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NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK 7, 2010

NEWS AND NOTES: Troy took command of the SBC with their dominating 42-13 win on the road at Middle Tennessee. Much was expected from MTSt this year after LY's 10-3 record incl a bowl win over SM but QB Dasher missed the first 4 (susp). While he returned to the lineup, he injured his finger on the 2nd series of the game and looked tentative running the football with just 27 yards rushing on 14 carries. MTSt had just 207 yards while Troy's offense dominated with 238 yards rushing and 281 passing...Husker QB Taylor Martinez sparkled in front of a national audience on the Thursday Night game. While Nebraska only had a 21-20 FD edge, they had a 587-315 yd edge as big plays were the key. Martinez set an NU record for rushing yards by a QB with 242 and he accounted for 4 TD's. A couple of key plays helped the rout. Leading 7-3 NU was sk'd on 3&6 for a 7 yd loss. Offsides gave them a 3&1 and 4pl later Martinez got a 35 yd TD run. NU took over with 2:07 left in the half and were pinned at their own 17. Martinez raced 54 yds which set up a 39 yd FG with just :14 left 1H. Martinez got a 41 yd TD run for the 45-6 lead and that would be his last play of the game...Oregon St QB Ryan Katz has taken on a hellacious slate of D's. Heading into last weekend, the top 3 D's statistically in the NCAA were TCU, Boise St and Arizona and Katz will have taken on all 3 in his first 5 games... Rutgers had 19-11 FD and 453-284 yd edges vs Connecticut...Oklahoma St trailed Louisiana 21-17 at the half and had a couple of big plays at the end of the game to cover. They did score TD's on their first 3 drives of the 3Q but only led 41-28 when UL was SOD at the OSU40 with 12:33 left. OSU got 52 and 47 yd FG's. They recovered a fumble at the UL15 and got a TD 3pl later to get ahead of the spread, 54-28...Northern Illinois had 209 yds rushing and 211 yds passing vs 272 total yards for Temple. Temple missed a 42 yd FG in the 3Q and NI went 75/10pl for a TD and the lead, 24-17. Mid-4Q NI went 90/11pl for a TD, 31-17. TU was SOD at the NI7 (1:38) and SOD at the NI16 with 1:00 left...The surprising number for the Minnesota/Wisconsin game was the halftime stats as UM had a 163-157 yd edge and trailed only 14-9. UW scored TD's on their first four 2H poss, the last put them ahead ATS 41-16. They surprisingly went for 2 after their last TD and it failed. UM got a 33 yd screen pass to the 29 and then on 4&11 a 29 yd TD pass with 5:01 left gave them the backdoor cover... Georgia was probably the best 1-4 team in the country as they were without AJ Green for 3 losses and had some tough close defeats. UGA took it out on Tennessee. The Bulldogs led 27-7 at the half. UGA scored on their first 2 poss of the 3Q to lead 41-14 with 3:12 left and UT had 1 more drive with backup QB Bray guiding them 77/12pl but they were SOD on 4&gl at the 3...USF had won 5 straight vs Syracuse winning by a combined 174-53. USF got a 94 yd KR TD to lead 9-6 but missed the xp. USF's last gasp ended on a 4&5 at their own 40 with 1:30 left...Indiana came in avg 455 ypg on offense but was held to just 210 with most of it late. Pryor had a career best 334 yds passing and 3 TD's but after the week prior's quad injury, never left the pocket being sk'd 3x for -19 rush yds. OSU led 31-0 at the half with a 320-68 yd edge and Pryor left for good with 11:05 left 3Q...Western Michigan jumped out to a quick 14-0 lead as Ball St fumbled the opening KO at their 23, then gave up a 24 yd IR TD in the first 1:00. Both offenses did move the ball with WM finishing with a 480-348 yd edge in their 45-16 win...Illinois played one of their best games yet under Ron Zook. They went into Penn St and while they trailed 3-0 early, they pretty much dominated the game with 23-7 FD and 437-235 yd edges. UI even fumbled 2 punts deep in its own territory but PSU had to settle for FG's on each...Tyrod Taylor broke Bryan Randall's VT record with his 27th win as a starting QB. Central Michigan actually opened the game with an 80/13pl drive for a TD but Virg Tech stormed back to 38-7 and 45-14 leads. The stats show CM having 21-17 FD and 401-394 yd edges...Tom O'Brien got his first win vs his former team, Boston College, and did so in convincing fashion with a 44-17 win. NCSt had 26-12 FD and 422-272 yd edges...Charlie Strong was an SEC DC and brought some defense to Louisville as they pulled the shutout, the Cardinals first in 4 years. Memphis' closest scoring opp came in the 2Q when they went 55/7pl but missed a 42 yd FG on 4&8. UL led 35-0 at half and scored on their opening 2 drives of the 3Q for a 49-0 lead en route to their 56-0 win. UL had a 574-223 yd edge...Texas Tech has now beaten Baylor 15 consecutive years and had 35-22 FD and 635-507 yd edges...TCU got their 2nd straight shutout for the first time since 1955. Wyoming was playing without QB Austyn Carta-Samuels and Dax Crum hit just 10-17-116. TCU led 31-0 at the half with a 334-106 yd edge and scored TD's on their first two 3Q poss to lead 45-0 and punted for the first time with 10:25 left in the game...West

Virginia had their most points since scoring 66 vs Connecticut in 2007. It was a rare trip east for UNLV, who was off rival Nevada, but WV didn't commit a TO for the first time in 8 games. Despite the fact WV only had a 16-15 FD edge, they scored TD's on their first 2 poss and another on their 3rd on a 30 yd drive after a fumble to lead 21-0 and it was 35-0 at the half with a 314-148 yd edge...Cal dominated UCLA, in fact in the 1H they led 28-0 and had a 246-58 yd edge. Cal had

a 22-12 FD edge for the game...Georgia Tech had 477 yards rushing, the 5th best total in school history. GT trailed 7-6 late 2Q when they got a TD to take a 13-7 lead but GT did have a 295-106 yd edge. GT fumbled to open the 3Q and the next 3 poss were TD's and GT led 27-14. UVA was SOD at the GT3 and GT went 97/11pl for a TD with 4:49 left. UVA trailing 33-14 started at their 2 with 2:23 left and went 98/9pl for a TD...Louisiana Tech has been playing musical QB's but may have finally found one and amazingly it was the same QB who had been their starter last year in Ross Jenkins. Once Jenkins took over last week vs Hawaii, the offense responded with nothing but long drives. Against Utah St, LT had 212-105 yd edge at the half and led 17-3 and ended the game with 27-13 FD and 427-195 yd edges...Arkansas did have a 442-324 yd edge and never trailed vs A&M...Still playing without a host of susp'd players, NC's converted on 4&2 for a FD to the CU21 on their 1st drive and went 48/12pl for a TD and had a 7-0 lead with 6:45 left and never trailed...Miami, FI took its opening drive 11pl but missed a 32 yd FG. FSU led 24-7 at half but UM had a 208-193 yd edge. UM in fact finished with a 27-19 FD edge in the game. FSU finished with the yardage edge when they got an int with 5:59 left and Thompson got a 90 yd TD run with 4:24 left, a big part of their 298 yards rushing...Tulsa had a 45 yd FG blk'd in the 1Q and in the 2Q, on 4&1 from the SMU22 were SOD. TU settled for a 30 yd FG in the 3Q and then had a 48 yd FG blk'd again, this time with 12:19 left. TU got a TD with 6:45 left to make it 21-18 and SMU took over at their own 9 and went on a 12pl drive incl 4 FD's to the TU40 and ran out the clock...Missouri's 26-0 win over Colorado was not as impressive as the score with CU being stopped 3x inside the MU22 and missing 2 FG's. MU had just a 345-311 yd edge and each team had 18 FD's...There was nothing fluky about SC's upset of #1 Alabama as SC scored TD's on their first 3 poss to lead 21-3 and Bama got a TD with :38 left in the half to pull within 21-9. The momentum appeared to shift a couple of times as Bama pulled within 21-14 but SC converted on 3&10 and went 82/15pl for a TD to lead 28-14. Four plays later Bama got a 51 yd TD then 3pl later they int'd a pass which bounced out of the rec's hands. They appeared poised to tie the game but they settled for a FG and faked it and it fell incomplete. SC then went 74/10pl, with the key a gutsy 4&1 conversion at their own 34 yd line. The TD made it 35-21 and Bama didn't threaten after that. Stephen Garcia played the game of his career hitting 17-20-201 yds with the only int coming on a bobbed pass...Three years ago Mike Hart made his infamous "Little Brother" comment about Michigan St and Michigan is 0-3 vs the Spartans since. MSU got their most lopsided win in the series since beating the Wolves 34-0 in 1967 and Denard Robinson who was the current flavor-of-the-month for the Heisman Trophy, had an off game with 3 crucial int include 2 inside the 5 (1 in EZ) which changed the momentum of the game...It had to be a frustrating loss for Southern Miss HC Fedora. SM led 20-0 and were in complete control. EC did not get a FD until the first play of the 2Q and after converting on 3&7, got a 46 yd TD on the next play. SM punted for the first time with 11:33 left in the 2Q. EC went 32 yds for a TD with 4:36 left to give them the lead, 44-43. SM got to midfield but on 4&10 Davis was sk'd for a 13 yd loss...At one point Dayne Crist had 12 straight completions for Notre Dame. Pitt did miss a 27 yd FG early 2Q and then their holder dropped the snap on a 36 yd FG at the end of the half and ND led 17-3 at the half. Pitt took some chances in the 2H. Trailing 20-3, they went for it on 4&1 at their own 32 and Lewis got a 30 yd run to the ND38 keying a 77/10pl TD drive. Pitt was SOD at its own 13 with 1:11 left and ND took a knee 2x...Toledo had their moments vs Boise St as they only trailed 15-7 in the 1Q and also fumbled at their own 45 setting up a TD and were int'd at the BSU16 in the 2Q. BSU got a TD with :30 left 1H to lead 36-7 then got a 36 yd IR TD to go up 43-7. Up 50-7, they recovered a fumble and drove 27/7pl for a TD to lead 57-7 with 2:03 left 3Q. UT went 71/11pl for a TD with 10:55 left but BSU ate up 10:31 on a 14pl drive before being SOD at the UT26...Wake Forest had a solid advantage vs Navy in the fact they had just faced GT's option offense the previous week and were catching Navy at the tail end of a 6,000 mile 3 game road trip. Tanner Price returned to the lineup and hit 37-53-326 yds for WF. With the game tied at 7, WF fumbled at the Navy4. Later WF fumbled at the Navy49 but still led 17-14 at the half. Leading 24-21 WF settled for a 31 yd FG with 8:34 left, 27-21. Navy got a TD with :26 left to lead 28-27. WF ret'd the KO 47 yds to the 49 needing only a FG for the win but their final 3 passes were incomplete...One of the reasons we liked Miss St over Houston beside the talent difference, was that MSU's large O-line figured to overpower UH's smaller defensive front. MSU rushed for 409 yards on 57 carries and had 538 yds offense. MSU led 33-10 at the half and opened the 3Q with a drive for a TD. Starting QB Relf was shaken up and Russell QB'd the rest. MSU led 40-10 when they had a 31 yd FG blk'd with 8:15 left 3Q at the end of a 10 pl drive. Their next drive was 61/9pl but they settled for a 39 yd FG which was blk'd. They scored a TD with 7:08 left, 47-17 and UH got a garbage TD with 4:36 left. MSU ended at the game at the UH15 for a comfortable 23 point win.

