NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK FIVE 2011

NEWS AND NOTES - Iowa used the hurry up offense to make a big comeback vs Pitt the previous week overcoming a 17 pt 4Q deficit. They stayed in the hurry up vs ULM. UI scored TD's on their first 2 drives and ULM went on a 57/14pl drive in between but settled for a 43 yd FG. Later ULM was SOD at the UI20 on a 4&4 dropped pass with 4:10 left in the half trailing 21-3 and UI marched 80/8pl getting a TD with 2:07 left in the half. That gave them a 28-3 lead with a 294-134 yd edge. ULM scored TD's on their opening two 3Q drives to make it 35-17 but UI scored a TD and a 32 yd FG on their next 2 drives to ice it... Michigan St bounced back off the Notre Dame loss taking advantage of 4 CM turnovers. They led 7-0 after 1Q when CM was int'd on their next 3 poss. The 2nd of the int's, MSU ret'd directly for a 37 yd TD and they converted on the other two into a TD and a FG to lead 24-0. At the half MSU was up 31-0 and did have a 256-47 yd edge. CM had beaten MSU 29-27 on a last second FG when they last met in 2009. This time MSU finished with a 481-112 yd edge and ended the game at the CM26 taking a knee in the 45-7 win...Memphis suffered another demoralizing defeat with the stadium half empty for Homecoming. They were mauled by SMU 42-0. UM got into the RZ once which was late 1H when they got to the 10 yd line but their 4th down pass fell incomplete. Taylor Reed started and hit 17-32-153. SMU scored TD's on their first 2 poss, fmb'l'd at the UM37 then actually punted twice before going 47 (after 33 yd PR) and 44 yards for TD's to lead 28-0. They also got to the 20 and were int'd in the EZ and had a 302-117 yd edge at the half. SMU did only lead 28-0 after fumbling at the UM5 in the 3Q but went 88/15pl and got a 3&14 TD pass with 7:51 left then after a fmb'l went 13/3pl for another TD to lead 42-0 with 6:10 left...Denard Robinson rushed for a season high 200 yds vs SDSSt but did hit just 8-17-93 yds passing. SDSSt actually had a 20-18 FD edge and UM only a 413-376 yd edge. SDSSt had won their first 3 games for the first time since 1981 but were matched up vs their former HC who knew them inside and out. UM led 21-0 at the half. In the 1H, SDSSt fumbled at the UM39, was SOD on 4&3 at the UM29, had a FD to the UM18 called back on a hold and ended up punting. UM was int'd on their first two 3Q poss and missed a 40 yd FG then fmb'l'd at their own 38 setting up the Aztecs only TD, 21-7 after 3Q's. SDSSt was SOD on 4&2 at the UM43 and UM went 57/4pl for a TD with 6:29 left. The Aztecs fumbled at the UM33 and on 4&10 from the UM13 had the pass dropped at the 1 at the end...Bernard Pierce set a school record with 5 rushing TD's as Temple, which gave Penn St a good fight the previous week, absolutely throttled Maryland leading 31-0 at the half and 38-0 before MD got a TD with 4:31 left to avoid a shutout. MD wore "wounded warrior" jerseys (black, yellow and red) and the profits from an action are donated to a wounded warrior project. QB O'Brien was sk'd for the first 3 times on the year. TU drove 74, 78, 7 (after punt blk), 93 and 66 yards for 4 TD's and a FG on their five 1H drives while MD punted on their first 4 poss and were SOD at the TU10 on their last. MD got an 80/8pl drive for a TD with 4:31 left to avoid the shutout and TU even finished with a 1st & gl at the 2 taking a knee...Mohamed Sanu set a Rutgers school record with 16 rec's but for just 176 yards. Tyler Tetteleton threw for 339 yards for Ohio while Rutgers only had a 410-404 yd edge they turned three 1H TO's into TD's for a 21-7 lead. Ohio fumbled at their own 29 setting up a 5pl drive for a TD and OU drove 26 yds for a TD after an int. OU fmb'l'd at the RU37 with 5:43 left in the half trailing 14-7 and after RU got 1 FD & punted, OU not only fumbled the punt, but RU fell on it in the EZ for a TD and a 21-7 lead with 2:30 left in the half. OU pulled within 28-20 and had the ball at their 46 but fmb'l'd again setting up a RU FG and RU then went 80/13pl with a substitution infraction on 4&1 giving RU a FD at the OU11 and they got an 11 yd TD pass on the next play to put it away 38-20 with 5:00 left. OU went 88/12pl getting a TD with 1:39 left...Teams off losses have been pummeling their FC's opponents and Boston College did just that to Massachusetts, even though they only finished with a 389-313 yd edge. Kellen Pagel is the UMmass QB and he is ex-NFL QB Mike Pagel's son. On his first pass on the first play of the game he was int'd and BC drove 47 yds for a TD. BC was up 17-0 when UM got a 100 yd KR TD to get within 17-7 but at the half BC had a 213-103 yd edge and led 24-7. BC got an 18 yd FR TD to go up 38-10 with 1:17 left in the 3Q and UM went 76/13pl. On 3&gl from the 1, Pagel was int'd and LB Pierre-Louis ret'd it 96 yds for a TD to make it 45-10 with 12:28 left. UMmass gained 93 of their yards after that on their final 3 drives incl a 69/6pl garbage TD...Ball St dominated as in the 1H they had a 333-101 yd edge. It was 7-0 when Army drove 48/12pl and missed a 32 yd FG. BS then went 80/6pl, 7/11pl, 17/6pl (after int) for TD's and went 56/11pl settling for a 21 yd FG on the final play of the half to lead 31-0. It was 45-7 after 3Q's and Army drove 80/10pl for a TD with 12:49 left and each team would get a TD in the final 3:00...Toledo lost RB Adonis Thomas in the 1Q and was missing 4 starters on defense. UT appeared in control early leading 10-0 after 1Q but Syr took a 30-27 lead on a score and a missed xp which somehow was called good by the Big East officiating crew and was not overturned via replay with 2:22 left. UT's opening drive was 75/22pl and they settled for a 20 yd FG and later UT was SOD at the Syr 31. The game was tied at 13 and 20 and UT got a TD with 10:54 left to take a 27-23 lead. Syr punted but then took over with 6:51 left and went 71/10pl for a TD and the lead. UT, after a PF face mask, had a 1st & gl at the 9 threatening for the win but settled for the

tying FG and OT and was int'd in OT while SU got a FG. The BE issued a formal statement 2 hours after the game admitting the officials erred on the xp call...Georgia dominated Mississippi more than the final as they had 25-8 FD and 475-183 yd edges. UGA was int'd at the UM41 but still led 17-0 when QB Rebs Mackey lined up at WR and threw a 38 yd TD pass on a reverse. With just 1:26 left in the half, UGA was up comfortably, 24-7 when UM ran a reverse on the PR and went 81 yds for a TD to make it 24-13. In the 3Q UGA missed a 48, 48 and 35 yd FG's and Blair Walsh had 15 misses on 73 career FG's and had 3 misses here. UM was SOD on 4&10 at their own 33 and Walsh finally hit a 43 yd FG with 4:16 left for the 27-13 final margin...The Irish had a 398-268 yd edge but only led at the half 7-6 because of a 79 yd Gray TD run. ND was int'd at the Pitt5 and missed a 39 yd FG on the 1H. They had a 258-143 yd edge. Pitt had its opening 3Q poss kept alive by roughing the P and they got a TD for a 12-7 lead. The next 4 poss were punts. The Irish took over with 11:28 left and went 85/11pl getting a TD and 2 pt conv with 6:48 left. Pitt got to the ND40 but on 4&25 fired incomplete with 2:24 left...It was unusual to see that Miami and BG combined for 60 points yet BG only had a 310-308 yd edge. BG got an 18 yd TD drive after a fumble and UM got a 6 yd IR TD in the 1H. BG blk'd a punt and rec'd at the 1 setting up a TD and led 20-17 at the half. BG opened it to 20-17 when UM got a TD with 11:03 left but BG fumbled the KO at their own 3 and faced a 2nd & 9 when Anthon Samuel set a school record with a 96 yd TD run. The TD was also a stadium record to put it away. UM's last shot ended on an int in the EZ with 2:20 left...Florida St was off their big game vs Oklahoma which they had looked forward to for 9 months and also was starting backup QB Clint Trickett who looked pretty good. Trickett hit 24-38-336 yds in his first start. He led FSU 67/8pl for a 32 yd FG. Clemson went 80/7pl for a TD then roughing the P gave them a FD and they went 77/8pl for a TD. They were up 21-10 at the half with a 227-168 yd edge. FSU got a 25 yd IR TD on the 4th play of the 3Q to get back in it 21-17. After a punt CU went 70/12pl for a TD, 28-17 but FSU went 80/7pl to make it 28-23. CU got a 62 yd TD pass, 35-23 (13:06 4Q). FSU went 78/4pl for a TD, 35-30 (7:21). CU was SOD on 4&1 at the FSU24 (2:49). FSU got to the 37 but on 4&8 Trickett was sk'd with 1:37 left...Oregon St fell to 0-3 for the first time since 1996. OSU did have an 85 yd PR TD just before the half to get back in this one. It was the 2nd longest PR in school history. OSU finished with 375-357 yd and 22-17 FD edges. They went on an 82/17pl drive to open but settled for a 25 yd FG. UCLA went 80/3pl for a TD then after an int went 46/7pl for a TD and after a fumble went 4 yards for a TD and led 21-3 with :32 left in the half UCLA punted and OSU got an 85 yd PR TD. At the half UCLA had a 209-138 yd edge and led 21-10. OSU pulled within to 21-19 but missed the 2 pt conv on the final play of the 3Q. UCLA got a TD with 6:15 left but the xp was blk'd leaving OSU within 8. They were SOD on 4&8 at the LA22 with 2:12 left and UCLA got 2 FD's and ran out the clock...Tulane did not force Duke to punt until the 4Q and Duke finished with a 484-318 yd edge despite the fact TU drove 77/8 and 96/11 for TD's in the final 10:37 while Duke gained just 29 yards in that span after leading 48-13. TU was off an upset as a DD underdog on the road and wilted for the 2nd straight time in that situation...Trent Richardson rushed for 126 yds and added 85 yds in rec plus 24 KR yds. Alabama had a 210-89 yd edge at the half but only led 17-7 but Maze got an 83 yd PR TD. Richardson took a screen pass 61 yds for a TD and Bama rolled to a 38-14 lead after 3Q's before playing conservative in the 4Q...Houston rolled to a 56-0 rout of Georgia St. They had a 732-241 yd edge...The UAB/E Carolina game was very interesting. EC turned it over 7 times but still managed a 28-23 win. UAB also had 3 TO's incl an int in the EZ in the 2Q. EC led 14-10 at the half when they gave up a 35 yd IR TD. The Pirates still appeared poised for the cover. They drove 62/6pl and 80/6pl for TD's, 28-17. UAB QB Ellis was ? coming in and was taken off on a backboard and backup QB Perry fumbled. EC took over at the 50 and drove 50/7pl but going in for the spread covering TD with 13:29 left, Dobson fumbled into the EZ for a TB. Perry led UAB 80/6pl incl a 51 yd pass and the TD made it 28-23 with 10:58 left. EC35 was driving for the clinching score and was at the UAB15 on 2&5 when they were int'd at the 9. UAB9 took over with 7:02 left at their own 9 and went 73/17pl. Looking for the game winning TD on 4&8 from the 18, they fired incomplete in the EZ with 2:22 left and EC got 1 FD and ran out the clock. EC did have a 542-400 yd edge...Louisiana Tech had a costly int in the 4Q or would have upset Miss St. MSU had 10 pis via spec tms as they got their first PR TD S/07. It was a 72 yd punt that Bumphis ret'd 82 yds for a TD in the 1Q. LT led 10-7 but MSU rallied to lead 17-10 at the half. MSU took a gamble in the 3Q going for it on 4&1 at their own 34 and was SOD and LT got a TD 6pl later to tie it but then LT fumbled a punt on their own 25 setting up a MSU FG and trailed 20-17. With 8:42 left, LT got a 28 yd FG to tie. They took over at their 20 with 6:50 left and got 3 FD's to the MSU20. On 3&5 from the 20, Isham floated a pass in the corner of the EZ which was int'd for a TB and the game went to OT. Isham tossed another int on the 2nd play of OT and MSU on 2&2 got a 17 yd TD pass to Perkins to pull out the win. LT had a 359-340 yd edge...Western Michigan settled for too many FG's in the 1H. They had a 227-200 1H yd edge but missed a 44 yd FG, went on an 18pl drive and missed a wide open rec on 1st & gl settling for a 26 yd FG, missed another FG, this one from 49 yds and went on a 13pl drive and settled for a 24 yd FG. At the half they only led 13-10. Illinois battled back to lead 20-13 but WM tied it with 13:58 left. UI got a 21 yd FG with 8:14 left for the lead. WM punted with 5:59 left and IU did a good job getting 3 FD's before being SOD with 1:05 left and WM having no time-outs left. WM got 2 FD's but too many of the plays were in bounds and they ran out of time at the IU41.

