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### NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK TWO 2011

**NEWS AND NOTES** - Rutgers was not as impressive as the final indicates vs NC Central. Starting QB Dodd engineered 3 scoring drives in the 1H but Rutgers only finished with a 347-120 yd edge. Leading 21-0, RU blew it open scoring 2 defensive TD's in a :45 span when DL Vallone fell on a fmb! in the EZ for a TD and 2 plays later Harmon got a 37 yd IR TD to make it 35-0. Backup QB Gary Nova who hit 6-17-97, led the team on a 57/3pl with a 44 yd TD pass then a 10 yd drive for a 36 yd FG (after fmb!) and a 54/14pl drive for a 22 yd FG with 10:35 left to close out the scoring. NC Central was sacked 9 times and turned it over 4 times...Utah jumped out to a 24-0 lead vs Montana St but only had 16-12 FD and 292-258 yd edges. They had an 8 yd TD drive after a 35 yd IR, and hit a 37 yd FG after a blk'd punt...Dave Clawson has done a great job at Bowling Green and a great job in openers. This year they were an underdog at Idaho and gave up a TD on the first drive and were SOD at the UI39 on their first drive but BG scored TD's on their next 4 poss followed by a FG and led 30-7 at the half with a 377-179 yd edge. UI pulled within 30-15 with 14:44 left in the game but IU was pinned at their 2 and tackled for a safety and after punting on their next poss, UI fmb!d at their own 30 & 49 on the final 2. BG finished with a 478-280 yd edge...FIU only had 22-17 FD and 401-301 yd edges but NT's 2 TD's both came via the defense. FIU got a 62 yd KR by TY Hilton and drove 29/4pl for a TD then after NT was SOD at the FIU40, got a 60/1pl TD pass to Hilton, 14-0. FIU went 93/9pl for a TD then after a fmb!, 33/2pl for a TD and led 28-0. It was 31-7 at the half with FIU having a 284-100 yd edge. NT did miss 48 and 41 yd FG's in the 3Q and trailed 41-14 and were SOD at the 1 yd line with 1:23 left but got a safety on the next play...WKU had a 13-11 FD edge vs Kentucky and the D's dominated with 19 punts. WKU had a slim 234-190 yd edge. UK's 2 scoring "drives" were a 22 yd TD drive in the 2Q (after an int) to lead 7-3 at the half. UK, on 3&14, got a 58 yd run by Newton down to the WKU26 and on 2&15, a 31 yd TD pass with 4:35 left to make it 14-3 and that was the final...Miss St's offense rolled up 405 yards in the 1H and finished with a school record 645 total yards. Memphis didn't cross midfield until the 2Q. Miss St avg over 9 ypp and finished with a 645-338 yd edge...It sure was an exciting Friday night ESPN game and Baylor's offense was very impressive. TCU has led the nation in defense the L3Y and in their worst game LY they allowed 361 yards. Baylor amassed a surprising 367 yards in the 1H! TCU did miss 2 FG's and 2 xp's in the first 3Q's and trailed 47-23 but charged back to take the lead 48-47 with 4:31 left. TCU had their streak of 25 consecutive reg ssn games snapped in this loss. Baylor had not beaten a ranked team since 2004. Last year TCU had beat BU 45-10. TCU drove for TD's on the next 3 poss and got two 2 pt conv but had the 3rd one go off of the WR's hands to trail 47-45. QB Griffin fumbled and TCU took over at the BU39 but settled for a 27 yd FG with 4:27 left. BU then hit a 3&10, 15 yd pass for a FD and continued on a drive to get a 37 yd FG with 1:04 left. TCU got to the BU40 but on 3&10 was int'd at the 20 and BU held on for the upset...The Connecticut game was moved from Thurs to Sat due to the use of their home stadium by Hurricane Irene relief staff. RFR TB Lyle McCombs ran for 141 yards and 4 TD's with 2 in each half. UC used all 3 QB's and they combined to hit 12-21-228 yds. Fordham was 5-6 LY and was playing their first FBS foe since 1954 as they just began offering scholarships last year. UC finished with a 21-8 FD and 434-169 yd edges...Ohio St rolled over Akron with 27-5 FD and 517-90 yd edges and Joe Bauserman started and QB'd all but 1 poss in the 1H with Braxton Miller's only pass resulting in a punt. Bauserman led 4 TD drives but Miller, after another punt on his first poss of the 2H, did guide 59/6 and 38/4pl TD drives and his final drive got them to the Akron 15 yd line where they ran out the clock. Bauserman hit 12-16-163 and Miller was 8-12-130 playing with mostly backups in the 2H...The defending National Champs Auburn Tigers were generally outplayed at home by Utah St. USU had a 27-17 FD and 448-364 yd edges and twice led by double digits. They led 21-7 before the half when AU benefitted from a 97 yd KR TD. At the end of the game, USU scored a TD with just 3:38 left to lead 38-28. AUB got a 15 TD pass on 3&gl with 2:07 left then recovered an onside kick and got a TD with :31 left to escape with a 4 pt home win...Boston College was without top RB Montel Harris and Northwestern was without QB Dan Persa. Kain Colter replaced Persa hitting 17-24-197 and ran for 71 more with a TD. BC's top RB was Andre Williams who came in questionable but rushed 22 times for 114 yards. NU trailed 10-3 but tied it 10-10 on a TD with :38 left in the half then opened the 3Q with a 60/12pl drive for a TD to lead 17-10. They extended it to 24-10 in the 4Q but BC got a TD with 6:00 left and NU was stopped on 4&1 with 1:37 left. BC took over at their 36 and got 3 FD's to the NU19 but Rettig scrambled under pressure and was tk'd on the final play. BC finished with a 474-424 yd edge...Purdue once again lost their QB early in the season and they were without their #2QB

as well. Caleb TerBush hit 19-33-219 as the 3rd string QB and also threw the 35 yd game winning TD pass in the final minute. Middle Tenn had a 460-420 yd edge. MTSU trailed for just 5:22 of the 1H and led most of the 2H. PU got a FG with 5:57 left to pull within 3 and a TD with :49 left to take the lead. MTSU went 50 yards and lined up for the game tying 47 yd FG but it was blk'd by Ricardo Allen...Alabama's 2 QB's both tossed a pair of int's but Bama dominated with a 482-90 yd edge and Kent St's only score came on a 3 yd "drive" for a TD

following one of the int's. Bama had a 24-6 FD edge. Trent Richardson only had 37 yards rushing but had 3 TD's. At the half Bama had a 257-22 yd and 13-1 FD edges...Bryn Renner made an outstanding debut for UNC. He completed his first 8 passes and finished 22-23-277 but had 1 int. UNC blasted FCS power James Madison 42-10 with 24-10 FD and 461-211 yd edges. Renner set the ACC record for highest single game completion % (95.7%) and he also scored a TD on a sneak early in the 4Q. Everett Withers had his coaching debut and it was very similar to what Butch Davis did in his first game as that UNC squad led JM 30-7 at the half and won 37-14...The Houston Cougars had a nice advantage vs UCLA in that temps were in the 90's and humid. Los Angeles had not been above 75° the entire month of August. UCLA also lost QB Prince in the 2Q to concussion. Richard Brehaut hit 17-26-264 yards. UH took over with :35 left in the half and got a TD on a 64/2pl drive, the TD coming with :08 left to lead 31-14. UH led 38-28 and had the ball with 1:59 left but gave up a TD pass with 1:19 left and then had to recover the onside kick to hold on for the win. UCLA finished with a 554-469 yd edge...Lane Kiffin continues to try some crafty things and it basically kept Minnesota in the game. LY he missed three 2 pt conv which basically cost them the cover vs the Gophers. Again USC tried 2 pt conv's after each of their first 2 TD's and once again came up short on both and only led 12-0. In the 3Q leading 19-3 Kiffin went for it on 4th&6 at the UM36 and the snap went over the QB's head for a huge loss with UM recovering at the 30 and setting up a TD. On their next drive USC was SOD on 4&1 at the UM20. UM actually pulled within 19-17 with 8:03 left and had the ball with backup QB Shortell in at their own 29 but were int'd at the 42 with :53 left. QB MarQueis Gray was inj'd and Shortell hit 7-13-98...It was an interesting game with Colorado St/ New Mexico. Each team missed a FG in the 1Q and NM fumbled at the CSU1. CSU got a TD with 1:32 left in the half to lead 7-3 but NM went 80/8pl getting a 3rd & 16, 27 yd TD pass with :12 left. That TD was their first TD in an opener since 2005 and gave them a 10-7 lead. CSU was SOD on 4&10 at the NM38 and missed a chipshot 28 yd FG early 4Q. CSU took the lead with a 40/11pl drive for a TD with 7:17 left. NM's hopes appeared out the window when on 4th & 14 they were sacked for a 7 yd loss at the CSU36 but CSU made a daring call going for it on 4&1 with 1:57 left and they were SOD. NM got 2 FD's to the 19 but another FD to the 5 was called back on a hold. On 3rd & 6 QB Austen was sk'd & fmb!d with :09 left at the CSU18...Houston Hutt was hoping for a heat advantage over BYU which plays in the altitude but with Tropical Storm Lee blooming, it was in the 80's under overcast skies. This was a defensive struggle as each team got a defensive TD and Ole Miss blew a 13-0 4Q lead, losing by 1. The winning score came when BYU fell on a fmb! in the EZ for a TD with 5:26 left...Howard Schnellenberger was not on the sidelines for the Florida game as his hip acted up and he was having severe discomfort and made a hospital trip on Friday. UF dominated in Muschamp's debut scoring on their first 4 poss and led 24-0 with FAU not picking up their first FD until 3:00 was left in the half. FAU did have a 1st&gl at the UF 4 and settled for a 26 yd FG and then missed a 34 yd FG with :05 left in the half, both following UF int's on their 5th & 6 poss. UF blk'd a punt and ret'd it 22 yds for a TD with 10:09 left 3Q but had a 1st&gl at the FA6 and was int'd in the EZ. UF's final score came on a 29 yd FG with 1:46 left to make it 41-3 and they had 30-11 FD and 468-137 yd edges...Oklahoma St's defense was better than the stats and the score indicate. They led ULL 21-3 in the 2Q and allowed just 113 yards at the half. UL got a 37 yd IR TD by Bentley and 50 yd IR TD by Moten which pulled them within 44-20. In the 4Q trailing 51-20, UL went 82/15pl for a TD and then trailing 61-27 they took over with 2:52 left and went 80/9pl for a 3 yd TD run with :17 left. The much anticipated debut of OSU OC Todd Monken saw the team roll up 666 yards, 9th best in school history...Pitt missed a couple of FG's in the 1H and only led 7-3 despite a 168-119 yd edge. They did get a key play in the 3Q with a 47 yd IR to the Buffalo 20 setting up a TD to make it 14-3. BUF pulled within 21-16 with 13:44 left but Pitt drove 60/6pl for a TD to make it 28-16 with 12:04 left. BUF was SOD at the Pitt38 (5:25) but Pitt fmb!d back. BUF was SOD at the PIT12 with 2:44 left and Pitt went 88/5pl getting a TD with 1:49 left to clinch it...Bill Callahan switched Nebraska from an option to a pro-style pass attack and Bo Pellini has slowly been switching the Huskers back. Their new OC, Tim Beck, is bringing the option back to the offense and his first call as a coordinator was a run to the FB which just happened to be the first time the Huskers had a FB carry the ball since 2004. Taylor Martinez rushed for 135 yards and passed for just 116 in the more option based offense. The Huskers led 23-0 at the half and 40-7 after 3Q's going through the motions in the 4Q and showing very little with a 365-230 yard edge.

