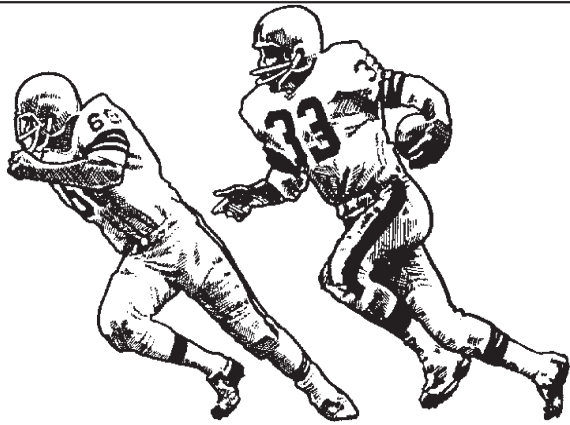

### NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK FOUR 2011

**NEWS AND NOTES** - It was a strange game between Iowa St and Connecticut on Friday night. After the first 9 poss of the game, Conn had a 131-(-7) yd edge. ISU QB Steele Jantz's first 4 passes resulted in 0-4 with 3 int, but the problem with UC was that they didn't take advantage of the opportunities. They were int'd at the ISU40 and then K Teggart who had hit 13 straight FG's, missed a 41 yarder and with 12:58 left in the 2Q, missed a 43 yarder. ISU got a key play when on 3&19, a jump ball which was caught by Reynolds for a 48 yd pass and ISU would continue on for a TD. QB Jantz was inj'd at the end of the half and looked doubtful to return but played the entire 2H. UC led 10-7 at the half, but ISU ran a double reverse pass for a 40 yd TD to make it 14-10. UC went ahead with 12:51 left, 20-17 but ISU answered with a TD with 9:08 left. UC punted with 6:57 left, was SOD on 4&2 at the ISU38 with 1:48 left then from the ISU44 their Hail Mary was knocked down on the last play...Boise St's Kellen Moore must be considered one of the Heisman frontrunners. He had an impressive Friday night outing at Toledo, the same team that took Ohio St to the wire the previous week. Moore hit 32-42-455 yds as BSU rolled up 32 FD's in their 40-15 win. Both teams blew opportunities late with UT fmb'l'g at the BSU9, BSU going on a 62/12pl drive and being SOD at the UT29 but BSU passed yet another test and will be a double digit favorite in the rest of their games...Purdue was coming off a loss to Rice where Rice blocked a FG at the end of the game and PU took out their frustration on SE Missouri. PU actually fmb'l'd on its 2nd poss and settled for a 19 yard FG on its 3rd but their next 5 poss all went for TD's and Robert Marve saw his first action since coming back from an ACL and QB'd 2 series with the team scoring on both poss as he hit 7-8-91. PU had a 38-0 lead at the half with a 396-57 yd edge. In the 2H PU only had 3 series but they were 68/8, 83/11 and 80/8pl all with TerBush back at QB all resulting in TD's in the 59-0 win...Auburn had its 17 game win streak snapped and they also had a 14 game win streak in the series vs Clemson snapped. AU actually led 21-7 with 8:54 left 2Q but CU scored 2 TD's incl one with 1:11 left to tie it at 21. CU scored a TD on a 65 yd pass on their first drive of the 3Q and never trailed again. At the end of the game, CU got a 38 yd FG with 11:48 left to lead 38-24. It appeared AU was ready for another one of its patented comebacks and got to the CU8 but they were int'd at the 5 with 9:34 left and CU went on an amazing 73/18pl drive running out the clock and taking a knee at the AU18...Georgia Tech was playing with revenge for the previous year's loss to Kansas in which they came in ranked and finished with a losing season. Their game was competitive at the half as GT only led 24-17 with a 337-246 yd edge but it turned into a record breaking day for GT. They opened the game with a school record 95 yd TD run by Orwin Smith to make it 7-0. They opened the 3Q on the first play with a 63 yd TD run by Peebles and would score TD's on their first 6 poss of the 2H to blow it open, 66-17 with 5:13 left before Kansas moved 63 yds for a TD. GT set a school record for rushing yards with 604 (previous high 558 vs VMI in 1975) and total yards with 768 (previous high 706 vs The Citadel, 1948)...Penn St had 308-197 yd and 18-13 FD edges vs Temple but missed a 45 yd FG, had a 49 yd FG blk'd and then had a 36 yd FG bounce off the goal post. PSU led 14-10 and TU did get the ball down the field with a pers foul to the PSU34 and on 4&10 was sacked and fmb'l'd and PSU just fell on it at the 41 with 1:01 left and ran out the clock...Pitt appeared to have this game locked up leading 27-10 with 12:00 left but Iowa made a miracle comeback. Pitt actually led by as much as 24-3 with 3:11 left in the 3Q. UI finished with a 475-422 yd edge. UI would go 73/7pl, 64/7pl (after Pitt was SOD on 4&3 at UI36) and 64/7pl for the last for a TD with 2:51 left to take the lead and Pitt's final poss ended on an int at the UI43...Bowling Green did finish with 28-18 FD and 514-396 yd edges, but gained 212 yards on their final 3 poss when they trailed 28-14. BG had a 6-1 TO deficit. Trailing 28-14 BG was int'd at the WY47 but WY was SOD at the BG36. BG was SOD at the WY8 with 8:11 left. BG went 67/8pl scoring a TD with 4:16 left and WY punted with 1:18 left and BG had no time-outs. They went 89/10pl getting a 10 yd TD pass with :03 left by WY blk'd the xp and held on for the upset...W Michigan had lost 5 straight to C Michigan and HC Cubit said it was like an elephant in the room, they needed to beat CM. They simply dominated. They led 24-0 at the half and opened it up to 41-7 in the 4Q. CM gained 173 yds on their final 3 poss making it a misleading final statistically as ULM gained just 16 yards in that span. Those 3 drives incl a TD when trailing 41-7 in the 44-14 rout...ULM played even better than the final score vs TCU as they led 17-14 mid-2Q. TCU got a TD with 5:16 left 1H to lead 21-17 and ULM missed a 43 yd FG on the final play of the half. TCU used 2 key plays at the start of the 3Q to break it open. They got a 94 yd KR TD to open the 3Q then after a fmb'l, drove 28 yds for a TD and led 35-17. TCU's final score came when ULM was SOD on 4&12 at the 50 with 3:40 left. TCU added a 28 yd FG with :28 left. TCU only had a 23-19 FD edge... Duke vs Boston College was an interesting game. BC led 19-7 with a TD with 1:21 left in the half but Duke went 63/4pl getting a 21 yd TD pass with :30 left to get back in it, 19-14. The 2H was dominated by Duke. Duke went 73/10pl but was int'd at the BC6. Duke went 46/9pl but missed a 33 yd FG, they went 70/14pl for a TD and missed the 2 pt conv then went 51/10pl and they were SOD on 4&5 at the BC30 with 4:15 left, up by 1. BC had

earlier missed an xp and took over at their 21 with 2:24 left. They had a FD at the Duke14. On 3&1 they ran into the line for no gain and lined up for the chipshot game winning FG from 23 yards out and it bounced off the upright with :43 left and Duke pulled the upset...It was a story of 2H's in the W Virginia/Maryland game. After 1 series in the 3Q where WV opened going 78/7pl for a TD, WV had a 380-176 yd edge and led 34-10. MD then went 71/11pl but was SOD on 4&gl at the 6, went 61/5pl for a TD, 44/7pl (after int) for a TD with 1:20 left in the 3Q then 66/12pl for a TD to pull within 34-31. WV had 2 FD's in that span. WV then went 65/14pl settling for a 21 yd FG with 4:42 left in the game to go up by 6. MD got to the WV35 but on 3&8 were int'd at the 13 and WV held on. WV had a 480-477 yd edge in the shoot-out with both teams using no huddle offenses...FIU rec'd a fmb'l 51 yds for a TD and won despite losing TY Hilton to a hamstring injury in the 1Q. UCF led 7-0 and was going in for another score in the final seconds of the half. They got to the FIU28 when on 2&16 with :16 left Godfrey was sk'd and fmb'l'd and FIU rec'd it 51 yds for a TD. Early 3Q UCF fmb'l'd a punt at its own 8 and FIU rec'd. Offsides set up FIU at the 4 and they got a TD run and totaled 4 yds offense for 2 TD's and a 14-7 lead. They did go 85/9pl for a 27 yd FG, 17-7. Late in the game UCF settled for a 31 yd FG with 1:52 left but FIU rec'd the onside kick and won despite being outgained 300-238...Arkansas St had been avg 481 ypg but VT, after allowing a 51 yd pass on ASU's first play which set up a TD 2pl later and put ASU up 7-0, allowed just 210 yards the rest of the game while VT finished with 427. Logan Thomas hit 21-33-292. VT missed a 40 yd FG and in the 2H was int'd and ret'd to the ASU42, int'd at the ASU4 and SOD at the ASU27 on their final 3 poss...Tulane was actually a 13 pt underdog to UAB and we used TU as the Big Dog POW and gave it away free on Button #8 as a Bonus Comp Line Play. The last 19 Big Dog Plays given out on the Comp Tapes have gone 12-7 with 10 outright winners and are +22.7 units. TU dominated. They had 28-10 FD and a 540-193 yd edges. UAB even got a 92 yd KR TD to only be down 28-7 at half with TU having a 305-122 yd edge. TU got 39 and 55 yd IR TD's the latter when they were safely up 42-10 and TU even ended the game taking over with 7:40 left driving 73/8pl and were at the UAB8 at the end... North Carolina had not won an ACC opener since winning at Wake Forest in 2000 and Virginia had a 468-401 yd edge. UVA actually had a 228-173 yd edge in the 1H but trailed 14-3 as they missed a 45 yd FG, settled for a 38 yd FG, were SOD at the NC36 and fmb'l'd at the NC37. The Tar Heels opened it to 28-10 and they fmb'l'd at the UVA5 with 13:05 left. UVA got a TD with 5:09 left to pull within 11 and then got to the NC36 and were int'd at the 14 with 2:53 to go...Dan Persa missed another game for Northwestern. Kain Colter hit 12-23-89 and Army dominated with 24-14 FD and 40:19 to 19:41 TOP edges. Army went on 18 and 10pl drives for a TD and a missed 47 yd FG. NW went 51/11pl to tie it with 5:23 left in the half but missed a 26 yd FG on the final play of the half. Army, up 14-7 went on a 14pl drive but missed a 25 yd FG and NW got a 62 yd TD pass with 6:03 left but Army went 75/9pl for a TD with 2:49 left and NW was SOD at the Army33 on their last drive...San Jose opted to sit Matt Faulkner and start Dasmen Stewart and Nevada was more impressive than the score would indicate with Stewart in the lineup. At the half NV had a 270-52 yd edge but only led 14-7 because they fmb'l'd at their own 34 and SJS got a 2pl TD "drive" and at the end of the half NV was SOD on 4&gl at the 1 with :44 left. It was 17-7 when Faulkner came off the bench. His 4 drives ended on a fmb'l at the NV38, a 1pl drive with a missed 37 yd FG, 72/9pl drive for a TD to pull SJS within 17-14 with 7:59 left and then a 69/13pl drive to the 15 where he was int'd in the EZ...Alabama was even more dominant than the final as at the half they had a 282-25 yd edge but settled for 37 and 26 yd FG's and missed a 36 yd FG and only led 20-0. Trent Richardson rushed for 167 yds on 11 carries and Eddie Lacy for 161 on 9 as Bama rolled up a 586-169 yd edge. NT did have 2 chances to avoid the shutout but had a 42 yd FG blk'd at the start of the 3Q and went for it on 4&gl from the 3 with 3:28 left and fired incomplete...USC got a big win over Syracuse, at one point leading 38-10 in the 4Q. Up 38-17, USC took over at their 17 with 5:32 left and worked it down to a 1st & gl at the 5 where they ran out the clock. Matt Barkley hit 26-39-324 yds...While Marshall turned it over six times vs Ohio, the Bobcats were pretty much dominant. The Bobcats settled for 20 and 21 yard FG's in the 1H and led 34-7 and opened it up to 44-7 early in the 4Q. Marshall gained 92 of their yards on their final 2 drives as OU reeled off 559 yards...Kansas St rolled to a 34-0 halftime lead vs Kent St. The Cats did have a 45 yd IR TD but also had drives of 95/6pl and 98/17pl. The closest the Flashes got to scoring was taking over at their 21 late 3Q and drove 76/19pl and had a 1st & gl at the 3 but they were SOD after a pen at the 9 with 5:53 left...Buffalo led 7-0 after 1Q but Ball St led 21-7 at the half. Buffalo battled back but did have an extra point blocked and also had a 2 pt conversion fail. Buffalo got a TD with 6:28 left to lead 25-21 when BSU went on a 75/18pl drive. The drive included improbable conversions on 4&13 and 4&7 and their TD with :22 left allowed BSU to escape with a 28-25 win...Nebraska started 3 walk-ons on the O-line for the first time since 1998 due to injuries. NU scored at least 40 pts in each of the first 3 games for the first time since their 1995 National Title season. While they were not dominant, they still went from a 20-7 halftime lead to a 44-17 lead. They got a TD then UW fmb'l'd the KO and they added another TD :09 later to go up 34-17 then added a 29 yd FG and an 86/9pl TD drive and with just 12:18 left were up by 27. UW got a pair of TD's on a 32 yd drive (after 64 yd KR) and 53 yd drive but then NU rec'd the onside kick and got ahead ATS again, 51-31 with 4:50 left. UW got a 52/1pl TD pass with 4:27 left to get back in the backdoor. NU rec'd the onside kick and got to the UW21 but was SOD. UW got 1 FD & was int'd on a deep pass at the NU23... cont on page 2



