NEWS AND NOTES - Toledo was without starting RB Adonis Thomas but Morgan Williams rushed for 130 yards. TOL drove 10/3pl for a TD after a fumbled punt and 2 pt conv to go up 8-3. After an int the Rockets went 41/5pl for a TD, 15-3. They were up 22-13 at the half and despite being outFD'd 17-12 and outgained 318-305, they rolled to three 2H TD drives in a 36-13 win on the road delivering us another Big Dog POW outright upset...Michigan had their most lopsided win since beating Indiana 58-0 in 2000. MarQueis Gray, the QB for Minnesota DNP and true frosh Max Shortell (1st start) hit 11-22-104 and had -16 yards rushing on 4 carries. In the 1H Mich had a 384-69 yd edge and the Gophers' first snap in Mich terr didn't happen until there was less than 1:00 left in the 3Q. Mich won The Little Brown Jug leading 38-0 at the half scoring on all six 1H poss...Penn St let Indiana hang around blowing some scoring opportunities and IU had the ball down by 6 at the end. PSU finished with a 464-256 yd edge and once again Matt McGloin moved the team the best with Rob Bolden hitting 6-14-67 and McGloin 10-22-204. PSU had a TD called back on a hold an on 2&gl from the 15 and then had a pass tipped and into near the goal line. PSU later would go on a 66/12pl drive but from the 5 yd line settled for a 22 yd FG and despite a 242-105 yd edge at the half, the game was tied at 3. PSU settled for a 27 yd FG then went on a 12pl drive and fmbl'd at the IU2. PSU got a 74 yd TD pass from McGloin to Moye for some breathing room, 13-3 after 3Q's and drove 64/13pl and settled for a 32 yd FG, 16-3. IU converted on 4th down on a 77/14pl drive for a TD with 3:51 left and got the ball back with 2:06 left getting to the PSU40 with :02 left but their pass fell incomplete...Kansas shockingly jumped out to a 20-0 lead vs Texas Tech with 191 yards and 3 TD's on their first 15 plays. Texas Tech survived that punch in the stomach and rolled to a . 45-27 lead after 3Q's and finished with a 530-478 yd edge. KU got a TD with 3:30 left to close it to 45-34 but TT rec'd the onside kick and got to the KU11 with 2 FD's taking a knee. In the 1H Cincinnati had a 3-0 TO deficit and only led 6-0. In the 2H MU missed a 34 yd FG and UC got a 72 yd pass setting up a TD. Later they drove 80/12pl for a TD to lead 20-0 and then when a snap went over MU's P's head, UC fell on it for a TD to make it 27-0. UC was int'd in the EZ twice in the game and had a 398-264 yd edge... For the 2nd straight week Syracuse's game came down to a replay at the end. In the 2nd OT SU fumbled. The replay appeared to show the RB was down but another showed the ball came out so it was inconclusive and SU's fumble which was ruled rec'd by Rutgers, ended the game. RU had missed a chance to win the game in regulation missing a 44 yd FG. At the half, RU had 13-2 FD and 187-88 yd edges yet trailed 7-3 as SU had a 65 yd FR TD. RU had a 23-13 FD edge but only a 302-295 yd edge...Montel Harris returned to BC's lineup and rushed for 108 yards becoming the school's all-time leading rusher topping Derrick Knight (2003). Still, WF finished with a 392-336 yd edge and never trailed. They scored a TD on their opening poss and led 17-9 at the half. Harris fumbled at the WF10 trailing 26-9 and BC was int'd at the 2 with 4:59 left in the 3Q. BC got a TD with 13:05 left and settled for a 32 yd FG with 6:00 left to pull within 24-19. WF got a 22 yd FG with 2:59 left and BC on 4&4 at the WF45 was SOD with 1:43 left...lllinois is 5-0 for the first time since 1951...Georgia dominated Mississippi St more than the final score as they had 20-13 FD and 315-213 yd edges. Isaiah Crowell topped 100 yards rushing for the 3rd time in 3 SEC games. MSU's only score came on a 72 yd IR TD with 9:10 left in the 4Q as UGA was looking to add to a 24-3 lead. UGA was int'd at the MSU20 but still led 21-3 at the half. UGA had a bad snap on a 22 yd FG and was tkl'd for a 12 yd loss, settled for a 27 yd FG, was int'd at the MSU29 and missed a 47 yd FG in their 14 pt win. Michigan St entered the game vs Ohio St #1 in the country in total D (172 ypg) and finished with a 321-178 yd edge. In fact, OSU's only score came with :10 left in the game with Joe Bauserman at QB. Braxton Miller hit 5-10-56. MSU ended a 7 game losing skid to the Buckeyes. The Spartans scored a TD on their 2nd poss on a 65/6pl drive for a 7-0 lead which they the Buckeyes. MSU had a 3rd & gl at the 6 and was int'd in the EZ early 4Q but with the score 10-0 OSU punted with 8:52 left, punted on 4&13 from its own 4 with 5:31 left, was SOD on 4&10 at the MSU43 with 3:06 left then took over with 1:51 left and went 62/6pl for a TD with :10 left in the 10-7 final...Virginia blew numerous opportunities in the 1H. They had 496-296 yd and 27-12 FD edges for the game but they let Idaho stay in the game and almost lost. In the 1H UVA went on consecutive drives of 67 and 73 yds for TD's to lead

14-0. UVA was int'd at the UI20, fmbl'd at the UI43 and fmbl'd at their own 26 and despite a 277-147 yd edge, only led 14-6 at the half. At the end of the half, UVA's QB Rocco took off on a run and was tkl'd at the 10 but they ran out of time. UVA had a 41 yd FG blk'd, missed a 36 yd FG and IU blk'd a punt for a TD with 3:11 left and the 2 pt conv tied it. In OT each team scored a TD but UI went for 2 and their pass was incomplete...QB Teddy Bridgewater made his first start for Louisville and had a

couple of key int's in the 2H. In the 1H Bridgewater hit a 41 yd TD pass with :33 left in the half to give UL a 13-7 lead and the Cards had a 167-130 yd edge. Marshall went on an 85/13pl drive but had a 19 yd FG blk'd. UL went on a 9pl drive and missed a 47 yd FG. Marshall went on a 62/7pl drive settling for a 24 yd FG and only trailed 13-10. UL was int'd at their own 30 with 4:32 left and MU went 30/5pl for a TD with 1:49 left for the lead. UL got to the MU45 but Bridgewater was int'd at the 37 and MU got 1 FD and took a knee for the upset...The talk all week was how Robert Griffin had thrown more TD passes than incompletions. Well, he had 3 TD passes and 8 incompletions vs Kansas St and his first int of the year. KSU trailed 35-26 in the 4Q but he threw an int on the 2nd last drive of the game and his 4th & 2 pass fell incomplete at the end and KSU got the home win, 36-35 to move to 4-0. Baylor actually came in ranked #15 in the country and were an away favorite for the first time since last year in Wk4...West Virginia was off a loss and their O-line opened up some big holes. Dustin Garrison rushed for 233 yards at the half and 291 for the game. WV finished with 643-217 yd and 30-14 FD edges. WV led 38-10 at the half and scored TD's on their first 3 poss of the 2H to lead 55-10 in the rout...Auburn had 358-289 yd and 22-13 FD edges vs South Carolina who was playing with double revenge. Stephen Garcia tossed a couple more int's hitting just 9-23 passes. AU took over with 5:27 left trailing 13-9 and went 57/12pl. They got a 9 yd TD pass to Philip Lutzenkirchen with 1:38 left and then SC got to the AU30 and thought they had :01 left but ran out of time...Northwestern got Dan Persa back in the lineup and appeared headed for an upset of Illinois. They led 28-10 midway thru the 3Q. Persa hit 10-14-123 but threw for 4 TD's. IIlinois went 74 and 58 yards for TD's to get back within 28-23 and Persa was injured. Illinois took the lead 31-28 but fumbled at their own 36 and Northwestern got a TD with 1:15 left to appear to pull out the win. IL went 69/7pl and with just :13 left Scheelhaase's 1 yd TD run gave IL the come from behind win... FIU had a 568-384 yd edge vs Duke. It was tied at 17 at the half when FIU got a FG and a TD to lead 27-17 had a 568-384 yd edge vs Duke. It was field at 17 at the hair when FIU got a FG and a 1D to lead 27-17 with 13:30 left. FIU got to the Duke12 but on 4&10 fired incomplete in the EZ with 2:29 left...Louisiana Tech/Hawaii was blown open in the middle of the 3Q as UH got 2 defensive TD's in a :04 span. Leading 20-13, UH went 65/10pl getting a TD with 9:29 left in the 3Q to lead 27-13. LT got to midfield but was int'd and ret'd 49 yards for a TD. The Longhorns have now won 2 straight on the road vs teams that beat them in Austin last year. It was billed as one of the biggest HG's in recent memory for Iowa St but Texas dominated and Iowa St had 86 and 63 yd drives for TD's in the 4Q to make the stats a bit misleading as they show UT only had a 400-380 yd edge and ISU had a 26-19 FD edge. TO's were a factor but the bottom line is UT got its revenge. Ohio did have a commanding 391-217 yd edge vs Kent St and 22-14 FD edge. They survived a blk'd FG and a blk'd punt in the 1H and KSU's only TD came on a 21 yd drive for a TD after recovering a fumble. OU led 10-7 at the half but had a 220-80 yd edge. OU extended it to 17-7. KSU got a 31 yd FG with 5:42 left to pull within 7 and OU punted 34 yds to the 1 with 2:00 left and KSU was SOD at their own 8...WKU nearly ended the nation's longest home losing streak which was 18. They did lead 14-10 but Arkansas St rallied for a 19-14 lead with 11:12 left. WKU got a 42 yd TD pass with 10:03 left to go up 22-19 and ASU missed the game tying FG from 44 yards with 5:51 left. WKU got 2 FD's and then went for the win on 4&1 at the ASU32 and were SOD with 2:39 left. ASU went 66/9pl and got a TD with :36 left and escaped...WM delivered a 3★ Selection Winner for PS and were in control of the game. They were up 14-0 in the 2Q and UC did not cross midfield until 6:00 remained in the 2Q on a 60 yd run. SMU had a 461-454 yd edge. TCU dropped out of the AP Top 25 for the first time in 46 weeks...Trent Richardson took another positive step towards the Heisman with 181 YDS rushing (incl 2 TD's) and another 27 yards rec. Alabama has outscored Florida 101-29 in their 3 meetings. UF actually got a 65 yd TD pass on their first offensive play and the game was tied at 10 after 1Q but Bama led 24-10 at the half. UF QB Brantley was inj'd in the final seconds of the 1H and missed the 2H but Bama finished with 21-9 FD and 366-222 yd edges in the 38-10 win. continued on page 2

