NEWS AND NOTES

SUGAR BOWL Michigan (-3) 23 Virginia Tech 20 OT - VT had 377-184 yd and 22-12 FD edges and settled for 4 FG's in regulation by 3rd string K Justin Myer as VT was without their top 2 K's. UM was extremely fortunate to escape with the win as VT dominated the first 24:00 but were SOD on 4&1 from the UM4 with 6:51 left in the half which was one of the key plays for UM. VT went on on 48.1 from the UM4 with 6:51 left in the half which was one of the key plays for UM. V1 went on 3 long drives in the 1H going 44/12pl, 46/12pl and 70/9pl. Meanwhile in that span UM was int'd and punted. Unfortunately for VT they settled for 37 and 43 yd FG's. VT's D forced another punt but roughing the P gave UM a FD and later on 38.17 UM threw it up. VT's DB went for the ball, wiped out another VT DB while doing so and Hemingway caught it and went 45 yds for a TD and a 7-6 lead (:49 2Q). VT then fmbi'd the KO and UM settled for a FG and appeared to be stopped when their holder michaelded the span and threw it up for grabe in a cluster of 37 defenders. The half their holder mishandled the snap and threw it up for grabs in a cluster of 3 VT defenders. The ball bounced off the 3 VT defenders, was caught by an OL for a FD and UM was awarded 3 more pts 2pl later and led 10-6 at the half. UM went 35/3pl after a TO for a TD to lead 17-6 (9:43). VT went on a 40/9pl drive settling for a 36 yd FG and then went on a 16pl drive for a TD to tie (10:22). VT, whose D had held UM all day, unfortunately went for a fake punt at midfield and was SOD leaving UM at the VT45 (7:21) and in scoring range and UM took advantage with a 39 yd FG. VT tied it with :02 left at the end of an 83/11pl drive. In OT VT got a TD but surprisingly it was overturned as it was not clearly an incompletion and many speculated it was a TD. VT then missed a 37 yd FG and UM got a 37 yd FG 4pl later for a fortuitous win.

CAPÍTAL ONE BOWL South Carolina (-2') 30 Nebraska 13 - Steve Spurrier was trying to break a string of 3 straight bowl losses and the one common denominator in those bowl losses was TO's by Stephen Garcia. Connor Shaw had 0 int's and SC had 0 TO's and SC got what Spurrier wanted and that was an 11th win, the most in school history. Shaw appeared very careful throwing the ball, sometimes holding on to it much longer than expected and would hit 11-17-230 and rush for 42. Alshon Jeffery had a big game with 148 yds on 4 rec's despite getting ejected from the game late 3Q when he and CB Dennard got into a shoving contest. SC finished with a 351-253 yd edge and surprisingly SC's leading RB, Brandon Wilds did not have a rush attempt as Kenny Miles rushed 15x for 67 yds. A couple of key plays went SC's way in the 1H as they blk'd and xp and ret'd it for 2 and instead of trailing 7-0 it was 6-2 (11:58 1Q) and while SC blew a key scoring opportunity having a 1st & gl and settling for a 20 yd FG and then missing it, they took over with :38 left in the half. They appeared to mismanage the clock and were down to just :06 at midfield when Shaw launched a Hail Mary pass and Alshon Jeffery caught it for the 51 yd TD to make it 16-13 at the half. SC got a TD with 12:25 left then drove 71/13pl for another TD with 3:05 left to clinch it, 30-13 and took a knee on their final drive.

OUTBACK BOWL Michigan St (+3) 33 Georgia 30 30T - MSU ended a 5 game bowl losing streak picking up their first bowl win since 2001 even though UGA appeared to have this one locked up a couple of times. It was MSU's 2nd straight 11 win season and UGA opened the year with 2 losses, finished the year with 2 losses with 10 wins in between. UGA dominated the 1H leading 16-0 with 7-2 FD and 206-73 yd edges. In the 1H, they were SOD on 4&1 at the MSU6 and fmbl'd at the MSU41 but did lead only 2-0 when they got an 80 yd TD pass with 3:06 left 1H to King then a 92 yd PRTD by Boykin with 1:39 left for their 16-0 lead. UGA was in the and MSU went 48/9pl for a TD and 2 pt conv, 16-8 (7:52). MSU got a 38 yd IR TD with 1:47 left 3Q, 16-14 (2ptng). UGA settled for a 32 yd FG and MSU got a TD with 8:22 left for the lead, 20-19 (2ptng). MSU got a TD with :14 left capping an 85 yd drive to force OT. UGA appeared to have OT won when they got an int in the first OT and then on 2&8, even though K Walsh had struggled all year, Richt opted to have the QB take a knee in the middle of the field to give Walsh a 42 yd FG straight on. He pushed it right. Each team got a FG in the 2nd OT and after a MSU FG, Walsh's 47 yd FG was blk'd in the 3rd OT.

