4★ Wisconsin over PURDUE - HC. UW is now 6-0 SU/ATS (avg cover by 13 ppg) vs PU and the L4Y have won by an avg of 39-8. LY UW (-26) won 62-17 at home as Ball ran for a career high 232 yds and 3 td's and UW finished with 605-284 yd and 30-14 FD edges. UW has won their L2 trips here by 21 each time with 102 and 303 ypg edges. With the B10's only 2-0 tms in conf play (OSU and PSU) ineligible to play in the title game, the winner of this one is likely to capture the Leaders title. UW (-14) delivered a 3★ on these pages in their 31-14 win over IL. The Badgers outgained IL 427-284 although they did add a td run with 3:26 left to secure the cover. QB Stave started and hit 16-25-254-2-1 although #3 QB Phillips saw action for the 1st time s/09 in the 1H. RB Ball (569, 4.0) looked good and WR Abbrederis (516, 11.9) had his 3rd str 100 yd gm since returning from inj. TO's (4) and D-Rob (340 of UM's 409 tt yds) derailed the Boilermaker Express as PU lost 44-13 as a 3' pt HD. With the offense going nowhere Hope played 3 QB's with TerBush hitting 16-25-105-1-1 incl a pick-6, Henry 2-2-9-0-0 and despite a torn ACL Marve hit 5-5-43-0-1. This summer Vegas had UW (-7) and with their offense starting to find its gear we think the Badgers are a Play On tm down the stretch.

FORECAST: Wisconsin 30 PURDUE 20

3★ Florida over VANDERBILT - In UF's last trip here (10) we used a 4.5★ LPS on UF (-14) and they flat out dominated as they led 41-0 with Meyer confused as to what to tell his tm to improve on at the HT interview. UF has now won 24 in a row SU but VU is on a 6-4 ATS run. LY in the 1H UF fmbld into the EZ and missed a FG. UF had a 277-119 yd edge but only led 17-0 and VU got a td with 1:16 left to only lose 26-21 (+13). After going 1-8 ATS as a HD (09-10) the Dores are a perfect 4-0 ATS L2Y. UF is 10-4 ATS as an SEC fav and the visitor is 12-7 ATS in this series with UF being a fav of 12+ for 19 str yrs. Arguably no tm has been more impressive TY than the Gators, especially after their opener as they are now 5-0 SU and have covered 4 str gms after their 14-6 win (+3) over #4 LSU LW delivering another Outright Upset for our Underdog POW on these pages. UF dominated the LOS with a 176-42 rush yd edge thanks to RB Gillislee's career-high 146 yds (4.3). VU is off a 19-15 (+7) win at Mizzou but was down 6-0 when MO QB Franklin left w/inj and DNR. The Dores also benefitted from a botched xp snap and a bobbled P that led to a safety and were outgained by 100 yds. This is a dangerous sandwich gm for UF as they're off that huge HG vs LSU and have SC and UGA on deck but the Gators have not lost in Nashville s/08, winning 10 str trips by 20 ppg. Even if UF sleep walks thru the 1H, Muschamp's 2H adjustments have resulted in the Gators outscoring their opp 78-13 incl 41-0 in the 4Q!

FORECAST: Florida 27 VANDERBILT 10

3★ New Mexico over HAWAII - It's taken new NM HC Davie 6 gms to do what it took previous HC Locksley 3 full seasons to do, win 3. Both new HC's have made dramatic scheme changes going to a rush offense. The Lobos have avg'd 272 ypg and 5.4 ypc while the Warriors have only avg'd 104 ypg and 3.1 ypc. UH has been plagued with inj's especially on D, as they've all'd an avg of 509 ypg and 56 ppg the L3W. With UH now in the MW this is an unusual trip (last was '88) but off an impressive outing (NM fans standing O after Boise) and a dominating win over TSU, this Lobo squad has an energy and excitement not felt by anyone in Albuquerque since '07. The Warriors meanwhile are 0-4 SU vs FBS foes and B2B trips can be wearing as in the L3Y they failed to cover both in that instance by 13 ppg. While NM will be in the rare role of AF (1st time s/08, 1-4 ATS), we have no prob backing a tm that has covered its L/3 gms by 20 ppg against a tm that has failed to cover its L/3 gms by 28 ppg!

FORECAST: New Mexico 33 HAWAII 23

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ UCF over Southern Miss - LY SM was -8 at home. SM led 30-23 and got a FD to the UCF12 and would have either gotten a FG or a td to get ahead of the spread but fmbld at the 11 with 2:47 left. UCF went 89 yds and got a 25 yd td pass on the last play and went for 2 and it was ng. SM is 6-1 SU and 3-4 ATS vs UCF and has won all 3 trips in Orlando. LTH SM pulled the outright upset (+10) 31-21 as UCF was ranked for the 1st time in school history. UCF is 13-6-1 as a conf HF. These tms look to be heading in opposite directions as SM is 0-5 SU/1-4 ATS, their worst start s/76. LW they lost at home to Boise 40-14 (+9) but did have a 424-310 yd edge as they suffered 5 TO's. QB play has been the prob as they have shuffled between 3 TY, and LW Alford (runner) had to replace the ineffective Lloyd (best passer). UCF is 3-2 SU/ATS with their only losses to OSU/Mizzou, two gms where they more than held their own. With a win here, UCF would be the prohibitive fav to take home the CUSA East title and playing at Bright House (21-10-1 ATS) should be more than enough to give them sweet revenge in a big way.

FORECAST: UCF 37 Southern Miss 13

2★ Oklahoma St over KANSAS - The fav is 7-1 SU/ATS in this series. OSU (+6) lost at home 43-28 to KU in '07 but the L2Y won 48-14 on the road (-24) and LY at home were -31 but won 70-28 tying a schl rec'd with 56 1H pts even pulling their str's on the final drive of the 1H! OSU scored td's on all 8 1H poss. The Pokes should be well rested as this is only their 2nd gm in 4W coming off a bye while KU is off their rival KSU. The extra time all'd QB Lunt (knee) to miss just 1 gm but Walsh (#2 FBS pass eff 199 ypg, 67%, 8-2, 159 rush) has been impressive and may continue to be used in packages which take advantage of his mobility. KU actually took a 14-7 lead over rival KSU before reality set in as the Cats then scored 49 of the next 51 pts. The Hawks actually outFD'd KSU 24-22 but the -5 TO deficit gave the Cats a short field as their 5 2H td drives avg'd 44 yds. KU QB Crist struggled yet again (190 ypg, 50%, 3-7) causing Weis to go with bkp Cummings for the 1st time this ssn. OSU has done well as a DD conf fav going 15-5 ATS and 11-3 ATS as a 20+ fav and get the nod here.

Arizona St at COLORADO - ESPN. ASU is 3-0 SU/ATS in their recent meetings ('06, '07 and '10) and has won by an avg of 34-10 (+172 ypg). LY CU came in banged up on both sides of the ball and ASU was fresh off a bye and led 41-7 after 3Q's. ASU needed a td with 6:20 left to get ahead of the spread, 48-14 and CU fmbld at the ASU2 gaining 177 of their 420 yds in the 4Q. ASU is 4-1 SU/ATS TY and is much improved and while CU is 1-4 SU/ATS although the Buffs are 3-2 SU and 5-0 ATS with 2 outright upsets the wk after a bye!

UTEP at TULSA - FSN. Heading into LY UTEP had won all 3 CUSA meetings at home incl upsets in '07 and '09. TU came into the game with little to play for as if they beat UH the next week, they would win the CUSA West, win or lose vs UTEP. TU only finished with a 500-443 yd edge in the 57-28 (-13) road win. The fav is 2-6 ATS in the series but the HT is 9-2 SU, 12-8 ATS and the schools have avg'd 76 ppg the L/9 meetings. LW the Hurricane (-3) beat Marshall, 45-38 as we cashed our Top Weekly CTOT on the Over while UTEP (-1) was shutout at home 17-0 vs SMU. Tulsa will be fired up for this national TV game and is 5-1 and looking for style points but UTEP has played a much tougher sked (#26-110).

Wku at TROY - A pivotal early ssn SBC gm with the winner remaining among the top 2-3 tms in the chase. LY winds gusting from 20-29 mph and WKU RB Rainey rushed for 227 yds as WKU (-5) had 494-330 yd and 23-15 FD edges in their 41-18 win. Both tms are off a bye and while WKU's amazing 13 str gm ATS streak still stands (longest in CFB in 10+ yrs), Troy is 8-1-1 SU vs WKU suffering their only series loss LY so they have legitimate revenge here.

