NEWS AND NOTES - Arizona had a young O-line making its first road trip and was also without top WR Jevon Criner. Oklahoma St dominated going 88/9pl, 80/12pl and 70/10pl on their first 3 poss for a 21-0 lead while UA had 2 FD's on their first 3 poss. OSU led 21-0 at the half and was never threatened. QB Brandon Weeden hit 22 of his first 23 passes and finished 42-53-397...FIU got their first ever win against a BCS foe and did it with 3 big plays. For the game Louisville had a 24-9 FD edge but UL's first drive was 10pl but not only ended on an int, Winston Fraser ret'd it 71 yds for a TD. FIU got a short pass to TY Hilton who took it 74 yds for a TD then Hilton split the DB's and got behind them for an 83 yd TD pass and FIU stunningly led 21-3. UL did blow a couple of opportunities in the game. Trailing 24-10 they were SOD on 4&1 at the FIU12, SOD on 4&13 at the FIU36 and then scored a TD with 1:49 left to pull within 24-17 but FIU rec'd the onside kick. Hilton set a school record with 201 yds receiving...It was an interesting Friday nighter for Missouri and Arizona St. Each team settled for a some FG's after long drives and MO led 16-10 at the half thanks to a blk'd xp. ASU scored TD's on 89/10pl and 60/7pl drives and led 30-16 with 14:23 left in the game. The Devils then forced a punt on 4&18 but fmbl'd the punt then led 30-16 with 14:23 left in the game. The Devils then forced a punt on 4&18 but fmbl'd the punt then pass interference on 3&15 gave MO a FD and MO got a 25 yd TD pass on the next play. On MO's next drive they converted on 3&14 and later on 4&gl from the 3 to tie it with 2:50 left. MO did miss a 48 yd FG with :12 left and ASU won it on a TD in OT...Oregon St came in as a banged up team vs Wisconsin and was only outgained 397-284 but didn't do themselves any favors. They had a -4 yd punt in the 1Q setting up the Badgers first TD, a 3&13, 17 yd pass 3pl later. An OSU PF pen on the punt gave UW the ball at their own 49 and Wilson hit a 10 yd TD pass on 3&5. The Badgers added a TD with :27 left in the half to lead 21-0. Once again OSU benched QB Katz early and Mannion took almost all of the snaps. OSU fmbl'd at the UW13 and was SOD at the UW17 on 2 of their last 3 drives...It's not very often that a team has 1 FD for an entire game. In fact the last time Michigan St held an opponent to just 1 FD was back in 1944 vs Maryland. MSU scored a TD or a FG or missed a FG on their first 8 drives then got a 39 yd FR TD to lead FAU 44-0 with 8:22 left and finally punted for the first time with 3:36 left in the game. They had a 434-48 yd edge...Army did have a 446-292 yd edge vs SDSt but were -3 in TO's. Army fmbl'd at the SDSt42, fmbl'd at their own 26 and trailed 14-0 but it was 14-14 at the half with Army having a 245-130 yd edge. Army was SOD at the SDSt48 and on their final drive, down by 3, were on the fringe of FG range on 3&19 from the 34 when they took a 6 yd sack and had to go for it on 4&25 and fired incomplete...Toledo scored their first points ever vs Ohió St having lost their previous 2 vs the Buckeyes by a combined score of 87-0 in '98 and '09 as they nearly upset OSU. In fact, OSU needed a 69 yd PR with :46 left in the half to lead 21-15. In the 2H TOL had a bad snap on a 51 yd FG and on their final drive they took over with 3:08 left and got to the Buckeye15 but on 4&5 fired incomplete and came up 5 pts short. TOL had a 338-301 yd edge...Illinois had their biggest win since 1944 as they scored on 7 consec drives and rolled to a 56-3 win. They had 27-6 FD and 519-96 yd edges. SDSt did not get their first FD until the 2Q and had just 54 yds offense at the half. Illinois FB Becker left the game in the 1H and may be out for the season. It was 42-3 when bkp QB O'Toole came in with 8:58 left in the 3Q guiding the team be out for the season. It was 42-3 when bxp QLB 0 folle came in with 8:58 left in the 3.0 gluting the team to a 30/4pl TD drive... Tough loss for C Michigan vs Kentucky and the key play came on a 4th down gamble. In the 1H CM went on an 81/16pl drive and settled for a 19 yd FG. Later they went 67/12pl settling for a 31 yd FG. They had a 227-93 yd edge but only led 13-6 at the half. On their 3rd 3Q poss, they went for it on 4&inches at their own 34 and were SOD. On the next play, UK got a 34 yd TD pass UK was then pinned at its own 13 when they got an 87 yd TD run to take their first lead, 20-13 and finally drove 85/13pl for a TD with 5:35 left to clinch it. CM finished with a 383-344 yd edge but lost by double digits...Alabama's D gave up 54/16pl on the opening drive of the game for a 43 yd FG and pretty much controlled the 1H with a 171-92 yd edge settling for a 22 yd FG after one 10pl drive and led 17-3. Bama got a TD by Birchardson with 6:14 left as he rushed for 111 yds and 2 TD's Penn St then went 71/14bl incl 3&10 and Richardson with 6:14 left as he rushed for 111 yds and 2 TD's. Penn St then wort 71/14pl incl 3&10 and 3&20 conversions and got a garbage TD with 1:53 left for a big part of their 251 yds...N Carolina had a 5-0 TO deficit vs Rutgers and were actually outFD'd 19-17 but that is not indicative of the game. NC had a 286-91 yd edge in the 1H but due to the TO's, only led 17-12. They led 24-15 with 1:12 left in the 3Q when RU went on a 62/13pl drive including a 4&12 conversion getting a TD with 10:40 left. RU's last drive went 33/9pl but on 4&7 they were SOD at their own 42 and NC ended the game at the RU7... Nobody gave Auburn a chance vs Miss St after their poor performance vs Utah St but they managed to ne NCAA's longest win streak to 17 and were highly motivated by being nearly a TD dog at

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home. AU Ted 14-0 but after MSU Tied it at 14, AU gave up a 27 yd IR TD. AU still rallied and led 34-24 at the half and then got a TD with 14:03 left in the game for a commanding 41-27 lead and even forced a MSU punt with 9:43 left. MSU went 83/12pl getting a TD with 4:51 left then forced a punt with 2:52 left. MSU drove 67/11pl. On 2nd & gl from the 2 with no time-outs, they swept QB Relf and he was tkl'd at the half yd line...lowa had a 10-0 lead early vs lowa St but it was 10-10 at the half. ISU led 17-16 but UI drove 80/11pl and got a TD with 5:50

left and the 2 pt conv put them up 24-17. ISU's last drive in regulation featured a 3&16, 20 yd pass, a 3&20, 40 yd pass, a 4&1 conv and then on 3&gl got a 4 yd TD run. UI scored in the first of 3OT's with a TD and ISU faced a 4&gl at the 4 and got a TD to keep the game going. In the 3rd OT UI got a FG and ISU a TD for the win. ISU had not scored a meaningful TD vs UI since 2006...E Carolina QB Davis had 260 yds and 4 TD's vs South Carolina but finished with just 127 yards passing, an int and was sk'd 5 times. Virginia Tech did have 20-11 FD and 332-112 yd edges but blew a couple of opportunities and actually needed a TD with 7:30 left to take their first lead of the game in their 17-10 win. VT got a 38 yd drive for a TD after a 30 yd punt, on 1st & gl from the 6 were int'd in the EZ and after having a FD at the EC14 settled for a 39 yd FG at the end of the half. VT's winning drive was 89/13pl for the TD with 7:30 left and EC's last 2 poss ended on a punt with 5:33 left from their own 26 and on 4&18 they fired incomleft and EUS tasts 2 poss ended on a purt with 5:33 left from their own 25 and of 44.18 they fired incomplete from their own 43 and VT took a knee....Idaho QB Reader threw for 299 yards and 4 TD's and Ul's D had 2 IR TD's. UI finished with 424-197 yd and 23-11 FD edges. They missed a FG and settled for a FG and only led 3-0 when N Dakota got a 79 yd PR TD to stunningly lead 7-3 (9:37 2Q). ND then got a 54/1pl TD pass 14-3 (7:33 2Q). UI went 80/15pl for a TD with 1:01 left in the half then went 71/6, 58/9, 91/11, their first 3 3Q poss to lead 31-14. They blew it open late when a 19 yd IR to the ND18 set up a 1pl 1 yd TD run by Bass then 2pl later with bkp QB Goska in for ND, the Vandals got a 37 yd IR TD with 4:41 left for the 44-14 final....Tulsa/Tulane was a 3-3 game with 4:08 left in the half. TLN was at the TLS35 but on 38/15 they were int'd and TLS went 73/6pl for a TD and a 10-3 lead. TLN's first two 3Q drives ended in a missed 4/4 yd FG and a finbl at the TLS33 and TLS had TD drives 68/2, 77 and 67 yds to ended in a missed 44 yd FG and a fmbl at the TLS23 and TLS had TD drives of 82, 77 and 67 yds to go ahead 31-3. TLN fmbl'd at the TLS39, was SOD at the TLS42 and punted on their final 3 drives...The key play o the Arkansas St/Memphis game happened early 2Q when Memphis, down 10-0, was SOD on 4&1 at the ASU29. ASU got a 71 yd TD pass on the next play to make it 16-0 and would go 82/13pl and 90/11pl for TD's on their next 2 poss to blow it open at the half. ASU scored 2TDs and a FG on their first three 3Q poss, the 2nd 2 led by bkp QB Smith and they had a 611-169 yd edge...Ohio U had a dominant 22-9 FD and 392-124 yd edges vs Gardner-Webb. OU got scoring drives of 40 and 28 yards and also got an IR TD but also blew some scoring drives. They had a 1st & gl at the 5 but fmbl'd, missed a 53 yd FG, fmbl'd at the GW47, were int'd at the GW35, SOD at the GW15 and settled for a 24 yd FG with 4:51 left...Dan Persa sat out a 2nd straight game and Kolter hit 10-14-104 yd and rushed fór 109 for Northwestern. Kolter inj'd his shoulder and only returned for a few plays later with 3rd string QB Trevor Siemian guiding 2 drives incl a 1 yd TD pass with 11:01 left and then Watkins was in for the final NW 2 drives. NW on 4&8 at the El22 just ran the ball in the line for 3 yds with 1:27 left and El got a 76 yd run and a 3 yd garbage TD with :07 left to make the stats closer than they really were at NW 437-341. Nothing misleading about the Wash St/UNLV final. WSU scored on their first 5 drives of the game as Marshall Lobbestael hit 24-32-361 and they then scored on their first 3 drives of the 2H with the 3rd drive being led by bkp Halliday. WSU made it 59-0 with 5:29 left and LV's only score came on a 95 yd KR TD. WSU's final drive was SOD at the LV20 and they also had a 35 yd FG blk'd...Southern Miss appeared in control vs Marshall as they were up 17-3 and had the ball with 2:00 left 1H. They only got off a 27 yd punt and MU went 41/7pl for a TD, 17-10. In the game SM turned it over SIX times and had a punt blk'd. SM fmbl'd at their own 35 early 3Q setting up a MU TD. MU took the lead with a TD with 1:19 left 3Q. SM was pinned at its 1 and RB Hardy was tkl'd for a safety and MU led 26-17. SM fmbl'd at the MU27, settled for a 28 yd FG then rec'd the onside kick but as you would expect, with 1:00 left on 3&10 ended the game on their 6th TO, an int at the 43....New Mexico St/Minnesota looked to be a high scoring game as at the half, NMSt had a 21-14 lead and a 271-199 yd edge. They even blew a couple of scoring opportunities in the 1H as UM had a 1st & gl at the 4 but was int'd in the EZ and NMSt missed a 45 yd FG. UM missed a 38 yd FG in the 3Q but down 28-21, the Gophers had a 1st & gl at the 7 and got the game tying TD with 7:54 left to make it 28-28 but replays respotted the ball at the footline and on 4&gl at the footline UM was stopped. NMSt got 4 FD's' and punted and UM got to the NMSt25. Coach Kill had a seizure on the sideline and the game was halted for a half hr and when they ret'd UM's 4th&10 pass fell incomplete and NMSt held on for the upset....Texas/BYU was played in 98° heat and BYU wilted in the 2H with UT having a 201-67 yd edge. UT QB Gilbert was benched and QB's Ash and Mc Coy alternated on every poss the rest of the game. Gilbert had a couple of costly int's and BYU jumped to á 13-0 lead. UT settléd for a 23 yd FG late 1Q. In the 2H UT was SOD on 4&1 at the BYU13 and then up 17-16, had the ball at the BYU30. RB Brown broke off a run and had a shot but was tkl'd at the 14 of BYU and the Longhorns took a knee 2x...Not many teams survive a defensive TO for a TD. It's externely rare when a team wins a game having 2 def TD's go against them. Georgia pretty much controlled the S Carolina game from start to finish. In fact 3 of their first 4 drives got to the RZ but they settled for 3 FG's and actually missed a chipshot 33 yd FG and led 6-3. SC ran a fake punt on 4&7 at their own 32 and DT Ingram got a FD and the 276 lb'r raced 68 yds for a TD. In the 3Q UGA appeared in control again leading 20-14 and had the ball at the SC39. RB Crowell, who hurt his ribs in the 1H was not 100% and fmbl'd when SC ret'd it 57 yds to the 5 basically a TO for a TD as SC got a 5 yd "drive" for a TD. SC then got a 25 yd IR TD to lead 28-20. UGA tied it and then retook the lead 35-31 but again was skid & fmbl'd and SC ret'd it for a TD. At the end, SC rec'd an onside kick and got a FD and took a knee. Basically 4 def and ST TD's vs UGA and they only lost by 3... continued on page 2