GATOR BOWL Florida (-2') 24 Ohio St 17 - UF got a 14 yd blk'd punt for a TD and a 99 yd KR
TD despite being outFD'd 20-14 and outrained 299-263 and came away with the 7 pt win in a

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battle of 6-6 teams. OSU fell below .500 for the first time since 1988 losing 7 games for the first time since 1897. UF's D-line had a season high 6 sacks and was harassing QB Miller on almost every play. UF did lead this one 24-10 settling for a 17 yd FG with 14:09 left. OSU punted with 12:22 left on 4&11, and on 4&5 with 5:02 left from their own 18. OSU drove 88/7pl getting a TD with :57 left but UF rec'd the onside kick.

LIBERTY BOWL Cincinnati 31 Vanderbilt 24 - Zach Collaros did a tremendous job returning from injury just to play vs Vanderbilt after breaking his right ankle Nov 12th. Coach Butch Jones felt it was the best performance of any player in the post season. Collaros' stats were not overwhelming as he hit just 12-29-80 and did not have his normal mobility with -8 yds rushing. Isaiah Pead rushed for 149. A couple key plays happened. VU had a much better offense with Jordan Rodgers at QB but he struggled in the 1H hitting 4-14-26 and was replaced by Larry Smith in the 2H who hit 8-19-142. VU was up 7-0 as UC had just 3 FD's on their first 5 poss. They handed off to backup RB Winn who went 69 yds for a TD to start the 2Q to tie it. VU went for it on 4&2 at the UC44 and fired incomplete with just 2:31 left in the half. UC went 56/9pl and got an 8 yd TD pass with :12 left in the half for the first key play, 14-7. Late 3Q VU went 52/8pl for a TD to tie (3:53) and UC would get a 44 yd FG. VU got a 68 yd TD pass to go up 21-17 with 14:03 left and appeared in control but UC got a 90 yd KR TD (13:51). VU punted twice and then was int'd at their own 43 and ret'd 12 yds with 3:15 left. UC went 31/3pl for a TD to ice it, 31-21. VU got a FG with :24 left but UC rec'd the onside kick

TICKETCITY BOWL Houston (-7) 30 Penn St 14 - UH was coached by interim HC Tony Levine. PSU was without starting QB McGloin who got a concussion in a locker room fight prior to the game and there was plenty of coaching indecision going on at PSU with New England's OC Bill O'Brien rumored to be the new HC. It was PSU's first bowl without Joe Paterno as the HC since 1962. Case Keenum's 227 yds passing in the 1Q set the record for passing yds in any quarter in any bowl with Louisville's Browning Nagle's 223 vs Alabama the previous record in the 1991 Fiesta Bowl. PSU star DL Devon Still was slowed by a turf toe. PSU's D got better in the 2H and allowed just 2 FG's. UH finished with a 600-306 yd edge but PSU had 3 shanked punts and some crucial missed opportunities by Bolden and UH came away with a 30-14 win. UH was our most improved team of the year coming into the

season and they finished with the most improved record of any team in college football.

CHICK-fil-A BOWL Auburn (-2') 43 Virginia 24 - Auburn susp'd RB Michael Dyer and also lost their DC but OC Gus Malzahn despite taking a HC job, stuck around to call plays. Chizik took over the D and Onterio McCalebb rushed for 109 yds and 1 TD. AU started Clint Moseley at QB but after he hit 1-4 passes for 6 yds he injured his ankle and Barrett Trotter played the rest of the game hitting and the plays of the played the rest of the game hitting. hit 1-4 passes for 6 yds he injured his ankle and Barrett Trotter played the rest of the game hitting 11-18-175. AU also blk'd 2 punts and rec'd an onside kick. UVA's top 2 def players (CB Minnifield and LB Greer) DNP due to knee injuries. One year after winning the National Championship Auburn came in 7-5. UVA wore orange helmets for the first time since 1978. AU missed a 44 yd FG and actually trailed 14-7 but led 28-14 when UVA got a 24 yd FG on the final play of the half making it 28-17. Surprisingly with Chizik coaching the D they allowed 295 yds to UVA in the 1H. Each team got a TD and both punted but AU blk'd the punt for a safety. AU ret'd the free kick 62 yds to the 15 but settled for a 45 yd FG, 40-24 (:47). AU got a 37 yd FG with 8:09 left and with 6:57 left, took over at the LIVA40 and went on an 11 play drive taking a knee at the LIVA4

at the UVA40 and went on an 11 play drive taking a knee at the UVA4.

