### **NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK EIGHT 2011**

NEWS AND NOTES - USC delivered a Thurs night ESPN winner for us taking advantage of 5 Cal TO's. In the 1H USC had a 187-132 yd edge and blew one opportunity off a TO by fumbling a snap on a fake FG. They settled for a 39 yd FG and also benefitted from stopping a Cal fake punt at the Cal37 which 5pl later resulted in a USC TD. The Trojans led 20-0 at the half en route to the 30-9 win... Air Force was missing all 3 starting DL and got worn down by San Diego St in the 2H. Ronnie Hillman rushed for 172 yards for the Aztecs including 22 and 57 yd TD runs on B2B plays to blow open a close game. AF had a 215-160 yd edge at the half...San Jose St beat Hawaii at home on a Friday night in front of a charged home crowd. The game featured a 2011 season high of 12 TO's with each team having 6. In the 1H SJS took advantage of some UH TO's and could have led by more than 20-7 as they missed a FG, settled for a FG and had an IR TD called back by a pers foul that was 40 yards behind the play. In the 2H SJS turned it over on their first 5 poss but one of the key plays of the game happened after UH had just taken the lead, 21-20. SJS turned it over after an 8pl drive at their own 40 and UH got a 32 yd TD run. The xp was blk'd and ret'd for 2 and instead of leading 28-20, it was 27-22. Each team missed a FG and SJS got a TD with :36 left to go up 28-27 and missed the 2 pt conv. UH only got as far as its own 39...Miami, FI gained 263 of its 311 yards in the 1H and avoided their first 0-3 start in conf play in program history. They led 27-10 at the half with a 274-177 yd edge but NC finished with a 429-311 yd edge. Giovanni Bernard became the school's first NC player to rush for at least 100 yards in 5 consec game since Ethan Horton in 1984. UM's Lamar Miller was held to 29 yards on 16 carries. Once NC got a TD with :46 left to pull within 30-24 they actually rec'd the onside kick and got to the UM30 but on 3&17 tried the lateral on the last play which came up short...Wisconsin shelled Indiana 59-7 but it actually wasn't as bad as LY when they won 83-20. Trailing 14-0, Indy was SOD at the UW36 and UW drove 64 yds for a TD and after an int, drove 80 yds for a TD. They led 38-7 at the half but the yards were only 379-217 as IU was SOD at the UW36, int'd at the 20 and int'd setting up a UW39 yd TD in the final minute. In the 2H UW got a 60 yd PR for a TD and rec'd a fmbl by the IU QB for a TD with 9:17 left to close the scoring...Missouri probably dominated Iowa St even more than the 52-17 margin although they did lose DT Terrell Resonno who ini'd his right knee in the 1H and DNR. Missouri opened the game with 10 straight runs, the first on a 50/8pl TD drive. They led 28-3 and had the ball at the ISU27 yd line when they were int'd and ret'd 78 yds for a TD. At the half MO had a 368-117 yd edge but only led 31-10. They expanded it to 52-10 in the 4Q and ISU went 74/6pl for a garbage TD and added 58 additional yards after that. Missouri had 13 yds on their final 4 poss with a backup QB...Utah's D dominated Pitt as they had a 251-120 yd edge. The Utes were without their QB Jordan Wynn (out for yr) and top WR DeVonte Christopher. Pitt appeared in control early thanks to special teams. The Panthers got a 10pl drive to open and punted and Utah went on a 12pl drive and settled for a 23 vd FG but Pitt got a 98 yd KRTD then blk'd a punt for a TD. The KRTD was their first since 2006 and the blk'd punt TD was their first since 1991 and they led 14-3 but Utah, with 2:07 left in the half, with QB Hays under heavy pressure, threw a pass which tipped off the LB's hand, over a DB and into WR Matthews hands which he took 33 yards for a TD to pull them within 14-13. Utah took a lead with a FG on the opening drive of the 3Q and never trailed again in a game played in 20-36 mph winds. Pitt trailed 19-13 when they were SOD at the Utah35 on 4&3 with backup QB Anderson in. On the next drive on 3&10 Anderson was int'd and ret'd 23 yds for a TD with 1:10 left for a somewhat misleading 26-14 final...We used Was first and fet 0.23 yes for a 1D with 1.10 fet for a somewhat misleading 20-14 mina....vvc used Virginia as a Big Dog POW and they delivered the outright upset. Teams with extra time to prepare for GT's option usually do well and Virginia upended #12 GT which had been off to its best start since 1966. UVA had 407-296 yd and 21-17 FD edges. UVA went 73/4pl and 45/12pl for TD's on their first 2 poss to lead 14-0. GT got a 32 yd IRTD to pull back to 14-14 with 8:24 left in the half but UVA went 73/40 and 45/12pl for TD and 10 yd 14 for the balf with a 273 454 yd 72/10pl and 21/8pl (after int) for a TD and a 36 yd FG and led 24-14 at the half with a 272-154 yd edge. GT opened the 3Q with an 85/19pl drive for a TD, 24-21 but punted on their next 3 poss and UVA took over at their 23 with 5:58 left in the game and would get 5 FD's on the 69/13pl drive taking

a knee at the GT6...Marshall benched QB starter

Rakeem Cato and AJ Graham hit just 11-22-99 yds but rushed for 129 yards on 20 carries and was the team's leading rusher. Rice finished with a 361-328 yd edge. Marshall went 69/1pl and 87/11pl for TD's, 14-0 and Rice went on 43 and 50 yd drives for 2 FG's, 14-6 at the half. Rice battled back to take a 20-17 lead. MU rec'd a fmbl at the Rice25 but was int'd at the 8 with 11:42 left and after 4 punts, Rice fmbl'd at their own

23 with 3:31 left. MU converted on 4&10 and went 23/5pl to get a 4 yd TD run by Martinez with 1:49 left to take the lead. Rice was SOD at their own 33 on 4&13...Dan Herron ret'd to the lineup for Ohio St and rushed for 114 yards. Braxton Miller hit just 1-4 passes for 17 yards as the Buckeyes kept it on the ground but his only completion was a 17 yd TD pass to Jake Stoneburner to put the Buckeyes up 17-7. OSU did not throw its first pass until 7:22 mark in the 2Q. Illinois had a 285-228 yd edge and OSU went 45/10pl for a 43 yd FG to open and the next 9 poss resulted in punts. At the half OSU had a 105-95 yd edge. Ul was int'd and ret'd 37 yds to the 12 and Herron got a 12 yd TD run on the next play, 10-0 early 3Q. OSU rec'd a fmbl'd at the UI22 and on 3&5 got a 17 yd TD pass to Stoneburner 17-0. UI went 80/15pl for a 3 yd TD pass. UI's last drives ended on an int at the OSU20 (from midfield) and a 41/8pl drive that was SOD at the OSU16 with 1:11 left...Colorado was last in the P12 in TD passes allowed while Washington was #1 in the P12 in TD passes. Keith Price had 4 TD passes in the 1H as UW rolled up a 379-104 yd edge and led 44-10. UW scored on all 6 poss in the 1H. Price was pulled with 1:05 left in the 3Q and on Nick Montana's first ever snap as a UW QB, he fumbled setting up a CU 36/6pl TD drive which pulled them within 45-24. UW got a TD with 2:32 left for the 52-24 final. CU is a banged up team without top WR Paul Richardson, top rusher Stewart and numerous DB's and UW was the Comp College Play on the NC Sportsline on Saturday, a play that just missed out on being a LPS and an easy winner...Michigan St is now 4-0 since the Mike Hart's infamous "little brother" comment. The Spartans held UM's potent offense to 250 yards and had 333 yards on offense. It was MSU's first 4 game win streak in the series since 1962. MSU had 6 sacks for 54 yards while the Wolverines had zero sacks. MSU rushed for 213 yards on 39 carries while UM rushed for 82 yards on 36 carries. It was tied at 7 and MSU had a 162-138 yd edge and the Spartans had leads of 14-7 and 21-7. UM got a 34 yd TD pass with 9:49 left then rec'd a fmbl but on 4&1 Robinson was tackled for a 10 yd loss. On the next drive Robinson was int'd and ret'd 39 yds for a TD to put the Spartans up 28-14 with 4:31 left to clinch it. UM was SOD at their own 46 with 3:18 left and the Spartans ended the game at the UM 21...Matt Simms made his first start of the season for Tennessee and hit 6-20-128 and 2 int. It was the 2nd straight bkp QB LSU has now faced. The key play of the game happened at the end of a scoreless 1Q. UT was at the LSU42 when Simms threw into the EZ and was int'd and ret'd 89 yds to the 5. That set up an LSU TD and a 7-0 lead. LSU then got a 10 yd PR setting up a 36/7pl drive for a TD to lead 14-0. It was 17-7 at the half. LSU had 3 poss in the 2H. They went 66/12pl, 99/16pl for TD's to put them up 31-7. After Tenn was SOD on A&7 at the LSU35, the Tigers went 65/10pl and on 4&3 got a 14 yd TD pass with 1:35 left. UT which had run for negative yards vs both Florida and Georgia rushed for 111 yds on LSU...The Penn St/Purdue game was played in a heavy wind as were many games in the Midwest. At the end of the half, PSU on 3&10 threw a TD pass where the rec caught the ball in both hands and had both feet down but it was punched away and ruled incomplete. PSU settled for a FG, 10-6. PSU led 20-12 and was at the PU23 when a pass into the EZ was tipped into the air bouncing off both the DB and WR and their feet and it was ret'd 50 yds and PU got a TD to pull within 20-18. PSU got a 98 yd KR and their KR Powell just flipped the ball towards the ref but was called for a 15 yd pen which took the ball from the 3 back to the 18 and PSU settled for a 29 yd FG. PSU finished the game at the PU5 taking a knee...Shovels of dirt were being thrown on Florida St after their 3rd straight loss but they dominated Duke with a 481-289 yd edge as EJ Manuel returned to the starting lineup but hit just 9-14-239. The game was tied 3-3 when FSU went 60/2pl for a TD then after a 26 yd PR went 64/4pl and 95/7pl for TD's to blow it open, 24-3. At half they had a 286-106 yd edge. Duke recovered a pair of onside kicks in the 2H and got within 34-16 but a 3rd onside kick was rec'd by FSU and the Seminoles went 39 yards for a TD in just 4 plays...UCF actually had a 184-144 yd edge vs SMU in the 1H but allowed a 47 yd PR setting up a 19 yd TD drive and also allowed a 92 yd PR TD by Richard Crawford so they trailed 17-3 at the half and never got within 14 points the rest of the game...Texas had a 24-21 FD edge vs Oklahoma St but the Cowboys had a 420-370 yd edge. UT controlled the ball for 39:18 but had trouble punching it in. UT was SOD on 4&3 at the OSU32, settled for a 34 yd FG after a 10pl drive and trailed 21-10 at the half. Each team got a 100 yd KR for a TD to open the 3Q, 28-17. UT pulled within 28-24 but then gave up a 74 yd TD run with 4:14 left in the 3Q to fall down 14 pts. UT on 4&3 had an open receiver but was caught inches short of the EZ on 4th & gl. UT was sk'd & fmbl'd at the OSU43 and int'd at the OSU47 on their final 2 poss...Brandon Ogletree had a big game forcing TO's on 2 straight poss with an int and 1 FF but BYU only turned those poss into 3 pts. Thanks to a 51 yd IR TD BYU and Oregon St were tied at 14 at the half despite BYU having a 222-141 yd edge. BYU was up 21-14 when OSU turned it over those 3 times and 24-14 after. OSU got a TD to pull within 24-21 but BYU got a TD with 10:39 left and then OSU missed a 48 yd FG and BYU went 69/6pl for a TD with 3:37 left to make it 38-21. OSU went 63/16pl getting a TD with :23 left for the 38-28 final. **CONTINUED ON PAGE 2** 