cont. from Front Page... Troy won its 6th straight vs Middle Tenn despite being outgained 582-479 and not taking their first lead until 1:11 was left in the 3Q. They named the field at Veterans Memorial Stadium Larry Blakeney Field. MTSU led 28-24 when they settled for a 42 yd FG and missed it. Troy got a 75 yd TD pass on the next play and they forced 2 MTSU punts while scoring a TD and Troy led 38-28. MTSU got a TD with 3:18 left then forced a punt and got it back with 2:53 left and got to the Troy 35 but on 4&5 were int'd at the 17....Kansas St delivered an Underdog POW win on these pages with their outright upset. The Wildcats QB Collin Klein was very impressive hitting 12-18-133 while rushing for 93 incl a crucial 26 yd run on 2&29 pinned at their own 3. K-St led 14-3 at the half and missed a 46 yd FG to open the 3Q. They still led 21-10 but UM got some big plays like a 59 yd TD run by Miller and a 34 yd TD pass to Benjamin and took a 24-21 lead. KSU answered with an 80/8pl drive for a TD. Each team punted but KSU only got off a 20 yd punt with 3:52 left and UM was able to get down to the 2 yd line. On 4&gl from the 1 Harris took off to the left and was clearly down and it didn't even look like the ball ever crossed the goal line but he was awarded a TD. Replays marked the ball at the 1.5 yd line and KSU held on for the outright upset...For the 3rd straight year Oklahoma St came back from a half time deficit. Brandon Weeden threw for a school record 438 yds and 2 scores. A&M appeared in complete control scoring on 4 of their 1H pass while OSU had 3 punts. OSU scored TD's on their first 3 poss of the 3Q while A&M punted, fumbled at the OSU44, was int'd at their own 23, int'd at their own 34, and punted on their first 5 poss. They trailed 30-20 when they drove 80/15pl for a TD with 2:20 left. They forced a punt with 1:47 left but turned it over again

on an int on 2nd & 9. On the last play of the game OSU with :05 left opted for Blackmon to race 39 yds into the EZ for a safety which skewed the rushing stats a little as they lost 55 yds on the final 4pl and made the final 30-29...We used Nevada as a Big Dog POW and unfortunately they could not hold on to a 28-13 lead mid3Q. Texas Tech on 4&4 with :36 left got a 4 yd TD pass to pull out the 1 pt win. Doege looked stymie as he took the snap on the final score, back peddled to the 17, scanned for an open rec, nobody to the middle, right looked left and found the TD. Nev alternated QB's Cody Fajardo and Tyler Lantrip but Fajardo's 139 yds rushing were a spark. TT was without top WR Moore for most of the game (inj'd ankle 1Q). The key to the game was that Nev went on an 83/12pl, 63/11pl and 78/12pl drives that resulted in 3 FG's of 31, 25 and 21 yds. Not only did they settle for those FG's, the missed the 13 yarder and lost by a point as TT on 4&gl from the 4 had the QB scramble back to the 17 before hitting a TD pass with :36 left and TT pulled out the win...All week Tulsa QB GJ Kinne was doubtful to play and while he did play, he hit just 14-24-123 yards. TU did not cross midfield in the first 38:30 of the game. Boise had a 307-90 yd edge at the half leading 27-0 and scored a TD to open the 3Q to lead 34-0. Kellen Moore's day was done and the backups played the rest where TU got 3 TD's after that including a 59/8pl drive for a garbage TD with 3:19 left making the game appear closer than it really was...Baylor punted on their first pass vs Rice but scored TD's on the next 5 poss. They did have 2 short fields with a 28 yd PR setting up a 43 yd TD and a fumbled KR setting up a 21 yd TD drive. It was 35-17 when RJ3 fmbld at the end of a 26 yd run at the Rice4 with :36 left. BU had a 381-211 yd edge at the half and 673-416 yd edge for the game.

4★ Alabama over FLORIDA - LY AL ended FL's streak of 24 reg ssn wins and handed Urban Meyer the 2nd most lopsided loss in his tenure at FL. They had met in the SEC Title gm the prev 2 yrs and Bama (-8) led 24-3 at HT thanks to a couple of key plays but relaxed a little in the 2H and ended up being outgained 281-273. LW Bama (-11) rolled #12 Ark 38-14 as we cashed our 4★ Top Weekly LPS on the Tide and they outgained the Hogs 397-226. RB Richardson is right back in the Heisman race after totaling 211 yds (126 rush, 85 rec) LW Tide QB McCarron had another efficient outing and is avg 195 ypg (66%) with a 4-2 ratio. The Gators tandem of Demps/Rainey have been the key to the offense all season and LW was no different as they comb for 277 all-purp yds (avg 275 all-purp ypg) in the 48-10 (-18) win over Kentucky. QB Brantley and OC Weis will face their biggest test to date vs the #1 D in the country. While the off and def are nearly even, UF does have a slight edge on ST's (#5-20). Bama is 12-7 as an AF and UF has been a HD just once in 10Y (0-1 ATS). Saban is a big gm veteran while this is Muschamp's 1st go-round vs a ranked foe as HC and we'll lean with the Tide who are 7-1-2 ATS vs UF since 1994.

3★ Western Mich (+) over CONNECTICUT - LY UC lost at MAC's Temple 30-16 and only outgained Buffalo 399-368 getting a TD w/1:26 left and a pick 6 with no time left for the miracle cover. LW they again got a frontdoor cover vs Buff 17-3 (-9) thanks to a poor tkl on a 49 yd TD rec with 4:58 left as they were outgained 319-293. The Huskies went a very deceiving 5-0 ATS as a HF LY (0-2 TY) and in the 4 gms vs FBS tms were outgained AT HOME by 22 ypg. WM has played 2+ BCS tms in each of the L5Y and while they are on a 3-8-1 ATS run they did beat Illinois in '08 and Iowa in '07. WM is on their 2nd straight away vs a BCS team and making their first flight S/'08's opener. We won a 3★ LPS on WM LW, as they only lost 23-20 to Illinois (+14). They did lose their top RB Drake (inj, CS) vs Ill and after avg 132 ypg rushing coming in, WM had just 35 vs Ill. WM has the off edge (#64-102), while UC has the def edge (#49-77). The 3rd visit to a BCS school TY is the charm for the Broncos.

3★ VIRGINIA TECH over Clemson - VT has pulled the upset in both ACC meetings covering by 23' and 22 pts. Clemson is off B2B HG's having beaten LY's Nat'l Champs and the Atl fav Fla St while VT is playing its 1st BCS tm. VT is off a 30-10 win over Marshall. DC Foster's defense is coming off one of his worst ssn's ever and TY has all'd 231 ypg to a soft sked. CU is coming off a 35-30 win over a Fla St tm that was missing QB Manuel. OC Morris' offense requires spd and he now has plenty of it while QB Boyd (314 ypg, 66%, 13-2) has matured under his tutelage. Fr WR Watkins has won 2 POW honors and most likely will get a 3rd after 141 yds (17.6) and 2 TD vs FSU. Swinney is 4-1 as an AD but Beamer is 9-5 as a HF and VT has won the L5 in the series by 23 ppg (no win by less than 17). The VT D and RB Wilson (130 ypg, 5.8) have all'd QB Thomas a chance to grow and now face a CU tm that has trailed Troy, Wolf and Aub while all'g 398 ypg. This is a tough spot for QB Boyd making his 1st road start and how much can CU have left in the tank after two huge HG's?

2★ Texas over IOWA ST - LY ISU came to Texas after giving up 120 pts in its prev 2 gms. "Historic" said HC Rhoads LY after ISU's 1st ever win vs UT and 1st win over a ranked opp on the road S/'90. ISU led 28-6 early 4Q as 43% (187) of UT's yds came after. It was LY's gm vs the Cyclones which convinced HC Brown that the Horns players and staff had become entitled and complacent and changes needed to be made. Prior to the bye the Horns used 3 int in the 1Q to jump out to a 14-0 lead over another revenge target UCLA in QB McCoy (12-15 168 yds and 2 TD) and RB Brown's (110) starting debuts. For the 1st time in ISU history the Cyclones have won their 1st 3 gms by 4 or fewer pts. QB Jantz (222 ypg, 58%, 6-6, 112 rush) has overcome slow starts to lead ISU to gm winning drives in the 4Q or OT in all 3! LTH, without the revenge motivation, UT was -16' and a 2★ on these pages in '07 and rolled to a 56-3 win (cover by FIVE TD's!). Okla is on deck for UT but they are off a bye and ready to start handing out some B12 payback in our Revenge Play of the Week.

2★ Nebraska (+) over WISCONSIN - The Badgers get the honor of being the official B10 welcoming committee in a night gm at Camp Randall with the GameDay crew on hand. Neb was 13-2 SU in B12 openers. NU did knock off OKSt on the road LY and Pelini is 6-1 ATS on away from home vs ranked tms. UW is 1-3 SU/ATS at home vs ranked tms but did knock off #1 Ohio St LY. The 4-0 SU/ATS Badgers have faced little resistance thus far outscoring foes by 40 ppg incl LW's 59-10 whipping of SD with 25-9 FD and 612-173 yd edges. Difference maker QB Wilson is #2 FBS pass eff (284 ypg, 76%, 11-1). The Huskers didn't fall prey to look ahead and won the biggest home gm in Wyom history 38-14 with a 490-305 yd edge. QB Martinez (421, 6.7) and RB Burkhead (420, 6.7) are #2 and 3 in B10 rushing although the pass gm has been inconsistent in the new off. Blackshirts were without potential #1DC DT Crick (concussion) and CB Dennard (leg) saw action for the 1st time TY LW and NU has all'd 390 ypg to FBS foes TY. NU has the D (#15-29) and ST (#4-78) edges while UW has the off (#11-30) and home crowd although NU received a record number of ticket requests for this gm and have instructed their fans to wear black.

