at the skill positions, are at home. For the 2nd straight week with a rookie QB CLE takes to the road and could be short 2 key weapons.

BALTIMORE 37 Buffalo 13 - While BAL is a Super Bowl favorite the Bills are the favorite for the

1st pick in the 2011 draft. BUF returns from its bye week (6-2-1 ATS) and 14 pt dogs are 1-5 ATS afterwards. BUF is 6-16-1 ATS vs 3-4 defenses as its overmatched OL struggles vs elite NT's such as BAL's Ngata. Fitzpatrick has been an upgrade at QB for BUF with 198 ypg (61%) with a 7-2 ratio but their installation of the 3-4 has been a disaster. BUF is -380 yds rushing (4.8) on the ground and LY's unit which had a 14-28 ratio with a solid 6.0 ypa is giving up 208 ypg (68%) with an 11-1 ratio (7.6 ypa). BUF has allowed teams to convert 33 of 68 3rd Dns (49%) and are dead last at TOP with -9:58. Unlike CIN, BAL is using the run while it grows into the passing game and is rather balanced (-13 run). While BAL isn't getting a bunch of sacks (17th) they've earned 1 every 16 att's. The #3 pass defense is allowing a 4-3 ratio with a solid 6.2 ypa. Home teams off a road OT loss are 3-11-1 ATS the L3Y and this is a hefty line with a team about to go on a bye. However after blowing a 10 pt lead vs NE the Ravens will be in a foul mood and the talent difference is simply to vast here. San Francisco at CAROLINA - The favorite is 4-1 ATS when CAR returns from a bye. The Panthers however return to a favorable situation as they get a SF team 2-23 SU in the EST. SF will also be dealing with the distractions around travelling to London next week. CAR has been outgained in 4 of 5 games TY being held to 147 vs CHI due to a depleted WR unit. CAR has a good chance to get WR Smith (ankle sprain) back and used the bye to get WR's Clowney (Jets) and Thomas (WAS) up to speed with the offense. CAR's #12 defense is pretty respectable (3.8 ypc allowed 7-9 ratio 6.1 ypa) considering they've lost the TOP battle in each game (30th -8:12). SF has been outgained 352-259 on the road TY as the OL has failed to dominate the POA being outrushed 127 (4.2) to 58 (3.0). SF came away with the win vs OAK LW thanks to the defense which held OAK to 83 yds passing (38%) with 2 ints. They held OAK to 67 yds rushing (2.3) if a 43 yd WR end around is omitted. Smith was awful in the 1H with 98 yds (40%). In the 2H Smith had 2 TD's as SF had a 225-67 yd edge as OAK imploded. We are split on this game as while SF has better overall talent, Fox is a better coach than Singletary and we want to see if Smith will return for CAR.

TAMPA BAY 21 St Louis 18 - What a difference a season makes! LY these 2 teams were a combined 0-12 SU and 3-9 ATS after 6 games. Led by young QB's the Rams and Bucs are pretty even statistically. STL has the #20 and #16 units (0 TO's) vs the Bucs #23 and #26 units (+5 TO's). However Bradford (226 ypg 57% 7-8) faced 5 defenses ranked 22nd or lower prior to SD. While STL has matched its combined win totals from 2008 and 2009 all 3 were at home. Freeman (226 ypg 61% 6-3) has faced 4 defenses ranked 13th or higher with 2 road wins. STL showed heart LW and after getting shelled on the scoreboard 44-6 at DET they not only held their own against SD but had a dominating 206-86 yd HT edge and led 17-3. TB meanwhile ran into an angry Saints team LW without starting Čtr Faine out 6 wks knee). NO finally stretched the field and TB was outgained 475-277. While both teams are making positive strides it must be noted that the Rams are 1-14 SU on the road with their only win at a winless DET LY. On the flip side TB is only 2-11 SU at home beating CLE TY and GB LY and being a fav is still new as they've only been the chalk once in 21 games (pushed vs CLE).

OAK dominated on the ground with a 241 (7.1) to 80 (2.9) rush edge. They held the Broncos to 3 FG's and a TD on 4 trips into their red zone and won the game with a 10 yd TD pass with :35 left. DEN was without 3 defensive starters and 2 key defensive backups vs the Jets LW. They let the game slip away giving up a 80/10 yd drive late with arch-nemesis Tomlinson doing them in. After upsetting SD at home with great special teams play the Raiders struggled on offense kicking 3 FG's on 3 drives into SF's 22. The technical aspect goes against DEN who is just 1-8-1 ATS as a Div HF while OAK is 10-2 ATS as a Div AD. The Broncos are also just 2-10-1 ATS as a HF and the one cover this year was courtesy of +4 TO's vs SEA as they only finished with a 369-339 yd edge. DEN just finished a stretch of being an underdog in 4 straight games and teams are just 1-4 ATS after having played the physical Jets team TY. The Broncos D has allowed 161 ypg (4.9 ypc) rushing the L3W which the Raiders will be able to exploit. While OAK OL has been thrashed allowing 21 sks that is not one of DEN's strengths as they have just 7 (1/26 att)