cont. from Front Page ... Kansas St delivered vet another outright upset, this time over Texas Tech. KSU got a 24 yd IR TD early and then added a 100 yd KR for a TD to lead 14-13. They missed the xp but Coach Snyder, unlike some other coaches in college ball (Lane Kiffin) doesn't go for 2 unless needed and KSU would score 3 TD's in the 2Q and 3Q and not once did Snyder go for the odd 2 points which helped the Cats stay ahead by 7 at the end of the game. At half TT actually led 28-20 with a 389-94 yd edge and had 2 FG's blk'd. KSU got a TD on the last play of the 3Q to take a 34-31 lead and would not relinquish it and KSU in the 4Q was SOD at the TT27 and missed a 31 yd FG. TT got a 19 yd FG with 2:32 left then rec'd the onside kick but on 4&4 fired incomplete from the KSU47 and the Wildcats remain unbeaten...Trent Richardson may have had a Heisman moment vs Mississippi with a 76 yd TD run where he had 4 players cornering him on the sidelines at the end of a run, stopped and started up again and got the TD. Richardson rushed for 188 yards. Alabama actually gave up a 59 yd pass on the 3rd play of the game and Miss got a TD 2pl later for a stunning 7-0 lead. The Rebels had 72 yards on that drive and 69 yds the rest of the game as Bama finished with a 615-141 yd edge in their dominating 52-7 win...Stanford turned the ball over 3 times all year but had 2 TO's in the 1H vs Wash St. As usual, SU struggled a bit in the 1H. in fact the FD's were even at 8 and SU only led 10-7. SU would score TD's on 3 of their first 4 2H poss to go up 31-7. WSU was SOD on 4&8 at the SU9 with 10:31 left. SU went 91/12pl getting a TD with 4:26 left to make it 38-7. WSU gave Jeff Tuel the start as he ret'd from his collarbone inj but they brought in Marshall Lobbestael and he guided the Cougars 80/12pl for a TD with :14 left to make it 38-14 but Montgomery ret'd the ensuing KO 96 yds for a TD on what turned out to the be the final play of the game and SU won by 30...Things did not look good for Virginia Tech early as Wake Forest had a 10-0 lead and a 122-2 vd edge after 1Q but VT would dominate the 2Q with 3 TD's, the 3rd coming after WF was int'd at their own 27 with :30 left in the half and VT went for it on the last play of the half and got a TD run by Thomas. VT had a 207-41 yd edge in the 2Q and opened the 3Q with an 80/6pl drive for a TD and rolled to a 38-17 win with a 473-320 yd edge...Auburn and Lattimore, for the season (knee)

Florida both came in with major? at QB and none of the?'s were answered. Seven different players took snaps at QB. UF #2 QB Driskell was? coming in and obviously not 100% but he was brought into the game in the 2H after Jacoby Brissett started and hit 5-10-45. AU starting QB Barrett Trotter has now lost confidence and hit 2-8-33 with Clint Moseley and Kiehl Frazier also seeing action. UF fmbl'd 2 punts setting up a 32/3pl TD drive and 22/6pl drive for a FG which was the majority of AU's offense. UF had a couple of long drives end in settling for short FG's then at the end were SOD at the AU16 after an 11 pl drive but AU finished with a 278-194 yd edge.

FRONTDOOR/BACKDOOR COVERS - A couple of blk'd FG's cost Navy and outright win and Rutgers a frontdoor cover in the last 5:00. RU had 423-305 yd and 22-15 FD edges. RU missed a 52 yd FG, fmbl'd at the Navy2 at the end of a 75/10pl drive but Navy was SOD at the 5 at the end of a 68/12pl drive. 2pl later Navy had a 16 yd IR TD to tie it at 7. RU was SOD at the N32 and had a 221-187 yd edge but Navy led 14-7 at the half thanks to a 54 yd TD run by Proctor. Navy extended it to 17-7 but RU went 52/6pl for a TD and then 66/7pl with a 3&9, 20 yd TD pass to go up 21-17. Navy got a 41 yd FG to make it 21-20 then had a 34 yd FG blk'd with 4:50 left. RU got to the Navy24 but had a 41 yd FG blk'd with :24 left which would have given them the cover...Mississippi St had a slight 296-289 yd edge but 3 long drives in the 3Q only produced 3 points and they needed a safety on the final play of the game to get the cover after the line had moved from +5' to +3 at the end of the week. It was the Gamecocks first game without QB Stephen Garcia and first road start for Connor Shaw who hit 20-28-155 yards. Tyler Russell started for Miss St and hit 11-29-165. At the half SC was int'd in the EZ with 4:06 left and int'd at the 1 from the MSU41 with :12 left. In the 3Q, MSU went 52/9pl and missed a 40 yd FG. They went 44/7p land missed a 53 yd FG then went 70/11pl and settled for a 22 yd FG with 3 long drives only producing 3 pts, they only led 10-7 and SC went 79/12pl for a 4 yd TD pass with 3:50 left. MSU got to the SC32 but was int'd at the 12 and on 4&13 SC ran out the clock taking a safety on the final play and to win by 2. The win was costly for SC as they lost LY's SEC Frosh of the Year, Marcus

4★ ALABAMA over Tennessee - Visitor is an incredible 17-2 ATS in series and fav is just 2-5 ATS but Bama is on a 4-1 ATS run. LY UT (+16') was outscored 28-0 in the 2H after trailing by 3 at half (UA 41-10). UA's streak of 41 gms w/o allowing a 100 yd rusher did end (Poole 117) and you have to think that will be mentioned during Bama's prep TW. LTH UA (-14) had to blk 2 FG's to preserve a 12-10 win. LW the Tide gave up an early TD drive to trail Miss 7-0 but then scored the gm's final 52 pts (-27) as we cashed another 4★ Key on the Tide (4th str wk). UA outgained UM 615-141 thanks to another outstanding performance by Heisman cand Richardson (career high 183 yd, 4 TD) as the Tide's 52 pts were their most in an SEC gm S/90. QB McCarron has now thrown 151 passes without an int (last int in opener) and is avg 197 ypg (67%) with a 9-2 ratio. The Vols meanwhile, without their 2 best off players LW (QB Bray out 4-6W, WR Hunter OFY), lost 38-7 as a 15 pt HD to LSU. QB Simms threw for just 128 yds (30%) with an 0-2 ratio and the Vols were outgained 383-239. The Vols are 6-1 ATS as an AD vs ranked tms and 8-4 as a DD conf dog but the Tide have the edges across the board (off #7-44, def #1-36, ST's #15-73) and are coming off Vandy and Ole Miss with a bye on deck while Tenn is coming off UGA, LSU and has SC on deck. For the 5th straight week as a 4★ Key and a possible October Game of the Month, it's Roll Tide!

