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#### **NEWS AND NOTES**

Virginia was 2-6 going into last Sat but was outgaining their foes by over 50 ypg. They had only forced 4 TO's in the first 8 but forced 5 vs NC State and dominated game with a 446-216 yd edge despite the fact they were on the road. Virginia led 16-0 at the half missing a 22 yd FG with :16 left. They opened the 3Q with a 64/6pl drive for a td, added a 33 yd FG to make it 26-0 and coasted. Phillip Sims hit 8-10-115 but Michael Rocco also played hitting 12-23-83. An interesting play in the 1st series when was when Sims handed off to Perry Jones and got wide open in the EZ but dropped an easy td pass. UVA scored 2pl later...ULM had been having a dream season with their upset of Arkansas, near upsets of Auburn and Baylor and an undefeated in the Sun Belt. Louisiana had struggled with Terrance Broadway at QB in their previous 2 games but piled up a 607-407 yd edge. UL led 21-10 when ULM got a 19 yd td pass with :48 left in the 1H to pull to 21-17 but UL did not let the momentum get to them. They took their opening 3Q drive 87/12 for a td and after being SOD at the ULM42 went 99/17pl for a td and a 34-17 lead. It was 34-24 when ULM was int'd at

the UL15. On the last play, UL on 4&6 opted to pass the ball with :04 left. Broadway hit Robinson with an 81 yd td pass with no time left and the xp was not attempted... Middle Tennessee and WKU played on a Thurs and MT pulled the first upset by a td+ dog on the weekend. MT settled for a 19 yd FG on a 73/13pl drive to open and after a punt the teams would score td's on 4 straight poss. WKU settled for a 29 yd FG, MT on 4&1 was SOD at the WKU32 with :32 left 1H and WKU missed a 47 yd FG on the final play, 17-17. It as tied 27-27 after a 27 yd WKU FG with 6:17 left but MT had a 96 yd KR for a 7 pt lead. WKU went 57/10pl but from the 21 on FD was int'd at the 6. MT on 4&9 ran the ball into the back of the EZ for a safety on the last play, WKU finished with a 438-342 yd edge... The Army/Navy game will be played for the Commander in Chief's Trophy as Army, despite having already clinched a losing season, knocked off Air Force and can now claim the CIC Trophy with a win over Navy in the season finale. AF might not have put the same importance on the game as they're in the battle for the MW Title and Army rolled to a 41-21 win in a game they led

35-7. Army has not won the CIC Trophy since 1996. QB Trent Steelman is now 3rd in Army's career rush leaders, passing the famed Glenn Davis. While Army came in avg 383 ypg (#1 in FBS) and AF was #2 with 366 ypg, AF was limited to 103 yards rushing while Army had 314. AF had actually only punted 15 times in its first 8 games but punted 4 times here. Cody Getz ret'd for AF after missing L2W but had just 14-23 rushing (came in avg 133 ypg). Each team went on a long to drive to open and AF was SOD on 4&1 at the Army1. Army went 96/11 and settled for a 20 yd FG then Army missed a 53 yd FG. After an int Army went 53/8pl for a td and after another int, added a 36 yd FG with :03 left to lead 20-7. Army had a 265-260 yd edge at the half. With the momentum, Army went 54/12pl and 43/8pl for td's and their 3rd drive was actually SOD at the AF32 as they opened it up to a 20 pt lead after 3Q's. AF QB Deitz had a streak of 79 consecutive passes without an int end as he tossed two and he also fumbled before being int at the 1 into the EZ for a td with 2:50 left, 41-21. That came 2pl after Army was SOD at the 26. AF went 63/16pl on its final drive getting to the Army3.

The Sooners were also without their top RB and WR and struggled. OU was -3 in TO's they got a td with :51 left and were going to go for 2 pts and the win but a pen had them kick the xp. BU got a key FD then a 34 yd td pass with :08 left for the upset. The Sooners are playing with legit revenge as they had been 20-0 SU in the series and had won the prev 13 meetings by 29 ppg and +255 ypg. The Sooners won as a 4★ Top Weekly LPS & Key Selection as they beat ISU 35-20 (-12). OU had 34-19 FD and 593-290 yd edges but kept ISU in it as they were SOD at the ISU5 and were also int'd twice. QB Jones is avg 302 ypg (65%) with a 16-6 ratio. OU's pass D is #1 B12 (170, 52%, 3-9). The Bears got their 1st B12 win TY by beating KU 41-14. BU finished with 32-14 FD and 666-342 yd edges as they scored the gm's L/24 pts. FBS's #1 passer Florence's (377, 64%, 25-11) favorite target is the FBS's #1 rec Williams (1340, 18.9, 10 td). Bears D remains FBS's worst all'g 527 ypg. While OU has won the L/5 HG's vs Bay by 24 ppg, they have dropped 5 in a row ATS (avg line -40!). LY UT was bent on revenge We used UT (-9) on the road as a  $3 \pm$  Key Selection and a  $4 \pm$  LPS and UT led 34-0 at HT with ISU only getting a couple of late 4Q td's on 86 and 63 yd drives. The HT is just 2-4 SU and 0-6 ATS in the series. UT moved to 7-2 after their 31-22 upset win over TT (+7). The Horns never trailed despite being outFD'd 25-18 as TT settled for 4 FG's in the RZ and had a td called back due to pen. QB Ash (221, 68%, 15-5) went the distance after getting the vote of confidence from Brown during the wk and RB Gray (533, 5.3) ran for 100 yd in his 2nd str gm. UW has now won 7 in a row in this series and in L/6 have won by an avg of 52-16 incl the L2Y when at home they won by a combined 142-27 even though they were -40. The Badgers needed the bye to sort out the QB situation as B10's pass eff leader Stave is OFY leaving the job up to O'Brien (151, 62%, 3-1 in first 3 sts of ssn) and the more mobile Phillips. Top OL LT Wagner (out L/2 knee) is expected to ret here after UW ran for a shocking 19 yds vs MSU. The Hoosiers have won 2 str B10 gms for the first time s/07, the last time they went to a bowl gm after beating lowa 24-21 (-2'). IU trailed the Hawks 14-0 mid-1Q after a pick-six and after 3 drives of hitting a 45 yd FG, being SOD at the IA8 and missing a 38 yd FG changed QB's. FSU is fresh off a bye while VT is off a Thurs Night loss to Miami 30-12 as a 1' pt AF despite having 24-15 FD and 421-347 yd edges. VT is tough at home on Thurs Nights (5-2 SU, 3-4 ATS) but FSU has a big edge with the best DL in CFB (#1 NCAA ttl D, #3 rush D) vs a young O-line that has struggled. Will the Hokies get a signature win in a rather disappointing season or will FSU continue its march toward the ACC Title?

Ulm at ARKANSAS ST - LY ULM (+2') at home had a 25-16 FD edge but settled for two 25 yd FG's in the 1H and only led 13-10. ULM got to the ASU27 but on 4&19 fired inc with :18 left (ASU -2', 24-19). LTH ASU (-4) won 34-20. While Ark St picked up an impressive road win at NT 37-19 (-4) ULM is playing a 10 str week off a loss to its rival ULL (40-24, -9') and on a short week with travel. While the situation favors Ark St, ULM has the tech edges going 4-0 ATS TY on the road while ASU is 1-3 ATS at home TY. Both tms are part of a 3 way tie atop the SBC standings and the loser here probably is eliminated. Saturday, November 10th

CLEMSON 41 Maryland 13 - HC. LY featured the 2nd greatest comeback in Clemson hist as CU trailed 35-17 but was down just 45-42 w/7:35 left. Watkins got an 89 yd KR td to lead 49-45 and CU sealed it w/a 44 yd td run w/3:55. LTH MD had FD/ydd edges but all'd an 87 yd KR and 61 yd IR td's while missing a FG and being SOD at the C29 and int at C21 in a 31-7 loss (+14'). Unlike prev yrs w/2H collapses, the Tigers continue to roll with 5 str wins and 6 str covers after LW's 56-20 (-12') demolition of Duke. For the 2nd str wk Boyd tied a schl rec'd w/5 td passes and is now #4 in the NCAA in pass avg 298 ypg (68%) with a 25-9 ratio. CU racked up nearly 500 yds by HT and had a 718-342 yd edge for the gm. LW MD was down to its 5th string QB due to inj's (a converted frosh LB) and fell behind 27-0 late 3Q and lost 33-13 (+7'). CU is just 3-3 SU and 1-5 ATS at home in the series and there have been 4 outright upsets

the last 7 yrs but it's tough stepping in front of a very hot tm when you have a converted LB at QB.

