NEWS AND NOTES

Another Big East unbeaten done in by a MAC tm. There's nothing fluky about Kent St's win over Rutgers as each team had 21 FD's and KSU led throughout. KSU had been 0-22 vs ranked teams but moved to 7-1 TY and likely wrapped up a bowl bid. Gary Nova threw an amazing 6 int and RU also lost a fmbl with KSU was +5 in TO. Perhaps the biggest play came in the 2Q when RU, down 7-3, threw a quick flanker screen but Fackler had a 1 handed int and took it 25 yds for a td and a 14-3 lead. RU trailed 21-3 but got a 19 yd td pass with :04 left in the half but RU punted on their first 3Q poss and Kent went 56/7 for a td and a 28-10 lead. KSU led 35-17 in the 4Q with RU getting a td with 10:35 left and KSU's final drive went 46/11pl taking a knee at the RU29... Miami, Oh pulled the big upset. If you looked at OU's last 3 games, they played 3 of the worst teams in the NCAA and were actually outgained by all 3 (Buff, Mass, Akron). OU had :09 and no time-outs and could kick the tying FG and go to OT or try for the win. OU opted for running 1 more play but was sk'd and it proved to be costly as the time ran out and they did not get another play off. QB Tettleton did not realize the team did not have a time-out left. OU finished with a 464-424 yd edge but MU had scored on the first 3 poss going 50/14 for a 40 yd FG, 54/3pl for a 54 yd td pass and 65/7 for a 22 yd FG and led 13-0. OU

pulled within 20-14 at the half and MU on 3&7 from the OU10 was int in the EZ with :29 left in the half. UM had a 309-218 yd edge at the half. OU's 38 yd FG with 4:41 left tied it up MU went 59/8pl for a go ahead FG with 1:24 left of 31 yards. OU went 65/9 and ran out of time from the MU7... Matt Scott hit 27-50-369 yds and rushed for another 100. USC WR Marqise Lee set a Pac-12 record with 345 yards receiving on 16 receptions and USC led by 15 in the 3Q. LY Matt Barkley set a schl rec with 468 yds passing vs AZ and topped that TY hitting 31-49-493. On 3&24 USC was int'd and ret 26 yds on their first drive and AZ went 60/6pl for a td then after USC was SOD on 4&2 at the AZ15, AZ went 76/11pl for a 25 vd FG and led 10-0. USC fumbled at the AU10, was int'd at the 34 and AZ was SOD at the USC35 then int'd at the USC10.AZ missed a 37 yd FG on the final play of the half and USC led 21-13 with a 395-285 vd edge. USC opened it up to 28-13 and surprisingly the next 4 poss were punts. AZ got a td with 3:56 left and USC fmbl and AZ got a td but failed on the 2 pt conv after driving 37 yds for the score, 28-26. On 4&2 Lee got a 1 yd run and was stopped short and AZ went 72/7pl and got a 7 yd td run, 32-28 (2ptng). The Cats went 49/9 for an 11 pt lead with 5:36 left. USC got a td with 4:30 left but AZ got 2 FD before punting with just:55 left. USC got to the AZ48 but fired incomplete on their final 2 plays.... Florida had 6 turnovers and Georgia 3. UF had an early fmbl set up UGA for a 20 yd td drive. It was like a TO when UF was SOD on 4&1 at the UGA36. In the 2Q UF went 70/15 but settled for a 38 yd FG then on 3&4 had an open receiver but a bad snap had Driskel's pass off the mark and they settled for a 22 yd FG, 7-6. Another TO had them 2&gl at the 5 when Driskel was int'd in the EZ. An int set up UGA for a 13 yd drive" for a 29 yd FG then trailing 17-9, UF drove to the UGA18. Driskel hit Reed with what appeared to be a td but has Reed leaped from the 4 to the EZ, he was hit and fmbl'd into the EZ for a tb with 2:05 left. On 2&11 UF was called for a pers foul face mask giving UGA FD and another PF gave UGA another FD and they were able to win and take control of the SEC East... The Bucks opened the 2H with a pick-six which sparked QB Miller who accounted for 3 td's in a 35-23 win as we won a 3★ LPS on OSU. OSU won it in the trenches as their DL pressured B10's #1 passer McGloin (264, 62%, 16-3) with 4 sks while the Lions were outrushed 234-32 This is the 1st time TY PSU will play as an AF but they went 10-3 in that role from '08-'11. The Boilers backs are against the wall as they must win 3 of their final 4 to go bowling and possibly save HC Hope's job.

