#### POST DRAFT "A" & "D" GRADES HITTING 91% OVER THE LAST 3 YEARS!

The Post Draft Issue grades a team's offseason a little differently than most. The grades we put into Power Sweep predict whether a team's record will improve or decline for the upcoming season. We take EVERYTHING into account. Included in the analysis are coaching changes, the NFL Draft, Free Agent signings, Free Agent losses & even favorable or unfavorable schedules. The "A" & "D" grades have been extremely accurate over the years.

Last year with the NFL work stoppage we were unable to do a Post Draft Issue. An overwhelming amount of people contacted us for the offseason grades that you've become accustom to receiving each year. With the unique 2011 season and the late Free Agency signings we did not release those grades, but THEY'RE BACK!!!!!

The Jets were one of the Super Bowl favorites last year yet finished 8-8 and even missed the playoffs. The receiving unit failed to live up to expectations and Mark Sanchez had 26 TO's (18 Int/8 fum) LY. There are many factors pointing upwards for the Jets for this season. Last year the Jets faced the #9 schedule in the NFL and this years is markedly easier at #27. The Jets also had a defensive ypp of 13.8 which is why they ranked #20 in points allowed (22.7) but had the #5 defense in the NFL (312 ypg). This year the Jets do lose 2 starters in WR Burress and S Leonard but add in MIA S Yeremiah Bell (16 st), K Josh Brown and FS LaRon Landry. They also had a nice draft picking up a solid DL in Quinton Coples, a rec with speed in Stephen Hill and a productive LB in Demario Davis. A controversial offseason pickup was Tim Tebow but we think he will push Mark Sanchez and either Sanchez will have a better season or Tebow will be leading them to the playoffs. Overall, the Jets will be improved on offense with new OC Tony Sprano as well as on defense. The Jets should go from 8-8 to the playoffs this year which is why they earn one of our coveted "A" grades.

The Dolphins had a couple of key things happen in the offseason. First, they brought in a new HC in Joe Philbin who was Green Bay's OC from 2007-11 and a new OC in Mike Sherman who comes from Texas A&M. The other was they were a key player in the Manning sweepstakes which they did not win, also missing out on Matt Flynn. They drafted Ryan Tannehill who appears to be a project and while he has NFL tools, he has very little experience as a successful QB in big games and may be 2-3 years away. The new coaching staff let go of 4 players who started 12 or more games last year and only bring in 2. They are playing in the tough AFC East and are switching to a 4-3 defense. Their schedule does go from #7 to #26 which should result in more wins but they only had 30 starts lost to injury last year (10th lowest) and their def ypp was 17.6. Overall this team, which spent its first round DC on a project does not appear poised to improve their record which is why they earn this grade.

For the last 17 years we have sent an imaginary employee, Fred, to Las Vegas to legally wager on some preseason odds. Fred plunks down his hard earned cash on different preseason wagers in the NFL. In 2000 Fred had a tremendous year. He wagered \$10,000 prior to the season and picked up \$17,300 at the windows after the Super Bowl. The top wagers were Denver and Baltimore to go OVER 9' and 8' wins and they recorded 11 and 12 wins respectively, for a solid profit of \$4,650. The BEST wager was \$300 on Baltimore to win the Super Bowl at 15-1 odds for a \$4,500 profit! That was a nice 73% return on his investment in a 6 month span, his best year ever. 2001 was another fine year as he picked up \$13,200 after the Super Bowl. The top 3 wagers in 2001 were all winners with Kansas City UNDER 8, St Louis OVER 11 and Buffalo UNDER 8. In 2002 Fred made money but not enough to pay for his plane flight as he took home \$10,100. He was 3-1-1 on his top wagers with Minnesota UNDER 8, Green Bay OVER 10 and Tampa Bay OVER 9 wins. In 2003 Fred gave back \$625 in an off year. In 2004 he wagered \$12,500 and came home with \$15,000 for a nice profit including New England to win the Super Bowl. In 2005 Fred ventured out with another \$12,500 and came back with \$14,000 making it worth \$ the trip. The best plays were Carolina OVER 9, Kansas City OVER 8', Denver OVER 8' and Oakland UNDER 7', For 2008 Fred cashed his \$ top play on Philadelphia Over 8.5 wins and also cashed 3 of his top 4 \$ wagers. In 2009 Fred again bet on the Super Bowl winner cashing in \$ on 19-1 odds on the New Orleans Saints. For the 2009 football season \$ he finished with a profit of \$2,900. In 2010 Fred hit 4 of his top 6 plays included his biggest wager of \$3000 on New England Over 9.5 wins.

