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NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK 5, 2010

NEWS AND NOTES: Miami was dominant in their 31-3 win over Pitt. In the 1H they had a 12-3 FD edge and in fact, Pitt's first FD came with under 6:00 to go in the 1H but UM was int twice, once in the EZ and once at the Pitt 7 and only led 10-0. Pitt closed it to 17-3 at the start of the 4Q but fmbld a punt and UM went 43/4pl for a TD. Pitt gained 71 of their yards on their final drive ending the game at the UM5 trailing 31-3. UM came in leading the NCAA in sacks and tfl and had 5 sk and 9 tfl vs the Panthers...SMU gave TCU a much tougher game than expected. TCU only had a 21-19 FD edge and 375-361 yd edge. In fact at the half TCU only led 14-10 with SMU having a 209-183 yd edge. TCU was int'd on the 2nd play of the 3Q and ret'd to the 1 and SMU got a TD to lead 17-14. TCU got an 83 yd KR to regain momentum and drove 13 yds for a TD then scored TD's on their next 2 poss to lead 35-17 early 4Q. SMU got a TD but TCU got a 19 yd IR TD with 7:14 left but missed the crucial xp as they were -17. TCU was SOD at the SMU38 with 2:19 left and SMU even got to the TCU17 but was SOD on 4th & 9...It was BC's first shutout loss at home since 1998 which was also administered by VT. In the 2H, behind backup QB Marscovetra, BC managed 39 yds offense. BC had 3 blown scoring opportunities in the 1H which really cost them the game. BC took their 2nd poss 64/9pl and had a 1st & gl but were int'd in the EZ for a TB and VT drove for a TD. BC was pinned at its own 1 but drove 69/9pl. They missed a FG. BC's last drive of the half went 84/13pl with :15 left and no time-outs, QB Shinskie ran and dove for the EZ. The ball hit the goal line but it was ruled down on the 1/2 yd line and the half ran out. At the half BC had a 211-164 yd edge. Shinskie was taking hard hits all day and after a fmbld and int, he was pulled and VT got the shutout...Ball St was shutout for the first time since 2005 and Iowa got to play a lot of players. Iowa did only lead 14-0 with 2:55 left 2Q when they rec'd a fmbld and they went 38/3pl for a TD to make it 21-0. At the half, however, Iowa had 15-3 FD and 284-54 yd edges. Iowa opened the 3Q with 65/6, 74/6 and 80/10pl drives for TD's to take command, 42-0 and on their 4th poss went 61/9pl for a 25 yd FG in the 45-0 win...Michigan QB Denard Robinson, a Heisman frontrunner, injured his knee in the 1Q and DNR. In one brief quarter, Robinson hit 4-4-60 and rushed 5x for 129 yards. Remember the rumors of Tate Forcier transferring from Michigan? Forcier came off the bench after backup QB Gardner had drives that ended on a TD, a fmbld and SOD and Forcier led Michigan to 5 TD's on 5 poss. He, unfortunately, also hurt his knee at the end of the game. UM scored TD's on their first 3 poss to lead 21-0 but BG thanks to a fmbld and UM being SOD (BG a 71 yd TD pass on the next play) only trailed 21-14. That's when Forcier led 5 straight TD drives and then Gardner came off the bench for a sixth consecutive TD drive, this one with 3:11 left to make it 65-21. UM had 721 yds offense to BG's 283...For the 2nd straight week, Buffalo played closer than the final as they lost by 24 but had an 18-17 FD edge vs Conn and were only outgained 399-368. Cody Endres came off the bench in the 3Q for UC after Zach Frazer (4-4 on first drive) went into a 3-10 slump. UC was playing without its star RB Jordan Todman who was injured. The game was tied at 14 at half with Buffalo having a 234-119 yd edge. Endres led UC to 4 scores on their first five 2H poss and in their first eight 2H poss they got 1 FG, 3 TD, fmbld at the UC10 which set up a Buffalo TD, were SOD at the UB33, fmbld at the UB28 and had a 42 yd FG blk'd. Chances for the cover appeared bleak when they got a 46 yd IR TD with 4:01 left, 45-21. UB went 73/12pl but on 4&gl from the 4 with :28 left, fired incomplete...VMI had just fallen to William & Mary 45-0 the previous week and brought almost its entire Corps of Cadets (21 busses) to the Virginia game so they could cheer. They actually only trailed 14-7 after 1Q. Virginia did finish with 25-8 FD and 466-179 yd edges...Maryland was without starting QB Jamarr Robinson and Danny O'Brien hit 18-27-250 yds in his first start. MD got a lot of big plays vs FIU. They got an 85 yd PR TD by Logan, a 56 yd TD run by D Scott, a 68 yd TD pass to Smith and got ahead of the spread in the 4Q with a 76 yd TD run by Meggett on their first offensive play after FIU closed within 7. Wes Carroll hit 35-58-355 yds for FIU. O'Brien's 68 yd TD pass came after a pass interference call wiped out a 3rd down completion...Michigan St, in their first game without HC Dantonio had 1 punt in the 1H and also fmbld at the Northern Colorado 22 and scored TD's on their other 5 poss and led 35-0 with a 387-141 yd edge. NC broke the shutout trailing 42-0 with a TD early in the 4Q...Toledo got their first win in Ross-Ade Stadium since 1992. An amazing stat is that Toledo came into the game last in the NCAA in total offense but had 378 total yards - 157 more than their season average.

UT led 17-0 at the half with a commanding 203-95 yd edge. PU played most of the game without starting QB Marve who was injured for the second straight week. PU got as close as 24-20 with 8:07 left but UT returned the KO 50 yds and drove 47/7pl for a TD to basically clinch it 31-20 with 5:24 left...Three weeks ago UCF's D held Russell Wilson of NCST to 10-30 passing. This time they took on the nation's #2 rusher in Daniel Thomas and held him to 76 yards on 22

carries. K-State managed just 3 yds in the 1Q and UCF had a 170-43 yd edge at the half. The Knights missed crucial FG's of 42 and 23 yards which kept K-St in the game. UCF also settled for a 27 yard FG with 5:14 left and K-St drove 67/13pl and got a 7 yd TD run with :24 left for their first lead of the game and won. UCF had 20-11 FD and 344-272 yd edges...USC may not be having a memorable start under Lane Kiffin but he is the first USC coach to begin his career 4-0 since Jess Hill did in 1951. USC had a 613-323 yd edge but Washington St surprisingly opened with an 80/9pl drive for a TD. USC got a 59/1pl run then a 25 yd IR TD to go up 14-7. WSU drove 45/6pl for a TD and only trailed 21-13 in the 2Q and it was just 28-13 at the half with USC having a 312-230 yd edge. USC dominated the 3Q going 93/4pl, 98/12pl, 64/9pl for TD's, the 3rd drive behind backup QB Mustain and came with 12:02 left in USC's 50-16 win...Turnovers did have a big factor in the Army/Duke game as Duke had a 5-0 TD deficit with QB Renfree having 2 int that were ret'd to the 3 and 5 yd lines - both setting up Army TD's. Army did have a long drive with a 33 yd FG blk'd and led 21-7 at the half and Army had a 173-80 yd edge. It was 35-7 when Duke gained the majority of their yards. They went 82/8pl for a TD, 43 yds but were int'd in the EZ from the Army34 then went 67/5pl for a TD with 1:41 left which made the final stats 372-333 in favor of Duke...Ohio St is now a perfect 4-0 ATS but surprisingly their D gave up 3 long drives to E Michigan. One came early 2Q, a 75/9pl TD and at the end of the half, 73/7pl TD and OSU only led 38-14. EM pulled within 45-20 after an 80/6pl TD drive but OSU scored TD's 4 of their 5 next poss to get their highest point total since 1950 at 73. Dane Sanzenbacher became the first OSU player with 4 TD rec in a game since Terry Glenn did it in 1995. OSU did finish with a 33-13 FD edge and over 300 yards both rushing and passing while EM had 248 total...North Carolina was playing once again without 12 players including 7 starters. Linebacker Bruce Carter had a big day with a 55 yard IR which set up a 28 yd TD drive and he also had a blk'd punt which set up a 27 yd drive for a 25 yd FG and NC led 17-13. RU got to the NC19 but was int'd at the 7 with 2:42 left. They had 1 more shot after a 26 yd NC punt. They took over at their 34 but on 4&14 fired incomplete...Northwestern and C Michigan were tied 13-13 at the half but NU went on an 11pl drive for a 27 yd FG then after an int, got a 25/1pl TD pass to lead by 10. After punting on their next drive, NU went 47/5pl for a TD and had the ball back up 30-13 in the 4Q and were driving when they fmbld at the CM36. CM went 64/8pl for a TD and then went 86/11pl including a 4&15, 20 yd pass to the NU25 which set up a TD with 1:11 left to get them under the number, 30-25. NU rec'd the onside kick and took a knee...If you followed along the scores on Saturday you were probably under the impression that Temple outplayed PSU for most of the game as TU had a 13-6 lead after 1Q, 13-9 at the half and late 3Q still led 13-12. The story of the game was PSU moved the ball but settled for Collin Wagner tying a school record with 5 FG's. Royster rushed for 187 yds and PSU had 216 yds rushing and 223 yds passing with a 20-8 FD edge as they held TU to just 202 yds. In the 1H PSU had 10-4 FD and 220-131 yd edges. A fmbld set TU up for a 28 yd TD drive and PSU was also SOD at the TU25 late 1H. Leading 15-13 PSU went 96/12pl for a TD and then got it back and got to the TU25 where they were SOD again with :19 left...Missouri had a 19 yd FR on Miami Oh's first offensive play for a TD and simply dominated. In the 1H, UT 28-3, MO drove 61/10pl and had a 1st & 5 at the 10 but was int'd in the EZ for a TB. They extended it to 51-6 after 3Q's and were about to make it 58-6 when they were SOD at the MU2 with 9:31 left in the game. If you look at the final stats and you'll see MO "only" had 469-316 yd and 25-19 FD edges, but MU gained 98 of their yds on a 15pl drive and got 5 FD getting a garbage TD with 1:40 left...Wyoming led AF 14-7 after 3Q's and AF needed a TD with 3:41 left to pull out a 20-14 win. Statistically the game was not even close with AF having 27-12 FD and 445-240 yd edges. AF was int'd in the EZ on 2nd & gl on their first drive, missed a 26 yd FG after an 11pl drive and at the end of the half, went on a 48 yd drive for a 39 yd FG but had a bad snap. In the 3Q AF was SOD at the WY38 and int'd before driving 78/16pl and 80/14pl for 2 TD's and a 20-14 lead. AF ended the game at the WY28 yd line taking a knee...NC State did have a 27-15 FD edge vs Georgia Tech and a 527-363 yd edge but the game was closer than the final score. NCST jumped out to a 10-0 lead despite missing a pair of 32 yd FG's and led 17-7 at the half with a 264-137 yd edge. They extended it to 31-14 then GT was SOD on 4&3 at the NCST48 (1:39 3Q). GT got back in it with a 38 yd TD pass then Russell Wilson, who had 168 passes without an int, was not only int but ret'd 33 yds for a TD which made it 31-28 with 12:05 left. NCST drove for a TD with 8:31 left and then GT out of desperation went for it on 4th & 10 at their own 31 and the pass was incomplete. NCST tacked on a TD 6 plays later for the 45-28 final...UAB deserved much better vs Tennessee. For the game UAB had 23-15 FD and 544-287 yd edges. UAB had just 1 TO but it was a 9 yd IR TD just before the half which actually put UT up 23-7. The key to the game was that UAB missed FIVE FG's during regulation. After missing 3 FG's in the 1H they went on a 67/13pl drive and missed a chipshot 30 yd FG in the 3Q. With the game tied, UAB drove for the winning FG but missed it on 54 yds with :38 left. In the 2nd OT UAB made a FG but UT got a 25/1pl TD...At times Arkansas appeared to be poised to upset #1 ranked Alabama. They got a TD with :15 left 1H to lead 17-7 then took their 3Q opening drive 53/10pl for a 48 yd FG and a 20-7 lead.