**cont. from Front Page ...** Even though Northern Illinois HC Dave Doeren had been an asst on the Wisc staff the previous 5 years, they were outgained by the Badgers 621-237 and outFD'd 34-11. They actually made a game of it in the 1H tying it at 7 with 1:59 left in the 1Q with UW missing a 50 yd FG. UW went 51, 97 and 77 yards on their next 3 drives for TD's to lead 28-7 and NI missed a 42 yd FG with :02 left in the 1H. At the half UW only had a 298-178 yd edge but went 77 and 79 yd for TD's to opened the 3Q and didn't punt until the last play of the 3Q up 42-7. UW was int'd at the 12 and then added a TD with 3:34 left in the 49-7 win...Teddy Bridgewater had been unimpressive so far for Louisville at QB but was forced into the lineup when Will Stein was inj'd. Kentucky did take their first drive 58/7pl settling for a 20 yd FG then fmb'l'd at the UL23. Stein hit a 38 yd TD pass to give UL a 7-3 lead. Bridgewater's first series was a 49/6pl drive with his 25 yd TD pass putting UL up 14-3. UK got an 80/9pl TD drive to pull within 14-10 at the half. Bridgewater led a 69/12pl drive for a 20 yd FG to open the 3Q and later a 46/7pl drive for a 25 yd TD pass for a 24-10 lead with 11:15 left. UK went 77/17pl getting a TD with 4:56 left to pull within 7. After a K/C interference pen UK started at the UL48 with 2:27 left. They had a FD at the 22 but on 4&6 fired incomplete with :51 left...Navy's option almost got the upset of South Carolina. Navy had leads of 7-0, 14-7 and 21-17. SC took the lead with 12:45 left on a 79/16pl drive. Navy's last drive converted on 4&15 but on 4&7 they were int'd at the SC45 with 13:33 left and SC got 1 FD & took a knee. Spurrier rode Marcus Lattimore 37 times for a career high 246 yards...Chris Rainey had a huge game for Florida with 233 total yards including an 82 yd TD rec and also blocked a punt. Surprisingly Tenn had a 23-17 FD edge and UF only had a 347-279 yd edge but the Gators did lead this one 30-7. UT missed a 37 yd FG on the first poss then had a punt blk'd on the 2nd setting up a UF FG. UF led 16-7 at the half but only with a 167-134 yd edge. UT was int'd on the first play of the 3Q and UF converted on 4&1 for a TD capping a 42 yd drive then UF got an 83 yd TD pass by Rainey to lead 30-7. UT settled for a 20 yd FG to pull within 30-16 with 13:13 left and made it 33-23 with a TD with 4:46 left but their final drive ended on an int at the UF17.

**FRONTDOOR COVERS -** Colorado St opened with an 80/9pl drive for a TD and led 7-0. It was 7-0 when Colorado took over with 7:55 left 1H and went 75/9pl for

a TD. CU took over with 2:16 left in the half and converted on 3&18 with a crucial run then on 3&10, got a 24 yd TD pass with :12 left in the half to make it 14-7. The game was 21-14 when CU took over with 11:25 left and they went 85/16pl and got a 2 yd Hansen TD run with 1:15 left to get ahead ATS. CSU was SOD on 4&4 from the CU42 when they were sacked for a 9 yd loss.

**MISLEADING FINALS -** Washington St led 17-14 at the half with a 260-221 yd edge. WSU appeared in complete control of the game as they got a 76 yd TD pass in the 3Q to lead 24-14 and then forced the Aztecs to go 3 & out. The game turned on a roughing the P penalty which gave the Aztecs a FD and 3pl later SDSt got a TD to pull within 24-21. SDSt didn't take the lead until 10:31 was left on a TD to go up 28-24 and then WSU was at the Aztec25 when Lobbestael had the ball slip out of his hands on a sack which SDSt rec'd at the 36. After a WSU offside, Hillman ran 59 yds for a TD and stunningly it was 35-24. WSU was int'd at the SDSt13 and with 3:59 left was int'd and ret'd all the way to their 20. On 3&11 the Aztecs got a 21 yd TD pass and it looked like an easy win but that was misleading...Turnovers were clearly the key in the BYU/Utah game. On the 3rd play of the game, a bad snap went over Cougar QB Heaps' head and he tried to pick it up and throw it incomplete but the ball slipped out of his hands and Utah fell on it for a TD. BYU fmb'l'd on their next drive at midfield. BYU's next drive went 74/8pl. They had a 1st & gl at the 6 but Di Luigi fmb'l'd at the 3. BYU went 37/6pl and settled for a 45 yd FG and at this point had a 130-48 yd edge but trailed 7-3. BYU went 66/4pl for a TD in the 2Q to lead 10-7. Utah would get a 30 yd TD pass with :32 left in the half to lead 14-10 but BYU had a 227-187 yd edge. The Cougars would have 7 TO's in the game. Four times on 3&long Utah had a pass interference give them a FD and that happened at the start of the 3Q. Three plays later Utah got a TD on a 59 yd pass, 21-10. After a 29 yd PR Utah had a 19 yd 'drive' for a 39 yd FG to go up 24-10. BYU fmb'l'd the KO on their own 3 setting up another Utah TD. Two poss later BYU was sk'd & fmb'l'd on their 6. Utah got a 20 yd FG. BYU was SOD after a 60/12pl drive at the Utah 18 and a beleaguared BYU D gave up a 62 yd TD run. After a 20 yd IR set up Utah at the BYU35. White ripped off another 35 yd TD run and naturally Utah's last score came with BYU at the Utah36 when they were sk'd & fmb'l'd and it was ret'd 57 yds for a TD. Each team had 20 FD's.

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ ALABAMA over Arkansas** - Ark is 1-5 SU (3-3 ATS) S/99 in Tuscaloosa and in their L/trip lost 35-7 (+17) being outgained 425-254. Ark has dropped 4 str gms SU by an avg of 18 ppg vs Bama and the Crimson Tide have won 19 str SEC openers. LY Bama (-7) was down 20-7 mid-3Q but the Tide D had 3 int's (1 in the EZ and 2 came in the 4Q on Ark's L/2 drives). We had Ark +7 as a Key Selection on these pages and they never trailed ATS. This is QB Wilson's 1st road start but he did play 3Q's at Aub Ly and did well. TY he is avg 274 ypg (69%) with a 5-2 ratio. Ark is off to a 3-0 start (first time in B2B ssn S/88-89) but is taking a huge leap in competition here after playing 3 non-BCS tms. Bama's D has been as good as advertised not allowing a legitimate TD drive yet this season thru 3 gms (K-St "3 yd drive" after int, PSU garbage TD). RB Richardson's Heisman campaign got a boost LW with a career-high 167 rush yds (15.1) and 3 TD's while QB McCarron is settling in as the starter avg 193 ypg (64%) with a 2-2 ratio. Key matchup is Bama's #1 OL/DL in SEC vs Ark's #8 OL/DL (had to replace 3 3Y str's TY on OL). Bama controls the LOS and it's Roll Tide here.

**FORECAST: ALABAMA 34 Arkansas 13**

**3★ MICHIGAN over San Diego St** - Mich HC Hoke was the HC at SDSU the L/2Y and took with him OC Borges while his DC Long (offered a UM job) is now the HC at SDSU. Hoke ruffled some feathers by telling the players he was leaving via text message and saying he'd walk from San Diego for the Michigan job. In the only prior meeting in '04 UM (-20) won, 24-21. UM only had EM LW and has Minny on deck. Vs the Eagles, UM was only up 13-3 at HT but pulled away early 3Q, finishing with 24-12 FD and 471-236 yd edges in a 31-3 (-30) win. QB Robinson avg 177 ypg pass (49%, 6-4 ratio) but leads with 352 rush yd (7.0) which is more than double that of the #2 rusher. The top rec is Hemingway who avg an incredible 50.5 (1 TD) on his 4 rec. LW SDSU faced its first pass-happy off of the yr and battled back from a 10 pt early 3Q deficit to win 42-24 (-5) vs Wash St in front of a record home crowd (SDSU 25-19 FD, 500-419 yd edges). The win put SDSU 3-0 for the 1st time S/81 and snapped a 22 gm losing streak to BCS tms. QB Lindley went over the 10,000 career pass mark and is now avg 207 ypg (54%) with a 7-1 ratio. RB Hillman, who is flying under most radars, leads with 497 rush yds (#2 NCAA) and all 8 of SDSU's rush TD's. Former CB Lockett has crept onto the scene with 254 rec yd (21.2). You've got an angry bunch of Aztecs but Michigan has an enormous edge as Hoke and Borges know these SDSU players inside and out.

