NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK 11, 2010

NEWS AND NOTES: The Georgia Tech/Virginia Tech game had a lot of interesting storylines. First, VT had an extra week to prepare for the option and it didn't really show as they allowed TD's on GT's first 2 drives. A crucial play happened late 1H. VT had been picked off in the EZ and then fmbl'd a punt at midfield and GT was about to take a 21-7 lead when Nesbitt on 3&gl from the 6 was int'd at the 1. On the play Nesbitt tried to make the tackle and suffered an arm inj which put him out the rest of the game and it was 14-7 at the half. GT's Washington came into the game with 12 rush att on the season and 3 passes. He would hit 2-7-80 and rushed 11x for 45 yds. Nesbitt, who had 86 yds rushing on 6 att and before the inj, became the ACC's all-time leading rusher at QB. GT was SOD on 4&2 at the VT45 and VT went 55/8pl for a TD to tie it then drove 63/11pl for a TD and the lead, 21-14. Washington led GT 80/9pl getting a TD with 2:34 left but VT ret'd the ensuing KO for a TD. GT got to the VT17 but was int'd in the EZ on 2&11...In what may have been a preview for the CUSA Title game, UCF jumped out to a 20-10 lead vs Houston and their first 2 drives they were SOD at the UH15 on 4&3 and fmbl'd at the UH2. The D did get the latter one back as they got 15 yd IR TD 4pl later. It was 23-10 at the half with UCF having a 338-224 yd edge. UH actually opened the 3Q with 73/5pl and 80/9pl drives for TD's and took the lead 24-23 but UCF would go 76/12pl and 62/5pl for TD's while UH settled for a 34 yd FG which made it 37-27 (10:43 4Q). UCF got an int at the UH36 and added a 27 yd FG but UH got a TD with 5:46 left, 40-33 (missed xp). UCF went on a 9pl drive but missed a 39 yd FG with 1:53 left which would have clinched it. UH converted on 4&10 out to its 46 but after dropping a FD pass on 4&10, they were SOD...In the last two weeks on the Thurs and Fri games, amazingly three teams have fumbled the ball inside the opp's 3 yd line with a chance to win the game. It happened to Florida St, W Virginia and last week W Michigan. In the WM/CM game, WM led 22-13 when CM got a TD with 12:45 left. WM got back up by 2 scores with an 18 yd TD run but it was called back on a hold. They would settle for a 46 yd FG due to pen and missed it. CM got a TD with 6:04 left but WM answered right back. Trailing 26-22, they had a 2nd & gl at the 3 but amazingly fmbl'd and CM rec'd at the 5...Miami, Fl rolled up 504 yds despite not having their starting QB or RB thanks to their very talented reserves. Lamar Miller rushed for 125 yds and Stephen Morris hit 18-30-286. UM was int'd & ret'd 60 yds for a TD, settled for 33 and 31 yd FG's but Maryland also settled for 27 and 23 yd FG's. A key play happened in the 3Q when UM got a 55 yd FR TD which was wiped out by a face mask pen away from the play and MD got a 23 yd FG with 9:19 left to lead 20-18. UM got a 35 yd TD pass with :37 left and 2 pt conv but MD got to the UM30 and their pass to the EZ was just OOB and dropped on the final play...Joe Paterno was going for his 400th win and things did not look good as Northwestern got a TD with :56 left 1H to take a 21-0 lead stunning the home crowd. Scores late in halves always produce momentum and PSU got one driving 90/9pl for a TD with :03 left to get back in it. PSU scored TD's on their first 4 poss of the 3Q to roll to a 35-21 lead and NU dropped a TD pass in the EZ on 4&gl from the 9 with 8:11 left and Paterno was able to celebrate. PSU did have a 528-369 yd edge...Navy set a Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium record for pts scored by a team (EC or a foe) by piling up 76. The game was actually competitive as it was tied at 21 when Navy got a TD with :14 left 1H. EC fmbl'd the ball 3x in 6pl to open the 3Q as the game was played in rain. Navy got a 38 yd FG and TD drives of 29 & 21 yds. Leading 48-28, Navy rec'd a fmbl and drove 49 yds for a TD and then EC was SOD at its 50 and Navy drove 7 plays for a TD. Navy rec'd an onside kick to drive 36 yds for a TD and EC was SOD at its own 48 and . Navy drove 48 yds for a TD with 3:14 left for the final score. Navy's 76 pts were the highest in program históry surpassing the 74 they put up vs N Texas in 2007...Nebraska was playing without QB Taylor Martinez as well as his backup Zac Lee. Cody Green was only allowed to pass 4x in the 1H. lowa St led 10-7 at the half thanks to a Grant Mahoney 57 yd FG with the wind was at his back. NU got a 25 yd FG early 3Q then got a 29 yd IR TD to take the lead. After another int went 56/11pl for a TD to apparently take control, 24-10 but ISU went 75/12pl for a TD and NU fmbl'd the KO and ISU got a TD to

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tie. In OT each team scored a TD. ISU faked an xp and had an open receiver in the EZ. If the holder hit him, it would have been a 2 pt conversion but it was slightly behind him and the safety was able to int it and NU survived...Denard Robinson DNP after the 3Q of Michigan's shoot out vs Illinois. It was the highest scoring game in the history of UM football but they needed 3OT's to get to 67-65. It was 31-31 at half, also the highest total in UM history. UM finished with a 676-561 yd edge. After each team scored a TD in all 3OT, UM