Bama battled back with a TD and FG to get within 20-17 with 6:01 left. The key play happened when Mallett, on 3&11 was int'd and ret'd 33 yds to the 12. Bama got a TD 3pl later for its first lead of the game with 3:18 left, 24-20. Ark got to midfield but was int'd at the Tide 35 and Saban went for it on 4th & 1 at his own 45 and converted for a FD with :54 left...Florida St dominated Wake Forest with 28-12 FD and 485-185 yd edges but after fumbling at the WF7, settling for a 35 yd FG and missing a 51 yd FG and fmb'ing at the WF36, FSU only led 10-0 early 3Q. Up 17-0, WF was driving when they fmb'd at the FS132. FSU went 68/9pl for a TD with 7:28 left to get ahead of the spread. WF went on a 61/10pl drive but was SOD at the FSU18 with 3:44 left. FSU with excellent backup QB EJ Manuel in went on an 82/6pl drive and going for the throat they got a 23 yd TD pass with 1:04 left for a 31-0 final...Middle Tenn St K Alan Gendreau hit a 55 yd FG, the 2nd longest in school and SBC history to give MT a 6 pt lead at half. The game was fairly close with 2 big plays sealing it for MT. They got a 62 yd TD pass with 10:02 left 3Q and after UL was SOD at the MT19, at 27-14, Kyles got a 74 yd TD run 3pl later, 34-14...Riley Dodge took over as the starting QB for North Texas. He had been the starting QB at NT LY but with an inj'd shoulder limiting his throwing ability, he moved to WR. With inj's to their top 2 QB's, he's back at the QB spot and hit 10-15-146. He guided NT to a 423-357 yd edge at FAU, a game NT led 21-10. FAU did rally back and at the end had a FD at the NT28 down by 4 but a sk forced a 4th & 16 and FAU fired incomplete...Nebraska spent most of the 1Q vs South Dakota St bottled up inside their own 20 and was very unimpressive as a 44 pt fav vs SDS. They did get a 96/6pl drive for a TD on their 3rd pass then went 54/4pl for a TD on their 4th but only led 14-0 at the half. Taylor Martinez, who had rushed for 100 yds in each of the first 3 games, was held to 67 and also had a fmb'l and 2 TO's. SDS blew some chances. They had a 1st & gl at the NU2 in the 1H and were SOD. SDS went 73/11pl on their 2nd 3Q poss but settled for a 35 yd FG, 14-3. NU went on a 10pl drive for a 30 yd FG. SDS was int'd at the NU1 and SOD at the NU37 in the 4Q...Georgia had a 221-120 yd edge vs Miss St at the half. They had a 20 yd pass to the 1 orig ruled down but it was reversed and ruled there was a fumble and a TB. UGA had a 40 yd TD pass called back on a hold and settled for a 35 yd FG and trailed 7-6 at the half. MSU, clinching to a 10-6 lead, went for it on 4th & 1 at their own 39 and converted. Two plays later they got a 34 yd TD pass. UGA went for it on 4th & 10 at their own 20 with 3:53 left and fired incomplete. MSU, 3pl later tacked on a TD, 24-6. With the game secure, MSU allowed UGA to go 91/8pl for a 40 yd TD pass with 1:27 left. MSU rec'd the outside kick...Idaho appeared in control vs Colorado St as they had 4 long drives in the H.

On the first they were SOD at the CSU29 but they got 1 TD and settled for 31 and 32 yd FG's to lead 13-0. CSU took over with 4:32 left in the half and got a TD with :28 left. UI got a FD but was sk'd and fmb'd with :19 left and CSU got a TD 3pl later for a stunning 14-10 lead. UI took the lead back and led 27-17 but CSU tied it with 11:32 left. UI got a 59 yd TD pass with 9:46 left and while CSU went 64/7pl, they missed the xp and trailed by 1. UI punted with 2:46 left and CSU got 5 FD and got a 35 yd FG on the final play for the upset...Stanford was very impressive vs Notre Dame as their D pressured Dane Crist throughout the game. SU QB Andrew Luck did throw his first 2 int's of the year. SU got a 36 yd FG on the last play of the half to go ahead 16-6. Trailing 19-6 the Irish were SOD at the SU49 and SU got a TD 11pl later. On the next play, ND was int'd and ret'd 20 yds for a TD and a close game turned into a blowout, 34-6. ND got a 14 yd TD pass in the final seconds called back on a hold and SU walked away with a 37-14 win which was ND's 11th straight loss vs a Top 25 team and 3rd straight loss of the season as they now have lost 7 of their last 8 games...All week long Urban Meyer talked about how excited he was that the offense had finally come together and was much improved. The offense had slogged its way through the first 3 games of the season but Tre Burton helped ignite them as he scored 6 TD's and even had a 42 yd pass. He had those TD's despite having just 3 rec, 5 rushes and 1 pass. Florida led 21-0 but Kentucky faked a 28 yd FG for a TD to make it 21-7 at the half. The Gators scored TD's on all 4 poss of the 2H to take a 48-14 lead with 6:38 left and UK gained 65 of their yards on their final drive. UF has now outscored UK 155-26 in the last 3 games incl 73-0 in the 1Q...Marshall/Ohio was interesting as MU did have a 233-105 yd edge at the half and led 13-3. OU battled back using a fake 23 yd FG for a TD to take a 17-16 lead with :04 left in the 3Q. MU converted on 3&11 and 3&10 on their next drive, the latter for a 12 yd TD pass and a 25-17 lead. OU opted to punt with 2:31 left on 4th & 14 at its own 16 but MU was SOD with 1:01 left at the OU28. OU went 72/7pl and with :08 left got a 36 yd TD pass as the clock ran out but Solich went for 2 and it failed and MU escaped with a 1 pt win.

BACKDOOR AND FRONTDOOR COVERS: In the 1H Texas turned the ball over 5x and UCLA took advantage but only with a 13-3 lead. At the half UT had a 101 total yards offense on 36 plays and UCLA 75/32pl. UCLA got the most impressive drive of the game to open the 3Q going 80/8pl with 78 on the ground for a TD, 20-3. UCLA led 27-6 in the 4Q and UT drove 80/12pl getting a TD with just 2:28 left to make it 27-12. The outside kick went OOB and LA started at the UT27. On 3&2 when a FD would have ended the game as only :53 remained and LA could have taken a knee, Coleman ripped off a 29 yd TD run to put the game Over the Total.

4★ Florida St over VIRGINIA - FSU is 13-2 all-time vs UVA (10-5 ATS) but last met in '06 (33-0 FSU shutout). FSU has outgained UVA in every gm S/'97 (10 gms, +205 ypg) but the Cavs did pull the upset 26-21 in FSU's last trip here in '05. FSU rolled to an easy 31-0 win over WF LW, delivering a 4★ Key Selection on these pages. The Noles pushed their first ACC shutout S/'03 holding WF to just 185 yds (2nd gm in a row opp under 200 ttl yds). Ponder threw for 200 for the 1st time TY and is now avg 168 ypg (61%) with a 7-1 ratio. His fav targets are Easterling (14, 17.0) and Reed (23, 9.1) while the top rushers are Jones (284, 7.7) and Thomas (185, 5.6). LW UVA had a record setting day in their 48-7 win over VMI. The Cavs rolled up 341 pass yds, the most in a gm S/'03. Three diff QB's threw a TD in the same gm for the 1st time since before '50 and it was the 1st time ever at UVA that 2 Fr threw a TD in the same gm. UVA finished with 25-8 FD and 341-133 yd edges. QB Verica avg 232 (61%) with a 5-1 ratio. His top rec's are Burd (18, 14.4) and Inman (15, 14.3). The top rushers are Payne (217, 5.4, 5) and Jones (207, 6.5). While FSU has all the edges (off #19-79, D #14-38 and ST #16-86) and we'll go right back to the Noles this week.

FORECAST: Florida St 31 VIRGINIA 17
3★ SOUTHERN MISS over Marshall - The last 3 have been decided by a total of 15 pts. LY, MU had the yd edge (+69) but all'd 7 sks, a KR TD and was also -3 TO's in the 27-20 defeat. MU HC Holliday earned his 1st victory LW surviving on the final play for a 24-23 win over Ohio. MU all'd a 36 yd TD pass with no time left, but OU's 2 pt conv fell inc. S Miss rushed for 192 yds and forced 4 TO's holding off LA Tech LW for a 13-12 win. While the visitor has won 3 in a row SU and last time here Marshall pulled the outright upset as a 2★ on these pages and a Big Dog Play on the PPH. The Herd is 13-26 ATS as an AD and 8-11-1 ATS in CUSA AG's (5-15 SU). The Eagles do have a crucial home meeting with EC on deck but will have the talent edge here and should prevail. We won't let LW's close win for SM scare us as they are a strong home team while Marshall has struggled on the road.

FORECAST: SOUTHERN MISS 34 Marshall 17
3★ Ohio St over ILLINOIS - IL is 1-15 SU in B10 openers incl LY's 30-0 loss to OSU in a rain storm in Columbus. The visitor is 8-2 SU in the series! The L/4 times hosting OSU, IL has faced a #13 ranked or higher Bucks squad covering 3. OSU has won its L/7 here (last loss in Champaign in '91) by an avg of 29-11 but is 3-6 ATS overall vs UI. However, OSU is 15-4 ATS in B10 RG's and 15-5 as a B10 AF. IL rFr QB Scheelhaase is avg 127 ypg (54%) with a 3-3 ratio and 204 rush yd. RB Leshoure has 398 yd (6.9) incl 4 straight 100 yd gms. Illini D allowed MU's QB Gabbert 281 pass yd (71%, 2-0 ratio) and NI's Harnish 208 pass (76%, 117 rush yd) but faces its biggest challenge yet vs Heisman contender Pryor (235, 66%, 10-2 ratio, 269 rush yd) who accounted for 6 TD's in LW's win over EM. OSU scored its most pts S/'50 (73) with a 645-248 yd edge with the 2nd and 3rd string QB's also leading TD drives. After allowing just 2 off TD's coming in, OSU actually allowed 3 TD drives to the Eagles. We respect the series history but also OSU's spread streak (4-0 ATS TY) so we'll keep our money on the Scarlet and Gray.