cont. from Front Page ... Connecticut/Vanderbilt was a pure defensive struggle. The two teams combined for 12 sks for -72 yds, there was 2 def TD's and a blk'd punt for a TD. CT fmbl'd at their 42 setting up a 42/1pl TD pass for VU and VU went 80/6pl for a TD to lead 14-3 after 1Q with the 2Q producing 5 FD's combined and 7 punts and 2 TO's. After an int CT drove 6 yd for a 28 yd FG then blk'd a punt for a TD, 14-13 and got a 64 yd FR TD in the 4Q to lead 21-14. VU got a 50 yd IR TD with 6:45 left to tie then after a 48 yd run by Stacy got a 31 yd FG with 2:56 left for the lead. UConn on 4&16 fired incomplete from their own 25 with 2:09 left.

GAME UNDER THEIR BELT ADVANTAGE - Florida was impressive for a 2nd straight week. They settled for FG's on their first 2 drives. UAB had 2 of their first 3 drives getting 2 FD's and had another FD wiped out by a hold on the first drive and punted. On their 3rd drive UAB got a 38 yd TD pass after 2 FD's but it was wiped out by illegal shift and on 4&2 they were SOD. UAB had a snap go over the P's head for a safety with 2:32 left and after the extremely poor free kick UF drove 52/5pl for a TD with 1:09 left to score 9 pts in the final 2:32 and open it up 25-0. UF had a 308-95 yd edge at the half. In the 2H UAB had a FD at the UF30 and fmbl'd then ran a fake punt from its own 36 and was SOD setting up a UF 36/3pl TD drive. The Gators finished with 512-212 yd and 28-11 FD edges and led 39-0 after 3Q before putting the offense away in the 4Q. UF had the advantage of a game under their belts as both teams who didn't play the opening weekend were blown out... Darron Thomas matched a school record with 6 TD passes as Oregon rebounded from their LSU loss with a 69-20 win. The loss snapped Nevada's 7 gm win streak as they came out of last season 13-1 and ranked #11. Tyler Lantrip took over at QB for Kaepernick (NFL) and hit 21-35-219 yds and rushed 10x for 51 yds. UO led 55-13 after 3Q and the Ducks scored 2 TD's in the last 2:24, one after UN was SOD at their own 27 and the 2nd on a 68 yd IR TD with :20 left.

REPLACEMENTS - Mike Glennon, the man who replaced Russell Wilson at NCSt hit 24-41-315 yds but a lot of it came in the 2H with NCSt down 34-13. At the half WF had a 278-127 yd edge. With Tanner Price at QB, WF led SU by 15 when he was inj'd in Wk1. He ret'd to the lineup and hit 22-35-297 yds completing his first 8 passes. NCSt did pull within 34-27 on a 4&10, 63 yd TD pass with 5:34 left. NCSt's final drive got to the WF38 and on 4&10 they dropped what would have been a sure a FD pass.

POINTSPREAD PLAYS OF THE GAME - Keith Price is replacing Jake Locker at

Washington and he hit his first 8 passes hitting 18-25-315 yds. UW survived the dreaded

14 pt swing in the 2Q threatening to take a 28-7 lead on 3&8 from the 10 Price was int'd and ret'd 99 yds for a TD. In the 1H UW had a 370-192 yd edge and led 28-14. Hawaii did fmbl at the UW5 and were SOD at the UW9 in the 1H. The pointspread play of the game came after UH took over at the UW27 following a -5 yd punt and they trailed 38-26. They got a TD with 1:39 left for the apparent backdoor cover. The xp would have put them under the spread but UW blk'd the xp and ret'd it for 2 and instead of only trailing 38-33 it was an 8 pt game at 40-32. UW rec'd the onside kick... USC had a 416-319 vd edge vs Utah but a 3-1 TO deficit. The Trojans were SOD at the Utah32, int'd at the Utah15, had a FD at the Utah12 and fmbl'd and Utah which had been outgained 239-68 drove 84/12pl for a TD with :34 left in the half to get back in it at 10-7. USC led 17-7 when a fmbl set up Utah for a 51/1pl reverse to the 1 and a TD on the next play to make it 17-14. USC had a 47 yd FG wiped out by a false start pen and punted and the next 8 poss were punts. Utah took over at their own 33 and on the controversial final drive they had an int dropped by THIS SATU them the FD at the 38. After the free kick they got 2 FD's to the NC28 and were running out the clock

4★ BYU over Utah - This rivalry has been decided by a TD or less in 12 of 14 gms. For the 1st time S/67 this gm is not being ply'd in Nov and for the 1st time ever, this is a non-conf gm. LY we used a 4★ on BYU (+8') for the 4th str week and they delivered a 4th str winner as they led 13-0 into the 4Q but Utah blk'd a 42 yd FG as time exp and won 17-16. Utah (bye on deck) was welcomed into the P12 with a 23-14 loss to USC. Utah had lined up for the OT forcing 41 yd FG when it was not only blk'd, but ret'd for a TD that was initially waived off (unsports cond on USC bench) but 2 hours later ruled a TD delivering as a 2★ on these pages. Wynn is avg 170 ypg (55%) with a 3-0 ratio. His fav target is WR Christopher (147, 11.3, 2) and RB White has 206 rush yd (5.3). This is BYU's home opener and they just faced two BCS foes on the road (1 pt win vs Óle Miss, 1 pt loss to Texas LW). Heaps has done a good job driving the off avg 209 pass ypg (61%) but has struggled getting into the EZ with a 2-3 ratio. BYU has 0 rush TD's TY and WR Apo has the only 2 rec TD's. Both come in fired up but BYU has sizeable edges all around (off #28-73, D #25-38 and ST #53-75), is confident after winning vs the SEC and standing toe-to-toe with the Big 12 and wants to show the Pac-12 what they missed out on in conf re-alignment.