FORECAST: Nebraska 30 (+) WISCONSIN 33

2★ GEORGIA over Miss St - UGA had a series high 9 gm win streak snapped LY. It was one of the biggest wins in Mullen's tenure at MSU and we won with a 4★ College Totals Play on the Under 46' and it was 10-7 with 5:00 left. Last time MSU won in Athens was in 1956 and they dropped their L8 trips by 20 ppg but only lost 27-24 in their last ('06). Scheduling edge to Miss St with this sandwiched vs a pair of non-conf gms while UGA is sandwiched by 3 SEC AG's. LW in what fans termed the "Hot Seat" Bowl HC Richt and the Bulldogs (-9) got a key 27-13 conf win over Nutt and Ole Miss. QB Murray is avg 235 (64%) with an 11-3 ratio while super frosh RB Crowell leads with 411 (5.3). MSU had all they could handle with LT LW pulling out a 26-20 win (-19) in OT. After 2 great gms to open the yr QB Reff is showing the effects of taking a lot of punishment as he is avg 16 carries a game and now is completing just 58% with a 4-3 ratio. Miss St is 4-9 as an AD. GA has slight edges on off (#12-31) and def (#13-27), has a large edge on ST's (#8-91) and is playing with legit revenge over an opp they have owned here.

Thursday, September 29th

USF at Pittsburg - Pitt has won and covered 3 straight in the series incl LY when they broke a 10-10 tie w/a 22 yd TD run on the 1st play of the 4Q. The Panthers have gone 7-2 ATS home vs the BE while USF's success still depends on BJ Daniels' int's as they are 10-1 ATS vs FBS tms when he doesn't throw more than 1 int and have lost 6 straight. ATS when he's tossed multiple. USF has to travel on short week but should be fresher after facing 3 lightweight foes while Pitt is off of physical gms vs Iowa and ND in which they blew 4Q leads in both.

Houston at UTEP - The HT is 4-1 SU/ATS. LY UTEP led 7-0 but allowed a ssn high 656 yds as UH scored on 9 of 12 poss and did not punt. While a short week usually favors the home team Hou is off a HG vs GAST while UTEP is off 3 straight road games incl a cross country trip (all'd 575 yds and 52 pts vs USF). UTEP is 9-4 as a HD under Price while UH is 3-9 ATS on the road (upset 5x's).

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Friday, September 30th

Utah St at BYU - USU has now covered 3 straight and LY snapped a series high 10 gm losing streak, however, they've still lost 15 str trips to Provo. The Cougs are off a very difficult 4 gm stretch and are playing with legit revenge. BYU rebounded off the Holy War loss with a nice Fri Night Marquee Winner, beating UCF 24-17 (-2). We went against USU LW using Colo St (+10) as a 3★ LPS and USU went for two in the 2nd OT and was denied, losing outright 35-34. USU is 9-2 as an AD and ply'd Aub close earlier TY, although BYU is 7-1 ATS off a SU win. **Get the Friday Night Marquee Winner on gameday after 3:00 pm ET on your Northcoast Debit Card for just \$9.**

Saturday, October 1st

NAVY 23 Air Force 20 - LY's loss snapped Navy's streak of 7 str wins vs AF, 15 str vs service academies and 8 str yrs of holding the CIC Trophy. Down 1 pt in the 4Q Navy had a punt blk'd that led to an AF TD (also int at the AF22 w/2:55). Despite the loss Navy still covered (+9) making it 7-0-1 ATS and we won with a 4★ LPS on the Mids and they never trailed ATS and almost won outright. The Falcons haven't won in Annapolis S/'97. LTH AF was held w/o an offensive TD and missed a 31 yd FG to send it to OT. This is AF's 1st AG of the yr, off a blowout win vs Tenn St 63-24 with a school rec'd 792 ttl yds. Navy is off a bye and expect the Mids (15-3 SU at home) to pull out the win in this low scoring affair.

ILLINOIS 24 Northwestern 21 - LY's gm was at Wrigley Field with both tms going in the same direction. UI rushed for 518 yds (strong QB/44) and Leshoure eclipsed UI's single-gm rush rec'd w/330 yds (10.0). 6'6" Watkins (4th str gm TY) made his 1st career start (Persa inj) for NW hitting 10-20-135 with an 0-1 ratio. The L/2 times NW has traveled here they've pulled the upset. Persa is exp to ret for the 1st time TY after sitting out the 1st 3 (Achilles) with Colter (130 ypg, 65%, 1-1, #1 rusher 237) starting the ssn strong until faltering vs Army. Both QB's are exp to play. NU is all'g 206 rush ypg (4.7) bloated by Army's 381 (5.1). IL is 4-0 for the 1st time S/'51 after rallying from a 13-10 HT deficit to beat pesky WM 23-20 (we had a 4★ LPS on the Broncos +14) as the Illini had a 296-35 yd rush edge. QB Scheelhaas (159 ypg, 71%, 4-2, 224 rush) is #16 FBS pass eff but has had to be taken out of the L/2 after hits. IL is #1 B10 in sks (13). NU is 7-2 as an AD and 8-3 ATS in this series.

MICHIGAN 36 Minnesota 23 - Michigan is 19-1 SU (6-2 ATS) in the series but is just 1-10 ATS at home vs conf. The Wolves pressed the D-RB button early racing out to a 21-0 HT lead thanks to his 3 TD runs vs HC Hoke's former team SDSt in a covering (-10) yet sloppy 28-7 win in which UM had just a 413-376 yd edge and was outFD'd 20-18 while losing 4 TO's. QB Robinson is #4 FBS rushing (506, 8.0) but last in the B10 in comp % (44%). Improved Wolves D still is all'g 176 rush ypg (4.9). In front of an estimated 12,000 NDSt fans, Minny lost to the FCS's #12 tm at home 37-24. The Bison drove 65, 83 and 71 yd for TD's in the 1H but the gm's turning point came when Gray was int'd on a desperation pass with :05 left 2Q and the int was ret'd 52 yd after a lateral for a TD. NDSt also added a 40 yd IR TD with 2:58 left as Minny had an 18-17 FD edge. Kill used both QB's Gray (130 ypg, 51%, 3-3, #1 rush 351) and Shortell (4-8 for 71 yd w/1-1 ratio vs NDSt) and he said he wasn't sure who'll get the call going forward. Gophers allow just 105 rush ypg (3.7). Gophers have a ST edge (#58-94) but the Wolves have the rest of the edges (#14-85 off, #46-69 D).

BOSTON COLLEGE 27 Wake Forest 24 - BC is 4-0 SU/ATS vs WF but each was covered by a TD or less. WF struggled on the road LY getting outgained by 144+ yds in each (241 ypg). Grobe is 3-11 as an AD. Both teams are off wins over FCS opponents. RB Harris returned (miss 1st 3) for BC as they rolled over UMass 45-17 LW. Prior to UMass BC was avg'g just 81 ypg rush (3.1) but looked to have found confidence. WF is off a bye after a 48-5 win over G-W 2 weeks ago. LTH WF scored 2 TD's in the final 5:07 incl w/1:11 to force OT but fmb'l'd on 1&gl after BC had kicked a FG. LY RB Harris accounted for 63% (188) of BC's yds and all 3 TD's. BC has the def edge (#33-73) and has played the tougher sked (#39-117). After a disappointing 0-3 start (worst start S/'91) Spaz's young team looks to turn the corner and get a much needed home win.

Rutgers 30 SYRACUSE 23 - Syracuse has won and covered B2B gms vs Rutgers as a 2' pt AF LY and as a 9' pt HD in '09. The Orange however are very fortunate to pull out the OT victory over Toledo in which they were outgained 449-371 and the Big East conf formally announced an Orange 4Q PAT should not have counted. Rutgers also saw a bit of luck head their way vs Ohio w/a +2 TD finish and an 12 pt win. The Orange had quite an unusual year LY during conf gms as the visitor was a perfect 7-0 ATS but Rutgers was overmatched away from home vs BE opp losing 3 of 4 by 20+ while getting outgained in all 4 by 242 ypg. LY SU trailed in the 2H but w/the gm tied went 66/11pl hitting a 24 yd FG w/1:03 left (RU SOD at own 33 on last poss). There are trends favoring both tms as Rutgers is 11-5 as an AD while the HT is 10-3 ATS. This one could go down to the final minutes.

Toledo 27 TEMPLE 23 - Toledo is 6-14 SU on the MAC road but was 3-1 SU/ATS LY. This is the Rockets 3rd road gm in 4W with their only HG vs #4 Boise. Temple blew out Maryland 38-7 (+9) with a 425-240 yd edge. In his 1st start of the ssn, QB Stewart hit 9-9-140. Owl RB Pierce had his 3rd 100 yd gm (tied schl rec'd with 5 TD's) and leads with 496 (5.7) and 12 TD's (#1 FBS). Toledo lost in OT to Syracuse 33-30 (+2), thanks in part to a review error on what should have been a missed Syr PAT. The Rockets lost their leading rusher Thomas (brk arm) in the 1Q for 3-4W. While bkp RB Fluellen had just 62 yds, UT still had a 438-366 yd edge. Temple has the def edge (#54-76) but Toledo has the off edge (#59-90). Temple took the frustrations of letting the Penn St game slip away out on Maryland, but look for Toledo to take their outs on the Owls.

WEST VIRGINIA 49 Bowling Green 24 - BG has already exceeded its win ttl from LY and has 2 road wins under its belt incl LW's 37-23 win (+5) over Mia, Oh where true Fr RB Samuel (428 yd, 7.0) had 121 rush yds incl a school rec'd 96 yd TD run (Samuel left gm with inj in 4Q, CS). BG has covered 5 of 9 vs BCS tms and is 8-3 ATS as an AD under HC Clawson. This is HC for the Mountaineers and it's sandwiched between LW's offense defining LSU GameDay matchup and the BE opener vs LY's BE champ Conn. WV was 3-9 as a HF under former HC Stewart but finished LY covering 5 of 6. WV closed to within 27-21 with a late 3Q TD but then all'd a 99 yd KR TD and LSU rolled to a 47-21 (-5) win. WV QB Smith was 38-65 for a school rec'd 463 yds while WR Austin had 11 rec for 187 yds. WV is 14-0 at home vs non-BCS tms (40-12 avg). WV has the edge on off (#23-83) and def (#55-96). While this game hasn't been on WV's radar, they would like to erase LW's loss and should get back to their winning ways.