NC STATE 34 Wake Forest 17 - LY at home WF (+1') led 34-13 after 3Q's. WF was int'd in the EZ and

NCSt on 4&10 got a 63 yd td pass to get back within 7 w/5:34 left. NCSt's 4&10 pass fell inc from the WF38

w/1:31 left, 34-27. The HT is 14-2 SU (13-3 ATS) in the series including 5 str wins with 5 outright upsets the L9Y. Wake HC Grobe continues to work his magic as the Demon Deacons in what looked like a rebuilding ssn w/just 11 ret'g st'rs now sit 1 win away from bowl elig after LW's 28-14 (-3') win over BC. The Deacons can thank their D for the win as they forced 4 BC TO's and also made 3 stops on 4&1 plays incl one near GL in 2H. NCSt is off a 33-6 loss to UVA as we cashed an easy Underdog POW winner on the Cavs (+10'). The Pack imploded w/5 TO's as QB Glennon had 4 of them and NCSt was outgained 446-216. Typically NCSt HC O'Brien is great off a loss at 16-6-1 ATS and off B2B losses they need to get back on track here.

RUTGERS 34 Army 13 - RU has now won 7 in a row vs Army SU and is 6-1 ATS with the lone non-cover being their last meeting here in 10 (RU -7, 23-20 OT) with a 404-250 yd edge. LY Army was off a tough loss to AF and the game was played in Yankee Stadium. RU was -9 and QB Steelman was out for Army. It was a for tunate cover for RU as they only led 13-12 when they blk'd a P for a td w/6:36 left and then on 3&7 when a FD might have let them run out the clock, they got a 56 yd td run by Jamison for the frontdoor cover. Both tms played Kent St and both lost despite outgaining the Golden Flashes. Army now has a shot to win its 1st CIC Trophy s/96 after LW's 41-21 win (+7) over AF snapping the Knights 13 gm losing streak vs their service academy rivals. QB Steelman ran and threw for 100 yds and they benefitted from +5 TO's. RU is fresh off a bye off its loss to Kent while Army plays for a 10th str wk off AF and RU has extra time to prep for the bone wa large D edge (#18-117). We won a GOV in 1987 going against Rutgers and followed it up the next yr with a GOY winner on Army over Vanderbilt. Will we got back to these teams here?

SYRACUSE 31 Louisville 28 - UL is 6-2 SU but just 3-5 ATS in this series and there have been 4 outright upsets in that span. The dog was a perfect 7-0 heading into LY but UL (-3) covered 27-10 and we also had a 3★ CTOT on Under 44. LTH UL's win broke their 11 gm BE road losing streak (+7, 28-20). The also flad a 3 × CTO for flottle 44. ETH OLS WIII bloke their TT girl BE load losing streak (+7, 26-20). The Cards are 9-0 for the 1st time in schl hist after LW's 45-17 win (-16) over Temple. UL continues to be led by QB Bridgewater who threw 5 td's and is now #5 in the NCAA avg 270 ypg (70%) with an 18-4 ratio. The Cuse, coming off their biggest comeback in schl hist, led Cincy LW 24-21 in the 3Q before losing 35-24 (+5'). Syr set up a pair of Cincy td's by fmbl'g twice deep in its territory, incl one on the opening KO and they also missed a FG, had another blk'd, and got penalized 12x for 104 yds. Tech edges have to go to UL as HC Strong is 7-1 ATS on conf road while Cuse is 3-10 ATS vs BE at home but did upset #11 WV LY 49-23 (-144). No while he off end for so close New New House house he to got with the 1872 (-1472 (-144). 23 (+14). Also while the off and def are close, Cuse has played a much tougher sked (#37-93) and Liville is playing w/undefeated pressure. We won a GOY in the Carrier Dome in 2007, we will go back to it?

ILLINOIS 18 Minnesota 17 - UM is now 9-3 SU/8-4 ATS in this series and have had 3 outright upsets as DD dogs the L4Y. LY UM (+10') dominated leading 20-0 at HT with a commanding 217-18 yd edge in their FHG. UM finished with a 333-160 yd edge and led 27-0. Beckman and Kill met twice in the MAC and the HT won both SU/ATS. The Illini were officially eliminated from bowl contention in LW's 52-22 loss at OSU (-27'). They trailed just 7-6 going into 2Q before the flood gates opened with OSU outrushing IL 330-74 and the Illini's final td coming on a 77 yd FR. QB Scheelhaase (134, 60%, 4-6, 197 rush) pilots an off which is in the B10 basement in nearly every category (scoring, ttl, rush). The veteran D has been a huge disappointment as they've all'd 230 rush ypg (4.9) in conf play with #1 LB Brown re-inj his ankle vs OSU. The Gophers (+12) lost 35-13 to a Mich squad minus D-Rob 35-13 as QB Nelson hit just 13-29-142-1-0 vs the nation's #1 pass D. Trailing 21-7 early 4Q the Gophers settled for 2 short FG's on 18gl inside the Mich3 and also all'd a 41 yd td run on 4&1 to put it away. The Wolves did finish with a 389-275 yd edge. Despite losing 4 of their L/5 gms this is the Gophers' best shot to secure bowl elig with a trip to Neb and Mich St in the finale and this will come down to the wire.

IOWA 27 Purdue 20 - Iowa is now 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS in this series. LY both teams were fighting for bowl hopes and UI (-1') led 21-14 at the half and had a 257-117 yd edge. UI won 31-21 with a 408-282 yd edge. PU's last W at Iowa City was in '92 and since then they have dropped 6 in a row SU by 11 ppg (1-11 SU s/'81). Two one time front runners for B10 champ gm now meet to end long losing streaks and keep flickering bowl hopes alive. lowa lost its 3rd str to Indy despite getting out to a 14-0 1Q lead. lowa led 14-10 at HT but was indige after. John Lost its 31 to 1100 tespite getting out to a 14-50 testing data. Jowa led 14-70 at 111 out was indiged at length of the lead on a 99 yd to drive, the Hawks went 88/10pl to regain the edge 21-17 but IN answered with its own to drive. The Hawks have scored 9 off to's in 6 configms with QB Vandenberg struggling (198, 57%, 4-6). The Boilers lost their 5th straight 34-9 at home to Penn St (-3') to fall to 3-6 with HC Hope's job dangling in the wind. PU led 3-0 (1st 1Q pts all'd by Lions D all yr) and had the ball at the PSU41 when they fmbl'd. Boilers also missed a 45 yd FG, were SOD at the PSU37, 19 & 18 and scored their only td on the gm's last play. QB Marve hit 22-39-138-0-0 and was benched for TerBush (10-20-155-1-0). Vet Boilers D are allowing a B10 worst 264 rush ypg (5.8) in conf play PU is 3-10 ATS in Nov AG's and the visitor is this series has gone just 2-9 SU & 4-7 ATS making the Hawks the play here.

MISSISSIPPI 26 Vanderbilt 23 - Amazingly VU is now 5-2 SU/ATS in the series and there have been 4 outright upsets (3 in the last 4Y). In '10 here VU was +11' and upset Ole Miss 28-14 despite being outgained 385-300. LY Ole Miss was playing with legit revenge and was -2' on the road. VU broke a scoreless tie late 2Q with a td then got a 52 yd IR td 1:02 later and drove 57 yds for another td with :25 left in the half to make it 21-0 and cruised to a 30-7 home win. The visitor is 11-5-1 ATS in the series. The Dores are off an impressive 40-0 (-6') win at UK as they dominated from start to finish w/29-15 FD and 447-260 yd edges as UK only made it into the RZ one time after an IR. Ole Miss jumped out to a 10-0 lead at UGA LW but two key td passes doomed them in the 37-10 loss (+13'). The 2st came on a 3&1 as UGA QB Murray play faked the whole D and threw a 66 yd bomb, then the Bulldogs got a 40 yd Hail Mary w/:03 left in the 1H to go up 14-10 and grab momentum. Both tms sit at 5-4 and with a win become bowl elig. Both tms are relatively close talent-wise and we'll take the HT edge here.

N CAROLINA 41 Georgia Tech 20 - HC. LY at home GT (-7) finished with a 496-332 yd edge. GT did lead

20-7 in the 3Q but it was tied at 28 when the Jackets got a td with 5:20 left. The HT is 7-2 SU (NC 3-1 ATS here) but GT is 12-2 SU (7-6-1 ATS). A wk after being held to ssn lows in ttl yds, rush yds, pass yds and pts, GT rebounded with a confidence building 33-13 (-7") win over a QB-depleted MD tm LW. Jackets finished with 19-17 FD and 401-259 yd edges and put up 370 rush yds on a MD tm that came in #4 FBS in run D. QB Washington is avg 100 ypg (59%) w/a 4-3 ratio and is the #2 rusher with 511 (4.3) and enters this gm 1 shy of schl/ACC rec'd rush td by QB. Not only is GT on a B2B road trip but NC has the huge edge of a late ssn bye which also gave them extra prep time for the option and they are 5-0 ATS TY at home. QB Renner avg 265 ypg (63%) with an 18-6 ratio. RB Bernard is #5 FBS with 930 rush yd (7.4, 10 td) and #3 FBS in scoring adding 3 rec and 2 PR td's (#1 FBS PR). With edges on off (#17-25), D (#46-64) and ST's (#4-88), NC brings GT back to earth and we did win a GOY here in Chapel Hill in '05, but will we use them again?