**FOURTEEN POINT SWINGS** - The Michigan/Western Michigan game was an unusual one. It was called with 1:27 left in the 3Q which actually made it an unofficial game in Las Vegas (55 min must be played, 60 for a total). While UM appeared to have an easy 24 pt win, WM shot itself in the foot in the 1Q. They took their opening drive 74/15pl for a TD, got their 2nd drive to the UM21 where they missed a 38 yd FG. The key play of the game happened when WM went on an 8 play drive. On 2nd & gl from the 5, they had a pass that was tipped and not only int'd, but ret'd 94 yds for a TD and a 14 pt swing, so instead of leading 14-7 they trailed 14-7. Later, down 20-10 at midfield QB Carder was hit & fmb!d and Herron ret'd the fumble 28 yds for a TD to open it up 27-10. Herron became the first player in UM history to have 2 defensive TD's in the same game...Washington St QB Jeff Tuel fractured his left clavicle and it's not known how long he'll be out. Idaho St was just 1-10 last year and has a JC QB in Kevin Yost and could surprise. Yost hit 32-45-386 yds vs the Cougars but in fairness, WSU did lead 40-0 at the half. It was 33-0 when WSU got a 61 yd Hail Mary on the final play of the 1H. ISU gained 340 of their yards in the 2H...

**FOURTEEN POINT SWINGS** - Kevin Wilson's debut at Indiana didn't go as planned. They did have a 226-155 yd edge at the half and led 17-14 but Ball ST opened the 3Q with a 48/11pl drive for a 38 yd FG and a 70/9pl drive for a 20 yd TD pass and the lead, 24-17. Indy was SOD on 4&3 at the BSU9 with 14:51 left and BSU went on a great drive taking over with 9:30 left in the game. They ran the ball on 13 out of 14 plays on an 80 yd drive setting for a 22 yd FG with 2:12 left on a 10 pt lead, 27-17. IU went 52/9pl getting a 27 yd FG with :57 left but BSU recovered the outside kick.

**TAKING OUT FRUSTRATION** - The UC Bearcats had a disappointing 2010 and they were out to get off to a much better start this season. Teams in this situation generally play harder later in the game and that was the case with Cincy. The Bearcats led 34-0 with a TD with :39 left in the half then AP fumbled the QB and UC got a 3rd & 14 TD pass with :09 left 1H, 41-0. At half UC had a 351-108 yd edge and QB Collaros would not play the 2H. UC led 65-3 when AP drove 71/11pl for a TD with 8:06 left. UC, with 3rd string QB Kay in, went 72/11pl and tacked on a 14 yd TD run with 1:10 left for the 72-10 final. AP was just 2-9 last year and has only 8 scholarship seniors... Texas wanted to build a new attitude this year with new coordinators and they played well vs Rice as they finished with a 506-224 yd edge. Texas had a 198-73 yd edge before allowing Rice a 50 yd drive at the end of the half and a 49 yd FG with :56 left. Rice actually pulled within 13-9 but UT put together 3 consecutive TD drives of 72/8, 99/8 and 94/11pl to go up 34-9. UT finished at the Rice 15 yd line.

**MISLEADING FINALS** - Clemson and Troy was a misleading final. At the half Troy had a 195-121 yard edge and with a late 61/5pl drive for a TD with :51 left in the half, took a 16-13 lead. A pair of TO's set up Clemson for FG's on 2 drives that combined for zero yards. CU punted to open the 3Q but then got a 54 yd pass to Allen to take the lead, 20-16. They led 26-19 with 11:20 to go when they got a 75 yd TD run by Bellamy to make it 33-19. After a punt and kick/catch interference, CU took over at the Troy 28 and after a -1 yd drive kicked a 45 yd FG, 36-19. Troy fumbled and CU went 42/7pl for a TD with 1:26 left and a misleading 43-19 win. Troy had a 19-16 FD edge... The 2H was ugly for San Jose St but in the 1H the FD's were even with SJS having 9 and SU having 9. In fact, SU had just a 189-162 yd edge. TO's and blown opportunities were the key. SU had a 13 yd TD "drive" after a fmbld and later an 8 yd drive for a 37 yd FG after a long PR. SJS had a 1st&g at the 8 but settled for and missed a 23 yd FG then had a 1st&g at the 7 and settled for a 19 yd FG. SU also had a 1 yd TD "drive" after a 39 yd FR and led 27-3 despite the game being played evenly. SJS fumbled into the EZ for a safety, was SOD on a fake punt on its own 44 and fmbld at their own 39 in the 2H as the game turned into a blowout.

**INJURIES OF NOTE** - A key in the Fresno St game was that the young O-line, breaking in 4 starters, suffered a key injury as C Richard Helepiko left with an ankle inj early in the game. Pat Hill was forced to put frosh Cody Wickman in at tackle "Our center went down early and they had to make 3 moves, we weren't intact" Hill said. "We had a guard at center and a freshman tackle". FSU only trailed 19-14 at the half despite being outgained 310-122 as they recovered a fumble for a TD and had a 16 yd drive for a TD after another TO. They did go on a 57 yd drive and missed a 35 yd FG. In the 3Q FSU was in'td at the Cal9 and trailing 36-21 had the ball at the end but was on 4th&2 at its own 20 lost 5 yards.

**FRONTDOOR AND BACKDOOR COVERS** - The debut of Russell Wilson was the hottest game ever in the 94 year history of Camp Randall Stadium (90' at KO). Wilson led the Badgers to 8 scores on 8 poss with 7 of those being TD's and the only FG came on a 29 yd'r on 2nd & 3 on the last play of the 1H. Wisc led 51-3 when Wilson came out with 8:45 was left in the 3Q. UNLV drove 75/11 and 70/9 for a pair of TD's to get in the backdoor by a half point, the latter TD coming with 11:41 left. UW finished the game at the LV22 taking a knee... Ariz St returnman Miles was dynamic including a 98 yd KR to open the 3Q as ASU rolled to a 41-0 lead over UCDavis. UCD gained 161 of their 243 yards in the 4Q and on 4&2 with 12:10 left got a 48 yd TD run then on 4&2 got a 38 yd pass to the 1 setting up their backdoor covering TD with 6:26 left in the 48-14 final. ASU did get to the UCD17 but was SOD on 4&4 with :08 left. Tough loss for WF who absolutely dominated the 1H with 13-2 FD and 242-52 yd edges but settled for 2 FG's and K Newman who had 14 straight FG's missed a chipshot 34 yarder. SU got a TD on a 37/4pl drive after WF punted from its EZ and stunningly WF only led 20-7 despite complete domination. Each team took a 2nd & 3Q drive for a TD and it was 26-14 but WF missed a crucial xp. The key play of the game happened on WF's next drive. They were at the SU12 when on 3&19 QB Piced fired a FD pass to the 2 but he injured his leg and would miss the rest of the game and a hold wiped out the completion. They settled for a FG to keep SU in the game, 29-14. SU went on 73 and 53 yd TD drives, the latter with 7:07 left to tie it. Backup QB Stachias threw an int at the WF32 but SU K Krautman had a streak of 16 straight FG's snapped by a blk'd FG with 2:17 left. However, SU won in OT by 7... Joe Paterno coached from the pressbox and PSU ret'd the opening KO 95 yards for a TD. PSU dominated the 1H with a 15-2 FD and 252-66 yd edges and led 41-0 when ISU took over with 8:17 left and drove 62/11pl getting a TD with 2:16 left for the backdoor cover. Bolden got the start but hit just 6-12-37 yards. McGloin hit 6-8-77 yds but McGloin had 4 poss and had 3 TD's on those. Bolden had 6 poss resulting in a TD, a FG and a missed FG. Third string QB McGreggor did not throw a pass but led a 12 yd TD drive in the 4Q. ISU was QB'd by Washington transfer Ronnie Fouch (PS#55) who was held to 11-23-105.

