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NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK TWELVE 2011

NEWS AND NOTES - Teams playing with BCS pressure have struggled, like in 2007 when all of the teams that controlled their own destiny lost. Oklahoma St had it all in their favor. They were ranked #2 in the BCS, would play in the National Title game if they won their final 2 games and Brandon Weeden had moved to the top of the Heisman polls. They were taking on an Iowa St team that entered play 0-56-2 vs teams ranked 6 or higher in the AP poll. Paul Rhoads was the DC at Pitt when the Panthers knocked W Virginia out of the #2 spot and National Championship game back in that wacky 2007 season with a huge upset as a 4 TD dog and now engineered a 2nd one. At one point, ISU actually had an 8-3 FD edge but gave up a 70 yd IR TD and trailed 7-0. For the game ISU had a 33-24 FD edge and it was 24-24 after regulation with ISU winning in the 2OT...Illinois outgained Wisconsin 301-285 but was done in by 4 TO's and ST mistakes. The Badgers' 4 TD's came on drives of 2, 30, 44, and 39 yards. Illinois had leads of 14-0 and 17-7 (after a PI wiped out a TD IL kicked a FG) at the half and IL had 15-5 FD and 224-93 yd edges. IL had TO's on 3 of their first four 2H poss setting up 2 UW short TD drives and at the end IL got to the UW29 and was int'd at the 19. Also, with the wind at the back of the punt, IL's PR let the punt sail over his head and it ended up going an extra 25 yds to the 3 yd line for a 74 yd punt... Buffalo scored its most points S/92 with 51 vs Akron and had a 497-239 yd edge. It was 30-3 at the half...Munchie Legaux got his first QB start at Cincinnati as Zach Collaros was out. UC was held to a season low 225 yds by Rutgers. The Big East now has 5 teams with just 2 losses on the season and the race for an automatic BCS bowl berth is wide open. RU did have 385 yds offense and a 23-11 FD edge...Georgia clinched an SEC Title game berth but were very unimpressive vs Kentucky. They did have a 317-165 yd edge but settled for short FG's. In the 1H they settled for 5 FG's, missing 1. In the 2H UGA was int'd in the EZ and fmb'd at the UK40 before finally getting a 7 yd TD pass with 14:55 left to get up by 2 scores. UGA was SOD at the UK27 with 3:39 left...Army ret'd QB Trent Steelman but he lasted just 2 plays. Temple led 28-0 at the half. Last year TU had 8 wins but did not get invited to a bowl and they now have 7 wins this year...Michigan St clinched the Big Ten Legends div when Nebraska lost to Michigan. UM now has a shot at 10 wins and a win over Ohio St making it a glorious season in Brady Hoke's first year. The Wolverines did benefit from some short field in the game but finished with a 418-260 yd edge and had a 24-11 FD edge. It was NU's first game in Michigan Stadium since 1962. The game was tied at 10 and UM led 17-10 at HT before rec'd the 2H KO at the NU33 which set up a TD. They blk'd a punt setting up a 50 yd drive for a TD, got an 11 yd PR setting up a 31 yd TD drive, rec'd a fmb'l...Wake Forest WR Chris Givens had 191 yards receiving and WF had a 514-415 yd edge snapping a 3 game losing streak and becoming bowl eligible. Maryland is one of the most banged up teams in football and fell to 2-9 and gained 68 of their yards on an 11 play drive at the end of the game... Miami and USF, a couple of disappointing teams were tied at 3 when UM drove 61/15pl to get a 36 yd FG on the final play of the game. One key play was that BJ Daniels, the starting QB for USF, left in the 3Q with a shoulder injury. Daniels had accounted for 371 yards total offense the previous week. The surprising number in this game was that at the 1H, UM had a 205-162 yd edge and the teams had combined for 6 points. The usual average in the NCAA is 13.8 yards for every point scored but this 1H had 367 yds for 6 pts - or 61.2 ypp...Rice had a 13-0 lead hitting 54 and 51 yd FG's but Tulane got a 4&7 TD pass with 10:03 left. Rice got a TD with 1:04 left and opted for 2 which would have put them ahead of the spread but the 2 pt failed. TU did get to the Rice37 on their last drive which helped them finish with a 289-237 yd edge...San Jose jumped out to a 10-0 lead and led 20-14 at the half with a 264-153 yd edge. Navy went for it on 4&19 and were SOD at the SJS38, punted with 7:03 left and fired incomplete on 4&3 at the SJS45 with 2:29 left on their final 3 poss after SJS went ahead 27-24 on the 4Q's 1st play...Luke Kuechly set the career ACC record for tackles with 523. Notre Dame took their opening drive 80/7pl for a TD and their 2nd 46/9pl for a 40 yd FG and while they finished with a 417-250 yd edge, this one was ugly. ND only led 13-7 at the half and in the 2H, 8 of the first 9 poss were punts with the other being an int. BC got a TD with 1:57 left to pull within 16-14 but ND rec'd the inside kick...It was a tough loss for Texas Tech who had been beaten by an avg of 42 ppg the prior 3 wks but led for all but the final 2:22 vs Missouri. TT jumped out to a 14-0 lead and led 17-10 at the half, 27-17 after 3Q's and finally with 2:22 left MO got a TD for the lead. TT lost 3 players to injury (WR Torres, RB Washington and OG Edwards) and were the 2nd straight team to complain about the condition of MO's artificial turf. MO was without

Coach Gary Pinkel who was susp'd for the game due to a DWI. After leading the entire game, TT got the ball and drove right down the field and had a FD at the MO11. On 2&6 from the 7 a pass was tipped and int'd at the 4 with :32 left and MO got the fortuitous win.

INJURIES OF NOTE - Oregon St beat Washington for the 7th time in the last 8 meetings. UW was starting Nick Montana at QB as Keith Price was banged up. Montana hit 11-21-79. When Oregon St went up 31-14

Price came off the bench and led an 85/10pl drive and got a 4&9, 20 yd TD pass. OSU fmb'd the kick at their own 17 but Price was int'd at the 1 and the Beavers went 99/12pl getting a 4&gl, 1 yd TD run with 2:06 left to go up by 17 and Montana came back in. OSU had a 484-315 yd edge.

LETDOWN AND LOOK AHEAD - TCU showed some clear letdown after their upset win over Boise St which basically handed them the MW Title this past week. In fact in the 1H vs Colorado St they were outgained 183-148. TCU did end up recording its 45th victory for its senior class, a school record in a 34-10 win and extended their MW records by winning a 23rd straight league game and 16th straight league game at home. CSU had a first time starting QB in true frosh Garrett Grayson (14-24-228) and CSU finished the game with a 408-372 yd edge with TCU getting a 69 yd IR TD in the 3Q... NC State did indeed blow out CU but they benefitted from a short field the majority of the 1H. NCST finished with a 398-337 yd edge. Clemson had just clinched the ACC Atlantic and decided to rest Sammy Watkins who was banged up. In the 1H NCST led 7-3 when CU fmb'd at their own 6 setting up a 6 yd drive for a TD, fmb'd at their own 18 setting up an 11 yd drive for a 21 yd FG. NCST got a 34 yd PR setting up an 11 yd TD drive to go up 24-3. CU did take over with 2:35 left trailing 37-6 and went 68/8pl getting a 2 yd TD run with 1:22 left...Teams that have unbeaten seasons and National Championship hopes dashed, usually have a letdown spot the next week. Stanford struggled to get past Cal and Boise St did not cover vs San Diego St. BS did benefit from 3 early TO's by SDS as after an int they went 24/4pl for a TD, SDS fmb'd a punt on their 10 setting up a BS TD and SDS fmb'd the ensuing KO at their own 23 and BS on 3&14 got a 14 yd TD pass to lead 21-0. BS did lead 42-14 at the half. Leading 45-14 BS fumbled at the SDS3. SDS got to midfield and punted but roughing the P gave them a FD and they would get a TD 2pl later to pull within 45-21. SDS got a TD with 6:25 left to make it 45-29 with the 2 pt conv to get under the spread. BS rec'd the inside kick and went 36/4pl for a TD to get ahead of the spread, 52-29 with 4:11 left. The Aztecs went 76/17pl converting on 3&13, 4&14, 3&8 and with just :05 left in the game, got a 1 yd TD pass to make it 52-35. BS rec'd the inside kick.

MEANINGLESS GAMES - When Penn St took the field against Ohio St it was basically a meaningless game and the winner of next week's game vs Wisconsin will be the winner of the Big Ten Leaders div whether PSU beat or lost to OSU. The Lions showed great character and pulled out the road win. They led after Stephon Green ran 39 yds for a TD 1:30 in and led the rest of the way. PSU had won just 2 of their last 10 games in Columbus but both came vs true frosh QB's in Art Schlichter in 1978 and Terrelle Pryor in 2008 and now a 3rd time vs Braxton Miller...Tulsa was playing in basically a meaningless game vs UTEP. If they beat Houston next week, they get a spot in the conf champ game. TU showed no look ahead but did only have a 500-443 yd edge. In fact, at the half it was TU 297-263 and they only led 21-15 when they got a 94 yd KR TD with 2:45 left in the half, 29-15. TU got a 37 yd IR TD to go up 50-15 and UTEP did gain 64 of its yards on 11 plays in the final 4:00 after TU had scored a TD to make it 57-28.

BACKDOOR/FRONTDOOR COVERS - Texas A&M went to backup QB Showers with 8:00 left in the 3Q as the game vs Kansas was a rout. A&M finished with a 469-197 yd edge. You wouldn't think anything was on the line late in the game but KU took over with 6:52 left trailing 61-0. They would convert on 4&6 for a FD to the 13 and then with just :46 left in the game, got a 15 yd TD run by Sims on 2&12 for a TD which put the game Over the total and also had KU avoid the shutout.

MISLEADING FINALS - It was a shocking early score in the Furman/Florida game as FUR jumped out to a 22-7 1Q lead. UF used big passes. In the 1Q FUR had a 196-72 yd edge. UF got 80, 29, 64 yd TD passes and a 77 yd TD run then added 27 and 75 yd IR TD's for a very misleading 54-32 final in which FUR had a 20-19 FD edge... At the half vs Louisville, Conn had a 165-105 yd edge but gave up a 100 yd KR TD to open the game and settled for a 24 yd FG and trailed 14-10. The game was 28-20 when UC rec'd an inside kick at their own 41 with :13 left when they tried the lateral play and UL ret'd a fumbled lateral 36 yds for a TD with no time left on the clock to make what was a 1 score game into a 34-20 final...We're not sure if we should classify Nevada as a Misleading Final or just a brutal loss for the Wolf Pack. In the 1H NV had an amazing 272-43 yd edge. They fumbled at the LT22, were int'd at the LT30 and were SOD at the LT33. NV had a 15-2 FD edge. NV still dominated the 3Q as well going 67/12pl for a 19 yd FG, 59/6pl settling for a 24 yd FG and on their 3rd poss, went 49/9pl for a TD. With 13:01 left, NV had a commanding 20-3 lead that should have been much worse and a 437-118 yd edge. LT got 84, 89 and 92 yd drive on their final 3 poss for the win.

OPTION OFFENSES ARE TOUGH TO DEFEND - Three big plays hurt Alabama and we have to wonder why FBS schools even schedule an FCS school which runs the option as it is very difficult to prep for. Georgia Southern basically had 2 big plays on its triple option offense and a ST play for their 3 TD's. Bama jumped out to a 17-0 lead but GS got an 82 yd run by FB Swope. With :52 left in the half GS had just converted on 4&1 at its own 32 and 5pl later got a 39 yd TD pass. GS also got a 95 yd KR TD and the confounding option had by far the best effort vs Alabama's D all year with 341 yards. Jaybo Shaw is a Georgia Tech transfer and hit 1-5 passes for 39 yds. GS did gain 37 of its yds in the final couple of plays when trailing 45-21. Trent Richardson rushed for 175 yds and had 3 TD's.