BACKDOOR COVERS - Air Force led Colorado St 28-7 at the half and extended it to 49-13 after 3Q's. CSU got a TD with 11:14 left and then took over with 6:55 left and drove 92/16pl. A TD with :41 left gave them the backdoor cover. CSU outrushed AF thanks to those last 2 drives 285-248. AF did abandon the run in the 2H going to more of a pass attack and threw for 185 yards.

4★ Arizona over WASH ST - AZ is off its 1st loss of the ssn LW vs OSU, a defeat that knocked them out of the Top 10. Like the rest of the P10 when it comes to playing against WSU, AZ has owned the series winning the L/4 by 25 ppg incl LY when the Cats scored on their first 7 poss in their 48-7 romp (WSU has been outgained by a comb 1002-393 in the L/2). WSU did show some fight for a 2nd consec wk vs UO but still came up 20 pts short in the home defeat. While the dog has gone 7-3 ATS in this series, WSU is just 8-13 ATS vs the P10 under Wulff losing by a 45-11 avg making this another potential long day in Pullman. A quick strike offense, a hungry defense, a team that was ranked in the Top 10 off a rare home sellout loss has all the makings for a blowout.

FORECAST: Arizona 51 WASH ST 16

3★ TULSA over Tulane - History hasn't been good for the Green Wave in CUSA play vs Tulsa as they are 0-5 SU/ATS losing by an avg score of 43-12. A wk after their big win vs Rut, Tulane took a step back vs Army in the 18 pt defeat. Despite the 3 pt loss LW to SMU, Tulsa delivered a 3★ LPS Winner (+6) but could have easily won outright having 2 FG's blk'd. LY Tulane trailed 17-0 in the first 9:00 and never got closer than 14 pts in the 37-13 loss. The last time here Tulsa was -28' and we used them as a 3★ LPS and they rolled to a 56-7 win. Tulane has been fortunate enough to face bkup QB's in 2 of the L/3 wks and should have difficulty against Hurricane starter Kinne (298 tll ypg, 60%, 13-6 ratio) here as Tulsa is expected to roll (3-1 ATS run as fav of 20+ pts). Very similar to our 4★ release as we have a quality program with an improving defense off a loss against a struggling offensive team.

FORECAST: TULSA 48 Tulane 13

3★ California over USC - Cal returned to its winning ways LW vs UCLA delivering a 4★ LPS Winner as the Bears held a UCLA run game that was avg 321 ypg rush (5.9) to a meager 26 yds (1.0) on the ground. The Trojans fell victim to a game-winning FG on the last play for a 2nd consec wk in the loss to Stanford even though they had the yardage (499-484) and TO (3-1) edge. USC's defense has dominated the Golden Bears the L/2Y by a combined 47-6 score (outgaining Cal by a 434-220 avg) incl last time here when the game was tied 3-3 early in the 2Q with Cal being shutout the rest of the way and being held to 87 tll yds. The visitor is on an 11-3 ATS run and HC Kiffin may a difficult time keeping his units focused as his "Us Against the World" mantra is harder to preach after an upset loss to UW and an emotionally draining loss to Stanford.

FORECAST: California 31 USC 24

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Houston over RICE - At just 6 miles apart, Houston and Rice have the closest campuses of any FBS schools. UH was pounded at home LW vs Miss St 47-24 as the Bulldogs delivered our 5★ Oct GOM Winner (538-403 yd edge). The Owls also come into this one off a beatdown as UTEP put up 463 yds in their 44-24 defeat. The HT is 8-3 ATS in this series and that has definitely been the story over the L/2Y as UH needed a win to wrap up the CUSA Title and led 59-0 at the half playing their bkups the entire 2H LY which was a yr after their disappointing performance at Rice, a game in which they were upset 56-42 (-3) costing them a bid to the CUSA Champ game (did trail 56-28). UH is 1-9 ATS as an AF incl a dismal performance at UCLA earlier TY. While it is well known that Houston is with a 3rd string QB and we used that to our advantage LW, they are also well coached team that has quality players that will fill in to this "system's" role.

FORECAST: Houston 47 RICE 30

2★ GEORGIA over Vanderbilt - GA is 8-1 SU (lost in '06) and 5-4 ATS but the visitor is 14-4 ATS and prior to LY the previous 3 were decided by 5 ppg. UGA (-7) outgained Vandy 399-296 in a 34-10 win LY. Both are off huge much-needed wins with GA QB Murray avg 228 ypg (62%) with a 10-3 ratio. The GA running game is struggling avg only 137 ypg (4.0). VU crushed EM LW and QB Smith is avg 159 ypg (56%) with a 5-3 ratio. RB's Norman (327, 6.2) and Stacy (241, 6.9) split carries. Vandy is 9-2-1 as an AD. GA meanwhile is 4-9 ATS as a HF though 2-1 TY with covers by 19 (opener vs UL) and 16 pts (Tenn) LW. GA has large edges on off (#22-86), def (#21-60) and ST (#2-57). UGA ended its 4 gm losing streak LW and with the return of WR Green (108 ypg, 16.5), UGA may be a play-on tm the rest of the yr.

FORECAST: GEORGIA 41 Vanderbilt 17

2★ Mississippi (+) over ALABAMA - The SU winner is 20-6 ATS in this series and UM has covered 5 of the L/7. LY, AL picked off UM 4x and Bama RB Ingram rushed for 172 yds and the game's only TD while PK Tiffin hit 5 FG's (single gm record) in Bama's 22-3 win in Oxford. Ole Miss is fresh off a bye (5-0 ATS) while Bama plays for its 7th str week and is off their 1st reg ssn loss S/'07, 35-21 to SC. Ingram (396, 7.1) and Richardson (442, 7.0) were held to 64 yds combined LW and QB McElroy (216 ypg, 72%, 9-3) lost this first gm as a starter since grade school (35-1). UM QB Masoli (165 ypg, 61%, 6-5, 262 rush, 5.2) upset 2 Top 6 tms at Oregon. RB Bolden has 518 (6.8) but UA's #3 D is only allowing 102 rush ypg (3.3). Nutt is 6-0 ATS as a true AD and 7-0 ATS vs Top 10 tms covering by 18.8 ppg and has upset #2, #1 (twice), #4 and #18 tms outright in that span. UM is 10-1 as an SEC AD while Saban is 1-6 ATS off a SU loss at Bama. While others may want to play Bama off the loss, very few programs have had a 4 week schedule the Tide has faced.

FORECAST: Mississippi (+) 17 ALABAMA 31

THURSDAY, October 14th

Kansas St at KANSAS - Kan is 7-3 ATS off a bye but just 1-12 SU/ATS vs K-St HC Snyder. LY K-St RB Thomas ran for a then-career high 185 yds (7.7) in K-St's 17-10 home win (+2). The visitor is 1-6 ATS getting upset 3x's the L/6Y. KU has an all Fr backfield in rFr QB Webb (184 ypg, 61%, 6-3 ratio in 4 sts) and true RB Sims (329, 4.9). The Hawks allow 188 rush ypg (4.7). The Cats play their 2nd straight Thursday night after LW's 48-13 home loss to speedy Neb in which Huskers QB Martinez accounted for 369 tll yd and 5 TD and the B12's #2 rusher Thomas (691, 5.4) was held to a ssn low 63 (2.9). Snyder said the QB competition will be open in practice with Coffman being benched and Klein and Lamur seeing action vs the Huskers. K-St is allowing a shocking 247 rush ypg (5.8).

Usf at W VIRGINIA - WV is 11-3 SU but 2-11-1 ATS in BE HG's. USF has covered the L/4Y vs WV with 3 outright upsets vs ranked WV squads holding WV well below their ssn avg each time as USF's speed on defense has neutralized WV's big play ability. USF is traveling on a short week off a 13-9 upset loss to Syr (outgained 307-219). USF QB Daniels is only avg 137 ypg (53%, 4-7, 186 rush, 3.6). USF's #43 D is allowing 146 rush ypg (3.9) but 215 rush ypg (5.4) vs their 2 BCS opp and WV avg 163 ypg (4.2) behind Devine (475, 5.3). QB Smith is avg 228 ypg (66%) with a 12-2 ratio. These schools have avg just 37 ppg in the 5 gm history with 4 unders.

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FRIDAY, October 15th

Cincinnati at LOUISVILLE - Battle for the Keg of Nails and these schools are only 106 miles apart. The visitor is 7-2 ATS incl 4 in a row and the favorite is 10-3 ATS. LY UC QB Collaros made his 1st career start vs UL hitting 15-17 (88%) for 253 with a 3-0 ratio and 52 rush (4.7) in a 41-10 win. Cincy snapped a 5 gm losing streak to UL in their last trip here (28-20, -4). UL is off its 1st shutout in 4Y (56-0 over Mem with 574-223 yd edge). UL QB Froman is avg 235 ypg (60%) with a 9-4 ratio and their top rusher is Powell (689, 7.6). UC is off a 45-3 win over rival Miami, Oh. Collaros is avg 236 ypg (63%) with a 12-1 ratio and RB Pead has 402 (9.8). UL has dropped 4 straight as a BE HD, but both tms have shown improvement the L/3 wks under their new HC's. **Don't forget to get the Friday Night Marquee Winner!**

SATURDAY, October 16th

Miami, FI 45 DUKE 24 - In the L/4 meetings, Duke has built a lead and UM has battled back for the win. LY UM QB Harris played with his thumb and index finger on his throwing hand heavily wrapped. Duke is 5-14-1 ATS (2-18 SU) hosting ACC foes. The Devils are off a bye after a 21-16 loss at MD 2W ago. UM is in a Fla St/NC sandwich and is 7-10 as an AF (2-0 TY). Rumors of an inj to QB Harris were swirling all wk, but UM stayed tight-lipped. It was clear in LW's 45-17 loss to FSU that he was struggling. He hit just 19-47 (40%) with an 0-1 ratio (9 int in L/4). RB Berry did go over 100 yds for the 2nd consec gm but a missed 32 yd FG on the 1st series set the tone for the day although UM was only outgained 471-424 and had a 27-19 FD edge. UM is 6-1 SU but 3-4 ATS all-time vs Duke (UM avg win by 19 ppg). Not a great spot for UM but its large talent edge should prove too much here.