The Cougars were int'd at the CU28, SOD at the CU44 and trailed 13-10 at the half despite a 220-122 yd edge. CU led 20-17 when they got the apparent game clinching TD with 5:11 left, 27-17 but WSU got a TD 7pl later with 2:35 left with all 3 timeouts left, they kicked off deep and forced a punt with 2:03 left and got a 63 yd TD pass with 1:10 left for the lead. CU got a 24 yd pass but Richardson fumbled at the end at the WSU38...Southern Miss was even more dominant than the 48-24 score but surprisingly they trailed 24-20 mid3Q. SM had a 654-229 yd edge and 33-15 FD edge for the game. Rice scored when SM fmbl'd the KO and Rice ret'd it 17 yds for a TD, 14-13. SM got a 75 yd FR TD in the 2Q and led 20-17 at the half. SM went on a 76/10pl drive and on 4&1 at the Rice4 they fumbled and Rice ret'd it 96 yds for a TD and stunningly led 24-20. SM was int'd on their next drive but scored TD's on drives of 44, 75 and 63 yds on their next 3 poss to lead 41-24. Rice had a 4&gl at the 6 but they were SOD with 10:20 left and 2 poss later SM went 94/7pl and got a 23 yd TD pass with 3:13 left.

D'EJA VU ALL OVER AGAIN - Texas A&M had another dominating 1H leading 35-17 with a 404-271 yd edge. Once again they had another poor 2H and Arkansas would rally for the win. The Hogs got a TD with 1:41 left to take their first lead of the game, 42-38 and A&M on 4&2 from their own 39 was SOD. Tyler Wilson threw for a school record 510 yards. A&M Christine Michael ran for 230 yards and 3 TD's and A&M which is joining the SEC fell to 0-6 vs the SEC since 1996. WR Wright broke the school receiving record at 204 yards by half and finished with 281 on 13 catches. A&M had 628-581 yd and 30-28 FD edges.

FRONTDOOR AND BACKDOOR COVERS - Jordan Jefferson's susp was lifted and he was called on for a 4th & ol at the 1 QB sneak and a TD early vs Kentucky. Morgan Newton missed on his first 9 throws hitting 2-11 passes in the 1H and was sacked 3 times. LSU had a 201-45 yard edge at the half and took a 35-0 lead with 10:39 left in the game. Kentucky would go 70/12pl getting a TD with 4:22 left for the backdoor cover and did end the game at the LSU28. The game started at 11:21 am and everyone knows LSU is not as ferocious during the day at Tiger Stadium...Matt Barkley passed for a school record 468 yards and 4 TD's. Arizona compiled a 37-26

FD edge and USC had a 582-554 vd edge but this one appeared put away for USC as they led 34-12 in the 3Q. It was 48-34 when USC went for it on 4&1 at the UA37 with 1:51 left. UA stopped them and went 53/5pl getting the backdoor cover with 1:00 left on a 4 yd TD pass...Boise St was playing with revenge vs Nevada after the Pack had ended their perfect season the previous year. BSU's D was the key factor as BSU finished with a 329-182 yd edge and a 22-12 FD edge. Cody Fajardo had been splitting snaps with Tyler Lantrip was recovering from a shoulder injury and DNP. BSU only led 20-0 at half but had a 187-54 yd edge. Nevada did not cross their own 38 yd line until 8:23 was left in the 3Q and it happened on a 31 yd KR and NV at that point led 30-0. NV got a 21 yd FG with 14:48 left to make it 30-3. Gophers are #113 pass eff D (266, 68%, 11-3) and have just 2 sks in 5 gms. PU has PSU on deck but after 3 str losing yrs will not look past any tm despite their 3-8 ATS record as a HF.

NORTH CAROLINA 27 Louisville 10 - UL has won the 2 most recent gms ('04 and '05) by a comb 103-14 but these are much different teams. TY UL beat Murray St (unimpressively) and lost to FIU (trailed 21-3) before defeating rival UK. LW UL lost to Marshall 17-13 giving up the GW TD pass with 1:49 left. The Cards were outgained 353-281 and outFD'd 21-16. NC's gameplan is to build early leads and then play good D and use their power running game. NC has wins over JMU, Rutgers (outgained RU 405-244) and UVA (led 21-33Q). After losing to GT, NC rebounded LW defeating neighbor EC, 35-20. QB Renner threw 4 TD passes building a 28-3 1H lead that was never relinquished. Renner is avg 225 ypg (76%) with an 11-6 ratio while RB Bernard is avg 110 ypg (7.0). After facing GT's option and EC's Air Raid the Tar Heel front seven (#2 DL) should be hungry for this inexp'd OL which has all'd 16 sks! True Fr QB Bridgewater should be making his 1st road start unless Strong goes with his orig st'r diminutive 5'8" Stein (listed as 5'10"). L'ville has its conf opener on deck (Cincy) while NC hosts Miami. NC is 5-2 as a HF vs non-conf foe's and won't look past the struggling Cards' NC STATE 41 Central Mich 24 - First meeting. NCSt is 8-2 SU vs current MAC teams but lost their last meeting 20-17 (-9) to Akron in '06. CM is 2-30 SU on the road vs BCS schools with the avg score 44-17 (wins in '09 at MSU and '08 at Indy) and is just 7-20-1 ATS (0-2 TY). NC State is 6-2 ATS prior to a bye but lost to outright (-7') to EC LY. Both were home underdogs LW. CM (+9) survived a 4Q comeback attempt by NI (48-41) but NCSt (+10) saw their 4Q comeback fall short (45-35) vs GT. As you would expect NCSt has all the edges (off #81-109, def #71-103, ST #67-111). Both are in conf sandwiches but CM is playing its 4th road game in 5 wks and this is probably their "C" gm for Oct as they need to concentrate on winnable MAC gms. Former HC Jones built this squad into a MAC Championship team by mailing in the BCS gms while NCSt HC O'Brien needs as many wins as he can get. RICE 47 Memphis 23 - UM's only prior visit to Rice was in '07 (series 1st gm). UM (+1) had two 10 pt leads incl one in the 4Q outgaining Rice 571-418 (+8 FD), winning 38-35. The visitor has two outright upsets (3 and 1 pt dogs) in the only meetings with UM having a 123 ypg edge. Rice is coming off 3 BCS tms and CUSA East fav SM (outgained LW by 425 yds) and takes a huge step down in competition. The Owls are 6-0 ATS hosting CUSA foes and 10-3 as a HF. UM continues to struggle and has allowed 500+ yds in 8 of L/12 (all'd 477 LW vs MT). The Tigers have lost 14 straight conf gms (5-9 ATS) and are 0-14 SU (5-9 ATS) on the road (only 3x's lost by 14 or less). Rice has a big edge on ST (#13-98). The Owls are 30-14-2 ATS at home while UM is 6-10 as an AD. Rice is in a rare DD HF role but is 3-0 SU/ATS with an avg cover by 26 ppg and takes on one of the nation's worst teams (UM 4-25 SU and 10-19 ATS L2+ yrs)

