

### **NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK 10, 2010**

NEWS AND NOTES: At the half Indiana had a 205-170 yd edge vs Northwestern and had gotten a TD with :48 left to lead 10-7 but NW got a 23 yd FG to tie it at 10. NW went 87/11pl for a TD on their opening 3Q drive to lead 17-10. IU missed a 40 yd FG and NW drove 47/10pl for a 45 yd FG, 20-10. NW took over with 6:19 left up by 10 pts and went on a 10pl drive but on 4&4 ran for 1 yd. IU, after a 27 yd pass on 4&10 got a 39 yd TD pass for the backdoor cover with :44 left but NW rec'd the onside kick...The key to the Miami/Virginia game was UM QB Jacory Harris getting inj'd early 2Q. UM finished with 24-18 FD and 448-361 yd edges. While Harris threw an int, his backups threw 4 with UVA tying a school record with 5 int. Most of UVA's scores were set up by the beneficial TO's. A 46 yd IR set up UVA for a 48 yd TD drive and they led 14-0 at the half despite UM having a 210-176 yd edge. Trailing 17-0 UM had a FD at the 16 but was int'd in the EZ. Their next drive ended on an int that was ret'd 25 yds to the 5 and UVA got a TD on the next play, 24-0. UM went 65/4pl getting a TD but missed the 2 pt conversion, 24-6. UM went 90/15pl for a TD but missed the xp, 24-12. UM rec'd the onside kick and got a 60 yd TD pass and had plenty of time as it was 24-19 with 4:39 left but their D allowed conversions on 3&4 and 3&8 giving up a 20 yd pass and UVA ran out the clock.

Pitt only had a 15-14 FD edge but had a 255-185 yd edge. Pitt missed a 28 yd FG before the half and only led 6-3 but the key play of the game happened with Pitt leading 14-3. UL got to Pitt's 34 when Froman had the ball slapped out of his hand and picked up by NT Myles Caragein who lumbered 56 yds to the 5 setting up the TD for the 20-3 lead. UL missed a 30 yd FG and didn't cross midfield after that with Pitt even being SOD on 4&20 at the UL24 with :56 left...BC ended its longest losing streak since 1998 (5). Montel Harris rushed 36 times for 132 yards. BC finished with a 304-262 yd edge and in the 1H had a 221-94 yd edge. Clemson got a 55 yd IR TD to take a 7-0 lead and BC settled for 21 and 37 yd FG's. CU did miss a 43 yd FG in the 1H. CU also missed a 36 yd FG in the 3Q and on 3&16, a tipped pass was int'd at the BC13 early 4Q. CU was SOD on 4&6 at the BC32 and int'd at the BC45 and on their final drive only got to their own 33 where their Hail Mary pass was int'd with :05 left...lllinois finished with 24-9 FD and 391-205 yd edges. The Illini went 80/10pl and 58/11pl for TD's in the 1Q to lead 14-0 and Purdue's best scoring chance came when they were SOD on 4&3 at the UI28. UI got a 23 yd FG on the final play of the half to lead 17-0. UI went 64/8pl on their opening drive of the 3Q then after a fmbl, went 26/4pl for a TD and after a 12 yd punt, 32/3pl for a TD to lead 37-0 and won easily 44-10...Michigan St was lucky to get past Northwestern the previous week thanks in part to a fake punt and thanks in part to a fake punt lowa was upset at home to Wisconsin. Iowa was undervalued last week and knocked off unbeaten #5 MSU in dominating fashion. The Hawkeyes scored a TD and a FG on 12 & 10 play drives on their first 2 poss then got a 66 yd IR TD and a 43 yd TD drive after an int. They added a 70 yd TD drive to lead 30-0 at the half. MSU trailed 37-0 before they got a TD with 14:56 left and only crossed midfield once being SOD at the UI39...Maryland had 28-9 FD and 446-155 yd edges. Their 62 pts tied the school record for most pts ever in a conf game tying their 1975 school record and their 48 pt rout was their most lopsided ACC win since 2002. Maryland did benefit from some big plays as they blocked 2 punts, one of which set up a 27 yd drive for a 22 yd FG and the other set up a 13 yd TD drive. MD also got 25 and 8 yd IR TD's and after 25 & 18 yd punts, drove 61 and 58 yds for TD's. MD led 55-7 after 3Q's...Arizona had a 374-104 yd edge at the half but only led 19-7 as they settled for a 42 yd FG, fmbl'd at the LA14 and settled for a 24 yd FG. UCLA got a 68 yd TD pass then a fleaflicker for a 49 yd TD to pull within 5. UA was int'd in the EZ and then settled for a 30 yd FG to lead 29-21 with 1:18 left. LA got to its own 46 but was sk'd & fmbl'd and UA rec'd at the LÁ24 and took a knee...Navy was off their big win over Notre Dame and we used Duke as the Big Dog POW and they delivered the outright upset. Navy was flat. In the 1H Duke led 24-0 and had a 268-67 yd edge. Duke led 34-15 with 8:38 left and it was 34-24 when they were SOD at the Navy33 with 4:35 left. Navy converted on 4&10 twice on a 68/10pl drive for a TD to get to 34-31. Duke rec'd the onside kick but opted to punt 36 vds for a TB. Navy got to their 43 but were SOD...Missouri came in unbeaten and ranked #7 but Nebraska jumped out to a 24-0 lead with Missouri having 1 FD and the Huskers scoring on each of their first 4 drives. NU had a 300-166 yd edge at the half. Roy Helu rushed for a school record 307 yds with TD runs of 66, 73 and 53 yds. MO did get within 31-17 but punted with 8:40 left and NU went on a 14 play drive

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eating up the rest of the clock...Tulane and SMU left some points off the board. The opening drive of the game went 71/9pl but SMU fmbl'd at the TU5. TU took its opening drive 85/12pl but missed a 27 yd FG so they had 166 yds offense in the first 10:00 and zero pts. SMU settled for a 25 yd FG and TU opened the 3Q with an 18pl drive and settled for a 25 yd FG and at the end of the game, TU - down 24-17, was int'd in the EZ on 4&5 with 4:50 left and SMU went 80/5pl for

a TD. SMU, which trailed 17-3 late 3Q, won by 14...Tennessee WR Denarius Moore had 6 catches for 228 yards, 2nd best in UT history vs #17 South Carolina last week. Marcus Lattimore returned to form with 184 yards rushing for the Gamecocks. It was 10-10 at the half and UT pulled Matt Simms for Tyler Bray one play after Simms fmbl'd and SC drove 27/6pl for a TD. Bray's first pass was int'd and ret'd 24 yds for a TD. He did rally UT to a 24-24 tie but SC got a 70 yd TD pass and a 92/8pl drive for a TD. UT was SOD at their own 42 with 2:09 left...lt was a game of 2 desperate teams in Florida/Georgia. The team off a bye generally wins this rivalry and UF had that advantage which allowed RB Demps to be close to 100% healthy and also they got susp'd WR Rainey back in the lineup. UF jumped out to a 21-7 halftime lead but only had a 248-195 yd edge. For the game they benefitted from a 4-1 TO advantage. UGA tied it at 24 with 9:01 left then Burton got a 51 yd TD run with 6:56 left, 31-24. UGA tied it again with 4:36 left and it went to OT. UGA was int'd and nearly ret'd for a TD as the player dove for the EZ but was ruled out at the 4. UF got a 37 yd FG 4pl later for the win...Since Ohio St lost to Wisconsin they have beaten their last 2 foes by a 101-10 margin. Minnesota was competitive early scoring a TD and missing a 35 yd FG on their first 2 poss only trailing 14-7. It was 24-7 when UM got off an 11 yd punt with :36 left in the half and OSU got a 38 yd TD pass 2pl later. While OSU missed a 23 yd FG and was int'd in the EZ from the 2, they did blk a punt for a TD in the 3Q and then ret'd a fmbl 30 yds for a TD in the 4Q and had a 24-10 FD edge...Last week was a great situation for Texas as they were coming off a loss and Baylor came in as a ranked team for the first time since '93. UT spent the entire 1H basically in BU terr but settled for 4 FG's and BU got some big plays beating the UT blitz. With UT up 9-3 and :43 left in the 1H, BU faced a 3&10 and got a 59 yd TD pass on a slant to Williams where he ran untouched to the EZ. UT only led 12-10at the half and opened the 3Q with an 80/9pl TD drive to go up 19-10. UT later missed a 47 yd FG. On the next play BU got its 2nd big play when Finley raced 69 yds for a TD to get them within 19-17. UT was int'd and ret'd to the 11 setting up a TD and BU would then drive 85/7pl. On 3&10 another slant went 31 yds for a TD untouched, 30-19. UT went on a 15pl drive and settled for a 21 yd FG and then fmbl'd at their own 35 on their last poss...Big plays were the key to Toledo's rout of E Michigan. EM actually had a 17-14 FD edge. UT got a 74 yd TD pass in the 1H and in the 2H got a 73 yd TD pass, 53 yd TD pass, which was 2pl after an int, 55 yd run which set up a TD and then got a 3 yd TD drive atter an int. EM was SOD after 9 and 10 pl drives at the UT15 and 17...Penn St was down to 3rd string McGloin and an underdog at home to Michigan. McGloin hit 17-28-250 yds vs the UM D. PSU led comfortably throughout as they were up 28-10 at the half. In the 2H they led 38-17 but UM chipped away to 38-31 with 9:20 left. A pers foul on the KO set up PSU at the UM49 and they got a FG 7pl later to make it a 2 score game. UM as SOD on 4&8 at its own 28 and PSU got 2 FD's to the 3 but opted to take a knee...Oklahoma St was playing without WR Justin Blackmon. Kansas St led this one 7-0 when OSU took over at their 33 with 2:08 left in the 1H. On 3&10 they got a 16 yd TD catch with :56 left to tie it. KSU opened the 3Q with a 60/11pl drive but missed a 24 vd FG. OSU went 80/10pl for a TD, 65/10pl for a FG to lead 17-7. KSU was int'd at the OSU15 and then fmbl'd at the OSU25. A 26 yd IR TD by OSU opened it to 24-7 with 7:06 left.