FORECAST: ALABAMA 38 Tennessee 0
3★ Kansas St over KANSAS - Sunflower Showdown. The Cats are 13-4 SU/ATS and LY after being held to a punt and FG on their 1st 2 poss, KSU had 6 str TD drives and an 85 yd FR TD to lead 52-0. LY's win was their first since '02 in Lawrence (6-3 ATS L/9). Snyder has always placed extra emphasis on the Kan gm (15-4 SU, MOV by 29 ppg) while Gill's emphasis is on beating Missouri. We've been riding the money train on these pages with KSU as they pulled their 4th str upset 41-34 of TT (+3') in Lubbock as 2★ play LW. Since '95 tms who have pulled 4 str upsets are 6-2 ATS when they are favored. The Cats had just 94 1H yds but trailed just 28-20 as they had IR and KR TD's and also ret'd a blk'd FG 30 yds to set up a 46/9pl TD drive. The Raiders outFD'd (32-16) and outgained KSU (580-339) but also lost 4 TO's (0 for KSU). Gritty Klein (123, 59%, 7-3) is the B12's #4 rusher (578, 4.2). The Cats have the nation's MIP run D all'g 97 rush ypg (3.2) after all'g 231 (5.9) LY! KU's 2H struggles continued as after trailing just 27-17 at the half they lost to Okla 47-17 as OU had 29-9 FD and 610-252 yd edges. QB Webb is #16 FBS pass eff (206, 66%, 11-5). The problem has been on D where KU is dead last in FBS in ttl (565 ypg) and scoring (49 ppg). Snyder knows when to put the half war and the page of the

3★ NEVADA over Fresno St - UN is only 4-8 (4-7-1 ATS) in the series S/'99 but has won 4 of the L/6 (4-2 ATS) incl the L/3 (2-1 ATS). LY's gm had 7 lead changes as UN went 54/7pl for a TD w/4:51 left in a 35-34 win (-8'). FSU is coming off a 31-21 (+3') 4Q comeback win over Utah St as QB Carr was 23-39-248 and RB Rouse rushed for 140 yds. UN is fresh off a 49-7 (-29') win over NM (42-0 after 3Q's) finishing with 34-14 FD and 598-257 yd edges incl 338-168 rush (6 rush TD). FSU is 3-1 ATS in its L/4 "true" AG's and has covered both TY but the Bulldogs are 5-10 ATS as an AD in conf play. This is UN's 3rd consec HG and it is 23-7 ATS as a HF and the Pack is 18-10 ATS as a conf HF. The line was overcompensated with Fresno winning as a HD LW and now we'll back one of the premier home teams vs the spread with a very reasonable line.

2★ MISSOURI (+) over Oklahoma St - MU is 1-3 SU/ATS in the series. In the L/gm (\*09) MU (+7) only trailed 24-17 at HT but was held scoreless with just 80 yds in the 2H (2.9 ypp) and lost 33-17 (+7). LTH (\*08) OSU (+14) upset #3 MU. OSU is 12-3 ATS as a conf AF. OSU FBS's #6 passer Weeden (350, 73%, 16-6) remains undefeated as a starter outside of Stillwater (9-0 SU/ATS) after LW's 38-26 win at #22 Texas. OSU was actually outFD'd 24-21 but RB Smith ran 30 yd and 74 yds untouched for TD's. OSU is T-#3 FBS with 20 TO's forced. MU destroyed ISU 52-17 (33-17 FD, 294-157 rush yd edges) as they scored TD's on their 1st 4 poss and ISU's lone non-garbage time TD came on a 78 yd IR. QB Franklin (248, 61%, 10-4, 390 rush) accounted for 6 TD's in the blowout. B12's #1 rusher Josey (717) has the FBS's best ypc (9.7). MO has the D edge (#25-43) and the tricky Tigers could pull the upset.

2★ VANDERBILT over Army - In the only recent meeting in '09 VU (-10) trailed 3-0 at HT and 10-3 in the 4Q. Army got the upset in OT to deliver yet another outright upset by a DD dog for a Big Dog win. Army is off a bye while Vandy is in the midst of a Bama, UGA, Ark and UF stretch. LW Vandy lost to UGA 33-28 (+11') but the game was misleading as Vandy got a 35 yd pass on a 4&13 fake punt that led to a TD, a 96 yd KR TD and forced UGA to att 6 FG's (missed 2). QB Rodgers did replace the ineffective Smith (has in each gm TY) in the 2Q but he only threw for 47 yds (21%) with an 0-1 ratio (80 rush yds). Army has been night and day in home vs away gms this ssn with a 3-0 ATS mark at home with an avg MOV of 29-14 giving up just 267 ypg but they are 0-3 SU/ATS on the road with an avg defeat by 44-25 and they are giving up 519 yds. QB Steelman leads the off avg 55 ypg (53%) but is the #1 rusher with 536 (4.9) and 11 TD. Army is 7-4-1 ATS since becoming an Independent ('05) in BCS road/neutral gms (outright W's in '06 in OT at Baylor and LY at Duke) and way back in '88 we used Army (-2') as our Coll GOY and they delivered us the winner. While most BCS tms would overlook Army, that is not the case here as Vandy should be looking to get a most BCS tms would overlook Army, that is not the case here as vandy should be looking to get a rare "W" late in the year in a stretch of rugged SEC play. FORECAST: VANDERBILT 38 Army 17 2★ Washington (+) over STANFORD - SU comes with the nation's longest winning streak (14, schl rec'd). After another slow start (led WSU just 10-7 at HT), SU took over again in the 2H outscoring WSU 34-7 in the 2H led by QB Luck's 336 pass yds (64%) and 4 TD's. After LW's win over Colo, UW has now reached 30+ pts in their 1st 6 gms led by QB Price (244 ypg, 69%, 21-4 ratio) which is also a schl rec'd (scored 50+ pts LW for 1st time S/10 vs CU). LY SU's (-7) 41-0 hammering of UW marked the biggest MOV for either trn in this series (81 gms). SU all'd just 107 yds which was the 2nd fewest in schl hist. SU has simply dominated the LOS the L/2Y avg 300 rush ypg (6.2) to just 59 rush ypg all'd (2.2) and it will be interesting to see how UW's inexp LB's handle the massive presence of SU's TE's. SU has outscored its opp by 31 ppg at home the L2Y and is now on a 9-0 ATS run while UW should be delivering their "A" game after a bye and a home meeting with the Buffs. UCLA at ARIZONA - Both tms have faced some tough schedules (AZ #1, UCLA #3) and come in with an extra wk to prepare which was beneficial considering UCLA is w/o QB Brehaut (leg inj) and the Cats are breaking in DC Kish as their interim HC after terminating Stoops. UL is off of B2B AG's (led Cincy at HT LW) but did find some success a year ago vs the Knights as they needed a win at RU to secure a bowl and took no chances rolling to a 28-0 1H lead and winning 40-13.

West Virginia at SYRACUSE - Both come in off byes with WV 8-1 SU (7-3 ATS) in the series and

IOWA 44 Indiana 13 - HC. Indy has led Iowa in the 2H in each of the L/2Y. In Indy's last visit ('09) they (+17') were up 21-7 at HT but all'd 265 yds and 28 pts in the 4Q most of them after Indy wrongfully had a TD pass taken away via replay which could have iced it losing 42-24. LY Iowa (-17') trailed 13-9 into the 4Q and needed a 52 yd TD pass w/2:50 left to pull out the win 18-13 as Indy dropped a pass in the EZ with :35 left. Indy is playing an 8th str wk and 2nd str road trip coming off LW's physical 59-7 pounding at Wisky while Iowa had a bye 2W ago. Indy has scored just 1 off TD in the 1H vs a BCS opp TY (67 yd run down 28-0). The QB carousel continued with Kiel (shldr) sitting out and both Fr Roberson (2-5-10) and Wright-Baker (6-15-54, 2 int, 1 fmbl) seeing time. Iowa ended its 5 gm series losing streak to NW despite being outFD'd 29-17 and outgained 495-379 as S Miller had an early 98 yd IR TD. NW also punted after driving to the I17, missed a 47 yd FG, fmbl'd on their own 25 (set up Iowa FG) and drove 25/5pl for a TD (onside K). QB Vandenberg (248 ypg, 61%, 12-4) is the B10's #2 passer but Iowa might try to get the ground gm going here with Coker (578, 4.6) having an inconsistent ssn and Indy all'g 227 (5.0, #117 FBS). Iowa has all of the edges with the largest one on D (#55-112) and don't expect another close call.

VIRGINIA 24 NC State 23 -The HT has covered 6 straight in the series with 4 outright upsets. NCSt is off a bye and in their last gm they beat CM 38-24 (-10'). After struggling in the 1H (all'g 254 yd) the D dominated the 2H forcing 4 int's. QB Glennon threw 4 TD and is avg 248 ypg (64%, 16-4) and RB Washington is the 1st back S/05 with B2B 100 yd gms. The Pack are an incredible 16-2 ATS off a bye and 2 wks ago they returned vocal leader DT Sweezy, DT Slay and LB Manning. LW VA fans rushed the field as the Cavs upset #12 GT 24-21 (+7'). VA beat GT at their own gm rushing for 272 yds (5.8) and holding the option to a ssn low 296 ttl yds. VA QB's now face a NCSt D that leads the ACC in int's w/12. The VA defense is #3 in the ACC with a strong DL (142 rush ypg, 3.9) and secondary (#2 ACC pass eff D) which will be a challenge for NCSt. Keep in mind Cavs gms vs FBS tms TY have been decided by 4.8 ppg. The Wolfpack are just 5-16 SU (11-10 ATS) on the ACC road but UVA is 3-8 SU (2-9 ATS) in ACC HG's and 1-5 as a conf favorite.

PURDUE 24 Illinois 23 - HC. LY UI (-17) won the matchup of Fr QB's as Scheelhaase had 313 ttl

PURDUE 24 Illinois 23 - HC. LY UI (-17) won the matchup of Fr QB's as Scheelhaase had 313 ttl yds (PU's Robinson 76 ttl yds) as UI led 37-0 into the 4Q. IL threw 4 passes on its final drive capped by a TD pass with 1:36 left. PU HC Hope wasn't pleased: "I probably wouldn't have done that. I'm not going to cry about it." The Illini haven't won here S/'01 dropping 3 str trips (avg loss by 26 ppg) but did snap their 5 gm losing streak to the Boilers LY. IL is just 3-7 ATS as a conf AF (1-0 TY). Mistakes doomed the Illini as they dropped their 1st gm of the ssn 17-7 to OSU as they lost 3 TO incl 2 which set up 12/1pl and 22/3pl TD "drives". IL had 18-14 FD and 285-228 yd edges vs an extremely conservative Bucks off (just 1 comp). Scheelhaase is #15 FBS pass eff (201, 65%, 11-5, #1 rusher w/396). Jenkins (895, 16.6) is #5 FBS rec ypg. Illini are #5 FBS in sks (26) and #18 in rush D (98 ypg, 2.7). The pesky Boilers also had their share of mistakes vs PSU as they missed a 44 yd FG and an xp, had an int with :25 left 1H which set up a Lions FG, were int'd at the PSU27 and all'd a 92 yd KR which set up a FG in a 23-18 loss. QB TerBush (158, 61%, 6-4) hasn't thrown for over 200 yds since the opener as they've relied on the RB tandem of Bolden (370, 5.3) and Shavers (296, 5.2). Boilers are #47 pass eff D (200 ypg, 54%, 7-4). Illini have edges on both sides (#46-69 off, #20-58 D) but the Boilers have an enormous ST edge (#13-117) and pull the upset.