Last year Fred showed a profit of +\$1,550 as we had \$225 on the NY

Giants to win the Super Bowl at 17-1.

There are conflicting factors for PIT but after tying for the AFC North crown for 2 straight seasons, winning on tie-breakers in '10 then losing on tie-breakers in '11, it's time for them to get back on top. In 2011, the Steelers matched their 12-4 record from 2010 but benefitted from 3 net close wins and had a def ypp of 19.2. Their schedule TY goes from #24 to the 10th toughest. PIT was banged up LY missing 60 sts due to inj and Roethlisberger was far from 100% at the end. They had an off ypp of 18.3 and their +101 ypg was #1 in the NFL. PIT finished -13 in TO's which points up and they won 6 of their final 7 games. They are another year older on defense but finished #1 in total def for the 3rd time in 5 years. They finally addressed the OL with their 1st 2 DC's in David DeCastro from Stanford and Mike Adams from Ohio Si then went to the def front 7 with their #3 and #4 DC's. As usual, they lost more than they gained during FA but that is status quo for the Steelers and this team should remain healthier than LY's version.

BAL was a dropped pass away from being in the Super Bowl LY. That has many forecasting them to take the next step this season. They are coming off B2B 12-4 years but there are numerous factors pointing downward. They had 2 net close wins LY, were +49.8 ypg (5th), had a def ypp of 17.4 and only had 23 starts lost to injury LY which was 8th lowest. They took on the #28 schedule as well and now face the #3 schedule. I do expect QB Flacco to be better but they are still missing a consistent deep speed WR. Two key areas of concern are the loss of OLB Jarret Johnson to SD with DE/OLB Terrell Suggs tearing his Achilles (?TY). If he does not return you have to figure the Ravens def will be weaker than their #3 finish of LY. We also wonder if Ray Rice can continue to take a pounding as he had 367 touches LY. Just 2 years ago in the Post Draft Issue we had BAL as an "A" and they went from 9-7 to 12-4 but TY with a tougher schedule we don't see them getting to a 12 win total.

The Bengals have been a perfect rubber band team the last few years going from 4-11 up to 10-6 back down to 4-12 and back up to 9-7 with a playoff berth and this year should bounce back down CIN does have the advantage of Andy Dalton having a year of experience and added a pair of 1st RD DC's in CB Dre Kirkpatrick (CIN only 10 Ints LY) and G Kevin Zeitler. They also added a couple of solid DT's in #2 DC Devin Still and #3DC Brandon Thompson which should help them be even tougher up front (#10 rush def LY). The Bengals lost 7 players who started 9 or more games LY and brought in 2 via FA to replace them. CIN had just 22 sts lost to injury LY and their schedule goes from #27 to #6. The Bengals are also fairly raw at WR as outside of AJ Green there is a combined 8 rec's coming forward from 2011. Also teams that had 5 more net wins than they had the previous year have a 75% chance of a weaker record and that is why the Bengals grab a "C-" grade

The Browns made some drastic changes in the offseason drafting Brandon Weeden in the 1st RD and bringing in a potentially elite NFL RB with Trent Richardson. They continued to bolster the OL with their #2DC Mitchell Schwartz but didn't address the WR issue until the 4th RD. CLE let 5 players who started 9+ games depart in FA and only brought in run-stuffing DE Frostee Rucker. This is a team that had 3 net close losses LY and despite their 4-12 record, were only -43.6 ypg. They also had an offensive ypp of 21.2 and Josh Cribbs and the special teams should have more of an impact. After wearing the HC/OC hats as a rookie, Pat Shurmur brought in Brad Childress to run the offense and lighten the load. Their schedule does climb from #15 to #4 and one Vegas casino has them as an underdog in all 16 games this year. The Browns are a stronger team than last year and did have the

LY we went out of a limb and called for HOU to have their best record ever at 10-6 which is precisely where they finished. HOU had the #30 def in 2010 and improved by per game avg's of 5.1 FD's, 91 yds and 9.3 points while going from a 33-13 ratio to an 18-17 ratio to finish 2nd overall (286 ypg) LY. HOU opened up 10-3 but once they clinched a playoff spot, dropped their L/3 regular season games. After besting CIN in the Wild Card RD, they nearly beat BAL with 16-11 FD and 315-227 yd edges. TY HOU let several starters go in FA with the biggest losses being Mario Williams and DeMeco Ryans off the D. They will also field a new starting RG and RT. They added 2 FA's and drafted a pass rusher in Illinois' Whitney Mercilus with their #1DC but did not have a 2nd Rnd DC. HOU faces the #31 schedule in the NFL for this year and have to be regarded as one of the Super Bowl favorites, especially playing in the AFC South.

