4★ OKLAHOMA over Kansas St - OU is now 8-1 SU but just 4-4-1 ATS vs K-St. LY OU was off a loss and was the lower ranked team (#11 vs #10). It was the story of two halves. KSU led 17-14 in the 2Q. They missed a 25 yd FG with 4:27 left and trailing 20-17 fmb'd on 2&12 with :19 left in the half and OU got a 53 yd FG on the final play to lead 23-17. The 2H was all OU and Landry Jones threw for a schl rec'd 505 yds. KSU punted on their first 5 2H poss and OU scored td's on each and won 58-17. LW K-St beat NT 35-21 (-27) as QB Klein had another gutsy perf w/315 comb rush/pass yds. LY vs the elite Big 12 defenses (OU and TX) the Wildcats avg'd 182 ypg and 11.5 Fd/ym. Both tms come in undefeated and ranked in the Top 15. Okla is playing their "A" game for Sept off a bye and two weak foes with another bye on deck. OU is 24-11-1 as a HF but Kan St has covered 8 str as an AD with 3 outright upsets. Each of the last 3 years, we've used a DD fav that has cashed as a 5★ Winner. Could the Sooners be in the same situation this year?

FORECAST: OKLAHOMA 44 Kansas St 20

3★ FLORIDA over Kentucky - UF has now won 25 in a row vs UK. UK had actually covered 5 in a row from '02-'06 but UF has not only covered the L/5, they've outscored UK 115-6 in the 1Q of the those. LY UF was -19' on the road but led 31-10 at half and rolled to a 48-10 win (405 rush yds). After 2 SEC road gms, this is the Gators SEC home opener but they've dropped 5 of 6 ATS at home vs SEC with the only cover by 0.5 pt. However, they are off 2 impressive comeback wins as they trailed A&M 17-7 before scoring 13 unanswered and LW trailed 20-13 before scoring 24 unanswered in their 37-20 (+3) win at Tenn cashing as a 3★ Key Selection on these pages. QB Driskel (so much for 2-QB system) continues to improve each wk (14-20-219-2-0 vs UT) as the Gators outgained UT 555-340. UK HC Phillips maybe on the hottest seat in America fall to a 32-31 OT loss to WKU. The Cats roared back from a 24-10 3Q deficit to send it to OT but in the end could not overcome QB Smith's 4 ints. UF is 18-7 SU and 16-8 ATS the wk prior to a bye. Gators' HC Muschamp said there's a "night-and-day" difference in the toughness of TY's team and we agree as the Gators easily move to 4-0.

FORECAST: FLORIDA 41 Kentucky 10

3★ GEORGIA over Vanderbilt - GA is now 16-1 SU in this series (only loss '06). Many times GA is in a sandwich but LY had a bye on deck. GA was -11' on the road but all'd a fake P to set up a td and kept settling for FG's leaving VU in the game as they also all'd a 96 yd KR td. The Dogs were up 23-7 before hanging on for a 33-28 win. Both are off wins vs overmatched foes but VU has a bye on deck while GA has Tenn/SC. LW VU beat Presbyterian 58-0 (-39). QB Carta-Samuels got the surprise start and went 13-20-195-1-0. GA was tied 14-14 mid-2Q vs FAU LW but then scored 42 str pts as QB Murray threw for a career-high 342 yds (outgained Owls 713-318). They were playing w/o 3 D s'trs incl AA LB Jones who was given a breather with a nagging groin inj. The visitor is 14-6 ATS in the series and GA is 9-14 ATS as an SEC HF but 4-1 the L/5. The Dogs have the edges on off (#10-60) and def (#11-29) and Carta-Samuels has just a 3-6 career ratio on the road and hasn't seen this type of spd on D in 2 yrs. Since VU put a scare into the GA late LY, they will take them more seriously here. Georgia has been two of our most recent 5★ Winners as they were -4 vs Kentucky (44-31) and -8 vs Michigan St in a bowl (24-12).

FORECAST: GEORGIA 41 Vanderbilt 17

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ FLORIDA ST over Clemson - The home team is 9-1 SU but CU is 6-1 ATS. LY we liked CU as they were in a great situation. They were off a big win vs Aub but were at home a 2nd str wk while FSU had just faced #1 Okla in their "Game of the Season" and came up short while also losing their QB and bkp FSU QB Trickett got his 1st start on the road. After the game was over, Tiger fans celebrated like they won a Nat'l Title and they had 26-19 FD and 455-365 yd edges in the 35-30 (-2) win. The previous yr at FSU they outplayed the Noles with a 25-18 FD edge but came up 3 pts short. FSU has dominated so far this season outscoring their foes 176-3 and LW amassed 385 rush yds avenging their loss to WF LY in a big way 52-0 (-27) as we cashed our Top Weekly Totals Play on the Under. RB Thompson had 197 rush yds LW (21.8) and will be facing a CU D that has all'd 180 rush ypg (4.8) TY. The CU off has been impressive so far avg 518 ypg but the FSU D is all'g just 103 ypg. CU did get WR Watkins back LW in a 41-7 win over Furman and their QB Boyd is avg 249 ypg (73%) with a 6-1 ratio. However, he lines up behind an OL with 3 new s'trs and 7 underclassman in the 2 deep facing the top D-line in the country on the road. That gives FSU the matchup edge as they continue their Revenge Tour 2012 by playing their "A" game here.

FORECAST: FLORIDA ST 41 Clemson 17

2★ FIU (+) over Louisville - UL is playing with legit revenge. LY these two met for the 1st time and FIU got their first ever win over a BCS foe. UL actually had 24-9 FD and 446-293 yd edges at home but 3 big plays gave FIU the win (71 yd IR td, 74 and 83 yd td pass). UL is 15-6 ATS in road openers. FIU does have its SBC opener on deck but will be excited for the rare visit from a ranked BCS foe. While FIU is 0-4 SU hosting BCS schools, they are 3-1 ATS blowing a 4Q lead LY vs Duke and in their L/2 outgained Duke and Rut by an avg of 470-278. FIU is 6-0 ATS as a HD. The Cards are the only BE team to be ranked but nearly blew a 36-7 HT lead vs NC LW as NC scored 20 str 4Q pts and had a potential td pass deflected in the EZ with 1:53 left. QB Bridgewater is #7 FBS pass eff (285 ypg, 82%, 5-0). FIU was at the other end of the spectrum LW as they fell behind UCF 23-0 at the half with just 2 FD's and 26 tl yds. They did cut it to a 10 pt deficit early 4Q before the Knights went on a 6:49, 69/14pl FG drive which put the game away. FIU is dangerous but UL picks up the win.

FORECAST: FIU (+) 24 Louisville 30

2★ TULSA over Fresno St - The Golden Hurricane are 1-4 SU but 3-2 ATS vs the Bulldogs (first gm in '99, last met '05). Unlike LY when Tulsa opened with three Top Ten tms they are much fresher TY and only had Nicholls St LW (won 66-16, -41). FSU just battled a pair of BCS schools (although Colo may be weakest BCS tm TY) and has their conf opener on deck. LW the Bulldogs were a DD fav over a BCS tm for the first time s/93 and cruised to a 69-14 win. FSU outgained CU 516-123 in the 1H and had twice as many td's (8) as the Buffs had FD's (4). Pat Hill was 16-9 ATS as an AD (his best role) but they have a new HC and Tulsa is 8-2 ATS as a HF with the situational edge and the stronger team.