FORECAŠT: BYU 24 Utah 10

3★ Penn St over TEMPLE - PSU has won 28 in a row vs the Owls who had not scored a TD in the L/4 prior to LY (outscored 154-9) but drove 28 yds after a fmbl for a 1Q TD. PSU trailed 13-9 at HT but allowed just 71 yds and no drive over 5pl in the 2H as they settled for 5 FG's and won 22-13 (-14) despite a 439-202 yd edge. The Lions had just 137 yds heading into the 4Q at home vs #2 Bama in a 27-11 loss. Both QB's struggled as Bolden hit 11-29 for 144 with an int while McGloin was 1-10 and at one point in the 3Q the Tide nearly int'd 5 straight passes. TU is 2-0 for the 2nd consecutive ssn for the 1st time since the late '60's as they waited out a 1:19 lightning delay to rout Akron, 41-3. A finally healthy Pierce (297, 7.8) is #6 FBS in rushing. Ex-Owls HC Golden was a Lions player while new HC Addazio has no such ties and there will be more Blue than Red in the stands at this TU 'home game' making it feel more like State College. Temple is overvalued with their two big wins but a closer look shows that they beat Villanova, who LW lost to Towson 31-10, and an Akron squad which went 1-11 LY getting outscored by nearly 20 ppg. FORECAST: Penn St 34 TEMPLE 13

3★ Washington St over SAN DIEGO ST - Only prior meeting was in '07 (WSU won 45-17). SDSt has dropped 8 str when hosting a BCS opp (last win in '96) but WSU has dropped 5 str road openers by 29 ppg. WSU is full of confidence with its 1st 2-0 start S/'05, has gotten progressively better each yr under Wulff and won their last road game (Oreg St 31-14). LW they routed LV, 59-7 with 32-9 FD and 610-158 yd edges. Lobbestael avg 296 ypg (75%) with a 7-0 ratio (did play most of opener after Tuel inj'd) and he's spread the ball around as 4 have 2 rec TD's TY. SDSt, facing its 3rd option tm in 3 gms, grounded out a 23-20 win over a fired up Army squad LW. Army fmbl'd 8x's (lost 3), and SDSt was outgained 446-292. Lindley hit an unusually low 8-18-146 and is avg 175 ypg (51%) with a 5-0 ratio. His fav rec is converted CB Lockett (195, 24.4, 2) who suffered some crucial drops LW. The top rusher is Hillman with 306 (6.8) and 4 TD. SDSt has a gm vs excch Hoke next week, is in the unusual role as a HF vs a BCS school and must prepare for a pass happy offense. What a surprise it would be to pick a now-improved WSU team that has gone 5-31 SU in the 3 years prior to TY as the Sept 5★

FORECAST: Washington St 34 SAN DIEGO ST 33 OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ USC over Syracuse - Incl the '97 Fiesta Bowl, SU has made 3 trips out west the L18Y going 0-3 losing by 17 and 21 twice (got whipped by Wash 41-20 in wk 2 LY, +13'). Syr is lucky to be 2-0 at this point as they escaped in OT vs Wake in wk 1 and barely got by an avg IAA opp in Rhode Island by a TD a wk ago (QB Nassib career high 318 pass yds). The P12 awarded USC the cover several hours after the gm was finished LW (see News & Notes) vs Utah returning a blk'd FG for a TD but much like Syr, has not been impressive thus far (21 ppg TY). USC is in a P12 sandwich and has a huge game on deck at Ariz St. Syr is in a IAA/Toledo sandwich and LY Marrone was 5-1 ATS on the road winning at Cincy, WV, Rut and USF outright. Kiffin is just 1-5 ATS vs nonconf but USC has huge off (#9-87) and def (#14-77) edges here and should use this contest to get up to speed heading into their showdown with the Sun Devils. In 1987 we had a 5★ on USC and won 31-14 and in 1995 won a GOY with them over Ariz St, 45-28. Will we go with the FORECAST: USC 41 Syracuse 14 Troians again?

2★ KANSAS ST over Kent St - 1st meeting. When Kansas St was a national power Bill Snyder went on an 18-5 ATS run vs non-conf foes blowing out weak tms and having his squad gain confidence early in the season. He may want to get that reestablished as they are just 2-15 ATS vs them his last 6 seasons incl just getting by EKU 10-7 (-29') in the opener 2 wks ago. Kan St is 11-8 as a HF while Kent St is on their 2nd tough road game in 3 weeks (lost to Bama 48-7, +39). The Flashes are off a disappointing 20-12 loss to Louisiana as a 9' pt HF. They actually held UL to just 159 yds but gave up a 63 yd IRTD and fmbl'd at their own 1 setting up UL's only TD "drive". The Flashes were also hit with 9 penalties for 90 yds. LY Kent St stood toe-to-toe with BC and Penn St and has 14 ret st'rs and a veteran QB but does have a new HC. Kansas St is off a bye and a week 1 performance where they were non-motivated and only had a 3 pt win vs an FCS tm. In that gm they actually finished with a 303-129 yd edge and we'll expect them to be more focused here.

FORECAST: KANSAS ST 27 Kent St 3 2★ OHIO over Marshall - MU is 12-2 (both losses in Athens) incl 6 str wins. Four of the L/5 have been decided by a ttl of 11 pts. These two schools are 80 miles apart but Marshall has not traveled here S/'04. LY Ohio trailed 13-3 at HT being outgained 267-100. OU, down 7 w/1:01 left, drove 72/7pl for a 36 yd TD pass on the final play but elected to go for the win (2ptng, pass inc). Marshall is off its CUSA opener having played at WV on a Sunday in the opener and they have VT on deck. LW MU surprised by coming from behind with a Fr QB Cato to beat SM 26-20 (trailed 17-3). Ohio is off a win vs a IAA foe (Solich's 100th win as a HC) and at home a 2nd str week and is 10-5 as a HF. They are also 11-3 SU at home and Marshall is 6-30 SU on the road and 9-20-1 ATS. Marshall is the more exp tm with 14 ret st'rs (OU 11) and while the tms are close on off and def, OU has a huge ST edge (#4-97) and the solid home edge. We used a SBC team as our Sept 5★ in 2007, is it time to now use a MAC team? FORECAST: OHIO 30 Marshall 17

Thursday, September 15th Lsu at MISSISSIPPI ST - LSU has won 11 in a row vs MSU with the avg score 39-13. In the Tigers last visit to Starkville they were outFD'd 21-12 but thanks to being +4 in turnovers won by 4. LY Miss St had a 268-264 yd edge but lost by 22 as they were also -4 TO's. LSU is 8-13-1 ATS on the road and this is Miss St's home opener. LY in week 2 they hosted eventual national champ Auburn on a Thursday and came up just short 17-14. LW we cashed a 3★ on these pages going against the Bulldogs as they lost outright to Auburn 41-34 (-5') despite 31-21 FD and 531-381 yd edges as they were stopped at the 1 yd line on the final play. QB Relf has been dynamite this

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year avg 199 ypg (61%) with a 3-1 ratio while adding 157 rush (3.9). LSU meanwhile rolled to a 49-3 win over N'Western St LW and many of their st'rs got some rest in the 2H. History says play LSU as they are 15-4 ATS in the series but keep in mind MSU has 3 outright upsets in the last 3 years at home and the Cowbells will be loud in Starkville. Boise St at TOLEDO - In their 1st meeting LY, Boise won 57-14 (-38') forcing 5 TO's and building a 57-7 lead thru 3Q's. Both tms are coming off big gms with BSU topping UGA in ATL (35-21, -3) 2 weeks ago while UT gave Ohio St all it could handle in the Horseshoe falling 27-22 (+17') with their final drive ending at the OSU16 (:48 left). UT is 10-4 as a HD while BSU is 13-4 as an AF and has covered its L/3 true road openers. The Broncos are off a bye but the Rockets have their full attention as UT has topped tms such as Purdue ('10), Colo ('09), Mich ('08), Iowa St ('07) and Kansas ('06) in the L/5 yrs and the last time a Top-10 tm visited the Glass Bowl, UT beat #9 Pitt (35-31, +10) in 2003. lowa St at CONNECTICUT - Last meeting was in '02 as the Cyclones were bowl bound but we used UC as the Big Dog POW (+17) and they won outright in Ames 37-20! Iowa St is off of a 3OT thriller vs rival Iowa a wk ago (ISU won 44-41). UC still has some questions at the QB position (used 3 different QB's thru 2 gms) but does have 14 ret st'rs from LY's BCS bowl participant and only has Buffalo on deck making this their most exciting home game in the 1H of the ssn. ISU has just 12 ret st'rs but did bag a stunning upset win at TX (+20') LY and Neb (+20) on the road in '09 and exciting JC QB Jantz has led the GW drive the L2W. West Virginia 37 MARYLAND 34 - New Maryland HC Edsall was at Connecticut and was 1-6 SU vs WV with his lone win last year in a gm UC was +4 in TO's but were outgained 414-278. When these two met last year WV dominated with a 350-62 yd 1H edge and led 28-0 in the 3Q. WV had a big game at LSU the next week and looked ahead and MD made it respectable only losing 31-17 (+10). Two wks ago, the new look Terps held off a depleted Miami squad (susp) in the rain for a 32-24 win. QB O'Brien led a high-tempo attack (348 yd, 70%, 1-1) to 499 yds, its most S/'05. WV struggled early vs Norfolk trailing 12-10 1H, then exploded for 45 2H pts as QB Smith threw for 371 yds (58%) and 4 TD. Maryland is fresh off a bye and W Virginia has a huge home game vs LSU next week. For as spirited as this rivalry (only 210 miles apart) has been, most its gms have not been competitive. In the L/15 meetings only the 2004 gm was decided by less than 10 pts. MD is 47-18 SU at home and Edsall was 39-12 SU at home at Conn. In 2002 we used a 5★ on Florida St (-15) over Maryland and they won by double digits.

CLEMSON 37 Auburn 27 - Chizik earned his M.A. at Clemson in '91 and was a grad asst/LB cch here from '88-'89. Aub has won 7 str road openers (L/4 by combined 11 pts). Aub has won 14 in a row SU vs Clem with the last loss in 1951. In their only 3 recent meetings Aub has won by an avg of 24-20 and is 0-3 ATS. LY was their first reg ssn meeting since 1971. CU was in a tremendous situation as they had played 2 weak foes while AU was in an SEC sandwich. AU did not get a FD until its 4th series and CU led 17-0 with 1:14 left in the half (276-121 yds HT). AU won in OT after a missed CU FG. AU is 2-5 as an AD and has a young QB and O-line making their first road starts in a tough place. AU is off a tough SEC gm vs MSU where they extended their nation's longest win streak to 17, winning their 10th str game decided by 8 pts or less. CU, despite two underwhelming performances, is fresh and ready off Troy and Wofford but does have their Atlantic Div showdown with FSU on deck. We won last week with a 3★ LPS on AU who won outright as a 5' pt HD but this week we will go against them as CU has 14 ret st'rs to AU's 6 and is 43-13 SU in Death Valley and will be looking for some revenge for last year's missed opportunity. We used Clemson as our 2009 September 5★ and they dominated holding Boston College to 4 FD's in a 25-7 win (-7). Might we go back to them?

