NEWS AND NOTES WEEK ONE

NEWS AND NOTES - Texas St was +14,300 on the ML vs Houston meaning 143-1 odds of winning the football game. UH had a new HC and TSU dominated and there is nothing fluky about it as they led 14-3 and 27-10 at the half in their 30-13 win. They finished with a 443-326 yd edge.

FRONTDOOR COVERS - Texas Tech dominated NWSU with a 37-6 FD and 500-84 yd edges yet they were laying 37' and only led 27-6 in the 4Q. They needed a td with 2:17 left to get ahead of the spread, 44-6. Bkp QB Michael Brewer hit 10-13-122 and guided TT to 17 points in the 4Q...it was a tough beat if you had the Under 51' in the Minn/UNLV game. The game was tied 13-13 with LV getting a FG with 2:30 left to send the game to OT. In the 3OT's, the two (which had comb for 26 pts in regulation) comb for 31 pts in the OT's to put the game Over the Total at 30-27!

NO FRONTDOOR COVERS - There were a couple games this past weekend where one team had a chance to cover in the final minutes and didn't get it done deep in the other team's territory. Utah was -42 and had a FD at the NColo 17 but gained 7 yds on their final 3 runs getting down to the 10 and only won by 41. Utah did have a 414-114 yd edge in their shutout win and a missed 27 yd FG on the final play of the half was another key play...Michigan St dominated Boise St with a 25-14 FD and 461-206 yd edge. Generally, when a team has that kind of yardage edge, it amounts to a 3 td+win. Unfortunately, for MSU they gave up a 43 yd IR TD and missed 2 FG's during the game. At the end, MSU had a FD at the BS14, a FG would have given them a push, a RB running into the EZ for a td would have given them a win, but the worst case scenario happened as they got a FD at the 4

and then just took a knee, only winning the game by 4, laying 6'...USC led Hawaii 35-0 in the 2Q and led 49-10 (-42). They had a FD at the UH24 but were stopped 2 yds short of a FD at the 16 with 2:11 left and would only win by 39. Coach Kiffin had a little something to do with that as well as usual, he opted to go for a 2 pt conv three times, failing on each and those missed 3 pts cost a push.

MISLEADING FINALS - Temple appears to have blown out Villanova last week 41-10 but VU actually had a 365-362 yd edge and 18-15 FD edge. VU went on an 85/12pl drive and settled for a 21 yd FG, gave up a 58 yd IR td, another fmb set up a 24 yd td, they were SOD at the TU29 and ended the game inside the Temple 5.

LATE 1H SCORES = BIG 2H's - Brent Hundley's first touch as a UCLA QB was a 72 yd td run as UCLA piled up 651 yards vs Rice in the opener. RB Jonathan Franklin became the first player in LA history to have a least 2 rushes with 72 yards in a game with 74 and 78 yard td runs. UCLA did only lead 29-24 when they got a FR TD with :17 left in the half to go up 25-24.

4★ North Carolina over WAKE FOREST - LY NC was just '6' at home vs WF but had a season high 562 yds and their most pts in a game in 7 yrs in a 49-24 win. LTH ('07) NC lost 37-10 (+5) but had a 313-269 yd edge. WF scored 27 pts on 55 yds of offense (NC all'd 98 & 83 yd KR's and 3 TO's incl a 77 yd IR td). Technical edges to WF as NC is 2-7 SU in their 1st gm away from Chapel Hill and the HT is 4-2 SU/ATS in the series. WF has just 11 ret'g str's but is 14-6 as a HD while NC has 13 ret'g str's and a new HC and is just 4-7 as an AF. LW both tms played FCS foes but had far different results. NC (-32) rolled up 524 yds in HC Fedora's debut and came 3 pts shy of a schl rec'd in their 62-0 win over Elon (1st shutout s/99). WF, meanwhile, overcame a 14-7 3Q deficit to squeak by Liberty, 20-17 (-25). The offense struggled early (no FD's 1st 3 poss) with only 42 yds midway thru the 2Q and were outgained 363-293 for the game. UNC's All-ACC RB Bernard did inj his knee LW after racking up 203 all-purp yds and 3 td's in the 1H, but is ready to go. NC had a 562-331 yd edge and it was 49-17 before WF got a 65 yd td drive with 2:23 left and with Fedora now at the helm the talent gap is slanted even more toward the Heels.

FORECAST: North Carolina 34 WAKE FOREST 14

3★ NORTHWESTERN over Vanderbilt - NU is 1-1-1 vs VU w/the only recent meeting in '10. NU (-3 AF) never trailed but needed a stopped 2pt w/2:25 left. NU won by 2 but was outgained 432-365. NU has won 5 str home openers by 27 ppg but are 6-9 ATS in openers (11-6 SU). VU's last trip to Evanston was in '52, a 20-20 tie. The Commodores are 4-14 in road openers (2-2 L4Y, 5-2-1 ATS run). Incl 4-0 SU/ATS LY, VU is 17-10 SU and 14-10 ATS (3 NL gms) vs non-SEC tms (not incl bowls). The Cats (-1) almost blew a 35-13 3Q lead but after an Orange penalty bkp QB Siemian hit the GW td pass with :44 left in a wild 42-41 shootout giving us a **3★ CTOT** winner on the Over. QB Colter (shldr) left the gm but is expected to return here. We won a Thurs Night Marquee on Vandy as they kept SC within the number (+6) in a 17-13 loss. The Gamecocks had a 205-62 yd rush edge outgaining the Commodores 115-17 in the 4Q as SC took the lead for good with 11:25 left. NU has BC on deck while VU has an FCS school. While the teams are very even in our rankings, the situation clearly favors NU as Vandy played a gut-wrenching SEC opener on national TV, making this almost a double letdown spot.

FORECAST: NORTHWESTERN 34 Vanderbilt 28

3★ BOWLING GREEN over Idaho - LY was the season opener for both teams and ID opened with a 78/6pl drive for a td at home in the Kibbie Dome. BG was SOD at the ID39 then took over. At the half BG had a 377-179 yd edge and got the road upset 32-15 (+5). ID had won the '09 bowl 43-42 (E) after trailing w/:32 left. ID is 1-11 SU in road openers (7-5 ATS) with their avg loss by 29 ppg. BG is one of the most improved tms in the country with 17 ret'g str's and this is their only HG in the 1st 4W catching ID on a long trip. BG was impressive LW in their opener only losing 27-14 (+28) at The Swamp as we cashed a **3★ CTOT** on the Under. The Falcons managed 327 ttl yds vs 1 of the best D's in the country as QB Schilz (took multiple shots) hung in the pocket to throw for 204 (49%). ID has just 10 ret'g str's and it showed LW as they were dominated by E Wash 20-3 (-5) being outgained 412-237. They were playing w/o talented Wash trans QB Blackman who was susp'd LW but should play here. ID did cover at bowl bound UVA, WM and NI their last 3 trips east of the Mississippi with 2 outright upsets and an OT loss! The Vandals have only 10 ret str's and while some teams are motivated off an FCS loss, we feel this will be tough for them to handle especially when making a long cross country trip, knowing they also have LSU on deck.

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ MISS ST 27 Auburn 17 - Aub is now 10-1 SU and 8-2 ATS in this series. The Tigers had not been a dog in this series s/'00 but were a +6 HD LY and we used the defending Nat'l Champs as a **3★ LPS** and a **3★ Key Selection** in PS. The crowd was loud and enthused throughout and Aub delivered the 41-34 win at home stopping MSU at the footline at the end of the game. In the 8 yrs prior to LY Aub avg'd +187 ypg but was outgained 531-381 in '11. Aub did lead 41-27 with MSU getting 150 yds on their L/2 drives. MSU is 0-12 SU/1-11 ATS in their SEC opener but 6-10 SU/11-5 ATS in SEC HG's. The Tigers have won 5 str trips to Starkville (last loss in '00) but the last 2 by a ttl of 4 pts. LTH AU led 17-7 at HT but was shutout in the 2H being held to 118 yds (3 P's & blk'd FG). AU is 15-4 ATS in their SEC opener. The fav is 14-6 ATS in this series. Situation clearly favors the Bulldogs off an FCS foe (beat Jackson St 56-9, +3 TO's, 2 def td's) while AU is off a big gm loss to Clem as they blew a 19-16 4Q lead. QB Frazier had 194 pass yds but comp just 41% of his passes and Aub was outgained 528-374. Frazier will be making his 1st SEC road start (LW neutral site) and the Cowbells will be loud as the Bulldogs pick up Mullen's 1st win over a SEC West foe not named Ole Miss.