**FORECAST: MICHIGAN 41 San Diego St 24**

**3★ AUBURN over Florida Atlantic** - First meeting. After flirting with defeat the first 2 weeks, needing an inside kick and late TD to beat Utah St, and a goal line stand to upset Miss St, Auburn saw its 17 game winning streak snapped LW at Clemson, giving up 624 yards in the 38-24 loss. The Tigers are 17-0 SU vs current Sun Belt teams (4-3 ATS since '02, avg win by 33 ppg). FAU is off a bye and is just 1-17-1 ATS (0-2 TY) on the BCS road. FAU is just 1-4 ATS the week before their conference opener and they have ULL on deck while Auburn is in middle of 4 gm stretch (at Clem, at SC and at Ark). The Tigers have won 13 str non-conf HG's by an avg of 44-18. FAU's offense may be just what the Tigers defense (#67 - all g 534 ypg) needs as FAU had just 1 FD their last game and our rankings have them #119. We've had the Tigers pegged playing on them as a HD vs Miss St, against them as an AD LW and now we'll again back them in a large HF role.

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ ULM (+) over IOWA** - First meeting. A week after a disappointing loss to their in-state rival, Iowa is sky high after the biggest comeback win in their history LW vs Pittsburgh, rallying from a 17 point deficit in just over 12 minutes to shock the Panthers 31-27. QB Vandenberg threw for 399 yds (162 in the 4Q) and is avg 275 ypg (62%) with a 7-1 ratio on the season. ULM is off a 38-17 loss at TCU in a game that they led after the 1Q 17-14. They allowed TCU to return the opening 2H KO 94 yds for a TD. Iowa comes in with a distinct ST's edge (#35-117). This will be ULM's third non-conf road game in 4 weeks vs winning bowl tms from LY which finished a combined 31-9. Iowa is 2-0 vs current SBC schools (33-11 avg win) while ULM has lost 9 in a row SU to BCS schools (avg 43-9). Both teams have byes on deck. We like the job HC Berry has done with the Warhawks and despite being on a tough 2nd str AG, certainly we'll fade Iowa in a big HF role.

**FORECAST: ULM 17 (+) IOWA 31**

**2★ SOUTH CAROLINA over Vanderbilt** - SC is 1-3 ATS vs Vandy incl B2B outright SU losses in '07 and '08 as 9' and 13' pt favs. LY the gm was tied 7-7 at HT but SC's defense locked down in the 2H allowing just 70 yds as Vandy did not cross midfield until its last off play (SOD at SC48). SC RB Lattimore missed the gm with an ankle inj and RB Maddox rushed for a career-high 146 yds. SC only had 169 yds in the 1H but 315 yds and 14 pts in the 2H as they won 21-7 (-12). Vandy was 20-5-1 as an AD until they had an interim HC LY and went just 1-4. The Commodores are off to a 3-0 start under new HC Franklin and LW dominated Ole Miss (+2) 30-7 with a 387-234 yd edge. QB Smith is avg 123 ypg (54%) with a 3-2 ratio but was inj'd LW (CS) and was replaced by GB QB Aaron Rodgers' lil bro Jordan. LW we went against SC and easily cashed our Underdog POW on Navy (+18) who nearly pulled the outright upset in the 24-21 loss. Lattimore was the star though running for a career-high 246 yds (6.6) and 3 TD's. SC has huge edges on off (#21-92) and def (#14-47) and will be motivated to atone for LW's near loss and Vandy's 3-0 record will no doubt have their attention.

**2★ TROY over Middle Tenn** - In the SBC's biggest rivalry, played for the Palladium Trophy, MT has dropped 5 str SU/ATS vs Troy by an avg score of 34-13. LTH on national TV, MT trailed 24-0 as their 1st 10 poss all ended in punts. Troy HC Blakeney said LY, "we always put a priority on MT" and as of late MT plays their worst ball vs Troy. Troy has the SBC's top QB Robinson, who in LW's 38-28 loss at Arkansas torched Razorback DB's for 373 yds (57%, 3-1 ratio) vs the SEC's #8 set of DB's. The key matchup will feature the SBC's #1 OL (MT) vs the #1 DL (Troy). This is Troy's home opener as they opened with 2 tough road gms vs Clemson and Ark and they are 41-6 SU at home (11-7 ATS HF). MT is off a bye and HC Stockstill is just 3-7 SU off a bye. Troy has a decided edge with the #64 off vs MT's #120 defense, but remember MT played GT's triple option which has skewed those numbers. Both teams have lost to a pair of BCS foes and while Middle is off a bye, no one causes more matchup problems for the Blue Raiders than this Troy squad.

**NC State at CINCINNATI** - Only meeting was LY in Raleigh on a Thurs Night. UC (+2) didn't run a play inside the N32 until the final 2 drives when they were down 30-7. NCST had a 491-385 yd edge. In fact they gained 41% (159) of their yds on those two drives. Their young O-line was overwhelmed on the road at night (5 sks). UC RB Pead (knee inj) did not have a carry. NCST is off a win over South Alabama and Cincy is off a 59-14 win over Akron as our Early Bird POW. **UCf at BYU** - First meeting. BYU is off the "Holy War" loss 54-10, being outgained 481-354 with 7 TD's (-5 overall). It was the Cougs worst loss vs Utah S/22 (1st yr of FB). They have a revenge game vs in-state rival Utah St on deck while UCF has a bye on deck. UCF is off a disappointing 17-10 loss to FIU after imploding with 6 sks all'd incl 1 that was fmb'd and ret'd 51 yds for a TD (all'd 2 tkl sks

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1st 2 gms). The Cougs are 13-1 SU on Fri nights S/87 (only loss vs USU LY) but UCF is 9-3 ATS as an AD. ### Saturday, September 24th

**OHIO ST 30 Colorado 13** - CU is 0-6 (2-4 ATS) S/05 when on the road vs non-conf/BCS schools, avg score 33-14. CU is 2-4 ATS (1-5 SU) after CSU when on the road. OSU 9-4 ATS vs non-conf BCS tms during the reg ssn. This is CU's 3rd road gm in 4 wks and they are 7-18 as an AD. The Bucks limp in after their 1st regular ssn loss to an unranked non-conf opp S/88, a 24-6 setback to Miami in which OSU was outgained 363-209 and QB's Bauserman and Miller combined to hit 4-18 for 35 yds with 1 int and 1 fmb'l. The only off bright spot was RB Jordan Hall who ret'd from susp to run for 87 yds before being KO'd with leg cramps. The normally stingy D all'd UM's Miller to run for 184 yd (7.1), the most a RB has had vs the Bucks in over a decade. CU beat rival CU in Denver as QB Hansen was responsible for all 4 TD's. The Buffs overcame a slow start (10 1Q yds) to finish with 23-16 FD and 360-243 yd edges. OSU has edges (#46-67 off, #10-48 D) on both sides but has the B10 opener with MSU on deck while CU has their P12 debut (WSU) on tap.

**DUKE 33 Tulane 29** - The Green Wave are 3-14 on the road (4-1 ATS run vs current BCS schools with wins at Rutgers 2x's incl LY and at Miss St in '06). Devils are only 3-9-1 ATS as a HF the last 12 ly but are 3-3-1 ATS under Cutcliffe. TY Duke lost to Richmond (missed 28 yd chip-shot FG), then got drilled by SU (actually outplayed SU in 1H). LW Renfree overcame a 12 pt deficit throwing for 359 yds as Duke escaped with a 20-19 win when BC missed a 23 yd FG with :43 left. It was their 1st win in an ACC opener since 2008. Renfree is completing 73% of his passes. Tulane was outgained in the 1st 2 games TY but bounced back LW rolling up 540 yds and crushed UAB 49-10 (+13) as we cashed another OUTRIGHT UPSET on the Big Dogs. QB Griffin leads with 239 ypg (61%) and a 6-1 ratio while RB Darkwa has been off to a slow start (50 ypg, 3.2). Tulane is on its 2nd straight AG and is used to playing in front of small crowds (an edge Duke usually has over an opp). TU is 2-0 in the series but Duke HC Cutcliffe was 2-0 vs TU at Ole Miss. Cutcliffe continues to gain fan support and Duke can get some momentum here with FIU on deck.

**Toledo 27 SYRACUSE 24** - Orange are 2-0 SU/ATS vs the Rockets and in the L/meeting ('03) won 34-7 (-3). LY SU was 4-1 ATS off a SU loss. Both teams were manhandled by ranked foes last week as Toledo lost 40-15 (+20) to Boise St and Syracuse lost 38-17 (+16) to USC. However, Syracuse had to travel to SoCal on Saturday night while Toledo played Friday at home. Both have their conference openers on deck. While the defenses are close, Toledo has an offensive edge (#52-87). UT is just 2-10 ATS in visits to BCS schools but LY beat Purdue 31-20 as an 11' pt dog and in their last road game nearly upset Ohio St, losing 27-22 (+17). The Rockets have been using a 2 QB system and avg 282 ypg through the air while the Orange are allowing 269 ypg. Toledo's top rusher RB Thomas leads with 227 yds (6.1) just 3 yds less than the whole Syracuse team and his 3 rush TD's is 1 more than the SU team. Orange are just 1-4 SU/ATS vs FBS teams at home under Marrone and that continues here.

**EAST CAROLINA 41 Uab 20** - UAB is 1-5 ATS vs EC dropping 4 in a row SU. The HT is 7-3 ATS while the dog is 7-2. LY the Pirates scored a series/ssn high 54 pts and allowed a series high 42. EC trailed 35-27 into the 4Q but had 4 str TD drives incl an 11/3pl (after 56 yd PR) and a 28/4pl (after fmb'l KR). Conf opener for UAB (2-9 ATS run in CUSA). LTH UAB had season bests holding EC to 14 FD and 325 yds but allowed a 99 yd KR TD and an 89 yd IR. EC is fresh off a bye and is 12-7 as a HF. EC is ranked #3 in our pass eff D allowing just 40% comp. Pirates have led into the 2H in each of their first 2 gms (both vs ranked BCS opp's #12 SC and #11 VT). This is a huge step down in talent level as EC's new 3-4 seems to be working and although 0-2 SU, they are 2-0 ATS. UAB was hammered LW vs Tulane and has been outscored 88-10 and outgained 1052-405 on the ssn. Also QB Ellis left LW and is ? (CS). LY UAB had a 544-287 yd edge at Tenn and 24-18 FD edge at Miss St and beat SM on the road but TY's first 2 performances have been underwhelming and EC has the big edge on offense (#60-93).