converted on their 2 pt conv and UI was sk'd for an 11 yd loss...New Mexico St had a 346-296 yd edge vs Utah St and 22-17 FD edge. USt benefitted from 84 and 68 yd KR's by Williams which set up 10 and 12 yd TD drives. USt did lead 24-20 when NMSt was SOD on 4&3 at their 27. USt knelt 3x losing 6 yds and on the final pay of the game, ran out of the back of the EZ eating up the final :08 for a safety and a 27-22 final...An interesting factor in last week's Arkansas/South Carolina game is that the gamé had zero baring on SC's chances at a BCS bowl or SEC Championship. Win or lose, what SC did the next week vs Florida would determine their post season destinations. SC was competitive early but left some key pts left off the board in the 1H. Mid-2Q trailing 10-7 they had a FD at the Arkansas 6 but had a 29 yd FG that bounced off the upright. At the end of the half with :13 left SC got a 3 yd TD pass to make if 24-14 but a questionable offensive pass interfer call took the pts off the board and they settled for a 29 yd FG. With RB Lattimore banged up and the big game on deck, Spurrier decided to sit him most of the 2H. Trailing 41-10 SC brought in backup QB Shaw as Garcia was pulled and he led SC down to the Ark11 but took a late hit OOB and 3rd string QB Strickland would lose 1 yd and they settled for a 31 yd FG. The stadium was half empty by the end of the game but once again meant much more to Ark than it did to SC...There were plenty of interesting things to come out of the Kansas St/Texas game. UT finished with 23-13 FD and 412-270 yd edges. Collin Klein was a surprise QB starter for KSU and ran for 127 yds while hitting 2-4-9 yds. UT starting QB Garrett Gilbert threw 5 int's and UT was also stopped on a fake punt and fake FG in the game. KSU would have scoring "drives" of -1, 9 and 14 yds. UT was also int'd in the EZ from the 11. KSU's final scoring drive summed up the day for UT as on 3&4 a pers foul gave KSU a FD. KSU punted 4pl later and roughing the P gave them a FD and they got a TD 2pl later. UT blk'd the xp but KSU picked it up and ran it in for 2 to lead 39-0 before UT scored a TD with 12:55 left then went on a 70/16pl drive for a TD with :31 left...Air Force won its first Commander-In-Chief's Trophy in 8 years. It was the 17th time they've won the Award and Navy had won the last 7. AF won for the 7th straight time in Michie Stadium. Army came in as the only team in the country which had not thrown an int but trailing 14-13, Steelman threw one in the final minute of the half which was ret'd 32 yds to the Army23 and AF got a 2 yd TD run with :13 left in the half for a 21-13 lead. Later, with the game at 28-16, AF got a 53 yd FR TD. AF only outrushed Army 277-244 and Army actually had a 19-18 FD edge...Minnesota played a decent game vs Michigan St as they were only outFD'd 16-14 and outgained 320-267. UM missed a 32 yd FG and was SOD on 4&1 at the MSU41 early 2Q. MSU twice in the 1H went for it on 4th & gl. The first got them a 1 yd TD run with 6:03 left in the half, the 2nd with no time left resulted in a Baker 2 yd TD run and the daring calls made it 21-0 at half instead of just 13-0. UM got to the MSU12 and was int'd in the EZ and at the end of the game, UM was SOD on 4&1 at the MSU25...For the 2nd straight year Indiana almost upset Iowa. The story of the game was each team driving the length of the field and consistently settling for FG's. lowa had a 66/10pl drive for a 23 yd FG, Indy went 59/8pl for a 37 yd FG, lowa had drives of 11 and 12 plays result in a short 27 yd FG and a missed 22 yd FG. Indiana went on 8 & 12 pl drives for 38 and 28 yd FG's and was also int'd at the lowa18 in a 6-6 1H. Indy broke through with a TD late 3Q, 13-9 but punted at the lowa42 ass find at the lower of the day of the control of am CT start vs Vanderbilt but the Gators would heat up and had 480-109 yd and 24-7 FD edges. There were actually 3 blk'd punts, 2 ret'd for TD's and another set up a 3 yd TD "drive". UF blk'd 2 of the punts and earned 14 pts while VU earned 7 off of it. It is also possible that UF Jordan Reed won the starting QB job as he hit 11-19-120 and QB'd almost the entire 2H. UF led 41-0 at half and delivered an easy 4'★ winner for us...Louisville was without starting QB Froman and RB Powell but Justin Burke hit 13-25-143 yds and Jeremy Wright and Victor Anderson combined to rush 29x for 143 yds. Surprisingly UL was able to knock off Syracuse on the road. SU had a 194-106 yd edge at half and led 17-14. UL went on 60/10pl and 90/12pl drives for TD's to open the 3Q to take a 28-20 lead. Their last drive started with 5:01 left and went 9pl running out the clock...Purdue gave QB Sean Robinson his first start and he hit 19-38-141 yds and rushed 12x for 31 yds but his 3 int's were the key to UW getting the cover. PU actually led 10-6 at the half with a 173-126 yd edge. News and Notes continued from Front page....BYU's domination of UNLV was even more than the final score of 55-7. The game was 55-0 when BYU went for it on 4&8 and simply ran the ball into the middle of the line for no gain with 3:16 left. UNLV at this point had just 74 yards offense and gained 70 yds on their final 11 plays and on the last play of the game, got a 24 yd TD pass to avoid the shutout...It may have been the true start of the Turner Gill era and the end of the Dan Hawkins era. What looked like a glorious game for Hawkins and Colorado had them ahead 45-17 in the 4Q over Kansas. The 4Q was a nightmare. It was the greatest comeback in KU history and also the first time in KU history they scored 35 pts in a single quarter. KU snapped an 11 game conf losing streak. Trailing 45-17 KU converted on 4&1 for a FD and got a 13 yd TD on the next play. They then rec'd an onside kick and drove 59 yds for a TD. CU fmbl'd and KU ret'd it 28 yds for a TD with 7:12 left. The Jayhawks got an int and drove 47/5pl for a TD to stunningly tie it. CU punted with 2:49 left and KU went 63/5pl with a 28 yd TD run for the lead. CU had a chance to tie and in fact had a 1st & gl at the 7 but their final 2 passes fell incomplete...Tulsa was coming off their upset of Notre Dame and still dominated Rice despite giving up a 50 yd TD pass on Rice's 2nd offensive play of the game and a 55 yd TD pass on the 5th play of the 3Q. At half TU led 41-7 and had a 440-193 yd edge. Rice trailed 57-13 when they scored TD's on B2B

drives to pull within 57-27 with 10:56 left. TU brought in backup QB Shavodrick Beaver and they went 80/16pl eating up 9:52 scoring a 1 yd TD with 1:04 left for the 64-27 final...It was an exciting home crowd with ESPN GameDay on hand as TCU came into Utah as some fans camped out 30 hrs in advance but the game was dominated by TCU. At the half TCU had 23-5 and 328-72 yd edges. TCU led 40-0 when Utah was given a TD late. Asiata's knee was down at the 3 but he was given the TD and it was not reviewed and that was just TCU's 3rd conf TD allowed all year. TCU finished with a 558-199 yd edge...Boise St made a strong statement for their BCS contention by wiping out red-hot Hawaii. BSU had a 30-11 FD edge and a school record 737 yds while holding a potent UH offense to just 196. It was just 21-0 at the half and BSU scored TD's on their first two 3Q poss. BSU pulled QB Moore with 13:16 left in the 4Q.

BACKDOOR/FRONTDOOR COVERS: Oregon was playing their first game as #1 in the BCS and was taking on a Washington team without QB Jake Locker. Surprisingly the Huskies stayed with UO throughout much of the game. UW was within 18-13 with 13:11 left in the 3Q and 25-16 with 6:14 left in the 3Q. The Ducks went 76/9pl and 54/5pl for TD's then after a 69 yd PR went 16/5pl for a TD to lead 46-16. UO then went 90/11pl getting a 30 yd TD run with 4:34 left to get ahead of the spread. UW did ret the KO to the UO41 but punted on 4&19.