BACKDOOR/FRONTDOOR COVERS: Temple did finish with 21-8 FD and 399-154 yd edges. TU also got B2B shutouts for the first time since 1971 but only led 6-0 at the half over Akron despite a 205-90 yd edge. In the 2H, a 38 yd PR set up a 37 yd drive for a TD but then int set up a -4 yd drive for a 45 yd FG. With 12:00 left, TU only led 16-0 when they drove 64/6pl for a TD with 9:03 left. TU then drove

56/9pl for a TD with 2:37 left to get ahead ATS and Akron punted on 48.17 from its own 31.

INJURIES OF NOTE: RB Bilal Powell of Louisville had a right knee injury and only played 2 plays in the 2H...QB Sean Robinson got his first start for Purdue and hit 7-20-52. Rob Henry still played but did not throw a pass rushing 2 times for 9 yards as he had a badly hurt forefinger on his throwing hand after cutting it and losing a nail vs Ohio St...The key injury in the Cal/Oregon St game happened early. OSU did lead 6-0 when Cal QB Kevin Riley hit a 32 yd pass on 38.15 out to the Cal37. Unfortunately he was inj'd and missed the rest of the game. The next 4 poss resulted in 3 punts and a fmbl and OSU scored 3 TD's. In the 4Q Cal was SOD at their own 42 but got a 45 yd TD pass with 20 left to close the scoring. Brock Mansion hit 14-24-138... Syracuse got off to their best start in 9 years with a 31-7 win vs Cincinnati. UC QB Collaros DNP and Chazz Anderson hit 18-33-148 yds. SU went 80/14pl for a TD then benefitted from a pair of UC fmbl's to go 19 yds for a TD where they fmbl'd into the EZ but rec'd for a TD and rec'd at the UC19 and got a 26 yd FG to lead 17-0. It was 17-7 at the half. UC was int'd on 2&gl from the 6 and ret'd 60 yds and SU added a 37/4pl drive for a TD to lead 24-7. UC was SOD at its own 42 at the start of the 4Q and SU added another TD to lead 31-7...Kansas was down to 3rd string QB Quinn Mecham who was making his first start after they took his RS off. He hit 22-33 but for just 149 yds. lows St was coming off their upset of Texas and in the 1H KU dominated. KU had a 10-5 FD edge but settled for a 35, 42 and 38 yd FG's. ISU also got a 62 yd PR TD so they only trailed 9-7. ISU scored TD's on their first 3 poss of the 2H and went on to a 12 pt win.

MORE NEW & NOTES: San Diego St's first 3 drives vs Wyoming ended on an int at the 5 and they settled for FG's from the 4 & 11 yd lines and only led 6-0. WY benefitted from a fmbl'd PR to drive 13 yds for a TD then blk'd a punt to drive 2 yds for a 30 yd FG and actually led 10-6 despite SDSt controlling play. The Aztecs rallied to lead 20-17 at the half. The Aztecs would increase their lead to 41-24 with 12:26 left. WY on 4&1 got a 21 yd TD run then 3pl later an int set up a 35/3pl drive for a TD and they pulled within 41-38 with 7:32 left. SDS got a 59 yd TD pass with 4:56 left and then WY on 4&12 was sk'd for a 13 yd loss back to their own 29 and SDSt's 4 runs got them to the 11 as the clock ran out. BIG DAY FORTHE BIG DOGS: The Big Dog Play of the Week is known for its outright upsets by large underdogs and bagged 4 this past Saturday (Tulsa, Bowling Green, Duke, UAB - see pg 8). On the money line, despite having 9 big dogs and 5 losers on the ML (-\$500) the 4 wins accounted for +\$1305 or +\$905 profit playing on the ML and ATS the dogs were 6-3 for a super profitable +11.1 units. UAB had numerous opportunities to put it away. They did lead 14-6 when SM opted to go for it on the 1H's final play 3&gl from the UAB1 with :08 left in the half and were stopped. UAB led 35-21 after getting a TD with 7:13 left. SM converted on 4&7 with a 15 yd pass to get a TD with 5:31 left and then on 4&gl, an 8 yd TD pass with :28 left. In OT, UAB

got a 4&gl 7 yd TD pass in the 1st OT to tie. After each scored a TD in the 2OT, SM went for 2 and got it...There were a couple of key plays in the Tulsa/Notre Dame game. ND QB Crist was inj'd but Tommy Rees did fill in well hitting 33-54-334 yds. After ND scored an apparent tying TD early, their xp was not only blk'd but ret'd for 2 and instead of 7-7, the Irish trailed 9-6. ND got a fake punt on 4&10 from its own 41 keying an 80/13pl drive for a TD. ND led 20-12 with :45 left in the half and had a FD at the TU30 when they were int'd and ret'd 66 yds for a TD and only led 20-18 at the half. TU did fmbl at the ND19 but got a 59 yd PR TD to pull within 27-25 with 4:59 left 3Q. The next 7 poss were punts. TU went 57/12pl incl a crucial 3&26, 31 yd pass and their 27 yd FG gave them the lead. The Irish went 59/9pl. Their K was perfect on FG's on the season but did have that blk'd xp. ND needing only a FG had a 2&8 at the TU19 which would have been a 36 yd FG but tried a pass to the EZ to Floyd which was int'd and TU pulled the upset...Bowling Green did control the game vs C Michigan but needed a fortuitous fmbl at the end and a TD with :21 left to pull out the win. In the 1H BG had a 144-87 yd edge and led 10-0. CM got a 3&12, 18 yd TD pass early 3Q when the key play, a 63 yd IR TD at the start of the 4Q to actually take a 14-10 lead. CM got a FD to the BG41 but on 3&7 with 2:26 left, fmbl'd and BG went 59/7pl getting a 1 yd TD run with :21 left to pull out the win.

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Ucf at HOUSTON - The HT has gone 3-0 SU/ATS in this series and LY UCF earned their 1st ever win vs a ranked foe (1-23 SU, 9-13 ATS) as trailing 17-10 at HT, the Knights rattled off 27 of the gms next 30 pts with a 224-57 yd edge in that span to knock off #13 Hou 37-32 (+4). Both come into this meeting off big wins to set themselves up for potential division titles (UCF 3★ LPS Winner over EC) and quite possibly another meeting in the CUSA Champ. The Knights have actually covered 8 straight on the road while the Cougars are 7-0 ATS in CUSA HG's where the line is 7 or less.

SATURDAY, November 6th

Air Force 23 ARMY 20 - Army is just 2-11 ATS vs AF (4 str SU/ATS losses). The last time Army beat AF at West Point was in '96 as AF has won 6 str at West Point by an avg of 19 ppg. LY's gm was tied at HT (7-7) before the Falcons scored TD's on 4 of 5 2H poss. AF is off a 28-23 loss to undefeated Utah as a 7 pt HD. They trailed 28-10 after 3Q's but scored twice in the 4Q before being SOD twice and did finish with a 410-327 yd edge but were -4 TO. Army is off a 29-7 (-34') win over VMI finishing with a 381-282 yd edge as they had 316 yds rush, the most S/'08. AF is playing for its first Commander-in-Chief Trophy since '02, while Army is playing for its first bowl since '96 (also last CIC Trophy). AF has the off edge (#53-91), a slight def edge (#58-63) and has faced the tougher sked (#49-113) but the Cadets won't make it easy.

