NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK ELEVEN 2011

NEWS AND NOTES - With 4:51 left in the 1H Florida St not only led 28-0, they had a 214-16 yd edge and BC had 0 FD. BC got a TD early 3Q then gave up a 47 yd FG and Florida St was then SOD at the BC5 but after an int, FSU drove 36/6pl for a TD with 10:16 left, 38-7. Luke Kuechly had 20 tkls and BC clinched their first losing season since 1998 and was eliminated from boul control intoThere have been come fire OR's at USC but Matt Rarkley set a school record with 6 TD passes with 3 other USC OR's some fine QB's at USC but Matt Barkley set a school record with 6 TD passes with 3 other USC QB's at one time having 5. Colorado did have a couple of blown opportunities as they had 31 and 37 yd FG's blk'd and settled for a 30 yd FG after a 1st & gl at the 8. It was 35-17 with 11:19 left when USC drove 66/9pl incl a 4&3 conversion to the CU31 and they got a 19 yd TD pass with 7:06 left for Barkley's 6th TD. USC's final drive did go 71/8pl and the game ended at the CU16...Scott McCummings who has been used mainly as a running QB for Connecticut took over in the 4Q and his option-style change of pace running guided to the 7 pt win over Syracuse. CT amazingly turned the ball over 5 times in the 1H getting inside the SU32 on the first 5 drives but it was just 7-7 at the half due to the TO's. The Orange were forced to stay in a hotel an hour away from the stadium due to a power outage in East Hartford...Marcus Coker ran for 132 yds vs Michigan and Iowa led as much as 24-9 but had to survive at the end. UM got a TD with 7:53 left to pull within 24-16 and lowa punted 2x, the latter with 2:15 left. UM got to a 1st & gl at the 3, but a pass caught in the back of the EZ was ruled OOB then on 4&3 the pass was broken up on the final play of the game...One week after a solid game vs Wisconsin, Braxton Miller hit just 5-11-55. He had a scintillating 81 yd QB draw for a TD on 2&12 which put Ohio St up 10-7. With the game tied at 20, they faced a 3rd & gl at the 20 and Miller's 20 yd TD run on a QB draw gave them the lead, 27-20. Indiana was int'd with 4:07 left and OSU drove 58/4pl for a TD with 2:41 left to finally get some breathing room, 34-20. IU actually took the game's opening drive 42/11pl for a 35 yd FG then after a fumble drove 41/6pl for a 10-0 lead...Texas frosh Joe Bergeron ran for 195 yds and 3 TD's. UT ran for 439 yds vs Texas Tech. UT's top rusher, Malcolm Brown, was sidelined with a toe injury and top WR Jaxon Shipley had a knee injury. UT led 31-6 at the half and 52-13 when TT went 74/12pl for a garbage TD with 1:01 left...Florida led Vanderbilt 17-0 at the half and could have been up by more as they had a 277-119 yd edge. A key play happened on their first series when on 3&1 they got a 39 yd pass which appeared to be for a TD but fmbl'd for a TB. They also missed a FG. Jordan Rodgers came to life in the 2H and hit 19-28-297 on the day, VU got a TD with 10:54 left to pull within 20-14 but UF took over with 5:59 left and went 94/8pl for a TD with 2:13 left and missed the 2 pt conv, 26-14. VU went 80/5pl and got a TD with 1:16 left but UF rec'd the onside kick...Virginia became bowl eligible for the first time since 2007 and dominated Maryland with a 527-353 yd edge. MD suffered their 5th straight loss. It was the Terps' FHG and 16 seniors were honored. UVA ret'd the opening KO 48 yds and on the first play got a 47 yd TD run but only led 14-13 at the half. UVA drove 94/13pl for a TD then after an int went 66/7pl for a TD and after a punt went 69/7pl for a FG and a commanding 31-13 lead at the start of the 4Q and rolled...NC State came in ranked in the bottom half of the ACC in defensive stats but held Giovani Bernard to 47 yards on 18 carries and knocked Tar Heel QB Bryn Renner out of the game at the end of the 3Q. It was NCSt's first shutout in over 5 decades vs their rival and the 1st time NCSt had won 5 straight over UNC since 1988-92. The win came after HC's O'Brien and Withers traded verbal jabs about graduation rates and the NCAA investigation of UNC during the week. NCSt had a 290-165 yd edge. At the half NCSt finished with a 230-32 yd edge and UNC was int'd at the NCSt goal line to open the 3Q and in their only other shots in the 2H they were SOD at the NCSt23 and int'd at the UNC42...Georgia was without 3 susp'd RB's and Aaron Murray only played the 1H but UGA jumped out to a 49-3 HT lead and rolled to a 63-16 win. Later, after South Carolina lost to Arkansas, UGA found out it controls its own destiny to get to the SEC Title Game...Louisville was overlooked in the Big 12 expansion for West Virginia and dealt WV's Big East Title hopes a setback. WV had a 533-351 yd edge but UL also led the game 31-21. The key play happened at 24-21 when WV lined up for a 23 yd FG. UL blk'd it and ret'd it 82 yds for a TD for a

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31-21 lead. UL extended it to 38-28 with 1:50 left but WV got a TD with :42 left but UL rec'd the onside kick. Teddy Bridgewater hit 21-27-246 yds and WV went scoreless in the 3Q for the first time all season...The two teams who might be playing in the Big Ten Title game (Michigan St and Ohio St) both struggled vs overmatched foes and the weakest 2 teams in the B10. MSU was off their crushing loss to Nebraska but actually regained the top spot in the division as both Michigan and Nebraska lost. They actually trailed 14-7 and got a TD with:04 left in

