NEWS AND NOTES: Air Force got off to a slow start vs UNLV but then rolled. The Falcons did have a couple of blown opportunities or could have won by more than 15. In the 1Q AF had a 1&gl at the 4 but fmbl'd at the 2 and the Falcons actually trailed 17-14. AF got a TD with 9:33 left to go up 35-20 but UNLV faked a punt from the AF49 and fired incomplete with 5:38 left. AF got 3 FD's and had a FD at the 12 but took a knee on the final 2pl...Washington wore black uniforms for the first time in school history and also painted the endzones black in this Thursday night game. UCLA led 7-0 behind backup QB Richard Brehaut and then LY's Groza Winner, Kai Forbath, missed a 44 yard FG at the end of the 1Q. UW missed a 53 yd FG but would drive 61/8pl and got a TD with 5:57 left in the half to tie it at 7. UW had a 165-117 yd edge at the half. UCLA lost Brehaut on the 3Q's 2nd series and the teams would combine for 8 punts on the next 8 poss. Brehaut was replaced by Darius Bell (a running QB). With 6:22 left, Bell threw an int that was ret'd 28 yds for a TD and UW took a 17-7 lead. They brought in 4th string QB Clayton Tunney who hit 1-8-13 and had a pass int'd and UW tacked on another TD 3pl later capping a 43 yd drive with 4:24 left for a misleading 24-7 win in what was a 1-score game early-4Q. UCLA's 3 QB's combined for a ridiculous 6-25 with 3 int...Boise only led 3-0 after 1Q and 10-0 mid-2Q. Fresno fmbl'd at the Boise30 down 17-0 and BSU led 20-0 at the half. In the 2H BSU would get 4 TD's and a FG. Three of their TD drives were 22 yds (after 14 yd IR), 40 yds (after 12 yd punt) and 36 yds (after 19 yd IR). Overall BS was impressive statistically with 516-125 yds (after 12 yd punt) and 36 yds (after 19 yd IR). Overall BS was impressive statistically with 516-125 yd and 31-9 FD edges and came out in orange for the game trying to dispel the theory they win at home with blue uniforms on blue turf...Kansas actually led Oklahoma St 14-10 and the key play of the game happened with 8:27 left in the 2Q as they trailed 17-14. They were stuffed on 3&gl from the 1 and went for it on 4&gl from the 1 and were stopped. OSU led 20-14 at the half. After each team missed a FG in the 3Q OSU got a TD with 6:16 left in the 3Q to lead by 13. They blocked a punt for a TD to extend it to 20 then drove 61/5pl for a TD. KU got to the OSU40 but punted and OSU went 85/12pl for a TD with 5:41 left for the final margin...Louisville's leading rusher was actually P Chris Philpott who gained 21 yds on a fake punt. Bilal Powell had zero yds on 4 carries but was forced to the sideline with an illness. UL led 10-7 after rec'ing a fmbl for a TD but WV went 82/8pl for a TD to lead 14-10 at the half. There were 9 punts on the first 10 drives of the 2H. UL was SOD at the WV47 with 4:59 left and WV had a 41 yd FG blk'd with 2:33 left but on the next play UL was int'd at WV47 with 4:59 left and WV had a 41 yd FG blk'd with 2:33 left but on the next play UL was int'd at midfield and WV ran out the clock...USF had a 162-81 yd edge vs Pitt at the half but missed a couple opportunities at TD's and also missed a 52 yd FG and the game was tied at 3. Tulsa had a 543-363 yd edge but twice opted to go for it on 4th&long passing up makable FG's. Tulsa had a FD at the UTEP 18 but with 2:49 left on 4&22 they passed up a 47 yd FG and fired incomplete. UTEP got 2 FD's to the TU36 but on 4&10 were int'd at the 30 with 1:40 left...Clemson had a 196-49 yd edge at the half getting a 40 yd TD pass with :46 left 1H to lead 13-0. CU led 30-3 before Wake Forest went 79/12pl getting a garbage TD with 6:02 left and CU finished the game at the WF36...Wyoming RB Alvester Alexander ran for a school record 5 TD's as WY beat Colorado St 44-0 in the Border War. WY dominated as you would think by the final with a 479-162 yd edge. It was 23-0 at half and WY had a pair of 80 yd TD drives to open the 3Q and extend it to 37-0...Michigan St had a frustrating 1H vs Purdue and very nearly lost the game despite coming in with just 1 loss on the year. PU got an 80 yd TD run and a 35 yd IR TD. MSU had a pair of long drives for TD's but missed the xp and with 11:10 left in the 2Q, MSU had an 11-1 FD edge but actually trailed 14-13. PU scored a TD with :08 left in the 1H and opened the 3Q with a drive for a TD and led 28-13. MSU got a TD and 2 pt conv with 6:54 left to pull within 3 and then blk'd a punt and rec'd at the 3 and got a TD on the next play to go up 35-31. PU did get to the MSU20 but on 4&7 was int'd at the 17...It was another incredible loss for North Carolina as they had