Army 21 MIAMI, OH 20 - Army has lost 2 straight to Miami (series 2-2) but they last met in '98. Army has a bye on deck while Miami is off rival Cincy with their MAC schedule on deck. Miami is 2-8-1 over 6 yrs as a HF incl losing outright to BG 37-23 (-4) earlier TY. The home team is 5-0 ATS in Army gms TY incl Army dropping 2 SU/ATS on trips to MAC teams TY being outscored by a combined 65-6 in the 1H (97-47 overall). Miami QB Dysert is avg 259 ypg (61%) with a 2-5 ratio. LW Army limited a Tulane team that came in avg 246 pass ypg to just 74 yds pass (50%) with an 0-2 ratio. Miami is allowing 168 rush ypg (4.1) while Army is avg 368 rush ypg (5.1) and has 4 players over 246. Army QB Steelman is avg just 41 ypg (39%) passing with a 1-2 ratio but is their top rusher with 437 yds (5.1) and 9 rush TD's. While Army has a slight off edge (#102-117) Miami has a huge def edge (#54-106). Temple 34 BALL ST 17 - HC and just the 2nd meeting. BSU (+14') lost 24-19 in Philadelphia in '09.

The Cardinals led 13-10 mid-3Q but didn't score again until the gm's final play. BSU is 2-7 SU and 1-8 ATS in MAC HG's incl a 28-25 SU win (-4) over Buffalo TY. Ball St is off a blowout 62-6 (+37) loss to Oklahoma in a money game. Temple was in a letdown spot LW after a dominating win over Maryland. They gave up 2 early TO's (-3 overall) to Toledo which led to a 15-3 Toledo 1Q lead as the Owls actually had a 318-305 yd edge. After falling behind 29-13, the Owls pulled their biggest offensive weapon, RB Pierce (571, 5.1, 12TD) as they were forced to pass. BSU is allowing 207 ygg rushing (5.1). Ball St QB Wenning came into LW avg 218 ypg (73%, 7-0 ratio) but had just 84 yds (39%) with an 0-3 ratio vs Okla. Temple is allowing 188 ypg passing but with a 3-6 ratio. The Owls have the huge def edge (#30-110). Temple is 6-2 as an AF and Ball St 3-6 as a HD.

Arizona St 27 UTAH 13 - Sun Dévils last visit to Salt Lake City was in '77, a 47-19 win (ASU has won 7 straight vs Utah). The Utes are 13-4-1 ATS vs ranked tms but were 0-2-1 in those matchups LY. Utah was blasted in its 1st P12 HG vs Wash and may come into this matchup w/o starting QB Wynn (182 ypg, 57%, 6-2 ratio) who was inj'd in the 2H (CS) which may give Hays his 1st career start (10-16-156 LW). ASU was able to overcome three 1Q TO's (trailed 13-0) to outscore OSU 35-7 down the stretch as the Beavers (388-367 yd edge) had 5 TO's of their own. Utah is 12-6 ATS as a conf dog and is at home for a 3rd straight wk heightening their altitude edge (5-1 HD L11Y) while ASU is on an outstanding 9-2 ATS run vs conf opp's. The Sun Devils do have a solid edge in off (#25-78) while the Utes' 2-2 record doesn't necessarily reflect their level of play as they narrowly outgained Mont St 292-258, lost at USC (outgained 416-319), were aided by 7 TO's in the win over RYU and counded up 5 TO's of their own against the Huskies LW

BYU and coughed up 5 TO's of their own against the Huskies LW.

BYU 30 San Jose St 20 - First meeting S/98. SJSt 1-16 SU on the road scoring its first SU away win S/08 (5-10-1 ATS) LW vs Colo St, 38-31. SJSt jumped out to a 24-14 HT lead but needed a 38 yd TD pass with :54 left for the final margin. QB Faulkner (25-38-313) stepped up in the 2H after RB Rutley left in the 3Q (ankle, CS). SJSt finished with a 24-18 FD edge but was outgained 458-450. Faulkner is avg 216 ypg (60%) with just a 4-2 ratio. Rutley (519, 5.7, 6) has almost 5x's the yds of the #2 rusher. SJSt is playing its 4th AG in 6W but BYU is off a Fri night revenge gm vs state rival Utah St with Oreg St on deck. A QB battle could be brewing as Heaps was replaced by Nelson with 5:06 left LW when BYU was down 24-13. Nelson sparked a 27-24 comeback win leading the 96 yd GW drive and the ground gm finally got rolling, finishing with 200 yds (avg'd 68 ypg first 4). Heaps is avg 192 ypg (54%) with just a 3-5 ratio but Nelson has only thrown for 182 till yds (62%, 2-0). The Cougs are 6-2 ATS off a SU win but haven't resembled the 'play on' team of year's past, so we'll take a look at the dog.

TOLEDO 38 Eastern Michigan 17 - HC. EM is 2-14 SU at the Glass Bowl incl 5 str losses (1-4 ATS) by an avg 41-15 score. Toledo has taken on the tougher sked with this being their 2nd easiest opp (#21-118 sked edge). LY EM susp 5 players just prior to the gm and despite a 17-14 FD edge lost at home 42-7 (+10). Toledo does have rival BG on deck and is coming off a dominating 36-13 (+8') upset of Temple thanks in part to being +3 TO's. Toledo has the edges on both off (#50-115) and def (#69-108). EM got its 3rd win of the season 31-23 over Akron as an 8 pt HF, which is more than their win total of the previous 2 ssns combined. The Rockets caught the Owls in a flat spot LW, off a big win and will need to avoid that same situation here.

Ohio 3Ť BUFFALO 17 - The Bobcats are 9-4 SU (6-6 ATS) vs the Bulls. LTH Ohio hit a 47 yd GW FG w/1:25 left (UB was int'd at OU23 on next drive). Ohio is 8-1 (7-2 ATS) in MAC AG's. LY OU (-16) won 34-17 at home with a 386-204 yd edge. Buff is 3-10 ATS at home. Bobcats have the off (#65-110), def (#72-95) and a huge ST's (#9-115) edges. Ohio did have a FG and a punt blocked LW vs Kent St as despite a 391-217 yd edge, they only won 17-10 as a 16 pt HF. Ohio QB Tettleton had been a pleasant surprise as he is avg 240 ypg (64%) with a 12-1 ratio in his first ssn as the starter but was inj'd vs Buff (CS). The Bulls (+29) are off a money game, a 41-10 blowout loss to Tenn. Buffalo is led by Cincy transfer QB Anderson, who is avg 176 ypg (57%) with a 3-3 ratio. Buffalo has played the much tougher schedule (#70-119). The L2Y the Bulls are 0-4 SU/ATS as a HD, while Ohio is 3-1 SU/ATS as an AF. NORTHERN ILLINOIS 33 Kent St 23 - Strength vs strength. MAC's best OL vs MAC's best DL. NI is 15-3 SU vs KSU incl 3 str wins by 22 ppg. L/gm ('08) NI (-3) led just 14-7 at HT but won 42-14 on the road. NI has won 8 str home games (7-1 ATS) by 26 ppg. KSU is on its 4th road gm in 6 wks. Both teams are off SU losses in their MAC opener. NI was upset as a 9 pt AF but KSU only lost by 7 as a 16 pt AD. As good as NI was on off LW vs CM (41 pts, 587 yds) they were equally as bad on defense (48 pts, 563 yds) as they all'd 5 CM TD's of 36+ yds. While KSU has the def edge (#87-119), NI has a massive off edge (#33-120). KSU has played the tougher schedule (#59-90). Both teams are just 1-4 ATS under 1st yr HC's and neither can afford another conf loss. While KSU could have their best off performance of the season vs a weak NI defense, look for NI's mobile QB Harnish (377 rush, 6.6), who is avg 246 ypg (67%) with an 11-3 ratio to get the Huskies back on the winning track.