the half to lead 21-17. Minny went back ahead 24-21 and MSU tied it with 14:49 left and then got a 35 yd Bell TD run with 10:58 left for the lead. UM's last 2 drives ended on an SOD on 4&10 at the MSU48 with 4:12 left and they got to the MSU45 and were int'd at the 23 with :09 left. UM had a 415-402 yd edge...TCU won their Mt West record 21st straight league game and tied the league record with consecutive road wins with 11. TCU finished with a 617-353 yd edge and had to overcome 5 TO's and trailed 20-17 late 3Q when they drove 80/10pl for a TD and the lead. TCU got a 74 yd James run to the 8 to set up another TD with 13:20 left, 31-20. TCU fumbled' at the WY7 and surprisingly on 4&14 with 2:01 left in the game, down by 11 pts, WY opted to punt and it went 40 yds and TCU ran the clock out... At the half SMU had a 31-0 lead and 296-61 yd edge and was dominant. The Mustangs fumbled the opening snap of the 3Q and Tulane ret'd it for a TD. After another 18 yd punt drove 20 yds for a 43 yd FG and after an 18 yd punt went 47/7pl for a TD to get back to 31-17. Trailing 38-24 they were SOD at the SMU26 and SMU got a TD with 1:39 left for the 21 pt margin...Navy earned their biggest halftime lead since 2006 with a 385-109 yd edge vs Troy and led the game 35-0. QB Kriss Proctor was doubtful coming in but did start and played most of the game...Montee Ball rushed for a career high 232 yds with 3 TD's for Wisconsin. Purdue's Raheem Mostert had 5 KR's for 206 yds keeping PU in the game early but UW had 605-285 yd and 30-14 FD edges. The Badgers had 425 yds at the half and led 38-17...In the 1H vs Air Force, Army had a 286-81 yd HT edge but only led 14-0. They were SOD on 4&1 and fmbl'd into the EZ for a TB and could have easily been up 28-0. AF rallied to tie it at 14 then the key play happened when Army faked a punt on 4&6 and they snapped it to the upman who pitched it back to Allen who never got a handle on the pitch and AF rec'd at the Army14 and got a TD 4pl later to lead 21-14 and never trailed again. Army fumbled at their own 19 setting up an AF FG and was int'd with 3:53 left. Army finished with a 366-301 yd edge...Zach Maynard was almost benched during the week but hit 10-17-118 and Cal dominated Washington St as at the half they had a 243-55 yd edge and led 23-0 and extended it to 30-0 when WSU rec'd a fumble and drove 17 yds for a TD with 13:38 left...The wind was a big factor for Oklahoma as they were playing with legitimate revenge vs A&M and off their first home loss in 39 games. OU appeared in control at 13-3 when A&M got a 79 yd pass on 3&9 with 1:39 left in the half which gave them the yardage edge at the half, 208-180 and pulled them within 13-10. OU had the wind which gave them the yardage edge at the hair, 208-180 and pulled them within 13-10. OU had the wind at their backs in the 3Q and took advantage driving 31 yds (after 34 yd punt), 28 yds (after int), 69 yds and 34 yds (after int) for TD's and a dominating 41-10 lead. A&M got a couple of late TD's, one with 9:49 left then drove 95/9pl for a garbage TD with 2:37 left to make the final score respectable. The key news for OU is that the FBS's #1 all-time rec'r, Ryan Broyles, tore his ACL and is out for the year and remember last week, OU lost its top rusher RB Whaley...Tennessee had just taken on 4 top 10 D's but last week took on our #118 rated D in Middle Tenn and rolled up 411 yards in their 24-0 win. Each team was SOD inside the other's 20 twice in the game incl Tenn with 1:26 left on 4&5 at the MT 19...Houston moved to 9-0 for the first time ever after having been 8-0 in 1979 and 1990. Case Keenum became the career leading passer in college football passing up Timmy Chang's 17,072. It happened with 6:00 left in the 3Q on a 16 yd pass to Justin Johnson. UH only led 21-10 at the half and was up 42-13 when they got a 52 yd IR TD with 8:06 left and bkp QB Turner guided a drive with 5:00 left and UH ended at the UAB35 running out the clock...Tough loss for USF vs Rutgers. In the 1H they had a 158-87 yd edge and led 10-0. USF fmbl'd the punt at their 12 setting up an ŘU FG. USF went on a 16 play drive but missed a 47 yd FG. USF appeared to ice it with a TD with 7:38 left which put them up 17-3 but RU got a 98 yd KR TD with 7:25 left. Two poss later RU converted on 4&9 with an 11 yd pass to the USF45 and would get a TD with 1:01 left to tie it. USF's final drive got to the 10 yd line where they lined up for the game winning 27 yd FG but missed it. In OT USF was int'd and RU got a 37 yd FG...Missouri was SOD twice deep ir Baylor terr and led 14-13 at the half but trailed 42-25 after an 80 yd run by Ganaway. MO drove 80/11pl for a TD with 3:55 left and 87/7pl for a TD with 1:59 left but BU rec'd the onside kick and finished with a 697-578 yd edge which was much wider prior to those final 2 drives...Arkansas had a frustrating 1H vs South Carolina. They had a dominating 253-43 yd edge but settled for FG's of 44, 45 and 29 yds and missed 2 of them. Also, QB Wilson was trying to throw the ball away and threw it right to DT Taylor who ret'd it 48 yds for a TD. Also at the end of the half, Ark on 3&10 had a wide open TD pass dropped and settled for the FG and missed it. SC got as close as 24-21 and 30-28 (10:30 4Q) but the Hogs pulled out to 44-28 lead. In the 2H was SOD on 4&gl at the 2 and on 4&1 at the SC29 and finished with a 435-207 yd edge...Basically in Utah games, whoever has the TO advantage usually wins and wins big. Arizona had a 457-332 yd edge but Utah had a 3-0 TO edge and won by 13. At half Utah led 20-7 despite UA having a 212-191 yd edge. On top of the 3-0 TO edge, Utah also blk'd 2 punts so it was like having 5 TO's. The most crucial TO happened at 27-14 when UA had a 1st & gl at the 2, were int'd in the EZ and ret'd 57 yds. continued on page 2

LETDOWNS AFTEŘ BIG WINS - Texas Tech upset Oklahoma and the next week suffered a huge upset to lowa St. ISU off their upset win, almost lost to Kansas. KU led 7-3 but had a 49 yd FG blk'd and then missed a 46 yd FG and then fmbl'd at the ISU14 all in the 1H. It was an almost identical situation to the previous year where KU had the yardage edge and should have had a significant 1H lead. This time they had a 178-169 yd edge and actually trailed 10-7. KU went for it on 4&1 at the 6 and got a FD to the 4 but then surprisingly opted for a 19 yd FG on 4&gl at the 1 to tie it at 10. KU punted with 11:46 and 9:12 left and ISU went on a 63/12pl drive for a 42 yd FG with 4:30 left. KU opted to punt on 4&11 with 2:37 left and ISU got 2 FD's and escaped...Nebraska was off their big win over Michigan St and was a huge HF. At the half Northwestern led 7-3 but Nebraska had a 181-160 yd edge as they fmbl'd at the N'wstrn6. NW had leads of 14-3 and 21-10 and Neb got within 21-18 with 8:55 left but NW went 66/13pl for a 1yd TD run with 1:34 left to put it away. Neb got a TD with :18 left for the final score which helped them finish with a 468-411 yd edge.

FRONTDOOR COVERS - Miami scored on all four 1H poss and had a 300-106 yd edge but Duke, trailing 35-14 was SOD at the UM14, int'd at their own 27 and UM drove 27/2pl for a TD and then Duke fumbled at their own 21 and UM drove 21/4pl for a 6 yd TD run with 5:23 left to put the game Over the total...Stanford has played by the same MO for most of the year. It was close in the 3Q vs Oregon St. In fact, there were a couple of key plays. Late in the 1H SU had a 4 yd pass which was fumbled and ret'd for a TD but a personal foul call on a hit to the WR wiped it out. Later, OSU on 3&11 got a 31 yd screen pass deep int'd in SU terr but a holding call wiped it out. At the time they trailed just 17-13. SU got a 27 yd TD pass with 2:40 left in the quarter then after rec'ing a fmbl went 24/3pl for a TD then got ahead of the spread with a 95/13pl drive for an 8 yd TD run with 6:07 left. OSU got to the SU22 with 4:42 left. SU did finish with a 507-285 yd edge despite playing in a huge situational disadvantage coming off a triple OT win vs USC with Oregon on deck...Idaho scored a TD with 9:57 left to pull within 22-17 of San Jose then got a TD and 2pt with 3:59 left, 25-22. On what appeared to be the frontdoor push on the total Idaho got the ball back and on 3&5 ripped off a 70 yd run to the 10. SJ used their last time-out but thanks to the long run ID was able to tuck in a TD with 1:49 left and then SJS went 76/3pl getting a 47 yd TD pass with 1:08 left and had ID got just gotten a FD they likely would have run out the clock to finish with a 47 pt final