C Michigan 41 E MICHIGAN 38 - LY we used EM as a Big Dog POW (+12) and they delivered an outright upset on the road 35-28. CM trailed most of the gm before tying it with 1:09 left. EM got a 38 yd td run with 37 left and CM was int'd on the EM4 on the last play. EM has been a dog ELEVEN str yrs, yet has 5 outright upsets in the L8Y. The Eagles fell to 1-8 SU (0-5 MAC) with a 45-14 (+16) loss to Ohio last Thurs. EM was only down by 10 at HT but stalled in the 2H being outFD'd 25-18 and outgained 559-320 on the day. QB Benz is avg 176 ypg (53%, 10-6) but has not topped 140 the L/2 while top rusher Hill (736, 7.3, 6 td) has not found pay dirt in that span. LW CM was outscored 28-8 in the 4Q in a gm that featured 6 lead changes. The Chips did go over 500 yds for the 1st time TY but fell 42-31 (+1) at WM as we went against them winning a 4★ Small Coll Play. While the record doesn't reflect it (1-4 SU), Radcliff is avg 314 ypg (60%) with a 12-4 ratio vs MAC foes and has topped 300 in 4 of those 5. Tipton (983, 6.2, 12 td) has 355 rush yds the L2W and has gone over 100 in the L/3. Davis (40, 20.8, 8 td) racked up 208 rec yds vs WM. LTH CM did have a 523-358 vd edge and won 52-14 (-10) but series history proves EM can keep it close.

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MIAMI, OH 24 Kent St 23 - MU is 7-3 SU in the series and there have been 4 outright upsets the L6Y but the HT is just 2-5 SU/ATS. LY we expected a D struggle and it was just that as MU won 9-3 (3' pt AF). Each tm had 5 sks and KSU had a 244-166 yd edge. LW KSU won its 7th in a row SU and kept the Wagon Wheel at home with a 35-24 (-20) win over rival Akron. UA scored on each of its 1H poss to lead 24-14 at HT, but KSU held them scoreless after. QB Keith is avg just 141 ypg (58%) with an 8-3 ratio relying heavily on a ground gm that has avg'd 238 ypg the L/7 led by Archer (892 yds, 9.2, 10 td) and Durham (887, 4.7, 11). After a 3-3 tie at HT LW, MU and UB got into a shootout in the 2H. Down by 7, MU conv 2 4th downs on a 75/16pl drive to tie UB at 24 with :23 left. However, UB ret'd the ensuing KO to the MU35, ran 1pl and kicked the GW 47 yd FG as time expired and MU fell 27-24 (+3). QB Dysert (274 ypg, 61%, 18-9 ratio) did move past Big Ben as MU's all-time leading passer. Kent does have all the edges (#71-92 off, #70-115 D and #74-112 ST's), but remember MU beat prev unbeaten Ohio at home earlier TY as a 4\* Small Coll winner for us and Kent is playing for its 8th str wk.

BYU 48 Idaho 0 - LY was the 1st meeting s/55 (2-2 SU) and BYU rolled. BYU has won 6 str home finales by 22 ppg. The Cougs are off a bye (7-0 off a bye L3Y, avg score 46-14) after destroying GT 2W and 41-17 (+2) on the road. It was the 5th time TY that BYU's D did not allow a td. In the 1st 4 cms of

BYU 48 Idaho 0 - LY was the 1st meeting s/'55 (2-2 SU) and BYU rolled. BYU has won 6 str home finales by 22 ppg. The Cougs are off a bye (7-0 off a bye L3Y, avg score 46-14) after destroying GT 2W ago 41-17 (+2) on the road. It was the 5th time TY that BYU's D did not allow a td. In the 1st 4 gms of the yr frosh RB Williams had just 18 att's but he's seen his carries increase the L5W and has tallied 433 of his 516 rush yds in that span. QB Nelson is avg 206 ypg (60%) with a poor 9-11 ratio (19-7 ratio LY). BYU is 15-4 ATS in Nov, many times delivering as a 4★ Key Selection on these pages. LW Idaho (+21) debuted new interim HC Gesser and only trailed SJSt 21-13 with under 1:00 left in the 3Q but all'd 3 td drives and a 47 yd IR td for the 42-13 final. QB Bushnell, in his 1st start (Blackman dismissed), hit 14-29-196 with 1 td. The top rusher is Bass (339, 3.7) but ID has a ttl of 3 rush td's TY and is facing our #9 D. Stiting at 5-4 BYIL can lock up the Poinsettia Bowl hid here and do so emphatically.

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AKRON 34 UMass 20 - 1st meeting. UM is on an 0-4 SU run on the road in Nov. This is the Zips home finale and they are 3-1 ATS as a HF. UA is off a disappointing 35-24 loss to rival Kent. The Zips (+20) jumped out to a 14-0 lead and led 24-14 at HT but KSU scored the final 21 incl a 15 yd td with :38 left for the 35-24 final. QB Williams (300 ypg, 62%) set a UA single-ssn rec'd with his 24th td pass (12 int) and the Zips had 23-18 FD and 442-364 yd edges. Top rusher Chisholm leads with 803 (5.7) incl 561 (6.3) in MAC play. UM is on its 3rd str AG off a 63-0 (+35) drubbing at the hands of NI (NI +5 FD, +343 yds). QB Wegzyn is avg a paltry 149 ypg (52%) with a 7-4 ratio and is the #2 rusher with just 150 yds (2.1). UM ranks dead last in 2 of our 3 major categories (off, ST's, #121 on D) and UA is not much better (#86 off, #102 D, #119 D) but the Zips should be able to pull out a home win in this battle for the East basement and HC Bowden, prior to the ssn, said his goal was to get 2 wins TY (1 in each of L2Y).

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W Michigan 33 BUFFALO 30 - The Bulls are 0-5 SU but 3-2 ATS vs WM but in the L/2 gms have lost by just 6 & 3 pts. LW WM trailed rival CM 23-14 with 15:00 left but racked up 257 ttl yds and 28 pts in the final stanza for a 42-31 win (-1) delivering a 4★ Small Coll winner. QB Van Tubbergen (291 ypg, 61%, 15-11 ratio vs MAC) threw for his 3rd str 300 yd gm, RB Chance (830, 5.4, 4 td) went over the 100 yd mark for the 4th time TY and WR Monette (#3 rec, 34, 14.5, 3 td) had his 2nd str 100 yd rec gm. UB used a 47 yd FG on the final play (1st ever final pl win in regulation via FG in IA era) to down Mia, OH 27-24 (-3). It was tied at 3 in the 1H but the 2H turned into a shootout with the tms trading td's. QB Licata, filling in for the inj'd Zordich (157 ypg, 51%, 9-7 ratio, CS), hit 13-24-127-2-1. RB Oliver, in his 2nd gm back, ran for his 2nd str 100 yd gm and leads with 726 (5.7, 4 td) despite missing 4 full gms. UB has lost 7 str home finales by 13 ppg and the HT is 0-5 ATS (3-2 SU) with WM +136 ypg in their two trips here. The Broncos know that if they win out, they achieve bowl eligibility and squeak out a road win here.

ALABAMA 34 Texas A&M 20 - Last met in '88. Bama is 9-3 ATS in Nov HG's under Saban but is coming off the huge game vs LSU although they do only have W Car on deck. A&M is 4-15 ATS as an AD vs a ranked foe and they are on their 3rd str AG playing for their 10th str wk. LW the Tide jumped out to a 14-3 HT lead at #5 LSU but found themselves down 17-14 late in the game as McCarron comp just 1-7 passes for 0 yds in the 2H prior to the final drive. LSU blew some opportunities to put the game away (3 failed FG att). Bama did march 72/5pl in a drive that culminated w/a td pass w/just :51 left as the #1 Tide won 21-17 (-8) although we cashed a 3★ LPS going against them. McCarron has still not thrown an int TY but the #1 Tide D did give up 435 yds and they will have their hands full again TW vs Johnny Football who tore thru Miss St's D to the tune of 440 comb yds (30-36 passing!) as the Aggies rolled to a 38-13 (-7) win at MSU. A&M outgained MSU 693-310 and had a 36-15 FD edge. Keep in mind the L/2x Bama has lost a gm it came at the hands of a mobile QB's Cam Newton and Jordan Jefferson. Still we can't step in front of the elephant here as A&M's off has been sluggish in the 2H of gms vs the other two elite D's it faced earlier TY in UF/LSU.

