NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK THIRTEEN 2011

NEWS AND NOTES - Texas A&M dominated the 1Q with Texas not even getting a FD and the Aggies getting the ball at midfield on most of their poss. A&M got a TD and 2 FG's to lead 13-0. The FG's were 49 and 52 yds by Randy Bullock. The game started to change when A&M fmb'd a punt at its own 41 and on the next play UT got a 41 yd trick pass from WR Shipley to Irby, 13-7. UT trailed 16-7 at the half but got a 58 yd IR TD then an 81 yd PR but after the PR they settled for a short 23 yd FG, 17-16. Ryan Tannehill had 3 int's and his 3rd set up UT for a 24/6pl drive for a TD and a 24-16 lead. A&M battled back and actually took the lead with 1:48 left but UT QB McCoy ran 25 yds down the middle of the field to the Aggie 23 setting up a 40 yd FG for the win in what figures to be a final game for quite some time in this storied rivalry...E Michigan had an 18-11 FD edge vs Northern Illinois but a couple of big plays allowed the Huskies to escape and advance to the MAC Title game. EM had 1st & gl at the N12 and 8 but they settled for FG's each time on a windy day. Once they passed up a 43 yd FG as they were going into the stiff wind and were SOD on 4&3. NI's big play was a 3&1, 68 yd TD run by Harnish in the 3Q which made it 18-6. Trailing 13-12 EM got to the N32 but a pair of sks forced a dropped pass on 4th down...USF played without starting QB BJ Daniels and Bobby Evelt hit 20-35-210 yds. UL clinched its share of the Big East Championship with the win and snapped a 16 game losing streak in reg ssn games played in the state of FL dating back to 1972. USF took a 17-3 lead on a 1 yd TD run with :35 left in the half and appeared in control but UL got a 54 yd KR and 2pl later an 18 yd TD pass to make it 17-10 at the half. UL trailed 24-20 but took the lead with 9:38 left, 27-24. USF was int'd and UL drove 17 yds for a TD. USF was SOD on 4&4 at its own 34 with 2:59 left...Tulsa and Houston were playing for the CUSA West Title and UH was also playing to keep their BCS bowl bid alive. The Cougars moved to 12-0 for the first time in school history and the game was close at the half with TU having a 226-224 yd edge. Trailing 13-10, TU fmb'd at the UH10 with :47 left in the half. UH got 2 big plays in the 3Q. On 4&10 they got a 33 yd TD pass to increase their lead to 20-10 and later on 4&1 got a 38 yd TD pass with 1:23 left in the quarter, 27-16. Case Keenum was pulled after an 8 yd TD pass with 7:16 left and UH added a 14 yd TD pass from bkp QB Turner with 6:18 left...In W Michigan's FHG QB Alex Carder DNP due to injury and Tyler VanTubbergen hit 19-21-252 yds. WM had a mistake-filled game and yet still won 68-19. WM fmb'd a punt at their own 49 then after an Akron punt was tk'd for a safety and only led 10-2. The Broncos fumbled a 2nd punt at their 46 setting up a UA FG and only led 10-5 but then scored TD's on their next 8 poss to go up 66-5. UA went 80/9pl for a TD then ret'd a fmb'l 72 yds for a TD to make it 66-19. WM was also SOD at the UA5 and 12 on their final 2 drives...Arkansas and LSU's last 6 meetings had all been decided by 8 pts or less and Ark jumped out to a 14-0 lead after a 47 yd FR TD but in the first meeting of 2 teams ranked in the Top 3 in Death Valley since 1959, when Billy Cannon got his famous PR vs Ole Miss, Tyrann Mathieu ret'd a punt 92 yds for a TD which tied it at 14. While LSU only had a 201-166 yd edge at the half and led 21-14, they dominated the 2H with a 293-88 yd edge and finished with a 26-11 FD edge, even taking a knee at the AU18 at the end...Pitt had a commanding 217-74 yd edge at the half vs West Virginia but lost RB Zach Brown to injury on their 2nd to last play of the half. Isaac Bennett spelled him in the 3Q before he also went out with injury. Keep in mind, earlier in the year, Pitt had lost their top RB Ray Graham. Without their RB's, the offense stalled in the 2H and was held to just 79 yards. WV made a big rally and went for it on 4&6 at the Pitt24 when a FG would have put them back within 3 but the gamble paid off and they would get a TD 4pl later for their first lead of the game with 6:10 left and Pitt punted with 2:30 left and their final 3pl were 2 sacks and an intentional grounding...Denard Robinson accounted for 5 TD's and Michigan snapped a school record 7 game losing streak to Ohio St. Braxton Miller threw for 235 yards and rushed for 100 and UM may have locked up their first BCS bowl since 2006 as the fans rushed the field afterwards. A key play late kept the Buckeyes in the game when UM appeared to get a TD to go up by 10 but it was overruled by relay as the RB was ruled down at the 1. Robinson's TD on the next play was called back due to a hold and a PF and they settled for a FG and only led by 6 with 1:59 left. OSU only got to their 35 and their final pass was int'd at the UM48 with :39 left. Brady Hoke is the first coach in UM history since 1901 to win 10 games in his first season. OSU will not win the Big Ten Title for the first time since 2004 and they lost 3 str Nov games for the first time since 1999...It was Deja Vu all over again for Nevada. Last week vs Louisiana Tech they had a 465-412



yd edge and this week vs Utah St they had a 290-134 yd edge but only led 10-7 at the half. NV lost starting QB Fajardo to an ankle injury late 3Q while leading 10-7. Backup QB Lantrip led 1 TD drive and NV took over at their 27 with 10:26 left. On 4&1 NV got a FD at the Utah St 11 on a Lantrip run but he fmb'd and Utah St would get 4 FD's incl 4&1 and 3&10 conv and took a knee...Oklahoma had allowed a school record 616 yards last week vs Baylor but held Iowa St to a season

low 245 yards and ISU did not have a drive longer than 35 yards with their only TD coming on a 10 yd drive (after a bad punt). It was ISU's lowest yardage total since last year when they only got 183 being shutout by Oklahoma. Iowa St had not beaten ranked foes in B2B weeks since 1974. Even though it was the home finale for Oklahoma, there were thousands of empty seats and the winds were 30-40 mph which slowed down the OU offense. OU settled for a 20 yd FG, on 2nd & gl from the 1 was int'd in the EZ and settled for 27 and 36 yd FG's in the 1H. OU fmb'd at the ISU20, was int'd at the ISU12, settled for a 21 yd FG and was int'd at the ISU20 in the 2H which is why they only won by 20 points...Tennessee blew a chance at a Liberty Bowl bid by losing to Kentucky in their final game. It was UK's first win in the series since 1984 breaking a 26 game losing streak to Tenn. UT had a 15-10 FD edge and a 276-217 yd edge. UK wore black jerseys for the 2nd time this season at the request of its 21 seniors. UT had 3 TO's late which cost them a shot at the win. UT had a 46 yd FG blk'd in the 1H and on 4&4 were SOD at the UK31. In the 2H UT had a 1st & gl at the 8 and went to the Wildcat but fmb'd. UK fmb'd and it appeared to be a clear recovery for UT but it was not overturned and 3pl later UK got a TD...Another game with late 1H heroics, Michigan St and Northwestern were tied at 3 and NU at the end of a 15 pl drive and at the MSU4 when they fumbled with 5:25 left in the half. MSU went 97/8pl getting a TD with 1:40 left then got a 57 yd PR TD with :34 left in the half and a 3-3 game blew open a 17-3 and MSU never led by less than 7 after that. Trailing by 7, NU did have the ball but punted with 10:22 left and on 3&17, MSU got a pass to Cunningham which he bobbled 3 times but hauled in for a 29 yd TD. MSU was playing with the Big Ten Title game on deck...Kansas and Missouri have a long rivalry, second in games played only to Wisconsin and Minnesota but only 47,059 were on hand at Arrowhead Stadium in what was likely the final of the series on a cold, wet afternoon. KU led 10-3 at the half but fmb'd a punt snap on their own 14 at the start of the 3Q and MO went 14 yards for a TD then 93 and 82 yds for TD's and rolled to a 24-10 win and finished with a 357-137 yd edge...MarQueis Gray ran 27 times for 167 yards and set a Minn record for rushing yards by a QB with 966 topping Billy Cockerham's 831 (1999). Illinois actually held an opponent under 100 yards passing for the 5th time this season but in the 1H UM had an amazing 217-18 yd edge and led 20-0 and extended it 27-0 en route to their 27-7 win. Ron Zook is 34-51 in 7 seasons, a winning % that is 11th among the 13 UI coaches who have coached more than one season and was fired the next day after the Illini's 6 game slide...NC State had the 2nd biggest comeback ever in an ACC game as they amazingly trailed 41-14 in the 3Q but rallied for the win and won by 15, 56-41! The key play of the game was a 59 yd IR TD by CJ Brown with 1:00 left. The previous high was when Clemson came back 28 pts down to beat Virginia in '92, 29-28. NCSst turned it over on each of their first 3 poss of the game incl when James Washington fmb'l's with nobody around him for 5 yards which MD scooped up and ret'd it 66 yards for a TD and a 7-0 lead early...Virginia Tech usually peaks at the end of the year and they had their best game of the season vs Virginia with a 38-0 win and a 410-241 yd edge...Alabama was even more dominating than their 42-14 final score would indicate. The Tide entered the 4Q with a 309-44 yd edge. In fact, after the opening KO of the 3Q, Bama had 221-31 yd edge and 13-1 FD edges but fmb'd into the EZ which Auburn fell on for a TD and AUB ret'd the opening KO of the 3Q 83 yds for a TD and Bama at that point only led 24-14. Trent Richardson rushed for 203 yards on 27 carries and also had a TD receiving in the Tide's 42-14 win. Richardson has avg'd 198.4 ypg vs ranked foes (all-purp yds)...Penn St jumped out to a 7-0 lead vs Wisconsin but the Badgers led 28-7 at the half incl a fmb'l'd KR with 2:09 left in the half setting up UW for a TD. PSU then fmb'd to start the 3Q and the Badgers got another TD and rolled to a 45-7 win. They did have a 450-223 yd edge...Southern Miss got their first CUSA East Title since 2006 and first 10 win season since 1988. Memphis avoided a shutout when trailing 44-0, SM fmb'd into the EZ and UM fell on it for a TD with 6:54 left. While SM had 2 IR TD's in the game, they also fmb'd into the EZ for a TB on the last play of the 1H on 1st & gl from the 1...Louisiana got their 7th IR TD of the season which tied an NCAA record which was set by Tennessee in 1971. While UL jumped out to a 7-0 lead at Arizona, AZ did not start QB Foles who was ? coming in but AZ rolled to a 45-37 win with Foles hitting 33-43-352.