<u>MUSIC CITY BOWL</u> Mississippi St 23 Wake Forest (+6') 17 - MSU had a 4-0 TO deficit. Vick Ballard ran for a career high 180 yds and it was a very tough loss ATS for MSU. Ballard was 3 yds shy of Walter Packer's school bowl record of 183 rushing yards in the 1974 Sun Bowl. MSU starting QB Tyler Russell was limited with a sprained knee and DNP. Chris Relf was banged up and was not the same QB in the 2H but with Dylan Favre also out with injury, he stayed in. Relf hit 12-19-129 yds but had 2 int's and rushed for 64 yds on 15 carries. There were a couple of key plays that cost MSU the cover. MSU had a 382-287 yd edge but had a missed xp, and allowed a 46 yd FG that wobbled through the uprights and bounced off the back of the goal post with 3:27 left to only lose by 6 laying 6.5. One MSU TO was crucial as with :06 left in the 1H at the WF9 they opted to try to run 1 more play and were int'd in the EZ and came away with zero pts. They also fmbl'd at their own 28 setting up WF's first TD drive. They were SOD at the WF38 with 1:51 left 3Q. At half MSU had a 230-124 yd edge. On WF's drive for the FG that gave them the backdoor cover, they converted on 4&1 and 4&3 during the drive. MSU took a knee 3x at the WF31 at the end of the game.

MEINEKE CAR CARE BOWL Texas A&M (-9') 33 Northwestern 22 - A&M was led by interim HC Tim DeRuyter and Pat Fitzgerald's main focus of the bowl prep was having the team carry a monkey around since they had not won a bowl game since 1949. Dan Persa set an NCAA record for career completion % (72.3%) hitting 25-37-213 yds. A&M led 30-7 but after they'd blown DD leads in almost every game this year, they did not feel safe. NU got a TD with 5:22 left to pull within 30-22 and get under the spread but A&M kicked a 31 yd FG with :30 left for the frontdoor cover. A&M lost OL Joseph Villavisencio during bowl week and played a motived game with everyone wearing a helmet sticker. The crowd was heavy A&M and the roof was closed at Reliant Stadium. NU led 7-3 early 2Q (10:12) but a key play happened with :20 left in the 1H as NU punted and A&M ret'd it 35 yds to the NU40. A&M got a 40 yd FG to lead 20-7 and those 3 pts came in handy for the cover. NU got TD's with 11:15 and 5:22 left to get under the spread, 30-22 and A&M on their final game clinching drive got a 3&13, 21 yd pass to midfield, a 3&6, 29 yd pass to the 18 and the 31 yd FG came with :30 left after on 3&2 when a FD would have allowed them to run out the clock, they lost 4 yds and settled for the spread winning FG.

HANDICAPPING NOTES FOR THIS WEEK'S NFL SEMI-FINAL GAMES

Here are some notes for the Semi-Final round of the playoff games. We tried to put as much information as possible in the write-ups but there was not room for all of it. Below are some questions you might have about this upcoming round and our researched answers. Not all of these will be in effect for this week's games. If one is not, we are including it so you can add it to your handicapping arsenal.

How do double digit favorites do in the Semi-Final round? Remember, teams in the Semi-Final round not only have the home field edge but had a bye the previous week. They catch their opponent off a big win in the playoffs and playing a second straight tough game. Since the playoffs were expanded in 1990 there have been 19 DD favs and they've gone 11-8 ATS and 12-7 O/U. Since 1997 there have been 9 DD favs and they are 7-2 SU and 6-3 ATS with PIT upsetting Indy in '05 and SD upsetting Indy in 2007. **How does a road team do after a win in the Wild Card round?** Since '97, this has happened

21 times. In the 6 seasons from '97-'02 there were 5 road teams which won (all underdogs) and they went 0-5 SU/ATS the next week. But since 2003 there have been 16 road teams which won in the WC round and while they were 8-8 SU in the Conf Semi's they did go 11-5 ATS. The 6 teams that won as AF's in the WC round are 5-1 ATS the next week

How do teams do that COVER by double digits in the Wild Card round? Since the 4 game Wild Card round was started in 1990, there have been 39 teams that COVERED by double digits. Of those, 17 were underdogs in the WC round that pulled upsets and those teams went 5-12 ATS in the next round. Favorites that cruised to big wins are 9-12 ATS in the next round for an overall record of 14-24 ATS. The NY Giants covered by DD in '07 vs Tampa and of course went on to 4 straight wins covering all 4 by DD and winning the Super Bowl.

