PICKING AN UPSET

There has been a lot of college football played since '97, 15 years worth of it. If you count each FBS team playing a game (so 2 tm each gm) in that span there were 20,882 diff gm of data to analyze.
Let's look at the biggest favorites and you will see that Las Vegas does its job well picking out big favorites. Since 1997 there have been 596 teams that have been favored by OVER 31 points in a game. Of those 596 only SIX have lost the game straight up. The biggest upset ever was when Stanford (+41) upset USC in 2007 and showing what a weird year that was, the 2nd biggest upset ever was also in 2007 when Syracuse (+37) beat Louisville. The other 3 huge upsets since 1997 were: Temple (+35.5) over Virginia Tech in 1998, Central Michigan (+35.5) over Western Michigan in 2000, James Madison (+35) over Virginia Tech in 2010 and North Texas (+32) over Texas Tech in 1997. Basically an underdog of 31 points or more in a game, wins 1% of the time.

Now let's look at the chances of your favorite team winning if they are installed as an underdog of 24.5 to 31 points. Since 1997 there have been 756 teams that have been favored by 24.5 to 31 points in a game. You would expect the underdogs would have a better chance of winning outright than the above teams and naturally they do. In that span 30 teams that have been favored by that margin have lost straight up in a game with three such upsets last year. Texas Tech was +28.5 when they upset Oklahoma on the road, Iowa St was +27.5 when they upset Oklahoma St at home and Sacramento St was +27.5 when they beat Oregon St on the road. The amount of upset did not go up as much as we thought they would as upsets occurred only 3.97% of the time or 1 out of every 25.2 games.

You would figure that the percentage of upsets in the 17.5 to 24 point favorites level would go up drastically from that 3.97% in the previous category. Since 1997 there have been 1,316 teams that have been favored by 17.5 to 24 points. We're still a little surprised that there were only 89 upsets in this level of favorites over the 15-year span. That is just 6.8% upsets which comes out to 1 upset loss for every 14.8 teams that are favored by 17.5 to 24 points. Last year there were six such upsets which included UNLV over Hawaii, Northwestern over Nebraska, Wyoming over San Diego St, New Mexico St over Minnesota, Colorado over Utah and UAB over Southern Miss.

We will start breaking it down into smaller categories as we continue to go down in level of favoritism. The next category to look at are teams that are favored by 14.5 (more than 2 TD's) to 17 points. Since 1997 there have been 836 teams that have been favored by 14.5 to 17 points in a game. Of the 836 teams favored by this amount 110 have lost the game outright. That is close to double the odds as the category above as 13.2% of the teams favored by 14.5 to 17 points lose outright and an upset occurs 1 time for every 7.6 games played in that level. There were only 8 such upsets last year including USC over Oregon.

The next level down that we'll look at is the 10.5 to 14 point category. From 1997 - 2011 there were 1,458 teams that were favored by this level. Of those 1,458 games there were 306 upsets which was 20.99% of the time. That still means that roughly 4 out of every 5 teams favored by 10.5-14 points wins the game with an upset occurring once every 4.8 times.

From 1997-2011 there were 1,360 teams that were favored by 7.5 to 10 points and of those 1,360 teams there were 359 upsets which was almost the same results as the favorites from 10.5 to 14. That means that 26.39% of the time a team was favored by 7.5 to 10 points they lost outright and that translates into 1 upset every 3.8 games.

Since 1997 there have been 2,476 teams that have been favored from 3.5 to 7 points. These are teams that are expected to win the game but the game should be close. The last time we tightened up the category the upsets went from every 4.8 games to every 3.8 games. Should we expect 1 in every 2.8 games here? Since 1997, 865 of the 2,476 teams that were underdogs of 3.5 to 7 points have pulled outright upsets and that translates into 1 every 2.9 games or 34.9% of the time.

Now we get to the category that will tell us if Las Vegas knows what they are doing. Games where a team is favored by 3 points or less. These games are basically toss-ups but Vegas favors one team and makes them the favorite. What percentage of teams pull minor upsets as underdogs of 3 points or less? Since 1997 there have been 1,643 favorites of 3 points or less. There have been 785 "upsets" by teams that are underdogs of 3 points or less which comes out to be 47.8% and that shows these games are definitely toss-ups!

Typing this, we are thinking that 3 point games should have a much higher % of the favorite winning so let's take a closer look at just those games. There have been 576 games in which a team was favored by 3 points by Las Vegas over the last 15 years. How many times does that team win outright? The answer is 319 times or 55.4% of the time. That is 319 times the favorite has won and 257 times the underdog has won which means the underdog is almost as likely as the favorite to win the game when the line is exactly 3 points.

Here is a quick chart showing the chances of a team winning outright depending on where Las Vegas sets the line.

