### **NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK TEN 2011**

NEWS AND NOTES - Pitt dominated their Wed night game vs Conn even more than the final score as in the 1H they had a 321-80 yd edge but had a FD at the UC22 with 13 left and no time-outs and took a sack and got zero points and only led 21-3. Pitt led 35-13 when UC took over with 3:22 left and went 71/8pl for a garbage TD with :43 left. The victory was costly for Pitt as they lost star RB Graham (knee) as well as starting OT Matt Rotheram (brk ankle) and starting WR Cameron Saddler (fractured sternum) all for the season...Michigan RB Fitzgerald Toussaint ran for a career high 170 yards. UM had 339 yds rushing and a 535-311 yd edge. Things looked good for PU early as they got a 48 yd TD pass to lead 7-0 and UM scored a TD then was int'd on their next 2 drives but PU was sk'd for a safety then gave up a 37 yd FG, was int'd and UM drove 83/5pl for a TD and UM added a 22 yd FG on the final play of the half to lead 22-7 and PU's first four 2H poss were 3 punts and an SOD at the UM1 when trailing 36-7...Louisville had a 339-182 yd edge and led 27-3 when Syracuse took over with 2:53 left and went 63/6pl and on 4&7 got a 20 yd TD pass with 1:31 left to "only" lose 27-10...Virginia Tech in the 1H vs Duke had a 301-162 yd edge, was int'd at the Duke2 and from the Duke30 was int'd in the EZ and also missed a 29 yd FG. In the 2H VT clinging to a 14-10 lead, punted with 1:50 left and Duke was int'd on 4&1 at their own 38 with :55 left... Washington St actually had a 30-20 FD edge vs Oregon despite the fact that RB LaMichael James and QB Thomas ret'd and started. Brian Bennett replaced Thomas in the 2H. In the 2H WSU had a 260-215 yd edge but they were int'd at the 2 with 8:17 left in the 1Q, int'd at the 2 with 8:35 left and missed a 25 yd FG and trailed 15-10 at the half. The Ducks finally got some breathing room with a Thomas 93 yd KR TD and WSU trailed 43-20 when they went 85/13pl getting a by dt TD run and 2 pt conversion with 1:50 left in the game...Oklahoma lost leading rusher Whaley to injury on the first play of the game and it was really a story of 2H's. In the 1H Kansas St led 17-14 mid2Q but a key play of the game happened with :19 left in the half. KSU was down by 3 and had the ball but fmbl'd and OU would get a 53 yd FG that just cleared the upright on the final play of the half which gave them momentum into the locker room and a 23-17 lead. The Sooners scored TD's on their first 5 poss of the 2H while KSU punted on all 5 and the game turned into a blowout with OU finishing with a 690-240 yd edge...Notre Dame was coming off a disappointing loss the previous week to USC and held Navy to a season low 229 yds. Navy was starting backup QB Miller (5-13-33) who rushed for 55 yards on 19 carries. ND had 2 RB's score multiple TD's for the first time since 2001 and the starters sat the 4Q. ND led 35-7 at the half with a 258-100 yd edge. Navy was SOD at the ND14 on their opening 3Q drive and the Irish went 86/9pl for a TD to go up 42-7. Navy was SOD at their own 43 and the Irish 5pl later got another TD for a 49-7 lead en route to their 56-14 win...As has been the case in all 3 Texas A&M losses this year they blew a double digit halftime lead as they led 28-17 at the half but only managed a FG in the 2H. A&M led 28-14 when Missouri got a 26 yd FG on the final play of the half to give them some momentum. Still the game shifted when A&M up 28-17 with 11:20 left was int'd at the 25 and ret'd 45 yds. MO drove 30/3pl to get a TD to get back in the game and then went 79/6pl for the lead, 31-28. A&M tied it on a FG with 4:10 left after having a FD at the 15. A&M was sk'd on FD at the MO42 with :25 left and fmbl'd and MO missed a 46 yd FG but got a TD on 3&8 in OT on an 11 yd pass and A&M was SOD on 4&5... Arkansas is the anti-Texas A&M as for the 3rd time this season, they and Adw Was 30D off 45... Arkansa's the fact and recked a Adw as to the 3rd time this season, they trailed by DD but rallied for a win. Casey Hayward broke up 6 passes and Vandy actually finished with a 462-388 yd edge. Ark rallied to tie it on a 94 yd FR TD with 13:25 left in the game and took the lead on a 42 yd FG with 6:53 left but had the ball on their own 39 with 4:37 left and went conservative. On 38.8 that was partially blk'd, they ran for a 1 yd loss and punted and VU went 80/8pl but missed a tying 27 yd FG at the end...Northwestern scored on 9 of their first 10 poss and piled up a 616-488 yd edge in a high scoring shootout vs Indiana. IU has now allowed 40+ points in 4 straight games. NU had a 59-31 lead when IU got a TD with 9:08 left and NU then ate up the final 9:08 going 54/17pl taking a knee at the IU8 to end it...Minnesota students stormed the field after their upset of lowa. It was a game where IU blew numerous chances to put the game away and left the scrappy Gophers in the game. UM had been outscored 48-0 in the 1Q of their first 7 games but it was scoreless. IU took their first 5 drives of the game into UM territory but were SOD at the UM31, punted 19 yds, missed a chip shot 21 yd FG

on 4&2 and missed a 43 yd FG that clanged off the upright and it was just 7-7 at the half despite a 260-165 yd edge. UI leading 14-7 was at the UM14 when they were šk'd and fmbl'd and it was ret'd 43 yd getting the Gophers back in the game. It was still UI 21-10 when they gave up a TD with 8:22 left and UM then rec'd a surprise onside kick and would get a TD on 4&gl from the 3 with 2:48 left and went for the gutsy 2 pt conv (failed) but they still led by 1. IU was SOD on 4&10 at its own 31...Tulsa pounded SMU with a 451-265 yd edge.

The game was played with 28 mph swirling winds but TU settled for a 22 yd FG on their 2nd poss then after an int, drove 20/5pl for a TD and after a 27 yd punt into the wind and K/C interf, drove 25/6/pl for a TD to lead 17-0. It was 24-0 at the half and they had a 230-76 yd edge and increased the lead to 38-7 when SMU gained 72 and 56 yds on their final 2 drives which ended on SOD at the 3 and int in the EZ from the 4...Florida lost their 4th in a row for the first time since 1988. Georgia had a 354-226 yd edge but ST hurt them as UF had a 99 yd KR TD and a 63 yd KR set up a 40 yd FG. UGA got a TD with 13:18 left to lead 24-20 and at the end of the game, UGA had a 4th & 2 at the UF10 and broke a tackle and was brought down at the 1 on what would be the last play of the game...One week after N Carolina committed 6 TO's vs Clemson, they forced 5 from Wake Forest. It wasn't just the TO's that had NC winning 49-24 as they had a 562-331 yd edge. NC drove 34 and 77 yds on their first 2 poss, both after WF TO's for a 14-0 lead but only led 14-10 at the half with a 215-134 yd edge. NC missed a 47 yd FG and only led 21-17 when they went 80/9, 34/5pl (after int), 41/3pl (after int) and 75/6pl (WF SOD) for TD's on 4 consecutive poss to go up 49-17...Joe Paterno broke Eddie Robinson's record for victories by a Div I coach with 409 but this was a low scoring defensive battle with 18 punts in a game played in snow. Illinois had 94 yds passing and the Lions just 98. PSU was SOD on 4&1 at the UI35 and UI went 64/11pl for a TD and a 7-0 lead with 3:32 left 3Q, which appeared commanding. PSU settled for a 30 yd FG with 7:00 left and got it back at their 20 with 3:05 left and went 80/10pl for a TD with 1:08 left. UI did drive but a 42 yd FG bounced off the upright on the final play...Army gave Max Jenkins his first career start in what would be his last game at Michie Stadium as a senior. The game was played in snow. Fordham was shutout for the first time in six years and allowed 50 points for the first time in over a decade. Army led 42-0 at the half and very few fans remained at the end in the freezing stands. over a decade. Army led 42-0 at the hail and very lew lans remained at the end in the reezing stands. Rich Ellerson who played in the CFL said he'd never played in a game with such high winds and that they were playing a team that wanted to throw the ball and it was difficult to throw. Army finished with 544-86 yd and 27-6 FD edges...If you were watching the scoreboard, Oklahoma St absolutely dominated Baylor in their 59-24 win as it was 35-0 at half and 49-3 after 3Q's. BU actually finished with a 36-23 FD edge and it was not all garbage yards. In fact BU's first drive went 69/16pl but on 4&1 they were SOD at the gl line. BU fmbl'd the KO setting up a 13 yd OSU TD. BU went 49/7pl but missed a 48 yd FG. BU went 63/13pl but on 3&gl from the 5 was int'd in the EZ. BU went 46/11pl but on 4&1 was SOD at the OSU32. BU went 57/8pl but on FD from the OSU26 was int'd at the 11 and ret'd 34 yds. BU fmbl'd in the 3Q to set up an OSU 7 yd TD drive, went on a 10pl TD drive for a 36 yd FG, a 66/9pl drive but fmbl'd at the OSU1 before finally getting a TD on the first play of the 4Q when trailing 49-3...Rutgers was led out on the field by former player Eric LeGrand and the game was played in poor conditions with rain and blowing snow. Footing was fortuous and no more than 5,000 were in the stands cutting down on RU's home edge. The Knights appeared poised for the upset as they led 31-21 at the half and were up 31-28 when with 11:02 left when they faked a 28 yd FG and had an open man in the EZ but the pass was floated and hung up for a little but was dropped. West Virginia got a TD with 6:18 left then RU fumbled at their own 37 and WV got the frontdoor cover on a 37/3pl drive for a TD with 4:50 left. RU's last 2 drives were SOD at the WV33 and int'd WV22...Hawaii did have a 353-234 yd edge vs Idaho but it was a tough loss for the Vandals. In the 1H they were SOD on 4&1 at the UH42 which set up a UH FG and they trailed 13-7. UI got a 70 yd FRTD with 4:22 left in the 3Q to lead 14-13. Idaho had 2 chances to put it away. They went for it again on 4&1, this time at the UH16 with 14:11 left and was SOD. UI was driving again and with 3:04 left, up by 1, UI had 3&6 at the UH9 but was in'd at the 5. UH drove and got a 35 yd FG with :30 left for the lead. UI got 1 FD and then gained 6 yds on 2 passes and their 53 yd FG on the game's final play was no good...Texas had a 5 game home losing streak in Big 12 play end in a thoroughly dominating 43-0 romp over Kansas. UT had a 35-3 FD and 590-46 yd edge. At the half they had a 316-10 yd edge and punted just once while KU punted 7 times...Mississippi and Auburn were tied 17-17 at half and UM had a 215-191 edge but Clint Moseley would have his first 4 career TD passes and AUB got WR Blake back and he had 71 yards rec. AUB dominated the 3Q with a 141-22 yd edge and pulled away in their 41-23 win with UM even getting a 10 yd TD pass on the game's final play. Clemson came in unbeaten and Georgia Tech off 2 losses and a key injury note was that RB Andre Ellington for CU DNP. CU took their opening drive 67/12pl but settled for a 34 yd FG. CU fmbl'd on their own 19 and GT would go 71/8pl, 80/11pl and 78/9pl on their next 3 poss all for TD's to lead 24-3 at the half with CU missing a 40 yd FG. CU got a TD with 14:47 left to get within 14 then got a 26 yd IR to the GT9 but threw an int in the EZ and GT went on a back breaking 58/16pl drive before being SOD with 1:29 left while CU's final play was an int at midfield with 1:06 left..Kentucky lost starting QB Morgan Newton on the 3rd series of the game trailing 7-3 at the time. MSU had a 21-6 lead at the half and was int'd at the 2 with the Bulldogs having a 271-127 yd edge. Frosh QB Maxwell Smith for UK caught his stride in the 2H. He led UK 51/12pl for a 35 yd FG on the first drive then 70/11pl for a TD to pull them within 28-16 with 13:50 left. On their 3rd and last drive of the 4Q, UK went 68/16pl but on 4&7 was SOD at the 8 with 4:46 left and the Bulldogs got 3 FD's running out the clock. cont. on page 2