**FĹORIDA ST 45 Maryland 17** - The Noles were off B2B 35-30 losses, despite good performances, vs OU (all'd 310 yds), Clem (w/o Manuel) and WF (5 TO's). LW they finally played a complete gm dominating Duke 41-16 (-13'). A healthy QB Manuel passed for 239 yds (3 pass 50+) and 2 TD while a run gm that came in avg 86 ypg rolled for 242 yds (5.4) despite losing LY's #1 rusher. FSU is just 7-17 ATS in conf HG's while the Terps have never won in Tallahassee going 0-10 (2-7 ATS). MD almost ended their series road losing streak LTH but, up 26-22, couldn't get a FD and all'd a 3 yd TD run (44/4pl) w/:32 left. LW MD let an 18 pt 3Q lead evaporate losing 56-45 to Clemson. Mobile QB CJ Brown made his 1st career start rushing for a MD QB rec'd 162 of MD's 290 rush yds. Edsall has weathered susp's, defections and has had 13 inj's (incl 3 st'rs LB) but the Terps are playing inspired ball on both sides while playing more frosh than anyone in the ACC (5 on D, 18 on 2 deep). Brown will be making his 1st road start vs a fired up crowd and their depth isn't enough for 4Q's.

MIAMI, FL 38 Georgia Tech 24 - UM 4-4 SU/ATS vs GT but has won and covered the L/2. LY the Canes (-2') delivered a LPS winner for us 35-10 with the series largest MOV S/67. LTH GT was outgained 454-228 being held to a ssn low 2.4 ypc and 95 rush yds (lowest in Johnson era vs FBS team). We used Miami as our Marquee GOM and they won 33-17 (-4') motivated by all'g 472 rush yds in their '08 meeting. LW, with 8 in the box, QB Harris looked flawless as Miami gained 263 yds in the 1H and led NC 27-10. In the 2H Mia struggled with just 48 ttl yds but escaped Chapel Hill with a win. GT is off a very disappointing 24-21 (-7') loss to VA, where poor offensive play and penalties finally did them in. MD and VA forced QB Washington to beat them taking away his options and vs better DB's the pass game has been exposed. GT is all'g 177 rush ypg (4.7) incl ssn highs the L/2 wks and the task gets tougher vs Mia's big OL. Miami is just 8-22 as a conf HF and this is Golden's 1st look at the GT option. He faced Johnson twice (Temple vs Navy) and all'd 420 (7.5) and 359 (6.0) rush in those two but fared better vs the option in his last 3 yrs.

Wake Forest 31 DUKE 30 - Schools are just over 80 miles apart. Duke is just 3-22 SU (8-16-1 ATS) hosting ACC opp's. Duke has lost 11 str (6-5 ATS) but 4 of the L/5 have been decided by a comb 15 pts and these 2 have avg'd 80 ppg combined the L/4! LY QB Renfree had career highs in yds (358) and TD passes (4) and the 48 pts were the most scored in a loss in schl hist. WF is off FSU and VT while Duke is off a bye. Both are off deflating losses LW and this matchup will feature the #2 vs #3 pass offenses. Duke was outgained 481-289 (99 yds on final 2 drives) losing to FSU 41-16 (+13'), the same team WF defeated despite being outgained by 34 yds (+5 TO's) in their 35-30 win. QB Renfree is avg 263 (69%) with a 6-3 ratio but the run gm has struggled avg just 92 ypg (3.0). After winning their 1st 3 in ACC play (1st time schl hist) WF lost 38-17 (+7) to VT. QB Price is avg 268 ypg (62%) with a 12-3 ratio and WF should get top RB Harris (412, 4.5) back (CS) while WR Givens leads the ACC with 739 yds (18.5). Duke has lost 11 in a row SU to WF with WF winning their last 5 trips to Durham scoring 41+ each time. Expect another shootout.

Arkansas 43 MISSISSIPPI 30 - HT is 13-4-1 ATS but the fav is 14-4-1 ATS. LY Miss (+10) did have the FD and yd edges but trailed 21-0 never recovering from a fmbl which led to a TD and 97-yd PR TD. RB Davis rushed for 176 yds. Ark is coming off a bye while Ole Miss is off Bama where after getting a 72/5pl TD drive on their opening drive were held to just 69 total yds the rest of the game (outgained 615-141) in the 52-7 (+27) loss as we cashed another 4★ Key on the Crimson Tide. QB Mackey has started the L/2 gms and is avg 164 ypg (46%) with a 1-1 ratio. LW HC Nutt susp'd 4 players before the gm incl 2 strs (CS) and also lost two def strs for the year in DL Dorsey and DB Temple which is not a good sign vs the SEC's #1 off. Ark is much healthier coming off the bye after two big wins vs A&M and Aub. QB Wilson is avg 297 ypg (65%) with a 12-3 ratio. The Rebs are dangerous vs ranked tms going 24-11 ATS and Nutt is 2-1 SU vs his former tm. Ark has big edges on off (#16-82) and def (#37-78) but Miss has the ST's edge (#5-21). Nutt is on the hot seat and could use a respectable showing vs his former tm to silent the critics.

USF 24 Cincinnati 20 - HC with a bye on deck for the Bulls (2nd bye in a month) but the rest they had prior to LW certainly didn't help them as they struggled in a 16-10 loss at Conn, a game in which they missed 2 FG's and turned the ball over 4 times (outgained Huskies 339-253). Similar to Rutgers, Cincy has been a surprise in BE play thus far already surpassing their 4 win mark of a year ago and just one victory away from becoming bowl eligible after their win over Louisville, a game in which they actually trailed 16-7 at HT (outscored UL 18-0 in 2H). This matchup features 2 of the biggest dual-threat QB's in the conf with USF QB Daniels avg 297 ttl ypg and UC Collaros avg 232 ttl ypg. The Bearcats had covered 6 straight vs the Bulls incl upsets in 4 of the L/5 but LY USF snapped the streak as an 8' pt AD. Both tms have played very weak schedules TY (UC #119, USF #96) and

with USF dropping 2 consec gms, we'll side with the Bulls looking to get back on track at home. CLEMSON 37 North Carolina 23 - NC 7-3 ATS in series. LY CU (+2, 16-21) never led but went 86/5pl (2ptng) cutting the deficit to 5. NC gained 3 FD's running out all but :13. TY Clemson has trailed in 1H vs Troy and Wofford, was down 21-7 to Aub, faced a FSU team w/o QB Manuel, then held a VT team to 3 pts (w/inexp QB in 1st big gm) and then defeated a bad BC team. LW Clem trailed 35-17 in 3Q but escaped the upset with their thrilling 56-45 win over MD. QB Boyd looked out of rhythm early and several times threw directly at MD DB's (2 drops, 1 TD) but finished with 270 yds and 4 TD while RB Ellington had a car high 212 rush yds (8.8). NC rallied from 24 down and recovered the onside kick but fell short losing to Miami 30-24 LW. NC's defense played physical vs UM (all'd just 48 2H yds) and their strong DL held RB Miller to just 29 yds (1.8). NC has the defensive edge (#26-45) while Clemson has the offense edge (#12-48) and big ST's edge (#19-89) featuring their game changer Watkins who broke CJ Spiller's all-purp rec'd LW with 345 KR yds after an 89 yd KR TD. LTH ('06) NC suffered its worst loss in the series' 54 gm history, 52-7. NC is 6-2-1 as an ÁD while CU is 8-2 ATS as a conf HF under Swinney and is on a 6-0 ATS streak vs FBS tms.

Northern Illinois 41 BUFFALO 38 - NI's third trip ever to Buffalo (2-0 ATS). NI won 45-21 (-16) in '99 and 40-9 (-23) in '03 (LTH). NI is 5-1 ATS in the series and LY won 45-14 (-14) at home. Key mismatch is QB Harnish vs #13 set of DB's in MAC. Harnish is avg 221 ypg (66%) with a 12-4 ratio and is the top rusher with 671 (8.2) and 7 TD. He became just the 10th player in NCAA history to have 200 yds passing and 200 yds rushing in the same game vs WM. LW UB gave up 400 yds rushing (6.2 ypc) to Temple and is allowing 215 ypg rushing (4.8) on the season. NI had 494 yds rushing (9.1) against WM LW and is avg 254 ypg rushing (6.0) on the san. After allowing 400+ yds to each of their 1st 4 FBS opp, NI's D gave up just 394 yds comb in the L/2 gms. UB lost 34-0 (+20) to Temple LW being outgained 458-155. However, they did upset Ohio 38-37 (+8") in their last home game. While the def's are close (N #105-107), NI has huge off (#25-106) and ST (#75-115) edges. NI is off a huge win vs WM and has UT on deck so this could be a flat spot.