Pittsburgh 23 SYRACUSE 16 - Pitt has won 5 str by 13 ppg and has outgained SU in 7 of 8 (+141 ypg). LY Pitt trailed 3-0 after allowing 71 yds on SU's opening drive but scored the next 37 all'g just 214 yds on the last 61 plays (3.5). Last time here SU had a 14-3 and a 24-16 leads but lost by 10. SU is 5-11 ATS as a HD and Pitt is 7-3 ATS as an AF. Syr is off a 13-9 upset of USF (307-219 yd edge) and has started out 4-1 for the 1st time since '99. SU QB Nassib is avg 198 (58%) with a 10-2 ratio and RB Carter has 524 (5.3). Pitt is off a 23-17 loss at ND and QB Sunseri is avg 192 ypg (65%) with a 5-3 ratio. The ground gm has stalled behind a struggling OL and AA Lewis only has 206 (3.4) while Graham leads with 536 (8.9). Syr is holding an "Orange Out" but Pitt has edges on off (#55-76), def (#25-38) and ST (#13-35) with 2-3 Pitt facing a much tougher schedule than 4-1 Syr (#23-117).

† Rutgers 23 Army 16 - New Meadowlands Stadium, home to the NY Jets and Giants. Army led 3-0 early LY but 3 TO's and an RU blk'd punt TD led to a 27-10 RU win. Rutgers is 7-0 ATS vs Army and has won 6 str by an avg of 34-9. Rutgers is in a BE sandwich off an upset of Conn 27-24 with a 453-284 yd edge. Backup true Fr QB Dodd, in for inj starter Savage (99.8 ypg), threw for 322 (62%) with a 2-0 ratio and may make his 2nd start here. The week prior RU lost to Tulane 17-14 despite a 353-245 yd edge. Army beat Tulane 41-23 as a 1 pt AD with a 343-298 yd edge and has won 3 road gms for the first time S/'67 and has covered 4 straight as an AD. Rutgers has the def edge (#39-66) and is holding opp to just 90 ypg rush (3.1) while Army is avg 274 ypg rush (4.6) led by FB Hassin with 393 (4.9) and QB Steelman with 355 (3.8).

C MICHIGAN 24 Miami, Oh 17 - Miami leads the series 11-10-1 SU (5-5 ATS) but the Hawks have failed to cover L/3. CM has won the L/2 SU/ATS ('05 and '07) but prior to '05 the Chips were 1-5-1 SU, 2-5 ATS in the series. These two last met in the '07 MAC Champ gm where MU only trailed 7-3 mid-3Q before falling 35-10 (+3). MU is coming off a 45-3 loss at Cincy LW where the Hawks were outgained 609-269 incl 384-42 on the ground. QB Dysert is avg 204 ypg (66%) with a 5-6 ratio and his top target is WR Robinson who is #7 in the NCAA in rec per gm (7.8) and has 47 rec (10.6). CM is 13-3 SU, 12-4 ATS in MAC HG's. QB Radcliff hit 21-48-266 with 3 TD LW at VT and is avg 284 ypg (58%) with a 10-8 ratio while RB Cotton has 491 yds (5.4). The Hawks are 7-3 SU/ATS in MAC road openers and have won B2B trips in Mt Pleasant ('99 and '95) but it will be tough to make it 3 in a row here.

CLEMSON 31 Maryland 21 - LY MD was held to one FD and trailed 10-0 after the 1Q before their comeback and the visitor is 4-1 SU with 4 outright upsets. CU is 10-19-1 as an ACC HF but MD is 4-8-1 ATS (2-11 SU) on the road vs the ACC. MD was +11 their last trip here and a PPH Big Dog POW and won outright 20-17. The Terps are off a bye after a 21-16 win over Duke 2W ago. CU, in a UNC/GT sandwich, is off a 21-16 loss to UNC which had HC Swinney apologizing after the gm, saying he was "extremely embarrassed." CU had its lowest off output of the season but actually outgained UNC 305-255. Swinney will make sure his team remembers LY and his apology should motivate the Tigers.

MICHIGAN ST 28 Illinois 20 - Both started bkup QB's LY as ILS mcoGee was benched after throwing a pick six as MSU (-4) won 24-14. IL is 3-11 SU/ATS S/'90 but upset MSU as 26 pt AD's in '06 (last visit). MSU is 4-9 ATS as a B10 HF and 3-6 ATS after Mich. IL is 9-1 ATS as an AD incl LW's upset for their 1st ever win at PSU. The Illini dominated a Lions D (minus 11 regulars by CU's end due to inj/sup) rolling up 23-7 FD and 282-65 rush yd edges. QB Scheelhaese (128, 59%, 4-4 ratio, 277 rush) is last in B10 in passing but won his 1st true road start thanks to the B10's #2 rusher Leshoure (597, 5.7). Illini are #20 NCAA tll D allowing 117 rush ypg (3.7). MSU beat Mich for the 3rd straight yr for the 1st time S/'65-67 by dominating the 2H with a 276-115 yd edge. MSU held the NCAA's #1 rusher QB Robinson to 301 tll yd and forced 3 int with 1 in the EZ and another at the MSU5. QB Cousins (236, 68%, 10-4 ratio) is #9 NCAA pass eff backed by the dangerous RB duo of Baker (683, 7.0) and Bell (549, 7.7). MSU is allowing 111 rush ypg (3.5). Both played their 'A' gms LW.

PURDUE 24 Minnesota 23 - Misleading final LY as UM was outgained by 121 yd (-9 FD) but forced 3 TO, converting 2 into short TD drives and also had a blk'd FG TD. The L/3 has been decided by 11+ with the favorite 10-1 ATS. PU is 8-3 SU/ATS S/'97 vs Minn but is 0-2 SU/ATS the L/2Y and hasn't dropped 3 straight S/'89-91. The beaten up Boilers upset NW 20-17 despite being outFD'd (23-13) and outgained (389-279) thanks to ST as the Cats fmbld a P which set up a PU FG, the Boilers blk'd a NW FG and the Cats missed a 45 yd'r with :58 left. QB Henry (#3 QB in spring) hit just 6-18 for 47 yd with 1 int but ran for 132 yd winning his 1st start. Despite having the NCAA's tll leader in DE Kerrigan the Boilers are just #110 pass eff D (222, 70%, 5-2 ratio). UM lost its 7th straight to rival Wisky as the Badgers bullied their way to 30-16 FD and 250-96 rush yd edges. UM QB Weber avg 241 (60%) with a 12-4 ratio but #1 TB Bennett has just 140 (3.0) in the L/4 while batting an ankle inj. Gophers are last in B10 (#100 NCAA) allowing 196 rush ypg (5.7). The loser of this gm may end up in the B10's basement.

NC State 47 E CAROLINA 30 - There have been 3 straight outright upsets in this series while this is arguably a flat spot for NCSt as they are off of their overwhelming 44-17 victory over BC (26-12 FD and 422-272 yd edges) and have FSU and Clem on deck after next wk's bye (6-1 ATS prior to bye). Falling behind 20-0 in the 1Q and committing 4 TO's usually spells doom for a road tm but EC shook off the early rust to pull out the 1 pt win over SM. Last meeting ('08) EC came in ranked #15 but was upset in OT (-7). Both tms have matched up with VT already TY and while both actually led the Hokies at HT, neither was able to pull out the win. While EC is 11-3-1 ATS as a HD and the Wolfpack are just 2-7 ATS as an AF, both of NCSt's wins in that span have come TY so expect the Pack to get up early (outscored opp by a 133-45 margin in the 1H TY) and control the remainder of the gm.

South Carolina 37 KENTUCKY 33 - The visitor is 13-5 ATS in this series and SC has won 10 in a row SU. Spurrier is 17-0 SU vs the Cats (6-1 ATS run). LY UK QB Hartline led the tm to a 17-14 halftime lead but suffered a knee inj early 3Q and SC went on to a 28-26 win. SC is off probably the biggest win in school history over #1 AL, 35-21. SC's #14 D sk'd AL QB McElroy 7x LW (19 ssn) and held RB's Ingram and Richardson to 64 rush yds combined. QB Garcia is only avg 189 ypg (72%, 8-3), but RB Lattimore (459, 91.8) has eased some of Garcia's pressure. UK came close to upsetting Aub (lost 37-34 as Aub hit FG with :02 left, UK outgained 511-336). QB Hartline is avg 240 ypg (67%, 9-3) and RB Locke has 574 (5.3). WR Cobb (168 rush, 403 rec, 12.6) accounted for 4 TD LW. SC might still be celebrating while UK is desperate for a win off 3 str SEC losses, but UK's #63 D is allowing 190 ypg rush (4.8) which means Lattimore and Co should have a productive day.