cont. from Front Page ... FRONTDOOR COVERS - East Carolina did have a 461-266 yd edge vs Tulane but TU actually led 10-7 at one point after an 11 yd punt set them up for a 47/2pl TD drive. It was 17-13 at the half and 27-13 when TU was SOD on 4&9 at the EC44. EC went 56/5pl getting a TD with 2:11 left to go up 34-14...Arizona St did score 3 TD's in the 1Q and led 21-0 vs a banged up CU team. Tyler Hansen did not start but came off the bench in CU's 3rd series and threw for 285 yards. ASU only had a 522-420 yd edge. They led 31-7 at the half and it was 34-7 when CU was SOD on 4&gl at the ASU1. CÚ then fmbl'd the punt at their own 13 and ASU got a TD to go up 41-7 but CU answered with a TD with 12:45 left, 41-14. CU was SOD on 4&2 at the ASU49 with 8:23 left and ASU went 51/5pl for an 8 yd TD run with 6:20 left to get ahead of the spread. Hirschman came in for QB Colorado and they went 70/7pl. On 2&11 from the aSU15 Ford got a 12 yd run to the 2 but fmbl'd and ASU hung on for the cover.

SHUTOUTS - Air Force lost QB Tim Jefferson in the 1Q but Connor Dietz filled in well even though he threw 1 pass, he rushed 6 times for 87 yds. AF, despite being in a flat spot, did lead 35-0 at the half with a 240-115 yd edge. New Mexico fumbled the punt on their own 24 and was int'd with 3:06 left in the half setting up an AETD with 1:55 left. NM was int'd at the AE14 and missed 40 and 30 vd EG's on their 3 poss in the 2H resulting in a 42-0 shutout...Florida St had a 444-166 yd edge including 249-106 in the 1H where they led 24-0. NCSt's best scoring chances ended on a missed 51 yd FG and a fumble at the FSU30. FSU only led 24-0 when they got a 39 yd FG with 8:56 left and added a 26 yd TD pass with 4:28 left.

SITUATIONAL EDGES - NU had a huge situational edge vs Michigan St catching the Spartans off 2 big home wins vs Michigan and Wisconsin and they had little left in the tank while Nebraska was off a bye and an easy romp over Minnesota. In

the 1H NU led 10-3 but only had a 101-83 yd edge with a 25 yd TD drive after an int. The Huskers went 80/13pl and 89/11pl on their first 2 drives of the 3Q to take command, 24-3 and at the Legends division, as they now hold the tie-breaker over MSU. NU only finished with a 270-187 yd edge...Kent St was fresh off a bye while Bowling Green was playing their 9th straight grueling game and came off a big upset of Temple. BG did have a 4-2 TO deficit. The final score came with KSU leading 20-15 when BG with :15 left was sk'd and KSU ret'd it for a TD in the 27-15 win...UCF was off an upset loss as a big HF and Memphis was off an upset win as a DD road dog. The situation said UCF would be angry and smack someone and that they did. They had 28-6 FD and 501-134 yd edges in their 41-0 win...Texas Tech was off their big upset win over Oklahoma, moving up to #19 in the polls and were thoroughly waxed by Iowa St as they were outgained 512-290 and ISU's 368 yds rushing was their most since 2002. It was the 2nd straight year ISU beat a ranked team on the road and there was nothing fluky about it. The Cyclones had 67 and 80 yd TD drives and after a 41 yd IR, got a 1 yd TD drive to go up 21-0 and it was 24-7 at the half. They got a 71 yd TD run in the 3Q then leading 31-7 took over with 4:48 left in the 3Q and went on a back breaking 82/17pl drive for a TD with 11:08 left to make it 38-7. TT had just 191 yds passing...Ohio St had a large situational edge vs Wisconsin, catching them on their 2nd straight national TV road game while OSU was fresh off a bye, playing with revenge and in a rare role of home underdog. At the half UW led 7-3 but their powerful run game was held to 10 yds rushing and for the game OSU had a 268-89 yd edge. OSU led 26-14 after getting a TD with 4:39 left but the Badgers got 2 TD's to take the lead with 1:18 left, 29-26. After a 41 yd KR, OSU got a 40 yd TD pass with :20 left and UW had an untimed down at the OSU43 after a face mask pen and

4★ ALABAMA over Lsu - First #1 vs #2 matchup in the reg ssn S/06 and the first matchup of the top 2 tms in Bryant-Denny Stadium history. #1 is 8-12 ATS the L/20 vs #2 but has won and covered 3 of L/4. This is Saban Bowl 5 and Bama and LSU have split the L/4 meetings since Saban took over at Bama. Both teams are off a bye and LY both tms were also off byes and LSU held AL to a ssn low 102 rush yds while LSU (+6') rushed for 225 yds and pulled out a 24-21 win. LSU has outgained the Tide in 4 of the last 5 and Miles is 4-2 SU vs AL (only LSU HC to ever beat AL 4x). The Tigers are led by QB Lee who is avg 156 ypg (63%) w/a 13-1 ratio (#12 NCAA pass eff) while Jefferson has played in the L/4 and is getting more reps each week. RB Ware leads with 512 (4.0) and after being susp vs Aub will be back here along with defensive star Mathieu. Bama's young QB McCarron is becoming more than just a game-manager and is avg 208 ypg (67%) with a 10-3 ratio while RB Richardson 989 (6.6, #7 NCAA) and 17 TD's could lock up a trip to NY for the Heisman with a big gm here. While LSU's D gets alot of pub they are giving up 251 ypg (14.4 FD's) while Bama's D only allows 181 ypg (9.9 FD's). Bama is also +280 ypg while LSU is +120 ypg. Saban has done well with revenge going 5-0 ATS covering by 14 ppg. While it is well noted that LSU is 30-1 SU S/'01 in AG's w/a start of 6:00 pm or later, Bama is 25-1 SU at home S/'07, has the better D, the better HC and the best player on the field in Richardson. 3★ PITTSBURGH over Cincinnati - Pitt has owned this series of late going 8-2 SU (7-1 ATS) but surprisingly enter this meeting fighting for their bowl lives while Cincy is fresh off a bye and on top of the BE standings. The Panthers have a few extra days of rest here as well playing the previous Wed night at home vs Conn, but despite the victory the tm lost 3 starters to ssn ending inj's incl arguably the BE's top offensive player in RB Graham (958, 5.8). LY Pitt (+1') was our Top Weekly LPS and they delivered an easy 28-10 win on the wintery road with a 430-265 yd edge. UC is just 1-5 (0-3 ATS) in trips to Pittsburgh but won the last ('09) as the #5 Bearcats (-2) trailed #14 Pitt by 21 late 2Q and by 14 in the 4Q but got a miracle win taking the BE Title away from the Panthers. The BE standings have been very hard to decipher TY and while Cincy comes in on top, Pitt has ply'd well at home TY vs conf opp (2-0 ATS, 21 pt avg victory) and QB Sunseri had a break out game in Graham's absence with a career-high 419 pass yds (459 ttl). Cincy comes in with the far better record and while Pitt is only 4-4, by comparing the talent level on the field the Panthers should be the favorite.