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at AF in the 4Q but behind bkp QB Reynolds (Miller inj'd 4Q, CS) rallied for a win in OT as we cashed ANOTHER Outright Upset for the Big Dogs. CM is off a 50-35 loss (+11) at UT but should be fired up after not being at home for 5 wks. CM is just 2-9 ATS at home under Enos but they do have the off edge (#74-107). **Friday Night Marquee are ON FIRE (5-1 83%). † Oklahoma 31 Texas 28 - Dallas. UT had lost 5 in a row to OU from '00-'04 incl 3 outright upsets. Many wondered if Mack Brown could beat Bob Stoops. UT then won 4 of the next 5 (4-1 ATS). LY OU (-11) had the veteran QB while UT was rotating a Fr and So and UT was -4 in TO's in the 55-17 rout as OU scored 3 D td's. OU (-4) used the bye to regroup and won their 19th str off a loss by beating TT, 41-20. After TT took a 14-13 2Q lead, OU scored 27 str pts incl a 46 yd pick-6 to pull away. Playing with a practically brand new rec corps, NFL hopeful QB Jones (258 ypg, 63%, 7-2) is #9 B12 pass eff. UT (-7) lost its 7th str to a ranked tm vs WV as they led 38-34 going into the 4Q but couldn't protect their lead as WV went on 76/12pl and 76/8pl td drives while UT drove to the WV34 but was SOD and the WV8 but missed a FG before scoring with :15 left. QB Ash (255 ypg, 78%, 11-1) is #3 FBS pass eff. UT's secondary has been a disappointment rating #90 pass eff D (222 ypg, 60%, 9-7). Eleven of the L/14 RRR's have been decided by DD's but we expect this one to come down to the wire as both tms can ill afford a 2nd loss in B12 play.

MICHIGAN ST 19 Iowa 10 - The HT is 10-2 SU (7-5 ATS) in this series but Iowa is 8-2 ATS. LY Iowa was a 3 pt HD and MSU was out to avenge the previous yr's thrashing when Iowa (-6-) beat them 37-6. MSU got its 1st win in Iowa City s/89 breaking a 7 gm losing streak as they won 37-21. MSU is 2-4 SU/ATS prior to rival Mich (also Wisky, Neb next 2W) and the Hawks are off a bye. Iowa used the bye to work on its offense with QB Vandenberg #100 FBS pass eff (200 ypg, 58%, 2-2). They will get back Bullock (280, 4.3) who was their leading rusher when he was inj'd in wk 3. FB Weisman then took over running for 507 yd (7.0) and 7 td in the L/3. MSU fell behind B10 doomed Indy 17-0 in the 1Q and 27-14 at the half before regrouping to hold IU scoreless in the 2H with 2 FD's and 37 tt yds in a 31-27 win as a 15 pt AF. QB Maxwell (238 ypg, 56%, 6-3) saw #1 rec TE Sims (313, 13.0) leave the gm early (ankle). Bell remains the B10's top RB rusher (#9 FBS 776, 4.5). MSU is #1 B10 rush D (86 ypg, 3.0). MSU has the off (#80-91), D (#7-49) and ST's (#40-45) edges but the dog is 16-6 ATS (8 of the L/9 decided by a td or less).

North Carolina 44 MIAMI, FL 34 - LY UM was on its 2nd str road trip and NC was -2' at home but the Canes built a 27-3 lead in the 2Q. NC got within 30-24 and did recover the onside and got 2 FD's to the UM30 with :26 left but couldn't score. NC is off a 48-34 (-6) over VT as RB Bernard ran for a career-high 262 yds (11.4) which were the most rush yds ever vs a Frank Beamer ch'd VT tm. QB Renner is avg 269 ypg (63%) with a 15-4 ratio while defensively they are all g just 86 rush ypg (2.6). UM is off the gm vs ND (Soldier Field) with FSU on deck (2-5 ATS prior). After several key drops and pen which could have given them the early lead, UM found themselves down 7-3 as ND scored the L/34 pts in a 41-3 loss (+15). QB Morris is avg 306 ypg (59%) with a 9-4 ratio but the D has been the problem giving up 510 ypg (#122) incl 376 rush yds LW. The Canes have been outscored 93-16 vs their two Top 20 opp TY, and NC, w/a healthy Bernard is a Top 20 tm. In a gm that could decide the Coastal (UM is 3-0 in ACC), NC has the edges on off (#12-38), def (#38-92) and ST's (#3-50) and keep in mind UM has been traditionally poor at home since they left the Orange Bowl with no great home field atmosphere (4-8 ATS run).

BOWLING GREEN 31 Miami, Oh 24 - "Miami Whammy!" Traditionally MU has been the thorn in BG's side as they are the only tm in the MAC that they have a losing record against (21-42-5 all-time). However, LY BG (+4) got the longest run in schl hist, a 96 yd'r by Samuel in the 37-23 win. MU is 10-3 SU vs BG and LTH got a 33 yd FG (after a 4★) as time expired to pull out a 24-21 (-2) win which was played in dense fog. LW BG (-5) cashed us a 4★ LPS Small Coll Play as they dominated Akron in the 2H outscoring them 24-0 (held them to just 36 2H yds) in the win. A wk prior Akron torched MU for 629 yds and 49 pts in a 7 pt MU win. Miami is off yet another blowout loss to rival Cincy (7 str) as they were outscored 28-0 in the 2H of a 52-14 loss (+20). QB Dyserl is avg 286 ypg (64%) with a 13-6 ratio but the rush D is all g 243 ypg (5.6). While it is well noted the HT is just 1-7 SU and has lost 4 in a row SU/ATS with 4 outright upsets, the Falcons are simply the better tm with a huge edge on D (#59-120).

ARMY 31 Kent St 28 - In the L/gm ('10) KSU trailed 28-7 at HT being outgained 220-158 and in the 2H never got closer than 14 pts in the 45-28 loss. Army is 2-0 SU ('06 & '10) vs KSU but did go 0-4 LY vs the MAC. Army picked up its 1st win of the ssn LW over BC 34-31 (+9) as we cashed our 5th str Big Dog Comp Play Winner given out Free every Thurs. QB Steelman ran for 141 yds (6.4) incl the GW 29 yd td w/45 left. It was the 4th time this ssn that Army had 2 ply'r's top 100 yds (1st time s/48) as they totalled 516 rush yds (6.5) and now lead the country avg 397 ypg. KSU is off to its best start s/87 after LY's 41-14 win at EM (-3) and now stand at 4-1 SU/ATS. They racked up 27-7 FD and 467-200 yd edges in the win. RB Archer leads the country in all-purp yds avg 231 ypg! KSU has dropped 11 str road/neutral non-conf AG's by 25 ppg (3-8 ATS). Both tms have veteran units but Kent is in a MAC sandwich while Army is in the 3rd gm of a 3 gm homestand and is 6-1 ATS at home.

OHIO 47 Akron 30 - LY Solich thought OU played its most complete game of the yr vs UA as the Cats had a 319-136 yd edge at the half and UA got a 5 yd td drive after a fmbld to pull within 23-10 after 3Q's. OU (-13) led 37-13 when UA drove 74/9pl for a td with 2:11 left. OU has won 4 in a row SU by 16 ppg and the HT in the series is 8-3 SU with the Cats 4-1 ATS at home. OU is off to a 6-0 SU (3-3 ATS) start, their best s/76 but LW was outFD'd 30-16 and outgained 501-333 in the 38-31 win (-14) at home vs Buff. While the off is led by the nation's #3 rusher in Blakenship (843, 4.6), the D has all'd B2B gms of 500+. Akron is much improved TY but still stands at 1-5 SU after we went against them and cashed a 4★ Small Coll Play on BG (-5) in a 24-10 UA loss. The Zips dynamic off rolled up 280 1H yds en route to a 10-0 lead but managed just 36 in the 2H and QB Williams was held to 228 pass yds after avg 336 ypg prior. This is HC for OU and they have a bye on deck but have failed to cover 3 of their L/4 gms as a fav TY and UA has backdoor potential.

Toledo 34 E MICHIGAN 24 - LY UT was -21 at home. They led 23-9 at the half with a 214-147 yd edge and won 54-16 with 542-227 yd and 26-10 FD edges. Since '90 UT has dropped just 4 gms in the series with the avg loss by just 4 ppg (18 wins by 23 ppg). LTH UT had 3 td passes of 50+ in the 42-7 win. After suffering an opening OT loss to Ariz, UT has reeled off 5 str wins (4-1 ATS) after LW's 50-35 win (-11) vs CM. UT did trail 21-10 in the 2Q but benefitted from 2 IR td's incl one w/38 left giving them the frontdoor cover. QB Owens has gone the distance in every gm since that ssn opening loss and is avg 251 ypg (66%) with a 9-1 ratio. After a solid 6-6 ssn LY, it looked like EM had turned the corner under English but TY's 0-5 SU (1-4 ATS) start has them at the bottom of the MAC again. LW off a bye and playing on HC, they were embarrassed 41-14 (+3) by Kent ST getting outFD'd 27-7 and outgained 467-200. EM has been dominated at the LOS all g 305 rush ypg (#124, 6.1) but is capable of giving the favored Rockets some fits as evidenced by their 23-7 loss (+32) to MSU 3 weeks ago.

Maryland 23 VIRGINIA 20 - HC. MD at one time was the far superior program with 16 consec wins between '72-'87 but the Cavs have won 14 of the L/19 (5-1 ATS). LY UVA (-3) was at MD and we used a 3★ LPS on UVA. UVA was dominant with a 527-353 yd edge. The visitor is 5-1 SU (4-2 ATS) incl 3 str wins. These tms seem to be going in opposite directions as UVA is now 0-5-1 ATS TY (2-4 SU) after their 42-17 (+1) loss to Duke but they did outgain Duke 461-394 and were up 17-14 at HT. Poor QB play has doomed UVA all ssn and while QB Sims got the start he comp just 50% of his passes with an 0-2 ratio. MD is now 3-2 SU (2-3 ATS) topping LY's win tt after their 19-14 win (-7) over WF. The Terps are shockingly atop the Atl div and while the off has struggled, one bright spot as been super true Fr WR Diggs who is avg 155 all-purp ypg. The story has been the superb play of their D, which is all g just 257 ypg (#7 NCAA) and held the powerful WV off to just 24 pts and 351 yds, by far WV's lowest ttls of ssn. Tough to lay pts at home with the Cavs who are just 1-7-1 ATS as a HF and we'll side with the better D playing with more confidence.