How do upset winners in the Wild Card round that won SU by 13 points or more do in the next round? First of all, since 1981, teams that won SU as 6 pt dogs or more are just 2-8 ATS in the next round. Since the NFL went to the 4 game Wild Card round in 1990 there have been 11 teams that pulled an upset in the Wild Card round and won BIG (by 13 points or more). In the next round those teams are just 2-9 SU and 3-8 ATS with the last SU/ATS winner being CAR in 2005 when they also upset CHI in the Conf Semi-Finals. Last season it applied to BAL after their win at NE but the Ravens lost the next week.

How have #1 seeds fared? Before 2009 being a #1 seed had been a curse. Vegas had overcompensated and the #1 seeds in the Conf Semis were 7-5 SU but 2-10 ATS (2-0 SU/ATS LY). Before '09 the last time a #1 seed won the Super Bowl was in 2003 as NE beat Carolina and the last time a #1 seed covered in the SB was in 1998 when Denver beat Atlanta, 34-19. It was 16 vears since two #1 seeds have faced off in the SB as Dallas beat Buffalo 30-13 in 1993 before #1's Indy and NO met up in '09. LY matched a #2 seed (PIT) vs a #6 seed (GB)

How do teams do that are off an OT win? Since 1977, there have been 19 OT games in the NFL playoffs. In 2003 CAR and PHI were each off OT games when they played so we will toss out that result. Teams are just 4-12 SU off an OT win and 6-9-1 ATS as they are off an emotionally draining game and have had trouble the following week. LY Arizona beat GB but lost at NO but NO beat MIN in the Conf Finals and then beat IND for the SB. In '07 the Giants beat GB in the Conf Finals and then beat NE in the SB. In '06 Chicago beat Seattle in OT and then went on to win and cover against New Orleans. In 2003 TEN hung on for a win over PIT in OT and then were beaten by OAK 41-24 the next week while GB beat Seattle in OT and then should have beaten PHI (except for 4th and 34) but ended up losing in OT although they did cover (+5').

For the 4th time in the L/9Y the Pats have secured the #1 seed in the AFC despite having the #31 D in the NFL. They are also the only team to have logged a winning record in 11 str years since FA opened in 1993. That said NE is under a lot of pressure having lost 3 straight playoff gms while going 0-6 ATS back to the 2006 AFC Championship game. Brady has avg'd 240 ypg (60%) with just a 5-4 ratio in the L3 losses. NE went 7-1 SU/4-4 ATS at home TY with the Giants loss snapping a 20 game SU home win streak. They were +47 ypg at home in 2011 (7th) with a +8 TO mark for a 31-19 avg score. They beat DEN 41-23 as a 7 pt AF in our 5★ NFL GOY just 4 wks ago. DEN had a 16-7 lead after their 1st 3 drives. NE adjusted mid-stride and dominated DEN 34-7 from there with a 363-168 yd edge holding the Broncos to 70 yds rush in the 2H. DEN went 5-3 SU/6-2 ATS on the road TY being outgained by 42 ypg (24th) with -2 TO's for a 25-22 scoring deficit.

When John Fox's Panthers reached the SB it was by emphasizing a strong run game, physical defense and good special teams play with no TO's. While DEN has had some lucky breaks, under Tebow they have essentially followed that formula. The Broncos run-option #23 off makes the most of his size and athleticism to stretch D's and wear them out for the 4Q. Tebow has major accuracy issues right now but the key is avoiding TO's as all 4 losses with him as the starter have a combined -11 TO mark. DEN has also been helped out by the resurgence of Willis McGahee who has an impressive 7 games with 100 yd rushing finishing 8th in rush yds TY. DEN has run the ball an amazing 62% since their bye week so its not a surprise that only 2 players have more than 20 rec's right now. Eric Decker and Demaryius Thomas have good spd the current off hasn't maximized it. DEN's OL had started 16 str together but RG Chris Kuper broke his ankle vs KC which ends the run. DEN's defense has outplayed its #20 ranking and have the likely Def ROY in Von Miller solidifying the D. They switched to the 4-3 with the talents of Elvis Dumervil and FA pickup Broderick Bunkley but they have given up their share of rush yds. The #17 pass D is a bit misleading as they've given up a 24-9 ratio and have had issues at both S spots TY. DEN's ST's were doing very well for most of the yr but they dropped to an avg finish due to poor play at the end.