FORECAST: Ohio St 41 ILLINOIS 13

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Michigan over INDIANA - LY UM survived Indy 36-33 despite the most yds (467) and pts the Hoosiers have had in the series as they got inside UM's 20 5x but kicked 4 FG's and missed 1. IU has dropped 16 straight to the Wolves and UM has been favored by an avg of 20 ppg the L/19Y. IU is 1-6 ATS in B10 openers and 12-22 as a HD. The Wolves have been a B10 AF just once under Rich Rod (0-1 LY). With just a 21-14 UM lead over BG LY's QB str' Forcier came off the bench to hit 12-12 for an inj'd Robinson (knee) in the Wolves 65-21 win in which they had a 721-283 yd edge. Rod said the NCAA's rush leader Robinson (688, 8.7) could've ret'd and he is avg 183 ypg (71%) with a 4-1 ratio. UM is #35 pass eff D (264, 56%, 5-6 ratio). Chappell (#6 NCAA pass eff) threw 4 TD passes in Indy's 1st 5 pass as IU jumped out to a 35-13 3Q lead over Akron but they did not cover as they all'd a late 3Q TD and ended the game at the UA4. IU is #1 B10 pass off (304) but is last in rushing (113, 3.9) with weaker #5 each wk vs a soft sked (NCAA's easiest at #120 thus far). Hoosiers are allowing 177 rush ypg (5.2) and haven't faced an offense with the speed of the Wolves. We've cashed many times going vs the Hoosiers at home vs the B10's "Big Two" (OSU and Mich, IU is 0-5 ATS) and will continue to ride that trend.

FORECAST: Michigan 51 INDIANA 30
2★ BAYLOR over Kansas - The HT is 8-1 SU all-time but just 1-3 ATS the L/4. BU was waxed in the last meeting in '07 vs a #20 Orange Bowl bound KU squad, 58-10 (+26*) in Lawrence. The Jayhawks have never won in Waco (0-4) only coming up a combined 4 pts short the L/2. KU is 0-5 SU/ATS on the road including a 31-16 Friday night loss at SM 2 wks ago in QB Webb's 1st road start. LW KU took care of business in a 42-16 win over NMSU in which the Hawks had 501-275 yd and 26-14 FD edges. RFr Webb is avg 189 (62%) with a 5-1 ratio in his 1st 3 sts. True frosh RB Sims has 290 (5.5) while also starting the L/3. KU is #5 by the NCAA's standard in pass D (129) but #97 in our pass eff D (59%, 2-3) which takes into account the opps faced. Despite a 60 min weather delay, BU rebounded from the TCU debacle to win 30-13 at Rice with a 456-296 yd edge. QB Griffin is avg 243 ypg (59%) with an 8-2 ratio and 157 rush yd. BU's D has allowed just 1 TD TY vs tms who aren't TCU. BU has edges across the board and gets 1 win closer to their bowl goal.

FORECAST: BAYLOR 31 Kansas 17
2★ W MICHIGAN (+) over Idaho - WM leads the series 2-0 SU (1-0 ATS) as the Broncos defeated the Vandals 27-16 in the first meeting in Kalamazoo (in '72) before WM topped UI 51-28 (-8) in the Kibbie Dome in '08 as a 4★ LPS Winner for us. UI is on its 3rd AG in 4 wks and is in a rare trip to the Midwest but LY did beat NI 34-31 (+15*) with the Huskies fresh off their upset of Purdue. UI is coming off a tough 36-34 (-7) loss at Colo St (FG as time expired) despite a 347 yd and 3 TD outing by QB Enderle who is avg 258 ypg (65%) with a 7-7 ratio. The Broncos are fresh off a bye and will host the Vandals for HC here. QB Carder is avg 307 ypg (64%) with an 8-6 ratio and is #7 in the NCAA in ttl off (321 ypg) and has a pair of WR's with 25 catches each in White (27 rec, 14.1) and Nunez (25 rec, 8.2). UI covered its first 3 gms TY before LW's loss while WM is on a 3-13 ATS skid. With Idaho still learning how to win consistently, a last second loss will be tough to overcome especially on a second straight road gm. WM, off a bye, for their HC crowd.

OTHER GAMES

THURSDAY, September 30th • Texas A&M at OKLAHOMA ST - LY OSU led 29-25 and put the game away with a 93/16pl drive which chewed up 7:41. OSU is 8-17 vs A&M and has never beaten the Ags 3 straight. The Ags are 3-16 ATS in their 1st AG from Kyle Field. A&M is 16-28 ATS in B12 AG's S/'99 and has dropped their L/3 ATS to OSU. OSU is 14-6-1 ATS as a B12 HF. OSU is #1 NCAA in ttl offense led by QB Weeden (325 ypg, 73%, 11-2 ratio), #3 NCAA rush RB Hunter (473, 7.9) and #1 NCAA rec WR Blackmon (24, 18.0, 8 TD). A&M QB Johnson (288, 59%, 7-4) struggled with 4 int vs FIU but A&M turned to RB's Michael (331, 5.8) and Gray (188, 5.0) to rally from a 20-6 4Q deficit. This is the B12 opener for both who should be refreshed off of their bye weeks.

FRIDAY, October 1st • BYU at UTAH ST - Since '83, BYU is 20-1 vs with the lone setback being a 2 pt loss (58-56) here in '93. USU does own a 17-15-2 edge at home in the series, but BYU has won 10 of the L/12 in Logan. The HT is 6-1 ATS in this series with the visitor covering LY and these two have avg 64 ppg over the L/11 (S/'93). In two of BYU's L/3 trips here ('99 and '02), the Cougars were a 17 pt AF and barely escaped winning 34-31 in 2OT ('99) and 35-34 ('02). The Cougars have been DD fav in the L/10 in the series by an avg of 21 ppg but aren't in that role here.

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SATURDAY, October 2nd • Oklahoma 27 Texas 17 - Dallas. Ten of the L/12 matchups have been decided by DD's. LY OU never trailed until UT (-3) kicked what turned out to be the GW FG w/12:08 4Q (OU's L/3 drives ended w/SOD and int's at UT20 and UT37) to win 16-13. LY was the closest MOV S/'97 and UT held OU to -16 rush yds, fewest ever in RRR history. The dog is 14-7-1 ATS. After dropping 5 straight to OU

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from '00-'04, UT is 4-1 SU (4-0-1 ATS). The Horns couldn't overcome 5 TO's in their shocking 34-12 home loss (1st S/'07) to UCLA LW. QB Gilbert is avg 221 ypg (63%) with a 4-4 ratio. The run gm has struggled with inj's and diminishing results (197 in opener, 167, 93, 85 vs UCLA). Brown has said this is best D but they allowed 264 rush yd to the Bruins after coming in as #2 NCAA rush D. OU jumped out to a 24-9 3Q lead and held on to beat Cincy who drove 80/8pl for a TD with 0:58 left to cut it to 2 but OU rec'd the outside K. QB Jones is avg 305 ypg (65%) with a 9-3 ratio and his top target is the NCAA's rec leader WR Broyles (41, 11.8, 7 str 100 yd gms). RB Murray has 436 yds (4.2). OU's D is #97 NCAA allowing a surprising 421 ypg. Neither has played up to its potential (combined 2-6 ATS TY) and even though UT has the D edge (#3-19), the Sooners look to be the more complete team with a vet QB and a big offensive edge (#12-47).

CONNECTICUT 27 Vanderbilt 20 - Vanderbilt won the only previous meeting SU 28-24 in Nashville in '02 (Conn covered +8). VU is 21-5-1 as an AD and is fresh off a bye with only EM on deck while UC plays a 5th straight wk and has a Friday Nite BE game vs Rutgers on deck. UC has 16 ret starters from a tm that walloped SEC member SC in the bowl 20-7, but has started the '10 ssn slower with losses to Mich and Temple while VU has looked better than expected with a close loss to NW and an upset of Ole Miss (+11). Both tms prefer to run with VU relying on productive TB tandem Norman (225, 6.8) and Stacy (134, 5.6). LW UC's top RB Todman (448, 7.3) was out (elbow, CS) in their 45-21 win over Buffalo. It was tied at 14 at the half but UC QB Frazer (138 ypg, 52%, 2-1 ratio) was benched at the end of the 1H and bkup QB Endres ret'd from a 3 gm susp to lead the win (11-17 for 139, 2 TD) and UC had 2 IR TD (only 399-368 yd edge, UB 18-17 FD edge). VU is allowing 206 rush ypg (4.4) while UC is allowing 160 ypg (3.7) vs a lighter slate (#13-81). UC has the edge on off (#42-97) and def (#62-77).

Ohio 30 E MICHIGAN 20 - Ohio has won 6 of the L/7 (5-1-1 ATS) including the last gm in '07 (48-42, -4). EM was rolled 73-20 (+44) by Ohio St LW but the Eagles managed 3 long scoring drives (75, 73 and 80 yds) vs an OSU D that had allowed just 2 offensive TD's coming in. QB Gillett is avg 138 ypg (58%) with a 6-3 ratio and TE Thayer has been EM's top rec target with 15 (12.3). OU has the edge on ST (#25-115) but star MLB Keller (led conf in tks in '09) missed LW (CS). Ohio dropped a 24-23 decision LW at Marshall when the Bobcats scored on a Hail Mary as time expired but gambled and went for the 2 pt conv and came up short. OU has a dilemma of sorts at QB where the position is somewhat unsettled. Jackson is the better passer of the two (115 ypg, 60%, 4-5 ratio) while Bates is the better runner (161 yds, 6.0, leads team in rushing) but neither has been able to take a firm grasp of the #1 spot. The HT is 4-1 SU (4-0-1 ATS) but EM is 4-17 SU and 7-13-1 ATS in MAC HG's. While OU is 12-18 ATS as an AF, the Bobcats are 5-0 SU in MAC AG's and should get it done vs an EM team still searching for its first win (0-16) under HC English.

C MICHIGAN 27 Ball St 20 - BSU is 1-5 SU vs CM as CM has outgained them in 5 straight games by an avg 169 ypg but BSU did win its last trip to Mount Pleasant. The visitor is 5-1 ATS. LY the 3 pts allowed by CM was its fewest in a conf game since 1996. BSU is on its 3rd str AG while CM just finished a 3 gm road trip and is happy to be back home. Ball St is the most exp'd team in the MAC (#4 exp ratings) while CM is just #85. Ball St ran into an angry Iowa team off a loss that knocked them out of the Top 10. They lost 45-0 (+28) and were outgained 562-112. CM only lost 30-25 (+6) but scored the final 12 pts incl a TD with 1:11 left for the backdoor cover vs NW. While CM has the off (#85-112) and def (#53-100) edges, BSU has played the tougher schedule (#85-113) and keeps it closer than expected.