Minnesota at GREEN BAY - MIN swept both meetings LY SU and ATS as Favre and Rodger's combined for a 12-1 ratio. The deciding factor in both games was the Vikings ability to get to Rodgers who was sacked 8 and 6 times respectively. GB was in poor shape due to injuries LW and are off their 2nd straight OT loss. MIN found themselves in a tough matchup vs the Cowboys and were able to outlast them for the win. Both teams are looking up at the Bears in the standings and the loser could be relegated to competing for a Wild Card spot. HC Hawkins questionably went for 2 (and missed) on CU's 1st 2 TD and the Buffs also fmbl'd going into the EZ which Baylor rec'd for a TB. QB Hansen (173, 67%, 6-6) QB'd the whole way vs Baylor after being benched vs MO. RB Stewart has 618 (4.6) and must carry the load at 5-6 175 with #2 RB Lockridge OFY. Buffs are #73 pass eff D (234, 67%, 12-7). These are 2 desperate teams at 3-3 but the difference is that Buffs are playing for the well liked HC Hawkins' job.

Fresno St 34 SAN JOSE ST 13 - FSU has won 15 of the L/16 gms (S/'91) with the lone loss coming

here in '06. FSU is on a 5-1-1 ATS run in this series and the fav is 6-0-1 ATS (push LY). The HT is 5-2-1. LY the Bulldogs scored 34 unanswered after the Spartans took an early 14-7 lead in a 41-20 win (-20). Last time here ('08), FSU trailed 10-3 at HT before outscoring SJSt 21-0 in the 2H. With the game tied at 10-10 late 3Q, FSU HC Hill decided to run the ball right at SJSt as 24 of FSU's L/25 plays were rushes in a 24-10 (-3') win. Points have been hard to come by for the Spartans as they are dead last in the NCAA (#120) in scoring off (8.9 ppg) and the most they have scored TY in a game is 16. TCU 38 Air Force 17 - LY in freezing rain, AF forced 3 TO's (2 inside its 10) and scored w/:57 left but TCU rec'd the onside. AF had just 4 off plays that were 15+ yds. The Falcons are 1-6 at Amon G. Carter (only win was LY's bowl). AF is 0-2 ATS TY (8-6 ATS) on the MWC road and TCU is 20-2 SU and 18-4 ATS in MWC HG's. LW TCU got off to a slow start once again, which is surprising at home. They did get 2 TD's in the last 1:30 to make it a respectable 17-0 and they have now outscored opps 118-10 at home in the 1H. In the 3Q, BYU scored the first points vs TCU in over 175 min. TCU's off was held 100 yds under its avg and they only rushed for 108 (had avg'd 249 ypg). After hesitating to tack on pts, HC Patterson decided to go for it on 4&3 late 4Q for the 31-3 margin. QB Dalton is avg 248 ypg (76%) with a 10-0 ratio at home TY. LW AF had 2 failed 2pt conv's (1 was called good, then overruled) in a 27-25 road loss to SDSt. AF, who entered avg 353 ypg rush, was held to 312, but still ranks #1 in the NCAA. They did lose #2 rusher Tew (out 4-6 wks) and were already without WR Fogler when Kauth (CS) was inj'd (AF has no bye TY)

which will hurt as TCU has shutdown the AF option the L/2 (161, 142 tll ydsl).

UTEP 44 Tulane 27 - The HT in this series is 4-0 SU and 3-1 ATS (1st meeting in '05 was in Ruston, LA due to Katrina). The Wave was blasted LW in Tulsa (all'd 332 rush yds) as the Hurricane delivered a 4★ LPS despite Tulane QB Griffin putting up a career-best 412 pass yds. UTEP on the other hand fell to UAB as the weak opp's that they had faced so far this ssn apparently caught up to them (Blazers had 25-15 FD and 500-229 yd edges). LY UTEP led w/1:13 left but all'd an 11 yd TD pass with a second left and then lost in OT. While UTEP is just 5-13 ATS as a HF, TU has now dropped 11 consec CUSA AG's (3-8 ATS) and will likely continue that trend here.