LATE SURGES HELP TO BIG WINS - Boise St trailed Wyoming 7-0 with 2:00 left in the half. They got a TD with 1:10 left in the half then forced a punt with :08 left. Kellen Moore threw up a prayer and the ball was deflected at the goal line by a WY DB and fell into the hands of Miller for a 46 yd TD on the final play of the half giving Boise St some momentum into the locker room. WY went 3&out on their first 2 poss and were int'd on their 3 in the 3Q while BSU built a 36-7 lead...LT wrapped up a bid to the Poinsettia Bowl with the win over NMSst giving them the WAC Title. Louisiana Tech led just 9-0 when they got the ball with 4:00 left in the half at their own 4. They went 96/13pl and got a 1 yd TD run with :28 left in the half. NMS opted to not take a knee and instead threw it and LT got a 45 yd IR TD with :07 left to blow it open 23-0. LT did have a 295-178 yd edge at the half and would roll 44-0...FAU got a TD with 3:18 left in the half to tie at 14. UAB was sk'd and fmb'd at their own 9 with 1:30 left and FAU got a 28 yd FG to take the lead, 17-14 with :10 left. FAU took that momentum into the 2H and built a 38-28 lead before UAB got a TD with :33 left to pull within 3 but FAU rec'd the outside kick.

LTH in '08 was Prince's final gm and KSU was +3 TO's and won 38-30 but failed to cover as a 9' pt HF as they were outgained by 175 yds. Cash machine Cats have gone 9-1 ATS vs FBS tms TY but this is the 1st time they've been a conf HF (2-1 ATS as fav TY). ISU is 1-3 SU/2-2 ATS on the B12 road TY being outgained by 226 ypg in the losses. KSU is off a much needed bye after they completed their Texas 'sweep' by beating the Horns for the 4th str time. The Cats were outFD'd 15-8 and outgained 310-121 but 2 int's set up scoring drives of 36 and 13 yds while the D held UT out of the EZ on their final drive. QB Klein (144 ypg, 58%, 11-5) leads B12 QB's in rushing (1013, 3.8) and BCS QB's rush TD (25) but needed the time off after being unable to practice the wk prior to gm the L/2 due to various aches. Cats allow 124 rush ypg (3.9). ISU had been outgained in 6 of their 1st 7 gms TY by 86 ypg prior to Barnett becoming the QB. In his 4 sts ISU is 3-1 SU/ATS and had outgained the 1st 3 by 126 ypg prior to LW's misleading loss to OU. In wind gusts up to 40 mph the Cyclones were outFD'd 25-13 and outgained 509-245 and had their lone TD 'drive' of 10 yds set up by a bad P snap. OU was int'd in the EZ and at the ISU12 and 21, fmb'l'd at the ISU20 and settled for 4 FG's with 3 under 28 yds or it could've been much worse. Iowa St allows 195 rush ypg (4.6). KSU still has a BCS bowl shot and you know Snyder will add a few wrinkles with an extra week to practice.

FORECAST: KANSAS ST 34 Iowa ST 17

3★ PITT over Syracuse - Both tms come into this meeting with a chance at the postssn with a victory. Despite a 3-1 TO edge and a 20-7 lead mid-3Q in Morgantown, the Panthers were done in by 10 WV sks in the one point loss while Syr gave up some key plays to the Cincy offense and ST's in a 17 pt defeat in the Dome LW. Pitt has won 6 str in this series overall (4-2 ATS) by 16 ppg and 4 str at home going 3-1 ATS. LY Pitt was our Top Weekly LPS and rolled to a 45-14 win covering by 29 pts! The Panthers are in their preferred role here as they have gone 8-1 ATS in BE home games while the Orange are being outgained by 82 ypg on the road going 0-4 ATS. Todd Graham-led tms usually hit their stride by the tail end of his 1st yr which is what we expect to happen here as Pitt moves to 6-6 on the season. After Syracuse lost to USC by 21 points, their other 3 road opponents are currently ranked #112, #103 and #110 on our offensive ratings. Pitt is clearly superior to all three of those teams and has averaged 483 yards per game in their three conference home games. Better offense and better defense get the win.

2★ CUSA Championship Game - HOUSTON over Southern Miss - This is the 7th CUSA Champ and UH is 1-1 SU/ATS tying UCF and Tulsa for the most title appearances. SM is 0-1 SU/ATS. This will be a rematch of the '06 gm that UH won 34-20 (-5) at Robertson Stadium. Cougars had a 443-349 yd edge (+6 FD). The SU winner is a perfect 6-0 ATS in CUSA Title gms with the HT covering 2 str and 4 of 5. In '09 #18 UH lost vs EC 38-32 (2' pt AF) in their last CUSA Champ gm. UH was outgained 557-413 (-10 FD) and QB Keenum was 56-75-527 with a 5-3 ratio. UH is just 3-8 SU (6-5 ATS) vs SM but the fav is 7-1 while the HT is on a perfect 5-0 SU/ATS run. Interestingly Keenum and SM QB Davis have never squared off vs each other (both Sr's). LY in SM's 59-41 (-3) home win Davis was 24-31-293 with a 2-0 ratio with 111 rush yds (6.5) and 4 TD's (Keenum DNP, out ssn). LTH in '09 UH won 50-43 (-6) at home as Keenum was 44-54-559 with a 5-1 ratio tossing the GW TD with :21 left (Davis DNP, out ssn). These two have had 7 common foes TY and UH is 7-0 SU/5-2 ATS outscoring them 53-23 and outgaining them 597-397. SM is 5-2 SU/4-3 ATS outscoring them 32-21 and outgaining them 449-327. UH is 6-0 as a HF while SM is 2-0 as an AD TY. Heisman hopeful Keenum is 19-0 SU/16-2 ATS as a str at Robertson Stadium. He is avg 394 ypg (73%) with a 43-3 ratio and is #3 FBS in pass eff. UH has a RB-by-committee approach as Sims and Hayes comb to avg 117 ypg (6.5). Edwards has 74 rec (20.2) with 18 TD's and leads a talented WR corps. SM's Davis is avg 254 ypg (63%) with a 24-10 ratio. The RB's have been banged up all yr but D Johnson had a solid gm vs Mem (103, 9.4). The combo of Balentine/Bolden form an underrated WR duo with a comb 99 rec (13.7) with 13 TD. SM does have the NCAA's #12 pass eff def all'g 221 ypg (58%) with a 12-16 ratio as UH comes in at #16 (209, 57%, 14-16). Both have solid ST units (UH slight #20-26 edge). UH is in the midst of its best ssn in schl history (12-0) while SM has matched theirs ('52 and '88, 10-2) but with a win the Cougars will be the first CUSA school to crack the BCS and remember both of the Golden Eagles losses have come on the road against CUSA foes.