IOWA 23 Pittsburgh 20 - Iowa is 1-3 vs Pitt and in the only meeting S/'52 ('08) lost 21-20 despite 361-259 yd and 19-13 FD edges. Pittsburgh native Ferentz was a grad asst with the Panthers in '80. LW lowa blew a 24-17 late 4Q lead when ISU drove 59/13pl scoring the tying TD with 1:26 left in their 1st ever OT loss to their instate rival (Cyclones 473-365 yd, 26-18 FD edges). After a rough opener (2 fmbl), RB Coker got back on track with 137 yd vs ISU. Iowa is 4-0 ATS after SU losses to the Cyclones. Pitt struggled to get past a Maine tm (35-29) which finished 4-7 LY. The Panthers had just 381-371 yd and 26-19 FD edges and all'd 7 sks to an opp Pitt HC Graham said they "should dominate" although the Bears scored their final 2 TD's in the L/3:16. QB Sunseri was pulled after his 2nd int for Anderson, but remains the st'r. Graham leads the FBS in rushing (322, 5.7). This game is very reminiscent of that '08 encounter as that yr Iowa had the slightly more talented tm but the HT (Pitt) prevailed while TY the Panthers have #59-77 off and #32-45 D edges. CINCINNATI 52 Akron 3 - The Zips are 1-2 SU at Cincinnati but the gms have been decided by a total of 9 pts. UC only won the last meeting in '08, 17-15, kicking a 48 yd FG w/7:45 left and holding UA to a punt and getting a int (at UA44) on its final 2 drives and that '08 Cincy tm was 11-3! Cincy is a much improved tm and a Big East contender TY but is in a Tenn/Thurs Nt sandwich. While Cincy is just 4-8 ATS as a HF they covered vs Austin Peay (72-10) as a large HF (-42). Akron is off a 41-3 loss to Temple in their MAC opener but only has VMI on deck. The Zips have lost 15 straight road games, going 5-10 ATS (3-3 as AD LY). Akron failed to cover either of their 2 games as a DD dog TY losing by a combined 83-3. Cincy has large talent edges on both off (#24-120) and def (#49-116) The Bearcats are off a 22 pt loss (+4') and should be focused to cover the large number.

BOWLING GREEN 38 Wyoming 31 - Wyoming HC Christensen was the OL/OC at Toledo from '92-'00 going 5-4 vs rival Bowling Green (5-6 in career vs BG). WY lost the only meeting in '08, 45-16 at home! BG was a 4★ in Power Plays and a Small Coll Late Phone Selection and at -3 covered by 26. Both come in off blowout wins with huge yardage edges, as WY finished +429 and BG +379. Each took on an FCS foe with BG routing Morgan St, 58-13, and WY blowing out Texas St, 45-10. Vs 2 FCS teams, WY true Fr Smith is avg 265 ypg (60%) with a 4-3 ratio. BG QB Schilz avg 275 ypg (65%) with a 7-1 ratio. His fav target has been Cooper who has 244 (24.4) with 6 TD. The top rusher, Samuel, has 263 yd (8.0) with 2 TD and has B2B 100 yd gms (1st here S/'04). WY has barely handled their last two trips to MAC country beating Toledo LY 20-15 and Ohio in '07, 34-33. BG is finally up to scholarship limits but does have rival Miami on deck and WY has lost 9

str road openers by an avg score 33-9 (3 shutouts).

MICHIGAN 41 E Michigan 17 - UM has won all 9 gms in this series and in the 4 most recent meetings has won by an avg of 33 ppg outgaining the Eagles by 161 ypg. English was on the UM staff from '03-'07 as the DB cch and DC the L2Y. Trailing 24-7 into the 4Q UM rallied to beat ND in the final minute for the 3rd consecutive ssn as Robinson overcame 3 int's to hit the GW 16 yd TD pass with :02 left. The Irish had 513-452 yd and 28-16 FD edges but also had 5 TO's incl an int at the Wolves 2 and fmbl's at UM's 9 and 30. EM is 2-0 for the 1st time S/89 after beating 2 FCS tms. The Eagles had a 336-(-13) yd rush edge over Alabama St yet won just 14-7 as a fmbl set up the Hornets' only TD. RB tandem Sherrer (231, 7.7) and Greene (266, 7.4) both have run for 100 yds in the 1st 2 gms. English is 1-4-1 ATS vs BCS tms although this is a big flat spot for the Wolves.

W MICHIĞAN 37 C Michigan 17 - C Mich's HC, OC and DC all coached at W Mich. The HT has won 17 of 21 "Victory Cannons" going 13-6-1 ATS S/'90. LY WM took a 22-13 lead into the 4Q but, down 4, started a drive w/6:04 left at their own 34. After a 1&gl from CM6, WM fmbl at the 5 w/1:37 ending the comeback. CM has won 5 str (ties longest series streak '77-'81 and '83-'87). WM is playing with legitimate revenge and is the stronger team at home. CM is on its 2nd straight road game. WM has our #63 off, #78 D and #23 ST's while CM comes in at #100, #103 and #109. WM HC Cubit is just 1-5 vs rival CM and that win was in his first ssn in 2005. WM has found its run game in RB Drake, who has 151 yds rushing 7.6, while CM is ellowing 3.6 vnc WM endet their 5 cm series leging treak with a big win

rushing (7.6), while CM is allowing 3.6 ypc. WM ends their 5 gm series losing streak with a big win. Mississippi 27 VANDERBILT 17 - UM hasn't won an SEC opener S/'03, a 24-21 win vs Vandy. UM has dropped 4 of the L/6 meetings but won in their L/trip to Nashville. UM led 17-0 and held VU w/o a comp in the 1H (238-79 yd edge). LY VU jumped out to a 14-0 lead and scored the final 14 pts as Ole Miss' L/6 drives ended on a missed 32 yd FG, punt, 2 SOD's and 2 TO's and Vandy upset the Rebels 28-14 as 11' pt dogs (UM 385-300 yd edge). VU RB Norman rushed for 111 yds (80 yd TD run) for his 1st career 100 yd gm vs an SEC opp. Vandy has 19 ret st'rs and is 2-0 and riding high with new HC Franklin after a 24-21 come-from-behind win over Conn LW. VU held Conn to just 193 yds and the final was a bit misleading as they gave up two non-offensive TD's. After a home loss to BYU, Ole Miss rebounded to beat S Illinois, 42-24. The Rebels were playing without their top two RB's but diminutive Jeff Scott (5'7" 175) ran for 118 yds (7.4) and 3 TD's filling in. Ole Miss HC Nutt is on the hot seat and can ill afford to start SEC play 0-1 but he should have no problem motivating the troops after LY's upset loss in this series.

BOSTON COLLEGE 27 Duke 20 - The Eagles have won 4 str in the series. LY in BC's 1st visit to Durham they led 21-6 but Duke got a 95 yd FR TD to cut it to 5. BC stopped Duke on 4&gl from the BC4 w/:46 left. Duke's last trip to Chestnut Hill was in '06, a 28-7 loss. BC's offense has looked anemic behind an inexp'd OL which continues to get shuffled around and have been w/o RB Harris (orig committed to Duke) who should return here. LW BC's def kept it close into the 4Q (9-6) before UCF exploded for 21 pts losing 30-3. Duke is off a loss to Stanford 44-14 and after playing better than expected in the 1H finished up all'g 504 yds and is now 0-2 after also losing to Richmond in wk 1.BC is 0-6 as a HF and Duke is 32-16 as an AD. Renfree threw for 307 yds vs BC's tough D LY and TY has passed for 190 ypg (70%) but is not as mobile as the 2 QB's BC has faced. This is the ACC opener for BC (0-3 ATS) and they have a IAA foe on deck. Duke is 4-1 ATS in their ACC opener and has Tulane on deck. BC is off to its first 0-2 start since 1994 and desperately need a win here.

GEORGIA TECH 44 Kansas 23 - We love to play "ON" tms off a loss to an FCS foe as everyone overreacts and LY Kansas was upset at home by North Dakota St. The next week they went in +13' at home vs #15 GT and Kansas admitted to prepping for the GT option most of Aug. Naturally Kansas was a Big Dog Play and pulled the outright upset 28-25. LW KU delivered as our Underdog POW with a thrilling 45-42 (+5') win over NI as QB Webb threw a 6 yd TD pass w/:09 left. GT easily took care of MT LW 49-21 (42-7 3Q) as they rolled for 596 yds. Their triple option attack remarkably lead the NCAA in pass % wk 1 and LW rushed 382 yds showing they are not one dimensional. This time KU is in its 1st road gm and GT is playing with legit revenge. GT does have their ACC opener on deck but learned their lesson about overlooking Kansas and had a 407-320 yd edge LY. This should be an offensive show as both teams have shown little defensively in their wins vs non-BCS schools.

† Colo St 31 Colorado 30 - Denver. CU has won the L/3 at Sports Authority Field by an avg of 15 ppg. LY CU took a 24-0 lead into the 4Q and DN allow CSU to penetrate the redzone. The Rams did win on the road in '09, 23-17 (+10'). LW CSU QB Thomas became school's 1st soph QB to hit 3,000 yds pass as CSU beat N Colo, 33-14 with 28-9 FD and 501-216 yd edges (269-49 yd, 15-3 FD edges at HT). Thomas avg 219 ypg (74%l) but with a 2-3 ratio. He has no rec over 100 yds yet and the top rusher is Carter with 146 (5.2). Colorado lost a heartbreaker in OT vs Cal (not a P12 gm), 36-33, despite a 582-370 yd edge. QB Hansen hit 28-49 for a school record 474 yds, 3 TD and Richardson set a CU rec'd with 282 rec yds. Hansen avg 349 ypg (56%) with a 5-1 ratio while Richardson leads with 333 (23.8). The offenses are close with CU having the D edge (#58-92) and CSU having the situational edge and a large ST edge (#19-88). CSU feels like the step-child to Colorado and only has Utah St on deck while Colorado travels to Ohio St. You have to believe this is CSU's A+game for Sept while CU needs to jump-start its team. We used Colorado games twice as winning Sept 5*s and outright upset winners make for great a Game of the Month.