FORECAST: TULSA 44 Fresno St 30

Kent St at BUFFALO - KSU is 1-4 SU (1-3-1 ATS) s/05 but won the LTH ('08) with 6 lead changes (3 in 4Q). KSU (+9) trailed 21-17 but got a 25 yd td pass w/5:57 left. UB on 2&gl from the 7 got a pass to the one but fmb'd into the EZ (KSU ran out L1:46). The HT is just 1-5 SU and in their last meeting ('09) UB got a FG with :05 left to win on the road. Hazell is 1-5 ATS as an AD and Quinn was 4-2 ATS at home LY. UB has the edge on off (#64-115) and KSU on D (#71-105) and both tms enter 1-1 with blowout wins over FCS tms and blowout losses to SEC schls. Byu at BOISE ST - BYU is 0-2 (1-1 ATS) vs BSU. BYU has the exp and technical edges and BSU has dealt with inflated lines, BSU is 1-7 ATS as a HF while BYU is 4-0 as an AD. Baylor at ULM - 1st meeting. Second time ('96) a BCS schl will visit Monroe and the 1st non-conf FBS tm to play in Monroe s/07. ULM is ply'g a 3rd str BCS foe off trips to Ark and Aub but they have impressed going 1-1 SU (2-0 ATS) with both gms going to OT. First time out on the road w/o RG3 for Baylor but QB Florence is very capable and in 7 str in '09 as a true was 77-121 (64%) on the B12 road. Baylor was 0-4 ATS away LY so despite being off a bye and SHSt (won 48-23 but we cashed a 4★ Small College Play on SHSt +30') who would blame a look ahead with their first trip to WV on deck? Saturday, September 22nd

WAKE FOREST 30 Army 27 - WF has won 5 str in series but last met in '07. WF's Grobe is well versed in stopping the option going 3-1 ATS vs Navy/GT in '09-10 but didn't face either LY. The Deacons did struggle on rush D all'g 4.8 ypc vs FBS foes LY and LW ran into a buzz saw all'g 385 rush yds (8.6) to FSU in a 52-0 loss (+27) as we cashed a 2★ on the Noles on these pages. WF's off also struggled as expected managing just 7 FD's but should get back on track here vs an Army D that all'd 515 total yds LW in a 41-40 loss to NI (+3). Army, trailing 28-13, did take a 40-35 lead late in the 4Q but couldn't hang on. The Cadet ground gm, after a disappointing opener, did notch 3 100 yd rushers LW in amassing 486 rush yds (5.7) and they had an incredible 42:33-17:17 TOP edge. WF has gone 3-1 ATS as HF only failing to cover 45 pt spread vs an FCS foe. However, after a 52-0 beating LW, you have to wonder what their psyche will be and we'll gladly back an underrated Army tm here.

Usf 37 BALL ST 27 - LY in their 1st meeting, BSU was coming off a win over Indy while USF was off their upset of ND but it is was USF's home opener and they dominated winning 37-7 (-20) as USF QB Daniels threw for a career-best 359 yds and USF led at the half 30-0 with a 386-76 yd edge. After "good" Daniels led a 4Q comeback win on the road at Nev in wk 2, five days later "bad" Daniels was back throwing 3 int as USF dropped a key BE conf gm at home to Rutgers 23-13 (-7) falling to 0-9 on Thurs Night TV appearances. Ball St is 0-3 hosting BCS schools (avg loss by 12 ppg) but LW beat Indy as a 2' pt AD for a 3rd str time 41-39 getting together a 42 yd FG on the final play. BSU did have a 32-28 FD edge but was outgained 558-440. USF does have rival Fla St on deck and is just 3-9 ATS as an AF. However, BSU is just 3-8 ATS as a HD and USF has a huge edge on D (#47-110).

DUKE 45 Memphis 21 - 1st meeting. The Tigers are 0-14 SU/2-11-1 ATS vs BCS schools. Cutcliffe is 6-3-1 as a HF here at Duke and all of their gms are important if they want to make the postssn so there won't be look ahead to their ACC opener next week. Duke only had NC Central LW and won 54-17 (-35). QB Renfree is avg 256 ypg (70%) with a 5-3 ratio and the Devils are avg 409 ypg. Cutcliffe was the HC at Ole Miss and went 2-2 SU vs Memphis (lost L/2). Mem looks improved TY under 1st yr HC Fuente but they still stands at 0-3 SU (1-2 ATS) after a 48-30 loss (+5) to MT LW. TT trans QB Karam has been respectable avg 212 ypg (58%) with a 5-1 ratio but the Mem D has all'd 483 ypg. Duke is 1-2 as a DD fav and this is their 1st time s/'94 that they are a 20+ fav vs an FBS foe but this is Cutcliffe's best tm yet here and 9 of his 11 home wins here have been by DD's with the avg margin by 23 ppg.

MICHIGAN ST 41 E Michigan 10 - Hard to imagine Sparty being focused in a ND/Ohio St sandwich but they have performed well in their L/2 sandwich gms beating CM earlier TY 41-7 (-19) off Boise with ND on deck and CM again LY off a ND loss the Spartans won 45-7 (-21). After an outright loss to CM in '09 MSU is 4-0 ATS vs Mich MAC schls outscoring them by a 43-11 avg margin. MSU was manhandled by ND's DL LW all'g 4 sks while rushing for just 50 yds (2.0) in a 20-3 loss which snapped their 15 gm home win streak. It was their worst showing on off at home since losing to CM 20-3 in '91. However, their opp EM is 0-8 in series (0-5 ATS) and in the L/5 gms have been outscored 50-9, outgained 512-223 and outFD'd 24-10. EM HC English had his team bigger and stronger LY going 2-0 ATS vs B10 trailing Mich 14-3 at HT and Penn St 17-0 but TY is 0-3 SU/ATS and LW were pummeled by Pur 54-16 (+23) getting outgained 576-313. EM does have a bye on deck and is 7-4 ATS as an AD but MSU has a huge edge on D (#4-119) and will want to atone for LW's miserable performance.

VIRGINIA TECH 27 Bowling Green 17 - VT is hosting MAC team sandwiched between 2 non-conf BCS gms (Pitt/Cincy) while BG is on its 3rd AG in 4W, off main rival Toledo and has HC on deck. Under Clawson BG is 0-5 SU (2-3 ATS) vs ranked opp's w/an avg score of 45-16 and the L/2Y was outgained 643-217 vs WV and 721-283 vs Mich (throw away gms) but did compete well earlier TY vs UF in a 27-14 loss (+29). Both tms are off tough losses as VT was dominated by Pitt 35-17 (-10) getting outFD'd 27-14 and outgained 537-324. VT QB Thomas had arguably the worst gm of his career throwing 3 ints (45%). BG meanwhile lost to their arch rival UT for a 3rd str yr 27-15 (+3) as QB Schilz only avg'd 6.0 ypa. After going 10-4 ATS as a DD fav in '09-'10 VT is now just 1-8 ATS and BG is 16-7 ATS as a DD dog.

IOWA 23 C Michigan 13 - Iowa is 2-0 SU/ATS in series but last met in '98. Iowa has gotten off to an uninspiring 2-1 start as their offense is avg just 17 ppg (#110 in FBS). LW they were able to beat N Iowa 27-16 thanks to RB Weisman's 113 yds (4.7) and 3 td's. QB Vandenberg has struggled avg just 198 ypg (57%) with an 0-2 ratio and new OC Davis has voiced his concerns over the lack of playmakers. The conservative Iowa off has led to a 9-22 ATS record as DD fav. The Hawks do have a HC gm vs big rival Minn on deck, a foe who has upset them in B2B years as 15 and 15' pt dogs. CM is no bargain away from home having lost 7 str ATS but had 227-93 yd edge at HT at KY and 253-233 yd edge at HT at NCSt LY but withered. The Chips (0-2 ATS) were whipped by MSU 41-7 (+19) in their last outing in front of a record home crowd and QB Radcliff has also struggled with a 1-3 ratio (51%). CM is in the 1st of 3 away with MAC Champ NI on deck, a tm they upset LY but did have a bye LW. With both tms struggling to find an identity, we'll be conservative and call for the HT to win by 10.

OHIO ST 48 Uab 6 - First meeting. If any HC will step on an opp's throat it's Meyer. He went 16-2 as a DD non-conf fav at Fla with one loss vs Mich in Lloyd Carr's last game but he is just 1-2 ATS here in that role fol'g LW's 35-28 win over Cal (-16'). The Bucks led 20-7 at HT but all'd two long td runs and found themselves tied at 28-28 before Miller found Smith for a 72 yd td pass with 3:26 left. Miller did throw for a career-high 4 td passes and after avg 22 carries the 1st 2W he had just 12 LW as they want to keep him fresh for the entire ssn. UAB is in 2nd of B2B away vs BCS Top 15 tms and while they did lose 49-6 to SC (+33') LW, the FD's were even at 20 and SC HC Spurrier sd, "This was one of the closest 49-6 games I have ever been around." UAB is 13-8 ATS vs ranked tms and OSU does have a huge game at Mich St next wk. Look for plenty of the OSU bkps to get work and after LW Meyer said, "The best thing about 3-0 is the chance to go 4-0" and the Bucks easily do so here.

NORTH CAROLINA 42 East Carolina 20 - LY EC had a record home crowd but Renner had 4 td passes, RB Bernard rushed for 146 yds and NC jumped out to a 21-0 lead. EC QB Davis threw for a school record 417 yds but most came in the 2H as NC led 28-3 at the half with a 326-216 yd edge and won 35-20 (-6). EC 490-456 yd edge as EC was -4 in TO's. Pirates are 1-5 SU/ATS vs the Tar Heels. EC is 1-14 SU (win in '10 vs NCSt, OT) and 4-10-1 ATS vs BCS tms. LW they did pick up a huge conf road win at S Miss 24-14 (+7) despite being outFD'd 20-13 and outgained 324-228 (EC +3 TO's). Meanwhile NC is off 2 tough losses to WF and Lville. LW the Heels found themselves down 36-7 but thanks to 4 2H td passes by Renner were at the UL3 down 39-34 but their 4 dn pass fell inc in the EZ. The Heels have been hurt by the absence of All-ACC RB Bernard and there is a possibility he ret's here. Fedora also faced EC the L4Y at SM going 3-1 ATS and LY won 48-28 but EC had 420-299 yd edge. EC is in its 3rd str away and McNeil is 3-7 ATS as AD while NC only has Idaho on deck and needs to right the ship.

