NEWS AND NOTES: Texas A&M had a commanding 222-63 yd edge at the half vs Okla St but Jerrod Johnson, who had 4 int and a costly fmbl kept the Cowboys in the game. It was 21-7 A&M at the half but OSU rallied for a 21-21 tie. A&M was SOD at the OSU33 and then int'd. OSU went 48/5pl for a TD and the lead. A&M went on a 43/9pl drive but Johnson was sk'd & fmbl'd and ret'd 63 yds for a TD, basically a 14 pt swing, 35-21. A&M put together a pair of 80 yd TD drives to tie it with 2:54 left then forced a punt with 1:16 left. The Aggies were at their own 46 when Johnson was int'd and ret'd 28 yds to the Aggie40 with :16 left. On the final play OSU got a FG for the win...BYU fell to 1-4 for the first time since 1973 and Utah St, who had lost 10 straight to BYU, won for the first time since 1993. BYU trailed 31-10 when they scored a TD with :28 left...Ohio St did struggle vs Illinois early with UI getting a 55/9pl TD drive for a stunning 7-0 lead and the Illini led 10-7 before the half and the Buckeves drove for 57 yds for a TD with :45 left for the lead. The key play happened on OSU's first poss of the 3Q. Terrelle Pryor ran for a FD but was inj'd and would not only miss 2' series, but when he returned, they basically handed the ball off to the RB almost every offensive play after that and OSU only managed an 11 pt win, 24-13...Florida St was possibly even more dominant than the score would indicate vs Virginia in their 34-14 win. They led 27-0 at half with a 292-42 yd edge and UVA's only TD's came on a 76/1pl TD pass early 3Q and then trailing 34-7 they drove 70/14pl and on 4&gl from the 12 got a TD with 1:39 left...Vanderbilt/Connecticut was closer than the final as UC only had a 376-326 yd edge. VU led 21-14 with 5:26 left 1H when UC drove for a TD with 1:04 left. UC got a TD on their opening 3Q drive then after a roughing the P gave them a FD, they got a 25 yd FG to lead 31-21. VU was int'd at the UC20 but UC fmbl'd at the VU7. With 8:33 left UC got a 44 yd IR TD to clinch it...TCU continues to win unimpressively. This time vs Colorado St they only had a 6-0 lead at the half with a 164-51 yd edge. TCU scored TD's on 2 of their first three 3Q poss and led 27-0. CSU fmbl'd at the TCU25 with 3:55 left and TCU had a shot at the cover but took a knee at the 13 on the final play...Kent St led Miami, Oh 14-3 in the 1Q and gave up a TD with 2:31 left 1H to only lead 14-10. KSU was int at the MU31 late 3Q and MU drove 69 yds for a TD and their first lead, 17-14. MU then blk'd a punt for a TD, 24-14. After a KSU TD, MU went on a 14pl drive getting a 21 yd FG with 3:32 left. KSU drove and had a 1&gl. On 2&gl from the 7 QB Keith was int'd in the EZ for a TB with :56 left...Army actually led Temple 28-13 at the start of the 3Q and TU was playing without star RB Pierce. Matt Brown rushed for 226 yds on 28 carries and TU scored TD's on their first four 2H poss to turn it around and take a 42-28 lead before Army scored with 1:18 left. TU rec'd the onside kick and got a 4&3, 5 yd run to the Army31 on the last play...The key to the Tulane/Rutgers game was probably RU QB Savage being inj'd and missing the final series of the 2Q and the entire 2H. RU cut it to 17-14 after 3Q's and after punting 2x on 4th & 6 they were SOD at the TU36 with 1:38 left. The Knights got it back after an 18 yd TU punt but were int'd...The last few years Air Force had outgained Navy almost every season but came up short but this year they finally ended their jinx. This time Navy had a 17-13 FD edge. AF benefitted from a couple of key plays as Navy went inside their 20 3x but missed a FG and settled for 2 short FG's. AF also blk'd a punt and drove 15 yds for a TD after to lead 14-6. Navy's last drive got to the AF33 but they were int'd at the 22 and ret'd 10 yds with :25 left...It was a record breaking game for Baylor. Robert Griffin set a single game record with 444 totals yds and BU set a school record with 678 yds offense. BU got their largest B12 win ever and their biggest conf win since back in 1922 when they won by 47 over Arkansas as BU hammered Kansas 55-7...Miami, Fl had a 280-169 yd edge at the half vs Clemson and led 27-14. CU turned the ball over six times but UM also turned it over 2x. The key happened with CU down by 6 when they were SOD at the UM20 and the Hurricanes drove 69/10pl for a 29 yd FG with 2:40 left. Two of CU's TO's came on their final two drives...Minnesota lost their first 4 HG's of the season for the first time since 1983. Northwestern trailed almost the entire 2H as they got the apparent tying TD at 21-20 but missed the xp. Trailing 28-20 they got a TD with 8:12 left, forced a punt and got the go-ahead 27 yd FG with 1:58 left. UM, needing only a FG for the win, got to the NW39 but on 3&11 were int at the 40 and ret'd 9 yds with :17 left...LSU had a yard edge of 432-217. Last year they were outgained by an avg of 328-305 but ended up winning 9 games. Against a Tennessee team, with a young O-line and QB making their first road start, LSU trailed 14-10 when they stopped the Vols at

