

The Texans defeated the Bengals 20-19 as a 2.5 pt AD just 4 wks ago to win the AFC South. CIN had a 16-3 lead at the end of the 1H being held to 3 FG's on 3 trips inside the HOU31. The Texans crushed them in the 2H with 16-6 FD and 202-81 yd edges with Yates leading an 80/13pl yd drive for the GW TD. HOU is 5-3 SU/6-2 ATS at home TY with a +103 yd margin (-2 TO's) for a 22-6 avg score. CIN finished 5-3 SU/5-1-2 ATS on the road TY for a -16 yd difference (+2 TO's) for a 24-21 avg score. The AFC North/South squared off TY with CIN going 5-4 SU/4-4-1 ATS vs common foes for a +14 ypg margin (+2 TO's) with a 23-22 avg scoring deficit. HOU was +85 ypg on avg (+5 TO's) for a 24-15 avg score going 6-3 SU/6-2-1 ATS in those

CIN's #20 off made the most of one of the easiest skeds TY with loads of help from their #7 def. Rookie QB Dalton had four 4Q comeback wins vs 10 for Palmer's 99 games. It should be noted that he's been held to under 178 ypg passing (54%) with a 4-1 ratio in the L5 gms. CIN's OL has thrived in new OC Jay Gruden's system with just 25 sks while helping Cedric Benson hit 1000 yds for the 3rd straight season. Benson hasn't had the impact in the passing game that WC OC's desire from their RB's but CIN's has a very promising set of WR's. Despite missing 1.5 games due to a knee injury, Green is the 8th rookie 1st RD WR with 1000 yds and has 21% of the teams rec's. CIN lacked a quality receiving TE until they drafted Jermaine Gresham LY. While he's been solid receiver and pass blocker he's not very well equipped for the run game. Jerome Simpson has logged 3 100 yd rec efforts TY and is a quality #3 in Gruden's system but he's still fairly inconsistent. This is the 4th year of DC Mike Zimmer's system and he finally has enough healthy pieces in place to make it work. The best defender hands down is Geno Atkins who has dominated at DT vs the run and pass. Atkins has helped open the way for DE Carlos Dunlap to get quality pressure on QB's despite dealing w/a nagging hamstring injury. HC Marvin Lewis finally has a solid LB unit to work with and FA pickup Manny Lawson has thrived in this system but Rey Maualuga still has coverage issues. CIN finished 14th in pass defense LY despite being ravaged by injuries and a healthier unit came in 9th TY though they've not played a demanding set of QB's. CIN has an avg spec tms unit which is a step up after coming in 30th LY thanks to their coverage units.

The Texans have plenty of big plays with Matt Schaub on film, but the truth is the #13 offense was rather run oriented even before his injury, HOU avg'd 396 ypg with 27.3 ppg under Schaub with a 36-29 run/pass mix or 55% run. Part of this was due to Andre Johnson's injury in gm 4 but Gary Kubiak was simply making the most out of the best RB tandem in the NFL. Arian Foster and Ben Tate have combined for 11 100 yd rushing efforts and their combined rushing yds are more than 27 teams. Foster is a more complete RB and is useful in the pass gm while Tate is a superior change of pace back. This tandem has TJ Yates, who was a 4 yr starter for the Tar Heels in the same offense, to become the 10th rookie QB to start a playoff was a 4 yr starter for the lat releasin the same otherise, to become the 10th rookie QB to start a playon gm since the 1970 merger (along with Dalton). Those QB's are 4-5 SU/ATS avg 154 ypg (56%) w/a 9-14 ratio in their 1st postseason game. Prior to TEN, Yates' only start with Johnson was vs ATL when he hit for 188 yds (48%) with a TD in his 1st career start. HOU's OL (#11 sks allowed) has been elite with Ctr Chris Myers and RT Eric Winston being arguably the best at their positions for 2011. How important has DC Wade Phillips been? Over the 1st 13 games, the Texans improved by 102 ypg overall, 84 ypg passing, trimmed the ppg allowed by 10.7 ppg and went from a 33-13 TD/Int ratio to 13-17. LY's #30 defense is now #2 for 2011. HOU didn't lose a beat after Mario Williams was lost due to rookie 1st RD DC JJ Watt stepping up and dominating. The switch to the 3-4 was a boon to the LB's as Brian Cushing's liabilities in space were removed and it eased the burden on DeMeco Ryans who returned from a torn ACL. HOU shrewdly revamped its secondary by picking up CB Johnathan Joseph and FS Danieal Manning in FA which allowed Kareem Jackson to play to his strengths. HOU has one of the better special teams in the NFL for 2011 after being 27th LY thanks to improved coverage units.