VIRGINIA TECH 35 Duke 26 - HC. LY Duke was +14' at home. In the 1H VT had a 301-162 yd edge but was SOD twice, missed a chipshot FG and kept Duke's td alive with three 15 yd pen's and only led 14-7. Duke pulled to 14-10 with 7:30 left 3Q but that was the final. VT has won 11 in a row SU (7-4 ATS) vs Sandwick by an avg of 21 ppg (3 shutouts, L/loss in '81) and have outgained them by 219 ypg in the L/8! True sandwick gm for VT off a rd trip to NC and a rd trip revenge vs Clem. The Hokies are off to their worst start s/'92 (3-3 SU/1-5 ATS) after LW's 48-34 loss (+6) at NC. Bud Foster's D continues to be the most disappointing unit in the country and have all 495 yds or more in 3 of the L/4W. As disappointing as VT has been, Duke has been just as surprising in their 5-1 SU/ATS start (best s/'94). LW bkp QB Boone threw 4 td's and WR Vernon became the ACC's all-time rec leader. The technical edges say VT and the situation now favors the Hokies who desperately need a win while Duke comes in fat and happy off a pair of conf wins.

MINNESOTA 28 Northwestern 27 - NU is now 4-1 SU but just 1-4 ATS and the dog has covered 4 in a row. LY NU (-16) scored td's on its 1st 3 drives to lead 21-7. UM got under the spread with a 48 yd FG (7:28) and then NU was SOD on 4&4 at the UM9 passing up a 26 yd FG in a 28-13 win. LTH NU (-5) got a 27 yd FG with 1:58 left to pull out the win 29-28. The visitor is 15-2 ATS. Minny is 5-10 SU/6-9 ATS in B10 HG's but this is the 1st year of alcohol sales at TCF Stadium and the crowds have been distinctively louder giving them a home field edge for the 1st time in years. UM is fresh off a bye which may give QB Gray (high ankle sprain) enough time to heal. He's sat out the L/2.5 gms with the less mobile Shortell throwing for 205 ypg (58%) with a 5-4 ratio incl 3 picks in the loss to Iowa which ended their 5 gm win streak (longest s/'05). The improved D already has forced more TO's (10) than they did in all of '11 (9). NU led PSU 28-17 heading into the 4Q LW but the Lions drove 81/18pl for a td on 4&5, stopped NU, drove 85/16pl for a td, stopped NU on a 4&out and added a td on a 28 yd drive to score the gm's final 22 pts. QB tag team of Siemien and Colter continued with Colter running the option effectively but Siemien struggling to find targets open down field. With a 9-2 comb record these 2 are still the B10's 2 surprise tms but UM may be fresh while NU is playing a 7th str wk and this could go down to the wire.

RUTGERS 27 Syracuse 17 - RU is now 5-2 SU/ATS in this series. LY RU was +1' on the road and had a 13-2 FD edge at the half but trailed 7-3. RU had settled for 1 FG and missed 2 and SU's only td was a 65 yd FR. San San Te missed 3 FG's for RU incl a GW 44 ydr but RU still won it in OT 19-16. The Knights should be focused here off a bye and Conn with only Temple and Kent St on deck and the HT in the series is 10-4 ATS. LW a grinding off and a suffocating D all'd RU to come away with a 19-3 win (-7) over UC. After the gm HC Flood said, "if you could bottle today's game, you'd have Rutgers football." RB Jamison had another 100 yd effort and they did benefit from 5 UC TO's. Meanwhile the Orange after 8 str losses to FBS tms dating back to L/Oct, were able to beat Pitt LW 14-13 (-1') thanks to a stifling D which produced 5 sks and limited the Panthers to 27 rush yds (0.7). QB Nassib is avg 277 ypg (66%) w/a 10-6 ratio but will be tough sledding against our #14 D.

FLORIDA ST 42 Boston College 10 - Prior to LY, BC had given FSU fits since they joined the ACC with the 2 teams 3-3 SU and BC 4-2 ATS never having lost by more than 11 pts. LY FSU dominated as they led 28-0 with a 214-16 yd edge en route to a 38-7 (-14) road win. The visitor is 5-2 SU/6-1 ATS and while FSU does have Miami on deck they are 3-0 ATS in that role. Both tms are off 2H collapses as BC let a 24-14 2Q lead slip away in their 34-31 (-9) loss to Army as they were outFD'd 31-17 and outgained 595-420. After jumping out to a 16-0 HT lead FSU seemed like they were content to just come out of Raleigh with a "W" and it cost them dearly as a key punt blk set up NCST for the GW td pass w/16 left in the 17-16 loss (-17). NCST amazingly conv 3 4th downs on the drive incl the td pass. BC is 20-10 ATS as an AD while FSU is just 4-11 ATS as a conf HF. BC is in between Army and GT option offenses in the middle of a 3 game road trip. Despite the technical edges, FSU has edges on off (#6-77), D (#3-71) and ST's (#2-56) and should roll for the 2nd yr in a row in what, prior to LW, seemed like a flat spot but now will be a statement gm.

CONNECTICUT 23 Temple 13 - HC. UC is 3-1 SU s/'04 but lost the L/meeting ('10), 30-16 as a 6 pt AF. UC is 0-6 ATS vs TU in lined meetings but the Owls should have their attention with this now being a conf gm. LW, much to our dismay, Temple beat USF 37-28 (+3). The Owls benefitted from 2 missed FG's (USF K hadn't missed all yr), were +3 in TO's and were greatly helped by RB Harris who after just 35 yds in 15 carries TY (hamstring), ran for 133 yds. Conn is off a 19-3 (+7) loss to Rutgers as the FD's were even at 17 but were done in by 5 TO's. When you have one tm that was -4 in TO's and one that was +3 the prev wk, obviously there will be some line value favoring the Huskies. Pasqualoni is just 2-5 here as a HF and they have a Friday night gm at Syr on deck while Addazio is 3-1 as a dog. While the tech edges favor the Owls, the Huskies clearly have the better defense (#18-90) and need a win if they have any hopes of making a bowl this year.

PITTSBURGH 24 Louisville 21 - UL won the 1st 3 meetings in this series but Pitt has now won 4 in a row by 21 ppg and have covered 5 in a row! LY was the 1st time the dog won SU in the series as Pitt (+3) won on the road 21-14. Pitt led 21-7 before UL got a 25 yd td pass with :12 left. UL comes in off a bye (15-8 ATS) while Pitt (2-3 SU/3-2 ATS) is off a tough Fri night loss at Syr, 14-13 (+1'). The key play was a 52 yd FR td for Syr that gave them a 14-0 lead and while Pitt did have a 346-305 yd edge they were held to just 27 rush yds (0.7). Pitt's inconsistent QB Sunseri has shockingly recovered to avg 315 ypg (73%) with a 7-1 ratio the L/3W while his counterpart, UL QB Bridgewater, who avg'd 285 ypg (82%) with a 5-0 ratio the 1st 3W, is avg just 141 ypg (56%) with a 3-3 ratio the L/2. UL comes in undefeated at 5-0 but they have failed to cover each of their L/2 AG's as an AF despite not bringing home an outright BE Champ Pitt is an impressive 20-9 ATS vs BE foes, is at home and has the owned the series. Pitt is 4-0 the L/2Y as a HD with 2 outright upsets and grabs another key conf win here.

E CAROLINA 34 Memphis 13 - HC. LY we had a Marquee Inside Information PPH on EC (-14) and they delivered 35-17 with a 524-233 yd edge. EC has won 6 str in this series by 18 ppg and has covered an amazing 10 str! LW in a gm that could decide the CUSA East race, EC (+11') jumped out to a 14-0 early lead at UCF, but a 99 yd KR td sparked the Knights into outscoring the Pirates 40-6 the rest of the way. QB Carden has started the L/4 and is avg 198 ypg (62%) w/a 4-5 ratio. The Tigers grabbed the 1st win of the Fuente era LW, 14-10, over Rice (+7') - yet another Outright Upset for our Big Dogs (avail every Thurs!) The gm was played in heavy rain as neither tm topped more than 245 tll yds. EC is 15-8 ATS as a HF while Mem is 8-14 ATS as an AD. EC is 47-10 SU all-time on HC incl 3-0 ATS the L3Y. EC has the talent, series and technical edges and should win this one easily by DD's.