the LSU31 with 5:41 left. The Tigers drove to the UT1 with :04 left but the snap went past QB Jefferson and UT rec'd for the win and celebrated on the field. Unfortunately they had 13 men on the field and LSU got another crack at it after it appeared they had lost. They converted on the last play of the game for a 1 yd TD run and pulled out the 16-14 win. LSU also converted on 4&14 on their final drive with no time-outs left and sent 3 subs on the field as the clock continued to click

down and it looked like Miles would have another time clock malfunction. Dooley pointed out that with LSU running 3 players on the field the rules state the D has to be given enough time to make a substitution and the refs should have held the play up until UT's D was set but that protocol was a substitution and the lets should have held the play by thinlif of S D was set but first protocol was not followed... Pitt's Ray Graham ran for 277 yds in his first college start and Dion Lewis did not play (shoulder inj). The Pitt/FIU game was just 13-10 at the half and 16-10 after 3Q's. It was 23-17 Pitt with 12:07 left when they got some big plays. After Pitt converted on 3&13 with a 15 yd pass, Graham got a 79 yd TD run. After an FIU punt, Pitt went 45/6pl with a 19 yd TD run then FIU was sk'd & fmbl'd at their own 16 (4:22) and Pitt got a 4 yd TD run with 1:32 left for a 42-17 score and it was not as comfortable as the final...UCLA faced Washington St without starting QB Prince. Richard Brehaut hit 12-23-128 yds but Johnathan Franklin rushed for 216 and Derrick Coleman for 185 as UCLA continued their strong run game. The key play of the game happened in the 4Q. WSU thought they had taken the lead, 35-28 when a 2&1 QB sneak was orig called a TD. After a review, they spotted it at the inch line. Two plays later on 4th & gl from the 1 WSU was SOD with 13:51 left. UCLA went 99/7pl with a 73 yd run by Coleman on 3&2 the key. After an 11pl drive, WSU missed a 45 yd FG and UCLA went 72/8pl for a TD with 3:04 left for some breathing room. WSU fmb/fd at the UCLA38 with :58 left...Michigan St held John Clay to 17 carries for 80 yds breaking his streak of 10 straight games of 100+. They also held Scott Tolzien to just 11-25 passing while Kirk Cousins was 20-29. MSU had a 230-118 yd edge at the half and led 20-10. At the end of the game, they faced a tough decision. They had a 4&gl at the 1, up 27-24. A FG would put them more than a FG ahead but they opted to go for it and got a 1 yd TD pass with 2:43 left for a 10 pt lead. Wisconsin would end up being SOD on 4&17 at the MSU32 with 1:04 left...Denard Robinson had 19 carries for 217 yards incl a game winning 4 yd TD run with :17 left. Robinson also hit 10-16-277 yds. Robinson is the first QB to throw for 200 and rush for 200 twice in season. He now has the top 3 highest total offensive yards in a single game in school history and in 5 starts already has 1,008 pass yds and 905 rush yds in five games Indiana had its first sellout crowd since Memorial Stadium was renovated. Indiana's Ben Chappell hit 33-64-480 yds - all school records. The game could have been even higher scoring than the 42-35 final. ...Oklahoma has led each of their games this season by 17 pts and had been outscored in the 4Q, 41-10 coming into the Red River Rivalry. They