PENN ST 27 Temple 13 - Temple has covered 3 str but Penn St has won the L/6 by a comb 190-32 all'g just 3 td's. LY TU had one of their largest crowds in history but unlike their previous HG vs PSU, this time their fans had a slight crowd edge. TU has not defeated PSU s'/41 (0-36-1). LY TU (+7) led 10-7 in the 4Q but after an int PSU went 44/12pl for a td w/2:42 left. PSU was w/o its starting K and missed 3 FG's. PSU had a 308-197 yd edge. PSU is just 5-14 ATS as a HF. The Lions did get their 1st win of the O'Brien era LW 34-7 (-5) over Navy. QB McGloin threw 4 td's and they benefitted from 4+ TO's as they were outgained 391-341 and outFD'd 22-16. TU is 1-1 after a loss to MD 36-27 (-10) but is coming off a bye and has a bye on deck. The Owls do have a huge ST's edge (#17-112) but PSU has the D edge (#28-89) and will be focused especially here after LY's close call.

WEST VIRGINIA 45 Maryland 23 - WV is 5-0 SU/ATS in the series. LY we used a 3★ CTOT on Over 57'. It was the story of two halves. At the half WV had a 302-176 yd edge and after the opening drive of the 3Q led 34-10. MD then was SOD at the WV6 but went 61/5pl, 44/7pl (after int) and 66/12pl for td's to make it 34-31 (10:29). WV got a 21 yd FG with 4:42 left and MD was int'd at the WV13 with 1:13 left. While WV does have its much-anticipated B12 home opener on deck, they are off a bye and James Madison. WV beat the Dukies LW 42-12 (-35') in Wash DC thanks to 5 Geno Smith td passes. The Heisman cand is comp 88% TY with a 9-0 ratio! MD is most improved TY at 2-1 but LW they did lose 24-21 (+3) vs Edsall's fired up former schl Conn. MD does have bye on deck but WV has huge edge on off (#1-104). It's also safe to say the Terps D may be shell-shocked having faced FCS W&M, Temple and Conn. Look for WV to get another comfortable win.

WISCONSIN 37 Utah 13 - 1st meeting. UW has cashed 6 str ATS the game prior to their conf opener. The L3Y it's been vs FCS foes and they've dominated (avg line -37, 58-9). After playing 1 BCS team each ssn the L6Y UTEP is playing their 3rd in 4W. Possibly the most disappointing unit in CFB TY has been the UW OL. LW the Badgers found themselves down 14-3 at HT before rallying for a 16-14 win (-14') over Utah St (Aggie missed late FG) in Madison. UW was outgained 308-234 and made a QB switch at HT going with ex walk-on Stave over heralded grad trans O'Brien who was just 5-10-63. RB Ball did get 139 yds but it came on 37 carries as he is avg just 3.8 ypc TY. The Miners are 1-2 SU (2-1 ATS) and are coming off a 41-28 win (-14) over NMSU as they led 27-0 in the 2Q. UTEP QB Lamaison did throw for 300 yds and a career-high 4 td passes but their top RB Jeffery missed for a 2nd str gm (? here). UTEP is 5-9 ATS off a SU win and 4-11 ATS in AG's vs BCS tms and you have to think the UW OL which avg 321 lb vs a UTEP DL with 2 DE's avg 230 should lead to a big gm for Ball, right?

MIAMI, OH 44 Massachusetts 6 - First meeting. UMass is 4-8 SU in conf AG's and that was in the FCS. When UMass HC Molnar was the OC at UC his Bearcats went 3-0 vs MU scoring 43 ppg and putting up 422 ypg but clearly he is not working with the same talent here. UMass has served as stat padders for their first 3 opp as they've been outgained by an avg of 521-194 and outscored 48-6. Miami was just 4-8 LY and used LW's gm at Boise as a paycheck gm losing 39-12 (+21) getting outgained 599-227 and outFD'd 33-9. This is their MAC opener (only HG vs FBS tm till Oct 27) and they are a much improved tm and one of the MAC's best while Mass is making the large step up to FBS with a new HC and looks like the MAC's weakest. Miami names the score here.

Utah St 27 COLO ST 23 - LY we had a 3★ LPS on CSU +10' and it was also the Free Big Dog POW given out at 1-347-677-1700. It was yet another outright upset winner as CSU won 35-34 on the road. Utah St does run some spread option with their mobile QB Keeton and CSU has Air Force on deck so it will invest heavily into prepping for it. USU dropped 4 str vs CSU by 20 ppg. USU is off 2 very physical gms (Utah and Wisky) but fared quite well splitting the two gms SU and going 2-0 ATS. LW they blew a 14-3 HT lead at UW (+14') and missed a 37 yd FG in final seconds in a 16-14 loss. QB Keeton is performing like the All-WAC player that he is avg 234 ypg (68%) with a 6-1 ratio. After picking up a big win over in-state rival Colo in opener, which has since been lessened (Colo is 0-3 SU/ATS), CSU has followed that with 2 losses incl LW 40-20 to SJSU as they were outgained 568-286. While USU has clear edges on off (#76-112) and D (#54-111), the dog is 19-3 ATS when USU takes to the road and CSU is 10-4 ATS as a HD.

ARKANSAS 34 Rutgers 17 - 1st meeting. There were only 2 HC changes after Jan 1st and they are meeting here. RU is off a Thurs night win over USF and has bye on deck but this is their 3rd long road trip to the deep South in the 1st 4W. USF did get a key BE conf road win LW (23-13 +7) as RB Jamison did his best Ray Rice impression running for 151 yds on a schl rec'd 41 carries and now dating back to LY has 4 str 100 yd gms. LW the Hogs minus QB Wilson (? here) were manhandled 52-0 (+20) being outgained 438-137 and were -5 TO's. Bama did have an early 7-0 lead w/o making a FD thanks to a bad snap on an Ark P and the Hogs did miss an early FG which could have made it a completely diff gm. Ark is 13-6-1 ATS as a HF (JLS is 0-2 TY in that role) and among BCS conf there is no larger div than between the powerful SEC and the BE. The Hogs played 4 SEC HG's vs non-Top 5 tms LY and won those by 24, 16, 42 and 27 incl our College GOY on Ark -14' vs Tenn (49-7 Winner). LW QB Wilson called out his tm in the post game and we expect a much better effort TW provided Wilson plays. Will we go back to the Hogs for our September 5★?

RICE 35 Marshall 34 - The visitor is 0-3 SU and 1-2 ATS in this series. LY Rice was the 8th team from the state of TX to play in Huntington and lose SU but they were +5 and only lost 24-20. Rice settled for 24 and 35 yd FG's in the 1H and trailed 17-6 (MU 222-155 yd edge). Rice went 86 and 79 yds in the 2H for td's to lead 20-17. Rice had the ball but fmb'd with 3:31 left and MU got a td with 1:49 left for the lead and the win. Both are off losses as Rice lost 56-37 to LA Tech (+21) all'g 609 yds (did have 33-30 FD edge). MU is off a tough 27-24 (+5) loss to Ohio as they let a 24-17 4Q lead slip away thanks to a couple of key TO's. MU QB Cato might be the MIP in the country as he leads the NCAA avg 407 pass ypg (71%) with an 8-2 ratio. MU is 7-16-1 ATS as an AF and Rice is 21-8-1 ATS at home vs CUSA foes. The Thundering Herd are a dismal 0-8 in the state of Texas and coming off the heartbreaking loss, fall to 0-9 here.

ILLINOIS 28 Kansas 24 - LY saw 7 lead changes (3 in 4Q). KU (+4') down 4 went 47/11pl hitting a GW 6 yd td pass w/:09 left in their 45-42 win. KU players were embarrassed LY to be a HD and are likely to be a dog again to same MAC tm they beat! LW the Hawks were a 3 td HD to TCU playing in its 1st ever B12 gm and the game was closer than the 20-6 final. KU QB Crist had 303 pass yds, but he was int'd, fmb'd as he was heading to the EZ in the 4Q, and missed several 3 dn throws that prevented K-St from capitalizing on 4 TCU TO's. LW NI led Army 28-13 but found themselves down 40-35 late in 4Q before Lynch (342 pass yds) threw a late td pass in the 41-40 win (-3). NI did rack up an incredible 515 yds on just 17:33 TOP (2.3 pts a min!) NI is 3-0 hosting BCS tms s'/98 and hasn't hosted one s'/03 a 20-13 OT win over #15 MD (+8). However NI all'd 3 100 yd rushers LW and now faces K-St RB Pierson/Cox who have comb for 526 yds already TY which should make this gm come down to the wire.