Air Force at WYOMING - LY this game was played in heavy winds (30-60 mph winds) but we used WY as a Big Dog POW and they were +16' on the road and delivered the outright upset, 25-17. AF did lose QB Jefferson early when they were SOD at the WY1 late 1Q. LTH the Falcons (-13') trailed 14-7 into the 4Q but had 78/16pl & 80/14pl td drives, outgaining the Cowboys 129-20 and won 20-14 (-13'). The HT is 4-0 ATS in this series. AF is coming off Navy where they are surprisingly 7-3 ATS (0-2 L/2Y). They will need to rely on their Military toughness to bounce back as they blew a 21-13 lead in the 4Q, losing 28-21 (-9) in OT. They did outgain Navy 507-359 but were -3 in TO's. RB Getz leads the NCAA in rush ypg avg 177 (7.9)! WY (+20) also lost in OT LW blowing a 28-21 4Q lead vs Nev. QB Smith was ejected in the 4Q for his 2nd unsportsmanlike pen after leading the Pokes back to a 21-7 deficit and as of presstime it is unclear of his status here. With the tms evenly matched (6 of L7 decided by 10 or less) a better play might be the Under as these two have avg'd just 29 ppg comb the L/5Y going Under in all 5 and covering towards the Under by 20 ppg! LY WY held AF to their 2nd lowest yds of the season (156 yds below ssn avg) and Christensen is 3-0 ATS vs the bone. If WY QB Smith plays, we'll take the dog by 1.

BALL ST 38W Michigan 37 - LY we had a 3★ CTOT on Over 58 and it covered by HT with WM leading 35-28. BSU got a td with 5:50 left to pull within 7 but WM got a 40 yd FG to lead by 10 and BSU on 4&g! from the 5 was SOD at the 2 with :29 left (WM 45-35, -12). LTH the Broncos jumped out to a 28-0 lead. WM took advantage of 5 BSU TO's resulting in 24 pts and WM won 45-16 (+5) as we also won a 3★ CTOT on Over 48'. BSU fell to 1-2 in MAC play losing 35-23 as a 3 pt HD to NI despite QB Wenning's school rec'd pass at (71) and comp (42). BSU took a 23-14 3Q lead but on their next 4 poss threw an int and missed 2 FG's (33, 34) while the D couldn't stop NI QB Lynch (402 tll yd, 4 td) as NI scored the gm's final 21 pts. MAC's #1 passer Wenning (290 ypg, 63%, 11-4) leads the league's #1 off (492 ypg). The D is being ripped for 193 rush ypg (4.9) & 297 pass ypg (62%) with an 18-3 ratio. WM (-17) pounded MAC

newcomer UMass leading 52-7 in the 4Q with 32-16 FD and 551-218 yd edges. QB Van Tubbergen was responsible for 6 td vs UM and in his 2 sts is avg 258 ypg (66%) with a 6-4 ratio while filling in for an inj'd Carder. WM has a big D edge (#80-116) but this could be decided by who has the ball last.

N ILLINOIS 37 Buffalo 23 - UB has lost 7 in a row SU vs NI (4 at DeKalb by 32 ppg). Every gm had been decided by DD until LY (9th overall). LY's gm was tied 10-10 but NI took a 31-10 lead into the 4Q. Down 7, UB went 88/14pl scoring a td w/14 left. OT looked certain but UB missed the xp and UB had a 572-328 yd edge! LTH UB just trailed 21-14 at HT but was shutout in the 2H being outgained 258-123 with 58 yds coming in their final drive and NI won 45-14 (-14). After trailing 23-14 in 3Q at BSU, NI (-3) rallied to win their 5th str scoring the gm's final 21 pts behind QB Lynch (402 tll yd & 4 td). Lynch (209 ypg, 61%, 9-3) is the FBS's #8 rusher (789, 6.9). The Bulls (+14') jumped out to a 14-0 lead over undefeated Ohio but a 100 yd KR td kick started the Cats who scored 24 str pts. After UB tied it up at 24 in the 3Q, OU got 2 td's before UB scored with :08 left. The Bulls did finish with 30-16 FD and 501-333 yd edges! UB is led by QB Zordich (159 ypg, 49%, 8-4, 304 rush). The Huskies have all of the edges especially on D (#69-91) and ST's (#62-120) and only have Akron on deck but UB has covered in all 3 gms as a DD dog TY.

Idaho 26 TEXAS ST 24 - Inaugural WAC gm for TSU but they are ineligible for a conf title and ply'g a WAC member who will be orphaned when the league disbands next yr (TSU to SBC). ID is 3-1 vs TSU (all gms after '90) but lost the L/meeting ('96 in TX), 27-21. The Vandals are 7-20 in WAC away gms (avg W by 11 ppg and avg L by 27 ppg). This is ID's 4th AG in 6W but they are off their 1st win of the ssn, 26-18 over NMSI as an 8' pt HF. ID forced 4 TO's and Farquhar hit 5 FG's incl a 55 ydr. QB Blackman is avg 252 ypg (65%) but with an 8-10 ratio. TSU fell to 2-3 losing 35-14 to NM as a 3' pt AD. After all'g a 60/9pl gm opening td drive, TSU fmbld the ensuing KO which NM then turned into a 1 yd td drive on the next play. The Bobcats were outrushed 361-32 and so far TY they've been outrushed by 211-127 ypg. ID has covered 1 gm TY (1-5) but they should have some renewed confidence after LW's SU win.

MISSISSIPPI 23 Auburn 20 - AU is 15-3 SU and 12-6 ATS (3 str covers by 12 ppg) in this series. In their last trip here in '10, AU was on upset alert as they had moved to #1 in the BCS poll and Houston Nutt had knocked off 3 Top 5 foes and was known as a Giant Killer. AU led 17-14 and Ole Miss was int'd at the 2 and AU scored 17 pts in the final 6:51 of the half to lead 34-17 and went on to a 51-31 win (-7). LY AU was -13 and UM finished the game with a 21-20 FD edge and the game was tied at 17 at the half but AU rolled to a 41-17 lead before Ole Miss got a 10 yd td pass on the final play. LW in a 30-27 (+13) loss to A&M, Ole Miss let a 10 pt 4Q lead slip. Despite a lot of talk of using multiple QB's, Wallace went the distance while throwing for 305 yds (59%) with a 1-2 ratio. The Rebs are much improved TY and their 5-1 ATS rec'd reflects that. Aub is now off to its worst start s/'98 at 1-4 SU/ATS after LW's 24-7 loss to Ark (-7). The much maligned Ark D forced 5 TO's and had 8 sks vs Aub which caused Chizik to finally make a switch to QB Moseley in the 2H, but he then proceeded to throw 2 int's in the EZ. While Ole Miss has a bye on deck and will put forth max effort, we're not sure we can back them as a HF as Aub has the D (#30-54) and ST's (#8-49) edges.

HOUSTON 40 Uab 30 - LY UH was -27' on the road in front of a 75% empty stadium. UH only led 27-10 at the half but finished with 34-17 FD and 655-269 yd edges in their 56-13 win. The SU winner in this series is 8-0 ATS all-time but the Blazers are 0-3 SU/ATS s/'08 (avg score 50-14). LTH ('08) the Blazers led 20-3 at HT with a 257-199 yd edge but were outscored 42-0 in the 2H mustering just 4 FD's and 70 yds. The UH off has produced B2B 600 yd gms and LW UH (-9) beat NT 44-21 thanks to a career-high 210 rush yds by RB Sims. UAB also had an off explosion LW with 52 pts and 512 yds in their win over SE Louisiana. QB Brown in just his 2nd start comp 16-22-266-1-0 all before the half. UH is 3-1 ATS prior to bye in the reg ssn but UAB has played the much tougher sked (#36-93) and has the ST's edge (#57-87) giving them a chance at the backdoor.

MICHIGAN 31 Illinois 14 - UM had won 6 in a row in this series (4-1 ATS) until IL pulled B2B upsets in '08 and '09 winning 45-20 at the Big House (+2) and at home 38-3 (+7). IL covered in '10 (+3) but lost 67-65 in 3OT (highest scoring gm B10 history). LY it was the series 3rd outright upset in 4Y and a 4th str cover by the dog as UM (+1) won 31-14. IL has a bye on deck but is travelling B2B off Wisc. The Illini have now lost their L/3 SU/ATS while being outscored 118-45 after LW's 31-14 loss to Wisky as a 14' pt AD. The Illini led 7-0 early 2Q but the Badgers scored 24 str and outgained IL 427-284. After missing nearly 3 gms due to injury, QB Scheelhaase has gone the distance the L/2 avg 224 ypg (61%, 1-3, 91 rush) behind a banged up OL which has all'd a B10 worst 20 sks. Fresh off a bye UM (-3') clobbered Purd 44-13 as the Wolves forced 4 TO's and outgained the home standing Boilers 409-213. D-Rob atoned for the ND debacle by hitting 8-16-105-1-0 (1st gm TY w/o an int) while running for 24-235 accounting for 84% of UM's tll yds. UM has huge edges on off (#23-105) and D (#19-53) and look to be headed in the right direction but could be peeking ahead with "Lil Brother" on deck.