were outscored again. OU led 21-7 at the half and appeared to clinch it with a TD making it 28-10. Texas used a fake punt which set up a FG and then stuffed Oklahoma on a fake FG for an 8 yd loss. Texas also took advantage of a 17 yd punt with 2:37 left for a 21 yd FG to pull within 28-20. UT kicked off deep as they had all 3 time-outs left and forced a punt with 1:02 left but fmbl'd the punt and OU rec'd at the UT41 for their 8 pt win. UT did have a 26-15 FD edge...Rice actually had a 24-17 FD edge vs SMU but gave up a 32 yd IR TD in the 1Q and trailed 7-0. It was 7-3 late 1H when SMU took over with 1:04 left but they needed 3 plays to go 80 yds for a TD and led 14-3. Rice missed a 58 yd FG on the final play of the half. Rice rec'd a fmbl'd punt in the EZ for a TD to pull within 14-10. Each team went on a long drive but SMU got a TD and Rice had a 1st & gl at the 3 but settled for a 35 yd FG. SMU not only blk'd it but ret'd it 77 yds for a TD to make it 28-10. SMU would extend it to 42-17 after an int but Rice got a TD with 5:04 left, rec'd the onside kick and got a TD with 1:40 left...Last week NCSt was ranked for the first time since 2003 and they appeared on their way to a big win over Virg Tech leading 17-0. At with 8:17 left 2Q. On 4&9 they dropped a TD pass from the VT31 and then on 3&10 from the VT16 Wilson was int'd in the EZ again with :48 left 1H. NCSt, trailing 28-27, had a 14 yd gain to the VT 9 Vilson was find in the E2 again with .46 left Fh. No.St, training 26-27, flad a 14 yu gaint of the VT9 yd line but it was called back on a hold. On 4th &11 they settled for a 42 yd FG with 4:42 left, 30-28. VT got a 39 yd TD pass with just 1:27 left then a 46 yd IR got them to the NCSt6 and Evans got a 3 yd TD run after an offsides pen for a misleading 41-30 final in a game VT trailed with 1:40 left...Alabama did have a 268-96 yd edge at the half but Florida finished the game with a 281-273 yd edge but also had a 4-0 TO deficit. Each team went on a long drive to open. Bama got a 28 yd FG and UF on 4&gl from the 2 was int'd in the EZ on a jump pass. It was 24-3 at the half but UF opened the 3Q with a 69/10pl drive. They had a 1st & gl at the 5 but settled for a 21 yd FG. The Gators were cooked when they had the ball back down at the 18 and were int'd and ret'd 32 yds for a TD with 6:10 left in the 3Q. UF went 72/9pl and had a 1st & gl at the 2 but fmbl'd. On their next drive, they were SOD at the Bama13 and Bama took over with 4:22 left and gained 37 yds and got 3 FD's running out the clock...USF played without leading rusher Demetris Murray but Moise Plancher rushed for 93 yds and 2 TD's...New Mexico's 3 scoring "drives" vs UTEP were a 27/4pl drive following a UTEP fmbl, a blk'd FG which they ret'd 45 yds for a TD and then after UTEP scored a TD with 3:37 left in the game, Myles Daughtry ret'd the ensuing KO 100 yds for a TD. That's how they accounted for 20 pts in a 38-20 loss. UTEP had a 455-237 yd edge...Southern Miss dominated Marshall as the score would indicate. They had a 269-46 yd edge at the half with Marshall punting on their first 7 poss and it was 28-0. MU did get a 104 yd KR TD and trailing 34-7 a snap went over SM's P head for a safety. Marshall benched starting QB Anderson and AJ Graham hit 10-12-98 yds in the 2H. *Cont on Pg 2*