FORECAST: PITTSBURGH 34 Cincinnati 27 3★ ARIZONA over Utah - Despite a 388 yd performance from QB Foles, he tossed 3 costly int's as the Cats were outscored 14-3 in the 4Q to Wash losing 42-31 LW. Utah on the other hand finally broke into the win column in the P12 as RB White ran for a career-high 205 yds (avg just 54 ypg in conf play) while the Ute defense forced 4 Beaver TO's (D recorded 6 sks). The Utes are 1-7 in Tucson S/'69 but won their L/trip in '04, 23-6 (-13') however the score was very misleading as UA fmbl'd the opening KO, fmbl'd at the UT2, were int'd setting up an 11 yd Utah TD drive, fmbl'd at the UT8 and missed a 35 yd FG. ISÚ needs this W to keep bowl dreams alive with OKSt, OU and KSU to round out the ssn while KU has just run the gauntlet playing 5 of the B12's top 6 tms so this is a step down and they may be playing for Gill's job. 2\* TEXAS over Texas Tech - Texas is coming off a bye and a near-bye (Kansas) while Jekyll and Hyde TT is playing an 8th str week. Blue Raiders are 3-29 (11-8 ATS) vs the SEC (w/the avg score 38-10, all 3 wins vs Vanderbilt) and are 5-35 SU (19-14 ATS) on the road vs BCS conf tms. Usc at COLORADO - In the last gm in '02 USC was +3 and they hammered #18 CU (in Boulder) with 22-4 FD and 425-61 yd edges (cover by 40 pts!) and that gm started to propel the USC juggernaut under Carroll. This is a letdown spot for the Trojans however as they are coming in off trips to Cal, ND and their home meeting with the Cardinal. USC is just 4-11 ATS as an AF and now battles the altitude and a short week vs a ČU tm that has nothing left to lose and should see the return of their leading RB Stewart and leading WR Richardson.

Saturday, Nov 5th • WEST VIRGINIA 34 Louisville 24 - Six of the L/8 in this series have been decided by 8 pts or less while the HT has dropped 4 straight ATS. Despite just 26 pts in '09 and 27 LY, these tms have combined to avg 60 ppg over the L/7 meetings. WV is 10-2 SU vs UL incl 4 straight wins and is playing their only home game over a 4 week stretch. Trailing by 10 heading into a snowy 2H vs Rutgers, WV outscored the Knights 20-0 for the victory as they went to the run gm with 210 yds (5.7). UL has now won B2B conf gms for the 1st time S/07 as the Cardinals def all'd just 10 ppg to a Syracuse tm that was avg 30 ppg on the ssn (3★ Totals winner on Under). LY the Cardinals (+3') led 10-7 briefly thanks to a sk/fmbl/TD w/10:26 left 2Q but from that point on were shutout gaining just 66 yds w/4 FD's (deepest drive to WV46). The Mountaineers were 17 and 17' pt favorites the last 2 times hosting UL dropping both ATS as they only won by 7 and 8 and despite WV having a huge off edge (#15-108), the Cardinals balance it out with a #22-65 def edge and are all'g just 16 ppg TY.

EASTERN MICHIGAN 31 Ball St 28 - Ball St is in the midst of a 3 gm road stretch and playing their 10th consec gm while EM is coming off a bye and shockingly is ahead of BSU in the MAC West race. EM has covered 3 straight in the series incl the outright upset LY. That win also snapped an EM 18 gm overall losing streak (English's 1st W as HC). EM (+10') trailed 21-0 but won 41-38 in OT. LTH BSU (-2') trailed 27-13 in the 2H but scored the final 16 pts holding EM to just 22 4Q yds. BSU is 8-3 SU 7-4 ATS) S/'90 in Ypsilanti. Ball St beat CM 31-27 as a 2' pt HF but lost LW to WM 45-35 as an 11' pt AD being outgained by an avg of 84 ypg. EM beat CM 35-28 as a 12 pt AD and beat WM 14-10 as a 12 pt HD being outgained by an avg of 11 ypg. Ball St does have the edges on both off (#93-113) and ST (#48-101). However EM is avg 226 ypg rushing (4.9) while BSU is allowing 199 ypg (4.9). Against WM the Eagles actually had something they have not had in years, a noisy supportive home crowd and they should have that again here.

Mississippi 27 KENTUCKY 20 - HT is 6-1 SU (5-2 ATS) and the fav is 6-2 ATS. LY UK (+3) led 14-7 early 2Q but all'd 35 of the next 41 pts. UK tacked on two late TD drives but three 1H TO's cost them 21 pts (11, 9 and 7 yd TD drives) and UM won 42-35. Ole Miss lost their L/visit to Lexington in '06 (+3') 31-14. The Rebels did have the yardage edge (395-380) but were -4 in TO's. Both tms and HC's are in need of a conf win to quiet the restless fan bases as Ole Miss has now lost 11 str conf gms (most in school history) after LW's 41-23 loss (+13) to Auburn. The gm was tied at 17 at HT and they have moved the ball much better w/Mackey under C (331 ypg vs 237 ypg) and he is avg 176 ypg (53%) with a 4-3 ratio in his 4 sts. Despite a "Blackout" home crowd UK lost to Miss St LW 28-16 (+10) as QB Newton was inj'd in the 1H and DNR (CS). His replacement Smith had 174 yds (79%!) and moved the team well despite the loss. While the D's are even, Ole Miss has the edge on off (#81-105) and ST's

(#6-55), has played well the L/2 wks despite the losses and break their conf win drought.

GEORGIA 45 New Mexico St 17 - NMSU is 0-3 SU (1-2 ATS) vs UGA losing by an avg of 32 ppg The Bulldogs (-27) won the last meeting (in '02) 41-10 but had just 17-16 FD and 299-275 yd edges. The Aggies are 1-5 SU/ATS on the road vs BCS tms S/'04 including 1-2 SU and 1-2 ATS under HC Walker but the lone win and cover came TY vs Minny where NMSU was +20' and pulled the outright upset 28-21 (ended an 18 gm losing streak to BCS tms). The Aggies fell 48-34 (+15) to Nevada LW as QB Christian threw for a career-high 432 yds and 3 TD's. UGA has huge edges on off (#21-85) and def (#8-111) and comes in riding high after its 6th consec win as the Bulldogs ended a 3 gm losing streak to Florida (only UGA's 4th win in 22 tries vs UF) with a 24-20 (-2') win that may have saved HC Richt's job. QB Murray was just 15-34-169 but it was enough as they outFD'd (23-11) and outgained (354-226) the Gators while holding them to -19 rush yds. UGA is only 3-9 ATS after facing UF the week prior and is only 1-4 ATS vs non-BCS conf tms during the 2H of the reg ssn. This is the 3rd consec ssn they have a non-conf gm vs a non-BCS tm sandwiched between UF and AU, but the L/2 yrs after facing UF, UGA has outscored its next opp 93-7.

Usf 24 RUTGERS 23 - The dog is a perfect 6-0 ATS in this series with 4 outright upsets while RU has covered 4 in a row and is 4-1 SU. RU is playing a 7th straight week. The Bulls are off of their 2nd bye in 3 wks and have shockingly dropped 3 in a row SU, all gms in which they were favored. RU (+6') blew a 10 pt HT lead vs WV LW giving them their 17th consec loss to the Mountaineers. LY's gm featured 6 lead changes. Up 27-22, RU (+10) fmbl'd into their EZ which the Bulls recovered for the GW TD. LTH USF (-2') was shutout for the 1st time ever in program hist (just 7 FD's and 159 yds) and they will be dealing with a potential chilly climate not to mention being without WR Griffin (493, 12.3, ankle) who has nearly doubled the productivity of the #2 WR.