Georgia 30 AUBURN 16 - At one time the visitor dominated this series as they went 11-3-1 SU from 1992-2006. The L5Y the HT is a perfect 5-0 ATS and 4-1 SU and UGA is 4-1 SU in that span. LTH Newton and an Aub tm heading for #1 won 49-31 (-6'). LY UGA was -11' at home and dominated with 528-195 yd, 29-9 FD and 304-51 rush edges. UGA led 35-7 at the half and won 45-7. LW UGA fell behind 10-0 early but thanks to 2 long td passes incl one w/:03 left, rallied to take a 14-10 HT lead in their 37-10 win over Ole Miss (-13'). They did have a 533-234 yd edge and QB Murray rebounded from his poor performance at UF to go 21-28-384-4-0. Aub notched just its 2nd win of the yr LW with a 42-7 rout (-24) of NMSt. They did only lead 7-0 at HT and relied heavily on their run gm (311 yds) in QB Wallace's 1st start (9-16-164-1-1). Brian VanGorder, UGA's DC from 2001-04, was hired by Aub TY. Auburn is in a NMSt/Ala A&M sandwich so will be fully focused and is 7-3 ATS as a HD incl just a 12-10 loss (+20') to LSU earlier TY. Still the Bulldogs can clinch a spot in Atlanta w/a win here and after a few anxious moments will put the Tigers away in the 2H. NEBRASKA 37 Penn St 17 - These two had not ply'd s/'03 when PSU covered at Neb (+10) losing 18-10. LY this was one of the most talked about and watched games of the ssn as PSU had fired Paterno and the Lions were a 3 pt HD. PSU trailed 17-14 and finished with a 375-331 yd edge but had a couple of blown opportunities. PSU is on its 3rd AG in 4W. The Lions bounced back from the OSU loss to bury Purdue 34-9 after trailing in the 1Q for the 1st time all ssn. PSU outgained the Boilers 506-375 dodging several bullets (PU was SOD 3x inside the PSU40) but all'd their only to on the gm's last play. B10's #1 passer QB McGloin (271, 62%, 18-3) is the conf's MIP under O'Brien. Nothing wrong with a Lions D which is all'g 107 rush ypg (3.6) in conf play. The Huskers won their 3rd straight overall and had their 2nd straight conf road 4Q DD comeback by driving 80/9pl and scoring the GW td with :06 left

Notre Dame 30 BOSTON COLLEGE 9 - BC is 8-4 ATS and the dog is 8-4 ATS. LY ND was -24' at home and did finish with a 417-250 yd edge but only led 13-7 at the half and they only won 16-14. After winning 6 str from 2001-08, BC has dropped 3 str by 8 ppg. The tms have combined to avg 32 ppg the L4. Trailing 20-6 in the 4Q, #4 ND was able to pull out a 29-26 (-16') 30T win over Pitt LW thanks to a missed 33 yd FG in the 2nd OT. ND overcame a -3 TO deficit (incl 2 in Pitt EZ) but did have huge 34-13 FD and 522-308 yd edges. The star was QB Golson who was benched earlier in gm, but came back to throw 2 td's and ran for another as he tallied 301 ttl yds. After 12 str bowl appearances, BC is now

staying home for a 2nd yr in a row after LW's 28-14 (+3') loss to Wake. The story remains the same as the BC off relies solely on QB Rettig (285 ypg, 56%, 16-8 ratio) while the rush off is #118 avg just 75 ypg (2.7). That doesn't bode well vs an ND rush D all'g just 101 (3.3). ND is 4-0 ATS away from home TY with an avg cover by 25 ppg! The L/2 times ND was undefeated this late in Nov ('93 & '02), it was the Eagles who dashed their Nat'l Title hopes with upset wins but that was vs ND tms playing in huge flat spots while TY's ND tm overcame its flat spot LW and will be much more focused here.

USC 41 Arizona St 27 - The Nat'l Title was a distinct possibility at the start of the yr but now USC is stinging with its 3rd P12 loss after a 62-51 loss to Oregon (all'd 730 yds). LY USC had come in winning 11 in a row SU (6-4-1 ATS) incl their L/5 trips to Tempe. ASU was -2' at home and won 43-22 but the game was much closer than the final as USC had a 402-393 yd edge. The Sun Devils meanwhile blew an early 14-3 lead to Oreg St and are still a game away from bowl eligibility. ASU has dropped 6 in a row SU here but are 2-0-1 ATS in their the L/3 trips. Teams that lose after winning 11 in a row in the series are playing with legit revenge. While on the surface you may question what USC's mindset is off B2B losses with rivals UCLA and ND on deck, they still control their own destiny in the P12 South and could end up in Pasadena if they win out.

WASHINGTON 20 Utah 17 - The Huskies are 7-0 SU all-time vs Utah incl LY's Underdog POW in PS as

UW (+10) went on the road and led 31-7 before a late gbg td with :07 left. The Huskies picked up their 1st road win in more than a yr LW at Cal despite 12 pen's and 4 TO's (outgained 450-409). The Utes meanwhile put together arguably their best showing of the ssn at home vs WSU LW holding the Cougs to just 255 yds (-4 yds rush) and all'g WSU to get its only score on the final play of the game. Huge bowl implications for both here with UW at 5-4 and the Utes at 4-5 and while we expect the hometown Huskies to pull out a victory, it should be tight with Utah holding the D (#15-34) and ST's (#65-106) edges. NEW MEXICO 26 Wyoming 20 - LY WY was poised for revenge with the NM 34-31 score posted in the locker room as the Pokes had a 536-430 yd edge in that gm but were -4 in TO's and lost by 3 on the road. LY we still used a Big Dog POW on NM (+24) and the Lobos trailed just 17-10 after 3Q's and lost 31-10. The HT is 4-0 SU (3-1 ATS) and NM is 9-3 SU in the series (9-4 ATS) and WY is 0-5 ATS as an AF. WY comes in off another Border War win over rival CSU (4th str) 45-31 (-7'). The Pokes were outgained 512-468 but benefitted from a +3 TO margin and the gm marked the return of HC Christensen who was susp'd for the Boise gm. NM which looked like it was heading towards a bowl gm in Bob Davie's 1st yr has now dropped 3 str gms after LW's 35-7 (-2') loss at UNLV. With no pass gm threat (QB Holbrook out), frosh QB Gautsche was just 3-6-43-0-1 and NM was outgained 530-350. They did have a remarkable 41:02-18:58 TOP edge and were +2 TO's despite the loss. The talent is even so we'll side with the HT here.

San Jose St 37 NEW MEXICO ST 16 - LY SJSt ended a 13 game overall losing streak. SJSt (-10') actually trailed at home 24-17 mid-3Q. They scored 2 td's then settled for a 31 yd FG to lead 34-24 with 7:07 left. NMSt is 1-6 in WAC gms vs SJSt (win by 2 pts, avg loss by 15 ppg). LTH SJSt trailed 17-3 but after an 80/8pl td drive led 27-23. They all'd a 79/8pl drive and an 8 yd GW td pass on 4&gl on the final play (-3', 27-29). SJSt is 9-2 ATS as an AF and LW won in that role 42-13 (-21') as they rolled up 21-12 FD and 413-288 yd edges and secured their 1st winning ssn s/'06. QB Fales continues to be one of the best QB's you've never heard of as he is #8 in the NCAA in pass eff avg 317 ypg (73%) with a 21-6 ratio. NMSt has now dropped 8 str gms (2-5-1 ATS) after LW's 42-7 loss (+24) at Aub. The gm was much closer than the final as the Aggies trailed just 7-0 at HT and the FD's were close at 19-15. The lone bright spot all ssn has been WR Franklin who didn't disappoint w/154 rec yds LW moving him to #3 in the NCAA avg 124 rec ypg (17.4). With only one official WAC bowl bid, the Spartans need as many wines as they can get and with all of the talent edges should win comfrictly before

any wins as they can get and with all of the talent edges should win comfortably here.

Oregon 44 CALIFORNIA 27 - Bears HC Jeff Tedford was the OC at UO from '98-'01 before coming here. He was 4-1 SU from '04-'08 but has now dropped 3 in a row SU to the Ducks (4-2 ATS). Two years ago Tedford's D held UO (-19') to a ssn-low 317 yds and a missed FG cost them the upset win at home,15-13. LY his D did it again, at least in the 1H as Cal led 15-14 at HT but the Ducks ended up winning 43-15 (-24) in a Thurs night gm. The Ducks offense was virtually unstoppable LW at USC putting up 62 pts, 37 FD's and 730 yds in an 11 pt win cashing a 3★ LPS winner on the Over. UO RB Barner rushed for a schl rec'd 321 yds and 5 td's while earning some mentions for the Heisman in the process. Cal meanwhile outgained the Huskies on Fri Night but was done in by 4 TO's and now enters this meeting with some major inj concerns at both QB (Maynard? knee) and WR (Allen out w/knee). UO has now won 16 in a row on the road in P12 play but judging by how tight the Bears have ply'd and the fact that the Ducks are in a USC/Stanford

OKLAHOMA ST 51 W Virginia 27 - Holgorsen was the OC at OSU in '10 and Gundy seemed annoyed when folks questioned "his" offense after Holgorsen left for WV LY. TY long time OSU STC Joe DeForest who was in Stillwater for 11Y (longer than Gundy) is now WV's DC. Gundy is now 22-9-1 ATS as a HF but WV is 7-1 ATS as an AD. OSU (+9) fell 44-30 at #2 KSU who was without Heisman contender QB Klein (head/arm) for most of the 2H. The mistake prone Pokes finished with a 504-481 yd edge but were derailed by a -5 TO margin and all'd a 100 yd KR td. QB Lunt hit 11-20-184-1-3 before also leaving in the 3Q with a head inj leaving #3 Chelf (16-27-233-1-1) to finish the gm. WV's 5-0 Top 5 start has turned into a 3 gm losing streak as they blew a 10 pt 2H lead and lost to fellow B12 newcomer TCU 39-38 in 2OT. WV led 24-14 when the Frogs rec'd an errant P snap for a td and with 1:44 left WV was burned by a 96 yd td pass as TCU's WR was knocked OOB by the defender but came back onto the field and was untouched for the score. After a WV td in the 2OT, the Frogs hit a 25 yd td pass and 2 pt conv for the win. Since his hot start QB Smith is awg 227 ypg (58%) with a 5-3 ratio in the 3 gm losing streak (2 gbg time td passes). WV is #123 in our pass eff D (350 ypg, 66%, 23-6). We won 2 straight Top Weekly LPS winners on the Cowboys incl our 5★ Oct GOM. Will we go back to them here? Kansas St 31 TCU 24 - Last met in '86. KSU is Patterson's alma mater ('83) so this game is special to him. TCU faced the AF option (Klein is a mobile QB) for the L7Y and Patterson's D shut it down each time (155 ypg rush L/4). They spent time in the spg prepping for the option even though AF is not on the sked and TCU has a bye on deck and can go all out. The Frogs come in off

K-St twice with our GOY in '96 and '99 and covered both. Will we make it 3 for 3?

