Revenge is an often overused term but Maryland was playing with legitimate revenge vs Temple. The previous yr they took the Owls lightly and were manhandled at the line in a 31 pt shutout loss at home. This time it was MD that had the 19-9 FD edge despite being a large dog and finished with a 334-230 yd edge. It was almost yet another blown lead for Coach Edsall at Maryland. The Terps appeared completely in control leading 26-3 at the half with a 180-34 yd edge. The momentum turned when MD fmbl the opening 3Q play and TU got a td. TU had all the momentum in the world when they got a td with 7:04 left to pull within 29-27 but MD went on a surprising 75/11pl drive getting 3 crucial FD's and a td with 2:51 left to ice it. MD finished at the TU25 taking a knee and was yet another outright winner for the PPH Big Dog Plays!...Memphis almost pulled the big upset vs Ark St. In fact, Memphis led the majority of the gm. They key drive happened when Memphis started at their own 16 and went on a 6:30 drive going 77/13pl but leading 28-27, missed a 25 yd FG with 9:10 left. ASU went 80/9pl and got a td and missed the 2 pt conv to lead 33-28. Memphis punted and ASU was able to get 3 FD's punting with :11 left and holding on for the

FCS UPSETS: There were 4 more FCS upsets this past week. Illinois St had a great rush D and matched up well vs E Mich's power rush attack. There was nothing fluky about ISU's win as they had 371-248 vd and 21-11 FD edges. EM did lead 14-10 at half with a 172-148 yd edge. ISU went 67/6pl and 52/7pl on the first 2 poss of the 3Q to go up 24-14. ISU got a 20 yd IR with 5:37 left

and went 30/10pl for a td with 1:08 left to clinch i...N Dakota St moved to 6-3 vs FBS schools s/06. There was nothing fluky about their 22-7 win over Colo St. They had 21-11 FD and 366-243 yd edges. CSU gained 65 of their 243 yds on their last 2 drives...While not an FCS upset, Utah St had not beaten Utah since 1997. They had a 380-325 yd edge vs Utah and were winning when Utah QB Wynn with an injury. Backup QB Jon Hays hit 12-26-154 but looked like an improved QB this year. USt blocked a punt for a td in the 1Q and led 13-3 at half with a 148-92 yd edge. Utah got a td with 3:19 left to tie then missed a 52 yd FG on the final play of regulation. In OT they had a 3&gl, 6 yd td pass called back on offensive pass interference and on 4&gl from the 17 they didn't call a potential defensive pass interference and USt won by 7.

QB Bridgewater has been sensational completing 82% of passes so far TY throwing for a career-high 344 yds LW. NC lost a heartbreaker 28-27 (-9') to WF LW as with a slick field and the gm being delayed 75 min due to lightning, NC all-everything RB Bernard was a late-scratch (knee, probable here). QB Renner was having a great gm (10-14-118) before taking a huge hit (poss conc) and was never the same. NC is 4-0 SU in non-conf true away gms (avg score 27-14). NC has edges on off (#20-67) and ST's (#30-68) and UL HC Strong is just 5-10 ATS at home. With a healthy duo of Bernard/Renner, the Tar Heels pull the outright upset. GÉORGIA TECH 34 Virginia 24 - GT DC Groh was the VA HC for 9Y and still owns a home in Charlottesville. LY, however, the situation favored VA. VA had a bye the wk before to help prep for the option and held GT to 296 yds. VA led at the half 24-14 with a 272-154 yd edge and won 24-21 (+7'). LTH UVA only trailed 13-7 at the half (outgained 293-117) as GT was +2 in TO's. UVA all'd 477 rush yds (6.4), most in an ACC gm s/81. LW the Cavs were the beneficiaries of 4 missed Penn St FG's and a PAT in their 17-16 (-9') win. The last time here, Ark appeared on its way to an upset (+7) as they led 20-7 in the 3Q and Bama didn't get its first lead until 3:18 was left in the game in a 24-20 non-covering road win. LY we had a 4★ Key Selection in PS and a 4★ Top Weekly LPS on Bama (-11) at home and the Tide rolled to a 38-14 win with a 397-226 yd edge. The Crimson Tide are 6-1 SU/7-0 ATS in 'true' road openers while Ark is just 2-5 ATS in SEC openers but is 5-2 ATS the L5Y as a HD. Patterson is now the winningest coach in schl hist (110-30) after their 56-0 win over Grambling (-50'). The Frogs had a 531-70 yd edge. The Weis era is off to a sluggish start as the Jayhawks blew a 24-16 4Q LW in a 25-24 loss to Rice (-12). This is LT's home opener and they should have a decent crowd off of LY's 8 win bowl season. In a game that could feature a lot of pts,