VIRGINIA TECH 38 Boston College 6 - HC. BC is coming off a bye while VT is playing for the 8th str wk. VT is 3-0 SU/ATS winning by 24 ppg. LY VT (+4) won 19-0 but the gm was misleading as BC blew 3 easy scoring opportunities in the 1H incl a drive to the 1 yd line as time ran out. BC (+13') was hammered 48-14 their last visit to Blacksburg as they trailed 31-0 not getting their initial FD until 12:00 left in the 3Q. BC lost to Clemson on the road 36-14 2 wks ago and the score could have been worse but CU QB Boyd was KO'd of the gm. Take out the UMass win and BC has been outscored 137-72 all'g 441 ypg TY. BC has battled inj's across the board and looks like they will prepare for next year snapping 12 str bowl appearances. After a slow start LW QB Thomas threw for 2 TD and rushed for 2 in their 38-17 win over WF. RB Wilson has 907 yds (6.1) and the D is all'g 298 ypg. VT has huge edges on off (#37-96) and def (#13-53). The L/2 times BC has been shutout was vs VT VT is 17-7 as a DD conf fav but BC is 10-6 ATS as a conf AD.

Texas A&M 41 IOWA ST 20 - A&M may feel insulted in being ISU's HC opp. In the L/meeting ('09) A&M (-6) won 35-10 w/a 501-324 yd edge at home. ISU is 4-7 as a HD and A&M is 3-1 as an AF. A&M beat Baylor for the 10th str time at Kyle Field 55-28 with 35-24 FD and 681-480 yd edges (266-50 rush). QB Tannehill (290 ypg, 67%, 13-6) threw a schl rec'd 6 TD's incl 4 to #1 rec Swope (619, 15.5). A&M is the B12's most balanced off thanks to RB's Michael (565, 6.1) and Gray (521, 4.6). The Ags' D ranks #1 FBS in sks (26) but dead last in pass D (361 ypg, 67%, 12-3) with 3 QB's setting schl passing records vs them TY. ISU lost its 3rd str 52-17 to Missouri as we had a 3★ LPS on the Tigers who dominated the LOS with 33-17 FD and 583-343 yd edges. The Cyclones only TD's came on a 78 yd IR and a 4Q garbage drive 52-10. QB Jantz (220 ypg, 55%, 10-8) is the B12's lowest rated full-time QB str (#91 FBS pass eff) and he's been sk'd 12x in B12 play behind a banged up OL. The Cyclones have been outmanned up front all'g 218 rush ypg (4.5). ISU is 0-3 SU/ATS in B12 play TY being outscored by 27 ppg and the last time they were at home we used a 3★ LPS on Texas and they led 34-0 at the half.

Western Michigan 44 EASTERN MICHIGAN 20 - Visitor is 12-5 ATS with WM off 3 straight wins by DD's. LTH WM (-13') did trail early but scored 28 pts off of a ssn high 6 forced TO's and won 35-14 (-13'). LY EM (+19) was tied 24-24 w/8:32 3Q. From that pt on, EM was outgained 255-143 during à 21-6 WM run. EM is on a 3-12 ATS run in MAC HG's but TY beat Akron 31-23 as an 8' pt HF. WN is on their 4th AG in 5 wks and off their big showdown with NI, where after leading 15-13 at HT, WM was outscored 38-7 in the 2H. The Broncos allowed 494 yds (9.1) rushing vs NI and is allowing 217 ypg (5.9) rushing on the season. While EM is avg 229 ypg (5.1) rushing but just 102 ypg passing. WM is avg 408 ypg while EM is allowing 379 ypg. WM has the edges on off (#55-113), def (#90-111) and ST (#3-85). WM is 3-1 as an AF. EM is 5-13 ATS as a HD. While EM takes their games vs WM and CM more seriously than their opp, WM is coming off a conf loss and will be focused here. The winner will claim the Mich MAC trophy as both teams beat CM TY. WM won 44-14 as a 7 pt HF with a 442-362 yd edge vs the Chips, while EM won 35-28 as a 13 pt AD with a 449-426 yd deficit.

TCU 52 New Mexico 10 - TCU is off bye while NM (+29') was shellacked by Nevada, 49-7 on the road LW. QB Holbrook was pulled in the 3Q (9-22-62, 1 int) and Austin (who started 1st 4) led NM on its only TD drive. The Lobos have gone 0-6 SU (1-4-1 ATS) in MW play vs TCU being outgained on avg 384-219. The L4Y the Frogs have beaten the Lobos by a comb score of 180-30! LY TCU was only up 31-17 mid-2Q (NM 2 TD's on 13 yds) when Pachall came in at QB (Dalton inj'd) and he led TCU to 35 unanswered pts (TCU's 66 pts were a MW rec'd). The LTH NM (+44) trailed 30-0 early 2Q being outgained 244-4 but TCU only won 51-10 and was never ahead of the spread despite 2 IR TD's. TCU brings in a MW rec'd 19 consec conf wins and is 13-9 as a HF of 20+ the L/4Y TCU obviously has huge edges all around and this one could get ugly in a hurry.

Central Michigan 31 BALL ST 30 - Visitor is 6-1 ATS while the Chippewas are 5-2 SU/ATS incl 3-0

SU/ATS in Muncie (avg win 20 ppg). LTH CM (-15) led 21-3 at HT with a 271-98 yd edge. LY Ball St (+19', covered by 33') delivered as yet another Big Dog upset as they took a 28-3 lead into the 4Q

BSU led an injury depleted Ohio tm 13-7 at HT but allowed OU to tie it twice and won as OU missed a late FG that would've tied it for 3rd time in the 2H. They were actually outgained 413-372. BSU QB Wenning is avg 184 ypg (63%) with a 7-5 ratio. CM QB Radcliff is avg 250 ypg (56%) with a 13-11 ratio. CM is alone in last place in the MAC West and would be all but eliminated with another loss.

Tulsa 34 RICE 24 - These two have avgid 75 ppg L/6Y. The L/7Y Rice has been unable to stop the Tulsa offense giving up an avg of 46 ppg and 505 ypg. LY Rice (+17) led 7-0 but at HT trailed 41-7! The Owls are an incredible 21-3-2 as a conf HD S/99! The key matchup will be TU QB Kinne and TU's #32 off vs Rice's #99 D (Rice has big #7-87 ST edge). Tulsa is off one of the nation's toughest non-conf slates, a bye and a win (held UAB to 0 pts and 123 yds in 2H). TU is 6-1 ATS on the road and has covered by 24 ppg in the 2 as an AF (48-7, -9 at Mem LY and 31-3, -12 at Tulane TY). Rice outgained Marshall LW but lost due to a late TO. The Owls were just 2-12 on 3rd down and settled for Ž FG's in 3 trips to the RZ. Rice does play better at home (2-0 SU/ATS) but has rival UH on deck while Tulsa is 7-2 SU/ATS vs CUSA and still has their sights on the West Div.

Louisiana Tech 31 UTAH ST 30 - Both tms have experienced heartbreak in their 1st 3 losses as they each lost a trio of gms by a combined 9 pts or less. Since becoming WAC foes in '05, LT has won 5 of the 6 matchups (4-2 ATS) with the lone loss coming the LTH (23-21, +1') in '09. The MOV in this series is just 9 ppg and the HT has won the L/3 (2-1 ATS). Both tms are led by a pair of true frosh QB's in LT's Isham (232 ypg, 62%, 8-7 ratio) and USU's Keeton (168 ypg, 61%, 10-0 ratio) and both are led by formidable RB's in LT's Creer (528 yds, 4.2) and the USU's Turbin (754 yds, 6.9). LT is fresh off a bye and posted a road win over ID (24-11, -4) in its last outing and is on a 5-1 ATS run in AG's incl a 3-0 mark TY while USU is off a 31-21 (-3') loss at Fresno and is 3-7 ATS their L/10 HG's.

Temple 34 BOWLING GREEN 17 - TU has never won at BG (1-3 ATS) with the avg score 45-20. LY the Owls (-20) held on for a 28-27 win as BG scored a TD on the final play but the 2pt came up short. BG limps into this matchup on a 3 gm losing streak all'g 979 rush yds (326 ypg) during the slump. TU comes to town avg 257 ypg rush (#8 FBS rush off) incl 750 yds in B2B wins over BSU and UB. RB's Pierce and Brown both cracked 100 in each while QB Stewart att just 24 passes comb in the wins. LW Pierce (844 yds, 5.1) set schl ssn records for rushing TD (17), overall TD (17), pts scored (102) and set the career mark for ttl TD (44). TU has a large edge on def (#17-101) and ST (#8-74). It's no secret the Owls will try to impose their will by running the ball and the Falcons must develop some resemblance of a run def to have a chance.

Ohio 38 AKRON 17 - The HT in the series is 13-4 ATS. UA has dropped the L/3 SU/ATS vs OU. LY in OU's HC gm, the Zips (+16') trailed 24-3 at HT being outgained 496-278 (38-3 til a garbage TD). The Bobcats were hit hard by inj's especially on D as after starting 4-1 they have dropped the L/2 as a fav (by comb 4 pts) and are on a 4 gm ATS losing streak. Akron has lost 16 str vs FBS opp (7-9 ATS) but is òn a 3 gm ATS win streak and is off a bye. UA QB Moore is avg 166 ypg (48%) with a 6-6 ratio. Ohio QB Tettleton is avg 236 ypg (63.3%) with a 15-4 ratio. Ohio still controls its own destiny in the MAC East and with a win here plus a bye on deck (help get back inj'd ply'rs) would be right back in it. OU has the edges on off (#66-118), def (#86-100) and ST's (#16-112) and despite their inj's look for the Bobcats to roll.

TULANE 34 Memphis 24 - HC. Green Wave is 2-10-2 ATS vs Mem incl 5 str losses by 25 ppg. In the last gm ('08), TU (+14) trailed 31-0 in the 3Q being outFD'd 32-10 and outgained 488-222. The Tigers are 5-0-2 ATS at Tulane incl B2B winning trips. TU is 2-9 as a HF but MU is on its 3rd AG in 4W and TU is in its 3rd str at the Dome. TU continued its lack of consistency LW (trailed UTEP 41-7 into 4Q) and during their 4 gm losing streak has all'd 44 ppg but only has been outgained by 75 ypg. QB Griffin did suffer a bruised hip early 2Q as Ponder played the rest of the way (CS). MU lost again LW vs EC (led 10-0 into 2Q, TD was a FR in EZ). Tigers have dropped 16 str CUSA gms (5-11 ATS). MU got a surprise start by QB Jones (10-18-124, 0-2 ratio) LW as the unit is banged up (Reed exp to start). Both tms come in with a lot of ?'s but as TU HC Toledo said, "I feel like I have been on a bad roller-coaster ride," and we'll say that the Green Wave are on top.