LW BYU put up a ssn high 516 ttl yds en route to a 55-7 win over UNLV, delivering a **4★** on these pages. The Rams also pounded UNLV, 43-10 earlier TY. BYU QB Heaps threw for a ssn high 294 (1st 200 yd gm in L/3) and now avg 182 ypg (55%) with a 3-6 ratio since taking over as the starter. The top rusher is Di Luigi with 681 (5.2) and he is also the top rec (37, 9.8). LW CSU fell to SDSt 24-19 as their 4Q rally fell just short. QB Thomas is now avg 227 ypg (66%) with a 10-10 ratio and CSU's top rusher, Mason, has just 431 yds. BYU has a large edge on D (#49-94). LW we told you we used BYU as a **4★** Newsletter Play in 4 of the L/6 gms of '06 and this once young team is now becoming a legitimate "play on" team. BYU was a GOY winner in 1989, and while they've underachieved thus far TY, winning out would get them to a bowl. **FORECAST: Byu 37 COLORADO ST 20**

3★ FLORIDA over South Carolina - The winner of this gm will clinch a spot in the SEC Title gm. UF (-17') only led 17-14 after 3Q's LY, but SC QB Garcia was int'd by UF DL Trattou and he ret'd it 53 yds to set up a TD in a 24-14 win. UF sk'd Garcia 4 times and Spurrier lost his 4th in a row vs his alma mater. UF had a 339-247 yd edge with SC having an 18-17 FD edge. SC is 11-7-1 as an AD under Spurrier while UF is 21-13-1 as a HF under Meyer. SC is off a 41-20 loss to Ark which gave us our 4.5★ Coll Totals GOY Winner on the Over. QB Garcia (229 ypg, 68%, 14-9) was benched LW after throwing 2 int but then bkup Shaw was inj'd and SC was down to 3rd stringer Strickland. Star RB Lattimore wasn't 100% (ankle inj, CS) and was held to 30 yds LW (752, 4.6). UF (-14) delivered a 4.5★ LPS Winner in their dominating 55-14 win over Vandy. UF changed to a hurry up off in their bye 2 wks ago and has avg 465 ypg ttl off L2 (329 ypg 1st 7 gm). Garcia crumbled under pressure LW and will face a stronger UF pass rush TW (UF's D has 19 sks, SC's OL all'd 22 sks).

3★ TENNESSEE over Mississippi - LY UM RB McCluster rushed for 282 yds in a 42-17 rout of Tenn (-6) at home. It was UM's first win over the Vols S/83. LY was the first time UM had been favored in this series S/88. UM is 7-1 ATS in the series. UT true frosh QB Bray made his 1st career start LW and threw for 325 yds and 5 TD in the Vols (-19') 50-14 win over Memphis. Bray (126 ypg, 55%, 7-3) won the job over Simms (162, 58%, 8-5) and helped UT snap a 4 gm losing streak. UM is off a 43-21 win over ULL (+29' was a 2★ Small Coll Winner for us) in which QB Masoli (169 ypg, 57%, 12-7, #2 rush 446, 4.8) left in the 1Q with a concussion (CS). UT is 1-3 SU and 0-4 ATS at home vs FBS tms TY. UT was tied at 13 vs Oregon, only down 7-3 to FL, tied LSU 7-7, down 13-10 to AL, tied 10-10 to SC all at the half but wore down in the 2H of each. UT is in a must-win situation to keep their bowl hopes alive and UM has to win 2 of their L/3. Another situation where a young team, at home, is off a confidence building win which can translate into expected late season success. Fond memories as Tennessee beat Ole Miss as a GOY winner in '84 and also cashed as our GOY in '86.

FORECAST: TENNESSEE 34 Mississippi 24 OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Georgia (+) over AUBURN - GA has won 4 in a row in the "Deep South's Oldest Rivalry" for the 1st time S/'44-'48. LY Aub jumped out to a 14-0 lead scoring on its 1st 2 poss (156-(-2) yd edge at that point), but GA (-4) rallied for a 31-24 win. GA broke up an Aub pass at the goal line to preserve the win. The visitor is 11-6 ATS but the HT has covered 3 in a row. Last time here UGA (-9) scored a 4Q TD then held Aub on a 4&1 at the GA14 for a 17-13 win. GA took a break from conf play LW with a 55-7 win over Idaho St which should help them get past their disappointing OT loss to FL. QB Murray is avg 231 ypg (62%) with an 18-6 ratio. Aub QB Newton has rumors swirling around him but has been the most dynamic off plyr in the nation TY avg 189 ypg (67%) with a 19-5 ratio and 1,146 rush (6.5). GA is only allowing 106 rush ypg (3.1) but all'd 231 rush yds to FL with their mix of mobile QB's and fast RB's. Aub's one weakness may be their secondary as they rank #76 in our pass D rankings which means GA WR Green could have a big night. Aub can clinch their spot in the SEC Title gm with a win here, but GA needs 1 win in their L/2 gms to be bowl eligible.

2★ Boston College over DUKE - Duke was 0-12 in '06 but covered the only lined meeting in this series (lost 28-7, +29'). BC is 1-10 ATS as an AF the L/5Y. LW it was 24-21 at HT but UVA took its first 3Q poss for a TD and its first lead of the day. The Devils were down 48-47 late 4Q and looking at 48-20 at their own 21. QB Renfree (252 ypg, 59%, 12-15 ratio) hit Varner for a 32 yd pass and 2pl later RB Scott broke off a 35 yd TD run (2pt) and despite being outFD'd 33-26 and outgained 643-489, Duke beat UVA 55-48 and won their 1st Nov gm in 20 tries. BC will be making its 1st trip to Durham but Duke is 7-18 ATS (2-1 TY) as a HD. LW BC beat WF 23-13 as RB Harris ran for 183 (4th str 100+ yd gm) and all 3 of BC's TD's. QB Rettig has avg 138 ypg (54%) but with a poor 2-5 ratio the 4 gms he's started and finished. Harris IS the BC off (1019 rush yd, 4.5) having scored all 6 of BC's rush TD's TY. After a 5 gm losing streak (-1 TO), BC has strung together a 2 gm win streak (+5 TO), and both Duke and BC could be bowl elig if they win out. While Duke does have the off edge (#49-92), BC's D (#19-109) is too much for the Devils. LW's road win is invaluable for the young BC QB and this defense can dominate any opponent they face.

2★ OREGON ST over Washington St - OSU is 9-1 ATS in this series while the fav is 14-4 ATS. OSU was unable to get anything going on off LW as they were upset by the Bruins on a 51 yd FG as time expired. The Cougs were unable to take adv of hosting a Cal tm w/a QB making his 1st career start in the 7 pt loss (+14') as the WSU's off totaled just 194 ttl yds. WSU hasn't won a game away from home S/'07 (17 str defeats by 31 ppg) and LY at home the Cougars suffered a 42-10 defeat (+31) to the Beavers as OSU outgained WSU by 567-192 yds. Don't be fooled by OSU having the NCAA's #88 D (our #37) as WSU has been outscored 171-26 (0-3 ATS) in their L/3 trips to OR and OSU has won the L/3 by an avg of 53-13. The Beavers have historically finished the season strong having gone 10-2 ATS their L/4 reg season gms and is now also hungry off a loss. Not afraid to lay DD's as OSU has gone 8-1 ATS in that role vs conf opp's.

THURSDAY, November 11th
Pittsburgh at CONNECTICUT - There have been 3 outright upsets in the L/4Y in this series and the visitor has covered the L/3. LY Pitt trailed 21-6 late 3Q but Pitt had the largest comeback under Wannestedt and won 24-21 (-6') with a 489-303 yd edge. UC is 14-5 ATS as a HD and pulled the outright upset 2 wks ago in a 16-13 OT win over WV (+5'). Pitt is 8-3 ATS in BE AG's and has a 2 gm lead in the conf. Both tms are off byes and have strong running gms with UC's Todman (954, 5.5) and Pitt duo Graham (685, 7.3) and Lewis (479, 4.4).