BOISE ST 31 Fresno 27 - LY was FSU's worst home loss in Pat Hill's 15 yr tenure. #5 Boise led 37-0 at the half and 50-0 after 3Q's delivering a Fri Night Marquee winner for us as we had BSU -20' and were able to go to bed early, 57-7. FSU's 4Q td on a 79 yd PR stopped a BSU streak of 111 str pts in the series as they had won 51-0 the yr before. BSU is on a 10-1 ATS run vs FSU and has scored at least 51 pts in each of the L/4 meetings but look for that to change here as the tms do not resemble their prev editions. While Boise is 4-1 SU/3-2 ATS, they are doing it with a bit of "smoke and mirrors" failing to score an off td in 2 gms and LW were outgained 424-310 in a 40-14 win (-9) thanks to 5 S Miss TO's. On the other side, FSU is 4-2 SU but has covered all 6 gms TY incl LW's 28-7 win (-17) at CSU where they outgained the Rams 408-249. QB Carr is avg 303 ypg (69%) and is #2 in the NCAA in td passes (18) while RB Rouse already has 711 (5.4). Boise is 1-7 ATS as a HF while Fresno is 6-0 ATS as an AD and despite the series domination, Fresno has the better off (#25-60) and is playing with new confidence under 1st yr HC DeRuyter.

Usc 34 WASHINGTON 21 - The Trojans had won 7 in a row w/ UH but Sarkisian, who spent 7 yrs with USC as an asst HC and OC, took over at UW and the Huskies pulled upsets in his first 2 matchups vs his ex-team as 19' and 10 pt dogs. LY USC (-11') at home had a 426-175 yd edge and led 40-0 before UW drove 69 yds for a 4&4, 20 yd gbg td pass with :11 left. USC is 7-4 SU/ATS in Pac-12 AG's (0-2 ATS TY) and is off a 38-28 (-14) road win at Utah. Thanks to two fmbls, USC found themselves down 14-0 early 1Q but then outscored the Utes 38-7 before all'g a backdoor td w/1:20 left. USC is travelling for a 2nd wk in a row (4-11 ATS in 2nd str AG) but did play on Thurs and have a few extra days. UW is off B2B gms vs Stan and Ore and LW lost their 9th str to the Ducks 52-21 (+25) as UW had 5 TO's. USC has the edges off (#10-68), D (#10-41) and ST's (#5-104) and while USC is just 2-9 ATS (5 outright upsets!) as an AF playing the P12 Pacific Northwest tms (Wash's and Ore's) they won at ND and Ore SU/ATS LY playing in cooler temps and LW's score was misleading due to the poor start.

BYU 20 Oregon St 17 - HC. Bronco Mendenhall played LB for OSU and is now 2-0 SU/ATS vs his alma mater both times winning outright as a dog (+2', +3) by DD (24, 10). LY BYU was +3 in Corvallis and had a 282-59 yd edge at half. LW in a gm marred by 8 TO's, OSU beat WSU 19-6 (-15) as they had 370-227 yd and 39:15-20:45 TOP edges. OSU is 4-0 for the 1st time s/'02 and has already topped LY's win tll thanks to a dynamic pass gm (#8) and an improved D all'g 17 ppg (31 ppg LY). BYU's D continues to be among the best in the country (#3 scoring, #5 tll) after LW's 6-3 win over Utah St where we easily cashed our Fri Night Marquee on the Under (covered by 37'). The off has been inconsistent due to QB play and Nelson (back) should return here but Hill, who started the L/2, is doubtful (knee). OSU is 2-11 SU & 5-8 ATS in non-conf AG's. The Beavers are 3-0 ATS as a dog TY - all 3 outright upsets and while the Beavers are much improved TY, BYU is also improved and now has the altitude advantage (3rd str week at home heights) int with OSU in a P12 sandwich.

Alabama 34 MISSOURI 13 - Last met in 1978. MO is 5-12 SU/ATS vs ranked opp's. Ala is 12-5 ATS as an SEC AF and comes in off a bye while the Tigers are off Vandy with a bye on deck. The Tide are the unanimous AP #1 tm that they have lost 3 key ply'rs to ssn ending inj's and in their L/outing only outgained Ole Miss by 87 yds, a tm that TX outgained by 277 yds! Despite the inexp. it's business as usual as the Tide D is #1 in both total/scoring D. QB McCarron is #5 in the NCAA in pass eff and has yet to throw an int TY (12 ttd). LW MO settled for 2 short FG's in jumping out to a 6-0 lead, but then starting QB Franklin went down with inj (out indef), and thanks to a bobbled xp snap and a bobbled punt, lost to Vandy 19-15 (-7). Bkp QB Berkstresser who played well in a start earlier TY in a win over ASU, was just 9-30-189-1-0. Missouri did knock off #3 Okla at home in '10 but w/o their starting QB will fall well short of an upset here.

4★ New England over SEATTLE - Quick name the last two NE HC's? They face off here as Carroll led the Pats from '97-'99. Despite his tenure with the Patriots, Brady has NOT played at CenturyLink Field as he was on IR in 2008 when the teams last met. While both teams have their main division rivals on deck NE has the edge hosting the Jets next Sun while SEA knows that the NFC West goes through SF which is where they'll play on Thursday. While they have beaten DAL and GB at home LW was the 1st time TY that rookie Wilson passed for over 200 yds and unlike DAL/GB, NE can actually run the ball (165 ypg 4.3). Some might be impressed with Seattle's 16 sks the TY games but 8 game vs Green Bay. Now they face one of the league's elite in audibling against a blitz and taking advantage of one-on-one matchups. Belichick is still a great defensive mind confusing starting rookies as he's faced them 13 times allowing 189 ypg, 54% and an 11-21 ratio. No need to worry about a West Coast trip as in the L2Y SD has gone to DEN, OAK and SD and are 3-0 SU/ATS covering by 8 ypg.

FORECAST: New England 31 SEATTLE 17

3★ Dallas over BALTIMORE - DAL has had 2 weeks to seethe over their MNF meltdown and road teams off a bye that lost as HF's prior are 13-4-2 ATS. As we've written many times the Cowboy's line is always inflated at home but on the road especially as a dog they are a looser team away from Jerryville. Dallas is 9-4 ATS as an AD incl covering all 4 vs the AFC the L2Y (HOU, IND, NYJ & NE). Romo's splits are noteworthy as his road numbers (289 ypg, 66%, 19-6) are far superior to his home numbers (244, 67%, 17-12). The Ravens are off a trip to Arrowhead where they needed a stout defensive effort to overcome a flat offense. This is their first non-prime-time home game after winning their first 3 although they failed to cover their last 2. BAL's new high paced offense has avg'd 457 ypg at home while Flacco has avg'd 342 ypg passing but their 3 foes have an avg pass D ranking of #24 while Dallas visits with the #1 ranking. Lastly DC Rob Ryan is now in his 2nd season here and he's quite familiar with the Ravens from his CLE days as with lesser talent he held BAL to 299 ypg and 16 FD's/gm the L3 meetings in 2009 and '10.

FORECAST: Dallas 26 BALTIMORE 23

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Minnesota over WASHINGTON - The formula to win games on the NFL road is to have a solid rush attack, have a D that doesn't allow big plays, win the turnover battle and if you have a superior ST's unit it's a bonus. That's 4 checks for the Vikings! The AP led rush attack has avg 151 ypg and 5.1 ypc L2W while the D is allowing 4.6 ypg. MIN is also on the plus side in the TO battle while having a #16 to #24 ST edge. WAS has played all 3 NFC South teams close beating NO/TB and playing ATL tough until Griffin was KO'd w/a concussion. The Skins D still ranks #30 allowing 456 ypg the L4W while the offense was slowed to a season low 316 vs ATL. With WAS starting either rookie QB, having a defense that ranks at the bottom and having played the #21 schedule means we want no part of them as a favorite. Vikings HC Frazier has pleasant thoughts about the Skins as he beat them 17-13 in 2010 as his first game as interim HC and leads the Vikings to another win this week.

FORECAST: Minnesota 24 WASHINGTON 17

OTHER GAMES

Pittsburgh at TENNESSEE - Thurs. Tough spot for TEN as they return home off B2B road losses by a comb 68-21 and are facing a 4th straight D ranked in the top 12. In LY's game at Pittsburgh the Steelers (-3) dominated as Big Ben threw for 5 td's in the 38-17 win. TEN did however upset the similar Ravens team at home, 26-13 (+5). PIT has lost both road game TY both SU and ATS and are just 7-14-1 ATS as an AF so who prevails? You can find out by calling for this Marquee after Noon ET on game day!

CLEVELAND 14 Cincinnati 13 - Quick rematch here as CIN beat CLE 34-27 in the 1st meeting but failed to cover as a 7 pt HF moving the dog to 9-1-1 ATS in the series. CLE had a 439-375 yd edge as RB Richardson totaled 109 yds (5.7) on the ground. Dalton had 318 yds (77%) with a 3-1 ratio as CLE was without CB Haden (susp) who returns here. The Bengals have won 7 of 8 vs the Browns but are only 4-3-1 ATS and in their L2 trips here as an AF as they won by 3 in OT (-6) and lost outright 51-45 (-7). CLE and the Saints (ply'd SNF) are the only winless teams at presstime which makes the Browns a dangerous, backed into the corner team. This also adds pressure to CIN not wanting to be CLE's first victim and while we don't expect them to overlook an instate div rival next the game on Nat'l TV next SNF vs PIT has to be on their minds. The Browns have totaled 10 sacks in their 2 Div games this year and both were on the road. Now at home they'll hold nothing back as CIN's QB Dalton has been sacked 4 or more times on the road on 3 different occasions and the team has been outscored by an avg of 31-17. Look for this to be another close AFC North battle.