4★ MICHIGAN ST over Boise St - Friday. First meeting. Boise St is 8-1 SU/7-2 ATS s/06 vs BCS schools (only SU loss at Wash in '07). Broncos are 16-6 ATS the L/4 yrs in 'true' road gms & 7-2 SU but just 4-6 ATS in road openers. BSU will open the ssn vs a ranked BCS tm for a 4th str year. This is a great spot for Mich St as Boise is one of the least exp'd tms in the NCAA with just 7 str's back replacing 6 NFL DC's and QB Kellen Moore. MSU has 13 ret str's but they do have just 21% of their offensive yds returning while Boise has 36%. MSU does have a top-notch RB corps and O-line vs a def front 7 that returns 0 str's. While it should be noted that Boise is 2-0 ATS in their only 2 roles as a dog the L4Y, this Boise tm is clearly not in the same class as those past teams. MSU has one of the best D's in the country and will take advantage of an inexp'd Boise squad.

3★ Ucf over AKRON - Thursday. These 2 used to be in the MAC together from '02-'04. UCF has dropped all 3 trips to Akron and the Knights are 2-5 SU and 1-4 ATS vs the Zips (L/gm in '04). LTH ('03) UCF trailed 21-3 at HT and was outFD'd 30-15 and outgained 504-317 in the 38-24 loss. The Knights are 2-11 SU but 8-5 ATS in road openers (beat Buff '10 & NCST '07). UCF will travel 3,916 miles round-trip to their 1st 2 gms TY (both to OH). This is the home opener for new HC Terry Bowden and they figure to be fired up but UCF is many levels ahead of them and has significant edges on off (#41-119), def (#28-120) and ST's (#42-111). UCF was 6-1 as an AF in '09-'10 but just 0-3 LY. Akron is just 3-6 as a HD in Infocision Stadium. UCF does have Ohio St on deck but gets their season started with a blowout as they are 5-1 ATS as a fav of 20 or more.

3★ CALIFORNIA over Nevada - Cal is 22-2-1 vs UN but is coming off a loss in 2010. Cal (-2) only trailed 31-24 late 3Q but all'd two 75+ yd td drives as UN at home pulled away. Bears have won 10 str home openers by an avg of 33 ppg (8-1 ATS) and this is their first gm in newly refurbished Memorial Stadium (played HG's in San Fran LY). They are 17-3 as a HF and only have an FCS gm on deck. UN (like Kal) is a much better team at home than on the road and is just 8-14 as an AD since Ault ret'd. LY Cal was +220 ypg at home (-26 ypg away) and UN was just +35 ypg on the road (+257 at home). With that in mind look for more of the same here as Cal gets its ssn off to a good start.

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Western Michigan (+) over ILLINOIS - In 2008 the gm was played in Detroit and WM pulled the outright upset, 23-17 (+7). WM is now 3-0 ATS in all 3 recent meetings and they almost got another upset again LY. We had a 4★ LPS on WM +14 and they were also a Big Dog Play. Despite settling for 3 FG's and missing one, WM had a 277-200 yd edge at the half and led 13-10. IL took the lead with 8:14 left on a FG but WM punted with 5:59 left and their final drive got to the IL41 where they ran out of time. Illinois has a new HC in Tim Beckman who was 2-1 SU vs Cubit in MAC play at Toledo and those two teams LY played to a 66-63 final in regulation (UT -12' at home) with a comb 1,439 yds. WM has knocked off 4 BCS teams under Cubit and this is one they feel they can win with Illinois having a new OC and DC and playing gm one.

2★ BOSTON COLLEGE over Miami, FI - After dropping 15 str SU from '85-'06, BC has won 2 str vs UM. LY these two met on a Friday for the 1st time since the gm that spawned the miracle back in 1984 of the Hail Mary Flutie pass. Jacory Harris had thrown 5 int's all year but LY threw a career worst 4 vs BC. UM led 14-10 at the half and had a 204-183 yd edge with BC being SOD at the UM14 late 2Q. BC leading 17-14 fmb'd at the UM2 but got a 45 yd IR td by Kuechly with 14:48 left to lead by 10. UM got a 49 yd FG with :14 left but BC rec'd the onside kick. The Eagles are 12-3 SU (9-6 ATS) in home openers (losses vs WF, GT & NW) while Miami is 1-6 SU/ATS in road openers incl B2B losses. LY BC dropped their season opener to Northwestern and it set the tone for their losing season (first s/'98) and they only have Maine on deck this year. Spaziani is 12-6 SU at home. BC has 17 returning str's (Miami just 10) and should pick up a key ACC win.