Much like the Packers, NE has taken a bit of heat TY for their #31 D. Belichick flipped the unit to a 4-3 due

Much like the Packers, NE has taken a bit of heat TY for their #31 D. Belichick flipped the unit to a 4-3 due to the lockout but inj's took their toll with only 5 def strs playing all 16. NE's 'bend don't break' scheme relies a lot on situational FB which is where Belichick excels. NE is a healthy 14th in sks despite not having a marquee pass rusher, is tied w/SEA for 3rd in takeaways (34) and are an avg 15th in ppg allowed. NE's #31 pass def has only all'd 3 more TD's than int which is 8th best TY. NE has given up 8 gms of 300 net yds passing TY but since their bye week on Oct 23rd they have all'd only 2 games with an opposing QBR of over 100 with 1 vs IND when they toyed with them in the 4Q. NE also seems to be mentally tougher than the L/2Y on D as they have solid leaders in Vince Wilfork, Jerod Mayo and the defenders are used to this style of ball. The Patriots also quietly got Patrick Chung back in the ssn finale as well as Brandon Spikes to help shore up the run defense. NE's best def player is Tom Brady as he sets the tempo with his command of the game. Along with Brees he also broke Dan Marino's NFL passing record and his 39 pass TD's was 2nd only to his 50 in 2007 and his 8.57 ypa was 2nd only to Rodgers TY. 2010 offered a glimpse of how versatile NE's 2 TE spread off could be as Gronkowski and Hernandez are starting to max it out. NE is the only team with 3 ply'rs over 900 yds rec and just Welker and Hernandez comb have more rec yds than DEN (by 188 yds) or JAX (by 386 yds). Brady's success eats into the #20 run gm and keep in mind it had finished 12th or better the L/3Y. NE's RB's get playing time depending on the situation/foe and are a "hidden asset" in this off. The top 3 RB's have comb for 1,459 yds (4.2) which would be 2nd behind Jones-Drew in rushing TY. The fact that Brady has been sk'd just 32 times TY (9th) is quite impressive as only FA addition Brian Waters has started all 16 gms TY. NE also has also improved on ST's as after being 11th LY they are 6th thanks to their ount units.

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Not much has changed in our thought process after using NE over DEN as our NFL GOY. LY's home playoff loss will have the ply'rs, cch's and fans all taking nothing for granted. The Tebow express cont'd by pulling the upset but that was at home against a depleted and banged up Steelers squad. In fact since 1996 WC teams of 6+ that pulled the upset are 0-6 SU (1-5 ATS) the next wk. Only TWO tms have pulled upsets as a HD of 6'+ and both lost and failed to cover the foll wk after the emotional gm. DEN also goes from the late OT game Sun to a Sat gm plus travels across county. We'll back Brady vs any D and will relish the thought of Belichick devising a gameplan to shutdown the Broncos.

FORECAST: PATRIOTS BY 27 RATING: 3★

BAL earned its 3rd ever AFC North title and finished 12-4 for the 3rd time in franchise history. They are a very exp'd with this being their 8th postseason game in the L4Y and they are the only team with a playoff win in each of the L3Y. The Ravens went a perfect 8-0 SU/4-3-1 ATS at home TY with the 4th best ydg differential at +86 ypg (+5 TO's) for a 27-15 avg score. Joe Flacco hasn't been very impressive in the playoffs avg just 150 ypg (53%) with a 4-7 ratio in his 7 starts though he didn't have to do much vs NE in 2009. HOU went 5-3 SU/ATS on the road TY outgaining foes by 66 ypg (3rd best) while tying GB for an NFL best +12 TO's setting up a 26-19 avg score. BAL has won 3 str vs Kubiak including a 29-14 win back in Wk 6 as a 7 pt HF coming off a bye week. BAL had a 402-293 yd edge but settled for 2 TD's/5 FG's inside the HOU30 before taking a victory knee at the end. HOU had 2 TD's, 6 punts and were SOD 3 times with Schaub at the helm.