**USF 34 Utep 3** - First meeting. While HC at EC Holtz went 2-0 SU/ATS vs UTEP w/the avg score 49-32. UTEP has lost 37 str (3-12 ATS run) when traveling to a current BCS school w/an avg score of 45-11 (last win was at Ariz St in '74). USF is off HG's vs Ball St and Florida A&M while UTEP is in its 3rd str road game and off rival NMST (only happened twice S/93 and they lost both SU/ATS). USF does have a big Thurs gm at Pitt on deck but UTEP also has a Thurs gm vs UH on deck. QB Jay Hall got his first career start LW (32%, 124 yds, 0-1) as Lamaison has an inj'd shoulder but was labeled the "QB of the future." UTEP is 0-4 SU/ATS vs recent BCS tms being outscored by 38 ppg (all as DD dogs, failed to cover by 12 ppg). USF is on an 8-2 SU/7-3 ATS run and should continue its winning ways vs a tm with a QB making his first road start vs a BCS def.

**ILLINOIS 31 Western Michigan 24** - UI is 8-3 SU but 1-8 ATS hosting non-conf FBS schools. WM is 0-2 in Champaign but in their last meeting ('08) in Detroit we used a 2★ on these pages and a Big Dog Play of the Week and WM delivered the outright upset, 23-17! LTH ('04), WM (+8) led 27-23 late 4Q before allowing a 40 yd KR that set up UI's 40/6pl GW TD drive w/1:02 left. Illinois is off the 17-14 upset of #22 Ariz St, their 1st win over a ranked team since 2007. They also have their Big Ten opener on deck against in-state rival Northwestern. WM is off a 44-14 win over CM, breaking a 5 game losing streak to their rival and delivering a 3★ LPS Winner. They only have a non-conf gm on deck but are just 3-10-1 as an AD since upsetting Iowa in '07. While Illinois has a slight edge on offense (#50-62) they have a big edge on defense (#27-79) and have not forgotten their '08 loss to the Broncos.

**RUTGERS 27 Ohio 23** - In the only recent meeting ('06) Rutgers (-16) trailed 7-0 after an early int but held Ohio in check with 13-8 FD and 300-119 yd edges, winning 24-7. Rutgers is just 11-22-1 ATS after a bye week and 1-7 as a HF while Ohio is 11-4-1 as an AD. While the Knights had the week off the Bobcats blew out their non-conf rival Marshall 44-7 as a 3 pt HF with a 559-331 yd edge and winning a 2★ on these pages. The Bobcats are 3-0 for the first time since 1976. Both teams have their conference openers on deck. While their offenses are close, the Knights have the defensive edge (#63-88). Rutgers OL has a size edge over Ohio's DL (6'4" 302 vs 6'2" 269) but they are avg just 2.1 ypc while the young but talented Ohio DL is allowing just 2.9 ypc.

**PENN ST 38 Eastern Michigan 3** - Penn St is 4-5 ATS vs the MAC (avg win by 24 ppg) and EM is on its 2nd straight B10 road gm after losing to Mich 31-3 LW. The Eagles fmb'd at the UM35, were SOD at the UM1 and settled for a 21 yd FG on their 1st 3 drives which totaled 162 yds to take a 3-0 early 2Q lead but had just 74 yds the rest of the way. The Eagles are #6 FBS in rushing (290, 6.3) but have played 2 FCS foes although they did have 207 (4.5) vs Mich LW. PSU missed 3 FG's and had a TD pass called back in a disappointing non-covering 29th straight win over Temple in which the Lions 1st lead came on a TD run with 2:42 left. The QB carousel continued with Bolden and McGloin combining to hit 22-36 for 216 yd with 1 int and both TD drives began inside the Owls 50. Leading rusher Redd (255, 5.1) had cramping problems vs TU. The Lions D is back to their usual high standards allowing just 112 rush ypg (3.3). The Lions need to end their QB drama with the B10 opener on deck but are just 1-5 ATS as a 28+ pt fav.

**Smu 38 MEMPHIS 17** - SMU is 0-3 SU (1-1 ATS) vs UM. UM has won both CUSA meetings but by a tll of just 8 pts. In the L/gm ('08) UM outruined SMU 306-38 (5.6-2.4). SMU is 4-15-1 as a fav and 3-11-1 as a conf fav. They do have the Iron Skillet vs TCU on deck. Mem is 3-8 as a HD. The Tigers have lost 13 str CUSA gms (5-8 ATS) being outscored by 21 ppg. SMU HC Jones said whoever wins will play QB and has given the starting QB job to Sr McDermott after Padron went on the 0-3 run (LY CUSA Title gm, bowl and A&M). Both schools are coming off FCS wins. UM is 7-15-1 ATS after a SU win and hasn't won B2B gms S/'08. Despite LW's win, UM is in complete disarray with "heat" coming from the alumni (fired DC Hopson after just 2 gms). Mustangs look to start 2-0 in conf play and shore up their QB situation prior to bigger conf tests in Oct.

**MARYLAND 27 Temple 20** - MD is 6-0 vs Temple. The last meeting was in '05, MD (-26) won 38-7 w/26-11 FD and 472-226 yd edges. Edsall is no stranger to Temple as he was 3-3 SU w/ 0-6 ATS w/ Conn incl a 30-16 (-6) loss LY. MD came back from a 24 pt deficit but fell short LW losing to #18 WV, 37-31. QB O'Brien got to the WV35 but was int'd at the 13 w/1:13 left. O'Brien is throwing for 319 ypg (68%) but with a 2-4 ratio. RB Meggett avg 103 ypg (5.1). Temple is off a deflating 14-10 home loss to Big Bro Penn St a game they surprisingly led until 2:42 left in 4Q despite being outgained 308-197. The Owls now have a 2 hr bus trip to College Park. TU has a new HC in Addazio and since leaving the BE the Owls are 0-13 SU in road/neutral gms vs BCS opp's w/the avg loss by 36 ppg. Both these coaches are Syracuse alums, Edsall having served as an asst from '80-'90 and Addazio from '95-'98. Edsall was 19-11-2 as a HF at UC and this is a big step down after facing Miami, FI and WV with only Towson on deck.

**MICHIGAN ST 34 Central Michigan 13** - MSU is 0-6 ATS (4-3 SU) vs CM and had their 4 gm series SU win streak snapped in '09, 29-27 (-14). MSU allowed an 11 yd TD pass (2ptng) w/32 left and CM recovered the onside kick nailing a 42 yd FG w/'03. HC Enos played QB at MSU from 1987-'90 later serving as QB/RB cch from 2006-'09. The Spartans are in a ND/Ohio St (road) sandwich while CM in its 3rd str road gm and is just 1-5 as an AD including 0-2 TY. They are in a MAC sandwich but will be motivated for the in-state BCS school. Mich St has the #6 set of RB's in the country going up against CM's LB corps (#12 in MAC) which lost 2 1st TM MAC players. MSU has huge edges on off (#34-102) and def (#21-104) and is 11-5 ATS vs the MAC but CM is 4-0 ATS vs Big 10. CM is off their first loss to rival WM (44-14) in 6 seasons. Michigan St had a 358-275 yd edge over Notre Dame but lost 31-13 (+5) thanks in part to allowing a KR TD for the first time since 2002. Look for the Spartans to take out their frustrations here.

**Georgia 27 MISSISSIPPI 13** - Bulldogs have won the L/8 by 13 ppg (5-3 ATS). In their L/trip to Oxford ('06) UGA (-18) struggled as they were down 3-0 at HT but pulled out a 14-9 win. Under Richt, UGA is 8-2 (5-4-1 ATS) in true road openers (0-2 L2Y) and only had a IAA foe LW as they crushed Coastal Carolina 59-0 with a 470-112 yd edge. QB Murray is living up to his preseason All-SEC hype avg 224 ypg (63%) with a 9-2 ratio while true frosh RB Crowell leads with 316 total yds and 3 TD. Ole Miss is off an abysmal performance at Vandy losing 30-7 as a 2' pt AF. QB Stoudt threw 5 int's and was pulled for Mackey until he was injured (CS). The Rebels OL has been a big disappointment opening holes for just 109 rush ypg (3.2). HC Nutt has pulled a lot of upsets vs ranked tms but is 0-3 as a HD here. Both coaches are on the hot seat and desperately need a conf win but UGA has edges on off (#12-42) and def (#18-68) and has the much better QB situation.

**MIAMI, OH 27 Bowling Green 23** - The RedHawks are the only MAC team to have a winning record vs BG and are 10-2 SU/ATS vs Falcons since 1999. BG is 10-3 ATS as an AD while Miami just 2-7-1 ATS as a HF. This is the first home game for Miami's new HC Treadwell but they are 1-5 ATS in home openers. LY Miami was 10-4 and BG just 2-10 but in a foggy Wed night gm Miami (-2) got a late int and nailed a 31 yd FG on the last play to win 24-21 (did lead 21-7). BG has actually won in 2 of their last 3 trips to Oxford by 21 and 28 pts. Both teams had comebacks come up short last week. BG trailed Wyoming 28-14 in the 4Q and looked to tie the game with a TD with :17 left but had the PAT blocked losing 28-27 as a 9' pt HF. Miami tied Minnesota 16-16 in the 3Q and after falling behind 29-16 had a possible GW TD broken up in the EZ as time expired to fall 29-23 as a 4' pt AD. While Miami had a 405-399 yd edge BG had a 514-396 yd edge. Miami has huge def edge (#55-102). This is the MAC opener for both but Miami does have non-conf rival Cincy on deck.

**Army 30 BALL ST 26** - Army has won both prior meetings ('99 and '09 at West Point) SU while going 1-1 ATS. In '09 QB Steelman tossed his first career TD pass and w/the gm tied at 17, Army got a huge 18 yd IR TD in the 4Q to win it 24-17 (-8) despite being outgained by 110 yds (but +3 TO's). Army is 5-1 SU in true road games but in the last 15 yrs is 0-8 ATS as an AF. Ball St is 3-10 SU (1-12 ATS) the L3Y in Scheumann Stadium, including a comeback 28-25 win (-4) last week vs Buffalo. Both teams have upset a B10 foe this year as Ball St beat Indiana 27-20 (+5) and Army beat Northwestern 21-14 (+7). Under Ellerson, Army is 4-3 SU but 2-5 ATS vs MAC teams, including a 49-26 loss to Northern Illinois as an 11 pt away dog. Steelman is off his 2nd straight 100 yd rushing gm with 3 TD's in each. He leads Army with 302 yds rush (4.6) and 45 ypg (36%) passing with an 0-1 ratio. Ball St is led by QB Wenning 182 ypg passing (71%) with a 4-0 ratio. Army has learned to win away (5-1 L2Y) but covering is a different scenario.

