NEWS AND NOTES - Boise St showed remarkable dominance vs Fresno St and actually scored 111 straight points vs Fresno St until a PRTD by the Bulldogs on Friday night. In 2010 they beat FSU 51-0 at home and had scored the final 10 points in 2009. Boise led 37-0 when FSU gained 73 yards in the final :20 of the 1H. Boise pulled QB Moore leading 43-0 in the 3Q and was up 50-0 After 3Q. BSU cruised to a 57-7 win with a 464-270 yd edge...Purdue got their largest margin of victory in a Big Ten game since 2008. MarQueis Gray did return to the lineup for Minnesota and threw for 104 yards and rushed for 20. It was Minnesota's 2nd straight blowout loss and turnovers fueled it. After a 26 yard punt, PU went 39/7pl for a TD then went 36/11pl for a 53 yd FG. Then, after a fumble went 11/7pl for a TD then got a 37 yd IR TD and led 24-0 after 1Q. PU led 31-3 at the half with a 180-85 yd edge. They extended it to 45-10 before Minny got a TD with 7:55 left...Tyler Russell replaced an ineffective Chris Relf as MSU trailed 3-0 at the half with UAB having a 181-118 yd edge. After punting to open the 3Q, MSU went 89/7pl for a TD then after a UAB fmbl went 71/4pl (after UAB fmbl) for a TD and after a UAB int, went 72/11pl for a TD with 5:03 left to go up 21-3. UAB's final drive was SOD at their own 47 with 3:18 left. Russell hit 11-13-166 while Relf hit 6-10-46. UAB QB Perry missed at least 5 open rec's and in the 1H there were 10 punts and 3 FG att's with 2 missed for the 2 teams combined. Miss St had just a 416-340 yd edge...Georgia Tech failed to put Maryland away and the Terps turned to backup QB CJ Brown. Brown hit just 4-17-36 yards but had the game changing play of the day. A few inches may have determined this game as well as GT had 4 different plays which could have gone for TD's but the connection was missed by inches and/or a drop with wide open rec's. In the 1H GT had a commanding 232-89 yd edge but only led 14-3 as they had a TD pass dropped and punted, missed a 34 yd FG and then were int'd in the EZ for a TB from the 18 yd line. GT led 21-3 and was SOD at the MD23 with 12:14 left when the key play happened. Brown faked a pitch and raced 77 yards down the sideline for a TD to get MD back to 21-10 and got 1 more late TD to only lose 21-16... South Carolina's only weakness at the start of the year has been QB Garcia who had a 4-9 ratio. Conner Shaw did start his second game and after a not so good outing vs East Carolina in his first start, Shaw guided SC to 639 yards and a 32-6 FD edge vs Kentucky. He hit 26-39 and most importantly had 0 int's. Kentucky had lost their first 2 SEC games by 33 ppg and SC Marcus Lattimore only ran the ball twice in the 1Q but finished with 102 yards (22 att). When they pulled Shaw, 3rd stringer Andrew Clifford and 4th stringer Dylan Thompson both appeared but no Garcia. UK ran just 6 plays in SC territory all on their opening drive and Shaw's 4 TD passes matched Garcia's effort for the entire start of the season. UK actually led 3-0 after SC fumbled the opening KO and it was just 7-3 after 1Q but SC had a 290-57 yd edge at the half and led 20-3 in the 54-3 romp...Rice only had a 350-307 yd edge vs Memphis. Rice was int'd on 2 of their first 4 poss and only led 7-3 after 1Q then were SOD at the UM21 and punted on their next 2. After a 21 yd PR, they went 46/11pl for a 15 yd TD pass with :38 left in the half to lead 14-3 and had a 245-107 yd edge at the half. Rice got a 47 yd IR TD early 3Q and then drove 74/7pl for a TD to lead 28-3. Memphis rec'd a fumble at the Rice20 and got a 30 yd FG and 2 poss later fumbled at the Rice24 with 4:52 left and on their final poss, got to the Rice31 but were int'd at the 11 with :29 left...Wake Forest led almost start to finish vs Florida St. FSU started Clint Trickett but when Trickett was int'd and ret'd to the 38 setting up a 38/4pl drive for a TD and a WF 16-7 lead with 1:48 left in the half, EJ Manuel came off the bench. Manuel led an 88/6pl drive for a TD to make it 16-14. WF built the lead to 32-17 early 4Q and FSU down 35-24 got a TD with :54 left to pull within 5 (2ptng) but WF rec'd the onside kick. Josh Harris rushed for 136 yards...QB Jon Hays made his first start for Utah and had 3 crucial int's vs Arizona St. The Sun Devils led 10-7 at the half. Utah faked a punt and would go 79/9pl for a TD to lead 14-10. ASU got a 35 yd FG with 5:00 left 3Q, 14-13. Utah then turned it over 3 times and ASU went 44/5pl, 32/3pl and 61/10pl for TD's to blow it open, 35-14. Utah was sacked on 4&16 at midfield and punted on their final 2 poss...West Virginia/Connecticut was a tale of 2H's. In the 1H Conn had an 11-10 FD edge but missed a 42 yd FG and settled for a 22 yd FG on the last play of the half and actually trailed 10-9. The key play of the game happened mid3Q. Conn, threatening to take the lead, had a FD at the WV13 when QB McEntee was hit and fmbl'd. The ball popped into the air and was ret'd 83 yards to the UC12. WV got a TD 2pl later to go up 17-9. Conn would then got 3 & out on their next 2 poss, get tackled for

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a safety and got 2 FD's on their next 4 poss, all punts while WV rolled to a 43-9 lead. UC did get a 48 yd IR TD with 7:54 left to close the scoring and WV won 43-16 with a 541-275 yd edge...Oklahoma got a 55 yard IR TD, 19 yd FR TD and 56 yd FR TD in their 55-17 win over Texas. The FD's were even at 22 but the Sooners did have a 453-259 yd edge. Landry Jones hit 31-50-367 yards...Texas has come in the Red River Rivalry game ranked #11 three times and allowed 65

in 2003, 63 in 2000 and 55 in 2011... Kansas St led 10-3 at the half and opened it to 24-3 with 11:23 left in the game. Missouri would go on 12 and 8pl drives for 2 TD's to pull within 24-17 with 5:02 left and had some momentum. They opted to kick off deep but KSU went 66/11pl picking up 3 crucial FD's and ended the game at the Missouri 11 yard line pulling the outright upset...All season long Penn St has been better statistically than they were on the scoreboard. Versus Iowa, PSU had a 395-253 yd edge. In fact, Iowa came in leading the Big Ten in passing but PSU held them to 169 yards. PSU settled for a 20 yd FG after an 88/18pl drive then another 20 yard FG after an 81/12pl drive and only led 6-3 at the half. PSU had a 3&5 from the 6 but was int'd in the EZ but got a TD with 8:08 left to lead 13-3 and lowa's final 3 poss ended on 2 int's and a 4th&39 sack...Oregon St jumped out to a 27-6 halftime lead vs Arizona and held on for their first win of the season. The Beavers did get a blocked punt for a TD in the 1H helping them to that lead but had a 224-141 yd edge. They extended it to 30-6 mid3Q but Arizona chipped away. The Beavers went on a 48/9pl drive and missed a 42 yd FG and Arizona got within 30-27. OSU went for it on 4&gl at the 2 and got a TD with 5:22 left to lead 37-27 and Arizona went 78/7pl but on 4&gl from the 2 were SOD was 3:02 left and the Beavers won by 10... If you compare LSU and Alabama's games vs Florida, they are fairly even statistically and the scores are almost identical. Alabama's win is still far more impressive. Alabama last week had to play in The Swamp vs Florida's #1 QB for the 1H and #2 for the 2H. LSU was in Death Valley and was facing a 3rd string QB in Jacoby Brissett who became the first UF frosh QB in Florida history to take his first snap as a starter. Brissett, who was in a hostile environment, hit 8-14-94. It was just 27-11 after 3Q's and LSU would punch in a 2 yd TD run with 1:27 left capping a 76/11pl drive for the 41-11 final. LSU had a 453-213 yd edge...Houston's defense looked porous on Thursday night vs UTEP but vs East Carolina they had 9 sacks and had 4 ints. Case Keenum became the #2 all-time career leading passer passing Graham Harrell at TT and he hit 30-37 for 304 yards with his last pass being a 27 yard TD with 14:34 left in the game to make it 49-3. EC did have 20 FD's but was int'd at the UH21, EC43, UH33 and UH33. They also went on a 15 play drive to the UH19 but punted after sacks, were SOD after a 10pl drive at midfield and had a drive to the UH34 also end on a punt. UH went 80/10pl and got a TD with 1:19 left for the 56-3 final...You had to expect a high scoring game with Southern Miss and Navy and the two teams combined for 1,153 yards. Navy actually had 144-0 yard edge at the start but trailed 7-0 as they went on a 68/13pl drive settling for a 29 yd FG which was blk'd and ret'd 79 yards for a TD then went 76/13pl but was SOD on 4&gl at the 1. SM's offense was almost unstoppable and had TD drives of 99, 75, 77 and 58 yards in the 1H and led 35-7 with a 327-213 yard edge. The teams basically traded TD's in the 2H on almost every poss with SM leading by 28 or 21 points and Navy, trailing 63-35, was SOD at the SM2 with 1:59 left...Some key plays kept Miami, FI in the game vs Virginia Tech and VT blew a big lead and actually needed a TD with :56 left for the win. VT took their first 2 drives right down the field for TD's to lead 14-0 and their 3rd drive was headed for the same but they fumbled at the Miami27. UM on 3&18 threw a pass down the sideline which looked incomplete. Somehow the replays gave them a 41 yard pass for a FD overthrowing the call and they got a TD a few plays later. VT still led 21-7 at the half. In the 2H, UM got their 2nd big play, a 3&4 pass where DB Whitley went for the ball and missed and Benjamin took it 77 yards for a TD. VT still led 24-14 and 31-21. UM on 3&12 early 4Q was sk'd and was forced to punt but QB Harris was standing over the DE and Collins threw the ball back at him and got a 15 yd penalty keeping the drive alive and UM got a TD. UM faced a 2nd & 30 and handed off to Miller who took it 30 yards for a TD and stunningly they led 35-31 with 2:51 left but VT went 77/8pl and Logan Thomas had a 19 yd TD run with :56 left for the win. Thomas hit 23-25-310 yards and 3 TD's passing and 2 rushing... Central Michigan QB Ryan Radcliff had a great 1H hitting 15-17 for 196 yards. CM settled for a 22 FG after an 82 yd drive and trailed 21-17 at the half despite a 253-223 yd edge. Radcliff was 1-10 with 3 int's in the 3Q and NCSt took control 35-17. It was 38-17 when CM got a 77 yd TD run by Cotton with 8:18 left then recovered the onside kick. They got 3 FD's to the NCSt11 but was int'd in the EZ with 5:38 left and NCSt got 3 FD's and ran out the clock...Notre Dame scored their most points since Lou Holtz's final home game when they beat Rutgers 62-0. It was the most combined points ever for a game at ND Stadium. ND scored on all six 1H poss and led 42-16 at the half as the Falcons were no match physically for the Irish. ND even inserted mobile Andrew Hendrix who hit all 4 of his passes and rushed 6 times for 111 yards. The 2 teams combined for 1,125 yards. Air Force26 had a FD called back on a clip and went 3 &out after dropping a FD pass on 3&7. The Irish led 59-19 when AF went 74 and 67 yards for a pair of garbage TD's on their final 2 drives, the latter with :33 left... Tennessee was held to -9 yds rushing vs Florida but Georgia did even better holding them to -20 yards rushing. In the 1H, each team had some long drives result in FG's and it was 6-6. UGA took control at the start of the 3Q scoring TD's on their first 2 poss to lead 20-6. UGA had an amazing poss where they went 12pl and had a FD at the UT23. After 3 holds and a 15 yd PF, they punted on 4&50! UT took over with 6:11 left and QB Bray was injured. Backup QB Simms converted on 4&2 and on 4&16 for FD's and got a TD with 2:45 left to pull within 8. UGA rec'd the onside kick. cont. on pg 2 cont. from Front Page ... Nebraska had the biggest comeback in Cornhusker history with Ohio St not scoring after Braxton Miller left the game with injury. Taylor Martinez was coming off a horrible game vs Wisconsin where his 3 int's turned the game around but hit 16-22-191 yards. Still, OSU led 27-6 in the 2H with NU only taking the lead after a Bauserman int with 6:29 left and getting a 17 yd TD run by Burkhead with 5:10 left. NU finished with a 25-16 FD edge. After Miller went out of the game NU had a 15-3 FD edge and managed the comeback with Bauserman hitting 1-10-13...It was a tale of 2H's in the Northwestern/Michigan game. In the HN U had a 297-257 yd edge and led 24-14, even dropping a TD pass at the end of the 1H and settling for a 20 yd FG. Denard Robinson had 3 crucial 1H int's being picked off at the 4 yard line 3 times. In the 2H UM battled back to take its first lead with 2:58 left in the 3Q and then NU turned it over on consecutive drives. NU, trailing 35-24, went for it on 4&5 at the UM37 and QB Persa had his helmet ripped off by a DL but no pen was called and the play was blown dead because his helmet was off. Fitzgerald got hit with a 15 yard PF for protesting the call and UM went 39/9pl for a TD with 2:19 left to clinch it, 42-24.