FORECAST: MISS ST 27 Auburn 17

2★ TULSA 49 Tulane 14 - LY Tulsa was -12 on the road and got a 73 yd td drive with 2:16 left in the 2Q to lead 10-3 at the half. In the 2H the Hurricane got 82/9pl, 77/3 and 67/3pl td drives while Tulane missed a 44 yd FG and fmb'l'd at the Tulsa23. Coach Toledo said "Their DE's were very physical and had their way with us." Tulsa had a 412-235 yd edge in a 31-3 win and they are now 7-0 SU/ATS in CUSA play vs Tulane! Tulane is 8-2 ATS in road openers (5 str covers) while Tulsa is 7-4 SU/3-4-1 ATS in home openers. Tulsa (-2) jumped out to a 16-7 1Q lead at Iowa St but couldn't maintain the momentum in new QB Green's starting debut in a 38-23 loss in which they were outgained 441-358 and outFD'd 28-16. Green hit 23-49 for 198 yd but threw 2 int incl the final dagger which was ret'd 50 yds to set up a td. Tulane (+20) hung tough in HC Johnson's debut vs Rutgers trailing just 10-6 in the 4Q before an IR td and a 42 yd td pass made it a 24-12 final for the Wave's 11th str loss. QB Griffin hit 34-48 for 254 yd but the Wave ran for just 8 yds. The Green Wave has been outscored 146-34 in 3 trips to Tulsa. We have used two **3★ LPS** and a **4★ LPS** on Tulsa in their L/3 at home vs Tulane (even won with a **4★** on the road). Tulsa only has Nicholls St on deck so we will continue to ride this streak and back Tulsa AGAIN!

FORECAST: TULSA 49 Tulane 14

2★ VIRGINIA over Penn St - PSU is 5-2 SU vs UVA but the visitor has dropped the 2 recent gms ATS ('01 & '02). Lions lost LTH in '01, 20-14. PSU is 1-6 s/'00 vs non-conf/BCS tms on the road while UVA is 4-1 s/'04 in non-conf HG's vs BCS (loss vs #3 USC in '08). PSU is in rebuilding mode TY with just 6 ret'g str's and a new HC for the 1st time in 45 yrs (new schemes) while UVA is in London's 3rd yr with 12 ret'g str's and an exp'd QB. LW PSU let a 14-3 HT lead slip away (tipped td pass in 3Q for OU changed momentum) as they dropped an emotional HG to Ohio 24-14 (-6). HC O'Brien's new-look offense moved the ball well early but the disturbing stat was the PSU front 7, thought to be the strength of the tm, getting worn out by the fast-paced OU off all'g 499 ttl yds. LB Hodges, CB Morris and #1 RB Belton all left with inj's/cramps in the humid weather. LW UVA raced out to a 16-0 1Q lead (149-7 yd) en route to an easy 43-19 (-24) win over Richmond as London beat his former schl. QB Rocco threw for 311 and will look to take advantage of a PSU secondary that has to replace all 4 str's. PSU still rates the edge on D (#32-62) and ST's (#54 -110) but clearly the probation-stricken Lions are a shell of their former selves while the Cavs will look to take some momentum into a key conf gm next week.

Pittsburgh at CINCINNATI - Pitt won the series 1st 7 but has lost 3 of 4 (3 losses by 11 ttl pts). LTH Pitt led 14-0 (never trailed) pulling the 2H shutout in the snow holding UC to 75 yds (3.3 ypp) & 5 FD's giving us an easy Top Weekly LPS winner on Pitt (+11) 28-10 (don't you love dogs that win by almost 3 td's?). Pitt is just 5-13 SU in road openers and has a new HC but does have 14 ret'g str's while Cincy has 11. LY we had a **4★ LPS** on Pitt +3' and it was a tough SU loss for them at home as they led 23-13 in the 3Q but missed a 50 yd FG on the final play which would have sent it to OT (lost 26-23 but

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covered). The Chryst era got off to a rough start LW as Pitt (minus 6 susp'd ply'rs incl RB Shell) lost to Youngstown St, 31-17 (-18) as Pitt never led. Pitt does have the edge of a GUB as this is UC's season opener and the Bearcats have a relatively inexp'd QB in Legaux. **LW's Thursday Night Marquee was a winner on Vandy (+6)! Get Thursday's Winner after 3:00 pm ET (see above).**

Friday, September 7th

Utah at UTAH ST - 110th meeting. The Utes are 12-0 SU (avg by 24 ppg) and 8-4 ATS vs the Aggies. Utah went a perfect 3-0 ATS LY and is 30-13 ATS in non-conf away gms (incl bowl). After playing every ssn from 1944-'09 this series took a hiatus the L2Y. Utah St HC Andersen used to be the OC at Utah. USU has 12 ret'g str's while the Utes have 16 but Utah does have rival BYU on deck. LW Utah (-43) cruised over N Colorado 41-0 as QB Wynn took some time to regain his form after missing the final 9 gms LY (shldr). USU QB Keeton continued his efficient ways from LY throwing for 304 yds (85%) as USU rolled up 581 ttl yds in their 34-3 win over S Utah (-21). The Aggies upset in-state rival BYU (+4) 31-16 on a weeknight gm in '10 but Utah does have huge talent edges (off #56-69, def #20-93 and ST's #25-92). **Get another Friday Night Marquee winner on your Northcoast Debit Card for just \$9 after 3:00 pm ET!**

Saturday, September 9th

Indiana 31 UMass 17 - 1st meeting. IU is 4-7-1 ATS in road openers. UMass has won 10 str home openers by 24 ppg and this will be their first HG (in Gillette Stadium 90 miles from campus) as an FBS schl but naturally a gm vs a BCS tm is a different animal. Hoosiers are 6-2 SU in road openers but lost LY vs instate Ball St (-5 27-20). IU is 35-7-2 SU vs the MAC. IU is much improved with 15 ret'g str's TY while UMass has a 1st yr HC and is making the big step up in competition. It showed LW as they managed just 3 FD's and 59 yds on Thurs night vs Conn while new QB RfR Wegzyn struggled (LY's str' Pagel out indef). On the other side, Indy HC Wilson spent the offseason grooming QB Roberson to become a more traditional QB rather than a run-first guy and it worked LW as he threw for a career-high 280 yds in the 24-17 win over Indiana St (-14). UMass will have IU's attention after the MAC loss LY and while UMass will treat this as their Super Bowl, Indy has the talent edges all around and will want to double LY's win-total!

MICHIGAN 41 Air Force 24 - Only meeting in 1964. Huge situational edge to AF as UM is off the Bama showdown having to face the option while AF is off an FCS tm with a bye on deck. UM is 15-3 SU but 6-10 ATS in home openers. Hoke has exp vs AF however as SDSt HC ('09-'10) going 1-1 SU/2-0 ATS. UM is 11-0 (8-2 ATS) L3Y at home vs non-conf (avg win 40-17). AF is 4-5 in 'true' AG's vs BCS and is 13-3 SU (14-2 ATS!) in road openers (3-3 SU vs BCS w/3 losses by 4 ppg). UM has 13 ret'g str's in Hoke's 2nd yr while AF is among the least exp'd tm in the country with just 6 str's back. UM was overwhelmed LW by defending nat'l champ Bama 41-14 (+13) as the Tide controlled the LOS outrushing the Wolves 232-69 (5.5-2.8). QB Robinson who was banged up twice (did not miss a snap) did throw for 200 yds (42%) but 115 of those came on 2pl and he was limited to just 27 rush yd (2.7). RB Toussaint (1041 LY) will ret TW after being susp'd LW. We did cash a **3★ Small Coll LPS** against AF LW as they failed to cover in their 49-21 win over Idaho St (-31). AF rolled up 626 yds incl 484 rush (8.3). Calhoun is 8-4 ATS as an AD but did get pummeled at a similar ND LY (59-33, +14). They did only lose to Okla 27-24 (+16) in '10. Clearly UM has much better personnel, but after LW's confidence-shaking performance, you have to question the mind set of UM here vs an academy team that is trained every day to be mentally tough.

OHIO 38 New Mexico St 21 - LY was the season opener for both teams (only series meeting) and OU went on the road (-6) and dominated with a 241-6 rush edge. OU led 44-10 with 3:33 left 3Q and NMSt would get a 97 yd KR and 54 yd pass for scores to only lose by 20. Under Solich, Ohio is 9-2 SU (6-3 ATS) hosting non-conf opp's (losses in '09 vs UC & in '07 vs WY). NMSt is making a rare trip east of the Mississippi (1st s/'09, 45-0 loss to OSU, +44). LW we easily cashed our **4★ Top Weekly Small Coll LPS** as an NMSt (-3) as they beat Sac St 49-19. QB Manley threw for 367 and the Aggies were +3 in TO's. The Bobcats fell behind 14-3 at HT vs PSU LW but a key tipped 43 yd td pass in the 3Q changed momentum and OU would score 21 unanswered in their 24-14 upset (+6). QB Tetteleton carved up an inexp'd PSU secondary with 324 yds (76%) as OU rolled up 499 yds. OU does have large edges everywhere (off #64-110, D #71-116, ST #57-113) but Walker is 11-8-1 ATS as an AD upsetting Minny LY (+20) and LW was just 1-4 as a HF. While this is OU's home opener, you have to believe there will be a lot of back-slapping after LW's impressive win and we'll grab the dog here with some extra line value.