FORECAST: HOUSTON 51 Southern Miss 27

2★ Texas over BAYLOR - UT is 16-2 SU (10-8 ATS) and last lost B2B to BU in '91-92. However LY BU (+7) came in ranked for the 1st time S/93 and despite trailing 19-10 early 3Q scored 20 unanswered. The Horns had a 428-328 yd edge and in fact UT has outgained the Bears in each of the L/13 by an avg of 479-236 all'g only 300+ yds twice. UT (-23) did win 47-14 in their L/trip to Waco holding BU to just 246 yds. The visitor is 11-4 ATS and BU just 7-13-1 ATS in home finales. BU is just 15-28-2 ATS as a HD but 2-0 TY incl the upset of OU (+15) in their last HG. Bears are 6-0 SU/5-0 ATS at home TY outgaining foes by 167 ypg and avg 48 ppg (low of 42) while the Horns are 3-2 SU/ATS outside of Austin TY being outgained by 31 ypg. LW we won a 2★ LPS on Texas (+8) as they rallied from a 13-0 2Q deficit to upset SEC bound rival A&M. UT was outFD'd 22-12 and outgained 328-237 but used a trick play to get a 41 yd TD pass from returning WR Shipley (out L/3) and added a 58 yd IR TD early 3Q to make it a 2 pt gm. An 81 yd PR set up a 23 yd FG to give UT the lead which they added to moments later after an int set up a 24 yd TD drive. After the Ags hit a FG they drove 68/8pl for a TD with 1:48 left for a 25-24 lead (2ptng). QB McCoy, making his 1st start since Oct 1, aided by a PF pen, led a 48/7pl drive with a key 25 yd scramble which set up the GW 40 yd FG. Since returning from inj #1 rusher Brown (668, 4.7) has had 72 yd (2.6) the L/2. Horns are #8 pass eff D and the only FBS tm to not allow a TD pass of 20+ yds TY. RG3 has an FBS best 22 TD passes of 25 yds TY+. Griffin (concussion, CS) DNP in the 2H of LW's win over TT but the Bears burned Florence's RS and he hit 9-12-151 and 2 TD in a 66-42 win. BU had 38-25 FD and 617-444 yd edges with the key spread play being a 90 IR TD in the 3Q. Bears allow 198 rush ypg (5.3). Horns have huge D (#3-86) and ST (#8-105) edges and have to be insulted to be a dog for the 1st time in this series which they have dominated S/94.

Thursday, December 1st

West Virginia at USF - USF has been a dog in all 6 meetings with 3 outright upsets while WV has covered 4 of their L/5 on the BE road. After a win in the "Backyard Brawl", WV is good shape for a bowl game with a chance remaining at a BCS berth while USF still needs a win here to become eligible for the postssn.

Friday, December 2nd

MAC Championship Game - Ohio 39 Northern Illinois 36 - Detroit. Ohio has won the last 2 meetings and has covered 3 straight. In the last meeting ('09), OU was outgained 421-247 but won 48-41 thanks to a PR TD and an IR TD. Both tms will be making their 3rd MAC Championship gm with 1 being guaranteed their 1st win. Ohio lost both times as a dog to Central Mich 31-10 (+3) in '06 and 20-10 (+13) in '09. NI lost both of their gms as a DD fav giving up final min TD's losing 31-30 (-13) to Akron in '05 and 26-21 (-17) to Miami LY. Both were favored vs all 5 common opp's (DD NI 3x, Ohio 2x) with OU going 3-2 SU and 1-4 ATS (even TO), while NI went 4-1 SU and 2-3 ATS. Ohio avg'd a 29-25 win with a 444-371 yd edge, while NI avg'd a 40-28 win with a 519-386 yd edge (+3 TO). Ohio sophomore QB Tettleton is avg 241 ypg (64%) with a 26-7 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 576 (4.4, 8 TD). His top target is WR Brazill with 58 rec (16.3, 10 TD) while RB Harden leads with 866 (5.7, 2 TD). NI senior QB Harnish has had an amazing yr avg 224 ypg (63%) with a 23-4 ratio and leading all FBS QB's in rushing with 1,351 (7.9, 11 TD). His top WR is Palmer with 42 rec (13.5, 5 TD). Top RB Hopkins has 872 (5.2, 15 TD). Both come in at 9-3 SU and 5-7 ATS. After being upset by Ball St, OU won 5 str but lost its L/2 ATS. After being upset by CM, NI won 7 str but also lost its L/2 ATS. Both are guaranteed bowl bids per a MAC rule put in after the NI lost to Akron in '05 and sat home. Ohio has the edge on D (#81-98) and ST's (#40-47) while NI has the edge on off (#19-46). Ohio had 3 extra days off and does have the coaching edge as this will be HC Solich's 3rd MAC Champ gm in his 7th ssn at Ohio and 12th ssn as a HC. NI is led by rookie HC Doeren.

Pac-12 Championship Game - OREGON 49 UCLA 14 - 1st ever P12 Champ gm as UCLA benefitted from a postssn-ineligible USC and a poor South Div to get in with a 6-6 record while the Ducks are battle tested in the tough P12 North. With the changes in the conf, the two haven't played TY for the 1st time S/'05 with the Ducks covering the L/2 incl LY's 60-13 (-26) thrashing in Eugene (UO's 1st gm ever as AP #1) where the Ducks outFD'd (32-19) and outgained (582-290) the Bruins. A wk after their 1st home loss under HC Kelly, the Ducks returned to dominating fashion at Autzen as they more than doubled up rival Oregon St in FD's (38-15), yardage (670-315) and on the scoreboard (49-21). They did get a scare however with RB James (1427, 7.2) as he was inj'd in the 3Q and missed the remainder of the game (exp back here). Knowing they already had a trip to Eugene locked up after Utah's loss the day prior, the Bruins suffered their worst loss S/'30 (2nd yr of series) to rival USC LW as they were blanked 50-0 giving up 572 ttl yds (1 yd short of their season worst). LA newspapers reported after the game that HC Neuheisel will be dismissed after the Champ gm. The Ducks have performed well as a DD fav going 31-14-3 ATS while the Bruins are on a 1-5 ATS run as a DD dog. Looking further into the matchup and you'll see that the Ducks are averaging 569 ypg at home TY while the Bruins are all'g 454 ypg on the road (UCLA all'g just 370 at home). On the flip side, the Ducks are giving up a surprising 448 ypg in Eugene vs IA opponents while UCLA will look to control the clock behind the RB combo of Franklin (912, 6.1) and Coleman (643, 5.1) as the Bruins avg 175 ypg rushing away this year. UCLA has played our toughest schedule but Oregon has the edges in off (#3-37), def (#17-54) and ST's (#4-90). The home team in this series has had its struggles in the past going just 6-13 ATS but with UO outscoring their home opponents by a 48-22 avg, it's hard not to ride the HT in the inaugural Championship games, especially when the Bruins have failed to cover 9 of their L/10 away games.

Saturday, December 3rd

CINCINNATI 31 Connecticut 17 - Conn has covered 4 of the last 5 in this series and are amazingly still in contention for the postseason after a standout defensive/ST's performance vs Rutgers that saw the Knights turn the ball over 6 times and rush for -9 yards. The Bearcats still have a chance at a BCS automatic berth here after a good 2H showing vs Syracuse last week led by RB Peard who posted 192 total yards (Cincy alternated both QB Legaux and Luallen for inj'd Collaros). LY Conn forced 5 Cincy TO's which turned into 21 Husky points in the 38-17 victory (-2). Cincy has struggled at home as a conf fav going just 1-7 ATS but when looking at how poor Conn has played on the road TY (outgained by 143 ypg while going 1-3 SU/ATS), we'll side with the Cats here as the home team has won the L/4 in this series outright (Conn has never won in Cincinnati).