E Carolina at UAB - UAB and ÉC both come into this meeting arguably off their worst outings of the ssn. While it wasn't their largest margin of defeat TY, UAB was in look ahead mode vs a struggling Marshall tm as they were -10 but lost outright by 2 TD. EC all'd the 2nd most pts ever in program history (79 in '32) as they were punished on the ground vs Navy (521 rush yds, 8.4) in a 76-35 home loss. UAB held EC to a season best 14 FD's and 325 yds (UAB 520 ttl yds) LY but allowed a 99 yd KR TD and an 89 yd IR in the 37-21 defeat (+13). The Pirates have had success in this series going 4-1 ATS but the HT is on a 7-2 ATS run and 6 of the L/9 have been decided by 8 pts or less.

Both tms have clinched a 2nd straight losing ssn since their title game meeting. Ball St is 3-7 ATS TY while UB is 2-7 ATS.

SATURDAY, November 13th
Maryland 27 VIRGINIA 23 - The visitor is 3-6 SU and 2-7 ATS but has won 3 of the L/4 SU. Both are coming off tough road losses as they both lost leads in the final :45 as UVA led Duke 48-47 before all'g a 35 yd TD run in a 55-48 loss, while the Terps had a 20-18 lead before the Hurricanes scored on a 35 yd TD pass to snatch a 26-20 win. UVA QB Verica is avg 231 ypg (58%) with a 13-10 ratio and LW passed for 4 TD and a schl record 417 yds but he also threw 3 int that Duke conv into 2 TD and a FG. RB's Payne (673 yd) and Jones (557) are both avg 5.0 ypc. UM QB O'Brien is avg 142 ypg (53%) with a 14-4 ratio and his fav target has been WR Smith (37, 16.1). The Terps are just 3-8 ATS as an AF (0-4 ATS L/5Y), while the Cavs are 9-5 in home finales but just 1-5 the L/6Y. This is UM's 4th AG in 5 wks and the Terps will be looking for just their 2nd win in their L/10 trips to Charlottesville.

W VIRGINIA 27 Cincinnati 17 - The HT is 1-6-1 ATS in the series. WV is 7-2-1 SU hosting UC but has dropped 2 of the L/3 but by just a comb 5 pts. The L/3 in this series have been decided by 3.7 ppg incl LY's 24-21 win by UC (-9'). UC HC Butch Jones coached WR's at WV from '05-'06. UC has won 7 straight BE AG's by 12.9 ppg while WV is 6-10 as a HF under Stewart. Both tms come in off byes and 2 str losses with both HC's under criticism. WV QB Smith (212 ypg, 66%, 15-5) has struggled the L/2 gms (169 ypg, 1-3 ratio) and WV is -6 in TO in their L/2 but has outFD'd their L/2 opp 44-28. UC QB Collaros (274 ypg, 62%, 20-4) missed the last gm with a knee inj (CS) and bkup Anderson struggled in a 31-7 home loss to Syr. UC has to win 3 of therir L/4 to make a bowl. These 2 tms who have comb to win the BE in each of the L/3Y and are now in the bottom of the BE standings and desperate for wins. WV won as our GOY in '87, could the Mountaineers do it again?

UCF 37 Southern Miss 23 - After LW's 7 pt victory over Hou (QB Godfrey 399 ttl yds), UCF has now covered 12 of their L/13 regular ssn gms and remain the only CUSA tm w/o a conf loss in '10 (11 straight conf wins). SM took care of a feisty Tulane group LW (outFD'd 28-17 and outgained 402-358) as they scored the final 16 pts of the gm after going into the 4Q deadlocked at 30. LY SM jumped out to a 14-0 lead after the 1Q and ply'd w/a DD lead for most of the 2H. SM is 2-0 in Orlando and in '08 after falling behind 6-0 held UCF to just 90 yds in the final 3Q's. A big matchup here will be a SM off that has scored 40+ pts in each of the L/5 gms vs a UCF def that is #1 in CUSA (#18 nationally) all'g just 308 ypg. SM is just 1-4 ATS as a conf AD over the L/5Y while the Knights are 9-3-1 ATS as a conf HF and will continue their likely run to the CUSA Title here this week.

Svracuse 20 RUTGERS 17 - The HT is 10-2 ATS in the series. The winner the L/4Y has won by 18+ pts

and outgained the losing tm by at least 172 yds (+262 avg ypg). LY Syr tied a school record with 9 sks

and held Rut to 130 yds despite playing with a scholarship depleted team. LY's 31-13 win by SU (+9') snapped a 4 gm RU win streak in the series but RU has won 3 str at home by 22 ppg. Syr has won all 3 of their BE road gms TY SU/ATS, but hasn't been a BE AF S/04. Rut is 11-6 ATS as a BE HD. SU is off a 28-20 home loss to L'Ville in which they were outgained 303-256 despite facing a UL tm w/o its starting QB and RB. Rut has had extra time to prepare off a 28-27 loss at USF last Wed (outgained 306-238). Syr needs 1 more win to be bowl elig (ply'd 2 FCS tms) while Rut has to win 2 of their L/4 to be bowl elig Miami, FI 27 GEORGIA TECH 17 - GT is 4-1 SU/ATS in the series and HC Johnson is 7-1 SU/ATS off a SU loss at GT. Both are expected to be without their starting QB's here (GT Nesbitt OFY, arm; UM Harris doubtful, head). GT is off a tough loss to VT as they built a 14-7 lead and were threatening to score when Nesbitt was int'd at the VT1 (inj'd). Tied at 21 with 2:34 left, VT got a 90 yd KR TD for the 28-21 win. GT finished with a 426-335 yd edge and bkup Washington (2-7 pass, 45 rush) played the entire 2H. LW UM true Fr QB Morris was making his 1st start and drove his team 82 yds capped by a 35 yd TD pass with :37 left for the 26-20 win over MD. He finished throwing for 286 but did have an int ret'd for a TD. Miami had a huge 504-254 yd edge but pen's (one negated def score) hurt them. LTH ('08), GT piled up 472 rush yd (8.4) vs ÚM (most rush yds ever in an ACC gm) as UM was clearly bothered by unusually cold weather. LY, in MIA, GT was held to a ssn low 95 rush yds (2.4). UM has all of the edges (off #27-44, D #4-50, ST #54-100), a new QB that already has a win under his belt and the early forecast is calling for a 63° day.