W Michigan 31 MINNESOTA 30 - Minny coach Kill was 2-1 SU vs Cubit when Kill was at NI but the dog was 2-1 ATS. UM is 6-11 ATS as a HF and 27-4-1 SU vs the MAC. LW Minny learned from their recent outright upset losses to FCS tms by taking care of business in a 44-7 win (-12) over New Hampshire. Their biggest weapon is QB Gray who had 100 yds both rushing and passing. WM is also off an FCS foe and after a deadlocked 14-14 1Q, exploded for 28 2Q pts in their 52-21 (-22') win over E Illinois. QB Carder rebounded from a horrible opener to throw for 5 td's as the Broncos had 31-16 FD and 631-344 yd edges. WM has a large edge on off (#32-99) while Minny has the home and ST (#36-114) edges. HC Cubit has fared well vs BCS tms upsetting Virginia, lowa, Illinois and Conn and could pull another here. SOUTH CAROLINA 41 Uab 10 - The Gamecocks have won the prior 2 gms ('03 and '08). L/gm SC never trailed and led 26-6 prior to a UAB garbage td w/:24 left (SC -26). McGee has scored 43 ppg (439 ypg) vs SC the L2Y as OC w/Ark but does not have the same horses to work with and UAB is 2-8 ATS in road openers. LW QB Thompson got the start over Shaw (shldr, CS) and hit 21-37-330 in the 48-10 (-21') win over EC. After the gm Spurrier said that, "if Shaw is 100%, he's our guy. We now know if something happens to him, Thompson can go in there." The gm was a bit misleading as SC benefitted from a late gbg td and was +4 TO's. Spurrier is 4-8 ATS as a DD fav vs non-conf and does have an SEC gm vs Mizzou on deck while UAB comes in off a bye but is just 2-8 ATS in road openers. At half OU had 17-7 FD and 359-195 yd edges and led 34-7 en route to a 44-7 win finishing with 559-331 yd and 30-14 FD edges. LTH OU trailed 13-3 at HT being outgained 267-100. OU down 7 w/1:01 drove 72/7pl for a 36 yd td pass on the final play but elected to go for the win (2ptng, pass inc). LW the Herd (-33) beat W Carolina 52-24 (615-335 yd edge) as QB Cato continues to shine in his 2nd yr and is avg 395 ypg (73%) with a 5-1 ratio. A week after OU pulled off the biggest win in schl hist, they beat NMSt 52-21 (-21') LW. While OU did have 28-15 FD and 584-206 yd edges, the gm was just 21-17 in the 3Q. QB Tettleton is now avg 291 ypg (72%) with a 4-0 ratio and must be licking his chops vs a Herd D all'g 495 ypg, MU HC Holliday is 10-3 SU at home but look for the Bobcats to buck that trend here.