MISLEADING FINALS - UCF absolutely dominated Marshall and it's shocking that they only won by 10. In the 1H UCF had 13-1 FD and 246-47 yd edges. They had a pair of long TD drives but also had a 63/6pl drive end on a fumble at the MU11 and had a 10pl drive end on a 22 yard FG where they mishandled the snap. Marshall's only TD came when UCF fumbled and MU ret'd it 12 yards for a TD with 3:07 left in the 3Q. UCF had 2 chances at a TD at the end but on 3&2 from the MU11 were int'd at the 4 with 5:04 left and UCF's final drive went 48/7pl with the last play of the game getting to the MU4. UCF finished with 21-6 FD and 387-130 yard edges.

INJURIES OF NOTE: Clemson was cruising along vs Boston College with a 26-7 lead when Taj Boyd inj'd his hip on the first drive of the 3Q and he did not return. Cole Stoudt hit 6-10-37 yards in his place. CU still managed a 47 yard FG with :39 left in the 3Q to lead 29-14 and then drove 58/6pl and on 4&1 got a 36 yd TD run by Ellington with 11:24 left to get ahead of the 21 pts spread, 36-14. BC was SOD

at the CU31 and SOD at their own 33 on their final 2 drives. CU had actually not scored a TD vs Boston College since 2008. Another injury of note was RB Montel Harris for BC did not play after having rushed for 100 yards the week before in his only game of the season so far. CU finished with a 500-258 yd edge.

FRONTDOOR AND BACKDOOR COVERS - Louisville OC Mike Sanford did not travel with the team so QB coach Watson called the plays. NC got their 8th straight win over a non-conf opponent and Giovanni Bernard became the first Tar Heel to rush for at least 100 yards in 4 straight games since Ethan Horton in 1984. UL actually controlled the 1H with a 188-59 yd edge but the Cardinals missed a 40 yd FG after a 75/15pl drive, were SOD at the NC43, int'd at the NC19 and missed a 36 yd FG. In the 2H, UL punted on their first 5 poss. NC took the points off the board on a 23 yd FG when UL jumped offsides and got a TD and later went 66/5pl for a TD to lead 14-0 with 12:19 left. NC was SOD on 4&1 at the UL39 with 2:35 left and UL went 61/10pl and got an 18 yd TD pass with :41 left for the backdoor cover. NC rec'd the onside kick... Illinois is off their best start since 1951 and had 3 scoring plays of 66+ rards to erase an early 10-0 deficit. Indy ret'd the opening KO 98 yards for a TD and Illinois trailed 10-0 when they got a 77 yard TD pass on 38.11 with 4:22 left in the 1Q then got a 66 yd FR TD and later a 67 yd TD pass to Jenkins to lead 27-13 at the half with a 280-119 yd edge. It was 34-13 when Indy got a TD with 5:29 left capping an 85/11pl drive for the frontdoor push but IL took over at its 11 and went 89/11pl and got a 1 yd TD run with 1:20 left for the frontdoor cover. Indy got to the IL15 but their final pass was incomplete... Texas A&M did what they usually do which is jump out to a big lead, this time it was 31-20 at the half and A&M had a 301-225 vd edge. This time A&M got a break in the 3Q. They led 31-23 when they blk'd a 50 yd FG and ret'd it 63 yards for a TD to make it 38-23. A&M got a TD with 11:59 left and were up comfortably 45-30. TT got a 31 yd FG that bounced off the upright and went through to make it 45-33 with 9:34 left but TT on 4&2 fired incomplete with 4:00 left at their own 33. A hold on A&M forced a 4&17 and they punted with just 2:55 left and TT would go 91/11pl getting a 20 yd TD pass with :31 left for the backdoor cover.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS LLEGE SELECTION

4★ Alabama over MISSISSIPPI - The Crimson Tide have been very good to us on these pages TY cashing 3 str 4★ Key Selections! Alabama has won 7 str in this series but Ole Miss has covered 5 of 6 with 4 of those decided by 4 pts or less. LY we used a Big Dog POW on Ole Miss. Bama was off a loss to SC dropping from #1 but only finished with a 15-13 FD edge (23-10-20'). The Tide continues loss to SC dropping from #1 but only finished with a 15-13-FD edge (23-10-20). The flue continues to take care of business on the road going 13-2 SU (11-4 ATS) with 3 ATS L's LY to ranked foes. LW QB McCarron threw for a career-high 237 yds and 4 TD's (has not thrown an int since opener) while Heisman candidate Richardson had his 5th str 100 yd gm as the Tide (-29) won 34-0 cashing another 4★ Key. Their D continued to live up to their lofty #1 ranking getting their 2nd shutout of the ssn. Before the bye week, the Rebels had their most complete game of the ssn as we cashed our Free Comp Underdog POW on Miss (+3') as they beat Fresno 38-28. QB Mackey got his 1st start and threw for 214 yds and RB Scott now leads with 350 (5.1). Nutt is 6-0 ATS off a bye but they are 1-4 ATS as a HD getting outgained by 179 ypg. Why jump off the bandwagon now as Bama is 5-1 ATS TY with easily our #1 D facing a Ole Miss off that ranks just #81 and a QB making just his 2nd start? For the 4th week in a row it's Roll Tide!

FORECAST: Alabama 41 MISSISSIPPI 6 3* Western Michigan over NORTHERN ILLINOIS - NI has gone 8-2 ATS (7-3 SU) in the series but the dog is 4-1 ATS. LY WM allowed a 79/7pl TD drive and trailed with 3:42 left. WM went 64/12pl but was int'd on 2&10 at the NI12. Excluding the WM game NI went 7-0 ATS and was +226 ypg vs the MAC LY but failed to cover against WM and they were only +20 yds. In the L2Y at home vs the MAC NI is 8-0 SU (7-1 ATS) but WM has won and covered 4 of their L5 MAC road games (did lose LTH 38-3, +6'). LY QB Carder hurt his ankle and WM could not use its full gameplan. We won a 3★ Small College Play on WM LW, as they beat BG 45-21 as a 10 pt HF, NI beat KS 40-10 as a 17 pt HF, NI's defense went into LW allowing 40 ppg and 500 ypg but held KS to 10 pts and 70 ttl yds. This will be a battle of 2 of the MAC's top QB's. WM's QB Carder is avg 280 ypg (70%) with a 15-5 ratio and 116 yds rushing (2 TD). While NI QB Harnish is avg 224 ypg (70%) with a 12-3 ratio and 442 yds rushing (7 TD). This looks to be a shootout with NI's #38 off vs WM's #73 def, and WM's #53 off vs NI's #113

def. We'll back the MAC's most talented team for yet another ★ rated winner.

FORECAST: Western Michigan 47 NORTHERN ILLINOIS 34 3★ PITTSBURGH over Utah - LY these 2 met in the season opener on a Thurs with Pitt coming back twice from a DD deficit to force OT, but eventually losing SU and pushing ATS. TY Utah has to travel midseason in the midst of their new P12 schedule while breaking in new QB Hays who will be making his 1st career road start for the ini'd Wynn (199 yds, 60%, 1-3 ratio in 1st career start LW) and attempting to end a 2 gm losing streak as they turned the ball over on 3 consec drives in the 2H in a loss to ASU. After a ssn-high 523 yds a wk earlier against USF, the Panthers returned to their inconsistent form LW vs Rutgers as QB Sunseri struggled (125 yds, 50%, 0-3 ratio) and was actually benched for a bit in the 2H. The Panthers, led by RB Graham (896 rush, 6.0, 9 TD) are a different tm at home and with a bye on deck (10-6 ATS prior), expect Pitt to hand out some revenge against a Utah squad making a rare trip East. FORECAST: PITTSBURGH 31 Utah 14

OTHER SELECTIONS 2★ Georgia over VANDERBILT - Georgia mauled Vandy LY as a 4★ LPS winner outgaining them by 407 yds in a 43-0 shutout (cover by 29 pts!). They've also won 9 str trips to Nashville (7-2 ATS). Bulldogs Richt has always been thought of as a premier road HC and after LY's 4 losses (equaled previous 5Y combined) he has shown at Miss and Tenn that they are back TY. LW Richt reached milestone win #100 as UGA (-2') beat Tenn 20-12 w/a 366-270 yd edge as we cashed a 4★ LPS on the Bulldogs. Despite suffering from a wrist inj that limited his touches super frosh RB Crowell had 2 rush TD's in the 2H to put the game away and now leads with 573 (4.9). QB Murray is avg 221 ypg (61%) with a 13-6 ratio and the UGA D has now allowed just 1 off TD in the last 4 gms! That does not bode well for a Vandy off that was shutout at Bama LW and now has avg'd just 1.5 ppg and 134 ypg the L/2 SEC gms. UGA might have some value TW as they were up 20-6 vs Tenn and were just outside the UT RZ looking for more in the 4Q when a barrage of penalties forced a 4th and 57 punt! Vandy is 1-8 as a SEC HD coming off a physical gm vs Bama. While UGA has a bye on deck and they don't control their SEC East destiny, they now have one hand on the steering wheel after 4 str FORECAST: Georgia 31 VANDERBILT 7 wins and will take no foe lightly.