NY JETS 20 Indianapolis 13 - These two last met in the 2010 Wild Card round as the Jets (+2.5) pulled the 17-16 upset over Peyton Manning at IND with Sanchez leading a 41/5pl drive with a 32 yd FG on the final play. This is a must win for the Jets having lost their best off and defensive weapons to IR, off a Monday Nighter vs HOU with a road game vs NE on deck. IND is off a very emotional come from behind played for hospitalized HC Pagano. After trailing 21-3 at HT Luck led the Colts to five 2H scoring drives while the Colts D held the Packers to 5 plays or less on 7 of their 8 second half drives. It'll be much more difficult for interim HC Arians' on the road in front of the frantic Jets fans while Luck plays only his 2nd road game after throwing for only 51% and a 1-3 ratio in his first which was a 20 pt loss to CHI. Look for the Jets to have an aggressive defensive gameplan as when they played another rookie in MIA they were very vanilla with no sks, 1 tfl and only 2 qb's and needed OT to escape with the win. The desperate home team knocks off the young Colts in a letdown spot.

Kansas City 20 TAMPA BAY 17 - The Chiefs go from B2B games at rowdy Arrowhead Stadium to what very well could be the quietest stadium (Raymond James) where TB is 5-18-1 ATS. This is a new role for KC as it's only the 3rd time in 5+ seasons that KC has been an AF (2-1 ATS) but HC Crennel did have his team ready when at CLE as they went 4-1 ATS. The Chiefs cashed as a 3★ on these pages LW holding Flacco to under 200 yds passing. KC continues to be undervalued with their 1-4 record as they rank #4 on off and #11 on defense outgaining foes by 76 ypg vs a top 5 schedule. TB meanwhile, has been outgained by 93 ypg vs a bottom 5 schedule with their #27 off and #25 defense. The Bucs however still have their backers with a new coaching staff and a 3-1 ATS start despite getting outgained by 214 ypg vs both teams with defenses in the top 22. This is the value play of the week with the visitor one of 4 teams with both units in top 11 while the host is one of 4 teams with both units in the bottom 8.

NOTRE DAME 24 Stanford 10 - In '09 Stan snapped a streak of 7 ND wins in a row SU and now has won the L3 SU and covered the L2. LY ND benched QB Rees after he hit 6-13-60 yds with Andrew Hendrix hitting 11-24-192 off the bench. Stan (-7 at home) led 28-7 when ND went 87/4pl getting a 2 yd td run with :23 left to "only" lose by 14. ESPN GameDay will be here for the 1st time s/o05 as ND is now 5-0 SU/4-1 ATS after LW's 41-3 (-15) annihilation of Miami. QB Golson was benched due to being late for a tm meeting, but replaced Rees after one series and had his best day yet hitting 17-22-186-0-0 with 51 rush yds. ND only threw 2 passes in the 2H as they rolled to 376 rush yds (most s'00). Their D has not given up a td in 3 gms and they still are the only tm in the country yet to trail in a gm TY. The same can't be said for Stan who trailed Ariz 48-34 late in the 4Q but was able to force OT and eventually win 54-48 (-10). QB Nunes rebounded from a poor outing vs Wash to throw for a career-high 360 yds. The Irish are 7-1 SU (5-3 ATS) at home vs Stan with their lone loss the LTH in '10. Stan is travelling with Big Game vs Cal on deck (3-6 ATS prior) and the Irish have slight edges across the board.

SAN JOSE ST 26 Utah ST 23 - LY was a missed opportunity for an outright upset by the Big Dog POW as SJS (+10) led 33-21 with 8:21 left but USU got a 21 yd td pass with :41 to go up 34-33 and SJS's 67 yd FG on the final play was blk'd. The Spartans still easily covered by 9 at home. USU is 1-8 in trips to San Jose but won the LTH. The Aggies were down by 3 but went 67/12pl for the GW to

BYES: Carolina, Chicago, Jacksonville, New Orleans

ATLANTA 38 Oakland 17 - Tough spot for OAK coming off a bye where they are 0-9 SU/ATS in that role losing by a 28-13 avg score vs an ATL team that is 8-1 ATS prior to its bye. Compounding this is that since '05 rookie HC's as AD's off a bye are 3-9 ATS. Their #29 pass defense has been beat up by inj's and along with DET the Raiders are the 1 of 2 to have not earned and INT TY giving up 72% comp with a 9-0 ratio. Ryan has avg'd 237 ypg (65%) with a 22-6 ratio in his L10 home games avg 29 ppg. None of OAK's WR's has 200 yds thru 4 games and the top 3 rec's are RB McFadden (18, 6.2), TE Myers (16, 14.3) and FB Reece (13, 9.1). ATL's #17 run defense (5.4) is overinflated by the fact they faced 2 mobile QB's and they get an OAK team desperate to get their run game on track (61 ypg, 3.4). For those worried about a letdown here NDIV HF's of 7 or more prior to the bye are 21-6 ATS since 2002. Falcons stay undefeated!

PHILADELPHIA 30 Detroit 24 - At 1-3 (0-4 ATS) start is depressing for both Lions fans and players but it's even worse that it against the #18 sked. DET's bottom 5 ranking in our special teams ratings is obviously deserved as the unit has clearly cost them the L2 games giving up 2 KO/PR td's in each game. PHI meanwhile became the first ever NFL team to win 3 of their first 4 games by 2 points or less. Vick has been publicly maligned for his 6-6 ratio and 5 fumbles as well but he's been up to the task as the Eagles came from behind and scored last in all 3 wins with GW drives of 82/16pl, 63/10 pl and 75/12 scoring with 1:18, 1:55 and 1:49! PHI almost pulled an upset vs PIT LW but 2 fumbles (one on PIT 3) in the 2Q proved to be the difference. This is a pair of teams that rank in both the top 10 Off/Def but are a combined 1-7-1 ATS thanks to DET #26 scoring def AND PHI #31 scoring offense. DET may get the huge addition of FS Delmas but this game will go to the team that can finish their drives.

MIAMI 17 St Louis 10 - For the 2nd straight week the Rams have a situational edge with extra rest from the Thursday Nite win over ARZ, taking on a MIA team that returns home off B2B road games and a pair of OT affairs in the L3W. STL, however has survived on big plays and that hasn't happened on the road as they are avg 206 ypg and 13 FD's/gm with their longest drive in each road game only 43 and 52 yds. The Dolphins may only be 2-3 but they've played better than we expected. Both the OL and DL deserve credit as they are +5 sacks and avg 4.6 ypc rushing and lead the NFL with 2.6 ypc on rush D. After a confidence building road win against one of LY's playoff teams they are the superior team at home for only the second time after beating OAK 35-13. The system on page 8 makes it even stronger!

ARIZONA 17 Buffalo 14 - ARZ owns the situational edge with extra rest after their loss to STL last Thur's while BUF is in their 3rd road game in 4 Wks having flown out to SF LW. The week after traveling to face the physically relentless 49ers teams have struggled going 3-8-1 ATS incl 1-4-1 ATS away for a second straight. ARZ has its own issues as Kolb's 17 sacks are 4th in NFL history for most in consecutive games (1 out of every 5.8 pass att's). The OL issues don't stop there as they avg 63 ypg (2.7) on the ground. Kolb does have a palatable 208 ypg (61%) and 7-2 ratio and now faces the #24 pass defense giving up 64% with a 12-4 ratio. BUF's OL is missing 2 starters itself (LT/RG) and while ARZ is allowing 101 ypg (3.6 ypc) with just 1 td on the ground. BUF's vaunted DL has been a poor return on investment it's 172 ypg (5.6 ypc) with no cohesion at all. Look for ARZ's #4 pass rush to further expose Fitzpatrick's (177 ypg 54% 6-4 on road) poor mechanics in a game decided by a FG.

SAN FRANCISCO 19 NY Giants 13 - San Fran gets a shot at redemption as a muffed punt cost them a shot at the Superbowl in LY's OT loss in the Conference finals. The 49ers continue to be the NFL's most dominant home team as they manhandled Buffalo (621-204 yds) giving them 9 straight ATS covers as a HF. The Giants trailed Cleveland early but came back behind the running of Bradshaw (200 yds, 6.7) who set new high's in yds (151 rookie ssn) and carries (26 LY) but those numbers will not be duplicated against the league's #2 D. Eli however does have his off rolling avg 469 ypg the L4W and he loves the spotlight on the road as the Giants won at Philly (+8), 28-16, at NE (+9, 24-20), at DAL (+4, 37-34) and of course here in the playoffs (+2, 20-17 in OT). The Giants DL will be the deciding factor in this game as SF is 11-0 ATS when rushing for over 120 yds and on the flip side in their 5 losses the last 1+ seasons they've allowed an avg of 5.2 sks/gm. We'll be fans watching this one as they meet for the 3rd time since last November.