TT has been impressive in their 2-0 SU/ATS start beating Texas St 58-10 on the road LW (-20) while NM lost 45-0 (+38') to TX. NM used its option offense to grind out FD's and held the ball for 20:00 in 1H but QB Holbrook was inj'd (CS). SJSt beat UC Davis 45-13 (-20) with 28-17 FD and 503-252 yd edges. CSU, a week after upsetting rival Colo, was beaten by defending FCS Champ N Dakota St 22-7 being outFD'd 21-11 and outgained 366-243. SJSt is 1-7 as a HF with 4 outright upset losses but this is 3rd vr HC MacIntyre's best tm yet while CSU HC McFlwain is just in his 1st vr

The Tigers were arguably the most impressive Top 5 tm LW as they mauled UW 41-13 with 24-12 FD and 437-183 yd edges (242-26 rush edge). Meanwhile a week after losing to an FCS tm at home, ID was much more competitive in a 21-13 loss to BG (+17). QB Blackman, who was susp'd for the opener hit 30-37-352. Indy has already topped LY's win total after pummeling UMass LW 45-6 (-14). The win was dampened by the loss of QB Roberson who is OFY (ankle). KC is off a home opening loss to ATL in which Cassell struggled after missing the final 7 games LY on the IR. However by looking back at 2010 he threw for a higher % on the road (60.4 vs 55.8%) while also having a 14-4 ratio. While both tms are 0-1 we'll back the team that we project to make the playoffs TY to get the bounce back win.

FORECAST: Kansas City 23 BUFFALO 17 **OTHER GAMES**

Chicago at GREEN BAY - Thursday. CHI clearly has the situational edge as this rivalry game is sandwiched between hosting IND and STL while GB is off SF with a Monday Nighter vs SEA on deck. While GB has the technical edges going 9-5 ATS as a div HF, CHI will look to avenge the X-mas day loss which eliminated them from the playoffs after QB Culter broke his thumb. The NFL Marquees went 28-9 80% LY and this is this year's first NFL Thursday Night Marquee.

NY GIANTS 30 Tampa Bay 20 - TB's Schiano returns to the NY/NJ area where he was the Rutgers HC from 2001-11. LW the Giants became the first defending SB Champs to lose the mid-week opener in nine such contests as they dropped a key div gm to DAL 24-17 (-3'). The secondary which was thought to be improved after being torched last year for 255 pass ypg (#29) gave up 307 yds. TB, on the other hand, got off to a great start with a 16-10 win over CAR as a 2.5 pt HD. The Bucs D limited the Panthers to just 0 pts in the 1H and harassed CAR QB Newton all day and forced 2 int's. NYG has been downright mediocre at home the last 3+ yrs going 13-12 SU and 8-16-1 ATS while TB after going 11-3-1 ATS in '09-'10 as a AD fell to 2-6 ATS in that role LY after the tm quit on Morris. After going 3-10 ATS off a SU loss in '09-10 the Giants were 4-2-1 ATS LY and certainly want to get LW's bad taste out of their mouths. However this is their only non-marquee gm of the first 4 weeks as they play on Primetime the next 2 wks. We'll call for the Giants by 10 and let Vegas decide who we like.

NEW ENGLAND 38 Arizona 10 - NE did what they do best vs TEN as they only had 3 pen and no TO's in their 31-14 win cashing as a 2★ winner here on these pages. While Brady was below his normal level throwing for 236 he still completed 74% of his passes throwing 12 of his 23 to his TE duo. The Pat's offense took what was given to them and Stevan Ridley who never topped 15 carries or 97 yds LY took over with 21-125 rushing. Belichick also goes to 4-0 vs QB's making their 1st start as they held TEN to 4.7 ypp and knocked Locker out of the game. This week they face either a banged up John Skelton (high ankle) who after his first start in PHI LY played 3 more road games and avg just 170 ypg (54%) with a 2-8 ratio or Kolb who SEA didn't game plan for LW in the Cards win.

INDIANAPOLIS 20 Minnesota 14 - In Luck's debut he got off to a slow start vs our #8 D on the road in the 41-21 loss to CHI. While he did have 309 yds passing, he threw 3 int's and had trouble moving the ball as of IND's 13 drives, only 2 were more than 6pl. However, he now gets to make his home debut vs a Vikings back 7 that we rank as the league's worst (LB's #31, DB's #31). MIN also comes into this gm with a banged up Ponder with possibly backup Webb st'g and will be missing a st'g LB. The Vikings were able to pull out a 26-23 OT win (-3') vs JAX LW but it has to be troublesome that much-maligned JAX QB Gabbert had a career-day vs them. On the bright side, RB Peterson looked to be fully recovered from the ACL injury as he ran for 84 yds (4.9) and 2 td's. MIN is just 3-10-1 ATS vs the AFC on the road and while they were 4-4 ATS on the road LY, they were 1-2 ATS in gms where the line was between the 6's and lost two of those outright. Wins will be hard to come by TY for the Colts but with the home crowd behind them, look for Luck and Co to nab one here.