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ARKANSAS 44 Auburn 27 - LY Ark (+3') led 43-37 w/14:09 left but imploded all'g 28 unanswered (L/3 TD's on a 47 yd FR and 2 int's). Ark QB Mallett was knocked out of the gm in the 2Q with a concussion and bkp QB Wilson threw for 332 yds and 4 TD. LY's 108 total pts was the highest scoring non-OT SEC game ever. Aub has won 3 of its L/4 trips SU/ATS to Fayetteville but LTH was a 2' pt fav and lost 44-23 as they trailed 34-3 mid-3Q. LW Ark (+2') rallied after trailing 35-17 at HT to beat A&M for a 3rd str year, 42-38. The Hogs pass gm was firing on all cylinders as QB Wilson threw for a school record 510 yds (303 ypg, 65%, 10-3) and WR Wright had a school record 281 rec yds (21.6). Aub (+10) also had a key win away from home LW beating SC, 16-13. The Tigers ran 40 more plays than SC and had a 358-289 yd edge. RB Dyer leads with 567 (5.5) and 7 TD's while QB Trotter is avg 179 ypg (60%) with a 9-5 ratio. Aub's much-maligned D did have their best performance LW but still are all'g 440 ypg. The dog is 10-4 ATS in the series with 7 outright upsets the L/10Y and Aub's young tm is gaining experience weekly. In 2001 we used Ark (+1) at home as our 5★ Oct GOM and the Hogs delivered a 42-17 win covering by 26 pts. Will we use the Hogs again here with a bye on deck while they are just part of a brutal Oct schedule for Auburn?

STANFORD 45 Colorado 10 - Last game was played here in '93 (41-37 Stanford win over #7 Colorado, +5). The Buffs have dropped 13 straight conf AG's (this is their 1st in the P12) by 18 ppg (3-10 ATS) and haven't won on the road at all since the 2007 season (19 gms). CU was primed for a win a wk ago vs WSU before they all'd 2 TD's in the final 3:00 to give the Cougars the come from behind win. The Cardinal are 12-3 ATS in conf HG's incl LW's 45-19 (-21) win over UCLA as Heisman hopeful QB Luck padded his stats (227 yds, 85%, 3-0 ratio). Luck should have no problem against a young and inexperienced CU secondary that is hampered by numerous inj's (7 CB's missed LW, all'g 11-2 ratio TY). To make matters worse, the Cardinal have solid edges in off (#5-71), def (#14-51) and ST's (#20-89) while CU has dropped 10 of its L/14 ATS vs Top 10 tms (1-13 SU) being outscored 38-12. VIRGINIA TECH 27 Miami, FI 13 - The Hokies have owned the Canes (11-5 SU/13-3 ATS) and the Canes have topped 17 pts just once S'03. In UM's last visit to Blacksburg they came in ranked #9 (VT #11) and had ssn lows in pts (7), FD (12) and yds (209). QB Harris DNP LY and in '09 was just 9-25-150 with an 0-1 ratio (-28 rush yds). TY VT's sked offered time for QB Thomas to mature as the Hokies relied on defense and rode the back of one of the best RB's in the ACC Wilson (128 ypg, 5.9). While both did their part (CU avg'd 38 ppg) LW Thomas was exposed as an inexp'd QB (125, 56%, 0-1) and along with an un-Beamer-like ST unit and penalties (12.0 KR, 29.4 punt) proved too costly losing 23-3 to Clemson. The loss snapped a 14 gm ACC win streak and the 3 pts were the 2nd lowest at home under Beamer. UM defeated Bethune-Cookman 45-14 despite being outgained 422-335 and outFD'd 24-15. B-CU dominated UM on both sides in the 1Q (139-39 yd edge) and had a 7-0 lead (trailed 14-7 1H). The Canes have struggled against the run giving up 174 to OSU, 265 to K-St and 219 LW. Miami is 8-18 ATS vs ranked tms and VT is an incredible 42-19 ATS in ACC play. This is a gut check

NOTRE DAME 38 Air Force 17 - ND dropped the last gm in '07, 41-24 when they were in the midst of their worst ssn S/63. AF is coming off Navy but is 3-1 ATS after playing the Mids. The Falcons 35-34 OT win marked the highest score EVER in the Navy/AF series. The gm was comfortably Under until the Mids scored 18 pts in the final 10 mins to force OT. After a PF on a TD, Navy was forced to kick the PAT from the 18 in OT and it was blk'd and AF needed just 4pl (and a PAT) for the win. QB Jefferson (9-10-136) has now thrown for 493 yds (70%) with a 5-2 ratio and is the #2 rusher (210, 4.3, 4) behind Clark (382, 9.3). ND is off its best showing of the yr in a 38-10 win over Purdue, going over the 500 yd mark (551-276 yd edge) for the 3rd time TY. PU entered the gm #11 FBS rush but was held to just 84 yds (3.1). RB Wood (191 yds) leads ND with 584 (5.7). QB Rees is avg 248 ypg (65%) with a 10-6 ratio and his top rec is Floyd (561, 11.9) who comes in #7 FBS in rec's. After having 15 TO's the 1st 4 gms, ND had 0 vs PU. Despite going 7-19-2 as a HF (1-1 TY) and 11-21 ATS S/91 (27-5 SU) vs service academies, ND showed improvement in their 2nd gm LY vs the option making their edges on off (#13-35) and D (#4-82) too large to ignore.

Southern Miss 38 NAVY 34 - First meeting and first time SM will play the option. Fedora was the QB/

Southern Miss 38 NAVY 34 - First meeting and first time SM will play the option. Fedora was the Qb/ WR cch at AF from 1997-'98 and during that period beat Navy twice (30 ppg avg). Key matchup will be SM QB Davis and the skill positions vs a weak back 7 of Navy that does not get to face quality pass attacks in practice. Navy is off gm 1 in the CIC series and is just 2-5 ATS after AF. Navy is 14-4 SU at home and 3-1 ATS TY (overall 10-4 ATS run). SM is off a CUSA win over Rice (ssn high 654 yds, def allowed just 10 of 24 pts) and has a bye on deck. SM is allowing 82 ypg rush (2.4) with the #2 DL and #3 set of LB's in CUSA (good speed in front 7) to help defend the option (MLB K Williams is out). QB Proctor has done an excellent job in replacing Dobbs and is a better runner (100 ypg rush, 4.4) but did cost his tm LW with PF pen after a TD in OT. SM has covered 3 str and catches Navy off an emotional gm. NEVADA 41 Univ 13 - UN has won 6 in a row (5-1 ATS, LY's backdoor the only non-cover) marking the longest win streak in the Battle for the Fremont Cannon. To's plagued LV the L/2 gms. The Rebs had a 4-1 TO edge in a surprising 40-20 (+17') win over Hawaii before turning the ball over 5x's (3 int, 2 fmbls) to S Utah in a 41-16 loss (-11') as all 3 of LV's picks led to TD's. After 4 consec AG's to open the ssn, the Pack finally plays its 1st HG of the yr. LW UN's off was bottled up by Boise (only 182 ttl yds) as the Pack rushed for just 59 yds and was without QB Fajardo (shldr inj, CS). UN has exploited LV with the pistol rushing for 1,377 yds (459 ypg) and 17 TD's in the L/3 vs the Rebs! These two have played each other every yr S/'89 and will become conf foes again next ssn. UN is 21-7 as a HF while LV is 1-11 as an AD (only cover by 1 pt TY). The Rebs come into Reno off a bye but look for the Pack to continue its winning ways vs its rival.