OREGON 52 Arizona 24 - UO is 5-2 SU but just 2-4-1 ATS vs UA. This has been a high scoring matchup as in the L4 UO's avg win has been by 51-37 and UO has only been -23, +18, +31 and +36 yds in the 4 meetings. LY UO was -15 on the road and LaMichael James rushed for a schl rec'd 288 yds. The Ducks had 1H td drives of 2:42, 2:19, 2:06, 2:02, 1:37 and led 35-3 with 2:45 left 2Q. UA did get as close as 35-24 with 2 td drives to open the 3Q but UO opened it back up to 49-24 in the 56-31 (-15) win. Both tms enter 3-0 SU but UA is 2-1 ATS while UO is 0-3 with inflated lines and has backed off in 2H of gms (led Ark St 50-3, Fresno 35-3 and TT 35-7). Having a mobile QB to work with has proved wonders for 1st yr HC Rodriguez as the Cats are avg 612 ypg and Matt Scott has also been sensational in the pass gm avg 332 ypg (72%) with a 7-1 ratio. On the other side Duck QB Mariota is avg 225 ypg (75%) with an 8-1 ratio. UA is 2-8 ATS in road openers and UO is 20-5 ATS in their 1st conf game. The Ducks have all the edges (off #4-17, def #26-60, ST's #13-79) and look for them to keep their foot on the gas this week.

UCLA 31 Oregon St 14 - Mike Riley had a streak of not beating UCLA which ended in '08 with a 34-6 win (-7) on the road. In '09 at home they won 26-19 (-9) and have dropped 2 in a row since. In fact, UCLA is now 7-2 SU but an even more impressive 8-1 ATS in this series. LY OSU was -4' at home. UCLA

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delivered the outright upset 27-19 and led 21-3 when they gave up an 85 yd PR td with :13 left in the half. OSU, trailing 27-19, got to the UCLA24 but was SOD with 2:12 left. OSU is 4-13 ATS in their 1st AG but is off a bye and the dog is 11-4 ATS in the series. However, due to OSU's opener being cancelled the Bruins have a 3-1 GUB edge and are 3-0 SU/ATS TY after beating UW 37-6 (-17) LW. RFR QB Hundley has been spectacular avg 276 ypg (67%) with an 8-3 ratio and RB Franklin continues to lead the NCAA with 541 yds (8.2). While Oreg St's win over Wisc 2W ago looked impressive the Badgers are 0-3 ATS while UCLA has flexed its muscles on both off/def in recent wks and may be TY's MIP tm to date.

USC 41 California 20 - USC is now 8-0 SU (by 19 ppg), 6-2 ATS in this series and way back in 1987 we won a Sept 5★ on USC -9 (31-14). LY USC was -3 and we used a Thur Night Marq on them and they won comfortably 30-9 the wk before playing ND. USC had all'd 84 pts and 946 yds the prev 2 gms but held Cal to 329. Maynard hit 25-43-294 yds but accounted for 4 TO's (USC +3 TO, Cal 329-313 yd edge). The LTH the Trojans were -2' and rolled to a 48-14 win with a commanding 602-245 yd edge (372-65 half). USC has won the L/4 by an avg of 31-7 but the visitor is 12-4 ATS and USC is just 2-5 ATS prior to a bye. The Trojans were playing w/out their All-P12 C Holmes LW and it showed as Stan outgained them 417-280 and USC was held to just 26 rush yds while Barkley was sk'd 4x in the 21-14 loss (-8') cashing a 2★ on Stan on these pages. Cal is off an impressive effort at OSU. After trailing 20-7 at HT, the Bears tied it up at 28 in the 4Q before a busted coverage all'd OSU to hit a 72 yd td pass in the 35-28 (+17) loss (Cal did miss 3 FG's). With their nat'l champ hopes taking a severe hit LW, it will be interesting to see how the Trojans respond but we think they bounce back in a big way.

WASH ST 41 Colorado 27 - These 2 have met 3 times in the L10Y and surprisingly the visitor is a perfect 3-0 SU/ATS with all 3 being outright upset wins. LY WSU (+3) had 455-336 yd and 28-20 FD edges but CU led 27-17 after a td with 5:11 left. WSU went 77/7pl for a 19 yd td pass with 2:35 left and forced a punt with 1:50 left then got 2 FD's and a 63 yd td pass with 1:10 left for the lead. LW the Cougs finally got HC Leach's off in gear amassing 461 yds in a 35-27 (-8) win at UNLV. Bkp QB Halliday (exp'd from LY) started in place of the inj'd Tuel (CS) and threw 4 1H td passes en route to 378 (58%). The Buffs are arguably the worst BCS tm TY at 0-3 SU/ATS. LW they played arguably their worst half of football ever down 55-7 (outgained 516-123) in their 69-14 loss to Fresno St. WSU is just 8-17 ATS as a HF and this is the first time they will be a DD conf fav s'/07 but Embree is 1-7 ATS as an AD and the Cougs need every win they can get if they want to make a bowl.

Lsu 30 AUBURN 16 - Miles is 5-2 SU vs Aub but just 3-4 ATS. The home team has covered 3 in a row and the fav in a row. LY LSU was -20' at home and got the largest MOV for LSU in this series. It was 45-3 when AU drove 86/10pl for a td with 2:22 left. AU did give Clint Mosley his 1st career start (12-20-145). While AU has a bye on deck they have been tested with gms vs Clem in ATL and a road trip to Miss St (both losses) and LW's 31-28 OT win over ULM (-15). LSU is off 3 HG's (Idaho LW 63-14, -42) with Towson on deck but is 3-0 SU outscoring its foes 48-10 (+265 ypg). Conf tech edges even out as LSU has covered 4 str as an SEC AF by 14 ppg and Aub is 4-1 ATS as a HD. LSU QB Mettenberger is making his 1st road start. Aub is 12-7 ATS vs Top 10 tms but LSU is 14-4-2 in its 1st SEC gm and 9-3 ATS in SEC AG's (5-0 SU and ATS LY). It's tough seeing AU QB Frazier who is avg 150 ypg (51%) with a 2-5 ratio having much success vs our #6 D. While the HT is 11-1 SU in the series, we look for that trend to stop here.

GEORGIA TECH 41 Miami, FI 24 - In '08 on a cold night in ATL, GT embarrassed UM with 472 yds rushing, 8.4 ypc and routed them 41-23. Since then, UM has dominated winning 33-17 at home (-4'), 35-10 on the road (-2') and LY was -2' at home and won 24-7. GT came in avg 517 ypg and UM held them to 211. We had an easy 3★ LPS winner on UM. Tough spot with a young Mia front 7 (only 2 Sr) playing its 3rd AG in 4W and facing the option but coming off an FCS foe makes it more manageable (beat Bethune-Cookman 38-10, -38' LW). Their star has been true frosh RB Johnson who is #2 in the NCAA in all-purp avg 213 ypg. LW GT scored 50 or more pts in an ACC gm for 1st time s'/00 in a 56-20 win over VA (-10) with a 594-297 yd edge. GT is just 3-5-1 as an ACC HF but is playing with revenge and is the stronger tm at home.

IDAHO 27 Wyoming 24 - This is WY's 1st gm at the Kibbie Dome (built in '71, enclosed in '75). ID has hosted only 7 non-conf FBS tms the L10Y going 3-0 SU vs MW tms and 0-4 vs the rest. WY has a bye on deck but while the Pokes are 13-3 as an AD under Christensen, he is 0-3 as an AF with two outright losses and if they are a HD they are 9-3 ATS. WY is off yet another outright loss to an FCS tm LW losing 24-22 (-11) to Cal Poly (outgained 359-260). QB Kirkegaard started in place for inj'd Smith (CS) and the Cowboys employed a conservative approach, limiting long passes and relying more on the run gm. While ID did lose 63-14 to LSU (+42) LW, it was a 28-14 HT gm and QB Blackman was much better than his stats showed (23-36-174-2-4) as just 2W ago he completed 30-37 for 352. With more stability at QB, we'll take the home team in this one.