Air Force 28 ARMY 24 - LY we had our 4'★ CTOT GOY on Under 58 and it covered by 3 td's! Army

was w/o QB Steelman and this gm was a tale of 2H's as Army dominated the 1H with a 286-81 yd edge but only led 14-0 and AF tied it in the 3Q. Army faked a punt and was tkl'd at its own 14 which was the key play of the gm. AF got a td for a 21-14 lead and would win 24-14 (-16'). AF is 21-2 SU in this rivalry winning the L/6 by 21 ppg. The Falcons are off 2 str MW wins incl an impressive 48-31 (+3') win over NV LW as AF had 36-21 FD and 600-380 yd edges. The AF D after all'g a MW rec'd 338 rush yds to NM's Carrier 2W ago all'd just 93 yds to NV's Jefferson - the nation's leading rusher. QB Dietz has quietly put together a solid ssn avg 106 ypg (63%) with a 7-0 ratio and has 527 rush yds (5.7). Army is off yet another disappointing loss LW 30-22 (+3') vs Ball St. The only constant TY has been their NCAA #1 rush but only led 14-0 and AF tied it in the 3Q. Army faked a punt and was tkl'd at its own 14 which was the off avg 383 ypg (5.8) but AF is right behind them avg 366 ypg (5.8). No current Army player has ever beaten AF or Navy so this is their "A+" gm for Nov while AF is in a MW sandwich but while they might have the intangible edge, it's tough backing an Army tm that is 2-6 ATS too much here.

KENT ST 38 Akron 21 - These two are less than 12 miles apart and this is the 42nd battle for the Wagon

Wheel. LY KSU enjoyed its largest MOV over UA s/74 as they won 35-3 (-4') at home and had a 380-223 yd edge. UA had a 164-119 yd edge at the half but trailed 9-3 and went 3&out on its 1st 3 3Q poss and trailed 23-3. There have been 5 outright upsets in the L/8. KSU continues to have its best ssn s/73 after upsetting unbeaten Rutgers 35-23 (+13'). It was their 1st ever win vs a ranked tm (0-22) and their 6 gm upsetting unbeaten Hutgers 35-23 (+13). It was their 1st ever win vs a ranked tim (0-22) and their 6 gm win streak is their longest s/40. They did benefit from 7 RU TO's, and were outgained 409-355 but did own 224-96 rush yd and 37:05-22:55 TOP edges. Their stars are the 1-2 punch at RB with the 250-lb Durham being the bell-cow with 780 (4.7) and the speedy Archer being the change of pace with 766 (8.9!). LW Akron lost its 6th str gm 35-14 (+7') to CM but did have 27-21 FD and 492-444 yd edges. This is their 10 str gm and they are depth-shy in the 1st yr under HC Bowden. KSU has crucial gms at MU, at BG and OU to close out the ssn but clearly they have all the talent edges and should win comfortably. Vanderbilt 30 KENTUCKY 24 - UK is now 7-3 SU/ATS in this series and the fav is 5-1 ATS. There have been 6 outright upsets the L12Y. LTH we used UK (-15') as our 2010 5 ± GOY. They led 38-13 before all'g a garbage to with 2:23 left but still covered, 38-20. LY at home VU (-14) got its largest MOV in an SEC gm s/71. At the half they led 24-0 with a 278-41 yd edge. Vandy is off a HC win vs UMass 49-7 (-33) but in a unique situation as they've been an SEC AF 4 times in 12Y not only going 0-4 ATS but 0-4 SU incl Tenn LY (-1', 21-27). UK is playing its 10th str gm with a bye on deck and is off a 33-10 (+14) loss at Mizzou as 3 UK fmbl's led to 3 MO td's. UK is a dangerous conf HD under Phillips with 3 upsets incl the final 2 IV. (Miss and Tenn) but Vendu aced a win if they would to get the 28th bendugger. the final 2 LY (Miss and Tenn) but Vandy needs a win if they want to go to B2B bowl gms.

The Minutemen would do former TB Bucs HC John McKay proud as clearly make up for their lack of off (270 ypg, #124) with their lack of D (all'g 468 ypg #112). This is NI's 10 str gm but they do have a bye on deck. It's tough to back a huge dog when they are 2-6 ATS while NI has not only won 8 str gms SU but has also covered 5 str.

LOUISVILLE 35 Temple 18 - Temple is 2-1 SU in Louisville and did cover its LTH in '03 losing 21-12 (+14'). In their only other meeting in the L15Y, UL won 62-0 (-40') in '06. Temple is 9-5 ATS as an AD but on its 3rd AG in 4W and LW was hammered 47-17 (-6') at Pitt their 2nd str 25+ loss after starting BE play 2-0. The Cardiac Cards continued their march to the BE Champ LW with a 34-31 (-3') OT win over Cincy. UL trailed by 10 on two diff occasions but picked off Cincy QB Legaux 3x and benefitted from Cincy HC Jones calling a TO before a high snap on the GW FG att in OT which all'd UL a re-kick. QB Bridgewater is avg 264 ypg (71%) with a 13-4 ratio and UL has won 5 gms by a td or less TY. UL has the off (#54-108) and D (#48-86) edges and should allow their fans to breathe easy TW with a DD win.

WAKE FOREST 23 Boston College 20 - LY at home BC (-1) was outgained 392-336. They trailed 24-9 into the 4Q and lost 27-19 (SOD at WF45 w/1:45 left). WF is 14-9 SU hosting ACC foes but BC has won its L/2 trips here. There have been FIVE outright upsets in the L/9 meetings and the gms have all been close with the largest MOV 10 pts (avg 5.8). WF is off a 42-13 (+12) loss to Clem L/Thurs as they were down 35-0 in the 2Q and were held to -23 rush yds in the 1H. QB Price is avg 195 ypg (53%) with a 9-4 ratio. BC is off a 20-17 win over MD (-2') as they snapped their 5 gm losing streak and avoided their worst start s/'89 with a td pass w/:52 left. While the run gm has been abysmal avg 83 ypg (2.9) QB Rettig has been solid avg 276 ypg (56%) with a 15-5 ratio. This is BC's 4th AG in 5W and WF is off a Thurs gm and had a bye 3W ago. While the series says BC, the situation and home edges give WF the nod.