Duke went on three long drives but settled for 3 short FG's and led 9-0. They were at the Maryland 16 when they were int'd in the EZ for a TB with 4:37 left in the half in a game they had dominated. Maryland then went 80/8pl for a TD with 1:12 left 1H to only trail 9-7. The Terps got an 84 yd PR TD early 3Q and then on 3&7 got a 71 yd TD run by Scott early 4Q, 21-9. Duke got a TD with 7:20 let and got the ball back driving to the Maryland 33 but were SOD on 4&15 with 2:00 left. For the game, Duke had a 399-294 yd edge...Buffalo flat out dominated BG statistically with 27-10 FD and 441-176 yd edges while Buffalo had 6 TO's and BG 5. UB left BG in the game because they fumbled at the 2 and were int'd setting up BG for a 5 yd "drive" in the 1Q. UB missed a 35 yd FG and only led 14-13 at the half. They led 28-13 when they were int'd in the EZ. UB had the ball at the BG21 on FD leading by 15 when they were int'd and ret'd 82 yds for a TD with 10:14 left. BUF got off an 11 yd punt and BG went 37/4pl for a TD with 7:12 left. BG faced a 4&18 from the 50 and was int'd at the UB21 with 1:35 left but UB fmbl'd 2pl later and BG attempted a game winning 40 yd FG on the final play and missed it...A check of the FD's shows C Michigan with 21-14 FD edge vs Ball St but BSt controlled the game. At one point BSt had a 422-246 yd edge and led 31-11 before CM gained 125 yds on their final 2 drives. BSt led 14-3 at half and 28-3

after 3Q's and rushed for 306 yards...Tulsa had a 26-12 FD edge vs Memphis, 233 yds rushing and 214 passing while Memphis had 207 total yards. TU led 20-7 at half but scored TD's on their first 3 poss of the 2H to break it open 41-7 and added a TD with 2:57 left for the 48-7 final...North Texas had 21-13 FD 371-358 yd edges. There were 2 crucial plays in the game. NT trailing 7-0 had a 3&1 at the UL32 when they fmbl'd and it was ret'd for a TD by UL and NT trailed 14-0. It was 21-14 at the half. Trailing 28-14, NT went 72/11pl for a TD with 8:53 left then forced a punt with 4:54 left. NT drove 91/12pl and got the apparent tying TD with :31 left but UL blk'd the xp and rec'd the onside kick and won by 1...Georgia's AJ Green ret'd from his 4 game suspension and had a big game with 7 rec for 117 yds incl 2 TD's, with one of them being spectacular. Unfortunately the altitude and lack of PT had him cramping up in the 2H and after hauling in a 50 yd rec on the 3rd snap of the 2H he did not catch another pass. Georgia settled for a 33 and 20 yd FG's in the game and missed a 41 yd FG. Colorado settled for a 38 yd FG but roughing the K late 3Q gave them a FD and on the next play they got a 10 yd TD run for a 29-24 lead. CU missed a 52 yd FG with 3:37 left and UGA appeared on their way to a win. They had a FD at the CU27 with 1:56 left and CU used a time-out. CU LB Beatty blitzed and stripped RB King of the ball and CU rec'd it at the 30, got 1 FD & took a knee