WESTERN MICHIGAN 23 Connecticut 20 - LY we used WM (+3) as a 3★ Key Selection in Power Sweep and they delivered the upset win on the road knocking off a BCS foe. WM actually dominated as they had a 14-0 lead and UC did not cross midfield until 6:00 were left in the half. WM finished with a 27-20 FD edge but did allow UC within 7 at the end and UC fmb'd at the WM13 with :45 left. WM QB Carder threw for a career high 479 yds. WM is off a 28-23 loss to Minny with their MAC opener and legitimate revenge gm next wk vs Toledo but will be pumped for a rare trip here by a BCS team. UC just faced NCST and MD (lost to NCST by 3, then beat MD by 3) with this being their 2nd str road game. UC has the D (#18-83) and ST's (#30-100) edges but WM has the home and off (#43-106) edges and Cubit usually pulls one of these BCS upsets each yr.

SOUTH CAROLINA 27 Missouri 20 - A matchup of banged up st'g QB's. SC is 0-2 SU/ATS vs Missouri incl their last meeting in the '05 Independence Bowl. This will be MO's 1st SEC road gm as their first SEC HG was a misleading 41-20 loss to UGA 2 wks ago (led 17-9 in 3Q). Huge sked edge to SC off EC/UAB with KY on deck while the Tigers are off GA and a revenge gm vs ASU with a trip to UCF on deck. LW the Tigers were able to get a solid win over ASU 24-20 (did lead 24-7 in 3Q) as QB Berkstresser started in place of inj'd Franklin (shld'r, probable here) and threw for 198 (51%) with an 0-1 ratio, and MO's D forced 4 TO's. SC was dominant at home LY (all'd 189 ypg vs SEC). LW they beat UAB 49-6 but it was misleading (FD's even) and even HC Spurrier admitted in post-game that it was the closest 49-6 gm he's ever seen. SC QB Shaw did inj his shld'r again and is ? here but his bkp Thompson is plenty capable and threw for 300+ yds 2W ago. MO is 10-4 ATS in the 1st gm of the season away from Columbia and was 3-1 ATS as AD LY as elusive Franklin kept them from all'g more than 2 sks in any game but it'll be different vs a pair of All-SEC DE's.

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4★ Houston over DENVER - Last time these 2 met was at the end of 2010 as HOU got Tebowed blowing a 23-10 4Q lead. Since that game the Texans have gone 13-6 SU/14-5 ATS in the regular season. HOU of course is very familiar with Manning facing him twice annually until 2011 but Peyton will be seeing this new DC Phillips led HOU unit for the first time as in 2010 Wade was the HC/DC at DAL and the Cowboys held Manning to a ssn low 75.4 QBR with 4 of his 14 int's on the ssn coming in the loss. HOU has been solid for us TY cashing two easy weekly LPS incl LW's 27-7 win over JAX as 6.5 pt AF. The Texans improved to 2-0 for the 3rd consec ssn by gaining 242 yds in the 1H while building a 17-0 lead and also held JAX to a franchise-low 117 yds. DEN is off a MNF road gm at ATL and will be playing their 3rd str playoff team from LY. Manning looked like his former self in the season opening win over PIT throwing for 252 yds and 2 td's. HOU was a perfect 3-0 ATS LY as a dog of 3 or less while DEN is just 10-26-1 ATS as a non-div HF so we'll call for the overall better team to get another road win.

FORECAST: Houston 27 DENVER 17

3★ NY Jets over MIAMI - The road team has covered 4 of the L/5 in the series. LY the Jets beat MIA 24-6 as a 7 pt HF ending a 3 gm losing streak thanks to Revis returning an int 100 yds for a td to steal the gm's momentum. MIA won the rematch 19-17 eliminating the Jets from the playoffs but failed to cover as a 3 pt HF. MIA won its first home opener S/05 35-13 upsetting OAK as 2 pt dogs as they outran the Raiders 259-23 inc 172 yd & 2 td for Bush. The Dolphins trailed 10-7 at the half but dominated the 2H driving 44/4pl, 80/3pl, 57/8pl and 75/8pl for td's. After tossing 3 int in the opener Tannehill hit 18-30-200-1-0 and scored his first 2 career td's. The Jets (+5) led the Steelers 10-6 late 2Q when PIT drove 80/11pl for a td with 1:03 1H to take the lead. After the terrific opener Sanchez struggled vs the Steel Curtain hitting for 138 yds (37%) with 1 td though he was without his #2 receiving option in TE Keller. CB Revis is expected to return here vs MIA's bottom tier WR's. While this is a 2nd straight road gm vs NY vs MIA's 2nd straight at home the Jets need every win with home gms vs SF and HOU on deck.

FORECAST: NY Jets 20 MIAMI 7

OTHER SELECTION

2★ CLEVELAND over Buffalo - This is the 5th meeting in 6 years due to both teams being bottom feeders in the AFC. BUF beat CLE 13-6 as a 1 pt HF in the last meeting in 2010 and this is the 5th time BUF has been an AF since 2008 (3-1 ATS). LY when the Browns were between a 3 pt HF and a 3 pt HD the games couldn't be closer as 4 of the 5 games were decided by 4 pts or less (17-16, 6-3, 12-13, 14-10). The Bills are off a misleading final as they were outgained 422-379 and outFD 25-15 but were +3 in TO's in the 35-17 win vs KC. The Bills D allowed 150 yds and 6.3 ypc rushing LW and while the Chiefs rush attack rates higher than CLE's, a healthy Richardson (109, 5.7) showed how improved the offense can be when the D can't completely focus on Weeden. CLE does have BAL on deck next Thur but with this young offense that has 4 rookies which have already made starts and 2 OL with only 1 year of exp every game will have their complete attention especially their first win. The Bills are 2-15 SU on the road in the last 2+ years allowing 32 ppg and drop another here.

FORECAST: CLEVELAND 23 Buffalo 20

OTHER GAMES

NY Giants at CAROLINA - Thursday - This is the 4th meeting in 5 years but the 1st with CAR hosting. The Giants beat CAR 31-18 to open up their new stadium in 2010 (-5.5) after closing out their old one with a 41-9 loss (-8.5) to end 2009. The Giants may be 9-4 ATS as an AF but they needed to come back from a 24-13 HT deficit LW and have SNF vs PHI on deck. CAR meanwhile is at home for the 2nd straight week and off a div division win vs NO. Remember our mid-week Marquees are now available at Noon ET.

CHICAGO 27 St Louis 10 - The Bears are still stinging from being held to 168 yds (14 yds per drive) by GB LW. CHI is 2-7 ATS at home off a loss but their defense takes a big step down in terms of passing talent here. STL tallied a win in their home opener vs WAS despite benching RB Jackson mid-2Q as their defense held WAS (with a penalty assist) on their final drive. They covered vs DET with a rusty Stafford (3 int with 2 IR td) who was looking ahead to SF. Look for Cutler to rebound after a horrific game at GB where he threw 4 int's and was pounded with 7 sks and 12 QBH. OC Tice will streamline the offense to cover for the loss of RB Forte (ankle sprain) with the short passing attack and lots of RB Bush 54 yds (3.9) LW.

DALLAS 31 Tampa Bay 20 - The Cowboys tallied an easy 31-15 win as a 7 pt AF in Week 15 LY vs a Bucs team that had given up on their HC. DAL had a 28-7 FD and 399-190 yd edge. This is DAL's home opener which has been a money burner as they've dropped 4 straight ATS and are 1-8 ATS off a SU loss. TB has already shown a new "hard nose" attitude under HC Schiano as they were dead last in rush D in 2011 but held CAR (#3 rush off '11) to 10 rush yds (0.8). However, their pass defense was shredded by the Giants as Manning tallied 295 yds passing in the 2H vs Freeman's 243 for the game. DAL followed up its win over NYG by getting stuffed at SEA as RB Murray was held to 44 yds (3.7) and none of the passing targets could handle SEA's physical DB's. Look for an angry DAL team to exploit TB's secondary with a vengeance and for DC Ryan to go after TB's OL.

San Francisco 24 MINNESOTA 7 - The 49ers are off LW's SNF "handshake rematch" vs the Lions and those results are unknown. SF is 6-3 ATS on the road and covered 3 of 4 as a fav of 7 or more under Harbaugh LY. The matchups clearly favor the 49ers as their league leading 2011 rush D (77 ypg, 3.5 ypc) started this season just like it left off (45, 3.2 vs GB) and that spells trouble for the Peterson dependant MIN off that was 0-8 ATS when rushing for under 130 yds incl both games this year. SF's D got 4 sacks on the road at GB against a veteran QB and by shutting down the rush attack they will have a field day against a pressured Ponder. On offense the 49ers are not flashy but after leading the NFL with +28 TO's and finishing 2nd with 13.1 yds/pt they were TO free at GB and Smith completed 77% of his passes while the rush attack avg'd 5.8 ypc. The Vikings fell victim to Luck's first ever NFL win LW and will fall to 3-9-1 ATS at home after this loss.