2★ Kansas St (+) over TEXAS TECH - Five straight wins, 5 straight covers and TT has avg 669 yds and outgained KSU by 374 ypg the L/3 but Leach was the HC for each (last met '09). KSU hasn't won in Lubbock S'97 as they have dropped 3 str visits by an avg 37 ppg. In '09 KSU fell behind 38-0 at HT and finished allowing 739 yds. Despite 34-23 FD and 523-393 yd edges TT lost 45-40 to bitter at 11 and liniable allowing 739 yets. Despite 3423 TD and 323-335 yet edges 11 onliter rival A&M as the gm's turning point came in the 3Q when clinging to a 31-23 lead, the Aggies ret'd a blk'd FG 64 yds for a TD. B12's #2 rusher Stephens (570, 5.2) was also seriously inj'd late 3Q (CS). QB Doege is #21 FBS pass eff (341 ypg, 71%, 17-1). TT is #115 FBS in rush D (224, 4.9). LW we had ANOTHER Underdog POW OUTRIGHT UPSET winner (4 this year and 2 on KSU) as KSU scored their 3rd straight upset (+3) pulling out to a 24-3 early 4Q lead over Missouri. The Tigers then got 2 TD drives in which they had nearly half of their total yds for the gm but after pulling to within 24-17 with 5:25 couldn't stop the Cats who ran out the clock. Unflashy KSU QB Klein (119, 57%, 6-3, 468 rush) and RB Hubert (469, 5.5) are getting the job done. It's the D that's been the difference however leading the B12 in ttì (299) D and they are #38 pass eff D (206, 56%, 7-7). Could it be 4 straight upsets for HC Snyder? FORECAST: Kansas St 33 TEXAS TECH 30

2★ FLORIDA ATLANTIC over Wku - Florida Atlantic has spent their first FIVE gms on the road and this is their home opener in their brand new stadium. They are 0-5 SU (2-3 ATS) but Schnellenberger played a lot of bkps vs 3 FBS foes to better prepare them for the Sun Belt. He has called this one of the most important days in FAU football and a monumental day. FAU has won all 3 meetings but has dropped the L/2 ATS. WKU has covered 6 of 7 conf road games falling in LY's ssn finale by 1 They have had 9 days to prepare and are off an emotional OT rivalry gm victory at MTSU. WKU RB Rainey leads the conf with 573 yds (4.2) and FAU is giving up 130 rush ypg in conf play. The entire FAU off has struggled with the exception of RB Morris who, after a slow start, is avg 109 ypg (5.7) the L/3. FAU playing with a lot of emotion here and gets the win in their new stadium

OTHER GAMES

Thursday, October 13th - San Diego St at AIR FORCE - Both tms were 9-4 LY, both won bowls and both were 5-3 in conf play. The dog is 7-3 ATS. LY SDSt was the Underdog POW on these pages and knocked off their 1st ranked foe in 26 gms. The Aztecs are 5-3 ATS as an AD (0-1 TY) and LY outgained foes away (sked incl BYU, Missouri and TCU). Tough to prep for the option on a short wk but HC Long knows it as well as any cch and LY they beat both AF and Navy (4★ Bowl LPS winner) and has faced it 2x TY. AF is in the midst of a brutal sked as they are off trips to Navy (D on field 105pl) and ND (ND scored on every poss in 1H and won 59-33) with a trip to Boise on deck. The Aztecs had a bye two weeks ago to begin prep for the option, but are on a 2 gm SU/ATS losing streak.

Usc at CALIFORNIA - Cal is playing its 2nd consec Thurs night game after LW's trip to Oregon which saw the Bears leading by 1 at HT before being outscored 29-0 in the 2H. While another weeknight meet-ing would normally be an edge for the Golden Bears, USC is off a bye and has won 7 straight in the series (5-2 ATS). LY USC was -2' at home and had an amazing 372-65 yd edge at half and led 42-0 en route to a 48-14 win as QB Barkley threw for 352 yds and 5 TD's. Something in Cal's 1st conf HG at AT&T Park will have to give as the Trojans are just 5-12 ATS as an AF while the Bears have gone just 4-9 ATS as a HD.

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MIDWEEK MARQUEE PLAYS

Friday, October 14th - Hawaii at SAN JOSE ST - The Warriors have won 9 of the L/10 (5-5 ATS) outgaining SJSt in each incl by 268 ypg the L/5Y. LY UH had a 626-164 yd edge at home and QB Moniz threw for a school record 560 yds in a 41-7 (-29) win. UH is usually at a travel disadvantage to the mainland but the Warriors are coming off a bye here. In their L/4 trips here, the Warriors have won by 7 pts or less in each (2-2 ATS). This is HC for the Spartans and San Jose is a much improved team having covered 4 of their L/5 TY.

Saturday, October 15th - NORTH CAROLINA 30 Miami, FI 24 - The HT is 10-1 SU. NC has been outgained 6 straight times in this series and while they lost LY in Miami they pulled the outright upset the previous 3 ssns. TY UM has lost to Maryland (w/o 8 susp player) defeated a short handed OSU team and rookie HC, were surprised by a now ranked 5-0 KSU team and beat FCS B-CU. LW UM capitalized on a couple of bad calls and VT defensive miscues to escape a 21-7 3Q deficit and take the lead 35-31 w/2:51 left. Despite 519 yds of offense incl 236 on the ground they couldn't hold on losing 38-35. NC defeated a struggling UL team LW 14-7 despite being outFD'd 19-11 as we won our Top Totals Play on the Under QB Renner is avg 218 ypg (74%) with a 12-6 ratio and RB Bernard has rushed for 100+ yds in 4 str (1st NC RB S/'84). The NC defense is all'g 119 rush ypg (3.3) but this will be the key matchup as UM's OL paved the way for 236 vs VT and their RB Miller has 677 yds (7.2!!). LY vs NC Canes QB Harris threw 3 TD's as UM reeled off 30 unanswered pts in the win but LTH he threw 5 int's. NC has the situational edge off a HG vs L'Ville and Miami is in a VT/GT sandwich.

PENN ST 30 Purdue 13 - PSU has controlled the series (10-2 SU/ATS) and is +184 ypg the L/4 This is Purdue's 1st B10 road game and their only other AG TY was at Rice (25,317 attendance) where the Owls got their 1st win over a BCS opp in 10Y when they blk'd the Boilers last second FG It's PSU's HC but they could be flat off LW's revenge win over lowa. The Lions used their run gm (231-84 yd edge) and D (3 TO's and 5 sks) to pound out an old school 13-3 win. Both QB's played but PSU stuck with McGloin after he threw an int late 3Q in the EZ and the gm sealing drive featured 10 straight runs setting up a TD pass with 8:08 left. RB Redd (574, 4.8) is the B10's #5 rusher while Moye (485, 17.3) is the #5 rec. Lions are #4 FBS ttl (251) and #5 scoring (10.5) D and didn't allow the Hawks a TD LW despite missing 3 D starters. The Boilers jumped all over the woebegone Gophers 31-0 after 26 mins and coasted in a 45-17 win in which they had 22-11 FD and 372-213 yd edges. QB's TerBush and Marve combined to hit 18-27-155 with a 2-0 ratio. The D which hadn't scored a TD as a result of a TO in 4 gms produced 2 in the 1Q. Boilers allow 143 rush ypg (3.7). PSU is 4-11 as a HF (1-2 TY). Both tms have issues at the QB spot but the Lions have a huge D (#6-58) edge.

Heisman contender QB Wilson (278 ypg, 75%, 13-1) has been the "free agent pickup" of the year as he's #1 FBS pass eff which has perfectly complimented the rugged gm led by RB duo of Ball (511, 5.5) and White (329, 5.9). Unheralded Badgers D have all'd 3 meaningful TD's in 5 gms (and 3 in garbage time). IU meanwhile is playing for a 7th straight week and this is their 1st B10 road game. Thanks to an opening KR TD IU jumpéd out to 10-0 lead over undefeated IL before crashing back to earth in a 41-20 home loss in which they were outgained 518-302. With the starting QB for the 1st 4 gms (Wright-Baker) out for the 2nd gm in a row (ankle), IU turned to true Fr Roberson (11-17-148, 1 int) after st'r Kiel (6-19-71) suffered an ankle inj. IU had 7 P, 2 TO and 2 FG on their first 11 drives for 165 yds before gaining 137 on their final 2 after IL took a 21 pt lead. UW is running for 5.5 ypc TY while IU allows 4.6 ypc which spells trouble.

RUTGERS 33 Navy 20 - Two year hiatus from a series played 13 of the previous 14 yrs. The home team in 6-1 SU/ATS. It is tough to play Navy mid/late ssn as the option starts to roll especially with new QB Proctor and it's also tough in the middle of 4 conf games. Navy is always a live dog (on 9-2 ATS run) and LY beat ND (+6') 35-17 and EC (+3) 76-35 in that role. After a emotional loss to rival AF HC Niumatalolo suspended tm capt and star FB Teich (CS) and SM took adv beating the Mids 63-35 (led 35-7 1H). It was the most pts Navy has all'd S/'02. Rutgers took on Pitt's explosive offense LW and the D dominated for a 34-10 win. The offense has struggled TY especially at QB but Navy is all'g 408 ypg and their best defensive showing was vs WKU. The Knights forced 4 int's (1 for TD) and held the Panthers to 271 yds after they had a ssn high 523 vs USF. Rutgers leads the NCAA in forced TO's with 22. Schiano has the def edge (#37-110) and knows the option as in his L/8 meetings (Army and Navy) his Knights have all'd just 269 ypg. Rútgers has won their last 3 at home vs Navy by an avg of 40-24. We'll ride RU's 5-0 ATS streak with Navy's mind-set in question.

Florida St 34 DUKE 24 - Not only has Florida St never lost to Duke (16-0) but no game has been closer than 19 pts and they've covered 3 straight. Duke was 4-13 ATS as a conf HD but LY went 3-1 ATS while FSU has covered 4 straight at Duke. FSU has scored 50+ in each of their last 5 trips here incl LTH 51-24 ('07). Duke is fresh off a bye after their comeback win over FIU 31-27 (trailed by 10 4Q). After 2 early losses to Richmond and Stan, HC Cutcliffe has turned QB Renfree loose and he has responded avg 272 ypg (71%) with a 5-2 ratio while WR Vernon has 505 yds (14.9). FSU's nightmare has continued losing their 3rd straight LW, 35-30 to Wake. FSU outgained WF 425-391 but couldn't overcome 5 TO's and fell short in their comeback bid. RFr QB Trickett made the start but Manuel (held out inj'd shldr) replaced him after 3 TO's turned into 10 WF pts. FSU has the edges here on off (#35-54) with huge edges on def (#9-85) and ST's (#2-86). Cutcliffe says this is the fastest team he's had here but it doesn't compare to FSU. Duke comes into this one not used to winning and FSU not used to losing

Toledo 38 BOWLING GREEN 28 - The 76th meeting between these close rivals (22 miles) in the "Battle for the Peace Pipe" where the HT is 10-2 SU and 9-2-1 ATS. BG was never a conf HD in the 6Y under previous HC Brandon but is now 0-4 ATS in that role under current HC Clawson. UT is 2-1 as a conf AF under HC Beckman (DC/asst HC at BG '98-'04) and is on a 6-3 ATS streak in AG's. BG returns home after 3 consec AG's but its HF advantage has vanished in recent yrs as S/'05 the Falcons are just 14-18 SU and 10-21 ATS incl a current slump of 1-5 SU/ATS (only win and cover vs FCS tm). These two are headed in different directions as UT has won B2B gms and rolled up 542 ttl yds LW in a 54-16 win -20') over EM, while BG has lost its L/3 (12 TO's) and allowed 578 yds in a 45-21 loss (+10) to WM. BG's defense has been shredded in B2B wks allowing 1,221 ttl yds (incl 711 rush yds) and faces a UT team here that moves the ball well both on the ground (240 yds LW) and through the air (27-31, 302 yds, 4-0 ratio LW). The Rockets appear to have too much firepower and will look for their first win here \$/'05.