† Wisconsin 41 Northern Illinois 27 - The Badgers have been very good to us giving us winners in our favorite Sept 5★ (-10 vs Indy, 62-13 in '84), our 1996 Sept 5★ and our 2009 GOY. This is at Soldier Field in Chicago and naturally UW will have a large crowd edge. In '09 (last meeting) UW won 28-20 but was up 28-6 into the 4Q. NI was SOD at UW36 at the end. Doeren spent the L5Y w/UW (DC L/3) so he has great knowledge of the UW personnel and schemes. Oreg St's ST's miscues gave the Badgers a short field to work with in the 1H LW in a 35-0 win, their 1st shutout S/'09. UW outran OSU 208-23 while QB Wilson is now #2 FBS in pass eff and now faces a NI tm that has only 2 D st'rs back. Heartbroken Huskies were burned for a 6 yd TD pass on 4D with :09 left in a wild 45-42 loss at Kansas in which they all'd the Hawks over 250 yds rushing (253) and passing (281). KU also had 2 TD runs called back due to holding pens. Dual threat QB Harnish is #6 FBS pass eff. NI is allowing 278 rush yor. (4.5) and LWS OI, has outweighs the Huskies DI, by 64 lbs per mag (324-260)!

rush ypg (4.5) and UW's OL has outweighs the Huskies DL by 64 lbs per man (324-260)! MINNESOTA 31 Miami, Oh 17 - These teams have not met since '07 but Minny will be WELL prepared for this MAC foe for numerous reasons. First, Minny was 3-9 LY and Miami was 10-4. Second, Minny is 0-2 and only has an FCS foe on deck. Third, Miami, in their last trip here ('07), took the game to 30T's and Minny barely escaped (41-35, -8'). Finally, Coach Kill lost to Miami in the MAC Title game LY when a 4&20 pass was tipped and caught keeping Miami's final drive alive. HC Kill had a seizure on the sideline LW on what basically was the final play of the game, but he is expected to be ok and has never missed a gm in his career. Miami coach Treadwell is familiar with Minny's personnel as he was at Mich St LY. While Minn has the off edge (#85-105), Miami has the D edge (#48-61). Miami had an early season bye LW while Minny now has 2 games under their belt. This could actually be a Big Ten team playing its "A" game vs a MAC foe while, Miami has its MAC opener on deck.

FLORIDA 34 Tennessee 24 - The tm that has rushed for more yds has won 8 str and 20 of 21 and our projections have UF with a 190-65 rush edge. Florida has won a series high 6 str over Tenn (L/4 all by DD's). LY Fla went just 1-3 SU hosting SEC foes (worst mark S/79) and is 1-6 ATS in SEC HG's. LY UF was -13' on the road and won 31-17 as UF's def held the SEC's leading rusher, UT Poole to 23 yds on 10 carries and UT had 29 total rush yds. The Gators have been impressive in the first two weeks outscoring FAU and UAB by a combined 80-3 while holding them to 175 ypg. QB Brantley has adjusted well to new OC Weis' pro-style offense avg 212 ypg (67%) with a 1-2 ratio but the real star has been RB Rainey who, after becoming the first player in school history to score a TD rush, rec, and on a return in the same game in the opener, ran for 119 (7.4) LW. His running

This is a 2nd yr HC vs 1st time HC and UT is 7-3 as an AD making this game closer than in recent meetings.

NOTRE DAME 31 Michigan St 24 - LY the Spartans stunned the Irish with a fake FG TD pass in OT

(the play clock had expired prior but not called) and MSU HC Dantonio had a heart attack after the gm. Nine of the L/11 have been decided by single digits (4 of 6 by a FG). The visitor is 7-3 SU and 8-1-1 ATS! ND is 0-2 as they've turned the ball over an FBS worst 10 times incl 5 inside the opp's 10. The Irish led rival Mich 24-7 going into the 4Q before the Wolves offense exploded with the tms combining to score 3 TD's in the final 1:12 incl the GW with :02 left. Rees lost for the 1st time as the QB starter hitting 27-39 for 315 with 3 TD but he also had 2 crucial TO's inside the UM10. MSU had the FBS's biggest box score blowout of the week in their 44-0 pasting of FAU in which they had 27-1 FD and 434-48 yd edges! The Owls had just 1 drive of more than 7 yds as the Spartans have yet to allow a TD in '11. ND HC Kelly took over for Dantonio at Cincy and there is a little rivalry between them as whispers have already begun about whether the right man is patrolling the Irish sideline.

NORTH CAROLINA 31 Virginia 21 - ACC's oldest rivalry played every yr S/19. LY NC's 34 pt MOV

NOHTH CAROLINA 31 Virginia 21 - ACC's oldest rivalry played every yr S/19. LY NC's 34 pt MOV was its best in the series S/59. NC WR Jones had a then-career high 198 rec yds (28.3, 119 in 1Q). LTH the VA defense smothered NC all'g a season best 3 pts, 9 FD's and 174 yds. UVA has won 10 of 13 and after a loss in '05 pulled the shutout the next year. VA pulled out the 34-31 win over IU LW on a 23 yd FG as time expired. The Cavs blew a 23-3 3Q lead but tied it up w/1:36 left and on the next series DE Johnson blind-sided QB Wright-Baker and ripped the ball loose to give VA poss at IU14. LW NC dominated with a 405-244 yd edge but had 5 TO's and barely survived for a 24-22 win over Rutgers. QB Renner hit 42 of 49 incl a schl record 19 straight (275 ypg 3-4 ratio). The key matchup will be VA's run game of Parks/Jones avg 143 ypg vs the Heels who have all'd just 30 ypg rush. LY NC ended a 14 gm losing streak on VA's home field and did it with style winning 44-10 (-6). This is the ACC opener for both but the 2nd str AG for VA and 3rd str HG for NC. NC corrects their TO problem and hands VA their 1st loss.

Texas 23 UCLA 16 - Both teams had losing records LY and are much improved although UCLA hasn't shown it on the field thus far in '11 with a loss to Houston and needing a strong 4Q at home a wk ago to get by SJSt (all'd 202 rush yds). UT has dropped 3 str in this series incl LY when they allowed 264 (4.7) rush yds after holding UCLA to -6 yds into the 2Q. Four UT TO's kept UCLA in the gm in the 1H as UCLA led 10-3 at one pt with 18 total yds offense. The Bruins BIG OL wore down the smaller Horns in the 2H 34-12 (+15'). This is Texas' 1st road gm but they should have a good number of fans on hand. Over the 1st 2 wks of the ssn the Horns have all'd just 459 yds ttl on def (230 ypg) but continue to struggle with consistency at QB with Gilbert being replaced by McCoy (7-8 for 57 yds) and Ash LW after a rocky beginning vs BYU. Texas has a bye on deck and is playing with legitimate revenge. UCLA has 16 ret st'rs but after an 8-0 ATS run as a HD, they are just 6-6 since. The Bruins are in the middle of another QB controversy in stalling some of their Pistol offense while Texas is 41-5 SU on the road (all'd just 239 ypg on road in '10).

NEBRASKA 34 Washington 13 - This will be the 3rd meeting in the past yr. LY UW (+3) was hammered during the reg ssn (56-21) but got revenge in the bowl (held NU to a ssn low 189 yds, 209 yds below ssn avg). UW is just 1-8 in road openers but did put together a solid outing LW vs HI with 466 ttl yds in the 8 pt win (just 250 yds in opener vs IAA EW). The Huskers needed a strong 4Q to pull away from a stingy Fresno squad who actually trailed by just 1 pt entering the final period (NU outgained 444-438). UW has their P12 opener on deck and has not traveled to Lincoln since '98. QB Price (career-high 315 pass yds, 4 TD vs HI) is making his first road start in one of the toughest venues in the country and with the Huskies going just 5-13 as an AD and the Huskers in a non-BCS sandwich, this could be a long day for UW with NU seeking legitimate revenge.

Texas Tech 31 NEW MEXICO 21 - TT is 12-1 vs NM but in the L2Y has outgained the Lobos by just 56 and 29 yds despite 20 and 35 pt wins. LY (-25, 52-17) TT blk'd 2 punts, forced 3 TO's and had a 93 yd KR. TT is off a bye after thumping Texas St 50-10 in the opener. QB Doege hit 23-33-326 with a 3-0 ratio with Moore grabbing 221 rec yds (18.4) and RB Stephens putting up 118 (5.6) rush. NM did fix the sacks (9), TO's and pen's that plagued them in the season opener but were still destroyed 52-3 at #14 Ark LW. It was 14-3 after 1Q, but Ark opened it up and finished with 34-15 FD and 632-297 yd edges. QB Austin is avg 171 ypg (59%) with a 1-0 ratio and proj st'r Holbrook did see action LW hitting 7-10-40. TT (14 ret st'rs) has a QB making his 1st road start vs a veteran NM tm with 15 ret st'rs and 5 BCS schl transfers. Northwestern 34 ARMY 24 - NW is 4-1 ATS in non-BCS road gms and beat Rice 30-13 LY. Army is 1-6 at Michie Stadium S/'05 vs BCS schools with the avg loss by 24 ppg (only win was in '09 in OT vs Vandy). NW is 1-6 in the rare role of AF (5 yrs). NW has a huge edge on offense (#26-101) and edges on D (#71-112) and ST's (#52-99) as well. NW did just face a pass happy tm and now shifts gears to the option and is 10-21 ATS off a SU win. Cats QB Colter did his best Persa impersonation (77%, 109 rush yds) LW and it is unknown if the Sr QB will be medically cleared for this gm. Army is off a 23-20 loss to SDSt as they had 25-16 FD and 446-292 yd edges. However after being tied for 5th LY in fewest TO's lost (14 in 13 gms), the Knights have 3 TO's in each of their first 2 games. It could even have been worse LW as they had 8 fumbles but recovered 5 of them. NW has lost just 1 TO this year but also only has 2 takeaways. The one good sign for Army is they are avg 5.0 ypc (353 ypg) while NW has allowed 4.2 ypc. Nevada 31 SAN JOSE ST 24 - The fav is 9-2 ATS in this series. UN is on an 8-1 SU and 7-3 ATS run

The Spartans are a much improved tm returning 18 strs. LW SJSt was tied at 17 mid-4Q with UCLA before falling late. QB Stewart got the start (111 pass yds, 47 rush yds) and provided the offense with a spark it was missing in the opener. LY SJSt trailed 14-10 after 1Q but had 3 costly TO's after (fmbl, int at N3 and int in EZ) in a 35-13 loss (+37'). LTH UN led 55-0 in the 4Q (won 62-7, -13') as they never punted scoring TD's on 9 of 10 poss (missed FG on only other drive) and tied an NCAA record with four 100 yd rushers (517-30 edge on the ground). For 3 str yrs SJSt has yielded a ssn high in yds vs UN (525, 665 and 640) but all of those were vs Kaepernick who is now gone. The Pack saw its 7 gm win streak snapped LW in a 69-20 (+26') loss at Oregon. QB Lantrip made his first career start (21-35-219, 1-2 ratio) but UN did manage 283 yds on the ground vs the Ducks. This is UN's WAC opener but the 2nd of 4 straight road gms to open the year while this is SJSt's home opener.