a 404-275 yd edge but Tom O'Brien amazingly improved to 4-0 vs NC thanks to a TD pass in the 3Q on what looked like it would be a sure incompletion on 4th down then a PRTD and a stopped 2 pt conversion at the end. NC settled for 19, 21 and 38 yd FG's and despite having a 338-137 yd edge, they only led 19-10. It appeared NCSt's last gasp happened with .52 left 3Q. The Wolfpack opted to go for it on 4&2. QB Wilson, under pressure, threw it out of the back of the EZ but 3 players who were actually outside the EZ tipped the

ball in the air and it came back into the EZ and was caught by Spencer for a 2 yd TD. NCSt then benefitted from an 87 yd PR TD to take the lead. At the end of the game, UNC got a TD but their 2 pt conversion was incomplete and NCSt rec'd the onside kick leading 27-25 and later with NC pinned at their 5 NCSt tacked on a safety for a misleading final...lowa has led or been tied with 4:00 to go in all of their losses this year...Wisconsin RB's Montee Ball and James White became the 2nd pair of Badgers to rush for 150+ in the same game, the first duo since 1973 when Billy Marek (226) and Ken Starch (184) did it vs Wyoming. Scott Tolzien hit his first 13 passes which made it 24 straight including the end of LW's blowout win vs Indiana. Michigan's Denard Robinson set the FBS record for most rushing yards in a season by a QB (1538) topping AF's Beau Morgan's mark and became the first player in NCAA history with 1,500 yards rushing and 2,000 passing in the same year. UW led 24-0 at the half with a 379-124 yd edge. UM rallied to 31-14 and 38-21 and even 41-28 but got no closer...South Carolina was coming off their big win over Florida but Troy fmbl'd the opening KO and SC got a 17 yd drive for a TD. Later Troy fumbled a punt snap and SC went 29/2pl for a TD to lead 21-0. Later, after a fmbl they drove 7 yds for a TD and then got a 22 yd IR TD with 1:42 left in the half. Troy, on the last play of the 1H, threw a pass that was int'd and ret'd 56 yds for a TD and SC led 56-7. Alshon Jeffery became SC's single season school record holder with 1,210 yds topping Sidney Rice's 2005 record...While it was an Indiana HG, Penn St's white outnumbered IU's red 3-1 at FedEx Field. The game was tied at 24 when PSU missed a 43 yd FG but they blk'd a punt for a TD late 3Q and after an int added a 35 yd FG. After IU was SOD, PSU drove 56/12pl and got ahead ATS with a TD with 3:20 left. IU punted on 4&9 with 2:01 left... Duke had 22-19 FD and 443-410 vd edges but GT was fortunate to come away with the win. Duke led 13-6 at the half with a 227-136 yd edge. The key play of the game happened with GT trailing 13-9. Duke had a FD at the GT14 threat-ening to make it a 20-9 game but was int'd and ret'd 85 yds for a TD and instead of leading by 11, they trailed 16-13. Duke was down 23-20 when they missed a game tying 34 yd FG with 9:20 left. GT faced a 3&9 at their own 21 and got a 79 yd TD pass to go up by 10. Duke missed a 54 yd FG with 5:50 left and GT got 3 FD's and ran out the clock...While Kent St was destroyed by 35 by W Michigan they did have some key mistakes and actually finished with a 431-426 yd edge. KSU was int'd setting up a WM 28 yd drive for a TD. KSU on 4&gl from the 2 faked a FG and was SOD. KSU on 2&gl from the 3 was int'd in the EZ late 2Q then SOD on 4&4 at their own 48 with :16 left in the half and WM got a 42 yd FG 3pl later. KSU was SOD at the WM9 in the 3Q and trailed 31-3 four pl later...In the 1H Miami, FL had a dominating 265-126 yd edge vs Virginia Tech. UM fmbl'd at the VT34 with 6:57 left in the half and missed a 47 yd FG at the end of the half. The game was tied at 17 when VT got an 84 yd TD run. UM had a TD go off the fingertips of WR Benjamin and punted then was int'd on their next 3 poss and VT added a TD...Stanford scored on every poss with Andrew Luck on the field going up 48-7. This was the most lopsided loss for Cal in the rivalry since Stanford beat them 41-0 back in 1930. Brock Mansion fmbl'd on the 3rd play setting up an SU score and it was all downhill from there. In fact, SU had a 312-119 yd edge at the half and led 31-0. Cal even scored on 4&7 with a hook and ladder for a 23 yd TD with :15 left...UCF returned the opening KO vs Tulane for a TD and after a pair of TO's got 4 and 29 yd drives rolling to a 38-0 lead in their 55-14 win. TU was playing without starting QB Ryan Griffin and Kevin Moore hit 15-34-156 delivering an Early Bird POW winner on UCF as the line went from 14' to 17'...In the Texas A&M/Nebraska game NU had 16 pen's while A&M had 2. With 5:51 left, NU was called for a very questionable roughing the QB penalty and NU HC Pelini was penalized for unsportsmanlike conduct...LSU got another narrow escape, this time vs Mississippi. Houston Nutt is known for knocking off Top 5 teams and UM led 24-23 after 3Q's and also led 30-29 with 8:49 left. Markeith Summers got a 65 yd TD pass with 4:57 left to give Missis-sippi the lead but unfortunately he dove into the EZ so UM had to kick off from its own 15 and LSU started at midfield setting up the game winning TD drive with :44 left. UM only got out to their own 25 and was int'd on the game's final play...Memphis has now lost 10 games in consecutive seasons and 3rd time since 2006. The key pointspread play happened late. UAB led 31-15 and had a FD at was SOD at the 5 with 1:13 left but UAB only won by 16...Texas/Florida Atl was closer than the final as the Longhorns had some key plays. UT only led 17-7 and FAU went for it on 4&34 but was SOD at the UT18 with just :34 left in the half. UT got 2 FD's then threw a Hail Mary on the final play of the half and their prayer was answered with a TD for a 24-7 lead. FAU only trailed 30-17 and had a FD at the UT44 in the 4Q when they were int'd and ret'd 57 yds for a TD. FAU fmbl'd on the next play and UT drove 41/9pl to finally get ahead ATS, 44-17 and UT tacked on a TD with 2:26 left for the 51-17 final...Nevada played well for having a big game vs Boise St on deck but were fortunate to get the margin that they did. New Mexico St missed a 46 yd FG in the 1H and NV, leading 24-3 had a FD at their own 21 when they got a 79 yd pass to Taua for a TD with :22 left to make it 31-3 at halftime. NMSt was int'd at the NV33 then punted with 11:32 left trailing 38-6. NV got a 57 yd TD run by Mark with 10:03 left. NMSt had a 4&2 at the NV17 and were int'd & ret'd 90 yds for a TD with 5:17 left and NMSt's final drive ended on a fmbl at the NV13 with 1:06 left. Continued on page 2