New Orleans 21 CAROLINA 20 - The Saints are 5-1 in this series the L/3Y (avg'd 36 ppg L/3) but just 2-4 ATS. LY in Wk 5 here they failed to cover as a 6.5 pt AF in a 30-27 win. Prior to "Bounty Gate" this game would have been a no-brainer (NO 13-3 ATS off SU loss) but the offensive dynamics have changed with NO HC Payton being out as evident in their 40-32 loss to WAS LW as a 7' pt HF. While the Saints scored 32 pts they had multiple 3&outs and QB Brees comp % was just 46% after completing 71% of his passes LY. When Payton was calling the plays on sidelines LY, they dropped a div game to TB and managed just 283 yds vs STL in a loss, which was 193 ypg under their avg. CAR trailed 13-0 at HT LW and never could recover after a lightning delay despite Newton's 303 yds passing (did throw 2 int's). LY at home CAR was 2-2 ATS but 0-4 SU vs tms with a winning record getting outscored by 11 ppg. While this is a vital div gm, it should be noted that CAR has a primetime mid-week HG vs defending SB champs on deck but clearly the Saints loss brings this line down a couple of pts.

PHILADELPHIA 28 Baltimore 20 - PHI has a big situational edge with this game being sand-wiched between CLE and ARZ road games. BAL is off a big MNF Div matchup with a SNF game vs NE on deck. Harbaugh used to be the Eagles STC and has an insight into their operation. After virtually missing all of preseason, PHI was lucky to have escaped CLE with the win as Vick was very rusty with 317 yds (52%) with a 2-4 ratio. The Eagles did tally a 456-210 yd edge and RB McCoy kept the team from imploding with 110 yds rushing (5.5). They now return home after holding RB Richardson to 39 yds rushing (2.1) with CLE gaining just 74 yds (6 FD) in the 2H. BAL has set out to be a more Flacco driven team despite the fact he avoid just 224 ypg (57%) with a 10-6 ratio on the road LY. PHI had the #10 pass def and led the NFL with 50 sacks LY (2 LW) with their DB's playing zone instead of man which they prefer. We'll call for PHI to get the win to make up for LW's poor offensive showing.

MIAMI 17 Oakland 16 - The last time a pair of true rookie HC's squared off was '08 as John Harbaugh and Tony Sparano met in the Wild Card round in 2008. What happens often with rookie QB's or a new starter is they look good early as teams don't have film on them and HOU showed what they could do LW holding MIA to just 99 total yds in the 2nd half. Operating with the worst WR unit in the NFL, Tannehill had 219 yds (56%) with an 0-3 ratio as HOU's press D shut him down. MIA has an obvious situational edge with OAK coming cross country off a MNF home Div game. MIA has struggled gong 6-10 ATS at home the L2Y and with these 2 being in the bottom tier of our power rating numbers we can't support an OAK team that is an AF for the 1st time since Wk 14 2005 or six HC's ago. Both teams have decent defenses and we'll take the points with whomever is the dog here.

CINCINNATI 19 Cleveland 17 - The dog is 7-1 ATS in the series with CLE having a slight situational edge with CIN having traveled to BAL on MNF. CLE did a decent job of shutting CIN down in the 1st meeting LY until QB Dalton caught CLE in the huddle and hit WR Green for a 41 yd td. CLE LW used 4 Vick int's to lead 16-10 but PHI went 91/16pl to score the GW td with 1:18 left and while the Browns covered it was their 8th straight ssn opening loss. CIN is off a div MN game at BAL and they haven't fared well after facing the Ravens going 2-6 ATS the following game. The Bengals are also a team to play against as a fav as they avg'd only 20 ppg at home and only 19 ppg vs their div LY and that is evident by their 2-9 ATS record as a div HF. We may be the only ones backing a Browns team with QB Weeden making his first road start after having a 5.1 QBR (12-35, 118, 0-4) but remember PHI's wide 9 D is unusual and they led the NFL in sacks LY. We'll almost always back a div AD of almost a td in what we feel will be a low scoring game.