The Bucks fell behind Indy (1-7) 10-0 before using big plays via the run gm to grind out a 34-20 win over the Hoosiers in which they had 3 100 yd rushers for the 1st time S/89. Leading by just 7 with 4:07 left the Bucks got an int at their own 28 before adding a TD with 2:41 left for the final. OSU had 0 100 yd rushers in the 1st 5 with LT Adams susp'd (154 ypg, 3.7) but have had 6 in the 4 gms he's played (267, 5.4). Bucks have struggled vs mobile QB's TY all'g 169 ypg (3.8). QB Ash threw just 3 1H passes vs TT and is avg 134 (60%) with a 3-5 ratio in B12 play. Burly Fr Bergeron had 87 yd in the 1st 6 gms but has had 100 yd in B2B gms (327, 7.8). UT is #9 FBS rush D (95, 3.5). Tigers led Baylor 14-13 at HT but couldn't contain the Bears in the 2H who had a school rec'd 697 yds in a 42-39 loss. VT is 20-2 SU (17-5 ATS) as a conf AF but GT has only been a conf HD four times in 7Y going 3-1 ATS defeating Clem 2 wk ago. Friday, November 11th • Usf at SYRACUSE - Syr has been a dog of at least 6' in all 6 BE meetings and after dropping the first 5 both SU and ATS, pulled the upset LY. The 1st 4 of the series saw USF outgaining them by 264 ypg giving us a pair of 5★ LPS winners incl our '07 Coll GOY when USF (-16') rolled to a 41-10 home win. USF is playing with legit revenge but is on a 2nd str AG and a short wk. Saturday, November 12th • Pitt 20 LOUISVILLE 17 - Various inj's on the off, two 3Q TO's and a late missed FG were the difference from Pitt controlling their own destiny in the BE (outgained Cincy 397-366 in a 3 pt loss, covered as a 4★ LPS winner and 3★ on these pgs) and now needing wins in 2 of their L/3 to become bowl elig. After a rough start to the ssn the Cardinals have now won 3 str (5-0 ATS run) to move up in the standings. CU QB Boyd is #17 FBS pass eff avg 295 ypg (61%) with a 25-5 ratio. RB Ellington DNP LY in this gm and missed 2W ago (inj, CS) while Fr bkps rushed for 93 yds (3.9) and had 2 costly fmbl's. LW WF gave ND all it could handle and actually led 17-10 at HT but was shutout in the 2H losing 24-17. The Deacs fmbl'd inside the ND10 and missed a 42 yd FG with 5:24 left on their final drive. QB Price is avg 239 ypg (62%) with a 15-6 ratio and ACC leading WR Givens has 985 (17.0). With RB Harris battling inj L/4, Grobe said, "If I could put a run gm together (105 ypg, 3.0) I will have died and gone to heaven." Teams off a home gm vs ND who travel in conf play are 1-4 ATS. VIRGINIA 31 Duke 21 - Before LY's win over UVA the last time Duke had beaten a conf opponent 3 straight seasons was vs WF ('93-'95). Duke has covered 4 str in the series. LY UVA made a comeback and took the lead 48-47 with 2:06 left but gave up a TD with :40 left. LW UVA led just 14-13 1H but dominated the 2H for a 31-13 win (-3) over MD cashing a 3★ LPS with a ssn high 527 yds. QB Rocco has passed for 533 yds (61%) and after a 3-8 ratio is 4-1 the L/2. UVA's big OL (307 lbs) takes adv of small DE's (Duke 232) as the run gm is avg 190 ypg (4.6) featuring "Superman" RB Jones (1106, 6.3 ttl off). Duke D has all'd 240+ rush ypg in 3 of L/4. LW Duke could not stop Miami losing 49-14. QB Renfree is avg 242 ypg (67%) with a 7-8 ratio and now faces the ACC's #3 pass D that has struggled vs above avg pass attacks. Duke's receiving unit has had big gms the L/2 vs UVA and that looks to be the key matchup again. BC's nightmare continued losing 4 TO's leading to an embarrassing 38-7 loss to FSU on ESPN last Thurs. This is BC's 1st losing ssn S/98 and the rebuilding has already began. BC's offense struggled but added a wrinkle with rFr QB Bordner who was successful running the read option vs FSU. O'Brien took Withers comments and motivated NCSt to their Eth strugin away the Heale 12 0 and their 1st shuffer if the series C/06 1100 to 100 to motivated NCSt to their 5th str win over the Heels 13-0 and their 1st shutout in the series S/60. NCSt had all'd 3 of 4 ACC opp's over 400 yds offense but LW held NC to 165 yds, knocking QB Renner out in 2Q and held the NC run gm (avg 190 ypg) to an eye popping 3 yds!! Both are playing a lot of frosh after being hit hard by inj's. BC has the sked edge off a Thurs gm while NCSt is making a 3rd road trip in 4W and is 1-6 ATS off an NC win. Spaz is on a 1-11 ATS run at home after starting 5-0.

Buffalo 28 EASTERN MICH 27 - EM has won all 4 (3-1 ATS) covering B2B gms. LY they met in gm 11 with UB last in scoring off and EM last in IA in scoring def. EM pulled the upset as a 7 pt AD and they all'd a ssn best 16 FD's and 17 pts. EM had only been a fav twice from '07-'10 losing outright to Army in '09 and Toledo in '08. TY they were a HF 4x's going 3-1 SU but 0-4 ATS, incl LW's outright loss to Ball St, 33-31 (-2) despite a 501-375 yd edge, giving up a FG in the final min. UB went 1-5 SU/ATS as a conf AD in Quinn's 1st year but is 0-5 SU but 2-3 ATS (lost L/3) TY. EM QB Gillett had his best gm of the ssn hitting 12-17-196 with a 4-0 ratio and rushed for 126 yds and is the top rusher with 565 (4.7). UB is off a bye but vs Miami, trailing just 14-13 lost their #1 WR, Alex Neutz, and were outscored 27-0 from then on. Ags' #1 rusher Michael (899, 6.0) and WR Swope (874, 14.6) were KO'd in the 4Q (CS). A&M allows 110 rush ypg (3.0). KSU took advantage of 4 TO's and traded big play blows with #3 OSU but couldn't cash it in the EZ on 3 pass plays from the OSUS with :12 left in a 52-45 loss. Tough guy Klein leads FBS QB's in rushing (906, 4.4) with more att on the ground than thru the air (136, 58%, 9-4). KSU is #96 pass eff D (303, 66%, 19-14). The Cats are +11 in TO margin while the Ags are -10. A&M is 0-4 ATS outside of College Station TY while KSU is 3-1 at home vs FBS tms pulling outright upsets of Baylor and Missouri. Kent St 27 AKRON 14 - 12 miles apart and play for the Wagon Wheel Trophy, which KSU has not won in

Kent St 27 AKRON 14 - 12 miles apart and play for the Wagon Wheel Trophy, which KSU has not won in B2B yrs S/87-'88. UA has won 9 of 10 at home in the series with 3 str covers incl B2B outright upsets. The HT had covered 5 str prior to UA's cover LY as a 17' pt AD (17-28). This is UA's home finale and in that role LY they got their only win of the ssn. KSU beat CM 24-21 as a 1 pt HF with a 422-402 yd edge but despite leading 24-14 in the 4Q needed CM to miss a game tying FG to hold on. Baylor 44 KANSAS 30 - The HT has won all 7 B12 matchups and KU has won all 3 at home by 30 ppg going 4-2 ATS in the series. LY BU not only won 55-7 but they finished +408 in yds. BU is 6-1 ATS in the rare role of AF S/98 (0-1 TY). Under Gill KU is 2-5 as a conf HD. Thanks to a fmbl at the MO1 and a missed 27 yd FG BU trailed MO 14-13 at the half LW before rallying to take a 42-25 lead with 7:05 left. MO scored twice before the Bears rec'd an onside K to secure the win. The Bears have totalled 429 yds or more in every gm TY including 600+ in 3 of their L/4! QB Griffin (348, 74%, 26-4, 386 rush) is #2 FBS ttl off and #3 pass eff. Bears are allowing 212 rush ypg (5.7). KU blew several opp to get their 1st B12 win as they drove to ISU's 32, 19, 23 and 2 but had a FG blk'd, missed a 36 yd'r, fmbl'd at the ISU14 and hit a 19 yd FG in a 13-10 loss which eliminated the Hawks from bowl contention. After being held to -2 yds on the ground vs Texas KU ran for 174 vs the Clones (best since TT in Wk 4). KU is still last FBS in D allowing 541 ypg with ISU's 426 yds its fewest all'd to an FBS tm TY. BU is 0-3 SU/ATS on the road TY but needs 1 more win for their 1st B2B bowl bids S/91-92 with OU, TT and UT on deck.