Iowa was up 10-0 LY before NW took adv of four 2Q TO (incl FR TD on play Stanzi was KO'd) and held the Hawks to just 121 yds in the final 3Q's. LW the Hawks needed a 52 yd TD pass with 2:50 left to take the lead and Indy dropped a TD pass with :28 left in an 18-13 win in which Iowa had a 445-313 yd edge. QB Stanzi (246, 68%, 20-3) is #2 NCAA pass eff. #1 rusher Robinson (806, 4.7) DNP vs Indy due to a concusion (CS) but true Fr Coker had 129 (5.9). Iowa is #19 pass eff D. Despite missing a 27 yd FG the Cats led PSU 21-0 before the Lions rallied 35-21 for Paterno's 400th win. PSU did dominate the stat sheet with 28-20 FD and 528-369 yd edges as the Cats had just 27 3Q yd while the Lions were taking the lead. QB Persa (251 ypg, 73%, 13-3 ratio, 469 rush) is 1 of 3 QB's in the top 12 NCAA ttl off and pass eff (Cam Newton and Denard Robinson). NW is allowing 170 rush ypg (4.9) vs FBS tms. This gm is sold out so expect lots of Black and Gold in the stands but the deg won and covered L/2V.

LY UM nearly overcame a 28-7 HT deficit as they blk'd a P for a TD but couldn't recover the onside kick. The visitor is 3-0 SU/ATS and UM is 6-3 SU/ATS in the series. LTH IL (-12) lost outright 27-20 despite a 550-312 yd edge. LW IL missed the 2 pt conv in the 3rd OT to lose 67-65 in the highest scoring gm in B10 history as the Wolves had 33-25 FD and 676-561 yd edges but also had 5 TO, were SOD at the IL30 and missed a 39 yd FG. The L/2 QB Scheelhaase is avg 313 ttl ypg with 8 ttl TD. Despite being shredded LW IL is #41 pass eff D. Minny lost their 9th str to MSU. The Spartans scored 2 TD on 4&gl runs incl 1 on the 1H's final play and had just a 320-267 yd edge as the Gophers missed a 33 yd FG on their 1st poss. WR Gray finally played QB (2-6 for 24) but also caught a TD pass. UM is allowing 201 rush ypg (5.5) and their 6.8 ypp all'd is #119 NCAA. IL has huge D (#31-91) and ST (#44-120) edges. Zook is 6-2 ATS as a conf HF and the Illini need this to ensure a bowl bid.

WF is 1-11 S/'86 in Raleigh (avg loss by 14 ppg). LW NCSt had a 275-260 yd edge but lost 14-13 in a sloppy game on both sides. CU fmb'd 5x's (lost 2) while NCSt drove inside CU's 20 5x's but only managed 13 pts. Wilson is avg 208 ypg (59%) with a 20-11 ratio (3-5 ratio L/3) and now takes on our #114 pass eff D all'g 225 ypg (62%) with a 24-7 ratio! TT had 29-14 FD and 485-355 yd edges but after allowing 69 and 71 yd TD runs, the D held QB Gabbert to just 12-30 for 95 yd and Raiders RB Batch had a career high 134 rush yd. OC said Potts and Sheffield (11-20 for 99 yd) would continue to split snaps. Raiders are #46 pass eff D. The Sooners are 16-7 ATS off a SU loss under Stoops and add to the NCAA's longest home win streak.

BAYLOR 37 Texas A&M 34 - A&M is 3-18 SU and 4-17 ATS S/98 in Nov AG's. The Ags are 21-2-1 vs Baylor but both losses have come in the L/3 trips to Waco incl '08 when A&M was outgained 510-308 (Griffin at QB 41-21, -8'). After losing 3 straight to ranked tms A&M is right back in the South race after their KO of the Sooners. The Ags led 9-0 with OU running 1 play and ret'd the 2H opening KO 100 yds as they stopped the Sooners on 4&gl 3x inside the 2 in a 33-19 win. QB Tanneyhill has been the spark as he's avg'd 276 ypg (68%) with a 9-3 ratio taking over for Pressn B12 OPY Johnson. A&M is #11 pass eff D. BU came back to earth in 55-28 loss at OKSt in which they trailed 41-7 late 3Q and were outgained 725-464! B12 ttl offense leader QB Griffin (286, 66%, 20-6 ratio, 416 rush) was contained by the Cowboys who held him without a TD for the 1st time TY. The Bears are #85 pass eff D. A&M has a huge D edge (#27-79) but the Bears bounce back.

NEBRASKA 48 Kansas 13 - HC Gill was the Huskers QB from '81-'83 and also an NU asst cch from '92-'04. RB Helu had 82 of his 156 rush yds in the 4Q LY when the Huskers outscored the Jayhawks 18-7. NU hasn't lost at home to Kansas S/68 (20 str). KU is 9-24 ATS as a DD digit conf dog. The HT is 5-1 SU (avg W by 17 ppg). Minus their top 2 QB's Martinez (ply'd 1 snap, ankle) and Lee (shldr) the Huskers blew a 24-10 HT lead and needed to int a fake xp pass on a 2 pt conv try in OT to beat ISU, 31-30. #3 QB Green hit just 7-12 for 79 as the Huskers ran on 21 of their 1st 24 plays and were outgained 360-314 and outFD'd 24-15. Martinez is #2 B12 pass eff (145, 60%, 9-3 ratio in sts) and #5 in rush (886, 7.9) and should play here. Blackshirts surprisingly allow 162 rush ypg (4.0). KU trailed Colorado 45-17 with just over 11:00 left before rallying for 35 unanswered pts for the greatest comeback in school history. JC QB Mecham got his 2nd straight start and hit 23-28 for 252 with a 2-2 ratio. The Hawks allow 203 rush ypg (5.1). The Huskers are 2x GOY winners ('99 and '06), would we

go back to them for their last meeting in a rivalry they've owned? **KENTUCKY 38 Vanderbilt 17** - The dog is 7-4 ATS in this series and VU has lost 5 of the L/6 SU/ATS. The visitor has covered 4 of the L/5. LY UK (-3') had a 399-209 yd edge with 308 of their yds on the ground in their 24-13 win over Vandy. UK held Vandy to 1 FD and 31 yds after halftime with Vandy only having the ball for 6:56 in the 2H. UK is 1-6 ATS (2-5 SU) in their FHG. UK can clinch a bowl with a win here while VU was eliminated from the bowls LW in their 55-14 loss to FL (-14) which gave us a 4.5★ LPS Winner. UK is off a 49-21 win over Charleston So (502-269) and RB Locke (574, 5.3, out L/4 gm shldr inj) could ret TW. WR Cobb has 783 (12.4) plus 206 rush (5.6). UK QB Hartline is avg 267 ypg (66%) with a 21-8 ratio. VU changed OC's 2 gms ago (outscored 35-11 and outgained 472-181 in SEC play TY) but their #105 off is still struggling as top RB Warren is OFY and #2 RB Stacy left LW's gm (concussion, CS). QB Smith is only avg 118 ypg (50%) with a 6-4 ratio. UK is 0-5 as a SEC HF and VU is 8-2-1 as an SEC AD but 1-2 TY.