Detroit 30 TENNESSEE 24 - Situational edge to TEN as while both teams are off West Coast road trips DET travels for a second straight after playing on SNF LY after playing the physical 49ers the Lions hosted ATL and were held to a ssn low 263 yds. This is Schwartz's 1st game vs TEN after having been their DC from 2001-'08. The Titans came into the season energized with a new QB off a 9-7 season but now at 0-2 and with a trip to HOU on deck the pressure is mounting. After facing Brady and Rivers in B2B weeks (74% comp 5-1 ratio) they now face Stafford and Megatron. On offense the inexperienced Locker faced our #16

& #23 DL the first 2 games. This week he will face our #2 ranked unit and see the 9-wide D for the first time with their below avg OL and the speedy Lions can go 8 deep on the DL which keeps them fresh vs the mobile QB.

WASHINGTON 28 Cincinnati 20 - WAS may seem to have the situational edge with a huge home crowd behind RG3 and returning home at 1-1 but a HF off 2 road games to start the season is 0-11-1 ATS since 2005. Griffin and his elite athleticism has had the edge vs NO and STL who are installing new defensive systems TY and this is only the 3rd time Shanahan has been a HF with WAS (0-2 ATS). CIN has run the same system since 2008 under DC Zimmer but there are concerns. The 308 pass yds and 72% comp are explainable on the road vs BAL but allowing CLE's QB Weeden to throw for 322 yds (70%, 2-0) with a 114.9 QBR the week after putting up a 5.1 QBR (118, 34%, 0-4) need some explaining. CIN's biggest weakness is their depleted OL (Ctr/RG) and their secondary is still showing 2011's problems allowing 8.9 ypa (71%) with a 4-0 ratio. Look for WAS to rebound and start to establish a home field edge at FedEx Field.

NEW ORLEANS 30 Kansas City 24 - Normally this is a flat spot for the Saints after facing CAR (0-3 ATS the L3Y) but now at 0-2 for only the 3rd time since 1997 that will change. KC also joins the 0-2 club and with this trip followed by SD and BAL the hopes of a new season may dissipate quickly. LW we wrote that the Saints offense will definitely not live up to the Payton run version and while Brees is still slinging it around at 332 ypg he's only comp 54% (71% LY) with a 4-4 ratio (46-14 LY) with most of his production in the 4Q (29 of 59 pts) as they trailed 30-17 and 28-13 into the final stanza. We'll call for NO to atone for their season opening losses by a pair of FG's as KC makes this a tougher than expected event.

INDIANAPOLIS 20 Jacksonville 14 - JAX improved to 6-3 ATS against the Colts after winning both matchups SU/ATS LY with an 18-8 avg score. MJD has had 7 100-yd gms vs IND in his career and is avg a remarkable 101 (5.3) vs them. Even with IND's D ranking among the league's worst vs the rush, it will be tough to match those numbers TW as JAX's beaten up OL has seen 4 plyrs already on IR and LW they turned to vet Herb Taylor who hadn't played in a gm s/08 to start at LG. Gabbert finished 7 of 19 for 53 yards - his fewest pass yds as a str and his status is doubtful (hamstring/toe). Add it all up and the Jags had a franchise-low 117 yds in the 27-7 loss to HOU. Luck's home debut was a success as the rookie threw 2 td's, took advantage of several key MIN pen & marched the off 45 yds in :23 to set up a 53-yard field goal with :08 left, which gave IND a 23-20 win (+3). He also played the entire 2H without 3 str's on the OL. We expect Luck to continue his winning ways at home while Henne will be making his 1st start inside a rejuvenated dome crowd.

Philadelphia 27 ARIZONA 20 - The Cardinals pulled off one of the bigger upsets in 2011 with a 21-17 win as a 13' AD. PHI blew their 5th 4Q lead as ARZ logged a 23-15 FD and 370-289 yd edge behind #2 QB Skelton who had 315 yds (53%, 3-2). PHI was without WR Jackson, FS Allen and LG Mathis with Vick hitting for 128 yds (47% 0-2). LW the Eagles had a 486-325 yd edge in the 24-23 win over Baltimore but 4 TO's cost them the cover as a 2' pt HF. After his 4 int in the win over CLE, Vick threw for 371 yds (72%) and ran for the GW td w/1:55 left as the Eagles moved to 2-0 for the first time S/04 (SB appearance). Despite being outgained 387-245 and having 2 costly fmbles, the Cards pulled off the biggest shocker of the yr so far upsetting the Pats 20-18 as 13' pt dogs. ARZ won behind QB Kolb who was efficient but not spectacular with 140 yds (56%) and NE did miss a 42-yd FG on final play. Technical edges go to the Cards as they are 5-2 ATS as non-div HD while the Eagles are 2-6 ATS as a non-div AF. No question PHI has the talent edge but they took a beating vs BAL with injuries and we'll caution siding heavy with the Eagles as their 9 TO's in the first 2 gms concern us.

SAN DIEGO 24 Atlanta 17 - ATL is in a poor situation off LW's MNF game vs the no-huddle offense vs DEN and have a home game vs CAR on deck. The Falcons also lost their top CB Grimes (Achilles) for the yr in the opener and had to face DEN's dangerous pitch-catch combo of Manning and Thomas in their first gm without him. Under Smith ATL is 5-0 SU/4-1 ATS on the West Coast including an outright upset of the Chargers 22-16 (+5) in their last visit here in '08. SD is 2-0 for the first time S/06 after LW's win over TEN as 6' HF which gave us a 3★ Key Selection winner on these pages. The Chargers dominated with 27-9 FD and 416-212 yd edges as Rivers looked to be in midssn form while the D held TEN's Locker in check. We'll call for SD to win by a td as we want to see the status of TE Gates (ribs) and ATL off MNF first.

Pittsburgh 27 OAKLAND 20 - The Black & Gold travel to face the Silver & Black. This was clearly the rivalry of the 70's with 5 straight playoff meetings incl 3 straight AFC Championships. Schedule makers did the Raiders no favors opening with a MNF div game, traveling across country to humid South Florida while also having a trip to Mile High on deck. PIT is traveling to face their 2nd AFC West foe in 3 weeks but they also have a bye on deck. OAK "improved" rush attack has totaled 68 yds (2.0) to start the season and now faces LY's #1 D that is allowing 92 ypg (3.8) and flexed its muscle by harassing Sanchez relentlessly LW. OAK's WR unit is very beat up which allowed MIA to stack the line LW and shut them down. PIT won't be intimidated by Palmer who they faced with CIN and PIT has a strong WR tandem (Wallace/Brown 264 yd total 13.2) to exploit OAK's thin secondary.

New England at BALTIMORE - The #1 and #2 seeds from the NFC met last Thursday and tonight LY's top 2 AFC seeds face off. The difference is that these 2 met earlier this year in LY's conf finals as the Ravens Billy Culliff shanked a 32 yd FG with :11 left. Can the Ravens gain playoff revenge or will the Patriot's improve on their 21-7 ATS record off a SU loss?

Green Bay at SEATTLE - The Packers are on a 2nd straight Nat'l TV game but the trip is clearly negated by the longest possible layoff with out a bye off a Thursday Night dominating win. It will be bedlam for the NFL's loudest fans as this is only their 2nd MNF home game since 2007 (won LY 30-13) and when they are hosts they've won 5 straight and have covered by an avg of 15 ppg. LY Rodgers performed at a higher level away from home (312 yds 67%, 21-21) but will he be able to quiet the 12th man?

VIRGINIA (+16') over TCU

TCU is 1-1 vs VA but won the L/meeting ('09). TCU (-11) led 30-0 w/4:39 left in the 4Q as VA gained 61% (108) of its yds after (14 pts). Under Patterson, TCU is 19-2 SU at home vs non-conf opp's (1st BCS foe to visit s/08). TCU backers have paid the price for success as they were 19-6 ATS as a HF through '10 but LY were just 2-4 ATS vs inflated lines (-34 avg line). The Frogs are off their 1st ever B12 road gm (beat KU 20-6, -2) and has a revenge gm vs SMU on deck (TCU 25-1 at home s/'05, only loss LY to SMU). VA is in a tough spot coming off Penn St with their ACC opener vs the option of GT on deck (lost 56-20 +10) and is on a 2nd str road trip flying all the way to TX. UVA did play very well as an AD LY knocking off Mia FI (+14, 28-21) and Fla St (+14, 14-13) while only failing to cover by 1 pt vs NC (+10, 17-28, had 468-401 edge) and we would be surprised if they didn't put forth a maximum effort here. Is there anything better than having a DD dog win the game outright and lead wire-to-wire? Might we pick the Cavaliers as our September 5★?