Cincinnati 24 TEMPLE 20 - These 2 last met in '03 and Cincy trailed 24-10 in the 4Q but won in 3OT's (-13', 30-24). After B2B losses the Cats were able to overcome a 24-21 3Q deficit to beat Syr LW 35-24 (-5). Three days after HC Jones said he'd never considering benching QB Legaux, he was benched (6 int's L/3 gms) after nearly throwing an int in the 3Q and bkp Key threw a 13 yd td pass to put them up for good. The one constant has been RB Winn who had a career day with 30 carries for 165 yds and 3 td's. After a 2-0 BE start, the Owls have lost 3 str SU/ATS by an avg of 42-15. LW vs L'ville the Owls ret'd the opening KO 93 yds for a td and even tied it at 17 in the 2Q before all'g the gm's final 28 pts. The Bearcats have the off (#42-105) and D edges (#51-96) but Temple is a scrappy HD going 10-3-1 ATS. TENNESSEE 37 Missouri 24 - First meeting. Missouri is in its 2nd of tough B2B AG's (Swamp LW) while Tenn is off a HG vs Troy with Vandy on deck. The Tigers jumped out to a 7-0 HT lead LW vs UF but couldn't hold on as QB Franklin threw 4 int's incl one on a Hail Mary in the EZ w:05 left. The Tigers did have a 23-11 FD edge but failed to score on 6 consec drives in UF territory. UT HC Dooley had to be sweating bullets LW when Troy led 48-41 late in the 4Q but the Vols scored two td's in the final 3:00 to pull out a 55-48 win (-18'). While UT did manage a schl rec'd 718 yds, they all'd a schl rec'd 721 yds as they avoided their 1st 5 gm losing streak s/'88. QB Bray did have 530 yds and 5 td's both career highs. Both tms still have bowl aspirations but the Volunteers' five losses have come vs tms with a comb 6 losses and if they win out, they would finish 7-5 and possibly save Dooley's job. We used the Volunteers twice as our GOY in '84 and '86 & LY went against them with Ark and won all three of them.

4★ Houston over CHICAGO - Sunday Night - The best record in the AFC travels to face the second best record in the NFC. The Bears have been very profitable when the line is between +3 and -3 as they are 12-3-1 ATS but the Texans are 5-0 ATS in that same role the L2Y. CHI has benefitted from playing the #30 schedule TY but you can call them a pretender as they've outgained those teams by only 6 ypg losing the yardage battle to 4 of them (+312 yds vs JAX). HOU's combo of top 10 units (#10 off, #10 def, 5th best TO margin) has outgained the #18 sked by 86 ypg losing the yardage battle only twice. LW in scoring 51 pts on the road the Bears became the first NFL team to ever score td's on a run, pass, int ret and a blocked kick ALL in 1Q! That final has been like many misleading CHI finals TY as Cutler is comp only 58%, has been sacked 14 times in the L/3 games and has thrown 8 int's in 8 games after only having 7 LY. Their offense will also have to adjust to the one man wrecking crew known as JJ Watt (#1 w/10.5 sks) who demands double teaming. The Texans meanwhile slept through their 1H after their bye but in the 2H held BUF to 3 pts, 6 FD's and 119 yards. It's not offen that you can get a playoff team with a better offense and defense vs a tougher sked as a dog and we'll jump on it.

3★ NY Giants over CINCINNATI - When you're 3-5 you may think you can compete with most teams. CIN however has played the #29 schedule but the wins have come via teams with a combined 6-21 record. The Giants meanwhile are at 6-3 and off a loss vs PIT sothey'll be hungry and out to prove a point. Under Coughlin, NY is now 18-8 ATS as an AF and already this season the Giants knocked off DAL, SF and CAR while covering their last 6 away. The Bengals need to run the ball to keep pressure off Dalton and with them avg only 3.9 ypc their expectations for Green-Ellis (62 ypg, 3.5) to shoulder the load has fallen way short. CIN did play hard LW vs DEN but blew a 4Q lead giving them 4 straight losses both SU & ATS. Different mind sets here as the Bengals have struggled down the stretch each of the L3Y going 7-19 SU and 7-16-3 ATS while a hard nosed, old school disciplinarian is the perfect HC to back to ensure there's no letdown prior to a bye.

2★ San Diego overTAMPA BAY - The Chargers saved Turner's job with a 31-13 win over KC LW. The cross county trip this week is negated by being off a Thursday Nighter but they need to stay focused as they are one game behind DEN which is where they travel next week. The Chargers snapped a 3 game losing streak but as important Rivers found his groove going 18-20 and he'll look to atone for his poor performance in the wind and rain the week prior (18-34 at CLE). The young Bucs squad have exceeded expectations under the "iron fist" of Greg Schiano and while a 4-4 record and B2B road upsets leads to excitement it also can make the players, fans and gamblers over value them (SD -3 over summer is now a dog). Tampa's offensive success comes when they can run the ball as they topped 100+ yds in their 4 wins and were kept under the century mark in their losses with SD's #4 rush D allowing only 3.7 ypc. The Chargers won't look past them and will start their normal second half season awakening (33-16-1 ATS games 9-16). The last time TB was a fav in the 2H of the season versus a .500 or better team was in 2008 when they coincidently laid 3' to this same SD team and lost 41-24.

CTHER GAMES

Indianapolis at JACKSONVILLE - IND has dropped 4 of the L5 SU/ATS as the Jags have long geared themselves towards stopping the historically top team in the division. The division home team may have won 7 straight on Thursdays but they are just 4-3 ATS. Can the Jags take advantage of the short week or will the younger but healthier Colts pull off their 2nd road win? This game as well as the top college game will both be part of our Thursday Marquee available after Noon EST gameday!

NEW ENGLAND 37 Buffalo 20 - Just a "slight" situational edge to NE off a bye with a home game vs IND on deck while BUF travels for a 2nd straight, off a loss vs a physical HOU squad with a winnable Thursday home game vs MIA on deck. In their first meeting this year the Bills were destroyed 52-28 as they blew a 21-7 lead after scoring on their 1st drive in the 2H. From there NE rocked 22-7 FD and 330-145 yd edges with 6 straight td drives. The Pats #1 ranked offense is on a record setting pace avg 29 FD/gm and in comparison the league leaders the L3Y have avg'd 26, 23 & 23 FD/gm. The new balanced attack (54/46% pass/run) led by the league's #4 rush off (150 ypg) has given Brady additional time with play action as evidenced by his 16-3 ratio. The Bills have been an equal opportunity defense allowing 337 ypg vs 4 teams whose avg off ranking is #28 while allowing 499 ypg vs the 4 best offenses they've faced. Give Belichick a throat to step on and he will. The Bills, in the meantime, after starting LY 5-2 and going 1-8 down the stretch could be in the same situation after starting 2-1 TY and currently on a 1-5 run into this game.

Denver 24 ČAROLINA 17 - Despite this being the Broncos 2nd straight EST game this is an "A Game" for them. John Fox takes on his former team which made him suffer thru a 2-14 lame duck season in 2010 where ownership purged talent across the board. Both teams have played to p7 schedules this year so when you see that CAR is +2 ypg you wouldn't expect a 2-6 record. You can call it a soph slump or not but Newton is throwing for only 57% with a 5-8 ratio compared to 60% with a 21-17 LY while also fumbling 4 times TY compared to 3 of all LY. That along with a rush attack that's avg 111 ypg (4.3 ypc) the L4W is the reason their previous 4 losses were by a combined 12 pts. While there's no question the Broncos #3 offense has benefited from TY's comeback player of the year Manning (300 ypg, 69%, 20-6) the D also has shown marked improvement (#20 LY vs #10 TY) with the offense #4 in the league extending drives (47% 3rd down conv #4). With a CAR secondary allowing 70% completions at home and an offense that is avg 30.5 ppg the L6W we'll back the visitor whose only losses this season were against 3 div leaders with a combined 19-4 record.