MIĂMI, FL 27 Maryland 13 - In their last meeting in '06 MD (-3) won 14-13 despite being outFD'd 18-6 (-62 yd) as they had TD passes of 65 and 95 yd (62% of off). LW UM was dealt a devastating blow in a scoreless gm when QB Harris went to the turf with 11:56 left 2Q after tossing his 1st int on the day. UM went to #3 QB Whipple (#2 inj'd) who hit just 2-6. In the 2H they brought in 4th string true Fr Morris. He finished hitting 9-22 for 162, but did rally the Canes starting with a 29 yd TD strike with 10:34 left. UM pulled within 24-19, but UVA conv two 3D's and ran out the clock. On the day UM had 24-18 FD and 448-361 yd edges but the QB's comb to throw 5 int which UVA conv to 21 pts. MD is 4-9 ATS the L/6Y in Nov AG's. LW MD scored on its 1st 4 poss and had 2 blk'd P's en route to a 27-7 HT lead. The Terps put up 28 in the 3Q incl 2 IR TD's and rolled WF 62-14 finishing with 28-9 FD and 446-155 yd edges (WF -3 yds rush!) MD is 1-4 ATS vs Mia S/82 and while Mia does have GT on deck, MD is on its 3rd AG in 4 wks. MD's blowout win LW gives us line value here, but even without Harris, we'd lean with the Canes who are still far superior talent-wise.

CLEMSON 27 NC State 17 - NCSt is just 4-13 SU in ACC AG's. The Pack was down 21-7 at half LW vs FSU on Thurs night. They battled back and on the GW drive conv 4D twice, incl 4&gl from the 1 when QB Wilson found a wide open TE Bryan in the back of the EZ w/2:40 left. NCSt had lost 2 of its L/3 on last-minute drives and it looked like it would happen again as FSU got to the 4 but LB Irving grabbed a Ponder fmbl to preserve the win. Wilson (288 ypg, 58%, 19-10 ratio, 269 rush yd, 5 TD) became the 1st NCSt QB in 22Y with 3 rush TD in a gm. HC O'Brien is 0-3 SU (1-2 ATS) vs CU being outscored by 20 ppg and outgained by 207. CU is off a tough loss to BC, 16-10. The Tigers missed two FG's and had 3 trips inside BC terr but were SOD and int'd twice. A wk after putting up 236 rush yds vs GT, CU was held to 86 vs BC. QB Parker (164 ypg, 53%, 8-6 ratio) only threw for 176 with an 0-2 ratio. Top rusher Ellington (684, 5.9, 10) missed the end of the gm (foot) and will be out a few wks. CU has won 6 str over NCSt by 16 ppg and over L/5Y has outgained them in each (+188 ypg). We know the home team has dropped 5 str ATS (1-9 ATS run), but CU is 5-2 ATS in the series.

DUKE 33 Virginia 27 - Duke has covered 3 str vs UVA (outscored UVA 59-20 the L/2) with an outright upset LY, 28-17 (+7). The Blue Devils are 2-13 SU (9 str losses) and 4-11 ATS in Nov HG's. LW Duke QB Renfree hit his 1st 16 passes (tied schl record) as the Devils built a 24-0 HT lead then fought off a furious Navy comeback in a 34-31 win for yet another outright upset for our Big Dog POW. Duke finished with a 456-375 yd edge helped by Renfree who set a schl record for comp % (93.3). UVA is 12-4 SU (has lost B2B gms) in the series but just 5-11 ATS. UVA is off a 24-19 win vs Miami. In a scoreless gm, DT Dolce leveled UM QB Harris, knocking him out. The 3 UM QB's comb to throw 5 int, which UVA conv into 21 pts. The win snapped a 9 gm ACC losing streak and marked UVA's 1st win over a BCS foe TY (UVA got 1st win over IA foe LW). Way back in 1984, we used this matchup as our Sept 5★. Will we use it as this week's 4.5★?

SYRACUSE 23 Louisville 20 - UL is 2-7 ATS vs Syr with Syr covering 5 in a row. The dog is 7-0 ATS. SU has outgained UL the L/2Y by 75 ypg after being outgained the previous 3 (-157 ypg). LY SU allowed a 15 yd TD pass with 1:24 left and then was int'd at the UL32 with :24 left and UL (-7) pulled out a 10-9 win. LY 45 of UL's 151 yds (30%) came on the GW TD drive. The previous 2 yrs Syr pulled huge upsets as 13 and 37 pt dogs. UL is off a 20-3 loss to Pitt in which their #54 off was held to just 185 total yds and star RB Powell (1067, 7.0) left the gm early 2Q with a knee inj (CS). Syr has been impressive pulling upsets in 3 of their 4 BE gms incl LW's 31-7 win over Cincy (Syr +6). SU's #33 D has been impressive allowing just 299 ypg and if UL RB Powell is out, SU should be able to contain QB Froman (204 ypg, 61%, 11-4) like Pitt did LW (13-22, 82 yds). SU's #80 off is led by QB Nassib (176 ypg, 56%, 14-5) and RB Carter (746, 5.3). A win here makes Syracuse

bowl eligible, a true testament to the great job HC Marrone has done.

Iowa 31 INDIANA 21 - The fav is 10-3 ATS and these two have gone OVER the total the L/5. Indy has gone just 3-13 SU S/94 and 6-20 ATS in home finales. The Hoosiers led 21-7 LY at HT but the key play came in the 3Q when officials wrongfully called a TD pass inc which would've put Indy up by 2 scores and Indy missed the ensuing FG as lowa won 42-24. Last time here lowa (-6) won 45-9 in '08. lowa destroyed unbeaten MSU with a 30-0 HT lead picking off 3 Cousins passes incl a 66 yd IR TD as they got right back into the thick of the B10 race. QB Stanzi (240 ypg, 69%, 19-2 ratio) is #2 NCAA pass eff with RB Robinson (806, 4.7) leading the ground gm. lowa is #31 NCAA pass eff D. Indy lost 20-17 to NW to fall to 0-4 in conf play. The Hoosiers have been outscored by 58 on the B10 road but just by 10 (-13 yd comb) at home. B10's #1 passer Chappell (306 ypg, 65%, 18-7) has thrown all of his int in conf play (5-7 ratio) building up his stats vs Indy's weak non-conf slate. Hoosiers allow 168 rush ypg (5.2). The Hawks stay in the conf race in a flat spot.

MICHIGAN 37 Illinois 27 - UM hasn't fared well the L/3Y in Nov going 2-8 SU and 2-7-1 ATS. The Wolves have been upset the L/2Y vs the Illini losing by 25 ppg (-153 ypg). Illini had a B10 ssn high 377 rush yds (6.7) LY vs UM as 2 players topped 100+. UI destroyed a Purdue team starting a 4th string true frosh QB, 44-10 (24-9 FD and 391-205 yd edges) bringing the Illini 1 step closer to bowl eligibility. QB Scheelhaase is last among conf full time QB's in passing (137, 61%, 10-7 ratio) but he makes the offense go with his feet (451 rush yd). Illinois has the conf's MIP D allowing 102 ypg and 13.4 ppg less than LY. After a 5-0 start UM lost its 3rd straight 41-31 to PSU as they trailed 31-10 in the 3Q before making a gm of it. Robinson's brilliant play continued vs the Lions (381 ttl yd and 4 TD) as he still is #2 NCAA rush ypg (1287, 7.9). UM's D is officially the league's most generous allowing 440 ypg and 30 ppg. The Wolves cool Rich Rod's seat a little by clinching bowl eligibility for the 1st time since '07.