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ TEXAS over BYU** - Texas is 0-2 vs BYU with the last meeting in '88, a 47-6 defeat (yes, UT was 4-7 that yr). BYU's off was unusually weak for most of LY but got better as true Fr Heaps (PS#2) gained exp and they put up 42.4 ppg the L/5. LW we went against BYU and won a 4★ LPS as the Cougs trailed Ole Miss 13-0 into the 4Q (UM did have 96 yd IR TD). Heaps led BYU 72/8pl for a TD then LB Van Noy chased down UM's QB and FF, taking it into the EZ for the TD and a 14-13 win. BYU had 20-13 FD and 316-208 yd edges with Heaps hitting 24-38-255, 1-1 ratio. Everything about Texas was unusually weak LY as they went from the Nat'l Title gm to a losing ssn. It looked like another long season was on the horizon as the Horns only led Rice 13-6 at HT. They settled for two 1H FG's inside the Rice22 before finally waking up in the 2H with 3 TD's on their 1st 4 poss, winning 34-9 and delivering another 4★ LPS. The Horns finished with 22-16 FD and 506-224 yd edges as QB Gilbert hit 13-23-239, 1-0 ratio and Davis pulled in 115 rec yds. BYU is 2-6 as an AD and after going 1-4 as a HF LY, with outright losses to Iowa St and Baylor, we expect UT to put the hammer down at home TY.

### FORECAST: TEXAS 27 Byu 13

**3★ OREGON over Nevada** - Since '96, UN is 0-5 in this series w/a avg loss by 23 ppg with the last meeting in '03. LY's Wolf Pack win at BYU snapped a string of 14 str road opener losses. Ducks are on a 16-1 SU home opener run (loss in '04 vs Indiana). UO is off a massive letdown in the opener vs #4 LSU in which they were done in by 3 TO's in their own territory as LSU outscored the Ducks 24-14 in the 2H but do only have Missouri St on deck. They are 23-8-1 as a HF and UN is 6-12 as an AD. UO avg 609 ypg at home LY but UN surprisingly only all'd 317 ypg on the road. UN has just 12 str's back and this is the first start for their young QB. UO's avg home win was 59-15 LY and they have a GUB edge and will be well prepared to face a team that finished 12-1 and #12 AP LY.

### FORECAST: OREGON 48 Nevada 13

**3★ AUBURN (+) over Mississippi St** - LY it was a Thurs Nm gm in Starkville and Aub (-1) did have a 210-125 yd edge at half and led 17-7 despite Cam Newton being int'd in the EZ and AU dropping 6 passes. MSU pulled to 17-14 to open the 3Q and at the end MSU was SOD at the AU41. LW the Tigers nearly became the first defending Nat'l Champ to lose their season opener S/'98 (Mich) as they scored 2 TD's in the final 2:07 to pull out a 42-38 win over Utah St. New QB Trotter did throw for 263 (74%) with a 3-0 ratio. Miss St was dominant LW racking up a schl rec'd 645 yds led by RB Ballard who ran for 166 (16.6) and 3 TD. Auburn is 17-1 SU (14-4 ATS) in SEC openers while Miss St has lost 11 str (1-10 ATS) SEC openers. Auburn is 9-1 SU vs Miss St with a +157 ypg edge. Miss St has the D edge (#25-58) and is the more exp'd and talented tm but Auburn has a lot of history on its side and the home field edge.

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ USC over Utah** - USC is 6-3 vs Utah but dropped the last meeting ('01 Las Vegas Bowl). Utah's last visit to the Coliseum was in '48 and this the Utes' 1st ever Pac-12 conf gm. They do come in here with a few extra days of rest after their victory over FCS Mont St (191 rush yds, 5.0). The Trojans barely got past the visiting Gophers a week ago 19-17 despite schl rec'd performances by QB Barkley (34 pass comp) and WR Woods (17 rec's). Utah has finished with the better record and has ranked higher than USC for 2 str yrs so the Trojans should be fully motivated to "welcome" them to the P12 (Utah did stay within 7 of the Ducks in Autzen just 2 yrs ago). USC is just 3-9 as a HF but needs to reestablish their swagger as they begin conf play. We like what we saw as far as USC's defense was concerned as DC Kiffin made it known that with the better depth TY, they practiced tackling throughout the summer. Now with a GUB, we expect even more significant improvement while the Utes may be distracted by the mystique of the Coliseum.

### FORECAST: USC 31 Utah 14

**2★ GEORGIA (+) over South Carolina** - SC (-3) beat UGA at Williams-Brice Stadium for the 1st time S/'00 LY, 17-6. RB Lattimore rushed for 182 yds (4.9) and 2 TD for SC and UGA WR Green missed the gm (susp). Spurrier said of UGA DC Grantham who came from the NFL, "that little inside zone play, the NFL doesn't run that play. That's a new little scheme for Grantham I guess." SC did have a 228-73 yd edge at half but UGA, down by 1 TD, also fmb'd at the SC1. UGA HC Richt's seat is as hot as ever after LW's 35-21 loss to Boise where the UGA defense was carved up by QB Moore. SC fell behind EC early LW 17-0 as QB Shaw got the start but he was relieved by LY's starter Garcia who ran for 2 TD's and threw for another in the 56-37 win. Taking away an odd 41-37 score in '09, these two teams' other 12 recent matchups have been by an avg score of UGA 16-11. Richt has only been a HD twice in his 11 yrs. Georgia is our pick to win the SEC and Richt is 7-3 SU in this series (4-2 vs Spurrier) and desperately needs a win.

### FORECAST: GEORGIA 24 South Carolina 21

**2★ WKU (+) over Navy** - Navy won the only prior meeting (-29'), 38-22 in '09. They were down 14-10 late 2Q but scored 28 str to pull away. Navy only had a 473-434 yd edge. Navy is just 2-5 as an AF and has just 10 ret str's making their 1st road trip. They are coming off a 40-17 win over Delaware, despite only having a 437-363 yd edge. Navy gave up 220 rush yds LW and WKU RB Bobby Rainey is coming off a 105 yd (3.8) effort LW and had 1,649 (4.8) LY. WKU is in its home opener with 15 ret str's and is 5-3 as a HD. They are coming off a 14-3 loss to UK, despite outgaining and outFD'd UK by 234-190 and 13-11 margins. Navy is on a 5-13 ATS in their first 4 gms of the year while the Hilltoppers only have Indy St on deck and got some extra prep time for the option in during August.

**Arizona at OKLA ST** - These 2 met in LY's Alamo Bowl LY (1st meeting S/42). In the 1H UA drove into OSU terr 6x's and despite a 209-168 yd edge, the Cats trailed 23-7 at the half. OSU's potent off was held to just 312 yd. OSU blew out ULL 61-34 with 666-320 yd and 31-19 FD edges and to make matters worse the Cajuns' 1st 2 TD's were IR TD's as they tallied 162 of their yds in the 4Q. UA only led N Ariz 14-10 at the half before scoring the gm's last 27 pts as they finished with a 487-259 yd edge but were outrushed 80-75. AZ has just 10 ret str's and an inexp OL (5 new str's) making their 1st road start on ESPN Thurs night. UA has the D edge (#28-53) but OSU has the off (#2-34) and ST (#8-57). FIU is 6-3 ATS vs BCS schools in Sept and could be even better as LY they almost upset Rut (FIU 371-172 yd edge), Tex A&M (led 20-6 in 4Q) in their 1st 2 and outgained MD 472-419 and only trailed Pitt by 6 in the 4Q. LW all-everything TY Hilton got off on the right track with 283 all-purp yds as FIU built a 28-0 1Q lead en route to a 41-16 win over N Texas. The Cards were unimpressive LW vs Murray St, getting outFD'd 19-16 and having 4 TO's in their 21-9 win. FIU is 1-8 SU but 5-1 ATS in road openers and L'ville does have rival Kentucky on deck and the Cards are just 5-10 as a HF. FIU actually has the edge on offense (#65-98) with UL having the much stronger D (#37-87).

### Saturday, September 10th

**WISCONSIN 37 Oregon St 20** - OSU is 2-8 SU S/'90 when facing an AQ non-conf school. UW has a couple of extra days of prep after playing on Thurs, destroying UNLV on ESPN, 51-17 as they scored on their 1st 8 poss (7 TD). OSU is making an odd trip to the Midwest after being upset by FCS Sac St 29-28 in OT at home in the opener but does have a bye on deck. The Beavers became just the 7th team S/'80 to lose the opener as a HF of 24 or more despite a 496-367 yd edge as a wild flurry ended regulation as a Beaver fmb'l at the SS123 was ret'd 55 yd by the Hornets to the Beavers 23. Sac St had a 28 yd FG blk'd with 2:35 left and the Beavers drove to the SS15 only to miss a 27 yd FG on the final play of reg. OSU QB Katz started vs FOUR Top 10 tms (3-1 ATS) LY, but was benched for the 2H/OT LW in favor of Mannion who Riley said had a good camp and WR Rogers DNP. UW barely got past Ariz St (-12) by 1 LY at home but didn't have QB Wilson who hit 10-13 for 255 yds while accounting for 3 TD's in his Badgers debut. OSU HC Riley is 1-11 SU and 2-12 ATS on the road in Sept and will be hard pressed to improve that rec'd here.

**Iowa 27 IOWA ST 17** - Iowa dropped 5 straight to rival ISU from '98-'02 but since has won 6 of 8 incl 3 str holding ISU to 15 tlt pts and 301 ypg. Over the L/2Y ISU has had 9 TO's vs rival Iowa which resulted in 35 of the Hawkeyes' 70 pts. LY ISU trailed 35-0 into the 4Q and a late garbage score snapped 17 str Q's w/o a TD. HT is 6-1 SU. Iowa is in a rebuilding year with just 9 ret str's but did win their last trip here 35-3 as a 2★ on these pages. The Hawks beat FCS Tenn Tech 34-7 in a gm halted for 84 mins due to a thunderstorm. Iowa wasn't nearly as impressive as the final however as they had just 21-18 FD and 394-296 yd edges and TT had passes int'd at the Iowa39 and 11 (89 yd IR TD), missed a 33 yd FG and were SOD at the Iowa30. The Cyclones do have just 12 ret str's and are 3-6 as a HD but did upset TT and only lost to Neb by 1 here LY. ISU survived an upset bid by FCS power UNI scoring 2 TD's in the final 4:40 including the final with :43 left. QB Jantz's debut was uneven as he hit 18-40 for 187 yds with 3 int but he also rallied the Cyclones who were outgained 385-328. Iowa has the edges all around (#75-106 off, #39-77 D and #16-79 ST).