The Texans have plenty of big plays with Matt Schaub on film, but the truth is the #13 offense was rather run oriented even before his injury. HOU avg'd 396 ypg with 27.3 ppg under Schaub with a 36-29 run/pass mix or 55% run. Part of this was due to Andre Johnson's injury in gm 4 but Gary Kubiak was simply making the most out of the best RB tandem in the NFL. Arian Foster and Ben Tate have combined for eleven 100 yd rushing efforts and their combined rushing yds are more than 27 teams. This tandem now supports TJ Yates, who was a 4 yr starter for the Tar Heels in the same offense and became the 10th rookie QB to start a playoff gm since the 1970 merger last wk vs Cincy (along with Dalton). HOU's OL (#11 sks allowed) has been elite with Ctr Chris Myers and RT Eric Winston being arguably the best at their positions for 2011. How important has DC Wade Phillips been? Over the 1st 13 games, the Texans improved by 102 ypg overall, 84 ypg passing, trimmed the ppg allowed by 10.7 ppg and went from a 33-13 ratio to 13-17. LY's #30 defense is now #2 for 2011. HOU didn't lose a beat after Mario Williams was lost due to rookie 1st RD DC JJ Watt stepping up and dominating. The switch to the 3-4 was a boon to the LB's as Brian Cushing's liabilities in space were removed and it eased the burden on DeMeco Ryans who returned from a torn ACL. HOU shrewdly revamped its secondary by picking up CB Johnathan Joseph and FS Danieal Manning in FA which allowed Kareem Jackson to play to his strengths. HOU has one of the better special teams in the NFL TY after being 27th LY thanks to improved coverage units.

BAL's best finish on offense has been 13th with Joe Flacco at QB so TY's #15 ranking is within the norm. After having a career best ssn in 2010, Flacco's #'s are a bit disappointing esp his 57.6% comp rate. Part of this is due to having a rookie #2 WR and a pair of 2nd year TE's seeing more time in the passing game. OC Cam Cameron generally emphasizes the pass to start the year to get more snaps for Flacco in warmer games while keeping Ray Rice fresher down the stretch. TY was no different as Rice avg'd 62 ypg (4.1) in the 1st 9 gms vs 115 ypg (5.3) over the final 7 finishing 2nd in rushing to Jones-Drew. Under Flacco the biggest issue with BAL's off has been a lack of speed on the perimeter. They upgraded that with Torrey Smith who finished 3rd in rec yds and 4th in ypc for rookie WR's with more than 10 rec's. Boldin missed the L/2 with a knee injury but is expected to ret for the playoffs along with Lee Evans who missed almost all of the ssn with an unspecified foot injury. TE Ed Dickson had a solid impact in the passing game but he was tasked with more blk'g in the L/7 which coincides with Rice's surge. BAL's OL had an excellent yr as they started all but 1 gm together due to RG Andre Gurode's toe inj and were 12th in sks all'd. The Ravens #3 def also had an excellent yr finishing in the top 10 for the 9th straight ssn. BAL is one of the few teams with the luxury of being able to plug in DC's, though 1st year DC Chuck Pagano was more aggressive with the blitz than in previous ssns. BAL only had 8 games missed by def starters TY with 4 coming via Ray Lewis' turf toe injury. While BAL allowed 8 gms of 100 yds rushing (120 ypg, 3.7) they also held foes to 93 yds or less (65 ypg, 2.1) 8 times. They are 1 of the 5 teams with more int than TD passes allowed TY and allowed 200 or fewer yds passing in 9 gms TY. BAL's biggest issue is their special tms which after being 12th IY tumbled to 25th due to poor play by the return units

On off they both prefer to slow the clock as the Texans are tied for the NFL's most rush att's while BAL is #8. In the L3Y BAL's playoff D has all'd 161 yds at KC, 263 at PIT, 426 at NE, 275 at IND, 276 at MIA, 391 at TEN and 275 yds at PIT allowing an avg of 16 ppg.

Jim Harbaugh followed up leading Stanford to a 12-1 season and its 1st BCS bowl win by taking SF to their 1st NFC West title since 2002. SF is 7-1 SU/7-0-1 ATS at home and while they've only outgained foes by an avg of 21 ypg owning an NFL best +19 TO's has set up a 28-11 avg score. They are 8-1-1 ATS vs non-div foes TY with a 23-14 avg score as despite being -37 ypg in those gms they are +13 TO's. NO went 9-2 ATS vs non-div foes TY with a 36-22 avg score with a +118 yd edge (2nd to PIT) with +1 TO's. NO beat a very different SF team 25-22 as a 5 pt AF on MNF in Wk 2 LY. SF had a 417-287 yd edge but 4 TO's killed their momentum as NO hit a 37 yd FG on the final play to win. NO is 5-3 SU/4-4 ATS on the road being +84 ypg (2nd best) but were -7 TO's. NO has broken the 500 yd mark in 6 gms TY while SF has only tallied 3 games of 400 yds offense.