Clemson 34 MARYLAND 17 - This series has seen 4 upsets in the L6Y with 3 of them as DD dogs LTH CU blew an early 10-0 lead. In the 4Q CU missed 47 and 48 yd FG's but had a FD at the M32 driving for a tie/win but 3pl later was sk'd and fmbl'd and lost 24-21 (-12). LY was very misleading as MD had FD and yd edges (+137) but after a 7-3 lead, all'd an 87 yd KR TD and a 61 yd IR TD while also missing a 33 yd FG, SOD at C29, int at C21 and CU won 31-7 (-14'). LW CU put up 17 quick pts in the 1Q but lost QB Boyd in the 3Q (CS) in their 36-14 win over BC. If Boyd can't go Swinney has full confidence in true Cole Stoudt. CU is now avg over 450 yds in 5 of the L/6 gms (323 vs VT) and the defense has all'd 260 ypg the L/2W. MD mounted a comeback led by a bkp QB (trailed 21-3 3Q) but fell short 21-16 to GT. There is a QB controversy in MD as Edsall pulled LÝ's ACC FOY O'Brien after a 1 for 6 start for unproven soph CJ Brown. Despite playing w/o several key players on D MD held GT's #2 scoring O to a ssn low 386 yds. Clemson has all the edges here incl off (#17-73) and ST's (#33-110) and is on a 4-0 ATS streak.

Virginia Tech 34 WAKE FOREST 20 - VT won and covered 3 ACC meetings and LY had a ssn high 605 yds (VT led at HT, 49-14). After taking all of the criticism for their loss to Clem, Hokies QB Thomas rebounded with a near perfect 23-25-310 with 3 pass and 2 rush TD's incl a 19 yd TD run on 4&1 with 56 left to defeat Mia 38-35 (VT led 21-7 3Q). VT came into the gm all'g 58 rush ypg (2.0) but played w/o DT Hopkins (300 lbs) and a big UM OL opened holes for 236 yds as the 2 teams comb for over 1,000 yds. Wake held off a late rally (led 32-17 4Q) defeating FSU 35-30. Wake is off to its best start in ACC play (3-0) in school history. QB Price (270, 62%, 10-2) has improved TY but was just 3-16-92 vs VT LY while Harris (411 yds, 4.5) had 241 of the team's 346 LY. The surprising story is the rush defense with an undersized DL all'g 102 ypg (3.6). They now face one of the best RB in the ACC Wilson with 771 yd (5.8) and a 260 lb QB who showed his legs LW. VT has the defense edge (#12-66) and has played the stronger sked (#63-100). VT has only given up 30+ pts in ACC play 5 times since joining and their frustrated DC Foster will correct the miscues that has plagued the team the L2W. VT continues an awesome run as a conf AF going 14-3 ATS trumping Wake's 11-3 ATS streak as a conf HD.

Georgia Tech 30 VIRĞINIA 27 - GT has now won and covered B2B gms and DC Al Groh who was the HC here for 9 ssns returns "home". UVA's rush D is the obvious concern as they allowed 477 (6.4) to GT LY and on the season allowed 5.1 ypc. UVA is more prepared under London in his 2nd ssn all'g 116 (3.5) so far. They are off a bye to prep for the unique offense and hosted Idaho the week prior while the Jackets are playing their 4th straight ACC game. GT held off MD LW 21-16 a game they led 21-3 in 3Q. GT should have been up big in the 1H but were plagued by penalties, miscues and 7 dropped passes incl 4 huge pass plays for possible TD's. HC Johnson went conservative in the 2H and took the pitch/pass out of QB Washington's hands which made his triple option (avg 578 ypg) 1 dimensional (1 drive over 5pl). GT defense was w/o 3 of their starting LB's incl their star Attouchou but all should return here. UVA also let ID hang around needing OT for the win 2 wks ago. The Cavs had some QB issues in their last game and also were w/o their top RB and NFL caliber DE (CS). The visitor is just 3-13 SU but GT won LTH, 34-9 w/a 447-198 yd edge. Johnson warned GT players not to read their own press clippings prior to MD and the Cavs should be prepared for the option.

TEMPLE 34 Buffalo 17 - Temple has covered 3 straight, winning the L/2 by a comb 79-13. LY's shutout was TU's first vs an FBS schl S/'84 and their 42 pt win was the biggest over a MAC tm. RB's Pierce and Brown each topped 100 yds. TU is 1-4 ATS as a conf HF and in the 2 times they were a DD HF they only covered vs Akron by a 1/2 pt (-29', 30-0, led 6-0 HT) and beat BG by just 1 pt laying 20. They did lose outright to Toledo 36-13 as an 8 pt HF TY. BU was 10-3 ATS as a conf AD under former HC Gill but was 1-3 ATS LY incl giving Akron their only SU win of the ssn. The Bulls did cover at Ball St TY (+4') losing 28-25 all'g a TD with just :22 left. We won a 3★ Small Coll Play on Temple LW as they destroyed that same Ball St team 42-0 as a 9 pt AF with a 510-236 ttl yd edge. The Bulls upset MAC East fav Ohio, 38-37 as an 8' pt HD and their 510 ttl yds were their most since '09. Temple has the off edge (#78-103) and huge edges on def (#24-99) and ST's (#11-114). With all of the MAC East teams having at least 1 conf loss TY, TU is right back in the div race and after their blowout loss to Toledo, they can't afford to look past anyone.

WYOMING 37 Univ 20 - LY's 26 pt win was the largest in series history and LTH LV had a 27-20 4Q lead but lost 30-27 (-3). Interesting sked matchup as each had a bye 2 wks ago with another on deck. Both come in off blowout losses. WY took a 12-0 lead (failed 2pt after TD, missed PAT after muffed P rec'd in EZ) vs USU LW before the Aggies had even had an off touch. WY resorted to arm tackling and couldn't stop USU's run gm, being outgained 548-394 with USU scoring the final 42 pts in a 63-19 rout. QB Smith is avg 246 ypg (60%) with a 7-5 ratio and WY has 3 rushers over 200 yds. LV's D played well LW, putting the off in great spots but lost its 7th str vs Nev, suffering the 1st ever shutout in the series, 37-0. QB Herring did not comp a pass until 4:17 was left in the gm! You have to believe Hauck will re-evaluate his stance on not replacing Herring after LW's showing (1-14-8, 1 int, 5 sk). LV was outFD'd 31-7 and outgained 699-110. The final could have been worse, but LV caused 5 UN TO's (finished +3). Herring has thrown for 615 ttl yds (123 ypg, 53%, 5-5 ratio). WY is 2-4 ATS (1-1 TY) as a fav while LV is 1-10 ATS away failing to cover by 17 pog (did cover vs Wisc by 1). These are two desperate tms.

MISSOURI 38 Iowa St 17 - MO has won 4 str at home but ISU has covered 3 str in Columbia. LY ISU cch's put in never used 0 schemes prior to MO and they held the Tigers to a ssn low 306 yds but still were shutout 14-0 in their ssn finale playing for a bowl bid at home with currently exiled QB Tiller hitting just 13-31-155 and fmbl'g the ball away at the MU30. The Cyclones missed 2 FG's (38 and 27). MO (-4) looked like the underdog falling behind KSU 24-3 early 4Q before compiling 153 of their 326 yds on their final 2 drives scoring 2 TD's before the Cats ground out the gm's final 5:02 on a 66 yd drive to the MO9. QB Franklin (240 ypg, 60%, 7-2) and the B12's #1 rusher Josey (588, 10.7) have been solid. The D however has all'd 33 ppg and 457 ypg in their losses to 3 ranked tms (Arz St, OU and KSU). Usually reliable K Ressel has struggled hitting 7-13 including misses from 43 and 37 LW. ISU is on their 2nd straight away and are 5-2 ATS as a B12 dog of 12+ pts under Rhoads after LW's 49-26 loss (+16) to Baylor. The Bears had 37-17 FD and 391-181 rush yd edges and also benefitted from a 14 pt swing when leading 28-14 they got an 86 yd FR TD. QB Jantz (232, 55%, 10-8) is last in the B12 pass eff and the Cyclones' 15 TO lost is T#108 FBS. ISU is allowing 202 rush ypg (4.3). Both tms need a win here if they want to make a bowl TY and while it is noted that Mizz is 2-7 as a conf HF, they have huge edges on off (#20-87) and D (#22-78) and should get a bounce back win.

CENTRAL MICH 31 Eastern Mich 21 - This is EM's 4th AG in 5 wks and HC for CM. Talk about an even series ATS as neither has been able to cover 3 str in the L13Y (EM covered '95-'97), CM has been favored in 10 straight but EM has pulled 4 upsets the L7Y incl twice ('07 &'08) as a DD dog. In Enos' 1st ssn CM was not only 1-3 ATS as a DD HF, they LOST ALL THREE OUTRIGHT losing to Ball St 31-17 (-19'), Miami 27-20 (-13') and BG 17-14 (-12'). CM was a DD AF vs EM and rolled to a 52-14 win (-10) and LTH CM won 56-8 (-22'). EM went 4-0 ATS LY as a conf AD and after the Eagles only won 7 ttl away games in 9Y they managed 2 last season beating Ball St 41-38 (+10') and Buffalo 21-17 (+7') LY. EM did lose as a 20' pt conf AD LW to Toledo 54-16 being outgained 542-277. CM lost to NC St 38-24 as a 10' pt AD despite a 427-406 yd edge as QB Radcliff had 4 int's. This in-state "rivalry" game means more to EM than to CM, but CM can still keep their hopes of retaining the Mich MAC trophy for a 3rd str ssn with a win here. Both teams have struggled TY with the highest unit between the two being CM's #103 D.

Miami, Oh 16 KENT ST 13 - The dog is 4-1 ATS with FOUR outright upsets. LTH was the only time the fav covered as KSU (-7) was outgained by 302 yds but was +5 TO's in a 27-17 win. In that game MU QB Dysert made his 1st car start (337, 58%, 1-2) as KS had the ydg edge at half with a big lead throughout. MU was 1-2 as a conf AF LY. LY KS led 14-3 and 14-10 into the 4Q but down 6 w/3:23 left went 49/9pl only to be int'd in the EZ on 2&gl from the MU7 w/:56. The Flashes have won 2 straight MAC home openers (1-1 ATS) and they have a bye on deck while this is Miami's first road game in almost a month. Miami got its first win of the ssn LW 35-28 over Army as a 1' pt HD outscoring the Knights 21-0 in the final 27 min. KS struggling offense took on the MAC's worst defense LW but was held to just 70 ttl yds losing 40-10 to NI as a 17 pt AD. They have gone over 200 yds ttl offense just once this year and that was vs a IAA. KS starting QB Keith was pulled after throwing a pick 6 LW but bkp QB McCloud hit just 6-22-63. LW Miami QB Dysert had a season best 342 yds (65%) with a 4-0 ratio.

OREGON ST 27 Byu 23 - Thé only recent meeting was the '09 LV Bówl which BYU won 44-20 as a 4★ in our Double Bowl Issue and they were the dog covering by 26' pts! BYU HC Mendenhall is an OSU alumni (2 yr st'r at S/LB and Capt) and a cch there for 4Y. OSU is 27-2 SU in non-conf HG's but did lose to an FCS foe to start the ssn. OSU has notoriously struggled in Sept (9-14 SU) but from Oct on has gone 33-14 SU/ATS incl a win over Ariz LW, 37-27 (+1). OSU opened with a 27-6 lead before all'g UA to pull within 30-27 late 4Q. The D stuffed UA on 4&gl from the 2 then on 4&6 from the OSU24, UA's pass was inc and the Beavers won 37-27. Mannion is avg 256 ypg (66%) but with a poor 4-7 ratio and OSU is still missing its top rushing threat Agnew (#1 rusher despite only playing 1 gm, CS). BYU has finally found its run gm as they avg'd just 68 ypg rush the 1st 4, but have avg'd 212 the L/2 although OSU's D is all'g just 130 ypg. BYU built a 23-6 HT lead and had 2 key int's end SJSt scoring threats in the 29-16 win (-13) LW. The QB reins were handed to Nelson (Heaps no snaps) and he finished 14-24-219 with a 3-2 ratio and added 65 rush yds as BYU finished with 25-18 FD and 443-325 yd edges. The off and D's are close, but OSU has a history of big rebounds starting in October.