KENTUCKY 24 Kent St 20 - The Wildcats are 6-0 SU (avg win by 30 ppg) and 2-0-1 ATS all-time vs the Golden Flashes (all gms after '84). In the L/meeting ('07) UK won 56-20 (-13) with only a 484-453 yd edge (-2 FD) but had a +4 TO advantage. UK is 7-1 SU (6 str wins by 27 ppg) and 4-2 ATS (2 NL gms) in home openers. Kent is 3-1-1 SU (6-10 ATS/L16) in road openers. Kent is 2-8 ATS as an AD while UK is 5-2 ATS as a HF. KSU's last win vs a BCS school was in '07 (Iowa St), going 0-11 SU (3-8 ATS) since (avg score 37-10). Kent St did beat a Top 10 FCS team in Towson 41-21 LW (-7) but were outgained 316-267 and benefitted from +6 TO's and a 98 yd KR td. UK played their opener vs Lville on Sunday, so the results are unknown as of presstime. These tms are very close talent-wise with KSU actually having the D edge (#51-87). KSU also has the huge situational edge here with UK off a rivalry revenge gm (played on Sun) with 1 less day of prep while KSU has a bye on deck and has two extra days prep (played on Thurs) and we'll take the dog and the pts here.

OHIO ST 34 Ucf 17 - 1st meeting. Both tms are much improved TY but neither is bowl elig. UCF is 1-22 SU (beat #13 UH in '09) and 10-13 ATS vs ranked opp's. O'Leary and Meyer squared off in '06 (only time as HC's) when UCF lost 42-0 (+23) at #7 Fla. The Knights are 4-7-1 SU in non-conf AG's but easily won last Thurs over FBS bottom-dweller Akron 56-14 (-24) as a **3★ Winner** on these pages. UCF jumped out to a 35-0 HT lead and never looked back as QB Bortles completed 81%. The Urban Meyer era started off in grand fashion as we cashed our NC Sportsline Comp Coll POW on the Bucks as they destroyed Miami, OH, 56-10 (-25). After being outgained 172-48 and trailing 3-0 in the 1Q, the Bucks exploded for 490 yds in the final 3Q's led by QB Miller who threw for 207 yds (58%) and added an OSU QB-record 161 rush yd (9.5). Meyer is now 32-6 ATS vs non-conf foes incl bowls. In bowl seasons, UCF is 9-3 ATS as an AD and OSU has BCS Cal on deck. This is the 2nd str week in OH for UCF while OSU is in the middle of a 4 gm home stand. These teams are not far apart talent-wise with OSU having the slight edge on off (#29-38) and D (#8-27) but Meyer is well aware of the job O'Leary has done (UCF campus just 111 miles from Meyer's old stomping grounds) and the Bucks will not take them lightly here.

CLEMSON 49 Ball St 21 - CU is 2-0 vs Ball St. The L/meeting (also LTH) was in '02 and the Tigers won 30-7 (-27). CU has won 8 str home openers by 20 ppg (5-3 ATS) while BSU has dropped 15 str road openers vs BCS schools by 24 ppg but are 9-6 ATS in those. BSU is 21-7 ATS as an AD but CU was 5-2 as a HF LY avg 40 ppg at home. While CU is off Aub, they only have Furman on deck. Playing w/o star WR Watkins (susp'd 1st 2) the Tigers overcame a 19-16 4Q deficit to beat Aub for the 2nd str yr, 26-19 (-3) LW. CU QB Boyd had 266 ttl yds, RB Ellington ran for 231 (8.9) and WR Hopkins set a school rec'd with 13 rec (9.2) as the Tiger off didn't miss a beat rolling up 528 yds. Last Thurs BSU (-3) turned a deadlocked 13-13 HT gm into a 37-13 lead early in the 4Q grabbing a key MAC win over EM, 37-26. The Cards rolled up 36 FD's and 596 ttl yds incl the most rush yd s/'09 but HC Lembo has faced 2 BCS tms and lost by a comb 99-13 and this is sandwiched by a pair of winnable gms so this may turn into a paycheck gm for BSU.

KANSAS 38 Rice 24 - Only meeting in 1961 Bluebonnet Bowl (KU 33-7). Owls have lost 23 str true road gms vs BCS tms by an avg 27 ppg (last win at NW in '97). Rice is just 4-16 SU (9-11 ATS) in "true" road openers. KU is 25-1 SU in HG's vs non-conf. LW the Weis era got off to a winning start as KU beat S Dakota St 31-17 (-22). ND trans Crist did complete just 47% for 169 yds but RB Pierson, filling in for a susp'd Sims (KU's leading rusher LY, out 1st 3), ran for 124 (6.2). The KU D which was dead last in the NCAA LY (513 ypg) did allow 411 but only gave up 7 pts thru 3Q's (44 ppg LY). Rice's D was not much better LY (462 ypg, 33 ppg) and LW were bulldozed for 646 yds and 49 pts vs a UCLA tm that was starting a frosh QB. The score was only 29-24 late 2Q before UCLA scored 20 unanswered. QB McHargue had an impressive day throwing for 172 (61%) and added 95 rush (4.3). Weis is just 8-19 as a HF but the spread won't be inflated at KU like it was at ND. Rice is 5-13 ATS as an AD and has just 10 ret'g str's TY. Weis has preached all offseason about the importance of starting 2-0 before they welcome in B12 newcomer TCU next week and the Jayhawks take care of business here.

WYOMING 34 Toledo 27 - UT lost 20-15 (-4) in the only prior meeting ('10). UT trailed 20-0 late 3Q (UT gain 48% of yds after that) but then cut the deficit to 5 w/6:59 left but were SOD their L/2 drives (at W26 & T49) in the Glass Bowl. LW the Rockets suffered a tough 24-17 OT loss to Ariz (+10) but did catch a few breaks as Ariz missed 2 short FG's and had 2 td's called back by penalty. The two tms comb to run 182pl and the much-maligned UT D did allow 624 yds. The usually efficient QB duo of Dantini/Owens (68.5% LY) combined for just 197 yds (45%). WY shockingly jumped out to a 9-7 lead early vs TX LW but were outscored 30-8 the rest of the way in a 37-17 loss (+31). QB Smith did throw for 276 yds (57%) vs one of the best secondaries in the country but did throw 2 int's. WY was embarrassed by a MAC tm in the bowl LY and outgained at BG in the reg season (514-396) so they will not take UT lightly. UT has a huge game vs rival BG on deck while WY has an FCS foe. WY has the altitude edge here and UT flew to Ariz LW, ret'd late and now has to travel west again with a 1st yr HC and just 8 ret'g str's so look for the Pokes to go 2-0 vs UT.

Georgia 27 MISSOURI 26 - Last met in '59 Orange Bowl. The Bulldogs are 9-2 SU/ATS in true road openers but UGA is 6-9-1 ATS in "true" SEC road gms. LW MO raced out to a 28-0 lead after running just 12pl but HC Pinkel was displeased after a 207 yd 1Q was foll'd by 53 yds and 0 pts in the 2Q playing his str's deep into the 3Q in the 62-10 (-44) win over FCS SEL. While the score was lopsided, the yds were only 452-223 and MO benefitted from +4 TO's, 2 def td's and 2 long PR td's! UGA was sluggish early vs Buff (led 24-16 at HT) but scored three 2H td's to pull away in their 45-23 win (-38). Frosh RB Gurley was the star running for 100 yds (12.5) and also had a 100 yd KR td. MO will be sky high for their first ever SEC HG and Pinkel, usually not one to look ahead, said he's given his players special dispensation to talk about the match-up with the Bulldogs thru the offseason. UGA will be playing this gm without at least 2 of its str's on D and 2 more str's could miss meaning that their availability could be the difference in what should be a closely-contested game.