FORECAST: BOSTON COLLEGE 27 Miami, FI 17

2★ OHIO ST over Miami, Oh - The Urban Meyer era begins and they will be fired up for his home opener where OSU is 19-0 SU and 15-3 ATS. MU is 0-4 vs OSU incl a 34-14 loss as a 15 pt AD in the L/gm ('05). MU trailed 34-0 after 3Q's gaining 47% (139) of their yds in the 4Q. OSU has not lost to an instate rival since 1921 but LY they only beat Toledo 27-22 (-17') and UT was at the OSU28 and fired inc on 4th&5. Both teams are among the MIP in the NCAA this yr. LY Miami played two BCS tms on the road and only lost to #21 Missouri by 11 and to Minny by 6. However, this Buckeye team - while they can't play for a B10 Title or bowl gm TY - has plenty to play for and will want to make a statement that LY's losing record (first s/'88) was an aberration.

OTHER GAMES

Thursday, August 30th

South Carolina 27 VANDERBILT 20 - Blackout. VU is 4-17 SU and 7-13 ATS all-time vs SC but is 2-3 SU and 3-2 ATS the L5Y and the visitor is 8-2 ATS. VU had outright upsets in '07 and '08 and only lost by 4 in '09 but has dropped the last two 21-7 in '10 at home (+12) and 21-3 on the road (+15'). LY Garcia threw 4 int's keeping Vandy in the gm and Lattimore was held to under 100 yds rushing but SC dominated with a 367-77 yd edge and 17-5 FD edge. It was the fewest yds SC had given up in a gm s/'87. SC is on a 6-1 SU, 4-2-1 ATS run on the road but Vandy was 3-0 as a HD LY. LY Vandy caught a lot of teams "C" gms but SC will be prepared (only EC, UAB on deck) with Vandy off a bowl. The last time Vandy was off a bowl they went 1-5 ATS at home the next year.

Eastern Mich 34 BALL ST 33 - BSU is 9-4 ATS vs EM (L/3 gms decided by a tfl of 7 pts). LY's gm had 7 lead changes (3 in the 4Q). EM went up 31-30 on a 20 yd FG w/1:18 left (but had a 1&gl and settled for a FG when td would have clinched it). BSU then went 46/9pl hitting a GW 44 yd FG w/:09 left. LTH EM snapped an 18 gm SU losing streak (HC English's 1st W as a HC). EM trailed 21-0 but took a 35-28 lead (4Q) only to allow a 68/9pl td drive w/:34. EM held BSU to a FG in OT and on 3&8 tossed a 12 yd td pass. The tms are close exp-wise with Ball ST having 13 ret str's and EM 14. Technical edges favor EM as Ball St is 1-7 ATS as a HF while EM is 8-5 as an AD and had a 501-375 yd edge in LY's gm.

† Texas A&M 34 Louisiana Tech 30 - LT is 0-10 SU (1-5 ATS) vs A&M with the avg loss by 30 ppg. Only one gm was away from College Station & that was also in Shreveport as A&M (-14') won 37-17 in '99. In the L/gm ('10) LT (+19) trailed 14-10 but had 1&10 at the T16 with under :30 in the 1H. After a TO with :18 left, A&M went 73/3 plays for a Hail Mary 44 yd td pass to lead 21-10 and went on to a 48-16 win. LT hasn't had B2B bowl ssn s/'77 & '78. The Bulldogs are the defending WAC champs and stood toe-to-toe with TCU in the bowl (lost 31-24 as 9' pt dog). A&M was one of the biggest underachieving tms in the country LY going 7-6 SU despite being favored in 12 of their gms. The Aggies have a new HC in Kevin Sumlin and LY LT and HC Sonny Dykes led a powerful UH team 34-7 in the 3Q but lost 35-34 (+6'). A&M has a huge SEC gm on deck (first ever) vs Florida and also has a 1st time starting QB playing in their first gm under the new schemes of Sumlin. This one will come down to the wire but the Aggies have the edges on off (#13-60) and def (#24-68).

CONNECTICUT 34 Massachusetts 13 - 72nd meeting. UC is 10-5 SU s/'86 vs UMass but lost the L/meeting ('99), 62-20. That gm was UC's last with IAA/FCS status while ironically this is UMass' 1st gm with IAA/FBS status. UC is 5-1 ATS in lined home openers. UC had been 9-5-1 as a HF but was just 1-4 ATS LY under Pasqualoni and they do have NCSt on deck. Each tm has 14 ret str's but UMass has a new HC and is taking a large step up in class. They also will be without the services of QB Pagel for this one (head inj, 7 st LY). The Minutemen did only lose to Michigan (+29) by 5 in 2010

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but BC (-9) beat them by 28 LY. While UMass will be fired up for their first FBS gm, Conn has the edges on off (#90-123), def (#47-122) and ST's (#41-123) and should win comfortably here.