RB Montel Harris (#1 ACC w/836, 4.5) has helped take the pressure off of QB Rettig who is avg just 12 comp per gm (140 ypg, 49%, 2-3 ratio) in his 3 sts since returning from inj. WF, off a bye, was rolled 62-14 LW by MD, being outFD'd 28-9 and outgained 446-155. After RB Josh Harris ran for 241 vs VT, WF was held to -3 rush yds LW. QB Price is avg 191 ypg (56%) with a 4-1 ratio in his 3 sts since ret from inj. BC has won 3 in a row SU/ATS in the series but WF has pulled 3 outright upsets S/03. LW vs the Hoosiers Trumpy (110) was NW's 1st 100 yd rusher in 21 gms. The Cats allow 127 rush ypg (4.2). PSU went to ex-walk on #3 QB McGloin LW who hit 17-28 for 250 yd in a 41-31 win over Mich. Led by Clay (887, 5.5) and White (570, 6.6) UW ran for 163 ypg vs the B10's top 2 rush D's and lowa's Ferentz later said the Badger OL was the best he'd seen in his 12 yrs as HC. MSU's unbeaten bubble burst in a big way at lowa as the Spartans trailed 30-0 at the half as Cousins threw 3 int incl the gm turning 1Q 66 yd IR TD. After running for 175 in each of the 1st 6, MSU's run gm has been slowed to just 76 ypg (3.0) the L/3. Spartans are #20 pass eff D and welcomed back their top CB Rucker LW after his susp. UNC is off a close 21-17 win over our pick to win the FCS, William & Mary (3★ Small Coll Winner LW). The Heels were outFD'd 20-19 and had to rally from a 17-7 deficit in the 4Q but finished with a 421-286 yd edge. FSU is just 4-9 ATS in Nov HG's but UNC is 6-11 ATS on the ACC road and on its 3rd AG in 4 wks. OKLAHOMA ST 37 Baylor 34 - OSU is 13-1 SU and 10-2-2 ATS vs Baylor. OSU hasn't lost to BU

QB Weeden is #8 NCAA passing (318, 65%, 23-9) and the NCAA's #3 rusher Hunter (1174, 6.2) leads a potent offense. OSU is #43 pass eff D. Despite being outgained 428-328 by a Texas team who settled for 5 FG's, Baylor leads the B12 South after its 1st win in Austin S/'91. QB Griffin (288 ypg, 67%, 20-5, 401 rush) leads the NCAA in pts responsible for and is #3 NCAA in ttl off. The Bears are #67 in pass eff D and are allowing 153 rush ypg (4.0). The battle between the B12's most surprising teams could come down to who has the ball last. SOUTH CAROLINA 38 Arkansas 35 - The fav is 13-3 ATS in the series and Ark is 7-2 ATS. The HT has won 3 in a row by 14 ppg, LY Ark QB Mallett hit 23-27 for 329 yds and Ark (-7) scored 23 unanswered pts in a 33-16 win. SC QB Garcia threw for 327 yds with a 1-1 ratio. SC is off a 38-24 win over Tenn and controls its own destiny in the SEC East, but has the "SEC East Championship" on deck (at FL). SC RB Lattimore rushed for a career high 184 rush yds LW (722, 4.8) after returning from inj and QB Garcia is avg 238 ypg (71%) with a 13-7 ratio and WR Jeffery leads the SEC in receiving (52, 18.0). SC has the edge on def (#19-29) but their #108 pass D is allowing 260 ypg (67%) with a 13-4 ratio and they now face the SEC's pass leader, Mallett (306 ypg, 66%, 18-7). UA is off a 49-14 win over Vandy in which QB Mallett set a UA record with 409 pass yds. Points should be plentiful in a close gm.

Colorado 27 KANSAS 20 - KU is 12-2 SÚ and 11-3 ATS in HG's vs the B12 North. The dog is 6-1 ATS and LY we used a Top Weekly LPS on Colorado +9' at home and they upset the #17 Jayhawks 34-30 in Boulder covering by DD. CU joined KU in the B12 North basement with their 43-10 loss to Oklahoma in which they were outgained 635-263 and outFD'd 31-12. QB Hawkins hit 17-44 for 187 with 1 TD in his 1st '10 start for the inj'd Hansen. The Buffs may rely more on RB Stewart (737, 4.3) down the stretch. CU is allowing 140 rush ypg (4.4). KU led 9-7 at the half holding ISU to 5 FD's before the Cyclones woke up with 21 3Q pts in a covering 28-16 win (KU scored a TD with :09 left). #3 QB Mecham hit 22-33 for 149 yd and a 1-1 ratio in his 1st start. The Hawks are being bullied on the ground allowing 210 rush ypg (5.2). CU has lost 16 straight outside the state of Colorado but this could be their best shot to end that streak.

BALL ST 31 Akron 17 - The outright winner has covered 6 straight and the fav is 5-1 SU/ATS. Akron has dropped the L/2 meetings both SU/ATS ('05 and '08) but has outgained BSU in 4 of the L/5. Both lost to WM (BSU 45-16, 5' pt HF, outgained 480-348; UA 56-10, 7' pt HD, outgained 519-274) and lost to KS (BSU 33-14, 10 pt AD, outgained 482-272; UA 28-17, 17' pt AD, outgained 261-195). BSU QB Wenning is avg 106 ypg (53%) with a 10-11 ratio. The Cards have 4 RB's with 250+ yds led by Williams with 434 (5.0) but he missed the last gm. UA QB Nicely is avg 131 ypg (49%) with a 3-9 ratio and has struggled in new off taking snaps under center and RB Allen leads with 480 (4.3). Ball St has the off edge (#108-120) and def (#111-119) edges while Akron 1 of 2 winless IA teams and they've been outscored 43-13 in their MAC games TY.

TULSA 45 Rice 20 - Rice comes into this meeting fresh off a bye (Bailiff 5-0 ATS) while Tulsa had its TD w/1:47 left in the 4 pt win. The Blazers have gone 4-1 1st ever meeting in South Bend vs ND, which despite committing 12 pen, the Hurricane pulled out the Herd will likely struggle again here as they are just 6 one of the biggest upsets in school history as they int'd a ND pass in the EZ w/:36 left (outgained covered just 2 of their L/11 regular ssn meetings overall.

LY Fr AA RB Pierce went down with an inj on TU's 1st off series and Brown rushed for career and ssn highs (156, 8.7) and Temple rolled 47-13 (-10') as KS was without its starting QB. Last time here KS had a ssn high 329 yds rush and 561 ttl yds in a 41-38 win. This is TU's 5th AG in 7 wks (3-1 ATS). TU QB Gerardi has started the L/2 gms avg 170 ypg (65%) with a 4-2 ratio, while RB's Brown (682, 5.5) and Pierce (644, 5.1) lead the rushing attack. KS QB Keith is avg 201 ypg (59%) with an 8-8 ratio while RB Terry leads with 477 (3.6). Temple has the off edge (#84-111) while KS has the def edge (#38-50). Temple's off strength is the run game (173 ypg, 4.7) but KSU ranks #1 in the NCAA in run D (66 ypg, 2.1).

UTAH ST 37 New Mexico St 20 - Battle of the Aggies. NMSt is just 3-12 in trips to Logan but has won 2 of the L/5. The dog has thrived in this series going 8-3 SU/ATS. LY NMSt claimed a 20-17 (+10') win on a 28 yd FG as time expired despite being outgained 429-230 and outFD'd 18-10. Last time here NMSt's 47-2 (+6) loss was the worst in the series S/64 and it also marked the last gm as HC for both Mumme (NMSt) and Guy (USU). NMSt comes into this one off a thrilling 29-27 win (led 17-3 at HT) over SJSt as QB Christian (169 ypg, 48%, 7-2 ratio) hit WR Rogers for an 8 yd TD pass on the final play. USU sleepwalked thru the 1H of LW's gm at UN (trailed 35-0 at HT) before coming to life in the 2H scoring 42 pts in a 56-42 loss. QB Borel passed for a career-high 399 yd (2 TD) LW and is avg 199 ypg (55%) with a 7-6 ratio. NMSt will be looking for B2B WAC wins for the first time S/'06, but USU hasn't lost 2 str in this series S/'66-'67 and should get that elusive 1st conf win of the yr here.

Navy has been a slow starter and LW fell behind 24-0 at the half but rallied back for 31 pts in the 2H to give us a 3★ Winner on the Over but Navy still needs 1 more win to clinch their Poinsettia Bowl bid since they fell to Duke LW, 34-31. Navy was held to just 148 rush yds by a Duke D all'g 197 rush ypg. QB Dobbs is avg 119 ypg (51%) with a 7-4 ratio but threw for a career high 227 and 2 TD LW and is the tm's top rusher (552, 3.2). EC is off a 49-35 loss to UCF and has UAB on deck next Thurs. QB Davis is avg 292 ypg (65%) with a 21-11 ratio giving EC a solid edge on off (#38-71) but Navy has the edge on def (#74-104) and ranks #106 in our pass D rankings EC has all'd 184 rush yng (4.5) and hasn't faced an ontion tm TY.