LTH ('09 CUSA Title gm) UH led 19-14 at HT but EC pulled away and won 38-32 (+2'). EC is off a disappointing 56-28 home loss (-3) to Navy and all'd 512 rush yds. It was tied at 14-14 late in the 2Q before Navy exploded for 4 str td's. UH led UTEP 45-7 LW in the 3Q but gave up 28 unanswered pts and failed to cover as a 13' pt HF. QB Piland who suffered a concussion in the SMU gm 9 days earlier was just 16-30-174-2-0 and UH did benefit from 6 UTEP TO's. In a gm that promises to feature a lot of pts we will take the Pirates who have one of the best HF edges in CUSA play.

GT had 4pl that probably would have gone for td's but the deep passes to the rec's missed by an inch or were dropped. GT led 21-3 after 3Q's. Trailing 21-3 MD got a 77 yd td run by bkp Brown and stayed within the spread in a 21-16 loss. GT is 8-3 SU vs MD but did lose the LTH ('07), '28-26 (-3'). The dog has covered 5 in a row with 3 outright upsets and the HT is 5-1 SU but 1-3 ATS. GT was destroyed 41-17 (-2') LW at home vs a BYU tm playing its 3rd str BCS tm and travelling across the country for the 2nd wk in a row. The GT off was held w/o a rush td for the 1st time in 2Y and held w/o an off td for 1st time in 4Y as they were outgained 411-157. MD down to their final scholarship QB, lost to BC 20-17 (+3) as 4th string Rowe did complete 23-42-240-2-3 but now HE is OFY and they will start a converted LB Petty with TE McMahon backing up here. Both tms desperately need a win here if they have any bowl aspirations left and we'll take the team with the QB.

Clemson 41 DUKE 34 - Last met '08. CU had dropped 5 str ATS (4-1 SU) at Duke with the common refrain after the gms being: the small crowd put them to sleep. LTH ('07) CU trailed 7-3 after 1Q but put the gm away in the 2nd and 3rd Q's outscoring Duke 37-0 with 14-3 FD and 305-39 yd edges (47-10, -16). Duke is 7-4 ATS as a HD and has a bye on deck but is playing a 10th str week while CU had a bye 3W ago and played last Thurs. The Tigers are off a dominating 42-13 (-12') win at Wake as QB Boyd threw for a sold pelyed last hills. The rights are in a dominating 42-13 (12) will a wake as 3D by time with a soch recid 428 yds w/5 td's and WR Watkins had a soch recid 202 recyds as the Tigers raced out to a 35-0 lead in the 2Q. CU became the 2nd ACC tm in hist to score at least 37 pts in 7 str gms and their struggling D held WF to -23 rush yds in the 1H. Duke predictably didn't handle clinching their 1st bowl bid s/94 well LW as they were demolished 48-7 (+27) at FSU getting outgained 560-232 and QB Renfree was knocked out of the gm (CS) after completing just 13-21-92-0-0 while bkp Boone was 3-15-37-0-0. While CU has the talent edges, as long as Renfree can play here, Duke has played exceptionally well at home TY going

5-0 SU/ATS outscoring their foes 43-21 and we think they could give the Tigers a game.

ARKANSAS 37 Tulsa 30 - Only recent meeting was '08 when Tulsa was ranked #19 and UA was a 7 pt HD and won 30-23 as a 3★ LPS. Tulsa is off a bye but the top 3 CUSA tms are all on deck incl a trip to Hou (LY's West champ). Ark is also in the same spot having UK, a bye and Ole Miss prior but at SC. at Miss St and LSU ahead but does need wins for faint bowl aspirations. TU is 7-1 SU and in their last outing were able to survive 28-24 (-21") over Rice as they were playing w/o their st'g QB Green. Green should be back here but he is comp just 52% which is low for a TU QB. While it looked like the Hogs were finally playing up to their talent level after 2 wins, LW they fell back to Earth with a 30-27 loss (-6') at home to Ole Miss as they outgained the Rebs 464-355 but had 2 crucial TO's and all'd a blk'd P. Tulsá was 0-3 ATS the L2Y vs the top-notch off's of Okla and OKSt failing to cover the avg spread of +15 by 17 ppg but it's tough backing an Ark tm that is 1-6 ATS TY and will be playing for a new HC shortly.