Ucla 37 RICE 17 - UCLA is 4-0 SU (1-1 ATS) vs Rice but their last and only trip to Rice was in 1966. The Bruins are 2-5 SU since '06 (1st yr Pac-12 had 9 conf gm schedule) in reg ssn gms on the road vs non-conf opp's. Bruins haven't been an AF the L2Y but are 2-0 ATS the L4Y. This is Jim Mora's first gm as a HC and they do have 3 big gms on deck (Neb, Hou, Ore St). UCLA has HUGE edges on the O-line and D-line with Rice having just 1 str' back on each unit and UCLA's loaded with size and VHT's. Rice has a great record as a HD s/00 at 21-1-2 but they are just 1-7 as a non-conf HD with that one win being LY when they upset Purdue (+1') 24-22. The Bruins normally are coming from comfortable LA weather but moved their training camp this year and have routinely played in 100° temps. With the weather being a non-factor, we will call for the Bruins to win comfortably.

BYU 37 Wash St 23 - 4th meeting w/the last gm in Provo in '90. BYU is 7-4 SU/ATS vs BCS tms in home openers and Wash St is 3-11 ATS in season openers, 0-6 SU (avg loss 44-17) and 1-5 ATS in road openers. New Wash St HC Leach was an '83 BYU graduate so this gm is important to him (LY BYU Mendenhall won at his alma mater Ore St) and Wazzu only has FCS EW on deck. LY Mendenhall took on another pass happy tm in Hawaii on the road and they held them 114 yds below their season avg on offense. BYU only has Weber St on deck and has the big edges on def (#29-83) and ST's (#17-85).

Minnesota 27 UNLV 20 - First meeting. LV is 2-11 SU vs Big 10 tms (beat Wisc in '86 & '03). Golden Gophers are 11-3 ATS in road openers and nearly upset USC (+23') LY losing 19-17. First time ever UM will play in Nevada. Minny has 12 str's back and a veteran QB and should be a much improved team in Kill's 2nd season. UM is 12-6 as an AF but only been in that role once the last 2 yrs. The Gophers only have an FCS foe on deck and will want to get this ssn off to a positive start. On the other side, this might be a make or break year for LV HC Hauck and he is 0-4 ATS vs BCS schools. However, LV is a much different team at home going 7-3-1 ATS while they are just 1-13 ATS on the road and should keep this one within the number.

SOUTH ALABAMA 24 Utsa 21 - Two newcomers to the FBS TY. LY was their first meeting and the gm was tied at 7, 10, 17 and 24. In the 2nd OT the Roadrunners settled for a 43 yd FG but allowed a 25 yd td run and lost 30-27 at home. UTSA is in just its 2nd yr of the program and returns 21 str's while USA is in its 4th year and ret's 15 str's. USA has an impressive 19-1 SU record at home in their history but 14 of those foes were vs sub-FCS and this is the first FBS member to play here. Both teams should be fired up in their first FBS gm and it should be noted that UTSA was +111 ypg at home LY and -101 ypg on the road.

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Friday, August 31st

† Tennessee 31 NC State 21 - Georgia Dome. While their last meeting was in 1939 it is interesting to note that was also the last time Tenn played on a Friday! UT has started the ssn just 2x's away from Knoxville the L9Y going 0-2 SU/ATS (both non-conf BCS opp's). NCSt was 8-5 LY and won its bowl and returns 13 str's but is a dog to a tm that was just 5-7 LY. UT did play the 7th toughest sked LY (Bama, LSU, Ark) while NCSt faced the #71 sked. UT beat Cincy LY 45-23 (-4') in non-conf action and has 19 ret str's and the Vols only have Georgia St on deck. A marquee matchup to look at will be UT's WR's Rogers/Hunter going against one of the best CB's in CFB in NCSt's Amerson. UT HC Dooley is clearly on the hot seat and they will need to build confidence but this should be NCST HC O'Brien's best tm yet.

STANFORD 37 San Jose St 16 - Back in the 90's SJSt used to refer to this as class warfare and usually got more fired up for the gm than Stanford did, but s/'01 Stanford is 8-1 SU/ATS. LY was a misleading final, as at the half the FD's were close and Stanford only had 182-162 yd edge. However, on the scoreboard they led 27-3 and just wore SJSt out in the 2H. The Spartans did hold Stanford to their lowest offensive yds the entire year (373) but lost 57-3 (+29) in SU's 2nd highest scoring gm of the yr. Stanford loses QB Luck and 2 AA Ols and while they will still be solid they are clearly down a few notches. SJSt is an improved tm in MacIntyre's 3rd yr but does have just 11 ret str's. The Spartans are 6-2 ATS as an AD and will keep this one closer than LY.