The Giants have struggled behind key mistakes by Eli (6 ints), bad play by special teams (33 net avg, 5.9 PR and 15.9 on KR's a defense that can't stop the run (137 ypg 3.8) or get off the field on 3rd Dns (44% conversion rate). HOU's defense has gotten a pass so far due to their big win vs IND, the breakout play of Foster (134 ypg 6.3) and the Schaub/Johnson big play ability. HOU's #3 rush def is a mirage as foes have only run 79 times on them which was the lowest of teams with 4 games logged prior to SNF. They have given up 338 ypg (70%) with a 8-2 ratio with a huge 8.2 ypa. They have only pulled in 9 sacks (1 every 18.2 pass att) with DE Williams owning 5 of them. LW the Texans did finally get some pressure with 4 sks but still gave up 363 ttl yds to OAK in the win. This is only 2nd game away for the Giants (lost 38-14 at IND) and may have to again deal with dome issues. LY the Giants finished 1-4 ATS away failing to cover by 18, 24, 25.5 and 29 pts. HOU should have WR Johnson back (missed LW) and will fired up playing off a previous home loss.

San Diego 27 OAKLAND 13 - SD owns the longest win streak vs a foe in the NFL with 13 SU wins vs the Raiders though they dropped to 10-3 ATS failing to cover both meetings LY as 10 and 16.5 pt favorites. OAK capitalized on the energy of a MNF season opener to keep it close in the 1H of the initial meeting but melted down in the 2H. The 24-16 final in the 2nd matchup wasn't as close as it looked as the Chargers owned a 346-180 yd edge. SD forced 3 FG's on 3 drives by OAK into their 30 and only allowed 1 drive over 30 yds on the day. SD sits atop the rankings with the #1 off and def (+1 TO). SD continued their offensive assault LW outgaining ARZ 419-124 and despite their 2-2 record their avg 449 ypg and are outgaining foes by 214 ypg. Oakland has also played much better then their 1-3 record as they have the #10 off and def units (-3 TO) and LW battled back from a 31-14 deficit vs HOU but lost 31-24. SD's recent slow starts will ensure focus and this is a solid technical spot. The Spartans led 13-0 at HT and their 231 yds ttl off in the 1H alone was more than the team avg of 226 yds Sparlatis led 13-0 at h1 and their 23 y Vis tit off in the 14 and the was more than the terial and 01-22 y Vis over the 1st 4 gms, but it wasn't enough. QB La Secla is avg 147 ypg (67%) with a 2-3 ratio while RB Muldrow has 237 yds (5.2) and WR Jones has 22 rec (9.0). UN has a huge edge on off (#6-120) and also gets the nod on def (#65-94) and ST (#54-119). UN is off its 6th consec win over instate rival UNLV 44-26 LW as UN outgained (516-294) and outFD'd (29-15) LV to remain perfect at 5-0 on the ssn. UN features the NCAA's #5 off avg 526 ypg and is paced by QB Kaepernick (#7 NCAA ttl off) who is avg 210 ypg (70%) with an 8-2 ratio to go along with 548 rush yd (7.9). RB Taua has 641 yds (6.4) while WR Matthews has 18 rec (15.0). This one has mismatch written all over it and look for UN to cruise easily here.