MICHIGAN ST 34 Wisconsin 33 - The HT has won 5 in a row SU. LY UW converted 3 of MSU's 4 TO's into TD's. Wiskey led 38-16 before allowing 2 garbage TD's. The Spartans are 5-14-1 ATS (8-12 SU) in B10 home gms but the Badgers are just 3-9 ATS in B10 road gms (3-7 SU/L10 trips to E Lansing). MSU is 0-4 SU/ATS the L/4 ssn's prior to taking on rival Mich. Both took on FCS tms LW with MSU, under OC Treadwell's direction for the ailing Dantonio, beating N Col 45-7 with 532-266 yd edge as the bkup's played extensively. QB Cousins is #17 NCAA pass eff avg 216 (67%) with a 6-2 ratio. MSU has had 200 rush yds every gm led by Baker (449, 7.9) and true Fr Bell (396, 8.3). MSU is allowing 85 rush ypg (2.7) but this is the 1st power rush tm they've faced TY after 4 spreads. UW beat up Austin Peay 70-3 scoring TD's on all 7 1H poss with 33-8 FD and 618-157 yd edges. Clay (501, 6.5) has had an NCAA best 10 straight 100 yd gms with true Fr White adding 269 (7.9) as 2 of UW's top 3 WR (Toon and Gilreath have missed L/2, CS). UW is allowing 95 rush ypg (3.5). There has been seven straight OVER's (avg ttl is 66 ppg) in this series so the last one with the ball wins.

Northwestern 31 MINNESOTA 27 - The visitor is 14-1 ATS and the dog is 6-2 ATS. LY Minny dominated the 4Q with 116-8 yd edge in a 35-24 win in Evanston. UM was ranked #20 the last time they hosted NW ('08) and NW pulled off the upset limiting UM to just 68 rush yds (2.7). These schools have avg'd 67 ppg over the L/6. The Cats are 9-3 SU in road gms (8-4 ATS) and are off a 30-25 win over CM. The Cats led 30-13 early 4Q with a fmb setting up a CM TD and the Chips scored their last TD with 1:11 left but NU rec'd the outside K. QB Persa is #3 NCAA pass eff (263, 80%, 8-1 ratio). The Cats have forced 12 TO's TY and are allowing 111 rush ypg (3.9). LW the Gophers lost their 3rd consecutive non-conf HG for the 1st time since 1898 to NI, 34-23. UM did outgain NI 470-378 but missed a 42 yd FG, had a P blk'd which set up an 11 yd TD drive, was SOD at its own 40 and the NI21 and had a pass int'd in the EZ. QB Weber avg 251 ypg (63%) with a 7-3 ratio. RB Bennett had 291 (6.1) in the 1st 2 but 80 (2.6) the L/2 while battling inj. UM is #117 pass eff D (199, 68% 8-5 ratio) with 10 new str's on D. The dog in NW gms is 15-2 ATS (2-2 TY) and this is just the 2nd time as a conf AF in Fitzgerald's tenure (0-1). Overall, NW is 1-3-1 ATS as an AF over 4 yrs (1-1 TY).

Virginia Tech 31 NC STATE 28 - Seven of the L/8 have been decided by 7 or less (LY NCSU worst series loss S/'56). VT is 6-2 ATS (5-2-1 SU) vs NCSU and these two comb avg just 35 ppg (8-0 to the UNDER). NCSU's 4-0 start is their best S/'02 (W 1st 9). LW Wilson threw for a career-high 368 and 3 TD as NCSU beat GT 45-28. NCSU opened scoring with a blk'd P ret'd for a TD. The Pack finished with 27-15 FD and 527-363 yd edges, holding GT to 247 rush yds (lowest TY). Wilson is avg 278 ypg (60%) with an 11-1 ratio. RB's Greene (242, 4.6) and Haynes (213, 4.6) pace the run gm while Spencer (14, 15.1) and J. Williams (13, 16.1) lead the rec's. VT is 22-6 SU and 21-7 ATS on the road in the ACC. They're off a 19-0 win over BC behind 4 FG's from PK Hazley (T-#8 NCAA FG). The yds were close at half but for the 2nd time in 2W, VT's D tightened up in the 2H, holding BC to just 39 ttl yds. QB Taylor did put up a ssn high 237 yds and is now avg 187 ypg (65%) with a 5-2 ratio. He is also the leading rusher with 201 (4.3). Boykin leads the rec's with 11 (22.3). The Hokies are on their 2nd str road trip (4-1 ATS in 2nd of B2B S/'05) and look to hand the Pack its first loss TY.

N CAROLINA 48 E Carolina 27 - LY NC beat EC 31-17 and totaled 433 yds. It was the 1st time a Butch Davis-coached tm beat the Pirates. NC does have a big game vs Clem on deck and EC is off a bye and usually gets up for state rivals that play in the ACC (did win outright '07). Two wks ago EC built a 27-21 lead over VT, but the gm was put away when VT got a 68 yd IR TD and the Pirates lost 49-27. QB Davis is #2 NCAA in pass (#6 ttl off) and avg 293 ypg (66%) with a 9-3 ratio. The top rec is Harris with 23 (12.8, 4) and the top rusher is Williams (273, 5.6). NC is 9-2-1 SU (3-1 ATS) in this instate matchup. LW they battled back from a 10-0 deficit to beat Rut 17-13 with 15-14 FD and 295-244 yd edges despite still being down 12 sup players. The already depleted D lost LB Sturdivant in the 4Q (CS) but held RU to just 98 ttl yds in the 2H. Yates' streak of no int ended after 117 when a pass bounced off Boyd's hands and was picked. He is now avg 275 ypg (68%) with 5 TD. RB White (178, 5.1) left early LW (ankle, CS) and Draughn (DNP gm 1) finished with a ssn high 55 yds (7.7, 5.5). Even if the susp are still enforced, expect the Heels to roll.

MARYLAND 45 Duke 31 - The last time MD dropped 2 str to Duke was in '70 and '72. LY MD trailed the entire gm and was down by DD's in the 2H. Duke had been a DD dog in the U5 before being a fav LW. LW Duke lost, 35-21 vs Army despite a 372-333 yd edge. QB Renfree avg 278 ypg (62%) with a 9-7 ratio. RB Scott leads with 272 (6.5) and the top rec's are Vernon (27, 16.4), Varner (24, 11.0) and Kelly (19, 11.0). While the Terps were aware that QB Robinson (shldr) was not playing LW, it was a gm-day announcement that rFr O'Brien (on a sprained ankle) was getting the start and he became the 1st Fr QB to start S'99. Despite being tied at 21 in the 3Q, O'Brien stayed calm and led MD on TD drives of 80/3pl, 39/5pl and 76/1pl and the Terps walked away with a 42-28 win despite being outFD'd 28-15 and outgained 472-419. O'Brien threw for 250 (67%) with a 2-0 ratio. RB Meggett leads with 268 (8.1) and Scott has 209 (5.6). WR Smith (limped off a few times LW) paces the rec gm with 15 (23.7) and his 355 yds is more than 5x's that of the #2 rec. We are aware that MD is just 1-7 as a conf fav under Friedgen but they'll extend the lead if they can to avenge LY's loss.

RUTGERS 27 Tulane 10 - RU is 3-1 all-time vs TU with the last gm in '98, a 52-24 TU win (-19, TU finished 12-0 in '98 ranked #7). RU is off a 17-13 loss to NC, a gm in which they led 10-0 in the 1Q. RU QB Savage (123 ypg, 52%, 1-3) has struggled TY and threw 2 int LW incl 1 at the NC6 with less than 300 left. RU RB Martinek (167, 4.3) ply'd LW despite an ankle inj but should be healthier TW. RU is 19-10 ATS after a SU loss in the regular season. The Knights do have their Big East opener on Fri vs Conn. Tulane is off 42-23 loss to Houston facing UH's 3rd str QB. TU QB Griffin (120 ypg, 66%, 0-2) was inj'd in the 1H LW (CS) and bkup Moore led TU to all 23 of their pts but also threw 2 int that UH turned into 14 pts. RU has large edges on def (#36-98) and ST (#21-116) but the off are close (#102-116). RU is on a 1-5 run as a DD fav while TU has covered the 4 of the L/6 as a visitor vs BCS tms.

Temple 18 ARMY 17 - In the L/3Y the winner in this series has actually been outgained in each (-76 ypg) but won by 14+ each time. LY tied 13-13 (4Q) Army was SOD at its 24 on 4th & inches and Temple scored twice in 2:00. The Black Knights are 2-5 ATS hosting MAC schools. Golden is 3-2 as an AF while Army is 6-20 ATS as a HD. Temple led Penn St 13-9 at half but lost leading rusher RB Pierce (343, 5.2) in the 3Q (CS) and was outgained 439-202 as PSU outscored them 13-0 in the 2H. TU QB Stewart is avg just 139 ypg (57%) with a 3-2 ratio and could struggle if Pierce is not available. Army scored 4 TD's off Duke TO's and led 21-7 at half and 35-7 after 3Q and with a big lead was able to grind it out holding the ball for almost 40:00. TU is allowing 160 ypg rush (4.2) while Army is avg 275 ypg (4.5).

Georgia Tech 37 WAKE FOREST 30 - LY WF forced OT (late 4Q TD) but after a FG couldn't stop GT on 4th & in the 5 (next play was 3 yd TD run). GT has not traveled here S'03 but Johnson is 5-1 as an AF at GT (did lose to Kansas TY). LW GT was upset at home, 45-28 (-8) by NCSU. QB Nesbitt had hit 1-7-9 thru 3Q's but down 31-14, GT went to the air to try and rally (finished 5-18-116). GT went 90/3pl for a TD then got a 33 yd IR TD by Tarrant, but NCSU answered with 2 TD's of their own and GT was outFD'd 27-15 and outgained 527-363 (just 247 rush yds, lowest TY). Nesbitt has thrown for 316 yds (33%) with a 3-1 ratio and leads the run gm with 362 (4.8, 6). Allen is #2 with 265 (5.2). LW went against WF, and their 31-0 loss to Fla St delivered as a 4★ Winner on these pages. WF was outFD'd 28-12 and outgained 485-185. QB Price was inj'd with less than 2:00 left 3Q (CS) and Stachitas moved the offense but FSU's D held on for its first shutout over an FBS foe S'03. Stachitas and Price have comb to throw for just 436 yds (50%) with a 3-4 ratio but they are the #1 and #2 rushers respectively. The top rec is Givens with just 9 (23.6). The HT is 8-3 ATS in this series and WF is 14-5-1 as a HD (and seeing the option for the 4th time in 2.5 yrs). Add that to WF's 11-5 SU/ATS record in ACC HG's and you get a WF team keeping it inside the number.