KANSAS ST 31 Miami, FI 21 - LY we used KSU as the Underdog POW on these pages and they delivered another outright upset winner as a 13 pt dog on the road! Collin Klein threw for 132 yds and ran for 93 and RB Hubert rushed for 166. KSU led 17-3 at half and 21-10 late 3Q. UM battled back and down 28-24, QB Harris was stopped on 4&g1 at the 1.5 yd line with :49 left. UM is 10-5 SU/ATS in the 2nd of a B2B road trip (2-0 LY) but is clearly in rebuilding mode in the 2nd yr under Golden with just 10 ret'g str's. LW, despite being outgained 542-415 and down 14-0 early, they beat BC 41-32 (-2) on the road snapping a 2 gm losing streak to BC. Frosh RB Johnson broke 2 long td runs avg 19.3 ypc and QB Morris was efficient with 207 yds (62%). All wk long, KSU HC Snyder harped on his team about starting fast (LY only beat FCS EKU 10-7 in opener) but the Wildcats found themselves up only 9-6 at HT vs Missouri ST. One of the reasons it was close was the fact they rarely blitzed on D and ran a vanilla off (QB Klein only 13 rushes). KSU did break free in the 2H in the 51-9 win (-34) but the yds were close 493-418. TW Snyder joked "that he's going to tell his team that he wants a very slow start to see what happens." KSU has 14 ret'g str's the most for Snyder s/'00 and they won 10 gms LY. This is a sandwich between two weak foes and they will put forth a much better effort TW.

Mich St 31 C MICHIGAN 17 - MSU is 4-1 SU but 2-3 ATS in this series. This marks CM's 1st time hosting MSU and "the biggest single event in Mt Pleasant history," according to the AD and they brought in extra seating for the ticket demand. In '09, CM pulled the outright upset winning 29-27 (+14) and were +102 yds. CM HC Enos played QB at MSU from 1986-'89 (also ch'd there '06-'09) and CM QB Morris Watts spent 12 seasons as MSU's OC in 3 diff stints. LY MSU was -21 at home and dominated. CM's only td came on a 13 yd drive after a blk'd punt. MSU won 45-7 (31-0 half) with a 481-112 yd edge. LW the Spartans outgained Boise St 461-206 but only came away with a 17-13 win (-7) as they had 4 TO's incl an IR td. It was the first time BSU had been held w/o a off td s/'97 and MSU dominated the LOS with a 213-37 rush yd edge (4.1-1.5). RB Bell had a career-high 210 yds (4.8) but QB Maxwell did struggle in his 1st start throwing 3 int's. CM fell behind 24-10 but was able to outscore FCS SEMO 28-3 down the stretch in their 38-27 (-23) win LW. RB Tipton ran for a career-high 180 (10.6). MSU is 8-4 SU in "true" road openers (5-2 ATS) but this will be just the 3rd AG vs a non-BCS school (L'ville '95 & Hawaii '04) s/'89. Mich St fans figure to make up a good part of the crowd (56 miles apart) but MSU is 2-9-1 ATS the gm prior to Notre Dame and are in a huge sandwich here while the Chicks are off an FCS foe with a bye on deck.

† USC 42 Syracuse 21 - MetLife Stadium. The Orange is 0-3 vs the Trojans. LTH ('90) SU (+9) lost 34-16 in the Kickoff Classic. SU is 4-17 s/'05 vs ranked foes but has won 3 str by an avg score 33-17. LY we had a 2★ on these pages on USC (-14) and they delivered a 38-17 win. USC was also the NC Sportsline Comp Coll POW. USC finished with a 501-331 yd edge and led 38-10 finishing the game with a 1&g1 at the SU5. LW the #1 Trojans got started in style with a 75 yd td on their very 1st play in a 49-10 (-43) win over Haw. WR Lee was the star with 197 rec yd (19.7) and had a 100 yd KR td and QB Barkley kicked off his Heisman campaign with 372 yds (61%) and a 4-0 ratio. Syr found themselves down 35-13 in the 3Q to NW but rallied back to take a 41-35 lead with under 4:00 left. After a critical 15 yd pen by SU, NW scored a td with under 1:00 left and the Cuse dropped a heartbreaker 42-41 (+1) and we easily cashed a 3★ CTOT on the Over. The high-tempo Cuse off did run 95pl for 596 yds with QB Nassib throwing for 470 while obliterating the schl rec'd with 44 comp (was 29) on 65 att. USC is 13-2 SU and 11-4 ATS in their 1st road game but does have Stanford on deck and is travelling from coast-to-coast here so it will be tough backing a 20+ pt fav vs a tm with backdoor potential.

NOTRE DAME 31 Purdue 17 - ND is now 6-1 SU and 5-2 ATS (4 str wins by 15 ppg) in this series. LY PU had just the 7th night game ever in Ross Ade Stadium history (3rd vs ND) and for the 1st time s/'96 had bye the week before the Irish. ND still dominated with a 551-276 yd edge. ND had a 314-122 yd edge at HT, led 35-3 mid-4Q and won 38-10 (-12) on the road with PU driving 95 yds for a garbage td with :21 left. LTH PU cut the deficit to 20-12 (4Q) but on their L/2 drives had to punt from their own 4 & were SOD at their 44. ND is coming off a trip to Ireland but wanted an early start time vs Navy (9 am EDT) so they could get back by Sun morn and not interrupt their upcoming game week prep. ND was w/out LY's str's QB Rees/RB Wood (both susp'd) but didn't miss a beat as rFr QB Golson threw for 144 (67%) and RB's Riddick/Atkinson comb for 206 (7.4) and 4 td's in their 50-10 win (-15). Purdue str' QB TerBush was a late scratch (susp'd, will play here) but exp'd bkp Marve came on to throw for a career-high 295 (79%) and 3 td's in the Boilers 48-6 win over EKU (-20). PU had 93-10 FD and 547-190 yd edges but had 5 TO's. PU is 4-11-1 ATS after a SU win and has dropped 4 str road openers by 23 ppg (1-3 ATS). PU has only beaten ND in South Bend one time s/'74 (1-14). The Irish are 12-4 SU in home openers (3 of 4 losses by 7 pts or less) and will still have LY's home opener debacle vs USF fresh in their minds. However, ND does have a big gm at Mich St on deck foll'd by Mich so this is not an "A" gm for them while this is PU's most important gm in the month!

NEVADA 31 Usf 30 - 1st meeting. USF is 5-1 SU (3-3 ATS) in road openers and is on a 9-1 run in non-conf AG's SU with their only loss at #8 Fla in '10. UN is 9-2 SU (5-3 ATS) in home openers. UN is 2-5 SU/ATS hosting BCS schools since their move up to IA ('92). UN is 17-2 SU (11-8 ATS) at Mackay Stadium the L3Y (losses to Mizzou & LT). USF is just 3-9 ATS as an AF and has a huge Big East gm in just 5 days on a Thurs. The Pack is off an impressive win over Cal. 31-24 (+11) as they had a 450-365 yd edge. They did race out to a 14-0 lead with Cal's starting QB sitting out but were still able to hang on. QB Fajardo had 230 pass (78%) and also added 97 rush (4.6). USF beat Chattanooga 34-13 (-27) as QB Daniels threw for 265 (65%) with a 3-1 ratio and the USF D limited the Mocs to just 151 yds. While USF has the edges on off (#41-42), def (#28-75) and ST's (#80-110), UN has the altitude edge and this is just the 3x USF has played west of the Rockies in schl history.

Wisconsin 27 OREGON ST 24 - LY UW was -20' at home and was taking on a banged up OSU tm missing many key players. OSU also had a -4 yd punt setting up a 15 yd UW drive for their 1st td. At half UW led 21-0 (209-104 yd). UW did have just 20-17 FD and 397-284 yd edges but won 35-0. OSU ran just 18 (28%) of their 65pl in UW terr (just 2 in the RZ). This will mark the 1st trip to Corvallis for Wisconsin (2-0 vs OSU). Under Bielema, UW is 4-0 when traveling out West/HL. UW has won 10 str road/neutral openers by 13 ppg (4 vs BCS) and UW is 7-3 ATS vs non-conf BCS tms (9 str SU wins by 15 ppg). UW is 8-2-1 ATS in its 1st gm away from Madison and OSU is 3-9 SU/ATS in reg ssn gms vs current non-conf BCS schools. UW narrowly suffered a shocking loss to N Iowa LW hanging on for a 26-21 win (-33). RB Ball did have 120 yds but only 3.8 ypc. New QB O'Brien was efficient with 219 yds (83%) but certainly is no Russell Wilson. This is the Badgers "A" gm for Sept with 3 non-BCS tms in their other gms and they have a GUB edge with OSU's gm vs Nicholls St being PPD LW. OSU is 6-3 ATS as a HD and should be fired up for this. OSU has 15 ret'g str's (UW 11) and has a bye on deck. After LW's gm HC Bielema said "Wisc football may not be the prettiest thing to watch, but we get W's." We expect more of the same here in a close gm.