VIRGINIA 44 Idaho 13 - 1st meeting. This is a unique East Coast trip for the Vandals and they are playing just their second ever ACC opponent. UI is 8-3 ATS as an AD and has covered in 5 of its L6 vs BCS tms. UI QB Reeder was 22-38-235 LW but the Vandals allowed 513 ttl yds in a 48-24 (+3) loss to Fresno and managed just 55 yds in the 2H. UVA has the edge on off (#63-107), def (#53-109) and ST (#33-80). UVA is coming off a 30-24 (-3) loss LW to S Miss where QB Rocco (198 ypg, 62%, 1-7 ratio) continued to struggle with int going 16-24 for 140 yds with 3 picks. LY the Cavs went 3-0-1 ATS vs non-conf tms and outscored the 4 opp's in the 2H by a 75-13 margin. UI is recently off a trip to Texas A&M and faced a physical FSU team LW while UVA has a bye on deck and should be focused because this is a gm the Cavs need to win to keep their bowl hopes in sight.

TENNESSEE 38 Buffalo 10 - Tenn showed LY that if given the chance to run up the score they will do so. They topped 50 pts 3 times incl both of the times they were favored by 14+. The Vols had a bye since their Florida loss and they spent the off week figuring out how to replace their best WR, Justin Hunter (17 rec, 18.5, ACL). QB Bray has been terrific avg 329 ypg (68%) with a 10-2 ratio but they need to shore up a run gm that is avg just 82 ypg (2.4). Under HC Quinn Buffalo is 0-5 SU/1-4 ATS vs non-conf FBS tms but they have played well vs Conn and Pitt TY and despite the two SU losses actually outgained them by a 361-352 avg. Missed opportunities in the red zone cost them LW as they scored just 3 pts in 3 trips. Cincy trans QB Anderson is avg 196 ypg (59%) with a 3-3 ratio while RB Oliver leads with 442 (4.4). You have to think UB had LW's HC gm circled while the Vols are off a bye and there will be no looking past lesser foes with memories of LY's 2OT game vs UAB still lingering.

ARMY 34 Tulane 27 - The visitor has covered 4 str incl pulling the upset the L3Y and in '08 Army won 44-13 as a 19' pt dog. LY Army was +1 on the road and rolled to a 41-23 win in the dome. Tulane is on a 3rd str road trip and while they are 4-2 ATS as a AD they were a DD dog in all 6. Tulane's up and down ssn continued LW (trailed Duke 45-13 after 3Q). LW Army was mauled by Ball ST (trailed 38-0). Tulane with all their travel has even less time to prep for the bone and just faced two pass happy offenses. Tulane is on a 3-9 ATS run and Army is 1-3 SU but 2-0 ATS at home. Tulane is allowing 122 rush ypg (3.5) but Army has run for at least 300 yds in 4 str for the 1st time S/96.

Penn St 33 INDIANA 16 - PSU is 14-0 vs IU with the avg MOV by 17 ppg. The Lions are 9-1 ATS as a B10 AF but Indy was 3-0 LY as a conf HD. Indy had covered L/3 but LY we used the Lions as the NC Sportsline Comp Play in Landover MD and they won 41-24 (-10) with QB McGloin hitting 22-31 for 315 yds. That gm was 24-24 with less than 2:00 left 3Q when the Lions ret'd a blk'd P for a TD. PSU threw their 1st TD pass of the ssn in a costly 34-6 win over EM. McGloin hit 14-17 for 220 and a 3-0 ratio while st'r Bolden was 7-13 for 115 and a 1-0 ratio. The D lost leaders LB Mauti (OFY ACL) and CB Lynn (back, CS) vs the Eagles. Indy trailed NT 24-0 before making things interesting with an IR TD and 2 late TD drives led by bkp QB Kiel. The Hoosiers totalled 217 of their 404 yds in their L/4 drives and the deficit could've been worse as NT had a 24 yd FG blk'd and fmbld at the IU31 and 41 on their 1st 3 drives. IU's #1 rec Belcher didn't make the trip (CS). Disjointed Hoosiers are allowing 190 rush ypg (4.4). PSU eases into conf play with the struggling off taking on our #110 D.

Georgia Tech 34 NC STATE 31 - The dog is 6-1 ATS with 5 outright upsets as the visitor has won 4x. In LY's gm the FD's told the story as NCSt held GT to a ssn low (15) while GT all'd a ssn high (27) and the Wolfpack went on the road (+7) and won outright, 45-28. NCSt has an edge after a Thurs gm prior and C Mich on deck while GT is off its ACC opener and their QB will make his 1st ACC road start. A banged up NCSt D all'd 503 yds in their 44-14 loss to Cincy. Eight of their top 15 players are inj'd incl their starting front 4 and they now face the triple option. GT met its 1st true test LW and snuck by with a 35-28 win over NC. GT missed a FG, fmbld in H0, had an int and Hill dropped a wide open TD. GT is 6-2 under Johnson as an AF while NCSt is 7-3 as HD and beat #16 PSU, 28-14 LY. GT is 4-0 for the 1st time S/90, the yr they shared Nat'l Title. GT gets revenge on a Wilson-less Wolfpack squad but won't have it easy.

EASTERN MICH 27 Akron 20 - EM has lost 3 str to the Zips each by a TD, but EM is 7-1 ATS in the series. UA is 1-5 SU in Ypsilanti but won the LTH ('08). That was Akron's last road win as they have now dropped 16 straight by 21 ppg. EM was 0-10 SU (2-8 ATS) at home in HC English's 1st 2 yrs and while the Eagles have won both at home TY, those were vs FCS foes (1-1 ATS). This HG is important to EM as it is sandwiched by 4 AG's. Both tms are at the bottom of our rankings as Akron has our #119 off and #115 D, while EM ranks #115 and #116. However, Akron has faced the much tougher sked (#54-110) and Akron did outgain Cincy 349-342 on the road. EM's offensive strength has been their rushing as they are avg 234 ypg (5.2) while Akron is allowing 233 ypg rush (poor 4.6). The Eagles have missed Sherrer (ankle) the L/2 and HC English hinted he used the PSU gm to get more passing opp for his QB's to get them ready for MAC play. These two comb for 3 wins LY but already have a comb 3 wins TY (all FCS). After going 2-22 in '09-'10, EM gets their 3rd win of the season here.

Cincinnati 41 MIAMI, OH 14 - UC has won a record tying 5 str (by 28 ppg, 4-1 ATS) in the 115 gm series. LY UC posted 609 tkl yds (#5 schl history) with 384 yds rush. MU gave up 28 pts in the 1Q. UC recorded a 197 yd effort from RB Pead on just 10 carries. New MU HC Treadwell was the OC at Cincy from '05-'06. Cincy has had extra days to prep with a bye on deck. UC should have the added motivation of their rival winning 10 gms LY while they were at home for the holidays. MU would have to win out (incl MAC Champ and bowl) to equal that win til as they are 0-3 (1-2 ATS) TY. They lost their MAC opener LW to BG, 37-23, as a 5' pt HF despite only being outgained 310-308. We won our Thurs Night Marquee LW with Cincy (-7) beating NC State 44-14 with a 503-322 yd edge. Cincy has the def (#47-61) and huge off (#26-110) edges. Cincy has lost just 2 TO's TY and is +14 TO's on the yr while Miami has just 3 takeaways on the ssn and is -3 TO's.

OHIO 38 Kent St 10 - OU has all'd 7 sks to KSU in each of the L2Y. LTH the Flashes held the OU to -9 rush yds (2nd best ever) as the D had 7 sks and 3 int (KSU led 20-3 late 4Q). LY Ohio needed a win to wrap up the MAC East on the Fri after T-Day. KSU was playing its last game for outgoing HC Martin and was pumped up at home. OU trailed 14-0 despite just 64 yds off by KSU. OU had a 37 yd FG blk'd and was sk/ fmbld in EZ (rec for KSU TD) on their 1st 2 drives and Kent ST (+4) got the upset, 28-6. OU is 7-3 ATS at home and KSU is 15-41 SU on the road. The Flashes got their 1st win LW, but despite leading 33-0 in the 2H, did not cover as a 9' pt HF (33-25) over S Alabama. Ohio is off its 1st loss falling 38-26 to Rutgers (+4) despite only being outgained 410-404. KSU has played the tougher sked (#59-116). While the def's are close (OU #89-98), OU has a large off edge (#67-120). OU is the stronger tm and gets its revenge.

Texas Tech 41 KANSAS 34 - TT has covered B2B, won 1 pt in a row (avg 42-22) and 6 straight at Kansas. LTH ('08) they took on a #19 KU tm and were a 1 pt dog and were a 4★ LPS. TT won 63-21 covering by 43 pts! TT is 8-3-1 as an AF and KU is 3-7 as a HD. KU used the bye to regroup after the D was shredded by GT for an FBS record 12.1 ypc as part of a school record 604 rush yds. KU is #120 FBS in scoring (44.0), rush (282, 7.5) and tkl D (550) and is still scrambling with the offsn blows of DC Torbush retiring in June and the loss of their top 2 DT's. Webb (192 ypg, 66%, 6-0) is 1 of the FBS's most improved QB's as he's #5 in FBS pass eff after KU finished #110 FBS pass eff LY. TT rallied from a 28-14 mid-3Q deficit when QB Doege hit the GW 4 yd TD pass on 483 with .36 left despite being outgained by Nev 562-441. Doege is #7 FBS pass eff (316 ypg, 77%, 11-0 ratio) but his top target Moore (#2 FBS coming in w/ 21 rec, 16.1) inj'd his ankle early and was shutout. The Raiders have all of the edges (#28-82 off, #80-112 D and #48-93 ST) but do have A&M on deck while only LY's NCAA record setting comeback over Col has kept the Hawks from dropping their L/8 B12 HG's (1-7 ATS).

BOISE ST 41 Nevada 17 - UN snapped a series high 10 gm losing streak in what was arguably the biggest win in school history LY knocking BSU out of Nat'l Title talk. UN has lost 6 str on the Blue by 30 ppg but has covered the L/2 and 3 of 4. This is only the 3rd time under Petersen that BSU has had the opportunity to avenge a loss from the prev ssn ('08 beat Hawaii 27-7, -23', in '09 beat TCU in 2nd str bowl). UN, with a brutal sked, is on a 4th str AG incl trips to Oreg and TT. In the gauntlet, QB Lantrip avg 174 ypg (58%, 2-4). The top rusher is Ball (362, 5.2) and Matthews (284, 14.2) leads the rec's. UN stood toe-toe vs TT LW, falling 35-34 with a 562-441 yd edge. They had built a 21-7 early 3Q lead but all'd TT to battle back and drive 56/9pl for the GW TD w/36 left. BSU is off a non-covering 41-21 (-28) win over Tulsa. QB Moore (#3 pass eff) avg 332 ypg (79%!) with a 12-2 ratio. RB Martin (202, 3.2, 2 TD) should be able to pad his stats vs FBS's #108 run D (avg 120 ypg, 5.7). UN is much weaker than LY's tm (13-1, #11 AP) and BSU retaliates.