+3 WIN DIF FROM LY -2 LY Mike Munchak took over as HC and exceeded expectations getting to 9-7 but TEN missed the playoffs for the 3rd straight year. This was despite a disappointing season from Chris Johnson who heldout and was nowhere near the Chris Johnson of old, only rushing for 1,047 (4.0). We expect Johnson to rebound TY and they added #1 DC Kendall Wright from Baylor who was a great pick. They used their #2, #3 and #4 DC's on the defense but none are projected starters. Despite being 9-7, TEN was only #17 on off and #18 on def being outgained by -20.1 ppg. Their schedule goes from #30 to #19 and Matt Hasselbeck is another year older. Losing Cortland Finnegan is a big blow for a secondary that allowed a 21-11 ratio LY. We'll call for a drop in the Titans' win total as they begin the transition to the Jake Locker era.

OC Bruce Arians worked with both Peyton Manning and Roethlisberger as rookies and the Colts should have an improved team this year.

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
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

For those of you who feel statistics are not important, the San Diego Chargers are your team. The Chargers amazingly finished #1 in the NFL in offense and #1 in defense in 2010 but finished just 9-7 due to special teams. Last year they were #6 on offense and #16 on defense but finished 8-8 missing the playoffs once again due to injuries. Norv Turner is known for his slow starts but the Chargers actually opened 4-1 out of the gates before losing 6 in a row then winning 4 of their last 5. They improved their D by using #1, #2 and #3 DC's on that side of the ball including dynamic LB Melvin Ingram from South Carolina. They lose 4 who started 9+ last year but were very active in FA bringing in 5 who started 8+. While SD has concerns about the depth on the OL, they have re-stocked the receiving unit and appear to have bolstered their pass rush (tied 2nd in 2010 but 23rd in 2011). The Chargers had 53 starts lost to injury LY, face a manageable schedule and we project them to beat the media hyped Broncos for the AFC West Title.

The Chiefs went from 4-12 in 2009 all the way up to 10-6 in 2010 but we called for them to miss the playoffs last year. KC did just that falling to 7-9 with the #27 offense but they did have the #11 defense. They struggled to overcome the early season losses of TE Tony Moeaki, SS Eric Berry and RB Jamaal Charles to knee injuries. QB Matt Cassel missed the final 7 games (hand) and former CLE HC Romeo Crennel takes over. KC has some nice, young talent on the defensive side of the ball and used a 1st RD pick on NT Donatri Poe. We look for a significant return to form by Charles plus they get the addition of Peyton Hillis who had numerous problems in CLE last year but should return to his 2010 level (1117, 4.4). Both should benefit from a more athletic OL that gets a big upgrade with former Texan RT Eric Winston coming in. The Chiefs back 7 is among the best in the NFL and they had an offensive ypp of 23.5 last year and also had 54 starts lost to injury. A couple sets of our power ratings call for the Chiefs to have double digit wins this year.

For an 8-8 team DEN was one of the most talked about franchises in the NFL last year and it was due to Tim Tebow. Every talk show and football TV show talked about Tebow every day. Tebow did almost perform a miracle as after the Broncos started 1-4 he guided them to a 7-4 record but they lost their last 3 games and backed into the playoffs at 8-8. This year Tebow is gone but they get a huge upgrade at that position with Peyton Manning. IF Manning is able to stay healthy and plays anywhere near the lovel be did with the Calle DEAL William and the control of the playoffs. anywhere near the level he did with the Colts, DEN will have an explosive offense as Manning's loss LY proved he might have been the MVP of the NFL. The Broncos actually used their #2 DC on a developmental QB so may not get a lot of help from the draft and made plenty of moves in FA (see chart). DEN did benefit from 3 net close wins and only had 21 starts lost to injury (4th lowest) Defensively they are very thin at DT and that could be a huge issue as all 3 AFC West foes have solid talent at RB. They also now face the 4th toughest schedule in the NFL this year and while they could improve their record, we don't see them repeating as AFC West champs.