While this is HOU's 1st playoff game ever CIN doesn't have much of an edge as they haven't won a playoff game since Jan 1991. Reliant Stadium will be incredibly loud here and Dalton's only other dome game was vs STL. HOU's defensive improvement TY can't be understated & PP shows it with HOU having a 106 yd edge here. PP has this duel of rookie QB's very close to the line so this is a No Play.

NO PLAY: TEXANS 22 BENGALS 18

The last meeting was in 2009 when PIT beat DEN 28-10 as a 2.5 pt AF. This is also the 1st playoff game for DEN since PIT beat them 34-17 as a 3 pt AD back in '05. The Steelers have gone 5-3 SU but 2-6 ATS on the road TY despite being +62 yds (4th best) due to a -11 TO mark. DEN has been outgained by 39 ypg at home (28th) and are -10 TO's for a 3-5 SU/1-6-1 ATS record. PIT beat Fox's Panthers 27-3 LY as 14 pt HF's. DEN has struggled vs winning teams TY going 1-4 SU/ATS being outgained by 82 ypg (29th) with -11 TO's losing 35-19. PIT has outgained their winning foes by 62 ypg (3rd best) but -12 TO's have them 4-4 SU/ATS. PIT has a massive edge in postseason experience with most of LY's team that made it to the SB still on the roster.

LY's #2 defense had to contend with a lot of questions concerning their age after losing to GB in LY's Super Bowl. PIT quietly had already taken steps to address that and while TY's unit has been helped by facing IND, STL and CLE twice the #1 defense is on par with LY's in terms of yardage. The concern for the Steelers is that they have 35 sks vs 48 LY and 15 takeaways vs 35 LY so they aren't quite as dangerous. Their 100 ypg rushing is also the most allowed since 2003's 109 ypg mark. Brett Keisel has had one of his best seasons in 2011 stepping into role that Aaron Smith used to fill. PIT has also been force feeding 3rd year DE Ziggy Hood onto the field and teams have been running right at him as he's not fully into the system. PIT may be challenged by SF as the top 3-4 LB unit in the NFL but they are still one of the most physical around. One reason for the diminished sack total is that LaMarr Woodley has been dealing with a hamstring issue and OL's haven't had to deal with pressure off both edges. PIT's #1 pass defense has only been beaten by the 2008 unit for fewest passing yds in a season in the L15Y. While PIT's 11 int are a big drop-off from previous units their 15 pass TD's allowed is 2nd best TY. PIT IS officially become a pass 1st team as Roethlisberger passed for the 2nd most ydd in his career despite working behind an OL that fielded 10 different starting combo's. Mike Wallace used PIT's reputation as a run 1st team to his advantage and has quietly become a true #1 WR while Antonio Brown has gone from 6th RD DC LY to the teams MVP after earning his 1st 1,000 yd receiving season while greatly improving PIT's return units as they finished with a middle of the pack ranking TY. Rashard Mendenhall is likely out for the year w/a knee injury and Isaac Redman who is a hybrid FB will likely see most of the carries as Mewelde Moore has an unknown knee issue. PIT is a team that excels in adapting to its roster as shown by their 4th DD win total in 5 yrs.

When John Fox's Panthers reached the SB it was by emphasizing a strong run game, physical defense and good special teams play with no TO's. While DEN has had some lucky breaks, under Tebow they have essentially followed that formula. The Broncos run-option #23 off makes the most of his size and athleticism to stretch defenses and wear them out for the 4Q. Tebow has major accuracy issues right now but the key is avoiding TO's as all 4 losses with him as the starter have a combined -11 TO mark. DEN has also been helped out by the resurgence of Willis McGahee who has an impressive 7 games with 100 yd rushing finishing 8th in rush yds TY. DEN has run the ball an amazing 62% since their bye week so its not a surprise that only 2 players have more than 20 rec's right now. Eric Decker and Demaryius Thomas have good speed the current offense hasn't maximized it. DEN's OL had started 16 straight gms together but RG Chris Kuper broke his ankle vs KC which ends the run. DEN's defense has outplayed its #20 ranking and have the likely Def ROY in Von Miller solidifying the defense. They switched to the 4-3 with the talents of Elvis Dumervil and FA pickup Broderick Bunkley but they have given up their share of rush yds. The #17 pass defense is a bit misleading as they've given up a 24-9 ratio and have had issues at both safety spots TY. DEN's special teams were doing very well for most of the year but they dropped to an avg finish due to poor play at the end.