4★ Alabama over AUBURN - The winner has won the Nat'l Champ the L2Y. LY was the 1st time both were in Top 10 S/94. Bama led 24-0 mid-2Q completely dominating Aub but missed 2 key 1H scoring chances (fmbi into EZ and at Aub12). The Tide had just 58 yds in the 2H and the 24 pt comeback was the largest in Aub history (28-27 +3). Auburn is 5-1 ATS in the Iron Bowl but Bama is now 9-5 ATS as a conf AF. LW both tms struggled vs FCS foes as Aub led only 21-16 in the 4Q before reeling off 2 TD's in the 35-16 win over Samford (HC Sullivan Heisman Winner at Aub). After a weekend of upsets, the #2 Tide itself comes back in the National Title picture but their 45-21 win over Ga Southern was uninspiring as their "disinterested" D gave up 302 rush (7.7) to the option and keep in mind the Tide had given up just 519 total rush yds (1.8) in the prev 10 gms combined! RB Richardson continues his march to NY for the Heisman and now has 1,702 ttl yds and 22 TD's. The Tigers have a solid RB of their own in Dyer (1194, 5.2) but HC Saban will be in the D's ear after LW. The "28-27" score hung in Bama locker room in the off-season and Bama S Barron said after LY's gm, "As a defense, we didn't finish in that game. Never again will we go out and not finish like we did in that Aub gm." Since then they have all'd an avg of 6 ppg and no FBS opponent has topped 14 pts and it's highly unlikely the Tigers exceed that here. The Tide take back state bragging rights.

FORECAST: Alabama 38 AUBURN 6

3★ Tennessee over KENTUCKY - UT has beaten UK 26 in a row which is the longest series losing streak in the NCAA. Tenn has also covered 4 str and 15 of 19. While they've covered 4 str in Lexington, the L/2 have been decided in OT. Speaking of OT, the Vols blowups remain alive after a thrilling 27-21 OT win (90 yd IR TD) over Vandy as we cashed a 4★ LPS on UT (+1). QB Bray starting for the 1st time in 6 gms (thumb) threw for 189 yds (48%) with a 2-2 ratio as he struggled gripping the ball (removed gloves after 100 yd IR in 3Q). UK meanwhile put forth a spirited effort in a 19-10 loss to UGA as a 30' pt AD (led 10-6 in 1H) but saw their bowl hopes dashed in the process. QB Smith took several shots (inj shldr CS) and has regressed the past 2 wks avg 156 ypg (49%, 2-2) after avg 229 ypg (65%, 2-0) the prev 2. If he can't go Newton (88 ypg, 48%, 8-7) will take his place. UT is 3-0 ATS as an AF the L4Y and has the edges on off (#74-113) and def (#29-68). LY Bray threw for 354 yds vs UK and with another week to adjust to the inj he should have another solid outing as the Vols become bowl eligible.

FORECAST: Tennessee 27 KENTUCKY 10

3★ Arkansas (+) over LSU - SEC West/Nat'l Title Implications in the Battle for the Golden Bowl. Ark has outgained LSU 5 str, has covered 4 str and won 3 of 4 outright. LY Ark had a 464-294 yd edge with a pair of 80 yd TD passes. LSU did win the LTH as they kicked a 41-yd FG w/:04 to force OT (Ark missed 35 yd FG in OT). This tightly contested series has been decided by 8 or less the L6Y with the cumulative score Ark 185-184. LW both tms took care of business as LSU dispatched Ole Miss 52-3 (-31) as they outgained the Rebels 458-195 but did have 2 Def TD's. The Tigers matched their best start S/58 as QB Jefferson got his 2nd str st (4-0 ratio). Two wks ago we easily cashed our GOY on the Hogs in their 49-7 win (-14) over Tenn and LW we cashed a 4★ on these pages and our Top Weekly LPS on the Razorbacks (-13) in their 44-17 win over Miss St. QB Wilson had a school record 32 comp and leads the SEC avg 292 ypg (63%) with a 21-5 ratio. LSU is only 5-17-1 ATS as a conf HF but are 10-2 SU in home finales and are 8-3 ATS TY w/non-covers coming as 30+ pt fav's in flat spots. Ark does have slight off (#10-15) and ST's (#2-25) edges while LSU has the def edge (#2-25). With the recent series history and the Hogs covering by DD's in each of their L/3 gms will we ride Woo Pig Soovie for a 3rd str week.

FORECAST: Arkansas 24 (+) LSU 31

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ UCLA (+) over USC - USC is 11-1 SU in this rivalry winning the last 4 by an avg of 16 ppg (27-9) with no win by less than 14. LY the Trojans (-6) admitted this was their "bowl" as UCLA gained 53% of its FD's (9) and 39% of its yds (141) on the L/2 pass after the gm had been decided. LTH USC (-13) led 21-7 when they kneeled down to end the game. UCLA decided to call a timeout so instead on kneeling again, USC threw a 48 yd TD pass and nearly caused a brawl with celebrating. The Trojans could be 11-0 here after their win in Eugene as yet another outright upset winner for our Big Dog POW but they dropped a 3OT loss to Stanford and fell apart late vs ASU. With USC unable to play in the postseason, UCLA controls its own destiny in the P12 South after a convincing win vs Colo LW, a game in which they nearly topped their ssn high in ttl yds with 553 (1 yd short). The Bruins are just 3-12 ATS as a conf AD while the Trojans are just 4-7 ATS as a conf HF. The home team has covered 20 of the L/29 in this series. It will be interesting to see how the Trojans deal coming off the upset win while UCLA has plenty to play for.

FORECAST: UCLA 23 (+) USC 30

2★ Iowa (+) over NEBRASKA - The schools dubbed this "The Heroes Game" when NU joined the B10 and they'll play for the Corn Bowl trophy. NU is 4-9 ATS (1-2 TY) as a conf HF under Pelini and are 3-9 ATS in their home finale but have won the L6 SU by 20 ppg. Iowa has been a DD dog (line opened at 9') just once in 4Y ('09, +16' OSU, 24-27 OT) but have 2 DD losses (at PSU and MSU) in a ssn for the 1st time S/07. The last meeting was in '00 and Iowa lost 42-13 (+41'). This is Iowa's 2nd straight road gm where they are 3-6 SU/2-7 ATS the L2Y although they ended their 6 gm road losing streak by beating Purdue 31-21. LW. IU outgained the Boilers 408-282 but also were aided by PU TO's at the Hawks 41, 1, 29 and out of the EZ for a TB. Hawks have B10's #2 rusher Coker (1297, 5.0) and #1 rec McNutt (1240, 16.8). Hawks allow 166 rush ypg (4.0) in B10 play. NU blew their last shot at a trip to Indy in a 41-17 loss at Mich where they were outFD'd (24-11) and outgained (418-260). RB Burkhead (1108, 5.0) was held to a ssn low 36 yd vs the Wolves and trailing just 17-10 at HT the normally stout Huskers ST imploded fmbi away the 3Q KO and a blk'd P which set up TD drives of 33 and 50 yds. Huskers allow 188 rush ypg (4.1) in B10 play. This one goes to the wire.

FORECAST: Iowa 21 (+) NEBRASKA 24

2★ Texas Tech (+) over Baylor - † Cowboys Stadium. TT has been fav'd every matchup S/94 and has won and outgained Baylor 15 str covering 12. This is TT's finale while BU hosts Texas next wk. LY TT was a 1 pt fav after being a DD fav for 10 str gms (20+pt fav in 7 of those). Bries is a TT grad, ex-RB coach ('02-05) and was contacted for the Raiders HC job in '09. LY Griffin had career highs in att (42), comp (31) and yds (384) vs TT in a gm that saw 4 lead changes and 3 ties as BU ran out of time at the Raiders 31. The Bears did return an inside K for a TD and had another fake P set up a TD as TT had the FD (35-22) and yd (635-507) edges. BU has gone 1-2 ATS as a conf away fav (0-2 TY) and they are 1-3 SU/0-4 ATS on the road TY. TT blew 2 DD leads as MO rallied for a 31-27 win without susp'd HC Pinkel. After the Tigers went ahead with 2:22 left the Raiders drove 68/10 pl but were int'd at the 4 with :37 left. TT is #111 pass eff D (224, 60%, 21-5) and #113 in scoring D (37 ppg). The Bears beat OU for the 1st time ending a 20 gm skid and got their 1st win over a 5 star foe S/85 in a 45-38 stunner. Sooners TO's ended drives at the BU31 and 26 and they were also SOD at the Bears 25 as RG3 hit the 34 yd GW TD pass with :08 left. RG3 (357, 73%, 33-5, 550 rush) may have catapulted himself back into the Heisman race. BU is #94 pass eff D (259, 62%, 25-10). TT needs 1 more win to prolong the B12's longest bowl streak and this is their last chance.

OTHER GAMES

Thursday, Nov 24th • Texas at TEXAS A&M - UT was fav'd in this series 11 str yrs by an avg of 15 ppg but LY was A&M's turn and they won and covered. A&M is now 5-1 ATS incl all 3 at home. Despite A&M being a 21, 7-20 pt dog the L/3 hosting Texas they've outgained them 2 of 3 and are +170 yds cumulatively. UT is 4-0 ATS/SU as a conf AD the L12Y. This is 11th str wk for A&M but UT is traveling on a short wk after LW's loss to KSU in which the Horns held the Cats to 8 FD and 121 yds but couldn't overcome 2 Ash int's. He was benched for McCoy after the 2nd int who led UT's 1st TD drive in 3 gms in the 3Q and 10 pts overall. Horns also got back #1 and #3 rushers Brown and Bergeron but the duo comb for 20 carries and 73 yds. UT's D has held their L/4 to 229 ypg and 14 ppg. They are #11 pass eff D and the FBS's only secondary which hasn't all'd a TD pass of 20+ yds TY. A&M became bowl elig by scoring on and their 1st 9 pass in a

61-7 rout of Kan. Ags #1 rusher Gray (1045, 5.3) sat out the 2H with a shldr inj (CS). A&M allows 108 rush ypg (2.7). This is the last sked matchup for these on and off field rivals with A&M's imminent SEC departure. **Get the Turkey Day College Play included in your Thanksgiving Exec Package!**

Friday, Nov 25th • BUFFALO 30 Bowling Green 24 - This series has had 3 str upsets and the dog has covered 5 str. LY UB led 28-13 into the 4Q and after BG got an 82 yd IR TD (2ptng) they got a 48 yd TD pass to trail by 2. On the last pass BG got to the 21 but missed a 40 yd FG on the final play. BG has a big ST edge (#41-113) and is playing only its 2nd game in 16 days while UB is playing their 3rd in 13 days. BG is off a heartbreaking 1 pt loss to East Champ Ohio giving up a FG as time expired. The Bulls set a schl FBS rec'd with 51 pts in a 41 pt blowout of Akron. Oliver had 235 yds (8.1) and leads with 1,268 (4.3). He needs just 65 yds to break NFL RB James Stark's single ssn rec and now faces a BG D that is all g' 208 ypg rush (5.3). **NORTHERN ILLINOIS 44 Eastern Michigan 34** - The visitor is 9-1 ATS with the only loss the LTH. In the L/3 NI has won by a comb 188-9 covering by 33 ppg. NI was 7-1 ATS as a conf HF the L2Y under Kill and is 3-0 SU (2-1 ATS) in that role TY. EM went 1-3 ATS as a conf AD in English's 1st ssn, went 4-0 ATS LY (cov by 10 ppg w/2 upsets) and is 1-2 SU/ATS TY. Versus 6 comm opp, EM was 3-3 SU/ATS (dog 4x) being outscored 28-25 and outgained 373-365 (-4 TO). NI was 5-1 SU/3-3 ATS (fav 4x) outscoring opp 45-35 with a 534-418 yd edge (+1 TO). EM has been one dimensional on off (226 rush-125 pass), while NI has been balanced (262-245) thanks in great part to QB Harnish who is avg 236 ypg (64%) with a 22-4 ratio and is the FBS's #1 QB rusher with 1,203 (7.8, 10 TD). NI has big edges on off (#14-111) and ST's (#48-106). NI has had 10 days off while EM has had just 6. EM is trying to become bowl elig for the 1st time S/95, while NI is hungry to return to the MAC Champ gm after LY's upset loss (-17) and punches its ticket with a win here.