**KENTUCKY 20 Central Michigan 10** - Wildcats are 5-0 (all gms in KY) vs the Chippewas with the last meeting in '06. UK was +2 TO's and won 45-36 (-9) jumping out to a 21-0 lead (never trailed) but was outgained 558-373 yds (-9 FD). CM did get a TD with 6:58 left to trail by 2 but missed the 2 pt. Phillips is 3-1 as a HF and this is their home opener but they do have the showdown with rival L'ville on deck. CM is 3-18-1 SU (10-10 ATS) in road openers S/'89 and have their rival, WM, on deck. They are 5-2 ATS traveling to face BCS tms. Both tms struggled vs weaker opponents in their opener on Thurs night. UK beat WKU by just 14-3 as a 16' pt AF as they were actually outgained 234-190 as QB Newton was just 7-18-93 with a 1-3 ratio. CM beat IAA foe SCSU, 21-6 as a 19 pt HF but did have a 256-137 yd edge. QB Radcliff also struggled some going 14-27-168 with a 2-2 ratio. UK has a huge edge on D (#42-103) and has a Top 25 OL which should give them the edge as both teams look to improve on LW's performance.

**San Diego St 34 ARMY 17** - 1st meeting. We almost used SDS't as our Bowl POY in their 35-14 win over Navy as a 3 pt dog (they were a 4★ LPS winner covering by 24), because Rocky Long knows how to shutdown the option. The new HC's era started with a bang as SDS't snapped a 2 gm losing streak to Cal Poly behind their studs QB Lindley (15-27-203, 4 TD, became SDS't career leader in pass TD) and RB Hillman (189, 2 TD). They are just 1-6-1 in the rare role of AF over 7 yrs but have 12 str's back from the 1st Aztec tm with a winning record S/'98. Army, with 11 ret str's, had a tougher road LW, losing to NI 49-26, in a gm they trailed 35-6 at half (NI 276-160 yd edge). The loss snapped a 2 gm ssn opener win streak and a 6 gm road win streak. The Black Knights are just 3-12 as a HD and while they were 7-6 LY, they did not beat a tm that finished with a winning record and in the bowl, vs SMU, won despite being outgained 413-229. SDS't is making one of the longer road trips in the country, but played Army HC Ellerson's previous team (CP) and its triple-option offense LW, holding the Mustangs to just 284 tlt yd and 12 FD.

**OHIO ST 38 Toledo 17** - Tim Beckman was the CB cch at OSU from '05-'06. UT has been shutout in both prior meetings ('98 and '09). OSU won 38-0 at Browns Stadium (23-9 FD and 522-210 yd edge) in their last meeting in '09 as OSU was off a loss to USC. OSU is 13-2 as a HF incl LW when we won a 3★ LPS with them as they beat Akron 42-0 (-31') in HC Fickell's debut. Toledo is off a 58-22 (-8) win over a New Hampshire tm that had beaten an FBS foe in 5 of the prior 6 yrs. Toledo has 18 ret str's (only lost 9 left) and has upsets of Michigan and Purdue on the road the L/3Y. OSU has just 8 ret str's without the susp plyrs. Both are off impressive performance as Toledo had a 591-332 yd edge while OSU had a 517-90 yd edge. OSU QB Bauserman was named the str' and threw 12-16-163 with a 3-0 ratio and also rushed for a TD. Toledo has beaten a BCS team in each of the L/3Y and will be much more competitive than fellow MAC member, Akron, while OSU has Miami, FL on deck.

**NORTH CAROLINA 27 Rutgers 17** - LY Rutgers was off a bye and NC was playing without 12 inelig plyrs incl 7 str's and needed some late stops to pull out the win 17-13. NC scored 10 pts off a RU int and a blk'd punt. RU has lost 2 str vs NC but in their last and only trip to Chapel Hill in '06 won 21-16 (+4'). Both teams are stronger than LY with NC having 13 ret str's while Rutgers has 14. Both teams are off expected wins over FCS foes. RU shutout NCCU 48-0 as VHT RB Huggins (PS#7) rushed for 2 TD. NC defeated FCS #16 James Madison 42-10 as So QB Renner (PS#20) passed for 277 yd and an ACC 96% (22 of 23). RU has a bye on deck and NC has its ACC opener (UJva). NC is 10-19 as a HF while RU is 10-5 as an AD. The biggest matchup edge is NC's super DL (#2) vs an underachieving RU OL and LY RU was outgained on the road by a 463-243 yd avg.

**SMU 34 UTEP 13** - The HT is 6-1 SU (4-3 ATS) but UTEP has covered 4 in a row in the series. LY SMU trailed 14-0 into the 2Q but cut the deficit to a TD into the 4Q. SMU got inside UTEP territory on all 3 4Q drives but had to punt and then was SOD at the UTEP7 and UTEP40 and UTEP delivered another outright upset by a Big Dog, 28-14. The last time in Dallas, UTEP was down 4 and had a FD at the SMU 18 w/50 left but was sk'd on 4&6. UTEP has lost 11 str CUSA AG's by 14 ppg. The Miners escaped LW in OT vs a FCS tm but QB Lamaison's 365 yds were the most by a UTEP QB S/'86 in a ssn opener. SMU is on a short week after a Sunday opener but tms in that situation were 4-0 SU and 3-1 ATS incl a win/cover LY 28-7 as 11' pt HF vs UAB for the Mustangs. This is their CUSA opener and they only have a IAA tm on deck. SMU has 18 ret str's while UTEP has just 11 incl 2 on offense and a young QB and O-line are making their first road start.

**TENNESSEE 30 Cincinnati 27** - Cincy is 1-7 since joining the Big East ('05) in road/bowl games vs BCS opponents (avg loss by 20 ppg). The Vols are vastly more experienced than LY's team going 4-0 down the stretch and getting the benefit of bowl practices and have 13 ret str's incl vet QB Bray (293 pass yds, 71%, 3-0 ratio LW) and are off of their one-sided victory of Montana (led 28-0 in the 2Q). UC is off an expected win over Austin Peay (561-277 yd edge, led 65-3 in 4Q) The Bearcats are an improved tm as well with 15 ret str's incl QB Collaros (four 1H TD passes vs AP) and this is their most important gm of the first 3 weeks while Tenn has Fla on deck. Cincy has the edge on off (#24-42) but Tenn rates better on defense (#34-40) with the Cats having the ST edge (#48-99). This is a gm statistically where Cincy looks to be the stronger tm but do keep in mind it is an SEC bowl team at home vs the Big East.

**Tulsa 41 TULANE 27** - Golden Hurricane have won all 6 CUSA meetings (only loss 1968). Tulsa has outgained Tulane in each (+180 ypg) and every gm has been decided by at least 24 pts (avg score 45-14). LY QB Griffin had a career high 412 pass yds but Tulane trailed 24-7 at HT and then allowed TD's on the 1st 4 poss of the 2H and we won 52-24 (-20) with a 4★ LPS on Tulsa. Tulsa does have 16 ret str's incl QB Kinne and lost just 13 left but also lost their coach, best WR and best DB. This is their CUSA opener and it is sandwiched between a pair of Top 10 tms, Okla (destroyed LW as a overmatched squad) and Okla St. Tulsa is 7-11-1 as an AF. Tulane only had FCS SEL LW and will be pumped up for this as they are thinking bowl and their offense had a season high 527 yds vs Tulsa LY. HC Toledo always says they get little fan support and have little home edge and maybe that is why the Green Wave are 2-7 as a HD.

**Virginia Tech 41 E CAROLINA 20** - EC has dropped B2B gms vs VT and LY's 49 pts all'd was a series high. EC led 10-0 and 27-21 late 3Q before VT's 28 unanswered (-20) for the cover 49-27. Pirates have won 6 str home openers but 4 have been decided by 5 pts or less, incl upsets of WV and Tulsa. VT is 17-1 in true road openers (last loss was ironically in Greenville '92). EC also upset VT 27-22 (+9) at a neutral site in '08. LTH VT only won 16-3 (-13) in their "revenge" gm for that loss. EC does have just 12 ret str's incl QB Davis who hit 30-44-251, 1-2 ratio vs VT LY. LW EC led SC 24-14 in the 1H before all'g 42 2H pts in the 56-37 loss. VT rolled up 518 yds vs #2 FCS App St for a 66-13 win LW their highest total under Beamer S/'95 putting their HC 1 win away from 200. VT has Marshall on deck while EC has a bye. VT is 17-5-1 as an AF but EC is 12-4-1 as a HD. The offenses are close and this is QB Thomas' 1st road start but VT has massive edges on defense (#14-107) and ST's (#13-71).

**MINNESOTA 37 New Mexico ST 20** - 1st meeting and just UM's 4th gm vs a current member of the WAC. HC DeWayne Walker was a 2Y str' at DB for Minny from '80-'81. Gophers are 14-2 SU S/'95 in home openers but did lose LY to FCS SD. UM is 4-9 as a HF but this is Kill's 1st HG here. NMSt is 0-4 ATS vs BCS schools with avg loss by 34 ppg over 5 yrs (3-9 Kan beat them by 26 LY). The Gophers are off a 19-17 loss in Kill's debut in which they shutout the Trojans in the 2H. When UM lost starting QB Gray (7-12-94, 47 rush) to leg cramps in the 3Q true Fr Shortell came off the bench and hit 7-13 for 98 yds while directing a TD drive although he did throw the gm sealing int with :53 left. NMSt lost 44-24 at home to Ohio as the Bobcats rolled out to a 44-10 late 3Q lead (220 of their 368 yd on their L/3 drives). Kill likes to establish the run and NMSt allowed 5.8 ypc LY and was outrushed by the Bobcats 241-6!

