NEWS AND NOTES

W Michigan had been eliminated from a bowl and finished a disappointing season with a disappointing loss. The loss mirrored their season as they outgained E Michigan 443-369 and had a 24-20 FD edge but had numerous blown opportunities. WM was SOD at the WM36. They trailed 17-14 at the half with WM having a 220-212 yd edge. Each team got a FG to open the 3Q and then EM got a td to lead 26-17. EM was int'd at the EM28 and went 81/16pl but on 4&gl from the 1 opted for a short 19 yd FG to get within 6 since they were 2 scores down with 7:59 left. EM got a 34 yd FG to go back up 2 scores with 2:33 left and WM got a td with :49 left capping a 78/10pl drive. EM rec'd the onside kick and WM fired HC Cubit... Memphis only had a 333-213 yard edge but not only won a road game in CUSA play, they beat UAB 46-9. They went 66/9pl, 70/6pl and after blocking a punt, 24/2pl all for td's. Their 4th poss was 75/9pl for a td and they led 28-3 at the half with a 222-10p dege. UM went on a 49/12pl drive for a 51 yd FG and a 31-3 lead then after a 57 yd PR, missed a

42 yd FG. On the next play they recovered a fumble and went 18/2pl for a td and after a 21 yd PR went 49/3pl for a 44-3 lead. Their last score of the game came after giving up a td with 6:00 left, they blk'd the xp and ret'd it for 2 for the 46-9 final... All 7 of Michigan St's Big Ten games have been decided by 4 points or less and MSU is now in danger of not making a bowl as they fell to 5-6. MSU had a 419-303 yd edge and a 23-17 FD edge but much like their game vs Boise, blew numerous scoring opportunities and this time it actually came back to bite them. After just missing a td pass MSU settled for a 35 yd FG to lead 5-3. On their next poss MSU camé close to a td on 3&gl from the as it looked like the ball broke the plane but was spotted short and on 4&gl lost 3 yds. MSU missed a 37 yd FG with :02 left 1H and despite a 191-128 yd edge they trailed 6-5. Northwestern got a 43 yd IR td to open the 3Q. MSU fumbled at the NW35 and was int'd at the NW16 in the 3Q. Trailing 23-20 they punted on 4&8 with 2:46 left and after NW got 2 FD they got it back with

1:29 left and no time-outs. On 4&10 they were SOD at their own 20... Rutgers' Jawan Jamison, the leading rusher and 3rd leading receiver, was questionable coming in. He rushed for 37 yards on 7 carries but it was Savon Huggins who got the bulk of the work and he rushed for 179 yards on 41 carries. RU had a 420-341 yd edge. Butch Jones spent the week lobbing for fans to fill the stadium which only seats 35,000 and 34,526 were on hand. RU blew an opportunity as they were int'd at the 7 on their opening drive but UC missed a 34 yd FG. RU got a 71 yd td pass to Harrison to lead 7-0 but then went 57/10pl and on 3&8 with :25 left, floated the ball into double coverage in the EZ for an int and came with no points. At the half RU only led by 7 despite a 285-146 yd edge. UC was SOD at the RU8 and int'd at the RU38 but RU went 39/10pl and had a 22 yd FG blk'd. RU went 62/12pl for a 42 yd FG, 10-0. UC was SOD at the RU44, RU was SOD at the UC28 and UC got a 36 yd FG with :11 left to avoid the shutout. RU rec'd the onside kick.

4★ CLEMSON over S Carolina - CU was on a 10-2 SU run in this series (8-4 ATS) but SC has won 3 in a row SU and is 5-1 ATS the L/6. In the L10Y neither team has been favored by more then 5' and only once by more than 4.LY SC was at home and had the advantage with CU having the ACC Title game on deck. SC got its 3rd str win in the rivalry for the first time since 1968-70. SC dominated with a 450-153 yd edge and won 34-13 (-3'). There may be no hotter tm in the country right now especially on off than the Tigers who come in winners of 7 consec gms (8-1 ATS run) after their 62-48 win over NCSt (-15'). The Tigers did fall behind 24-13 before scoring 42 str pts and have scored at least 37 pts in 10 str gms. QB Boyd threw for 5 td's and ran for 3 more as he set an ACC record while the Tigers ran a schl rec'd 102 plays for 754 yds. LW we easily cashed a 3★ Small College LPS against the Gamecocks as they struggle vs option tms every yr under Spurrier and eeked out a 24-7 win (-31) over Wofford as it was just 7-7 entering the 4Q. On the road SC is getting outgained by 22 ypg and was dominated in gms vs LSU and Florida. LY the situation favored GT as UGA had the SEC Title game on deck but they were still -4' on the road and won 31-17. UGA had a 380-355 yd edge but GT gained 108 of their yds on the final 2 drives. UGA does have the large edge of having faced the triple option LW vs Ga Southern in a 45-14 win (was just 7-7 mid-2Q). If you saw QB Murray play vs SC/UF, you might be shocked that he now leads the NCAA in pass eff with a 28-7 ratio. While the BCS may rank UGA #3 right now, we can't shake the 35-7 beatdown they received by SC and also an escape at UK 29-24 (-26) while GT has been impressive in their 3 gm win streak. They are now bowl elig for a 16th consec ssn after LW's 42-24 win at Duke (did lead just 28-24 entering 4Q) and have split reps between QB's Lee/Washington in recent wks. Depending on next week's Mia/Duke gm, the Jackets could also find themselves with a conf champ gm on deck. However, with a Nat'l Title possibility in play now, UGA is playing w'added pressure and despite the adv of seeing the option LW, we think this will go into the 4Q undecided.