Texas Tech 30 IOWA ST 23 - TT has dominated this B12 series as they are 7-1 SU and 5-1 ATS. The fav is a perfect 6-0 ATS winning by 23 ppg. These two last met in '07 and TT pulled its str's with 9:24 to go leading 42-3 (won 42-17, -24'). ISU is 4-19 SU and 6-17 ATS vs the B12 South. ISU HC Rhoads was TT HC Tuberville's DC at Aub in '08. Tech had a bye LW to recover from a 24-14 home loss to Texas in which their 144 tll yd were their fewest S'90. Tuberville didn't like the timing of the bye but it allowed QB Potts (270, 63%, 8-2 ratio) a chance to heal his inj'd hand and for the Raiders to work on the run gm (70 ypg, 2.5). TT has been solid up front allowing 100 rush ypg (3.1) with 12 sk (#3 NCAA) and 11 TO's forced. ISU beat instate FCS power N Iowa LW 27-0 in a very misleading final as the Cyclones had 2 IR TD including a 94 yd/r, forced 5 TO's including a fmb! at the ISU1, stopped the Panthers on downs at the ISU20, blk'd a FG and converted a fake FG into a TD drive. QB Arnaud (shoulder, CS) sat out all but the 1st series and bkup Tiller hit just 11-22 for 87 yd while being sk'd 4x. ISU is #10 NCAA pass D (144, 51%, 2-7 ratio) partially because tms have been able to run at will on them (210, 4.7).

MISSISSIPPI 34 Kentucky 31 - UK (-3) won the last meeting a 31-14 win in Lexington in '06 but this only 5th meeting in 17 yrs. UK had just a 21-17 FD edge and UM had a 395-380 ydg edge but a 5-1 TO deficit in the gm. The fav is 5-2 ATS in this series and the home team is 4-2 ATS (5-1 SU) while UM is 6-2 SU incl 4-0 in Oxford (avg win 10 pts). Ole Miss has a bye next week and is off a 55-38 win over Fresno St which was their 1st home win of the yr (suffered upset losses to Jax St and Vandy). UM QB Masoli has avg 183 ypg (62%) with a 3-5 ratio and 219 rush (5.3). UM RB Bolden had a career best 228 yds, 2 TD LW vs Fresno (410, 7.7). We won a 3★ LPS by going against UK LW as FL (-14) dominated, 48-14. UK outgained their 1st 3 opp by an avg of 497-258 winning by avg of 44-18 but the step up to SEC play LW gave QB Hartline trouble (231 ypg, 66%, 6-2) with 2 int vs FL. RB Locke has 475 yds (5.7) with four 100 yd rush gms TRY. UM is on a 1-4 run as a HF and UK is 6-3 as an AD and both are looking for their 1st SEC wins of the yr.

Tulsa 37 MEMPHIS 27 - Memphis has dropped all 3 CUSA meetings and is attempting to avoid an 0-3 start in conf play after a tough loss to UTEP all'g a FG on the final play. Tulsa on the other hand is off a solid performance vs IAA foe Central Arkansas, a 41-14 win. Their defense remains suspect so far TY all'g 38 ppg and 471 ypg. In Tommy West's final gm as the UM HC the Tigers lost in OT LY (led 30-23 but allowed a TD w/:32 left and in OT was int on their 2nd play). Memphis is 10-4 ATS in its 1st CUSA home gm and has moved the ball much better the past 2 wks with QB Williams (137 ypg, 60%, 2-2) as the full-time starter. The visitor however is 9-1-1 ATS in the series and the Hurricane should be too much for the Tigers here.

Kent St 21 MIAMI, OH 17 - KSU has benefitted from a +11 TO ratio the L/2Y vs MU as LY they were outgained by 302 yards but still won 29-19. The visitor is 4-1 SU/ATS in the series. Miami is 5-9-1 ATS in MAC HG's incl failing to cover TY vs EM (won 28-21, -14). Miami trailed Missouri 28-3 at half and 44-3 in the 3Q as they were outgained 469-316. Kent St is off a bye but in their last game only trailed Penn St 17-0 in the 4Q, as they held PSU to 382 tll yds incl a 48 yd 4Q TD rec for the frontdoor cover. They were outgained 382-228 but were without starting RB Jarvis, who is expected to return here. The offenses are close as KSU QB Keith is avg 215 ypg (63%) with a 4-5 ratio, while MU QB Dysert is avg 198 ypg (67%) with a 4-6 ratio. KS does have the edge on def (#44-81) and ST (#32-117) and pulls out the road win.

Tcu 45 COLORADO ST 10 - TCU has won the L/5 by an avg of 32-9. The HT is 5-1 ATS in this series but TCU is 15-5 SU and 10-8-2 ATS in MWC AG's. TCU will remember their last trip here as they only had a 15-14 FD edge winning 13-7 (-15') as they had a showdown vs BYU on deck. They only have WY next wk and are off a 41-24 win over SMU. After QB Dalton's 2nd int, TCU found themselves down 17-14 early 3Q. Kerley ret'd the ensuing KO 83 yds and TCU went 13/3pl for a quick score before driving 58/12pl and 64/6pl for an early 4Q 35-17 lead. Dalton is avg 200 ypg (69%) with a 5-4 ratio. The top rusher is Wesley with 418 (7.6) and the top rec is Kerley with 17 (9.8). CSU snapped a 12 gm SU (9 gm ATS) losing streak when PK DeLine hit a 35 yd FG as time expired for a 36-34 win over Idaho LW and CSU delivered another outright upset winner for our Big Dog POW. Fr QB Thomas threw for 386, the most yds at CSU S'05. He is avg 270 ypg (70%) with a 4-0 ratio. RB Carter went over the 100 yd mark and scored CSU's 1st rush TD of the yr. CSU still only avg 59 ypg rush which will force them to the air, where TCU ranks #9 NCAA in pass D. The Frogs have huge edges all around (off #10-107, D #12-104, ST #5-75) and name the score.

AIR FORCE 21 Navy 17 - Navy set an academy record LY with its 7th win (5 of 7 were outright upsets) in a row over AF (6 of 7 by 7 pts or less) and for the 3rd straight yr AF outgained Navy on off (AF had 240 yds and 14 FD's and Navy had a ssn low 209 yds and just 10 FD's). Navy PK Buckley hit 3 FG's including a gm winning 38 yd/r in OT for the 16-13 win. AF won 19 of 21 meetings in this series from 1982-2002. Navy is 10-3-1 ATS in the series and 12-3-1 overall vs service academies. Navy is fresh off a bye while AF was in a flat spot LW (Okla/Navy sandwich) but still pulled out a 20-14 win over WY with 2 TD in the 4Q. Navy QB Dobbs has been dinged up (125 pass ypg, 174 rush, 2.4) and faces old HS rival AF QB Jefferson (Dobbs tms 5-0 in FB/hoops HS/college). Jefferson is avg 105 ypg (49%) with a 3-2 ratio and has 287 rush (6.5). With both tms running the same off, we expect a low scoring, close gm again TY. AF has edges on off (#44-67), def (#54-73) and ST (#26-106), so this may be the yr that Navy's streak ends, but it won't be easy.

Buffalo 28 BOWLING GREEN 27 - LY BG came back from a 13 pt 4Q deficit scoring the winning TD w/:39 left, while the L/2 gms in BG went to 3OT ('06) and 2OT ('08). The last time here ('08), BG had a 27-7 lead in the 4Q but lost which lifted UB to the MAC Champ gm. The HT has gone 0-3 SU/ATS S'07. The Bulls are getting their legs under new HC Quinn and LW were tied at 14 at Conn before falling 45-21 (+20). QB Davis was 18-42 for 227 with 3 int (2 which went for TD's) and is avg 221 ypg (47%) with an 8-7 ratio. BG was gouged by Mich LW in a 65-21 loss (+25') surrendering 721 tll yds (2nd most in UM hit, 466 rush) and an inability to stop the run (all'g 263 ypg, 6.3 ypc) has hampered the Falcons' run. BG was very inexperienced at QB entering the ssn (only 1 QB on roster with gm exp = 1 gm and 13 pass att's) and lost starting QB Schilz (221 ypg, 65%, 2-4 ratio, clear #1 out of camp) to a shoulder inj in wk 3 (CS). Pankratz is avg 171 ypg (61%) with a 2-2 ratio and made his first career start LW. BG is on a 7-1 ATS streak in reg ssn gms but is 0-7 ATS S'03 in MAC openers. UB is 2-5-1 ATS in reg ssn gms but is 7-4 ATS in MAC openers. Both teams are 1-3 SU but BG is -198 ypg and Buffalo is +16 ypg.

BOSTON COLLEGE 23 Notre Dame 20 - ND snapped a 6 gm losing streak LY to BC but in their last trip to Chestnut Hill they were shutout (-5 TO). The HT has been +5 TO's in each of the L/2Y. BC is off an extremely disappointing 19-0 loss to VT, its first shutout in 148 gms. BC had plenty of chances to make a gm of this, as they were int'd in the EZ mid-1Q, missed a 47 yd FG (short) mid-2Q, then drove to the VT 1 but ran out of time on the last play of the 1H. QB Shinskie fmb!d on BC's 1st 3Q drive, then was int'd on BC's 2nd and was replaced by Marscovetra, but he could not get much rolling and VT added four 2H FG's. Shinskie is only avg 132 ypg (54%) with a 4-4 ratio while Marscovetra has thrown for 92 yds on the ssn. The top rusher is Harris with 306 (4.6) and his yds are more than 4x's that of the #2. BC's #20 D is led by LB Kuechly, who is #5 NCAA in tll tkl's. LW ND could only score a FG off 3 Stanford TO's and SU scored on a run and int :13 apart to turn a manageable (19-6) gm into a 37-14 rout. QB Crist is avg 287 ypg (59%) with an 8-3 ratio. He has 3 rec's. Floyd (24, 14.1, 2), Rudolph (22, 13.1, 2) and Riddick (21, 12.0, 2) over 20 rec's. The top rusher is Allen with 302 (5.0). The dog is 5-1 ATS in this series with 2 upsets. In the L/8 gms these tms have avg just 37 ppg.

LSU 27 Tennessee 10 - Tenn is 20-7-3 SU in this series but LSU has won the L/2 SU incl the last meeting in the '07 SEC Champ gm, 21-14 (LSU -7). LSU had just a 21-17 FD edge but a 464-343 yd edge in the gm and outruled UT 212-94. The dog is 6-0-1 ATS and LSU is 3-14-1 as a SEC HF and has a big game vs FL on deck. UT was lucky to pull out a 2 OT win over UAB LW as UAB had a 544-287 yd edge and a 23-15 FD edge, but UAB missed 5 FG's in regulation. UT has inexp QB Simms (209 ypg, 57%, 6-3) and a young O-line making their first road starts in a very hostile environment though luckily this is an afternoon start (LSU 26-1 in Sat Night HG's, 5-4 in afternoon HG's under Miles). LSU faced WV QB Geno Smith in his 1st road start and held him to 119 pass (48%) with a 2-1 ratio LW, but WV's D kept the gm close winning a 4★ LPS for us 20-14 (+10). LSU QB Jefferson has avg 105 ypg (54%) with a 2-4 ratio but luckily has the ground gm to fall back on TY (avg 190 ypg, 4.7). Miles and Dooley faced off twice incl LY's competitive gm when LSU (-22') only won 24-16 ('07 was an easy 58-10 LSU win, -36). LSU has edges on off (#54-71), def (#6-55) and ST (#8-90).