TEMPLE 24 Kent St 10 - TU has won and covered 3 of 4 incl B2B gms covering by 19 ppg. KS is 1-3 the L2Y. LTH KSU led 10-9 at HT but all'd 38 unanswered in the 2H being outgained 261-80. TU started the ssn blowing out opp but their L/3 conf gms have been decided by 4 pts or less. KS struggled early but after switching its OL around during the bye wk has won and covered 4 str. While TU has the edges on off (#77-120), def (#41-62) and ST's (#10-87) those numbers are on the whole ssn and these tms are much closer recently. The winner could tie for the MAC East Crown if Ohio is upset earlier in the wk. KS is trying to become bowl elig, but TU is trying to improve its bowl stock after sitting home LY at 8-4.

WESTERN MICHIGAN 52 Akron 10 - WM had won and covered 4 of 5 but LTH in '07 lost outright as an 8' pt HF. UA trailed 38-31 w/:15 left and WM took a safety but UA ret'd the kick 78 yds for a TD as time exp for the miracle win (which refs apologized later for missing several pen's on the play) WM is only 6-11 ATS as a conf HF but is 2-1 TY. Akron is 5-11-1 ATS as a conf AD (1-2 TY). WM has large sked edge with 9 days rest and only their 2nd gm in 17 days vs Akron who is on 6 days rest and playing in its 2nd of B2B away and 3rd in 4W. LY WM (-7) rolled UA on the road 56-10. Both tms have struggled on def (WM #109-120), but WM has huge edges on off (#43-119) and ST's (#8-97). WM is trying to salvage a once very promising ssn with a win to impress any bowls that come calling and should be able to have their best game this ssn as most teams have had vs Akron as the Zips have been outscored 121-16 in their L/3 gms.

Toledo 44 BALL ST 30 - UT is the 1st FBS tm since at least '80 to be involved in B2B gms in which each tm scored 60+ pts. LW (-14) they only scored 44 but held CM to 17 for an easy Fri Night Marquee winner. BSU covered LY and in 5 of the L/6. LY BSU jumped out to a 17-0 lead before giving up 31 unanswered but got a TD with :12 left for the backdoor (+11'). BSU is 2-5 ATS as a conf HD with an outright upset of Ohio (23-20, +14). BSU has only outgained 1 conf foe TY (UB by 47 yd) being outgained by an avg 125 ypg in conf play. BSU is off a heartbreaking 41-38 loss to NI, as they could not hold a 17 pt 3Q lead giving up a FG w/:08 left. However, they were actually outgained 710-398 and benefitted from a 92 yd FR TD. UT also suffered a 3 pt loss to NI all g a TD with :19 left but had a 589-532 yd edge. With a win Toledo will win at least a share of the MAC East Crown and comb with a NI loss would be headed for the MAC Champ gm. While BSU has the ST edge (#47-112), UT has the def (#90-117) and huge off (#21-91) edges. BSU is bowl elig but their only real hope of a bowl would be a stunning upset here.

USF 27 Louisville 17 - The home team had won and covered 7 straight prior to USF pulling the small upset LY as a 4★ Late Phone winner for us. UL is 0-4 SU and ATS in Tampa with the avg score 41-20. USF went 1-4 SU and 0-5 ATS vs the BE at home under Holtz with the only win coming as a 10 pt fav to Rutgers (28-27) LY. Bad news for the Bulls heading into here as not only did they lose a surprising def struggle to Miami, but they could also be missing dual-threat QB Daniels (296 ttl ypg) after he left in the 3Q w/a shoulder inj vs the Hurricanes. The Cardinals have shown great success on the road covering 7 straight including outright upset wins in 4 of those contests. One of those upsets came LW at Conn which has now put them back into the mix for the BE Title and a BCS berth. Schedule edge goes to USF as Louisville is on their 2nd straight away and 3rd in 4W not to mention playing on Fri at 11am EST. USF bkp QB Evedl does have a career start under his belt so USF may not be in as bad of a position as you would think.

Houston 47 TULSA 40 - This determines the CUSA West Champ. While UH has won 4 of 6 (4 upsets in series with the dog 5-1 ATS) the tms have split the L4 with TU 3-1 ATS. In those 6 gms no tm has been a fav by over 4 pts yet 3 have been decided by 17+ and 2 by 40+. Also 5 of the 6 have had a tm with at least a 140 yd edge. LY UH was without QB Keenum and lost at home by 3. Cougars are on their 3rd road game in 4W and continue their journey in uncharted waters at 11-0 (9-2 ATS). In 6 str covers they are outscoring foes on avg by 43 ppg (+288 ypg). TU had no look ahead problems taking care of UTEP LW and are playing just as well as anyone in the country. Hurricane are winners of 7 str (5 str ATS) and during that streak are outscoring foes 42-19 (+132 ypg). UT has won a rec 12 str CUSA gms and the last time they dropped a conf HG was in '09. TU has been a conf HD just 4x's the L9Y (4-0 ATS) incl a 46-45 (+1) SU loss the L/time hosting UH ('09). Under Sunlin UH is just 5-12 as an AF but covered their L2 TY by 15' and 21'. This by far is the best tm UH has faced TY as TU played OK, OKSt and Boise but went 0-3 SU (1-2 ATS) being outscored 49-23 and outgained 555-391.

WEST VIRGINIA 37 Pittsburgh 34 - WV has won and covered B2B gms in the series and in the L9Y the line has been 3 or less 6 times with 6 outright upsets in that span. LTH (line at E) it was tied at 3, 6 and 16 after Pitt got a 50 yd TD w/2:54 left. WV however went 42/10 pl and kicked a 43 yd FG on the last play. LY Pitt had a 205-75 yd edge at HT but trailed 14-7 because of TO's and ended up losing 35-10 at home as a 2' pt fav. Prior to that meeting, neither team had topped 19 ppg the previous 3 yrs. While both come in off a bye, slight scheduling edge to the Panthers as WV has a Thur night game in Tampa on deck against USF. This could be the last in the series of the "Backyard Brawl" for quite some time with both Pitt (ACC) and WV (B12) on their way to different conferences. Look for another tight affair coming down to the final play.

UTAH 27 Colorado 17 - The two P12 newcomers close out their inaugural seasons heading in diff directions. UT comes in on a 4 gm win streak after LW's snowy OT win in which they benefitted again from a +3 TO edge. UT is on their way to a bowl while CU has hit the 10 loss plateau for the 2nd time in 6Y and their 6th consec losing ssn overall (23 str road losses). UT is 13-6-1 ATS as a conf HF the L6Y and has gone 4-1 SU/ATS in home finales. UT has also gone 18-7-1 ATS as a DD fav with CU dropping 11 of its L/12 as a DD dog incl a 45-6 loss LW to UCLA, a gm in which CU all'd 3 TD's in both the 1st and 4th Q's (outgained 553-229 despite committing 9 pen's for 102 yd). CU went 0-4 ATS LY as a conf AD vs the B12 failing to cover by 13 ppg. Despite the coh'g and conf change, that trend has cont'd with CU going 0-4 ATS failing to cover by 14 ppg. CU is on its 2nd str AG and ply'g on a short wk but has fared well in these post Thanksgiving gms going 11-4 ATS in gms mostly vs Neb. With CU now having better health and UT being outFD'd by 26 over the L5 gms, we expect CU (our #1 toughest sked) to stay within the inflated spread here.

MIAMI, FL 30 Boston College 13 - UM has covered 4 str as well as 4 str at home. BC has a 5-1 ATS streak on the ACC road but is 3-4 as conf AD under Spaz. LW UM got an ugly 6-3 win over USF; the 1st time S/79 they have scored 6 pts or less for a win. UM drove 91/15 converting on 2 key 3D's with Wieclaw hitting a 36 yd FG as time expired. QB Harris is avg 224 ypg (66%) with a 19-5 ratio and RB Miller has 1,158 yds (5.4). UM defense has improved holding their L/2 to ssn lows (FSU 2nd) avg 254 ypg. BC missed numerous opp's on both sides with DB's dropping 2 int's, WR FD's and Rettig missing wide open deep strikes as BC fell short of their comeback losing 16-14. BC's anemic offense (15 ppg, 268 ypg on the road) has been carried by a young/inexp defense led by LB Kuechly who broke the ACC career tk rec'd (523). Miami has all of the edges (off #31-102, def #30-44) on what will be their 2011 finale as the school has chosen to institute a bowl ban before the NCAA imposes its penalties.

UCF 31 Utep 17 - UTEP is one win away from bowl eligibility and UCF would like nothing more than to keep them home for the holidays. Their only 2 meetings were in '07 and '08 with the home team winning both (by 45 and 16) but UTEP covering both. UCF is 11-6-1 as a conf HF incl 5-2 ATS if laying over 10. UTEP is 12-7 as a conf AD in Price's tenure incl 2-0 TY with an outright upset (also beat Rice on road TY w/line E). UCF LW dropped their 3rd str (eliminated from a bowl) and are on a 2-7 ATS run. Six of 7 Knight losses have come by a tll of just 31 pts! UTEP is off a home loss to Tulsa and are 1-3 SU/ATS the last month but Price is 4-1 ATS off a SU loss TY. UTEP QB Lamaison DNP LW and Meger was benched (CS). Miners are on an 8-27 run in gms away from the Sun Bowl (all under Price) and have been outgained on the road TY by 105 ypg. UCF is 23-9 at Bright House (19-12 ATS) and TY are 4-1 outgaining foes by 255 ypg. UTEP has had a better than expected ssn TY and does have the ST edge (#3-54). UCF has the better off (#60-98), def (#45-85) and although has underachieved TY will want to end the ssn on a positive in front of their home crowd.

ARIZONA ST 30 California 20 - Cal has taken 7 of 8 overall however the home team has covered 5 straight incl LTH when ASU (+6.5) trailed 14-0 early before taking their only lead at 21-20 with 10:21 left. Cal made a 24 yd FG w:/21 left for the non-covering win. LY Cal was the NC Sports Comp College Play on Sat and were -3 at home and won 50-17, covering by 30 pts! ASU's 2 TD's came on a blk'd punt and a 25 yd FR. ASU is on a 6-2 ATS at home vs conf opp while Erickson is on a 21-7 ATS run as a conf HF (ASU, Idaho, Oregon St, Miami). They did however drop a big game against rival Arizona who had just 2 wins coming in LW despite QB Osweller throwing for a career-high 487 yds. This is the 4th consec year for Cal to play a regular ssn game following Stanford (lost L/2 outright as 6' pt favorites in both). While the Bears continue to play solid at home, their road woes have continued as they have dropped 9 of their L/11 SU and ATS however they did hang in with Stanford in the "Big Game" LW (Stanford off bubble burst wk before) losing by just a FG (outscored the Cardinal 15-3 in the 4Q). To further our backing of the Sun Devils here, Cal is all'g just 13 ppg at home TY but a dismal 34 ppg on the road while ASU is in must win mode to put pressure on UCLA for the P12 South.