San Diego St 41 NEW MEXICO 13 - Rocky Long has won 9 straight in this series (8 as NM HC and LY as SDSt DC). SDSt has dropped 4 str in Albuquerque incl 70-7 the last time here. NM is 13-2 ATS in the series and the dog is 13-7 ATS with 6 outright upsets. LY NM did lead 20-16 in the 4Q and had a 386-303 yd edge but was done in by -4 TO's. LW SDSt fought off AF's comeback bid and knocked off their 1st ranked foe S/96 in a 27-25 win (AF had two failed 2pt conv). RB Hillman ran for 191 (8.0) moving his total to 785 (6.7) with 10 TD TY. QB Lindley is avg 274 ypg (55%) with a 10-4 ratio and has 2 NFL caliber rec's in Sampson (27, 19.5) and Brown (29, 17.0). NM is waiting to get word on early yr starting QB Holbrook (CS), and the team has avg just 176 ypg pass. The Lobos are off a bye after getting their first cover of the yr in a 16-14 loss at NMSt 2 weeks ago (+2'). SDSt will be a 20+ pt fav for the 1st time S/96. Expect Rocky Long to have his SDSt D ready to tee off on lowly NM.

LOUISIANA 31 Wku 24 - WKU's 1st trip to Lafayette S/'98. LY WKU trailed just 20-14 mid-3Q and after a TD (2pt) was down by 8 with 5:11 left. They elected to KO but UL ran out the clock with 9 straight runs. WKU is off a devastating loss as it looked like they were about to end their 25 gm (now 26) losing streak with a 24-7 4Q lead but lost 35-30 as a 1 pt HF. UL also could not hold onto a 4Q lead (21-17) over Troy as they had 5 TO but only lost 31-24 as a 20 pt AD. UL is 2-2 in SBC play and would need a Troy meltdown to have a shot at the title. WKU's QB Jakes is avg 150 ypg (53%) with a 7-4 ratio but the off depends on RB Rainey who leads with 771 (5.0). Not good news for a UL D that allows 143 ypg (4.2) rush. UL QB Masson is avg 213 ypg (55%) with an 8-3 ratio while the top active RB, Aaron Spikes has just 132 (2.6).

ARKANSAS ST 27 Florida Atl 24 - The home tm is 5-0 SU outgaining the visitor in each by an avo 156 ypg. LY FAU trailed 9-7 at HT but the 2H was a diff story as they scored TD's on all 4 poss. QB VanCamp had 242 yds (67%) with a 3-0 ratio LY in place of the inj'd Rusty Smith. LY QB Aplin made his 1st career start vs FAU going 20-27 for 168 with a 1-0 ratio and 82 rush yds. FAU is off a bye while ASU is off a 36-34 loss to Indiana as a 10 pt AD despite being outgained 505-337. ASU has the off edge (#95-114) but FAU has the def edge (#97-114). Aplin is avg 265 ypg (61%) with a 12-6 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 230 (2.8). FAU RB Morris leads with 386 (4.1) while QB VanCamp is avg 204 (63%) with a 5-4 ratio. ASÙ is 2-0 SU/ATS vs NT and ULM while FAÚ went 0-2 SU and 0-1-1 ATS.

MIDDLE TENN 38 Ulm 17 - With a win over MT LY ULM would've been guaranteed a bowl but despite holding MT to 114 yds below their ssn avg and to just 4 FD's and 87 yds in the 2H they were done in by 2 int (led to 2 MTTD's) and lost 38-19 (+3'). The Warhawks are 24-9 ATS the L/9Y in SBC AG's and 2-8 SU and 6-4 ATS all-time vs the Blue Raiders. ULM pulled a huge comeback with 28 4Q pts vs WKU to win 35-30 as a 1 pt AD. ULM's off is led by QB Browning, who is avg 214 (63%) with a 7-5 ratio and is their top rusher with 230 (2.6). MT is off a 42-14 loss to GT as an 18 pt AD as they were outgained 405-316 and were - 4 TO's. MT QB Dasher, playing in just his 2nd gm this ssn, threw 4 int. Dasher is avg 173 ypg (58%) with a 3-5 ratio. RB Tanner leads with 380 (5.5). MT has the off edge (#99-111) while ULM has the def edge (#99-107).

Louisiana Tech at BOISE ST - LT appears to have settled in on QB Jenkins as its top triggerman and he didn't disappoint LW as he was 31-44 for a career-high 417 yds and 3 TD (avg 148 ypg, 71%, 6-2 ratio) as he directed the Bulldogs to 683 ttl yds (4th highest mark in LT history) in a 48-35 win over ID. BSU has outscored its opponents 285-74 TY and is an amazing 36-0 in WAC HG's! Can Boise continue to impress or will LT keep it under the inflated number?

PRO ANGLES
There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the number in the () indicates how many angles apply to that team. The higher the number the stronger the angle play.

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