4★ New Orleans over CAROLINA - This is the 3rd time since 1990 that 2 teams that had 500 yds offense the previous week. NO lost to CIN 31-16 as a 3.5 pt HF in the last event. NO is only 3-6 ATS (2-7 O/U) vs CAR splitting LY's matchups. NO was in a pure letdown spot in the 1st meeting after opening the season on Thur, travelling to SF for MNF and going to OT vs ATL. NO had a 383-251 yd edge but 3 FG's and a fumble at the CAR 20 kept them sharp for the 2nd meeting. 5 Wks later NO blew out CAR 34-3 w/a 408-195 yd edge with 10 of CAR's 1st 11 drives going for 30 yds or less (missed FG on 11th). CAR went all in for HC Rivera vs his former team with a 543-317 yd edge. CAR gave up a 20 yd IR, a 69 yd PR along w/a 200 yd rusher in the loss. Newton had tons of yards again (409 total) but that was vs a CHI defense w/o its top 2 safeties with a MNF game vs DET on deck. NO has won 3 straight in these pages and we'll side with them again in a lower scoring game

FORECAST: New Orleans 28 CAROLINA 10 3★ PITTSBURGH overTennessee - This is the 4th straight year these 2 have met with the Dog being 3-0 ATS. PIT was w/o Roethlisberger in LY's matchup in Wk 2 in a 19-11 win as a 5 pt AD despite being outgained 238-127. The Steelers ST and defense were the difference as they took the opening KO 89 yds for a TD, pulled in 11 plays behind the LOS (1 every 6 TEN plays) and forced 7 TO's. PIT was very lucky to be down just 10-0 in the 1H vs HOU as they were outFD 14-7 and outgained 216-125. HOU returned a blocked FG for a TD but had 6 pts taken off the board due w/a penalty at the half. TEN's 3 wins have been vs a flat BAL team off a big win vs PIT, a beat up DEN team on the road and a young CLE team that gave up plays of 80 and 57 yds that resulted in 14 pts along with a 97 yd IR for TD. TEN rolled out plays CLE hadn't seen on film in LW's game but now face a more savvier PIT defense that is still at an elite level (#2). Look for the loss of WR Britt to start catching up FORECAST: PITTSBURGH 24 Tennessee 10 to TEN here and PIT to flex after a loss again.

OTHER SELECTION (one 2* this week due to amount of teams on a BYE) 2★ NEW ENGLAND over NY Jets - Incl playoffs the home team is 5-1 ATS in the series. The Jets blitz heavy/big name CB defense is specifically designed for NE/IND/SD style teams but in his L3 home games vs the Jets, Brady has avg'd 312 yds (61%) with a 7-1 ratio. Sanchez has yet to his 200 yds passing in NE avg 165 ypg (52%) w/a 4-7 ratio. While the SNF results are unknown for NYJ the Pats got a nice bounce back win over OAK 31-19 (-6) as we cashed our top weekly LPS and they are now 20-6 ATS after a SU loss. As predicted QB Brady rebounded from a 4 int performance vs BUF to throw for 226 yds and had 0 int's. While WR Welker had a big game 158 yds (17.6) it was the non-existent ground game that finally got going with 183 yds (6.1) but the D (#32) again gave up 500+ yds. NE has the situational edge with this being the Jets 3rd straight road game coming off OAK and a SNF matchup vs BAL and you have to feel LY's disappointing home loss to the Jets still lingers in the minds of Belichick and Co.

OTHER GAMES INDIANAPOLIS 21 Kansas City 17 - It's tough to look at these teams right now and think they were their respective div winners LY. KC entered LY's game as the NFL's last unbeaten team until IND won 19-9 as a 7 pt HF. KC was continually put in bad spots by Haley who opened the game w/an onside kick which IND recovered and turned into a FG. KC drove to the IND 8 but had an inc pass on 4th and 2 which IND turned into a FG. KC finally got into the win column LW after fending off a late rally by the Vikings. KC's passing game finally showed up as Bowe (107, 21.4) and Breaston (91, 22.8) got into the flow. KC converted 6 of 15 3rd Dns and the final score should have been more one sided but on 3 drives inside the MIN 22 they settled for 3 FG's. IND switched to Painter (143 yds 28% 0-2 career total) on MNF LW and also IR'd MLB Brackett (shoulder) and SS Bullitt (shoulder) beforehand. We'll call for the home team by just over a FG here as we want to see how a full week of prep with Painter looks. MINNESOTA 28 Árizona 21 - This matchup has 2 former PHI QB's with McNabb (170 ypg 59% 4-2) vs Kolb (262 ypg 62% 5-4). MIN beat ARZ 27-24 LY going to OT as a 7.5 pt HF. Down 14 with 5 min left in the 4Q MIN rolled up 117 yds on 8 plays for a pair of TD's to force OT. ARZ went 3 & out in OT and MIN hit a 35 yd FG for the win. MIN had a 507-225 yd edge but a 96 yd KR for a TD along with 3 TO's gave ARZ 17 pts. MIN's 2H woes continue as they've been outscored 47-13 and outgained by 612 total yards. While the OL (1 sack every 11.1 att's) is largely to blame, it's disturbing that McNabb has been held to under 6.8 ypa in 3 of 4 games. MIN's defense is getting torn apart on 3rd Dn (26 of 57 46%) with a weak secondary (#28 pass D, 6-3 ratio) and star WLB Greenway was KO'd of LW's game. ARZ gave up 14 FD and 214 yds to the Giants in the 4Q for 3 TD's in their loss. ARZ's only win came vs CAR in the season opener and they have given up 280 yds or more passing in 3 games. MIN is faster, more desperate and even in the DET loss players noted the cameras for the coaches film were vibrating due to crowd noise.

Philadelphia 20 BUFFALO 13 - The Bills are 3-1 despite a roster with 28 players being 5th RD DC's or lower inc UFA's. BUF's #9 offense has faced 4 defenses ranked 22, 28, 32 and 1st with CIN's ranking being inflated vs McCoy & Smith. After rallying from 18 pts in B2B games the Bills blew a 14 pt lead losing to CIN. BUF still has issues with the run giving up 130 ypg (4.9) so far and are allowing 19 of 46 on 3rd Dns (41%). PHI failed to capitalize on a good situation getting a weak and dinged up SF offense in its 2nd road game. PHI blew 15-7 FD and 293-153 yd edges at the half with a 20-3 lead. PHI checked out of the game after hitting a FG on their 1st drive of the 2H and SF made them pay with 21 unanswered points. Vick had a great game (480 total yds) but the defense gave up 289 yds in the 2H. PHI is very vulnerable at LB and Safety right now giving up 5 passes of 25+ yds to SF LW. PHI has a big talent edge on the field, Reid is 16-8 ATS on the road after a SU home loss and teams are 15-6 ATS away after gaining 500 yds in a SU loss since 1997.

UCF 34 Marshall 10 - LY RB Weaver rushed for 150 yds and UCF dominated MU with a 23-12 FD edge as we won a Wed Night Marquee PPH Play (35-14, 6 pt AF). LTH MU (+7) led 20-7 into the 4Q but allowed the GW TD w/:23 left after a fmbl set up UCF at the M30. UCF is 6-0 (5-1 ATS) vs MU but the visitor is 7-2 ATS. UCF is coming off a bye and 2 frustrating losses prior while MU has taken on two BCS tms (VT/Louisville). The Herd took advantage of a late int LW and won on the road but the offense is still struggling avg just 300 ypg. UCF is 14-3 SU/ATS the L2Y vs CUSA foes and MU is just 2-6-1 ATS on the road. The big strength-on-strength matchup will be the UCF running gm (#36 FBS) against the MU stop unit (#75). UCF is 14-6-1 ATS in Bright House and MU is 10-21-1 as an AD. The Knights are outscoring foes on avg 30-11 and outgaining them 420-190 but only stand 2-2 (should be 4-0) as TO's in key moments have cost them the L/2 but HC O'Leary will not let that happen for a 3rd

str gm (addressed problems during bye). **Louisiana Tech 27 IDAHO 24 -** LT has covered the L/4. LTH the Bulldogs led by DD's on 3 different occasions incl the 4Q but all'd a 67/10pl GW TD drive w/:52 left (LT missed a 56 yd FG as time exp) in a 35-34 (-3) UI win. LY we used LT as a 3★ LPS (-1') at home and they won 48-35. LW UI was outgained 496-296 and outFD'd 27-12 but still managed to take UVA into OT on the road. After the Cavs scored a TD first in OT, the Vandals decided to go for 2 and the win but the pass failed and UVA survived 21-20 (-15'). LW LT took an early 6-0 lead on visiting Hawaii before the Warriors scored 44 of the next 64 pts and forced 3 TO's in a 44-26 win (+4). The HT has big edges with the long trip and diverse locations and has won 3x. This is HC for UI and the Vandals are still looking for their first win over an FBS tm TY. UI has also failed to cover the L/6 vs FBS foes (2-4 SU) in the Kibbie Dome. LT has dropped both AG's TY at S Miss (19-17, +11) and in OT at Miss St (26-20, +19') and with a bye on deck, the Bulldogs will be looking to right their ship here.