Saturday, November 26th - MICHIGAN 24 Ohio St 17 - A historic 7 straight wins for OSU (5-2 ATS). The Bucks have won 3 straight in Ann Arbor but LTH failed to cover as an 11' pt AF (21-10) as they only outgained UM by 9 yds but were +4 in TO's. LY OSU won 37-7 as Herron rushed for 175 yds (OSU 478-351 yd edge). Since they played in '06 as #1 vs #2 OSU has not won by less than 11. UM's Hoke calls OSU "Ohio", refuses to wear red even though it's the color of his alma mater Ball St and installed countdown clocks to this gm as soon as he became HC. OSU is 1-3 SU/2-2 ATS on the road TY being outgained by 86 ypg. UM is 7-0 SU/5-1 ATS at home TY outgaining foes by 166 ypg. Huge ST edge for OSU (#6-100). UM turned a 17-10 HT lead into a blowout thanks to Huskers mistakes (fmbld 3Q KO and blk'd P) to stay in the hunt for an at large BCS bid by mauling NU 45-17. UM continues to get the ball to Toussaint (811, 5.7) who has outrushed QB D-Rob in conf play 698 to 441 (5.9-4.0). Wolves allow a B10 best 113 rush ypg (3.6) in conf play. OSU was eliminated from the B10 title gm after falling behind 10-0 for the 3rd straight gm in a 20-14 home loss to PSU. The Bucks (327-289 outgained) were burned by the Lions wildcat formation in the 1H before clamping down in the 2H including a goal line stand on 4&goal from the 1 but the gm's turning point came on the next series when OSU fmbld it back to the Lions. Minus the service academies the Bucks are last in the FBS in pass off with QB Miller's (76 ypg, 49%, 9-3, #1 rush 595) 4 completions to now elig Posey LW a ssn high for an OSU WR. Bucks have struggled vs mobile QB's allowing 148 rush ypg (3.8). LY at this time it was OSU fighting for a BCS bid while Mich had just finished being investigated by the NCAA and the cch staff fought rumors that they'd be unemployed soon.

Missouri 38 Kansas 23 - MO has won 4 of 5 Border Showdowns with all 5 gms in KC. LY MO won 35-7 as a 24.5 pt fav which was 2nd highest ever in the series (-26.5, 1987) with a 397-141 yd edge and had a 3-1 fan advantage. The dog is 11-5 ATS and there have been EIGHT outright upsets in 12Y in this series. This is the last scheduled matchup of the 2nd most played rivalry in CFB history with MO's SEC exit prompting a KU official to tweet: "Missouri forfeits...we win." This could also be KU HC Gill's last gm as he's gone 1-15 SU/6-10 ATS in B12 play being outscored by 28 ppg and outgained by 218 ypg. Hawks mistakes: 3 TO's, snap over P's head for a safety, 72 yd PR TD helped turn the A&M gm into another embarrassing blowout (trailed 44-0 at HT). The run gm was held under 76 yds for the 3rd time TY vs A&M. Hawks remain last in FBS in scoring D (46 ppg) allowing 42+ in 8 gms. Minus susp'd HC Pinkel MO rallied from 14-0 and 27-17 deficits to beat TT and become bowl elig. QB Franklin (232, 63%, 18-7, 794 rush) was the star accounting for 79% of MO's 4Q yds and both TD's in the Tigers 1st gm without B12's #1 rusher Josey (OFY). Tigers got an int on a tipped pass at their 4 to secure the win. Gill made the MO rivalry a priority and this is the Hawks' last shot before the Tigers head off to the SEC.

Rutgers 20 CONNECTICUT 17 - Rutgers is back in the BE race after a convincing win over Cincy who was w/o their starting QB (385-225 RU yard edge). The Knights have won 5 of 6 overall against the Huskies which includes B2B upsets and winning and covering the L/3 (decided by 3, 4 and 2 pts). LY Rutgers had a 453-284 yd edge but allowed a 100 yd KR TD, 66 yd TD run and 28/3pl TD drive in the 27-24 victory. Despite a 339-308 yd edge the Huskies were done in by an early special tms mistake vs Louisville and will now be home for this postseason after a BCS berth LY. Rutgers is playing for a 10th straight week while Conn has had 2 byes in the L5W and are 7-2-1 ATS in home finales. The Huskies also thrive as a conf HD going 11-2 ATS and winning their L/6 outright when covering which may give them a chance to keep this one tight in the wacky BE conf.

Cincinnati 30 SYRACUSE 20 - Syracuse had lost 5 straight incl the L/3 by 21 ppg but LY came away with a 24 pt win vs a Cincy squad w/out QB Collaros. UC is playing with legit revenge here but will once again be w/o their signal caller as Bq Legaux hit on just 12-31-158 yds (31 rush) vs a stingy Rutgers def in a 20-3 defeat in his 1st career start LW. Cincy has gone 10-7 ATS away vs the BE but the Orange do get the sked edge here after a bye week while the Cats are on the road for a 3rd time in 4 wks. Syracuse is on a 3-7 ATS run at home and 2-5 ATS as a conf HD in the 3Y under Marrone and will also be missing their top tackler S Phillip Thomas (sus, 82 tkl, 21 more than #2) for the rest of the year while the visitor in the series has now covered 4 straight. Another week of practice with the starters should give Legaux a better chance here.

NORTHWESTERN 28 Michigan St 27 - MSU has won 3 str incl LY which was also here at NW and the visitor has now covered 4 str. LY NW jumped out to a 17-0 lead but later MSU was successful on a fake P and it propelled them to the cover. MSU took a 1 pt lead w/2:00 left and tacked on another TD :53 later for the misleading final. MSU is 7-1-1- ATS as a conf AF while NW is 3-6 ATS as a conf HD (0-2 TY). LW Legends winner Sparty booked their trip to Indianapolis with a 55-3 (-28') demolition of Indy. MSU scored on 8 of their 1st 10 poss and finished with 22-12 FD and 470-236 yd edges as 60% of the Hoosiers yds came on 3 drives with 2 after trailing 34-3 at the half. MSU QB Cousins (229, 64%, 19-5) is #3 B10 pass eff. Spartans are #5 pass eff D (156, 50%, 13-16). The Cats won their 4th straight to become bowl elig with their win 18-13 win over Minny in which they led 21-3 after their 1st 3 poss. FBS comp % leader Persa (240, 75%, 15-7) teams with jack of all trades Colter (571 rush, 410 rec, 11 TD) to form the B10's best QB duo. After allowing 39 ppg in 1st 5 gms of B10 play, the Cats have all'd 15 ppg in L/3. This gm is meaningless for MSU with their BCS shot on deck while NW can ensure themselves a bowl invite with a 7th win (10 B10 tms could be elig for 8 spots).

Purdue 38 INDIANA 24 - PU is 7-2 SU being a fav in each but IU won and covered LY as well as covering 4 of the L/6 at home. LY the game was tied at 7, 21, 28 and after IU kicked a 26 yd FG with :09 left at 31. PU was int'd in OT and IU won with a FG. PU was not a conf AF LY and in the L6Y has gone 4-1 ATS (3x vs IU). IU is 4-2 ATS as a conf HD L/2. Mistakes doomed the Boilers as they coughed up the ball at Iowa's 41, 1, 29 and out of the EZ for a TB in a 31-21 loss in which they were also outgained 408-282. OSU hero Marve ply'd the goat this time with 3 TO's. Boilers are allowing 201 rush ypg (4.5) in B10 play. Indy ran into a Spartans buzz saw as MSU jumped out to a 34-3 HT lead and never looked back in which they were held to 6 plays or less on 11 of their 14 drives. IU QB Robertson has avg'd 158 (54%) 3-4 ratio and 287 rush in his 4 sts. IU is allowing 268 rush ypg (5.8) in league play. PU hasn't dropped 2 str in this rivalry S'93 and '94 and HC Hope needs this to make the Boilers bowl elig for the 1st time in his 3 yr tenure.

Illinois 31 MINNESOTA 17 - UM is 5-2 SU after beating IL 38-34 LY as a 21 pt dog and they've now gone 6-1 ATS. LY IL came in off the 3OT loss to Mich. UM has lost B2B at home but LTH covered as a 7pt HD. IL is 1-4 ATS as a conf AF. Sliding Illini covered (+14) as the Underdog POW and 4★ LPS

in their 28-17 loss to Wisky in which they led 14-0. The turning point came when UI's P dropped a snap at their own 2 yd line late 1H which set up a UW TD on the next play. IL (301-285 yd edge) had 4 TO's which set Wisky up for scoring drives of 44, 39, 30 and 2 yds and had a 2Q TD erased on a ? off pass infer penalty. Illini alternated QB and RB's to find an off spark with Scheelhaase and Fr O'Toole combining to hit 22-31 for 152 with a 0-3 ratio. IL is #1 B10 in conf play allowing 288 ypg becoming the 1st tm to hold the Badgers under 300 yd (285). UM fell behind NW 21-7 while stumbling to their 3rd straight loss despite having a 393-368 yd edge. QB Gray is the #1 rusher (786, 4.6) but has hit thrown for just 88 ypg (43%) with a 2-0 ratio while battling a back inj in the L/2. Gophers allow 248 rush ypg (5.5) in B10 play. Zook's seat is roasting with the 5 gm slide but the Illini get revenge for LY's debacle.

Georgia 34 GEORGIA TECH 24 - Scheduled as the reg ssn finale for the L59 years. The visitor is 10-1-1 ATS with UGA having 5 straight wins and 6 straight covers in Atlanta. LY UGA scored a TD and led 35-28 w/9:35 left. GT scored but missed the PAT to trail by 1. After getting the ball back deep in GT terr UGA was all'd to score a TD to preserve the clock. GT got to the 46 but threw an int. UGA has all'd 342 ypg rush (5.6) to Johnson's option (34 ppg) the L/3Y but are a much improved D TY all'g just 81 rush ypg (2.8) compared to 147 ypg (3.7) LY. LW the Bulldogs despite a sluggish performance were able to beat UK 19-10 (-30') and clinch the SEC East title (did have 317-165 yd edge). QB Murray is avg 222 ypg (61%) with a 28-9 ratio but leading rusher Crowell 832 (4.8) left the gm in the 1Q with an ankle inj (CS). GT recovered from the loss to VT and was able to hang on for a 38-31 win over Duke LW (-10') as they rolled up a 549-351 yd edge. QB Washington had 185 pass/136 rush and is avg 201 total yds (48%, 10-6). The Bulldogs have now won 9 str gms (-7-2 ATS) and while they have the SEC Champ on deck, in the L/3 gms in that situation vs GT they are 3-0 SU/ATS with an avg score of 33-10 and continue their winning ways here.

WAKE FOREST 24 Vanderbilt 23 - WF has won and covered 3 straight all by DD incl LY as a 5pt AD. Prior to this game VU HC Caldwell announced his resignation and despite a bkp QB and being down to their 4th string RB they had a 443-299 yd edge but had 2 P's blk'd (-2 TO's) in the 34-13 loss. What a difference a ssn makes with these 2 teams combined for 5-19 SU and 7-17 ATS record LY now 11-11 SU and 15-7 ATS! Wake became bowl eligible LW for the 1st time S'/08 by defeating MD 31-10 (-9') cashing in as a 3★ LPS. QB Price threw for ssn high 320 yd (240 ypg, 62%, 19-6 ratio) while RB Pendergrass has rushed for 100+ the L/2 and WR Givens has sch rec 1,207 yds (18.4). Vandy failed to get the elusive 6th win as missed FG's, pen's and 4 TO's incl a 90 yd IR TD in OT cost them in a 27-21 loss at Tenn as we cashed a 4★ LPS on the Vols (+1'). QB Rodgers had 3 good gms prior to LW's 3 pick perf and RB Stacy needs just 48 yds to become the VU's 4th 1,000 yd rusher (1st S'/95). VU's last 4 losses have come by a comb 19 pts but they are avg just 232 ypg and 11 ppg on the road. Vandy is 2-13 (6-8-1 ATS) on the road L/3Y losing 7 of L/8 by 24.6 ppg. Pressure is on Vandy who has their 3rd road gm in 4 wks and they lost their LTH 23-10 (+4).