After struggling with a finger inj the L/3 QB Henry played the whole way (16-26 for 189 2-2 ratio and 53 rush yd). PU is #96 pass eff D. This is both teams bowl game.

MARSHALL 30 Tulane 23 - Both schools come in a bit wounded as MU was w/o 3 RB's (50 rush yds, 2.0) and a slew of WR's LW in their loss to SMU while TU was missing QB Griffin (200 ypg, 61%, 13-5 ratio) with a wrist inj in the blowout loss to UCF. Bkup QB Moore threw for 156 yds (44%) with an 0-2 ratio and he could be once again get the call. LY the Wave had a +81 yd edge (+7 FD's) but 4 TO's resulted in 17 MU pts in the Herd's 21 pt win (-3'). LW, despite UM Harris (206 ypg, 54%, 14-11 ratio) being healthy, former 4th string true Fr Morris was the only QB to see time. UM had a 265-126 1H yd edge but due to a 3-1 TO deficit and a missed FG, it was tied at 10. BUF deserves to be commended for their 2 wins but they were vs a DET team that has now lost 26 straight road games and a CIN team that has imploded. Look for PIT to have a solid effort here as Roethlisberger gets a BUF defense giving up an 18-2 ratio, with only 15 sacks (1 every 21 att's) with BUF's home field edge nullified.