Virginia 27 MARYLAND 23 - HT in series is 7-3 ATS but an amazing 1-7 SU. LY MD (-2') snapped a 3 gm series losing streak. The Terrapins trailed 23-21 into the 4Q but exploded for 21 pts (103-31 yd edge w/2 int's). For the 1st time all year VA HC London ditched the 2 QB system as the Cavs used misdirection, power running (207 yd, 4.9), and trick plays to pull out a Thurs night 28-21 win over Miami. VA jumped out power running (207 yu, 4-3), and the plays to pull out a Thus high 2072 him over meaning 1, pully 2072 and to a 17-0 lead scoring on big plays and with a little luck (drop Hail Mary pass) held on snapping a 7 gm ACC road losing streak. In the snow and on a muddy field MD lost to BC 28-17 (scored 14 pts vs #2's). MD all'd a ssn high 372 rush (6.0) to a BC tm that avg'd 101 (3.4). MD played both QB's LW (neither was effective) and their banged up defense now faces VA's physical run gm avg 186 ypg (4.6). LTH UVA (-3') trailed 9-3 late 3Q but got a key 32 yd IR TD and scored a 2/1pl TD after MD was 50D on 4&17 at its own 2. Edsall faced VA in '07 and '08 and is 1-1 vs VA (2-0 ATS). The Cavs are 14-5 SU (10-9 ATS) S//92 vs ATS) ATS is 1000 with a in Callest Both MD in 12.6 in home finales and Edsall was 7.3.1 at Complete Torre fore MD incl B2B wins in College Park. MD is 13-6 in home finales and Edsall was 7-2-1 at Conn but Terp fans didn't weather the storm (estimated 10,000 in stands in 2H) LW and we doubt they will here.

CONNECTICUT 24 Syracuse 14 - UC HC Paul Pasqualoni devoted 14 yrs to Syracuse and was not too happy about being fired after tying for the Big East Title with a very young team. He has to have had this game circled since he was hired. Conn was ripped apart in the passing gm vs Pitt 10 days ago all'g 433 yds in the 35-20 defeat (+10). The Huskies do continue to get solid play out of their true Fr RB McCombs who has now run for 100+ yds in 5 of 8 gms TY. A wk after delivering a surprise upset over WV, the Cuse struggled to post any type of offense putting up just 10 pts vs Louisville (20 ppg under their ssn avg). The Huskies are 5-1 SU/ATS in the series with the favorite covering 6 of 7. UC has won 4 straight with each by at least 17 pts while the Orange are 0-3 SU/ATS in their trips to Storrs, losing by 19, 23 and 25 pts. In their last visit SU allowed 56 pts which was their most S/01. Large sked edge for the Huskies here as they are off a Wed night gm (bye the week prior) and are looking at another week off while the Orange are on their 2nd straight AG with a Friday gm on deck. UC is 12-3 SU the L4Y hosting BE opp's incl a 16-10 upset of USF TY (+7') and should reward their HC with a much desired victory here.

MIAMI, FL 31 Duke 17 - HC and 3rd str HG for Canes. Miami is 7-1 SU but 3-5 ATS vs Duke (UM avg

win by 18 ppg). UM is just 10-23 ATS as a conf HF and just 12-24 ATS as a DD conf fav while Duke is 25-13 as a DD AD. In each of the L5Y UM has trailed but battled back for the win. LY UM (-18) forced 7 TO's incl an int at the UM4, 22 yd IR TD and fmbl that led to a short TD drive. LTH Duke (+18') had a 16-13 lead into the 4Q but on their L/3 poss missed a 31 yd FG, gave up a 73 yd IR TD and was SOD. UM (-13') was stunned losing to VA 28-21 last Thurs Nt. Mia gave up big plays while getting 0 pts on 3 trips inside the VA25. QB Harris (trailed 17-0) rallied but his Hail Mary into EZ went off the WR's shoulder which would have tied the game (Harris left after the play with an inj'd shoulder, CS). UM has struggled vs the run but Duke is avg just 100 ypg (3.6). Big mismatch with UM's #1 OL (319 lbs) in ACC vs #12 DL in ACC (1 Sr) and RB Miller has 869 (5.7). UM has all the edges here (off #32-66, def #52-78) and after taking VA lightly will be focused here despite having FSU on deck.

MICHIGAN ST 38 Minnesota 3 - MSU is 4-6 SU and just 2-8 ATS (0-5 L/5) in series and led 24-0 into the

MSU is coming off of 1 of the biggest months in program history with wins over OSU, Mich, Wisky before running out of gas in a 24-3 loss at Neb and they also have a road trip to lowa (who handed them their only 2010 reg ssn loss 37-6) on deck so this is an obvious flat spot. MSU was smothered by the Huskers being outFD'd 18-12 and outgained 270-187 as we won a Top College Totals play on the Under. After the Wisky heroics MSU QB Cousins (212, 64%, 11-5) struggled vs NU behind a leaky OL (4 sks) which hasn't gotten a push up front with the B10's worst ground gm (133, 3.7). Sparty remains #2 FBS in ttl D allowing 229 ypg (only Wisky over 275 yds). Minny, who had lost their 1st 3 B10 gms by 38 ppg, beat lowa in B2B ssns for the 1st time S/99-'00. Despite being outFD'd 21-15 and outgained 446-371 QB Gray (134, 51%, 4-4, #1 rush w/500) converted 2 4Q 4th down incl the gm winning TD run on 482 with 2:48 left as UM had B2B TD drives after rec'ing an onside K. The Gophers had 6 FD in the 1st 3 Q's as the Hawks missed 2 FG and was SOD at the LWAN MSU may try to get the ground

gm going as the Gophers allow 202 rush ypg (5.3). The Spartans bounce back in a big way.

WISCONSIN 41 Purdue 20 - Wisky is 5-0 SU/ATS with an avg cover by 11 ppg and avg MOV by 19 ppg.

The HT is 2-6 ATS and the fav is 8-2 ATS in series. With their superior OL and RB's UW has worn down Purdue late in gms and has outscored them 89-6 in the final 3Q's the L/3 (no TD's all'd). LY UW covered 34-13 (+20) but had 3 scoring drives of 14 yds or less and were outgained 304-303. PU's OL dominated UW's DL in the 1H and they had a 173-66 yd edge before the Badgers capitalized on int's. PU is 2-22 SU (7-17 ATS) vs ranked opp's. UW hired PU's LB coach away from them this spring. Shell shocked Badgers are off B2B losses at MSU and OSU in which they all'd long TD passes with :20 and no time left. After worrying about the BCS rankings 2 wks ago, they now find themselves behind PSU and OSU and tied with Purdue in the Leaders standings. QB Wilson (254, 71%, 19-3) still is #1 FBS pass eff but the ground gm was held to just 89 yd vs OSU, its fewest S/'09. Badgers run D is being bruised for 190 ypg (4.3) in B10 play. After going 67/5pl for a TD on their opening drive the Boilers were throttled by Mich who scored 36 straight pts and finished with 25-16 FD and 535-311 yd edges. After going the distance vs IL QB TerBush (160, 62%, 9-4) split time with Marve (8-14, 66 yd, 1-1) vs UM. Boilers are allowing 186 rush ypg (4.4) in B10 play. PU has a big ST edge (#11-68) with the Badgers having P's blk'd in B2B gms which could minimize UW's LOS edge.

Battle of true Fr QB's here with OSU's Miller vs UM's Roberson who has avg'd 183 (60%) with a 2-1 ratio and 205 rush yd in his 2 sts. Miller (61, 52%, 6-2, 342 rush) had his best day yet accounting for 188 yd and 3 TD including the gm winning 40 yd bomb with :20 left as OSU upset Wisky as a 4 ★ LPS. Since LT Adams ref'd from his susp the Bucks have avg'd 241 rush ypg (4.8) the L/3 with fellow Tat 5 susp Sr Herron's fresh legs rumbling for 274 (4.9) in his 2 gms back. Young Bucks D are #17 FBS in ttl D. Big plays burned the Hoosiers as NW had 405 1H yds and scored on 9 of their 1st 10 poss in a 59-38 loss. IU has all'd 40+ in 4 straight gms thanks to a D which starts an FBS most 7 frosh. Expected enormous edges for OSU esp on D (#12-117) and ST (#5-103) and with 3 straight covers we'll keep on backing the reloaded and rejuvenated Bucks. FLORIDA 30 Vanderbilt 13 - LY we used a rare 4'★ LPS on Florida and they delivered a 55-14 win (-14) in Nashville as they led 41-0 at half and played the bkps in the 2H. UF had a ssn high 480 yds and held Vandy to just 109 yds. HT is just 2-6 ATS in series with the Gators being a favorite of 12'+ for 18 str years and they have won the last 20 w/the avg score 37-15. LW Vandy jumped out to a 21-7 lead vs Ark but lost 31-28 (+8') as they missed a chipshot 27 yd FG w/s.08 left that would have sent it to OT. QB Rodgers (Aaron's lili bro) continues to impress and while he is avg just 46 rush ypg (1.7). LW the Gators lost to their rival

NEBRASKA 38 Northwestern 28 - The last time these schools played was in the '00 Alamo Bowl with the Huskers (-14') winning 66-17 and outgaining the Cats 636-383. Neb is off MSU with Penn St/Mich on deck while NW is off a road trip to Indiana with Rice on deck. Neb is 1-7 ATS as a conf HF of 7+. NW is 9-3 ATS as an AD (2-1 TY). The Huskers grabbed the Legends lead pounding MSU 24-3 with a 190-101 yd edge as we won our top College Totals Play on the Under. RB Burkhead (882, 5.4) was Superman scoring 3 TD vs the stingy Spartans D. Both D's have underachieved with the Huskers forcing just 11 TO's and 13 sks TY. The Cats benched 4 D str's including pressn All B10 DE Browne 2W ago vs PSU as they are allowing 39 ppg and 454 ypg in conf play. NW ended their 5 gm losing streak jumping all over hapless Indy 59-38. Even at less than 100% and splitting snaps QB Persa (250, 75%, 9-3) has been dynamic. The Cats scored on 9 of their 1st 10 poss and had 405 yds by HT. Neb has the enormous expected D (#20-93) and ST (#7-87) edges but a huge situational edge goes to the scrappy Cats.