Saturday, September 1st

† Notre Dame 41 Navy 20 - Dublin. This will be billed as the Emerald Isle Classic. The gm will be played at Avium Stadium which took 3Y to build ('07-'10) and holds 50,000. In '96 these schools also played in Ireland (ND -16 won 54-27). LY we used a 3★ CTOT on Over 61' and ND won 56-14. The Irish rushed for 7 td's, their most in 19 yrs and were playing with some pent up revenge as they had lost 3 of their L/4 SU to Navy after having a streak of 43 wins snapped in '07. The Irish were a 23 pt HF but had the advantage of having faced AF and had a bye in the prev 3 wks leading up to the gm so they snuck in extra prep time and held Navy to a season low 229 yds. Navy was down to bkp QB Miller who made his first start. TY ND figures to rate a crowd edge (reported 33,000 traveling to gm) and they again have extra time to prep for the Mids but Navy may handle the overseas travel and distractions better as they have a bye on deck (16-8-1 ATS). ND will be without the services of LY's starting QB Rees (susp'd) but naturally has the edges across the board (off #20-80, def #19-91 and ST's #28-106) and for the 2nd str yr should win comfortably.

WEST VIRGINIA 42 Marshall 21 - WV has won all 7 recent meetings SU but is 2-3-1 ATS in this instate rivalry that MU fought hard to get played. LY the gm did not count ATS as there were 4 hrs and 22 min worth of rain delays and the gm was called with 14:36 left. In the 3Q MU settled for a 21 yd FG after a 1st&gl at the 3 to trail 20-13 but WV got a 100 yd KR td and added another td with 14:36 left on what turned out to be the final play. WV enters the year with high expectations and their offense improved greatly after bowl practice LY (70 pts vs Clem). They now have had an entire offsn of extra work and have Heisman contender QB Smith back. Marshall has 13 ret str's and only has an FCS foe on deck while WV has a bye. The Mountaineers clearly have the edges (off #4-82, def #69-100 and ST's #35-94) but MU acquired 4 BCS trans TY and will put forth a spirited effort vs their instate rival.

Kentucky (+14) over LOUISVILLE

Sunday. This is a fierce rivalry gm (Governor's Cup Trophy). The team that has rushed for the most yds has won the Governor's Cup 16 str times. LY's loss snapped Kentucky's school-record 21 consecutive regular-season non-conf wins ('06). Five of the last 7 meetings have been decided by 7 pts or less with 5 outright upsets the last 10 years. UL was a dog the last 3 meetings and UK is 4-1 SU (3-2 ATS) in the series. LTH UK (-3) led 20-3 late 2Q and hung on for Joker Phillips' first win as a HC. LY UK was -5 at home and had a 220-178 yd edge at the half but trailed 14-10. UL got a td with 11:15 left to lead 24-10 and UK drove 77/17pl for a td with 4:56 left but was SOD at the UL18 on 4&6 with :51 left. Prior to the 77 yd drive, UK had -10, 12 and -11 yd drives. UL is the BE favorite while UK is regarded the weakest in the SEC which gives the road Cats some extra value in this closely-contested rivalry.

PENN ST 24 Ohio 21 - Last met in '74. The Bill O'Brien era begins for Penn St but naturally with the tumultuous offseason and the loss of more than a dozen players thru transfer/inj/susp, the Lions will be fielding one of the most inexp'd tms in the country with just 6 returning st'rs. PSU has won their L/10 home openers by 29 ppg (lost L/3 ATS). OU is a veteran bowl team with 14 ret st'rs and is 3-2 ATS vs BCS tms with one of their losses LY at Rutgers (+4, 38-26) when they were only outgained 410-404. OU will be a dangerous dog here as PSU is revamping both its off and D but the line value has clearly come down with all the key players missing for the Lions. OU has the edges on off (#70-103) and ST's (#57-106) while PSU has the edge on D (#27-70). No doubt both tms will put forth a spirited effort and this one will come down to the wire.

Northwestern 27 SYRACUSE 24 - HT has won the 2 most recent gms ('08 & '09). L/gm SU (+3) won 37-34 (Marrone's 1st win as HC). SU led 17-0 into the 2Q but needed to score 10 pts in the final 6:07 incl a GW 41 yd FG as time exp'd to get the win. NW is 8-3 ATS in ssn openers and LY won at BC 24-17 (+4). Both tms are inexp'd with NW having just 10 returning st'rs but QB Colter has started 6 gms and the O-line has 3 st'rs back. SU has 12 returning st'rs and a veteran QB and is at home. SU is just 4-10 ATS in the Carrier Dome in the first 5 gms of the season and one of those wins was the opener LY when WF led by 14 but lost their QB and Syr (-6) covered in OT. The Cuse are 15-6 ATS hosting FBS non-conf tms but will be playing without their 1st Tm BE LT Pugh here. While NW has the off edge (#53-100), the Cuse have the D edge (#61-85) and like the L/meeting this one could come down to the final play.