WEEK 5 BYES: Baltimore, Cleveland, Dallas, Miami, St Louis, Washington

HOUSTON 24 Oakland 17 - OAK is 1-5 SU and ATS vs the Texans including a 31-24 loss as a 3 pt HD LY. Campbell DNP in LY's matchup and McFadden (47 yds 3.9) left in the 4Q w/a hamstring injury. Foster compiled 187 yds (9.4) from scrimmage as 3 OAK TO's resulted in 7 pts w/a missed 46 yd FG. HOU dominated PIT in the 1H LW (14-7 FD 216-125 yd edge) but faded in the 2H when WR Íohnson (hamstring) went out. HOU only had 3 FD's and 102 yds ĭn´the 2H w/ 42 yds coming on a TD run by Foster. HOU's #9 scoring offense has forced teams to abandon the run early but losing Johnson (20% of LY's offense, 23% TY) is a huge problem. HOU's #7 rush defense (4.9) will have a big challenge vs OAK's #1 rush offense (5.6) that has avg'd 134 ypg (5.3) in its L10 road games. While this will be another 11 am game for OAK, they are 12-4 ATS off a SU loss, don't travel as far and the loss of Johnson has this at a TD difference for now.

JACKSONVILLE 24 Cincinnati 23 - For the 2nd time in 3 Wks the Jaguars face a rookie QB and for the 3rd straight week they have scored 10 or less. JAX has only scored 3 TD's in 4 games and have been outscored 51-6 in the 2H. JAX's offensive situation reminds of CAR LY where they only had 1 solid receiving threat (WR Thomas 20 rec 10.6), a good running threat (Jones-Drew 98 ypg 5.1) with an overacheiving defense (#12). OC Koetter has to keep the system simple as Gabbert only has 69 real pass att's (5.6 ypa) after being groomed to be the #2 in preseason. CIN is a surprising +65 ypg offense (-1 TO) so far with a rookie QB and a rookie WR in the lineup for a new system. JAX in Koetter's 5th year is -72 ypg (-2 TO's) and have been outpassed by 365 yds on the year. We'll call

for the Jags by a FG as Koetter pull out all the stops here.

NY GIANTS 38 Seattle 10 - Coughlin takes Seahawks games seriously. In 2005, the Giants lost 24-21 (5 pt AD) in OT (due to 11 false starts) and were blasted 42-3 in the 1H in 2006 (AD). In the L2 meetings the Giants have won w/a 42-6 avg score. LY as a 7.5 pt AF vs a more experienced (but beat up SEA team) the Giants left w/a 487-162 yd edge. SEA only had the ball for 5:31 in the entire 2H and were held to 20 yds or less on 8 of their 1st 10 drives. LW we cashed a 3 \star LPS on the NYG (-1) as they rallied from a 27-17 deficit w/5:16 left in the 4Q to beat the Cards 31-27 as Manning hit 27-40 for 321 and threw 2 TD's during a :58 span in the 4Q. The Giants pass rush was able to get consistent pressure on Kolb (4 sks, 4 QBH) and now face a SEA OL that gave up 14 sks in the 1st 3 wks before all'g 0 LW. The Seahawks LW found themselves down 27-7 in the 3Q before cutting it to 30-28 in the 4Q and missed a desperation 61-yd FG w/:13 left. Jackson threw 3 TD's and now is avg a respectable 212 ypg (62%) with a 5-4 ratio. While the NYG are 7-14 as a HF of 7 or more SEA is 7-25 ATS as a NDIV AD losing by

30-16 avg score and the Giants are beginning to gain confidence with each passing week. SAN FRANCISCO 20 Tampa Bay 17 - LY SF sustained their 1st home shutout loss in 33 years as TB left w/a 21-0 win as a 3.5 pt AD in their 3rd road game in 4 Wks (w/a 4th on deck). TB logged a season high 6 sks w/a 299-189 yd edge (SF had just 21 off plays in the 1H) as the Bucs "improved" to 3-23 SU all time in California. After B2B East Coast games (which they asked for), SF has a strong situational edge here. TB is off their 1st MNF home game since 2003 with a home game vs NO and the London game vs CHI on deck. TB is 9-2 SU/9-0-2 ATS on the road but SF is 8-3 SU/9-1-1 ATS at home with the heavily maligned Smith at the helm. SF is off a huge upset win at PHI LW where they rallied from a 20 pt deficit early 3Q. Smith had 201 yds (76%) with 2 TD's in the 2H and Gore had his 1st 100 yd game since Halloween LY. SF is atop the NFC West despite being outgained by 87 ypg by not turning ihe ball over +8 TO's (tied #1 w/ DET). We'll call for SF by a FG and wait for the MŃF results.

San Diego 34 DENVER 20 - The Chargers survived their usual Sept swoon going 2-1 with an explainable loss at NE but they did however go 1-3 ATS. LW against MIA they again topped 400 yds on offense but 4 FG's kept the score tight. SD has been productive on the div road but LY they went 1-2 SU despite outgaining all 3 foes by 176 ypg. The Chargers have enjoyed this trip as they've won and covered B2B games and are 4-0-3 ATS the L/7 visits. DEN's now must try to regroup after B2B long road trips and losses. Big plays have been DEN problem allowing 17 plays of 18+ yds the L/4 games while only producing 11 themselves. SD should continue to exploit that as the Broncos have now allowed 26 plays of 18+ yds on the season. We'll continue to buck the Broncos with Orton who is now 4-17 SU and 6-15 ATS in his last 21 starts.

Green Bay at ATLANTA - We had a nice pulse on these two as ATL gave us a 3★ LPS winner in the reg ssn kicking a 47yd FG with :09 left and GB returned the favor in the Div playoffs as Rogers (366, 86%, 3-0) picked them apart giving us a ★ rated Power Sweep winner. Each team is in their preferred technical roles as ATL is 11-4 ATS at home and GB is 14-7 ATS on vs non-div foes on the road. Sunday Night Marquees are 2-0 this season and are ONLY \$9 with your NC Sports Debit Card available after 11am Gameday!

Chicago at DETROIT - Boy, how things can change in a season. LY the Bears were 8-3 visiting the 2-9 Lions and were -4.5 in a 24-20 non-covering win. Now the NFC North has the leagues only 2 undefeated teams. The city of Detroit will be rocking with their first Monday Night home game since 2001 but will the Lions be able to handle the pressure or will the desperate Bears burst their bubble?

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OREGON ST 37 Arizona 31 - Arizona is 2-10 SU/ATS being outscored 31-17 vs the Beavers while OSU has also outgained the Wildcats in 9 of the L/11 matchups by a 412-272 avg. LY the Beavers went into Tucson and knocked off the #9 Wildcats 29-27 (+8), a game OSU actually led by 9 until an AZ TD w/1:52 left. The Wildcats spotted another tm a big lead as they trailed USC 17-0 after the 1Q which was too much to make up as AZ lost by 7 despite QB Foles throwing for 426 yds (AZ def all'd 582 ttl yds). The Cats are now on a 1-9 run dating back to LY with 2 losses each to USC, Oregon and Okla St (our toughest sked TY). Despite taking a 13-0 lead early in the 2Q vs ASU (aided by 3 Sun Devil TO's), OSU had TO problems of their own (5 total) and were outscored 35-7 the rest of the way despite a 40-66-341 pass performance by OB Mannion (1.4 ratio). While the vigitor is 6.1 EU/ATS and the lest 3 gms have been performance by QB Mannion (1-4 ratio). While the visitor is 6-1 SU/ATS and the last 3 gms have been decided by a total of 9 pts, the Beavers are 16-6 in conf games at Reser Stadium. OSU has struggled in Sept over the past 6 years (9-14 SU) but from October on the Beavers have gone 32-14 SU/ATS.

OKLAHOMA ST 54 Kansas 23 - OSU is 8-1 ATS vs KS. LY OSU (-24) trailed 14-10 into the 2Q but

scored the gm's final 38 pts holding KU to just 109 yds and 8 FD's. LTH ('07) OSU (+6) lost 43-28 vs a #5 ranked Jayhawks tm. The Pokes are 12-4-1 as a DD conf fav. They do have a big game at Texas on deck but are off a bye and are 12-6-1 as a HF. Prior to the bye OSU rallied from a 20-3 HT deficit scoring 3 straight TD drives to open the 2H in their win vs A&M. QB Weeden is #1 FBS passing (398 ypg, 74%, 10-6) spreading the ball around more than LY but his top target is still LY's Biletnikoff winner Blackmon (38, 11.8). The Cowboys have forced 13 TO's (#7 FBS). KU avg just 208 ypg on the road LY. KU had 191 yd and 3 TD on their 1st 15 plays to roar out to a 20-0 lead over TT but the Raiders answered with 3 straight TD drives in both late 1Q/early 2Q and to open the 3Q to take a 45-27 lead. QB Webb (204 ypg, 68%, 9-3) is #4 FBS pass eff but threw his 1st 3 int of the ssn vs the Raiders which led to 3 TD's. KU is 5#119 pass eff (293, 72%, 9-1) and that does not bode well going up against Weeden and Co.