LW WY true Fr QB Smith accounted for 4 1H TD's and help build a 30-13 lead, and their 30 pts were enough as SDSt missed two late FG's from In40. TCU capitalized on ST's miscues, taking over after a bad snap on a P (4/2pl), a partially blk'd punt (37/3pl)

and a dropped P snap (38/4pl) all leading to TD's. TCU held off BYU's late rally and beat the Cougs for a 4th str year, 38-28, although BYU (+13') did deliver a Fri Night Marquee winner. TCU is 21-5 (15-9-2 ATS) in MW AGS (10 str wins by 30 ppg). This is a huge sandwich gm for TCU as they are coming off BYU and have a road trip to Boise on deck while WY pulled the outright upset of SDSt, 30-27 (+18') LW, delivering another Big Dog winner.

SMU 38 Tulane 17 - HC. Home tm is 1-8 ATS in the series and Tulane is 8-4 ATS vs SMU. Until the L2Y where SMU has outgained Tulane by an avg of 125 ypg, the Wave had outgained SMU for 7 straight by an avg of 111 ypg. TU is 5-1 (6-0 ATS) in Dallas since 1992 but lost their L/visit 26-21 as a 19 pt dog. Tulane rallied from a 17-7 HT deficit to lead 21-20 in the 4Q but allowed a TD w/5:23 left (L/2 drives ended on a SOD and fmbl). SMU is off 3 str tough conf gms (UCF, at SM and LW at Tulsa). The Mustangs have scored just 10 ttl pts and have been outgained by 155 ypg L2W. Tulane LW dropped their 6th straight (1-5 ATS) and was officially eliminated from a bowl (9th str losing ssn). SMU has big edges on off (#47-109) and def (#43-99) and a major advantage with the coaching staff. There have been 3 common opp's (UTEP, Mem and Tulsa) and Tulane is 0-3 SU/ATS being outscored 36-9 (outgained by just 10 ypg) while SMU is 2-1 SU and 1-2 ATS outscoring those foes 26-18 (+92 ypg). SMU has dropped two straight both SU/ATS but has 3 of their L/4 gms at home and will bowl for a third year in a row (1st time S/'82-'84).

AIR FORCE 34 Army 17 - Visitor is 8-3 ATS. LY AF (-6') trailed 6-0 and only led 21-16 with 2:22 left 3Q but went on a 21-6 run (165-94 yd edge) and won by 20. LW AF went back to its bread and butter, finishing with 335 rush yds (now #3 FBS rush off). They did lose QB Jefferson in the 1Q (should play TW), but fans got a glimpse of the future with bkp Dietz leading AF to a 42-0 win over NM (AF 22-16 FD, 361-223 yd edge). Army is just 1-15 SU (2-8 ATS run) in Colorado Springs S/79. In snowy conditions bkp QB Jenkins, in his 1st start, led Army to an easy 55-0 win over Fordham. Jenkins finished with 2 rush TD's and threw another as Army had 27-6 FD and 544-86 yd edges. Steelman was out (spr ankle), and even if he's able to go, it's tough to run the option on a weak ankle (CS). The Falcons have simply owned this series going 13-1 SU and 12-2 ATS and have held Army to 10 or less 8x's in the last 14 seasons. AF brings home its 2nd str CIC Trophy.

IOWA 31 Michigan 27 - 57th meeting and lowa has never beaten UM 3 str times. Iowa is 4-8 SU but 7-3-2 ATS in series (dropped 3 of L/4 ATS). UM has dropped 2 of their L/3 trips to lowa City incl '09 (+8, 28-30) when they were -4 in TO's (-8 L2Y). LY UI (-3') led UM 35-14 early 4Q holding on for the win despite being outFD'd (-8) and outgained (-139) but did have a 4-0 TO edge. Iowa is 20-12 ATS as a conf HF (1-1 TY) and UM is 1-7 ATS as a conf AD (0-1 TY). Vanilla Hawks D has traditionally struggled vs mobile QB's (ssn's worst pts and yd ttls vs ISU, NW and Indy TY) with Minny QB Gray running for 2 crucial 4Q 4D conversions including the gm winning TD with 2:48 left LW. The Hawks had 21-15 FD and 446-371 yd edges but missed 2 FG's and fmbl'd at the UM14 ruining RB Coker's huge gm (252, 7.9). UM dominated PU scoring 36 straight pts and finishing with a 535-311 yd edge. QB D-Rob (178, 55%, 11-11, 825 rush) may've found a RB who can share the rush load as Toussaint had 170 (8.5) vs the Boilers. Wolves are #1 B10 in rush D in conf play allowing 121 ypg (4.1). Hawks have a huge ST edge (#23-111) and are 10-2-1 off a SU loss under Ferentz.

OKLÄHOMA 44 Texas A&M 27 - The Sooners are 10-5 SU but 6-9 ATS vs the Aggies (avg MOV is 26 ppg). The HT is 14-3 ATS and the Aggies are just 4-14 ATS 5/99 vs ranked tms as an AD. A&M is also just 5-18 SU and 6-17 ATS in Nov AG (2-0 SU/ATS LY). LY OU (-3) trailed 19-0 early 3Q and the story of the game was OU being SOD THREE times on 4&gl at the 1 in a 33-19 loss despite a 29-17 FD edge. A&M has dropped 6 str trips (1-5 ATS) to Norman by an avg of 39 ppg. In the last trip A&M (+20) was hammered 65-10 being outgained 640-226. For the 3rd time TY A&M blew a DD HT lead in their 38-31 OT loss to Missouri. The Ags couldn't overcome 3 2H TO's or slow the Tigers ground gm (284-183). A&M QB Tannehill (290, 65%, 18-7) has had crucial 2H TO's in all 3 losses. Ags are last in the FBS in pass D (318, 64%, 14-4). The Sooners bounced back to blast undefeated KSU 58-17 with 34-15 FD and 690-240 yd edges. After the Cats cut it to 17-14 early 2Q it was all OU as they scored TD's on 5 straight poss to start the 2H despite losing #1 rusher Whaley (627, 5.6) on the 1st play with a brk ankle. Both tms rarely allow sks (OU #1 FBS w/ 3 and A&M-7) and are the FBS's #1 (OU-34) and #2 (A&M-30) sackers. OU has a bye on deck and is playing with legit revenge.

ARKANSAS 34 South Carolina 17 - Ark is 8-2 ATS in this series and the favorite is 13-4 ATS. Ark

is off B2B rd gms (5-0-1 ATS) while SC is off road trip to Tenn (2-7 ATS following Tenn all coming vs Ark). We won our CTOT GOY LY with the Over and Ark (+4') won 41-20. Ark had a scheduling advantage there as it didn't matter what SC did vs Ark, just what they did vs Florida the following week which would put them in the SEC Title game. They pulled some st'rs in the 3Q (Lattimore 30 yds) and the Hogs passed for 303 yds and led 41-10. SC has dropped its L/2 trips to Ark including the last in '09, 33-16. LW the Cardiac Hogs again got off to a slow start trailing Vandy 21-7 in the 1H before pulling out a 31-28 win as an 8' pt AF Vandy did miss a chipshot 27 yd FG on the final play. Two wks ago Ark trailed Ole Miss 17-0 before rallying for a 29-24 win and they were down 35-17 at HT to A&M earlier TV before winning 42-38. The Hogs are led by QB Wilson who is avg 291 ypg (63%) with a 13-3 ratio but has taken numerous hits all year long. SC was able to come off the bye w/out RB Lattimore (OFY knee) and get a 14-3 win (-3') at Tenn LW. True frosh Brandon Wilds ran for a career-high 137 yds (4.9) and the Gamecocks D limited Tenn to just 186 yds. QB Connor Shaw has avg just 121 (65%, 2-3) in his two road starts and the Hogs will no doubt stack the LOS and force him to beat them thru the air. Ark has the off (#20-39) and ST's edge (#13-79) and SC is playing only their 2nd gm w/out arguably the most valuable player to any one team in the SEC. Could we go back to this series again for a Big Play? North Carolina 27 NC STATE 24 - HT is 4-8 ATS in the series and the favorite is just 5-14 ATS. The L/2Y NC has lost 28-27 and 29-25. LY was another incredible loss for NC as they had a 404-275 yd edge but Tom O'Brien amazingly improved to 4-0 SU/ATS vs NC thanks to a TD pass in the 3Q on what looked to be a sure inc on 4th down and the Pack added a PR TD and a stopped 2 pt conv at the end. NC rebounded off Clem and dominated LW with a 49-24 win over Wake. The Heels outgained WF 562-331 as Bernard (banged up vs Clem) ran for 154 yd

Oregon 49 WAShink TON 35 - Final HG at Husky Stadum until 2013 due to renovation. The Huskles delivered a 3\* LPS winner LW vs the Cats in comeback fashion as RB Polk became the 1st player in UW history with 100 yds rush and rec in a gm while also adding 5 TD's. Despite the 15 pt win over WSU (-36), the Ducks were actually outgained (462-451) for the 1st time TY (just 3rd time in 2Y). Oregon has now won and covered 7 straight by 27 ppg in this series (18 pt avg spread, +208 avg yd edge). LY the Ducks led just 18-6 at the half but scored 35 in the 2H and LTH UO (-10) trailed 3-0 after 1Q before a 36-3 explosion the next 2 Q's. Ducks are an incredible 26-12-2 as a P12 DD fav while the Huskies are just 11-20 ATS as a DD conf dog incl a 65-21 (+20) defeat vs Stanford 2 wks ago, a game in which UW allowed 446 rush yds (10.4). UW also lost both of their meetings a LY vs Top 15 teams by a combined score of 97-21 (Stanford and Nebraska). Despite avg 308 ypg (7.1) on the ground themselves TY, the Ducks' season actually depends on how they fare next wk vs Stanford and not how well they perform here.