IOWA ST 28 Tulsa 27 - Only one prior meeting (ISU won 27-6 in 1961). Tulsa is 4-18 SU in road openers and 1-17 SU (1-4 ATS) on the road vs BCS schools (did win at ND in '10). Tulsa is 5-13-1 ATS vs the B12. Iowa St has just 12 returning st'rs from LY's bowl squad (6-7) but is 12-7 SU in Ames under Rhoads (5-10 SU away). Iowa St has rival Iowa on deck while Tulsa has their CUSA opener (Tulane). While this is QB Cody Green's 1st start for Tulsa he actually started here in Ames in '10 with Nebraska hitting 7-12 for 79 yds with 10 yds rush on 9 att's. They only let him pass 4x in the 1H and NU won in OT 31-30 (-17). Tulsa is a stronger team with edges on off (#37-68) and D (#45-67) but it is tough to go against the Cyclones at home so take the dog in this one.

NEBRASKA 38 Southern Miss 17 - The HT is 0-3 ATS ('99, '03 & '04). LTH was the L/meeting in '04, SM pulled the outright upset 21-17 (+14). SM was outFD'd 26-11 & outgained 476-239 but converted 5 NU TO's into 18 pts. NU is 18-0 SU & 11-5 ATS in home openers while SM is 4-16 SU but 13-7 ATS in road openers. NU is 5-12 ATS as a HF with 4 outright losses. LY SM was 3-0 as an AD with 3 outright upsets but do have just 10 returning st'rs and a new HC. NU has 14 returning st'rs and has an exp'd QB in Martinez while SM's young QB is making his first road start and it is in front of 80,000 plus. SM HC Johnson left S Carolina (was the DC) LY before the bowl so did not prep for NU. SM has a bye next week while the Huskers travel to UCLA but NU takes care of business at home.

† Iowa 31 Northern Illinois 17 - Iowa is 7-0 SU (4-1 ATS) vs NI with their last meeting also here at Soldier Field in '07 with Iowa winning 16-3 (-12). Iowa is an under the radar team TY that could surprise as they have a veteran QB and are more exp'd than their 11 returning st'rs indicate. NI is the defending MAC champs and has the longest current winning streak in the nation at 9 gms. The Huskies have 12 returning st'rs but have a new QB. Iowa does have a revenge match vs rival Iowa St on deck while NI only has an FCS foe. NI did play here LY and lost to Wisc 49-7 (+17). UI season ticket holders have ordered over 14,600 tickets to see the Hawkeyes open the 2012 campaign here and coming off of 8 and 7 win seasons Iowa needs a strong feel good start to their year.

† Colorado 27 Colorado St 20 - Invesco Field at Mile High, Denver. CU is now 4-0 SU and ATS the L/4 in Denver w/ the avg win by 15 ppg and avg cover by 7 ppg. A key play LY happened just before the half when CSU blk'd a P in a 7-7 gm but after fumbling it, CU rec'd for a FD and went on to get a td with :12 left for a 14-7 lead. CSU would not pick up a single FD in the 2Q or 3Q's but got a td with 14:20 left to pull within 21-14. CU (-7) went on a 10:00 drive and got a td with 1:15 left for

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the frontdoor cover and CSU was sk'd on 4&4 from the CU40. CU has just 9 returning st'rs but is in Embree's 2nd yr and had a lot of inj's LY. CSU has 15 returning st'rs and new HC McElwain just won a national title as an OC at Alabama. CSU lost their top 3 defensive players to suspension in the spring and CU does have a veteran OL to take advantage. Both tms only have an FCS foe on deck so this is critical to their season and we will call for the Buffs to win by a td.

GEORGIA 40 Buffalo 10 - 1st meeting. UGA has won 29 str HG's by 30 ppg vs non-conf/BCS schools (last loss in the '97 opener hosting SM). The Bulldogs are without 4 susp'd players and have a big SEC gm next week with their first road trip to Missouri. Richt has covered 4 in a row vs non-BCS tms with the avg win 58-8! Quinn is 0-2 ATS in trips to the South losing by an avg of 38-10 (Baylor, Tenn). Buffalo does have 15 returning st'rs and only has Morgan St and a bye on deck so should give a solid effort. With a veteran QB the Dawgs will give some playing time to the bkps and that might keep this closer than the talent level.