2★ New Orleans over DALLAS - Thursday - The Saints were playing for a perfect record LY when the Cowboys came in for a Sat night game and pulled a 24-17 upset as a 7.5 pt AD. DAL had a 439-336 yd edge and held the Saints to just 1 of 7 on 3rd Dns. Prior to LW's game HC Payton said his #4 defense was playing at a better level than the 2006 unit that finished 11th overall allowing 307 ypg and 20.1 ppg, NO's has only finished with a top 10 defense 7 times in 43 seasons and are allowing 292 ypg and 17.0 ppg in DC Williams 2nd year. With their struggles TY this is the Cowboys Super Bowl and a loss here would probably get their 12/12 game vs PHI flexed. DAL has won 5 straight Thursday games (B2B games in 2007) with a 426-275 yd edge and 33-11 avg score. Only the 2007 GB team was a playoff unit (13-3) and with the other 4 teams finishing a combined 17-47. DAL has been more focused under Garrett (-13 ypg but +14 ppg vs Phillips) but NO is healthier, better rested with the recent bye and this isn't a long trip. Turkey Day Play: New Orleans

2★ SEATTLE over Kansas City - The NFC West leader faces off against the AFC West leader. Cassel played in SEA back in 2008 and while the Chiefs travel here with better numbers the situation favors Seattle. KC has dropped 4 straight on the road going 1-3-1 ATS in that span. Seattle is now 3-1 SU/ATS at home and are not only off loss LW to New Orleans but were also embarrassed in their last home game, 41-7 to the NYG. The Chiefs offense revolves around their rush attack and they've been slowed avg 105 ypg and 3.9 ypc and that incl's a 39 yd run LW vs the porous Cardinals. Also an issue is the KC pass protection which allowed only 5 sacks the first 6 weeks but has allowed 3+ sacks 3 times the L4W. Seattle losses are all very explainable as they were - 4 TO's at Denver and St Louis, Oakland, the NYG and New Orleans all reside in the top 10 in defense. The strong Qwest home field edge is the difference. FORECAST: SEATTLE 33 Kansas City 18

OTHER GAMES New England at DETROIT - Thursday - Prior to the season this was circled by many as an easy win for Patriots backers. NE is 19-1 SU but only 11-8-1 ATS vs NFC foes. They are in a tough situational spot travelling after a short week vs the Lions only national spot TY after facing IND LW and have a MNF rematch vs the Jets on deck. NE is 4-0 SU and 3-1 ATS vs a Schwartz inspired defense including LY's 59-0 thumping of TEN which he ran from 2001-2008 and avg 38.5 ppg. DET is avg 344 ypg and lead the NFL with 33.3 ppg at home. While only 2-8 SU, the Lions are one of the best spread team in the NFL with a 7-2-1 ATS mark. Both defenses give up decent yardage (NE 398 ypg 30th, DET 343 ypg 19th) and points (NE 23rd 24.2 DET 22nd 23.7) that with the short week

has us looking at a higher scoring game.

Turkey Day Play: Over Cincinnati at NY JETS - Thursday - LY with their playoff spot wrapped up the Bengals rested players in the season finale in NY losing 37-0 as they weren't afraid to face them the following week at home in the Wildcard round. The Jets took advantage of CIN's lack of speed and upset them 24-14 as 2.5 pt AD's. Sanchez was highly efficient with 182 yds (80%) with a TD as the Jets finished with a 353-281 yd edge. Palmer was held to 146 yds (50%) with a 1-1 ratio and while he has much better weapons TY he only has a 6-5 ratio the L4W. CIN's #18 defense has been a big disappointment TY. LY they were +483 yds rushing (+0.2 ypc), made a sack once every 16 pass att's, allowing 18.2 ppg. TY they are -217 yds rushing (-0.6 ypc), with 1 sack every 34 pass att's, and are giving up 26.2 ppg. CIN blew a 31-14 lead at home to BUF LW giving up 35 2H points as CB Joseph (ankle) and FS Crocker (knee) and SS Williams (concussion) were KO'd of the game. CIN is locked into its 18th non-winning season in 20 years, blew a big lead LW and now travel on a short week. However the Jets have failed to put away teams in a convincing matter the L3W and we'll hold off here until we see just how beat up CIN is.