AIR FORCE 38 Wyoming 28 - AF has won 5 str holding WY to 246 yds or less 4x's but has failed to cover the L/2 as a DD fav. AF went 5-0 ATS as a conf HF in Calhoun's 1st 2Y but in the L/3Y have gone 2-6 ATS (0-2 TY). WY is 6-1 ATS as a conf AD under Christensen (only loss TCU). We like to use AF in big games as in '97 we used Air Force (+2') as our Coll GOY and they delivered the outright upset, 14-3, and LW they cashed as our Coll Totals GOY (Under 58) beating Army 24-14 (-4). It was truly a tale of 2 halves LW as AF was outgained 286-81, outFD'd 15-6 and trailed 14-0 at HT, but held Army to just 80 yds, 5 FD's and 0 pts in the 2H and came away with their 2nd str CIC Trophy. WY is off the battle of MW undefeateds and actually led TCU 20-17 mid-3Q but stellar frosh QB Smith was KO'd early 4Q and the off stalled down the stretch, losing 31-20 (+19). WY was outFD'd 28-15 and outgained 617-353 but stayed in it as the D forced 5 TO's incl 3 inside WY's 10. Smith should go TW and is avg 234 ypg (61%) with a 13-5 ratio. Both tms struggle on run D (AF #111 FBS, WY #115 FBS), but that especially doesn't bode well for WY as AF is #4 FBS rush off. Calhoun has struggled vs the WY D with just 291 ypg prior to LY's 445 and just 18 ppg in the 4 gms.

BYU 45 Idaho 10´- BYU is off a loss to TCU and is also off a bye after playing 9 str wks. Since taking over in the USU gm, QB Nelson is avg 202 ypg (60%) with a 12-5 ratio and the entire tm has rallied around his toughness. ID meanwhile is on the 2nd of B2B road gms and this is sandwiched by winnable conf gms. ID beat SJSt 32-29 (+8') LW. The Vandals booted a 55 yd FG to trail 22-10 at HT and there was no scoring until the 4Q, when ID went on 3 long TD drives, taking a 10 pt lead with 1:49 left. SJSt needed :41 for a TD, but ID recovered the onside. ID totaled 345 yds, its most vs an FBS tm TY, behind Bailey's career-high 163 rush yds. QB Davis played the whole way but in his 2 sts is avg a meager 98 ypg (51%) with a 1-2 ratio. BYU is just 3-7 ATS as a 20+ pt fav the L5Y. ID is 10-4 ATS as an AD but under Akey has a penchant for falling apart at the EOY going 5-17 SU (8-14 ATS) in the L/5 gms of the reg ssn S/07.

SMU 45 Navy 31 - Fourth meeting in L4Y. The HT has covered 3 str while Navy has won 4 in a row SU. In '09 our 5★ October GOM was on SMU (+7, never trailed ATS) and they should have been up by more at HT (led 14-0) but Navy made a big comeback and eeked out a 3 pt non-covering road win. LY SMU led 14-0 at HT but with the game tied at 21 threw an int at their own 19 with 1:33 left. They let Navy score but finished at the Navy25. Incl Army and Nevada this is SMU's 6th look at the option in 41 games and LY in the bowl they had a 413-229 yd edge vs Army but lost via TO's. SMU became bowl eligible LW (led Tulane 31-0 at HT) as QB McDermott and RB Line got the sputtering off back on track but did allow the Green Wave back in the gm (DN cover). Navy snapped a 6 gm losing streak with a win over Troy LW (Navy's home finale) keeping the Mids slight bowl hopes alive. QB Proctor looked good coming back from inj and the addition of RB Santiago boosted the off. Navy has gone 6-2 ATS in true AG's almost upsetting #11 SC TY. SMU is ranked #18 NCAA in rush def allowing 106 (3.1) ypg and will be the best run stop unit Navy faces TY (SM next closest at #40). Mustangs also shredded a def LW (453-271 yd edge) that is comparable to Navy (#47-107 edge).

UTAH ST 31 San Jose St 26 - USU has won and covered B2B gms. Seven of the L/10 in this series have been decided by 7 pts or less. The HT is 5-2 SU/ATS and the fav has covered 3 str. SJSt jumped all over UI early LW, building a 20-0 lead early 2Q before hitting a wall as the Spartans mustered only a safety over the next 41 min and UI scored 22 unanswered pts (more pts than UI scored in 5 gms TY) in the 4Q to knock off SJSt (-9') 32-29. QB Faulkner was 29-41-289 with 0 int (had 7 in 2 prev gms) but for the 2nd consec wk SJSt struggled to run the ball as they had just 68 yds (12 the prev gm). USU is coming off a big win LW topping UH on the road 35-31 (+3). The Aggies trailed 28-7 at HT before producing 280 of their 433 ttl yds in the 2H en route to scoring 28 of the final 31 pts, capped off by RB Turbin's 1 yd TD run with :14 left. QB Keeton left the gm with a neck inj (doubtful TW, CS) but Kennedy threw for 163 yds and 2 TD's. After a ssn filled with blown 4Q leads (5), USU will now look to build on LW's comeback.

TULSA 37 Marshall 16 - Tulsa has won both meetings but Marshall has covered both as a 13' pt AD and 16 pt HD. Tulsa is off a physical Thurs Night win at UCF (trailed at HT) and has matched EC for the most consecutive CUSA wins at 10 all-time (8-2 ATS). LW Kinne had a ssn high 29 yds rushing (251 as tm, UCF came in all'g 85 ypg), looking like his '10 form and as HC Blankenship said he "willed us down the field" on the GW TD drive (down 17-16 4Q). MU is fresh off a bye (5-10 ATS after) and their most complete gm (59-14 win vs UAB) led by QB Graham (5 TD passes, 1st time S/'03 by Stan Hill). TU is just 2-7 ATS as a HF of 14+ (0-2 TY) while MU is 3-6-1 ATS on the road under Holliday. Tulsa does have the edge on offense (#33-99). TU is 6-0 (4-2 ATS) outscoring foes 35-15 and outgaining them 460-334 if you take out OK, OKSt and Boise (ranked Top 10 non-conf foes). TU should continue to roll (5 str wins, 3 str ATS) against an MU team that is 1-4 SU on the road this yr being outscored 34-14 (-127 ypg).

BOISE ST 37 Tcu 21 - The 3 bowl meetings have been decided 11 ttl pts with the dog covering all 3. TCU has been a dog just 2x in 3Y. BS rates the sked edge as they are off a bye and trip to LV while TCU is on the 2nd of B2B long trips (WY LW). This was orig scheduled at TCU but the MW moved it here after TCU left the conf. LW BS was caught looking ahead and only led 21-14 at HT (LV 198-161 yd edge) before pulling away in the 2H, 48-21 (-41), which made Moore the NCAA's career leader for QB wins. Top rusher Martin (756, 5.1, 9) left early 2Q, but Harper ran for 109 (8.4) in relief. RB depth could be dangerously thin if Martin can't go (CS), but BS adapts well and if they're forced to pass,

TCU, while improved over earlier TY, ranks #65 pass eff D (225 ypg, 57%, 18-7). Moore avg 279 ypg (74%) with a 29-5 ratio (#4 FBS pass eff). LW TCU finished with 28-15 FD and 617-353 yd edges but all'd WY to hang around as the Frogs committed 5 TO's incl 3 in the redzone in a 31-20 win. QB Pachall (216 ypg, 69%, 19-5 ratio) hit 17-27-227. TCU did rush for 390 yds led by their 3-headed monster of James (181), Wesley (120,

2 TD) and Tucker (90, 2 TD) who comb for 84% of TCU's rush yds TY. A surprising stat is that Kellen Moore has never thrown a TD pass vs TCU, but that ends here.