**WASHINGTON 31 Hawaii 24** - In the L/gm ('07) UH erased a 21 pt 1H deficit scoring the gm's final 28 pts to complete an undefeated reg ssn. UH is 4-12 SU in road openers but won 3 of L/4. UW is 3-10 as a HF (3-4 under Sark). UH does have just 9 ret str's and their inexp team is making their first road trip but they do have a vet QB in Moniz who ran for a career best vs Colorado LW (121 rush yd, 3 TD). UW has 15 ret str's and was actually outgained at home LY by a 373-328 avg but improved as the season went on and is now on a 5 gm win streak after its home win over reigning FCS Champ E Wash, a game in which they should have lost as they were outgained by a 504-250 mark but won the TO battle 4-0 in the 3 pt victory (UW int'd EW in their EZ w/:29 left in the game). UW has the edge on off (#52-72, UH 1 ret OL str'), def (#50-65) and ST (#72-100) which should be enough to get past the Warriors.

**California 27 COLORADO 20** - This is actually a non-conf gm for the two Pac-12 schools as it was sked prior to the Buffs joining the conf. LY these two met in Cal and we had a 4★ LPS on Cal -10 and they rolled to a super easy 52-7 win covering by FIVE TD's! That was their 1st meeting S/'82. Cal only has an FCS foe on deck but struggled away from home LY as they were 5-2 ATS at home and 1-5 on the road and their D all'd 399 ypg on the road (261 ypg at home). Cal has just 12 ret str's but QB Maynard did start 12 at Buffalo in '09 and he performed well in his 1st career start with the Bears (319 ttl yds, 2 TD in 36-21 win over FSU). The Buffs (9-3-1 ATS at home) have the altitude edge and have 16 ret str's from a tm that just missed out on a bowl due to blowing a 28 pt 4Q lead to Kan. Cal also blew a late lead giving up a TD to Wash on the final play to miss out on a bowl. CU does have a new HC seeking his 1st win (lost at Hawaii LW, outgained 343-240) and this is his home opener but they have their annual neutral site meeting in Denver with Colo St on deck.

**Stanford 41 DUKE 27** - Stanford did beat ND on the road LY but S/'96 is just 4-13 SU in AG's vs non-conf opp's. Duke has dropped 11 str hosting current non-ACC/BCS schools by an avg score of 38-15 (last win vs Rutgers in '95). Duke has 14 ret str's while SU has 11 incl QB Luck. Duke lost a heartbreaker 23-21 to Richmond LW missing a 28 yd FG with 1:28 left. Despite the 57-3 final, SU only outgained Duke ST 373-237 LW and has a Pac-12 AG on deck. LY Duke hosted Bama and got drilled 62-13. Duke has hosted 13 ranked tms since '01 and is 0-13 SU, 2-11 ATS and their avg loss is by 48-13! SU was 4-1 ATS as an AF LY and won by an avg of 27.4 ppg. Although Stanford has obvious edges, have to fade them with a cross country trip and their P12 road opener on deck.

**Alabama 24 PENN ST 13** - The Tide's last trip to State College was in '89, a 17-16 win (blk'd an 18 yd FG w/:13 left). QB Bolden made his 1st road start LY in Tuscaloosa going 13-29 (45%) 141 yds w/an 0-2 ratio. PSU trailed 24-0 LY early 4Q as 30% of their ttl yds and 35% of FD's came after. The Lions did have 3 drives deep into Tide terr in the 1st 3Q's end in 0 pts (3 TO). PSU's opening wallop of Indy St provided little clarity to the QB battle as str' Bolden hit 6-12-37 while McGloin was 6-8-77 but had a sure fire IR TD dropped. There's nothing wrong with the Lions D however as they held the Sycamores to 83 yds in the 1st 3Q's. Bama's QB audition favored soph McCarron as the Tide scored 5 TD, 1 FG on his 10 pass vs rFr Sims' 1 TD and 1 FG on

6. The duo combined to throw 4 int incl 1 which cost the Tide the shut out in their demolition of Kent (24-6 FD and 482-90 yd edges). After going 4-0 as a HD in '04-'05, the Lions are just 1-3 the last 5 years, but Bama does have an inexperienced QB making his first road start in front of 100,000+ in Whitehouse conditions.

**Tcu 20 AIR FORCE 17** - On the surface Air Force looks like the play with a Sr QB, at home, off an FCS foe with a bye next wk. Calhoun is 4-1 as a HD, 2-0 vs TCU in that role incl an outright upset in '07. TCU is on its 2nd str AG and was dealt a devastating blow LW, when it was the veteran D that surprised. After ranking #1 in the NCAA in ttl D each of the L/3Y, TCU played surprisingly mediocre all'g Bay to put up 564 yds and 50 pts (most yds S/'06, most pts S/'05). soph QB Pachall showed veteran leadership leading a late TCU comeback, before 2 forced passes on the final drive (25-39-251, 4-1 ratio). We like the matchups as TCU has two AA LB's (who have to be upset about LW) and AF has lost 3 str and has been held 97 ypg below its ssn rushing avg in MWC play vs TCU. AF entered LY's gm ranked #1 NCAA in rush yd and TCU's Wesley single-handedly outrushed the entire AF squad (209-184). AF handled S Dakota LW, building a 30-7 HT lead before all'g two 4Q TD's to make the final 37-20, finishing with a 487-368 yd edge. LTH ('09), TCU dealt with freezing rain and icy conditions and only won by 3, but this time the weather will be better and since this is week two, TCU spent time in the ofssn working on the option. TCU is 10-5 as an away fav but hasn't played off a SU loss the L/2Y (2-0 in that role in '08). Expect the Frogs to play with a chip on their shoulder as it's them vs the MW.

**NC State 28 WAKE FOREST 27** - Visitor has dropped 4 straight (HT 13-2 SU) and 5 of last 7 have been decided by 8 points or less. Last time here, the Wolfpack had a FD at the WF29, down by just 6, but Wilson threw an int in the end zone w/2:02 left. LY's 38-3 loss was the worst in this series since '73. WF only trailed 10-3 at HT with a 142-137 yd edge but was outgained 258-36 in the 2H. QB Glennon (156 yd last week) is making his first road start but this is not an intimidating environment. LW NCSt struggled vs Liberty being outgained 406-318 needing 7 TO's for the 43-21 win. Wake led Syr 29-14 in the 4Q but then lost QB Price (CS) and lost in OT, 36-29. NCSt has 13 ret str's and is 0-10 ATS as an AF with NINE outright upset losses! WF has 17 ret str's and is 11-4 as a HD and this is their home opener. NCSt is the stronger team with the edge on offense (#62-82) and defense (#35-73) but the angles, venue and ST's (#77-112) all favor the Deacons as does the series history.

**Purdue 27 RICE 23** - PU hasn't traveled to Rice since '58 and in the L/meeting won 21-19 in '98. PU has had just 1 road trip vs a non-BCS tm in the L/9Y and covered that one by 21' pts. PU had 16 ret str's and was looking like one of the most improved tms in the country but like LY has suffered inj's to skill players (lost QB Henry for ssn, Marve still a ?). Caleb TerBush did throw the GW TD pass LW vs MT and looks to be making his 1st road start. They only have an FCS tm and a bye on deck so they will be motivated for this trip to Texas and figure to have some recruits in attendance. They are 5-1-1 as an AF over 7 yrs. Their OL is upgraded and rates in the top 25%. Rice has 17 ret str's incl Mich transfer RB Sam McDuffie. LW we won a 4★ LPS going against the Owls who held their own in the 1H LW vs Texas but still haven't found the EZ yet. Rice is 12-6-1 as a HD but they are 0-5 SU/ATS hosting BCS schools since 1998 incl 0-4 the last 3 yrs losing by 22 ppg to Vandy, NW and Baylor.

**Southern Miss 41 MARSHALL 27** - LY we had a 3★ on SM (-9) vs Marshall and SM delivered at home, 41-16. Marshall trailed 28-0 at HT as the Herd had just 46 yds on 23pl (2.0 ypp). SM is 3-0 in Huntington with each gm decided by SD. In '09, the gm was tied 20-20 before a SM 63/7pl TD drive w/6:54 left. SM int'd MU at their 2 and 7 on their L/2 drives to preserve the win. SM is 11-5 as an AF with Marshall 9-5-1 as a HD and this is their home opener. Marshall has 14 ret str's but a new QB while SM has 14 ret str's and is our pick to win CUSA East. The D's are close but SM has a large edge on off (#40-111) and a huge edge on ST's (#9-97). MU is off a short wk vs instate rival WV and SM escaped LT (all'd just 244 yds) LW but the gm was played in heavy rains as they survived a blk'd FG, dropped punt at the one and all'd a KR TD.

**Temple 34 AKRON 17** - The Owls are 4-0 SU/ATS in MAC gms vs Akron with the avg score 34-11. LTH TU (-5) hammered UA. Thanks to an int and bad snap TU did trail 17-7 but scored 49 unanswered. After HT most of the 10,927 had left on a cool Fri night. This is the MAC opener for each with Temple off city rival Villanova with Penn St on deck. Temple has a new HC but is 6-3 as an AF over 9 yrs. LW the Owls destroyed Villanova 42-7 (led 42-0) with a 475-275 yd edge. QB Mike Gerardi was named the starter just prior to the game and responded by throwing 14-20-235 with a 2-0 ratio. RB Pierce returned to form rushing for 147 (7.4) with 3 TD. We went against the Zips as a 2★ on these pages cashing on OSU and the Zips were crushed 42-0 being outgained 517-90. QB Moore threw for just 6-16-54 with an 0-1 ratio in his starting debut. Akron is 4-2 SU/ATS in home openers but lost LY. The Owls have the advantage on both sides of the ball (off #86-120, D #86-115) and will look to continue the Zips woes.