San Diego St 27 BYU 14 - BYU has scored a TD in 16 of 17Q's vs SDSt (no TD 4Q 2006 leading by 47-10) San Diego St 2/ BYD 14 - BYD has scored a 1 Dir 16 of 17 Us Vs SDSt (In 10 4Q 2006 leading by 4/-10). The favorite is 6-11 ATS. Since the Aztecs upset BYU in Provo in 2000 they have dropped their L/4 here by 29 ppg. BYU does have TCU on deck. LW BYU lost on Fri night to Utah St, 31-16, which snapped a 10 gm win streak over the Aggies. It was BYU's 4th str loss, putting them at 1-4 for the 1st time S/73. True Fr QB Heaps has thrown for 467 (51%) but with an 0-2 ratio in his 2 sts. JJ Di Luigi leads in both rush (374, 5.8) and rec (23, 11.4). BYU has all'd 929 yds rush the L/3W (310 ypg!!) which does not bode well for the #79 D facing a resurgent SDSt ground gm (214 ypg, 5.9). Oregon 59 WASH ST 17 - The Ducks are off a big victory LW over Stanford, a game in which they trailed early 21-3 but couldn't be stopped on offense yet again totaling 625 yds in the 21 pt win. They now come into a series in which they have outscored the Cougs by a 115-20 margin (63-14, -21' here in '08) over the L2Y. LY QB Tuel became the 1st True Fr QB to start a gm for the Cougs since Drew Bledsoe in the 52-6 defeat (+35). WSU showed some fight LW in the Rose Bowl actually holding onto a lead near the end of the 3Q and putting up a ssn-best 384 ttl yds. They now return home to Pullman, a place in which they have gone 4-9 ATS as a HD and 1-9 SU (3-7 ATS) under current HC Wilff (outscored by a 48-13 avg). UO has gone 10-2 ATS vs schools from the state of WA and should continue their dominance here with the only question being if they can move to 6-0 ATS as a fav of 20+ points (covered 1st five by 17 ppg).

ARIZONA 34 Oregon St 17 - LY QB Foles hit 25-34 for 254 yds and 3 TD's in his 1st career start as the Cats held onto the upset victory (+3). In '08's visit to Tucson, OSU K Kahut connected on a 24 yd FG as time ex-

pired to give the Beavers the victory (Kahut missed the game-tying PAT earlier). While the Wildcats come into this meeting well rested after an early bye week and bolstering an undefeated mark and their highest ranking in the Stoops era (#9), AZ has struggled in the past vs OSU going just 2-9 SU/ATS while being outscored by a A3-181 margin. After another miserable Sept, the Beavers returned to expected Oct form LW vs ASU as QB Katz posted the best game of his young career throwing for 260 yds (66%) with a 2-0 ratio (48.6% completions prior to LW). UK is off a loss to Ole Miss in which UK had a 424-301 yd edge but trailed 42-20 in the 4Q before a late come back try was thwarted. QB Hartline is avg 244 ypg (64%) with an 8-3 ratio. RB Locke has 543 (5.3) and WR Cobb has 501 total yds. Aub has a large edge on D (#29-60) and will be able to exploit UK's biggest weakness 166 rush ypg all'd, 4.5). Aub just demolished ULM and has Ark on deck but won't forget LY's upset.

With QB Marve OFY rFr Henry (17-31 for 140 yd, 1-1 ratio, 67 rush yd) will get his 1st road start. HC Hope called out some of veteran def players after the Boilers gave up 378 yds to a Toledo off which came into the gm LAST in the NCAA in ttl offense 220 ypg. PU's young secondary is all'g 202 ypg (69%) with a 5-2 ratio (#110 NCAA pass eff D). QB Persa is #3 NCAA pass eff (272, 79%, 10-2 ratio) and is the Cats leading rusher with 271 yd. NW is #61 pass eff D (250, 60%, 6-9 ratio). The dog in NW gms is 16-2 ATS vs FBS tms.

Miss St 30 HOUSTON 20 - UH comes into this matchup fresh off a much needed bye as they cont to

develop true frosh QB Broadway (3 TO's, sk'd 5x's vs Tulane) in the absence of their #1 and #2 QB's. The Bulldogs should have had some extra time to prep as well after an easy win vs Alcorn St LW (566-330 yd edge). LY the Cougars were off an upset loss to UTEP which knocked them out of the Top 25 and while it was fied 17-17 into the 4Q, UH pulled out a 31-24 win (553-490 yd edge). In that meeting however MSU used the adv of their big OL (303 lb avg) vs the Cougs small DL (267 avg) putting up a whopping 330 yds (6.5) on the ground. While UH is 7-1 SU vs Miss St (last loss '72), there are new dynamics in place for this one as UH has been a home dog just once in the L/4Y (+2 vs Tenn, lost by 18) while MSU has been an AF just 3 times in 4 ssns. The Bulldogs have the D edge here (#14-90) and have played a far tougher

sked (#58-112) while the young Cougar QB has yet to see the spd of an SEC opponent.