Wyoming 30 COLORADO ST 27 - Border War. Back and forth series with WY winning and covering the L/2 and getting their 2nd shutout of CSU in the past 3 gms at War Memorial Stadium. LTH was very unusual in that EVERY score caused a lead change with WY getting a 33 yd FG with 1:27 left for the win and CSU lost to WY at home for the first time S/98. LY WY RB Alexander scored a schl rec'd 5 TD's. CSU fell to AF 45-21 LW, starting true frosh QB Grayson again (CS on Thomas) who has thrown for 373 yds (58%, 2-2) in his 2 sts. RB Nwoke has become CSU's go-to guy with 810 rush yds the L/5 gms incl 269 vs AF. WY all's 228 (5.1) ypg rush. LW the Pokes battled Boise for 2nd place and came out ready to play. Safety Anderson started the scoring, getting a 29 yd IR TD on BSU QB Moore's 1st pass but BSU scored 36 unanswered before WY tacked on a garbage TD with 5:26 left in the gm for a 36-14 final (+33). WY was outFD'd 26-11 and outgained 479-191. CSU all's 234 (5.5) ypg rush and QB Smith has set the MW frosh rec'd for ttl yds (2859). This is the Pokes 4th away game in 6 weeks and their 1st time playing as an away fav this year (0-2 in that role under Christensen). HT is 7-2 SU (6-2 ATS) in the series. CSU is 9-4 as a hoem dog under Fairchild, who likely coaches his last game here while the Pokes have a bowl game up next.

TCU 51 UNLV 6 - TCU has 7 str wins and has covered 4 str and all 3 at home. The Frogs' dominating numbers incl an avg score of 41-7, avg line of -25, avg of +291 ypg and they've only all'd 4 TD's in the 6 gms. LTH UNLV was outgained by 418 yds (just 6 plays in TCU terr). LY TCU won 48-6 despite not getting any sacks and UNLV's only score came on a gbg TD with :41 left. LV is off a 31-14 (+14) home loss to SDSt. The Rebs actually led 14-7 at HT before SDSt put it in RB Hillman's hands and LV was outgained 391-261. QB Herring went down with a spldr inj (CS) and his bkp Reilly has been struggling with inj's of his own, while the #3 QB Barnhill was playing TE up until a month ago. While RB Cornett did rush for 136 yds (9.1) vs SDSt, TCU all's just 113 (3.2) ypg rush at home. TCU is 19-6 ATS as a conf HF while LV is 1-14 ATS as an AD (did cover opener vs Wisky +35). TCU is off a bye while LV is playing for a 6th str wk, is on the road for a 3rd time in 4W and has lost by 30.8 ppg away from home TY.

Oklahoma 42 OKLAHOMA ST 41 - Bedlam for a 2nd str yr in Stillwater in a series where the visitor is 3-9-1 ATS and 3 of the L/4 here have been decided by 6 or less. OU has dominated the series winning 8 str (6-1-1 ATS) and has outgained OSU in 7 of those meetings by an avg of 476-282! OSU's Gundy is now 0-10 SU vs OU as both a QB (0-4 as str '86-'89) and HC. LY OU was a dog (+3) for the 1st time in the series S/'98 but won a wild 47-41 gm as QB Jones matched an OU rec'd w/468 pass yds. The gm was tied at 24 at the end of the 3Q as 40 4Q pts were scored incl 4 TD's in 92 secs. OSU is 11-19-1 ATS vs ranked tms (2-1 TY). OSU left Ames thinking they blew their BCS shot but after a chaotic week realized that the dream still is a possibility with a win over their rivals. QB Weeden (374, 73%, 34-12) threw 3 picks incl the gm sealer in 2OT. RB Randle (1042, 5.8) and WR Blackmon (1241, 12.1, 15 TD) round out the triplets. OSU leads the FBS in TO's forced (37) before getting a taste of their own medicine vs the Cyclones (5 OSU TO's to 3 for ISU). The Sooners rebounded to beat ISU 26-6 but failed to cover (-28) in a misleading final. OU had FD (25-13) and yd (509-245) edges but threw int's in the EZ, at the ISU12 and 21, fmbld'd at the ISU20 and ISU's lone TD was set up by a bad P snap. OU played without #3 rec Reynolds (692, 17.7, susp, CS) and B12 tfl leader DE Alexander (18, shldr) was inj'd in the 2H further depleting units missing future pros Broyles (1157, 13.9, 10 TD) and Ronnell Lewis (13 tfl). OU has had 7 TO's the L/2 without Broyles. Cowboys are #15 pass eff D (267, 58%, 13-21) while Sooners are #30 (246, 53%, 16-13). OU is 4-0 as a conf AD in L/10Y and would like nothing better than keep their rivals out of the BCS party and claim their 8th B12 Champ.

NEVADA 42 Idaho 17 - UN has won 8 of the L/9 (7-2 ATS) by 33 ppg. The Vandals are 0-6 SU/1-5 ATS vs the Pack since these two renewed the series as WAC foes ('05) being outgained in every gm by at least 150 yds incl LY when UN outgained UI 844-339. UI has shown signs of improvement over the last month of play. QB Reader (183 ypg, 55%, 10-10 ratio) has played his way back under C and while the Vandals have lost 8 of their L/9, UI's L/4 WAC gms have all been decided by 7 pts or less. UI comes in fresh off a bye and after its first bye a month ago, they nearly upset Hawaii falling 16-14 (+7) missing a FG on the last play. UN is coming in off a 21-17 (+1) loss at USU where the Pack outgained the Aggies 500-373 but a costly TO late in the 4Q thwarted any shot at the win. QB Lantrip was 8-10-135 and a TD in place of str Fajardo (3Q ankle inj, CS) but on a keeper with under 6:00 to play, Lantrip picked up a FD at the USU11 but fmbld'd and the Aggies recovered and ran off the final 5:14. UN is coming off B2B WAC losses for the 1st time S/'08. While the Pack is just 5-4 SU/ATS in home finales S/'02, all 4 losses and non-covers were vs Boise. After blowing their L/2 gms due to self-inflicted wounds, the Pack could use a feel good win.

BOISE ST 51 New Mexico 6 - These two haven't played since NM was a fav over Boise in '99 and '00 (Boise won both by 14 ppg). NM has lost 17 str MW away gms with the avg score 37-10 (7-10 ATS). In LY's 4 conf AG NM's line avg'd being +22 pts and they not only received a ssn high line from their 4 opp's but it was 12 ppg higher than the next closest tm. NM is off a bye while Boise beat WY 36-14 but failed to cover (-33). QB Moore (#4 FBS pass eff) was picked on his 1st att of the gm for a 29 yd IR TD (1st IR TD since Nov '09). It looked to be tied at 7 at HT when Moore threw a 46 yd Hail Mary which was deflected down to WR Miller, who was laying on his back on the goal line, 14-7. BSU finished with 26-11 FD and 479-191 yd edges. Moore is avg 290 ypg (73%) with a 38-7 ratio and NM is #120 pass eff D all g 232 ypg (71%) with an 18-2 ratio. Boise went 2-2 ATS as a conf HF LY laying 30+ three times and has struggled as a HF TY going 0-5 ATS (avg line -27, smallest line -16 vs TCU). While the line could be one of the highest we've seen this year Boise has avg'd 55 ppg in their home finales the L/8Y.

BYU 34 HAWAII 17 - BYU has won 18 of the L/22 meetings (all four losses in Honolulu) incl 7 of the L/8 (3-5 ATS). The lone loss during that stretch came here in '01 when the Cougars (-3) came in ranked #9 at 12-0 and UH won 72-45 scoring the most pts ever vs BYU as current UH OC Rolovich (then UH's QB) threw for 543 yds and 8 TD's. UH kept its bowl hopes alive with a 35-23 (-16') win over Tulane LW snapping the Warriors' 3 gm losing streak. QB Graves made his 1st start and was 21-38-260 (57 rush yds) and accounted for 3 scores as the Warriors rolled up 482 yds (358 passing) and RB Iosefa's 1 yd TD run with 7:03 to go sealed the win. UH usually has the sked edge in these late ssn gms but the Warriors are playing for an 8th str wk while BYU is off a bye and playing only its 3rd gm in 36 days. Cougar QB Heaps started his 1st game since Sept 30th in BYU's last outing (Nelson out with a collapsed lung) and he went 21-36-238 with a 4-1 ratio. BYU is on a 6-1 ATS run in AG's and is on a 5-0 ATS run overall while UH has failed to cover in 6 of its L/7. This is BYU's 5th gm vs a WAC opp TY and the Cougars are 4-0 SU/2-2 ATS but all 4 of those gms were played in Provo. BYU will be looking for a clean sweep of the WAC while UH will be fighting for a chance to play again on its home field in a bowl gm.