CALIFORNIA 34 Wash St 24 - While the Bears have won 5 consec meetings vs the Cougars, WSU has covered in 8 of 10 incl LY's matchup, a game in which QB Brock Mansion made his 1st career start (171, 58%, 0-2) in Pullman. Cal (-14) did trail at HT but held WSU to 30 2H yds in the 20-13 win. Last time visiting Cal ('09 in Berkeley) marked Wulff's 1st ever HT lead over an FBS opp as a HC as WSU had a ssn high 440 yds but still lost 49-17 (+35'). The Cougs ply'd better than expected vs the Ducks LW as they outgained UO 462-454 in a 15 pt loss (QB Tuel DNP w/inj, may be OFY). After a loss LW to UCLA (QB Maynard 4 int), the Bears are 4-4 and desperately need a win here for their bowl chances (Stanford and Ariz St remain on sked). Cal is on a 9-3 ATS run as a conf HF and have a large def edge (#21-81) which should provide them enough spark to take one here.

NO never got its momentum going as on 4 trips into the Bucs red-zone they were held to 2 FG, 1 TD with an int coming at the end of the game. After dominating IND on SNF the Saints were caught off guard by the Rams level of physical play. NO was down 24-0 mid-3Q and earned 140 of their 283 yds in the 4Q when STL went prevent. TB spent the bye (5-0 ATS afterwards) healing up. DT McCoy (high ankle) is expected to return but RB Blount whoes only 100 yd game came vs IND (50 ypg 3.9 in other 4 gms) is uncertain. Freeman only has a 7-10 ratio right now as teams are jumping on Winslow's routes (31 rec 9.1) as the other receiving threats have been disappointing TY, NO is 7-2 ATS at home off a SU loss and DIV AD's off a bye are 11-25-1 ATS since 2000. Look for NO to control the pace of the game with an early lead as they take out their embarrassment for LW's loss on a division rival. FORECAST: NEW ORLEANS 34 Tampa Bay 14

3★ HOUSTON over Cleveland - This is CLE's 3rd road game in 4 wks with 2 long trips to the West Coast. The Texans have won and covered 3 of the L4 including a 16-6 win as a 3 pt AD in 2008. HOU is the only team in the NFL with a top 10 ranking in total offense, rush off, pass off, total defense, rush def and pass def and they have a top 10 special teams unit also. The Texans have held Brees, Roethlisberger and Flacco to 3-4 ratio with a respectable 7.7 ypa. Schaub (253 ypg 60% 13-5) will easily be the best QB the overranked #1 pass defense has faced. In the 4 full games without Andre Johnson the Texans have logged 22-15 FD and 411-251 edges. LY HOU allowed 377 ypg on defense but over the L2W they have allowed 326 yds total. CLE's #25 run defense has a tall order with the RB tandem of Foster/Tate who have 1040 rush yds (4.5) so far. CLE may again be without RB's Hillic (hamstring) and Hardesty (calf) here. McCoy simply lacks the weaponry to mount a serious challenge and look for the Texans to dominate a young and tired team.

2★ SAN DIEGO over Green Bay - In the past 7 seasons this is only the 2nd HD role for the Chargers as they beat IND 23-21 as a 3.5 pt dog in 07. Schedule makers did the Chargers no favors as GB is of a bye (undefeated teams at 5-0 or better off bye 13-4 ATS) while SD is in a div sandwich off a short week with a short week on deck (@KC Mon, OAK Thurs). Let's match up these 2 premier team and we'll call it even with GB's #4 off facing SD's #4 D. The edge goes to the Chargers with their #8 off vs GB's #28 D. SD has allowed over 318 yds just ONCE while GB allowed season highs to MIN (435 yds), STL (424 yds), DEN (384 yds) and CAR (26 FD's). The teams have basically played even schedules (#25 vs #26) yet SD is +94 ypg despite being -5 while GB is +32 ypg while being +9 in TO's. When comparing their game against elite opponents SD outFD NE on the road (29-28) while GB was outFD at home vs NO (27-24). Atlanta 31 INDIANAPOLIS 20 - The Falcons are 1-2 ATS off their bye under Mike Smith and have a huge home game vs NO on deck. ATL has played the #13 sked to this point in the year which accounts for the perception they've underachieved TY with the #17 and #20 units (+1 TO's). Defenses have managed to slow WR White (39 rec 10.9) who has been bothered by a knee injury and 1st RD DC Jones (25 rec 14.3) has missed 2 games w/a hamstring injury. The good news is that they face an IND team giving up 261 ypg (77%) with an 11-0 ratio the L4W with just 1 QB held to under a 95 QBR so far TY. Bill Polian placed the blame firmly on the defense as the DL is missing its 2 best DT's (Foster, Nevis) on IR. While Mathis/Freeney have 8 sacks combined the Colts have 12 as a team (18th). While Painter is not the big problem (just 4 ints TY) the Colts lack the quick strike capability here to help a defense that can't get off the field on 3rd Dns (#32, 49.1%). IND is simply underpowered here and with non-conference AF's off a bye being 17-4-1 ATS since 2000 we'll lean with the Falcons here.

NY Jets 17 BUFFALO 16 - The Jets are 3-0 SU/ATS vs the Bills with a 32-11 avg score. Sanchez DNP in LY's 2nd game as he was being rested for the playoffs and he's only avg'd 128 ypg passing (46%) with a 3-5 ratio vs the Bills. However, the Bills have given up 279 ypg rushing (6.2) to the Jets the L2Y and NT Kyle Williams isn't returning anytime soon. LW's defensive effort by the Bills came vs a very depleted WAS team. While they had a 390-178 yd edge it boosted them up to 18th in rush defense (120 ypg 4.9) and while they have 13 sks, 9 were vs WAS beat up OL. The Jets play the pass very well (4-11 ratio, 18 sks 10th), but have only had 2 games (DAL/SD) where they held foes to under 100 yds rushing (146 ypg 4.6). BÚF RB Jackson is playing at an All-Pro level (153 tótal ypg from scrimmage 6.8) and Fitzpatrick is at a higher level than Sanchez right now. The Jets are 29th on offense and their 300 ypg avg is 51 yds less than LY. While they are 11th with 24.6 ppg, 4 TD's have come by defense/spec teams TD's and they are 28th in rush offense (3.7). MIA took advantage of a sluggish Giants team with a 14-3 lead in the 2Q. From that point on they were outFD 15-6 and outgained 295-90 with 5 punts, a FG and an Int the rest of the way. MIA's #1 CB Vontae Davis has been hurt all year, the safety position is very weak and while they have 16 sks TY (18th) 7 of them came vs Tebow. As a result MIA has the #27 pass defense allowing 270 ypg (62%) with a whopping 14-2 ratio vs an offense with just 9 TD's so far. Don't overreact to MIA first cover of the season as the struggling offense

is avg 14 ppg since the opener and LW's 17 pts was a high in that span.

San Francisco 27 WASHINGTON 20 All 3 of the 49ers road games TY have been in the EST where they are 3-0 SU/ATS. West Coast teams (ARZ, OAK, SD, SEA, SF) are a combined 1-9 ATS as EST favorites since 2006. SF has a big stat edge the L4W with the #9 and #12 units (+4 TO's) vs the Red-skins #28 and #13 units (-6 TO's). The 49ers have a big edge with their special teams and had the best red-zone defense in the NFL prior to LW. In their 1st 3 games SF avg'd 214 ypg offensively as they learned Harbaugh's scheme. Since then they've avg'd 381 ypg and they've only had 1 game TY (DET) with negative TO's. Aside from injuries since the bye, WAS has struggled with inconsistent QB play over the L4W avg 200 ypg (54%) with a 2-9 ratio. The line is a great indication of DAL's huge stat edges with the #5 and #7 units (-1 TO's) vs SEA's #31 and #12 units (-3 TO's) and the Cowboys also have our #9 spec teams vs SEA's #24 prior to LW. DAL is perilously thin at RB (just 2 healthy RB's LW) vs a strong SEA DL with the #10 rush defense. Romo does have one of the deepest receiving units in the NFL vs SEA's #19 pass defense. Facing McCoy and Dalton the L2W has masked the fact that SEA's top 2 CB's (Trufant/Browner) are on IR. DAL has been hurt by injuries on its OL TY but they are 7th with 11 sks allowed (1 every 21 att's) and 14th with 17 sks earned (1 every 13.1 att's). SEA has given up 16 sks TY to aggressive pass rush defenses (SF, PIT, NYG) on the road and get another here. DAL won't overlook SEA with how they beat the Giants and while DD fav's are 5-9 ATS TY the Cowboys have too much talent here.