MIAMI 24 Tennessee 20 - The Dolphins had their 3 game win streak snapped at Indy and after being a dog in the first 7 games also fell to 0-1 as a fav. Miami was actually outgained by 139 ypg during that streak and after allowing St Louis to gain a season high they allowed 516 yds to Indy which is not only a season high but goes well back into the Manning years (week #13 2004)!! Now they return to South Beach as the hunted and despite a new HC it must be noted that Miami is 4-15 ATS as a HF. The Dolphins D is getting exposed as into LW they were ranked #22 on defense but #5 in scoring D as teams now have a solid grasp on their redzone D. Covering on the road takes a solid rush attack (CJ 133 ypg & 6.3 when 16-att's) with a veteran QB (Hasselback 64% TY) and while you may say they're 1-3 ATS as an AD they upset Buffalo and failed to cover against three top 11 D's at

SAN DIEGO ST 23 Air Force 20 - In LY's Thurs night gm AF (-7) came in with a banged up D missing its entire starting DL and SDSt wore them down. It was tied at 20 but SDSt exploded for 3 td's (incl one after a fmbl) to lead 41-20. The HT is 5-2 & SDSt has won B2B. SDSt is 7-2 SU/8-3 ATS in home finales. The key matchup edge is Rocky Long's D vs the option and his NM D held AF to an avg of 54 ypg below their season avg in his L8Y there and his D's here have covered 3 str vs AF with 2 outright upsets. SDSt is off arguably its biggest win in schl hist 21-19 (+15') at BSU as they have now won 5 str for the 1st time s/'95 and notched their 1st win ever over a ranked opp on the road (0-31 prior). They benefitted from 2 big ST's plays incl the opening KO td and a blk'd punt which set up a td drive. Bkp QB Dingwell continues to steady the ship w/Katz OFY. After winning B2B CIC Trophies, the Falcons come in off a 41-21 loss (-7') at rival Army dropping to 0-2 vs its academy rivals TY. TO's again were the issue as AF was -5 and RB Getz who DNP vs Nev (ankle) was held to 23 yds on 14 att. The Falcons are off a long trip to Army in B2B road gms with a Friday night game on deck while the Aztecs, after wins over Nev/Boise, are thinking MW Title.

SD, HOU and MIN. MIA's Tannehill is having a solid rookie season but one alarming note is that in their 3 close losses they've produced a total of 3 pts in those three 4Q's and 2 OT's. One team with nothing to lose versus the other off a disappointing loss in a brand new role.

Baltimore is off a bye and a win at Cleveland and Oakland is off a home loss traveling cross county. The reality is that the Ravens are still getting valued like yesteryears teams as they have the #26 D. LW they were outgained vs CLE and while they did score 3 td's in their other 10 drives they avg'd 3.2 plays each (2 total FD's). Cleveland meanwhile settled for 5 FG's incl 4 from inside the 16 yd line. The Ravens have now gotten outgained by 40 ypg despite playing the #23 schedule. The Raiders were off B2B upset wins but after leading 10-3 at HT they were without McFadden (ankle, 7-17) and the one dimensional offense struggled and the D was worn out giving up 515 yds. If he's heathy he now faces a D that has allowed 156 ypg rushing the L/4. The Raiders have been a solid road team and in their L/15 away they only been beaten by over 7 pts 4 times with the pair TY coming after traveling cross country off a MN game and at Denver off an OT home upset. Baltimore always ramps up vs division foes and their other 3 wins TY have been by a total of 6 points and if they're over a td fav they've dropped 5 straight in that role.

Atlanta 27 NEW ORLEANS 23 - The Falcons have this game circled as they have lost 7 of the L8 vs NO SU while failing to cover the L3. Both teams are off prime time games and while both teams have faced bottom 5 skeds, ATL is +12 ypg (#10) while NO is -87 ypg (#30) with the Falcons being +10 in TO's. Matt Ryan who has avg'd 275 ypg (60%) with a 6-1 ratio in his L4 vs NO gets to take on the #31 pass def allowing 306 ypg (67%) with a 15-3 ratio vs 11 sacks. ATL by comparison was only allowing 217 ypg (67%) with a 7-10 ratio prior to DAL and they have pulled in 3 sacks in 6 of 7 games TY. NO is likely to be without RB Sproles (brkn hand) again and there is now tape on how they adjusted the offense without him. It is noteworthy that ATL has only played 1 team with a winning record (DEN) but with Div home teams off a MNF game being 4-10 ATS and this being an excellent time for payback with series history we'll call for the road team here.

Detroit 28 MINNESOTA 27 - The Lions dropped to 3-11 ATS vs the Vikings with a 20-13 loss as a 4 pt HF. DET had the stat edge with 23-15 FD and 341-227 yd edges but they gave up a KR/PR for 14 pts as MIN ended an 11 game losing streak to NFC North foes (4-8 ATS). DET has outgained foes by 90 ypg so far TY (#21) thanks to the #2 and #7 units losing the yardage battle in only 1 game TY (SF). They did dominate as a 3★ LPS LW as they held JAX to 36 or less yds on each of their 1st 6 drives (3 FD 57 yds in 1H) but that was vs a team competing for the top pick in 2013. They now face a sterner test vs MIN thanks to RB Peterson who had 182 yds (10.7) vs the #5 defense on the road LW. Ponder has cooled off quite a bit in his L3 games avg 124 ypg (51%) with a 2-4 ratio as teams lockdown Harvin (8 rec, 90 ypg first 6/3rec, 41ypg L3) who left LW's game with an ankle injury. DET has the momentum having covered 4 straight with MIN failing to cover 4 straight and with NFC AD's being 29-9-1 ATS TY we'll call for the road team by 1 in a higher scoring affair.

The Jets #16 defense has struggled vs the run allowing 141 ypg (4.4) which is a good matchup for RB Lynch who has 98 ypg (4.8) with 5 100 yd games TY. The Jets aren't an explosive team with a single 100 yd rushing effort by Greene (vs IND) with a single 100 yd receiving effort (TE Kerley vs NE) TY. We'll call for the home team by 7 as Rex has an extra week to gamenlan for a rookie QB with a thin WB unit for now.

Dallas 24 PHILADELPHIA 23 - A pair of desperate NFC East teams who both went into their prime time games LW at 3-4 and the Giants loss keeps the winner in striking distance. While Philly is off a Monday Night trip to NO, Dallas is in a situation disadvantage being on the road for the 4th time in 5 weeks off a trip to Atlanta. The Cowboys look for revenge after getting swept LY as they were outscored by a combined 54-14 and outgained by 376 yds. This season both teams are TO plagued with DAL at -11 and Philly at -9 but the Cowboys have outgained their foes by 91 ypg while Philly has been outgained by 104 ypg the L3W. Vick is now playing under extreme pressure with fans calling for Foles to get a chance and after tossing 6 int's the first 2 games he has a 6-2 ratio since but has lost 5 fumbles and continues to not make the clutch throw. It continues to be profitable playing on an NFC East div AD as they are already 4-0 ATS TY and 19-6 the L4Y as the animosity among these division teams and the pressure of winning at home helps the visitor. No concerns with Romo on the road as he's produced a 7-3 ratio away compared to 2-10 at home!

SAN FRANCISCO 27 St Louis 9 - With both teams off byes we'll clearly favor a winning, experienced team that is not happy with a 6-2 record versus a team that's not used to winning and was 3-2 earlier this season but has now lost 3 straight. SF was held to under 100 yds rushing in both losses to Minnesota and the NY Giants which are teams with strong DL's that can get sacks with out blitzing. While St Louis' D ranks #12 in sacks 9 came against the sieve like Cardinals OL who has allowed 33 sks in their last 5 games. On the flip side the Rams have taken on 2 top 10 D's on the road and have totaled a combined 411 yds!! Don't need to worry about laying DD's at home with the 49ers as they're 4-0 ATS under Harbaugh winning by an avg of 29-5. SF has also been protective at home vs division foes especially on the defensive side of the ball going 3-0-1 ATS allowing 214 ypg. The league leading rush attack (5.6 ypc) will feast on a Rams D that has allowed 169 ypg and 5.6 ypc to the top 3 rush teams they've faced.

SMU 41 Southern Miss 17 - Last year Southern Miss had a great situational edge as they were off a bye, at home, in front of a sellout crowd at night and SMU was off a big win over UCF and had a bigger game vs Tulsa on deck. The Eagles (-3) dominated with a 28-14 FD edge in a 27-3 win. SMU is 0-3 SU/ATS (all 3 losses by 16+) with the avg loss by 20 ppg and the avg cover by 12 ppg. After having arguably the best ssn in school history LY, the Golden Eagles are now having their worst ssn ever TY at 0-9 SU and 2-7 ATS. LW they found yet another way to lose, this time blowing a 16-0 halftime lead in a 27-19 loss (-4) to UAB. SMU is off a loss themselves 42-17 (+9') at UCF and after leading CUSA in rush D heading into the gm, they allowed 241 yds and now find themselves at 4-5 and in desperate need of a win if they want to keep their faint bowl hopes alive. QB Gilbert has struggled avg just 238 ypg (53%) with a 12-13 ratio. Both tms have disappointed but the Ponies have shown much more promise and we think they get well here in a big way.