FLORIDA 24 Mississippi St 14 - HC Meyer faces former OC Dan Mullen. MSU is 3-4 SU vs UF but 6-1 ATS. MSU has been outscored 87-9 the L/2 trips to the Swamp. LY, it was 13-13 with 9:32 left 3Q but UF scored 18 unanswered pts in a 29-19 (-21) win. LY Mullen criticized officials when replays showed MSU WR McRae might have stripped the ball from a LB short of the GL on a 23 yd IR TD by UF. It was UF's 1st win in Starkville since 1985. LW we used MSU (-5) as our Oct 5★ GOM and they rolled to a 47-24 win over Hou with a ssn-high 409 rush. QB Relf is avg 113 ypg (59%, 5-3) with 295 rush (4.5) and is backed by Russell (111, 60%, 5-5). RB Ballard has 418 rush (7.2) and MSU is avg 212 rush ypg (5.1). UF has lost B2B gms for just 2nd time under Meyer and both were vs SEC West tms (12-11 SU, 9-13-1 ATS vs West S/04). UF was outgained 385-243 (outFD'd 20-12) and struggled without RB Demps (414, 6.5, foot inj, CS). UF QB Brantley is banged up and is avg just 176 ypg (62%) with a 6-4 ratio. MSU has pulled 8 outright upsets as an SEC dog the L/3Y but UF is desperate for a win

OKLAHOMA 49 Iowa St 13 - ISU has 1 win over the Sooners S/61 (33-31 in '90 in Norman vs #16 OU squad as 23 pt AD). ISU is 0-6 SU, 2-4 ATS with the avg score 34-8 vs OU in B12 matchups. The last game in '07 was close as ISU led 7-0 at HT but lost 17-7 but covered as 30 pt HD. ISU is 9-4 ATS as a DD B12 AD (3-0 LY). The Sooners are 12-6 ATS vs the B12 North. OU is 13-1 SU and 9-5 ATS the game after Texas and is off a bye. QB Jones (291, 64%, 11-3 ratio) has the NCAA's #2 rec to throw in Broyles (46, 11.3). RB Murray has 551 (4.2) and OU used the bye to get more consistency on both sides as the D is #93 NCAA (412 ypg). ISU led Utah 14-10 before the Utes exploded for 280 2Q yds and 31 unanswered pts to take a 41-14 HT lead. Utah finished with a 593-348 yd edge scoring the most pts ever by a visiting ISU opp (68). B12's lowest rated passer QB Arnaud's struggles continue (160, 57%, 8-7). ISU allows 201 rush ypg (4.9) but just because they're just a notch below OU in the NCAA D stats doesn't mean the talent's that close.

TEMPLE 42 Bowling Green 20 - BG is 7-3 SU (5-3 ATS) all-time vs TU but all 3 losses were in Philly and BG hasn't covered L/2. The HT is 6-1 SU, 5-2 ATS S/95 and in the L/5 these two have avg 71 ypg. Last time here ('06), it was tied 7-7 but the Owls (0-8 into the game) won 28-14 (+16) for their 1st win under HC Golden. Despite being MAC East foes, these two haven't met S/'07. BG QB Schilz returned to action LW (missed 2, shoulder) and hit 23-37-277 and 2 TD but had two costly TO's (IR TD, fmbld break in own end) and is avg 235 ypg (64%) with a 4-5 ratio. WR Jordan is #4 NCAA in rec per gm (8.3) and has 50 rec (11.1). TU has the edge on off (#84-110), def (#75-119) and ST (#36-98). TU has a balanced off as QB Stewart is avg 139 ypg (54%) with a 4-4 ratio and RB Brown leads with 477 yd (5.9). BG is #119 NCAA in ttl D (490 ypg) and #119 in rush D (251 ypg) so look for the Owls to exploit that as BG is allowing 5.8 ypg on the ground to only 2.3 ypg (71 ypg) in its favor.

BALL ST 37 E Michigan 20 - LY EM led 27-13 in the 3Q but after allowing a blk'd punt for a safety went 3&out their L/4 drives as BSU scored the final 16 pts getting their 5th win in a row vs EM (8-2 SU, 7-3 ATS). LY vs EM, BSU RB Lewis had 301 rush yds and RB Sykes had 203 as BSU avg 8.1 ypc. While both return, Sykes has just 238 yds (6.1) for the ssn while Lewis has just 189 (3.4). RB Williams leads with 363 (5.0) as they are avg 190 ypg rush (4.8). EM is allowing 250 ypg rush and 5.8 ypc TY. Ball St is 0-4 ATS as a HF under Parrish. Both teams are off blowout losses. Ball St gave up 2 TD's off TO's in the first min vs WM and trailed 45-9 in the 4Q as they were outgained 480-348. EM trailed 31-3 at the half and fell 52-6 to Vandy as they were outgained 558-209. Ball St has the def edge (#103-120) but EM has faced the tougher schedule (#54-84).

OHIO 37 Akron 13 - The Cats are 3-1 SU/ATS but have been outgained in the L/3. The HT in this series is 12-5 ATS (9-3 SU). OU is 10-3 ATS on HC while this is the Zips' 4th AG in 5 wks. LY UA outgained (346-292) and outFD'd (21-14) OUs but 5 TO's cost them (int at OU14 and fmbld into EZ, also missed 39 yd FG) in a 19-7 (+3) loss. Zips QB Nicely is avg 128 ypg (47%) with a 3-5 ratio and had a rough outing LW vs KSU hitting just 16-33 for 133 yds with 3 int and was sacked 7x's. OU has the edge on def (#69-116) and ST (#25-109) and the Bobcats are fresh off their most complete gm TY as the QB duo of Jackson (3 1HT TD passes) and QB Bates (2 TD runs) fueled a 49-25 (-9) victory over BG. Jackson is avg 125 ypg (61%) with an 8-6 ratio and moved into #2 all-time in TD passes at OU, while Bates has 303 yds rush (8.0) incl LW's 142 yds (12.9). Akron is still in search of its first win this season and the Zips won't find it here in Athens.

COLORADO 31 Baylor 27 - In '06 Baylor (+5) upset CU in Boulder 34-31 in 3OT as Buffs AA K Crosby missed a gm winning 36 yd FG in reg. In '07 BU (+9) was only outgained 228-199 at HT but trailed 30-9 due to 2 TO's and settling for a short FG in a 43-23 loss in Waco. CU is 22-13 SU, 21-14 ATS in B12 HG's and BU is 7-14 ATS vs B12 North on the road. Baylor is on its 4th AG in 5 wks after LW's wild loss to TT in the Cotton Bowl in which the Bears scored a TD on an inside kick and got a 34 yd pass play on a fake P but still couldn't keep up with the Raiders who had 635-504 yd and 35-22 FD edges. B12's total offense leader BU QB Griffin is #2 B12 pass eff (289, 64%, 13-2, 239 rush). The Buffs were shutout 26-0 for the 2nd straight time at Missouri in a misleading final as CU had a P blk'd, was called for intentional grounding for a safety, missed a 40 yd FG and had another blk'd, was int'd at the MU19 and was SOD at the MU22 and 18. The FD's were even (18) and the Tigers had a 345-311 yd edge. QB Hansen was benched for Hawkins who hit 16-25 for 133 with 1 int. RB Stewart has 493 yd (4.7). CU is #62 pass eff D (234, 64%, 11-6 ratio). The Buffs are 7-2 ATS in the state of Colorado L/2Y (3-0 TY).

COLORADO ST 30 Univ 27 - LY CSU lost for the 1st time ever in the city of Las Vegas. It snapped CSU's 6 gm win streak (1 tie) over LW which was its longest over any MWC tm. UNLV, on its farthest trip east S/'72, was downed by WV, 49-10 LW. QB Clayton (138 ypg, 55%, 5-2 ratio) was benched in the 2H and Fr Herring hit 8-14-101 with a 1-1 ratio. Top WR Payne (23, 16.9) was susp (CS). LW CSU trailed 49-13 into the 4Q when AF put the subs in. CSU scored 14 in the 4th and made the stats respectable. RB Carter DNP (CS) but Mason rushed for 139 (6.3). CSU 7-3 ATS (3-7 SU) in MWC HG's and the HT is 6-1 ATS in this series. These two have both ply'd Idaho and were each blown out by Nevada. The ID gm is CSU's only win TY (36-34) as they outgained ID 494-459 with a 26-22 FD edge while UNLV lost to ID 30-7 being outgained 332-187 and outFD'd 19-11.

NOTRE DAME 37 W Michigan 27 - Kelly is 3-1 vs WM as the HC of CM ('04-'06) and Cincy ('06 bowl). WM HC Cubit has pulled upsets of Illinois and Iowa and almost upset Fla St. ND is 4-14 ATS at home vs non-BCS schools but WM is 2-8 ATS as an AD. ND has a revenge game vs long time rival Navy on deck and is just 3-6 as a DD fav. WM lost to common opp Mich St 38-14 as a 23 pt AD in the ssn opener as they were outgained 483-323. ND lost to MSU 34-31 in OT as a 3' pt AD and was only outgained 477-461. ND has the off (#36-91) and def (#27-91) edges despite playing the much tougher schedule (#5-107). WM is struggling on the ground avg just 103 ypg (2.9) but ND is allowing 146 ypg rush (4.7). ND is 3-3 and can not afford to look past anyone but you have to feel WM is more excited about this matchup (ND's 1st vs a current MAC team S/'20).

N ILLINOIS 27 Buffalo 17 - UB hasn't beat NI since the 1st meeting in 1968 dropping 5 straight incl the last gm (31-13 in '06). NI is 22-7 SU in MAC HG's incl 5 straight (4-1 ATS) by an avg 23 ypg. NI has run for at least 200+ yds in every MAC meeting vs UB (avg 265 ypg, 5.9). UB is off a bye after needing BG to miss a last second FG to win 28-26 despite having 27-10 FD and 441-176 yd edges. NI has won 3 straight

and covered 4 str. UB has dropped 3 str ATS as a DD dog. NI beat MAC East fav Temple 31-17 as a 3 pt HF with a 420-272 yd edge. NI has the off edge (#57-103) as QB Harnish leads the MAC in pass eff and is avg 155 ypg (71%) with an 8-1 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 382 (6.7). RB Spann leads the MAC with 642 (6.1). UB QB Davis is avg 225 ypg (48%) with an 11-11 ratio while RB Oliver leads with 206 (2.9).

N Carolina 27 VIRGINIA 13 - ACC's oldest rivalry and NC has lost 4 str and is 3-20 SU and 1-11 ATS. Their last SU win was '05. The Cavs smothered NC LY holding them to just 3 FD's, 42 yd and 6 punts (6 pass) in the 1H. These 2 have comb to avg just 25 ppg S/'05. The HT is 7-3 SU (6-4 ATS), NC got its first win over Clem S/'01, 21-16 LW, delivering as our ACC POW on the PPH. Both tms had their lowest output of the yr, but NC was actually outgained 305-255. The Heels are led by 1 of the NCAA's MIP QB's, Yates, who avg 234 ypg (65%) with an 8-1 ratio. NC is 2-5 ATS as an AF and VA is 17-9 ATS as a HD. In the rematch vs their former HC, UVA lost 33-21 to GT LW, being out-gained 536-376 and outFD'd 26-16. UVA was only down 13-7 at half due to GT TO's, but the Jackets opened it up in the 2H. NC is in a CU/Mia sandwich and hopes to know more about the susp's TW.