OREGON 55 Washington 13 - The Huskies come into this meeting with a sputtering offense that hasn't scored in nearly 98 minutes incl being shutout at home for the 1st time S/'76 LW vs Stanford, 41-0 (SU 22-7 FD, 470-107 yd edges!!). UO meanwhile may have faced its biggest challenge of the ssn in LW's visit to USC (off a bye) where despite going back and forth for the 1st 3Q's, UO scored the final 24 pts, 53-32. UO has won a schl record 6 consec meetings vs the Huskies by an avg 42-17 (15 pt avg spread) while outgaining them by 285 ypg over the L/2. The Ducks have our #1 offense and #16 D and should have no problems handling the barkless Huskies here.

Southern Miss 34 TULANE 20 - TU has dropped 5 str (7-22 overall) in this series while being outgained by 172 ypg. Despite both tms blowing scoring opportunities throughout, TU led 17-10 going into the 4Q before all'g 21 unanswered pts to SMU in a 31-17 defeat as they were outgained 542-391. SM erased a 14 pt 4Q deficit to force OT vs UAB but lost in the 2nd extra period as the Blazers went for 2 and made it (SM 582-464 yd edge) giving SM its 2nd str home loss. LY SM never punted as 7 of their 10 drives resulted in a score (missed FG and 2 fmbl's on other 3 drives) as SM spoiled TU QB Griffin's 1st career start (158 yds, 64%) in the 43-6 (-21) win. The Wave is 1-5 ATS at home vs CUSA East and while the avg MOV over the L/11 gms in this series has been 26 ppg, TU is in a better spot here vs a SM squad playing this contest in between 2 tough divisional foes (trip to UCF on deck).

Texas 23 KANSAS \$T 16 - UT is 5-5 SU and 1-5 ATS all-time vs KSU. 10th meeting but KSU has pulled outright upsets the L/2 gms vs #4 and #7 UT tms. In the last gm ('07) UT outgained KSU (+58 yds) but lost by 20 pts all'g 2 KR TD's and an IR TD (UT's worst home defeat in Brown era). Since Texas lost at Kan St 45-42 in '06 (-16) they are 4-0 SU/ATS on the road vs the B12 North winning by an avg of 43-8. The Horns actually outFD'd (25-17) and outgained (428-328) Baylor but lost at home to the Bears for the 1st time S/91, 30-22 as they settled for 5 FG's. QB Gilbert (224, 60%, 6-9) is the B12's least eff full-time starter (#94 NCAA) and the offense (376 ypg, 23 ppg) is the most feeble in the Mack Brown era. K-St jumped out to a 7-0 lead but all'd OSU to score 24 unanswered pts in a 24-14 home loss in which they were outgained 511-289. QB Coffman (164, 66%, 8-6) has been inconsistent TY despite the presence of the NCAA's #8 rusher Thomas (996, 5.1). K-St is dead last in the NCAA allowing 229 rush ypg (5.7). The focused Horns get back on track.

STANFORD 27 Arizona 24 - Pivotal gm in the P10 between 2 tms chasing UO for the top spot. SU scored on 5 of its 1st 6 drives running away early with a 41-0 win in Seattle while despite having a ssn-best 583 yds, AZ had some difficulty shaking off a pesky Bruins team plagued by inj and susp in the 8 pt win. The Wildcats should have 2 healthy QB's here as despite have 2 consec successful starts, QB Scott (390 ttl yds LW) will likely turn the team back over to Foles (267 ypg, 75%) who missed the L/2 (knee). LY in a game that featured more than 1,100 yds offense, SU blew a 15 pt lead as AZ RB Grigsby scored on a 57 yd TD run w/2:57 remaining. The HT in this series is surprisingly just 4-10 ATS but SU has actually covered 7 of the L/9 HG's vs schools from the state of AZ. Ariz is 6-1 ATS in its 2nd of B2B AG's and while the Cardinal are 11-4 at home the L/3Y, the AZ defense (260 ypg all'd on road) should help keep this one tight.

Tcu 30 UTAH 20 - These two had only comb to avg 36 ppg in their prev 6 meetings but LY comb for 83. The HT is 4-1 in the MWC meetings. UT is 5-2 SU and 4-3 ATS having a 3 gm SU win streak snapped LY when TCU scored 3 TD's in 2:30 early 2Q to break it open in front of a record home crowd. UT is 2-0 SU in their only recent meetings in SLC and the Utes are a perfect 5-0 as a HD over the last decade. Both are undefeated and blowing out foes with TCU winning on avg 41-9 (+268 ypg) and UT winning 45-14 (+182). TCU's Dalton avg 210 ypg (66%) with a 16-5 ratio and now takes on our #48 pass eff D (165 ypg, 55%, 6-7 ratio). RB Wesley leads with 937 (6.8) and UT (#14 NCAA run D) allows 103 rush ypg (2.9). UT's Wynn is avg 239 ypg (69%) with a 13-6 ratio but faces his toughest test yet vs our #4 pass eff D (119 ypg, 50%, 7-7). RB's Wide (491, 5.0) and Asiata (488, 4.7) run up against the NCAA's #9 rush D all'g 98 ypg (3.3). TCU has a slight off edge (#12-17) while Utah has PR Smithson and the slight ST's edge (#1-6). Both rank high on D across the board, but TCU's NCAA-leading group helps the Frogs snatch a road win and keep their BCS dreams alive.

**UAB 37 Marshall 16** - Four of the L/5 meetings have been decided by 7 or less and the dog is on a 4-1 run. LY UAB was held to a ssn low 7 pts as they committed 15 pen in the 27-7 defeat (+7). Despite their 3-5 record, UAB could have easily picked up an extra 3 wins on the year as they all'd a Hail Mary on the last play to Troy, outgained Tenn 544-287 in Knoxville but lost in 2OT due to 5 missed FG's and nearly upset #25 Miss St on the road (-3 TO's). They did however overcome a late SM comeback LW and got a win in 2OT as they went for the 2pt conv. MU on the other hand has struggled to get things going under their 1st yr HC being outscored (42-15) and outgained (437-271) by wide margins on the road. HOU is off LW's huge MNF game vs IND and have the #19 and #31 units at home being outgained 420-328 (-3 TO's). HOU's #32 pass defense is worse than its ranking as they've allowed a 14-4 ratio with an 8.2 ypa with 4 opposing QB's earning 105+ QBR's. SD's #2 pass defense has only given up 56% with an 8-7 ratio and a very impressive 6.3 ypa. Rivers has been phenomenal TY with 331 ypg (65%) 15-7 ratio with 4 games of 106+ QBR's despite a slew of injuries to his WR's. LW SD was in a solid situation at home under pressure getting TEN on the road with Young back from injury off a big win vs PHI. SD held RB Johnson to 59 yds (3.9) and only gave up 24 yds to TEŃ on its 1st 3 drives in the 2H dominating the TOP in the game by 15:34. Both teams have their flaws but we'll side with the better defense vs a HOU team that is 3-8-1 ATS at home and 1-5-1 ATS as a fav.

FORECAST: San Diego 34 HOUSTON 24 3★ MINNESOTA over Arizona - In 2008 MIN caught ARZ celebrating their 1st Div Title in 61 years with a 35-14 win as a 3 pt AD. LY ARZ returned the favor with a 30-17 win on SNF as a 3 pt HD. The Cardinals defense dominated with a 398-231 yd edge before giving up a garbage time TD drive. ARZ held Peterson to 19 yds (1.5) on the ground and sacked Favre 3 times with 2 ints. Nine of the ARZ's 22 starters from that game are gone and Hall may once again make another road start in a loud venue. He only lasted thru the 1st drive of the 2Q vs SEA (concussion) generating 36 yds (25%) with an int. LW Hall lasted 1.5Q's before being pulled (71 yds 50% 1-2) and while Anderson had yds he was int'd twice in the 4Q. After barely beating STL with a rookie QB and 2 rookie OT's in the season opener the Cardinals have dropped 3 straight on the road being outgained 388-206 (-8 TO's) and outscored 35-9. ARZ's #29 rush defense has been dismantled TY allowing 143 ypg (4.4) and Peterson has avg'd 110 ypg (4.7). 2★ NY Jets over DETROIT - The top 2 QB's in the 2009 draft square off here. Sanchez (13-8) SU and ATS has had the luxury of growing into the position on a good team. Stafford (2-9 SU 3-8 ATS) hasn't had the same success due to lesser talent and bad luck with injuries. Stafford made his 1st full start since 11/26 of LY vs WAS. DET gave him a lot of short, high % throws to work himself back up to playing speed and he had 212 yds (58%) with a 4-1 ratio (4.7 ypa). DET's front 4 dominated the Redskins OL holding the RB's to 35 yds rushing (2.3) with 6 of 7 sacks by the DL. Despite being in a solid situation vs a depleted GB defense the Jets offense was very lethargic after the bye. While they tallied a 360-237 yd edge they turned the ball over 3 times in GB territory and missed a 37 yd FG. The defense was stout as it held Rodgers to his lowest output in 31 games with 170 yds (44%) but were unable to force any takeaways. With Sanchez coming down to earth the L2 games (227 yds 49% 1-4) we expect the Jets to take a more conservative approach offensively and target DET's depleted LB unit. The Jets have a much deeper and more talented defense than DET's #21 unit and we'll side with the embarrassed road team vs an admittedly improved home team as we get improved line value FORECAST: NY Jets 24 DETROIT 13 here