Green Bay at HOUSTON - SNF The Texans host their first prime-time game since Nov 2010 but it comes 6 days after a Monday Nighter at the Jets. While both teams finished in the top 10 in offense LY their defenses both rank in the top 8 this season. Houston has been an ATS machine covering all 5 TY with the MWF results unavailable while also going 7-1 ATS as a fav LY before resting starters the L3W. ARKANSAS 37 Kentucky 20 - UK is actually 4-1 SU in the series (3 outright upsets) but they last met in '08. The visitor is 4-0 ATS. In the L/gm UA (+7) had a 20-7 lead with the ball & just 4:56 remaining but lost by 1. Ark was 10-1 SU/11-0 ATS in SEC HG's but that was under former HC Petrino who liked to keep the foot on the gas. Ark is off B2B AG's but have a bye on deck. They finally broke thru LW with a 24-7 win at Aub (+7) as their D got 8 sks and forced 5 TO's. Prior to that gm they were 0-5 ATS under HC Smith. LW we cashed our near 5★ on MSU (-10) as they beat UK 27-14. The gm was a bit misleading as MSU did have huge 25-13 FD and 427-228 yd edges but were -2 in TO's. UK rotated FR QB's Whitlow and Towles but after Towles led a scoring drive in the 1H he sprained his ankle and could not go in the 2H (CS). Huge edges on off (#31-94) and ST's (#27-72) for Ark. UK has lost 10 str SEC road gms by 24 ypg and look for the same here.

The Cyclones are 5-2 ATS as a HD incl 3 outright upsets (#2 Okla St!) and ISU has been a dog in every gm vs FBS tms TY pulling 3 upsets incl LW's 37-23 win at TCU as a 7 pt AD which ended TCU's FBS best 12 gm win streak. In QB Barnett's first start of the yr (12-21-183-3-1) the Cyclones never trailed after the 4th play of the gm despite being outgained 455-350 and outFD'd 24-15 as ISU forced 5 Frogs TO's incl 3 int by 1st time starting QB Boykin. The HT has won 5 in a row SU and KSU has not traveled here s/07 when ISU (+15') won outright 31-20 which is the last time their matchup was decided by more than 8 pts. ISU has proven time and again that it's dangerous dog and they'll pull the outright upset here. **FORECAST: IOWA ST 24 Kansas St 23**

MISS ST 30 Tennessee 26 - Last met in '08. The Vols are 9-1 SU (6 str wins by 40-15 avg) and 7-3 ATS vs the Bulldogs. From 05-'09 the Bulldogs were 0-7 ATS as a HF but the L2Y have gone 7-4. Tenn is off a bye while MSU is only off UK with MT on deck. The fav has won 8 str Miss ST SEC HG's SU and is 7-1 ATS. UT has not beaten an SEC tm on the road SU other than Vandy and UT s/07 and is 4-12 SU vs the West. LW we cashed our near 5★ on MSU (-10) in their 27-14 win over UK as they rolled to 25-13 FD and 427-228 yd edges. QB Russell is avg 218 ypg (56%) with a 10-1 ratio. Their D has been solid but they will face their biggest test of the ssn vs a Tenn off that is avg 509 ypg and while the pass gm has been as good as expected w/QB Bray avg 317 ypg, it's been the improved run gm avg 179 ypg (4.6) after avg just 90 ypg LY that's been the diff. While the Vols have the off edge (#15-49), MSU has the D (#23-44), ST's (#20-53) and HF edges and move to 6-0 on the ssn.

LSU 23 South Carolina 16 - LSU is 6-17-1 ATS as an SEC HF (3-1 ATS LY) but SC is just 1-7 ATS vs the SEC West. LSU is 10-1 SU hosting SC (only loss in '94). In the L'meeting ('08) LSU (-2) limited SC to 39 rush yds (1.3) & just 1 of 9 on 3D in a 24-17 win. Both tms are off tough gms with LSU off a Florida rd trip and SC off rival UGA but the results could not have been any more different. LSU led UF 6-0 at HT but was dominated at the LOS in the 2H in a 14-6 loss (-3) as we cashed our Underdog POW on these pages on Fla. QB Mettenberger continues to struggle but some of the issues have been a beat-up OL that at one pt was missing 3 str's and overall LSU has lost 15 ply'rs since the summer to inj/trans/susp. SC, in their biggest HG in sch hist, crushed #6 UGA 35-7 (-1'). It was their 10th str win as their D held UGA QB Murray and the SEC's top ranked off coming in to a total of 224 yds (was avg 48 ppg and 536 ypg prior). While the off and D are close, LSU has a huge edge on ST's (#13-95) and we expect the Tigers to be very angry here coming off a loss playing in front of a home night crowd.

California 31 WASH ST 24 - Cal is now 7-0 SU in this series but just 3-4 ATS despite delivering an easy cover LY in Berkeley with a 30-7 victory (-9). Despite a rocky start to the year the Bears finally put together a solid showing LW vs UCLA forcing 6 Bruin TO's in a 26 pt win (+2). The expected high-flying Mike Leach offense was grounded LW in a 19-6 loss to OSU as the Cougs managed just 227 tll yds. WSU has a bye on deck while Cal faces their "Big Game" vs Stan (3-0 ATS L3Y before Stan, 1-7 ATS '01-'08). The SU winner in this series is 23-8 ATS and judging by the toughening up that Cal has been forced to go through with trips to USC and Ohio St, the Bears and their large off (#37-86) and D (#32-86) edges should have no problem playing in front of 32,000 here.

TEXAS TECH 44 West Virginia 41 - Only meeting was in 1938 Sun Bowl. TT is just 1-7 SU (2-6 ATS) when hosting B12 foes (0-4 LY, 1-3 ATS, avg loss 27 ppg). LW we won a 3★ LPS on Okla (-4) who beat the Raiders 41-20 winning in Lubbock for the 1st time s/03. QB Doeg had his worst performance of the ssn hitting just 22-36-203 with 3 int incl a pick-6 which essentially put the gm out of reach in the 3Q. The D, which was ranked #1 tll D by the NCAA coming in all'd a ssn high 380 yds. Holgorsen was a TT assistant from '00-'07 (OC '05-'07) and runs TT's Air Raid offense. WV (+7) trailed Texas 38-34 entering the 4Q but drove 76/12pl and 76/8pl for tlls with 10:50 and 1:18 left for the upset. QB Smith continues to put up Xbox numbers as he's #1 pass eff and pass ypg (399, 81%, 24-0) throwing to the CFB's top tandem in Bailey (#2 FBS rec ypg - 710, 14.5 w/FBS best 13 td) and Austin (#1 FBS rec's per gm - 58 rec, 11.4, 8 td). The pass D continues to struggle however as they're #117 pass eff D (336 ypg, 64%, 11-4). WV is 9-3 ATS on its 2nd str AG but once again in WV's wild B12 debut ssn it may come down to whoever has the ball last as no one in the state of WV marked this gm on the calendar.

Tcu 51 BAYLOR 48 - Ex-SWC rivals now reunited in the B12. TCU had been 3-0 SU/ATS vs BU from '06-'10 winning by an avg of 33-6 incl a 45-10 win in '10 (-21) at home. LY was the Fri night opener and BU (+3') beat a ranked tm for the 1st time s/04. BU led 47-23 in the 3Q but needed a FG with 1:04 left to pull out the upset win 50-48 and RG3's Heisman candidacy began. BU comes in off a bye after the 70-63 loss to WV. The offense hasn't skipped a beat without RG3 as QB Florence is #1 FBS in tll off (435 ypg, 64%, 16-5, 188 rush) while WR Williams is #1 in the FBS in rec ypg (667, 19.6). TCU has to travel here for 2nd yr in a row (visitor 0-3 ATS run). TCU's FBS best 12 gm win streak ended in Ames as ISU (+7) upset them 37-23. With QB Pachall susp'd (CS), Boykin hit 23-40-270-1-3 incl a pick-6 in his 1st start. TCU had 24-15 FD and 455-350 yd edges but couldn't overcome a 5-1 TO deficit. The Frogs D is #6 pass eff D (181, 45%, 6-10) but it should be noted that they've played only 1 off which ranks in the FBS's top 50 in pass ypg. The Frogs do have the ST's (#4-70) and D (#27-105) edges, have covered their L/6 after SU losses under Patterson and are playing with legit revenge.

Ohio St 49 INDIANA 23 - OSU has now won 17 in a row SU vs Indy and is on a 6-1 ATS run. OSU fans have outnumbered IU fans at this site and in the L/3 trips OSU has been either a 3 or 4★ newsletter

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play (PS or PP) and the Bucks are 5-0 SU/ATS here with their avg win by 35-10. OSU has outgained Indy by 268 ypg in the L/7. LY was their rare non-cover. It was 1 wk after OSU had upset Wisc and Miller hit just 5-11-55 but had an 81 yd QB draw for a td. IU actually led 10-0 (13-13 half). Indy only trailed 27-20 when they were int'd at the OSU27 with 4:07 left and the Bucks added a td with 2:41 left for a non-covering 34-20 (-27) home win. OSU is off another big home win TY as they spotted NU the 1Q before storming back to beat the Huskers 63-38 as a 2' pt HF, the most comb pts in an OSU conf gm s/50. The Bucks did score td's via an IR and a PR but they also scored td's on 5 str poss as Miller and RB Hyde comb to run for 44-326-5. The D continued to either make big plays or give them up as they forced 4 TO but also all'd 7pl of 20+ yds incl 2 of 70+ yds. Indy (+15') shocked MSU by jumping out to a 17-0 1Q and 27-14 HT leads but the 2H was another story as the Hoosiers were held to just 37 yd & 2 FD in a 31-27 loss. QB Coffman hit 33-48-282-3-0 while running the no huddle vs the tough Spartans D. OSU is 16-8-1 ATS as an AF, it's tough to go vs history here regardless of the situation.