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KEY SELECTIONS

4* NEW ORLEANS over Chicago - The Bears beat the Saints 27-24 in '08 pushing as a 3 pt HF NO went to the wire in their losing effort to GB LW and they have extra time to adjust to not having WR's Moore (groin) or Colston (collarbone) here. NO went 5-3 SU & 3-4-1 ATS at home LY with 2 ATS losses to rookie QB's as it took a while for the ŚB hangover to fade. They showed they were just as potent as ever with a 78 yd edge It took a while for the SB hangover to tade. Iney showed they were just as potent as ever with a 78 yd edge vs GB on the road. Now they are at home vs a CHI offense that doesn't have the same quick strike ability as GB. LW vs ATL the Bears converted 3 TO's into 14 pts and while they gave up yds to Ryan (319) they forced him to put it up 47 times logging 5 sks and 6 QBH. Cutler was very sharp with 312 yds (69%) with a 2-1 ratio. The OL gave up 5 sks and 11 QBH and took a hit with RG Louis (ankle) getting hurt and career C Spencer from SEA may get the start here. Playing on turf will help CHI's speed but Saints C Kreutz was CHI's C for 13 years and will help with the playcalls here. FORECAST: NEW ORLEANS 35 Chicago 21 3* WASHINGTON over Arizona - This is the 1st HF role for the Redskins under Shanahan who was 3-17 ATS as a HF w/ DEN before he left. ARZ had a favorable situation LW at home vs a rookie QB in his 1st career start. While ARZ got the SU win they gave up a whopping 422 yds to Cam Newton. They needed a 70 yd TD pass and an 89 yd PR in the 4Q to get the win. The Redskins had a better than expected game by Grossman (4-0 ATS) with 305 yds (62%) with 2 TD's vs NYG. While the ypc wasn't impressive (2.8) they did keep running the ball (26 att's) to force balance in the game. WAS gave up 315 yds LW they held the Giants to just 1 of 10 on 3rd Dns, with just 75 yds (3.8) vs a formidable RB tandem. WAS has the situational edge at home for the 2nd straight week vs a team that is 3-9 ATS in EST games. WAS is the "forgotten NFC East team" and while they don't have a "high Q" rating they will get some insight from RB Hightower on the offense and have a scouting edge on Kolb from his time with PHI.

OTHER SELECTIONS 2★ San Diego (+) over NEW ENGLAND - NE is off LW's MNF gm vs MIA (8-5 ATS) and beat SD 23-20 as a 3 pt AD LY. SD had a 363-179 yd edge but were down 20-3 mid-3Q due to 4 TO's in the 1H. SD rallied with 17 4Q pts but missed a 50 yd FG with 23 seconds failing to go to OT. Brady only had 159 yds passing (59%) as 8 of 11 drives started on their 40 or better. NE went 9-1 SU/8-2 ATS LY vs top 10 defenses LY with the only SU loss in Wk 2 vs NYJ. SD again scared their fans in the opener as they trailed 17-7 at HT. It was a game they dominated statically finishing with 31-10 FD and 407-187 yd edges but failed to cover allowing an opening kickoff return and 51/3pl d TD drive. NE's downfall had been their D which finished #25 LY. The Patriots allowed 27+ points 6 times last season incl the playoff's and not only did they go 0-6 ATS but they lost 3 of those outright. SD's travel disadvantage is negated by NE's short week and we'll call for the 2010 non-playoff team to cover vs a team that was 14-2 LY as this weeks UGLY DOG (26-16 - including LW's outright upset winner on Buffalo!). This is PIT's only HG for the 1st 4 Wks with a Peytonless IND team on deck. SEA is 0-5 ATS as a DD dog & 1-10 ATS away vs an NDIV foe. PIT has seen SEA OC Bevell's before in a 27-14 win (6 pt HF) in 2009 vs a better QB (Favre) with much better supporting cast. PIT was outgained 386-259 but made 4 sks and forced 2 4Q TO's for TD's. SEA was outgained 427-289 by NDIV foes in 2010 and are a weaker team than LY. PIT outgained NDIV foes 421-327 w/ Roethlisberger LY with a 366-245 yd edge at home also. PIT gave BAL a lot of lockerroom material in the offseason and paid for it with their 2nd 28 pt loss since 1990. PIT turned the ball over 7 times setting up 20 pts for the Ravens. They also allowed a 100 yd rusher for just the 2nd time in 51 games. Look for the Steelers to vent a lot of frustration on a SEA team that had 3 FD's and 37 yds at the half LW who may not have OG Gallery or WR Rice again.

FORECAST: PITTSBURGH 38 Seattle 10

OTHER GAMES DETROIT 31 Kansas City 21 - KC is in a poor spot after getting crushed in their home opener and have a road game vs SD on deck. This is DET's only HG in the 1st 4 Wks and their crowd edge will be a big boost to the DL. DET went 3-0 ATS as a HF LY beating STL, WAS and MIN. They now get a wounded QB at home and the focus will be if the DL can contain KC's ground game. KC RB's Charles and Jones combined for 59 yds rushing (4.9) vs LY's #32 rush defense. KC was held to 2 FD's and 60 yds in the 2H as they were held to 20 yds or less on 11 drives in the game. Without the play action, Cassel was held to 119 yds (61%) 1-1 with 32 yds in the 2H. DET allowed 28 yds (2.5) to the RB's on LY's #8 rush offense on the road LW. Stafford dominated with 305 yds (73%) with a 3-1 ratio. He's also seen a Crennel defense before putting 422 yds (61%) with a 5-2 mark on CLE in a 38-37 win (3.5 pt HF) in 2009. KC isn't as bad as they looked LW but DET is better than LW's score (+118 yds, almost 10 min TOP edge). We'll call for the Lions by 10

and see if the public overreacts to LW's events and moves the line.

NY JETS 27 Jacksonville 10 - The Jags have covered 6 straight vs the Jets inc a 24-22 win as a 6.5 pt AD in 2009. JAX spent a lot of money in FA on defense to "win now" but opted for Luke McCown who had 4 starts prior to TEN LW in his career. JAX kept it conservative with McCown (175 yds 71%) not asking him to do much (7.3 ypa) and putting the ball in the hands of Jones-Drew (97 yds 4.0). JAX had a 13-0 lead late in the 3Q but LY's #28 defense allowed an 80 yd TD pass followed with a 80/12pl 4Q drive. On 4 drives to the TEN 30 the Jags came away with 1 TD and 3 FG's and despite a 19:16 TOP edge were only +31 yds. McCown is now being tasked to go on the road vs one of the biggest blitzing teams in the NFL. The Jets will be able to leave Revis/Cromartie in man to man here as JAX doesn't have an intimidating receiver package. This will allow them to creep the safeties to reinforce LB's Harris and Scott to shut down Jones-Drew as the Jets get the win.

BUFFALO 23 Oakland 13 - The Bills have a huge situational edge at home vs OAK off a MNF road game vs DEN, travelling to the EST (1-5 ATS) with a home game vs NYJ on deck. OAK went 2-8 SU/ATS vs NDIV vs DEN, travelling to the Exp (143 At 3) with a horizontal fores LY with a more pedestrian 122 ypg rush (4.6) avg (213 5.4 vs DIV). BUF went 2-1 SU/ATS as a HF LY vs JAX, DET and CLE and the Bills are 4-0 ATS in NDIV home openers. The big question for the Bills will be if their defense which gave up 170 ypg (4.8) rushing LY (#32) can contain LY's #2 rush offense (156 ypg 5.0). BUF crushed the Chiefs LW 41-7 and held Charles/Jones to 59 yds rushing (4.9). They executed very well and on 5 drives that started on the KC side they scored 3 TD's, 1 FG and had 1 punt. BUF isn't as good as they showed last week but they have tons of intangible edges here. We'll take the home team

with a QB that knows the Gailey system vs an OAK team travelling on a short week.

Baltimore 20 TENNESSEE 14 - HC Munchak is very familiar with the Ravens having coached against them under Fisher. TEN appeared to catch a break LW vs JAX's #2 QB who only had 18 pass att's in preseason (Gabbert 70), all'd McCown and the Jags to jump out to a 13-0 lead in the 3Q before the offense was able to get it going in the 16-14 loss. Hasselbeck had an efficient outing throwing for 263 yds (62%) and he had a few

There have been 3 outright upsets in the last 6 and the dog and Tulane are 4-2 ATS. This is TU's 1st road trip but they have a veteran QB and O-line but Griffin struggled LW vs Tulsa in a 31-3 loss. This is UAB's home opener and almost a must-win for coach Callaway who is on the hot seat. Tulane actually outgained foes on the road LY 394-359 and are 7-2 in road openers with 4 str covers. KENTUCKY 24 Louisville 17 - HC's Phillips and Strong are old friends who used to coach together at SC. LY UL had 27 Sr's and UK has just 13 on their travel squad but UK won on the road 23-16 (-3) their 4th SU win in a row in the series (3-1 ATS) after having lost the previous 4. UK had a 466-317 yd edge and naturally has the more veteran tm TY with 16 ret st'rs while UL has just 10. UL has a young QB and O-line making their first road start. The Cards are coming off two disappointing gms to start the season after beating Murray St just 21-9 and last week were upset at home (-4') by FIU, 24-17, despite having 24-9 FD and 446-293 yd edges. passes dropped. On the other side the Ravens put forth one of the more impressive performances of week forcing a team-record seven TO's as they routed the defending AFC champ Steelers 35-7 (the most lopsided victory in series history). QB Flacco was sharp throwing for 224 yds (59%) and 3 TD's while Rice added 107 rush (5.6). While it is well noted that BAL is just 5-11 ATS as an AF & 4-8 ATS after facing PIT, the Ravens look to be on a mission TY after playoff disappointments the L3Y. We'll call for them to keep the momentum and take advantage of a TEN team that lacks explosiveness outside of RB Johnson and were hurt by the lockout.