Stability breeds success and for the 6th straight year Brees/Payton have a top 5 passing offense. In his L/8 gms Brees has destroyed pass defenses avg 341 ypg (72%) with a 27-4 ratio and his lowest QBR TY at home was 96.8 vs ATL. The diff in TY's #1 off is that 56% of the rec's and 47% of the rec yds are thru the RB/TE's which allows more blockers to get into play after the catch. NO's 56.7% rate on 3rd downs is the best since IND's 56.1% back in 2006. NO's #6 ground game is very underrated as no single RB is putting up big #'s but like NE, they play the back that fits the situation. For the 3rd straight year NO put 5 players in the Pro Bowl and all 5 are on offense. Graham broke Kellen Winslow's 31 year old record of 1,290 yds for a TE and is only in his 2nd year in the league. NO has had the same OL for 8 straight gms headlined by the best OG tandem in the NFL with Carl Nicks and Jahri Evans. NO didn't have a single defender voted to the Pro Bowl TY and after being 4th in yds and 7th in pts LY they are 24th and 14th. After earning 25 takeaways LY they only have 16 TY. MLB Vilma has been playing with a sore knee and teams have gotten used to DC Gregg Williams' schemes. Williams still likes to disperse the pressure from all over as noted by the fact that SS Roman Harper has more sks than DE Will Smith. After finishing 28th and 22nd in our special teams rankings in '09-'10, NO has a top 10 unit TY thanks to Darren Sproles who has 1,000+ total yds on offense and 1,000+ KR yds TY along with a healthy 10.1 PR avg.

At the start of the year Alex Smith was viewed as being on borrowed time. Having been a 15 year NFL QB himself, Harbaugh has took to the practice field and tutored Smith how to run his straight forward offense. SF's 2 TE set to allows them to control the LOS and give variety to the ground game. While the 49ers have yet to have a 1,000 yd receiver since they drafted Smith, Frank Gore has run for 1,000 yds in 5 of the L/6 seasons. Only DEN/HOU ran the ball more times TY than SF, as Gore had 5 straight 100 yd games in Oct/Nov as OC Greg Roman started to adjust for more passing from that point. WR Michael Crabtree finally started to mature into an NFL player TY and he likely would have had his first 1,000 yd ssn if not for another foot injury. The real #1 option in the passing game is TE Vernon Davis as 40 of his 67 rec's were for FD's. SF's passing game is muddled after that as while Kyle Williams has shown some flash they don't have another dependable quality option. This has led to their #30 red-zone finish as out of 193 off drives only 32 ended in a TD and only CIN's 30 had fewer among the playoff teams. SF's OL was much more stable with Anthony Davis and Mike lupati in their 2nd ssns as the 49ers started their L/13 games with the same unit. Pass protection is still an issue as they gave up 1 sk for every 10.3 att's. SF's #4 def is the best finish for an NFC West team since realignment thanks to their elite def front 7 TY. DE Justin Smith played at an NFL MVP level TY and sets the tone for the entire unit. Smith's 7 sks is actually impressive for a 3-4 DE and he often was the setup blk'r for Aldon Smith who came in for pass rush situations. Smith was a part of the best LB unit in the NFL TY along with All-Pro LB Patrick Willis and NaVorro Bowman who owd amped for 1st home playoff gm s' 2002. dominated in his 1st ssn as a starter. With SF having the #1 rush def TY (69 ypg, 3.2 at home), their #16 pass def is a bit misleading as they are 1 of 5 tms with more int than pass TD's allowed. SF simply owns the best spec teams unit TY thanks to picking up one of best STC coaches in Brad Seely.

While we would usually side with a strong D at home this NO squad has the potential of making a very impressive SB run. While extra motivation is not needed NO certainly remembers losing to an NFC West tm LY while also knowing that they are only the 2nd ever team to win 13 reg ssn gms and not have a bye.