Smu 34 TULANE 10 - The inj plagued TU ssn has completely halted any enthusiasm that new HC Johnson tried to carry over from the Saints. TU is now 0-5 (1-4-1 ATS) and after covering in the opener with a healthy QB Griffin they have avg'd just 178 ypg and have finished with only 11 FD's in 3 of those 4 gms. As you would expect when TU's defense is on the field for the majority of time they've been getting mauled for 525 ypg in those same 4 contests. Both their starting QB and RB are finally appearing on the inj list as ? but we don't expect them back here. While we're not a fan of laying the wood with a team that has won only 8 road gms in 4+ yrs the cavernous Superdome makes this close to a neutral matchup. LW's shutout at UTEP was the Mustangs 2nd of the ssn while the offense ret'd just 3 str's TY, they've already avg'd 440 ypg on the road. At 1-0 in CUSA play and with Hou on deck on Thurs SMU will not look past a tm they can dominate.

RICE 27 Utsa 24 - HC. Can it get any easier when a 5-0 team off a bye takes on a 1-4 team that was just upset by Memphis? We don't think so either. The Roadrunners have taken on the 2 other teams that moved up to the FBS this season, 2 DII foes and a New Mex St squad that has lost their L/8 vs FBS foes by 21 ppg. The Owls have only played 2 games at home. The loss to UCLA was expected while they outgained Marshall 647-593 losing in OT. Most teams may not give 100% attention to a non-conf game sandwiched between a pair of CUSA road games but at only 120 miles apart, recruiting the same players and just flat out pride to beat the "newcomer" Rice will be at their emotional peak.

Nevada 41 UNLV 27 - The 38th Battle for the Fremont Cannon (5th as conf foes). This has been a fierce rivalry gm which may be even fiercer now that the 2 are in the same league again. NV has dominated this series after losing 5 in row from '00-'04 they have now won 7 in a row (6-1 ATS) winning by 22 ppg. LY NV held UNLV QB Herring to 1-14-8 with his 1 comp with 4:00 left in the gm! At the half NV had a 378-48 yd edge. It was the first shutout in series history and NV had 699-110 yd and 31-7 FD edges. LW NV rallied from a 28-21 deficit at home to win 35-28 (-20) over WY. Fajardo (back) was inj'd late in the 4Q but HC Ault praised bkp Combs who hit 11-19-217-2-0. RB Jefferson already has 955 yds (#1 NCAA) and 11 td but UNLV RB Cornett is no slouch with 618 (4.9). UNLV (+27) trailed just 27-24 to LT on the road LW in the 3Q but all'd 31 str pts in the 58-31 loss. They have avg'd 437 off ypg since the opener. The home tm in UNLV gms under Hauck is 24-4-2 ATS at UNLV and we expect more of the same here in a high scoring gm.

SAN DIEGO ST 31 Colo St 24 - LY CSU was +13' at home and there was a high wind warning prior to the gm. CSU had a 205-179 yd edge at the half and lost QB Thomas to inj in the 2Q and he had taken every snap all year. SDSI finished with 23-12 FD and 327-287 yd edges and escaped 18-15. CSU is 1-6 SU/2-5 ATS vs SDSI but the visitor is 11-3 SU/ATS! LW CSU lost 28-7 (+17) at home to Fresno as former Kan St walk-on MJ McPeck got the start at QB for an inj'd Grayson (out indef) and went 15-29-192-1-0. SDSI got a 52-14 win (-20) over hapless Hawaii as QB Katz ran for 3 td's and threw for 2 more. SDSI has all the talent edges but CSU does have a bye on deck. The dog has covered EIGHT in a row (by 13 ppg) in the series with 5 outright upsets with the favorite's 3 SU wins by 3, 4 and 5 and it's tough to buck that trend here!

UCLA 34 Utah 17 - The HT owns 3 blowout wins in this series winning by scores of 31-10 (-3), 44-6 (+16) and 31-6 (-7) however LY's outcome is skewed a bit as the warm weather Bruins were forced to play with snow on the ground for the 1st time in 31 yrs while also facing Utah OC Chow who was the OC at UCLA the yr prior (LA 295-291 yd edge). Despite being spotted a pair of td's to start off their Thurs night tilt vs USC, the Utes were unable to maintain the lead in a 10 pt defeat (+14). The Bruins are off of B2B AG's and have a bye on deck (17-8-1 ATS prior to bye). LW's performance from rFR QB Hundley (4 int, 1 fmb) in the blowout loss at Cal was his worst performance of the ssn and we expect UCLA to return to their winning ways here as they have a large edge on off (#18-81) and get to face bkp QB Hays for a 2nd str yr.

ULM 41 Florida Atlantic 13 - LY FAU was at home +7' and it was HC Schnellenberger's final gm but ULM handed them their 3rd shutout of the ssn. The Owls have shown improvement in the new offense as they've split their 1st 2 conf gms ATS getting outgained by only 65 ypg (-129 SBC LY) vs a pair of foes that beat Ark as a 30' pt dog and beat GT as a 26' pt dog. FAU QB Wilbert has been the main beneficiary (65%, 5-3) after struggling LY (52%, 7-15). ULM is 5-0 ATS (incl LW's 31-17, -5 at MT) and outFD'd two SEC tms on the road by 9 and 8. While the road to the SBC Championship runs through WKU next week for ULM, we have no problems backing them here.

ARK ST 34 South Alabama 17 - Don't mind laying the wood with an ASU team off a previous home loss. The confidence building win (34-20, -2) at FIU on Thurs gives them extra rest to negate USA's bye. The Wolves went 5-0 ATS as a HF LY and will look to please the Jonesboro fans on HC (6-2 ATS). No SBC team will want to be the first loss to the conf newcomer and the Jags offense has only averaged 280 ypg vs the 3 foes in their same class while the D has allowed 447 ypg to UTSA and Troy. ASU has struggled out of the gate avg 11 ppg in the 1H vs FBS tms but as the midasn approaches HC Malzahn will open up more of the offense. While USA is 2-0 ATS away vs a pair of disinterested BCS'er's the reality is they trailed at HT by a comb 48-0 and after trailing big at HT will peek ahead to a more winnable home game vs FAU next week.

FIU 27 Middle Tenn 24 - An overachiever travels to face an underachiever. FIU, which was off B2B bowl appearances with 17 ret'g str's stands at 1-5 SU while MT has gone 3-1 since their opening ssn upset loss incl a 26' pt upset over GT. LW they did lose 31-17 (+3) hosting ULM as they were outgained 500-307. LY MT was +8 in their FHG and in the 1H settled for 2 FG's (37 & 25 yds) and missed a FG and despite a 176-161 yd edge, trailed 14-6. FIU got 51 and 26 (after 34 yd PR) yd drives for td's in the 3Q to open up a 28-6 lead in the 38-18 win. FIU frosh QB Hilliard now has starting exp although it was a home loss last Thur but we expect improvement (18-27, 133, 1-1). MT QB Kilgore has displayed welcome senior leadership as he's improved his % from 58.6 to 69.7 and his ratio from 18-12 to 8-3 TY. With wins at Memphis and GT, MT has performed well on the road but FIU is still talented and dangerous as a HD as evidenced by their close loss to undefeated LOU earlier TY.

† Texas A&M 45 LOUISIANA TECH 35 - Orig sked wk 1 but PPD. LT is 0-10 SU (1-5 ATS) vs A&M with the avg loss by 30 ppg. Only one gm was away from College Station & that was also in Shreveport as A&M (-14') won 37-17 in '99. In the L/gm ('10) LT (+19) trailed 14-10 but had 18-10 at the T16 with under :30 in the 1H. After a TO with :18 left, A&M went 7/3 plays for a Hail Mary 44 yd td pass to lead 21-10 and went on to a 48-16 win. LT hasn't had B2B bowl ssn s/77 & '78 but are well on their way at 5-0 SU (3-2 ATS) after LW's 58-31 win over UNLV (-27). Their wins over BCS/II/IVA earlier TY, this is their L/chance to make their case as a BCS Buster. QB Cameron is avg 291 ypg (68%) with a 13-0 ratio and while the off is avg 523 ypg, their D is giving up 531 ypg (#123)! They will face their sternest test of the yr as A&M comes in 4-1 SU (3-2 ATS) and their off led by QB Manziel is avg 517 ypg. LW they pulled out a 10 pt come-from-behind win at Ole Miss 30-27 (-10) despite 6 TO's. While both off and ST's rank in our top 20, the Aggies have the huge D edge (#20-107) and should put enough pressure on Cameron (#7 NCAA sks) to come away with a DD win.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 16th - Louisiana at NORTH TEXAS - UL was a 9 pt HF in '11 and NT led 10-7 when they had a 37 yd FG blk'd in the 2Q. The game was only 13-10 into the 4Q and UL drove 56 and 69 yards for td's and added a 31 yd FG with :44 left for the 20 pt win. UL did finish with a 345-232 yd edge and 18-12 FD edge. NT has dropped 5 str vs UL. NT is 3-2 SU at home vs SBC (3 covers by 27 ppg) in their new Apogee Stadium and while ULL has won 3 in a row in Denton this is their 1st visit to the new stadium.