WASHINGTON 23 Minnesota 20 - MIN is 0-8 SU and 0-7-1 ATS on the road in regular season play losing by a 27-17 avg score. They are only being outgained by 19 ypg on the road (#20 and #18 road units) but are -8 TO's. LY Favre avg'd 237 ypg (68%) with a 12-5 ratio for a 96.2 QBR on the road. TY he's avg 215 ypg (56%) with a 6-9 ratio with a 66.2 road QBR. MIN had the #1 pass rush LY with 23 sacks on the road pulling in 1 every 12 pass att's. TY the #27 pass rush has just 4 sacks on the road or 1 every 44 pass att's. In their L26 games the Vikings defense is giving up a 43-19 ratio. The MNF loss to PHI wasn't the 1st time the Redskins gave up 500 yds at home (HOU) where they have been outgained by 128 ypg. McNabb has struggled to integrate into the system and TY at home he's avg'd 299 ypg (59%) with a 5-6 ratio. He is arguably working with less talent then 2007's PHI group and has been sacked 22 times in the L6 games. At one point WAS had 7 players KO'd of the TEN game with injuries but they held on for a 19-16 win in OT. They had 14-5 FD and 242-123 yd edges at the end of the 2H. They wore down the Titans with a 86-51 play edge and 13:35 TOP edge. MIN's season is over and big changes could be coming sooner than later and we'll call for the home team by 3 as they refused to guit vs TEN

HOUSTON 23 Tennessee 17 - This is the 1st of 5 AFC South games for TEN in the final 6 Wks. TEN is 6-2 SU and ATS vs HOU as the teams split the series LY. TEN upset HOU 20-17 as a 4 pt AD in the 2nd meeting LY. TEN had a 228 (5.4) to 57 (3.4) rushing edge but needed a 53 yd FG with :52 left for the win. TEN has been surprisingly vulnerable to the pass the L3W allowing 325 ypg (66%) left for the win. TEN has been surprisingly vulnerable to the pass the Law anowing doc ypg (00%) with a 5-3 ratio giving up 27 ppg. This has put the onus on the passing game which TEN isn't built or even with Moss added. HOU's #31 defense is playing at a 2008 DET level TY. The Lions allowed after 3:00 pm EST! Pay just \$30 for the MNM Play and if it fails to cover - you'll get \$40 back on y 233 ypg passing (68%) with a 25-4 ratio with 30 sacks (1 every 14.7 att's). TY the Texans are giving 5

up 301 ypg (68%) with a 25-6 ratio with 17 sacks (1 every 22 att's). TEN has lost 3 straight and Fisher has lost all confidence in Young who left LW's game with a thumb injury. #3 QB Rusty Smith (62 yds 33% 0-1) a rookie 6th RD DC from Florida Atlantic was named the starter after LW's game. We'll take the home team by 6 as the Texans capitalize on the Titans in disarray here.

CLEVELAND 24 Carolina 7 - CLE and CAR have similar play styles as they want to run the ball and play a stout physical defense. The difference is that the Browns are succeeding and playing hard for their coaching staff while the Panthers are struggling mightily and playing out the string. In terms of yards these teams are close with CLE having the #28 and #23 units while CAR has the #32 and #14 units. CLE has been outgained by 71 ypg with McCoy at the helm but are avg 23 ppg. CAR has been outgained by 78 ypg in the same span but are only avg 13 ppg and have only scored 23 pts once TY. Both teams are injury depleted with CLE missing CB Brown, LB Fujita and WR/KR Cribbs LW with CB Wright and TE Watson getting KO'd vs JAX. CLE forced 6TO's vs JAX LW but only converted that to 10 points. The offense continues to roll thru RB Hillis who had 143 total yds (5.3) or 51% of LW's offense. McCoy has been solid but unspectacular and all 3 of his int's have been via tipped passes that weren't his fault. CAR was dominated statistically by the Ravens getting outFD 22-9 and outgained 378-270 but were able to hang around until late as BAL didn't take them seriously until an 80 yd pitch and catch TD off blown coverage. St Pierre only had 4 practices under his belt (173 yds 46%) and both his int's were returned for TD's as CAR only converted one of 13 3rd Dns. It's unknown who will start for CAR here but we'll side with the hard nosed home team despite the bloated line as they continue to improve.