COLORADO 34 Wash St 31 - This game pits the teams we picked for last in each of the P12's respective divisions. CU gets to host its inaugural P12 gm but is off a physical road trip to Ohio St (outgained by just 22 yds but -2 in TO's) while Wash St is off a bye, a wk after blowing a 10 pt lead in

the 3Q at SDSt (WSU roughing punter pen changed momentum towards SDSt). CU has not been a conf HF the L2Y and was 0-2 ATS in that role in '08. WSU was -140 ypg in conf play LY but that was a big improvement after being -260 ypg in '09. Behind bkp QB Lobbestall (5th yr Sr, 320 ypg, 62%, 10-2 ratio), the Cougs have outgained their foes by 169 ypg TY and went 3-1 ATS as a conf AD a ssn ago. WSU has gone just 5-11 ATS after a bye however while the Buffs have gone 5-1-1 ATS at home the L2Y and have a huge sked edge (#33-109) in this one.

ILLINOIS 33 CENTRAL MICH 30 - The home team is 4-1 SU/ATS. The winner of this game has scored 30+ pts (36.9 avg) for 12 str yrs and these 2 have comb for 6 of the L7 MAC West Titles. NI's young D (2 str's back) has certainly been tested on the ground but this the 1st tm they've faced that is a pass first tm. LY's loss snapped a CM 3 gm series win streak. CM only trailed 9-7 at the half despite three 1H TO's incl an int at the NI26 right before HT. LTH NI trailed 38-10 into the 4Q (31-45, +13'). While NI got back on winning side LW vs Cal Poly (47-30) they failed to cover (-22) for a 3rd str week. CM was pummeled 45-7 (+24) by Mich St. LY being outgained 481-112. They have dropped 5 str ATS incl all 4 TY. While CM has a slight def edge (#103-113), NI has a huge off edge (#39-111) led by QB Harnish, who is avg 215 ypg (73%) with a 9-1 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 285 (7.3). CM QB Radcliff is avg 191 ypg (50%) with a poor 4-6 ratio. NI is on its 3rd road gm in 4 wks and CM is happy to be back home after a 3 gm trip.

STANFORD 37 UCLA 23 - The Bruins are hell bent on revenge from their 1st home shutout S/'99 but the sked makers didn't do them any favors off a Texas tm bent on revenge, a road trip facing a revenging Oreg St tm (outgained 376-357 in the 8 pt win, +2 TO edge) and a 3rd AG in 5W while the Cardinal are fresh off a bye but do need to break in a new str at LB after LY's leading tkl'r, Skov was lost for the yr vs AZ. Technical edges also go to Stanford as they are 14-5 ATS at home while UCLA is 2-9 ATS as a conf AD. UCLA all'd 64% comp on the road LY (68% TY) and if they can't get Luck off the field (262 ypg, 67%, 8-1 ratio), they have little hope of keeping this one close as SU continues to roll.

OHIO ST 27 Michigan St 20 - LY's B10 co-champs met on the field after a 2Y hiatus. A close gm was expected in their last meeting in '08 but we used our 5★ Oct GOM on OSU (-3) and they steam rolled the Spartans 45-7, covering by 35! The Bucks are 33-3 SU at home vs the B10 and that incl 8-1 as a HF (10-1 covered all 4 by 12 ppg) while Sparty is 2-5 as an AD. Both tms bounced back from losses with MSU (31-0 HT lead) dominating CM 45-7 incl 23-8 FD and 481-112 yd edges and the Chips only TD being set up by a blk'd P. QB Cousins (237 ypg, 69%, 5-2) is a vet but this is his 1st trip to the Shoe. Spartans are #9 B10 rush ypg (143, 3.7) due to a banged up OL. OSU's ST's helped them dominate field position in a 37-17 win over Colo as the Bucks rec'd a muffed FG which led to a FG and ret'd a KO 90 yds which set up a TD. QB Miller hit 5-13-83 with a 2-0 ratio and 83 rush yds in his starting debut. OSU's D all'd over 300 yds for the 3rd str gm (1st time S/04). MSU does have the obvious sked edge with CM and a bye vs Colo and a trip to Neb on deck for the Bucks but OSU takes care of business in Columbus.

LOUISVILLE 27 Marshall 13 - The only 2 recent meetings were bowl games and Marshall won and covered both ('98 and '02). LY UL split their non-conf HF roles ATS but did manhandle CUSA Memphis 56-0 (-17). TY they are 0-2 as a HF in non-conf action. UL is off a bye and 2W ago beat instate rival UK. Marshall is coming off a HG vs VT and also has a road trip to LY's conf champ UCF on deck. LW MU trailed VT 23-3 but played better defensively as the off sputtered most of the day (still hasn't scored a rush TD this ssn). The Herd are 1-6-1 ATS on the road and UL is 15-7 ATS off a bye. The Cardinals should take care of a struggling Herd squad that might be putting more stock in CUSA gms.

TEXAS A&M 33 ARKANSAS 30 - Arlington, TX. Dallas Cowboys Stadium. In '09 ark alum Jerry Jones brought this gm to TX. In the 1st meeting we used a 3★ LPS on Ark (-1') and they rolled to a 47-19 win (cover by 26'). LY we used this as our Comp College POW and Ark (-5') again delivered, 24-17. LW we went against Ark with our 4★ Top Weekly LPS and cashed easily as the Hogs were thoroughly dominated by Bama, 38-14. Ark has been hit hard by inj TY, 1st losing RB Davis in the offsn while LW they played w/o DE Bequette and their other DE Wright was hurt on the 1st drive (CS). QB Wilson did not put forth a gutsy effort LW repeatedly taking shots and is avg 252 ypg (67%) with a 7-3 ratio. The rush gm has struggled w/o Davis avg 132 (3.9). A&M, again, blew a DD HT lead vs OKSt and again TO's were the key as they had 3 in the 2H blowing a 20-3 lead in the 30-29 loss. QB Tannehill is avg 297 ypg (67%) but with only a 6-4 ratio while the RB duo of Gray/Michael is avg 149 (5.1). Both tms are off big gm losses and in a conf sandwich and both like to throw it but A&M has the more veteran QB with the stronger pass D and has been healthier.

USC 41 Arizona 20 - USC was 28-1 hosting conf opp's from '02-'08 but has gone just 6-4 the L2Y. LY RB Marc Tyler had career highs in rush (160) and att (31) as USC jumped out to a 14-0 lead and never trailed giving the series its 2nd str upset and the dog its SIXTH str cover (AZ 5-1). USC is 4-10 ATS at home (2-1 TY) and returns home after their 1st road trip of the yr, a 21 pt loss to ASU (-4 TO deficit, USC had a narrow yd edge). AZ was 0-3-1 ATS in conf AG's LY and is toting a 3 game losing streak after LW's home loss to Oreg (trailed 35-9 at HT). While USC QB Barkley (280 ypg, 68%, 10-3 ratio) and AZ QB Foles (362 ypg, 70%, 10-0 ratio) are a few of the P12's elite, the advantage in the trenches goes to the Trojans in this one as while AZ has our #12 rated P12 O-line, USC possesses the conf's #1 rated D-line.

COLORADO ST 27 San Jose St 17 - CSU is 3-1 SU/2-0 ATS vs SJSt who got a much-needed win LW, 34-24 (-10) over NMSt which ended their 13 gm losing streak. RB Rutley (388 yds, 5.7) became the 1st Spartan in 7Y to rush for over 200 yds (209). QB Faulkner (184 ypg, 58%, 2-1 ratio) ret'd to the starting lineup and responded with 236 yds. An inj-riddled SJSt went 3-3 as an AD LY but in 5 of the 6 gms they were +29' or more. In the only other matchup they were -14 at ID and almost pulled the upset, outgaining the Vandals by 75 yds. CSU is off a hard-fought 35-34 2OT road win (+10') over Utah ST, delivering a 3★ LPS winner and another OUTRIGHT UPSET for our Big Dogs. CSU took adv of 2 USU muffed punts and stuffed two 2 pt conv tries in the 2nd OT (PI called on the 1st) for their 2nd road gm win TY. The Rams went 2-0 LY beating LV by 33 (-3') and NM by 24 (-16). Earlier TY they didn't cover vs N Colo (33-14, -21) but CSU dominated with a 501-216 yd edge and led 28-0 at HT. SJSt has a road trip at BYU up next while this is just CSU's 2nd HG of the ssn with a bye on deck.

ARIZONA ST 35 Oregon St 18 - OSU has won 3 in a row SU but the AD has covered all 3. LTH ('09) was the 1st OSU win in Tempe in 17 tries. Both tms are in their preferred technical roles as ASU has gone 8-0-1 ATS at home vs conf foes incl LW vs USC as they pulled ahead in the P12 South battle w/a 43-22 win (+4 TO's). OSU has gone 9-2 ATS as a dog away from home but is still searching for their 1st win of the ssn as they dropped a home meeting vs UCLA LW despite yardage (375-357) and FD (22-17) edges. LY OSU led by 10 but all'd a late TD after a blk'd P in the 31-28 victory (-3'). OSU does have just 12 ret str's but won on the road at AZ with a 1st yr starting QB LY and appears to be in a similar situation here with Rr Mannion getting the call. With that being said, the HT is on an 18-5-1 ATS run and the fav has covered 5 of the L8 all'g us to side with the Sun Devils here.

KANSAS ST 38 Baylor 33 - LY Baylor beat 1 tm with a winning record in '10 and it was KSU although they failed to cover (47-42, -6). BU's Finley ran for a schl rec'd 250 yds and Griffin threw for a career high 404 as BU became bowl elig for the 1st time S/94. It was misleading as KSU trailed 47-28 early 4Q scoring their final TD w/07 left. BU (5-54 B12 AG) will be a conf AF for the 1st time S/'97. BU scored TD's on 5 str drives to take a 35-7 early 2Q lead in a 56-31 win over Rice in which the Bears had 33-24 FD and 673-416 yd edges. After 3 gms the FBS's #1 pass eff leader RG3 has had more TD passes (13) than incomp's (12) and has led the Bears to 40+ in 3 gms for the 1st time in schl hist. Miami QB Harris' knee was ruled out and overturned via replay on a 48g run with :49 left which preserved KSU's upset (+13) as our Underdog POW. KSU led 14-3 at HT and had a 265-139 yd rush edge. After 3 gms QB Klein has nearly as many pass (335) as rush (310) yds and John Hubert (286, 6.5) may have solidified his grasp on the #1 TB job over Bryce Brown with 166 vs Miami. KSU has huge D (#37-90) and ST edges (#13-15) and Snyder is 8-3 ATS in B12 HG's incl 3 outright upsets.

4★ New Orleans over JACKSONVILLE - NO's defense struggled LW with MLB Vilma (left knee) as HOU rung up 364 yds passing. In the 2H, NO (-3) posted 20-10 FD and 277-172 yd edges in our 4★ Sept NFL GOM winner. After punting on their first 2 drives, NO scored on 6 of their next 9 drives converting 6 of 8 3rd Dns in the 2H. Gabbert had a slow start vs CAR LW getting outgained 88 to -1 in the 1Q as 36 of his 139 yds came on the last play of the 1H when the Panthers had busted coverage with JAX giving up a safety for the 2nd straight week. While Jones-Drew had 122 yds (5.1), 39 came on 1 run and JAX started the 2H with 9 runs on their first 10 plays with Gabbert bobbling the snap. Granted conditions were poor but JAX only ran 12 plays (no punt/FG) on the CAR side of the field LW. After poor efforts vs Clausen and McCoy LY, NO won't look past JAX w/a rookie QB here and we'll side with them again.