AUBURN 37 New Mexico St 13 - These 2 met at Auburn in '07 with AU (-16') and they won 55-20. AU has UGA at home on deck and the Tigers have played a non-conf (usually FCS) tm late in the ssn the L6Y. They are 0-4 ATS in those gms. Aub comes in off 5 str losses and off to its worst start s/52 (1-7 SU/2-6 ATS) after they all'd 671 yds (most ever all'd at home) in a embarrassing 63-21 (+14') loss to A&M LW. The calls éarlier TY to fire HC Chizik 2Y after winning a Nat'l Title seemed ridiculous at the time, but now with each loss it becomes more likely. NMSt also may be going thru a cch change next yr as HC Walker is 10-36 SU after LW's misleading 28-14 loss (+29) at LT where the Bulldogs missed 3 1H FG's and the Aggies scored the gm's final 14 pts. NMSt has played 2 late ssn money gms the L3Y at GA (+34', 16-63) and at Ohio St (+44, 0-45) but Auburn is 1-11 ATS in non-conf gms and in a large SEC sandwich. However, with the unique role of needing a big feel-good win the Tigers should keep the foot on the gas here if possible.

Stanford 40 COLORADO 13 - LY these two teams met for the 1st time s/93 (Stan 5-1 ATS). CU came in not only a banged up but then susp'd 5 players and WR Richardson sat out. Stan had 28-11 FD and 533-263 yd edges and won 48-7 (-29'). This is Stan's 1st trip to the altitude of the newcomers and also its 1st AG in 6W. Stan is off a 24-17 win (-25) over WSU where the Cardinal off struggled getting outFD'd 25-13 and had to rely on a D that produced a schl rec'd 10 sks and an IR td. QB Nunes continues his up and down season and is avg 203 ypg (53%) with a 10-7 ratio. CU is among the FBS's worst tms and LW predictably fell behind Oreg 56-0 at HT with both tms trying to end the gm quickly in the 2H. The Buffs anemic off (#105) is only outdone by a D (#113) that is all'g 204 rush (5.3). Stan is 10-2 SU and 7-5 ATS on the P12 road and its 10 wins have been by 26 ppg. While Stan is unlikely to put a huge number on the Buffs like UO/Fresno did, they can name the score here and look forward to a pivotal 3 gm conf stretch on deck that will determine their bowl/P12 North div fate.

UTAH ST 41 Texas St 17 - 1st meeting. In his last season as the HC at New Mexico ('97), Franchione beat Utah St 25-22. USt not only comes in at 7-2 SU but they are 8-1 ATS TY with their only loss a backdoor cover a CSU. LW they rolled over WAC newcomer UTSA 48-17 (-23') as QB Keeton continues to impress avg 262 ypg (68%) with a 19-5 ratio and the Aggie D is all'g just 96 rush ypg (2.6) which bodes well vs a TSU tm that likes to run the ball. The Bobcats are off a misleading 31-20 loss (+18') at SJSt as they were outgained 571-303. While the Aggies have played 10 str they do have a bye on deck while TSU is making B2B long trips playing in altitude and possible inclement weather.

LSU 17 Alabama 16 - Since the BCS started in '98 no teams involved in the Nat'l Title gm have ply'd each other the foll yr but that will change here. There have been 3 OT matchups in the L/7 meetings and the L/5 reg ssn gms have gone 2-2-1 ATS as Bama has won 2 and scored 112 pts while LSU has won 3 and scored 110 pts. Miles is 3-3 SU (2-3-1 ATS) vs Saban. LY in the 1st meeting, Bama missed 4 FG's and was int'd at the 1 and the Tide lost at home in OT 9-6 (-4'). The Nat'l Champ gm was a beatdown with Bama having 384-92 yd and 21-5 FD edges. LSU did not even cross midfield until the middle of the 4Q. The #1 Tide continue to be the media's bulletproof juggernaut after LW's 38-7 win (-22') win over Miss St but they did benefit from +3 TO's. QB McCarron is avg 211 ypg (69%) with an 18-0 ratio and is #1 in the NCAA in pass eff while the Tide D is #1 in most categories incl all'g just 57 rush ypg (1.9) TY (72, 2.4 LY!). LSU does come in extremely confident off B2B wins over Top 25 tms SC and A&M as The concern has to be QB Mettenberger who is avg 177 ypg (57%) with a 7-4 ratio. LSU does have significant sked edge off a bye while the Tide is on its 3rd away in 4 gms. Miles said after the win vs SC earlier TY that "Death Valley is a place where opponents' dreams come to die." Miles is 35-1 SU in home night games and the Crimson Tide's quest for a repeat Nat'l Champ dies here!

WYOMING 30 Colo St 27 - LY WY won its 3rd str over CSU in the Border War for the 1st time s/87-'89. HC Christensen embraced this rivalry when he took over and gives the team daily reminders of what it means all yr. There is even a clock in the weight room that ticks down to the next CSU gm. CSU (+5') did have a 25-18 FD edge in LY's gm but lost 22-19. CSU also susp'd 5 players prior to the gm. The HT is 7-3 SU and 7-2 ATS. Incl the LTH (WY 44-0, -2') the Rams have been shutout in 2 of its L/3 trips to Laramie. WY comes in a disappointing 1-7 SU after LW3 45-14 (+16) loss to Boise as they played w/o susp'd HC Christensen. He returns here vs a CSU tm that is off its first conf win albeit a misleading one as while leading Hawaii 28-27 in the 4Q, the Rams' final scores both came on long IR td's. Both tms are near the bottom in our off and def ratings and we'll go with the HF edge for the Cowboys who make it 4 str SU but are laying too many pts.