FLORIDA ST 34 Miami, FI 24 - The visitor is 9-1 ATS with SIX str upsets. LTH the 4Q saw 4 lead

LTH the 4Q saw 4 lead changes as it was decided on the final play (FSU's was inc from the UM2) on Monday Nite to open the season. Both tms took care of business LW with FSU defeating BC on the road, 38-7, and UM defeating Duke, 49-14. FSU QB Manuel is avg 244 ypg (67%, 14-8). Noles off is firing on all cylinders outscoring opp 154-39 the L/4, and the defense (#4 ttl D) is the best since Jimbo arrived in '07. UM QB Harris has taken care of the ball (#6 pass eff) avg 219 ypg (64%) with an 18-4 ratio. RB Miller became the 1st 1,000 UM RB S/'02. UM D uncharacteristically ranked 81st vs run and is 114th in pass eff D. This is the first Nov meeting S/'91 ("wide right"). FSU is 9-19 ATS as a conf HF. UM is 10-3 ATS as a conf AD winning 7 outright incl NC TY. Nine of the L/10 have been decided by 8 pts or less in this rivalry with LV's 45-17 FSU win the largest MOV. In that game Harris battled inj throughout the game and FSU rushed for 298 yds, the most UM had given up since '08 GT option. This matchup has 4 straight OVERs.

CINCINNATI 45 West Virginia 35 - This marks the Bearcats' 2nd game at Paul Brown Stadium TY (failed to cover in 9 pt win over L'ville). UC is now fully in the BE's driver's seat after escaping with a win LW at Pitt, a gm in which they were outgained 397-366 and needed a missed FG at the end of regulation to avoid OT. WV has now dropped 2 of their L/3 in conf play incl a home defeat vs L'ville LW, a gm in which they actually outgained UL 533-351 as a blk'd FG ret'd by UL for a TD early 4Q was the momentum changer. The dog had covered 3 str prior to WV winning 37-10 as a 5 pt HF LY as Cincy had a ssn low 15 FD's and all'd a ssn high 29 FD's. WV is on an 8-4 ATS run away vs BE while the Cats are 1-4 ATS at home vs BE (all as a fav) incl being upset in 3 of those contests. Sked edge to Cincy here as they had a bye 2 wks ago and this is WV's 3rd road gm in 4W.

PENÍN ST 27 Nebraska 17 - Home finale for PSU who LY lost for 1st time in 11Y (vs MSU) but is only 1-4 ATS. PSU is fresh off a bye while the Huskers make their first trip here S/02 when the unranked Lions (+5) thrashed #8 NU, 40-7. The Rodney Dangerfield 8-1 Lions only need to win 2 of their L/3 to earn the trip to the 1st ever B10 Champ gm but there are no gimmes left with trips to Columbus (where PSU is 1-8) and Madison left. Suspect PSU off's 251 yds is still the most Bama's #1 D has all'd in '11 with Redd's 5 straight 100 yd gms (1006, 5.2) the 1st in the program S/97. QB McGloin (133, 56%, 7-3) hasn't exactly been Aaron Rodgers as the Lions are #106 pass eff. The Lions have been tough up front all 112 rush ypg (3.1) with 7 TD's all'd in 6 HG's (3 to Bama). The Huskers lost to an unranked tm at home for the 5th straight ssn as 17' pt dog NW beat NU as yet another OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNER for our Big Dog POW. Despite losing QB Persa in the 1H to a shoulder inj the Cats never trailed as they had a 207-122 rush yd edge. Neb did fmbl inside the NW5 and at the NW20 but the Blackshirts also got a sk/fmbl at the NU36, flipped the field with a 55 yd IR and a missed 45 yd FG. Burkhead (951, 5.1) and Martinez (172, 59%, 10-7, 712 rush) were both held in check by the Cats D. Blackshirts are thin up front allowing 183 rush ypg (4.3) in B10 play. This is a great situational edge for the HD Lions who give the Huskers their 2nd B10 road reality check.

Okľahoma St 51 TEXAS TĚCH 44 - The home team is now 8-1 SÚ (OSU is 5-1 ATS) after OSU pulled the upset LY getting their 1st win in Lubbock S/44. OSU is 10-0 SU/ATS outside of Stillwater the L2Y and is 8-0 ATS as a B12 AF. TT is 6-1 ATS as a conf HD. TT is 23-3 SU and 20-4 ATS in home finales. TT has lost 3 straight HG's for the 1st time S/91 and they are 1-3 ATS in Lubbock TY vs FBS foes and 1-5 SU/2-4 ATS in B12 HG's. Wildly inconsistent Raiders have fallen behind the B12's worst (ISU and KU) by a combined 41-0 yet have outFD'd (by 10 per gm) and outgained (by 136 ypg) the B12's ranked tms (KSU, A&M and OU). Since their historic upset of OU TT has been dominated the L/2 getting outrushed by 339 ypg!! QB Doege (351, 69%, 24-6) and the off have become one dimensional without #1 rusher Stephens (OFY). Raiders are #72 pass eff D (204, 56%, 14-5) as tms have elected to move it on the ground (#118-249, 5.3). Despite 4 TO's OSU held off the pesky Cats who had 3 shots at the Cowboys 5 with :12 left to tie or take the lead but came up empty. OSU QB Weeden (357, 72%, 26-9) and WR Blackmon (87, 1039, 12 TD) had TO's which cost the Cowboys pts (61 IR TD, 2 Blackmon fmbl's which set up a FG and into EZ for a TB). OSU remains #1 FBS in TO margin at +17 and are #12 pass eff D (266, 60%, 10-18). OSU barely keeps pace.

IOWA 21 Michigan St 20 - HC. UI has covered L/5 and 8 of 9 overall which includes going 5-0 SU/ATS at home covering by 18 ppg. LY also at home they beat #5 MSU 37-6 (led 31-0 at HT). lowa is just 1-4-1 ATS in home finales. The L3Y MSU's rush attack has been held to 69 ypg (2.4) but UI's DL featured 3 NFL DC while that may not be the case TY (181 rush ypg, 4.3 in B10 play). MSU struggled to get past the scrappy Gophers 31-24 as they trailed 24-21 going into the 4Q and were outgained 415-402 as they relied on an int at the MSU23 with :14 left to seal the deal. LY's #1 rusher Baker (492, 4.2) lost another fmbl and was benched for Bell (528, 5.2). MSU is avg just 8.7 ppg and 289 ypg on the road TY. MSU allows 104 rush ypg (2.9). lowa led 24-9 early 4Q but had to hang on to pull the upset of Mich as a 3★ LPS. UM had a long TD run called back, dropped a TD pass and had 1 ruled OOB on their final drive as they threw inc on 4 passes at the UI3 with no time left. Coker (1101, 5.2) is the B10's #1 rusher. UI has home, series and ST (#44-81) edges to pull yet another stunner and take the Leaders lead.

ARKANSAS 38 Tennessee 17 - LTH ('06) both tms came in ranked but UT (+5') trailed 14-0 and 31-7 prior to a late garbage TD drive wi:30 left (31-14). UT is 6-2 SU but 2-6 ATS in the series and the HT is 5-1 ATS. Ark is 11-4-1 as a HF (4-1 TY). UT is off MT while the Hogs just faced #9 SC. Tenn frosh QB Worley's 2nd start was much smoother than his 1st. After throwing for just 105 yds (38%, 0-2 ratio) in a loss to SC, Worley nearly had that doubled at HT LW and finished with 291 yds (72%, 1-0) as we cashed a 4★ LPS on Tenn (-21') in the 24-0 win. With Ark's 44-28 win (-5) over SC LW cashing our free Comp Play of the Day and LSU's win over Bama, the Hogs now have a shot at a BCS gm and the SEC West Title if they win out. QB Wilson is avg 292 ypg (62%) with a 15-4 ratio. Since UT HC Dooley arrived he's followed the script winning as a fav (10-0 SU/8-2 ATS) and losing as a dog (0-12 SU/2-10 ATS). Tenn has the def edge (#23-37) but Ark has the off (#14-68) and ST edge (#21-51) and it's tough to back a true frosh QB making his 1st road start vs Petrino who is 8-0 ATS as a conf HF covering by an avg of 9 ppg here and is on an incredible 19-3 ATS run overall at home.