OAKLAND 16 Denver 13 - The Raiders are 0-8 SU/ATS off a bye losing by an avg score of 26-12. OAK is expected to start Palmer and his 116 yds (38%) and 3 int effort vs KC was really a preseason game for him. The Raiders are 9-2 ATS vs the Broncos winning and covering 4 straight by a 35-19 avg score. McFadden (right foot) is expected to be ready here and he has avg'd 145 ypg (7.5) rushing in his L3 starts vs the #17 rush defense. OAK will be Tebow's 1st rematch team as they faced him LY in his 1st career start. He only had 138 yds (50%) passing but tossed a 40 ydTD pass with a 30 ydTD run as the Raiders had a 502-235 yd edge vs a beat up team playing out the string. DEN took a cue from CAR and scrapped their base offense going to a more "college oriented" playbook to take advantage of Tebow's strengths. It didn't work very well as Tebow had 172 yds passing (46%) with a 1-1 ratio. He clearly was lost at several points in the game and 204 of DEN's 312 yds came in the 4Q with the game light years out of reach. OAK has the athleticism to contain Tebow and make him pass the ball which plays to their advantage. However, we need to see how Palmer plays with a full week of snaps before backing OAK beyond a FG for now.

Cincinnati 27 TÉNNESSEE 24 - Road teams off a long road trip to the Pacific Northwest are a surprising 9-3 ATS. This is a good matchup for the Bengals who will get RB Benson (susp) back vs a Titans team that is 27th vs the run (129 ypg 4.3) and 28th in sks by (13). CIN has won the yardage battle in 6 of 8 games TY and have done a good job of protecting Dalton allowing 5 sks in their L4 games. TEN has been outgained in 3 of their L4 games with the only edge being vs the lowly Colts. TEN dominated IND LW but that is not a major accomplishment TY. Lost in the final score is the fact that IND had their 2nd most offensive yds so far and that RB Johnson only had 34 yds rushing (2.4) in the game. Prior to SNF, over the L4W TEN has the #29 and #32 units (+1 TO's) while CIN has the #21 and #7 units (+2 TO's). The Bengals have held foes to under 300 total yards in 4 games, have the #3 rush defense (85 ypg 3.3) with just 12 offensive TD's allowed TY. Neither team has a bunch of quality wins under its belt for 2011 and we'll take the young and aggressive road team getting points outright here.

St Louis 24 ARIZONA 23 - After a brutal 1st half of the season the Rams sked (#2) finally starts to

lighten up. The Rams earned their 1st win of the season vs NO as RB Jackson dominated the game with 159 yds rushing (6.4). The defense had its best game of the year with 6 sacks, 10 tfl and 2 ints. While having been outscored by 12, 21 and 27 on the road TY the Rams have only been outgained by 37 ypg allowing 4 of 12 on 3rd Dn conversions (8 of 16 at home). ARZ has been outgained by 155 ypg at home TY giving up 354 ypg passing. They barely beat Newton in his 1st career start, gave up 3 TD's in the 4Q to lose to the Giants who were off a MNF game followed by a road game to PHI and were manhandled by PIT. Kolb admitted having problems adjusting to a completely different offense with ARZ prior to LW and that it was affecting his footwork. ARZ blew a 24-6 halftime lead vs the Ravens LW and were held to just 56 yds in the 2H. HF's that lost by 3 or less as DD AD's are 4-12 ATS. STL will be hungry for more after tasting its 1st win of the year vs an ARZ team that is 2-6 ATS at home off a SU loss.

NEW ENGLAND 37 NY Giants 20 - This is the 1st meeting since the Giants beat the Patriots 17-14 as 12 pt dogs in SB 42 ending their bid for a perfect season. Over the L4W this is a pretty even matchup statistically with the Giants #6 and #16 units (+1 TO's) vs the Patriots #12 and #28 units (0 TO's). The difference is the Giants have played one of the easiest skeds TY while NE has played the #4 sked. The Giants are 2-6 ATS vs an AFC foe while NE is 6-3 ATS as a fav vs the NFC. After a slow start vs MIA, the Giants avoided an embarrassing loss by outgaining the Dolphins 188-94 in the 2H as the defense held MIA to a FG and 4 punts with an Int to seal the game. They now take to the road vs a NE team that was punched in the mouth by PIT LW. NE was outgained 261-83 at the end of the 1H and didn't hit 200 yds until 4:30 was left. The problem with NE's #32 defense is that it gives up yardage in chunks in the air (323 ypg) and can't get off field on 3rd Dn. If a physical defense such as DAL or PIT can get Brady off rhythm the defense can't play physical ball on the back end. However, NE is too well coached and have shown time after time that they play some top ball after a loss and do so again.

Baltimore at PITTSBURGH - No two teams have met more since 2008 as these bitter rivals are in their 10th

meeting in 4 season. Pit has taken 4 of the 7 reg ssn meeting and both playoff match-ups incl LY's 31-24 Div Round win. Baltimore won and covered the season opener TY snapping a 5-0-1 ATS run for the visitor. It's the #1 vs #2 win. Saltimore won and covered the season opener 17 shapping a 5-0-1 ATS run for the visition. Its the #1 vs #2 D in the NFL a true black and blue matchup. NFL Marquees are 11-1 79% as of presstime. Chicago at PHILADELPHIA - There are many unknowns at presstime as Philly is off a Sunday Night matchup and may still in the race or could be 3 full game back. The Bears are off a bye and back to back

EC tacked on a FG while SM's L/2 drives stalled. Since the UH debacle EC is 3-0 SU/ATS as QB Davis is back to his '10 form (336 pass ypg 76% 6-1 ratio). SM has reeled off 6 straight SU/ATS (avg win by 42-18, 499-342 ypg). SM is playing with legit revenge and is 18-8-1 ATS as an AF but EC is 14-5-1 as an AD. Both schools beat Navy outright as an AD TY but surprisingly the Southern Miss 38 EAST CAROLINA 24 - SM is 11-3-1 ATS vs the Pirates but has dropped B2B gms Pirates allowed 149 yds less. The lone bright spot LY for the Bruins was QB Brehaut who set UCLA rec'ds for pass comp and att (33-56). UCLA will be without him TY (broken leg) as they are turning to QB Prince who is off a great performance LW in their upset over Cal (+5') rushing for 163 yds (8.6) as the Bruins were without key members of their WR corps (susp from AZ gm). ASU had their way with Colo outgaining the Buffs 522-420 (CU 239 garbage yds in 2H). ASU is 1-5 SU and lost 4 straight ATS in visits to Pasadena incl '09, 23-13 (+4'). There is line value here for the Bruins after they tanked a few wks ago vs AZ in front of a national audience. Have to feel that the Sun Devils may be already planning for their appearance in the Title Game, but UCLA continues to be a tough venue for conference AF's. UCLA's season has gone much as we expected with wins at Oregon St and vs Washington St, but even we were pleasantly surprised by LW's performance as despite having multiple susp players, they performed admirably for the HC crowd.

UI has won the L/2 (1-1 ATS) and is trying for 3 consec wins in the series for the 1st time S/63-'65. This has been a low scoring series as they avg just 40 comb ppg. UI is coming off a tough 16-14 last minute loss to Hawaii LW where QB Davis got the start but he was just 6-17-33 before usual starter Reader entered in the 4Q and went 5-7-52. UI is avg 212 rush ypg (5.4) the L/4 yrs vs SJSt but comes into this gm ranked #116 in the NCAA in rushing (85 ypg) although they did manage 149 yds LW (held UH to just 15). SJSt is coming off a 38-28 loss at LT where QB Faulkner was 33-49-327 and 3 TD but he also threw 4 int (7 in the L/2 gms) and the Spartans managed just 12 rush yds (RB Rutley just 23 yds on 14 att). SJSt has also had 11 TO's in the L/2 gms. The Spartans are in an unfamiliar role as a HF and are on an 0-6 ATS skid in that role (0-3 under HC MacIntyre). While UI has outgained SJSt in 5 of the L/6, this is a much better Spartan tm which should keep the Vandals winless vs FBS tms TY.