FLORIDA 30 Missouri 6 - First lined meeting, last met '66. For the L16Y Florida has played Vandy the week after UGA. This is UF's SEC FINALE!! (on Nov 3rd) with ULL, Jax St and Florida St on deck. This is only Missouri's 2nd SEC AG marking the 1st of 3 away in the L4W and its 1st experience in The Swamp. In a gm where the winner claimed control of the SEC East, UF blew several chances and had 6 TO's (only 1 A TO's 1st 7 gms comb) in their 17-9 loss (-6') to UGA. The two most critical ones came at the end of the 1 H as Driskel threw a lazy pass into the EZ that was int'd costing the Gators a short FG and a possible 9-7 lead and the final one was the dagger with TE Reed heading for the EZ only to fmbl. MO finally got its 1st SEC win LW 33-10 (-14) over UK. The Tigers turned all 3 of UK's fmbls into td's and QB Franklin who wasn't supposed to play came off the bench for an ineffective Berkstresser (10-18-71-0-2) to lead the win. UF still can claim a tie for the SEC East with a win here and we look for an agitated bunch of Gators to beat up on a MO tm that has found that "old man football" is not for the young and weak

Nebraska 17 MICHIGAN ST 16 - LY we had a 3★ CTOT on Under 49°. NU had a big situational edge off of an easy win while MSU was off of B2B W's over Mich & Wisky on a Hail Mary and had to travel. The Huskers (-4) won 24-3 with a 270-187 yd edge holding the Spartans to a ssn-low 187 yds. NU is 1-4-1 ATS on the

B10 road (usually 1st trips to stadiums) failing to cover by 18 ppg. This time NU is off a big home win over Mich and has to travel while MSU again is off a last second win over the Badgers. The Huskers (-2') took the Legends lead by dominating the 2H in their 23-9 win over Mich. UM trailed just 7-6 when QB D-Rob left the gm late 2Q due to an elbow inj and bkp Bellomy hit just 3-16-38 and 3 int as the Wolves had just 52 2H yds. NU finished with a 326-188 yd edge and the D finally earned their Blackshirts. Prior to a strong performance vs NW 2 wks ago B10 pass eff leader QB Martinez (223, 66%, 16-5) had struggled on the road vs BCS foes in the L2Y avg 166 ypg (52%) with a 3-7 ratio with the Huskers 2-4 SU/1-4-1 ATS. The Spartans ended Wisky's 21 gm home win streak by driving 75/12pl for a td to tie the gm at 10 with 1:08 left. After the Badgers hit a FG, MSU hit a 12 yd td pass on 3&8 for the win. QB Maxwell (224 ypg, 56%, 9-5) hit 9-11 in the final 2 drives playing his best game as a starter. B10's #1 rush D MSU (#7 FBS 91, 3.0) held UW to 19 yd with QB Stave being knocked out of the gm early 3Q severely limiting their off. NU has a big off edge (#17-85) but this time it's the Huskers who must travel after a big win and this one will come down to the wire.

W VIRGINIA 47 Tcu 41 - Only prior meeting was in 1984 Bluebonnet Bowl. New B12 members matchup TCU is on its 3rd AG in 4W and been working its way up the B12 ladder with diminishing returns (1-4 ATS in new conf). We went against the Frogs cashing our Oct GOM 5★ on OKSt (-6') as the Cowboys rallied from a 14-0 1Q deficit to score the gm's final 36 pts in a 36-14 win. TCU had just 1 off to tending their FBS best streak of 33 straight gms of scoring 20+ pts. QB Boykin (140 ypg, 62%, 11-6) limped off the field and didn't finish the gm (CS). TO's have been the story as the Frogs lead the league in both TO's forced (22) and lost (20). WV, meanwhile, is off a bye (TCU 9th str gm) after B2B pastings by K-St and TT by a combined 84-28. Former Heisman favorite QB Śmith (345, 74%, 26-2) was held to 211 ypg (58%) with 2-2 ratio in the losses throwing both of the td's in 4Q garbage time. The D fell near the bottom of the chart in nearly every NCAA category incl pass D (#120 - 360 ypg, 69%, 20-5). TCU is 4-1 ATS in the rare role of AD (incl LW's loss) but the situation greatly favors WV with TCU on a long and unusual trip East and running low on gas. NOTRE DAME 30 Pittsburgh 13 - Since '03 these two have met 7x's and the dog is 6-0-1 with 4 outright

upsets and the L/4 have been decided by 3, 5, 6 and 3 pts. LY ND (-7) did finish with a 398-268 yd edge but Pitt looked like they would win as they led 12-7 in the 4Q but had just 53 4Q yds and lost 15-12 (+7). ND is off arguably its biggest win s/93's upset of #1 FSU as they beat #8 OU 30-13 (+12') on the road. The gm was a bit misleading as the Irish did benefit from a ? holding call in the 1H that took a Sooner to off the board and the gm was tied at 13 mid-4Q. LB Te'o also had a big gm with 11 tkls, 2 tfl and a key int. ND's D did give up its 1st rush td TY but they still have all'd an FBS-low 7 td's. Pitt is off one of its most impressive performances of the ssn with a 47-17 win (-6') over Temple. It continues to shock us that Sunser is #8 NCAA pass eff avg 275 ypg (69%) with a 13-2 ratio while he has a 1-2 punch in the backfield behind him w/Graham and Shell comb for 1,063 (4.8). Clearly a flat spot for ND here, but with huge edge on D (#4-50), look for the Irish to continue their most successful ssn in at least decade with a DD win.