FLORIDA 41 Bowling Green 6 - 1st meeting. BG has pulled some big surprises in road openers knocking off Missouri, Minn, #16 Purdue and #25 Pitt in the last 11 yrs. The Gators have won 22 str Swamp openers by an avg score 48-12. Both teams are among the most improved in the country and UF has 17 returning st'rs and we think they will win the SEC East. LY Muschamp won his Sept non-conf gms by a comb 80-3 but they do have Texas A&M and Tenn in the next 2 weeks so figure to spent a lot of August preparing for those crucial SEC gms. The key may be that Florida needs to get its young QB's full of confidence for that upcoming 2 gm road trip so they will score. The Gators have a deep defense in the heat of Florida and with talented backups may try for the shutout.

TEXAS 48 Wyoming 6 - UT is 4-0 vs WY with an avg score 32-7. L/gm ('10) UT trailed 7-6 w/5:31 2Q but ended the gm on a 28-0 run stopping WY on 3 str drives inside UT territory (34-7, -27). UT has won 12 str home openers by 40 ppg. Three yrs ago it was similar as WY led late 2Q but Texas won 41-10 (-31) in Laramie (2 half pt non-covers). Texas only has New Mexico on deck. Christensen is 12-3 ATS as an AD with 7 outright upsets and has 12 returning st'rs incl QB Smith from a bowl team. Despite the fact both tms were 8-5 LY Texas has our #6 rated offense and #6 D while WY is just #93 and #90. Texas is a powerful team with a young offense (soph QB's and RB's) that need to gain confidence and swagger and will roll here.

HOUSTON 45 Texas St 17 - UH is 1-3 vs Texas St but won 68-28 in the L/meeting ('10's ssn opener, 1st since 1948). UH coach Levine's 1st collegiate job was w/Texas St in '97-99 (rec'd Masters from Texas St). Houston is 8-1 SU and 5-3 ATS in home openers (6 straight wins by 32 ppg & 4-1 ATS L/5). UH loses QB Keenum and their HC but Texas St is making the large step up from FCS. UH does have La Tech (defend WAC Champ) on deck but is 13-5 ATS as a HF. Texas St has 16 returning st'rs and is led by HC Dennis Franchione but in two trips to FBS members LY they lost at TT 50-10 and Wyoming 45-10. Keep in mind UH's "new" QB is David Piland who started 8 gms in 2010 and in the 2 gms they were a DD fav with him starting they won by 19 and 39. UH was a perfect 7-0 ATS as a fav of 20 or more LY which inflates this line and lessens the value.

† Auburn 27 Clemson 24 - Georgia Dome. These two met here in the 2007 Chick-fil-A bowl and Aub (+2) won in OT, 23-20. LY's loss to CU snapped a 14 gm series win streak for AU and also the nation's best 17 str wins. AU led 14-0 & 21-7 late 2Q but all'd 4 str td drives of 60/8pl, 81/12pl, 75/8pl & 80/4pl & never recovered. It was a great situation for CU and we used a 3★ LPS on CU (-3) and they won 38-24. CU was off an FCS foe and AU was off a big gm as a HD vs Miss St. This is just the 7th time CU opens a season away from home s/74 (1-5, only win '85). Last time CU opened here in ATL they were whipped by Bama 34-10 (-4). AU does have an SEC gm on deck while CU has Ball St. Aub rates a slight edge on D (#34-46) but CU has the offensive edge (#8-42). CU will be without the services of arguably the best WR in the country, Sammy Watkins (susp'd) but does have other exp'd skill position ply'rs in QB Boyd and RB Ellington. Line value is on CU's side as people have quoted over and over how they gave up 70 in the bowl. CU has the more exp'd QB and AU's D did yield over 400 ypg LY but with the susp of Watkins this gm rates as a toss-up.

USC 48 Hawaii 10 - These two met in Lane Kiffin's 1st gm in '10. USC was very thin and beat up and did not tackle in practice the last two weeks of August in '10 and it showed as they never trailed but couldn't shake UH till a td mid-4Q in the 49-36 (-21) win on the Islands. New Hawaii HC Chow was the OC at USC from '01-'04. UH is 0-7 SU (1-3 ATS) vs USC, with an avg loss by 35 ppg as the Trojans have avg'd 59 ppg the L/4 meetings. LTH ('03) UH (+21) lost 61-32. UH only trailed 10-6 mid-2Q but USC scored the next 42 pts. USC does have a trip to the East coast next week and then Stanford but is #1 while UH has just 10 returning st'rs and is changing up its offense from the run and shoot to more of a pro style attack so it will be a learning process with a new QB and young O-line (USC has our #10 rated D). Coming off two yrs of probation, the Trojans will want to make a statement here.