**NEBRASKA 35 Fresno ST 10** - 1st meeting. NU is 9-12 as a HF under Pelini and with 8 new B10 teams to prep for probably did not focus as much on these non-conf gms with a revenge match vs Wash on deck. Fresno lives for these gms, but LY was whipped by its two toughest road foes (Miss and Boise) by a comb'd 106-38. Fresno lost 36-21 to Cal in front of a crowd decked moist in red in Candlestick Park as they were outgained 413-210 and outFD'd 18-11. QB Carr hit just 21-33-142 in his debut LW as he was harassed (4 sks) after C Helepiko was KO'd in the 1Q. The staff went to a conservative gm plan with the instability up front and 14 of the Bulldogs' 16 drives were 5pl or fewer. The D set up 1 TD with an int and also rec'd a fmb! in the EZ for another score. NU dominated Chattanooga as expected as QB Martinez was the Huskers' #1 rusher (113, 3 TD). Neb has large edges on offense (#43-80) and D (#6-85) and there could be a huge matchup edge up front for the Huskers as DT Crick could manhandle a reshuffled OL.

**Virginia 28 INDIANA 20** - In their only previous meeting VA was -7 at home but rolled to a 47-7 win. VA came in #117 avg just 272 ypg of offense but had a 337-124 yd edge at the half and finished with 536 yds. Indy is 5-2 as a HD but has a 1st time HC vs a VA tm with HC London in his 2nd yr with a great recruiting class. The Cavs rolled to a 40-3 win over #3 FCS W&M outgaining them 496-169 as W&M was unable to cross midfield til 8:00 to go in the gm. LW IU lost to Ball St, 27-20, in Wilson's debut and this will be his first ever HG so Indy will be pumped. VA has 18 ret str's while Indy has just 12. IU has an FCS foe on deck while VA travels to NC. VA was 0-5 SU on the road LY but played a solid gm at USC with a 340-329 yd edge. VA is just 7-14 as an AF over 12 yrs (rare role) with a young QB making his 1st road start.

**FLORIDA 28 Uab 17** - These schools' only meeting was in '02 as Florida (-32) won in Gainesville 51-3. Florida does have their SEC opener on deck and is coming off Muschamp's 1st gm as HC in The Swamp so this is their "B-" game for Sept. The Gators (-35) dismantled FAU 41-3 LW delivering a 2★ on these pages as RB Rainey became the 3rd player in the FBS S/'96 to have a rush TD, rec TD and a return TD in the same game. UAB had all of Aug to prepare for this as it is their opener (UF GUB edge) and LY they did very well vs SEC tms. They went into Tenn and had a 544-287 yd edge and only lost because of 5 TO's. Also they led Miss ST 24-23 in the 4Q before falling 29-24 (+20). UAB is the more exp'd team w/16 ret str's while UF has 10. While the situation favors the Blazers, their close calls vs SEC tms LY should get the attention of the Gators and UF has huge edges on off (#22-71), def (#9-72) and ST's (#31-90)

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ SAN DIEGO over Minnesota** - SD comes in as our #4 most underrated team and MIN is #3. Norv Turner is 41-23 as HC at SD but is 1-2 SU and 0-3 ATS in his L/3 openers losing twice ATS as a TD plus favorite. LY SD had a disappointing 9-7 SU year but was still 9-7 ATS and when installed as a HF they lost twice outright but were 6-2 ATS with their wins coming by 24 ppg. They do have a big game on deck at NE but did not make the playoffs LY losing outright SIX times when favored (only a dog once all LY!) and knows they can't take foes lightly. SD also upgraded its special teams in the offseason luring in TB's STC Rich Bisaccia. MIN is just 2-11 SU away from home (2-10-1 ATS) and is just 2-11 SU on the road vs the AFC. Rivers avg'd 279 ypg (70%) with an 18-7 ratio at home LY (9.0 ypa!!) and gets a MIN defense without 3 DL str's from LY (DT's Kevin and Pat Williams, DE Ray Edwards). Look for SD to regain a little swagger and get it done at home as Rivers is expected to have his top 3 receivers together (Jackson, Floyd, Gates) for the 1st time since the end of 2009.

**FORECAST: SAN DIEGO 34 Minnesota 17**

**3★ NY Giants over WASHINGTON** - The Giants have won 5 in a row when visiting here and the Skins were just 2-6 at home LY. These two played in the final game of 2010 right here and the Giants came in with playoff hopes and led 17-7 but GB beat CHI which eliminated the NYG were and only won 17-14. That was the closest of the Skins' 5 losses at home in the series. The Giants have one of the NFL's best pass rushes and take on a WAS OL that will have a new Ctr and RG. Shanahan refuses to name a QB starter until gametime but Beck hasn't started since his 2007 rookie season (1-4 ATS). Grossman started the L3 games for WAS LY (3-0 ATS) avg 280 ypg (56%) w/a 7-4 ratio. In their 5 road wins LY the Giants won by an avg of 17 ppg and they are 16-7 ATS as an AF. The Giants have the edge in the trenches and with a better set of skills players with a manageable line and are the play.

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ Buffalo (+) over KANSAS CITY** - Arrowhead will be rocking as the defending AFC West champs open their season at home. Surprisingly KC is just 3-6-1 ATS in home openers with 7 outright upset losses. They upset SD LY on MNF despite being outgained 389-197 thanks to a 94 yd PR TD by McCluster and a 56 yd TD run by RB Charles. They had been a great HF but had a stretch of 0-6-1 ATS in that role until going 3-3 LY. One of those spread losses was vs BUF (6-1 ATS vs KC) as a 7 pt HF when they needed OT to win by 3 (each tm missed a FG in OT). KC, with the #1 rush offense in the NFL, vs the #32 rush D, rushed for 274 yds (6.1) and did have a 414-328 yd edge. BUF is 12-8-1 as an AD and LY they were outscored by 9 ppg at home and only 8 ppg on the road. QB Fitzpatrick gets his 2nd start at Arrowhead and LY hit 24-48 for 223 yds. KC was 3-1 ATS as a HF outside of the division LY. BUF is our #6 underrated team and KC is our #4 overrated team and we'll take the dog. This is our 1st **Ugly Dog Play** (25-16 61%) of the season!!!

**FORECAST: Buffalo 19 (+) KANSAS CITY 21**

**2★ ST LOUIS (+) Philadelphia** - LY we went against the Eagles in the opener vs GB as a 4★ Key Selection (-3) and the Packers rolled to a huge lead on the road. QB Kolb was injured and the Mike Vick era began and they got a couple of late scores to "only" lose 27-20 (GB covered). This year the Eagles are the "Dream Team" and are a bit overrated coming into the year. Remember Vick's QBR dropped some in the 2H of the year. Andy Reid is known as a solid road coach but is just 13-14 ATS as an AF recently. These two last met in 2008 PHI (38-3, 9 pt AF) in Spags 1st game as a HC. STL has had a full month to prep for Vick's mobility with their upgraded LB corps. They have a huge edge at DL (43 sks #7 LY) vs a PHI OL with a rookie Ctr, RG and a RT (Herremans) who is a career LG. PHI also has a rookie P and K here as well. STL did upset SD here LY (20-17, 8 pt HD) and was 5-3 SU/ATS in the dome and is a better team now. Three of the Eagles road wins LY were by just 3 pts and we'll call for the Rams to pull an upset here.

## OTHER GAMES

**New Orleans at GREEN BAY** - Thurs. The last two Super Bowl champs meet in Wk 1 and home field edge for the NFC playoffs which would be huge (dome tm vs cold weather tm) could be on the line here. The defending SB winners are 11-0 SU and 7-3-1 ATS in Wk 1 but NO may have gained some edges with Brees working the team hard during the lockout while GB had no organized practices. What a great way to kick off the 2011 NFL Season! **Thursday Night Magic! We are offering a very special MONEY BACK PLUS Guarantee on tonight's game on the Northcoast Debit Card System - take advantage on Thurs night after 3:00 pm ET! **Pittsburgh 16 BALTIMORE 13** - This series is one of the hardest hitting in the NFL and they ALWAYS play close games. The L7 regular season meetings have been decided by 6, 3, 4, 3, 3, 3 and 3 and PIT is 7-3 ATS (dog is 6-1 ATS). LY the road team won both games in upsets but PIT did win by 7 at home in the playoffs. BAL is 19-5 SU at home (15-8-1 ATS). Despite the two teams tying for 1st LY PIT was #14 on off and #2 on def despite a lot of starts lost to injuries and suspension. BAL was a pedestrian #22 off and #10 def and is getting long in the tooth. In LY's 3 meetings PIT had an avg 253-238 yd edge but held RB Rice to 20 (2.5), 32 (3.6) and 32 (2.7) yds rushing. PIT has a huge edge with their OL's vs a BAL OL with recently signed McKinnie (from MIN) at LT and Oher shifted to RT. PIT is 7-2 ATS as an AD, has better speed on both sides of the ball and we'll call for the Steelers to win for a 2nd straight year in M&T Bank Stadium.

**Detroit 21 TAMPA BAY 20** - TB went from 3-13 to 10-6 LY but only beat 1 team with a winning record as NO was resting starters in the season finale. They were one of the youngest tms in the NFL LY and figure to be improved and more confident this year. They were just 2-2-2 as a favorite LY (dog 9-5-2 ATS in all games) and no longer come into games with that underdog mentality. They do have the oppressive heat of Florida in Sept (100° heat index expected) vs a dome northern team. LY DET came into TB and pulled the upset 23-20 in OT (+4) which basically kept the Bucs out of the playoffs so they do have a revenge factor. DET snapped a 26 game road losing streak in that one. DET is an improved team while our improvement index has TB as the 5th most overrated tm for 2011. The Lions have a big edge with an OL that allowed 27 sks LY (6th) vs a TB DL 2 deep that will return a total of 8 sks from 2010. TB also allowed star MLB (Ruud) depart in FA and replaced him with rookie LB Foster (Huskies). We'll call for the road team by 1 in a physical battle.