LOUISIANA TECH 55 Utsa 24 - 1st meeting. While the HC at Miami, FI Larry Coker went 2-0 vs LT with a 48-9 win in '03 and a 48-0 shutout in '04. LT is 6-0 ATS at home vs WAC when favored by 5 or more winning those by an avg of 46.5-11.5. The Bulldogs (-30) led NMSt just 7-0 at HT thanks 3 missed FG's. They were up 28-0 before the Aggies scored 2 td's in the final 8:00 to make the final score respectable. QB Cameron is #5 FBS pass ypg (325, 71%, 21-0) joining Bama's McCarron as the only 2 QB's who have started every gm TY but still haven't thrown an int. The Bulldogs are #3 FBS with 24 TO's forced. After a 5-0 start vs NMSt and 4 lower division tms reality has set in as UTSA has now lost 3 straight by 26 ppg as they were pounded 48-17 by WAC leader Utah St. Utah St had a 522-299 yd edge but blk'd a P which set up a 5 yd td drive and UTSA shanks gave the Aggies the ball at midfield or in Road Runner terr on 3 other 1H poss. The Bulldogs, of course, have all of the edges but are 1-3 ATS as a DD fav TY. San Jose St 37 IDAHO 20 - LY in the 1H SJSt despite a 193-98 yd edge, only led 22-10. ID, who had not scored an offensive td in 11Q's, went 79/6pl, 81/10pl and got a 70 yd td run to shockingly take a 32-22 lead with 1:49 left and won 32-29 (+8'). SJSt has lost 3 str by a ttl of 10 pts. The visitor is 6-2 ATS and the dog is 4-0 ATS in the series. Idaho is fresh off a bye but will be playing the rest of the ssn under interim HC OC Gesser as Akey was fired after a 1-7 start. QB Blackmon (231, 63%, 9-13) has struggled with no run gm to support him (81 ypg, 3.0) and he has now been susp'd from the tm. The Spartans (-20) actually trailed Texas St 20-17 going into the 4Q but 2 big plays (78 yd td pass, 32 yd td run) proved to be the diff. One of the best ply'rs you've never heard of is QB Fales (315, 73%, 17-5, #7 FBS pass eff). Spartans are 4-0 ATS on the road TY while ID is 0-3 ATS inside the Kibbie Dome.

UCF 30 Smu 16 - HC. LY at home SMU (-3') had the adv of a bye the wk prior. SMU led 10-0 when they got a 92 yd PR td and at the half UCF actually had a 184-144 yd edge but SMU led 17-3. It was 38-10 when UCF got a td with 3:52 left. Surprisingly, UCF had a 450-400 yd edge. UCF has won the previous 3 meetings by 29, 14 and 10 and the HT is 3-1 SU in the series with the last meeting here in the '10 CUSA Title gm. SMU is just 3-7 ATS as an AD and 7-19 SU on the CUSA road. The Knights celebrated the news Intle gm. SMO is Just 3-7 Al S as an AD and 7-19 SO on the CUSA road. The knights celebrated the news that they will be elig for the CUSA Title gm and bowl by beating Marshall 54-17 as a 2'pt AF. The Mustangs (-20') led 1-6 Memphis just 16-13 in the 3Q before scoring the gm's final 28 pts in a 44-13 win. QB Gilbert (251, 53%, 12-13) is improving after a rough start thanks to the presence of RB Line (844, 4.9). These tms are 7-1 SU in CUSA play with SMU's 1 pt loss to Tulane perhaps looming large as UCF continues their march towards CUSA supremacy USF 24 Connecticut 14 - The HT is 7-1 SU/6-2 ATS as these two play in different climates and travel 1,266

miles. UC is 4-1 SU and 3-2 ATS the L5Y. LY UC (+7') was at home but USF had a 339-253 yd edge but fmbl'd at the UC7, missed a 46 yd FG, was int'd at the UC19. Trailing 10-9 UC got a 10 yd FR td to lead 16-10 and got the win. USF is playing with legitimate triple revenge and has a bye on deck but Holtz is just 4-11 ATS as a HF incl LW's 37-36 loss (-2') to the Cuse. Holtz was the UC HC from '94-'98 (34-23) and now finds himself on a smoking hot seat as the Bulls lost their 6th gm in a row, are 0-4 in Big East play (1-11 in L/12 BE gms) and need to win out to make it to a bowl. The Bulls blew a 20 pt HT lead and SU completed the comeback by hitting a td pass with :03 left for the win. QB Daniels (235, 56%, 14-9) and the off have been inconsistent due to TO's as their -12 TO margin which is #117 FBS. The D is the only tm in CFB outside of DIII Denison to not have an int TY! UC is fresh off a bye but Pasqualoni is 0-3 ATS as an AD here. UC also lost to Syr in their last gm, but was blown out 40-10 on Fri. UC used the bye to prep for their next 4 gms as they need to win 3 to go bowling. The run gm has been non-existent (87 ypg, 2.5) as UC's -6 yd vs SŬ was their fewest since moving up to FBS. The battle to stay out of the Big East basement and we'll go with the more talented HT.