SOUTH CAROLINA 27 Clemson 23 - In the L/23Y SC has been a series fav twice and LY was the first time in 31Y they were an AF. SC has now won and covered B2B games (1st time S'/69 & 70) and has covered 4 of the L/5. LY SC won despite having the SEC Champ on deck and TY they are only off The Citadel while CU is on the 2nd of B2B away and has the ACC Champ gm on deck. LW SC faced option-oriented Citadel and we cashed a 4★ against the Gamecocks as they only won 41-20 as a 40 pt HF. The win did earn SC B2B ssn's with at least 9 wins for the 1st time in 118 years. QB Shaw is avg 126 ypg (65%) with a 9-6 ratio and has avg 89 rush ypg (6.6) L/2 wks while RB Wilds has 3 100 yd gms replacing Lattimore. LW CU in a flat spot was sloppy committing 4 TO's (11 TO's L/3W after just 2 first 8 gms) in the 37-13 loss to NCS't (-7). They had been avg 37 ppg and 478 ypg but didn't reach the EZ until the final :90 and didn't crack the 200 yd mark until late in the 3Q. The Tigers did play w/out all-purp star Watkins (shld'r, CS) while QB Boyd is avg 296 ypg (62%) with a 27-9 ratio. CU is 9-2 SU in Columbia S/89 but lost the LTH when they had the ACC Title gm on deck and mailed it in. The L3Y have all been decided by 17+ each (3Y prior just 9 tt pts) but look for this one to be tighter as CU should be motivated after LW and has the off edge (#17-52) and ST's edge (#55-80). However SC is at home, has the D edge (#10-61) and will be looking to win 10 gms for the 1st time S/84.

NC STATE 34 Maryland 10 - Maryland has won 4 of 5 and did cover LY as a 2' pt HD with the home team winning by an identical score (38-31) for a 2nd straight ssn. LY NCST needed just a win to get the ACC Title game and led 14-0 after 1Q with the wind but trailed 17-14 at HT and later trailed 38-17. NCS't is 4-2 ATS as an ACC HF under O'Brien. State is off a dominating 37-13 win over #7 Clemson for their 1st win over a Top 10 tm under O'Brien. QB Glennon passed for 3 TD's and the Pack defense held a Clem tm avg 37 ppg and 478 yds w/o a TD until 1:22 4Q. CB Amerson got his 11th int (ACC rec) and the D had a ssn high 6 sks. MD lost its 7th gm in a row and 6th by DD this time at the hands of Wake 31-10. Bkp QB Brown had 296 of MD's 415 yds but despite fortune calls could not capitalize incl 2 missed FG's and twice were SOD in the RZ. They now face our #24 def that has all'd 9 ppg L/3. MD's young/banged up def has all'd 516 ypg L/3. MD went 4-2-1 ATS as a conf AD the L2Y under Fridge while Edsall went 5-1 ATS the L2Y at Conn but is 0-2 TY. LTH MD lost their starting QB and only had 91 yds in the 2H and now are w/o QB O'Brien who had a record setting day LY. NCST gets its 7th win for their 1st B2B post ssn appearances since '00-03.

NORTH CAROLINA 34 Duke 24 - Victory Bell Clash. NC has won 7 straight all as a fav of 7+ pts and has won 20 of 21. Duke however is 4-2 ATS and has covered 3 of 4 at NC. LY NC led 24-10 with 5:00 left (-7.5) but on 4&10 in the NC44 were int'd at the 2 and got tk'd for a safety and then gave up a TD after the free kick and did not cover. NC is 8-18 ATS as a conf HF but Duke is playing a 7th straight week with their 3rd road game in 4W. Duke again provided some late drama but Renfree's pass was int'd with 2:20 left dropping its 6th straight LW to GT 38-31. Big plays were costly again all'g 10 plays of 20+ but wk after wk Renfree's arm (most att's in ACC, 12-10 ratio) has kept them in the gm. Duke is overmatched in the trenches due to inj's vs NC's NFL caliber front 7 and a big physical OL. NC erased a 24-7 4Q deficit LW driving 91/4pl for a TD to come within 3 but recovered their outside kick a yd short and lost on the road 24-21 to VT. QB Renner is comp 71% but they lost RB Bernard (1057, 5.4) to a concussion 1H (CS). The defense provided constant pressure LW on one of the ACC top OL's and held the FBS's #4 rusher Wilson to 82 yds (3.9). LTH NC held Duke's pass happy off to just 125 tt yds in their 19-6 win (-10). Final home game for the Heels (and HC Withers) who have the off (#36-57) and huge def (#26-91) edges.

BOISE ST 44 Wyoming 20 - BS has won all 5 meeting and did cover LY as a 23' pt AF but WY covered the prev 3. LY BS was off a bye after beating VT while WY was off a trip to Texas playing its 2nd str Top 5 foe. WY is a stellar 6-1 ATS as a conf AD S'/09 and has pulled the outright upset 4 times (incl twice TY). The trend reverses though as WY is 3-8 as a dog of 20+ and BS has been a poor HF TY going 0-4 ATS in that role, failing to cover by 15 ppg with the avg line -25. QB Moore methodically led BS (-18') to a 52-35 win over SDS't LW throwing for 366 with a 4-1 ratio as he is #4 FBS pass eff. In the L/6 he has avg 305 ypg (74%) with a 21-2 ratio. His top target is Shoemaker (800, 16.7, 7 TD) and RB Martin ret'd LW (only 1 series vs TCU) and leads with 885 (4.8, 11 TD). WY became bowl elig with a 31-10 win (-24) over NM and we went against the Pokes with a 2★ winner on these pages. QB Smith is 2nd in the MW only to Moore in tll off as he avg 223 pass ypg (61%, 15-5 ratio) and is the #2 rusher (518, 5.1, 10 TD). BS has the off (#11-71), D (#20-99) and ST's (#24-70) edges but WY is playing with a newfound confidence.

Nevada 38 UTAH ST 31 - Matchup of two of the NCAA's Top 10 rush off (USU #6 274 ypg, UN #9 261 ypg). Since becoming WAC foes ('05) the Pack is 6-0 SU outgaining the Aggies by 131 ypg but USU has covered in the L/2 and has covered 7 of 9. The HT has covered in 5 of the L/6. These two have avg 69 ppg over the L/14 gms with the winner scoring less than 30 pts just once ('98). LW USU continued its late gm heroics w/a 49-42 2OT win (+3') at Idaho as the Aggies posted their 3rd consec win in the final minute. RB Turbin rushed for a career high 208 yds and 3 TD's as USU played in its 7th gm TY decided by one score or less (tied for most TY). UN came into LW's game having scored 42 pts or more in 4 consec gms and riding a 16 gm home win streak before suffering a costly 24-20 (-7) loss to LT. The Pack led 20-3 in the 4Q and held the Bulldogs to just 123 yds (5 rush yds) thru the 1st 3Q's but Tech scored 3 TD's in the final 9:11 incl the GW TD with :51 left to stun the Pack. The line opened at under a FG and UN is 4-0 ATS as a conf AD L/6Y (2-10 ATS as a SD conf AF). USU is just 1-5 SU and 2-4 ATS in home finales. Will the Pack be able to recover after LW's stunning loss or can the Aggies keep their late gm comebacks going?

4★ Houston over JACKSONVILLE - The Texans are 5-1 ATS as a favorite vs the Jaguars winning 24-14 as a 9.5 pt HF in the last meeting. HOU has the #1 and #1 units (+7 TO's) over the L4W w/a 33-11 avg score and that was without Andre Johnson who is expected to return here. HOU is forced to turn to Matt Leinart who has the best RB tandem in the NFL right now in Foster/Tate. They have combined for 1426 yds rushing (4.9) or 225 more yds than the Jaguars. Jags DT Alualu has been playing with a bad knee all year and DT Knighton (ankle) missed the L2W and now they face a top 5 OL here. JAX owns the #32 and #2 units (+4 TO's) the L4W with a 13-12 avg score with a Def ranking fluffed by facing IND/CLE. Gabbert has only cracked 200 yds passing twice TY (CIN/CLE) and if those are removed he's avg'd 115 ypg (47%) with a 5-5 ratio. He now faces a HOU defense that has forced either an int (14) or sack (28, 4th) once every 7.7 pass att's which is in line with Gabbert taking one every 7.5 att's. HOU keeps it simple and goes with their proven talent for the win here.

3★ DALLAS over Miami - Thanksgiving - Despite the short week the Dolphins (5-9 ATS vs NFC) are actually in a decent situation as this is their only road game in a 5 week span. DAL has covered 5 straight Thanksgiving games by a 31-12 avg score. The Cowboys survived a Div road scare at WAS LW winning in OT but now return home where they've topped 430+ yds the last 4 games and Romo is avg outstanding 68% as the OL has allowed only 4 sacks in the 5 games. Miami is 1-4 away (2-3 ATS) and their lone win was very misleading as they beat KC 31-3 but were outFD 20-17 and had 3 TD drives of under 50 yards. Giving this pick even more value is the Dolphins "blowout" win LW as they dominated the Bills 35-8 but were outgained 247-242 which included 23 and 2 yd TD drives. DAL has quality stat edges on the year with the #6 and #10 units (+6 TO's) vs MIA's #23 and #16 units (-6 TO's) and their 3 straight wins have been against a flat KC team an injury depleted WAS and BUF. Look for DAL send their fans home happy once again.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ SEATTLE over Washington - Both teams are off their primary division rivals. SEA has a clear situational edge with WAS having to come cross country here after facing 3 physical defenses. WAS brought its "A" game vs DAL LW as Grossman had the best effort by a Redskins QB TY (289 yds 66% 2-1) since the season opener vs the Giants (305 yds 62% 2-0). With that said Rex is making his first road start since STL on 10/2 and in his 2 games away TY the Skins have scored 15 and 17 points. SEA continues to build confidence and are on a 6-1-1 ATS run with upsets over BAL and STL the L2W. The SEA running game has allowed QB Jackson to use more play action and RB Lynch has now avg'd 111 ypg the L/3. Meanwhile you have to question the psyche of the Skins who are now 3-7 after missing a FG in OT and have lost their last 3 road games to CAR and MIA.

OTHER GAMES

Green Bay at DETROIT - Thanksgiving - The Lions have lost 7 straight Thanksgiving games SU/ATS by a 37-14 avg score. This includes a 34-12 Thanksgiving beating by GB in '09 as 11 pt HD's. DET covered both games LY improving to 3-7 ATS in the series. Rodgers was KO'd of LY's 2nd meeting with a concussion and the Lions ended a 10 game SU losing streak with a 7-3 victory as a 6.5 pt HD. Prior to that Rodgers had avg'd 305 ypg (70%) with a 14-4 ratio vs the Lions. GB has beaten 6 of its L8 foes by 10 or more despite being 5-5 in the yardage battle this year. The Packers lead the NFL by scoring a FG or TD on 52% of their 112 drives and have only had six 3 & outs in the L7 games. DET has definitely improved TY but they can't run the ball right now (#22) and defenses are going all out to contain Megatron who has 3 TD's the L6 games after 8 in the 1st 4. While GB's OL (#20 sks) will have their hands full with the DET pass rush (#7) Rodgers will keep the Packers undefeated.

Turkey Day Play: Green Bay

San Francisco at BALTIMORE - Thanksgiving - Harbaugh Bowl. Sans the Packers it matches teams with the conference's best records. The Ravens proud D missed LB Lewis and was scorched vs Cincy for 483 yds and 23 FD's (both ssn worst). In fact that was only the Ravens 4th game in the L2Y allowing 400+ yds and the following week they allowed 244 yds at STL TY and 289 vs MIA as well as 269 vs NO LY. The 49ers continue to win by running the ball (162 ypg 4.9 L/7 games) and stopping the run (74 ypg 3.6 on the ssn). That will force Flacco to throw which is not the Ravens preferred method of moving the ball and in the 4 games that BAL has failed to reach 100 yds rushing the Ravens have avg'd 264 ypg and 15 ppg. Both teams rank in the top 10 in defensive yds/play and in the top 5 in red zone defense making this a low scoring game.