Mizz is 9-2 ATS as an AF and is off a bye after the loss at OU which dropped them to 2-2 for the 1st time S/05. They've had plenty of firepower in their losses (517 ypg vs ASU and OU) but their D couldn't get off the field (542 ypg with just 1 sk). QB Franklin's numbers (246 ypg, 61%, 7-1 ratio, 260 rush) are better than #1 DC Gabbert's were at this time LY. RB Josey leads the FBS in ypc (533, 12.4!). Tigers allow 87 rush ypg (2.5). KSU is 4-7 as a HD but upset #15 Baylor (+3') in that role LW for another free winner as our B12 POW on Friday's Comp Line. KSU got the 1st int of Heisman hopeful QB Griffin of the ssn and turned it into a GW FG before stopping the Bears on downs on their final series. QB Klein (120 ypg, 55%, 6-2, B12's #4 rusher 423) has stepped up with B2B big gms as the Cats have pulled 2 str outright. KSU's imp'd D ranks in the FBS's top 20 in scoring (16.5), rush (88, 2.9) and total (292) D. Tigers have a big edge on off (#16-79) but KSU has the D edge (#24-27) and is on a roll. We've gone against Mizzou for a pair of 5★ Winners within the last several years and would have no problems backing HC Snyder here.

UH (-2') led 19-14 at HT and had a 557-419 yd edge but was done in by TO's (Keenum 4 int) and lost 38-32 (-2'). Dog has covered 4 str. UH escaped LW in EI Paso (down 14-0) on Thurs Night in which the def was shredded for 538 yds. UH has a bye on deck and is 8-5 as a HF under Sumlin. In their last reg ssn meeting UH was +10' and the Big Dog POW in '08 and dominated winning outright 41-24 with a 346 yd edge. This is EC's 1st true road gm and they went 2-4 ATS on the road LY with all 4 SU losses by 14+ pts. EC is off instate rival NC. QB Davis did pass for an EC rec'd 417 yds and outgained NC but 3 TO's (11 in L2 gms) on their first 3 drives proved costly (trailed 28-3). The Pirates are 4-1 in Houston incl a outright upset LTH ('07) as a 13' pt dog. UH brings a high-powered off (#7) vs an improved EC def but at home QB Keenum is 15-0 SU and 12-2 ATS as the str with an avg score 51-21 and UH is

BAYLOR 44 lowa St 27 - BU is 2-5 SU/ATS vs ISU and lost 24-10 (+1) in '09 (L/meeting) as BU QB Griffin DNP (inj). ISU (+5) dropped its L/trip to Waco ('08), 38-10 (Griffin was QB) and we won easily with Baylor as the B12 POW given away free on Friday's Comp Line. After undefeated starts both tms ret'd to earth in the B12 opener as KSU kicked a 31 yd FG with 3:10 to beat the Bears who were SOD at their own 35 on their final series. Heisman hopeful Griffin (#1 FBS pass eff 327 ypg, 82%, 18-1) has 18 TD vs 20 incompletions on the ssn but his 1st int set up KSU's GW kick. WR Wright is #1 FBS rec ypg (40, 621, 15.5). Young Bears D allows 29 ppg and 167 rush ypg (4.4). After 3 comeback wins to open the ssn ISU finally found a hole they couldn't dig themselves out of as UT took advantage of several Cyclone mistakes (3 TO's, missed 29 yd FG and blk'd P ret'd for a TD) to blaze out to a 34-0 HT lead as we won a 4★ LPS on the Horns (-9), 37-14. Despite his late gm heroics QB Jantz is #100 FBS pass eff (229, 57%, 7-7). ISU is #37 pass eff D (219, 50%, 6-1) but top cover CB Johnson (CS) was carted off the field after a scary collision vs Texas and the Cyclones haven't seen a pass gm in the same stratosphere as the Bears.

SOUTH CAROLINA 35 Kentucky 10 - Revenge. LY SC was off its huge upset of Bama and the situation greatly favored UK as the loss snapped SC's 10 gm series win streak. SC (-5) blew leads of 14-0 and 28-10 as UK went on a 68/12pl GW TD drive w/1:15 (SC was int in EZ w/:04). It was the first time ever that a UK squad beat a Spurrier cch'd team SU (1-17). RB Lattimore was injured and missed the 2H (212 ttl yds in 1H). The Gamecocks had been living on the edge all year and LW their bubble burst as they were upset 16-13 (-10) at home to Auburn. QB Garcia is avg just 169 ypg (52%) and leads the FBS in int's thrown (9). RB Lattimore has been one of the few bright spots on an off that is avg just 372 ypg as he leads with 677 (5.5) and 9 TD's. As bad as SC's off has been UK's has been worse avg just 256 ypg and LW vs LSU gained 100 (65%) of their 155 yds on their final two drives. QB Newton (129 ypg, 50%, 6-6) has been pulled several times and the Wildcat run gm has been non-existent avg 116 ypg (3.3). This is SC's 4th straight HG while UK is off Fla and a road gm at LSU but does have a bye on deck. The visitor is 13-6 ATS in this but UK has not won SU here since '99 and you have to believe SC will want to atone not only for LY's loss but also LW's disappointing performance.

Florida St 34 WAKE FOREST 20 - FSU is 2-5 ATS vs WF including losing outright 3x's but has won and covered the last 2. LY we used a 4★ on these pages on FSU (-20) and they had a 485-185 yd edge and delivered a 31-0 win. WF has been shutout two other times S'96 and got revenge w'18 and 10 pt wins. LTH QB Manuel made his 1st career start (265 ttl yds) as FSU (+5) went up 31-7 late 2Q never relinquishing the lead. FSU should be much healthier off a bye as Manuel DNP in their 35-30 loss to Clemson. LW Wake snapped a 4 gm losing streak to BC holding on for a 27-19 win (led 24-9 4Q). QB Price is much improved TY avg 280 ypg (63%) with a 7-2 ratio but now faces an FSU D which held OU's Landry Jones to 199 yds. Wake's undersized DL (247 lbs) has all'd just 100 rush ypg (2.5) but has just 3 sks and now faces an FSU OL weighing in at 314 lbs with a mobile QB. FSU has huge edges across the board (off #39-64, def #9-67 and ST's #2-77) with a much tougher sked (#47-117). The Noles are on a mission to regain ACC dominance.

Texas A&M 38 TEXAS TECH 34 - LTH A&M (+21') snapped a 7 gm road series losing streak winning 52-30. RB's Gray and Michael each topped 120+ rush yds. LY A&M QB Tannehill had a school rec'd 449 pass yds (1st career QB st) as A&M won 45-27 (-7). TT did fmbl into the EZ twice or it would have been a lot closer (the 1st would have put TT up 14-0). HT is 9-3 ATS. TT is 10-5 ATS as a HD and is 15-7 ATS vs A&M but has dropped 3 str in series. After a Top 10 start to the ssn A&M has blown



17+ pt HT leads in 2 straight gms becoming the 1st FBS to do so since 2005. The Ags have been outscored 52-12 in the 2H vs OSU and Ark and many have questioned their conditioning. A&M could not stop QB Wilson (510 pass yd) or WR Wright whose 281 rec yds were #2 all-time in SEC play. A&M still has the B12's top backfield duo of RB's Michael (408, 7.2) and Gray (363, 4.5). A&M is #120 FBS pass D (337, 66%, 6-2). TT spotted Kansas a 20-0 lead after their 1st 3 series before roaring back for a 45-34 win. QB Doege (329 ypg, 73%, 14-1) is #12 FBS pass eff despite throwing his first int LW. Young TT D is allowing 229 rush ypg (5.0). The situation and series history favor the HT.

Syracuse 21 TULANE 20 - Tulane has lost 4 str vs Syracuse by 22 ppg but the last meeting was in '99. TU has lost 4 str (2-0 ATS L/2) hosting BCS tms (avg loss by 17 ppg). SU is used to playing in domes and LY went 5-1 SU/ATS away and TU usually has little fan support (6-17-1 as a HD). TU, off 3 str AG's (LW hammered at Army as road trip caught up to them), is 2-10 ATS off a SU loss, has a conf div opp on deck and could be without 2 LB strs. The Orange come in very fortunate at 3-2 (2 OT "lucky wins" and IAA foe) as they have been outgained in each vs FBS opp's (412-322 ypg, -33 FD). SU's luck ran out LW in their 3rd OT gm of the ssn. The Green Wave have been very inconsistent and under HC Toledo are just 8-19 ATS at home (0-2 ATS TY) while SU has a bye on deck and has not taken non-conf foes lightly under Marrone (10-5 SU/ATS). Syr is 10-3 ATS off a SU loss under Marrone and TU is on a 3-10 ATS run (1-4 TY). Expect nothing less than another close game going down to the wire involving Syr.