This is a Legends elimination game with the winner still having a shot provided Neb stumbles. UAB 47 Marshall 44 - MU dominated LY's gm winning 59-14 (-5) with a 429-310 yd edge. They led 38-0 at the half (284-81 yds). They extended it to 59-7 before UAB got a td with 3:12 left. UAB is 1-6 SU/2-5 ATS vs MU (3 str losses) and there have been 4 outright upsets in 7 meetings. LTH the gm was tied 17-17 w/12:54 4Q. MU went on 2 td drives and they got the upset (31-17, +10). LW UAB fell behind 16-0 at HT but rallied for a 27-19 win (+3') at SM. RB Reaves rushed for 169 of his 223 yds in the 2H and QB Brown recovered from a shaky 1H to go 17-29-228-1-1. MU is also off a win as they beat Mem 38-28 (-20). The Herd did lead 31-7 late in the 3Q before all'g 3 str td's which got Mem back in the gm. QB Cato is #2 in the NCAA avg 366 ypg (69%) with a 27-7 ratio. MU is 1-13 SU and 7-15-1 ATS in Nov AG's. UAB is 13-4-1 ATS in their 1st HG off a road trip HOUSTON 34 Tulsa 30 - HC. LY these 2 were playing for the CUSA West Title in Tulsa. UH was also trying to keep alive a possible BCS bowl bid. It was close at the half with TU having a 226-224 yd edge and UH only led 13-10 but by the end of the gm, Keenum had thrown 8 td's and UH finished with a 558-337 yd edge in a 48-16 road win (-3). The fav is 2-7 ATS and while there have been 4 outright upsets in the L7Y (with the spread btwn +4/-4). Both come in off losses as TU's 19-15 loss to Ark (-7') ended their 7 gm win streak. The Hurricane rallied from a 10-o 1Q deficit to take a 15-13 lead into 4Q but UA drove 76/4pl for a td (missed 2 pt) and 75/12pl but missed a FG while TU finished with 7 4Q yds. TU was also SOD at the UA5 and missed a 42 yd FG & 2 xps. QB Green (194 ypg, 53%, 10-6) has struggled but the ground gm remains strong led by Douglas (721, 7.7). UH (-3) lost 48-28 to EC as the Pirates led 28-0 in the 2Q and coasted from there with 31-16 FD and 550-369 yd edges. QB Piland (309, 58%, 16-10) and the Cougars off has struggled with TO's as their 27 lost is tied for the FBS's worst. Look for another upset in this series.

COLORADO ST 34 Univ 28 - LY CSU had a 480-361 yd edge. CSU blk'd a FG for a td and led 35-31 with 4:06 left but LV got a td with 1:20 left to retake the lead. CSU got down to the LV28 but was int'd at the 24. The HT is 4-0 SU in the series and CSU has won 4 in a row in Ft Collins by an avg of 39-14. LV is on its 5th AG in 7W but after coming into the yr 1-13 ATS on the road under Hauck, is 3-1 TY (non-cover by 1' pts). The Rebs (-3') beat NM 35-7 covering their 5th gm in a row and 7 of 8. LV had a 530-350 yd edge and after the Lobos cut it to 21-7 put the gm away with 75 and 58 yd td's to finish the scoring. QB Sherry (229, 56%, 14-12) has been inconsistent and the Rebs have struggled vs the run (223, 4.8), CSU (+7') lost the Border War to rival Wyo 45-31 as trailing 14-7 in the 1Q the Rams were 3&gl from the 9 when they were int'd and ret'd 99 yds for a td. The Pokes were up 45-17 in the 4Q and coasted. Smith hit 13-23-326-2-1 with the costly pick-six and was replaced by Grayson who 3-9-61-0-1. We went against LV on road with our GOY winner in 2001. Could we use the same formula here?

Boise St 38 HAWAII 10 - UH has dropped 3 str vs BSU being outscored by an avg of 41-8 and outgained 525-264. UH lost 42-7 (+22) in the WAC "Title gm" in '10. LTH ('09) BSU led 34-0 at HT & 44-2 into 4Q. Boise is 17-7 ATS as an AF but comes into this off of their shocking (-15') home upset by SDSt, 21-19. The Aztecs ret'd the opening KO 100 yd for a td and also blk'd a P which led to an 8 yd td drive. The Broncos scored a td with 5:35 left but the Aztecs were able to run out the clock. QB Southwick (205. 66%, 10-7) has struggled with an entirely new off which leans on RB Harper (794, 4.8). Nothing wrong with the BSU D which is #8 FBS allowing 14 ppg. UH fell to 1-7 losing by an avg of 33 ppg after their 45-10 loss at Fresno. The Warriors trailed 42-3 at the break and QB Schroeder (181, 52%, 9-9) was KO'd in the 2H as the bkp QB's played for the 1st time TY. This is a huge physical mismatch but the Broncos

must bounce back on the Islands as BSU is 1-4 ATS off of a SU loss (1-0 TY). **Ucla 34 WASH ST 17** - Two tms heading in opposite directions here as the Bruins scored their most pts in a contest s/97 with a 66-10 win over Arizona (led 42-3 at HT, outgained the Wildcats 611-257). The Cougs meanwhile were held without a point until the final play as Utah had a 453-255 yd edge holding WSU to -4 rush yds. From 2001-'07 WSU actually was 6-1 SU with 4 outright upsets but UCLA has now won 4 in a row (by 20 ppg) although WSU has still covered the L/2 incl LY when the Bruins needed a td and 2 pt conv w/3:26 left to pull out the 3 pt win. Tough spot for UCLA here however with the long trip to Pullman and a date with the rival Trojans in the Rose Bowl next week. While we expect the Bruins to pull out the win with huge edges on both off (#14-94) and def (#17-79), the Cougs could use the weather to their advantage.

Ucf 37 UTEP 17 - Stateside this is the 3rd longest trip in the FBS (distance) with 1,527 miles separating these two. LY UTEP was playing for a bowl while UCF had been eliminated the prev wk. UCF led 31-0 in the 4Q as they had a 303-94 yd 1H edge. UTEP got a pair of gbg 4Q td's to lose 31-14 (+10). UTEP is 4-8 ATS hosting CUSA East and 7-16 ATS in Nov HG's. They are fresh off a bye while UCF is on its 3rd AG in 4W. The Miners come in 2-7 with questions surrounding who will QB the rest of the season and whether HC Price will return. Before the bye UTEP trailed Houston 45-7 in the 3Q and Sullivan, subbing for ineffective st'r Lamaison, led 3 4Q td drives. The D is getting worn down and is allowing 193 rush ypg (5.0). The 7-2 Knights lead the East by virtue of their early ssn win over EC. LW they never trailed beating the Ponies 42-17 with a 396-259 yd edge (SMU had 122 yd & scored a 4Q td). The Knights are 9-2 SU/ATS vs the West and continue

ARIZONA 55 Colorado 17 - HC. LY we used CU (+10') at home as a Big Dog Play and they delivered yet another outright upset 48-29 with a 500-412 yd and 27-23 FD edges. CU led as much as 34-10 with 3:50 left 3Q in the 19 pt win and is now 13-1 SU vs the Cats but last traveled here in '85. CU is 2-19 SU in conf AG's. Both teams were stomped LW with the Buffs (+28) being shutout 48-0 at home (1st time s/86) while

Early 1Q SU ret'd a pick six 52 yd for a td and the rout was on as the Cardinal had 25-6 FD and 436-76 yd edges with the Buffs failing to get into SU terr until there was 9:36 left. CU is last in the P12 in most major off categories and have scored just 51 pts in their 5 gm losing streak where they've been outscored by an avg of 42 ppg! UCLA scored on 6 of their 7 1H poss to take a 42-3 HT lead and for the gm AZ was outFD'd 36-18 and outgained 611-257. P12 ttl offense leader QB Scott (316, 63%, 20-9, 369 rush) was held to his lowest output of the ssn (128 yd) after suffering a concussion the wk prior. At 5-4 the Cats need this one to secure their 1st bowl trip under Rich Rod and do so easily.

S CAROLINA 31 Arkansas 22 - HC. Ark is 5-1 SU/ATS in this series and won their last trip here 41-20 (+4') in '10 as we won our CTOT GOY on the Over. LY Ark (-5) dominated with a 253-45 yd edge at the half in their 44-28 win. Ark had a commanding 435-207 yd edge and settled for 5 FG's missing 2 or could have won by more. SC is fresh off a bye after their 38-35 win over Tenn but more importantly they lost RB Lattimore. Bkp Miles has played significantly in his career (1,000+ yds) and will try to fill the void. Ark is off a 19-15 (-9) over Tulsa as they scored a 4Q td down 15-13. The Hogs are 4-5 and will need 2 wins against the likes of SC/Miss St/LSU just to qualify for a bowl after starting the ssn in the Top 10. The Hogs certainly

the likes of SC/Miss St/LSO just to quality for a bown after starting the ssrift the top 10. The Hogs certainly have the talent to make at least one surprise TY and LY we won our GOY on Ark (-14') in an easy 49-7 win over Tennessee. Will we go back to the Hogs for a 2nd year in a row?