Turkey Day Play: Under

ST LOUIS 23 Arizona 17 - The Cardinals were outplayed by the Rams in Bradford's return from a high ankle sprain getting outgained 400-262 in the 1st matchup TY. Special teams blunders cost STL the game as they had a 42 yd FG blocked on the final play of reg and gave up a 99 yd PR for TD after the 1st drive of OT to lose. This is ARZ's 4th road game in 5 Wks and they are off their rivalry game vs SF with DAL on deck. The Skelton offense caught up to ARZ LW as they were lucky to be down 9-0 at the half. SF had 12-2 FD and 249-52 yd edges but on 6 drives to the ARZ 31 settled for 3 FG's missing another 3. This exposed ARZ's 2 wins for what they were: defense and special teams victories. ARZ has been held to under 100 yds rushing in 5 of their L6 games while giving up an avg of 142 ypg (4.3) in their L6. STL was held to 185 yds LW as they played without both OT's due to injury after benching their #1 Ctr the week before. SEA's front 7 stacked up vs Jackson who was held to 42 yds (2.8) and 13 of their first 14 drives ended as a punt or TO. We'll side with the home team with the situational edge vs an ARZ team that came back to earth LW.

NY JETS 27 Buffalo 17 - After 2 nationally televised losses the Jets are firmly in desperation mode here. They beat BUF 27-11 as a 2.5 pt AD off the bye in the 1st meeting. BUF was held to 3 FD and 77 yds with drives ending in 4 punts, 3 TO's and 1 SOD. Sanchez has been less than inspiring the L2W with 279 ypg (56%) and a 1-3 ratio and is likely to be playing hurt after LB Miller blasted him LW. After a great start to the season, injuries are catching up to the Bills lack of depth. Already without #1 Ctr Wood (toner ACL) on a beat up OL the Bills were down to 3 healthy WR's during LW's game. This allowed MIA to tee off on RB Jackson (17 yds 2.4) and Fitzpatrick has been held to under 200 yds net passing for the 3rd straight week with a 2-7 ratio. Defensively the Bills issues are deeper than their #26 ranking as they've allowed 11 TD's on their L34 drives since the bye. Look for the Jets to be refreshed with the extra rest and angry after letting LW's game slip thru their fingers and the Bills fall below .500.

CINCINNATI 27 Cleveland 13 - The dog improved to 8-1 ATS in the series when CIN beat CLE 27-17 as a 6.5 pt AD in Wk 1. CLE clawed back from a 13-0 deficit in the 1Q to take a 17-13 lead mid-Q3. Late in the 4Q the Browns didn't see their defense and CIN quick snapped with AJ Green getting the go ahead 41 yd TD

SMU 34 Rice 17 - SMU has won B2B gms but Rice has covered 5 str and 8 of 9. LY SMU led 28-10 into the 4Q and 42-17 before all'g a couple of gbd TY's (42-31, -11). Rice LW got a win in their home finale but 2W ago were eliminated from a bowl. After going 5-2 as a conf AD in Ballif's 1st 2Y, Rice has gone just 2-9 in that role the L3Y. SMU was hammered LW at the hands of UH. The Mustangs have dropped 4 of 5 and have failed to cover 5 str. SMU is now 2-7-1 as a conf HF in the 3+ yrs under Jones but they have gone 10-1 SU vs conf opp's at home the L3Y. LY Rice was 2-8 and Ballif kept his tm focused going 2-0 SU/ATS to close out and they are in a similar position TY. Jones has gone just 0-4-1 ATS in the home finales and with SMU just 2-12-1 ATS their L4 reg ssn gms (0-3 ATS TY) they need a win in the worst way to not back into most likely the Hawaii Bowl.

OREGON 44 Oregon St 13 - Oregon has won 3 straight but the visitor has covered 5 straight (tms combined for 77 ypg and 949 ypg L/3Y). Bubble burst potential here for UO after dropping a heartbreaker LW against the Trojans, a game in which they trailed 38-14 in the 3Q before missing the game-tying FG with seconds remaining. Despite being limited in the WR corps (missing #2 and #3 WR's for most of the game) the Beavers defense benefited from Wash using a 1st time starter at QB in hostile Corvallis LW in the 38-21 win (outgained UW 484-325). LY UO was down 7-0 but after taking a 9-7 lead never trailed again turning 4 OSU int's into 17 pts. LTH there were 7 lead changes and OSU was forced to kick 4 FG's (40, 28, 29 and 45) as the Ducks came away with a 3 pt non-covering win. UO is 18-8-2 ATS as a

pass. CIN added a 39 yd TD run by Benson while they were trying to run out the clock. Dalton (81 yds 67% 1-0) was KO'd late in the 1H vs McCoy with 213 yds (48%) with a 2-1 ratio. CIN showed a lot of toughness vs BAL LW as despite 3 int's by Dalton they outgained the Ravens 483-373. CIN had a 1st & goal at the BAL 7 with :50 left to send it into OT but an intentional grounding penalty on 2nd Dn set up a sack on 4th Dn for the loss (4-8 ATS after SU loss). CLE was at home for the 2nd straight vs a JAX team on the road for the 2nd straight. CLE drove down to the JAX 20 4 times with 2 TD, a missed FG and an int but still haven't scored a TD in the 1st or 3rd Qtrs TY. They have only avg'd 258 ypg and 16.5 ppg on the road TY with 4 of their next 5 on the road now. CIN gets right here and stays in the playoff chase.

Carolina 21 INDIANAPOLIS 20 - The Colts return off a desperately needed bye (6-0 ATS) with only their 1986 0-13 team having a worse start. There is a strong chance they switch from Painter who has thrown for 100 or less yds in 3 of his L4 games to Dan Orlovsky. Orlovsky started 7 games for DET avg 216 ypg (56%) with a 8-6 ratio and went 5-2 ATS. As their records suggest neither team is statistically impressive the L4W with IND having the #31 and #28 units (-8 TO's) vs CAR having the #11 and #30 units (0 TO's). CAR's #30 rush defense (4.8) and #22 pass rush (19 sks) is a direct result of starting rookie DT's TY along with having 8 different starting LB's due to injuries. This has had a ripple effect as CAR has our #32 special teams unit (6.1 PR off vs 15.6 PR Def w/ 3 TD's). After getting hammered 30-3 by TEN, CAR blew a 24-7 lead mid 2Q to DET. CAR was outgained 282-180 in the 2H getting outscored 35-8. They have allowed a TD/FG on 41.8% of their foes drives which is worse than LY (34%). Teams that are 0-5 or worse off a bye are 16-1-1 ATS and look for the much needed bye to have reenergized a Colts team to make this very close.

TENNESSEE 20 Tampa Bay 17 - This is the 3rd road game in 4 weeks for the Bucs who are 2-3 ATS on the road TY after going 6-0-2 ATS away LY. TB has been outgained 408-341 on the road (-4 TO's) being outscored 31-17 on avg. TB's issues center on Freeman's play TY (6.7 ypa 11-15 ratio) and faces a pretty decent TEN pass defense (#16) which is allowing a 6.5 ypa with a respectable 15-9 ratio. This is the 3rd straight NFC South game for TEN after facing CAR/ATL on the road with a road trip to BUF on deck. TEN has been outscored by 470 yds TY (3.4) vs 124 yds (3.9) at the end of LY. Hasselbeck (elbow strain) left LW's game with Locker stepping in for 140 yds (47%) 2 TD's but Munchak has already stated if healthy he'll go with the vet. TEN still has a good majority of proven players held over from the Fisher era and 3 of their 4 ATS wins are vs sub .500 teams with a 29-9 avg score. TB's ATS win LW was misleading as GB had a bigger game on deck and we'll call for the home team by 3 for now and wait for the QB status.

ATLANTA 28 Minnesota 17 - ATL won the last meeting 24-17 in 2008 as a 3 pt AD. Ponder has 4 full games with the Vikings going 1-3 SU/2-2 ATS. Prior to Ponder, MIN was avg 311 ypg and 20.2 ppg (+4 TO's) and with him at the helm they are avg 343 ypg with 19.8 ppg (-4 TO's). MIN could be coming into ATL without RB Peterson (94 ypg rush 4.7 prior to LW) due to a left ankle sprain. Aside from Jared Allen (13.5 sks) the Vikings defense has been worse than their #20 ranking as they are 29th on 3rd Dn conv and 30th in pts allowed. This is largely due to their #28 pass defense that has given up 259 ypg (67%) with a 19-6 ratio and an 8.0 ypa. They let OAK score on 4 of their first 5 drives LW which was too much for the offense to overcome. ATL had 400-214 yd edge when on 2nd & goal from the TEN 7 Turner fumbled the ball. ATL went prevent defense which allowed TEN to go 84/14 for the backdoor cover. ATL has outgained foes by 141 ypg the L4W, MIN hasn't pulled in an Int in 5 straight games and we'll take the home team building momentum despite LW's results.

Chicago 27 OAKLAND 23 - Statistically this two similar teams with the Bears having the #18 and #14 units (+9 TO's) vs OAK with the #8 and #15 units the L4W and their -3 TO's mark improves to +1 TO's if the KC game is taken out. In the L3 games the Raiders are avg 251 ypg passing (63%) with a 6-4 ratio vs 206 ypg (58%) with a 7-10 ratio with 22.9 ppg prior. Palmer is giving OAK the deep threat strike it lacked with Campbell which has taken a lot of pressure off the #4 rush offense (157 ypg 4.8). After a tough start, Cutler (17-8 SU/14-10-1 ATS w/ Mertz) has avg'd 219 ypg (60%) with an 8-3 ratio and has only been sacked 8 times vs 15 in the first 4 Wks. They have also improved their balance on offense since the DET loss with 162 rushes vs 147 pass att's. OAK deserves to be commended for their record but they are 1-1 SU/ATS vs teams w/a winning record right now losing to NE and beating HOU in an emotional game. We'll side with the road team laden with experienced vets used to big games here if and only if Cutler (brk thumb) starts here.

New England 34 PHILADELPHIA 20 - The Patriots are off LW's MNF game vs KC and only have the Colts on deck. PHI is off LW's SNF game vs the Giants (1-5 ATS afterwards inc playoffs) and have a road game vs SEA on deck in 4 days. NE is 8-3 ATS away vs an NFC team while PHI is 1-5 ATS as a non-conf dog. The 2 key differences here is NE being +3 TO's vs PHI at -7. This has kept NE's depleted #32 defense out of bad spots for the most part even though they are the only team to earn and allow 400 ypg TY. Despite dealing with one of his lower receiving units, Brady has already topped 3,000 yds passing (337 ypg 66% 23-10). He's led NE to a TD or FG on 25 of 56 drives TY (44.1%) on the road. PHI was forced to start Vince Young LW with Vick (ribs) sidelined and its not known how he fared. We do know that PHI is 1-5 SU/ATS vs .500 or better teams right now despite a 442-344 yd edge due to -9 TO's in those games. While PHI OL coach Mudd will give the offense tips on Belichick's defense the Patriots despite their issues have much more going for their right now.

SAN DIEGO 24 Denver 14 - The Chargers are 9-2 SU/ATS vs the Broncos including a 29-24 victory as a 3.5 pt AF in the last meeting. SD had a 23-10 lead at the half with 15-5 FD and 276-109 yd edges with Orton in vs DEN. Tebow started the 2H and while he had just 79 yds passing (40%) he had added a TD pass/run in the 4Q. DEN had a 166-142 yd edge in the 2H and the Chargers admitted they were gassed due to Tebow after the game. DEN is 1-4 SU/ATS without Tebow starting TY being outgained by 82 ypg and outscored 28-21. They are 4-1 SU/ATS with him and minus the DET game are +3 yds. They are +4 TO's in their 4 wins with a 23-16 avg score. With Tebow getting the limelight the defense has been fantastic with a 25% 3rd Dn rate, 105 ypg rushing (3.8) and 15 of their 27 sks. SD has lost 5 straight since the bye due to Rivers inconsistent play (career high 17 int's) and a slew of injuries. However, they do have more talent defensively and more explosive players on offense than DEN has at the moment. Look for SD to get an early lead but for DEN to keep it interesting in the 4Q here.