BALTIMORE 26 Tampa Bay 17 - The Ravens have a strong situational edge here at home off a short road trip to CAR as our 4★ November NFL GOM. BAL had 16-4 FD and 258-93 yd edges at the half. the defense had 2 IR TD's and the Ravens finished with a 9:06 TOP edge. Not counting punts or FG's the Panthers only had 11 plays on the Ravens side of the field with 5 coming in the 2H after a 64 yd KR. In his L5 games Flacco has passed for 263 ypg (68%) with an 11-1 ratio with a solid 8.2 ypa. This will be TB's 4th road game in 5 Wks compounded by the fact they travelled to SF LW. While TB is a surprising 7-3 TY they lack a win vs a quality foe as all their victories have been vs foes with a losing record that are a combined 17-53. They did impress with a 21-0 shutout win at SF though and road teams off a shutout road win are 7-0-2 ATS. TB struggles to defend the run (#29 137 ypg 4.8), rush the passer (30th with 14 sacks 1 every 22 att's) and could be very tired here. BAL is the better team but after LW's win and with a SNF game vs PIT on deck they could be looking ahead here.

CHICAGO 24 Philadelphia 21 - The Bears are in a golden situation with extra rest vs a PHI team

off 2 Div games in primetime. CHI posted their 1st shutout win in 4 years vs MIA and home teams are 9-2-1 ATS off a road shutout win. However that was vs a MIA team down to its #3 QB, who had to field its #3 Ctr and Cutler only had 156 yds and was lucky to escape with just 1 int. CHI has had the same OL for 3 Wks straight giving up just 5 sacks and Martz has emphasized efficiency vs explosiveness. CHI is much more efficient on 3rd Dns converting 9 of 16 (57%) and balanced on offense (3 straight Wks with 31 or more rush att's) avg 123 ypg (3.3). In the 7 previous games CHI avg'd 2 of 12 (18%) on 3rd Dns and minus the CAR game they avg'd 67 ypg (3.2) rushing. PHI does have a massive edge in offenses (#3 vs #30) thanks to Vick going supernova vs WAS but the defenses are evenly matched (PHI #12 CHI #3). In his 4 full games PHI is 4-0 SU and 2-2 ATS and while avg 282 ypg (62%) with a 10-0 ratio and a stout 9.2 ypa prior to NYG. After allowing 137 ypg (4.3) on the ground in the 1st 4 games PHI has improved to 76 ypg (3.7). CHI's stripped down Cover-2 plays to the speed of its defense, doesn't cause force them to over think and is a good match for the big play Eagles at home.

ATLANTA 27 Green Bay 21 - This game features a pair of fairly matched teams with ATL having the #7 and #17 units (+11 TO's) vs GB's #13 and #11 units (+8 TO's). ATL has played a tougher sked though (#13 vs #25) to date. ATL beat GB 27-24 as a 3.5 pt AD in the last meeting back in 2008. This is the Falcons only home game in a 5 week span and they are 18-1 SU and 13-5-1 ATS at home with Ryan at QB. GB is now 10-3 SU in domes since McCarthy took over in 2006. GB has averaged 375 ypg and 31.4 ppg in that span. They are off a huge road win vs MIN which essentially made the NFC North a 2 team race. GB scored 24 pts while earning 260 yds in the span of 1Q to put the game away. ATL got a good game from STL for the first 3Q's but forced a TO and pulled away in the 4Q. ATL has the edge in being more balanced offensively with a 46-54 run/pass ratio thanks to RB Turner (86 ypg 4.3). GB shift its RB's to more of a pass blocking/outlet role when RB Grant went out and ATL will be able to focus more on coverage here. We'll side with the Falcons and their strong home edge here vs a visitor off a big road win vs a division rival.

OAKLAND 17 Miami 14 - This is the 3rd meeting in 4 years with the Raiders covering both in MIA.

OAK is 1-7 ATS as a HF vs MIA who is both teams are off bad losses with MIA being shutout at home vs CHI and road teams are 12-5 ATS after being shutout at home. Down to #3 QB Thigpen the Dolphins simply had a bad gameplan as they only handed the ball to Brown/Williams 6 times for 11 yds. This put an OL with a #2 C (got inj'd) with a limited LT Long in a bad spot as they were forced to pass protect (giving up 6 sacks on 48 offensive plays). The Dolphins only had 7 plays in CHI territory with 5 coming off a 46 yd KR to start the game, another being a punt with the last coming on the final play of the game. OAK went into PIT off their bye confident they could follow: up 2009's upset win with another. The #2 rush offense prior to the game was held to 61 yds (3.8). Campbell was exposed by the Steelers with 70 yds (37%) 0-1 getting sacked 4 times before being benched. They have outgained foes by 58 ypg at home (+4 TO's) with a 26-19 avg score. We'll call for the home team by 3 in a lower scoring game as we don't know who either team is starting here and the #6 and #10 defenses will make it tough for both sides.