FORECAST: New Orleans 38 JACKSONVILLE 10

3★ New England over OAKLAND - It's been 10 years since these two met in the "tuck rule" playoff game with NE winning in OT and going on to win the Super Bowl. The question is will Belichick be more upset after his team blew a 21-0 lead LW or will Brady who's 4 int's LW were as many as all of 2010. OAK is off a big win vs NYJ as McFadden ran wild with 171 (9.0) and 2 TD's while Campbell continued his efficient play and is avg 195 ypg (66%) with a 3-1 ratio. What looked like a potential flat spot for NE on their second straight road game, traveling across country with the NY Jets on deck now does a 180. NE is 19-6 ATS off a SU loss and will be happy facing a run oriented team after allowing 344 ypg passing (469 ypg overall!). The NE offense out paced the porous defense by avg 540 ypg the first 3 and will not let up after blowing the lead last week. **FORECAST: New England 38 OAKLAND 17**

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Carolina (+) over CHICAGO - Cutler sat out of LY's 23-6 victory as a 3 pt AD due to a concussion. Both teams had horrible QB play combining for 147 yds (43%) with 7 int's and 8 sks. CHI had a 247-147 yd edge with CAR being the first team since 1999 to start a rookie QB and 2 rookie WR's. CAR got its first win under Ron Rivera (Bears DC 2004-06) overcoming a big JAX play to end the 1H. Newton became the first rookie QB to have 1000 yds passing over his first 3 games. While he only had 158 yds (53%) he didn't turn the ball over which was the key difference. Vs NO, Cutler had 6 sacks on 45 pass att's vs just 12 rush att's (5.0) and he openly wondered if he'd survive the season. Martz followed it up with another 12 rushing attempts and CHI had their fewest rush yds (13) since 1952. CHI's defense has a great front 7 but their safeties have been beaten up and exposed giving up 70% with a 6-2 ratio so far. We'll take an undervalued road team getting points as our Ugly Dog in a surprising result. **FORECAST: Carolina 17 (+) CHICAGO 16**

2★ NY Giants over ARIZONA - This is the 3rd meeting in 4 years with the road team winning both matchups. The NYG have to be in a bit of a flat spot opening this season at WAS, hosting STL on MNF and then knocking off Philly on the road LW. They used a bend but don't break D and allowed a 10, 15 and a 14pl drive for a total of 6 points while allowing the longest play for the "big play" Eagles to be only 24 yds. On the flip side the "conservative" NYG off had 5 plays of 26+ yards incl TD passes of 28, 40 and 74 yds. LW we chased a 3★ LPS against the Cards (-3) on the road as Kolb driving them late for the potential-tying FG tossed an int in the 13-10 loss to SEA. While LY's #31 off has clearly improved with the addition of Kolb (271 ypg 63%, 5-3) the defense even with LW's solid performance is allowing 398 ypg. Even with the Giants in a flat spot, Manning and Comp should be able to exploit a ARZ secondary that is allowing 286 ypg. **FORECAST: NY Giants 27 ARIZONA 13**

OTHER GAMES

DALLAS 34 Detroit 27 - DAL beat DET 35-19 as a 6 pt HF LY with both teams using backup QB's. DET had a 12-7 lead in the 3Q and held the Cowboys to 0 FD's and -9 yds on 5 straight drives after their opening drive. DET gave up a 97 yd PR for a TD, fumbled on their 19 to set up a 19/4 TD drive and gave up 71 and 80 yd TD drives in the 4Q. DAL is off LW's MNF game and its not known how their beat up WR/OL/DB's fared vs the Redskins. LW DET rallied from 20-0 down vs MIN to win in OT. After being held to 40 yds net passing in the 1H Stafford led DET to a 20-3 scoring surge in the 2H with 15-5 FD and 308-108 yd edges. Megatron (C Johnson) finished with 108 yds (15.4) after being held to 7 yds (7.0) in the 1H as the defense held Peterson to just 5 yds (1.0). DET will be dealing with the media touting their first 3-0 start since 1980, their first win at the Metrodome in 15 years and it's now on them to handle success. While beat up DAL is the more potent than what the Lions have faced so far and we'll call for them by 7 and wait for the injury report.

PHILADELPHIA 24 San Francisco 14 - Instead of flying back home after the CIN game, SF is opting to spend 5 days practicing at Youngstown St. This is the 6th meeting in 7Y with PHI being 5-0 SU/ATS with a 35-18 avg score. LY PHI with Kolb won 27-24 as a 3 pt AD on SNF SF had the ball at the PHI 40 but under pressure Smith threw an int w/:30 left to seal the game. SF had 10 pen's and 5 TO's in the loss. The 49ers have issues with Edwards (knee) out and Crabtree (foot) is limited. In 3 games Gore (ankle sprain) has been held to 148 yds (2.5) and coverage is rolled over on TE Davis (15 rec 11.9). Harbaugh has been very conservative thanks to an OL that's given up 11 sacks (1 every 6.7 att's) that may not have Ctr Goodwin (knee). Vick broke his non-throwing hand LW vs NYG and his status is unknown. Kafka (107 yds 69%-0-2) may know the offense better than Young (hamstring) but he's not as experienced. Look for PHI to use a heavy dose of McCoy (115 yds 6.1) on the ground while the defense looks down the 49ers passing game here.

ST LOUIS 20 Washington 13 - This is the 4th meeting in as many years and the Rams have covered 3 straight w/a 360-269 avg yd edge. LY the Rams won 36-16 as a 4.5 pt HD despite RB Jackson being KO'd on a dirty play. While the yards were fairly even STL ran 25 more plays, held WAS to 1 of 10 on 3rd Dns and on 6 drives inside the WAS 20 had 2 TD's, 3 FG's while missing 1. WAS is off LW's big MNF game vs DAL and travels for the 2nd straight week with Haslett having been the DC 2006-08. STL was outFD 17-6 and outgained 406-81 at the half vs a BAL team angry after getting manhandled vs TEN. STL did get RB Jackson (23 yds 5.8) back in limited duty and he'll get more time here. WAS is an underrated team as the roster plays to the coaches schemes instead of fighting it. While both teams have a bye on deck STL is in a better situation at home and desperate to avoid 0-4.

CLEVELAND 20 Tennessee 14 - This looks to be a fairly even matchup with rookie coaches and talent for both teams. TEN has an edge with Hasselbeck (330 yds 70% 5-2) knowing OC Palmer's system and working behind a much better OL than what he had with SEA. TEN's offense took a serious blow with Britt (ACL/MCL) getting hurt LW and Johnson (98 yds 2.1) has struggled in the new system. TEN's defense is also giving up 3rd Dns at a big clip (20 of 43). CLE was dominated statistically LW being outFD 12-5 and outgained 234-99 at the half. CLE Hillis (throat) DNP and while McCoy didn't light up the fantasy numbers (210, 49%, 2-1) he kept the team in the game. CLE kept the pressure on Henne with 5 sks/8 QBH's and

OKLAHOMA 48 Ball St 6 - 1st meeting and it doesn't look pretty. OU has won 11 str vs non-BCS opp's at home (avg win 46-10) and Ball St 1-38 on the road vs BCS schools (avg loss 39-15). It's easy to say that OU has the RRR on deck but they are 10-1 SU prior (just 4-7 ATS). BSU is off to a 3-1 start under new HC Lembo but they do have a conf HG on deck (LY lost 45-0 at Iowa gm prior to conf). OU is 11-4 ATS at home laying 20+ pts. While BSU did upset an Indy squad led by LY's OU OC Wilson, 27-20 (+5) in the opener, they were blown out 37-7 (+20) at USF the next wk. Naturally every position is a mismatch and OU can name the score and at home it is usually a large blowout.

LA TECH 34 Hawaii 27 - UH is playing in its 3rd AG in 4W. UH's run-and-shoot was finally firing on all cylinders LW as QB Moniz (292 ypg, 66%, 11-1 ratio) tied an NCAA record with 7 TD passes in the 1H as UH topped UC Davis, 56-14. LTH UH was not focused as a day prior a tsunami hit the Samoa Islands affecting 45 players and 6 coaches and UH was held out of the EZ for the 1st time in 62 gms (outgained 449-301). They also lost their QB in the 2Q (Moniz era started) and were sk'd 7x's in the 27-6 loss (+5). LT has been playing "close but no cigar" as for the 3rd time in 3 gms vs FBS opp TY, they've seen a chance at a victory slip through their hands (3 losses by a comb 9 pts). LT has been outscored 48-14 in the 4Q TY. LW LT was tied 20-20 at Miss St late 4Q but their potential GW drive ended with an int in the EZ while in FG range. Then in OT, LT was picked off (Isham 2 int in L/4 att's) before MSU scored a TD to win 26-20 (-19). Two yrs ago LT used this game as a rallying point and responded. HC Dykes knows his team is close and this could be the game that LT uses to get things turned around.

NT Taylor (18 tkls 1 sks) is looking like the real deal. Look for CLE to continue to play small ball offensively and the defense to lock in on Johnson as TEN lacks a receiving threat to take advantage.

CINCINNATI 17 Buffalo 16 - BUF beat CIN 49-31 as a 4.5 pt AD LY after CIN had a 31-14 lead at the half. Fitzpatrick led BUF on 3 TD drives along with a 27 yd fumble return to take a 42-31 lead. BUF added a 30 yd TD run while trying to run out the clock & finished w/a 235-141 2H yd edge. CIN blew a good situation LW getting SF at home off an OT loss vs DAL. The Bengals may be without RB Benson (susp), lost 3 WR Shipley (ACL) 2 Wks ago and #4 WR Simpson status is unknown. Over the L2W CIN is 2 of 21 on 3rd Dns and Dalton only has a 6.6 ypa. BUF could be a bit worn out here after B2B wins after rallying from a 21-3 deficit vs OAK and a 21-0 spot vs NE. After years of horrible OL play BUF has allowed just 1 sack in 111 att's w/a 5.6 ypc on the ground. BUF leads the NFL with 3 WR sets (108 snaps prior to LW) to spread the field and run out of it much like the Titans did with Eddie George. They have the #3 offense despite their top 4 WR's LW being a 7th RD DC and 3 UFA's w/a 4th RD DC TE. We'll call for the home team by 1 in a lower scoring game as BUF finds out how tough success is.

Minnesota 27 KANSAS CITY 23 - After blowing a 17 pt lead at home vs TB the Vikings blew a 20-0 lead at home vs DET. MIN is the only team in the NFL w/o a TD in the 2H being outscored 64-6. So far TY in the 2H MIN has been outgained by 208, 159 and 200 yds with a total of 15 FD's. MIN is not a great grass team (9-16-1 ATS) largely as it negates the speed of their DL and RB Peterson. KC was able to hang around a worn out SD team that rested TE Gates (foot) and limited RB Tolbert and WR Floyd due to injuries. However, they were outgained 375-252 had a 9:26 TOP deficit with ZERO FD's and 34 yds in the 1H. KC's defense has just 3 sacks in 104 pass att's that has given up 46.5% conversions on 3rd Dn. Cassel has a puny 5.2 ypa with a 3-5 ratio due to targets that struggle to get open. On the surface the Chiefs played well LW but HT's off a road loss of 3 or less as DD dogs are just 11-29 ATS and we'll take the visitor here.