NEW MEXICO ST 31 New Mexico 30 - The 101st edition of the Rio Grande Rivalry. NM has won 6 of the L/7 (3-4 ATS). NMSt has won B2B gms just once S/'69 ('98-'99) and can achieve that feat here with a win as LY the Aggies snapped a 6 gm losing streak with a 20-17 (+10) win despite being outgained 356-218. LY's gm saw 5 lead changes as NMSt went 17pl/59 yds (TOP 7:00) for the winning TD on 4&gl w/:39 left. NM drove for a 47 yd FG to tie it, but it sailed wide right. The dog in this series is 8-4 ATS while the visitor is 5-2 ATS. These two are almost dead even on off and def but NMSt has a slight edge on ST (#97-120). Both starting QB's are avg 51% but NMSt's Christian is avg 158 ypg with a 3-2 ratio while NM Fr Austin is avg 79 ypg with a 2-4 ratio. NMSt was steamrolled LW by Boise 59-0. The Aggies never had a chance with BSU scoring on its 1st 5 poss as Boise got 21 pts off 3 NMSt TO's and led 38-0 at HT. NM managed only 229 yds of ttl off in a 38-20 loss vs UTEP LW. Both tms enter this game winless

(0-9 comb TY) as the two are just a comb 4-30 S/09 but something has to give here.

STANFORD 30 Usc 24 - While USC steamrolled thru the P10 during former HC Carroll's tenure, the dagger in his side could have been their struggles with Stanford (SU covered 8 of 11, FIVE upsets). For a moment LW this appeared to be a matchup of 2 undefeated but neither Stanford (led 21.3 at Oreg) nor USC (lost to UW on last second FG for 2nd str yr) were able to hold on. LY SU took no prisoners delivering the biggest scoring output vs the Trojans in USC hist as they put up 55 pts incl going out of their way to rub it in towards the end (2pt conv). In '08 here SU lined up for a FG down 45-17 and USC called time out. SU then went for it and got a spread covering TD (+24). Rare situation here for SU as they are fav'd for the 1st time S/86 vs USC and while the home team has lost 4 str in this series, SU is on a 10-2 ATS run on the Farm vs BCS opp's but we'll wait to see how both teams react off disappointing losses.

BOISE ST 48 Toledo 6 - 1st meeting. BSU is 7-3 SU and 4-4 ATS vs current MAC members and in the L/10Y they've won all 6 meetings by 30 ppg. LY Boise defeated MAC members BG (-16') and Miami (-37) by a comb score of 97-14. UT is 4-4 SU and 4-3 ATS vs current WAC foes and 3-7 SU and 5-4-1