2★ Miami (+) over BALTIMORE - This is their 6th meeting since realignment and the dog has covered 4 straight reg season games. BAL is 7-1 ATS after a bye and home teams off a bye that were taken to OT before the break are 11-3 ATS. These teams are evenly matched statistically over the L4W with the Ravens having the #10 and #19 units vs MIA's #12 and #9 units but BAL is +4 TO's vs MIA's -4 TO's. BAL's #29 pass defense the L4W is a legit ranking as while BUF earned 374 yds, BAL had given up 314 and 292 to DEN and NE the previous 2 games with 61% comp and a 3-2 ratio. The Ravens are giving up a 104.8 QBR at home vs 74 QBR on the road TY. MIA's defense rebounded from a tough home loss vs PIT LW. After giving up a 86/15pl drive the Dolphins forced CIN to punt on 9 of their next 10 drives (six 3 & outs) The other drive resulted in a TD which was setup when Henne was int'd on the MIA 37. DEN on its 2nd straight East Coast road trip is the only team BAL has beaten by more than a TD TY. Dogs are 5-2 ATS in Ravens games with the road team being 7-0 ATS in MIA's TY. While BAL will be focused after giving up 500 yds to BUF we'll take the Dog who has been overshadowed FORECAST: Miami 17 (+) BALTIMORE 16 by its AFC East rivals this year. **OTHER GAMES** 

Chicago 27 BUFFALO 24 - Toronto - The Bears return from their bye week (2-6 ATS) and fav's that lost by 3 or less before the bye are 20-8 ATS when they return. Both teams are fairly even on offense (CHI #29 BUF #27) but the Bears have a huge edge on the defensive side of the ball (#6 vs #29). CHI's pass protection woes are bigger than the stat rates (CHI #32 BUF #23) as they give up a sack every 6.9 pass att's (1 every 12 for BUF) and have given up 13 more than BUF. While Peppers only has 2 sacks TY his presence has boosted the rest of defense (3.6 ypc 4-9 ratio) and they've held teams to under 23 pts in 6 games. BUF finally accepted the fact it doesn't have the players for a 3-4 scheme LW and switched back to a 4-3 vs KC. It didn't help as they gave up 200 yds rushing for the 4th time in 5 games (241 ypg 5.6 in those) and 8th time in 2 years. BUF's defense simply lacks a pass rush (#24 with 11) and can't make plays while the ball is in the air (15-1 ratio 64%). BUF has only outgained foes once TY (vs. BAL) but we are very impressed with BUF's 3rd Dn conversion rate the L2W (22 of 40). CHI's weak OL would be a concern vs most other teams but we think that they can devise a decent protection plan for a week to supplement their solid defense to get the SU win.

New Orleans 30 CAROLINA 13 - NO dropped to 2-6 ATS with a 16-14 win in the 1st meeting as a 13 pt HF. NO had a 383-251 yd edge as Brees characterized the game as "a 30 pt day we turned into 16 pts with TO's and a lack of execution." NO had 4 drives of 60+ yds but ended up with a fumble, TD and 2 FG's in Clausen's 1st road start. NO is off LW's SNF game vs PIT and Div road teams with a bye on deck are 30-18 ATS. Statistically the Saints have been dominant the L4W prior to SNF outgaining foes 406-233 but Brees has thrown 8 ints. LY's secondary which pulled in 1 int every 22 pass att's has only tallied 1 every 51 (4 overall). NO's best pass rusher DE Smith (13 sacks LY) has been hobbled by a groin injury and has 1 sack TY. CAR's offense has been abysmal being outgained in 5 of 7 games (311-221 in

those) while being held to 14 pts or less in 5 games. LY RB's Stewart and Williams combined for 141 ypg (5.1) and nine 100 yd rush efforts despite Williams missing 3.5 games on the year. TY they are avg 77 ypg (3.6) with zero 100 yd rush performances. This and the lack of talent at WR has set CAR up with the #31 pass attack with a 6-13 ratio that is dead last with a 5.7 ypa (KC/HOU avg 5.2 on the ground). NO is better on both sides of the ball (#6 and #3 vs CAR #32 and #5) and while we respect the job Fox is doing by getting the best with what he has the Saints are deeper here.

ATLANTA 20 Tampa Bay 13 - The Falcons are just 5-10-1 ATS vs TB since realignment. ATL won the first game LY 20-17 but failed to cover as a 12 pt HF. ATL had playoff need in the 2nd game with TB coming off SU road wins vs SEA and NO. ATL won and covered as a 2 pt AD 20-10 with 24-13 FD and 397-206 yd edges. TB had a 48 yd FG set up when ATL fumbled the opening KO but was held to 52 yds on their next 7 drives. ATL has the situational edge off a bye vs a TB team on its 2nd road game after going cross country vs ARZ LW. TB received a lot of accolades by boosting its DL with the drafting of rookies McCoy and Price with its first 2 picks but their growing pains are painfully clear here. McCoy has struggled with bigger, stronger and more experienced OL and Price has been hampered by a hip injury. TB is allowing 149 ypg (5.2) on the ground, a defense that demands pressure by the front 4 has only gotten 6 sacks TY (3 by DL) and most of their 14 ints have come against QB's known for making poor decisions (Delhomme, Moore, Palmer, Anderson) recently. ATL has the #6 rush attack (137 ypg 4.2) that kept teams honest with a balanced offense (229 run/ 252 pass) that has gotten the most out of WR White (54 rec 13.8). Ryan is 16-1 SU and 12-4-1 ATS at home but Freeman has gotten 6 of his 9 wins via 4Q comebacks and we'll let the linesmaker decide where we sit.

New England 24 CLEVELAND 17 - This is the first matchup of Mangini (2-5 SU 3-4 ATS vs NE) vs Belichick with the Browns. CLE has won 5 games the L2Y when passing for under 100 yds compared to the rest of the NFL combining for 13 wins. It's unknown if CLE will start Wallace (ankle) or McCoy who despite being sacked 6 times (1 every 8.2 att's) has done a good job of not putting the team in a bad spot. CLE has been outgained in 6 straight games 367-284 but are a surprising 2-4 SU and 3-3 ATS. The only game they've been truly outplayed in all 3 phases was vs PIT (ATL pulled away on fumble returned by a TD on a sack). CLE has been innovative with play calling (NO), played to its strength with the run game (145 ypg 4.5) vs BAL and CIN as their overall size and power on defense helped hold foes to 20 pts or less in 5 games. NE has surprisingly been outgained in 5 of 7 games (366-245 on road) but NE has been excellent protecting the ball (just 6 giveaways) and have cobbled together the #14 rush attack (113 ypg 4.2) to provide balance. CLE's defense has overachieved TY but we'll take the road team with Brady vs a pass defense that has a 13-8 ratio even after their 4 int performance vs NO.

NY Giants 24 SEATTLE 17 - This is the 4th meeting in 6Y with the favorite being 2-1 and Manning has avg'd 310 ypc (60%) with a 5-4 ratio here. The Giants are only 3-6 ATS off a bye but the cross country road trip is mitigated by the extra rest. The Giants have a massive stat edge with the #3 and #2 units (-1 TO's) vs the Seahawks #30 and #26 units. The key stat in the Giants 4 game win streak is that they have outrushed foes 168 (5.1) to 47 (2.4). This has forced foes to become one dimensional, ineffective on 3rd Dns (21% conv rate) and opening themselves up to the #3 pass rush (1 sack every 9 pass att's). SEA is off a 30 pt loss to OAK as they were blasted with a 545-162 yd deficit. SEA only had one drive over 30 yds which resulted in a missed FG. QB Hasselbeck was sacked 8 times as the Raiders swarmed the Seahawks ground game holding them to 47 yds (2.5). We are fully aware of the impact and respect SEA's 12th man but the Giants are a veteran team that does very well on the road (18-9 SU and ATS) with a tougher defense than OAK.