Dallas 28 SEATTLE 24 - LY DAL was -11 hosting SEA but only won 24-14 as they were SOD at the S24 and were held to FG's twice after having 1&gl at the 8 and 1&gl at the 1. The Cowboys knocked off the defending SB Champs on Wed and despite B2B away gms to start the season the travel is negated by the extra rest. DAL does however continue to be up against inflated lines because of their popularity as they are just 4-15-1 ATS as a fav the L2Y and even worse they were only 1-7 ATS LY off of a SU win. If Vegas makes them a dog they are 11-4 ATS in that role as the team seems to relax away from home especially Romo as LY he avo'd 231 ypg passing at home and 280 ypg away and that cont'd LW with 307 (76%, 3-1) vs the NYG. We credit the SEA fans for causing the most false start pen in the NFL S/07 (111 next best 99) but have much less worries about the veteran DAL team compared to an overexcited Russell Wilson making his home debut.

Washington 24 ST LOUIS 21 - The top 2 tenured and future HOF HC's square off although this is Fishers 1st home game as STL's HC. The Skins are in an unusual scheduling spot opening with B2B road games. RG3 handled the noise of the Superdome with no problems as after his first 6 passes were dumpoffs behind the LOS he then threw an 88 yd td pass finishing with 320 yds (73%) with 2 tds and no int's. The Skins 464 yds of offense topped any of their 2011 performances. STL traveled to face DET and despite their run game getting shutdown (78, 2.9) Bradford (198, 68%, 2-0) led them to a 23-20 lead with 1:55 left but the Rams D allowed an 80/9pl drive and a 5yd td pass with :10 left. Because of the disparate results the Rams went from a 2pf fav to a 3pt dog. This STL team has a new mentality and we'll grab the extra value as Fisher was 8-3 as a HD while RG3 is an AF for the first time in his NFL career.

Detroit vs SAN FRANCISCO Sunday Night - SF is the only NFC team to open vs a pair of playoff teams from LY. After LW's 30-22 win (+5) vs GB they return to Candlestick where they were 7-0 as a HF LY. SF's D was #4 LY but they only played 2 teams at home that were in the top 10 in passing and that was the Cowboys (DAL 472-206 yd edge) and the NYG (Giants 395-305 edge). DET seeks revenge for their 1st loss LY (-4.5, 19-25) as they were 5-0 LY facing a 4-1 SF squad. A great Sun Night Marquee is yours after 11am ET the day of the game.

Denver vs ATLANTA Monday Night - Pre-Payton Manning DEN was on Prime time TV 3 times the last 2 years and this is already their 2nd appearance with 5 scheduled. While this is written prior to the DEN/PIT game ATL got off to a great start as Ryan connected with his top 3 rec's (Jones, White & Gonzalez) for 17 rec, 248 yds (14.6) and 3 td's. The Falcons were 4-1 ATS as a HF LY but only faced one winning team (TEN) and they failed to cover while the other 4 opponents avg'd just 4.5 wins last season. **This will be our Monday Night Magic release** so call on game day after 3pm ET.