COLORADO 30 lowa St 23 - The HT is 6-0 SU in the series but 4 were by 7 or less incl LY. The Cyclones have been outgained each of the L/5Y by 79 ypg (80 yds LY). The Buffs had 11 pen (-110 yds), 3 TO's and scored just 3 pts despite 4 trips inside the ISU10. The Clones are 1-11 SU and 4-8 ATS in Nov AG and are a conf AF for the 1st time in 5 seasons. CU has gone just 4-12 ATS vs the B12 North incl LW's record setting collapse vs Kansas as they all'd 35 unanswered 4Q pts in less than 11:00 in a 52-45 loss. HC Dan Hawkins' cch fate is presumably sealed although CU could hold out until ssn's end as his son Cody is the only healthy QB and is avg 261 (52%) with a 6-2 ratio the L/3. CU allows 147 rush ypg (4.4). ISU came up short in their comeback vs Neb as holder Kuehl missed open TE Franklin in the EZ on a fake xp pass

and was int'd. QB Arnaud (157, 58%, 13-10) is league's 2nd lowest rated full-time QB at #87 NCAA pass eff. ISU is allowing 198 rush ypg (4.7). In '96 and '90 CU won our GOY, would we go back to the desperate Buffs?

W MICHIGAN 41 E Michigan 17 - WM is 15-3 (9 gms decided by single digits) S/92 vs EM. LY EM led 7-0 but 6 TO's resulted in 21 of WM's 35 pts. The visitor is 11-5 ATS but EM is just 1-5 at Kalamazoo (avg loss 31-18). The L'4Y these schools have avg just 36 ppg (4 UNDER's). EM is off a bye but their only cover the L/7 gms was an OT win over Ball St (ended 18 gm losing streak). They susp 5 players (CS) incl their then #1 tkl'r LB Fort and top RB Priest (378, 4.4) prior to their loss to Toledo 42-7 (+10'). EM QB Gillett is avg 146 ypg (56%) with a 10-9 ratio and is the top rusher with 512 (4.0). WM is off a 26-22 (+3) loss to rival CM as they blew a 22-13 4Q



lead. Both teams fmbl'd 5x's but CM only lost 1 while WM lost 4 incl one at the CM2 with 1:37 left. WM QB Carder is avg 286 ypg (61%) with a 21-11 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 182 (2.0, 6 TD) but top rusher RB Winchester had just 266 (3.0). Versus 3 common opp both were 1-2 SU/ATS but WM had an avg 442-330 yd edge while EM was outgained 404-391.

KENT ST 17 Army 16 - In their only prior meeting, '06, KS scored a late 4QTD to force OT but lost 17-14 as KS fmbl'd while Army hit a 36 yd FG. Army is 3-2 SU but 1-4 ATS vs MAC tms the L/2Y. Army blew a 28-13 3Q lead over Temple losing 42-35 as a 6 pt HD being outgained 407-359. KS lost to Temple 28-10 as 3' pt HD being outgained 465-223. Temple was avg 173 (4.7) rushing coming into LW but KS held them to just 97 yds (2.1) as KS leads the FBS in rush D (69 ypg, 2.1). Army is avg 277 ypg (4.8) rushing. Army needs 1 win to be bowl eligible for the first time S/96, but is off a loss to rival Air Force and has Notre Dame on deck. KS was eliminated from the MAC East race and needs to win 2 of their final 3 to be bowl eligible.

ARKANSAS 48 Utep 17 - The only previous meeting was a 39-7 (-27') win by #8 Arkansas in 1989 in Little Rock. Ark is off a dominating 41-20 win over SC which gave us a 4.5★ Coll Totals GOY Winner on the Over. Ark QB Mallett is avg 306 ypg (67%) with a 19-8 ratio. Ark lost top WR Childs (46, 14.3) for the yr but Adams (571, 17.3) ret'd LW from an ankle inj and should be healthier here. UTEP clinched bowl elig LW for the 1st time since '05 with their 28-14 upset of SMU (+7) despite being outgained 359-319. QB Vittatoe is avg 226 ypg (55%) with a 19-8 ratio. '09 AA RB Buckram (316, 4.5) has missed time with inj TY (43 yds LW) and Banyard is the tm's top rusher (418, 5.3). The Miners are 3-11 ATS vs BCS schools and 0-3 as a 20+ pt dog. Ark's only losses came vs then-#1 Bama on the road and to current 10-0 Auburn, but this is probably a letdown spot for them.

NOTRE DAME 24 Utah 23 - First meeting. Utah has only played 6 gms in the eastern time zone the L/20Y and has gone 4-2 in those incl an upset of Mich, 25-23 in '08. UT was embarrassed 47-7 by TCU, with GameDay on hand, at home LW. The game got out of hand quickly as TCU had a 328-72 yd edge at half and was up 23-0. UT's only TD came on a very questionable 19 yd rec as replays showed Asiata's knee was down at the 3. The Irish are 6-13-1 ATS in home finales. ND has gone just 1-8 SU and 3-6 ATS the L/2 yrs in Nov but the Utes are on their 4th AG in 6 wks while ND is fresh off a bye. Two weeks ago, in a 1 pt home loss to Tulsa, ND lost starting QB Crist and top rusher Allen is also OFY (hip). Utah will be in a huge letdown after LW's bubble burst, but the Irish are on a 1-3-2 ATS run and have been upset their L/2.

MARSHALL 33 Memphis 16 - Battle of the CUSA East cellar dwellers as the team's have comb to go 4-14 SU and 5-13 ATS TY. The Herd did pick up an upset LW as a 10 pt dog with UAB possibly looking ahead to their Thurs night gm vs EC. The Tigers meanwhile surrendered 40+ pts for the 7th time in 9 gms LW vs Tenn as they were outgained by 201 yds in the defeat. LY RB Darius Marshall had career highs w/203 yds (8.1) and 3 TD's as the Herd went into Memphis and came out with a 27-16 victory as a 3 pt dog. The Tigers have dropped both gms in Huntington ('06 & '08) but actually outgained the Herd in each. Marshall is 18-5 SU and 14-6 ATS in Nov HG's and have by far the coldest CUSA venue giving them a strong advantage during the final month of the ssn.

Oregon 41 CALIFORNIA 27 - Despite a sluggish start LW vs UW, the Ducks (0 pts 1Q) scored 53 pts

Oregon 41 CALIFORNIA 27 - Despite a sluggish start LW vs UW, the Ducks (0 pts 10) scored 53 pts over the final 30's to beat a UW tm using a 1st time starter at QB (Locker out). Cal was also using a 1st time starter LW in QB Mansion and while he hit just 50% of his passes with an 0-2 ratio, RB Vereen saved the day with 112 yds and 2 TD as the Bears knocked off WSU 20-13 (-14'). LY UO held a Cal off that was avg 49 ppg to just a FG in the 42-3 win (+5'). Cal has had success vs UO in Berkeley winning 3 str by 11 ppg incl the last matchup here when they got past UO 26-16 (-2) in a torrential downpour. Four of the L/7 in this series have been decided by a TD or less while UO has failed to cover 8 of their L/10 Nov AG's. The Bears are also a different monster at home as they have outscored opp by a 47-9 avg (408-175 yd edge) vs getting outgained by 81 ypg on the road. UO continues to hold onto the #1 spot. Stanford 31 ARIZONA ST 27 - The HT is 9-1 SU (8-2 ATS) and prior to LY's 33-14 win, SU had been outscored by a 120-23 margin in the prev 3. SU cont'd its run at a possible BCS game with a 42-17 win (-8) over AZ. ASU meanwhile got a USC tm off their stinging loss to Oreg and nearly pulled out the victory as they missed a GW 41 yd FG w/1:34 left. While SU will likely bring home a win, ASU has covered 6 out of their L/7 TY and should keep this one tight as their D is all'g just 286 yds at home TY incl holding high-powered Oreg to a ssn-low 380 yds.