NAVY 26 Smu 23 - In '08, Navy QB Dobbs came off the bench and rushed for 224 yds and 4 TD in a 34-7 Navy win in a driving rainstorm with 39 mph gusts which grounded SMU's passing gm and Navy did not attempt a pass all gm. While SMU os just 2-5 ATS (1-6 SU) LY we won a 5★ on SMU (+7) as Navy pulled out a 38-35 OT win. Navy is off a last second win over WF (trailed 17-6). Navy QB Dobbs (115 ypg, 48%, 3-4, 317 rush, 2.8) hasn't lost a home start in his career. FB Murray (283, 5.2) suffered a sprained knee in 1Q LW (CS). SMU is in a Tulsa/Hou sandwich while Navy (4-11 HF) is playing its first game at home in 36 days (6,000 miles in 3 gm road trip). SMU QB Padron is avg 261 ypg (58%) with a 16-5 ratio and RB Line has 552 (6.8). SMU's #46 D is only allowing 115 rush ypg (3.3) but hasn't faced an option tm TY. While we originally thought we'd be siding with SMU, the opening line has actually opened under a FG.

NEBRASKA 27 Texas 13 - Despite holding the Huskers to 106 ttl yds and 5 FD, UT (-14) needed a last play 46 yd FG to win the B12 title 13-12 LY after officials put back :01 on the clock. NU HC Pelini publicly complained and there was lots of drama between the 2 during the B10/B12 breakup with NU producing a Red Out Around the World video with the slogan "Wear red. Be loud. Beat Texas." Horns are 11-0 SU and 10-1 ATS after the Red River Rivalry and had LW off to work on its offensive woes (9 TO's L/2). QB Gilbert is #82 NCAA pass eff (230, 63%, 4-5 ratio) and the Horns avg just 95 rush ypg (3.2) vs BCS conf D's. The Huskers are off a Thursday night blowout at K-St in which Martinez set a Huskers QB rush rec'd with 241 yd and 4 TD. "T-Magic" is avg 132 (61%) with a 3-3 ratio and a B12 leading 737 rush yd (10.8) with 12 TD! NU is #1 pass eff D (127, 50%, 4-1 ratio). UT fell out of the AP poll for the 1st time S/'00 and the last time the Horns lost 3 consec was Brown's 1st ssn in '99 which was also the last time the Horns were a 7 pt+ dog to a team other than OU.

FLORIDA ST 34 Boston College 10 - FSU has lost 3 (all upsets) of the L/4 incl 2 str. LY FSU was down 21-3 and battled back, but all'd a late TD and was SOD at the BC27 and BC pulled the home upset 28-21 (+4). LW BC was forced to start Shinskie (Rettig inj) and he hit just 7-24-89 with 2 int (1 retd for TD) as NCS scored on off, D and ST's. BC was outgained 422-272 and outFD'd 26-12 in its 44-17 loss. BC is just 1-5 on the road under Spaziani. FSU has avg'd 257 ypg rush (6.2) the L/4 and now takes on a BC D all'g 80 ypg (2.6). FSU's run gm piled up 291 yds (7.1) and the D harassed the clearly inj'd UM QB Harris (5 tfl, 8 pbu) in a 45-17 win LW. The Noles finished with just a 467-421 yd edge and were outFD'd 27-22. While FSU struggled in the HF role under Bowden (6-15 his L/4Y), Fisher seems to have righted the ship as the Noles are 3-0 in that role TY and BC is on an 0-9 ATS skid.

Iowa 27 MICHIGAN 24 - LY Iowa (-8) survived a 2nd play pick 6 and being SOD at 4&gl at the 1 early 4Q in a 30-28 home win. UM QB Forcier was benched in the 2H for Robinson who threw the final int. The Hawks have covered 5 str B10 AG's (9-3 ATS L/3Y). Iowa is fresh off a bye after beating PSU by their largest margin ever (24-3). QB Stanzi is #3 NCAA pass eff (245, 68%, 10-2) while Adam Robinson has run for 480 (4.9). UI is #1 NCAA scoring D (4 off TD's all'd) and #2 NCAA rush D (63 ypg, 2.4). UM lost to rival Mich St for the 3rd straight time (1st time S/65-67) as NCAA's #2 total offense leader Robinson was 'held' to 301 ttl yd and threw 3 int including 2 inside the MSU's. The Wolves were outgained 536-377 as they remain #1 in B10 ttl offense but last in ttl D. Robinson is #12 NCAA pass eff (204, 67%, 8-4 ratio) and the #2 rusher (991, 8.3). Young Wolves have allowed 500 yd 3x TY and are #119 NCAA pass D (304, 62%, 9-7 ratio). This is by FAR the toughest D front Robinson has faced as the Hawks haven't all'd a rushing TD TY.

WASHINGTON 38 Oregon ST 35 - OSU's 3rd AG in 4 wks and they have notoriously struggled in the 2nd of B2B trips away from home going 4-13 ATS. OSU did return to their expected October form LW however with a 29-27 upset (+7) of #9 AZ but did lose WR Rodgers (177 ypg all-purp) in the process (knee). UW suffered its 2nd consec home loss LW in heavy rain vs ASU in a venue that has notoriously been known for giving UW a distinct adv. UW went 25-2 vs OSU from '75-'03 but has dropped 6 str since (0-6 ATS) incl LY's meeting, a gm in which OSU held UW to 12 FD's and just 274 ttl yds in the 48-21 win (-13'). While the trends point to OSU (HT has covered just 5 of the L/16), UW continues to be a Jekyll and Hyde tm that shows up every other wk and judging by their performance vs ASU, expect to see a better Husky unit here.

VIRGINIA TECH 42 Wake Forest 25 - First trip to Blacksburg S/'83 and these two played in '06 as both were ranked (VT 27-6). Hokies are 19-5 SU and 14-10 ATS hosting ACC foes. LW Taylor became the sch'l's winningest QB, accounting for 75% of VT's ttl off in a 45-21 win over CM. VT was actually outgained 401-391 and outFD'd 21-17 but was helped by big plays and an 80 yd PR TD. WF has now suffered B2B last minute losses (vs B2B option tms). LW WF hit a 31 yd FG with 8:34 left then Navy was SOD at the WF38. WF went 3&out and Navy took over with 2:08, drove 64/10pl and got the GW 6 yd pass with :26 left. WF ret'd the KO to mid-field but Price's 3 passes were inc. While not a triple-option, VT has put up some impressive rush numbers avg 211 ypg (5.4) TY and WF is all'g 247 (5.6) the L/4W. VT has won/covered both ACC meetings vs WF ('04 and '06).

LOUISIANA TECH 34 Idaho 24 - LT has covered the L/3 and the HT has won B2B gms after dropping the 1st 3 in this series. Last time here, UI led 7-0 early 1Q before LT scored 46 of the final 53 pts in a 46-14 (-20) win finishing with 556-239 yd and 30-13 FD edges. LY Tech led 21-7 and 28-14 before UI took a 35-34 lead with :52 left and LT went 38/7pl on its final drive but a 56 yd GW FG was wide left. UI has the edge on off (#68-95) led by QB Enderle who is avg 282 ypg (64%) with a 10-9 ratio. This is a long trip for the Vandals but they are fresh off a bye. LT's def held UTEP to just 73 yds pass and 195 ttl yds in a 24-6 win LW to snap a 4 gm losing streak. Ross Jenkins (93 ypg, 70%, 3-2 ratio) may have become the answer at QB for Tech after going 20-32 for 149 yds and 1 TD while RB Creeer (389 yds, 5.4) rushed for 120 yds (6.7) and 2 TD LW. The Bulldogs will look to build off LW's win here.

TCU 41 BYU 10 - The Horned Frogs have outscored BYU 70-14 and outgained them 822-595, not all'g BYU more than 300 ttl yds the L/2Y. LW TCU finished with 578-191 yd and 27-8 FD edges in a 45-0 beating of WY. In the L/2 gms TCU has outFD'd (51-16) and outgained (1052-352) foes and pitched B2B shutouts for the 1st time in 55 years. LW BYU snapped a 4 gm losing streak with a 24-21 win over SDSt a week after firing their DC. The Cougs D held SDSSt to 53 rush yds but is still all'g 225 (5.1) taking on a TCU run gm avg 279 ypg (5.9). BYU is 0-5 ATS as an AD and TCU is 19-2 SU (18-3 ATS) in MWC HG's (11 straight wins by 36 ppg!).

UAB 34 Utep 27 - While UAB enters with a few more days of rest than visiting UTEP, they did have their share of issues vs UCF as they were outgained 399-269 and trailed 28-0 early in the 3Q. After LW's 44-24 win over Rice, UTEP is off to its best start S/'06. The impressive part so far TY for UTEP has been their def as, excluding Hou, they have given up just 288 ypg (447 ypg all'd LY). LY UAB all'd a ssn-high 585 yds, but forced 3 TO's, incl a 9 yd IR TD. UTEP was behind 21-3 and never got within DD's until its last score w/1:12 left. These have historically been the gms when UTEP struggles as they have dropped 7 consec ATS as conf AF's while their IA wins have come vs tms that are just 3-20 overall on the ssn. UAB on the other hand did play extremely well a few wks ago vs Tenn (544-287 edge) and would have been victorious if it hadn't been for a slew of missed FG's.

4★ NY GIANTS over Detroit - The Lions are 0-6 SU and ATS before a bye being outgained 385-235 and losing by an avg score of 32-10. The Giants have a clear statistical edge with the #5 and #2 units (-4 TO's) vs the Lions #17 and #25 units (+3 TO's). DET was in an ideal situation at home taking on a team with a comparable talent level with a rookie QB in his 2nd road game after 2 home wins. While the scoreboard shows a rout by the Lions in their 1st victory thanks to a 105 yd KR and 42 yd int return for TDs the stats were closer than expected. DET was outgained by 19 yds, gave up 43% conversions on 3rd Dn, committed 11 penalties and lost the TOP battle by 6:32. After beating CHI with a great defensive effort the Giants beat the Texans with an outstanding offensive showing. The Giants logged 17-4 FD and 254-74 yd edges at the end of the 1H with 3 scoring drives of 70+ yds on the day. The Giants held Foster who led the NFL by 126 yds before LW to just 25 yds (2.3) on the day. DET is only 2-8 ATS as a DD dog, are off their biggest win since 1995, WR Johnson (shoulder) hurt himself late in the 4Q and now face a Giants team with momentum.