SOUTH CARŌLINA 17 Florida 16 - UF has won 17 of 19 but SC pulled the upset in the Swamp LY holding UF to 67 yds thru 3Q (395-226 gm) claiming the SEC East. Not only has SC NEVER been fav vs UF since joining the SEC (*92) but they've been a DD dog 14 of 19 and have been a dog under a TD only twice (LY +6). SC lost control of their SEC East destiny LW in the 44-28 (+5) loss to Ark (outgained 435-207). QB Shaw has struggled since the UK gm and has avg just 123 ypg (65%, 2-4 ratio in his L/3 starts) and left the gm late in the 4Q w/an apparent concussion and DNR (CS). SC also clearly missed the services of RB Lattimore (OFY) rushing for only 79 yds (2.4) their lowest total of the ssn vs an Ark D that was all'g 249 rush ypg (5.3) in its L/5! UF finally got its ground gm going (46 ypg L/4) in the 26-21 win over Vandy. Despite Rainey being out (ankle, CS), the Gators had 197 rush yd (4.3) as Demps ran for a career-high 158 (6.9) as they ran several plays out of the Pistol. QB Brantley got the start again despite not being 100% and is avg 194 ypg (59%, 6-3) but left the gm in the 4Q (CS). SC is 3-5 ATS as a conf HF (2-1 TY) and UF after being a conf dog only twice from '05-'09, is 1-4 the L2Y in that role. UF has covered 11 of 16 true SEC AG's and has a huge ST's edge (#3-83) but with so many key players?, we'll wait for a solid line later in the week and call for the HT by 1.

HOU has big edges with Schaub (13-6 ratio) over Freeman (8-10 ratio), the tandem of Foster/ Tate (1279 yds 4.9 combined) vs Blount (67 ypg 4.4) who has been pressed into a 3 Dn RB role due to injuries. CIN has played 4 games with misleading finals (CLE, JAX, IND, SEA) against teams that are 28th or lower in our power ratings. They have been outgained in 2 of those matchups and by 30 ypg overall. KANSAS CITY 24 Denver 21 - The Dog is 5-1 ATS in the series with DEN covering both LY. KC has a great situational edge at home for the 3rd straight while series will be covering 3rd road game in 4 Wks. KC comes in with the #12 and #20 units (+4 TO) vs the Broncos #22 and #21 units (+1 TO) over the L4W. 1st & 2nd year QB's are 6-19 SU at Arrowhead and going into LW's game DEN was 1 of 6 teams with 4 OL that have been tagged with at least 4 penalties. While the Jags defense has improved by 65 ypg and 5.8 ppg the offense is 98 ypg and 9.8 ppg worse than 2010's #15 offense. Over the L4W JAX has the #32 and #4 units (0 TO) but they've played 4 straight top 5 defenses and 3 straight teams in our power ratings top 10. Gabbert's only avg'd 130 yds (44%) with a 3-2 ratio in the L4W and the Jags WR's are so bad they claimed Brian Robiskie after CLE released him. IND has only one the yardage battle in 1 game TY (TEN) and have given up 350 or more yards 6 times TY. On the surface this looks to be a big offensive show with DAL #7 offense taking on the Bills #12 offense. DAL has only been held to under 350 yds once TY (PHI) but they have struggled to convert into points as they owned the #30 red-zone offense prior to SEA. DAL has Iney nave struggled to convert into points as they owned the #30 red-zone oriense prior to SEA. DAL has logged a 424-312 yd edge at home but the only game they've dominated was vs STL. LW they lost WR Austin (hamstring) again and defenses are taking away Romo's security blanket in Witten (44 rec 12.5). It wasn't a big surprise the Bills struggled against the Jets stellar secondary LW and were outgained 191-73 in the 114. Fitzpatrick had an awful 1H with 24 yds passing on just 4 completions with 2 int's. RB Jackson has rushed for 100 yds in 7 of 8 games TY but the Cowboys aren't pushovers at 102 ypg (4.2). A week after a heartbreaking 3OT loss to Stanford, USC won on a rare Fri night game vs Colo as QB Barkley threw a school rec'd 6 TD's (3rd time TY with at least 5 TD passes) en route to a 42-17 Marquee winner on the Over. LY USC missed a FG that would have put them up 5 and then all'd UW to get a 32 yd FG on the last play and lost 32-31 in a gm that featured 8 lead changes. USC is 3-8 ATS as a conf HF but hasn't lost 3 consec to UW since the early '90's and it is hard for us to see that happening here. MIA has been playing tough since their bye while the Redskins have been reeling due to injuries and bad QB play. WAS is off a misleading final vs SF as they were down 19-3 halfway thru the 4Q before SF relaxed. Beck stats aren't that bad (247 ypg 62% 2-4 in 3 starts) but he's not getting a lot out of the run game (53 ypg 3.3 L4W). While WAS's defense has struggled lately they are a capable stop unit that can pressure the QB (#2 25 sks). MIA is only 5-19 ATS at home, happy to have their 1st win of the season and we'll call for them by 4 vs a WAS team angry over where their season went

New Orleans 30 ATLANTA 21 - The Dog has covered 4 straight in the series. NO has the stat edge over the L4W with the #2 and #14 units (-3 TO) vs the Falcons #21 and #7 units (+2 TO). ATL finds itself the HD despite 3 straight wins as they've been under whelming in 2011. Only 1-3 SU/ATS TY vs foes with a .500 or better record the Falcons have only dominated CAR and IND TY. They have been outgained in all 3 home games by a 414-298 yd margin. Minus the CAR/IND games Ryan has avg'd a mediocre 233 ypg (61%) with an 8-8 ratio (77.5 QBR). NO has had it's share of problems on the road (1-4 ATS) with its only cover being vs the Jaguars. ARZ is 0-11 SU and 3-8 ATS on the road losing by an avg score of 29-14. They have been outgained 363-287 TY with a staggering -12 TO. They've only won the yardage battle in 2 games TY and have only had 250 yds passing once since the opener vs CAR. The defense allowed 30 or more pts in 4 straight games before facing the 1 win Rams at home LW. Now they have to go cross country to face a PHI team that is much better than their record. The Eagles have won the yardage battle in every game TY by an avg of 119 ypg but a -10 mark in their 1st 5 games has hurt them. PHI's #7 sack defense could have a field day as ARZ bit a 10 minute of the second second

Baltimore 24 SEATTLE 21 - BAL is off SNF vs PIT (4-9 ATS after) with CIN & a Thanksgiving Harbaugh vs Harbaugh matchup on deck. The Ravens continue to rely on their D & while the 294 ypg they are allowing on the road is still above avg the Flacco led offense has only gained 229 yds and 146 yds in losses at TEN and JAX. SEA returns home after a 23-13 loss to DAL & Despite Jackson throwing 3 int's in his 1st start since the NYG upset (inj'd) the 381 yds & 18-18 FD log were a positive sign. SEA is 7-4 ATS at home under the fiery HC Carroll & his enthusiasm has brought back the 12th man edge. This season in the Seahawks 3 HGs they pulled the upset over ARZ (13-10, +3) stood toe to toe in the cover vs ATL (28-30, +5) & outgained CIN (411-252). The Ravens have failed to cover all 3 games this year

CSU is fresh off a bye and has the weather and altitude edges, but is struggling at 3-5 SU (1-7 ATS) after a loss to LV 2 wks ago. SDSt got back on track with a 35-7 (-35) win over NM LW finishing with 23-8 FD and 486-162 yd edges. RB Hillman finished with 141 yds and leads the FBS in ttl rush yds (#2 rushing). He could have a field day as CSU all's 226 ypg rush (5.6) and 20 TD (#114 FBS). The Aztecs have actually won 3 in a row in Ft Collins but all as a dog. SDSt is just 14-1 ATS as an AF the L/3Y and CSU is 8-3 as a HD under Fairchild plus the dog has covered 7 straight with five OUTRIGHT upsets.