NAVY 45 C Michigan 21 - The only previous meeting was a 63-34 Navy (-20) win in '03 in Annapolis. Navy is 4-3 SU but just 1-6 ATS vs the MAC. CM has clinched their 1st losing ssn S/04 and are off a come from behind win over rival WM as they won 26-22 (-3) after trailing 22-13 in the 4Q and being outgained as they benefitted from 4 WM fmbl's incl 1 at the CM2 with 1:37 left. Navy clinched its Poinsettia Bowl bid with a record setting 76-35 win over EC despite having just a 596-567 yd edge as they had 6 TD drives of 51 yds or less. Navy has the off edge (#59-103) and a slight def edge (#76-81). CM is allowing 4.2 ypc rush while Navy is avg 4.8 ypc. Navy QB Dobbs is avg 119 ypg (51%) with a 7-4 ratio and is the #1 rusher with 552 (3.2). Top RB Tiech has 482 (5.5). CM QB Radcliff is avg 264 (59%) with a 14-16 ratio while RB Cotton leads with 627 (4.7).

TULANE 30 Rice 27 - These schools have avg 64 ppg in their 5 CUSA meetings. LW's loss to SM moves Tulane to 6-16 ATS in Nov the L/6Y as while they had their chances (tied 30-30 in 4Q), they all'd the final 16 pts in the home defeat. Rice entered LW's game vs Tulsa 5-0 ATS off a bye wk but after jumping out to a 7-0 lead, they were destroyed 64-27 as Tulsa put up 612 yds of off incl over 400 in the 1H. LY the Owls trailed 14-0 after 1Q but scored 21 unanswered and won 28-20 (-3) despite a 402-331 yd deficit (visitor has outgained HT each of L/3Y). The Owls have had just one threat on offense all year in RB McGuffie who leads the team in both rush and rec (178 rush LW). The Wave on the other hand has shown flashes out of QB Griffin (446 pass vs Tulsa) and RB Darkwa (331 yds L/2W) giving them enough weapons here to pull out a victory.

TEXAS 31 Öklahoma Sǐ 28 - UT has dominated this series winning 12 in a row. The last and only time UT lost to OSU in Austin was in 1944! UT was outgained LY by OSU but won the TO battle 5-1 (41-14, -9'). OSU is 6-1 SU/ATS on the road L/2Y. These trns come in on opposite ends of the spectrum as OSU KO'd South leading Baylor 55-28 (OSU led 41-7) with a 725-464 yd edge while, thanks to 5 TO's, UT lost their 3rd straight and 5th out of 6, 39-14 (trailed 39-0!). Unbelievably, UT had 23-13 FD and 412-270 yd edges as the Cats threw for just 9 yd and their longest drive of the day was 54 yd as Gilbert threw 5 int to make him the NCAA's lowest rated full-time QB. UT is #21 NCAA pass eff and held the similar off's of TT to 144 yd (ssn low) and Baylor (328-2nd lowest). OSU welcomed back the NCAA's #1 rec Blackmon (75, 17.1, 15 TD) from his susp as he had 242 off yd and 2 TD in the romp. RB Hunter (1240, 6.1) is #3 NCAA rush and QB Weeden (331, 67%, 26-9) is #2 NCAA pass. OSU is #36 pass eff D. Led by their huge D edge (#5-46), UT stops the bleeding as they are a HD for the 1st time S/99.

4* SAN FRANCISCO over St Louis - This is the 1st HG after a bye for SF S/'03 and this is the 1st of 4 AG in 5 Wks for STL. After very few snaps with the #1's prior to DEN, Smith struggled in the 1H (37 yds (57%). He finished with 196 yds (63%) with a TD and his mobility was more than enough to offset SF's OL issues (0 sk). STL beat CAR 20-10 before the bye thanks to outstanding D as they forced 4 TO's (converted into 10 pts) and held them to 201 yds off. Statistically these teams are fairly even with SF having the #22 and #15 units (-4 TO's) vs STL's #27 and #10 units (+3 TO's). SF has outgained toes by 104 ypg (#3) at home but are -6 TO's which was under Alex Smith. STL has been outgained by 68 ypg on the road (#25) but are +2 TO's. STL has surprised TY thanks to a very favorable sked (#31 before LY), the D staying healthy and the rapid growth of Bradford. After 8 int in the 1st 5, Bradford has thrown 96 pass att's without an int and owns a 5-0 ratio the L3 (all covers). Both teams will seek to protect their inexperienced QB's with the run (Gore 86 ypg 4.2 vs Jackson 85 ypg 3.9) and let their D's make the big plays. STL has had the benefit of their 1st 2 NFC West games having been at home TY. However, this is the 1st where Bradford's faced a foe with an entire bye week to prep for him and SF's receiving weapons are much better than STL's.

FORECAST: SAN FRANCISCO 21 St Louis 9 3★ CLEVELAND (+) over NY Jets 17 - Mangini vs his former team, Rex Ryan vs Rob Ryan and the return of Braylon Edwards to CLE. CLE gets a situational edge being home for the 2nd straight week after a bye while NYJ is on the road again. The Jets have the stat edge over the L4W with the #14 and #7 units (+3 TO's) vs CLE with the #27 and #17 units (+2 TO's). McCoy has earned the starting job here as he's had a full months work with the #1's and will have a healthy RB Hillis (184 yds 6.3 vs NE) here to back him up. He's been very poised and had 174 yds passing (74%) with a rushing TD vs NE. CLE has not been afraid to let him air it out as he had 5 passes of 20+ yds LW and owns a 7.8 ypa (Bradford hit 7.0 in 1 gm - SEA). Sanchez only has 1 game TY where he's completed over 58% of his passes (NE) and minus that he's only hit for 210 yds (51%) with a 7-5 ratio with a pedestrian 6.6 ypa. The Jets are +70 yds on the road TY (5th) (+0 TO's) but slow starts TY (20-10 edge in 1Q) by the offense (40 yds comb on 1st 4 drives LW) have been a problem. CLE is better than its parts and are 4-0-1 ATS TY vs teams that are a combined 25-15 TY. The Jets will be aggressive with McCoy here but with AF's who went to OT as an AF being 1-7 ATS and CLE gaining confidence we'll take the FORECAST: CLEVELAND 20 (+) NY Jets 21 underrated home team. OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Tennessee (+) over MIAMI - TEN beat MIA 27-24 LY in OT but failed to cover as a 5 pt HF. MIA rallied from a 24-6 deficit to send it to OT with a 468-364 yd edge. MIA had 4 TO's with 3 inside the TEN 35 incl 1 in OT that set up a 46 yd FG by Bironas for the win. TEN returns from its bye (6-2 ATS) having essentially swapped WR Britt (23 rec 18.9) for Moss (22 rec 14.2) to provide the deep threat to take pressure off RB Johnson (90 ypg 4.1). Unlike MIN, TEN runs a very straightforward and simplified offense and Fisher was very confident that Moss would be able to mesh into the system. They are 3-1 SU and ATS on the road TY despite being outgained by 100 ypg (28th) thanks a league best +11 TO edge. MIA has a +45 ypg edge at home (11th) but have a -4 TO mark (27th). They have only earned 6 sacks at home TY and have allowed 231 ypg (67%) with a 6-0 ratio at home vs 204 ypg (57%) and a 6-5 ratio on the road. TEN is expected to go back to Young (#1103.1 QBR) who renipirred his ankle vs SD which means Moss won't have massive yards here. We respect MIA's toughness as a team but TEN is just as tough, brings a good pass rush (#8 26 sk 6 players with 2+) and NDIV teams that all 30+ before the bye are 15-5-1 ATS.