OREGON 47 Arizona St 30 This could very well be the preview to the inaugural P12 Title Game. The Ducks come into this home matchup with a few extra days rest after their Thurs night win over Cal (trailed by 1 at HT, won by 28) while the Sun Devils travel North for a 2nd straight week after LW's 4★ LPS winner over Utah, a game in which ASU scored the final 25 pts. In LY's meeting the Ducks were very fortunate to escape the desert with a win as they were outFD'd 31-20 and outgained 597-385 but a -5 TO margin did in the Sun Devils. ASU had been 1-6-1 ATS as a P10 AD but LY reversed that and went 4-1 ATS with 2 upsets over Wash and Ariz and 2 other SU losses by a comb 4 pts to OSU and USC. Oregon has now won 19 straight HG's dating back to '08 going 13-5-1 ATS incl a 5-0-1 run LY in which they outgained foes by an amazing 305 ypg. While UO will likely be w/o RB James for a bit (inj vs Cal), the Ducks have plenty of depth at the position to maintain their success.

TEXAS A&M 49 Baylor 35 - A&M is 5-1 SU and 4-1 ATS vs the Bears and has won its L/4 at home by

TEXAS A&M 49 Baylor 35 - A&M is 5-1 SU and 4-1 ATS vs the Bears and has won its L/4 at home by 31 ppg. LY Baylor (+3) at home led 30-14 in the 2Q with a 367-230 yd edge at half but lost 42-30 as K Jones missed an xp, had a 41 yd FG blk'd and missed 2 2H kicks (27 and 39 yd'rs). The Bears are 8-5 ATS as an AD under Briles. There is bad blood between these 2 administrations and fan bases as after the Bears sued in an attempt to keep the Ags in the B12, A&M had a press release detailing that the Bears had sold just 830 of their allotted 3,850 to this gm and returned the rest. After a slow start in which they fmbl'd at the ISU11, 31 and missed a 48 yd FG in the 1H the Bears used a 14 pt swing (86 yd FR TD) and muscle (391-181 rush yd edge) to beat ISU 49-26 (-16). Griffin fell to #2 FBS pass eff (304, 80%, 19-1) with big play dynamo WR Wright (48, 14.4) leading the FBS in rec ypg (690 ttl) and TD rec's (8). BU is #54 pass eff D (205, 55%, 12-5) but this is the biggest test of their secondary YTD. Despite being outgained 523-393 A&M (-9') rebounded from B2B losses to beat their nemesis TT 45-40 in Lubbock. The gm's turning point came in the 3Q as trailing 31-23, TT settled for a FG which A&M blk'd and ret'd for a TD. Ags QB Tannehill (265, 67%, 7-5) has 2 solid backs in Gray (479, 4.7) and Michael (460, 6.4). The Ags are #1 FBS in sacks (21) but last in pass D (348) and have forced just 1 TO since the opener while being outscored in the 2H of their L/3 by a combined 82-26. The offenses are even in our rankings while A&M has huge sked (#7-79), D (#21-82) and ST (#39-119) edges.

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Lsu 23 TENNESSEE 16 - The past 4 and 6 of the L7 have been decided by 8 or less. LSU has won 3 straight and has outgained the Vols by 189 ypg but Tenn is actually 2-0-1 ATS. LY LSU had a 434-217 yd edge but 4 TO's had Tenn up late and they "won" the gm but had too many men on the field which gave LSU one more chance and they got a TD to escape 16-14 (-16') at home. We won a 4★ CTOT GOM on the Under in that gm. Tenn's young tm (8 ret st'rs) went 0-3 as a HD LY (0-6 ATS run now as HD) but in all 3 losses they were competitive early and were worn out in the 2H (13-13 Oreg, 3-7 Fla, 10-13 Barna). The same thing happened LW as the Vols (+2') were tied w/UGA 6-6 at HT but wore down in the 2H in a 20-12 loss as they were outgained 366-270. On UT's TD drive late in the 4Q, QB Bray (316 ypg, 66%, 14-2 ratio) hurt the thumb on his throwing hand (out 4W) and was replaced by Simms. The UT rush off continues to struggle avg just 85 ypg (2.5) and will find it tough sledding vs an LSU run D all'g just 69 ypg (2.3). LW the Tigers took advantage of the Gators starting their 3rd string QB and rolled to a 41-11 win (-13') with 20-9 FD and 453-213 yd edges. QB Lee continued his efficient play and is now avg 158 ypg (60%) but most importantly an 8-1 ratio. Jefferson, back from susp the L/2W, has been used on occasion to take advantage of his running ability. LSU has the edges on off (#22-37),

D (#2-25) and ST's (#16-87) but they have a big gm vs Bama looming in the distance and Aub on deck. WASHINGTON 38 Colorado 17 - Last met in '00. LW the Buffs were victimized by inj/susp incl #1 WR Richardson (488, 16.3, 5 TD) vs Stanford as they were outgained 553-264 in the 41 pt loss. Richardson (knee) is exp to miss at least 4 gms. This is as big of a scheduling edge as you'll find with Wash off a bye and Colorado playing the second of B2B AG's and their 3rd in 4 wks. The Huskies also boast a HC in his 3rd year with the program playing many of his own recruits while CU has a 1st year and 1st time HC. The star for the Huskies TY is QB Price who avg 242 ypg (68%) with a 17-4 ratio (T-#2 in NCAA in TD passes). UW has been poor as a conf HF going 3-17-1 ATS but with the Buffs not winning on the road since 2007 (20 straight losses, 7-20 as an AD), we'll lean with the hometown Huskies in this one.

MICHIGAN ST 31 Michigan 24 - MSU has had 3 straight wins and covers since Mike Hart's infamous "little brother" comment (+182 ypg). LY UM led 10-7 mid-2Q LY before allowing 24 unanswered. QB Robinson was handcuffed for most of the gm accounting for 3 TO's including 2 int inside the MSU5 (1 in EZ). UM is 4-10 ATS but 2-0 TY vs the B10 including their 42-24 win at NW (-7') in their 1st road trip of the yr. UM trailed 24-14 at the half but scored 4 TD on 5 2H poss (1 missed FG) while NW had TO's on 2 straight poss as the Wolves pulled away. QB D-Rob (206, 56%, 10-9, B10's #1 rusher 674, 7.2) shook off 3 1H int which set the Cats up for 10 pts. Improved UM D allows 13 ppg (#9 FBS). MSU is off a bye after their misleading 10-7 manhandling of OSU, their 1st win over the Bucks S/99. MSU had 9 sks and a 321-178 yd edge and held OSU to 77 yds until their final 2 drives allowing a TD pass with :10 left to lose the shutout. Spartans top weapon is WR Cunningham (38, 15.3) while a banged up OL should be closer to 100% which could help kick start a stagnant run gm (50 ypg, 1-9 vs 2 BCS foes). Spartans are #1 FBS in ttl D (173 ypg), #3 scoring (10.2) with 64 rush ypg (2.2) and keep in mind they only all'd 275 yds in their loss at ND. MSU is 3-6 ATS as a B10 HF but look to win their 4th straight over their rival for the 1st time S/62.

ILLINOIS 23 Ohio St 20 - The Bucks bring out the best in the Illini. In the L5Y OSU had a rec of 56-9 while IL had a record of 26-36 BUT the ttl ydg diff was JUST 13 yds. LY OSU only led 14-10 into the 4Q and after QB Pryor was inj'd ran on 24 of 28 plays. Scheelhaase made his 1st B10 start going 12-22 (55%) for 109 yds. OSU is 7-1 SU and 8-0 ATS vs the B10 after a SU loss incl LW as they blew a 27-6 3Q lead in the biggest comeback in Neb history (+10'). OSU had more yds in their 1st 3 poss (195) vs NU than they had in the entire gm vs MSU (178) but the tide turned when Huskers LB David stole the ball on a scramble by OSU QB Miller which set up a 23/2p1 TD drive to cut it to 27-13. Despite the fmbl Miller was on his way to the best gm of his career (5-8-95, 1 TD, 91 rush yd) before being KO'd (ankle) on the next series. In a steady rain bkp Bauserman came in to hit 1-10-13 with 1 int while the lead slipped away and OSU has their first losing streak S/'04. If Miller can't go (CS) keep in mind Bauserman is a combined 3-24-26 with 1 int in 2 road gms TY. IL shrugged off a 10-0 deficit to Indy in their first road trip of the yr to win 41-20 with a 518-302 yd edge. IL has had the B10's best pass-catch combo of Scheelhaase (206 ypg, 67%, 10-3, 347 rush to FBS's rec yd leader Jenkins (815, 17.7). IL is #6 FBS in sks (22). My, how things have changed as IL was last favid in this series in '01 and OSU has been fav'd by an ayo of 19 pro

IL was last fav'd in this series in '01 and OSU has been fav'd by an avg of 19 ppg. Florida 27 AUBURN 24 - Muschamp earned his Masters at Aub in '96 and later was the DC ('06-'07) prior to Texas. These 2 haven't met since '07 but Auburn has covered 4 straight pulling the upset 3 times. Florida is off B2B losses to Bama and LSU for a 2nd str yr and LY lost at home to Miss St in that spot. The Gators are beat-up at QB and RB as true frosh QB Brissett (8-14-94 with an 0-2 ratio) had to play for inj'd Brantley and Driskel LW and RB Demps has seen little action since the 1H of the Bama game (CS for all 3). UF has lost consec gms by DD's for the 1st time S/92 and has lost consec gms by 28+ for first time S/71. Aub is also off a DD loss as after taking a 14-7 1Q lead over Ark they all'd 31 unanswered pts in the 38-14 (+9') loss as we cashed a 3* LPS on the Hogs. QB Trotter had his worst gm of the season completing just 6-19 passes and true frosh Frazier (run threat) was inserted to provide a spark as they were playing w/out their top 2 rec's. RB Dyer leads the way with 679 (5.5) and 8 TD's and will be facing a UF D which after all'g just 31 rush ypg (1.2) the first 4 gms has all'd 232 rush (5.0) the L/2. These two have one common opp in FAU. Aub struggled to a 30-14 win with only a 315-307 yd edge while UF dominated with a 41-3 win (468-137 yd edge). Auburn is at home (11-0 SU) but they aren't on the same level as Bama/LSU and UF has the edge on off (#24-44) and def (#15-62) and they could get Driskel/Demps back here.

CINCINNATI 31 Louisville 10 - Paul Brown Stadium. The visitor in this Keq of Nails series is 8-2 ATS but LTH UL could not compete with a #5 ranked UC squad (UC 41-10, -17). UC has a huge scheduling edge here as they are at home off a bye while UL is on the road for a 2nd consec wk (3'★ Top CTOT winner on the Under LW in the 14-7 loss to UNC). UL had a 277-259 yd edge vs UNC but missed 2 crucial FG's early and has a meeting with Rutgers on a short wk up next (Fri). UL has performed admirably on the road under HC Strong (6-1 ATS) over his 1st year and a half with the program but the Cardinals did lose at home to Cincy 35-27 a year ago despite UL going to a bowl and Cincy going just 4-8. It's uncertain at this time whether QB Bridgewater (173 yds, 63%, 1-1 ratio LW) or Stein (shldr inj) will get the start here while Sr QB Collaros is avg 243 ttl ypg (13 ttl TD) has the Bearcats (nation's 2nd easiest sked so far TY) peaking as they start up BE play. UC is 3-0 ATS at home TY outscoring foes by a 58-13 avg margin.