**Virginia Tech 31 MARSHALL 6** - Marshall has lost 12 str vs ranked opp's by 26 ppg. The Hokies haven't been to Huntington S/'40 (last loss in series). VT won the 3 most recent gms ('02, '05 and '09) by an avg score of 47-15 (2-1 ATS avg cover by 10 ppg). VT did struggle early LW vs Ark St (down 7-0) but is 17-6-1 as an AF and does have Clemson and Miami, FI on deck. MU is off an embarrassing loss to Ohio 44-7 were true Fr Cato struggled (43% 116 yds 1-4 ratio). VT is 3-0 but struggled vs CUSA EC in their only road gm (trailed at HT). Since the Herd moved up to IA ball they are 2-0-1 ATS as a DD home dog losing the 2 recent gms by just 6 tll pts. VT does have bigger tests on deck but is on a solid 18-4 SU and 15-6-1 ATS run. MU has been very inconsistent thus far and with an inexp'd QB vs a Bud Foster D, that doesn't bold well for the Herd.

**WASHINGTON 37 California 31** - UW is now 5-1 ATS vs Cal and LY on 4&gl from the CAL1 w/'02 left elected to go for the win with a 1 yd Polk TD run which also happened to be a bowl elimination gm with each tm having 6 losses (game was played in rain). The Bears are off a win over Presbyteriam (all'd just 48 tll yds and 3 FD, only pts all'd were on a blk'd punt and IR TD) with a bye on deck. UW is off a road trip to Neb (trailed by 3 at HT before being outscored 31-21 in 2H) and has a road gm with Utah coming up. Cal is 7-1-1 ATS in its first conf road gm of the season but just 6-14 ATS in conf AG's incl losing their L/2 in Seattle by 23 ppg (outgained by 113 ypg). The key to this matchup could be Cal QB Maynard (241 ypg) who has completed just 52% of his passes TY vs a UW pass def that is surrendering 320 ypg in the air and allowing nearly 60% comp. Aided by the near healthy RB Polk (130 rush yds LW vs Neb), the hometown Huskies and their large sked edge (#53-101) should continue their recent dominance vs the Bears again here.

**Lsu 30 WEST VIRGINIA 20** - LY's 1st ever meeting was just the 2nd time in school history that WV had played in front of 90,000+ people. QB Geno Smith was making just his 2nd road start and we won with a 4★ LPS on WV +10 in Death Valley and they almost got the upset losing 20-14 with a 14-12 FD edge. WV had a 139-55 yd edge at the half but trailed 17-7 due to a PR TD and a 7 yd TD drive after a fumble. WV has won 18 str non-conf HG's SU (L/loss vs #3 VT in '05 also LY WV was a HD). LSU's D did hold WV to 4 plays or less in 10 of 13 poss but now faces a new offense with Holgerson at the controls. LW WV (+1) jumped out to a 34-10 3Q lead at MD before holding on in a 37-31 win as they possibly started looking ahead. LSU does have a couple extra days to prepare coming off an impressive Thurs Night 19-6 win (-3) at MSU with a 361-193 yd edge. The key matchup will be WV QB Smith who is avg 336 ypg (69%) with a 7-1 ratio vs one of the best secondaries in the country. This is LSU's 3rd road gm in 4 wks but they are used to playing in big games (3rd ranked opp already TY) and will come away with a key non-conf road win.

**GEORGIA TECH 30 North Carolina 27** - The Tar Heels are 11-6 ATS vs GT while the dog is 9-5 ATS. LY's gm had 6 lead changes as GT trailed 24-17 late 3Q but went on 3 str scoring drives (last off a NC fmb). NC hasn't won in Atlanta S/97 dropping 6 str trips (4 by a TD or less). LTH NC was down 17-0 into the 4Q gaining just 154 yds (ssn low). This is GT's conf opener and 1st real challenge after an easy opening sked. LW GT avenged their '10 loss crushing KU 66-24 rolling up a school record 768 yds incl 604 rushing (broke rec'd '78). NC is off a 3 gm home stand and a 28-17 win over UVA LW. QB Renner is avg 231 ypg (81%) and his fav target is WR D Jones 336 (16.8). NC has one of the stronger front 7 in the ACC and is all'g 77 ypg (2.3) on the ground with 10 sks. TY NC doesn't have the bye to prepare for the option but last year was playing without 12 suspended players and will want to atone for allowing 372 rush yds last year.

**Florida 31 KENTUCKY 13** - UF has now won 24 (4-0 ATS run) in a row over UK with the last 3 by a combined score of 152-26 including a 73-0 margin in the opening 15:00. LY Trey Burton broke Tim Tebow's record scoring 6 TD's in a 48-14 win (-14) as they covered by 20 pts delivering a 3★ LPS. UK has struggled all season being outgained in each of their 3 games and LW lost 24-17 (-6) for the first time in 5 meetings vs in-state rival UL. On the other side UF is now 3-0 for the 7th consec ssn after their 33-23 (-9) win over rival Tenn LW despite being flagged for 16 pen for 150 yds (8 FD's). QB Brantley has adjusted well to OC Weis' pro-style attack avg 212 ypg (65%) with a 3-2 ratio while RB Rainey continued his tremendous ssn to date LW with 108 rush/104 rec and a blk'd punt. UF is 10-3 as an AF but this is their road opener and they are in a UT/Bama sandwich making this game closer than the last 3 meetings.

**Notre Dame 30 PITTSBURGH 24** - Pitt is 3-10-1 ATS vs ND while the HT has gone just 0-5-1 ATS. LY down 6, Pitt had the ball w/3:15 left and again w/1:37 but their 4&4 pass was inc ending any chance at the comeback. In the 1H Pitt had 3 drives reach the ND9, 10 and 19 but came away w/3 tll pts. Leading 24-3 early 3Q at Iowa LW, the Panthers were unable to hold on as Iowa outscored Pitt 28-3 the rest of the way for the comeback victory. In the loss, RB Graham put together another solid and is #3 in the NCAA with 419 rush yds (5.3). After a rocky 0-2 start, the Irish got a revenge win over Mich St, 31-13, despite being outFD'd 21-18 and outgained 358-275. Since taking over, QB Rees has now hit 70% of his passes for the ND offense which has our #10 ranking. First yr Panther HC Graham does have some experience coaching vs the Irish as LY his Tulsa team went into South Bend (+8) and came out with the 28-27 upset (days after the practice field tragedy). Pitt does have a huge Big East game on deck vs USF on Thurs while ND has a large sked advantage (#10-89) which should allow the Irish to climb back to 2-2.

**CLEMSON 26 Florida St 23** - The HT is 8-1 SU and Clemson is 6-2 ATS in the series. FSU is 7-4 SU overall at Clemson but has dropped 4 str SU/ATS by 15 ppg and CU has an avg cover by 18 ppg. LY CU led 10-3 at HT but needed a 29 yd FG drive to tie 13-13 w/53. FSU went 34/7p and got a 55 yd FG as time exp. Manuel started at QB LY but FSU did not open up the offense until the 2H. FSU's numbers TY are somewhat skewed as they took on 2 inferior opp's before their huge HG vs #1 Oklahoma. In front of a record sellout crowd FSU batted to tie it at 13-13 in the 4Q but OU proved too much as the Noles lost 23-13. FSU suffered a rash of injuries incl Manuel being knocked out late in 3Q. CU is off a big 38-24 win vs the defending champs but this is their "A" game for Sept. After trailing 21-7 1Q CU's offense came to life outscoring AU 31-3 and rolling up 624 yds ending the nation's longest win streak. Clemson has been a 2H team in the 1st 3 gms but QB Boyd looks to have grasped the system (304 ypg, 67%, 10-1). RB Ellington was injured late LW but CU has plenty of youth stepping up incl Fr WR Watkins who has 292 yd (13.9) and 4 TD. FSU has been outgained in 7 of the L/9 in this series and after their emotional loss last week may not have enough left in the tank.

**SAN JOSE ST 30 New Mexico St 20** - SJSt has won 6 of the L/7 (5-2 ATS) but LY NMSt snapped a 6 gm losing streak. NMSt led 17-3 at HT before SJSt took a 27-23 lead w/3:47 left only to allow a 79/8p drive and a GW 8 yd TD pass on 4&gl on the final play and NMSt (Comp Coll POW) got the outright upset (+3). LTH NMSt lost on a 19 yd FG w/3:47 left. NMSt's struggles to run the ball returned LW. After rushing for just 6 yds in the opener, they managed only 16 yds in a 16-10 (-3) loss to UTEP. QB Manley (297 ypg, 57%, 6-3 ratio) has been the bright spot on off but inj'd his knee and is ? (CS). SJSt has lost 13 consec gms with 6 of those losses coming by one score or less (20 pts comb) incl 4 by 3 pts or less. QB Faulkner (158 ypg, 53%, 0-1 ratio), who missed the prior wk (concussion), DNS LW but entered late in the 3Q and provided a spark. He had the Spartans on the verge of ending their losing streak but had a pass int'd in the EZ with 1:10 left and they came up short in a 17-14 (+6) loss to Nevada. SJSt is on an 8-23-1 ATS skid but has covered its L/2.

**IDAHO 31 Fresno St 30** - FSU has won 8 in a row SU in the series (4-2 ATS). LY UI trailed 13-0 but led 20-16 w/2:01 left before they all'd a 60/9p drive (FSU 4&1 conv from own 49) and a GW 1 yd TD run with :14 left. UI was outgained 517-187, outFD'd 31-10 and punted 10x's in a 37-7 (+35) loss at Texas A&M LW. The Vandals need to start mixing in the run to compliment the production they are getting from WR Scott (22 rec, 13.0). Fresno St avoided an upset last week to a scrappy North Dakota scoring a 4Q TD in a 27-22 win. FSU was expected to air out it more this year with Carr (213 ypg, 57%, 4-1 ratio), and has, but HC Hill will cont to run the ball and has a solid option in Rouse (365 yds, 4.6). Both teams have played ND at home in recent weeks (Idaho won 44-14) but the Bulldogs are in the uncomfortable role as an away favorite.

**Connecticut 27 BUFFALO 20** - Conn is 14-6 ATS vs current MAC members and 11-1 SU vs UB S/'95 incl 6 str SU/ATS wins by an avg of 27 ppg (+252 ypg). LY's gm was tied 14-14 at HT but Conn outgained UB 282-124 in the 2H (UB had 73 yds on late 4Q garbage drive). Two short missed FG's and the inability to cash in on 3 early Iowa St int's cost the Huskies last Fri as the Cyclones came back for the win in Hartford. Conn continues to use 3 diff QB's with none rising above the rest (combined passing stats of 188 ypg, 44%, 2-5 ratio). UB all'd a TD w/29 left LW all'g Ball St to come out with the win (Bulls had a 353-325 yd edge before that final drive). UB has gone 5-15 ATS vs current BE schools but did hang tough in their opener vs Pitt as the Bulls trailed by just 5 entering the 4Q. The Huskies are 9-5 as an AF but did travel to MAC member Temple a ssn ago losing outright 30-16 (-6). UB HC Quinn is 0-3 as a HD (avg loss by 16 ppg ATS) which should allow the Huskies (#54-106 def edge) to escape NY with the victory.