Louisiana Tech 44 TEXAS ST 27 - 1st meeting. Franchione beat LT 45-14 in '06 (HC at Texas A&M). TSU is 9-6 SU in Nov/Dec reg ssn home gms. LT is 8-0 SU on the WAC road (6-2 ATS). #19 La Tech comes in 8-1 with their only loss being by 2 pts to #15 A&M. The Bulldogs are off a 51-27 win (-30') over UTSA but they did just lead 27-21 mid 3Q. QB Cameron incredibly has yet to throw an int TY with a 24-0 ratio (#4 pass eff) and is avg 327 ypg (71%). Texas St is now playing its 3rd str gm vs the top tms in the WAC and LW lost 38-7 (+26) to Utah St getting outFD'd 24-9 and outgained 593-158 and it could have been worse if not for 3 USt TO's. While LT should cruise in this one it does concern us that the Bulldogs have the WAC Champ gm on deck vs USt followed by another tough gm vs SJSt.

Tulane 31 MEMPHIS 28 - LY TU fired coach Toledo during the wk and we used Memphis (+12') as a Big

Dog POW and they delivered ANOTHER outright upset winner (33-17!). Ryan Griffin was? but hit 31-50-377 for TU and TU did finish with a 459-289 yd edge. UM has won 6 SU/ATS by 24 ppg. LTH ('08) TU trailed 31-0 in the 3Q being outFD'd 32-10 (-266 yds). LW we used Tulane as a 3★ LPS and they delivered in a 49-47 loss (+5') to Rice. The Green Wave did fall behind 35-14 but rallied to take a 38-35 lead. After falling behind 49-41 TU got a td w/:56 left but the 2pt conv failed. They have now covered 4 str gms s/Griffin came back into the line-up and in those gms he's avg 394 ypg (65%) with a 14-3 ratio. Mem is off a 38-28 loss (+20) to Marsh LW as they fell behind 31-7 in the 4Q before cutting the lead to 3 in the 4Q. The Tigers did get one CUSA win here earlier TY vs Rice 14-10 (+5) but we're going to continue to ride the Wave here.

STANFORD 21 Oregon St 20 - The Cardinal went into Boulder LW and ripped apart Colo 48-0 holding CU

to just 76 ttl yds for the gm (6 FD's). The Cardinal do however appear to have a QB controversy on hand with Hógan (200+ ttl yds, 2 td) taking over for an ineffective Nunes early and having vast success. The Beavers found themselves down 14-3 early before coming alive and knocking off the Sun Devils by 10 (outgained ASU 424-303) as Vaz retook the starting QB job from Mannion for another wk. OSU was fav'd 8 str times in this series from '00-'08 and was 6-2 SU/ATS in that span. The L2Y Stan has dominated with a 38-0 win at home in '10 (-13') and LY were -20' and despite Stan being in a huge flat spot they still managed to cover 38-13 including a 300-33 rush edge. Situational edge goes to OSU as while Stan is 6-1 ATS in home finales, they again have a meeting on deck with the Ducks while the Beavers host an inj-plagued Cal squad and can put all their eggs into one basket as the winner here as a legit chance at the Rose Bowl.

LSU 27 Miss St 17 - MSU upset LSU in '99. Since then LSU is 12-0 SU and 9-3 ATS but those 3 MSU covers have come in the L6Y, LSU has won the L/12 by 27 ppg but the L/4 by just 12 ppg. LY was on a Thurs night and MSU came in with a banged up OL and QB Relf was not 100% after rushing 27x's the prev wk. LSU led just 6-3 at the half (177-117 yd) and won 19-6. LSU did have a 361-193 yd edge. LY Miss St caught Bama off its titanic battle with LSU and +17 covered by a half pt and now they catch LSU off that game. However, this is the 3rd str Top 20 opp for the Bulldogs who have been destroyed in each of the 1st two by an avg of 38-10 and LW were outgained 693-310 with their D missing countless tkls in the open field in a 38-13 loss to A&M (+7). The Tigers are off a very disappointing loss to #1 Bama 21-17 (+8') as they led 17-14 before all'g a 72/5pl td drive w/:51 left. Les Miles certainly lived up to his "Mad Hatter" reputation as not one of his gambles paid off LW incl 3 failed FG att's. We did cash a 3★ LPS on the Tigers as QB Mettenberger had a career day going 24-35-298-1-0. Back in 1992 we won a 5★ GOY on #16 MSU (+11)

NEVADA 35 Fresno St 34 - NV has now won 4 in a row SU in this series but FSU has covered the L/2. LY NV led 45-31 (-11') at home but FSU got a 2 yd td pass for the backdoor cover with 1:08 left. The Bulldogs are off a 45-10 (-33') win over Hawaii as QB Carr threw for 4 td's (tied w/Barkley #2 NCAA w/30 TY) and RB Rouse became the schl's all-time leading rusher. In their L/gm the Wolfpack were embarrassed 48-31 (-3") as they all'd 600 yds to AF and the Pack are now just 2-7 ATS on the ssn and have lost B2B MW gms. QB Fajardo is #9 in ttl off avg 329 ypg and RB Jefferson continues to lead the NCAA w/1,341 yds (5.0) but the D is all'g 432 ypg & 32 ppg. NV has a large sked edge as they are fresh off a bye which also heightens

their altitude edge and Fresno plays for the 11th str wk (6th road in 10 wks).

WKU 30 Florida Atlantic 17 - LY Schnellenberger called this gm the most important in schl hist as it was the 1st in their home stadium but WKU dampened the festivities with a 20-0 shutout. Despite the near sellout crowd, FAU did not cross midfield until 2:00 were left. This is the 1st time WKU has been favored in the series. It's kind of ironic that after 15 str covers dating back to LY, WKU limps in losing 2 out of their L/3 SU/ATS while it is FAU that comes in with 7 str covers incl LW's 24-17 loss (+16') to Navy. The Owls were fortunate that Navy QB Reynolds missed a play and took adv of TO machine bkp Miller to cut the lead to 7 late. Both tms played #1 Bama and while both lost by 5 td's, FAU was outgained by 393 yds while WKU was outgained by just 104. WKU has all of the talent edges and we expect a bounce back performance here as

they need more wins if they don't want to be left out of the bowl picture for the 2nd yr in a row.

TROY 38 Navy 37 - LY Navy won its 9th str game on Sr day. The Mids had their biggest HT lead s/06, 35-0 with a commanding 405-99 yd edge en route to a 42-14 (-6') home win. It was the 1st ever meeting. Troy is off Tenn and has two big SBC games on deck. LW the Trojans amazingly put up 721 yds (most ever all'd by a UT D) in a 55-48 (+18') loss. QB Robinson was 30-46-393-1-0 while bkp Anthony went 8-12-103-2-0. The D did allow 718 yds and gave up 2 td's in the final 3:00 after taking a 48-41 lead. After starting the ssn 1-3, Navy has now won 5 str and LW clinched its 9th bowl gm in 10 yrs (Kraft Fight Hunger) with a 24-17 (-16') win over FAU. Their turnaround has been sparked by frosh QB Reynolds who has an exceptional 8-1 ratio in his 4 sts and showed his value again LW as he left with an apparent arm inj for just one play only to have bkp Miller fmbl to set up a FAU td. Both tms do not practice against these contrasting styles of offense and it wouldn't surprise us if this one came down to the wire in a high-scoring affair.

NTEXAS 30 South Alabama 23 - 1st meeting. NT ended Fouts Field play 0-6 in home finales but the L2Y is 6-4 at Apogee Stad incl LY's home finale win. LW NT was playing w/o all-everything WR/RM Chancellor (OFY, avg 100+ ypg) and lost 37-19 at home to Ark St (+4). QB Thompson did throw for 316 yds and inj'd his knee but should ret here. NT did have a 23-22 FD edge. LW we won a 4★ LPS against USA as they lost 28-20 (+3'). The fell behind 28-7 at HT and their 2H rally fell short (did outgain FIU 458-354). QB Metheny was just

19-37-270-0-2. NT has all of the talent edges and has played a much tougher sked (#66-113). FLORIDA 45 Louisiana 7 - HC. Last met in '06 and UF has won all 4 meetings by 43 ppg. UF is off SC. UGA and Mizz but only has Jax St on deck. They are 5-1 ATS in these Nov non-SEC/non-Fla St HG's with the avg win by 59-14 but Muschamp did not cover in his only such game LY vs Furman (trail at half). The Gators did clinch a least a share of the SEC East Title LW with a 14-7 (-17') win over Mizzou. UF sleep walked thru the 1H down 7-0 prob as a result of the devastating loss the prior wk to rival UGA but was able to outscore the Tigers 14-0 in the 2H and int'd MO QB Franklin 4x's. They now finish the ssn w/3 str non-conf opp's. UL just played its rival ULM LW and they pulled another outright upset for the Big Dogs (+9') with a 40-24 win as QB Broadway threw 4 td's and they outgained the Warhawks 607-407. This is an SBC sandwich for them but it should be noted they are 14-2 ATS as an AD. Naturally UF has all the talent edges and can name a score here as they try to finish off what Muschamp wanted prior to the season in reclaiming The Swamp's home field edge.