DENVER 23 St Louis 17 - These two teams are on the opposite spectrum of ATS runs as St Louis has covered 7 of 9 but dropped their last game to Atlanta as they were outgained 391-304. Despite being 3-1 ATS on the road Bradford has yet to win a game outright for them and while the Rams have been outgained in all 4. Deriver meanwhile snapped a 4 game SU/ATS losing streak with a 49-29 win against KC in their previous home game. While Deriver is only 2-3 SU at Mile High and the loss to Oakland was ugly the others don't look so bad. They outgained the Jets 338-319 and had 145 yd rushing (most allowed by Jets TY) while outgaing Indy 519-365 and beating a 5-5 Seattle team 31-14. STL blitzed often early in the season but teams are now better prepared as ATL was LW, keeping their QB clean without a sack and only 2 qbh. Denver had a season high 4 sks vs KC and expect the Broncos to force Bradford into making quick decisions and Denver's veteran secondary will be ready. Until St Louis and their young QB learns to win on the NFL road we'll back the Broncos.

San Diego at INDIANÁPOLIS - SNF - SD is off LW's MNF game vs the Broncos and know that although they trail KC by a game they host them in couple weeks. The Chargers aren't a road dog often (1st time TY) but they are 5-2-1 ATS in that role the L2Y. The Colts are off the battle with NE and have now lost 2 games in the L3W. Indy has gone 3-1 ATS this year as a HF and all 4 times the line has been single digits. Can Indy get revenge from a 2008 Wild Card loss or do they drop a 3rd game in the last month? Rice meanwhile used QB McHargue (220 yds, 73%, 3-0 ratio) in his 1st start since wk 2 (shldr) which panned out with a 62-38 victory vs EC (Owls score 14 or more pts in each quarter). LY Rice had a ssn high in FD's (23) and yds (391) vs UAB but the Blazers led 20-0 and never looked back as Joe Webb rushed for 194 yds (9.7) breaking the CUSA record for most rush yds in a game by a QB. Rice is 9-5 SU and 10-4 ATS in home finales (5 str covers) while the HT is 3-0 SU/ATS. Despite Rice being outgained in each meeting by 110 ypg, they have been money as a conf HD going 20-3-2 ATS over the last decade while UAB (1-6 ATS as a conf AF) is still trying to find their way as a favorite.

PENN ST 31 - Michigan St 20 - MSU is 2-8 SU and 3-7 ATS in the series and hasn't won at State

College S/65 with 8 straight losses (3-5 ATS) by 24 ppg. PSU is 18-1 SU (15-4 ATS) in home finales. The home team is 12-5 ATS. PSU has won by 30 ppg and outgained MSU by 207 ypg the L/2. LY it was tied 7-7 at HT before PSU scored four 3Q TD's on 3,3,1 and 5 play drives. The Lions were tied at 24 late 3Q last week when they ret'd a blk'd P for a TD which began a dominating 4Q as they scored 17 unanswered pts. QB McGloin played all but the final series and the Lions are 4-1 SU/ATS in gms he's been the leading passer in TY (3-3 SU/1-5 ATS with Bolden). Lions allow an uncharacteristic 165 rush ypg (4.5). MSU rallied from a 28-13 deficit into the 4Q vs Purdue also thanks to a blk'd P which set up the GW TD. QB Cousins (332, 67%, 18-9) scored the winner vs the Boilers despite ankle and shoulder inj's. MSU allows 125 rush (3.6). This is rumored to be Paterno's final home gm

in State College and the Lions make sure the B10 title is split only 2 ways.

Oklahoma 38 OKLAHOMA ST 31 - LY OSU was shutout for the 31st time vs OU amassing just 109 yds w/ JUST 4 after HT! Gundy is now 0-9 vs OU as a QB and HC. The HT is 9-2-1 ATS but the Sooners beat #11 OSU 61-41 (-7') LTH. This is the last battle for the B12 South title as OSU won their 10th game for the 1st time in school history 48-14 at Kansas in which they had 36-18 FD and 597-288 yd edges. The Cowboys actually trailed 14-10 after 1Q but scored the final 38 pts as they stopped KU on 4&g at the 1 in the 2Q. OSU has the B12's #1 passer in Weeden (344, 68%, 30-10) rusher in Hunter (1461, 5.9) and rec in Blackmon (1560, 16.6, 17 TD) vs OU's triplets of Jones (316, 67%, 30-7), Murray (973, 4.4, 58 rec) and Broyles (#1 NCAA rec 106, 12.4). OU was just 2-8-1 ATS outside of Owen Field in the L/2Y but destroyed Baylor 53-24 in Waco. The Sooners led 53-10 into the 4Q and held QB Griffin to 207 ttl with most of it coming on 2 4Q garbage time TD drives. Sooners have a big D edge (#9-46) and take the South crown from their Bedlam rivals.