Kansas City 20 at OAKLAND 17 - The road team has dominated this series going 13-1 ATS winning the L7 outright. In the 2nd meeting LY the Raiders were driving for the game winning TD but were int'd at the KC 10 with :38 left when the pass bounced of Heyward-Bey's chest. KC won 16-10 as a 3.5 pt AD holding the Raiders to 202 yards after giving up a 70 yd opening drive. KC found itself in a tough game vs the Bills LW as while they had a 205-58 yd edge in the 1H they skipped an easy FG in the 1Q opting to go for it on 4th and 2 on the BUF 19. This enabled BUF to gain confidence and force the game to be decided on a 35 yd FG as time expired in OT. The only game KC has been dominated in statistically was SD and they've been in every game TY. OAK has dominated the L2 games with B2B 500 yd games (+4 TO's) behind McFadden (111 ypg 5.5) who has 4 100+ yd rush efforts despite missing 2 games. LY OAK didn't total 90 pts thru their 1st 9 games and have done so the L2W (teams are 4-12 ATS after doing so).

PHILADELPHIA 21 Indianapolis 17 - The Eagles return from the bye week and find themselves in a fantastic situation. HC Reid is 11-0 SU and 9-2 ATS off a bye while the Colts are off a MNF Div game. The Eagles defense continues to show progress having held 4 of their 7 opponents to season low or second low yardage totals and the rush D has held the L3 to 71 ypg and 3.2 ypc. Philly has also held opposing QB's to 54.9% completions and they have 11 int's. Manning has kept his teams offense moving (373 ypg) despite the attrition of skill players but it must be noted that 5 of the 7 opponents they've faced heading into LW were ranked 25th or lower on defense incl #32 HOU (twice), #31 WAS and #30 JAX. It is tough laying points to a Colts teams that has covered 4 of 5 meaningful games in that role including 4 upset wins but the lack of depth will play a bigger role on the road. IND may be a veteran squad but we expect even them to be down a notch after what is surprisingly their first MNF home game since 2006

Dallas at GREEN BAY - DAL has been favored in all 3 of the previous matchups slipping to 2-1 SU and ATS in the series with a 17-7 loss LY as a 3 pt AF. DAL came in off a big SNF win vs PHI getting an angry GB team off B2B losses to MIN and TB. The Packers defense pulled in 5 sacks, held DAL to 3 of 12 on 3rd Dns, held them to 61 yds rushing (4.4) and were +3 TO's. Kitna was not the problem in LW's game vs JAX as 2 of his ints came off tipped passes. Their defense imploded as they gave up an almost perfect QBR to Garrard at home. GB was able to make the fewest mistakes vs the Jets LW and now return home with a bye on deck. Pittsburgh at CINCINNATI - CIN swept PIT last SU and ATS breaking a 5 game SU and ATS losing streak. PIT had a 373-273 yd edge in the 1st game at CIN but Palmer threw a 4 yd TD with :14 left for the 23-20 win as a 3 pt HD. A 92 yd KR by CIN proved to be the gamebreaker in the 18-12 win (7 pt AD) in the 2nd meeting as CIN hit 4 FG's in the 2H in a statistically even rematch. This is PIT's 3rd straight road game and the 2nd of 3 straight primetime games for them. This is CIN's big chance in primetime to show the nation that they aren't the big disappointment their record shows. Don't miss out on Monday Night Magic! UH is playing for a 10th str wk (3rd trip to the mainland in 5 wks) but has won 6 consec gms and LW accepted an invitation to the Hawaii Bowl. BSU, off a Tues night gm, and, of course, are on the blue turf but nothing fluky about Hawaii's current run and Boise may start feeling the BCS pressure.

Nevada 48 IDAHO 31 - UN has won 7 of the L/8 (6-2 ATS) by 31 ppg. The Vandals are 0-5 SU and 1-4 ATS vs UN as WAC foes being outscored on avg 53-20 and outgained in every gm by at least 150 yds. LY UN only led 28-24 at HT but scored 42 2H points posting 662 ttl yds incl 484 rush yds (9.1) in a 70-45 win (-15'). UI is happy to be back home as they've played their L/5 gms in 5 different time zones incl LW's in Hawaii where 4 TO's led to 28 pts in a 45-10 (+14) loss. QB Enderle is avg 285 ypg (59%) with a 16-12 ratio but was only 23-41 for 207 yds and 2 int LW. UN (#3 ttl off) is led by QB Kaepernick (209 ypg, 68%, 12-5 ratio, 771 rush yds) who is #10 in the NCAA in ttl off. UN put the pedal to the metal in the 1H LW building a 35-0 HT lead over USU before all'g 42 2H pts in a 56-42 (-26) win. In the Pack's L/3 gms in the Kibbie Dome, UI laid out a welcome mat as UN has won by an avg of 51-14 outgaining UI by 250 ypg with 35, 38 and 35 pt wins! Look for the Pack to run their win streak to 4 in a row in the dome.

California 34 WASH ST 17 - The Cougs appeared to be creeping closer to a P10 win but those hopes were crushed early LW vs ASU as they were hammered 42-0 being outgained 493-264. LY Cal jumped out to a 28-3 1Q lead but did witness WSU QB Tuel's best performance of the ssn as he threw for 354 yds (67%) with a 2-0 ratio. The Bears have some issues of their own heading into this matchup as they were hammered yet again on the road (outgained 392-206) vs OSU and all but likely lost 4 yr starting QB Riley (176 ypg, 60%) for the ssn. Cal's bkups have no real exp and it appears that Mansion (PS#27) will get his 1st career start here (138 yds, 56%, 1-0 ratio TY). While Cal has a huge edge on def (#26-105), they have dropped their L/6 ATS in their 2nd of B2B AG's while going just 3-10 ATS as a conf AF. Wash St, on the other hand, is 8-3 ATS in this series and has covered 4 of the L/5 conf gms (28 pt avg dog).

Wyoming 24 NEW MEXICO 17 - LY NM's bus was delayed due to a snowstorm and they did not get to the stadium till 2 hours before KO. WY is 3-8 SU and 4-7 ATS in this series and 6-24 SU (10-20 ATS) in MWC AG's. The Pokes are just 1-5 in Albuquerque S/93 losing by 24 ppg. WY is off a 48-38 loss to SDSt being outgained 441-338. The 338 did mark WY's highest off output vs a IA foe TY. NM QB Holbrook was KO'd in the 1Q LW and the Lobos lost their 8th gm TY, 38-14, to Colo St. NM was outFD'd 30-11 and outgained 584-237. With the loss LW, WY has clinched a losing season and will be suffering from some bowl season letdown here, but they'll fight to avoid being known as NM's only win of the season.

Oregon St 26 UCLA 23 - Despite being outgained 583-299 LW vs AZ, UCLA used a slew of trick plays and schemes behind bkup QB Brehaut to nearly pull out the upset. OSU kept their dominance of Cal going LW in Corvallis as RB Rodgers threw for a TD before rushing for 3 more (119 rush, 5.4) in the 35-7 win (def held Cal to 206 til yds). LY, the Bruins erased a 19-3 4Q deficit only to drop the game in the final minute on a 17 yd TD run. While the Beavers have covered an outstanding 11 consec P10 AG's, OSU HC Riley just earned his 1st coaching victory over the Bruins 2 years ago (0-9 prior) as the Beavers have notoriously struggled vs UCLA going just 1-6 ATS while the dog has covered 9 of the L/13.

Missouri 38 TEXASTECH 35 - Mizzou is 5-2 vs TT and has won the L/3 by 26 ppg. In the last gm ('07), MO hammered TT 41-10 holding them to just 136 yds and shutting them out in the 2H. MO was 1-7 vs the B12 South into '10 but is 2-0 SU/ATS TY. MO's unbeaten start fizzled out in Lincoln

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as the Huskers used big plays to roar out to a 24-0 1Q lead and held on. Despite the tm's hot start Gabbert (262, 64%, 12-4) has been inconsistent at times ranking just #7 among B12 pass eff leaders (#55 NCAA). The Tigers D has been the story for all the right reasons until getting shredded for big plays by NU: run gm (328, 7.0) LW. TT lost 45-27 at College Station for its 1st 4-4 start S/99. The Raiders were outgained 623-452 but also lost 2 fmbl's on the goal line. Tuberville said after the gm that they may be forced to go to more of a run gm to help out the struggling D which is allowing a B12 worst 450 ypg (#113 NCAA). The Tigers bounce back after LW's loss.