Stanford 41 OREGON ST 24 - Sandwich game for the Cardinal as they are coming off a 30T victory

over USC (trailed most of the 2H, had not trailed all ssn coming in) and have the all important meeting with Oregon on deck. The half pt cover for the Cardinal now moves their ATS streak to an amazing 1 straight while they also hold the nation's longest winning streak at 16. The Beavers meanwhile coughed up the ball 4 times and saw QB Mannion sk'd on 6 occasions in a 27-8 loss at Utah. Prior to LY OSU had outgained SU in each of the previous 10 yrs by an avg of 452-268! Key mismatch will be Heisman hopeful QB Luck (305 yds pass in LY's gm) going up against the #9 set of DB's in P12 (all'g 222 ypg TY, 64%, 17-7 ratio). LY SU had a +5 TO edge but allowed no OSU drive further than the SU32 and rolled to a 38-0 home win (-13") delivering yet another Early Bird POW winner for the Comp Phone (1st time OSU was shutout S/"02). SU hasn't won B2B gms in this series S/"94 and '95 and the HT is 4-0 SU/ATS with 2 outright upsets which could keep this one close early on before the Cardinal once again pull ahead in the 2H with substantial edges on both off (#5-61) and def (#15-67)

OKLAHOMA ST 44 Kansas St 27 - Snyder is 10-4 SU and 9-4-1 ATS vs OSU. OSU has been the better team in the month of Nov going 13-9 SU and 14-6-2 ATS while KSU is 3-12 SU and 5-10 ATS. LTH ('07) KSU (+2') lost on an OSU FG w/:02 left. LY OSU (-4') was w/o WR Blackmon (susp) and trailed 7-0 but HSO (42) lost of all GSO FG Wi.22 left. ET GSO (44) was with WHS blackfill (stusy) and trialled 7-0 bit scored 24 unanswered incl a 26 yd IR TD to pull away 24-14 (-4') on the road. OSU is 14-7-1 as a conf HF. KSU is 9-3 as an AD vs ranked tms and 4-1 as a dog TY with 4 outright upsets despite being outgained in all 4. The Cinderella Cats got their bubble burst by angry OU 58-17 as the Sooners scored TD's on 5 straight poss to start the 2H while KSU had just 32 ttl yds. Methodical K-St off (#4 FBS TOP) is led on 5 straight poss to start the 2H while KSU had just 32 til yos. Methodical K-St off (44 FBS 10F) is led by QB Klein (124, 58%, 8-3, 762 rush) who has more rush att (177) this yr than pass att (154). KSU is #82 pass eff D (278, 64%, 15-12). OSU continued their mastery of Baylor jumping out to a 42-0 early 3Q lead before allowing 3 4Q TD's. The final is misleading however as BU drove 69/16pl, 49/9pl, 63/12pl, 43/11pl and 57/8pl in the 1H with nothing to show for it as they were SOD twice, threw 2 picks and missed a FG. OSU QB Weeden is #7 FBS passing (339, 71%, 22-7) with WR Blackmon (74, 11.3, 10 TD) stepping up now that Anyiam is OFY. Cowboys lead the nation in TO margin at +19 which is on pace to break Miami, FL's 2001 FBS record. Obvious off edge for OSU (#1-72) and the Cowboys have covered 7 straight by 13.1 ppg. KSU is 17-9 ATS off a SU loss under Snyder however and are back in their stronger role.

Missouri 42 BAYLOR 41 - HC. Tigers are 10-3 (5-2-1 ATS S/91) vs the Bears and haven't lost in Waco S/91 (4 str winning trips). LTH ('08) MU (-21) led 21-7 at HT but needed a 10 pt 4Q including a 75/13pl GW FG drive w/2:31 left for the win. In the L/meeting ('09) BU (+14) snapped a 7 gm series losing streak. The Bears trailed 27-16 at HT but held the Tigers to just 3 FD's and 35 yds on their 1st 5 2H poss pulling the road upset 40-32. MO is on their 2nd str AG and off ranked OSU and A&M while BU returns home after OSU with a road trip to Kansas on deck. MU rallied from an 11 pt HT deficit to upset A&M in OT as they outran the Ags 284-183. Three 2H TO's doomed A&M as they fmbl'd at the MO31 and MO42 and was int'd at the MO25. QB Franklin's mobility has helped to spark the B12's top ground gm and #1 rusher Josey (#4 FBS, 1017, 8.6) is on pace to set a new school rush record. Tigers are #66 pass eff D (250, 64%, 13-8). BU was blasted by OSU but the final was grossly misleading as the Bears drove 69/16pl. 49/9pl, 63/12pl, 43/11pl and 57/8pl in the 1H but went to the locker room down 35-0 as they were SOD twice, RG3 threw 2 int in the same gm for just the 2nd time in his career and missed a FG. QB Griffin is #3 FBS pass eff (339, 75%, 23-4) but all 4 of his int's have come in conf play. Bears D is built for speed

and is allowing 206 rush ypg (5.6!). **Houston 51 UAB 34** - HC. UH is 1-3 SU/ATS in Birmingham but did win their last visit ('07) 49-10 as a 13' pt fav. In the L/gm ('08) UAB (+18) led 20-3 at HT with a 257-199 yd edge but was outscored 42-0 in the . 2H mustering just 4`FD's and 70 yds. UH LW regained the Bayou Bucket and at 8-0 match their best start in history (last time '90). Just when things looked like they would be turning around UAB was dominated LW by Marshall (trailed 38-0 at HT and 59-7 in 4Q) as HC Callaway is all but out the door. QB Perry was benched and Bento looked lost (Ellis ssn ending in). UH had a bye 3W ago and is off Thurs night gm while UAB is playing for a 9th str wk. The big news here is that QB Keenum is 267 yds away from becoming the NCAA's all-time passing leader. LW he broke the NCAA all-time career passing TD's mark (9 TD passes LW) and 2W ago the ttl yds record. Keenum has been near perfect at home but is just 2-12 ATS as an AF being upset 8x's on the road! UAB is 7-2-1 ATS as a HD incl 2-0 TY with an outright upset. UH has a big off edge (#3-100) but has had 3 unimpressive AG's TY (tied 17-17 late 2Q at NT, trailed 34-7 at LT and trailed 28-24 3Q at ÚTEP). Perfection comes with a price and that is pressure as the season progresses.

SAN DIEGO ST 45 New Mexico 10 - Rocky Long vs his former team although the Lobos have covered as 16 and 23' pt dogs the L/2Y (when Long was SDSt's DC) losing by a comb 13 pts. NM is now 14-2 ATS (9-1 here) in the series. This is NM's 3rd road gm in 4W while SDSt had a bye 2W ago. SDSt is off a devastating loss to WY, 30-27 as the Pokes (+18') delivered ANOTHER OUTRIGHT UPSET for our Big Dog POW. Down 30-13 at HT, the Aztecs turned to Hillman and he took SDSt's 1st 3Q play 99 yds for a TD (longest run in FBS TY), which brought new life to the stadium. SDSt pulled within 3, but tried 39 and 27 yd FG's and both were missed by the Sr PK. Hillman (224 yds LW) still leads the FBS in rushing (1057, 6.2, 12 TD) but Lindley has been inconsistent in his Sr year (219 ypg, 50%, 14-5 ratio). NM was shutout for a 2nd str wk, this time 42-0 by AF (AF 22-16 FD, 361-223 yd edges). Holbrook went the entire way, hitting 17-27-109 with an 0-2

ratio (117 ypg, 60%, 3-4 ratio). The top rusher is Gongbay with just 270 (4.3, 4). This is an angry SDSt tm that has all the edges vs a vulnerable NM team and a 3rd str shutout wouldn't be shocking

RICE 28 Utep 27 - Owls were on a 7-0 ATS run in the series until LY when they also had a series high 4 gm win streak snapped. Rice (+9') led 7-0 but trailed 37-10 into the 4Q as 41% (139) of their yds came on Ž late long TD drives. UTEP has lost B2B gms at Rice by a combined 9 pts. In '09 ÚTEP (-6') blew leads of 13-0, 20-10 and 29-17 as 6 TO's proved costly including 2 fmbl's in the final 5:02 (1 on GL, another at R39). Rice is off a Thurs Night loss against instate rival UH. UTEP had their 6 gm ATS win streak snapped LW vs SM. Rice is 32-11-2 ATS in conf play. UTEP is 3-0 ATS after a SU loss TY. Both schools come in with excellent ST units (UTEP #1, Rice #12) and the Owls have huge technical edges.

FRESNO ST 35 Louisiana Tech 34 - Fresno is 9-3 SU in series but is just 3-7-1 ATS. FSU has not

covered in 6 of the L/7 and the dog is 7-0 ATS with four OUTRIGHT upsets! FSU is just 9-22-3 as a conf HF while Tech is on a 5-1 ATS run as a conf AD including 2-0 ATS in that role TY with two outright upsets. FSU is fresh off a bye while LT starts a 3 gm road trip but Tech has won its L/4 WAC AG's SU and has covered in its L/4 AG's overall. Similar to LY, LT has made a QB change at midssn (Isham shoulder inj, CS) and it's paying off. After leading his tm to a 4Q comeback 2 wks ago, Cameron got the start LW and paced Tech to a 38-28 (-7') win over SJSt as he was 17-27-237 (2-0 ratio). Tech outrushed SJSt 260-12 and forced 5 Spartan TO's. The L/3 gms between these two Bulldogs have truly been a "dog fight" as each was decided by 6 pts or less (a comb ttl of 11 pts) and the LTH, FSU won 30-28 (-9) on a 35 yd FG on the last play. This one very well could come right down to the wire again.

Boise St 52 UNLV 3 - LV has lost 10 str (2-7-1 ATS) vs ranked foes by 28 ppg (last win in OT vs #15

Ariz St '08). LV (+2') ret'd home for the 1st time in 35 days and pulled the upset over Colo St, 38-35, in a gm that had 8 lead changes. LV started QB Reilly but he threw a 52 yd pick 6 and Herring came in on the 3rd series and went the rest of the way hitting 9-13-90 with a 2-0 ratio (also 22 rush yd, 1 TD). There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc... takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