Utah St 37 NEW MEXICO ST 27 - Battle of the Aggies. The dog has thrived in this series going 8-4 SU and 9-3 ATS. Five of the L/6 gms in the series in Las Cruces have been decided by a TD or less with USU going 4-2 SU/ATS. NMSt is coming off a 44-0 (+19) loss at LA Tech as they were shut out for the 5th time in the L/5Y. RB Turner had 149 yds rush to become just the 3rd plyr TY to rush for 100 yds vs the LT's stout run D as he recorded his 6th 100 yd gm TY. However, QB Colwell (str Christian out w/inj) struggled going just 15-25-119 with 3 int and was sacked 7x's. USU posted a 21-17 (-1) victory over Nev to become bowl elig for the 1st time S/'97. USU scored on a double-pass with WR Morrison connecting with RB Turbin on a 34 yd TD pass on the final play of the 3Q to take a 21-17 lead then recovered a fmbld on their own 11 with 5:14 left and was able to run out the clock to seal the win. LTH USU outgained NMSt 429-230 but lost 20-17 (-10') on a FG as time expired and USU HC Andersen said the loss was the toughest of his coaching career. USU sure has suffered its share of heartbreaks TY with their 5 losses coming by an avg of just 5 ppg before getting things turned around with a string of 4 consec wins by just 4 ppg. USU further cements a bowl bid.

SAN DIEGO ST 40 Fresno St 34 - Former WAC foes but the last meeting was in '02 as FSU was a 17 pt HF and won 16-14. FSU is 16-8 ATS away the L/4Y and playing its 3rd AG in 4W. FSU lost its last-ever WAC gm as they were upset 27-24 (-6) by SJSt on Sr Night. FSU was up 17-10 at HT and finished with 25-21 FD and 449-424 yd edges but suffered 3 TO's which set up 14 SJSt pts. RB Rouse had with 151 yds and moved into the top spot for most rush yds in schl hist in B2B ssn. He leads with 1,493 (4.8) and has 12 of the tm's 17 rush TD's (#8 FBS rushing). QB Carr went over 3,000 pass yds on the ssn (5th FSU QB) and avg 267 ypg (63%) with a 24-8 ratio. SDSt is #58 pass eff D (187 ypg, 56%, 13-13 ratio) and all's just 131 ypg rush (3.1) at home TY. SDSt was trailing 14-7 at HT to LV LW, but shutout the Rebs in the 2H in a 31-14 (-15) win. RB Hillman finished with 192 rush yds and leads with 1,478 rush yds (5.7) and 15 of the tm's 22 TD's (#4 FBS rushing). A wk after throwing for 350 yds vs Boise, QB Lindley threw for just 152 (2-1 ratio) LW. He avg 224 ypg (53%) with a 20-8 ratio but his rec's have struggled most of the year. FSU is #77 pass eff D (266 ypg, 56%, 21-5 ratio). These two may be conf opps again next year and this might be Pat Hill's final gm.

ARKANSAS ST 37 Troy 20 - Troy has won 4 str (3-1 ATS) as LY they were a 10' pt HF and won 35-28. In that game Troy led 21-7 and 24-14 at HT. ASU had B2B 78 yd drives and took their only lead of the game, 28-27, with :49 left. Troy comp passes of 30, 10 and 10 yds and on 2&10 from ASU17 got a TD pass (2pt). LTH ASU led 10-0 early and again at 27-23 in the 4Q. Troy scored with 7:53 left and after ASU went 3&out Troy ran off the final 7:47 getting to the

ASU4 before taking a knee. LW Troy gave up 494 yds to WKU and lost 41-18. In their L/6 gms the Trojans are allowing an avg of 474 ypg! Despite their struggles, QB Robinson is still avg 281 ypg (62%) with a 19-13 ratio. The Red Wolves (9-2 ATS) are off a bye and their potent offense has gained more than 500 yds in a game 4x's TY! QB Applin leads the team in rushing as well and as he avg's 314 tt ypg, 65.4%, with 24 tt TD's. ASU has the off (#50-83), def (#57-111), as well as ST (#31-79) edges. Troy is on its 2nd str away and ASU will get revenge as it has done all ssn vs conf foes as they look to finish the year unbeaten in the SBC.

NORTH TEXAS 31 Middle Tenn 24 - They've played 10 gms with NT winning and covering the 1st 5, MT winning and covering the next 4 and NT pulling the upset as an 11 pt AD LY. LTH NT had the yardage and FD edges but was -5 in TO's. That sounds familiar as MT had 23-16 FD and 393-324 yd edges LW but lost to FIU 31-18, turning the ball over twice and having a ST breakdown. After B2B bowl bids, the Blue Raiders are limping to the finish line this year having lost 5 str and are on a 1-7 ATS run. Mean Green RB Dunbar (104 tt ypg) who was limited to 3 carries in his last game, should be near 100% here. The last time NT was off a bye they pulled the outright upset over Troy (+8'). While MT has the edge on off (#82-108), NT has played a much tougher sked (#57-106). NT was a conf HF only 4x in Dodge's 4Y (1-3) but they are 1-0 in that role TY. MT is 3-8 as a conf AD (1-2 TY). MT is playing for a 7th str wk while NT is off a bye and playing just their 3rd game in 35 days. MT has won 3 str in Denton by 24 ppg but this is their 1st at the new stadium and the Mean Green are much better at home this year.

FAU 28 ULM 27 - This will be Howard Schnellenberger's final game as he announced his retirement before the season. These two have met 7x's with 5 upsets. ULM is 5-2 SU and 5-1-1 ATS incl 4-0 SU/ATS at FAU (wins by 2, 3, 7, and 4). The road team won the 1st 6 but ULM did push as a 3 pt HF LY. In that game ULM had a 260-68 yd edge at HT and led 12-0. FAU scored 17 str and had a 4Q lead. After an FAU fmbld ULM went 55/9pl for the GW TD with 2:43 left. LW FAU snapped a 13 gm losing streak as they got their first win of the year, coming back from a 28-24 4Q deficit to win 38-35 over UAB. RB Morris (1114 yds, 5.2) scored a career-high 4 TD's and broke the 100 yd barrier for the 5th str gm. In their L/6 conf games FAU hasn't lost by less than 14 pts, getting outscored 203-66! ULM was not a conf AF in Berry's 1st year but was in that role once TY, losing by 17 (-6) vs NT. FAU is 0-2 as a conf HD TY and is 5-5 ATS the L/5Y. ULM is off a bye but with the Owls tasting victory, look for them to continue to send their legendary HC out on a winning note.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME - LSU 27 Georgia 20 - Georgia Dome, Atlanta. UGA leads the recent series 6-3 SU/5-4 ATS (L20Y). Both tms have been ranked in the Top 20 in each of the L/6 meetings. UGA is the only tm in the SEC that LSU HC Les Miles does not have a winning record against (1-2 SU/ATS) but the Tigers did win the L/meeting in '09, 20-13 (+3) as #4 LSU benefitted from a controversial celebration pen on WR AJ Green which set up their GW TD (:46). This will be the 3rd meeting between these two tms in the SEC Champ gm as they split the prev 2 with LSU winning 34-13 in '03 (-3) and UGA winning 34-14 in '05 (+1). These two have six common opp's TY and have had similar results with LSU going 6-0 SU/5-1 ATS outscoring foes on avg 38-7 (+192 ypg) while UGA is also 6-0 SU/5-1 ATS outscoring foes 27-12 (+184 ypg). Each was a fav in every gm and each failed to cover as 30+ HF's vs UK. LW LSU capped their best reg ssn in schl hist with a 41-17 (-12') win over #3 Ark as they finished SEC play 8-0 for the 1st time (trailed 14-0 w/6:00 left in 2Q). QB Jefferson has now played every meaningful snap for 3 str gms (155 ypg, 66%, 3-1 ratio L/3) and AA DB Mathieu was the star again with 8 tkl, 2 FF, 1 FR and a 92 yd PR TD in the 2Q that turned the momentum. The Bulldogs are also off a key win over rival GT, 31-17 (-5') and have now won 10 str gms for the first time S/'82 (8-2 ATS) despite playing w/out their top 2 RB's the last couple of wks. QB Murray is avg 225 ypg (61%, 32-10, TD schl rec'd) while super frosh RB Crowell, despite battling inj for most of the yr, leads with 832 (4.8) despite only 7 str (CS). The UGA D has been the story as they lead the SEC in sks (32) which is remarkable considering they had only 1 in the first 3 gms comb. UGA is 8-3 ATS as a DD dog and the off (LSU #13-15) and def (LSU #2-5) are basically even but LSU has the large ST's edge (#19-81). This one could come down to the wire but it's tough going against the Tigers who have met every challenge TY. LSU books their ticket to nearby New Orleans for the National Champ game.