LSU 27 Florida 13 - The Gators had covered 5 in a row ATS until LY when LSU (+6′) faked a 53 yd FG w: 35 left down 3. The holder tossed the ball over his head and K Jasper caught it after it hit the turf (review upheld) and ran 5 yds for a FD. Four plays later LSU scored the GW TD w: 06 left. Despite needing that lucky play for the win LY LSU did have a 385-243 yd edge in the Swamp. Will Muschamp spent 2001-'04 as the DC/LB cch at LSU. The HT in the series is just 5-14 ATS but Gators are off a big HG vs Bama in which they were dominated after their first play from scrimmage (65 yd TD pass). The key play happened late in the 1H with the Gators trailing 24-10 and driving when QB Brantley was hurt (knee, DNR, CS). Bkp Driskel came in but the UF off did not cross midfield from that point forward. The duo of Rainey/Demps who came in avg 275 all-purpose ypg were held to 8 yds rush (0.6 combined). LSU dominated UK and all'd only 55 yds until the Wildcats final two drives. QB Lee continues his efficient play avg 159 ypg (59%) with a 7-1 ratio. LSU is 3-17-1 as an SEC HF and it is well noted that LSU S/60 is 220-60-4 SU in night gms (28-1 under Miles) and just 25-25-3 in day games (9-4 UM). With UF's uncertainty at QB and the possibility of a true frosh making his first career start, the Tigers get the call and we'll wait for a solid line later in the week.

NEBRASKA 27 Ohio St 17- Last met in '56. First B10 HG ever for Neb and the 1st gm back for 4 susp'd OSU players. The Bucks were 21-3 SU (16-7-1 ATS) the L/6Y with the avg win by 20 ppg but that was under Tressel. NU HC Pelini is an OSU grad winning 4L at FS. Both teams come in after humbling results as OSU scored with just :19 left to avoid their 1st home shutout S/82. MSU dominated the LOS holding the Bucks to just 110 yds until their final drive while piling up 9 sks. The Spartans were SOD at the OSU36, fmbl'd at the OSU25, int'd at the OSU6 and 20 and also missed a 51 yd FG in a misleading final. HC Fickell said after the gm the QB competition will be open in practice TW to all 4 schirshp QB's after true Fr Miller struggled (5-10-56 with 1 int) while Bauserman hit 7-14-87 and 1 TD while QB'ing the entire 4Q. OSU allows 94 rush ypg (3.2). After NU took a 14-7 early 2Q lead the Badgers scored 6 TD on their final 8 poss to roll to a 48-17 win in which they had a 486-335 yd edge. NU QB Martinez was contained by UW throwing 3 int although he's still #4 B10 in rush (482, 5.8), he's fallen to #11 pass eff (165, 50%, 4-5 ratio). NU had their D's Big 3 (DT Crick, LB David and CB Dennard) on the field for the 1st time TY but the Blackshirts are allowing an alarming 27 ppg. OSU has been a DD dog only once recently (+12 to USC in '08, 35-3 loss) and NU is 7-4 off a SU loss under Pelini.

UCLA 34 Wash St 27 - The Bruins are just 5-12 ATS vs the Cougars. LY UCLA had just upset ranked tms in B2B wks and was -24 vs WSU but trailed 28-20 3Q in a letdown spot but still rallied to win 42-28 (WSU's L/3 poss ended on SOD at UCLA1, missed 45 yd FG and fmbl at UCLA38). The L/2Y UCLA has had their ssn high in pts and yds vs WSU and while that may not happen again TY, we'll back the home tm (#3 toughest sked TY) as they attempt to climb back to 3-3 on the ssn.

Tcu 34 SAN DIEGO ST 27 - Patterson has sized up SDSt as the one team that is close to TCU in terms of spd and athleticism in the MW. The Aztecs are 10-4 ATS off a bye. Two wks ago SDSt lost to its old HC, 28-7 at Mich. The players were reportedly devastated but should be plenty focused here as they've never beaten TCU in conf action and this is their last shot. QB Lindley is avg 219 ypg (52%) with an 8-1 ratio and has been hurt by youth at WR. RB Hillman is #2 FBS with 606 rush yd (6.2) and all 8 of SDSt's rush TD's. TCU will be harder to read as they are coming off their 2nd loss of the yr, this time to SMU, 40-33 in OT. The Frogs scored 23 4Q pts and forced OT where SMU got a 19 yd TD pass while TCU's 48.2 pass bounced off Carter's foot. It snapped a 22 gm home win streak as TCU was outFD'd 24-20 and outgained 461-454. Pachall is avg 236 ypg (70%) with a solid 13-2 ratio. The top rusher is James (379, 8.2, 2) and the top rec is Boyce (494, 15.4, 4). The D is suppect at best, all'g 142 ypg rush (4.1) and ranking #97 in our pass eff D.TCU is 6-0 SU (3-3 ATS) vs SDSt and trailed LY 14-0 before scoring 40 of the gm's next 47 pts. The Frogs are 1-2 ATS here in SD with 3 and 12 pt wins but in their LTH they won 55-12.

Fiu 38 AKRON 17 - HC and first meeting. FIU is 2-2 vs the MAC but 2-0 in road/neutral meetings incl LY's Little Caesars Bowl. FIU has big edges across the board on off (#72-119), def (#76-115) and ST's (#43-118). UA is 5-9 SU/ATS and 0-2 SU/ATS on homecoming at Infocision Stadium (opened '09). The Panthers are actually 4-1 as an AF and don't play again until Tuesday, Oct 18. T.Y. Hilton (102 rec yd, 20.4, 1 TD LW) appears to be close to 100% healthy as FIU's offense should put up huge numbers after posting 568 LW vs Duke. UA is 12-11-2 vs current SBC tms (L/gm beat NT 33-13 in '06 at home) and does have a bye on deck.

Troy 34 LOUISIANA 24 - SBC's best vs SBC's biggest surprise this year. LY in the 4Q UL (+20') was up 21-17 but fumbled at the T5. Later tied 24-24 Troy went 53/7pl for the GW TD. UL is 1-7 SU since 1994 vs Troy incl 5 str losses by 20 ppg. Troy is 2-6 as an AF but UL is 2-8 as a HD, 1-6 as a conf HD and LTH (+9') lost 48-31. Trojans have the #57 off vs the Cajuns #94 def. Troy QB Robinson is avg 332 (59%) with a 7-4 ratio and will spread the ball around as 15 different players had a catch LW! Since ULL named Gautier as the starter he has not dissapointed avg 275 (68%) 5-0 ratio. Troy has a home date with ULM on deck while UL will host N Texas for homecoming. A full house will be expected as HC Hudspeth has Lafayette believing in the Cajuns but Troy reestablished itself as the team to beat in the SBC.

ULM 31 Arkansas St 24 - LY we used a 4★ LPS on ASU (-4) and they delivered a 34-20 win at home (led 21-0) with a 474-391 yd edge and ULM getting a late TD. ULM is off a bye while Ark St is on B2B road trips. The dog is 9-2 ATS with 5 outright upsets. HT is 14-6 SU incl 6 str SU wins (4 by 8 pts or less) and ULM leads the series 6-3 ATS. Ark St has a huge ST's edge here (#24-117). Arkansas St had a much tougher than expected game and needed a TD pass with :43 left to defeat WKU LW. Ark St QB Applin is avg 277 (67%) 5-5 ratio but with leading RB Jackson's status in the air, the Red Wolves rush attack is non-existent.

NORTH TEXAS 27 Florida Atlantic 21 - NT's win LY snapped a 6 gm SU series losing streak (2-5 ATS). NT (+10) led 21-10 mid-4Q before all'g a TD drive to cut the lead to 4. FAU got the ball back twice in the final 3:32 but was int'd & SOD at the NT34 w/:59. The Owls are 4-0 SU in Denton (6-1 overall) but have only won by a comb 22 pts. FAU is on its 5th straight road gm to start the season! The matchups are even across the board (NT #107-118 off and #105-109 D). NT starting QB Thompson's status is up in the air as he DNP LW (CS). Mean Green were only 6-16 ATS at home but moved into a new stadium this year (1-1 ATS) and FAU has their much anticipated stadium debut next week.

PRO ANGLES There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of nandicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. <u>We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on</u>. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the number in the () indicates how many angles apply to that team. The higher the number the stronger the angle play.

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on. 