For all the excitement that Tebow has brought to the Bronco's he's clearly their biggest weakness. DEN has been held to under 20 pts in 8 of his starts and by keeping him in the pocket he can be controlled. He now matches up vs a PIT defense that is allowing 258 ypg and 8 ppg since its bye week. In losing Mendenhall with a beat up OL (again) the Steelers will be challenged to go downfield more in a hostile venue. PP calls for PIT to hold DEN to 251 yds in a lower scoring game and we agree with the low total for a play here.

NO beat the Lions 31-17 as an 8.5 pt HF on SNF just 5 weeks ago as Brees hit for 342 yds (72%) with 3 TD's and a 9.5 ypa vs a Lions defense short 3 starters (DT Suh, FS Delmas, CB Houston). The Saints went into the half with a 304-184 yd edge with a 24-7 lead and held DET to 0-6 on 3rd downs on in the 2H. Stafford had 408 yds passing (70%) with a 1-1 ratio but DET was still playing undisciplined ball and was hit with 11 penalties. Common foes are plentiful with the NFC North and South squaring off TY with NO being +106 ypg (-6 TO's) with a 33-22 avg score for a 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS mark. DET went 5-4 SU/3-5-1 ATS vs the same foes with a +37 yd difference (-2 TO's) for a 28-27 score deficit. This is DET's 3rd road game in 4 wks and 1st playoff game since 1999 for a franchise that hasn't won a postseason game since Jan 1992. DET went 5-3 SU/3-5 ATS on the road TY with a +34 yd mark (-2 TO's) and a 29-28 avg score.

Stability breeds success and for the 6th straight year Brees/Payton have a top 5 passing offense. In his L/8 gms Brees has destroyed pass defenses avg 341 ypg (72%) with a 27-4 ratio and his lowest QBR TY at home was 96.8 vs ATL. The diff in TY's #1 off is that 56% of the rec's and 47% of the rec yds are thru the RB/TE's which allows more blockers to get into play after the catch. NO's 56.7% rate on 3rd downs is the best since IND's 56.1% back in 2006. NO's #6 ground game is very underrated as no single RB is putting up big #s but like NE, they play the back that fits the situation. For the 3rd straight year NO put 5 players in the Pro Bowl and all 5 are on offense. Graham broke Kellen Winslow's 31 year old record of 1,290 yds for a TE and is only in his 2nd year in the league. NO has had the same OL for 8 straight gms headlined by the best OG tandem in the NFL with Carl Nicks and Jahri Evans. NO didn't have a single defender voted to the Pro Bowl TY and after being 4th in yds and 7th in pts LY they are 24th and 14th. After earning 25 takeaways LY they only have 16 TY. MLB Vilma has been playing with a sore knee and teams have gotten used to DC Gregg Williams' schemes. Williams still likes to disperse the pressure from all over as noted by the fact that SS Roman Harper has more sks than DE Will Smith. After finishing 28th and 22nd in our special teams rankings in '09-'10, NO has a top 10 unit TY thanks to Darren Sproles who has 1,000+ total yds on offense and 1,000+ KR yds TY along with a healthy 10.1 PR avg.

It's not hard to associate the health of Matt Stafford to the Lions' 10 win season TY. After playing in

just 13 gms in his first 2 yrs for a rookie-level total of 216 ypg (55%) with a 19-21 ratio, he exploded to 314 ypg (64%) with a 41-16 ratio. Aside from Jahvid Best, DET has had 10 of 11 offensive st'rs healthy for all 16 gms TY which in turn saw their 1st 400+ pt season S/95 which was also the last time they had 6,000 yds offense. The lack of a run gm has been a thorn in the side of OC Scott Linehan TY as DET has gotten off to a slow start in most games TY (outgained in 10 gms at half). While WR Calvin Johnson (only Pro Bowler TY) dictates the opposing defenses, Titus Young has quietly surged as a slot WR in the past 5 games (19 rec 12.2 ypc 4 TD). DET was forced to bring back Kevin Smith who was released back in March to bolster their RB depth and despite a high ankle sprain at the end of the yr he's been a factor. DET's OL, which has played 15 of 16 games together, is just 16th in sks allowed it's to be expected with over 650 pass att's. It's no secret that DET has one of the deepest and most Darren Sproles 29 294 10.1 1 Darren Sproles 40 1099 27.2 0 talented DL's in the NFL when they play disciplined ball but their LB unit is one of the league's most improved. Stephen Tulloch and Justin Durant have been perfect fits for the scheme and have been outstanding for the #24 run D. In Schwartz's 1st 2 yrs DET gave up a comb 58-23 ratio with ypa's of 8.1 and 7.3. TY they cut it down to a 20-20 ratio prior to GB as they had the same 4 st'rs for 10 of the initial 11 games but FS Delmas (MCL sprain) status is unknown after sitting out 5 straight. DET does have a bottom tier ST's as their coverage and return units haven't impressed.