HOUSTON 27 Pittsburgh 24 - PIT has had the luxury of beating up on SEA and facing a shell of a Colts team the L2W to ease the pain of losing to BAL. They now get a sizeable challenge vs HOU who are off a shootout loss to NO. The Texans were able to move the ball easily between the 20's but were mired down in the redzone. On 4 of 6 drives inside the NO 20 the Texans were forced to settle for FG's which came back to haunt them later. HOU has had impressive offensive balance so far with 102 runs (4.1) vs 92 passes (8.9) with an OL in its 3rd straight year together. The defense isn't as good as its #15 ranking but it is better than LY by leaps and bounds. PIT does have trouble vs top tier QB's that can get the ball off fast as shown by Rodgers in the SB and Flacco in Wk 1. They were expected to be without DE Keisel (knee) and CB McFadden (hamstring) vs IND LW. We'll call for the home team by a FG here and wait for an official line.

Atlanta 23 SEATTLE 17 - ATL came to SEA at the end of LY and blasted the Seahawks 34-18 as a 6 pt AF to wrap up a 3 game road trip. SEA only had 2 drives over 20 yds in the game with ATL starting at their 40 or better on 4 drives. SEA's OL has gone thru 3 different OL combos in its first 3 games and if LW's unit starts it will have 52 career starts combined. They have given up 14 sacks (1 every 6.9 att's) and are only grinding out a 3.3 ypg. They got past ARZ LW thanks to 2 int's and 2 missed FG's. 9 of SEA's 12 drives ended in punts or TO's. ATL was out of sync after their big win vs PHI LW. TB jumped all over the ground game (30 yds 2.0) and Ryan was forced to put it up 47 times only getting 1 TD drive. ATL is 16-4 ATS off a DIV loss while SEA is 7-19 ATS after a DIV win. ATL is more explosive on both sides of the ball and we'll call for them by 6 as they can't fall behind esp with GB on deck.

SAN DIEGO 31 Miami 14 - MIA's #30 defense is in a tough spot after facing 2 elite QB's to start the year, travelling to CLE then having to fly out to face the #5 offense before its bye week. The road team in MIA games is now 18-4-1 ATS. MIA has a bye on deck and certainly will have a sense of desperation with their 0-3 start after allowing an 80/13pl GW drive and a 14yd TD pass w/:43 left at CLE as the rumors have already begun about who will replace HC Sparano. SD's off which finished #1 LY (396 ypg) started this season in the same manner topping 375+ in all 3 games and got the bad taste of the NE loss out of their mouths with a 375-252 edge LW beating KC. The D also rebounded and is now allowing 220 ypg in their 2 home games. While it is well noted of the Chargers early season struggles (0-3 ATS TY) the Dolphins are in complete disarray and SD moves to 3-1 for the first time S/06.

GREEN BAY 30 Denver 13 - Kyle Orton returns to GB where he struggled against the Pack as the Bears QB throwing for just 112 ypg (49%) with a 2-3 ratio in 4 games. DEN's offense bogged down in their first road game LW and managed only 1 drive over 42 yards and the inexp'd OL has struggled with the new blocking schemes as Orton has been sacked 8 times and the run game has struggled (76 ypg, 3.2). The Broncos now make a 2nd road trip to face a GB squad that is off a div road game with a Sunday Night trip to ATL (who will be seeking playoff loss revenge) on deck. The Packers D allowed 476 ypg the first 2 gms but just 291 vs CHI LW and they have continued to get pressure with 10 sks TY. With TE Finley (3 rd rec LW) and RB Grant healthy TY the GB off is as potent as ever and the DEN D may be in for a rude awakening versus QB Rogers after having played OAK (#23 pass off LY), CIN (rookie QB) and TEN (new QB, #26 LY). GB is 12-4 ATS vs AFC foes. While DEN got their first cover LW it is their 3rd straight game decided by 3 points or less and this week they take a huge leap in competition.

NY Jets at BALTIMORE - BAL won the first matchup vs Rex Ryan 10-9 LY as a 1 pt AD on MNF in the season opener. The Jets were very sloppy in the game with 14 penalties, going 1 for 11 on 3rd Dns. BAL had 20-6 FD and 282-176 yd edges with Sanchez having just 74 yds (48%). BAL certainly has a scheduling edge with a bye next week while the Jets are in the middle of a 3 game road trip with NE on deck but NYJ is 7-3 ATS and 8-2 SU away vs non-div foes on the road as neither of these tms can afford to drop to 2-2. **Sunday Night Marquies are 2-0 this season and are ONLY \$9 with your NC Sports Debit Card available after 11am Gameday!** **Indianapolis at TAMPA BAY** - Not quite the matchup the NFL envisioned. At presstime we were unable to see how IND looked vs Pittsburgh but at some point it would not surprise if Collins was slowed by an injury or they decide to look at Painter. Tampa will also be in an unusual role having been a favorite just 8 times in the 35 games under HC Morris with the largest spread being -7 points.

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SOUTH CAROLINA 40 Auburn 23 - Aub has won 6 str (4-1 ATS) vs SC incl 2 wins LY. LY in the SEC Title gm, SC (+4) took the deficit to 21-14 w/:16 left 2Q but gave up a 51 yd Hail Mary on the 1H's final play (35-3 Aub run to end gm). In the reg ssn gm SC (+3) led 27-21 into the 4Q prior to Aub's 14 pt 4Q (4 TO's by SC in 4Q). The only recent time the winner of the SEC Title gm traveled to face the loser the next yr was in '04 when GA, off a 21 pt loss, was -2' at home and rolled #13 LSU 45-16. SC is off to its 1st 4-0 start under Spurrier and despite the O'Ball Coach apologizing for a "putrid offensive performance" LW, the Gamecocks dominated Vandy 21-3 with a 367-77 yd edge. The 77 yds all'd were the fewest all'd by SC S/87. While QB Garcia has struggled (1-4 ratio LW), RB Lattimore is #2 in the FBS with 611 (5.7) and takes on an Aub rush D that is all'g 227 ypg (4.5). Aub (-31) was underwhelming LW in their 30-14 win over FAU with only a 315-307 yd edge. QB Trotter is avg 196 (62%) with an 8-3 ratio while RB Dyer has 426 (6.9). SC is stronger than LY's version while Auburn has just 6 str's back. The Tigers are 2-6 as an AD and this is the first conf road gm for their new QB going up against our #12 D.

SOUTHERN MISS 41 Rice 24 - These 2 matched up in '07 and '08 with Rice winning both incl pulling the upset as a 20' pt dog. The Owls are 0-8 SU/1-7 ATS vs CUSA foes on the road the L2Y. SM is on a 7-3 ATS run as a conf HF but LY lost as an 8 pt HF vs EC after having a 20-0 lead and lost to UAB as a 10' pt HF. Rice is on the 2nd of B2B AG's. The last and only time in Hattiesburg ('07) marked Balliff's 1st win as the Rice HC. In that game SM was without its starting QB, top RB and top WR (inj's) and was done in by -7 in TO's. SM pulled a road comeback LW vs UVA while Rice ran into a Baylor buzzsaw (all'd 655 yds, trailed 28-0). Rice (CUSA opener) has played the more difficult sked but SM is already 0-1 in conf action and will roll the Owls with an offense that seems to have turned the corner.

UT gets a favorable P12 home opener as they are off a bye (HC Whittingham 11-1 SU/8-4 ATS) which heightens their altitude edge (UW came up short in the altitude of BYU LY). UT was very fortunate in their gm prior to the bye vs BYU as they were aided by 7 Cougar TO's in their 54-10 win. UW QB Price has been spectacular replacing 4 yr str Locker and is avg 246 ypg (67%) with a 14-3 ratio. The biggest ? for UW so far has been their def that has all'd 453 ypg TY incl 457 in their narrow victory LW vs Cal (Bears SOD at the UW2 w/:25 left, trailing by 8). UW pulled 2 conf road upsets LY beating USC (+10) and Cal (+6') outright. We will call for the outright upset with Washington off a confidence building conference opening win against a Utah squad which certainly will be excited for its first P12 HG, but must also play with that added pressure. **FORECAST: Washington 24 UTAH 23**

New Mexico St 34 NEW MEXICO 31 - 102nd Rio Grande Rivalry. LY NM led 14-13 at HT (only NMSt TD a FR in EZ). NMSt hit the GW 22 yd FG w/1:56 left and NM was int'd at the NMSt24. Thru 4 gms, NM has been outscored by 26 ppg and that incl LW's loss to Sam Hou St. In the 48-45 OT defeat, NM was outgained 547-528 and is now all'g an avg of 518 ypg TY. HC Locksley was fired the day after the SHSt loss after a NM recruit was arrested (DWI) while driving a car registered to Locks. DC Barlow was named the interim HC for the rest of the year. While NMSt is no Ark/Tt, they have avg'd 368 ypg and have the adv of a win under their belt already (at B10 Minny). NMSt QB Manley was KO'd vs UTEP but Christian filled in nicely (17-28-238, 1-1). WR Rogers leads with 369 rec yd (19.4) and 4 of NMSt's 7 TD's. NM used former str QB Holbrook to rally LW as he twice pulled them back from 14 pt 4Q deficits, hitting 19-30-289 with 2 TD (all in 2H) and he could get his first start since Oct of LY. NMSt has won the L/2, both of which were decided in final min. With the uncertainty at NM, the Aggies should pull out another close one.

North Carolina 31 EAST CAROLINA 24 - EC continues to line their sked vs ACC "big brothers" (4-7-1 ATS L4Y) but they've dropped B2B gms vs NC by 14+ ppg. LY EC led 17-14 mid-3Q but from that point on was outgained 243-52 (42-17 -14). EC however doesn't get them to travel to Greenville often and LTH won 34-31 ('07) and LY they knocked off NCSt in OT. EC does get NC in the 2nd of B2B AG's as the Tar Heels had to prep for GT's option LW and the EC pass attack TW. NC came back from a 20-7 3Q deficit but fell short losing to GT, 35-28. QB Renner came in comp 81% of his passes but was sk'd 7x's and had 2 costly int's. Meanwhile EC rolled up 542 yds and defeated UAB 28-23 despite losing a school rec'd 7 TO's. QB Davis is avg 249 ypg (68%) with a 7-5 ratio and NC picked him off 3x's LY and comes in with 10 sks TY. NC has grabbed 61 int's under Withers. NC is 4-1 SU/ATS in the series and EC is 14-4-1 as a HD incl covering vs VT TY. NC has a massive defensive edge (#24-99) and will be looking forward to getting after QB Davis after a frustrating loss.