**CHICAGO 21 Atlanta 18** - The Falcons were the #1 seed in the NFC LY and the Bears were #2 but CHI made it to the AFC title game and ATL lost in the Div round with both eliminated by GB. We look for the Bears to drop off this year (Ctr Kreuz is gone) and actually miss the playoffs but we also think the Falcons are a little overrated. ATL will be without Ctr McClure (144 consec starts) and will have a 2nd year player in his 1st start. They last met in 2009 and Cutler was int'd at the ATL9 at the end on the road (14-21, +3). No doubt ATL has the edge at QB and WR but CHI has the edge on

defense and is at home. ATL was 5-1 ATS as an AF LY but were 1-2 SU vs playoff tms. CHI is 18-8 SU at home and the grass will slow down ATL's WR's. With a road trip to NO and GB on deck CHI cannot afford to open with a loss and did beat GB, MIN, PHI and the Jets at home LY.

**HOUSTON 21 Indianapolis 20** - The Texans are 2-5 SU/ATS in Wk 1 but LY opened vs a team they had only beaten once SU in 16 tries. RB Foster (expected to miss - hamstring) rushed for a team record 231 yds and HOU led by as many as 17 and won at home 34-24 (+1 HD). HOU finished just 6-10 and incl a 30-17 loss at IND and the Colts won the South again. IND was a banged up team LY and puts very little into preseason gms and have dropped 3 straight openers ATS. Indy had been 20-4 SU on the road (16-8 ATS) prior to LY and figures to play closer to that past level in 2011 (6-0 AF in 2009). IND will play gamesmanship with Peyton's status all week but this is HOU's 1st fav mark in the series. HOU will be employing a new 3-4 defense under Wade Phillips here with 5 new starters on that side. We'll call for the home team by 1 in a lower scoring game and wait on Manning.

**CLEVELAND 20 Cincinnati 17** - CLE is 1-11 SU and 2-9-1 ATS in openers since their return. The dog is 7-1 ATS in this series and LY their games were decided by 2 and 3 pts. CIN has a young QB making his first road start (Dalton). CIN was the better team statistically LY (#20, #15 vs #29, #22) and CIN outgained the Browns by 118 and 119. CLE is 2-6 ATS as a HF and Lewis is on a 13-6-1 ATS mark as a dog. Despite the FA losses CIN comes up as our most underrated team in the NFL this year and should be a pointspread darling especially early in the year. Add it all up we think the Browns are the stronger team and at home but only call for a win by a FG and would take any extra points out there.

**JACKSONVILLE 20 Tennessee 14** - JAX was 0-10 ATS as a HF heading into LY but playing with a heat index of 105° at home in the opener they used some big plays to survive DEN in a 24-17 (-3) win despite being outgained 363-299. They went on to a 4-1 mark as a HF but none of their wins were by more than 7. TEN traveled here on a Monday and was favored (-3) and blasted the Jags 30-3 (Garrard injured early) but later JAX went into TEN and won 17-6. TEN has a brand new HC and QB while JAX is the more stable team with that edge magnified by the lockout. Their L11 meetings have been decided by 15.8 ppg. Only ONE game was decided by less than 7 points but 6 of those were outright upsets. TEN allowed 407 ypg on the road LY and has a weaker defense coming into the season. JAX dramatically upgraded LY's #28 defense at LB and safety while adding DE Roth as well. TEN RB Johnson will start but his holdout means he doesn't know the new offensive scheme. Basically pick the team you think will win the game and they should cover (done so for 11 straight meetings).

**Carolina 20 ARIZONA 19** - LY the Panthers went 0-8 on the road and this year they have a new HC installing new schemes and were put behind by the lockout. Newton earned the #1 QB role (for now) and former ARZ QB Derek Anderson is his backup. ARZ got an upgrade at QB with Kolb but were just #31 on off and #29 on def LY as they benefitted from 12 return TD's. CAR was active in FA and is our #2 most underrated tm in the NFL this year. Just two years ago ARZ was in the NFC Div round but they are 3-7 ATS as a HF with 6 outright upsets. This incl CAR which came in here in 2009 as a 10 pt AD and won outright 34-21 and we won with a 3★ newsletter and LPS on Over 41°. CAR has now won 7 str reg season games vs the Cardinals but did lose in the playoffs in 2008 at home. We like the dog here and an upset would be no surprise.

**San Francisco 23 SEATTLE 17** - The HT has won 4 in a row both SU/ATS with SEA winning LY's opener as a 3 pt dog in Pete Carroll's 1st game back. Carroll is 1-2 SU and 0-3 ATS vs Harbaugh from the USC/Stanford duels which became personal. SEA made the playoffs LY and knocked off the depleted Saints in the playoffs. They did it with special teams (#1 LY) and mirrors as they had just the #28 off and #27 def and now have a young QB vs the veteran Hasselback of LY. SF was #24 and #13 but finished just 6-10. Harbaugh is reinstalling the West Coast offense and was put behind by the lockout with QB Smith only getting 36 preseason pass att's. SEA has always been much tougher at home than on the road and LY they outscored teams at home but on the road lost by an avg of 30-18. LY SF was +50 ypg at home and -64 ypg on the road and is 9-6-2 as a HF and Seattle is 2-12 ATS as an AD and 2-9 ATS on grass. We like the changes at SF and they were the overwhelming favorite to win the NFC West LY and figure to get started on a winning note this year. LY SEA had an energetic 1st year HC in his home opener and now the Niners have that edge with the KO rules neutralizing SEA's special teams.

KU is 18-9 as a HF and after going 3-9 LY could be the more motivated tm facing a Huskie tm that was 11-3. Turner Gill faced NI just once when at Buff and that was in '06 (+24, 13-31). Kansas did not give McNeese St a chance at the upset as they never trailed winning 42-24 (-14') but only had a 447-420 yd edge. QB Webb was 7-10-146 with a 3-0 ratio. NI debuted their new hurry up offense (want to run 90 off plays per gm). They led Army 49-6 into the 4Q before allowing 20 garbage pts but still covered as an 11 pt HF (49-26). QB Harnish threw a career high 5 TD passes (12-19-195) while RB Hopkins ran for 138 yds (9.9). While NI has the offensive edge, Kansas has the D edge and NI is 2-11 SU in road openers S/'98. Have to enjoy getting a BCS home dog vs a MAC foe and we'll grab that value.

**USF 37 Ball St 10** - 1st meeting. USF is 14-0 in Raymond James Stadium openers with the avg win by 32 ppg. USF ended LY with B2B losses at home and never in the program's history have they lost 3 straight HG's. USF is off a big 23-20 upset over ND in a game that was extended due to weather delays. The score is misleading as USF was outgained 508-254 but was +5 TO's. QB BJ Daniels was just 18-30-128 with 1 TD. New BSU HC Lembo was the Elon HC the L/5 ssns going 35-22 incl a 28-13 loss at USF in '07. Ball St is off an upset of in-state BCS foe Indy 27-20 at Lucas Oil Stadium. BSU has their MAC opener on deck and this is their least important game of Sept. They are, however, an outstanding 19-5 as an AD and have 17 ret st'rs and are 9-3 ATS vs BCS schools. USF's biggest edge is on D (#32-102). BSU QB Wenning hit 23-29-173 with a 2-0 ratio vs IU. The Florida heat could be a factor in this game, giving an even bigger edge to the Bulls.

**ARKANSAS 45 New Mexico 10** - Ark has won 17 str non-conf HG's and is 10-0 SU (5-4-1 ATS) under Petrino. Ark only had a IAA foe LW with Troy on deck and will be trying to give their young QB some added confidence. Ark is 8-3-1 as a HF. They easily handled Missouri St 51-7 with 24-9 FD and 466-163 yd edges. Joe Adams tied an SEC rec'd with 2 PR TD's and QB Wilson hit 18-24-260, 2-0 ratio (Mitchell 10-11-104, 1 TD). NM has been one of the weakest tms in the NCAA the L/2Y but is 5-6 as an AD (not bad). LW they scored their 1st TD in an opener S/'05, but fell to Colo St, 14-10. Late 4Q, they had the ball at the CS15 but QB Austin (20-31-179, 1-0) fmb'l'd on a sck, the 3rd fmb'l lost on the day. NM also suffered thru 9 pen and vs a MW LD (avg 6-3 256) all'd 10 sks! which doesn't bode well vs an SEC DL. On the road LY NM was outgained 480-238 and lost by 32 ppg. They were 0-3 vs ranked tms losing by an avg of 65-10! With huge edges all around (off #8-114, D #18-96 and ST #20-89). Ark names the score.

**WASH ST 41 Unlv 20** - After LW's 64-21 win vs Idaho St, the Cougars are 14-1 SU in Pullman vs non-conf opp's. LW's win did come at a price as QB Tuel broke his clavicle (out 4-6W). His bkp, Lobbestael, hit 14-19-230, 2-0 ratio as WSU finished with 28-17 FD and 590-453 (vs a IAA) yd edges. LV HC Hauck was on the Wash staff from '99-'02 going 4-0 in the Apple Cup. LV is 2-11 SU on the road vs BCS tms. WSU is 4-12 in their rare role of HF but UNLV is 0-12 ATS as an AD (avg road loss by 35 ppg LY). They surprised no one with a 51-17 blowout loss to Wisky LW. Surprisingly though, UW only had 20-19 FD and 499-292 yd edges although they pulled their starters in the 3Q. With just 11 ret st'rs and a new Rebel QB in Herring (18-27-146, 2-0 LW), WSU starts 2-0 for the 1st time S/'05.