Incl playoffs since 2008, NO has been lethal at home vs a non-div foe with a 19-3 SU/17-4-1 ATS mark covering 8 straight by a 37-17 avg score with a +169 yd differential. PP gives the Saints a +144 yd edge which is in line with that mark. NO also has a huge special teams edge and with DET having given up 480 yds to Matt Flynn LW facing a white hot Brees does not bode well with them. PP calls for NO to get the cover here and we agree

These teams haven't met since mid-2009 w/the Giants winning 34-31 but failing to cover as a 7 pt HF in OT. The Giants went 4-4 SU/3-4-1 ATS at home TY w/a +30 yd edge (+3 TO's) for a 23.3-23.1 HF in Oil. The Giants went 4-4 SU/3-4-1 ATS at nome 1Y w/a +30 yd edge (+3 10's) for a 23.3-23.1 avg score. ATL went 4-4 SU/3-5 ATS on the road w/a +47 ypg differential (+1 TO's) getting outscored 23-20. ATL went 2-3 SU/1-4 ATS vs the common foes of PHI, SEA, GB, and NO getting outgained by 28 ypg (+2 TO's) and outscored 31-24 on avg. The Giants earned a 1-4 SU/2-3 ATS record w/a -46 ypg margin (-1 TO's) and was outscored 31-25 on avg. Coughlin has covered 5 of his L/6 playoff games. ATL is just 1-5 ATS TY vs foes w/a winning record while the Giants went 2-2 ATS.

ATL's #19 offense is perceived as one of the NFC's most explosive units but the truth is that prior to

the final week of the year they were 12th with a combined 63 plays with runs/passes of 20+ yds. They want to be a vertical passing/power run team behind Michael Turner but they've struggled to implement that. While Turner has six 100 yd rushing games TY he only avg'd 56 ypg (3.3) in the 5 games prior to 172 yds vs TB. Roddy White logged his 5th straight season of 1,150 yds receiving TY and his overall impact has dipped due to coverage and Julio Jones. Tony Gonzalez continues to impress with another to 5.TE season (80 years) but he lost a top and icolt quite as dispension the process are another. top 5 TE season (80 rec's) but he's lost a step and isn't quite as dynamic in the passing game. While Jones has impressed with his deep speed TY logging five 100 yd receiving games he's also basically missed 4 games due to hamstring issues. The OL gave up 13 sks in the 1st 3 games as it adjusted to the loss of RG Harvey Dahl in FA but since then they've given up 16 sks or a fantastic 1 for every 36 att's. ATL is only #19 in sks earned for the #12 defense which is the best finish for DC Brian Van Gorder's tenure. While DE John Abraham is still the big name on the DL, Jonathan Babineaux had a solid year as well. The back 7 played at a much higher level than in 2010 with Sean Weatherspoon playing some dominant ball TY for the #6 rush defense. ATL's secondary is better than their #20 pass defense ranking but injuries to SS William Moore followed by one to up and coming CB Brent Grimes put the unit off track. Since mid-Oct, ATL has only allowed two 300 yd passing games, both to Drew Brees. ATL's special teams are a bit below avg in our rankings as while Eric Weems has had a solid year, Bosher hasn't been able to boom punts due to the offense's success TY.

Statistically, Eli Manning isn't that far off from what you'd expect from him but he's had arguably his best season ever. Working behind 5 different OL combos, 2011 was another year with skill players being dinged up, yet Manning managed to throw for a career-high in passing yards. The Giants have their 1st 1,000 yd duo of receivers in Hakeem Nicks and Victor Cruz. Nicks has been a reliable but not overly splashy as the #1 WR while Cruz has been the 2nd best slot WR in the NFL TY behind Welker. Mario Manningham is now the possession WR and when healthy Jake Ballard is a solid receiving TE. Bradshaw and Jacobs each have a single 100 yd rushing game TY due to injuries to themselves and the OL. They are built to be a power rushing team and are much better than their #31 rush off ranking. The best player on the Giants #27 defense TY has been Jason Pierre-Paul whose 16.5 sks is quite impressive as he entered 2011 as the #3 pass rusher for the team. The LB's are avg even behind a strong DL, but the secondary has been a major liability TY due a lack of depth. They've given up five 300 yd passing games avg 335 ypg (58%) w/a 15-3 ratio in those. This is another unit getting healthier late in the ssn though and SS Kenny Phillips has been excellent when healthy. The Giants special teams aren't much better than 2010's #29 unit as they've struggled

on both sides of the ball on punts and are below avg on KR's.

Over the L4W, the Giants have the #8 and #16 units (+3 TO's) vs a good Dallas offense, a tougher than advertised Washington team and a physical Jets defense.