Alabama 20 LSU 13 - Saban Bowl 4. Saban is 2-1 SU (2-0-1 ATS) vs his former tm. The visitor is

10-2-2 ATS and the fav is 5-1-2. LY AL outgained LSU 452-253 and AL WR Jones grabbed a 73 yd TD pass in the 4Q to seal a 24-15 win over LSU. Both tms are off much needed byes and the Tide is lucky to avoid Death Valley at night (27-1 SU in Sat night HG's, 6-4 in afternoon HG's under Miles). Both tms have top 10 D's (AL #2, LSU #8) but AL has a large edge on off (#11-58) while LSU has a ST edge (#3-33). LSU's QB tandem of Jefferson and Lee is avg only 142 ypg (58%) with a 4-9 ratio. UA QB McElroy is avg 223 ypg (71%) with an 11-3 ratio. AL RB's Ingram (544, 6.4) and Richardson (606, 7.0) split carries while LSU RB Ridley is their workhorse (723, 4.8). UA is 8-3 ATS as an AF (2-2 TY with outright upset loss at SC and near upset at Ark though). LSU has only been a HD twice under Miles (0-2 ATS with 10 pt loss to FL LY and 6 pt OT loss to AL in '08). Both have strong lines and good running gms but the difference is AL QB McElroy (37-1 as a starter in HS/college). The winner of this gm has represented the West in the SEC Title game in each of the L/3Y.

UTEP 28 Smu 27 - After LW's road loss to Marshall (all'd GW TD w/1:47 left after roughing K on FG att gave MU a FD), UTEP has now dropped 3 in a row after a 5-1 start and now appears in jeopardy of even making it to a bowl despite the fact they are playing the nation's easiest sked. SMU on the other hand rebounded from a loss to UH to knock off Tulane 31-17 (trailed by 7 into the 4Q). LY SMU stopped UTEP's final drive with a 4&6 sack at the SMU14 in the 35-31 win (SMU -7). UTEP is 7-14 SU and 5-15 ATS in Nov HG's and 4-7 ATS in home finales but SMU hasn't won in the Sun Bowl S/'02 going 0-3 SU and 1-2 ATS since.

SAN DIEGO ST 40 Colorado St 23 - LY CSU's Mosure rushed for a career high 130 yds, but the Rams couldn't hold on to a 21-7 HT lead. CSU has now dropped 4 of 5 meetings SU (0-5 ATS) to SDSt getting upset in each loss. These two have comb to avg 58.5 ppg in MWC play. The visitor is 9-3 ATS and SDSt is just 4-6 ATS in MWC HG's. SDSt became bowl eligible with a 48-38 win over WY LW. QB Lindley (282 ypg, 53%, 15-7 ratio) threw for 365 as SDSt finished with a 441-338 yd edge. Leading rusher Hillman (893 vds, 5.7, 11) was held to just 44, but FB Sullivan scored 3 rush TD. CSU beat NM 38-14 LW, totalling 584 ttl yds incl 328 rush (most S/08 bowl). RB Mason (420 yds, 6.8) had 3 rush TD's and his 6th 100 yd gm. True Fr QB Thomas (223 ypg, 68%) has shored up his int problem as after a 1-6 ratio in the 1st 3 he's had an 8-3 ratio the L/G. CSU will be playing lights out football trying to keep

use of the standard of the sta LW with a 493-264 yd edge in the 42-0 shutout. USC made a game of it vs Oreg for 3Q's before all'g the final 24 pts in the 53-32 loss. While USC is off arguably its toughest gm and has B2B AG's vs AZ and OSU on deck, the fav is 10-5-1 ATS and LW's misleading final (USC led 32-29 mid-3Q)

gives us extra line value as the Trojans get back on track

MISSISSIPPI 44 Louisiana 20 - UM is 2-0 ('86, '87) vs UL but only won by 6 ppg. UM is 10-6 ATS as a HF under Nutt and was 5-0 as a DD fav under Nutt the 1st 2Y but 0-3 TY. UM is off a 51-31 loss to Aub (outgained 572-407) and has Tenn on deck. UL hasn't won a non-conf road gm since '06 but led OKSt at the half 21-17 and lost 38-31 LW at Ohio (+14' outgaining OU 471-414 yd edge). A loss here would put them out of the bowls as they need to win 3 of their L/4. UM QB Masoli is avg 181 ypg (57%) with an 11-7 ratio and has 429 rush (4.8). UL QB Masson (189 ypg, 54%, 9-5) was hurt on the opening poss LW (CS) and bkup McGuire (141 ypg, 65%, 2-1) filled in. Off 3 str losses to ranked tms, Ole Miss needs a feel good win at home.

Florida Atl 27 WKU 20 - Hilltoppers are 0-2 SU vs the Owls and the home team is 0-2 ATS. WKU is 0-3 SU/ATS at home TY. FAU is 4-1 ATS as an AF. LY RB Bobby Rainey had a career high 144 yds (9.6) vs FAU but, after cutting the deficit to 6, WKU elected to KO but couldn't stop FAU as the Owls ran out the final 4:59. Both lost to NT (FAU 21-17, 10 pt HF, -46 yd) but WKU, after ending a 26 gm losing streak was a 4' pt HF vs a NT tm which just had their HC fired. WKU lost 33-6 being outgained 400-272. FAU beat rival FIU 21-9 as a 5 pt HD despite being outgained 360-356, while WKU lost to FIU 28-21 as a 9' pt AD being outgained 343-299. WKU QB Jakes is avg 160 ypg (57%) with an 8-4 ratio while RB Rainey leads with 938 (4.7). FAU QB VanCamp is avg 203 ypg (62%) with an 8-6 ratio while RB Morris leads with 551 (4.2). WKU has a slight off edge (#107-113) while FAU has the def edge (#86-117). FIU 31 UIm 17 - FIU is 0-4 SU/ATS in the series and last time here had a 3&gl at the 1 but settled

for a 40 yd FG and then was SOD (lost by 4). LY ULM had a ssn high 577 yds incl 304 (5.7) rush yds vs FIU, but the Warhawks did get off to a slow start as they had just 1 FD on their 1st 4 poss. Both beat WKU TY (ULM 35-30, 2' pt AD, outgained 344-339; FIU 28-21, 9' pt HF, 343-299 yd edge). ULM beat FAU 20-17 as a 3 pt HF with a 418-218 yd edge, while FIU lost 21-9 as a 5 pt ÁF despite a 360-356 yd edge. ULM is off a huge upset of SBC leader Troy 28-14 as a 16' pt HD. FIU has the off (#86-110) and def (#65-#96) edges and has played the tougher sked (#70-97). ULM QB Browning is avg 218 ypg (62.4%) with a 9-7 ratio and is the #1 rusher with 236 (2.0). FIU QB Carrol is avg 210 ypg (57%) with a 6-9 ratio while they have 4 RB's with 220+ ybs (4.7).

Troy 28 N TEXAS 24 - NT is just 1-6 vs Troy and has been outgained by 288, 209 and 302 yds the L3Y. NT and Troy have either won or shared the SBC crown in 8 of its 9 years in existence. LY Troy led 17-0 after the 1Q and 41-7 early 3Q before pulling its starters. The only time Troy lost to NT was in '03, they are a perfect 5-0 as SBC opp's outgaining them in every gm (+181 ypg). After NT fired HC Dodge over the bye week, his son QB Riley won the starting job despite having surg on a broken wrist (non-throwing), and led a 33-6 win over WKU as a 4' pt AD. Troy suffered just its 2nd SBC loss since '08 to ULM, '28-14 as a 16' pt AF. Both teams failed to cover vs ASU and UL, but while NT lost SU to both (28-27 UL, 24-19 ASU), Troy beat both (31-24 UL, 35-28 ASU). Troy has the off edge (#59-99) and a slight def edge (#87-92).

TUESDAY, November 9th

Toledo at NILLINOIS - The game should decide the MAC West Champion as both are 5-0 in MAC play. UT is 14-2 SU and 12-3-1 ATS and the dog is 6-2 ATS in this series. NI is 5-10 ATS in home finales. LY NI held a 5 pt lead in the 4Q but allowed UT a 90/10pl TD drive with 7:05 to trail by 1 (2ptng). The Huskies had a 42 yd FG blk'd on their final drive and also had an PAT blocked earlier. Last time here NI was -9' and rolled to a 38-7 win.

WEDNESDAY, November 10th

Miami, Oh at BOWLING GREEN - MU is on a 13-6 ATS run in this series and is the only team in the MAC that owns a winning record over BG ("Miami Whammy"). The RedHawks have won 9 of the L/11 SU (8-3 ATS) incl the L/5 at BG (last loss in '97). MU is 0-8 SU and 2-6 ATS in weekday gms the L/2Y while BG went a perfect 5-0 SU/ATS in weekday gms LY. This is an ever-important game for MU as they find themselves in a 3 way tie for 1st in the MAC East and BG will look to play the role of spoiler in hopes of ending their home losing streak in the series