OREGON 54 Fresno St 23 - Last met in '07 with UO winning 52-21 (led 42-6 late 1H) and they have covered 3 str in the series. UO has outscored non-conf opp's 323-61 at Autzen Stadium the L3Y (4-1 ATS) They are off an SBC tm with an FCS tm on deck so they will be focused. LW the Ducks raced out to a 50-10 HT lead then sat their str's in the 2H in the 57-34 win (-37) over Ark St. New QB Mariota had 200 yds (82%) and a 3-0 ratio and RB's Barner/Thomas comb for 5 td's. Fresno ST beat Weber St 37-10 (-21) in HC DeRutyr's debut. Off stars QB Carr (298 pass) and RB Rouse (123 rush) led the way as the Bulldogs outgained the Wildcats 515-274. Not only do the Ducks have a huge edge on D (#18-94) and an large edge on off (#4-45) but they figure to score a ST's td as well (#11-104). Fresno is 16-9 as an AD (Pat Hill's best role) but has a new HC and may focus more on next week's winnable gm at home vs Colo.

SOUTH CAROLINA 31 East Carolina 17 - LY they met for the 1st time s/'90 and it was a strange game as TO's vaulted EC to a 24-14 HT lead despite SC having a 175-165 yd edge. SC rolled to a 56-37 win despite only having a 351-345 yd edge. Connor Shaw started for SC but hit just 3-9-29 and when EC led 17-0 Garcia came off the bench (7-15-110). Despite scoring 56 pts, SC had just 2 drives of over 50 yds. LW SC overcame a 13-10 4Q deficit to beat Vandy 17-13 (-6) as we cashed our Thurs Night Marquee on the Dores who were driving late but a 4th down pass failed when a SC DB grabbed a Vandy WR and it was not called. QB Shaw had a gutsy performance suffering a bruised right shldr and missed 2 series but led the GW drive (could be ? here). RB Latimore, ret'g from his ACL inj, had 110 yds (4.8) but looked tentative early. EC beat App St 35-13 (-14) in their ssn opener but were outgained 419-390 and only led 14-13 late 3Q. New QB Johnson threw for 242 (65%) with a 2-1 ratio. SC is 9-3 ATS vs non-conf FBS foes at home and has won 10 str home openers vs non-SEC tms (last loss in '99 vs EC) while EC is 1-9 SU and 3-7 ATS in "true" road openers (W by 4 pts, avg L by 21 ppg). EC has won 3 str trips to Columbia incl the LTH, 21-3 ('99). SC's largest edge is on D (#14-79) and EC does have a young QB making his 1st start in front of 80,000. Spurrier said that after "looking at the pressn press thinking we were hot stuff, maybe LW's gm was good for us." The Pirates are 5-1-1 ATS vs ranked tms incl 3 outright upsets and with Shaw not 100% we'll back the dog here.

IOWA 27 Iowa St 17 - When Hayden Fry was the coach at Iowa they dominated the series almost every year. When Ferentz took over in '99 ISU won the first 4 meetings but Ferentz went 6-2 over the next 8 and ISU had not scored a meaningful td in this series s/'06 heading into LY but ISU (+6) at home finished with a 473-363 yd edge and won 44-41 in 2OT. Iowa got a td with 5:50 left to lead 24-17 but ISU converted on 3&16, 3&20, 4&1 and then on 3&g1 got a 4 yd td run to tie it with 1:17 left. Iowa is now just 6-8 SU & 3-11 ATS vs their instate rival. The dog is 8-3 ATS and HT is 7-1. ISU has lost 4 str in Iowa City (L'win '02). LTH ISU trailed 35-0 into the 4Q and a late garbage score snapped 17 str Q's w/o a td. L3Y ISU has 12 TO's that have resulted in 45 (41%) of Iowa's 111 pts. While Iowa is off an uninspiring come-from-behind 18-17 (-9) win over NI (trailed 17-9 4Q), ISU is off an impressive win over Tulsa, 38-23 (+1) as after trailing 16-7 after 1Q the Cyclones reeled off 24 unanswered pts. The Hawkeyes have won 11 str home openers by 33 ppg (7-3 ATS) and are playing with legitimate revenge and may have been caught looking ahead LW.

LSU 38 Washington 17 - LSU is 2-0 (1-1 ATS) vs UW. In the L/gm ('09) the Tigers were a 17' pt AF and were outgained 478-321 (-8 FD) but had a 29 yd IR td to help them get the outright win 31-23 (UW did score a td on gm's final play). The LTH ('83) the Tigers won 40-14. The Huskies are just 1-9 SU & 2-6-1 ATS in road openers (4 str losses by 18 ppg). This will be the marquee gm for both in the 1st 3 wks of the ssn as they are sandwiched between non-BCS tms. An interesting matchup will be 1 of the nation's deepest RB's corps in LSU vs UW's new 3-4 D. LW UW jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the 1Q and held on for a 21-12 (-14) win over SDSU. LY's much-maligned D looked improved as they allowed 327 yds which was 126 less than LY's avg. UW QB Price had 222 yds (71%) and a 1-0 ratio. LSU HC Les Miles summed up his Tigers 41-14 (-43) win over NT LW as "imperfect, but with reason to smile" as the Tigers finished with 508 yds (most s/'07) incl 316 rush (6.9). QB Mettenberger threw for 192 (73%) and a 1-1 ratio in his 1st start. UW low humidity and now must contend with the heat and humidity of the Deep South and an LSU tm which is stronger than the one that finished #1 after the reg season LY. UW is 7-15 ATS as an AD (6-8 under Sark). Saturday night in Tiger Stadium amplifies LSU's home edge.

MISSISSIPPI 34 Utep 20 - Last met in '67 Sun Bowl. UM has lost 7 str HG's vs FBS opp's but that was under the former regime. The Rebs are 4-6 ATS as a HF and 4-9 ATS after a SU win. The Miners are 0-15 SU on the road vs BCS schools (avg score 51-14) but 5-2 ATS in road openers. UTEP is 12-8 ATS off a SU loss the L3Y and LW gave Top 5 Okla a scare in their 24-7 loss (+30) as it was tied at HT and was just 10-7 after 3Q's (UTEP could have led but missed 2 FG's). LW C Ark jumped out to a 20-14 HT lead over Miss but the Rebs scored 35 unanswered in the 49-27 win (-20). QB Wallace threw for 264 (83%) with a 2-1 ratio and added 82 rush (6.3) as the Rebs rolled up a 565-347 yd edge. The off and ST's are even while the Rebs have the edge on D (#54-85). UTEP is 4-1 ATS as an AD but Miss will want to match LY's entire win-total.

Texas Tech 41 TEXAS ST 20 - LY TSU came out in an option style attack and controlled matters early. In fact they led 10-0 but were done in by TO's as 3 of their 4 fmb's turned into TT td's. TSU led 10-7 at the half (141-139 yd). TT appeared to have no shot at the cover but rec'd fmb's at the TS23 and got a td with 5:55 left and then another FR at the 27 and got a td with 3:27 left to get ahead of the spread, 50-10 (-39). The Bobcats have won 16 str home openers and will be jacked for this with it being their first HG as an FBS schl in a newly renovated stadium and a bye on deck. TSU pulled off the biggest shocker of wk one as they upset Houston 30-13 as a 36' pt dog! Naturally TSU was one of our Big Dog Plays of the Week and had you bet them not only ATS but also on the \$ line (like we recommend) you would have been +15.4 units! The win was no fluke as TSU had 23-15 FD & 444-326 yd edges and controlled the clock for 43:09! TT lost their L/5 gms of LY so LW's 44-6 win over NWSt was their first win in nearly 10.5 months. TSU HC Franchione was just 1-4 vs TT when he was HC at A&M ('03-'07) and Tuberville, who is on the hot seat and needs W's, is 3-1-1 as an AF here. Clearly the Bobcats will have the Red Raiders full attention after LW's performance.