Alabama 30 MISS ST 6 - Bama has won and covered 3 str outgaining Miss St by 192 ypg (avg win 31-7). Bama is 12-2 SU (9-5 ATS) away vs the SEC. The Tide have to be "kicking" themselves after LW's 9-6 OT loss at home vs #2 LSU. Incl OT, Bama had 7 trips inside LSU35 but came away with just 6 ttl pts as they missed 3 FG's, had another blk'd (ret'd 26 yds) and on the gm's biggest play, WR Maze out of the Wildcat at the LSU28 underthrew a sure TD pass to a wide-open TE and while both players had their hands on the ball, the LSU DB was awarded the int at the LSU1. Bama did have a 295-239 yd edge and Heisman hopeful Richardson had another great outing with 169 ttl yds and now leads with 1,078 rush (7.3) and 17 TD. QB McCarron (207 ypg, 66%, 10-4) did throw for 199 yds but had a costly int. Miss St is off a 55-17 win over UT-Martin as they racked up 570 yds and never trailed (all'd 454 yds). HC Mullen has used both Russell (better passer) and Relf (runner) at QB the L2W taking advantage of their strengths but it will tough vs the #1 D all'g just 187 ypg and 7.1 ppg. While this is an obvious bubble burst for Bama, who is 0-4 ATS following a gm vs a Top 7 tm, MSU is just 1-7 ATS vs Top 4 tms S/'05 and has failed to score a TD in 5 of those gms. In 1992 we used Miss St at home and they delivered as our College GOY vs Bama. Could we go back to the series again

with Bama clearly angry over LW's missed opportunity?

ASU did however lose its hold on the P12 South in a loss to UCLA despite 29-19 FD, 465-416 yd and 2-0 TO edges, ASU missed 3 FG's (one as time expired) and all'd a late Bruins TD drive (33 yd pass on 3&29). The Cougars lost their 5th str LW vs Cal, a gm in which they had more penalty yds (61) than total off (55) at the half, LY ASU was coming off an embarrassing 33 pt loss to Cal and dominated WSU 42-0 (-21'). UM went 8-2 ATS vs non-conf foes in HC Nutt's 1st 2Y here but is 3-4 ATS since. Tough spot for LT as its playing the 2nd of 3 consec AG's and the 4th AG in the L/5W, but the road has been kind to LT as they are 6-2 SU/7-1 ATS and are on a 5-0 ATS run in AG's TY. LT is fresh off a 41-21 (+3') win over FSÚ as QB Cameron threw for a career-high 358 and 4 TD. UM led UK 13-10 in the 4Q LW before all'g 20 unanswered in a 30-13 loss (-1), their school rec'd 11th str SEC loss. It marked the 3rd consec wk UM led or was tied but couldn't hold and became the 1st SEC team eliminated from postssn. UM is

playing for pride the rest of the way out and Nutt is on the hottest seat in all of CFB. **Wisconsin 52 MINNESOTA 17** - While UW has won 7 str in this series they are 0-4 ATS when laying DD. The dog has covered 4 str (MOV 7.7 ppg) and there have been 11 str OVERs (68 ppg). LY UW only led 14-9 at HT but the Badgers scored TD's on their 1st 4 2H poss. After B2B heartbreaking last minute losses to MSU and OSU UW mauled PU, 62-17 with 30-14 FD and 605-284 yd edges. #1 FBS pass eff QB Wilson (249, 72%, 21-3) and FBS's #1 scorer Ball (1076, 6.6, 24 TD) got back on track. Thin Badgers D still all'g an uncharacteristic 176 rush ypg (4.2) in conf play. Mininy stuck with MSU actually still all the properties of Badgers D still all g an uncnaracteristic 1/6 rush ypg (4.2) in conii piay, willing stuck with MSU23 to outFD (22-19) and outgaining (415-402) the Legends leader before throwing an int at the MSU23 to end all hopes. QB Gray may've turned the corner avg 244 ypg (61%) with a 4-2 ratio and 133 rush yds the L/2. UM is still being overwhelmed at the LOS all'g 260 rush ypg (5.9) in B10 play. This is UW's 3rd B10 night AG but this one won't come down to the final play (see System on page 8).

Notre Dame 45 Maryland 17 - FedEx Field, Landover, MD. Only previous meeting was in '02, a 22-0 in '09 in 2011 (name back from an early 14-0 deficit) and was 2-1 vs

ND win. Edsall won at ND, 33-30 in '09 in 20T (came back from an early 14-0 deficit) and was 2-1 vs. Kelly while at Conn. ND looked flat footed in 1H vs Wake LW trailing 17-10 but snuck out with a 24-17 win. It was the smallest venue to host ND S/'45. Kelly is now 12-0 in Nov. QB Rees is avg 233 ypg (66%) with a 17-10 ratio but ball security continues to be an issue for ND (2 TO's LW). RB's Gray and Wood lead a run gm avg 174 ypg (5.5) behind an OL that hasn't given up a sk since Sept 24th (5 TY). They now face a depleted DL all'g 233 rush ypg (4.9). ND's DL depth is hurting and they started 3 Fr vs WF's misdirection run gm and they struggled early. MD is off a 31-13 loss to UVa as MD lost 5 TO's and dropped its 5th str. Edsall is going with the 2 QB system and while O'Brien looked spot on LW, the WR's struggled with drops. Meanwhile the D only has enough depth for one half. ND has had 2 blowouts in these neutral site gms (40-14 vs Wash St '09, 27-3 vs Army LY) and has huge edges on off (#16-69) and def (#10-89). Fresno St 42 NEW MEXICO ST 38 - FSU has never lost to NMSt winning all 17 meetings (3-5 ATS)

and has been a 12+ pt fav in all 6 WAC matchups. However, NMSt has covered 4 of the L/5 as a DD dog incl LY as a 30 pt dog (33-10) as they were only outgained 354-267. Three of the L/5 have been decided by 7 or less. Both tms were roughed up LW. NMSt trailed UGA just 7-3 early 2Q before being rolled 63-16 (+33') and lost starting QB Christian (who was playing with a shldr inj) when he made a tkl on an IR right before HT (CS). A slow start (14-0 after 1Q, 34-7 at HT) doomed FSU as it fell to LT 41-21 (-3'). NMSt is 2-5 ATS as a conf HD under HC Walker with both covers +14' or less and all 5 L's of +16 or more while FSU is 7-0 SU/6-1 ATS as a conf AF. This is a must-win gm for FSU to remain in the WAC hunt while also trying to seek its 12th bowl bid in L/13 yrs.

SOUTHERN MISS 30 Ucf 13 - While SM has won 3 str and 5 of 6, the visitor has covered 4 str pulling 2 upsets. LY #25 UCF was a 10 pt HF but after they jumped out to a 14-0 lead, SM scored the next 31. UCF is off a rare home loss (led at HT and in 4Q) vs Tulsa. QB Godfrey has played well the L2W (569 ttl yds, 64% of off) but losses have mounted due to TO's and not making plays. SM has reeled off 7 str wins both SU/ATS with the avg MOV by 24 ppg. LW vs EC they were outgained by 121 yds and scored 4 non-off TD's. SM has the off (#31-61) and ST (#39-101) edges. UCF is 9-4 ATS as a conf AD but is 0-4 SU/ATS in AG's TY. Red-hot SM most likely locks up the CUSA East with a win here (UAB and Mem on deck), HC Fedora is 9-3 SU/10-2 ATS during the L/4 gms of the reg ssn here and has stressed winning at "The Rock" and SM is on a 16-2 SU/12-6 ATS run incl 2-0 SU/ATS TY as a CUSA HF winning each by 24 pts with a 554-280 yd edge.