Pittsburgh at KANSAS CITY - Quite a tough start for KC's QB Palko as his first 2 ever NFL starts were on national TV in LW's game at NE and this week. While Pittsburgh is clearly the better team you must remember that KC is 4-0 ATS as a HD the L2Y winning all of them outright. **Purchase for just \$9 on the NC Sports Debit Card Sunday after 11 am ET. The NFL Marquee Plays as of Presstime are 61% on the season!** **NY Giants at NEW ORLEANS** - A pair of division leaders face off. The Giants can however match up with a strong DL that leads the NFL in sacks and has totaled 4 or more in 4 games vs a Saints unit that lost the only game they allowed over 4 TY (St Louis). **Call after 3:00 pm ET for your Monday Night Magic Winner on your NC Debit Card. Virginia Tech 27 VIRGINIA 17 - Commonwealth Cup and most importantly the battle for the Coastal title. VT has won 7 straight by 20 ppg (6-1 ATS) and cashed 3 straight at Virginia. LY we cashed on a 3★ mid Q3 play on Under 57 and VT led 37-0 before all'g a late TD. VT held off a late rally after leading 24-7 total 4Q for the 24-21 win over NC giving Beamer his 250th win and VT its 8th consecutive 10 win ssn (most FBS). RB Wilson is the FBS's #3 rusher with 1,442 (6.2) while 250 lb QB Thomas is avg 212 ypg (60%) with a 16-7 ratio and has 337 yd rush (3.3). VA is off a thrilling 14-13 (+17) win over FSU setting up this much anticipated showdown. QB Rocco drove VA 75/5pl for a TD with 1:27 left 4Q. On FSU's final drive VA held on 4D but were flagged for a face mask then held on 3&5 as FSU's pass was ruled complete inbounds which would run out the clock and VA headed for the locker room. Replay officials reviewed it for several agonizing minutes and called the play inc giving FSU a FG opp which they missed. VA is avg 188 rush ypg (4.5) but were held to a ssn low 89 (3.2) vs #4 def and now face VT all'g 105 (3.3). QB Rocco has a 10-2 ratio the L4. LTH UVA was a 15' pt HD and only trailed 14-13 at HT but was outscored 28-0 in the 2H. Beamer is 16-4 ATS as a conf AF while UVA went 1-3 ATS as a conf HD in London's 1st year but beat GT TY 24-21 (+7). VT has the edge on off #29-50, def #13-37 and exp as Beamer/Foster are 18-4 down the stretch since '04.

Over 29 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 202-147 incl 9-3 75% with **SIX OUTRIGHT WINS TY!!** Over the last 12 years the Underdog Play has added **41 OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS to the incredible record!**

Mississippi (+18) over MISS ST

The HT had won 6 straight prior to Miss St's road win LY and Mullen is 2-0 SU/ATS vs Nutt (the only SU W's vs SEC West in 3Y, 4-10 ATS). LY Miss ST jumped out to 31-9 lead, but Ole Miss got the ball back down 8 with 2:30 left but couldn't mount a drive. Mullen is 2-0 ATS as a conf HF. LW both tms were mauled by the elite of the SEC West as we cashed our Top Weekly LPS against the Bulldogs in their 44-17 loss (+13) to Ark. HC Mullen has used up to 3 QB's in recent wks but LW Relf (concussion) DNP while Russell/Favre were ineffective as they were outgained 539-211. Meanwhile Ole Miss starting QB Mackey and leading rusher Scott were susp'd for LW's LSU gm (CS) and the Rebels were pounded 52-3 (+31) in the loss to #1 LSU. The Rebels have lost 6 str gms and a schl rec'd 13 str conf gms. MSU needs a win for a bowl and is looking to win 3 str Egg Bowls for the 1st time S/'42. This is unique territory for the Bulldogs however being a DD conf fav for only the 3rd time in 11Y (beat UK 28-16, -10 TY) and have been a DD fav only once in this series in the L/35Y losing outright 21-17 as a 14 pt fav in 1981. While the Bulldogs have won 3 str at home, the dog has covered all 3 and expect inspired performance in Nutt's farewell.

WISCONSIN 27 Penn St 17 - PSU has dominated in B2B gms covering by 35 and 24' pts. In fact the fav has now covered 6 str in this series (last met in '08). UW is 8-2 ATS as a conf HF the L3Y. LY was the 1st time in 4 sns that PSU was a conf AD and they went 0-2 (Iowa and OSU). In that '08 meeting we gave out PSU (-6) as the TV Play of the Day and they won 48-7. UW is 14-4-2 ATS in Camp Randall finales. Using healthy doses of the wildcard to keep OSU honest the Lions jumped out to a 20-14 HT lead and before shutting out the Bucks in the 2H to win a share of the Leaders title. With #1 rusher Redd (1122, 5.2) banged up (8-63), Green ran for 93 yd and 2 TD while the D forced 2 crucial 2H TO's in the win. QB McGloin (134, 54%, 7-4) went the distance for the 2nd straight gm after alternating in the 1st 9. Lions are #8 FBS til D and have forced a B10 best 25 TO's. Wisky trailed IL 14-0 before rallying for a 28-17 non-covering (-14') win as we won yet another Underdog POW. UW was held to a ssn low 285 yds and were helped out by IL errors which set up scoring drives of 44, 39, 30 and 2 yds. B10's #1 rusher Ball (1466, 6.6) was the star with 224 yds. Badgers allow 162 rush ypg (4.2) in conf play. This is the last of a tough, emotional 3 gm stretch for the Lions who are 1-8 ATS as a DD dog but the winner takes all here for a trip to Indianapolis.

FLORIDA 21 Florida St 20 - UF had won 6 str prior to LY and they are 5-2 ATS. They've won the L/3 at home by an avg score of 39-10. FSU is off disappointing 14-13 to VA LW as Mr. Automatic K Hopkins (20-23) missed a 42 yd GW FG after replay officials put time back on the clock after the out pass to Reed who was unable to get OOB, but the review overturned the call to an inc pass. This is the 2nd wk FSU has had sloppy perf being flagged for 81 pen incl 3 on a big PR that would have put them in VA terr and also settled for a FG after having 1agl at the VA1 in 3Q. Manuel is avg 235 ypg (66%) with a 16-8 ratio while the run gm is avg 126 ypg (3.8). FSU was off a 5 gm win streak vs teams with a comb 20-35 record. LY was a diff scenario with FSU having the ACC Champ game on deck and now come in off a tough home loss while UF just had a tune-up gm a 54-32 win over Furman. UF struggled early all g a ssn high 22 pts in the 1Q and trailed 22-7 vs an FCS team, before outscoring them 47-10 in the final 3Q. While the offenses are close (UF #41-42), FSU has the def edge (#4-23) and this gm features 2 of the FBS's best ST units #1 FSU vs #4 UF.

East Carolina 27 MARSHALL 24 - There are 18 teams that have not yet been eliminated from bowl consideration or have become bowl eligible and this is the only matchup among them. EC has covered B2B games 4 of the last 6. MU is off B2B AG's but did have a bye prior while EC is playing their 10th str wk. LW on a Thurs Night MU overcame 6 TO's coming back from a 22-10 4Q deficit to not only keep their bowl hopes alive but CUSA East Title hopes as well. Despite a wrath of inj's (WR/RB/OL) EC kept its bowl hopes alive in their home finale. Pirates are 0-2 as a conf AD TY being outgained by 232 ypg. MU has been outgained in conf action by 81 ypg while EC has outgained conf foes by 61 ypg. The Herd have won 6 str CUSA HG's (4-2 ATS) and are 12-2 SU and 8-4 ATS in home finales. EC is 11-19 ATS in Nov AG's. EC yr play another winner-take-all gm for the 2nd str wk with high emotion as they look to bowl for a 6th str yr but MU still has an outside shot at the CUSA Title (SM loss and MU win).

LOUISIANA TECH 41 New Mexico St 20 - The HT is 8-2 SU and 5-2 ATS since joining the WAC. In the L/6 gms, LT has been a DD fav 3 times and NMST once with the DD fav going 4-0 ATS. Both tms are on ATS streaks (LT covered in 8 of L/9, NMST in 7 of L/9). The Aggies are 8-2 ATS as a conf AD under HC Walker and have also gone Over in 7 of their L/8 gms. NMST is coming off a 4-2 SU (+22) at BYU. QB Christian (12-23-98) tied the game at 7 in the 2Q with a TD pass but left in the 3Q (banged up most of yr, CS). LT is coming off a huge win LW at Nev. After trailing 20-3 in the 4Q (had just 123 yds thru the 1st 3Q's), LT erupted for 289 4Q yds and scored 3 TD's in the final 9:11 incl the GW TD with :51 left to stun the Wolf Pack 24-20 (+7). The win was LT's 6th consec victory (most S/'99), putting the Bulldogs in the driver's seat for the WAC Title. QB Cameron was 25-45-355 and 3 TD's (all in 4Q). LT has held all L/11 opp TY below their ssn rush avg and has a +15 TO margin during its win streak. Look for the Bulldogs to wrap up the WAC Title here.

SOUTHERN MISS 48 Memphis 13 - SM has won and covered B2B, both as a DD fav but in the L11Y neither tm has won or covered 3 str. SM is 7-4 as a conf HF incl a DD cover TY vs Rice. SM is off just its 2nd loss of the ssn as LW on Thurs Night they outgained UAB by nearly 100 yds (led 14-0 early). Under Fedora after a road loss when playing at home the foll wk SM is 4-0 SU (3-1 ATS) outscoring foes by 37 ppg and outgaining them by 192 ypg. UM suffered another demoralizing loss LW on Thurs Night up 22-10 in the 4Q (lost 2W ago taking a 35-17 lead in the 4Q). UM has gone 1-19 SU/7-13 ATS in CUSA action while SM is on a 14-7 SU/ATS run. SM is 15-4 ATS vs UM with huge edges (off #26-116, def #54-115 and ST #21-92). Under Fedora in the L4 reg ssn gms (incl 3 TY) SM is 10-5 SU/11-4 ATS. UM can't wait to get another disappointing ssn over with and SM needs a win to clinch the CUSA East and a spot in the conf champ gm next wk. The Eagles are 8-1 SU and 7-2 ATS in home finales and Fedora will stress harder TW in practice winning at "The Rock".

Air Force 34 COLORADO ST 28 - AF has won 5 str (avg score 38-20) and covered 3 str prior to LY. CSU was a 24 pt dog, was even in TO's and was only outgained by 12 yds but still needed to go 92/16pl, convert on 42 and score with :41 left to only lose by 22. LW AF delivered a 2★ on these pages with a 45-17 win (-24) over UNLV, keeping their bowl hopes alive. A surprising stat is that QB Jefferson has never had a 100 yd rushing gm, but CSU all's 224 ypg rush (#113 FBS). CSU clearly caught TCU in a hangover off the Boise win as the Rams only lost 34-10 (+34) and CSU had a 408-372 yd edge. Str Thomas DNP, but true Grayson threw for 248 yds (58%) with a 1-1 ratio. RB Nwoko (232 yd vs SDS) was held to 60 but still leads with 846 (5.1, 7 TD). CSU is 6-3 ATS as a conf HD under Fairchild and playing in what could be Fairchild's final game, but Falcons are 7-4 as an AF under Calhoun and this is a must win for them.