he Raiders were coming off an 8-8 season in 2010 and expectations were high for 2011. Their final record shows that they finished 8-8 once again, just missing out on tie-breakers for the playoffs. OAK lost QB Jason Campbell to injury after 6 starts and made a trade with CIN for Carson Palmer who had been content to retire prior to the season rather than play for the Bengals. Palmer had a 13-16 ratio but the Raiders still had the #9 offense. OAK set an NFL record with 163 penalties losing an avg of 85 ypg because of them. The Raiders let go of 6 players who started 7+ games for them last year while adding only 2 from other teams. OAK lost out in the draft as they didnt have their own 1st, 2nd or 3rd RD DC's with their #3 DC coming in via a compensatory pick. OAK will also have a new set of starting CB's with both coming in via FA. HC Dennis Allen is the 1st defensive oriented HC here since John Madden but he is also the 8th HC since John Gruden arrived. The AFC West is a much improved division and OAK benefitted from 5 net close wins last year and we see their record dropping this year

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

The Eagles were the talk of the 2011 offseason with all of their FA signees as they fell into the trap of being the "Dream Team". PHI finished #4 on off and #8 on def, one of 3 teams in the NFL to rank in the top 10 on both sides of the ball. They were also 1 of 4 teams with 3 receivers having 800+ yds. They blew multiple 4Q leads and needed to win their final 4 just to finish 8-8. LY's Eagles FA signees will be more adjusted now in their 2nd year of the system, as will DC Juan Castillo who previously had been the OL coach for 13 years. PHI's first 3 DC's, #1 DC DT Fletcher Cox (Miss St), #2 DC LB Mychal Kendricks (Cal) and #2 DC DE Vinny Curry (Marshall) all figure to have a major impact on the defense which could be the best in the NFL. The Eagles were -14 in TO's (30th), -3 in net close losses, were actually +74.2 ypg LY, which was the 3rd best and their schedule dips from #14 to #19 After the season PHI made an excellent trade in acquiring DeMeco Ryans from Houston who along with Kendricks should go a long way towards solidifying the middle of the defense. We'll call for the Eagles to go from their 8-8 record to one of the best in the NFL.

There are two ways to look at the Giants this year. They were only +8.7 ypg yet won the Super Bowl and were also +7 in TO's and +2 net close wins. This year they use their 1st RD DC bringing in RB David Wilson out of Virg Tech. Wilson figures to replace Brandon Jacobs who they let go during FA. The Giants also lose Super Bowl hero Mario Manningham, RT Kareem McKenzie and CB Aaron Ross signing only one player who had 7+ starts LY in TE Martellus Bennett from DAL. Rueben Randle (#2 DC) adds to a speedy, deep receiving corps and could be a steal as LSU had poor QB play or his numbers would have been better. They are breaking in a new RT and will basically have an all-new set of TE's for 2012. The Giants, despite winning the Super Bowl, were #8 on off but just #27 on def. They have too much talent in the DL (41.5 sacks, #3 LY) to have numbers that bad on that side of the ball.

The Cowboys' major need in the offseason was at CB (#23 pass def, 2nd worst in team history) so they traded up to draft Morris Claiborne out of LSU in the 1st RD. This is in addition to having picked up Brandon Carr, who was arguably KC's best CB LY and one of the better unknown CB's in the NFL. DAL is now projected to have 3 new starters in the secondary for 2012. They also added LB Dan Connor from CAR to bolster the run defense in FA. The OL will have a different face at 4 positions as LY's OT's flip sides along with 2 new OG's including OG Nate Livings from CIN. DAL was +32.3 ypg in 2011 with the #11 off and #14 def despite their 8-8 final record. Tony Romo had a solid season (31-10 ratio) but the Cowboys were done in by injuries to the WR's early in the year and lost promising RB DeMarco Murray in game #14. DAL controlled their own destiny in the NFC East LY but lost 4 of their final 5 games and missed the playoffs for a 2nd straight season. While they play in the same division as two of the NFL's top teams in PHI and NYG, DAL is a team that will contend for the NFC East Title and they figure to be an improved team this season.

There are a lot of factors pointing up for the Skins this season. LY they were -14 in TO's, had 2 net close losses, were only -3.1 ypg and despite their 5-11 record finishing with the #16 off and #13 def. They also had 65 starts lost to injury which were the 5th most. The biggest improvement in the offseason is at the QB position as they go from one of the league's weakest positions to drafting Robert Griffin #2 overall. However, we don't think Griffin will have the same impact Cam Newton did at CAR as he played in a Texas Tech-type style offense at Baylor. He must now adjust to the speed of the NFL but there is no doubting his NFL talent. The Skins signed WR Pierre Garcon from IND (947 yds 13.5) and CB Cedric Giffin from MIN and only lost three 8 game starters from last year. They surprisingly used their 3rd pick on Kirk Cousins out of Michigan St whom they expect to groom and trade in the future. The OL depth is a big concern for this season and the Safety positions will be something to watch as well. Expectations will be high for WAS with RG3 on hand and there are some factors pointing upward but keep in mind the division they play in and we don't expect see a big improvement in the record this year