FORECAST: NY GIANTS 41 Detroit 13

3★ CHICAGO over Seattle - CHI beat SEA 25-19 as a 2.5 pt AF LY. SEA was without Hasselbeck and 6 other starters but opened with a 13-0 lead. CHI rallied back thanks to 2 SEA TO's they converted into 10 pts. Cutler logged 247 yds (78%) with a 3-1 ratio in the game vs the same defense SEA runs. The Bears opted to shut down Cutler (concussion) vs CAR LW but he is expected to start here. The Bears defense was the dominant unit LW as they did what they were supposed to holding CAR to 147 yds (just 2.4 yds per play), logged 5 sacks, 3 ints and forced 7 straight punts. SEA is 2-10-1 ATS away after a bye and have lost the L4 by 15 ppg. They made a good move by trading for BUF's RB Lynch (164 yds 4.4 TY) who'll bolster the #29 rush attack mainly on 1st and 2nd Dns as Carroll doesn't trust him to pick up blitzes yet in passing situations. SEA has actually been outgained more at home TY (134 ypg) than on the road (61 ypg). They've been outscored 51-17 on the road due to -5 TO's with 4 of those coming in the opposing 30. This is the best Bears defense since 2006 and we'll take the home team as we expect Cutler to return.

FORECAST: CHICAGO 31 Seattle 17

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ DENVER (+) over NY Jets - The Jets are off LW's MNF game vs the Vikings and road teams are a surprising 7-3 ATS before a bye after MNF. Statistically this looks like a fairly even matchup with the Jets having the #13 and #11 units (+8 TO's) vs DEN's #4 and #19 units (0 TO's). A closer look at the schedule shows that DEN has faced 4 teams with an offense 19th or lower and 4 teams with a defense 22nd or lower. The Jets have faced 3 offenses ranked 18th or lower with 3 defenses ranked 7th or better including MIN. DEN has beaten SEA who simply doesn't travel well and only outgained them by 30 yds and while they had a 519-365 yd edge they imploded vs IND in the red zone (2 FG, 3 SOD). LW vs the Ravens (who basically run a carbon copy of the Jets defense) Orton had his 4th straight 300 yd game but 137 of that was after the game was out of reach. The Broncos injuries at RB has been a serious obstacle (outtrushed by 76 ypg with a 2.3 ypc). Rookie WR Thomas (13 rec 12.4) was KO'd of LW's game with a neck injury. DEN is catching the Jets off their 3rd primetime game in 5 Wks, in their 3rd road game in 4 Wks in the altitude with a bye on deck and the HD in a good situation and is the **Ugly Dog Play**.

FORECAST: DENVER 21 (+) NY Jets 17

2★ MINNESOTA over Dallas - The Vikings crushed the Cowboys in LY's CSF's 34-3 as a 3 pt HF. MIN dominated more than the 323-248 yd edge implies as the defense tormented Romo with 6 sacks and held the Cowboys to 5 FD and 103 yds in the 2H. With 2:00 left in the game and up 27-3 MIN rubbed it in as instead of hitting the FG, Favre threw an 11 yd TD pass. MIN went all-in for 2010 trading for Moss to bolster a sorely disappointing passing game. MIN is in a prime-time sandwich off the NYJ with a trip to GB on deck but this is the Cowboys visiting and they still trail both CHI and GB. The Vikings have won 10 of 11 at home under Favre and have gone 8-3 ATS and their only SU loss came earlier TY as they outgained MIA 364-226 but were done in by turnovers. Dallas meanwhile was off a bye and while they moved the ball (outgained TEN 511-321) they were sacked 6 times had 133 yds in pen and Romo threw an int in the EZ. A rejuvenated RB Peterson (392, 5.6) and TE Shiancoe (11 rec, 15.4) will be the 2 beneficiaries playing against defenses that must now double team Moss. MIN should also see fewer blitzes and Favre is now 10-0-1 ATS when getting sacked 2 times or less the L2Y.

FORECAST: MINNESOTA 34 Dallas 24

OTHER GAMES

San Diego 35 ST LOUIS 10 - The Chargers are the vastly superior team statistically with the #1 and #1 units (-2 TO's) vs STL #20 and #20 units (-1 TO's). However they are 0-8 ATS as an NDIV AF. They will be in a foul mood after failing to capitalize on thumping ARZ, by losing to OAK with home games vs NE and TEN next. While STL is an improved team TY they have had a very favorable schedule starting off vs 3 teams with new QB's (2 learning new systems), a beat up SEA team that doesn't travel well and a DET team at a similar talent level to them. Bradford's #s are what you expect from a solid rookie QB (232 ypg 57% 6-8 but 5.7 ypa) and he's been consistent and LW was his 1st time operating from a big deficit. He will be without his best WR Clayton (23 rec 13.3) who has been outstanding despite being acquired 6 days before the start of the season. SD is thin at the LB spot and will likely give up yards to RB Jackson (80 ypg 4.1) who is slowed by a groin injury. However SD's #3 pass defense allows just 160 ypg (56%) with a 4-7 ratio and very impressive 6.0 ypa. SD will also get back LT McNeill here bolstering the OL for a QB with a 105.4 QBR. Playoff teams that have posted 500 yds of offense but lost are 10-1 ATS the L3Y. Look for the Chargers to put this away quickly especially after an embarrassing loss to a division foe they have dominated.

HOUSTON 30 Kansas City 24 - HOU is 6-2 ATS before a bye week. Both teams come in off losses with KC playing IND very tough and HOU getting rolled by the Giants. KC took a page from the Jaguars/Titans playbooks and focused on running the ball (113 yds 4.2) to minimize Manning. Defensively they dropped as many defenders into coverage as they could and forced the #28 run game to make plays. KC was only outgained by 80 yds and were done in by mistakes starting the game with an onside kick, and going for it on 4th and 2 from the 8 instead of taking the FG. While HOU had LB Cushing and WR Johnson back LW they were blasted in the 1H being outFD 17-4 in the 1H and outgained 254-74. HOU was held to just 24 yds (1.6) rushing and on 4 drives that started on their 46 or better had 1 FG and 3 punts. Both teams have young secondaries and have struggled with pass D (KC #26, HOU #32) but the Texans are giving up 8.3 ypa and own an 11-3 ratio. KC held 3 teams to under 14 pts TY (14.3 ppg) while HOU has allowed at least 24 pts in each game (27.2 TY). KC is an improved team that is gaining confidence each week as they buy into the improved coaching. HOU is playing like the Vermeil era Chiefs where they are all offense and no defense. We'll call for the home team by 2 FG's in a higher scoring game as the Texans aren't used to success yet.

NEW ENGLAND 20 Baltimore 10 - NE lost their 1st home playoff game to BAL in the Wildcard round LY losing 33-14 as a 3.5 pt HF. Ray Rice ran for an 87 yd TD on the 1st play from scrimmage as BAL broke NE's spirit with a 24-0 1Q lead. Flacco only had 10 pass att's as the Ravens held NE to 196 yds. NE opted to trade Moss as their base offense TY is a 2-TE set with rookie

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Hernandez (18 rec 13.3) rapidly stepping up and Brandon Tate (11 rec 12.3) coming into his own. Foes will blitz NE more as they won't have to worry about the deep threat but Brady's only been sacked 1 every 24 pass att TY (7th). NE's very young secondary is a concern giving up 283 ypg (69%) with a 9-7 ratio with 3 int vs MIA. BAL dominated a 1 dimensional DEN team at home LW as Orton had 137 of his 314 yds in the 4Q down 3 scores. They forced DEN to punt on 6 of their 1st 7 drives. Now they travel to NE team that is 5-2 ATS after a bye week with 1 non-cover coming by a .5 pt vs MIA LY. NE's offense is actually quite balanced as the #13 rush attack is only -22 plays vs the pass and RB Taylor (foot) is expected to return here. We'll call for the home team off a bye with an affordable line here.

New Orleans 23 TAMPA BAY 13 - The road team is 4-1 ATS in the series with the only loss coming at the end of the year when NO opted to start resting starters with the #1 seed wrapped up. NO dismantled TB 38-7 in the 1st meeting as 10.5 pt AF. NO gave up a 95 yd drive to TB on their 1st drive then locked down with a 351-124 yd edge as Freeman gave up 4 TO's in his 3rd start. NO has the edge statistically with the #10 off and #10 def (-1 TO's) vs TB's #21 and #18 units (+5 TO's). NO has struggled vs 2 teams fielding rookie QBs with better than avg run games. LW they lost to the 1st rookie UFA QB to start a game in the 1st 5 Wks since 1967. ARZ converted 4 TO's and a missed FG into 24 pts negating a 373-194 yd edge. While NO is putting up solid stats via the air (#5 pass) the depleted RB corps (#31 rush) is allowing defenses to drop deep into coverage and limit big plays. TB's defense pulled the upset LW on the road with 2 ints during the final 2:28 which were converted into 10 pts for the win. Freeman was very composed with 280 yds (61%) and a 1-1 ratio on the day though the Bucs 125 yds rushing (5.7) is misleading as 61 yds came on a run by FB/RB Graham. We are aware the Saints are 0-9-1 ATS but this is a good situation with a very embarrassed SB Champ off 2 SU losses vs a TB team that is off a game where they were gifted with a win.

Atlanta 23 PHILADELPHIA 13 - This is the 6th meeting in 7 years with the favorite going 4-1 SU and ATS. PHI beat ATL 34-7 as a 5 pt HD LY with the Eagles rubbing it in by having Vick score 2 TD's. ATL didn't have QB Ryan or RB Turner and were outgained 380-295 with 99 yds coming on a garbage time TD drive. PHI is off LW's SNF game vs SF and those results are unknown. Vick (ribs) is expected to miss and this will be Kolb's 5th NFL start vs a Falcons pass defense better than its #20 ranking. While they are allowing 223 ypg and a poor 67% rate they are giving up an acceptable 7.1 ypa and own a 5-10 ratio. While ATL is on the road for the 3rd time in 4 Wks they have a good edge with their run game (149 ypg 4.1) vs the #27 rush defense giving up 139 ypg (4.3). ATL has also held foes to 14 ppg TY while PHI has given up 19.8 ppg as while their defense is fast it can be pushed around. ATL's special teams are also underrated as minus a 72 yd PR return they are giving up 1.0 on PR's and 18.6 on KR's. While there is no line due to SNF we'll side with the road team displaying some impressive resiliency with 3 straight tough wins.