FRESNO ST 30 Colorado 20 - First trip to Fresno for the Buffs. CU is 4-1 vs FSU but lost the L meeting 24-22 ('01). The Buffs have lost 7 str 'true' road openers SU by 19 ppg (4-12 SU/ATS). CU is a disappointing 0-2 SU/ATS getting upset by in-state rival CSU in the opener and then LW lost on the final play to Sacramento St 30-28 (-21) as they were outgained 466-341. FSU comes in 1-1 after LW's 42-25 (+34) loss to Oreg. At one point the Bulldogs were down 35-3 in the 2Q. They do have a very solid trifectá in QB Carr (266 ypg, 68%, 3-0 ratio) RB Rouse (119 ypg, 4.9) and WR Adams (19 rec, 11.1). FSU has 14 ret'g st'rs and will be excited hosting a P12 tm while CÚ has just 9 ret'g st'rs and has their P12 opener on deck. FSU was just 1-13 ATS as a HF under former HC Hill but this is a new staff. FSU has a large edge on off (#43-108) and CU is just 1-11 ATS on the road. FSU has hosted 3 BCS tms the L3Y knocking off both Cincy and IL and will make it 3 str here.

UTEP 28 New Mexico St 20 - "Battle of I-10". UTEP has now won 3 in a row (by 21 ppg) in this series both SU/ATS and the LTH, won 42-10 with a 495-296 yd edge (-15'). LY UTEP was without starting QB Lamaison and bkp QB Jay Hall hit just 9-28-124 but UTEP (+3) won 16-10 on the road. NMSt fmbl'd at the 1 after an 80/15pl drive, missed a 21 yd FG and settled for a 20 yd FG and led 10-6 when UTEP had a fake P which went 60 yds and set up a td. The HT is 11-4 SU but just 1-6 ATS the L/7Y. The Aggies are 1-6 L3Y in the 2nd of B2B road gms (win LY at NM) and are off a 51-24 loss to Ohio (+21'). The gm was just 21-17 in the 3Q before OU exploded. One wk after throwing for 367 yds, NMSt QB Manley had just 132 LW. UTEP is 0-2 but both losses came to BCS tms as LW they yds, NMSt QB Manley had just 13/2 LW. UTEP is U-2 but bour losses carrie to DCG inis as Lw urey lost 28-10 to Ole Miss (+8). While UTEP is just 9-19 as a fav the Miners are playing a brutal sked TY and this will be the only gm in Sept in which they will be favored and need to take care of business.

UCLA 44 Houston 20 - LY UH had a clear-cut edge in the weather as they had been practicing in high heat and LA's high temperature all summer had been 76°. The game was moved to 3:00 in the afternoon and it was 92° at KO. UH led 31-14 at the half. UCLA converted on 4&gl for a td and UH fmbl'd at the LA5 and the Bruins went 95 yds for a td to pull back to 31-28. UH led 38-28 with 9:31 UCLA got a td with 1:19 left but UH rec'd the onside and took a knee. UCLA is 11-5 SU/ATS vs non-conf. LTH UH trailed 31-3 after 3Q's gaining 32% of their yds in the 4Q (115). QB Keenum was inj'd late 2Q and UH was down to its 3rd string late 3Q (current QB Piland DNP). These tms seem to be heading in different directions under 1st yr HC's as UCLA is 2-0 SU/ATS and UH is 0-2 SU/ATS. LW both tms were involved in shootouts as the Bruins pulled a 36-30 upset (+5') over Neb while the Cougs set multiple NCAA records in a 56-49 loss (+3) to La Tech (see LT write-up). UCLA frosh QB Hundley has been sensational avg 254 ypg (69%) with a 6-1 ratio while RB Franklin leads the NCAA in rush with 431 (10.5!). UH QB Piland, after struggling in the opener (UH OC fired), rebounded nicely completing 53-77-580 and a 4-0 ratio. The HT is 5-1 ATS (4 str covers) while UH is 4-9 ATS in road openers so with the technical and talent edges in their favor, expect the Bruins to continue their hot start

GEORGIA 48 Florida Atlantic 6 - GA is 9-0 vs the SBC (avg win 46-11) but is just 2-5 ATS and in an SEC sandwich between a 1st time road trip to Mizzou with 3 SEC gms on deck. Despite missing 4 D st'rs (susp) the Dawgs rallied from a 17-9 early 3Q deficit to score 32 2H pts in a 41-20 win as 3 pt AF's. Up 27-20 in the 4Q MO had an int ret'd to their 1 and a FR to the 5 which set up short to 'drives' to blow the gm open. Ex-FAU HC Schnellenberger used these "money games" to play bkps and get his team ready for conf play and was just 5-18-1 ATS vs BCS schools. They have a new HC in Pellini and are off a 31-17 loss to MT as 7' pt dogs in which they trailed just 7-0 at the half before being worn down by the Raiders run game being outrushed 302-96. FAU is 1-6 ATS vs ranked tms. GA did beat NMSt in an SEC sandwich LY 63-16 (-34') and look for more of the same here.