NOTRE DAME 31 Michigan 24 - This has been a series dominated by the dog. UM owns a pair of 38-0 home wins (-10'03 and -9'07). Other than that, the underdog is 14-0 ATS with ELEVEN outright upsets. LY UM was +3' at home in the 1st night game ever at Michigan Stadium. ND appeared to have it won numerous times. At half ND led 17-7 with a 15-3 FD edge and then led 24-7 after 3Q's. ND fmb'd at the UM7 with 6:08 left and UM took the lead with 1:12 left on a 21 yd td pass. ND drove 60 yds and got a 29 yd td pass with :30 left to apparently re-pull out the win but UM got a 64 yd pass to the 16 and then opted to go for the td and got it with :02 left. ND finished with a 28-16 FD edge. Now ND gets this gm at home and at night. LW for the 2nd yr in a row ND dominated the LOS vs MSU (held them to 50 rush yds, 4 sks) in the 20-3 (+5) victory as the Irish got their first win over a Top 10 tm s/05 and are 3-0 for the first time s/02. UM meanwhile continues to be the DRob show for the 3rd consec yr as LW he accounted for 397 yds (avg 350 run/pass ypg) and 4 td's in a 63-13 win over UMass. Robinson has been a thorn in ND's side each of the L2Y accounting for 958 comb rush/pass yds. ND has lost 3 str gms in this series by 4 ppg all by all'g a UM td in the final :30. With ND's D (#7) fielding one of the best front 7's in CFB, we will call for that trend to end here.

MINNESOTA 27 Syracuse 23 - UM has gone 1-8 SU/3-6 ATS vs non-conf BCS schools (avg loss by 10 ppg). UM is 2-1 SU but 1-2 ATS vs Syr, and in '09 won 23-20 as a 7 pt AF in OT. Minny has already matched its ssn win total from each of the L2Y and it doesn't matter that the B10 opener is on deck. Gophers were 1-2 as a HF in Kill's 1st yr losing outright as a 20' and 8' pt fav but are 2-0 TY after their 28-23 win over WM LW (-3). This is their first role as fav vs a BCS tm s/'09 which they also lost outright. However, they could be w/o the services of dual-threat QB Gray who inj'd his ankle in the 2Q of LW's win (CS). His bkp Shortell did throw 3 td passes. Cuse were 0-5 ATS away LY but QB Nassib has progressed and outgained the L/2 foes (Conn by 54 yd, Pitt by 12 yds) and TY he is #2 in the NCAA in pass ypg avg 380 (66%) with a 9-3 ratio. Syr is in an FCS/bye sandwich but did have to exert effort LW in their 28-17 over Stony Brook as they rallied from a 17-14 HT deficit but did have 27-13 FD and 549-311 yd edges. This will be the 1st outdoor meeting between these two which should give the edge to the Gophers and their crowds have been noticeably louder TY after they decided to sell alcohol in their stadium.

NEW MEXICO ST 31 New Mexico 30 - LY was the 1st time in more than 40 yrs that NMST won 3 in a row in this series and their 14 pt win was the largest MOV s/'68. NM had fired HC Locksley and DC Barlow was the interim HC. NMST led 35-7 (6:30 3Q) and finished with a 538-428 yd edge as a 1 pt road dog, 42-28. NM is on its 3rd str road trip off of expected blowout losses to Texas and TT by a comb 94-14 while the Aggies lost to their other rival UTEP LW on the road 41-28 as a 14 pt dog. Despite being outgained 702-127 and outFD'd 38-8 the Lobos nearly covered vs TT (+32') 49-14 thanks to a 98 yd KR td. TT replaced QB Doege after he threw his 6th td pass with 13:19 left 3Q and missed a 39 yd FG, was SOD at the NM16 and ended the gm at the NM5. Lobos HC Davie juggled QB's Holbrook and Gautsche and the duo combined to hit 6-12-43. The Aggies trailed UTEP 27-0 early 2Q and 41-14 early before driving 82/9pl and 89/12pl for td's in the final 6:25 to get the backdoor cover. QB Manley is avg 263 ypg (49%) with a 7-2 ratio. Both of these teams are struggling but NMST has the home and series edges and makes it 4 in a row.

TENNESSEE 48 Akron 10 - UA has lost 21 str road gms by 24 ppg incl going 0-5 ATS as a DD AD LY (avg line +24, avg score 51-9) but they did cover as a 24' pt AD vs FIU losing 41-38 in OT 2 wks ago. Akron ended a 10 gm losing streak with new HC Bowden's 1st win over Morgan St LW in which they had 43-12 FD and 753-200 yd edges. Have to feel Bowden will toss in the towel with their conf home opener on deck. Tenn however is in their BIGGEST sandwich of ssn with double revengers vs FL and UGA. UT lost to their rivals for the 8th str yr 37-20 as a 3 pt HF in front of a GameDay audience as they blew a 20-13 3Q lead all'g the Gators to score the gm's final 24 pts. Mississippi 43 Tulane 19 - UM has won 10 str over Tulane (by 17 ppg) but their only meeting s/'00 was also here in '10. The Rebs led the Green Wave 24-3 at HT but failed to cover (-20', 27-13). The Wave is 0-2 under new HC Johnson and needed the bye after the scary inj to S Walker overshadowed the Tulsa gm. TU is being pounded at the LOS avg just 0.3 ypc while all'g 5.7 and failed to score a td in the 1st 3Q's of their 1st 2 gms. The Rebs are off an embarrassing home loss to Texas as we had our Top Weekly LPS on the Horns who had a 676-399 yd edge. UT had over 300 yd rushing and passing as the Rebels all'd their most pts in a gm s/'17. With Bama on deck the Rebels need wins. Ole Miss is 3-12 as AF under 3 diff HC's but

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now travels for 1st time with Freeze (3-1 ATS AF at ASU LY) and JC QB Wallace (205 ypg, 69%, 6-4, 143 rush yd) makes his 1st road start. Tulane is 3-10 as a HD with cavernous Dome as a disadvantage. **ILLINOIS 34 Louisiana Tech 24** - 1st meeting. New IL HC Beckman took on Ohio St (only 5 pt LY) and Syr (officials cost win) at Tol but the shoe is on the other foot with a WAC tm traveling to B10 with confidence after LY's SEC road win. LT has gone 9-0 ATS away from home the L2Y and was 6-0 ATS as a dog LY incl 3 upsets. At UT LY Beckman was 3-2 as a HF but never stopped scoring as they avg'd 57 ppg in 5 roles as HF. The Illini are 2-0 as a HF TY inc LW's 44-0 win over Charles South (-42). The Illini ply'd without QB Scheelhaase (ankle) for a 2nd str gm but O'Toole hit 26-31-333-5-1 in the most extensive action of his career. A war after being ill prepared for ASU's up tempo off, IL held CSU's option to 6 FD and 125 tll yds. LT is 2-0 for the 1st time s/'04 as they dominated Rice 56-27 although they failed to cover as a 19 pt HF. The Bulldogs jumped out to a 21-0 1Q lead but Rice hit a 57 yd FG prior to HT and hit a 14 yd td pass with 1:41 left to keep it under the number. Ill has their B10 opener on deck while this is the start of a 2 gm road trip for LT as they have UVA on deck. LT's biggest edge is on ST's (#29-111) and they also have a very significant off edge (#27-93). IL is at home and have the D edge (#22-92) and should cover the small number.

ARIZONA ST 24 Utah 21 - ASU has now won 8 in a row SU over Utah but prior to LY the last meeting was in '93. LY ASU (-3') was on the road and UU was giving QB Hays his 1st start. This was our "almost 5★" LPS, a strong 4★ as our #2 play. UU settled for a 35 yd FG with 5:00 left in the 3Q and trailed 14-13 but then UU turned it over 3 str times and ASU led 35-14 with 10:39 left and UU did not cross midfield after that. ASU is 10-3 ATS in P12 home openers. After looking dominant in their 1st 2 gms, thanks to 4 TO's ASU fell back to earth as they fell behind Missouri 17-0 2Q and 24-7 in the 3Q. After 2 scoring 2 quick 4Q td's the Devils cut it to 24-20 but were SOD at the MO2 and were int'd at the GL with just over 1:00 left. Utah is 21-6-1 ATS the wk before a bye (reg ssn). Utah is 0-5 SU/1-3 ATS playing the wk after BYU. In the most unique finish of the wk the Utes held on to upset (-3') their Holy War rivals in their last scheduled meeting, 24-21. Trailing 24-7 BYU was driving to tie the gm up when it appeared their last pass fell inc. After officials put :01 back on the clock and cleared the field of fans, BYU had a 51 yd FG blk'd but UU was penalized 15 yd when the crowd rushed the field too early. On an untimed down BYU's 36 yd FG at clanked off the left upright finally giving the Utes the win. Remarkably, ASU is facing their 4th straight bkp QB and while they have the off edge (#32-68) Utah has the D edge (#19-35) and QB Hays is much improved TY.