ACC Championship Game - Virginia Tech 34 Clemson 24 - Bank of America Stadium, Charlotte. VT is looking for its 4th ACC title (3-0 ATS) in the L5Y while Clem is making its 2nd appearance S/'09, a 39-34 loss to GT. LY VT defeated FSU 44-33 (-3') here in Charlotte sending them to the Orange Bowl and TY may have Nat'l Title implications. These 2 have gone in diff directions since CU's 23-3 win. CU QB Boyd was off of 2 HUGE wins (1st road start) over ranked FSU and Aub. VT's D held CU's off to 328 yds but QB Thomas struggled in his 1st gm on the big stage. VT has since won 7 straight (2-5 ATS) rising to #5 in the polls while CU collapsed losing 3 of L/4 (0-4 ATS) after rising to #6. CU limps in since clinching 3 wks ago needing a FG to beat Wake on the final play (down 28-14 4Q) then were crushed by NCSt. LW Clemson was dominated by SC losing 34-13 and was held to a ssn low 153 yds. SC sacked Boyd 5x holding him to just for 83 pass yds (prev low 204 vs VT). Boyd is avg 278 ypg (60%) with a 28-10 ratio. RB Ellington needs just 63 yds to top 1,000 and FPOY WR Watkins has 1,073 (14.9). After just 8 TO's in the 1st 8 gms, CU has 12 in the L/4 incl Boyd's 7 int's. The D has all'd 384 ypg (28 ppg) incl 187 rush (4.5). VT played its best gm of the yr LW dominating rival UVA 38-0 to wrap up the Coastal. VT held UVA to 30 rush yd, 1.2 ypc (148 under ssn avg) and harassed QB Rocco (4 sks) into 3 TO's. VT is the only team in the FBS to win 10 gms the L8Y and is 10-1 ATS away vs the ACC. Thomas is avg 234 ypg (63%) with an 11-2 ratio in the L/7 and at 250 lb is a Clydesdale in the run gm (414, 3.3) to compliment RB Wilson who tied an ACC rec'd with his 10th 100 yd gm (1595 yds, 6.3). He rushed for 128 (5.6) vs CU TY. VT D is #12 in FBS all g 302 ypg, #9 vs run (99 ypg, 3.1), #9 pass eff and has 37 sks (#8). You can bet VT will take notes from SC's gameplan. VT met BC in the title gm in '07 and '08 and after losing to them in the earlier meeting took both SU/ATS, outscoring them by a 30-14 avg. Clemson has the edge on ST's (#66-98) but VT has a huge edge on defense (#7-63) with exp in this situation and gets past the young Tigers for a BCS bowl.

4★ PITTSBURGH 28 Cincinnati 14 - CIN dropped to 2-8 SU/ATS vs PIT with a 24-17 loss as a 4 pt HD just 3 games ago. The Bengals hung tough thru most of 3 Qtrs until PIT wrapped up a 81/11p drive with a TD. This allowed them to ramp up the pressure on Dalton (170 yds 50% 2 TD) who threw his 2 int's in the 4Q. PIT is off LW's game vs KC and its not known how Roethlisberger (brkn thumb) fared. This is PIT's 1st home game in a month (3-2 ATS) where they have dominated statistically with a 408-250 yd edge (but -3 TO's). In home games, PIT is the only team with top 10 rankings total yardage, rushing and passing on both sides of the ball. Over the L4W PIT has the #5 and #5 units (0 TO's) vs CIN with the #9 and #11 units (0 TO's). CIN is 5-0-1 ATS on the road TY but they were down 31-14 early in the 4Q before the only playoff level team they've faced on the road let up (BAL). PIT is the only current top 10 offense CIN has faced TY and while CIN outgained CLE by 115 yd they barely got past them. We'll side with the home team that knows how to play in big games and has gone 4-0 ATS on these pages.

FORECAST: PITTSBURGH 28 Cincinnati 14

3★ WASHINGTON over NY Jets - The Jets are just 1-4 SU/ATS on the road TY after logging 15-7 SU/14-8 ATS inc playoffs in Ryan's 1st 2 years. They've only been outgained by 20 ypg but they haven't helped out Sanchez (227 ypg 57% 5-4 away) by being outrushed 144 (4.4) to 89 (3.3). Despite tossing 4 TD's LW, Sanchez had an awful day with 180 yds (49%) as the offense struggled to find a rhythm. WAS is off a rivalry game vs DAL where they went deep into OT and a long trip out and back from SEA where they pulled the upset. The Skins are much healthier than in the last few weeks and it showed as they gained 416 yds in the road win. WAS D's also continues to keep them in games and the L5W they're allowing 324 ypg and 21.2 ppg. We'll grab the value with an improving WAS team that lost 6 straight prior to LW and now face a team with 3 ATS losses.

FORECAST: WASHINGTON 21 NY Jets 20

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Dallas over ARIZONA - The Cowboy's have now won 4 straight but failed to cover 3 of those. "I like plans where we get out there and get 30-point wins." Jerry Jones said. "I'm going to talk to him [Jason Garrett] about that. We need bigger wins." The Cardinals are just the type of opponent that the Cowboy's can appease their owner with. Cowboy nation has been well supported in trips to Phoenix but Dallas has lost B2B trips outright ('10 26-27 (-6)' & '08 24-30 (-5) in OT). The Cardinals return home after a 3 game road trip and have to be pleased having knocked off Philly and St Louis but they have dropped both games as a HD TY and not been outgained by 82 ypg at U of Phoenix Stadium. The Cowboys numbers on the road are not overwhelming but they've outgained 3 quality non-div foes (NYJ, SF & NE) by 101 ypg going 2-0-1 ATS. Down the stretch LY the Cowboys topped 100+ yds rushing each of the L8 games (6-2 ATS). That bodes well for a DAL sack against ARZ #21 rush D. Whichever QB is under C they've taken a beating as their 36 squads allowed are #31 while the Cowboys DL feasts away from home with 20 sacks in the 5 games.

FORECAST: Dallas 27 ARIZONA 13

2★ NY GIANTS (+) over Green Bay - Despite having to travel the Packers are in a solid situation with extra rest vs a Giants team off a MNF road game. GB is 4-0 SU/ATS vs foes with a winning record TY outgaining them by 52 ypg (5th) (+8 TO's) with a 30-21 avg score. On the road TY Rodgers is avg 315 ypg (71%) with a remarkable 16-1 ratio and 9.64 ypa. GB's #30 defense does give up the big yards (393 ypg) and 3rd Dn conversions (43.4% 29th) but they've only allowed 7 rush TD's and the secondary has a 19-22 ratio. GB has given up 400+ yds in 5 of their L6 games but have countered with a 9-12 ratio and 13 sks. This is the only game out of primetime for the Giants in a 4 week span and to their credit they know how to deal with an undefeated team this late in the season. DET's physical DL gave a good indication on how to disrupt Rodgers holding him to 65 yds (56%) with a TD in the 1H and the Giants are more disciplined than the Lions. The pressure of an undefeated season will start to hit GB, esp vs a Giants team that has been a HD only twice in 4 seasons.

FORECAST: NY GIANTS (+) 27 Green Bay 30

OTHER GAMES

Philadelphia at SEATTLE - The Seahawk fans are treated to their first prime-time affair at home since 2007 (beat SF 29-0). Nice scheduling edge getting an East Coast team making a trip for a 3rd time in 4 games. Philly is in complete desperation mode as if they win out they would finish 9-7 which still probably isn't enough. In the last 2 seasons the Eagles didn't make the playoffs they won and covered 4 of their L5 in '07 but lost and failed to cover their last 2 in '05. **NFL Marquee's are an outstanding 15-7-1 68%. Grab this winner after 3pm Thursday for just \$9 on the Northcoast Sports Debit Card System (Private Play Hotline).**

Tennessee 27 BUFFALO 23 - The Bills return to Ralph Wilson Stadium for only a second time in their last 7 games where the dog has covered all 4 this year. Buffalo has now lost 4 straight after giving up a 77/12p TD drive with 1:06 LW and now has the psychological disadvantage of having a losing record for the first time TY. Attrition can be blamed on them avg just 285 ypg & 12.5 ppg the L4W as they are #2 in the NFL with 13 players lost to the IR. The Titans continue to live and die by the running game and the 4 times this season when they've totalled 90 or more rush yards they've gone 4-0 SU/ATS incl Chris Johnson topping 130 yards 2 of the L3W having a ssn high 190 (8.3) vs Tampa. They now face a Bills squad that has allowed 124 ypg and 4.5 ypc rushing on the ssn. The Titans also will get a boost knowing they trail HOU by 2 games with the Texans down to a 3rd string QB and a meeting with them in the season finale. The Titans losses TY have come vs JAX, PIT, HOU, CIN and ATL who came into LW as the NFL's #3, #2 #1 and #6 overall D while the Falcons were the leagues #2 rushD. Buffalo's #24 D and #22 rush D come nowhere close.