Green Bay 27 CAROLINA 20 - The Packers have virtually every edge imaginable vs the Panthers and the line reflects it. Rodgers showed no rust with 312 yds (77%) 3-0 ratio vs LY's #4 defense. GB did give up a huge chunk of yds to NO LW (477) but that was vs one of the top 5 QB's in the NFL. They won't take CAR lightly esp after Newton showed off all of his physical skills LW vs ARZ with 422 yds (65%) with a 2-1 ratio. DC Capers gets a little extra time to figure out how to contain Newton and force him to make mistakes vs GB's coverages. Newton may have had the best game by a Wk 1 rookie QB ever but that was vs ARZ with a new DC and a thin secondary. Stewart and Williams only had 56 yds rushing combined LW and CAR will look to get more out of them here as they can't count on another big week by Newton. GB is clearly the

superior team but the potential for a backdoor cover with a road game vs CHI on deck is too big here.

MINNESOTA 24 Tampa Bay 17 - TB beat MIN 19-13 as a 4 pt HF in the last meeting in 2008. TB went an impressive 6-0-2 ATS away LY as the lack of big home crowds actually helps them out. The lack of work in the offseason was clear for TB who were very lucky to be down 20-10 vs DET at the end of the 1H. TB's pts were set up by a 78 yd KR and a 28 yd int return for a TD off a tipped pass. DET had 16-7 FD and . 324-108 yd edges and at the 2 min warning TB had run 14 offensive plays in the 1H.TB simply couldn't get the ground game going as TB's QB's had half of their 56 yds rushing (3.5). TB's young DL didn't get near Stafford logging 0 sks/0 QBH. McNabb had a decent game vs TB in a 17-16 loss w/ WAS as a 1 pt AD with 228 yds (63%) with 2 TD's. He was ineffective vs LY's #1 defense with 39 yds (47%) w/a 1-1 ratio. MIN was throttled statistically overall (407-187) vs SD but were in the game until the late 4Q. They will have a loud crowd edge here to help a defense that plays better on turf and we'll take the home team here.

Cleveland 17 INDIANAPOLIS 16 - This could be CLE's 1st AF role since the end of 2007. IND was mauled by the Texans in the 1H LW being outFD 19-5 and outgained 259-72 while giving up a 79 yd PR for a TD. IND's only score came after HOU fmbl'd on their own 27 in the mid-4Q. IND converted 1 of 9 3rd Dns and gave up 167 yds rushing (4.1) to HOU w/o Foster. CLE looked like the inexperienced young team changing systems that they are as they committed 7 penalties in the 1Q to setup 13 pts for CIN. They then blew their 5th 4Q lead in 17 games with CB Haden missing an assignment before CLE gave up a 38 yd TD run to seal it. CLE is well suited for this game as without Manning to pull the trigger and Collins (197 yds 52% 1 TD) only having 25 days with the team their skill players are no where near as dangerous. CLE AB Hillis is more than capable of pounding the ball to help control the tempo. IND is the veteran team, entrenched in its systems getting points vs a CLE team is is young but until Collins shows us that he knows the system, we'll call for the Browns by 1.

Dallas 24 SAN FRANCISCO 14 - One of the marquee rivalries of the 80's and 90's, these two franchises have just two playoff wins between them since 1999. SF has a big situational edge at home for the 2nd week to start the season. DAL is logging a lot of miles to start the season having to travel to the Jets LW and now goes to the West Coast. LW SF jumped out to a 16-0 HT lead over SEA and after the Seahawks cut it to 19-17 in the 4Q, Ted Ginn ret'd the ensuing KO 102 yds for a TD and then added a 55-yd PRTD to seal it. QB Smith only had 124 yds passing but completed 75% of his passes and had 0 TO's. DAL is 1-6 ATS as an AF and faces an SF tm that is 10-4-1 ATS as a dog. While the Sunday night results vs NYJ are unknown DAL has a big edge at QB with Romo over Smith, deeper receiving threats and just one year after failing to live up to the preseason hype, the Cowboys are a undervalued this year with basically the same talent as LY's team.

MIAMI 24 Houston 21 - Both teams played the preseason favorite to win their division. HOU got their second straight opening win but this time vs a Manningless Colts team while MIA is off NE on MNF. A scheduling oddity has made these two teams familiar having played annually from '06-'09 with HOU winning all 4 but only covering 2 as 3 of the 4 were decided by a total of 6 points. The Schaub/Johnson combo picked up right were they left off and RB Tate (116 yds 4.8) replaced an injured Foster which now forces the defense to prep for another weapon. Schaub also excelled on the road throwing for more ypg (304 vs 242), a better (64.2 vs 62.9) and a better ratio (14-5 vs 10-7). MIA is an attractive option as a dog here with HOU off its huge win, getting the media feed as the AFC South is theirs for the taking. MIA had the #6 defense LY, Henne

has a better OL to help him out and practices vs the 3-4 each week and we'll take the points here. **DENVER 24 Cincinnati 14** - The Broncos beat CIN 12-7 as a 4.5 pt AD to open the 2009 season. CIN went ahead 7-6 with 38 seconds left on a 1 yd run by Benson. DEN scored an 87 yd TD off a ball tipped by a CIN defender to pull ahead with :11 left. DEN is off LW's MNF game vs OAK and those results are unknown. They do have a situational edge for being home for the 2nd straight week to open the season vs CIN on the road again. Cincy jumped out to a 13-0 lead vs CLE thanks to 7 penalties and CLE adjusting to its new schemes. Ďalton lookéd good in the 1H (81 yds 67% 1-0) but hurt his right wrist and his status iš unknown. Gradkowski (92 yds 42% 1 TD) struggled to move the team in the 2H as 14 of CIN's pts came off CLE's mental errors. While also moving to a 4-3 defense, DEN has a better secondary at this point than CLE, has a more established veteran core and Fox will also have a better pass rush with Dumervil and Ayers.

Philadelphia at ATLANTA - Vick (bruised ribs) DNP in PHI's 31-17 win as a 2 pt AF LY vs ATL and didn't

even go on the sidelines. PHI had a 474-293 yd edge, held ATL RB Turner to 45 yds (3.0) rushing and were in total control of the game after opening up with a 21-0 lead. PHI is off a big win vs a STL team that lost 5 starters while ATL was hammered on the road by CHI. Whose Wk 1 results are more misleading? Get the Sunday Marquee Play after 11:00 am for just \$9 on the Northcoast Debit Card System.

St Louis at NY GIANTS - Former Giants DC Spagnuolo faces his old team for the 1st time since taking over with the Rams. STL is 7-3 ATS away vs a NDIV foe under Spags while the rest of the NFC West is 9-19-2 ATS combined. They did lose 4 offensive starters LW with Bradford and Jackson being unknowns here. This is only the 2nd MNF HG for the Giants under Coughlin (6-2 SU/ATS) who have a rematch at PHI on deck

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Houston 41 LOUISIANA TECH 31 - UH's last visit to Ruston was in '94 losing 32-7 (last met '95). LT is 8-2 SU in non-conf HG's since '01 (five IAA foes) incl a win over Miss St and a 1 pt loss to SM LY. They are 8-2 as a HD. The defenses are even but UH has a large edge on offense with QB Keenum and also on ST's (#22-61). UH is 2-11 ATS as an AF under Sumlin and LW the Cougars were tied with NT 17-17 late 2Q until they scored 31 unanswered. LT struggled with Central Ark LW winning in 2OT but allowed 445 yds and 45 pts. The talent says UH but the technical edges side with the HD, so we'll call it by 10 and see where the line settles

TEXAS A&M 41 Idaho 13 - 1st meeting. LW the Vandals trailed 14-3 to N Dakota before scoring 41 unanswered pts fueled by QB Reader's 299 yd, 4 TD outing in a 44-14 victory (424-197). UI is 0-5 SU (no lined gms) all-time vs current Big 12 schools having been outscored 166-24 (28 ppg). The Vandals are 1-10 SU in road openers (avg loss by 29 ppg) but have gone 8-3 ATS (covered 5 of L/6). UI is 7-3 ATS as an AD and did cover at Nebraska LY despite 6 TO's. A&M has large edges on off (#4-92) and def (#20-106). The Aggies are 14-0 SU (6-3 ATS) vs current WAC foes (avg score 42-16). A&M topped SMU 46-14 in its opener behind QB Tannehill's 246 yds (2-0 ratio) and RB Gray's 132 yds rushing (6.3). The Aggies are fresh off a bye, however, A&M is only 1-5 SU after a bye under HC Sherman. The Aggies are 8-3 as a HF but have a huge revenge game vs Top 10 Okla St on deck while UI has its WAC opener vs Fresno up next.

The Bulls, after only losing to Pitt in the opener 35-16 (+30) made it look easy beating Stony Brook 35-7 a week after the Seawolves took UTEP to OT. Buffalo has reestablished a running game as after not having a 100 yd rusher since 2009, the Bulls RB Oliver has had 2 straight to start the season. Ball

St has the stronger offense, is at home, has the series edge and wins this by a FG.

ILLINOIS 31 Arizona St 28 - Last met in '88. Under Zook, UI is just 3-9 SU vs non-conf/BCS opp's but this is only their 3rd at home and first since 2006. ASU has dropped 3 str road openers but the L/2 have this is only their ard at nome and first since 2000. As to has propped 3 at load openers but the D2 have come by a ttl of 4 pts. This is the Illini's "A" game for Sept (off a meeting vs Ark St and S Dakota St with W Mich on deck) while the Sun Devils held off a late Mizzou rally to prevail in OT last Fri in Tempe (QB Osweiler 353 pass yds, 4 ttl TD) and has the key game of their P12 South season on deck at home vs USC. The Illini outgained SD St by a 519-96 clip LW and is 10-5 ATS as a dog while this is rare situation. for ASU as they have been an AF just 5 times over the L5Y going 2-3 ATS. The Devils have covered 6 of their L/7 road openers and do have slight edges on off (#22-39) and def (#23-35) but Illinois has the ST's (#57-81), home and situational edges and almost upset Ohio St at home a season ago.