UCLA 41 Wash St 13 - Wash St is 11-5 ATS vs UCLA but has lost the L/2 by a combined 71-10. In UCLA's 43-7 victory LY in Pullman, the Bruins put up a season-high 556 yds while the defense int'd WSU on their 1st 3 poss holding them to just 181 total yds. LW UCLA forced 5 TO's and rushed for 264 yds (4.7) in a stunning 34-12 win over #7 Texas, their 1st road win vs a ranked opponent S'01. WSU lost its 12th straight to an FBS opponent, 50-16 to USC. The Bruins have gone 8-5 ATS hosting schools from the state of WA S'96 while also posting a stellar 17-7 ATS record as a HF. On the flip-side WSU has lost 9 straight P10 AG's (3-6 ATS) under Wulf by an avg of 43-6. UCLA is off B2B upsets over ranked teams and undoubtedly is in a flat spot with Cal on deck but seem to be on a roll.

Georgia 24 COLORADO 20 - Battle of 2 coaches on the hotseat as UGA has lost 3 in a row for the 1st time S'90 (0-3 in SEC for 1st time since '93). CU HC Hawkins has 4 str losing seasons but begins '10 at 2-1 but the only BCS gm was 52-7 loss to Cal (-5 TO). The only previous meeting between these 2 was in '06 when #9 UGA escaped with a 14-13 win (UGA -27) in Athens. CU led 13-0 in the 4Q before UGA QB Cox replaced then-true frosh QB Stafford and led the Bulldogs to two 4Q TD's and the defense held on for the win. UGA is 3-6-1 as an AF since '06 but Richt is 33-8 SU in opponents' stadiums (0-2 TY). The Bufts get a rare non-B12 BCS HG but since the B12 was formed ('96) they are just 3-6 SU and 1-8 ATS in those. GA 6'4" AA WR AJ Green returns from his 4 gm susp which should help young QB Murray (220 ypg, 61%, 5-2). CU is advertising this as a "Blackout" gm showing the importance of this non-conf tilt. UGA has large edges on off (#25-80) and ST (#3-85) but the def are close (#15-35). CU is 5-10 ATS after a win but 5-2 as a HD and has the large edge of a bye LW which heightens their altitude advantage vs a GA tm on its 3rd road gm in 4 wks and in an SEC sandwich.

Illinois 24 AKRON 17 - LY Akron led 10-6 after 3Q's but was outscored 21-0 and outgained 138-30 in the 4Q. The HT has won 3 in a row SU and ATS. NI is 3-8 SU/ATS on the MAC road and this is their 3rd str road gm and 4th in 5 wks. The Zips are 0-4 SU and 1-3 ATS but got the backdoor cover LW vs Indiana (+22') as they scored a TD with 2:02 left but were outgained 426-335. UA QB Nicely is avg 127 ypg (44%) with a 3-1 ratio as he is struggling with the change of offense (taking snaps under C). Their top RB Burney leads with just 241 (5.0). NI is off the upset of Minn 34-23 as a 4 pt AD. They were outgained 470-378 but stopped Minn on downs twice. QB Harnish is avg 109 ypg (66%) with a 3-1 ratio but is the #2 rusher with 302 (7.9). RB Spann leads with 458 (6.9) incl a career best 223 (14.9) vs Minn and should do well vs an Akron tm all'g 4.5 ypc rushing. NI has the edges on off (#78-120) and def (#76-113) but may be a bit road weary.

Utep 27 NEW MEXICO 20 - The Miners won 10-6 as a home dog (+3') in their last meeting in 2007 but NM leads the series 26-9-1 SU in gms ply'd in Albuquerque. NM jumped out to an early lead LW (first lead of the season) but the Lobos didn't score again until :20 were left 4Q and were blown out, 45-10, by UNLV. QB Austin became the 1st true Fr QB to start for NM S'88 (Jeremy Leach) and he hit 17-40-177. He has thrown for 330 (49%) with a 2-3 ratio on the season. LW NM went over 100 yds rush (as a tm) for the 1st time TY and Dennis leads the run gm with 143 (3.9). Ty Kirk is the top rec with 18 (10.9). UTEP battled back from a 10-3 HT deficit LW and hit the GW 18 yd FG as time expired for the 16-13 home win over Memphis. QB Vittatoe is avg 265 ypg (60%) with an 8-2 ratio. His fav target has been Adams who has 13 rec (21.4). The top rusher is Banyard with 240 (4.9) although Buckram (knee) made his ssn debut LW and led the team with 59. UTEP is just 4-16 SU on the road and only 1-8 as an AF while the HT has won 5 in a row including B2B outright upsets.

OREGON ST 30 Arizona ST 27 - ASU's Dennis Erickson was the HC at Oregon St from 1999-2002. After a promising performance in their last road trip 2 wks ago at Wisky (tying PAT blk'd w/4:00 left), the Sun Devils lost a tough one LW in Tempe vs Oregon, 42-31. ASU outgained Oreg (#1 tll off) 597-405 but gave up 7 TO's in the loss. LY OSU won for the first time in Tempe in 16 tries dating back to 1969. They are however in yet another early ssn struggle after their loss LW in Boise 37-24, a game in which they were dominated statistically but still were just a play away. OSU has now been outgained TY by 197 ypg. The home team has won 8 of the last 10 meetings but OSU is just 5-19-1 vs ASU. While the Beavers are 22-11 ATS as P10 HF's, the ASU defense (held UO to 405 yd) should keep this one tight in Corvallis.

4★ SAN DIEGO over Arizona- LY after 3 games with Warner at the helm the Cardinals were avg 335 ypg with 19 ppg for a 1-2 start. Warner had 288 ypg (66%) with a 4-4 ratio but thanks to the consistency around him he got better as the year went along. TY after 3 games the Cardinals are 2-1 and avg 291 ypg with 16 ppg. Anderson has only hit for 190 ypg (52%) with a 3-3 ratio but LW was the 1st week that he had RB Wells (75 yds 5.4). Fitzgerald however is still struggling with his knee injury and only had 2 rec (13.0) vs the Raiders. Overall SD's #7 pass defense has been pretty stout holding Cassel to 68 yds, Garrard to 173 yds and Hasselbeck to 220 yds thru 12Q. LW without RB Mathews the Chargers struggled and gained only 89 yds on the ground (4.2). There is a different dynamic here facing an ARZ team that is allowing 146 ypg (4.3) on the ground and has not been able to establish drives losing the TOP in all 3 games by 6, 18 and 6:00. By taking the home team in Cardinals games you are 10-3 ATS with the only 3 losses coming in LY's reg ssn finale as they were resting players, were still adjusting to life with Anderson vs STL and caught an inspired OAK team LW. Lost in LW's loss with horrible special teams play (101 and 99 yd KR for TD for 2nd time in 15 games) was Rivers torching a comparable secondary for 455 yds. SD throttled JAX at home 2 Wks ago who were off a win vs a lower tier team at home and travelling and the Chargers do the same here.

FORECAST: SAN DIEGO 42 Arizona 17
3★ NY GIANTS over Chicago - Sunday Nite - The Bears are off LW's MNF game vs GB (2-6 ATS away afterwards) and they could have a commanding lead in the NFC North. While Giants OL isn't what it used to be (14 games w/o 100 yd rusher) their defense should continue to improve as the year goes on. CHI has done a solid job of adapting to Martz' offense with 386 ypg and 23 ppg so far with Cutler sticking to 5 step drops. The Bears however are now off a road upset at Dallas and are on a short week off a division Monday Nighter. The Giants are off B2B losses and while they were outplayed at Indy 2 weeks ago LW they finished with a 471-271 yd edge but were done in by -3 TO's. That type of sloppy performance under HC Coughlin will have the Giants wishing they were back in training camp. LY NYG started 5-0 and a mid-season swoon of 4 straight losses basically ended their season. Now sitting at 1-2 a third straight loss would be devastating. We also like the matchup of NYG's front 7 against the Bears OL which is being protected by a slew of short drops and isn't very physical.

2★ PITTSBURGH over Baltimore - Including playoffs PIT is 4-1 SU and ATS in the series. Playing without Roethlisberger, Palomalu and DE Smith in the 1st game the Steelers lost 20-17 in Dixon's 1st career start. Dixon threw a 4Q int that set up a 29 yd FG for BAL (393-298 yd edge) that was the difference maker. With Roethlisberger back for the 2nd game, PIT needed a 38 yd FG for the win with 5:25 left as RB Rice ended PIT's 33 game streak of holding RB's to under 100 yds. PIT is 12-3 ATS as a Div dog and this will be the 1st time they are a Div HD since WK 4 2000 (4-0 HD since). PIT is 3-0 thanks to its defense which has held foes to 278 ypg and 2 offensive TD's. They have held the #1 RB in the L3 games to 89 total rushing yds (2.2). They now have a bye on deck (7-2 ATS before) and the natural reaction for most teams would be to exhale. However they now take on a BAL team that allowed 173 yds (6.0) to CLE which trailed 17-14 going into the 4Q. Flacco redeemed himself with 262 yds (71%) with 3 TD's vs LY's #29 pass defense (#12 now). In the 2nd game CIN won 16-7 (13 pt HF) as they focused on grinding out a win with a 210 (4.7) to 58 (3.2) yd rush edge as they had a 16:22 TOP edge. Despite a 299-119 yd edge for the first 3.5Q vs CAR with a rookie QB making his 1st start the Bengals struggled to put the Panthers away. Palmer is not the same QB as his 2007 self and was extremely lucky to only have 2 int's on the day as CAR defenders dropped another 4. TENNESSEE 24 Denver 16 - This is only the 3rd meeting since realignment with DEN being 2-0 SU and ATS. Fisher did an excellent job of getting his team back on track after turning the ball over 7 times vs PIT. They stopped the Giants 3 times inside the TEN 6 with 2 TO's and a 1 SOD. They overcame a 471-271 yd deficit as the defense brought consistent pressure on a Giants OL (13 plays behind LOS) without starting Ctr O'Hara. RB Johnson got back on track with 125 yds (3.9) which allowed Young to be efficient especially on 3rd Dn where hit 5 of 6 for 63 yds with a TD and sack. While they gave up 386 yds to Manning 122 of that came on the Giants final 3 drives. DEN got down 13-0 early to IND and had to go to the air often (Orton 37-57, 476) as the Broncos gained 519 yds in the 27-13 loss. DEN had 4 poss inside the IND 20 but only came away with 6 pts incl being SOD at the IND1 in the 2Q. Rodgers has shredded DET for 336 ypg (70%) and 11-1 ratio with the Packers tallying a 447-262 yd edge. GB is off LW's MNF game vs CHI and have a road game vs WAS on deck. DET took an early 7-0 lead thanks to a Favre int that set up a 12 yd drive but were then outscored 24-3 with the FG coming off another Favre int. Hill has had to put it up 88 times in the L2 games leading to 4 int's with 126 of his 237 yds LW coming in the 4Q. RB Best only had 26 yds LW (3.7) as he sat out most of the 2H with a toe injury. TOLEDO 24 Wyoming 20 - First meeting. Wyoming is 2-2 SU and 0-4 ATS vs the MAC. In '08 they opened with a 21-20 win vs Ohio and lost 45-16 to BG as they were -4 in turnovers. In their last trip to play a MAC team they won 34-33 at Ohio in '07. Toledo is 15-3 SU in the Glass Bowl vs non-conference opp. Wyoming HC Christensen was the OL/OC at Toledo from '92-'00 under now-Mizzou HC Pinkel. Wyoming is 6-1 ATS as an AD the L/2Y. Toledo is off 3 straight road upset wins and returns home for the first time since being destroyed 41-2 by Arizona. The Rockets are just 2-3 SU/ATS as a HF the L/2Y. Wyoming led AF 14-7 in the 4Q as a 13' pt HD but allowed 13 unanswered pts and was outgained 445-240. Toledo outgained the weapon-less Boilers, who were down to their 3rd string QB and RB, 378-370 and won 31-20 as an 11' pt AD. While the defenses are close Toledo has an #88-113 edge on offense.