**Ucla 28 OREGON ST 27** - Oregon St is just 6-18 SU vs UCLA and is on a 1-7 ATS run vs them. UCLA has won 3 of L/4 trips to Corvallis but dropped its last visit. While the Bruins erased a 19-3 4Q deficit in that gm, they allowed a 70/7p GW TD drive w/4:44 left (UCLA ended on OSU15). LY UCLA went 49/8p nailing a GW 51 yd FG as time exp'd (OSU's L/4 poss ended on 3&outs, 9 tll yds). OSU is off a bye but did make some noise during their wk off handing over the starting duties at QB to rFr Sean Mannion (194 ypg, 66%, 0-0 ratio) who takes over for incumbent str Katt. UCLA (road trip to Stanford on deck) is off a beatdown by Texas with continued concerns at QB as Prince (started, 3 early int) gave way to Brehaut once again (150 yds, 0 int). The Beavers have inj concerns heading into this one as true Fr RB Agnew is exp back after missing wk 2 (223 rush yds, 6.8, 3 TD in opener vs Sac St) while receiving threats TE Halahuni and WR Rodgers could see their 1st action of the yr making this a game to keep an eye on later in the week.

**TEXAS TECH 37 Nevada 27** - The only previous meeting was in '08 when #12 TT won 35-19 (-10) in Reno despite being outgained (488-421) as 4 of UN's 5 scoring drives ended in FG's (3 from 31 yds or less). UN's pistol off isn't firing like it was LY with several new faces at the skill positions, but it had just enough firepower to get past SJSt in the conf opener LW, 17-14 (-6). UN RB Ball, who has been tabbed as the Pack's best pure RB the L/2Y, rushed for 124 yds and UN's D int'd a pass in the EZ with 1:10 left. UN's last road win over a BCS foe was in '03 at Wash (28-17, +17) and the Pack has gone 3-11 SU (4-10 ATS) vs BCS tms overall since. TT clobbered hapless NM 59-13 (-21) LW building a 59-7 lead early in the 4Q. QB Doege had a performance for the ages as he was an eye-popping 40-44 for 401 yds with a 5-0 ratio with a record 90.9 comp %! He tied a Texas Tech record by hitting his first 15 passes as they amassed 624 yds off. TT has covered its last 4 at home but have their B12 opener at KU on deck.

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ NEW ORLEANS over Houston** - HOU has gotten off to a fast start vs both a Colts team that is a husk of itself without Manning and a Dolphins team adjusting to a new OC with a poor run game. NO in contrast has played the 2 teams from LY's NFC Championship game outgaining GB 477-399 and dominating CHI in the 2H holding them to 80 yards. NO's blitz happy D had 6 sks, 7 tfl and 10 QB hits LW and should get DE Smith (5.5 sks LY) back from susp and CB Porter back from a pre-sen inj. That doesn't bode well for Schaub as the Texans were 2-7-1 ATS LY when allowing 2 or more sacks with both covers coming at home. LW HOU's def did hold MIA QB Henne to 170 yds (40%, 1-1) a week after he put up 416 yds on NE but this week will be a different story vs Brees who is avg 333 ypg (67%) with a 6-0 ratio. The Saints now stand at 10-3-1 ATS as a non-div HF while Houston is just 2-7 ATS in non-Reliant domes.

**FORECAST: NEW ORLEANS 34 Houston 20**

**3★ Green Bay over CHICAGO** - CHI upset GB 20-17 in the 1st meeting LY as a 3 pt HD thanks to 18 penalties by the Packers. In the 2nd meeting GB won 10-3 (10 pt HF) despite CHI playing its starters most of the game to try to keep GB out of the playoffs. In the NFC Championship game, GB won 21-14 as a 3 pt AF as Cutler (knee) was KO'd. GB HC McCarthy admitted prior to LW's game that the Packers did zero gameplanning for CAR in the offseason as they had no idea what to expect schematically. They based everything off the ARZ game and found themselves looking at a 13-0 deficit at the half. In the 2H they outscored CAR 30-14 with a 293-261 yd edge (83 on CAR final drive). CHI was kept off balance all day by NO's pass rush giving up 6 sks and 10 QBH's and only converting 2 of 12 on 3rd Dns. Already w/o SS Harris, they lost FS Wright who was playing SS LW (status unknown for both) and Brees capitalized with #3 safety Meriweather still learning the system. GB is much healthier and more dangerous than the team that beat CHI in LY's title game and do so again here.

**FORECAST: Green Bay 38 CHICAGO 21**

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ SEATTLE (+) over Arizona** - SEA gets the situational edge at home with ARZ on the road again after coming back from their game vs WAS. SEA has fielded one of the youngest OL's since the 1995 Panthers the L2W and it's shown as they've allowed 10 sks (16 QBH) on 66 pass att's. SEA has tallied 64 (2.9) and 31 (2.4) yds rushing. While its very early, Kolb (280 ypg 61% 4-1) and Wells (92 5.7) have been what the Cardinals needed going into the season. ARZ's problem is the defense as they have 2 young starting CB's and 2 old safeties who lack speed (8.9 ypa!!). SEA may get big FA addition WR Rice (torn labrum) into the mix to give them a full set of skill players. SEA QB Jackson has been lukewarm at best so far TY but he gets a break after facing SF who got to gameplan for months for the opener and PIT who blew them out of the water LW. With the ARZ team travelling again and we'll take the Seahawks here as our UGLY DOG (26-17 - incl an outright upset winner on BUF earlier this year!).

**FORECAST: SEATTLE 27 Arizona 23**

**2★ CAROLINA over Jacksonville** - CAR comes into this game with tons of confidence due to the surprising play of Newton who got a lot of work in prior to training camp with former CAR QB Weinke. In his 2 starts he's posted 854 yds (63%) with a 3-4 ratio with 14 pass plays of 20+ yds vs 30 all of LY for CAR. While still very raw, Newton is doing all the right things like hot read adjustments on blitzes and CAR had a 214-126 yd edge over GB LW at the half. Unlike Clausen LY, Newton has the backing of key veterans like WR Smith (14 rec 23.9) adding to his confidence. While Garrard was an avg NFL QB, he was one of the leaders in the lockerroom. McCown barely got the Jags past TEN in Wk 1 and the Jets shut him down LW (59 yds, 32%, 0-4). JAX was outgained 173-97 at the half and simply doesn't have a game changer outside of Jones-Drew (88 yds 4.9) offensively. We'll side with the more confident and surprisingly explosive home team here even though Jones-Drew will get his yards vs 2 rookie DT's.

**FORECAST: CAROLINA 20 Jacksonville 13**

## OTHER GAMES

**CINCINNATI 17 San Francisco 14** - SF is 5-2-1 ATS in their 1st road game and Harbaugh has had the benefit of 2 home games to ease his team into his new schemes. CIN is 1-8 ATS at home. CIN isn't expected to have much of a crowd edge as Dalton's home opener will be their 5th straight non-sellout. Home teams that opened the season w/ 2 road games are 1-10-1 ATS. CIN was in a good spot LW vs a DEN team off a MNF loss that was severely injury depleted. The Bengals didn't get off to a good start getting outFD 13-4 and outgained 169-93 in the 1H. CIN adjusted at halftime as Dalton put up 332 yds (66%) with 2 TD's in a losing effort. SF failed to take advantage of an injury depleted DAL defense travelling on the 2nd straight week losing in OT. SF was outgained 472-206 at home and Smith has failed to stretch the field at this point (152 ypg 71% 2-1) and Gore has been ineffective with 106 yds total (2.5) as SEA and DAL stacked the line. CIN will only get better as the year goes on and we'll call for them by 3 in their home debut.

**New England 31 BUFFALO 20** - The Patriots have dominated the Bills winning 15 straight (11-4 ATS) with a 29-12 avg score. In his L7 starts vs BUF, Brady has avg'd 252 ypg (70%) with a 20-2 ratio. Fitzpatrick has avg'd 225 ypg (61%) with a 3-6 ratio vs NE with the Bills. BUF was in a prime situation LW getting OAK off MNF and coming cross country but found itself down 21-3 at the half. This is a different BUF team though and they scored TD's on all five 2H drives. BUF logged a 326-247 yd edge securing the win by beating OAK at their own game with 164 yds rushing (11.7) in the 2H. NE has logged back to back 500 yds offense vs 2010's #6 and #1 defenses. NE has converted an astounding 15 of 24 FD's to start the season with Brady having a 10.7 ypa and a 7-1 ratio. While the Bills are better they've had very favorable matchups so far and we'll call for the road team by 10 as we want to see how BUF fares vs a truly elite team.

**PHILADELPHIA 24 NY Giants 17** - The Eagles have won & covered 6 straight including playoffs with a 32-21 avg score. PHI changed the NFC landscape by scoring 28 pts in the last 7:28 of LY's 2nd meeting. PHI had a 220-65 yd edge and added a back breaking 65 yd PR to win the game on the final play. A much healthier Giants defense held Vick to 113 yds (61%) with a 1-1 ratio for 3.5 Qtrs until they imploded. Both teams are off primetime games with PHI facing ATL on SNF and the Giants coming off the Rams on MNF. NFC East Div AD's are 23-9 ATS since 2007. There is not a lot of information to go on as the Giants are better than their Wk 1 showing and will only be getting healthier. PHI still has their speed edge but they can be beaten by a power rush attack as STL showed before Jackson got hurt. We'll call for the home team by 7 and wait for a solid line later in the week.

**CLEVELAND 23 Miami 20** - CLE beat MIA 13-10 as 5 pt AD's LY thanks to 3 TO's by the Dolphins which setup a pair of FG's. Henne was w/o WR Marshall (hamstring) and #2 WR Hartline (hand) left in the 2H. MIA held Hillis to 57 yds (3.2) rushing but squandered 10-4 FD and 160-79 yd edges in the 1H. LW CLE was able to hang on to a 4Q lead vs IND after blowing four 4Q leads LY and a 17-13 lead vs CIN in the opener. Hillis ran for 94 yds (3.5) incl a key score just before the half that put CLE up for good. QB McCoy spread the ball around to 8 diff rec's while throwing for 211 yds (69%, 1-0). The Dolphins are now 0-2 for the fifth time in the past six yrs after allowing a franchise-worst 622 yds to NE in the opener then were beaten deep repeatedly by HOU LW. QB Henne threw for a career-high 416 yards in the opener but LW threw for just 170 (40%, 1-1). The Dolphins ST's play continues to be an Achilles heel as they had a 22 yd FG blk'd and missed a 34-yarder while also committing two key TO's. We are well aware the road team in Dolphins games are 36-14 ATS since 2008. The Browns are well aware of MIA OC Daboll's weak spots (was CLE's OC LY) and should be able to take advantage of a disappointing MIA D.