The big talk LY was that if the Packers should go unbeaten, would they rest their starters for their last few games and could they be the first ever 19-0 team. This was strange as GB had the #32 def paired with the #3 off. All the mystery ended when they lost at KC before going on to win their last 2 reg ssn games before losing to the Giants in the 1st RD of the playoffs. GB improved from 10-6 to 15-1 and figures to take a step back record-wise. They benefitted from 4 net close wins and had excellent off and def ypp's and were also +24 in TO's LY (5th with 188 pts off takeaways) all factors pointing downward this year. They made some significant additions in the draft bringing in #1 DC LB Nick Perry from USC, a solid pair of #2 DC's on Jerel Worthy from Michigan St and CB Casey Hayward from Vanderbilt. They lost 2 starters but picked up one in FA. Keep in mind this GB Packer defense was #2 in '09 and #5 in '10 with similar personnel and while they should rebound the depth situation on the DL is something to watch. As long as Aaron Rodgers stays healthy, they have one of the top offenses and GB is one of the preseason favorites to win the Super Bowl this year. Their offseason grade here reflects the chances of them improving upon their 15-1 record last year.

Last year the Bears were sailing along at 7-3. They then lost QB Jay Cutler for the last 6 games and RB Matt Forté for the last four and went 1-5 down the stretch finishing just 8-8. The Bears made a big move in FA by acquiring Brandon Marshall (five straight 100 yd seasons) from MIA for triade a big move in FA by acquiring brandon marstall (live straight 100 yd seasons) from MiA for two 3rd RD DC's. Marshall and Cutler were a great QB/WR tandem in DEN and WR was one area the Bears had really been lacking in recently. The Bears only lost one 16 game starter from LY and brought in starting LB Geno Hayes from TB. In the draft they got DE Shea McClellin in the 1st RD from Boise St then added to the receiving corps with big Alshon Jeffery from South Carolina in the 2nd RD. They should have one of the most improved offences in the NEL after being #24 last the 2nd RD. They should have one of the most improved offenses in the NFL after being #24 last  $\gamma$ ear in their injury plagued season. Cutler was sacked 75 times in the Mike Martz offense and that number should drop with Mike Tice now calling the plays. CHI's def slipped some from #9 to #17 but they figure to be better with a more efficent offense. We fully expect them to once again field one of the elite special teams units for 2012 (see page 10). All of the talk in the NFC North will be about GB and DET but the Bears could be the surprise team in the division.

In 2008 and 2009, the Lions went a combined 2-30 but upped that to 6-10 in 2010 in Jim Schwartz's 2nd season. They made another large jump to 10-6 in 2011 despite being held to 68 ypg rush (3.7) in their final 5 games inc their playoff loss to NO due to RB injuries. The Lions are loaded with star power incl QB Matt Stafford (5000 yds passing LY), WR Calvin Johnson and some high DC's on defense al entering the prime of their careers. They did have just 23 starts lost to injury last year, were +11 in TO's and had 2 net close wins. Despite their recent defensive improvements they haven't finished in the upper half of the league since a #14 finish in 2000. In the offseason, the Lions strengthened their offense with their first 2 picks getting OT Riley Reiff out of Iowa then Ryan Broyles out of Oklahoma to add to their deep receiving corps. While Dwight Bentley has a good shot at being the nickel CB the rest of the DC's are aimed at improving a special teams unit that allowed 13.4 on PR's (31st and 25.6 on KR's (26th). FA was basically a wash as they lost one starter but gained one. In the last 11 years, DET is only the 2nd team in the NFL to improved their record by 3 or more games in B2E seasons (GB +3 wins in '06, +5 in '07 (13-3) then -7 wins in '08 (6-10)).

#### MINNESOTA VIKINGS (4-12)

The Falcons dropped from 13-3 to 10-6 last year going from the NFC South Champ to a Wild Card. They were destroyed in the WC game 24-2 being outgained by the NYG by 442-247 as the OL struggled vs the Giants pass rush and RB Michael Turner was ineffective. Mike Smith still does not have a playoff victory to his credit despite 4 straight winning seasons. The Falcons do play in the NFC South where there's been a different division champion each year so they must be considered one of the favorites TY. They only had 29 starts lost to injury last year and go from facing the #26 schedule to #19th. They also were +8 in TO's and bring in a more aggressive playcaller with OC Dirk Koetter from JAX. They had a 7 more net wins than they had the previous year, had a super defensive ypp of 21.5 and a super off ypp of 13.1 and only had 16 starts lost to injury all year.