4★ NY GIANTS over Buffalo - The Bills get to face another angry NFC East team wondering what happened after a home loss. BUF is 12-6 ATS on the road with NYG being 6-12 ATS at home. While in a great situation LW at home vs SEA coming cross country the Giants struggled to get their power run game in gear with RB Jacobs (knee) and Ctr Baas (neck) out. NY was outrushed 145 (5.0) to 69 (2.8) and failed to convert their first 8 3rd Dns. The Giant's D played more than well enough to win forcing 3 TO's, with 22 plays behind the LOS as they KO'd QB Jackson. They had a 1st and goal on the SEA 10 2 with 1:25 left but the WR slipped on his route the ball tipped off 2 players and was returned 94 yds for a TD. BUF redirected the Eagles aggressive play style as they converted 4 TO's into 17 pts. While the Bills only have the #28 defense (#13 scoring) they are +11 TO's which is giving their #11 offense (#3 scoring) extra drives. Look for Coughlin to call a physical game here and let his #1 pass rush dictate terms to Fitzpatrick and company here. FORECAST: NY GIANTS 34 Buffalo 17

3★ Philadelphia over WASHINGTON - The visitor is 8-1 ATS in this series. LY WAS upset PHI 17-12 as 3★ Philadelphia over WASHINGTON - The visitor is 8-1 ATS in this series. LY WAS upset PHI 17-12 as a 5' pt AD in the 1st meeting with Vick (ribs) being KO'd in the 1Q. PHI blew out WAS 59-28 as a 3 pt AF in one of the best MNF efforts by a QB. Vick had 333 yds (71%) with a 4-0 ratio adding 2 rushing TD's as PHI finished w/a 592-375 yd edge scoring TD's on their 1st 5 drives. Shanahan is 11-4 ATS after a bye. LY the Redskins gave up 389 ypg (31th), 23.6 ppg and 128 ypg rushing (4.6) with tons of distractions. TY with a rebuilt DL they are allowing 297 ypg (1st), 15.8 ppg with 85 ypg rush (4.3). After 4 games, WAS has just over half (15 2nd) their sacks vs all of 2010 (29 25th 1 every 19.9 att's) with 1 every 9.4 att's. After hammering STL transitioning to a new system in the opener, PHI has dropped 4 games SU/ATS. They have turned the hall over a min of 3 times in that snan (14 total 5 LW) which foes have converted They have turned the ball over a min of 3 times in that span (14 total 5 LW) which foes have converted into 52 pts. The Eagles back is in do or die mode here and they did tally 489 yds vs BUF. Look for ball control and fundamentals to be a huge emphasis in practice as the Eagles get on track.

2★ New Orleans over TAMPA BAY - The visitor has covered 5 straight which has gone Under 5 straight times avg 40 ppg. NO won the 1st meeting 31-6 as a 4 pt AF which they dominated more than the final score indicates. The Saints had 24-12 FD and 426-172 yd edges before they took the field for their 1st punt with 12 min left in the game. NO converted 9 of 12 3rd Dns as they outrushed the Bucs 212-42 (6.6-2.3). At quick glance you may favor the Buc's situation with NO on their third road game but TB is off their first MNF home game S/01 and a trip to SF.TB is clearly learning to win as evidenced by victories at MIN, and vs ATL and IND but against a superior foe they are 1-10 ATS as a HD and 0-5 ATS as a conf HD. TB was handed a 45 pt thrashing by SF where they were outFD 22-10 and outgained 304-195 after they hit their FG. Making things worse was the fact that RB Blount was KO'd in the 3Q w/a knee injury. We'll take the veteran Saints with a manageable line vs a young Bucs team with a long trip to Londoon on deck.

GREEN BAY 27 St Louis 17 - The Rams come out of the bye (4-0 ATS) in very poor shape due to injuries. Both of STL's starting CB's are on IR and they lost their projected nickel CB prior to camp. LY they had the #19 pass defense (best in the NFC West) w/a 21-14 TD/int ratio and a 6.8 ypa and TY's #11pass defense with only 1 secondary starter from 2010 has a tough matchup here. At this point STL has struggled to run OC McDaniels Patriots offense (outscored 79-16 1H TY) due to OL problems (1 sack every 8.4 pass att's), a bad WR unit depleted by injuries (lost WR Amendola 90 rec 8.2 w/ Bradford) and RB Jackson (hamstring) getting hurt. Bradford's 5.6 ypa in a vertical offense is worse than LY's 6.0 ypa as a rookie in a West Coast system. STL is getting GB at a great time though after 3 road games in 4 Wks with ATL on SNF and MIN on SNF on deck. Look for McDaniels to channel the offense thru a healthy Steven Jackson who has avoid 132 total ypg (5.0) after a bye in his career to take the pressure off the defense against a Packer team due for a Juli.

PITTSBURGH 30 Jacksonville 13 - PIT beat JAX 26-21 as a 4 pt AF in the last matchup in 2008. In 2010 the Jags avg'd 341 ypg and 21.4 ppg offensively with a total of 47 pass plays of 20+ yds. TY they are down to 271 ypg and 11.8 ppg with 9 pass plays of 20+ yds. Over the L4 games the Jags have totalled 284 yds passing (43%) with a 1-3 ratio in the 2H. PIT was w/o 4 starters LW vs TEN and while active RB Mendenhall (hamstring) DNP. LY PIT was 2nd in the NFL with +17 TO's and were tied for 2nd w/ CHI for 35 takeaways. TY they are last with -10 TO's and have only earned 4 takeaways. Part of this is due to the fact they've started 5 different OL's (9 diff players started) so far with LT Starks getting 3 practices after being a street FA. While JAX does have a better defense vs LY (#28 vs #8) they still have a bad pass rush (8 sks #22) with 1 sack every 21 att's which is good for Roethlisberger who's been taken down 15 times (1 every 16.8 att's). We'll call for PIT with better skill players at home vs a JAX team that is 10-24 ATS vs a NDÍV foe with a rookie QB vs LeBeau's system.

DETROIT 27 San Francisco 24 - This is the 3rd meeting in 4 years w/ SF winning both by a 26-10 avg score. This is SF's 3rd road game in 4 Wks but they have a bye on deck while DET is off their 1st MNF game in 10 years with ATL on deck. While DET's 4 game win streak at the end of 2010 raised expectations the 49ers are one of the big surprise teams for 2011. Harbaugh has streamlined the offense to a college level enabling Smith to play smart, clean ball. While he's not putting up huge yardage numbers (193 ypg) Smith has got a crisp ypa (7.7) with 66% and a 7-1 ratio. Simply put he's not putting the defense into bad situations and Gore (126 ypg 7.2 the L2W) is starting to get into the flow. SF's special teams are also playing at a high level with a 45.8 net punt avg, 11.8 PR and 32.5 KR avg thanks to Ginn. SF is an undervalued team right now as the NFC West gets little respect and the Lions are due for a drop off after coming back from B2B 20 pt deficits and a huge MNF game.

ATLANTA 30 Carolina 27 - ATL has won and covered 4 of the L5 meetings with a 16-8-2 ATS mark since 1998. ATL won both meetings LY 31-10 as 7 and 14 pt favorites with 340-290 yd edges. In Ryan's 3 home starts he's avg'd 248 ypg (70%) w/a 5-1 ratio vs the Panthers. ATL was one of the most aggressive and Continued from Page 4 - College

OHIO 27 Ball St 23 - These teams have only met twice in the L10Y with Ohio winning both SU and the home team covering both ATS. In '09 (L/meeting) Ohio trailed 17-12 but went 58/7pl for a TD (2pt) w/3:11 left. The Bobcats are 8-4 ATS as a conf HF which includes beating KS 17-10 (-16) TY. This is the first MAC road game under Lembo but Ball St did go 6-2 ATS as a conf AD the L2Y. Ball St did pull 2 upsets (+19' vs CM and +3 Buf) while Ohio did lose one outright as fav (-9' Tol). Ohio has the . edges on off (#58-100), def (#88-112) and ST (#15-38). Ohio lost 38-37 to Buffalo as an 8' pt AF, as they were hit by injuries on defense and surrendered a season worst 510 yds. Ball St ran into an angry Temple team and was destroyed 42-0 as a 9 pt HD being outgained 510-236 yds the 3rd time this year that they allowed 500+yds. **TULANE 30 Utep 27** - Tulane has covered 4 str pulling the upset 3 times incl a 10 pt win as a 10 pt

dog LY with a 461-286 yd edge. TU is 2-8 ATS with 5 outright losses in the rare role of HF and just 3-8 ATS as an HD with HC Toledo saying they have very little home field edge. UTEP is 3-7 ATS away vs CUSA foes but is 3-0 ATS on the road TY. LTH it was a miracle win for Tulane as they got a Hail Mary TD with :01 left to force OT and won it there. UTEP is off a bye and TU is off 3 str AG's and Syracuse (trailed 24-7 but tied gm at 34-34 only to allow the GW FG as time exp, +115 yds). TU does have the exp'd QB but an inexp at WR (inj's) has them playing walk-ons (Griffin did have 355 yds LW spending extra time with his young rec corps). UTEP has allowed a def TD in 3 gms TY but seems to have found a run gm (184 ypg, 4.8 L/3) which has helped with the QB play. Outside of a winless UAB tm and IAA, Tulane is being outgained 419-306 and outscored 40-18 while UTEP has covered 4 str (tms combined 15-5 record) and has been off for 16 days. "Everyone will be close to 100%" says HC Price. This gm should come down to the wire and after LW's close loss, Tulane gets a close win.

disciplined teams in the NFL LY finishing with an NFL best 58 penalties (116 for foes) and were 3rd with +14 TO's with 31 takeaways. Prior to GB, they had already tallied 27 penalties (27 for foes) and were even with 0 TO's (8 takeaways). After having our #8 special teams LY they dropped to 22nd as of LW. Their pass rush has been their biggest disappointment with just 5 sacks (301h) with 1 every 27.8 pass atts. CAR is 1-4 SU due to special teams (29.0 net avg on punts, 5.7 PR avg, 27.2 KR avg given up) and the #27 run defense which has given up 135 ypg (4.9). They are 4-0-1 ATS avg 428 ypg on offense with 23.2 ppg vs 258 ypg and 12.3 ppg LY. Newton has either passed or ran for 12 of the teams 13 TD's so far. CAR is proving to be a very scrappy dog in 2011 and we'll take the points here.