This is a quick rematch as they traveled to KC in week #4 and took advantage of five1H TO's and 6 overall to jump out to a 20-0 lead. That win raised their record to 9-1 ATS for the road team in SD div games. KC meanwhile is 9-2 ATS as an AFC West AD. Call for this Thursday Marquee and get a play on this game as well as tonight's college selection!

Denver 31 CINCINNATI 24 - While Denver's results of their Sun Night game are not known it will clearly be a letdown after a trip to face Brady in NE, Rivers in SD and hosting Brees and the Saints. The Broncos D however will be happy to not face a marquee QB. While Cincy sits at 3-4 and QB Dalton's pass % is 64% after being 58% LY his ratio is only 13-10 compared to 23-10 LY. What makes his numbers even worse is that he's faced 6 teams whose avg pass D rank is #26 and vs #2 PIT he threw for 105 yds (50%) while DEN comes in #9. The Bengals are on a 1-6-1 ATS streak at home and this year at Paul Brown Stadium they've allowed 69% comp and that was against Big Ben and 2 rookie QB's (Weeden & Tannehill). Manning has shaken off the rust and in his L/4 games he's thrown for 329 ypg, 68% and an 11-1 ratio. Peyton also went 11-4-1 ATS away his L2Y at Indy and while he's 1-2 ATS TY the losses came to a pair of division leaders with combined 12-3 records.

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GREEN BAY 27 Arizona 13 - The Cardinals are off LW's MNF game vs SF and road teams with a bye on deck off of MNF are 10-3-1 ATS. GB has a slight statistical edge with the #21 and #13 units (+3 TO's) at home in cold weather vs the domed #31 and #6 units (+4 TO's). However, their real edge is their #1 pass rush vs an OL that has given up 35 sacks TY with 4 straight games of 5 or more prior to SF. IND outgained TEN 286-166 after the 1H and Luck

CINCINNATI 28 Syracuse 23 - UC is now 6-1 SU/5-2 ATS in this series. LY Syr was out to avenge a 31-7 home loss and they were -1' in the dome. UC was w/o QB Collaros but still rolled to a 30-13 win. Syr did actually have a 363-268 yd edge and trailed just 10-6 at the half. The visitor has won 3 in a row SU by 21 ppg and has covered 5 in a row. After 5 str wins, the Bearcats have dropped to 2 str incl LW's 34-31 (+3') OT loss at L'ville on Fri where UC had a 10 pt lead twice but couldn't hang on and HC Jones had an ill-advised TO on UL's FG att in OT as UL fmbl'd the snap but got a 2nd chance. Syr's D has forced just 8 TO's this yr. The loser of this gm likely falls out of the league race and we'll side with the HT who has outplayed its L/2 opp's despite the losses.

UTAH 24 Wash St 17 - These two have met 3x s/99 and surprisingly the visitor is 3-0 SU/2-1 ATS. LY WSU finished with a 399-358 yd edge and the field was covered in snow most of the gm. UT (-3') would prevail in OT on a 38 yd FG. UT snapped a 4 gm losing streak and kept its bowl hopes alive LW with a 49-27 (-1') drubbing of Cal. The Utes did benefit from 2 Dunn 100 yd KR td's (schl rec'd) and finished with a 22-19 FD despite being outgained 441-344. QB Wilson has avg 183 ypg (64%) with a dismal 1-4 ratio in his 3 sts. WSU is off a close 24-17 (+25) loss to Stan after the final drive fell short. QB Tuel (218 ypg, 67%, 7-4 ratio) got his 1st start since gm 2 and responded with his 1st career 400 yd pass gm (on WSU rec'd 43 att's) but took 10 sks! CLEVELAND 21 Baltimore 17 - The Ravens are 8-Ĭ ATS off the bye week and have had an extra week to stew after getting hammered by HOU prior to the bye. However, the Ravens who have failed to cover 5 straight are contending with the Hurricane Sandy situation prior to travelling. BAL relies on a no huddle offense to set the pace in the game and while it works well at home (+33 ypg) it struggles on the road due to crowd noise (-148 ypg). The Ravens are also prone to playing down to the level of their competition as shown by barely getting past KC. BAL had a 438-357 yd edge vs CLE in the 1st meeting holding the Browns to 43 yds rushing (2.5) winning 23-16 but failing to cover as a 12 pt HF. CLE did move from its 10 down to the BAL 33 with a chance to tie at the end but Weeden over threw the pass. CLE gave a solid defensive effort LW holding SD to 6 punts and 2 SOD on 11 drives. CLE also expects to have both starting DT's Rubin (ankle) and Taylor (pectoral) for depth for the #24 rush defense. The dog is 8-3-1 ATS in CLE games and with the Ravens beat up and distracted we'll call for the home team with the points.