**VANDERBILT 24 Connecticut 23** - LY it was tied 21-21 at the half but Conn (-7) outscored Vandy 19-0 in the 2H for a 40-21 win as then-Conn RB Todman rushed for 190 yds. It was Vandy's longest road trip since 1979 (1004 miles). While this is a matchup of the defending Big East champs off a Fiesta Bowl vs a squad that was 2-10 LY, we think Vandy has a shot. Both teams are coming off blowout wins over FCS schools. New Vandy HC Franklin showed his willingness to gamble, going for it on 4th down 3x's to keep drives alive in their 45-14 win over Elon while Conn HC Pasqualoni ret'd to the college sidelines and used rFr RB McCombs as a workhorse with 141 yds rush and 4 TD's in their 35-3 win over Fordham. Vandy is 1-8 as a HD but this is the first road start for the Husky QB's (3 played LW) and they are just 13-24 SU on the road.

**UCF 23 Boston College 20** - Just one prior meeting in '08 when BC won hosting UCF 34-7 with 24-12 FD and 405-252 yd edges. BC is 6-2 in true road openers but has dropped B2B gms by 18 and 27 pts. UCF is 0-10 hosting current BCS tms since moving up to FBS. BC is off a disappointing home

loss to NW, 24-17. The Eagles rushed for just 104 yd (3.5) without star RB Harris and gave up a rare 496 yds incl 227 rush (most S/'09) to a NW tm that started a bkp QB. UCF is off a 62-0 win over FCS Charleston Southern with 506 yd (316 rush) and 3 rush TD's by QB Godfrey. UCF is 16-8-1 ATS in Bright House while BC was 6-1 as an AD but 3-3 under Spaziani. BC has 14 ret st'rs and will be well motivated off the loss for a UCF tm that finished LY 11-3 and ranked #21 returning just 10 st'rs. BC has the defense edge (#22-51) while UCF has the offensive (#54-64) and ST's edge (#12-65).

**Notre Dame 31 MICHIGAN 27** - This is the FIRST EVER night game at Michigan Stadium and both teams will wear special uniforms to commemorate the event. Six of the L/7 and 8 of the L/10 in this series have been outright upsets (UM 5-1 SU at home). LY ND QB Crist missed 8 series in the 1H (ND 0 pts) and ND trailed 21-7 but rallied to take the lead 24-21 when he ret'd. QB Robinson got a TD with :27 left for the UM upset and had a UM QB record 50-2 tll yds. The LY ND has led in each w/less than :30 left but allowed a score w/:27 LY and :11 in '09 (L/visit to Ann Arbor). Mich had its first weather shortened gm in its 132 yr history as they beat WM 34-10 in gm which was officially stopped in the 3Q due to lightning. The final was misleading however as with the score tied 7-7 UM got a 94 yd IR TD (14 pt swing) and the Wolves added a 29 yd FR TD in the 3Q (17-17 FD and 288-279 UM yd edge). ND had 2 weather related delays totalling nearly 3 hrs complicating matters in their 23-20 loss to USF. The Irish had a 508-254 yd edge but lost 5 TO's (0 USF) incl 3 inside the USF10 one of which was ret'd 96 yds for a TD. QB Crist (7-15-95 and 1 int) was benched at the half with Rees (24-34-296, 2-2 ratio) handling the 2H duties and Kelly said he'd revisit the QB battle TW. ND has the D (#7-49) and ST (#18-76) edges. While we're well aware that the dog in the series is 13-2 ATS, have to believe ND traveling on the road off a home loss will take the dog mentality.

**UCLA 31 San Jose St 10** - 1st meeting. The Spartans have dropped 17 straight AG's vs BCS conf tms by an avg of 31 ppg and just faced a physical Stanford team LW (only outgained 373-237). SJSU is much improved with 18 ret st'rs while UCLA is 14-6 as a HF but is in a Houston/Texas sandwich. They do have 17 ret st'rs and are also much improved and nearly came back for the win against the Cougars LW behind bkp QB Brehaut as they missed a short FG and had a PAT blk'd on their L/2 possessions (lost by 4). QB Prince suffered a concussion and Brehaut found some success (264 pass, 87 rush, 3 tll TD) so a QB controversy could be in the offing. LY SJSU all'd 521 ypg on the road facing 4 ranked tms. Since their upset of Stanford in '06 SJSU is 0-6 SU/ATS vs the Pac-12 with their avg loss by 37 ppg.

**MICH ST 38 Florida Atlantic 7** - Mich St is 2-0 SU but 0-1-1 ATS in this series. LY a Fla Atl HG was moved to Detroit and we used FAU as a Big Dog Play and while they did not get the outright upset, they covered by 13 (+26, 30-17). Fla Atl trailed 30-14 when they had a TD ruled down short. Down 16 (2 scores) Schnellenger, with 2:50 left, went for the FG and did not att an onside kick! Fla Atl was dominated by Florida last week being outFD'd 29-11 and outgained 468-137 in the 41-3 loss. Howie uses these gms vs BCS schools as tune-ups generally and is 4-17-1 ATS but Mich St is 1-9-1 ATS prior to ND. Kirk Cousins only hit 9-17-142 LY and should have more success vs an Owl secondary that lost 3 st'rs after finishing #115 in the pass D LY. FAU has a bye on deck and LTH Mich St only won 17-0 (-17) in a gm played in a monsoon.

**ARK ST 34 Memphis 20** - Memphis HC Porter was the RB cch at Ark St from '99-'01. The Tigers are 11-2 SU vs the Red Wolves but did lose the LTH ('07) as they blew a 31-6 HT lead (Ark St -5, 35-31). UM was a HD in their last meeting in '08 and won 29-17 and had a 453-352 yd edge. LW Ark St (+21) cashed as our Comp Underdog POW and they had a 1 pt lead over Illinois in the 2Q before surrendering 16 pts in a 1:47 span in their 33-15 loss. UM was dominated by Miss St LW, being outgained 645-338. QB Summerlin was hurt in the 1H (ankle) and true fresh Reed took his place hitting 23-35-149 with a 1-1 ratio. Ark St has our #85 offense and #93 D. UM with just 9 ret st'rs from LY's 1-11 tm, comes in #117 on off and #114 on D. UM is 1-9 in road openers incl 6 str losses by 20 ppg while in home openers, Ark St is 12-6 SU and 10-0 ATS.

**Houston 41 NORTH TEXAS 24** - These two have not met S/'98 and this is the first gm at new Mean Green Stadium so expect a fanatical crowd and a great effort by NT. New NT HC Dan McCarney did a great job at Iowa St but was just 6-13 as a HD. LW NT was down 28-0 after the 1Q in their 41-16 loss vs FIU as new QB Derek Thompson went 14-27-167. NT does have just 12 ret st'rs from a 3-9 tm while UH has QB Keenum (310 yds, 75% 1-0 ratio LW) and is back to their 2009 level. UH is a poor 2-10 as an AF and is off a huge 38-34 win over UCLA with their CUSA opener on deck (also on road). UH also gave up 232 rush yds (5.5) LW and NT has a great RB in Lance Dunbar who's totaled 2,931 yds (6.2) the L/2Y.

**Georgia Tech 34 MIDDLE TENN 27** - LY in the only meeting, MT trailed just 14-7 at HT but committed 6 TO's which resulted in 28 pts (ironically lost by 28). Blue Raiders are 2-7 SU and 1-5 in home openers. MT is 1-3 hosting BCS tms (beat MD in '08). MT is coming off a heart-breaking loss at Purdue where they gave up the winning TD with :49 left and had the game-tying FG blk'd on the last play. QB Lance Kilgore had 330 yds (60%) with a 2-1 ratio vs Purdue. GT hasn't faced a non-AQ school on the road S/'03 (lost 24-13 at BYU). GT's new QB Tevin Washington threw for 271 yds (62%) with a 3-0 ratio vs West Carolina as the Jackets exploded for 63 pts. GT is 8-5 as an AF and MT just 2-5 as a HD over 10 yrs. GT has edges with the option later in the year, but have to believe MT took some summer time preparing for this type of off.

**KENT ST 31 Louisiana 24** - Just one prior meeting in '08, KSU lost 44-27 being outgained 667-396! KSU all'd 414 (8.0) rush yds (the most S/'98). KSU is 9-1 in home openers (all W's vs FCS opp's, loss vs Minn in '06, 44-0). The Ragin' Cajuns have lost 7 str vs non-conf opp's by 30 ppg. Kent St put very little into LW's unwinnable gm at Bama (outgained 482-90) but now are in Hazell's 1st HG and he has the fans excited. UL does not have the mobile QB like they did in '08 and KSU has a much stronger rush D which was #2 in the NCAA in '10 and is led by DT Nix. UL also has a 1st yr HC and just 13 ret st'rs (KSU has 14). UL was 6-1 as an AD LY while KSU is 4-2 as a HF over 4 yrs. While UL had 320 yds of offense vs OSU they allowed 666 yds and trailed 34-10 at the half. The Cajuns lost last year 38-31 to Ohio in their last trip to the Buckeye State but covered as a 14' pt AF. KSU has slight edges on offense (#100-104), and D (#93-110) and good sized edge on ST (#67-113) and is at home.

**To Read rankings** - YPC is yards per carry for each team's offense and defense. Turnover edge is the amount of turnovers that team is + or -. OFFYPP is offensive yds per point. This shows the avg amount of yds a team travelled per point scored. The lower the number the more efficient the off. DEFYPP is defensive yds per point. The higher the number here, the better the def is at making their opponents work at scoring points. The remaining columns show the team's rank in that category. Next to the passing ratings there may be a ★ or an X. On the offensive side a ★ means they are completing over 59% of their passes while the X shows that their QB's are completing less than 53%. ## PRO ANGLES

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of takedown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. **We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on.** If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