They also lost QB Schaub to injury mid-year or would have had one of the best records in the NFL. Prior to those final games they were 5-1 ATS at home winning by an avg of 24-13. They do have a division game on deck at JAX. LY these two met in week 2 at MIA and HOU won 23-13 (-3). The last 2 years the Texans have opened up at home and covered by 11 and 18. While MIA was 2-6 SU on the road LY they were 5-2-1 ATS and were only -18 ypg on the road (-37 ypg at home!). They are a super 21-7-1 as an AD but do have a new HC, coordinators and a very limited WR corps. HOU has a slight edge on D (#4-12) but a huge edge on offense (#1-31!). The Texans DC Wade Phillips is in his 2nd season and after LY's #2 def finish, and #6 finish in sacks he'll unload unimaginable pressure on MIA rookie QB Tannehill. Houston opens up the season strong again. **FORECAST: HOUSTON 28 Miami 6**

3★ NY JETS over Buffalo - The visitor is 8-1 ATS in the series but the Jets are 7-1 SU winning the last 4 by an avg of 33-14. In the last 8 trips here the Bills have lost by more than 4 only once (6-2 ATS). LY the Jets whipped BUF on the road but at home in need of a win for the playoffs, they trailed 24-21 late, took the lead with 1:01 left then needed Stevie Johnson to drop a td pass with :08 left to escape with a 28-24 non-covering win at home (-9). This year BUF is the trendy playoff pick in the AFC East while the Jets, who have been everyone's Super Bowl darling the last 2 years, have fallen out of favor and are picked to miss the playoffs. That gives us some value on the Jets. Yes, Ryan is just 10-12 ATS as a HF and with a big game at PIT on deck and they only outscored foes at home by 7 ppg LY. BUF is just 3-14 SU on the road and 7-7-2 ATS as an AD under Gailey. The Jets were #5 on defense LY while the Bills were just #26. We expect the Jets to be a playoff team this year and they are at home and are now under the radar with something to prove and that is when they are at their best. **FORECAST: NY JETS 21 Buffalo 9**

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ TAMPA BAY over Carolina - LY CAR caught the Bucs at the tail end of the year. TB was 10-6 in 2010 and came into 2011 with playoff expectations. They beat BOTH ATL and NO in the 1H of the year but never recovered from their trip to London. TB fell out of touch with the playoff race at the end losing their last 10 games (including 19 & 32 pt losses to CAR). QB Freeman missed the game here in TB due to a shoulder issue and is in vastly better shape for 2012. TY Tampa has a new HC in Schiano but a lot of the young talent they had LY, when they were the chic pick to make the playoffs, is still here. This year TB is our #4 most improved team and will more closely resemble that 2010 unit which beat CAR at home 31-16. TB is a poor home team going 2-11 ATS as a HD but that record is reflected in this number. CAR was 3-5 SU on the road LY but those wins came over that beleaguered TB team, a poor IND and a HOU team that had clinched the playoffs. CAR is 7-0 ATS as an AF but TB upgraded at RB, TE, WR and HC in the offseason. Our power ratings have he Bucs as the slightly stronger team talent-wise, they are at home and an underdog and that makes them the play here. **FORECAST: TAMPA BAY 20 Carolina 17**

2★ New England over TENNESSEE - When these two last met in '09, NE rolled to a 59-0 win (that's not a typo!). With only ARZ on deck NE should be well prepped for the Titans who are coming off a 9-7 season. TEN did upset BAL in their home opener LY, 26-13, but benefitted by catching the Ravens off a big win over PIT. Belichick has won his last 8 openers SU with the extra time he gets to work on the game in preseason and Brady is 28-13 ATS as an AF. TEN was outgained at home LY but NE did allow 440 ypg on the road. NE has a much improved defense and we rate them #16 (#3 off) with TEN #18 and #30 on off and def respectively. At the end of the year we project NE to win the SB and the Titans to be an also-ran at 6-10 so at that point this opening day line will look cheap. **FORECAST: New England 34 TENNESSEE 20**

The Colts were 0-8 SU on the road with their avg loss by 31-13. These two last met in '08 with the Bears a 9 pt dog upsetting Indy on the road 29-13 (+9) in the highest lined game of the opening week. Chicago can't help but look ahead to their divisional showdown with Green Bay on the road next Thursday. Indy is 4-1 ATS as a DD dog over 10 yrs (all gms LY). Lovie Smith is 4-4 SU/ATS in openers. While the Bears have an edge on offense (#17-28), they have a HUGE edge on defense (#8-32) and ST's (#1-25). Not a great situation but the Bears are off a 1-5 finish from LY without their key players and need to get their confidence back up. Check out the System on page 8 which makes them even stronger.

Philadelphia 24 CLEVELAND 17 - Last met in '08 (PHI -15' at home, 30-10, MNF in Dec). LY the Eagles were the "Dream Team" and expected to have a huge year and got their season off to a great start by whipping (31-13, -4) a Rams team that had been 7-9 in '10 and was the preseason favorite to win the NFC West. TY they take on an improved Browns team that is actually a underdog in every one of their games TY. After a 5-1 ATS mark as an AF in '09, PHI is just 4-6 ATS in that role since. They do have a big home game vs BAL on deck. PHI was just 8-8 LY despite having a top 10 offense and defense. CLE also had a top 10 D LY but finished 4-12 due to a poor offense. They greatly upgraded that unit in the offseason but the skill players are all rookies. CLE always opens the season at home but is 0-7 SU/ATS in those games since upsetting BAL way back in 2004 and they are just 3-6 ATS as a HD the last 2 yrs. PHI was 5-3 SU on the road LY with the avg win by 23-10.5.

NEW ORLEANS 31 Washington 24 - Last met in '09 (NO -9' AF, 33-30, OT). WAS is actually one of the most improved teams in the NFL and the Saints are at the other end of the spectrum and have an interim HC to their interim HC (OL coach Aaron Kromer). LY NO won its home games by an avg of 42-19 and was a perfect 8-0 ATS as a HF. WAS has an exciting rookie QB in Robert

Griffin III and LY NO only beat CAR (with Newton at QB) by 3 in Sept (on road) but did wax them 45-17 at home holding CAR to 301 yds (89 below season avg). Shanahan is 8-6 ATS as an AD with the Redskins and LY was only outgained 326-313 on the road even defeating the eventual SB champs in week 14 when the Giants were fighting for a playoff spot. He has opened each of the last 2 seasons with an upset win knocking off the NYG and DAL but both were as HD's. Tough to go vs the Saints at home but would take Skins with anything more than a td.

MINNESOTA 20 Jacksonville 13 - Last met in '08 (MIN +2 AD, 30-12). The Vikings enter year 3 of the Leslie Frazier era and LY in their 1-7 finish they got a total of 175 rush yds from an oft injured Peterson and were using a rookie QB. They had a lot of key indicators like SEVEN net close losses LY and show up #3 in our most improved list (but JAX is #10). MIN now has a revamped back 7 and while MJD returned to JAX he doesn't know Mularkey's offense having not met him until Sept 2 face-to-face and will not be able to approach LY's performance missing the entire preseason. MIN ranks #24 on off and #29 on def while JAX is #26 on off and #18 on defense. Gabbert can be easily confused and now he must contend with the loud Metrodome crowd with a shaky OL vs DE Allen (22 sks LY). JAX avg just 238 ypg on the road LY! Minny is 7-2-1 ATS in season openers.

DETROIT 24 St Louis 17 - The Lions are 7-3 ATS as a HF and in their 5 home SU wins LY they won by 45, 11, 14, 6 and 28. This is the first year they come in with high expectations after making the playoffs LY for the first time since 1999. St Louis was 1-7 ATS on the road LY losing by an avg score of 25-8. These two last met in 2010 when STL was 7-9 team and they were +3 here in Detroit and were pounded 44-6 (Rams 341-322 yd edge though). STL is #1 on our most improved list this year while Detroit is a bottom ten team on that list (#23). New STL HC Fisher is 15-9-1 ATS as an AD and Detroit has a huge game on Sunday Night next week vs SF on the road and may peek ahead a bit.

KANSAS CITY 23 Atlanta 20 - Last met in '08. While Matt Ryan is an NFL veteran this is his first trip to Arrowhead. The dog is 5-0-1 ATS in Arrowhead openers with 5 outright upsets. LY the underdog was a perfect 8-0 ATS in Chiefs home games! KC has won 6 in a row as a HD with 5 outright upsets. They return RB Charles, TE Moeaki, SS Berry and have an upgraded OL with RT Winston from HOU. When they made the playoffs in 2010 the Chiefs were 7-1 SU at home and we feel they have a playoff caliber team TY. ATL has a MNF game vs DEN on deck and Mike Smith is 9-5 ATS as an AF. The offenses are close but KC has our #9 rated D (ATL #22) and KC is at home.

GREEN BAY 27 San Francisco 13 - SF is much stronger than in 2010 when they travelled here (+8') and were whipped 34-16. SF was 6-2 SU on the road LY and 3-1 ATS as an AD under Harbaugh. SF has our #1 rated D and the Packers are coming off a season where they were last in the NFL on defense. The two years prior GB was #5 and #2 on D and we expect them to be much tougher on that side and rate them #11. GB was 6-1 ATS as a HF last year with their avg win by 38-23. The Packers do not like the way it ended last year with their upset loss at home to the Giants and will want to get their season off on a solid note. The 49ers actually were in the NFC Title game after going 6-10 the year prior. The biggest edge here (besides home field) is Aaron Rodgers vs Alex Smith.

SEA is just 8-26 SU on the road while ARZ is 26-14 SU at home and finished LY winning 5 of their last 6 overall. ARZ is the dog due to Skelton getting the start but SEA is fielding a true rookie in Russell Wilson who got just 1 start in pressn. We even pick both teams to each finish 6-10 this year. Add it all up these teams are even and we will call for the home team to win by a FG and let Las Vegas determine who we like.