SF's problem right now is their OL with a 2nd year starter (RG Rachal), 2 rookies (LG Iupati and RT Davis) and former LG Baas still adjusting to Ctr. As a result SF has struggled at the POA with Gore being held to 38 and 43 yds on the road (2.5) with 7 sacks. Smith is checking down at a Trent Edwards rate and he hasn't established chemistry with Crabtree who has half the rec yards (81 13.5) that TE Davis (173 11.5) does. ATL snapped a 4 game losing skid in OT vs NO converting 3 TO's into 10 pts. Ryan has only thrown 1 int in 106 pass att's while the defense has made 6 in 97 att's. ATL is 14-3 SU and 12-5 ATS under Mike Smith at home with a 27-18 avg score including our **4★ NFL GOM winner vs ARZ**. This is a game to be handled with caution as LW's results shifted the line 3 pts. SF is the dangerous and desperate team here with ATL happy after pulling a road upset of the SB champs. We'll call for the home team by 4 in a close matchup as Ryan struggles facing 3-4 defenses.

ST LOUIS 20 Seattle 17 - The technical edges side with the road team here as SEA is 4-0 SU and ATS as a DIV AF with the L3 roles all coming vs STL (25-19 avg margin). STL is 10-21 ATS at home and 5-17 ATS vs the NFC West. STL was without their #2 WR and their top 2 TE's LW and were able to get Spags his first home win as a HC. Bradford has been very impressive so far and in his 3rd NFL start he earned his 1st win despite not having RB Jackson (groin) for the entire 2H. OC Shurmer adjusted and Bradford hit 9 of 13 for 122 yds setting up a TD and 3 FG's on short and safe passes in the 2H. Hasselbeck is a poor 1-7 SU and ATS on the road avg 209 ypg (58%) with a 6-1 ratio. SEA has been outscored 32-14 in that span. SEA beat SD despite being outgained 518-271 thanks to 5 takeaways (but only 3 pts) along with a 101 and 99 yd KR's for TD's. SEA has ridden the energy of Qwest Field for their 2 covers TY but now have to travel to a listless venue (only 41,000 fans vs ARZ, and many empty seats vs WAS). Look for STL to play very tough vs a beat up SEA team (LB Curry, CB Trufant left TD) that doesn't travel well and it wouldn't be a surprise to see Spags get another home win.

NY Jets 17 BUFFALO 14 - The Bills are a surprising 9-4 ATS vs the Jets and split the series SU and ATS LY. In the 1st meeting in poor weather Sanchez had a meltdown with 6 int's which enabled BUF to win the game on a 47 yd FG in OT despite being outgained 414-296. In the Toronto rematch the Jets took the ball out of Sanchez's hands with 43 rushes (5.8) to establish a 331-194 yd edge for the 19-13 victory as a 3 pt fav. The Jets defense tore into the Fitzpatrick (98 yds 39% 0-1) led offense holding them to 1 of 11 on 3rd Dns, forced 2 TO's and made 14 plays behind the LOS (sacks/QBH/ff) on 50 Bills snaps. Despite HC Gailey admitting that all 3 QB's on the roster "were basically the same" the Bills went back to Fitzpatrick (247 yds 71% 2-2) as Gailey felt he provided more in the way of intangibles. Indianapolis 35 JACKSONVILLE 17 - The Colts are not afraid to play in Jacksonville where are 6-2 SU since realignment and have covered 3 straight. Manning has a full season worth of snaps vs the Jaguars and has avg'd 264 ypg (63%) with a 30-12 (96.6 QBR). IND's defense knew they were getting into a shootout after DEN deactivated RB Moreno LW. They gave up 476 yds passing but held DEN to 2 FG's and SOD them 3 times inside their 20. The Colts offense was precision vs DEN with Manning hitting 325 yds (63%) with 3 TD's. This was despite being without their #2 and #3 WR's Garcon and Gonzalez. After being destroyed by SD, JAX again struggled vs PHI getting outgained 373-184. Jones-Drew (ankle) is not 100% and the pass defense has given up a 35-18 TD/int ratio the L/19 games. Garrard also lacks the proven WR's that can compete in a shootout vs a high tempo team (see SD). IND is now 21-5 SU away, 7-1 ATS as an AF, has covered 3 straight here and despite being 2-1 has outgained all 3 opponents by 108, 153 and 189 yds. To show how much the Jaguars have been outplayed lets just look at their 1H stats the first 3 games. They have been outscored 56-17, outFD 13-6 and outgained 240-103 on avg. Look for IND to get their 1st AFC South win here.

OAKLAND 16 Houston 13 - The Texans are 4-1 SU/ATS vs the Raiders and beat them 29-6 as an 8.5 pt AF. The Texans defense dominated helping post a 329-165 yd edge, held OAK to 45 yds rushing (2.1), made 19 of 57 plays behind the LOS and forced 3 TO's. While OAK formally gave Gradkowski the start LW (255 yds 50% 1-1) after Campbell's struggles the real issue here is the Raiders OL which switched starting Ctrs after the 1st game and have missed their best OL, LG Gallery (hamstring), the L2W. They have given up 29 of 216 plays behind the LOS with 5 TO's. HOU lost LT Brown (sus) prior to LW's game and while they were outgained 385-340 they did outFD DAL 24-21 but were at a 3-0 TO deficit. HOU's #31 defense gets a bit of a break statistically after facing 3 upper tier QB's who have gouged them for 423 ypg and 73% completions. With teams having success in the air the 51 ypg rushing (2.7) allowed is deceiving. Despite coming off a loss this is still a flat spot for HOU off IND, WAS, DAL and with the NYG on deck. HOU is now in the rare role of AF (1-4 ATS all-time into TY) and the only 2 times they've been an AF off a loss they were -3.5 at JAX and lost 31-24 LY and were -3 at ATL in '07 and lost 26-16. Gradkowski is the right QB for the Raiders who has a lot of Rich Gannon in him and OAK is good for 2 surprise upsets a year (PHI and PIT LY).

Washington 28 PHILADELPHIA 24 - Donovan McNabb returns to PHI and the dog is 5-1 ATS in the series. Reid made the right move by shifting to Vick (288 ypg 58% 5-0 67 yds rush 5.6 in his 2 starts) as the Eagles OL is in poor shape. Including LY's playoff loss the Eagles are 2-5 SU and 1-6 ATS vs a 3-4 defense allowing 21 sacks. LW PHI had good matchups vs JAX with their young DL and porous secondary. WAS also had an ideal matchup vs a young QB with a young and depleted receiving unit (#1 WR IR and down to #3 TE). WAS struggled to contain the short passing game and the offense floundered on 3 drives inside the STL 12 settling for 3 FG's. We don't mind backing a Skins team that not only has gone 8-1 ATS as a div AD against a PHI squad that is 1-6 ATS as a div HF. McNabb is now getting comfortable (278 ypg 61% 2-1) in the offense and will find success downfield against an Eagles team that has allowed 209 ypg (54%) with a 4-5 ratio vs DET and JAX. WAS was caught in a look ahead to this game and didn't prepare for STL correctly. LW's loss will sharpen their focus and we'll call for the road team by a FG.

New England at MIAMI - MNF - NE got a win vs BUF LW but it wasn't easy as they never opened more than an 8 pt lead. MIA is off LW's SNF game vs the Jets and it's not known if they played to the same intensity that they did vs MIN. MIA is now 4-1 ATS vs NE and Brady admitted that their D gives him the most trouble in games. With both teams having a bye on deck there will be no holding back by either team in what promises to be a marquee matchup for the AFC East. **Don't miss out on Monday Night Magic! The Owls are 12-5-1 ATS in this series and are on a 4-0 ATS (3-1 SU) run while the Mustangs have dropped 10 straight visiting Rice including being outgained by 104 ypg over the L/3. Ferentz has owned the Lions winning 7 out of the L/8 SU pulling 5 outright upsets. His 7 wins over PSU have come by a combined 38 (5.4 ppg) with LY's 11 pt victory the only 2 score gm. The dog is 9-2 ATS in this series with 6 OUTRIGHT UPSETS! On a rainy night in front of a 'Whitehouse' crowd PSU (-9) led LY 10-5 at HT but committed 4 2H TO's, missed a 48 yd FG and the turning point came early 4Q when Hawks DE Clayborn ret'd a blk'd P 53 yd for a TD in a 21-10 loss. Iowa rebounded from the loss to Arizona with a 45-0 blanking of a Ball St team (562-112 yd edge) who had more P (9) than FD's (8). QB Stanzi is #5 NCAA pass eff (250, 67%, 9-1 ratio). RB Robinson has 385 yd (5.5) and UL was forced to burn Coker's RS (60, 6.0) vs BSU due to Hampton's inj. The Hawks are allowing an NCAA best 228 ypg. PSU rallied from a 13-9 HT deficit to extend their win streak over Temple to 28 gms, 22-13, as the Lions outgained the Owls 439-202 and outFD'd them 20-8 but RZ problems contributed to a PSU record tying 5 FG's. While UW is off a bye, they are just 4-11-1 ATS in P10 openers, 5-13 ATS in reg ssn trips to the state of CA and have not won outright on the road S/'07 (13 straight)!
Miami, FI 27 CLEMSON 20 - The HT has dropped all 3 ACC meetings. CU kicked a 30 yd FG w/'05 left to force OT LY in a gm that featured 12 lead changes. UM is off a 31-3 rout of Pitt, delivering as our Thursday Night Marquee GOM Winner! The Canes finished with 20-11 FD and 348-232 yd edges and held Pitt's Lewis to just 41 yds. UM rolled up 5 sks and continues to lead the NCAA in tfl per gm (11.3). QB Harris is avg 230 ypg (64%) with a 6-6 ratio. His top rec has been Hankerson (16, 15.1) who has 3 of the tm's 6 rec TD's. The top rusher is Berry with 226 (5.3). CU has not only covered all 3 ACC meetings vs UM (all in OT), but they've pulled 2 outright upsets. They are off an early season bye, and it couldn't have come at a better time as they were banged up in the physical 27-24 OT loss to Aub 2 wks ago. QB Parker stayed in the gm despite inj's to his shldr, ribs, head and hand and was limited in the bye wk with a back bruise (CS). He is avg 170 ypg (59%) with a 6-1 ratio. His fav target has been Allen (8, 19.5, 1) and the top rushers are Ellington (273, 7.4, 4) and Harper (155, 5.0, 1). The Canes are 6-10 SU/ATS on the ACC road (just 1-7 as conf AF) and this one could come down to whoever has the ball last.