With the NFC East matching up vs the South we already have 4 common foes in TB, NO, ATL and the NYG. The Panthers have gone 1-3 (2-2 ATS) getting outscored 99-80 and outgained by 20 ypg while the Skins are 2-2 (3-1 ATS) only getting outscored by a point (105-104) and outgaining the foursome by 47 ypg. LW Newton voiced his displeasure with the offense and despite going on the road vs the #7 D he threw for 314 yds (outgained CHI 416-210) but threw another game costing pick 6 up 19-14 with under 7 min left. The Panthers need RB Stewart for their offense to be successful as LY in their 6 wins he had at least 10 rush att's or 85+ yds and TY again he had 11 rush att's in the NO win but he struggled again LW (42, 2.5). The Redskins rush D at home however has only allowed 90 ypg and only 3.5 ypc. We'll fade the Panthers on a second straight road game off blowing a 19-7 4Q lead and with only one win on the season. The Skins meanwhile return home off a previous home win playing with revenge from a 33-20 loss LY with an excited QB and home crowd knowing they want to head into their bye on a positive note.

Detroit 34 JACKSONVILLE 14 - The time to jump on a team is when others think they're underachieving but there's a reasonable explanation. No one has played a better set of defenses than the Lions as into LW they've already faced the league's #1, #3, #6, #8, #10 and #12. Versus the one non-top 12 D they faced (TEN #30) they posted 583 yds and 36 FD's!! Look for the Lions to prioritize getting out to a fast start as they trailed at HT in ALL 7 games this season. The Jaguars only have 3 main issues this season but they are unfortunately their off (#32), defense (#25) and their ST's (#32). Jacksonville has had 7 td drives in the L/6 games but ONLY 2 have been over 5 plays long meaning if you can stop the home run you will shut them down as evidenced by getting held to 212 yds or less in 3 of the L5W. The Jags have also been very hospitable at home with a D allowing 67%, that only has 4 picks on the year and only has a 1.0 sack % at home. The trio of Stafford, Megatron and TE Pettigrew are salivating and Johnson is the ONLY rec avg over 15 ypc (15.6) with at least 32 rec while Pettigrew is on pace again for another top 5 finish among TE's. We'll back a hungry Lions squad who despite being a disappointing 3-4 know they are playoff worthy and has averaged 40 ppg in their L/5 when favored by 6 pts or more.

Chicago 20 TENNESSEE 13 - The Bears are sitting atop the NFC North with the NFC's second best record so forgive them if their full attention is not on this trip with a Sunday night home game vs the AFC's leader on deck. However traveling on the road against a team you are expected to beat is where Lovie Smith has shined going 6-1-1 ATS as an AF failing to cover the lone ATS loss by 1/2 pt. The Bears TY have feasted against the #25 schedule outgaining IND, STL, JAX by 166 ypg and LW when the offense struggled the NFL's #1 ST's forced punts of 6 & 35 yds leading to 38 & 49 yd td drives while the D pitched in with a pick 6. While TEN units are only ranked #24 and #30 it has been against the #4 schedule incl home games vs NE, DET and PIT the last 2 of which they beat. TEN's CJ has topped 90+ yds rushing in 4 of the L/5 but he only totaled 24 (1.6) vs Minny's top 10 D and now he faces the leagues #1 rush D (78 ypg, 3.8) which has also totaled 27 sks and they will feast on an immobile Hasselback and an OL that has all'd 2.6 sks/gm the L/5. Look for Culter to have plenty of time vs a D that has had multiple sacks in only 2 games this season and to take advantage of a sieve-like secondary allowing 72% comp. Big difference for Titans psyche coming into this at 3-5 after they failed to take advantage of a 13-6 4Q lead kicking off to a team they had held without a td and then to lose at home in OT.

NY GIANTS 27 Pittsburgh 24 - These 2 teams have appeared in 4 of the L/5 Superbowls with Eli winning 2 and Big Ben dropping two. The Steelers strong D and consistent rush attack led them to a 7-1 ATS mark as an AD from '08-'10 but injuries to the OL and the void of a healthy main RB had Pittsburgh 0-3 ATS as an AD LY and they are 1-3 on the road TY. They have however already beaten Washington and Philly outgaining both by 99 ypg while the Giants were outgained vs both by 72 ypg. The Giants have been a poor HF as of late and that's continued this season as they are 1-3 ATS and 7-17-1 since '09. The teams are very much alike as both have top 11 offense that can grind it out as they each are averaging over 21 FD's per game. On the defensive side however Pittsburgh's season worst is when they allowed 359 yds and 21 FD's while NY has allowed over that in half their games. The Giants have needed TO's to assist their D and they've done that as they are tied with NE with +13 TO's while the Steelers are a pedestrian +1. We'll call for the Giants by a FG and see if Pitt can cover for the 1st time in 5 tries as an AD of 4 or less or if the Giants can cover as a fav of a to or less vs the AFC (0-5-1 ATS).

Dallas at ATLANTA - The Cowboys are in a brutal division sandwich having lost to the Giants LW with a trip to Philadelphia on deck. Dallas has however outgained opponents on the road by 74 ypg. While the Falcons are getting outgained by 76 ypg at home they win the games they are supposed to going 9-1 ATS as a HF of 6 or less. Philadelphia at NEW ORLEANS - With the interim-interim being replaced by the interim we are unable to know if Vitt made a difference to a defense that rated dead last in the NFL prior to their trip to Denver. The Saints did enough to win in Brees' record setting game and followed it up with a victory in Tamp but they've still allowed 421+ yds in every game.