STANFORD 41 Oregon St 17 - Stanford's BCS hopes are still intact after LW's "Big Game" win over Cal, a game in which SU scored on 8 str poss with Luck at QB. OSU also got back to its winning ways w/a splendid def performance vs USC (255 yds all'd) a week after being run all over by WSU. Stanford is 2-7 SU vs OSU (outgained in 10 str gms, 168 ypg avg) incl LY, a game in which RB Quizz Rodgers rushed for a career high 189 yds and 4 TD's in OSU's 38-28 victory (+1) over SU. OSU has gone 13-4 ATS the game prior to in-state rival Oreg but judging by which team has been more consistent TY, Stanford should have a good chance to close out the ssn at 11-1.

ARKANSAS 37 Lsu 27 (Little Rock) - The last 5 gms in the "Battle for the Golden Boot" have been decided by 2.6 ppg (13 ttl pts) incl 2 of the L/3 decided in OT. The visitor is 7-3 ATS and Ark has covered 3 in a row all as a dog. Ark hasn't been fav'd over LSU S/'02 and the dog is 8-3 ATS in the series. LY LSU pulled out a 33-30 OT win despite being outgained 375-326 and outFD'd 24-18. LSU was without its top 3 RB's and ret specialist Holliday was their leading rusher with 57. QB Jefferson hit 17-25 for 179 with a 2-1 ratio. Ark QB Mallett hit 17-39 for 227 with a 1-1 ratio. PK Jasper hit a 41 yd FG to tie with :04 left and hit a 36 yd FG in OT for the win. Ark was lucky to escape with a 38-31 win in 2OT over Miss St LW. Ark has a large edge on off (#5-46) with Mallett avg 297 ypg (67%) with a 27-9 ratio but faces LSU's #14 pass D (#12 overall, Ark #32). LSU escaped with a 43-36 win over Ole Miss LW (gave us a 4* LPS Winner, +15). QB's Jefferson and Lee split reps but only combine for 152 ypg (58%) with a 6-10 ratio. LSU's BCS dreams are given the boot by the Hogs.



Tcu 51 NEW MEXICO 0 - TCU has gone 2-1 the L/3 vs NM (did not cover as 44' pt HF LY), outscoring them by a comb 114-13. LTH TCU was -6' in the opener and won 26-3. We went against NM with a 4* on these pages LW, and BYU destroyed them 40-7. NM was down 20-0 at HT and outgained 366-183 thru 30's. TCU is at a disadvantage coming off a bye with Boise beating Fresno 51-0 on Friday night. HC Patterson ran the ESPN circuit selling his tm's BCS attribute, now the Frogs get to prove it on the field. TEXAS TECH 48 Houston 38 - Old SWC rivals that played every yr from 1976-'95 but 1st trip to Lubbook S/ 92 for UH. LY TT allowed a ssn high 579 yds to the Cougars. They led 28-23 after 3Q's but instead of an 18 yd FG went for it on 4&gl from the UH1 and the QB sneak was stuffed. TT is 22-3 SU and 19-5 ATS in their home finales. TT got a bowl qualifying 6th win, 64-21 win over Weber St which they led 47-0 in the 3Q which enabled Tuberville to empty the bench. After a topsy turvy few weeks QB Potts (271, 65%, 27-8) hit 21-24 for 272 with 4 ttl TD. The Raiders are #118 NCAA pass D (294, 63%, 25-11). The Cougars ret'd a blk'd FG 89 yd for a TD on the 1H's final play LW to cut it to 24-20 but S Miss scored 3 straight TD's to stay in the CUSA race. The Eagles had a 349-24 rush yd edge which overcame the MM Roberts Stadium record 467 yd passing by Piland. The spectacular frosh is avg 357 (60%) with a 22-11 ratio. The Cougars allow 84 pass ypg less than the Raiders but it should be noted that in our pass eff D ratings (which takes into account opp faced) UH is #70 and TT is #87. Expect an air show. There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