Miami 24 GREEN BAY 21 - MIA returns from its bye (6-3-1 ATS) after an embarrassing MNF loss that cost their STC his job. MIA moved the ball well (400-265 edge) but 4 Henne TO's (converted into 13 pts) along with the special teams blunders were a disaster. Despite concerns over LT Long (knee sprain) the Dolphins are a very healthy team right now. GB was already without 3 starters LW and lost TE Finley (right knee), DT Pickett (right ankle), TE Lee (shoulder) all in the 1Q. Rodgers also sustained a concussion in OT when he was Int'd. GB had a 10 pt lead halfway thru the 3Q but the injuries sapped their depth and WAS rallied for the win. This is the Dolphins 1st road game in 3 Wks and they matchup well here statistically with the #13 and #7 units (-3 TO's) vs GB's #12 and #15 units (-2 TO's). They have good matchup advantages with Brown and Williams (100 ypg combined 4.4) vs the #15 rush defense (105 ypg 4.6). While OLB Matthews leads the NFL with 8.5 sacks for the #2 team in sks he left LW's game with a hamstring injury and his availability unknown. We'll side with the healthier, rested and focused AD vs a beat up GB team with a SNF game vs MIN on deck.

PITTSBURGH 27 Cleveland 10 - This is the 1st post-bye home game for PIT since 2004 who will also have the added advantage of working Roethlisberger back after his suspension. LY CLE snapped a 13 game losing streak to PIT with a 13-6 victory (10' pt HD) on a very cold night with 8 sacks vs a depleted OL. CLE outtrushed PIT 171 (4.6) to 75 (3.4) with Cribbs having 200 all purpose yds. PIT has 3 straight road games on deck with 3 of their next 4 games being in primetime. PIT has outtrushed foes better than 2-1 TY (134, 4.3 vs 62, 2.6). This is a problem for CLE whose offense is going thru Hillis who was held to 28 yds (2.8) LW. Wallace was named the QB after some gamesmanship by Mangini and was moving the ball effectively but an ankle sprain forced Delhomme in. Also limited himself by an ankle injury, Delhomme had 97 yds (57%) and 2 Int. CLE has been outgained by 71 ypg and outscored 47-20 in the 2H TY. CLE's return units have been sluggish (6.2 PR 16.2 KR) as teams aren't going anywhere near Cribbs. Div Dogs are 21-5 ATS so far TY. CLE will hold off on naming the QB again but neither are healthy vs a reenergized arch-rival on the road, that's down a Div game in the standings and still smarting from LY's loss.

SAN FRANCISCO 23 Oakland 17 - Both teams are very familiar with each other as the NFL schedules the Battle of the Bay annually in preseason. Both teams have been major disappointments so far TY. Prior to the SNF game SF had the #25 and #17 units (-6 TO's) with OAK having the #15 and #23 units (0 TO's) and its a telling state of the NFC West that the 49ers defense is the highest rated. OAK's issues come from adjusting to OC Hue Jackson's new system while switching QB's and a young receiving unit. LY thru 5 games OAK avg'd 192 ypg and 9.8 ppg but have improved to 339 ypg and 22.2 ppg and should have beaten ARZ. However their defense is still at the same level as LY (382 ypg 26 ppg allowed LY) with 346 ypg 26.8 ppg especially with the run (156 ypg 4.5 overall LY) with 148 ypg (5.0). OAK jumped out to a 12-0 lead vs SD LW with 2 blocked punts. SD pulled back into the game thanks to 290 yds in the 1H by Rivers who finished with an 10.3 ypa. There is no line due to the SNF game but SF is at home, won't have to worry about an OAK fan base showing up, have much better special teams than SD and we'll call for them by 6 here.

Indianapolis at WASHINGTON - SNF - Mike Shanahan takes on one of his biggest tormentors in Manning who is 7-2 SU/ATS against him. Indy found themselves in a battle vs KC tied at 9 into the 4Q but Manning orchestrated a pair of 12 play drives to not only win but cover. WAS showed the fortitude Shanahan demands (and they lacked LY under Zorn) as they came back from a 10-0 deficit knocking off GB in OT. Can Indy move to 8-1 ATS in prime-time or will the Redskins pull off their 4th upset of the season having already beaten DAL, PHI and GB?

Tennessee at JACKSONVILLE - MNF - This is the only primetime affair for the Jaguars for 2010 and a win here will go a long way towards boosting ticket sales for a team in danger of relocation. They validated the victory over the Colts by scoring on 8 of 9 possessions after trailing the Bills 10-0. TEN is off a battle vs DAL in which they alternated six 2H scores. With ALL FOUR teams in the AFC South at 3-2 the winner obviously stays on top. **Don't miss out on Monday Night Magic! Replays showed the ball was out before the RB's knee went down, but the ruling on the field stood and BYU went up 24-14 5pl later. SDSSt scored with 6:27 then forced a punt but threw 3 inc. BYU was able to run out the clock with the help of a pass intercal call at the SDS40. AF is off a 49-27 win over Colo St, a gm they led 49-13 into the 4Q when they put their subs in. CSU scored 14, gained 147 and totaled 9 FD in the 4Q to make it look respectable. SDSSt's DC is ex-NM HC Rocky Long and his NM D's held AF under its ssn rush avg 9x in 10 yrs.

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Utah 41 WYOMING 13 - UT has outscored WY 112-17 the L/3Y. Utes are 10-4 ATS in MWC AG's. Last trip here they rolled to a 43-7 win (-23). LY WY led 10-9 into the 4Q but Carta-Samuels was sk'd 5x, all in the 2H. LW Carta-Samuels (161 ypg pass, #2 rusher) was a late scratch (undisclosed inj) and WY turned to '08 str' Crum who hit 11-17-16 with an 0-1 ratio. WY only managed 191 yds tll off (40 came on 1st pl) and TCU proved too much as WY fell 45-0. WY did drive to the TCU13 mid-4Q but on 3&5 Crum was int'd at the 4. LW Utah fell behind 14-10 after 1Q, but score 31 unanswered pts and cruised to a 68-27 win over Iowa St. UT finished with 28-19 FD and 593-348 yd edges and pulled QB Wynn after 3Q's. UT has put 50+ pts on its L/3 opp and HC Whittingham will take no prisoners in this final MWC season.

TOLEDO 21 Kent St 20 - KSU hasn't won in the Glass Bowl S/77 going 0-9 SU losing by 18 ppg (0-2 ATS), but UT has been outscored 61-17 TY at home and has dropped 4 of its L/13 there. UT is also 0-4 SU/ATS in MAC home openers being outscored by nearly 25 ppg (173-74). KSU won at home in '06 (40-14, -7) but this is only their 2nd meeting S/99. KSU forced 5 TO's LW and turned two of them into scores while also recording 7 sks vs Akron in a 28-17 win. KSU has the edge on def (#45-81) and ST (#61-95) but these two are #113 (UT, 284 ypg) and #114 (KSU, 278 ypg) in the NCAA in tll off, but KSU does feature the NCAA's #1 rush def (60 ypg). The Rockets were grounded 57-14 LW in Boise where they had 5 TO's and just 287 tll yds (65 rush) in their 1st road loss TY. Toledo has won 7 of 9 (3-1 ATS L/4) in this series and look for UT to grind one out to secure its 1st home win TY.

TEXAS TECH 47 Oklahoma St 40 - The HT is 9-3 ATS and OSU is 4-1 ATS in the series. TT is 19-12 ATS as a B12 HF LY TT (+4) had a pick 6 mid-4Q and their final drive was SOD at the OSU49 in a 24-17 loss. Last time here TT beat #8 OSU 56-20. The Raiders jumped out to a 45-28 mid-3Q lead over Baylor and held on for a 45-38 win in the Cotton Bowl with 35-22 FD and 635-507 yd edges. QB Potts is #1 NCAA pass ypg (330, 66%, 17-4 ratio) after LW's 462 yd and 4 TD performance. Tuberville said the Raiders offense would have to carry them prior to LW's game as the D is doing 406 ypg and a B12 worst 32 ppg. OSU actually trailed ULL 21-17 at the half before scoring on 7 of their 1st 8 2H poss in a 54-28 win on Friday (we had a Marquee win on the Over). OSU QB Weeden avg 322 ypg (69%) with an 18-6 ratio and his top target is NCAA's #1 rec Blackmon (47, 15.9, 11). RB Hunter has 700 yd (6.4). OSU is last in the B12 in pass D (291) but #1 B12 with 16 TO's forced. Both run the Air Raid offense so it's up to the struggling D's to step up.

TEXAS A&M 34 Missouri 24 - MO's only win in College Station was in '02 (1-4 SU). In their last gm ('07) Mizzou won 40-26 as 19' pt HF. A&M is 18-11-1 ATS after a SU loss. This is MO's 1st true away AG TY but they are 9-3 ATS on the road winning by 13 ppg. A&M has lost 2 straight incl 24-17 to Ark at Cowboys Stadium in which they were outgained 442-324 with TO's again playing a big role (4 LW and 18 L/4). QB Johnson (248, 56%, 13-9 ratio) has disappointed as a Sr with more int than he threw all of '09 but HC Sherman has stood by his QB. RB Michael has 507 (5.1). Ags are #3 pass eff D (231, 58%, 7-7) and have a huge ST edge (#1-60). MO shutout CU for the 2nd time in a row at home in a misleading final as the Buffs missed 2 FG's and had 3 drives end inside the MO22. QB Gabbert (246, 67%, 7-3 ratio) sat for most of the 4Q due to a hip pointer (CS). WR Moe has 44 rec (10.9). Tigers are #8 pass eff D (189, 60%, 2-9 ratio) but have faced a very soft slate of opp QB (1 in NCAA's top 50 passer). The Ags stop their slide at home.

Southern Miss 38 MEMPHIS 7 - These schools have met every yr S/81 with SM covering 14 of the L/18. After jumping out to a 20-0 lead LW vs EC, SM fell a point short to the Pirates as they had to settle for too many FG's (5) while being called for 153 yds in pen (119th in nation). UM was shutout for the 1st time S/99 LW as neither QB Williams or Smith could get the ball moving yet again (223 tll yds). LY SM led 10-6 at HT then got a 50 yd PR TD (1st for SM S/'03) that sparked them to score 20 of the next 23 pts (UM had the yd edge 425-360 but committed 11 pen for 105 yds). While the Eagles have been outgained in 6 of the L/7 meeting vs the Tigers (-55 ypg), that trend will be reversed as SM's def has held 4 of their 6 opp under 310 yds TY. SM has gone 15-7 ATS as an AF and will be fired up after their first home loss after 11 wins.