Washington 37 Wash St 30 - CenturyLink Field, Seattle. UW began renovating their stadium after Oregon so this HG moved here as will all HG's for 2012. It's ironic that the Cougars are the only one of the two that have actually played here this ssn, a 44-21 (-3) loss to Oregon St. WSU saw its bowl aspirations end in OT LW in Pullman vs Utah as despite a small yardage edge, QB Halliday threw 4 int's (incl 1 in OT) in his 1st career start. Halliday suffered a lacerated liver and was hospitalized leaving the job to Lobbestael (224, 60%, 16-7). The Huskies struggled on the road LW vs the Beavers in QB Montana's 1st career start for an inj'd

Price who actually came in for a few drives in the 4Q to att the comeback. Price should start here but expect RB Palk to carry the load as he's comb to rush for 414 yds (7.8) and 3 TD's in his 2 sts vs WSU. UW has won B2B games SU/ATS (9-4 SU, 10-5 ATS run) but the Cougars have actually won 2 of the L/4 and 4 of the L/7. After WSU tied it with 4:26 left LY, UW changed their mind on their final drive deciding against a long FG and got a 15 yd tkl breaking run on 4th down and a 27 yd TD pass for the win and cover w/44 left. The Huskies are in need of a win here after losing 4 of their L/5 to build some confidence heading into their bowl game.

STANFORD 34 Notre Dame 31 - Stanford has knocked off ND in B2B games for the first time in the series' 25 game history incl LY on the road when the Cardinal dominated the LOS with QB Crist under heavy pressure throughout and ND lost at home 37-14 (ND gained 141 of their 351 yds on the L/2 drives). LTH the Cardinal were a 10 pt fav and won 45-38 making the dog 6-1 ATS when the game is at Stanford. In that game ND led 14-7 after 1Q, 24-20 at HT and 31-27 into the 4Q. After a bubble bursting loss to Oreg, Stanford struggled LW en route to a 3 pt victory over Cal and a 2nd str ATS loss (had covered 12 str prior) Despite a 419-262 yd edge the Irish recovered a late onside kick to hold onto a 2 pt win over BC and were dealt a blow when RB Gray (791, 6.9, 12 TD) went down with inj (OFY). The tms are close on off (SU #5-13) and D (#11-22) but sked edge goes to Stanford who is playing its 3rd str at home while the Irish are playing their 3rd away from home in 4W but the Irish D (#11-22) keeps it close.

FRESNO ST 34 San Jose St 31 - FSU has won 16 of the L/17 gms incl 4 straight (only loss in '06). SJSJt hasn't won in Fresno S/'87 dropping 11 str trips by 22 ppg (incl the L/6 by 32 ppg). FSU is on a 5-2-1 ATS run in this series S/'03 and the fav is 6-1-1 ATS (LTH was a push). The HT 6-2-1 S/'02. After rushing for just 134 yds (45 ypg, 1.9) in the previous 3 gms (all losses), SJSJt's finally got its running gm in gear as RB Rutley rushed for 132 yds and 2 TD's (also career-high 8 rec for 101 yds) and QB Faulkner was 33-44-345 and threw the GW TD in the 4Q in a 27-24 (+5) win over Navy. LW FSU took a 17-0 2Q lead at Hawaii before falling behind 21-17 but QB Carr (19-29-271) connected on a 4Q TD pass to lift the Bulldogs to a 24-21 win (+5') to snap a 3-gm losing streak. RB Rouse added a ssn high 176 yds in the victory. FSU is 0-10-1 ATS as a conf fav but SJSJt is just 1-18 SU in AG's the L/3 yrs. While bowl hopes have been dashed for both tms, these two will battle for regional pride in this one.

OKLAHOMA 48 Iowa St 17 - OU has won 12 straight in this series and has covered 5 of 6 incl 3 straight at home. LY's mauling was also at Norman as OU finished with a 672-184 yd edge in the 52-0 shutout. OU is 13-7 ATS as a conf HF (1-2 TY). ISU has gone 8-3 ATS as a DD conf dog under Rhoads incl upsets of Neb (+20), Texas (+20), TT (+14) with the biggest yet LW over #2 OSU (+27). ISU is 0-3 ATS the gm after those big wins. The Cyclones stunningly outFD'd (33-24) and outgained (568-536) the mighty OSU offense and treated the Cowboys to a bit of their own medicine by forcing 5 TO's incl an int in 2OT. ISU is now 3-0 SU/2-1 with QB Barnett under C. Cyclones are #60 pass eff D (243, 58%, 15-8). OU's national title aspirations were snuffed out by Baylor as the Bears used big plays and TO's to stop the Sooners. RG3 hit the gm winning 34 yd TD pass with :28 left for their 1st ever W over OU (0-20). QB Jones (380, 65%, 28-10) threw a crucial pick at the BU26 in his 1st start minus FBS's all-time rec leader Broyles whose replacement Franks fmb'd at the BU31. De Lewis (#3 B12 flt) may be OFY (knee, CS). Under Stoops OU is 18-7 ATS off of a SU loss and the Sooners have won 8 straight home finales by an avg of 32 ppg. Check out the system on pg 8 and even with Bedlam on deck, OU needs momentum for the de facto B12 title gm.

San Diego St 34 UNLV 24 - SDSJt is 8-1 ATS in series (5 str covers). LTH SDSJt was a 6 pt dog and finished with a 445-397 yd edge but after leading 21-14 mid-3Q all'd 2 TD drives and also threw a pick 6 and lost 28-24. HC Long had said that SDSJt tends to come out overexerted in big gms and that held true again LW as early TO's set up BS for TD "drives" of 24, 10 and 23 yds. SDSJt RB Hillman ply'd sparingly (CS), but Muema filled in with 119 yds (9.2) and 3 TD's (2 rush, 1 rec). SDSJt (+18') fell 52-35 despite only being outgained 497-470 and outFD'd 26-24. Lindley threw for a ssn high 350 yds but WR's still struggled with drops and wrong routes. LV's road woes cont'd as they were dominated by AF 45-17, delivering a 2★ on these pages. A bright spot for LV has been the run gm that has avg 230 ypg (5.0) the L/4 vs 132 (3.3) the 1st 6. The HT is 6-1 SU and SDSJt is 2-3 SU here with their SU wins by 8 and 7 pts. LY marked the 1st time in 5Y that SDSJt was a conf AF and they are now 0-3-1 ATS in that role. LV is 15-6 ATS as a conf HD incl 3-0 TY.

HAWAII 41 Tulane 20 - TU's last trip here was in '02, a 36-28 upset (+14) over UH in the Hawai'i Bowl as a 3★ on these pages. TU held Rice to just 237 tkl yds LW but fell 19-7 (+14) en route to dropping its 9th consec gm (outscored by 25 ppg during the losing streak). TU is just 28-51-1 ATS S/'05 and is on a 6-14 ATS skid, but the Green Wave is 7-4 ATS in its L/11 AG's. UH suffered a 24-21 loss (-5') to Fresno LW as the Warriors fell behind 17-0 early 2Q before rallying behind QB Graves (13-27-199, 2 TD) who replaced Austin (6-13-45, started for inj'd Moniz), but it wasn't enough as UH lost its 3rd consec gm. The Green Wave is playing its 2nd consec AG and its 3rd AG in 4W while making the long trip here. The Warriors backs are against the wall as they have two non-conf gms remaining (BYU next week) and must win both to become bowl eligible. UH comes into this game completely focused while hoping TU treats it more like a season-ending vacation.

WKU 27 Troy 24 - Troy has won all 4 but only covered LY and that was by 1 point. In that game they were tied at 14 into the 4Q before 2 Troy TD's. LTH Troy only led 21-20 at HT in their non-covering win (40-20, -24). Hilltoppers are in a rare fav role here as since becoming limited they've been a conf HF only 3 times, but have dropped all 3. This is only the second time they are a conf fav TY as they won in that role LW at N Texas 31-21 (-3), are bowl eligible for the 1st time and have won 8 str ATS! After gaining 214 yds LW, RB Rainey is now #2 FBS with 1,468 (4.5) which doesn't bode well for Troy as the Trojans are all g' 179 rush ypg to conf foes. Troy is 5-1-1 as a conf AD incl 1-0 TY. They snapped a 5 gm losing streak LW, crushing winless FAU 34-7. QB Robinson threw for 396 yds (67%, 3-1 ratio). WKU will have a significant ST edge #39-94. This is WKU's reg ssn finale and last chance to audition for a bowl invite while Troy travels to Ark ST next week.

ARIZONA 41 Louisiana 31 - First meeting. Only 2nd time in 25Y UA has not closed vs ASU. UA is 12-8 ATS as a HF, 8-5 ATS as a DD fav and is on a 6-3 ATS run vs non-BCCS tms. UL did go 6-1 ATS as an AD LY yet lost 6 games by 20+ pts and is 5-0 with 3 outright upsets as an AD TY. In the L2Y they've played 3 BCCS teams on the road going 2-1 ATS losing by an avg score of 53-21 with an avg line of +32. Ragin Cajuns are off a much needed bye after opening with 11 str gms. Despite losing their last game they will be on a high after getting a bowl invite TW for the first time in school history. QB Gautier is #24 in the nation in pass eff throwing for 2,173 yds (63%) with a 19-5 ratio. Arizona won a back and forth game vs their rival LW, coming back from 27-17 in the 4Q to win 31-27. QB Foles is #3 FBS with 3,982 yds (69%) with a 25-13 ratio. Louisiana's opportunistic def has an FBS high pick 6's TY. Arizona with a huge off edge (#25-83) and are much more battle tested (#2-113 sked edge). Wildcats have won 6 str at home vs non-conf foes by 28 ppg and while they make it 7 str here, this one will be closer.

Fiu 34 MIDDLE TENN 24 - MT has won 4 of 5 incl winning and covering B2B games. LY FIU led 14-0 and later 17-14 at HT. MT got the go ahead TD with 7:26 left and FIU went 3&out and on their last pass got to the MT26 but Hilton fmb'd. That cost FIU the outright Sun Belt title. Blue Raiders found themselves down 25-2, but battled back to 25-9 at HT, before giving up 20 unanswered LW and falling to Ark ST 45-19. QB Murphy made his 1st career start throwing for 219 (58%, 1-0 ratio). FIU had a commanding 28-7 2Q lead over ULM LW and held on for a 28-17 win despite being outgained and outFD'd. QB Carroll didn't start for the 2nd str game, but came off the bench after newly named starter Medlock was inj'd on the 2nd play of the game and threw for 213 (47%) with a 3-0 ratio. MT has been a conf HD only ONCE in 7Y ('08 +6 Troy, 17-31) while FIU has been a conf AF only 7 times in their history and lost in that role earlier TY (-3 WKU 9-10). Despite being bowl eligible, FIU isn't guaranteed a spot and still needs to look good here.

Uab 34 FLORIDA ATLANTIC 23 - Fourth straight year they've met (only gms) with FAU winning 2 of 3 as a 13 pt fav in '08 and as a 14 pt dog LY. We used FAU as the Big Dog POW and they trailed 28-12 mid-3Q. They scored on a 38 yd TD run with 2:20 left for their first lead then UAB had a 28 yd FG blocked on the final play. UAB came back from 14 down to pull off one of the biggest upsets in school history LW beating Southern Miss 34-31 (+24)! Under QB Perry, UAB is 3-1 ATS on the road incl their last road game pulling the largest comeback in school history (down 35-17 4Q) in their only role as an AF. UAB has a couple of extra days rest off that Thurs game for this ssn finale while FAU hosts ULM next week. The Owls are the only winless FBS team losing yet again LW 34-7 to Troy. They've lost 6 str ATS and have given up 400+ yds 6 times TY! UAB HC Callaway is 2-1 as an AF and will be coaching his last game as UAB has 5 str losing seasons under his tutelage, but he goes out the winner of B2B gms here.