QB Driskel got the majority of the snaps after a tightly-contested QB battle in camp but RB Gillislee was the star with a career-high 148 yds (6.2). The Gators are our pick to win the SEC East featuring one of the top D's in the country (10 str's back) and will be taking on an inexp'd QB making his first start in front of the home crowd with new schemes on both sides of the ball. No doubt the Aggies will be fired up but now UF also has the GUB advantage and should come out of College Station with the "W". **FORECAST: Florida 28 TEXAS A&M 20**

Maryland 24 TEMPLE 23 - MD probably has a little revenge stored up here. LY at home MD was dominated on both sides of the LOS and TU RB Bernard Pierce set a school rec'd with 5 rushing td's. TU had a 285-45 rush edge and 425-240 yd edge and won the game 38-7 leading 31-0 at the half (MD avoided the shutout with a 80/8pt td with 4:31 left). MD is vastly improved in Edsall's 2nd season with 15 ret str's but is arguably 1 of the most beaten-up tms in the country. It showed LW vs FCS W&M as the Terps were able to overcome 4 TO's and a short missed FG in their 7-6 win (-21). True frosh QB Hills had 145 yds (67%) and led the GW 4Q drive but threw 3 int's as the Terps trailed 6-0 into the 4Q. TU has just 8 ret'g str's and though Pierce is gone but they still ran over cross-town rival Villanova LW, 41-10 (-25) as they piled up 301 rush yds (6.4). Despite the 31 pt win, they were outgained 365-362 as they were +2 in TO's which incl a long IR td. MD is 2-7 SU in road openers but the Owls are 1-6 SU (-4.3 ATS) hosting BCS schools. Edsall has struggled here as he brought his Conn tm into Philly in '08 and got a lucky OT win and then in '10 they were whipped 30-16 with Temple being +6. There may be some extra value after LW's results and we'll gladly jump on the ACC tm in revenge mode vs a team that was in the MAC LY.

TEXAS 48 New Mexico 6 - UT is 2-0 vs NM (played in '48 & '88) with the same 47-0 score for both meetings. The Lobos have dropped 12 str vs ranked foes (L2Y avg loss by 51 ppg). Not incl NMSU, Lobos are 2-18 SU (5-8-1 ATS L/14) in non-conf AG's. NM dropped 5 str road openers, the L/4 by 50 ppg. NM is much improved under 1st yr HC Davie who was the A&M DC from '89-'93 and knows UT well. The Lobos rolled to a 66-21 win over FCS Southern in Davie's debut LW as they had a 347-78 yd rush edge. UT is a surprise contender for the Nat'l Title TY but LW trailed WY 9-7 early before using their 1-2 punch at RB in Bergeron/Brown who each ran for 100+ yds to pull away in 37-17 win (-31). Ash won the QB derby out of fall and was an efficient 20-27 (74%) for 156 yds and a 1-0 ratio. The Horns should put the hammer down here and NM's performance LW will keep UT focused so we'll call for another 40+ pt win for UT in this series.

HOUSTON 31 Louisiana Tech 28 - LY LT was +6' at home and nearly ended UH's unbeaten hopes in the 3rd wk of the ssn. LT led 34-14 in the 4Q and UH needed a 32 yd td pass with 1:36 left to pull out the win. LT had a 26-21 FD edge and 233-98 rush edge. The Case Keenum era is officially over. UH is coming off a devastating loss to FBS newcomer Texas ST, 30-13. New QB Piland hit just 39% (211 yds, 1-1) as UH was outgained 444-326 but did have the FD edge. The Cougars are now 11-3 SU & 7-4 ATS hosting non-conf foes. New HC Levine was on the LT staff in '02. LT, whose opener vs A&M was PPD until Oct, is 1-14 SU (-7.8 ATS) in true road openers incl 8 str losses by an avg 30 ppg. Expect UH to get back on track here.

Nebraska 28 UCLA 27 - Neb is 16-9-2 ATS as an AF and 6-1 vs the Bruins s/'73 winning the L/meeting in '94, 49-21. UCLA is 14-4 ATS in their home openers and 16-7 ATS as a HD. Neb is 7-3 in road gms vs non-conf BCS tms winning at Wash in '10 (-3, 56-21). The Bruins are 11-3 hosting non-conf foes. This is the Rose Bowl debut for new HC Mora who led the Bruins to a Thurs night 49-24 win at Rice in the opener with a 646-358 yd edge. The key play of the gm happened late 2Q with UCLA clinging to a 29-24 lead as Holmes ret'd a fmb'l 44 yds for a td with :17 left 1H. RFB QB Hundley hit 21-28 for 202 yd with 2 td and 68 rush yd while RB Franklin had 214 yd & 3 td. NU (-19) beat S Miss 49-20 as QB Martinez threw for a career-high 354 yd & 5 td. The Huskers finished with a 632-260 yd edge despite losing RB Burkhead (knee, CS) in the 1Q. Neb has all of the edges (off #17-44, D #21-30 and ST #9-56). UCLA will have an excited home crowd but Neb figures to travel about 20,000 fans in the rare West Coast trip in what should be a close gm.

SAN DIEGO ST 24 Army 17 - LY was their only recent meeting. The game was played on 9/11 and there were numerous tributes to Army prior to the game. SDSt had some key advantages coming in: they had faced Navy (option) and Cal Poly (option) in the bowl and Wk 1 respectively and Rocky Long knows how to defend the option. SDSt also jumped out to a 14-0 lead. Army finished with a surprising 446-292 yd edge and covered (SDSt -9, 23-20) with Army running almost twice as many plays (84-43) and holding the ball for 42:00. Ellerson is 2-1 SU, 1-2 ATS in road openers but LY trailed NI 49-6 after 3Q (only lost 49-26). SDSt is off a 21-12 loss to Wash, but did cover as a 15' pt AD only being outgained by 1 yd (-6 FD). New QB Katz only threw for 128 (53%, 1-1) and the run gm clearly missed Hillman (top rusher had 86 yd). This is Army's season opener so SDSt has the GUB edge and also spent some practices in August prepping for this one. Ellerson was the HC at Cal Poly from 2001-'08 going 2-0 vs SDSt, but must travel across the country to take on a team very familiar with defending the option.

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CONNECTICUT 28 North Carolina St 27 - The only prior series gm took place in Raleigh in '03 as UC lost 31-24. On Thurs night at home UC (-21) dominated 1st yr FBS member UMass 37-0 as the Minutemen failed to have a snap on UC's side of the field finishing with 59 tt yds & 3 FD. QB Whither threw for 219 yds in his starting debut. In Atlanta, NCST's highest profile players had tough days as QB Glennon tossed 4 picks and fmb'l'd out of the EZ for a safety while AA CB Amerson was toasted for 2 td passes in a 35-21 loss to Tenn as a 3 pt dog. The D's are close (UC #38-44) while NCST has a large edge on offense (#39-92). UC has the home and ST's (#41-98) edges. UC is 12-3 ATS as a HD and NCST is 3-12 as an AF with O'Brien 0-4 in that role in his 6 yrs. This is a big game for both although the Huskies have an emotional trip to Maryland to face former HC Edsall to face former HC Edsall only faces S Alabama but you have to wonder if their confidence was shaken LW.

STANFORD 34 Duke 17 - LY Duke was +20' at home and in the 1H went 70/9pl and missed a 27 yd FG and then missed a 45 yd FG. After a 76 yd IR td, Duke only trailed 10-7 with 2:24 left 2Q. Duke rec'd an onside kick but punted 13 yds and SU went 59/4pl for a td with :39 left. Duke missed a 3rd FG, this one from 49 with :02 left. Duke was SOD at the SU14 on the opening 3Q drive and the Cardinal would score td's on their next 4 poss to lead 44-7 before a Duke td with :57 left. The visitor is 3-0 SU in the series but LY was the only recent meeting. SU is 9-4 ATS vs non-conf and 8-1 ATS vs FBS opp's. Duke is a stronger tm with 17 ret str's while SU is down a few notches without QB Luck and 2 AA OL's. The Cardinal (-24) almost blew a 17-3 halftime lead LW in a 20-17 Friday night win over SJST in which they were outgained 288-280. Tied at 17 late 3Q a Spartans fmb'l at their own 25 set up the GW 20 yd FG with 13:58 left. Duke (-2) scored 30 2Q pts incl a blk'd FG which was ret'd 75 yd for a td to beat FIU 46-26. SU is 21-11 ATS as a HF but has a huge game vs USC on deck (Duke has FCS tm). Duke is actually 34-18-1 ATS as an AD but LW's results skewed this line and we'll back the Cardinal.