CHICAGO 27 Kansas City 17 - The Bears have a big situational edge at home vs a KC team off B2B primetime games under Tyler Palko with a road game vs the Jets on deck. CHI has the #16 and #25 units (+9 TO's) vs a top 6 sked TY while KC has the #26 and #23 units (-4 TO's) vs a bottom 5 sked. KC's upset wins vs OAK and SD are looking more like mirages now. While they've only been outgained by 36 ypg their L3 prior to PIT, they have given up 168 ypg rushing (4.4) and a 6-0 ratio with just 3 sks. They are dead last in the NFL with just 12 sks TY (1 every 24.6 att's) and have been outscored 134-75 in the 2H (no OT). CHI went to Caleb Hanie LW vs OAK who hit for 254 yds (50%) with a 2-3 ratio vs a physical OAK defense. CHI is 4-1 ATS vs a team with a losing record right now winning the L4 by a 31-18 margin. Minus the CAR game when everyone was unsure about handling Newton the Bears have held foes to 79 ypg rush (4.1) at home TY with 5 of their L6 foes under 80 ypg. Their pass defense has been very good the L5W avg 277 ypg (56%) with a 5-12 ratio. We'll take the team with the home field advantage with a more aggressive defense and special teams here.

MIAMI 24 Oakland 20 - MIA beat OAK 33-17 as a 2.5 pt AD in LY's matchup. MIA had a 24-11 FD and 471-263 yd edge with 5 of 13 drives going 65 or more yards. MIA outrushed OAK 186 (3.8) to 16 (1.3) and ran 82 plays vs 45 for OAK. MIA has the situational edge at home with extra rest vs an OAK team coming cross-country. They are also playing at an impressive level right now since falling to 0-7. Over the L4W they have the #23 and #4 units (+3 TO's) covering 4 straight although DAL was the only team with a winning record. Moore has been very effective with 225 ypg (67%) and a 7-1 ratio with a solid 8.7 ypa. The defense has played very well holding teams to 85 or less yds rushing in 4 of their L5 games (61 ypg 3.0 in those) and have a 2-6 ratio the L4W also. OAK is 5-0 ATS on the road TY but this will be their 3rd road game in 4 Wks with another vs GB on deck.

Baltimore 24 CLEVELAND 20 - BAL is 6-0 SU/5-1 ATS vs the Browns with a 27-11 avg score. Flacco has avg'd 206 ypg (68%) with a 8-3 ratio vs CLE while Rice has avg'd 88 ypg (5.0) in the L5 matchups. BAL has the situational edge with extra rest and only have IND on deck. BAL is 1-3 ATS vs teams with a losing record despite holding them to just 246 ypg on avg due to a -4 TO edge. They have also played flat after big wins going 0-3 ATS after beating PIT and HOU TY. Flacco hasn't been very inspiring on the road avg 256 ypg (55%) with a 7-4 ratio and disappointing 5.9 ypa despite overt attempts by Cam Cameron to get him jump started. CLE had a rare 17-7 lead at the half but once again failed to make adjustments at the half. They were outgained 241-87 from that point on. McCoy played better than his stats (151 yds 47%, 2-1) indicate due to numerous drops and had the team in place for a long FG that was ruined by a bad snap. Hillis (65 yds 3.4) did just enough to keep the offense balanced and look for the Browns to emphasize the run game here and keep it within the number.

HOUSTON 20 Atlanta 17 - This is the 1st road game for the Falcons in 4 Wks who are 7-3 ATS vs the AFC. HOU is 2-6 ATS vs the NFC and this is HOU's 1st home game in 4 Wks. After a slow start TY the Falcons have the #1 and #2 units (-1 TO's) the L4W vs HOU's #14 and #1 units (+5 TO's). Over the L3 games, Ryan has been solid avg 310 ypg (66%) with a 6-1 ratio. Even more impressive has been the Falcons #2 run defense which has allowed 57 ypg (3.1) the L4W. ATL dominated a one dimensional MIN team LW at home with 15-5 FD and 207-97 yd edges at the half with a 17-0 lead. A bad 3rd Qtr and a muffed punt let MIN back into the game but a goal line stand shut them down. HOU started Leinart LW only to have him KO'd with a left shoulder injury and had to bring in #3 QB TJ Yates (70 yds 53%). HOU only had 2 FD and 47 yds in the 2H as the defense forced JAX to punt on 5 straight drives and forced Gabbert out of the game in the 2H. Tough spot for a 3rd string QB but the Texans D get them the home win.

TAMPA BAY 20 Carolina 14 - The favorite is 6-1 ATS in this series and TB has the situational edge with CAR in its 3rd straight road game. TB won & covered both meetings LY 20-7 as a 3 pt AD and 31-16 as a 7 pt HF. In the 1st meeting CAR was done in by -3 TO's and the 2nd were outgained 421-300 with 65 yds coming on their final drive which was SOD on the TB1. TB is only 6-16 ATS at home (2-4 TY) and have only outgained IND at home. This isn't a very good matchup for the Bucs with their #30 rush defense (140 ypg 4.8) which has pulled in just 17 sks (30th 1 every 21 att's) vs the Newton led offense. CAR has gained 400 or more yds in 4 of its L5 games being held to 279 coming off the bye vs TEN. TB is off a misleading final vs TEN LW as they had 14 pts off 4 TEN TO's and until their final possession had just 1 drive over 35 yds. Teams are just 2-6 ATS since Wk 4 after beating IND TY and CAR gave the Colts their 3rd highest yardage total of the year.

Denver at MINNESOTA - This is DEN's 4th road game in 5 weeks. These are two evenly matched teams statistically with DEN's #25 and #18 units (-5 TO's) vs MIN's #23 and #19 units (+1 TO's). MIN started LW's game with 2 FD's and 33 yds which had them punt on their 1st 4 drives and down 17 pts. The defense came up huge in the 3Q allowing 1 FD and 28 yds. MIN got back into the game afterwards thanks to a muffed punt which set up a 39 yd TD. It's unknown if RB Peterson (ankle sprain) will return but MIN was held to 64 yds rushing (2.7) LW. This allowed ATL to play coverage and Ponder has avg'd 196 ypg (57%) with a 3-4 ratio over the L3W. The Vikings secondary is atrocious right now as in the L6 games they've given up 267 ypg (74%) with a 16-0 ratio despite an All-Pro season from DE Jared Allen (13.5 sks). LW DEN moved to 5-1 SU/ATS with Tebow under C as the OL gave him plenty of time and his 22 rush att's were the most by a QB in the SB era. Tebow won't put up fantasy stats (6 straight gms under 200 yds passing) but he has a 8-1 ratio and his play style wears out defenses. Without knowing the status of Peterson, we'll pass on this one.

SAN FRANCISCO 23 St Louis 7 - This is a very poor spot for STL who are 4-9 ATS vs SF covering both games LY. SF will have extra rest to dwell on the fact they were manhandled by the Ravens LW and are now 2 games behind GB for the #1 seed. SF was held to a season low 170 yds as Smith was rocked by 9 sacks. While SF is only +7 ypg at home TY they have also held teams to just 72 ypg (3.3) rushing and are +13 TO's with a 29-14 avg score. They are 6-0 SU/ATS vs foes with a losing record TY outgaining them by 58 ypg (8th best) (+15 TO's) with a 28-12 avg score. STL is 1-4 ATS on the road with their only cover coming against CLE. They've only been outgained by 9 ypg on the road (-4 TO's) but are allowing a whopping 141 ypg (4.7) rushing with a 23-10 avg score. STL has major issues on the OL (39 sks or 1 every 10.3 att's), a bottom barrel WR situation (only BUF's is worse) & have sent 10 CB's to IR so far TY. SF moves to 14-1-1 ATS at home with Alex Smith.