Oregon 48 COLORADO 20 - The L/3 meetings have all come in bowls (CU 2-1 SU/ATS) incl the most recent in the '01 Fiesta with both tms coming into the gm declaring that they should be in the Nat'l Title gm (#3 CU lost 38-16 to #2 UO and was outgained 500-328). In a potential preview to the P12 Title gm UO overcame an early deficit vs Ariz St to pull out the 41-27 victory as UO rushed for 269 of their 327 yds in the 2H led by bkp RB Barner's 171 who was filling in for the inj'd James (852, 9.0). The Ducks also lost QB Thomas (250 ttl ypg, 61%, 17-3 ratio) in the ASU gm with an apparent leg inj but he should be able to go here (CS). After an expected loss at Wash LW (outgained 562-269, down 3 TD's most of gm, 21st consec road loss), the Buffs return home and are 9-3-1 as a HD but with the inj's (RB Stewart out and WR Richardson ??), susp and attrition, another Duck victory, despite the potential absence of their stars, can be expected as they have now won 15 consec P12 gms (6-2-1 ATS run).

Nebraska 45 MINNESOTA 17 - NU may've saved their ssn prior to the bye with their biggest come back in history trailing OSU 27-6 in the 3Q before rallying for a 34-27 win. NU changed their off schemes and ran for 195 yds in the 2H after totalling just 37 at HT while the turning point came when LB David's 3Q FF set up NU's 1st TD drive of just 23/2pl. OSU's Miller was KO'd on the next series and NU had a 297-51 yd edge the rest of the way. Beleaguered QB Martinez avg 169 ypg (54%) with a 6-6 ratio and 584 rush yds (5.8). RB Burkhead is B10's #2 rusher (635, 5.9) underachieving Blackshirts are #75 FBS in rush D (168, 4.5) and now must make do without future NFLer DT Crick (OFY). With a 1-5 start and being outscored 103-17 in B10 play, UM is focused on the future playing a league high 18 true frosh. Gophers QB Gray (125 ypg, 49%, 3-4, #1 rusher 371) should be healthier after the bye (turf toe). UM allows 167 rush ypg (4.8) and are #109 FBS scoring D (35 ppg). NU is just 2-11 ATS as a DD conf fav and have Legends leader Mich St on deck. The Huskers are 8-4 as an AF and it's hard to believe but this is the first time in Kill's career that his tm is a lined HD. Expect lots of Red in the TCF crowd. CALIFORNIA 27 Utah 17 - Last met in the '09 Poinsettia Bowl and Utah (+3) won 37-27. Cal is com-

ing off a Thurs night HG vs USC with 2 days extra rest but may need it as despite outgaining USC, Cal was done in by 5 crucial TO's in the 3 TD loss. While Cal struggled, the play of WR Allen hasn't as he is avg 138 ypg as the tm's #1 threat. Utah is coming off a across country trip to Pitt where their D dominated the fav Panthers holding them to just 120 ttl yds (Pitt RB Graham just 46 rush yd). The strength of the Utah offense has been the rushing of RB White who's avg 112 ypg TY incl 171 vs Pitt. The Utes have dropped all 3 conf gms SU/ATS incl a -9 TO mark in their L/2 vs Wash and ASU (LPS 4★ winner on Sun Devils 2 wks ago) which should give Cal the edge here vs the road weary Utes. BOISE ST 48 Air Force 20 - 1st meeting. BSU's 1st MWC HG (bye on deck) and the 1st time they will be facing the option. BSU is off a 63-13 (-32) blowout of Colo St behind RB Martin (20-200, 3 TD), 'The Surgeon" Moore (26-30-338, 4 TD) and WR Shoemaker (9-180). CSU was only able to score on trick plays and BSU finished with a schl rec'd 742 yds (2nd time ever over 700) outgaining CSU by 511 yds. Moore now avg 288 ypg (76%, #4 pass eff) with a 21-4 ratio. Shoemaker (401, 16.7) is the top rec and Martin has 622 rush yds (5.1). LW a 20-20 late 3Q tie quickly mushroomed as AF all'd SDSt to score on 28/1pl (after fmbl), 77/11pl and 57/1pl on their next 3 drives and AF fell 41-27 (-7). QB Jefferson is avg 142 ypg (63%) with an 8-5 ratio and is the #2 rusher (259, 3.5, 5) behind Clark (556, 8.2, 3). This is AF's 3rd AG in 4W and they've all'd 122 pts the L/9Q's. BSU is 37-22 (0-2 TY) as and CM gained 51% (190) of their yds (14 pts) in the last stanza as BSU won 31-17. These tms are a HF and has avg'd 60 ppg the L/2 gms which may overinflate the line vs a pesky AF option.

2\* San Diego over NY JETS - This is the 3rd meeting in 4 years but the 1st with SD travelling East.

SD didn't take a rookle HC/QB combo in its 2nd straight road game seriously in the last meeting losing 17-14 as an 7 pt HF in the 2009 Div round. Afterwards former SD HC Marty Schottenheimer admitted that he helped OC Brian Schottenheimer scout the Chargers. This is SD's 1st road game off a bye week in the Turner era and while 4-1 TY their wins have been vs foes a combined 4-15. Rivers has 6-7 ratio right now largely due to the fact his top 3 targets Jackson (23 rec 17.7), Floyd (12 rec 21.5) and Gates (8 rec 9.3) have all been slowed by injuries. All are expected to start here and SD has nice stat edges with the #6 and #4 units (-5 TO's) vs the Jets #29 and #13 units (+ 1 TO's). The Jets #5 pass defense is solid (7.2 ypa 3-7 ratio) but teams are having success rushing on the Jets giving up 135 ypg (4.2). **OTHER GAMES** Chicago 17 Tampa Bay 14 - London, England - This is the 5th year in a row for the London game.

TB has a big edge in planning as while they lost to NE 35-7 (+15) in Morris' rookie season in 2009. It was their 3rd road game in 4 Wks and Morris entered into the game with a defeatist attitude after NE had blown out TEN 59-0 prior. Both teams are beat up injury wise with TB expected to be without RB Blount (MCL) and DT McCoy (high ankle sprain) here. TB comes in off a tight physical game vs NO where they converted 4 TO's into 10 pts. While they gave up 453 yds they held NO to 2 FG's and an int on 4 drives inside their 20. CHI is off B2B primetime games and their level of interest is uncertain. Cutler has been sacked 70 times since Martz took over and has been behind 4 diff OL's in 5 weeks prior to LW. The key to this game will be if TB can control Forte who is playing at an MVP level with 785 total yds (7.0) or 49% of the Bears total offense prior to MIN. We'll call for CHI by a FG and wait for an official line as we want to see DE Peppers (knee) status.

CAROLINA 23 Washington 20 - Both teams are dramatically different from 2009 when CAR beat WAS 20-17 as a 4.5 pt HF. It's strength vs strength here with CAR's getting it done with their #5 offense (#16 defense -5 TO's) while WAS is doing it with their #6 defense (#17 offense -3 TO's). WAS may switch to Beck at QB after Grossman imploded with 4 ints giving PHI 10 pts. They also lost their starting LG and LT and their status is unknown. The Redskins edge lies in their RB by committee approach generating the #12 rush attack (110 ypg 4.0) vs CAR's #31 rush defense allowing 140 ypg (4.8). This is due to 2 rookie DT's starting, a LB unit that has lost 2 of 3 starters and the Panthers are 24th with 9 sks earned so far. CLEVELAND 17 Seattle 10 - SEA is only 6-16 ATS all time off a bye but they did upset CHI LY 23-20 as a 5.5 pt AD off the bye. Teams that pull a SU win as a dog of 7 or more prior to the bye are 6-1 ATS but SEA may not have QB Jackson (chest) here. Whitehurst was decent with 149 yds (58%) for a TD but despite winning the season finale vs STL to earn a playoff spot he didn't get to compete for the #1 QB job in 2011. CLE (1-6 ATS at home) is in a West Coast sandwich after OAK with SF on deck. This will be the 1st time TY that SEA expects to have its fully healthy set of receivers with Rice (shoulder) and Williams (concussion) missing time as defenses have unloaded on the their run game holding them to 83 ypg (3.8) rushing. They have been outgained 365-269 on the road TY and their win vs the Giants came off 5 TO's including a 94 yd Int return at the end. For a team built for a power run game the Browns have put the offense on McCoy who has had to put the ball up 39 times in 4 of 5 games TY (GB's Rodgers has only done it once). Hillis (hamstring) was KO'd of LW's game and Hardesty only had 35 yds (3.2) LW. We'll call for CLE in a lower scoring game here as the Browns should get CB Haden back with a crowd edge.