NEBRASKA 47 Arkansas St 21 - In their only previous meeting NU was a 21 pt HF in '09 and won 38-9 with a 494-274 yd edge. NU has won 9 str non-conf HG's (5-4 ATS) by 29 ppg and is 10-0 SU and 6-2 ATS all-time vs current SBC members (avg score 47-7). Ark St has dropped 11 str non-conf away gms by 17 ppg. ASU (-23') was almost an upset victim in HC Malzahn's home debut as they



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rallied from a 21-10 deficit to Memphis as RB Oku got the go ahead td run with 6:31 left. ASU outFD'd (33-13) and outgained (619-293) the Tigers as Mem scored td's thanks to a blk'd P and a FR in the EZ. In front of a nearly split Rose Bowl crowd NU did get upset by UCLA (-5) as the Bruins sk'd QB Martinez in the EZ for a S to break a 27 tie in the 4Q. Despite a 92 yd td run for Martinez the Huskers were outgained 653-439 as they played without RB Burkhead (1357 yd LY, CS). The Blackshirts are all'g 457 ypg and 28 ppg. The Huskers are 8-5-1 ATS off a SU loss under Pellini and will take the Red Wolves seriously as they were 10-3 LY and won the SBC but Pellini is just 5-12 ATS as a HF.

NC STATE 40 South Alabama 6 - LY NCSt was off a loss and -24' at home vs a SA team that came in having won the 1st 19 gms in program hist but mostly vs competition that was below FCS level. NCSt never got ahead of the spread, adding a 67 yd td pass with 3:55 left to win by 22 w/a 392-286 yd edge. This is SA's 1st road gm but they have 15 ret st'rs. Hitting just 3 FG's SA won 9-3 over a Nicholls tm playing its 1st gm of the yr. The Jags held NSU to just 118 yds (best s/10) and forced 3 TO's stopping the Colonels twice inside SA terr in the 4Q. NCSt (-3') also leaned on their D to force 4 TO's in a 10-7 win at Conn in which QB Glennon hit the GW 46 yd fd pass in the 3Q. After throwing for 3,054 yds and 31 td LY Glennon has struggled behind an OL which has all'd 7 sks and the run gm is avg 87 ypg (2.4). O'Brien may want to get the offensive kinks out here. NCSt is 7-2 ATS as a HF, this is their home opener and they have just The Citadel on deck.

UCF 37 Fiu 13 - LY (1st meeting) UCF led 7-0 and took over with 2:58 left 2Q but QB Godfrey was sk'd and fmbl'd (Godfrey said his arm was going forward and O'Leary was upset that they did not review) and FIU ret'd it 49 yds for a td with :06 left 1H to tie it at 7. In the 3Q UCF fmbl'd a punt at their own 8 setting up another FIU td as the Knights lost 17-10 (-6) on the road despite a 300-238 yd edge LW. The Knights covered (+18') but lost at Ohio St thanks to 3 TO's and their inability to contain Bucks QB Miller (296 ttl yd and 4 td). ÚCF tied the gm at 10 in the 2Q but after an exchange of TO's, OSU got td's on 3 str poss to put it out of reach. OSU finished with 25-16 FD and 411-352 yd edges. FIU (-23') needed OT to beat an Akron team 41-38 at home who the Knights (-24) pummelled 56-14 thanks to 4 UA TO's on the road 2W ago (UCF 3★ Winner on these pages). After a botched snap, FIU hit a 30 yd FG on the last play of regulation and a 29 yd'r to win after UA missed a 45 yd'r. Medlock ran for a schl QB rec'd 141 in the win. UCF is 20-10-1 ATS in Bright House, have a bye on deck and are playing with legit revenge. UCF is 10-4 ATS off a SU loss and FIU is 4-18 SU in non-conf AG's.