2★ Minnesota over CHICAGO - The HT has won and covered 4 straight with a 39-24 avg score. Counting playoffs MIN has not won a road game since Wk 8 LY (1-6-1 ATS). They have only outgained their foes by 7 ypg and are -14 on TO's with a 28-19 avg score. While Favre has had his issues in this span the real culprit has been MIN's D. MIN has given up 243 ypg (60%) passing on the road with a 17-3 ratio, while only tallying 8 sks with six 100+ QBR games given up. MIN dominated statistically LW (507-225) but allowed a 96 yd KR & 30 yd FR TD and needed to come back from a 24-10 4Q deficit to win in OT. It may have been a season changing win as HC Childress may not have survived this game with a loss. Chicago went into their bye off a pair of 3 pt home losses (5' and 3pt fav's) and trailed in the 4Q LW against BUF (in Toronto). The D came up big with an int that led to a 23/6 pl TD. The Bears woes continue to be on the offensive side as since the opener (L7 gms) the Bears offense is avg 265 ypg and 15 FD's. Big edge to a rediscovered MIN pass rush (0 sks in 3 gms before 6 LW) against a CHI OL that has allowed 24 sks the L5 gms. Added value for MIN as while they lost road games to 3 excellent teams (NYJ, GB and NE) but they've outgained all 3. We'll back the better team looking up in the standings.

Baltimore at ATLANTA - Thurs - The NFL kicks off its early week schedule here with a pair of playoff contenders. BAL dominated MIA more than the 26-10 score shows as they never punted, picked Henne off 3 times and had a 2-1 rush edge. ATL is now 17-1 SU (12-5-1 ATS) at home with Ryan at the helm. While ATL had a 365-278 yd edge they struggled to put TB away due to an 89 yd KR. The Bucs had 3rd and 3 at the ATL 4 at the end but the Falcons stopped them to hold on for the win. Both teams are strong playoff contenders and it's too bad most of the nation doesn't get the NFL Network.

INDIANAPOLIS 27 Cincinnati 17 - CIN is off LW's MNF home game vs PIT and its not known if they snapped their 4 game SU/ATS losing streak. IND has excelled with Manning vs CIN with a 5-0 SU and 4-1 ATS record including a 35-3 victory as a 13.5 pt HF in 2008. In his L4 games vs CIN he's avg'd 287 ypg (70%) with a 12-2 ratio. IND has covered all 3 games at home TY by an avg of 10 ppg with a 372-270 ypg mark (+4 TO's). CIN has won the yardage battle in all 4 road games TY (+57 ypg which is 6th) they have only covered vs CAR. CIN was down 31-3 after a 97 yd KR in the 2H of the NE game, blew a 23-10 3Q lead to CLE, rallied from 24-3 down vs ATL but gave up 15 pts in the 4Q for the loss. Aside from Palmer's inability to string 2 good games together (every 90+ QBR followed by a 63 or lower QBR effort), CIN's glaring lack of a pass rush (just 6 sk 1 every 40 pass att's) is their biggest weakness. Despite only having his entire receiving unit for the season opener, Manning has dismantled teams avg 310 ypg (65%) with a 16-4 ratio. Injuries caught up to IND LW as after putting WR Gonzalez (knee) on IR, Collie (conc) was carted off the field and he will miss here. IND's #29 rush defense (141 ypg 5.1) is nothing new but despite their defensive struggles they are giving up a respectable 9-6 ratio with a 6.6 ypa. IND is only 3-9 ATS off a loss of 3 or less as their line tends to get inflated and without knowing the state of the Bengals after MNF we'll call for the home team by 10 here.

Houston 27 JACKSONVILLE 24 - This is the latest these teams have squared off in a season. JAX swept the series LY SU and ATS. Garrard has put up some impressive stats vs HOU avg 239 ypg (65%) with a 6-1 ratio for a 4-1 SU and 3-2 ATS mark (sat out '07 finale). Both have horrendous pass D's (HOU #32 JAX #28)

MISSOURI 30 Kansas St 17 - K-St is 8-3 as an AD vs ranked opps. LY MO was up just 17-12 late 3Q before scoring 21 unanswered to close out K-St. MO has won 4 str in this series with an avg score of 42-22 but they are only +90 ypg. K-St is bowl elig after their huge win over the bumbling Horns. The Cats capitalized on 5 int and stopped a fake P and fake FG in the 1H to take a 39-0 lead going into the 4Q despite being outgained 412-270 and outFD'd 23-13. QB Klein att just 4 passes (2 comp for 9!) but had 127 rush yd in his 1st start as his speed complimented RB Thomas (1102, 5.2). K-St is last in B12 in rush D (219, 5.6) but #14 pass eff D. After a 7-0 start the Tigers lost their 2nd straight at TT 24-17 despite jumping out to 14-0 and 17-3 leads. MO was held to just 46 2H yds as Gabbert hit just 12-30 for 95 yd and wasn't helped by rec's who dropped 2 potential TD passes. The Tigers allow 148 rush ypg (4.1). MO continues their series streak.

OHIO ST 34 Penn St 13 - PSU has scored no more than 20 in a gm vs OSU the L/8Y (12 ppg). The visitor is 3-9 ATS winning the L/3 SU. PSU is 2-16 SU on the road vs ranked tms. OSU has

combining for a 37-13 ratio (Manning had a 34-19 ratio LY, Brees 34-12) and 10 games with an opposing QBR of 100+. Do have to appreciate the energy that Fitzpatrick has brought to the Bills offense putting up 391 ypg the L3 (2-0-1 ATS) and remember this team led at Baltimore 34-24, lost at KC in OT and led with under 7:00 to go LW. Detroit has also impressed covering 5 straight but they've also lost 5 straight ATS on the road when the line in under a TD. If the Lions are an AF that adds another dynamic as they've been in that role only once in 5 seasons (lost 34-21, -3).

We'll side with the road team by a FG here in a lower scoring game (DIV HF's of 3 or less off a bye are 2-22 O/U). Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base you final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the number in the () indicates how many angles apply to that team. The higher the number the stronger the angle play.

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicappin or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts to roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc... takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