Houston 20TENNESSEE 17 - The Titans certainly have the situational edge here off a bye while the Texans travel for a second straight after losing to the Ravens getting outgained 402-293. The early bye week may be a negative this season as teams try to make adjustments in their offenses and LW

OKLAHOMA 51 Texas Tech 20 - OU is 12-6 ATS vs TT while HT is 5-0 ATS. Second B12 HG for OU and they have won 31 str (20-11 ATS). LY's gm was tied 7-7 early 1Q but then the OU (-15') D locked down TT all'g 0 pts and 259 yds (3.6 ypp). The Sooners have won the L/3 here vs TT by an avg of 48-17 (+207 ypg). In '08 they took on an unbeaten #2 tm and whipped them 65-21 (-7). Despite 29-9 FD and 610-252 yd edges OU (-35') failed to cover in a 47-17 win over Kansas as they settled for 4 short FG's and AA WR Broyles had an unforced fmbl out of the EZ for a TB. Heisman cand QB Jones (363, 68%, 16-6) is #3 FBS passing. RB Whaley (627, 5.6) is the B12's #3 rusher. Sooners are #3 pass eff D (201, 51%, 5-9). Raiders dominated the stat sheet (32-16 FD and 580-339 yd edges) but lost 4 TO's and all'd an IR, KR TD's and a blk'd FG (3 in L/2W) which set up a 46 yd KSÚ TD drive in a 41-34 loss. QB Doege (361, 71%, 18-4) may now have to shoulder most of the load without RB Stephens (OFY). Raiders are #70 in pass eff D (188, 56%, 7-4). TT is 4-8 as an AD and after facing the pillow soft D's of NM (#120) and Kansas (#116) in their 1st 2 AG's take on our #3 unit.

WAS, STL, DAL and CLE were coming off byes and were outscored in the 1H by a combined 71-23 while BAL was the only to have a HT lead (10-7). Hasselbeck has been the best FA pickup so far TY avg 283 ypg (65%) with a 9-4 ratio despite losing Britt (17 rec 17.0) and RB Johnson (50 ypg 3.0) stuck in neutral but now he faces the leagues #10 D. On the flip side don't mind backing HOU QB Schaub on the road as LY he had a higher comp% compared to at home (64.2-62.9) as well as a better ratio (14-5 to 10-7) and does so again TY (61.0-57.3, 6-1 to 4-4). We'll also fade TEN as a HF as they are 0-1 ATS in that role TY and are only avg 21 ppg and 17 FD's (outFD 5 of 6)

Denver 24 MIAMI 21 - This will be a homecoming game for Tebow as MIA honors the 2008 Florida national championship team. DEN is in full rebuild mode though and its not known if they'll find any takers for WR's Royal (59 rec 10.6 LY) who has been hurt TY or Lloyd who is 2nd with 19 rec (14.9) after making the Pro Bowl LY with 77 rec (18.8). Tebow's mechanics and inexperience (730 total yds 48% 5-3 in 3.5 games) are his big issues right now but his intangibles and athleticism gave the Chargers fits before the bye. While DEN has the #26 and #24 units (-6 TO's) they are expected to be as closer to 100% health than when they opened the season especially on defense. DEN's pass rush is also much better than LY's with 12 sks so far (17th) vs 23 (32nd) for all of LY. Despite being lead by a OL coach by trade MIA has given up 14 sks so far TY (23rd 1 every 10 att's). MIA's #31 pass defense has been awful TY allowing 316 ypg (63%) with a 9-2 ratio with just 6 sacks (30th, 1 every 24.5 att's). Fox is a conservative coach by nature but we'll side with DEN and a QB giving the offense a new wrinkle vs a Dolphins team that is just 5-17 ATS at home and on a short week.

DETROIT 28 Atlanta 21 - The Falcons beat DET 34-21 as a 3 pt HD in Matt Ryan's 1st career start in 2008. DET is in a prime situation in their 3rd straight home game with only DEN on deck vs ATL off a pair of tough losses at home vs GB on SNF and chasing Newton around LW. DET has the #13 and #11 units (+9 TO's) vs ATL's #20 and #22 units (+2 TO's). A good pass rush improves coverage and the Lions are 12th in sacks (14 1 every 16 att's) and are allowing just 206 ypg (65%) with a 7-8 ratio with a very impressive 5.9 ypa. SF turned the Lions aggressive DL play against them LW letting them over penetrate getting big plays in key spots as Gore gashed them for a 47 and 55 yd run. ATL stuck with the ground game (Turner 139 yds 5.1) vs CAR to wear down the young DL and keep Newton off the field. ATL forced 3 ints but only got 1 TD out of it. The defense has struggled to get off the field all year allowing 49% on 3rd Dns and have struggled with 2H adjustments getting outscored 68-13 in the 3Q. The Lions will be extremely angry here after being out muscled at home by the 49ers and the Falcons have been a shell of the 2010 version and will now face a very hostile

OAKLAND 23 Kansas City 21 - OAK is 5-2 SU/ATS vs the Chiefs taking both meetings LY. OAK snapped a 7 game home losing streak to KC with a 23-20 win in OT (Pick) overcoming 13 penalties and 3 TO's. Locked into a Wildcard spot, KC had little interest in the season finale which OAK won 31-14 as a 3.5 pt AD. OAK became the 1st team since the merger to go unbeaten vs their division but miss the playoffs. They are a stout 8-0 SU/ATS vs a DIV foe with a 32-18 avg score. OAK is off a pair of emotional games honoring Al Davis and lost QB Campbell (brkn collarbone) indefinitely. Boller (100 yds 57% LW) has experience in Jackson's system but has very questionable pocket presence. KC looks to have adjusted to injuries at the start of the season with 350 and 436 yds the L2 games albeit vs MIN and IND. In his L3 games Cassel has avg'd 220 ypg but with 68% completion and a 7-1 ratio. Haley has already said the team is going to continue to evolve the pass attack as Bowe (23 rec 18.3) McCluster (18 rec 3.4) and Breaston (14 rec 16.4) round into form and Baldwin (hand) finally gets involved. DIV dogs off a bye are only 5-13-1 ATS (pending MIA) but OAK may be too emotionally

drained to be laying points (3-8 ATS as a Fav) again.

DALLAS 28 St Louis 17 - This is the biggest statistical mismatch of the week with DAL #7 and #5 units (-2 TO's) vs the Rams #25 and #28 units (-1 TO's). STL is 0-5 for the 2nd time in 3 years due to injuries at CB/WR and have only scored 4 offensive TD's TY. They weren't as bad as their game vs GB looked as they outgained the Packers 202-128 in the 2H. On 4 drives inside the Packers 30 they came away with just 3 points with a missed FG, int'd 7 yds in the EZ and were SOD on the GB 15. DD AD's off a DD AD game are 15-5 ATS and the Cowboys are 3-8 ATS as a DD HF DAL did a great job of limiting the Patriots offense to just 371 yds LW and have won the yardage battle in all 5 games TY. DAL's defense has already logged 16 sacks TY (6th 1 every 12 att's) and gets a Rams OL that has given up 22 sks so far (32nd 1 every 9.1 att's). After finishing 7th with 43 sacks LY the Rams only have 9 (32nd 1 every 19) so far TY. They are getting manhandled at the POA and are allowing 163 ypg (4.9) rushing. DAL's defense played very well LW as they kept Brady off balance for most of the game (2 ints, 11 sks/QBH) and now they get a big step down here. The only question here is if

the Cowboys can play a consistent game for an entire 60 minutes.

Indianapolis at NEW ORLEANS - Not quite the expected for this rematch of Super Bowl 44. While the Colts are winless but the Saints expended a lot of energy in LW's NFC South battle. New Orleans is among the league's elite even with the loss LW but they are just 3-7 as a DD fav and have not layed over 14 points to ANYONE in OVER 35 years!! Sunday Night Marquees are 3-1 this season (as of 10/16/11) and are ONLY \$9 with your NC Sports Debit Card available after 11am Gameday!

Baltimore at JACKSONVILLE - Not an envious scheduling spot for JAX having to face physical PIT and BAL in B2B weeks. The Jaguars come in having dropped 5 straight since their opening win BUT you may need to be leery against this desperate team in a circle-the-wagons game with a D that has allowed 16 or fewer FD's in 5 of 6 games.

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Oregon St 28 WASH ST 27 - Qwest Field. First time this gm will be played off campus. Aided by 2 Stanford TO's, WSU stayed with SU in the 1H trailing by just 3 at HT but was outscored 34-7 in the 2H (outgained 475-257). Despite the loss, WSU did get back starting QB Tuel (17-30-145) for the 1st time since the opener (collarbone). OSU's rough yr continued with another home loss LW to BYU as QB Mannion threw his 8th and 9th int to just 5 TD passes on the ssn. LY OSU (-24) was embarrassed at home 31-14 as they were outgained 378-261 (WSU snapped a 16 gm conf losing streak). OSU is still 9-2 ATS vs WSU (outgained them by 791 yds the prior 2 meetings) while the fav in the series is on a 14-5 ATS run. Navy is 1-4 ATS prior to ND but EC is 1-20 SU (1-7 ATS run) vs non-conf foes in true AG's. EC is on its 3rd str AG cutting down on their Prep time for Navy's option but picked up a much needed win over Mem LW (524-233 yd edge). Navy is 8-16-1 as a HF. The Mids have dropped 4 str (LW vs Rutgers had a FG blk'd late) which is their longest losing streak S/02. EC has allowed 179 ypg rush (4.7) which is #85 FBS and LW Navy was held to 200 yds, 162 below its ssn avg. EC will be putting more stock into conf play and with an odd midseason matchup vs a difficult off to prep for, Navy will end its losing ways. SMU (+7). Would we go against Navy again **as a 5**\*? **HOUSTON 51 Marshall 20** - HC. UH is off a bye while MU is playing for an 8th str wk. LW. MU got a spark from QB Graham is his first career start (led 17-6 at HT) but needed a Rice fmbl to score late for the win despite being outgained (2 of 3 wins have been outgained). QB Cato did play late and may start TW. MU is 1-6 SU on the CUSA road (3-3-1 ATS) but the win was a DD outright upset. UH has a large off edge (#5-109) as QB Keenum is 16-0 SU and 13-2 ATS at home as a str (avg win 51-20) and 10-2 as a HF while MU is on their 3rd road gm in 4W, has dropped 13 str vs ranked foes

Thanks to ST's PSU beat Purdue 23-18 as the Boilers missed a FG, an xp and also all'd a 92 yd KR which the Lions turned into 1 of their 3 FG's. McGloin saw the majority of the action at QB for a 2nd str wk even though Bolden continues to be the st'r. The net result is a pass off which is ranked #81 (208, 51%, 6-6) and will be without their top target WR Moye (485, 17.3) for a 2nd straight wk. RB Redd (705, 4.8) has picked up the slack with 3 str 100 yd gms in B10 play. PSU is #19 pass eff D (161, 51%, 4-11). NW had 29-17 FD and 495-379 yd edges in the 41-31 loss to Iowa but was done in by mistakes incl a 98 yd IRTD in the 1Q. QB combo of Persa and Kolter have been dynamic (224, 70%, 10-3) but the D has been nonexistent in the 4 gm slide allowing 36 ppg and 445 ypg. The Lions are 8-2 ÁTS as a B10 AF and they have a huge D edge (#9-83).