LSU 38 Kentucky 10 - LSU is off its 3rd AG in 4W and 3rd game vs a ranked opp already. The key to this game might be when it was announced LW that the game will kickoff at 11:21 am locally and keep in mind under Miles, at home, LSU is 28-1 SU in night gms while they are just 8-4 SU in day gms. UK has been shutout in its L/2 trips to Death Valley ('00 and '06, avg score 42-0, -131 ypg). In the last gm ('07) #1 LSU had a 4 gm series win streak snapped losing in 3OT on the road (-9'). LW LSU (-5') finished up their impressive month of Sept with a 47-21 win over WV as they scored the final 20 pts but did get outgained 533-366. QB Lee has made everyone forget about Jefferson avg 156 ypg (64%) with a 6-1 ratio. UK is off to a poor 2-2 start being outgained by an avg of 366-281. QB Newton is avg 148 ypg (54%) with a 5-6 ratio and the big problem has been the run gm avg just 123 (3.6). Miles is a poor 3-16-1 ATS as an SEC HF and LSU has a big game vs Florida on deck but Phillips is 0-4 as an AD and it will be tough to seeing the Cats off moving vs our #2 defense.

Notre Dame 31 PURDUE 17 - This WILL be the biggest schedule differential TW with Purdue off of MT, Rice and SEMO vs ND off of USF, Mich, MSU and Pitt. Purdue is off a bye while the Irish are playing their 5th str BCS tm, 3rd of 4th away and have AF's option on deck. The Irish is 5-1 SU in the series (4-2 ATS) with the only loss in W Lafayette in '07. ND went 72/12pl and tossed a 2 yd GW TD pass w/:25 left in their LTH. LY PU trailed 20-3 into the 4Q as a ND fmb'l into the EZ could have put the gm out of reach (ND 23-12, -10'). After having blk'd FG's decide their 1st 2 gms the Boilers welcomed back QB Marve in a romp over SEMO in which they totalled 627 (most S'04) prior to the bye. HC Hope says he'll stick with QB TerBush (182 ypg, 63%, 3-1) as the str but won't hesitate to play both QB's. Boilers are #88 pass eff D allowing 286 ypg (59%) with a 4-1 ratio vs 2 FBS off (MT and Rice). LW ND overcame a fmb'l which set up a Pitt FG, an int at the GL and a missed 39 yd FG on the 1H's last play in an ugly 15-12 win over Pitt. QB Rees hit TE Eifert with a 6 yd TD with 6:48 left and the 2 pt conv and the D stopped Pitt on downs at the Pitt44 with 2:24 left to preserve the win. The Irish remain last in the FBS in TO's lost (15). Irish D allows 93 rush ypg (2.9) while PU's #1 rusher Bolden left LW with a hamstringing inj. The situation favors Purdue (3-1-1 as HD and upset

Ohio St in '09) who also has a big ST edge (#10-96) but the talent (#13-80 off and #7-51 D) and sked strength (#8-118) call for ND to grab the road win.

Mississippi 31 FRESNO ST 30 - In their only meeting LY in Oxford, FSU all'd ssn highs in pts and yds. UM RB Bolden ran for a career-high 228 (12.0), helping the Rebels build a 41-10 lead mid-3Q as Ole Miss rushed for 425 yds (most S'77) in a 55-38 win (-2). Under HC Hill, FSU is 6-2 SU and 5-3 ATS S'00 hosting BCS foes but has never beaten an SEC tm (0-4, avg loss by 32 ppg). FSU rolled up 513 yds LW vs Idaho in a 48-24 (-3') win, marking their 9th str vs ID. QB Carr (371, 5 TD LW) is avg 252 ypg (59%) with a 9-3 ratio. UM has the edge on off (#54-81), def (#64-93) and ST (#19-74). The Rebs are coming off a 27-13 (+9') home loss to UGA and managed just 183 ttl yds as they dropped their 8th str to UGA. The loss was another blow to HC Nutt's job security as the Rebels are now just 5-11 dating back to LY. FSU's Hill has also played to the tune of a chorus of boos TY as both fan bases are growing disgruntled. FSU has a track record of getting up for BCS foes and this is a game the Rebels can ill-afford to lose as the schedule gets much tougher from here on out.

TCU 34 Smu 20 - TCU is 10-1 SU in the battle for the Iron Skillet but SMU is 6-2 ATS. LY TCU was down 17-14 w/13:58 3Q. From then on TCU went on a 27-7 run incl 83 yd KR and 19 yd IR TD's. This game was orig sked for a Friday night, but was moved to Saturday. TCU is off a home game vs Port St (won 55-12, +167 yds) while SMU traveled to face conf foe Memphis (won 42-0, +380 yds) and travels again. SMU QB McDermott is avg 283 ypg (58%) with a 4-2 ratio. He has 2 rec's (Johnson and Beasley) over 250 yds and the top rusher is Line with 463 (4.9) and 11 TD's (#2 NCAA). TCU QB Pachall is avg 219 ypg (69%) with a 10-2 ratio and his favorite target has been Boyce (400, 16.0, 3 TD). RB's James (344, 8.6, 2) and Tucker (266, 5.0, 5) have filled in nicely for LY's str Wesley (has missed L/3). The Frogs also declared LB Brock OFY (has not played since opener). TCU is 23-9 as a HF and SMU hasn't won in Fort Worth S'93 dropping 7 str (L/5 by DD's) and in this hostile environment, it will be much the same for SMU.

Ark St 37 WKU 20 - HT has dropped both SBC gms. LY WKU led 21-7 into the 4Q but needed a 7 yd TD pass on the final play to force OT (drive set up after bad ASU snap on punt). In OT WKU went for 2 and the gamble paid off 36-35 (+12). The last time here it was then-HC Elson's final gm and WKU gave an inspired effort (+6') leading 20-10 late in the 4Q before a couple of FR's set up Ark St with 2 TD's and they escaped 24-20. Ark St is coming off a 53-24 blowout of C Arkansas in which they had 646-322 yd and 32-15 FD edges. WKU is off a bye and their newly named starting QB and leading WR were both lost in their last gm (44-16 loss at home to Indiana St). Red Wolves have a big ST edge (#46-119) and should put up big passing numbers (#29 pass off vs WKU's #105 pass eff D). ASU is 4-10 as an AF over 10 yrs (rare role, 2-0 TY) and is just 3-13 SU/ATS, while WKU WKU is 0-11 SU in Sun Belt HG's.

Duke 30 FIU 27 - FIU finished LY ranked higher in the NCAA in off and def, won their conf, won a bowl while Duke finished tied for last in their conf. The Blue Devils have won EIGHT GAMES on the road in the L11Y and to show you how excited FIU is they named this their HC game. The Panthers have hosted a BCS team 3 times going 3-0 ATS. LY they outgained Rutgers 371-172 and were "LeFeged", in '08 they lost to USF 17-9 (+28) and in '07 lost to Maryland 26-10 (+24). FIU is 3-1 off wins over NT, L'ville and UCF but suffered a disappointing loss to Louisiana 36-31 LW behind their bkp QB. Duke is off a win over Tulane 48-27. The Devils didn't look like your fathers' team but Tulane didn't look like the tm that dominated UAB the week before 49-10. QB Renfree is avg 254 ypg (73%) with a 3-2 ratio but faces a Panther D with 15 sks. These teams are very close talent wise but Duke will be fully focused for this off of Tulane with a bye on deck and needing every win they can get.

TROY 37 Uab 20 - The home team has won and covered 3 str with UAB going 3-1 SU/ATS. LY UAB trailed 23-0 but pulled the upset going 99/9pl with a 44 yd Hail Mary on the final pl. UAB is on the 2nd of B2B AG and has lost 13x in a row SU away vs non-conf but LY played a pair of SEC tms to the wire. They outgained Tenn by 257 yds and 5 missed FG's losing in 2OT and later they led Miss St in the 4Q before losing by 5. The Blazers not only lost on the scoreboard LW to EC (despite forcing 7 TO's), they also lost QB Ellis as he was taken off the field on a backboard. Troy has now beaten MT 6 str times but they have struggled going 1-3 ATS the next week incl LY winning by 7 as a 20 pt fav while also losing outright to FAU as a 16 pt fav. There are no huge matchup edges in this one, but Troy does have our #62 off while UAB has our #97 D. UAB is 4-2 vs in-state Troy S'02 but lost the LTH, 27-14. UAB is on its 3rd AG in 4W and Troy is 46-6 SU at home and playing with legit revenge.

LOUISIANA 24 Florida Atl 21 - FAU has won 4 str in this series as The Ragin' Cajuns are 1-5 both SU/ATS vs the Owls (3 outright upsets vs FAU). LTH FAU never trailed as they had a schl rec'd 624 yds scoring on 6 of their L/7 drives. Schnellenger usually sand bags the tough non-conf gms playing a lot of youngsters and building depth for the Sun Belt so expect their best game of the season so far here. They have played the #4 sked and are off a great showing at Aub LW as they were only out-gained 315-307 and had a 20-16 FD edge in the 30-14 loss (+31). Their 307 ttl yds were more than they had in their 1st 2 gms comb! UL is off a huge emotional high as they pulled the outright upset as a DD dog LW at FIU, so a letdown may be in order. LY UL trailed 24-14 early 4Q but got a FG and then a TD w/1:45 left. The Ragin' Cajuns elected to go for a 2 pt conv and the win but the pass was inc (FAU recovered the outside). This is the 4th AG in 5W for FAU, and that might cost them here.

MIDDLE TENN 38 Memphis 17 - 4th meeting in 5Y with MT winning the 1st and the home team taking the L/2. Mem may be the worst tm in the FBS as they are 0-3 SU/ATS vs FBS foes and have lost by a comb 148-17. They are off a 42-0 drubbing at home to SMU where they were outFD'd 27-7 and outgained 519-139. Despite losing to their rival Troy for the 6th str time LW, MT had their best showing in yrs having the edge in yardage 582-470 and FD's 26-23, while holding the lead until late 3Q. LY MT had the yd edge but 4 TO led to all 24 of Memphis' pts. Mem has lost 12 str away (4-8 ATS) TY and LY the avg line was +16.6 with the lowest being 11.5. MT has a short wk on deck with WKU coming in Thurs. MT is 0-3 ATS at home vs non-conf but remember they started last season with a susp QB and never got it started. In LY's game, Mem got its only win of the season taking on MT's 3rd string QB and won at home 24-17 (+3') so this is a revenge gm in MT's favor.

TULSA 41 North Texas 17 - Both feature new HC's and NT is on a high with McCarney picking up his 1st win LW after taking a 24-0 lead into the 4Q vs Indy and hanging on for a 24-21 W. We have to feel that Tulsa is in need of a win having just played Okla, Okla St and Boise plus they have a bye on deck. TU's offense with their 10 str's back avg'd 569 ypg at home LY with EVERY game totaling 538 or better. In their only other HG TY they lost to Okla St but had 482 ttl yds. QB Kinne was in doubt to play LW (knee) and struggled with 123 yds (58% 1-4 ratio) on the blue turf in Boise as he was clearly not 100%. Tulsa is 3-0 SU/ATS ('05, '06, '08 avg score 46-10) in the series. NT is on its 3rd road gm in 5W and has an SBC gm on deck. They faced a similar offense and tm in Houston and lost 48-23 (-21') TY, but with Kinne not fully healthy. Tulsa's #40 off vs NT's #108 def may not be as lopsided as the numbers suggest.

Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the number in the () indicates how many angles apply to that team. The higher the number the stronger the angle play.