OKLAHOMA ST 52 Louisiana 17 - While OSU is 5-0 SU vs UL with no win by less than 17, they are just 2-3 ATS. In '10 they were -24 at UL and actually trailed 21-17 at half but covered 54-28 It's it was 100° and OSU outgained UL 666-320 but thanks to 2 D td's, UL got the cover +38 "only" losing 61-34. Gundy is 16-7-1 as a HF but UL is 13-1 ATS as an AD incl LW's (+3) 37-24 upset at Troy snapping a 21 gm road opener losing streak. Despite being outgained 588-398 UL capitalized on 3 TO's incl a 56 yd FR td behind bkp QB Broadway (Gautier inj'd 1Q, CS) as they scored on all 6 RZ trips. OSU got out to a 14-0 lead but pen's (15 for schl rec'd 167 yd) and mistakes (4 TO's) were the difference as the Cowboys had a 636-501 yd edge in the 59-38 loss. UA clung to a 37-31 lead in the 4Q when the Cats got a 48 yd IR td to make it a 2 score gm. After not finishing the 1Q in wk 1's blowout true frosh QB Lunt hit 37-60-436-4-3 in his road debut. OSU is 11-6 ATS under Gundy

after a SU loss and has a bye on deck but the Cajuns are scrappy dogs. KANSAS ST 37 North Texas 13 - KSU's only loss vs NT was in '85 (1st gm) and since then they have won 5 str by 28 ppg. In the L/3 in Manhattan ('00, '05 and '08) the Mean Green have been outgained by 367 ypg withe avg score 51-8. K-St is off a huge blowout of Miami and has Okla on deck making this a sandwich game and the dog is 19-10 ATS in K-St gms (0-2 TY). KSU (-6') dominated the Canes jumping out to a 52-6 4Q cushion before UM scored their only off to and the Cats finished with 27-13 FD and 498-262 yd edges. NT crushed TX Southern 34-7 dominating the LOS with a 352-31 yd rush edge. Snyder was 7-5 ATS ('95-'06) vs McCarney when the latter was at Iowa St but McCarney won 2 of the L'/3 SU/ATS incl '04 when they won here 37-23 (+11). To keep QB Klein fresh for OU they will probably limit his runs making this number too high for our liking.

Middle Tennessee 31 MEMPHIS 30 - LY we had a Big Dog POW on Mem and almost got another outright DD upset. MT was a 23' pt HF at home but needed a 33 yd td pass with :11 left to get a win. Each team finished LY with just 2 wins. The home tm is 7-1 while MT is 7-3 SU in this instate series (2-2 ATS all-time lined). All 3 of MT's losses in the series have come in the Liberty Bowl. LTH UM scored all 24 pts off of 4 TO's in a 24-17 win (+3'). UM has its 3rd HC in 4 yrs and is just 5-13 ATS at home incl the ssn opening SU loss to UT Martin. LW we nearly got another big upset for the Big Dog as the Tigers (+23') had td's on a blk'd P and a FR and led Ark St for most of the gm despite being outFD'd 33-13 and outgained 619-293. MT (-7') had two 100 yd rushers for the first time since '09 and dominated the ground gm (302-96 yd edge) in their 31-17 (-7) win over FAU. MT is 10-5 ATS as an away favorite and the schools are just 240 miles apart.

KENTUCKY 27 Wku 20 - LY these 2 played in LP Field and WKU actually had an 86-45 1H yd edge and UK had just 75 yds after 3Q's (WKU 234-190 yd edge gm even though QB Jakes repeatedly overthrew open rec's). UK (-16') still won 14-3. Fourth meeting in 5 yrs and UK is 3-0 vs WKU (all gms after '08). LTH the Wildcats won 63-28 with a 482-284 yd edge.