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**TENNESSEE 23 Denver 20** - DEN beat TEN 26-20 as 6.5 pt AD's LY thanks to an Orton TD with 93 sec left. DEN scored on 6 of 7 trips inside the TEN 20, held RB Johnson to 53 yds rushing (2.8) while Orton put up 308 yds (70%) with a 2-1 ratio. DEN went into the CIN game very beat up with 6 starters (RB Moreno, WR Lloyd, DE Dumervil, DT Thomas, LB Williams and CB Bailey) sitting out but pulled out a 24-22 win over CIN. McGahee ran for 101 (3.6) while Orton was efficient with 195 yds (60%, 2-0) but the Broncos lost two more players to injury. With the Ravens focused on stopping TEN RB Johnson (53, 2.2), QB Hasselbeck threw for 358 yards (71% 1-1) and the Titans got a surprising 26-13 win over BAL LW. The Titans new look D was aggressive repeatedly hitting Flacco while sacking him 3x and forcing 3 TO's. TEN had a 35:52-24:08 TOP edge while outgaining BAL 432-229. DEN was just 2-6 ATS on the road LY and with the Broncos injury concerns and TEN riding high from LW, we'll call for the HT to get the win.

**MINNESOTA 27 Detroit 24** - DET broke a 6 game SU/ATS losing streak by beating MIN 20-13 as a 3.5 pt HF to close out 2010. Both teams were starting backups and DET finished with a 357-214 yd edge holding MIN to 1 drive over 30 yds in its 1st 7 drives. A week after throwing for 39 yds (47%) with a 1-1 ratio, McNabb had 75 yds (54%) in the 2H as the Vikings blew a 17-0 1H lead. Peterson had 83 yds (5.1) in the 1H but was held to 37 yds (3.7) afterwards. DET destroyed KC LW 48-3 holding the Chiefs to 5 FD and 79 yds in the 2H. Stafford is playing like his #1 DC pedigree with an 8.3 ypa and 7-2 ratio and has yet to be sacked. While its very early it is notable that DET has only allowed 5.8 ypa and a 1-4 ratio in its 1st 2 games. While they did cover as a large HF LW DET is working as an AF for the 1st time since the 2008 opener. MIN is desperate for a win after a poor Wk 1 showing and blowing LW's game with 35 sec left and are worth a look here.

**SAN DIEGO 38 Kansas City 10** - Favored in 12 straight meetings, SD is 6-1 SU but only 4-3 ATS vs KC. SD has avg'd a 162 ypg edge over KC in that span and have circled this meeting since losing the AFC West title LY. In the L4 games since Charlie Weis announced his departure KC is 0-4 SU/ATS, has been outscored 150-27 with Cassel earning 109 ypg (52%) with a 1-9 ratio. Over the L3W the Chiefs have lost key players to LY's 10-6 season losing TE Moeaki (578 yds 12.5) to a torn ACL in pre-4, SS Berry (#2 tklr #1 ints) to a torn ACL in Wk 1 and RB Charles (#2 NFL rush yds) to a torn ACL LW. SD clobbered MIN statistically 407-187 in Wk 1 holding them to 26 yds in the 2H. They lost to NE on the road and now get a wounded defending AFC West Champ at home. This is a big line but SD will be very focused here and brings the hammer vs their division rival.

**OAKLAND 20 NY Jets 17** - This is the 5th meeting in 7Y with the Jets winning 3 of 4 SU/ATS. OAK had a 21-3 halftime lead without the bulk of their receiving unit with TE Boss, WR's Heyward-Bey, Ford and Murphy sidelined. OAK gave up 5 straight TD drives in the 2H as the fatigue of playing on MNF and travelling hit them. Unlike previous Raider teams they stayed in the fight losing with 18 sec left. Campbell was crisp with 323 yds (70%) 2-1 as they converted 8 of 12 3rd Dns. The Jets made the most of being home for the 2nd straight week getting an inexperienced JAX QB with no receiving game to work with. The Jets defense came up big with a safety and 4 ints which were turned into 29 pts. While the offense got short fields to work with the Jets only had 101 yds rushing (3.2) with 23 (9.7) by Sanchez. Ctr Mangold (ankle sprain) is likely to miss and that would be huge vs an underrated OAK DL. We'll take the undervalued home team getting points here.

**ST LOUIS 24 Baltimore 17** - STL is off their 1st MNF since Dec 2006 vs the Giants. No team looked worse from Wk 1 to Wk 2 as the Ravens were beaten at their own game by the Titans. Rice was held to 43 yds (3.3) rushing, Flacco had 197 yds (47%) with a 1-2 ratio (6.2 ypa) and the defense couldn't get off the field. BAL gave up 358 yds (71%) with 1-1 to Hasselbeck and failed to generate any serious pressure (just 2 QBH). The Rams took their lumps vs PHI after RB Jackson (quad) left and it's not known how they fared vs the Giants. They have a good defensive front 7 that can bring pressure without blitzing. There are now 2 games of film on BAL's cut blocking scheme and the Rams will be able to counter now. BAL is an overvalued team that will be more focused but the loss of 1st RD DC Smith and nickel CB Carr vs PIT will still carry over here. OC McDaniels has faced BAL's defense the L2Y in losing efforts but has a better OL to work with and we'll take the home team getting points here.

**Atlanta at TAMPA BAY** - ATL has won 5 straight SU with the road team covering the L4. TB is 2-9-1 ATS at home and could be facing a very desperate 0-2 Falcons team. They take a big step down vs TB's defense after facing 2 veteran laden playoff level units vs CHI and PHI. So far TY TB's DL has logged 2 sks and 2 QBH's vs 2 avg OLs. In the 1H vs DET TB had 7 FD and 108 yds and in the 1H vs MIN they had 3 FD and 62 yds. Down 17-0 at the half, the Bucs took over the 2H with 16-8 FD and 273-114 yd edges scoring on 4 of 5 drives. Not counting the final play of the game, TB only allowed 3 plays of 10 or more yds in the 2H. ATL put up good yards (386) vs CHI but they couldn't put points on the board. They now travel vs an amped up div foe after a big primetime home game vs their former QB. We will officially pass on here we will wait to see how ATL played on SNF.

**Pittsburgh at INDIANAPOLIS** - PIT got a huge scare LW when Roethlisberger injured a knee in the 1H. The Steelers took care of business by clobbering the Seahawks 24-0 at home. IND was improved LW but still found itself in a tough loss to the Browns. This may not be the walk away that most expect as Collins gets more comfortable in the system. DD AF's that were DD HF's their last game are only 3-14 ATS as the line increases and look ahead comes in. **Get the Sunday Marquee Play after 11:00 am for just \$9 on the Northcoast Debit Card System.** An easy winner already this year (9/18 results unknown as of presstime).

**Washington at DALLAS** - DAL had a 380-250 yd edge vs WAS in LY's season opener but were down 13-7 with 1:50 left. Romo drove DAL down to the WAS 13 with :12 left. On 3rd and 10 with :03 left he tossed a game winning TD which was nullified by a holding penalty. DAL didn't recover as their 2010 season spiraled down from there. Both teams are off of close wins vs NFC West foes and Romo (ribs) comes in hurt. This classic rivalry is more than worth watching here.

The Canes opened up with 63/4pl and 77/12pl TD drives and never looked back vs OSU in which they had a 363-209 yd edge. RB Miller (303, 6.9) is #4 FBS rushing. After a 45 yd IR TD on Kent's 1st poss, KSU scored on 5 straight poss to take a 34-0 HT lead in their 1st shutout win S/'06. Improved Cats D led by ex-Canes LB Arthur Brown, who already rec'd limited immunity from the NCAA in exchange for testimony about his role in the Shapiro scandal, has all'd a 1 yd TD "drive" TY and are #1 FBS in tfl and scoring D. KSU is 9-3 as an AD and Miami is 8-14 as a HF and we'll back the dog looking for our 3rd straight Underdog Winner! **FORECAST: Kansas St 17 (+) over MIAMI, FL 24**

**MISS ST 37 Louisiana Tech 20** - MSU is 7-3 SU vs LT but has dropped the L/2 vs Tech ('96 and '08). In their last meeting in '08, we used a 3\* LPS on LT at home and they won outright 22-14 (+8)! MSU led 14-3 just before HT but 5 TO's led to LT's comeback win. LT RB Creer rushed for 99 yds while QB Isham passed for 199 and Tech led Houston 34-7 mid 3Q LW, but then allowed 28 unanswered pts including a TD with 1:52 to go to fall 35-34 (+8) to the Cougars. MSU has the edge on off (#25-73) and def (#29-83) here. State is in an LSU/UGA sandwich and LY in an SEC sandwich they were a 20 pt HF vs UAB but had to rally to win 29-24. MSU faced a stiffing def LW against LSU where it was held to just 193 tfl off yds (QB Relf 96 pass yds, RB Ballard 38 rush yds) but should be able to churn out some offense here. LT is just 10-28 as an AD and LY allowed 471 ypg on the road. LT may still be shell shocked after letting one get away and MSU will look to get back to its winning ways vs a more manageable opponent than the L/2.

**BAYLOR 45 Rice 31** - Old SWC rivals who played every yr from '45-'95. BU has won 5 str SU/ATS over Rice by an avg 19 ppg. LY on a rain soaked field the Bears (-8) trailed 3-0 but won 30-13 on the road with Griffin hitting 20-28 for 268 yds. The Bears have won 7 str SU at home vs non-conf/non-BCS opp's (avg 42-12). BU is 6-4 as a HF and Rice is 3-9 as an AD. BU scored on 8 of 9 poss in a weather shortened win over Sam Houston St in which the Bears had 25-10 FD and 545-207 yd edges. After jumping out to a 31-0 lead, the gm was halted for 41 mins due to lightning and the tms agreed to skip HT and play for just 12:00 in the 3 and 4Q's but with 2:58 left in the 3Q the gm was called. Heisman candidate QB Griffin (312 ypg, 84%, 8-0, 116 rush yd) is #1 FBS pass eff. Rice is off a bye after their thrilling 24-22 win over Purdue in which they blk'd a 31 yd FG att on the gm's last play to preserve their 1st win over a B10 tm since '97. The week off should be beneficial for banged up top offensive weapon RB McGuffie who had just 67 tfl yds in limited action in the 1st 2. Rice has a big ST edge (#2-114) but Bears have the huge off edge (#9-78) and now take on the Owls #99 D.

**Southern Miss 31 VIRGINIA 30** - Only meeting was in '09 as this is SM's 1st trip to Charlottesville. Incl bowls SM has dropped 12 in a row vs current BCS tms on the road (5-7 ATS). In '09, UVA (+14) lost 37-34 at SM. UVA led 34-17 mid-3Q but could only muster 57 yds the rest of the way. LW UVA outgained NC 468-401 but blew numerous opp's incl 3 TO's and lost 28-17. QB Rocco is avg 217 ypg (61%) with a 1-4 ratio and UVA's ground gm is avg 191 ypg (4.7). Last week SM rolled up 478 yds including 335 rush in a 52-6 rout of FCS SE Louisiana. In their 1st 2 gms they escaped LT and lost to Marshall in the rain and only avg 114 rush ypg. QB Davis avg 226 ypg (57%) with a 4-4 ratio. Both defenses have played well this year as UVA is allowing 296 ypg while Southern Miss is allowing 302. Virginia has Idaho on deck while SM has CUSA home opener vs Rice.