FORECAST: SAINTS BY 14

RATING: 4★

The Packers are the #1 seed in the NFC for the 1st time since 1996 thanks to the 6th 15-1 record in the NFL history. They are a stellar 17-1 SU/14-4 ATS at home and have won all 8 HG's for the 1st time since 2002. GB has outscored foes 40-21 at home TY despite being outgained by an avg of 4 ypg (+2 TO's). Mike McCarthy is 23-1 SU/20-3-1 ATS at home when GB scores 30 or more. GB beat the Giants 38-25 but failed to cover as a 6.5 AF. Both QB's combined for over 700 yds passing with GB going 68/5pl in :58 to hit the game winning FG as time expired. The Giants went 5-3 SU/ATS on the road T being outgained by 12 ypg (+4 TO's) but on the short end of a 27-26 scoring avg. They are however 4-1 SU/5-0 ATS on the road in the playoffs under Coughlin with a 21-18 avg score.

Statistically, Eli Manning isn't that far off from what you'd expect from him but he's had arguably his best season ever. Working behind 5 different OL combos, 2011 was another year with skill players being dinged up, yet Manning managed to throw for a career-high in passing yards. The Giants have their 1st 1,000 yd duo of receivers in Hakeem Nicks and Victor Cruz. Nicks has been a reliable but not overly splashy as the #1 WR while Cruz has been the 2nd best slot WR in the NFL TY behind Welker. Mario Manningham is now the possession WR and when healthy Jake Ballard is a solid receiving TE. Bradshaw and Jacobs each have a single 100 yd rushing game TY due to injuries to themselves and the OL. They are built to be a power rushing team and are much better than their #31 rush off ranking. The best player on the Giants #27 defense TY has been Jason Pierre-Paul whose 16.5 sks is quite impressive as he entered 2011 as the #3 pass rusher for the team. The LB's are avg even behind a strong DL, but the secondary has been a major liability TY due a lack of depth. They've given up five 300 yd passing games avg 335 ypg (58%) w/a 15-3 ratio in those. This is another unit getting healthier late in the ssn though and SS Kenny Phillips has been excellent when healthy. The Giants spec tms aren't much better than 2010's #29 unit as they've struggled on both sides of the ball on punts and are below avg on KR's.

GB is the 1st team to finish dead last in overall def but finish with the best record in the NFL. Part of this is because the Packers have kicked-off 30 more times than they've rec'd due to their #3 off. In fact, GB has scored more pts in the 1H (286) than CLE, IND, JAX, KC and STL have overall. This is due to Rodgers destroying the NFL starting with his playoff run LY. Over those L/19 games he's avg'd 302 ypg (68%) with an astounding 54-8 ratio. His 9.05 ypa avg in that span allows the Packers to be very aggressive in their playcalling and makes their #27 run game TY a non-factor. Seven Packers have logged 25 or more rec's with James Starks being the only non-TE/WR out of the group. Greg Jennings is a clear #1 WR and finished 25th in rec yds in the NFL despite missing the final 3 games with a knee injury. Jordy Nelson had breakout year with 5 fewer yds than his previous 3 ssns combined despite playing in fewer snaps than Jennings. Donald Driver has now settled into a more of a situational role due to the depth here while Jermichael Finley was rough early on after missing most of LY with a knee injury. While GB didn't have a single 100 yd game from Ryan Grant or Starks, they are really extra blockers for the pass gm and emergency receiving outlets. GB has started 6 different OL combos due to injury which accounts for the #22 ranking in sks allowed along with the QB's tendency to hold onto the ball to make plays. In 2010, Dom Capers def was 5th with 32 takeaways and TY they tied with SF for #1 with 38. Yes, they have the #32 pass defense but they also lead the NFL with 31 int as foes were forced to air it out more to try and keep up. Nine of 11 starters for GB started LY's SB and while Clay Matthews sack #'s are down he's still the driving force for the Packers pass rush. Each secondary starter has 3 int and while Woodson has 7, he has been burnt for big plays TY. GB's special teams finished 30th and 25th before an impressive bounce TY thanks to their return units.

We had a nice pulse on both teams using the Giants as a 3★ LPS in their earlier matchup as well as using them as a 3★ LW. NY's D is showed what they're capable of with a healthy D-line but that was against an ultra conservative offense with absolutely no surprises. The Giants have played physical must-win games vs the Jets, the Cowboys and the Falcons the L/3W and will struggle facing an elite QB for the first time since facing GB and NO in B2B weeks. Against the NFC's top 2 offenses the Giants allowed a combined 87 pts, 60 FD's, 1,026 yds and 732 passing yards.