TOLEDO 38 Miami, Oh 17 - HT is 5-1 SU/ATS but MU is 4-1 ATS. In the last gm ('09) UT (-5) was down 7 when they drove 99 yds and with under 1:00 left, a TD was signaled but after review it was determined UT fmbl'd the ball into the pylon (overturned to a TB). It was Miami's ONLY win in a 1-11 season. MU is 5-0 SU (4-1 ATS) on the MAC road incl LW's 9-3 win over Kent St as a 5' pt AF (MU outgained 244-166). QB Dysert is avg 251 ypg (60%) with a 7-5 ratio. UT is off a 28-21 win as a 7' pt AF over rival BG with a 456-343 yd edge. UT's 2 QB system is avg 247 ypg (66%) with a 14-3 ratio. RB Williams leads with 405 rush yds (5.5) and 7 TD's which is more than the entire MU team (398, 5 TD). While the D's are close (UT #61-66), UT has the edges on off (#43-114) and ST's (#67-120). UT does have NI on deck but should not look past LY's MAC champ and is 5-1 as a DD fav.

NOTRE DAME 38 Usc 21 - First ND home night game S/90 and ND is well rested coming off a bye. USC is off a Thurs night gm vs Cal delivering a Marquee winner as they were aided by 5 Cal TÓ's in the 21 pt win. USC has won 4 consec trips to South Bend (2-2 ATS). LTH USC (-10) never trailed and after ND had a 1&gl at the USC4, stopped 3 str EZ passes (last inc was gm's final pl). LY ND, (+4') down 3, went 77/7pl for the GW TD w/2:23 left. The Irish had the "luck" on their side as USC dropped a sure TD pass at the ND15 and 4pl later was int'd at the ND1 w/:36 which snapped their 8 gm losing streak (USC was without QB Barkley and his bkp threw for 149 yds in the rain). Despite the hype of this series and seeking revenge, USC does have a meeting with Stanford on deck and could potentially be missing their top RB Tyler (368, 4.4) and #2 WR Lee (404, 16.2) while ND has begun to live up to the high expectations, covering 3 of the L/4 with the avg win by 36-17.

FD's and yds were close but SMU (+9) had 4 TO's incl an int in the EZ and a fmbl on the SM2 in the 28-7 loss. SM has won both meetings. In '08 SM (-14') came in 5-6 needing a win to reach bowl elig. SM only led 7-6 at HT but in an 8:00 span in the 2H scored 21 unanswered. SMU is in the midst of a tough 3 gm stretch off UCF and at Tulsa while SM is fresh off a bye. Since the A&M opening gm loss SMU has won 5 str (outscoring foes 38-15 with a 468-297 yd edge) as QB McDermott is 5-0 SU and 4-1 ATS as the st'r. SMU 12-6-1 ATS as a conf AD. SM has been rolling as well as they entered the bye on a 4-0 SU/ATS streak (avg 48-22 score and 523-364 yds). SM does have the ST edge (#39-110) but SMU had 463 KR yds LW (incl 92 yd TD). This looks to be a great CUSA matchup but we'll back the HT as SM is 8-3 ATS vs CUSA with the Mustangs in the midst of a difficult stretch. Aub did have a commanding 526-243 yd edge. LSU had outgained Auburn the previous 4 by 146 ypg and LTH won 31-10 (-7'). This will be another day home gm for the LSU and while they are 9-4 SU in those gms under Miles, they are just 2-11 ATS. LW LSU beat Tenn 38-7 as a 15 pt AF as they outgained UT 383-289 and the 31 pt margin was the largest ever vs the Vols. While QB Jefferson continues to see more and more action Lee is still getting most of the snaps avg 155 ypg (62%) and a superb 11-1 ratio. LW Aub (+1') took adv of the young inexp UF QB's by holding them to just 194 yds in the 17-6 win. With reg st'r Trotter struggling as of late, 3 diff Tiger QB's got action incl Moseley who threw for 90 yds. RB Dyer is still the workhorse with 752 rush yd (5.1) and 8 TD's. This is AU's 3rd AG in 4W and with a bye on deck for LSU, this will be the final time to make a statement before the showdown with Bama in two wks. Colorado St 24 UTEP 23 - HC. The Miners are 0-8 SU (0-6 ATS) in the series but their last meeting was in '98. UTEP is 15-22 ATS in non-conf gms incl 2-1 TY as they rebounded off their ATS loss to an FCS foe in the opener. UTEP (+1') is off a 44-7 blowout win over Tulane. They built a 31-7 halftime lead (helped by a blocked P recovered for a TD in EZ) but only finished with a 390-365 yd edge (FD's even). QB Lamison, in 4 gms (inj'd 2), is avg 223 ypg (59%) with a 7-5 ratio. The top rec is Edwards with 346 (13.8) but only 1 TD and the top rusher is Banyard with 480 (8.1, 3 TD). CSU is off a blowout loss to Boise, 63-13 and all'd BSU a schl rec'd 742 ttl yds (outgained by 511). The Rams used two trick plays for TD's but stalled with eight 3&outs (comb 11 yds) on their other 10 drives (1 int, 1 fmbl) before the 4Q. QB Thomas played the entire gm and is avg 198 ypg (64%) with a 6-6 ratio. The ground gm has avg'd just 87 ypg (2.9) vs FBS foes TY. While the off (CSU #92-101) and D's (UTEP #85-101) are even, UTEP boasts our #1 ST's unit but CSU is #12, making this a gm that could balance on ST's and TO's (UTEP -6, CSU +2).

NMSt won B2B gms to even its record after second and the Aggies are 1.2 ATS) in Honolulus and the NMSt but a state of the as ID drove 91/18pl to the NMSt1 but a 4th down pass was inc. UH is off a 28-27 (-6) loss to SJSf where both tms committed 6 TO's as UH had a blk'd PAT ret'd for 2 vs them then all'd an 87/6pl GW TD drive with :36 left. NMSt QB Christian is avg 212 ypg (59%) with a 6-1 ratio and is also avg 4.9 ypc rush. The Aggies actually run the ball better on the road (560, 4.8) than at home (214 yds, 2.3). UH QB Moniz is avg 314 ypg (64%) with a 17-4 ratio. He had gone 152 passes without an int but threw 3 LW incl 2 on B2B att. NMSt is looking to win 3 consecutive games for the 1st time S/04 but look for UH to remain undefeated vs them here.

Louisiana 27 WKU 23 - HC. WKU has lost 18 str HG's. UL will be playing with revenge as LY WKU (+6) snapped a 26 gm losing streak with their 1st win over UL in 4 tries. It also marked Taggart's 1st win as a HC. WKU (+6) led 27-7 at HT and never took their foot off the pedal in the 2H on the way to a ssn high 409 yds in the stunning road upset. UL is 9-1 ATS on the road incl 3-0 TY. They are the surprise team of the conf, off to their best start S/70, and off a 30-10 win over NT. QB Gautier ret'd from inj LW and threw 4 TD's. On the yr he leads the conf in pass eff while throwing for 1,054 yds (65%, 10-1 ratio). UL is giving up 119 rush ypg in conf and WKU has the best RB in the league in Rainey (704, 4.1). WKU is off B2B road wins but is ret home. UL has the off (#100-110) and D (#82-96) edges. WKU's home losing streak reaches 19 as Louisiana remains the SBC's team to beat.

Middle Tenn 27 FLORIDA ATLANTIC 24 - Visitor is 1-4 SU/ATS but MT is 5-1 SU/3-3 ATS in the series. MT is just 5-10 ATS and 8-7 SU their L/15 gms after a bye. LTH MT (+2') trailed 20-13 in the 4Q getting the GW TD on a 74 yd run by QB Dasher (stopped FAU on 4&4 at MT23). LY the Owls (+5') trailed 31-7 in the 4Q after leading 7-0. FAU did miss a 27 yd FG and tossed 3 int's resulting in 14 pts (MT just 6 yds of offense). MT is off a much needed break as they lost at home in OT in their last game. MT QB Kilgore is having a solid ssn with 1,418 yds (58%, 12-5 ratio) but will be without his OC who resigned during the bye after being arrested. FAU was embarrassed in their new home LW being outFD'd 17-6 and outgained 289-121 in their 20-0 loss to WKU. This is just FAU's 2nd HG ever in their new stadium, but the attendance will not be close to the 30,000 they had in the opener LW. Both tms have struggled TY but FAU has played a much stronger sked (#46-111). MT has the edge on off (#72-119), while FAU is slightly ahead in our D rankings (#104-119). MT is hosting conf leader Louisiana next, while FAU has a bye.

Ulm 27 NORTH TEXAS 20 - ULM has won 3 str (covered L/2) in the series by 17 ppg. ULM has outgained NT in 6 of the L/7 by 133 ypg. The road tm is 1-4 (2-3 ATS) but ULM won the LTH. LY NT (+1) led 27-21 at HT with a 236-192 yd edge. The Mean Green trailed by 5 two different times in the 4Q but all'd 70+ yd TD drives after each. NT is 6-12 ATS at home vs SBC opp's the L/5Y but is 1-0 TY in their new stadium. NT QB's have struggled due to inexperience at WR, thus leaving RB Dunbar as the only real option.