BIG DOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

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Ohio St 31 WISCONSIN 21 - LY was a misleading final as UW had 22-8 FD, 368-184 yd and 42:47-17:13 TOP edges as OSU had 2 IR TD's and 1 KR TD in a 31-13 final. UW HC Bielema is 0-3 SU/ATS vs the Bucks with 2 misleading finals ('07 and '09) and another decided in the gm's last 68 seconds. Wiskey extended their record series win streak to 7 gms in a 41-23 chop down of Minny as the Badgers had 30-16 FD and 250-96 rush yd edges. QB Tolzien is #16 NCAA pass eff (200, 70%, 7-2). Thunder and lightning duo Clay (692, 6.0) and White (485, 7.7) should continue to split the carries. Badgers are #85 pass eff D (200, 57%, 10-4 ratio). New #1 OSU (1st time S/'07) won their 12th straight, 38-10, over Indy with a 478-210 yd edge. After a thigh inj vs IL Pryor never left the pocket and hit a 24-30 for a career high 334 and 3 TD before being pulled with OSU leading 38-0 with 7:57 left 3Q. Pryor is #6 NCAA pass eff (225, 68%, 15-3 ratio, 354 rush yd). OSU is #4 NCAA rush D (79, 2.7). UW is 7-3 ATS as a HD with 5 outright upsets. This is the Bucks 1st gm vs a ranked foe since 9/11 in Miami with their next likely on 11/20 and they are 15-6 ATS as an AF.

AUBURN 33 Arkansas 27 - The dog is 10-3 ATS with 4 str outright upsets in the series and Ark has pulled outright upsets the L/2Y. Aub OC Malzahn faced his former tm (OC at Ark in '06) and was a highly respected HS coach for many yrs in Ark. LY Ark (+2) jumped out to a 34-3 lead and held on for a 44-23 win. The HT is 4-1 ATS but Ark is 12-6 as an SEC AD. Last time here Ark (+16) had a 428-185 yd edge and knocked off the #20 Tigers. Both tms ply'd ULM TY with Ark not covering (-34, 31-7) and Aub covering (-35, 52-3). The tms are closely matched but Aub's #5 off prefers to run behind QB Newton (190 ypg, 65%, 12-5, 672 rush, 6.5) and Ark's #10 off prefers to pass with QB Mallett (350 ypg, 69%, 13-6). Ark has a #13-34 edge on def. Ark is off a 24-17 win over A&M and Aub pulled out a last second 37-34 win over KY LW to remain 1 of 2 undefeated SEC tms. Aub is at home playing with legitimate revenge after LY's loss to Ark ended a 5-0 start and began a 3 gm losing streak.

Boise St 55 SAN JOSE ST 3 - Boise is 10-0 SU and 6-3 ATS with the avg MOV by 29 ppg and has covered the L/3. However, in the L/3 in San Jose, BSU has only won by 9 ppg (1-2 ATS). LY it was tied 7-7 mid-2Q but BSU ended the gm on a 38-0 run holding SJSt to just 87 yds in a 45-7 win (-36). Last time here ('08), BSU outgained (393-207) and outFD'd (28-9) SJSt but it was tied 6-6 after 1Q and was only 20-16 early 3Q before BSU distanced itself. SJSt is facing its 5th ranked foe in 7 wks but did manage to hang around for a half (21-13 at HT) vs Nevada LW before giving way in a 35-13 loss. BSU comes in fresh off a 57-14 win over Toledo with huge edges on off (#2-118) and def (#12-93). This is simply a mismatch here as Boise is #5 in the NCAA all tll off (522 ypg) while SJSt is #116 (269 ypg) and BSU has the NCAA's #4 scoring off (47 ppg) while SJSt is #120 (10 ppg). Boise is also #2 in the NCAA in tll def (236 ypg). The Broncos are 10-3 ATS as an AF and own the nation's longest win streak (19) and will have no trouble making it 20.

FRESNO ST 45 New Mexico St 10 - FSU has won 16 straight but NMSt has covered 3 of the L/4 as DD dogs and in fact, NMSt had the ball at the end trailing by a single score but was SOD in each of those 3. The Aggies are coming off their first win of the ssn topping instate rival NM 16-14 LW when true Fr QB Manley (3rd stringer) made his first collegiate appearance on the Aggies' final drive (after a fmb! rec) and went 2-2 for 32 yds to set up K Stamper's 22 yd FG with 1:56 left. FSU has the edge on off (#69-117), def (#79-118) and ST (#19-89) but the Bulldogs are licking their wounds following a 49-27 loss to Hawaii LW. FSU got 211 yds and 2 TD passes from QB Colburn (250 ypg, 67%, 12-6 ratio) but he was also picked off 3x's. NMSt comes into this game #117 in the NCAA in tll off (263 ypg) and #118 in tll def (488 ypg) and look for the Bulldogs to erase LW's loss here.

Nevada 42 HAWAII 41 - These two have avg 60 ppg in the L/6. The HT is 9-1 SU and 8-2 ATS and UN hasn't won in Honolulu S/48! This features two of the nation's top off's as UN is #2 NCAA in tll off (545 ypg) while UH is #6 (497 ypg). LW in Fresno, UH WR Salas (50 rec, 15.1) scored 3 TD and RB Green (248 yds, 5.6) ran for 3 TD as QB Moniz, the nation's leader in pass and tll off (388 ypg), threw for 376 yds and 3 TD in a 49-27 win. UN is off to its best start (6-0) since becoming a IA tm in '92 as LW QB Kaepernick (210 ypg, 70%, 8-2 ratio, 549 rush yds, #6 NCAA tll off) passed for 273 yds (also ran for 2 TD) and RB Tava rushed for 196 and 3 TD as UN rolled up a ssn-best 640 yds tll off in a 35-13 win over SJSt. UN's pass D has been its Achilles' heel in recent yrs (#120 NCAA '08, #119 in '09) and has shown signs of improvement TY (230 ypg) but hasn't faced an off like this yet. UH knows this is a big HG and UN is playing its 3rd AG in 4 wks but Kaepernick's versatility could be the difference here.

INDIANA 44 Arkansas St 30 - First meeting. ASU is 0-5 SU and 2-3 ATS all-time vs B10 opp incl a narrow 24-21 loss to #13 Iowa LY as a 21' pt AD. ASU is on its 5th AG in 7 wks but did upset Texas A&M on the road in '08. Indiana is off a 38-10 loss to Ohio St as a 22' pt AD and trailed 38-0 in the 3Q being outgained 472-214. ASU led NT 21-3 and hung on to win 24-19 as a 3 pt AF with a 327-292 yd edge. IU has the off (#59-94) and def (#98-111) edges but ASU has played the tougher sked (#68-97). IU QB Chappell is avg 295 ypg (70%) with a 12-3 ratio while RB Willis leads with 278 yds (4.3) but he DNP LW (CS). ASU QB Aplin is avg 263 ypg (57%) with a 10-4 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 207 (2.7). RB Lawson leads with 289 (4.4). Both teams are allowing 400+ ypg.

GEORGIA TECH 37 Middle Tennessee 23 - First meeting. GT has played just one current SBC tm (beat Troy 35-20 in '06). Despite being 1-5 vs BCS teams the L/2Y MT has outgained 3 of them. GT is off a 33-21 win over Virginia as a 9' pt HF finishing with a 536-376 yd edge. MT had an extra 4 days off after losing what may have been the SBC Champ game to Troy 42-13 as 3' pt HF being outgained 519-207. MT QB Dasher ret'd LW after being susp the first 4 but suffered an hand inj early, missing a few series, and he threw for just 172 (59%) with an 0-1 ratio with 27 yds rush (1.9) with 2 TD. GT is avg 328 ypg rush (5.8) led by QB Nesbitt (543, 4.4) and RB Allen (525, 6.1). MT's D is allowing 185 ypg (4.0). GT has the off (#41-100) and def (#53-108) edges.

WKU 24 Uim 23 - The Warhawks are 5-1 ATS the L/10Y as an AF/WKU is 3-2 SU (1-0 ATS) vs ULM but LY met for the 1st time S/'55. LY WKU led 12-7 at HT and 18-14 mid-4Q but ULM escaped 21-18 at home (-21). WKU has played the much tougher sked (#27-74) and has a slight edge (#109-112) but ULM has the def edge (#101-117). WKU has the FBS's longest losing streak (25 gms) and hasn't beaten an FBS tm S/'07. WKU trailed FIU 21-0 but only lost 28-21 as a 9' pt AD being outgained 343-299. ULM blew a 12-0 lead over FAU and trailed 17-12 but a late 4Q TD and 2 pt conv gave them the cover 20-17 as a 2' pt HF, although they did have a 418-281 yd edge. Look for WKU's streak to end.

TROY 45 Louisiana 24 - UL is 10-4 ATS as a SBC AD under HC Bustle. However, since Troy's OT loss to UL in '05, Troy is 4-0 ATS winning SU by 21 ppg as UL has all'd 42+ pts in each gm. Troy is 6-11-1 ATS off a bye but this being their only game in a 25 day period and with UL having 2 SBC wins, they should be focused. In what was likely the SBC Title game Troy, destroyed MT 42-13 with a 517-207 yd edge. UL lost to MT 34-14 being outgained 424-341 yd. Both teams beat ASU by 7 but Troy had a 505-450 yd edge, UL matched ASU's with 456 yds each. We won a Friday Night Marquee on the Over in the UL-OSU gm (went over in 3Q), as UL had a big game hosting OSU and had a 21-17 HT lead but lost 54-28. While both teams are allowing over 400 ypg on D Troy is avg 487 ypg off, while UL is avg just 325 ypg and has been without star TE Green the L/2 who still is their top rec (14, 15.9).

NTEXAS 24 Fiu 23 - The outright winner has covered all 5 meetings but NT trails 2-3 in the series losing 3 str being outgained in each by 112 ypg (+8 in TO's). LY NT led 28-14 but 3 TO's led to 3 TD and a 35-28 FIU win. FIU, despite playing the tougher schedule (#48-102) has the off (#88-96) and def (#80-96) edges. NT is down to its #4 QB (top 2 OFY) as #3 QB Dodge played sparingly (broke bone in wrist) vs ASU. QB Baine, in his 1st start, threw for 77 yd (53%) and had 80 yds rush (6.2). NT was outgained 327-292 but settled for 4 FG's of 37 yds or less to lose 24-19 as a 3 pt HD. NT RB Dunbar leads with 582 (4.3). FIU led WKU 21-0 and finished with a 343-296 yd edge but needed to hold on for a 28-21 win (-9'). FIU QB Carroll is avg 194 ypg (57%) with a 4-6 ratio while RB Harden leads with 226 (3.4).