CINCINNATI 23 Indianapolis 13 - TO's were the key in LY's meeting as the Colts defeated the Bengals

23-17 but failed to cover as 7 pt HF. IND forced 5 TO's which they turned into 13 pts as Manning who has never lost to CIN was held to no TD's. IND wasted a 17-0 lead in the 2Q at home vs KC LW. The Colts were outgained 395-62 from that point as already worn out from MNF they were broken by 38 rush att's (5.1) overall. 271 of Painters 588 yds the L2W have been on 7 passes to Garcon while Wayne hasn't had 80 yds since the opener. IND has had 4 different OL's in 5 games giving up 10 sacks (16th) or 1 every 16.6 att's and are likely to be missing their best pass protector RB Addai (hamstring). CIN has logged 13 sacks (7th) (1 every 12.1 att's) allowing 191 ypg (57%) w/a 5-1 ratio. CIN played rope-a-dope with the Jags LW (only 1 play over 20 yds) staying efficient (8 of 19 on 3rd Dns) pouncing when the Jags made a mistake late (22 yd shanked punt). CIN may not have much of a home edge here due to a lack of fan interest but they are healthier, deeper and more fundamentally sound right now. **Houston 24 BALTIMORE 21** - The Ravens beat the Texans LY 34-28 in OT as a 3 pt AF on MNF. BAL

had a 28-7 lead after taking the opening KO 103 yds for a TD. HOU then outgained BAL 301-71 in the 2H sending the game to OT w/a 2 pt conv with :29 left to wrap up a 95/12 drive. After punting on the 1st drive of OT, BAL int'd Schaub for a 12 yd TD to get the cover. The Ravens find themselves in an ideal position off a bye (8-1 ATS) at home with HOU off 2 physical games vs PIT and OAK. In their 3 wins the Ravens have outgained foes 402-267 (+9 TO's) with a 35-10 avg score. They have dominated QB's in those games allowing 163 ypg (45%) with a 2-5 ratio. HOU was in a flat spot LW without WR Johnson vs an emotional OAK team. HOU had a 473-278 yd edge and were in position to win the game at the OAK 5 with 8 sec left. Schaub had his 2nd int to end the game with his 1st being turned into 3 pts as was a missed FG earlier. HOU has already stood toe-to-toe on the road vs NO and we will back the improved D getting points off of a loss

OĂKLAŇD 30 Cleveland 23 - The Browns have covered 5 straight in the series winning the last meeting 23-9 as a 3.5 pt HF in 2009. CLE needed the bye week (covered 3 of L4) to do some self scouting as they have been outscored by a combined 53-9 in the 1st and 3 Qtrs. Still adjusting to a new system, ČLE has essentially had to field 2 rookie OG's and have used 3 different starters at RT. McCoy's 5.7 ypa is 29th in the NFL and the team struggles to work outside the numbers with arguably the slowest receiving unit in the NFL. OAK is off a huge emotional game dedicated to Al Davis and have a great chance to have their 3rd home sellout of the year. OAK's offense has come a long way under HC Jackson as in 2009 they avg'd 266 ypg with 12.3 ppg. Now with Campbell running the same offense for the 2nd year in a row for just the 2nd time in his career, the Raiders are avg 382 ypg and 27.2 ppg. The #29 defense is giving up yards (422) and points (26.6) in chunks but CLE is only avg 320 ypg and 18.5 ppg. We'll call for OAK by a TD here and see how their emotions fare during the week

NEW ENGLAND 35 Dallas 24 - The bye came at an excellent time for the Cowboys (5-1 SU/ATS/O/U after a bye) due to injuries. They are slated to get #1 WR Austin, #2 CB Scandrick and starting DE Hatcher back as well having Romo (ribs) and Jones (shoulder) in better shape. Statistically, DAL looks to be in good shape with the #8 and #6 units but TO's (-4) have done them in along with the OL being rebuilt DAL owns the #31 run game (87 ypg 3.0) but it has failed in key situations. The Pats have rolled off 13 straight games of scoring 30 or more (99-00 Rams 14) with a quality win vs the Jets. NE's best defense is their offense as they have allowed 21 or more in 4 of 5 games TY. They are converting 3rd Dns at a supernatural 52% and thru 5 games Welker (740 16.4) has more receiving yards than any player in NFL history. Their effort vs the Jets was the 1st game TY where they allowed less than 445 yds though. We'll call for the home team by 11 here as they have tons of momentum. Romo is on a 3-7 SU/2-7-1 ATS run as a starter and teams off byes generally need a 1.5 Qtrs to get going.

Minnesota at CHICAGO - The visitor is 5-1 ATS but the Bears have covered 3 straight and are off a MNF road game at DET. CHI turned 4 Vikings TO's and a missed FG into 10 pts in the 1st meeting for a 27-13 win as a 1 pt HD (360-240 yd edge). In the 2nd meeting they took advantage of a listless MIN team with a 40-14 win as a 7.5 pt favorite at Univ of Minnesota's TCF Stadium. Was LW's Viking performance the "buy sign"? **Sunday Night Marquees are 2-1 this season (as of 10/8/11) and are ONLY \$9 with your** NC Sports Debit Card available after 11am Gameday!

Miami at NY JETS - Chad Henne (dislocated shoulder) became the 1st QB to be replaced due to inj TY over the bye. MIA now turns to Matt Moore who was 7-6 SU/9-4 ATS as a starter for CAR. Sparano has nothing left to lose at this point so he'll be pulling out all the tricks. The Jets are thrust into the national spotlight after 3 str road losses and are now looking up at BUF and NE in the standings.

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Oklahoma 59 KANSAS 17 - OU has won 6 straight by 22 ppg (4-1 ATS) incl the last gm in '09 which was also here when OU delivered 4★ Key Selection and LPS winners 35-13 (-7'). OU was a 7' pt fav despite being ranked lower (#25 vs #24). OU has stayed focused after the RRR winning 12 straight (8-4 ATS) but has just gone 3-6 ATS as an AF (but did win at Baylor LY 53-24). The Sooners scored a school record 3 D TD's for their biggest win (55-17) over rival Texas S/'03. UT's 5 TO's were turned into 31 Sooners pts and the Horns scored their only off TD with 3:06 left. QB Jones is avg 363 ygg (69%, 13-5) despite not having his full compliment of WR's TY until the RRR. Sooners are #1 pass eff D (220, 51%, 5-9). Kansas is now 1-6 as a conf HD and 11-28 as a B12 DD dog including LW's 70-28 drubbing at OSU in which the Cowboys scored TD's on their 1st 8 poss to jump out to a 56-7 HT lead while the Hawks helped matters with 4 1H TO's. QB Webb is #8 FBS pass eff (226 ypg, 68%, 11-5) but lacks playmakers in the WR corps. The Hawks D is last in the FBS in scoring (49.4), ttl (556) and pass eff (333, 73%, 16-1!). OU is 5-2 as an AF of 20+ and continues to pad their BCS resume.

NEVADA 44 New Mexico 13 - The only recent meeting between these 2 was the '07 NM Bowl which the Lobos won 23-0 (-2') as a 2★ winner for our Double Bowl Issue. NM is fresh off a bye, but comes to Reno with all sorts of problems. Aside from recently losing its HC, NM has lost 17 in a row on the road (6-11 ATS with 5 of their ATS wins as +23' or more) and has only won 2 gms in L3Y. UN on the other hand seems to have found its legs. After opening the ssn with 4 AG's, the Pack romped in-state rival UNLV LW 37-0 (-20') in the first shutout in series history as QB Lantrip passed for 366 yds and UN outgained UNLV 699-110 for the game as the Pack beat the Rebels for the 7th consec time. UN is 22-7 as a HF and has solid edges on off (#55-111) and def (#54-120). TT is a common foe between these two. While the Red Raiders won both gms, TT squeaked past UN 35-34 (-15') with a late TD at home while they rolled over NM 59-13 (-21) on the road. NM is desperate to get things turned around, but it won't happen here.

Over the last 12 years the Underdog Play of the Week has added 39 OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS to the incredible record including FOUR this year! MISSISSIPPI ST (+5') over South Carolina

They've not met S/'07 but it's been decade of domination by SC (5-0 SU/ATS) and they have wor the L/3 by 24,15 and 17 pts avg +130 ypg. Both tms may be playing relatively "green" QB's in this one as LW SC QB Shaw replaced the struggling Garcia as the starter and he threw for 311 yds (67% with a 4-0 ratio (Garcia only 4-9 ratio thru 1st 5 gms comb) as the Gamecocks (-21) racked up a dominating 639-96 yd edge in their 54-3 win over KY. It was their biggest MOV in an SEC gm since joining the league in '92 and the most yds under Spurrier in his tenure here. WR Jeffery finally had a big gm with 6 rec (15.8) and 2 TD's while the dependable RB Lattimore leads with 779 yds (5.3 and 9 TD. MSU (-17) found themselves down 3-0 at HT LW at UAB and QB Russell replaced the ineffective Relf (beating he took early ssn taking its toll) in the 2H while leading the Bulldogs to 3 2H TD's in their 21-3 win. Russell threw for 166 yds (85%) with a 3-0 ratio while RB Ballard topped the 100 yd mark and he leads with 531 (6.2). LY Miss St beat GA at home and outFD'd Ark 32-21 in an OT loss, have a bye on deck (7-2 ATS) and this will be Shaw's first true away start as the Bulldogs FORECAST: MISS ST 23 South Carolina 20 grab a key conf win.

SMU 23 Ucf 20 - UCF has won all 3 meetings going 2-0-1 ATS incl LY's CUSA Championship when they delivered 3★ Key Selection winner, 17-7 (-8'). Prior to the ssn UCF covered 12 str on the road (:37 away from 13 str) but are 0-2 SU/ATS TY (largely due to TO's). SMU has struggled in the HF role under HC Jones going 2-8-1 ATS. Mustangs do have dual schedule edge off a bye while UCF also has a short week on deck and SMU played a solid game (317-311 yd edge) at a stronger UCF LY. Playing in a steady rain LW, UCF took care of Marshall (led 16-0 at HT) in an ugly win and are outgaining foes TY 414-178 (27-10 avg score) despite being just 3-2. SMU QB McDermott is 4-0 SU and 3-1 ATS as the starter (Padron all but forgotten, DNP L/2). Both teams use different offensive philosophy (UCF #29 rush NCAA and SMU #12 pass) but SMU with RB Line has added an extra wrinkle for Jones. This year we side with the home team.

Boise St 37 COLORADO ST 13 - 1st meeting. Tms not used to elevation are 0-7 ATS the 2nd of B2B away the L/5Y but BSU does have 1 extra day's rest. Boise is off a Fri Night Marquee win over Fresno, 57-7, leaving a lasting impression on pollsters in their final gm on ESPN. BSU built a 30-0 lead before FSU even crossed midfield (FSU's only TD on 79 yd PR). Moore, coming off a subpar gm 2W ago, hit 23-31-254 with 3 TD and is now avg 278 ypg (74%) with a 17-4 ratio. CSU has covered its L/3 vs ranked tms as well as is L/3 vs Top 10 foes at home incl LY when they had #5 TCU, also in on 2nd of B2B away (outgained by 313 yds but only trailed 6-0 HT). CSU is off a bye after losing to SJSt on HC 2W ago. QB Thomas is avg 218 ypg (67%) with a 6-5 ratio (BSU #5 pass eff D). RB's Carter (260, 4.9, 2 TD) and Nwoke (231, 3.7, 4) handle the bulk of the action while WR Greenwood (257, 17.1, 2) and TE Gillmore (222, 10.6, 3) pace the rec gm. BSU is 14-4 (2-0 TY) as an AF but CSU is 8-2 as a HD. BSU has taken on our 6th toughest sked (CSU #118) and takes on AF's option next wk (may sneak in some prep work).

CSU 6-14 SU in MW HG's (avg loss by 16 ppg) and could stay within an overinflated number.

Stanford 41 WASH ST 24 - The margin on Stanford's L/3 wins has decreased from 58 to 26 to 10 LY which Wash St easily covered (+36) although it was somewhat misleading as the Cougs trailed 31-7 into the 4Q amassing 9 FD's (47%) and 245 yds (63%) in the final quarter. For the 2nd time in 3 gms WSU blew a 2H lead, this time coming into the 4Q (8 pt lead vs UCLA, WSU had 3 FG's of 26 yds or less) and now moves to 3-2 where they very well could be undefeated (28-15 FD and 389-371 vd edges vs Bruins). QB Luck and the SU offense put up 553 yds en route to a 41 pt win over Colorado. SU's offense outgained 6 of 7 opponents away from home (not Oregon) LY by 185 ypg going 5-2 ATS and have been just as impressive on the road TY outgaining Duke and Arizona by 202 ypg. They have however kept opponents in games longer than they would like (led CU just 13-7 in 2Q) while WSU was 3-1 ATS LY vs ranked conf members. The Cardinal have covered 8 straight dating back to LY but it must be noted that the only team they've faced with a winning record TY has been Duke (3-2).