NEW ENGLAND 30 Indianapolis 10 - Favorites of 20+ are 0-7 ATS/2-5 O/U with 4 of those losses belonging to NE in 2007. Incl playoffs, NE dropped to 2-5 SU/ATS vs IND with a 31-28 victory as a 4 pt HF LY. NE had a 31-14 lead in the 4th Qtr vs a better Colts defense but Manning led the Colts on a pair of 7 play/73 yd drives. IND was at the NE 24 with 37 sec left when Manning was int'd. Since then the Colts are 4-13 ATS with a defense that has given up 23 or more pts in 16 of those games. LW vs CAR they had just 1 yd in the 1st Qtr and were outgained 281-127 prior to the 4Q. Painter has dissolved in his L5 games avg 147 ypg (54%) with a 1-8 ratio while Brady just posted 361 yds (71%) with 3 TD's vs PHI. LW's results will only boost the line especially with the Colts hitting the road for the 1st time in 5 weeks. While it's certainly an overlay the Colts have failed to cover 7 straight. Belichick does have a grudge match vs Shanahan on deck but with NDIV fav's of 17 or more being 5-19-1 ATS since 1992 we'll call for NE to win by 20 here.

Detroit at NEW ORLEANS - When is playing the Saints a letdown? If you're the Lions it's the week after hosting the only undefeated team on Thanksgiving. The Lions have however covered 3 straight post-Thanksgiving games and are 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS away vs non-div foes. The Saints are 4-0 as a HF TY but are off a Monday Nighter vs the NYG and they get so pumped up for a primetime MN crowd they've gone 0-4 ATS the week after the L2Y. **NFL Marquee's are an outstanding 15-7-1 68%. GRAB THIS WINNER AFTER 11am SUNDAY FOR JUST \$9 ON THE PPH!!!**

San Diego at JACKSONVILLE - The Jaguars showed what their capable of earlier this year on Monday Night football holding BAL to 146 total yards. San Diego continues to be an anomaly with an offense and defense ranked in the top 15 yet they are 2-9 ATS. **Call after 3:00 pm ET for your Monday Night Magic Winner on your NC Debit Card. You'll get the MNM Play and pay \$30 but if the play fails to cover, you'll automatically receive \$40 back on your NC Debit Card. Over 29 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 202-148 incl 9-4 69% with SIX OUTRIGHT WINS TY!! Over the last 12 years the Underdog Play has added 41 OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS to the incredible record!

Michigan St (+9) over WISCONSIN

Big Ten Championship Game - Lucas Oil Stadium, Indianapolis. A rematch of the B10's most exciting 2011 gm as both tms rallied from a 14 pt deficit before Sparty won it on a 44 yd Hail Mary TD which barely found the EZ on the last play of regulation. Although we got another outright upset (+7) on these pages cashing with MSU as our Underdog POW the Badgers finished with 23-18 FD and 443-399 yd edges. Despite clinching the Legends Div with 1 gm left, MSU kept their foot on the gas with a 31-17 win over NW. Two key 2Q plays gave the Spartans the lead as NW fmb'd at the MSU3 which Sparty converted into a 97 yd TD drive and MSU then added a 57 yd PR TD to take a 17-3 HT lead. MSU has their all-time TD pass leader in Cousins (228, 64%, 21-6 TY) and rec in Cunningham (125, 16.8). Surprisingly the run gm is last in the B10 (139, 3.9) behind a reshuffled OL (only 15 sks all'd). Spartans rank #1 B10 in tll D (267), rush D (103, 2.9) and sks (38). Keep in mind that 6'7" All-B10 DE Gholston (59 tkl, 11 fll) DNP in the 1st gm due to a susp. After being burned by late long TD passes in B2B wks in losses to MSU and OSU Wisky regrouped in a dominating 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS Nov in which they outscored their foes 177-54 and outgained them by 274 ypg to take the Leaders title. After PSU's early long TD strike UW scored the gm's L/45 pts as the Badgers had 27-12 FD and 450-233 yd edges. FBS pass eff leader QB Wilson (224, 73%, 28-3) got the early Heisman love but FBS scoring leader RB Ball (#1 B10 w/1622, 6.5, 34 TD) could earn a trip to NY as he's 5 away from tying Heisman winner Barry Sanders' FBS TD record (39). Badgers D is #4 FBS in scoring (15 ppg). UW has the off edge (#8-39) while the Spartans have the stronger D (#10-23). MSU also has the ST edge (#61-95) with a 2Q blk'd P TD key in the Oct 22nd meeting. There have been 8 str OVERS in the series (68 ppg). MSU was shut out of a BCS bowl despite finishing with 11 wins incl one over the Badgers LY and look for this one to go down to the wire. **FORECAST: Michigan St 28 Wisconsin 27**

This was the marquee gm everyone was talking about. Things didn't look good early. UW went 80/11pl and on 3&4 Wilson hit Pedersen for a 9 yd TD pass, 7-0 (8:48). MSU fmb'd on its first play from the 25 (8:33) and UW went 30/3pl for a TD, 14-0 (7:42). MSU got 2 FD's and punted 33 yds on 4&12 (3:39) and UW got 2 FD's to midfield and was int'd at the 19 and ret'd to the 25 on 2&11 (2:6). MSU got a 32 yd run by Bell but punted on 4&6, 34 yds to the 5 (14:04). On 2&13 Wilson was called for intentional grounding in the EZ for a safety, 14-2 (13:10). MSU after the free kick went 72/4pl and a double end around went to WR Martin for a 34 yd TD run, 14-9 (11:22). UW went 57/9pl but had a 30 yd FG blk'd (5:55). MSU went 80/8pl and got a 35 yd TD pass, 16-14 (1:20). UW went 3 & out (4:5) and MSU blk'd the punt and rec'd in the EZ for a TD with :37 left scoring the 1H's final 23 pts and leading 23-14. At half MSU had a 213-201 yd edge. MSU punted to open the 3Q and UW went 58/8pl for a 33 yd FG, 23-17 (8:29). After trading punts, MSU went 80/13pl and on 3&11 Cousins hit Martin who made a great move and took it 15 yds for a TD and a 31-17 lead (10:58). Each went 3&out and Abbrederis got a 33 yd PR to the MSU43. UW went 43/3pl and Wilson got a 22 yd TD run, 31-24 (8:10). Later, MSU had Wilson almost sk'd when threw across his body and was int'd at the MSU39 (6:54) but MSU went 3 & out punting with just 4:28 left. UW went 87/8pl and got a 2 yd TD pass with :126 left, 31-31. MSU got a FD but then QB Cousins fmb'd and lost 10 yds so UW HC Bielema called time-out with :42 left as they had good success on PR's and came close to blocking some punts. MSU gained 12 yds and UW used its 2nd time-out forcing a 3&8. Cousins threw an 11 yd FD pass then got a 9 yd gain. They took a time-out with :10 left and Cousins's 1st shot at the EZ was inc. UW took its final time-out with :04 left and on 3&1 Cousins threw a Hail Mary that bounced out to Nichol at the 1 who fough his way into the EZ for the win. It was orig ruled down at the 1 but replay confirmed it was indeed a TD and MSU got the upset.

Clemson (+7) 23 VIRGINIA TECH 3 - Oct 1st. Light rain, 15 mph winds, unusually chilly (43'). VT had a tremendous situational edge off of 4 easy games while CU was off 2 big gms. After a CU punt, VT's pass on 3&4 went off the hands of Boykin and was int'd (10:01) but CU punted. VT got 2 FD's but then Wilson got a 7 yd run and the ball popped in the air and CU rec'd at the VT49 but a hold pushed it back to the 41 (5:47). CU got 3 FD's to the VT15 but settled for a 31 yd FG on a 45/11pl drive (2:12). Three punts. CU was int'd at the 45 and ret'd 14 yds and VT was in business (7:48). VT got a FD to the 5 but after a false start and a poor pass on 3&7 settled for a 24 yd FG, 3-3 with 4:35 left. CU got a 34 KR and a PF to the VT48. On 3&10 they got an 11 yd pass to the 37. They continued on a 63/9pl drive for a TD with :149 left in the half, 10-3. At the half CU only had a 160-137 yd edge. VT punted to open the 3Q. CU got a 27 yd pass on the first play then Boyd faked the WR screen and hit a 32 yd TD pass down the middle of the field, 17-3 (10:42). Six punts. VT, from the CU47, got 2 FD's to the 18 but on 4&4 the pass was low and wide (9:48). CU went 88/9pl and got a 31 yd TD run by Bellamy, 23-3 (6:12).