Oklahoma ST 41 ARIZONA 31 - These two have met the L2Y (3rd meeting L/15 gms) with OSU 2-0 SU/ATS (last gm in Tuscon 1942). In the '10 bowl, Ariz had a 370-312 yd edge but was -4 in TO's and OSU won 36-10. LY OSU was -14 at home and Ariz had a young OL making its 1st road start and was without their top WR Criner (appendectomy). We used the Under '66' as our Thur Night Play and it covered by 15 pts. OSU had a 306-146 yd edge at half (21-0) and finished with a 594-439 yd edge. The Wildcats are 2-8-1 ATS vs non-conf BCS foes. Cowboys are 7-1 SU (6-1-1 ATS) in road openers (4 str wins by 21 ppg). This is the Pokes only BCS foe in the 1st 4 weeks (whole offssn to prep for Rich Rod's) and Ariz also has non-BCS tms sandwiched around this gm. OSU got its most lopsided win s/'16 over Sav St as true Fr QB Lunt hit all 11 of his pass att's for 129 yd playing not even the entire 1Q as the Cowboys took a 35-0 lead. Rich Rod won his UA debut 24-17 over Toledo in OT but failed to cover as a 10' pt HF. The Cats had a 624-358 yd edge but missed 2 chip shot FG's and had 2 td's called back as new QB Scott hit 30-46 for 387 yd and rushed for 74 yds. With two completely diff offenses this figures to be on the high scoring side.

ARIZONA ST 24 Illinois 21 - LY these 2 met for the 1st time s/'88. IL had the sked edge as ASU was off a Friday gm vs MO and had their P12 opener vs USC on deck. IL had just faced an FCS foe. IL had 6 sks and held ASU to a season low 362 yds but were outgained 362-240. IL led 10-7 at HT with a 210-186 yd edge. ASU got the lead on a td on the 4Q's 1st play but IL drove 41 yds for a td after rec a fmb'l to go up 17-14. On 4&10 ASU fired inc from its 39 with 1:01 left. IL is 1-9 SU (-3.7 ATS) in neutral/road openers (avg L 15 ppg). The Illini are 12-3 ATS as an AD. ASU is 17-10 ATS at home vs non-conf. Both new HC's won their debuts with IL's Beckman besting a familiar MAC foe in WM 24-7 as a 10 pt HF. IL led 17-0 at the half but QB Scheelhaase (ankle) was KO'd and WM cut it to a 10 pt gm when the Illini got a 60 yd IR td in the 4Q to put the game away. WM had a 259-248 yd edge. ASU's Graham debut incl a 42-0 HT lead in a 63-6 win over FCS NAU. IL has the D edge (#15-58) and the more exp'd QB as long as Scheelhaase can go (CS) while ASU has the off edge (#37-90) and a large edge on ST (#22-107) and the home edge.

FIU 45 Akron 10 - LY FIU came into Akron and had a 524-269 yd edge but only won by 10, 27-17 (-17). UA has lost 18 str 'true' road openers by 29 ppg. In the L10Y this is only UA's 3rd gm away vs non-BCS/non-conf tms (2-0). The Panthers are 3-7 in home openers (1-6 vs FBS tms). LY Akron lost its road gms by an avg of 48-11.5 (-208 ypg) and they are 2-7 as an AD. Last Thurs we won a 3* on these pages going vs the Zips as they lost 56-14 to UCF as a 24 pt HD in new HC Bowden's debut. UA missed a 35 yd FG, was SOD at the UCF32 and had fmb'l's set the Knights up for td drives of 9 & 5 yds en route to a 35-0 HT deficit. FIU has 17 ret str's and had 29-16 FD and 513-420 yd edges in a 46-26 loss at Duke (+2'). The key play of the game came late 2Q as the Devils ret'd a blk'd 30 yd FIU FG att at 75 yd for a td. The Panthers are just 4-8 as a HF but have the edges all around (off #99-119, D #39-120 and ST #76-111).

TROY 39 Louisiana 33 - The last time UL beat Troy 2 str snss was in '51-'52. LTH it was tied at 24 when Troy went 53/7pl for the GW td. Troy is 7-2 SU (0-2 ATS run) vs UL but lost LY. Troy trailed 17-3 then all'd an 89 yd IR td just :03 before HT and the 2H never got closer than 14 pts. Troy had been 13-3 as a HF but is just 2-8 the L2Y. LW Troy (-6') jumped out to a 17-0 lead before all'g UAB to battle back. Up by 2 pts, Troy scored 2 td in :24 to open it up and, despite being outgained 459-453, won 39-29. RB Southward exploded for 204 rush yd (7.3) and 3 td. UL is 12-1 ATS as an AD and was 9-4 LY with the benefit of bowl practices and 13 ret str's incl QB Gautier. UL got a shutout win at home vs Lamar LW (1st shutout at home s/'02) with a 346-194 yd edge in the 40-0 win (-36'). Troy had won 5 str SBC titles until LY's poor 3-9 rec'd making this is a very important game for them and their 15 ret str's (Blakeney's most exp team s/'04). The Trojans have won 24 str home openers and the Ragin' Cajuns have lost 21 str road openers.

MID TENN 27 Fau 17 - LY FAU was off a disappointing home opening loss and Schellenberger sd his team was heart broken. MT's first 3 drives went 63/8pl, 80/10pl, 66/6pl for a 21-0 lead and they finished with a 479-276 yd edge in the 38-14 win and they also won 38-14 LTH in '10. MT is off a 2-10 ssn and will want to regain its swagger especially after LW's loss to McNeese ST, 27-21. MT was outgained 450-343 and outFD'd 24-20. One bright spot was a sch'l rec'd 241 KR yds. FAU has 15 ret str's and completed its rally LW over Wagner, 7-3 in HC Pelini's debut. FAU finished with 327-215 yd and 17-11 FD edges. FAU is 10-24-2 ATS as an away dog and just 1-6 in road openers. This is a familiar foe for MT (3-0 SU/ATS run) and they should right the ship here.

ARK ST 41 Memphis 24 - Second str ssn UM will travel to Jonesboro. LY ASU (-16') dominated with a 611-169 yd edge (47-3 after 3Q). It was the most lopsided win in series history. UM has lost 3 of the L/4 vs ASU (s/'06) and the HT has won 3 str (all after '07). UM is 11-3 SU and 6-8 ATS vs ASU. The Tigers are 1-10-1 ATS in road openers. ASU has won 7 str home openers, ironically the L/loss was to UM in '04. LW UM was downed by UT Martin, 20-17 on a late FG. In HC Fuente's debut, the Tigers faced a 2:40 delay due to Isaac and were outgained 392-359. ASU drew Oreg to open the ssn and made the final respectable by scoring the L/14 pts, 57-34 (+37). QB Aplin threw for 304 yds (66%, 3-1, 0 sk) and became ASU's leader in tt off and pass yds. ASU is 7-2 as a HF and in an UO/Neb sandwich so they need a win in their home opener, but after putting up 530 tt yds and 34 pts LW, the line should fall in UM's favor.

ARKANSAS 45 ULM 17 - Little Rock. Razorbacks are 9-0 SU (-3.6 ATS) vs ULM. In the last game ('10) UA had 499-188 yd and 26-10 FD edges in a 31-7 win. ULM only trailed 7-0 at HT despite being outgained 217-58. Ark has won 20 str non-conf HG's outscoring opponents on avg 44-17 (8-9-1 ATS). UA shook off some early gm rust (trailed 14-7 2Q), besting IAA Jax St 49-24 but failing to cover as a 46 pt HF. QB Wilson set the sch'l rec'd for pass yds in a ssn opener with 367 (70%, 3-0) but ply'd deeper into the gm than many expected. The Hogs have the big edges on off (#5-87), D (#43-96) and ST's (#6-121) but have a huge showdown vs Bama on deck while the Warhogs had all summer to prep for this as this is their opener. ULM has lost 18 str road openers (shutout 6x's) and UA is 17-5-1 ATS at home. After LW's slow start, look for the Hogs to explode out of the gate here.

ALABAMA 38 Wku 3 - Bama won 41-7 (28 pt HF's) with a 557-158 yd edge (+21 FD) in the schools' only other meeting ('08). UA is 10-0 in home openers with the avg win by 26 ppg but just 4-7 ATS. WKU is 0-8 SU and 1-1 ATS (WKU NL until '08) vs ranked opp's with the avg score 38-9. Naturally Bama has large edges on off (#7-102) and D (#2-76) but surprisingly WKU has the ST's edge (#49-62). Also WKU has a huge sked edge as this is a defining sandwich gm for the Tide coming off the Mich gm (won 41-14, -13', +162 yds) with a showdown at Ark next week. WKU is also off a ssn opening win, covering as a 30' pt HF over Austin Peay, 49-10 (+442 yds, +21 FD). WKU did outgain SEC foe UK LY 234-190 covering as a 16' pt dog but clearly the Tide are a different animal, although WKU could sneak in the backdoor with Bama looking ahead.