TEXAS 35 Oklahoma St 34 - OSU dominated LY leading 33-3 into the 4Q before they allowed 2 gbg TD's. Prior to LY's loss the Horns had won TWELVE in a row in the series by 17.5 ppg incl a 41-14 win in Stillwater over a #13 OSU team. The visitor is now 3-0-1 ATS but OSU has actually had the yardage edge in 3 of 4. Have to believe this game is special to the Horns as their conf home opener after going 0-4 at home in B12 play LY (0-2 as HD)! LY UT allowed a ssn high 532 yds incl 409 passing. OSU has gone 9-1 ATS on the road the L2Y and does have a schedule edge off a bye and home game vs Kansas while Texas is off an embarrassing 55-17 RRR loss to rival to OU in which the Sooners ret'd 3 of the Horns 5 TO's for TD's. The FD's were actually even (22) but OU had a 453-259 yd edge and UT scored its only offensive TD with 3:06 left. Frosh QB's McCoy and Ash supplied 4 of the TO's and the Horns all'd 8 sks (just 4 in 1st 4 gms). UT is #4 pass eff D (216, 54%, 5-6). OSU feasted on 4 Kansas 1H TO's to score TO's on their 1st 8 poss of the gm in a 70-28 win. OB Weeden is the FBS's #2 passer (376, 76%, 15-6) and it helps to have targets like Blackmon (46, 11.6). OSU allows 166 rush ypg (4.4). It's pay back time vs a familiar foe as UT bounces back after LW's disaster.

Usf 34 CONNECTICUT 20 - The dog has covered B2B gms while the L/3 have been decided by 3 ppg. This is USF HC Holtz's first trip back to Storrs where he was the HC from '94-'98. LY USF had a 333-232 yd edge as QB Eveld made his 1st ever start for an inj'd Daniels. He had a pass tipped and ret'd 55 yds for a TD and later Conn hit a 52 yd FG w/:17 letf for the 3 pt win. USF is off a bye and will be steaming after getting punched in the mouth by Pitt for their only loss of the ssn (all'd 523 ttl yds and 32 FD's) while Conn returns home after their blowout loss in Morgantown as they only trailed



by 1 at HT but were unable to score an off TD in the 43-16 defeat. A year ago the Huskies were an amazing 6-0 ATS (3-0 vs BE) at home but only outgained opp's by 15 ypg (-64 ypg BE) as they were +15 TO's (+10 BE). Times have changed in '11 for Conn as they are 0-2 ATS at home so far TY vs FBS

opponents giving the Bulls the edge here. **East Carolina 41 MEMPHIS 17** - E Carolina has not only won 5 straight (all as fav) they've covered NINE straight. Both teams have been doing a lot of travelling as Memphis is surrounded by 4 road games and EC is in the midst of a 3 gm road trip. EC is 2-8 as an AF and LY was -8' at Rice and lost 62-38. LY Memphis not only had a ssn high 413 yds at EC it was 128 yds above their ssn avg and 83 yds above their #2. UM is 2-7 ATS at home vs CUSA. EC was hammered LW in Houston (outgained 572-284, allowed 34 FD). QB Davis after an int to open the 3Q (3 in gm and 10 TY) was pulled in favor of bkp Johnson. EC leads the NCAA with 21 TO's lost. UM continued its struggles with a loss LW at Rice and is 2-16 SU and 7-11 ATS under HC Porter. UM is getting healthier and should have their starting RB and WR close to 100% and one bright side to the ssn has been forcing TO's (+3, 2nd in CUSA). EČ takes a huge step down in competition after facing 3 BCS schools and undefeated UH and gets a much needed win over a Memphis squad that has dropped 15 str CUSA gms (5-10 ATS).

MARSHALL 24 Rice 21 - The home team has won and covered both meetings. Rice is 0-9 SU (1-8 ATS) in CUSA road games. They are now traveling for a 3rd time in 4 wks and the Owls overall have dropped 7 str road gms SU/ATS by 23 ppg. Marshall went 2-2 ATS at home vs CUSA in Holliday's 1st ssn and it was disconcerting that they got outgained as a fav vs both UTEP (only 3 yds) and Tulane (by 139 yds). MU did upset (+7') SM at home TV but still was outgained. Rice is coming off Memphis but is just 1-4 ATS off a SU win. LW MU ran into UCF off a bye and two tough road losses and was handcuffed on offense (they did play in a steady rainfall). MU is 5-0 ATS off a SU loss. Rice has been outscored 46-21 (outgained 611-290) on the road TY allowing B2B 650+ (albeit against 2 BCS foes and SM). The Herd does have a solid 43-17 SU mark at home and is on a 4-1 ATS run (4-1 ATS overall TY and 2-0 at home). MU does bring in an underrated def (#69) and the offense has struggled the L4W (just 10 ppg and 266 ypg) but should take advantage of Rice's #105 D.

IOWA 30 Northwestern 27 - This may be the ONLY series in the country that has produced SIX straight upsets. What is more amazing is that in NW's 5 wins they been 3, 8, 10, 15 and 20 pt dogs. LY NW RB Smith said that his HC "hates lowa. I know that for a fact." NW did struggle going 0-5 ATS away from home in B10 play LY and in their 3 gms as dogs were outgained by 225 ypg and failed to cover by 15 ppg. LY UI led 17-7 into the 4Q before allowing TD drives of 85/13pl and 91/11pl (the last score w/just 1:22 left) as Cats QB Persa tore his Achilles on the GW TD pass (OFY). Both tms come in off losses as 3 lowa TO's spoiled their upset bid 13-3 to Penn St. The Hawks drove to the PSU4 and 35 on their first 2 drives but had just 3 pts to show for it and never was able to get their offense on track. Vandenberg (253, 60%, 10-3) came is as the B10's #1 passer but hit just 17-34 for 169 yd with 2 int as he was sk'd 5x. Rebuilding Hawks D is #93 pass eff D (235, 65%, 8-5). NW has blown DD leads in B2B losses to IL and Mich. LW the Cats took advantage of 3 Denard Robinson 1H int's to lead 24-14 at the break before UM took over scoring TD's on 4 of their final 5 poss. At one point QB Persa's helmet was ripped off by a Mich S on 4&6 at the UM38 and not only was the play whistled dead but NW HC Fitzgerald got a dead ball PF which set UM up at the NW37. Persa (227, 72%, 4-1) hasn't been the dynamic run threat yet (-8 rush yds). Cats are #111 pass eff D (264, 58%, 6-6) but you have to say with the dog in this series.

NEW MEXICO ST 27 Idaho 23 - UI leads the series 13-4 SU (8-6 ATS) and has won 6 of the L/7 while covering 7 of the L/9. LY the Vandals won 37-14 but failed to cover by 1 pt in the highest ever spread they've been favored by (-24). NMSt trailed 31-0 before a TD with :07 left in the 1H and 37-7 before a TD with :19 left in the game. Aggie QB Christian was only 8-29-134 and is again back under C TY (st'r Manley OFY) but he gives the Aggies a new wrinkle on off with his running ability (5.7 ypc) NMSt is now going with some option packages but he's also moving the ball through the air as well (267 ypg, 60%, 5-1 ratio). Ul's frustrations continued LW in a 24-11 home loss (+4) to LT. QB Reader was only 19-47-244 with an 0-3 ratio and threw a costly pick 6 that swung the contest and UI's running gm again struggled (47 ttl yds). The Aggies have failed to cover their L/4 at home while the Vandals have covered their L/4 on the road. Both tms are winless in the WAC and the loser here faces an uphill battle the rest of the way.

TULSA 44 Uab 16 - Tulsa has won both meetings (avg 42-26) but the visitor has covered both. Tulsa is 11-1 ATS as HF vs FBS if scoring Over 40, 0-10 ATS as HF vs FBS Under 40. They are 0-1 ATS TY but did have a 41-3 lead vs NT (backdoor). Tulsa is off a bye while UAB is playing its 3rd away gm in 4 weeks and is off a home game vs a physical SEC tm. LW QB Perry did start again (Ellis inj could be back TW) but struggled missing open receivers for big gains. At 0-5 HC Callaway is on a major hotseat. UAB is 5-2 ATS as a DD AD but Tulsa went 3-1 ATS LY hosting CUSA opp's. Tulsa has played the nation's toughest non-conf slate (vs current #3, #5 and #6 ranked tms) and at 2-3 is a little underrated but they still have the CUSA Title in their sights and the Blazers will be in the wrong place at the wrong time.

FRESNO ST 41 Utah St 37 - FSU has won 7 of the L/8 (incl the L/4) and while the Bulldogs are 5-1 SU vs USU as WAC foes, they are just 1-5 ATS and their only cover was LY. After watching 3 gms slip through their fingers, the Aggies found themselves down 12-0 before the off had even stepped onto the field LW vs WY but exploded for 63 of the next 70 pts in a 63-19 (-12). Frosh QB Keeton was 15-20-213 (5 TD) and converted 7-7 on 3rd down as the Aggies never punted while he was in the game. Meanwhile, the Bulldogs are coming off the receiving end of a 57-7 (+20') throttling by Boise. FSU trailed 30-0 before even crossing midfield. USU is 10-3 ATS as a conf AD and is 10-2 as an AD under HC Andersen and the Aggles are looking for their first 3-2 rec'd after 5 gms S/82. FSU is 3-16-1 as a HF and is an AMAZING 7-33-1 ATS off a SU loss under HC Hill. FSU needs to push the Boise loss aside and fend off a hungry USU team trying to gain momentum.

LOUISIANA 30 North Texas 23 - ULL and NT are both 4-2 ATS, but while ULL is a surprising 5-1 (best start for a tm in SBC hist), NT is 2-4. ULL has already beaten the top two teams in the conf, but has played our #112 sked (NT #24). LTH Louisiana was outgained by 149 yds but got 2 def/ST TD's for a non-covering win as NT blew a 10 pt 4Q lead. LY ULL led 28-14 into the 4Q. Up 7, ULL allowed a 91/11pl TD drive w/:31 left but blk'd the PAT for the 1 pt win. LY NT not only went 3-1 as a conf AD but they had THREE outright upsets. The visitor is 5-2 SU in the series. NT RB Dunbar is only avg 80 rush ypg total but has avg'd 120 ypg the L/3. ULL QB Masson had 211 yds (72%, 2-0 ratio) after taking over for Gautier early in the game LW (sprained ankle) and led the Ragin Cajuns to a huge upset over Troy. Since taking over as the starter, QB Gautier was avg 275 ypg (68%) with a 5-0 ratio but his status is ? here. Nonetheless, Masson has exp (21 car sts) and UL grabs its 6th str win.

TROY 31 Ulm 23 - The home team has won and covered 4 straight with ULM pulling the DD upset

twice incl LY as a 16° pt HD. Troy was 10-3 ATS as a HF from '07-'09 but has gone 1-6 ATS. ULM is 13-6 as an AD. The fired up Trojans are playing with legit revenge (16' pt AF LY, 28-14 loss) and has been held to conf lows in yds vs ULM L2Y. While the D's are close to even Troy has a sizeable edge on off (#63-102). Troy QB Robinson has topped LY's solid numbers (287 ypg, 64%) as he's avg 330 ypg incl 316 ypg at Clemson and Ark, ULM's 2 QB attack of Browning and Wells is avg 224 ypg (58%). Both teams are off conf losses and while ULM is at N Texas next, Troy does not have their next gm for 10 days. Tuesday, October 18th

Fiu at ARKANSAS ST - The home team is 4-0 SU and has covered 3 straight. LY FIU went 3-1 vs the SBC on the road and gained their top 2 yardage totals with 479 at NT and 668 at Troy. LY ASU was up 24-23 in the 4Q but allowed an 80/11pl GW drive capped by the 42 yd TD pass on 3&9 w/1:42 left. LTH ASU had a 430-223 yd edge and won 27-10 (-10'). PRO ANGLES There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of nandicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the number in the () indicates how many angles apply to that team. The higher the number the stronger the angle play.

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc... takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