† Alabama 31 Michigan 13 - Cowboy Stadium, Arlington, TX. Since '99 the National Champ from the previous yr is 13-0 SU with an avg win of 45-13 in the season opener. This will be the first reg ssn gm between the two tms as the prior 3 have all come in bowls. UM won the L/gm ('99 Orange Bowl) 35-34 as Bama missed an xp in OT. Bama did not face a dual threat QB like Denard Robinson LY and has just 5 returning st'rs from the best defense in college football LY. Bama opened the year 3-0 ATS off their last nat'l title and still has our #3 rated D. UM is off their first 11 win season s/06 and is a veteran team with 13 returning st'rs. The biggest matchup edge is Bama's #1 rated OL vs a rebuilt UM DL with 1 returning str. UM only faced two ranked tms away from home LY and was outgained 710-434 in those but got a fortunate win in the bowl vs #17 VT. They have faced just 2 Top 10 tms the last 3 yrs and lost those gms by a comb 85-35. Only once all year in 2011 did Bama's D give up 2 td's vs an FBS foe but that might happen here. However, the Crimson Tide, thanks to vet QB McCarron, will have more than enough on offense (#9) to secure an impressive opening win here.

Rutgers 34 TULANE 17 - TU has won the L/2 gms ('98 & '10). In the L/gm TU (+17) trailed 7-0 but later, holding onto a 3 pt lead, got an int at their 24 w/48 left to stop a comeback. TU is 1-7 ATS in home openers. Scarlet Knights are 5-17 in road openers (4-2 SU the L/6Y). Both tms have new HC's but RU has the edge there as Kyle Flood was on the staff and has not changed schemes. Ex-HC Toledo constantly pointed out that TU had no home field edge and while there will be some excitement for a new HC's opener, the crowd will not be a major factor. RU only has Howard on deck and TU is 6-18 ATS at home incl 1-6 ATS in home openers. TU does have 14 returning st'rs but some (incl QB Griffin) could lose their jobs while RU has 15 returning st'rs and a massive edge on defense (#18 vs #104). RU should remember their upset loss to the Green Wave two yrs ago and take care of business here.

Oklahoma 51 UTEP 16 - Just 5th BCS tm (reg ssn) to visit El Paso. UTEP is 0-4 SU (2-2 ATS) w/ an avg loss of 17 ppg. UTEP is 0-2 vs OU (L/gm 68-0 (+43) shutout in '02) Sooners are 3-0 in Sun Bowls (beat Stanford 31-27 in '09) but this is 1st reg ssn gm in El Paso. UTEP was 5-7 LY and has 13 st's back incl QB Lamaison. UTEP has a brutal schedule this year and is a stronger team than what most have forecasted. OU is just 4-8 ATS as an AF while UTEP HC Price is 10-6 as a HD. Schedule edge goes to the Sooners who only have Fla A&M and a bye on deck and will want to get their young receivers a lot of work and QB Jones will want to get off to a fast start after finishing last ssn horribly. The Sooners qualify for a perfect 8-0 ATS system (see pg 11) and should roll.
ARIZONA 44 Toledo 27 - UT is 0-3 w/an avg loss by 26 ppg. LTH ('08) UT (+23) trailed 27-6 late 3Q being outgained 452-244 for the gm (-16 FD). The Rockets are 2-7 (3-6 ATS) s/'03 in road openers & are 2-12 SU (4-10 ATS) s/'02 in BCS AG's. UA (-16) won 41-2 win in the L/meeting (2010's ssn opener). UA had a 518-183 yd and 25-10 FD edge. The Wildcats have won 11 str home openers by an avg of 27 ppg and this is the first time Rich Rodriguez gets to run out with his team so they will be excited. The Cats do have a big gm vs Okla St on deck. UT has just 8 returning st's but did almost upset Ohio St (+17' 27-22) on the road LY. Toledo did face Air Force's option in the bowl and held them to 67 ypg rush less than their season avg but this is a long trip out West played very late (10 PM EST) and UA has the better personnel on both sides of the ball.
WASHINGTON 34 San Diego St 24 - Last met in '97 (UW -23'H, 36-3). SDSst has won B2B road openers (Army, NMSst) after dropping 17 str (6-13 ATS). UW does return exciting QB Price, 3 OL st's and 7 st's back on D. SDSst is led by QB Katz who has already started a gm vs UW as he was Ore St's QB in 2010 and he hit 17-31 for 206 yds with an 0-3 ratio and 1 rush td. OSU (+2) lost in 2OT. Both tms had the benefit of bowl practices and return about the same amount of st's (UW 13, SDSst 12). SDSst is 4-26 SU in non-conf AG's since joining the MW ('99). Sarkisian is 6-4 as an AF but UW does have a trip to LSU on deck. Rocky Long was 4-1 SU on the road LY and outFD'd Michigan 20-10 but that was with QB Lindley and RB Hillman and UW has the edges across the board (off #33-79, def #41-81 and ST's #72-103).