Oklahoma 34 FLORIDA ST 27 - LY was a rematch of the '00 Orange Bowl and OU dominated scoring TD's on their 1st 4 poss. OU led 47-10 with a 487-298 yd edge before allowing a 47 yd garbage TD pass on the gm's final play. Landry Jones hit 30-40 for 380 yds incl 372 yds at the half before going more conservative in the 2H and they were the College 900 POW on the PPH. OU is 14-0 SU at home/bowls but is just 4-6 SU on the road. They are off a bye after discarding a high powered Tulsa offense 47-14. OU has 16 st'rs back incl battle tested QB Jones who LY vs 6 ranked foes threw for 362 ypg. FSU QB Manuel has started 3 vs ranked foes throwing for 157 ypg. FSU is off 2 tune-up gms vs non-BCS foes avg 510 ypg and outscoring them 96-10. FSU has this as a revenge gm but OU has circled it as well after hearing about it in April. OU was -7' at Miami in '09 and lost SU but that was an 8-5 tm that year and now comes in #1 and the most talented tm in the country

NEW MEXICO ST 30 Utep 23 - UTEP has won the "Battle of I-10" 7 of the L/10 (6-4 ATS) incl the last meeting in Las Cruces (38-12, -13'). UTEP has won by an avg of 40-11 the L2Y. The HT is 11-3 SU, however, the visitor has covered in 5 of the L/6. UTEP QB Lamaison (254 pass ypg) was knocked out of the gm LW and is exp to miss (shidr). It's early in the ssn but the Miners are only avg 33 ypg rushing thru 2 gms. NMSt is fresh off its first win ever vs a Big Ten tm, its first over a BCS school S/99 and ended a 12 gm road losing streak with a 28-21 win over MInny (as a 20 pt dog) delivering another OUTRIGHT UPSET for the Big Dog POW. The Aggies got a 4Q goal-line stand from the 1 to help preserve the victory. After churning out just 6 yds rushing in the opener, NMSt rushed for 133 yds vs the Gophers while QB Manley passed for 288 (3-2 ratio). Manley is avg 325 ypg (58%, 5-3 ratio) and has given the Aggies' offense new life after being stagnant the L/2Y. NMSt hasn't won B2B gms in 3 yrs but will end that streak here.

Ohio St 21 MIAMI, FL 20 - LY marked the 1st rematch S/'02's National Title. UM opened the 2H trailing 26-17 getting a 1&gl at the OSU6 but on 3D Harris tossed 1 of his 4 int's and OSU's IR went 80 yds setting up a short TD drive and the 14 pt swing. OSU had a 414-352 yd edge at home and won 36-24 (-8) despite allowing a PR and KR TD's. "U" is off a bye and should be closer to full strength after the susp ravaged opening loss to MD as Golden says QB Harris will replace Morris who hit 19-28-195 yds with 2 int incl the cover blowing 54 yd pick six with :51 left. The Bucks forced a Toledo inc

on 4&5 at the OSU16 with :48 left to keep their 90 yr win streak vs instate schools alive. The Rockets kept the staunch Bucks D off balance by using the Wildcat and misdirection as they had the 338-301 yd edge. ST mistakes were costly however as OSU had a 69 PR TD (re-kicked due to pen) and botched 2 FG's. QB Bauserman was booed by the home crowd after missing on several deep balls, but Fr phenom Miller DNP. Pryor rushed for 113 yds LY and will be missed.

Okla St 43 TULSA 30 - LY OSU led 20-0 into the 2Q and scored on their 1st 10 poss never looking back

The Cowboys did win their last trip to Tulsa ('00) but are just 3-6 there since '82. OSU is 6-1 SU/ATS in road openers and led 58-7 late 3Q LY vs TU pulling QB Weeden early 3Q. OSU has covered 7 in a row as an AF winning by 22 ppg and had 722 yds LY vs Tulsa. LW the Cowboys hammered Ariz on Thurs Night and got an extra 2 days of rest. Tulsa is 8-3 ATS as a HD and this is their home opener (568 ypg at home LY) and they have 16 st'rs back. Tulsa took care of CUSA foe Tulane LW but lost to #1 OU to start the year and now faces Top 10 tms in the next 2 wks. Both QB's are very fluid running their offenses but TU is missing its biggest weapon (Thomas) while OSU, with our #2 off, has weapons all around.

Hawaii 44 UNLV 20 - UH has won 3 of the L/4 (4-0 ATS) but the Warriors are just 1-3 SU (2-2 ATS) in trips to Vegas. LY the Rebels allowed 14+ in each quarter and trailed 52-7 before 2 garbage TD's (1 with :16 left). LTH in '09, there were 8 lead changes (4 in 4Q) as after UH took the lead by 5 they all'd a 67/14pl GW 15 yd TD pass w/:36 left and UH's EZ pass fell inc. UH has the edge on off (#71-116) and def (#69-120) but LV has the adv on ST (#56-100). LV has been walloped by B2B BCS foes (Wisky, Wash St) by a comb 110-24 to open the ssn (opp's combined to score on their 1st 13 poss!). UH has also faced B2B BCS D's in the first two wks (Colo and Wash) and the defenses mixed and matched their coverages to slow down UH's run-and-shoot offense. The adjustments have worked as QB Moniz is avg 104 ypg fewer passing (256 ypg) than he did last ssn. For the 3rd consec yr and the 4th time in L/5Y, UH will remain on the mainland to play consec road gms and is 1-3 SU and 2-2 ATS when they do this. In '07 and '09 the 2nd of the B2B gms were vs LV. UH won 49-14 (-17) in '07 but lost 34-33 (+7) in '09. While LV HC Hauck is 4-2-1 ATS at home, UH HC McMackin is 5-1 ATS as an AF and gets a big win here.

Stanford 31 ARIZONA 30 - Stanford has gone 4-1 in Tucson S/99 but did lose their last trip here, 43-38, as they all'd 80/6pl and 92/5pl drives in the 4Q. After another solid performance vs another less than stellar opp (Duke), SU has now outscored their 1st 2 101-17. Despite the scoring, SU has only outgained SJSt and Duke by 153 ypg as the def (#15) has put their off (#5) in solid position. The Wildcats defense was victimized by the passing gm a wk ago vs OKSt all'g 397 in the air and 594 ttl yds (341 ypg all'd LY). They may also be missing their #1 WR target Criner who DNP LW (CS). The visitòr in this series is on á 10-5 ATS run and Stanford has gone 9-3 ATS in its 1st conf AG but UA has covered 6 str as a HD and is known for pulling out some conf home stunners (#2 Oreg in '07, #8 Cal in '06) and could very well keep this one tight throughout.

TCU 38 Ulm 10 - 1st meeting. TCU is off two very tough road gms and is taking a big step down in competition. LW they were without their top RB Wesley and tackler Brock, but it didn't matter as they jumped out to a 21-0 lead at AF en route to the 35-19 win. Surprisingly they were outgained 416-410 but did have a 396-288 yd edge entering the 4Q. Patterson has won his last 6 home openers by an avg of 36 ppg (4-1 ATS, 1 NL) and he is 22-8 as a HF. ULM is a much more exp tm with 17 ret st'rs but did lose on the road LY by an avg of 40-16. They are off a dominating 35-7 home win over Grambling St as they all'd just 4 first downs and outgained the Tigers 452-144. RB Donald had 144 rush yds (12.0). It doesn't get any easier for ULM as they travel to Iowa next. ULM is just 15-33 ATS vs non-conf opp's, and 0-24 vs ranked opp's with the avg loss by 36 ppg but is 6-4 ATS since 2004. VIRGINIA TECH 38 Arkansas St 10 - VT is 3-0 vs Ark St (last met in 02) with the avg score 49-5. VT

has outgained ASU on avg 422-191 and ASU has just a comb 121 rush yds (1.2) in the 3 gms. VT has dominated the ACC as of late but is just 7-14-2 ATS vs non-conf. Despite a 332-112 yd edge LW, VT struggled with costly penalties, turnovers, and dropped passes and held on to win 17-10 over E Carolina, giving HC Beamer his 200th career win. There is concern as QB Thomas has struggled (120 ypg, 43%) but RB Wilson has shined (154 ypg, 7.3). They do only have Marshall on deck and are 8-5 as a HF. ASU is 3-0 the L5Y as an AD vs AQ tms and has upset Tex A&M and almost upset Texas and only has an FCS tm on deck. They are off an eye-opening performance against Memphis in which they outgained the Tigers by an astonishing 611-169 yds in the 47-3 beatdown, and will come into Blacksburg on a high. Ucf 26 FIU 20 - First meeting. The Knights are 3-13 SU in road openers but won LY. UCF is 1-8 the

last 15 ssns vs in-state opp's (only win vs FAU in '03). The Golden Panthers are 0-5 vs non-conf instate FBS schools (avg score 32-8). UCF had a dominating yd edge vs BC LW (422-141) in the 30-3 win, but was only up 9-3 early in the 4Q and is off to their best start in over a decade. They have a Friday Nite game at BYU on deck. This is their road opener (10-4 ATS) and they have a veteran QB and are 6-1 as an AF. FIU is off its 1st ever win over a BCS school (0-22 previously) as they hung on to a 24-17 win at Louisville behind Hilton's team record 201 rec yds. They are 2-0 for the first time in their history. FIU is 5-0 as a HD but is 1-5 hosting current non-conf opp's (win in '05 vs Florida A&M). Somebody's "O" has got to go!

ALABAMÁ 52 North Texas 0 - In the last gm ('09) NT trailed 30-0 at HT being outgained 355-57 (NT was without starting QB) before eventually falling 53-7 (-39'). Bama is in a large flat spot off their first road game facing a Whitehouse crowd at Penn St and they have Arkansas and Florida on deck. After spotting PSU a 3 pt lead, they scored 27 straight and won 27-11. Bama is 12-5 as a HF, and is 10-1 the L3Y (2-0 TY) vs non conf opposition. NT is off their first gm ever at their new stadium vs Houston and were only down 20-17 at HT, before QB Keenum got hot and torched the Mean Green for 458 yds and 5 TD's in the 48-23 loss. RB Dunbar has been held in check thus far rushing for just 53 ypg (2.9) and Bama has only given up 98 total rush yds on the season!

ARKANSAS 40 Troy 23 - Ark is 3-0 SU vs Troy with every win by 20+ but is 1-2 ATS. The Trojans are 1-12 SU vs the SEC with the avg score 38-19. In the last meeting ('09) UA won 56-20 jumping out to a 28-7 lead but it was 35-20 mid-3Q. Arkansas does have a huge game at Bama on deck but only had a couple of weak foes to start the year. They are off an easy 52-7 win over NM in which their 632 offensive yds was good for 6th best in school history. Ark is 8-3-1 as a HF but will be leery as Troy has had some near misses vs BCS schools as LY the Trojans only lost to Okla St by 3, almost upset LSU and Ohio St in '08 and are 8-6 ATS vs them. The final score in Troy's last gm vs Clemson was misleading as they were up 16-13 at the half, before getting outscored 30-3 in the 2H. Troy is off a bye and is just 6-13-1 in this situation and has their Sun Belt opener on deck vs MTSt, so their goal