Boise St 52 NEW MEXICO ST 3 - Boise leads the series 10-0 SU (-7.3 ATS) and has won the L/3 by a combined 149-7 (2 shutouts) with 1643-430 yd and 79-29 FD edges! LY BSU led 42-0 after 3Q's and the only NMSt score came after the Broncos fmb'd on their own 17. Last time here ('08) BSU won 49-0 (-21) with 495-150 yd and 26-11 FD edges. NMSt is coming off a 42-16 loss (+23) at KU. The Aggies off is beginning to make some strides under new OC Dunbar as QB Christian is avg 190 ypg (53%) with a 3-1 ratio and has a big-play WR in Allen who has 13 rec (20.6). But the running game (LY's strength) is

still struggling as RB Smith (1000 yd rusher LY) has just 100 yds (3.2) thru 3. Last time here ('08), UN trailed 17-7 after 1Q before scoring 35 of the L/45 pts in a 42-27 (+3) victory where UN outshouted LV 44-54. LY this gm was tied at 17 at HT before UN blew it open en route to a 63-28 (-6) victory behind 773 tll yds (3 UN players over 210 rush) and 32 FD's! UNLV trailed NM 7-0 early 1Q LW before scoring 45 unanswered pts in a 45-10 win as QB Clayton (134 ypg, 51%, 4-0 ratio) hit WR Johnson (20 rec, 13.9) for 3 TD passes. UN has the edge on off (#6-108), def (#70-91) and ST (#54-112) and has rushed for 1,003 yds (8.9) and 12 TD's comb in the L/2 meetings with LV. UN ended a 14 gm road opener losing streak with a 27-13 win at BYU LV to remain perfect on the year (best start S/'91) and they are ranked in the AP Poll for the 1st time S/'48. QB Kaepernick is avg 231 ypg (69%) with a 7-1 ratio and also has 451 rush yds (8.1) and is #3 in the NCAA in tll off (344 ypg) and became UN's all-time leader in off LV. Don't expect a new 5 year trend to start here as UN looks to make it 6 in a row.

OREGON 41 Stanford 31 - Both come into this one undefeated and have 2 of the most high octane offenses in the entire nation. The Cardinal defeated ND LW 37-14, to go 4-0 for 1st time S/'86. The Ducks on the other hand survived their meeting with ASU in the desert 42-31, forcing 7 TO's for the win. LY Stanford RB Gerhart rushed for a school-record 223 yds as SU became bowl eligible for the 1st time in 8 yrs knocking off the #7 ranked Ducks who were in a letdown spot after upsetting USC 47-20 the week prior. Prior to LY's 51-42 loss at Stanford (1075 comb yds), the Ducks had topped the Cardinal 7 consec yrs with an average score of 39-17. While UO has ply'd weaker opponents (NM and Port St) at Autzen so far in '10, it's still worth noting that they have not all'd a point outscoring them by a whopping 141-0 (697-129 yd avg). Judging by those numbers and the fact that the Cardinal have gone 1-6 ATS in its 2nd game of a B2B road trip, the Ducks should continue their run to a 2nd straight P10 title.

HAWAII 31 Louisiana Tech 21 - LH leads the series 6-2 SU (5-3 ATS) incl wins in 3 of the L/4. LY LH lost 27-6 (+5) failing to score a TD for the 1st time S/'04 (63 gms) and the Warriors were sacked 7x's. LH Tech had three 4Q TO's that proved costly in a 13-12 loss to SM. The Bulldogs' QB quandary looks like it will continue into conf play as after "starting" QB Cameron (115 ypg, 60%, 1-5 ratio) LY was 0-3 on his first drive before being picked off on his first pass attempt of LT's 2nd drive before being replaced by Hakmi who threw for career-high 262 yds (highest total of any Tech QB TY). LH QB Moniz is avg 334 ypg (64%) with an 11-3 ratio and is #4 in the NCAA in tll off (343 ypg) and LW threw for 395 yds and 6 TD (tied schl record for TD passes in a half) in a 66-7 win over FCS Charleston Southern. WR Salas had 7 rec (18.7) and 2 TD LW and has 31 rec (13.3) on the yr. As you would expect the HT is 6-0 ATS (5-1 SU). LT is 8-27 as an AD and the Warriors Run-&Shoot is running crisply while the Bulldogs attack is still struggling.

PITTSBURGH 34 FIU 17 - First meeting. Pitt has only played one gm vs a current SBC member, beating Louisiana 45-13 (-7) in '97. FIU is 0-20 vs BCS schools (0-17 on the road) losing by 27 ppg, but is playing their 4th in a row TY vs a BCS tm (3rd str road gm) and has only lost by 8.7 ppg in the 1st 3 (led almost whole gm vs TX A&M). Pitt is off a 31-3 Thurs Night loss to Miami (Marquee GOM Winner for us as Pitt was outgained 348-232 and outFD'd 20-11) and has ND on deck so this is a "C" game for them. FIU has just 11 ret str's and has its SBC opener on deck. QB Carroll is a Miss ST transfer who set FIU records LW for single gm pass att and comp in their 42-28 loss to MD. Carroll is avg 213 ypg (54%) with a 4-5 ratio. Pitt QB Sunseri is avg 173 (62%) with 3-2 ratio. AA RB Lewis has struggled TY with 143 (3.0) and is #2 behind Graham (215, 9.3). Pitt's offensive struggles go back to the inconsistent OL (9 sk all'd) as they are avg 126 rush ypg which is #58 in the NCAA. FIU has ply'd the big tms tough but Pitt needs a win after LW.

Louisville 34 ARKANSAS ST 27 - LY was their 1st and only meeting as UL led 21-3 w/2:00 to go in the 3Q but had a hard time putting ASU away (ASU at UL8 at end, pass into EZ inc). Third string QB Stein got his 1st career start (20-39 for 232, 0-1 ratio). In their 7 lined gms vs SBC tms, UL is 7-0 SU and 5-2 ATS with the avg win 46-17. ASU is 10-6 as a HD and has not had a BCS school visit here S/'01. UL is 14-7 ATS off a bye after losing at Oreg ST 35-28 as a 20 pt AD despite a 453-319 yd edge. ASU is in a SBC sandwich with N Texas on deck. They trailed Troy 21-7 but took a 28-27 4Q lead but allowed a TD with :22 left. QB Apelin is avg 299 ypg (59%) with a 6-2 ratio but also is the top rusher with just 146 yds (2.7). UL QB Froman is avg 211 ypg (57%) with a 2-3 ratio and RB Powell leads with 328 (6.3). UL has the edges on off (#64-95) and def (#72-111) and has a non-conf game on deck.

NTexas 30 Louisiana 20 - UL has won 4 of the L/5 vs NT incl B2B wins in Denton. The visitor has actually outgained the home team in each of the last 6 by 82 ypg. NT is 5-13 ATS at home vs SBC but is 8-2 ATS in the series. LY the Mean Green blew a 10 pt 4Q lead as they allowed the GW TD with :27 left on a 58/8pl drive. UL was outgained 424-340 LW but only trailed 20-14 at half but lost 34-14 (1'). NT got its first win over FAU which was also its 1st win of an inj-plagued ssn as they were led by QB Dodge, who was playing at WR before they lost their 1st and 2nd string QB's for the yr. In his first start Dodge threw for 146 (67%) with a 2-1 ratio and added 67 yds rush as he comb with RB's Hamilton and Dunbar for 261 yds. Not good news for a UL defense allowing 4.7 ypc. NT has the edges on off (#82-111) and def (#95-109).

AUBURN 41 ULM 6 - Auburn is 7-0 (3-3 ATS, 1 NL) vs ULM winning by an avg of 43-10 and has faced ULM more than any other Sun Belt tm. Last meeting was a 34-0 AU (-26) win in '08 in which AU had 19-12 FD and 406-220 yd edges (prev meeting also shutout 31-0 in '04). Aub is 11-6 as a fav of 20+ pts vs FBS tms. ULM escaped with a 21-20 win over FCS SE Louisiana LW but had 363-266 yd and 22-16 FD edges. This is a letdown spot for Aub off hard fought wins over Clem and SC with a revenge matchup with UK on deck. Aub QB Newton is avg 171 ypg (63%) with a 9-3 ratio and is the tm's top rusher with 485 (6.5). ULM also has a mobile QB with Browning avg 197 ypg (59%) with a 5-4 ratio and 183 rush (3.6). LY vs Ball St and Furman, Aub cleared the bench with many walk-ons seeing action on the depth-shy defense which led to 2 non-covers as 30+ favs. Aub's #31 D has better depth TY.

USF 34 Florida A13 - The Bulls are 2-0 SU but dropped their only lined meeting vs the Owls (in '07), USF's 35-23 (-17) win at FAU was closer than the final score as FAU missed 30, 42 and 40 yd FG's in the 1H and was SOD at the USF30 and trailed 7-0. FAU is 8-17-1 as an AD. USF is now 11-4 SU vs Florida tms (2 losses to FL, 2 to Miami). USF led WKU 21-0 in the 4Q but only won 24-12 as a 27 pt HF and was outgained 314-283. FAU trailed NT 21-10 at the half and lost 21-17 as a 10 pt HF being outgained 403-253 as they allowed 257 (4.7) rushing. USF has the edges on both off (#57-105) and def (#61-103). Both have conf games on deck. FAU is allowing an NCAA worst 276 ypg (6.3) on the ground while USF is avg 217 (5.7)

TUESDAY, October 5th • Troy at MIDDLE TENN ST - These rivals play for the Palladium Trophy. Troy is 14-1 vs current SBC teams on the road. Troy has won 4 straight in the series. LY the teams punted a combined 15x's in the 1H. The favorite is 7-1 ATS and this figures to be the battle for the Sun Belt Title as both teams won their SBC opener LW.

WEDNESDAY, October 6th • Uab at UCF - The visitor has won the L/3 SU with UAB outgaining UCF each of the L/2Y by 134 ypg. UAB got its 1st and only shutout in CUSA play in their last trip to Orlando as the Knights reached UAB territory just twice in 9 drives. UCF is 10-2 ATS off a SU loss and they fit this role again here after their 17-13 loss to K-St 10 days ago. The Blazers are also off a tough OT loss to Tenn and need to avoid an 0-2 start in CUSA play.