SAN DIEGO ST 38 San Jose St 35 - In the L/gm ('08) SDSt trailed 21-0 late 2Q (35-10 final) and never got closer than 11 pts in the 2H (outgained 476-146, -15 FD). In fact SDSt's only td came on a 28 yd IR. SDSt has its MW opener on deck but can't afford to look ahead after LW's 48-41 win over North Dakota as a 24' pt HF in record setting 97' heat. SDSt led 35-17 in the 2Q but could never put the gm away until they stopped ND on downs at their own 38 with 1:30 left. Long is just 4-5 ATS as a fav at SDSt. MacIntyre has his best tm yet at SJSt and is 9-5 as an AD incl TY's wk 1 covering 20-17 loss to Stanford (+25'). SJSt also beat both Fresno and Colo St on the road SU LY and is off a 40-20 win over Colo St as 11' pt HF's. QB Fales hit 27-34-370-3-0 and had 3 rec's with 100 yd vs the Rams. SDSt has the off (#70-79) and ST's (#55-66) edges and is at home while the Spartans have the D edge (#80-84) and could play spoiler.

Air Force 34 UNLV 24 - The HT is 7-0 ATS in series. LY LV was playing its 2nd str AG and came in 2-7 and with little to play for and facing the AF option where you have to be focused on every play. The Falcons rolled to a 45-17 win (-24) with 522 tll yds. LV got a garbage td with 5:30 left when trailing by 35. LTH the Falcons trailed 17-7 late 2Q but got a 90/12pl td drive before HT. In the 2H AF limited LV to just 68 yds on 4 pass (AF 343 rush yds, 5.5) and won 35-20 (-19'). Calhoun is 8-4 ATS as an AF and they are fresh off a bye after the close call loss at Mich (+21', 25-31) and won't be distracted by Vegas like most of the Rebs other foes (LV 9-4-1 ATS at home, 1-13 ATS on the road). LV is switching gears big time after facing Mike Leach and his pass happy off LW as they lost 35-27 (+8) to a WSU tm playing its bkp QB. LV QB Sherry did throw for 351 yds (67%) and RB Cornell is among the nation's leaders with 357 (5.1) LV HC Hauck is beginning to feel the heat at 0-3 TY (just 4-24 overall) and with 6 of their L/9 gms away LV needs to pull an upset 2 in 2 in conf play for his seat to cool.

Nevada 38 HAWAII 31 - The home team is now 11-1 SU in this series and UN had dropped 6 in a row ATS as a visitor. LY UN was -15' at home and had 525-307 yd and 34-21 FD edges. UH did lose starting QB Moniz in the 1Q (UH hit 20-45-269). UH blk'd a P for a td and only trailed 21-14 at the half despite being outgained 290-114 and never once did UN lead by more than 14 with UN getting a fake FG for a 15 yd td with 4:18 left to make the final 42-28 margin. LTH UN trailed 17-0 at HT being outgained 181-97. After a td w/3:06 left UN rec'd an onside K (down 6) but was int'd at the UH12 w/1:30 and that was their only loss of the yr. Both tms had an FCS foe LW with NV failing to cover (-28) in a 45-34 win over NWSt while UH rolled over Lamar 54-2. Pack RB Jefferson had 247 yd in LW's win and is #2 FBS in rushing (529, 5.8). The Warriors had just 20-6 FD and 369-127 yd edges over Lamar with a blk'd PR td and 95 yd KR td 3Q contributing to the margin. UN gets its first win on the islands since 1948 but it won't be easy.

ALABAMA 52 Florida Atlantic 0 - At the end of 2011 our power ratings had these two #1 and #120. LY Ala had SBC NT in Penn St/Ark sandwich and won 41-0 (-47). The Tide looked dominant again LW handling a Wilson-less Ark team its worst loss s/'05 and pitching B2B shutouts for the 1st time s/'80. McCarron is #3 FBS pass eff (202 ypg, 64%, 7-0) while the D has already forced an FBS best 12 TO's. Howie use to take the money and run going 2-16 as 20+ pt dog and w/Pelini's team coming off B2B SEC road games health will be priority having their SBC home opener on deck. FAU lost 56-20 to UGA LW but covered for the 1st time TY as 41' pt AD's as they were tied with the Bulldogs at 14 in the 2Q. The Owls wore down and were outgained 713-318 with their final score a 42 IR td in the 4Q which gave them the cover. Bama has its conf home opener vs Ole Miss on deck and is looking to make it 3 straight goose eggs.

WKU 24 Southern Miss 23 - 1st meeting. SM is 20-9 ATS as an AF but does have a new HC and is also just 4-11 SU (7-8 ATS) on the road vs non-conf. The Eagles are 0-2 for the 1st time s/'98 after losing 24-14 to EC for yet another outright upset for our Big Dog POW (EC +7'). SM led 7-3 at the half but frosh QB Alford had TO's on 3 str poss in the 2H which led to 3 Pirates td's. WKU had lost 6 str non-conf HG's prior to the win over an FCS tm in the opener. This is the 4th non-conf FBS team to visit in the L4Y (Navy, Indy and USF) losing by an avg of 38-16. The Hilltoppers are off one of the biggest wins in schl hist though knocking off KY 32-31 in OT as 6' pt AD's. WKU led 17-0 and 24-17 when UK drove 77 yds to take it to OT. After UK scored a td on its OT pass, WKU got a td run and then hit a 2 pt conv for the upset. QB Jakes is avg 211 ypg (71%) with a 5-3 ratio. SM comes in as a desperate tm esp with Lville, Boise and UCF on deck. With that said there's no tm in the country hotter than WKU who, dating back to LY, has covered 12 str gms.

Troy 34 NORTH TEXAS 31 - LY Troy (-8) was at home and led 27-24 after 3Q's but NT got a 46 yd td pass and Troy fmb'd at their 6 setting up an NT td on the next play for a 38-27 lead. Troy pulled to 38-33 with 7:43 left and then NT conv on 3 3D's all on passes getting to the Troy26 with :15 left where they were finally SOD. It was the 1st time s/'97 Troy had lost 2 str gms at home. Troy has won 3 str trips to Denton. This is Troy's most veteran tm s/'04 but they are 3-7 ATS as an AF (1-0 TY). NT just moved into a new stadium LY and was 4-2 ATS. Both tms covered vs ranked tms LW as Troy actually outFD'd (30-17) and outgained (572-457) Miss St but was done in by 4 TO's at home. The Trojans trailed the Bulldogs for most of the gm incl 23-7 at the half while NT trailed just 14-7 at the half thanks to all'g a 96 yd KR td. After cutting it to 14-13 (missed xp) in the 3Q KSU scored 21 str pts to put it away. Troy has a huge off (#55-101) edge and gets back to their winning ways in the SBC.

MISSISSIPPI ST 45 South Alabama 3 - 1st meeting. No doubt USA HC Jones (Bama alumni) will be excited to face an SEC tm. However, the Jags, on their 2nd str AG vs a BCS foe, may have more interest with 1st ever conf HG on deck. USA is 3-0 ATS vs FBS tms facing NCSt twice and Kent St. USA was only outgained 384-314 in LW's 31-7 loss to the Wolf Pack (+30') but 112 yds came in the 4Q when they scored a td with 5:20 left to get the backdoor cover. Despite being outFD'd (30-17) and outgained (572-457) the MSU won at Troy 30-24 but failed to cover as a 14' pt AF. MSU led 23-7 at the half as Troy TO's set up all 3 of MSU's 1H td's and they also missed a 26 yd FG. MSU has a bye on deck so Mullen will let the young offense go (59 vs Mem and 55 vs UTM LY). MSU is 12-7 as a fav under Mullen (2-1 TY) and gets the big win. Miss St was a 5★ GOM Winner on the road in '10 as they were -5 to Houston and won 47-24. LW's results were closer than expected so look for them to come out and dominate this inferior foe.

PRO ANGLES There are 3 main methods of handicapping. Fundamental, Situational & Technical. Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the number in the () indicates how many angles apply to that team. The higher the number the stronger the angle play.

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. **We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on.** If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