ATS vs ranked tms. WY is a common opp between these two TY and Boise won 51-6 in Laramie while UT lost 20-15 at home LW. UT trailed 20-0 mid-3Q and couldn't close the gap. QB Dantin is avg 133 ypg (65%) with a 5-4 ratio and his top target is WR Page (29, 12.1). As exp, Boise dominated NMSt LW 59-0 (65%) with a 5-4 ratio and his top target is WR Page (29, 12.1). As exp, Boise dominated NMSt LW 59-0 winning its 18th consec gm by scoring on its 1st 5 poss building a 38-0 HT lead. QB Moore is avg 267 ypg (66%) with an 11-1 ratio and WR Young has 20 rec (19.0), while RB Martin has played his way into the feature-back role running for 420 yds (7.2). UTEP 35 Rice 25 - UTEP sits at 4-1 to start '10 after their 18 pt win over NM LW and has now held 4 of their 1st 5 opp under 300 yds off while also limiting 3 of their 1st 5 to 13 pts or fewer. They have had their fair share of struggles vs the Owls dropping 4 str by a comb 20 pts (0-7 ATS run) and appear to be missing LY's leading rusher Buckram (knee) for the 5x time in 6 gms. LY UTEP blew leads of 13-0, 20-10 and 29-17 as 6 TO's proved costly incl 2 fmbl's in the L/5:02 (1 on GL and other on R39). Rice showed glimpses of putting its off together late LW vs SMU delivering a 4★ LPS Winner as they covered as an 11 pt dog but still have not found the consistency in the pass gm to be successful in CUSA play (3 diff QB's have ply'd due to inj and poor play). Prior to '09 Rice had gone 8-4 ATS in CUSA AG's but the tide turned LY as the Owls went 0-4 (outgained by 138 ypg). The L/6 matchups have all been decided by 10 or less (LY 1 pt) and while that is exp here yet again, we expect UTEP to be the one coming out victorious. FRESNO ST 38 Hawaii 30 - UH has won 6 of the L/9 incl 3 of the L/4. UH is 10-8 SU/ATS vs FSU as

WAC foes S/'92. The visitor in this series is 5-10 S/'95 but is 4-1 SU and 5-0 ATS S/'05. UH has won its L/2 trips to Fresno and the last time FSU beat a visiting UH squad they hung 70 on them (70-14, -21) L2 this to Fresho and the last time FSO beat a visiting OF squad they highly 0 of them (70-14, -21) in 10-14. L2 FSU dominated building a 42-3 lead thru 3Q's facing UH in its 1st game with Moniz at QB. Last time here marked UH's 1st ever road win vs a ranked opp (FSU #22). FSU is 0-9-1 ATS in WAC HG's while UH is 5-3 ATS in WAC AG's. UH's Moniz (#1 NCAA ttl off) and WR Pilares (217 yd, 2 TD) connected a school rec 18x's LW in a 41-21 win over LT, scoring the 1st 24 pts and never looking back. Moniz passed for a career high 532 yds (6th highest ttl in school hist). FSU put away a pesky Cal Poly LW 38-17 (21-17 at HT) as Colburn passed for 206 yds and 2 TD as the D pitched a shutout in the 2H The def will have to rise to the occasion again here as this is a matchup of the NCAA's #1 pass off (431 ypg) vs the NCAA's #2 pass D (124 ypg). The Bulldogs have already recorded more sks thru 4 gms (12) than they did all of LY and will need to bring the heat here to keep Moniz from piling up the yds again.

N TEXAS 31 Arkansas St 27 - Former Southland and Big West Conf foes. NT has dropped the L/5 in this series SU but is 6-3 ATS. Ark St is 2-10 SU and 1-11 ATS on the SBC road. LY NT trailed 27-0 and got within 4 but their onside kick with 1:23 was unsuccessful. ASU QB Aplin set a school Fr record with 362 yds tII off. NT is off a heartbreaking loss as the game-tying PAT was blk'd with :31 left as a 4' pt HF They had 21-13 FD and 378-351 yd edges but all'd a 40 yd FR TD early 2Q that gave ULL a 14-0 lead. After losing 2 st'g QB's TY, LY's st'r QB Dodge took over despite nerve damage in his throwing arm and

he's avg 169 ypg (70%) with a 4-2 ratio in his 2 starts. RB Dunbar leads with 477 (4.5). ASU is off a 34-24 loss to L'ville as a 6 pt HD as for a 3rd time TY after falling behind early had a big 2H rally come up short. QB Aplin is avg 239 ypg (59%) with a 6-2 ratio and is the #1 rusher with 146 (2.7).

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