East Carolina 31 UTEP 28 - Only prior meetings in '07 and '08 with EC winning and covering both. EC is off a loss vs East Div fav SM (+121 yds but all'd 4 def/ST TD's) but over the last month has played a lot better (3-1 SU/ATS) as QB Davis looks like his '10 form (318 pass ypg, 73%, 8-5 ratio, 4 rush TD). UTEP LW took a lead into the 4Q at Rice but wore down all'g 671 yds in a tough loss. The Miners rarely sub on D and it has shown at times in the 2H TY. EC has been a DD fav/dog in every AG TY but is 5-2 ATS on the road in between the 3's. UTEP has played very well hosting FBS schools TY (2-1 ATS) being outgained by 53 ypg but that incl ranked UH (9-0) and SM (8-1). Miners have a large ST edge (#2-113) Each tm is 2 wins away from bowl elig so the winner here would go a long way for a possible post ssn berth. UTEP ("U Take 'Em Pts") still applies vs CUSA tms as the dog is 20-10 ATS in the Sun Bowl.

COLORADO 45 Arizona 44 - 1st meeting in 25Y and a matchup between the tms that have played our toughest sked TY (CU #1, AZ #2). Despite the return of RB Stewart (leading rusher and rec), the Buffs dropped their 7th str ATS as USC's offense was too much to handle (all'd 561 yds, their 5th str all'g 500+). AZ was also dealt another loss despite outgaining Utah 457-332. FHG for CU (7-0 ATS run in that role) and they were 5-2-1 ATS at home vs B12 tms but haven't fared as well in that role vs P12 going 0-3 ATS. AZ meanwhile is on a 1-5-1 ATS run on the road vs conf foes the L2Y (7 consec SU losses away). With CU becoming healthier and having a potential weather edge, could this be the week they finally break into the P12 win column?

NEW MEXICO 24 Univ 23 - LV has covered the L/3 and LY had a ssn high 415 yds and was +3 in TO's winning 45-10 as a DD HF. LV was 0-7 ATS on the road LY and their avg line was +19, as they got outgained by 217 ypg, failing to cover by 16 ppg and the cumulative HT score was 27-210. LV, with nothing to lose, hung around vs Boise, trailing 21-14 at HT with a 198-161 yd edge. BS pulled away in the 2H and won 48-21 (-41). QB Herring did leave in the 2H (CS). NM is off a 35-7 loss to SDSt (outgained 486-162, outFD'd 23-8) but did score their 1st TD in 141:06. NM has now scored a comb 14 pts the L/4 gms and has 0 pts in the 2H of the L/3. Both rank in our bottom 5 on off and def, but LV rates a large 's edge (#23-118). In '01 we used NM (-2') at home as our GOY and they beat LV by DD's.

ARKANSAS ST 37 Louisiana 27 - Battlè for SBC supremacy. UL is 5-1 ATS vs ASU and has won and covered 3 str. LTH UL (+13') came away with a 21-18 win outgaining ASU 376-239. QB Applin is emerging as a dual-threat option avg 316 ttl ypg with 19 ttl TD's. UL is off a hard fought home victory vs ULM, 36-35. QB Gautier is coming off a 355 yd performance incl a 4-0 ratio. UL is on its 3rd AG in 4W playing for an 11th str wk while ASU is playing only its 3rd gm in 24 days. ASU has the edges all around (off #58-81, def #61-94, and ST #34-63). While 10 of the L/12 in this series have been decided by less than a TD, the HT is 10-1 SU and ASÚ will capitalize on that and remain on top of the SBC standings.

TROY 28 North Texas 20 - Troy has won 6 str and covered 3 of the L/4. They've won and covered B2B HG's (-20', -21') outgaining NT by 295 ypg. Big sked edge here to NT off a bye while Troy is off a road trip to Navy having just defended the option. Troy's struggles cont'd LW as they lost 42-14 and it would've been worse had Navy not pulled their st'rs late 3Q. Troy all'd over 500 ttl yds for the 3rd str gm. Troy is 10-7 ATS as a conf HF, but just 1-5 dating back to LY. NT went 3-1 ATS as a conf AD LY, but are 0-3 in that role TY. RB Dunbar is the NT offense as he avg 123 ttl ypg and will be needed as NT may be without st'g QB Thompson (concussion 2W ago, CS). NT is a diff tm away from home as they are being outscored 38-13, outgained 457-275, and outFD'd 23-15.

ULM 34 Middle Tenn 27 - MT has covered B2B gms, won 5 str and 9 of 10 being a fav in each. MT is on their 3rd road game in 4W and ply'd "big brother" Tenn LW where they were shutout 24-0. QB Kilgore was benched as he had just 25 yds (40%, 0-1 ratio). Still, he is having a solid ssn avg 237 ypg (59%) with a 16-10 ratio. The Blue Raiders are only 3-6 ATS as a conf AD the L4Y but LY went 1-0 beating the SBC Champ in the ssn finale and covered vs Troy earlier TY. ULM lost vs instate rival UL, 36-35 (+5) to continue an SBC trend as the conf dog is 15-8 incl 10 outright upsets TY. They have a decent QB of their own in Browning who is avg 207 ypg (59%) with a 9-5 ratio. ULM has the D edge (#70-112) but MT has the off (#77-93) and ST's (#74-117) edges. Both have underachieved TY and it will be interesting to see how ULM responds to the fav role here as the last time ULM was favored was back in '99 (-6, 10-0).

FIU 31 Florida Atlantic 17 - Not much of a rivalry with FAU winning and covering 5 str pulling the outright upset the L/2Y. FIU is just 3-7 ATS as a conf HF the L/3Y while the L/2Y FAU has gone 1-4-1 ATS away vs conf (were 9-4 ATS the prev 4Y). FIU's conf title hopes seemingly vanished LW after losing at WKU on a FG with no time left, 10-9. They were lucky to have the lead near the end of the game as they were outFD'd 22-8 and outgained 324-180. FAU remained winless getting blown out again, this time by ASU, 39-21. They have now lost 11 str dating back to LY. RB Morris is the Owls only threat as he is avg 88 rush ypg (5.4) with 4 TD. Not surprisingly, FIU has the edges on off (#88-119) and D (#63-102). With conf title aspirations now gone, FIU would still like to snap the losing streak to FAU.

LSU 41 Wku 0 - It's obvious that one of these tms is in line for a huge letdown after enormous emotional victories by each LW. LSU (+5) won the "Game of the Century" over Bama 9-6 in OT. LSU has faced non-BCS tms the L/4Y's after playing Bama and off a SU win over the Tide, are 2-0 ATS the next wk winning by a comb score of 109-10! These tms both played Kentucky TY and while LSU held the Cats to 13 FD's and 155 ttl yds, WKU all'd just 11 FD's and 190 ttl yds. WKU has now won 5 str as they also won on a FG on the final play besting FIU 10-9. RB Rainey is #4 FBS rushing avg 130 ypg but will find running difficult as LSU is #2 all'g only 79 rush ypg (2.6). The Hilltoppers goal here is to escape without any serious inj's as they are very much in the SBC hunt, and LSU is 35-0 all time vs the SBC.

OU is 8-15 ATS in Nov AG's and BG is 8-5 SU/8-4-1 ATS in home finales but BG is just 2-4 SU/ATS in that role S/05. OU has won the L/2 at BG and is going for its 3rd consec road win here for the 1st time S/80.

Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your inial selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays

Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods.