**TEXAS A&M 44 Oklahoma St 34** - LY in a wild Thurs Night gm A&M (+3) led 21-7 at HT but 5 costly TO's did them in incl a 63 yd FR TD early 4Q. With 16 left A&M tossed an int at the O32 which was ret'd 28 yds setting up OSU's 40 yd GW FG as time exp and A&M had a 535-341 yd edge. With LY's win over A&M, OSU has won a series high 3 str gms, but is 2-0-1 ATS. OSU is 2-6 ATS vs ranked tms. OSU is on its 2nd str AG after LW's crazy weather delayed gm which didn't end until 3:35 am CT (started 12:16 am) and this is by far A&M's biggest gm of the month. OSU's turning point vs Tulsa came on the 3rd series as TU QB Kinne was KO'd with a knee inj after hit OOB and HC Blankenship said it took the Hurricane out of their off gm plan which was to use Kinne's mobility. His replacement Henderson fmb'd 3x in the next 2 series and hit 6-20 for 104 with a 2-3 ratio as the Cowboys built up a 45-6 3Q lead before emptying the benches. A&M dominated Idaho 37-7 with 31-10 FD and 517-187 yd edges as the Vandals compiled 104 yd and 5 FD on their final 2 garbage time drives, scoring a TD on 4&1 with 2:55 left. The offenses are close (OSU #1-5) but A&M has a large defensive edge (#15-53) and of course the 12th Man home edge. With OSU 1-6 as a SD conf dog and A&M having cashed 6 of 7 at home vs the B12, this will be our Technical GOW.

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**Nebraska 37 WYOMING 16** - Last met in '94. Since '04 WY is 2-1 hosting BCS tms but 3-0 ATS and in '09 led Texas 10-6 late 2Q before the Longhorns pulled away in the 2H. Neb is off Wash and has its first B10 AG at #7 Wisky on deck. NU was only up by 3 at HT LW but QB Martinez needed just 10 2H pass yds to propel them to a 51-38 win (NU 22-20 FD, 464-420 yd edges) over Wash. Martinez is avg 163 ypg (48%) with a 3-2 ratio and leads with 384 rush yd (7.5, 6 TD). The #2 rusher, Burkhead, has 250 (5.2) with 5 TD's. WY is off a road trip to BG but has bye on deck. The Pokes D forced 6 TO's LW and despite being outFD'd 28-18 and outgained 514-396, WY blk'd BG's PAT with :03 left and pulled another OUTRIGHT UPSET winner for our Big Dogs, 28-27 (+9). True frosh QB Smith is avg 266 ypg (62%) with a 5-3 ratio and has 5 rec's over 100 yds. The top rusher is Muhammad with only 198 (7.6, 2 TD). WY is 3-0 for the 1st time S/'96 and does have the altitude edge but Neb fans travel well and NU has huge edges all around. The Huskers have scored 40+ in their 1st 3 (1st time that's happened S/'95) and should take care of business.

**OKLAHOMA 45 Missouri 17** - Mizzou hasn't won in Norman S/'66 dropping 17 str trips. Oklahoma is playing with legitimate revenge as they had 3 trips inside the MO15 result in 0 pts and allowed a KR TD as ESPN Gameday was on hand for the night game that sent the #1 team down. Teams that are #1 and lose are 3-5-1 ATS vs the same foes next yr. OU is 20-8-1 as a HF. MO has been an AD just 9x in 6Y (3-6 ATS). LW OU proved their mettle at #5 FSU by shaking off a 56 yd TD pass which tied the gm with 9:32 left and promptly driving 83/8pl for a TD and adding an insurance FG with 2:01 left to beat the Seminoles. QB Jones (287 ypg, 72%, 2-2) has a weapon in the nation's #2 rec Broyles (21 rec) but an improved run gm has been the difference spearheaded by walk-on Whaley (202, 5.2). Aggressive Sooners D has 9 sks and has forced 6 TO's in 2 gms. MO a school record 744-44 yd and 30-1 FD edges in their 69-0 annihilation of FCS WIL. 3rd string TB (1st 2 out) Josey ran for 263 yd (18.8) in the 1H as the Tigers roared out to a 42-0 HT lead. DE Jacques Smith (out L/2 with elbow inj) may return TW. OU has big edges (#3-28 off, #3-22 D and #12-51 ST) all around and this one gets the call as the Revenge Play of the Week.

**Colorado St 31 UTAH ST 30** - CSU is off a 28-14 (+7) loss to in-state rival Colo. CSU QB Thomas is avg 198 ypg (71%) with a 2-3 ratio and was 18-28 for 157 yds but was sk'd 3x's and CSU rushed for just 67 yds. They're also without LB Sisson, who was leading the nation in career tfl (40) before his inj. The Aggies OL and DL have shown huge improvements in their run game avg from LY to TY (169 to 334 on off, 179 to 62 on def). RB Turbin appears fully back from LY's ACL inj and is avg 125 ypg (6.2). USU has also found a solid replacement for departed QB Borel in newcomer Keeton who also possesses dual-threat ability (190 ypg pass, 69%, 2-0 ratio, 86 rush yds, 5.1). The Rams are 3-14 SU (4-13 ATS) on the road under Fairchild incl 11 str SU losses but will look to end that streak here.

**BOISE ST 49 Tulsa 20** - TU is 0-5 SU but 3-2 ATS vs BSU with the L/3 decided by a TD or less. Broncos have won 9 str home openers by 36 ppg but TU is 7-4 ATS (0-2 TY) vs ranked tms. LW TU's start was delayed until 12:16 am but 24,563 hung around to see TU put up 482 tfl yds (incl 365 rush) but fell 59-33 to OKSt. Watts (159) and Douglas (173) both went over the 100 rush yd mark, the 1st time TU has had 2 over 100 S/'06. TU was outFD'd 32-27, outgained 543-482 and lost QB Kinne to a knee inj early (CS). RFR Henderson hit 6-20-104 with a 2-3 ratio and if he's forced to go, faces an extremely tough environment in his 1st start. BSU does have a big revenge gm vs Nev on deck while TU hosts N Texas. BSU went into Toledo LW hoping to get its run gm back on track (129 yds vs UGA) but they only had 26 rush 1H yds (145 tfl). BSU (-20) had 32-21 FD, 610-349 yd edges and beat UT 40-15. QB Moore (#4 NCAA pass eff, pass ypg) avg 358 ypg (79%) with an 8-2 ratio. His top target is Doug Martin (147, 18.4, 1) who is also the top rusher (127, 3.0, 1). Boise is 41-20 as a HF. The Hurricane are on their 3rd away game and 3rd Top 10 tm in 4 weeks and face a momentous challenge without their top weapon, WR Johnson, and possibly their QB.

**Oregon 41 ARIZONA 20** - The Ducks journey to Tucson with renewed confidence after B2B routs over Nevada and Missouri St (642 ypg L2W) and are 15-5 SU (12-7-1 ATS) vs AZ. The Wildcats are in the middle of a tough 5 gm stretch off Okla St and Stanford (all'd 581 ypg L2W) with USC and Oregon St on deck. The AZ running gm (56 ypg, 2.6) and pass protection (7 sks all'd) have been the issue as QB Foles has performed well avg 350 ypg (75%) with a 7-0 ratio. The Ducks won 44-41 (20T) in their last trip to Tucson as UO went 80/15pl scoring on an 8 yd TD pass w/06 to force OT winning on a 1 yd TD run on 38gl. LY AZ went into Autzen and never trailed in the 1H. The Ducks controlled the 2H and won 48-29 (-19). AZ is 9-2 as a HD vs ranked teams but UO is 19-5 ATS in their 1st conf AG of the ssn, have a bye on deck and have been focusing a good amount of attention on this matchup for a good 2 wks all'g them to take a victory in the desert.

**usc 24 ARIZONA ST 23** - While Arizona St has dropped 11 straight to the Trojans, they have gone 4-1-1 ATS (last win in '99). LY ASU scored a TD w/6:59 left but had the PAT blk'd and ret'd for 2 (up 2 instead of 5), USC went on to kick the GW FG as ASU's L/2 drives ended on a missed 42 yd FG and an int. Last time here USC escaped with a 14-9 win despite being outFD'd 23-12 and outgained 347-258 as the gm featured 18 pen (173 yds). USC QB Barkley had 5 TD's passing (5 diff rec's) LW vs Syr as they rolled to a 21 pt win (501-331 yd edge). For a second straight week ASU nearly pulled out a close matchup as they led Illinois early in the 4Q but were unable to deliver at the end in the 3 point loss. Something will have to give here as USC is 13-1 SU and 11-3 ATS in their first road game while the Sun Devils are 9-3 ATS in conference home openers.

**Indiana 34 NORTH TEXAS 30** - First meeting, also 1st gm for NT vs a B10 foe. NT was 2-0 ATS vs BCS tms LY and is 1-0 TY after covering in their 41-0 loss to Alabama LW (+45). While NT did outgain Clemson 462-423 and Kansas St 459-450 LY, they were thoroughly dominated by the Tide (586-169) LW. IU got HC Kevin Wilson his first career victory LW as they finished with 557 tfl yds in their 38-21 win over FCS SC St. IU is 1-2 ATS vs SBC members with the avg score 35-23 and has been an AF just 5 times in 11 yrs (1-3-1 ATS). NT RB Dunbar has struggled mightily TY (40 ypg, 2.3) but should welcome an Indy defense that is #10 in the Big 10 in run defense (178, 4.3). IU does have their Big Ten opener on deck while NT will be sky high for this winnable HG vs a BCS conf tm.

**FIU 27 Louisiana 13** - Dating back to LY's bowl win, FIU has garnered their 3 biggest wins in school history in their L/4 gms. TY's wins include their first over a BCS foe (Louisville) as well as a win over an in-state rival, which was done LW 17-10 over a tough UCF team despite losing all-everything playmaker TY Hilton to a hamstring injury late in the 2Q (CS). Louisiana is coming off a tougher than expected 38-21 win over Nicholls St in a game that was tied 14 all in the 1Q. UL needed a blocked FG return for a TD as well as an IR TD to hold off the upset minded Colonels. FIU is 2-6 SU and 1-6 ATS vs UL but has won B2B gms SU. LY FIU had 7 sks and 3 int and won on the road 38-17 (-10) but was outgained 390-317. FIU is 3-5 as a HF and UL is 6-1 ATS in the series and 8-1 as an AD. FIU has huge edges in ST's (#25-82) and offense (#72-111) but with the status of Hilton unknown at press time, those advantages won't be as dramatic.