3★ Lsu over ARKANSAS - Friday. The HT has won 4 in a row SU (3-1 ATS) but is just 4-7 ATS. Ark is 7-2 SU/ATS in home finales and 11-6 ATS vs ranked tms. Miles is now 4-3 SU but 2-5 ATS vs Ark. Coming into LY the prev 7 meetings had all been decided by 8 pts or less and Ark jumped out to a 14-0 lead as a 12 pt dog with LSU trying to stay #1. Mathieu's 92 yd PR td tied it at 14 in the 2Q and the rout was on as the Tigers rolled to a 41-17 win. After starting the ssn in the Top 10, UA is 4-7 after LW's 45-14 (+5') loss at Miss \$1. Consistent TO issues usually are the sign of a less focused tm and the Hogs fit the bill as LW's -4 TO performance dropped them to -17 on the yr! All week long, we read that Les Miles thought his Tigers were playing their best ball of the yr, but the reality is they're just playing typical "Mad Hatter" style, blowing a 4Q lead to Bama where Miles' gambles back-fired, getting a miracle cover vs Miss St and LW, when they were left for dead, getting an 89 yd PR td for momentum and the win over Ole Miss 41-35 (-18'). QB Mettenberger has been cleared to air it out recently (avg 34 pass att's and 285 yds L3W) but he did throw 2 costly int's LW. We think this could play out a lot like the Bama gm for Ark where they could play their best and still be losing the gm in the 1Q. If that happens, look for them to mail it in.

The L3Y this game has been played at a neutral site and TT had a pair of 7 pt wins in the first 2 but LY BU set a school mark for pts in a conf game in a 66-42 (-13') win ending their 17 gm losing streak to the Raiders. In the 1H BU had 31 pts and 294 yds when Heisman winner RG3 was KO'd. In the 2H Florence burned his RS and guided BU to 35 pts and 323 yds. The tms come in off of widely disparate results as TT (+9') was rolled 59-21 at OKSt as we won a 3★ LPS on the Cowboys. It was tied 7-7 in the 2Q when OSU hit td passes of 60, 33, and 66 yds to sprint ahead for good. TT's off has been 1 dimensional in B12 play avg 97 rush ypg (3.4) which has put pressure on QB Doege (325, 70%, 35-11). The D slide has continued as TT allowed over 400 yd for a 6th straight gm. The Bears are off of their 1st win over a #1 team in school history when they KO'd KSU (-12') 52-24. The Bears made it look easy as they took advantage of an uncharacteristically sloppy Cats squad (3 TO's & 7 pen's) racing out to a 28-7 lead. The Cats cut it to 28-17 at the half but BU kept the gas pedal to the floor with 24 3Q pts. B12's top passer Florence (343, 62%, 27-13) has been greatly aided by the emergence of RB Seastrunk (161 ypg, 6 td in L/3). The team who wins the TO battle is 10-1 SU in Bears gms TY. BU needs 1 more win to go bowling but may still be celebrating LW's huge W.

2★ ARIZONA over Arizona St - Friday. ASU had been 7-2 SU from '99-'07 in this instate rivalry but UA has now won 3 of the L/4 with the L/3 matchups being decided on the final play. There have been 8 outright upsets in the L/15Y and LY we used UA (+10) as a Big Dog POW and got yet another outright upset winner (31-27). The HT in this rivalry is just 4-15-1 ATS (10-10 SU). On their 5th attempt ASU finally became bowl elig by knocking off listless WSU 46-7. ASU had 32-14 FD and 561-241 yd edges and their shutout was spoiled after a fmbl set up an 87/2pl td drive with :57 left. QB's Kelly and Eubank combined for 6 td's with Kelly #15 FBS in pass eff (235, 67%, 25-9). Underrated Sun Devils D leads the FBS in sks (47) and is #21 in tID (335 ppg). The Cats scored 17 4Q pts to win their 1st road gm of the ssn beating Utah 34-24. With the score tied early 4Q UT was stopped on a fake P at their own 41 which set the Cats up for the GW td and UA added a FG after the Utes were SOD at their own 30. P12's ttl offense leader QB Scott (301 ypg, 62%, 21-9) ret'd after missing LW due to a concussion and hit just 12-27-160-1 but he combined with Carey (204, 7.8) for the bulk of UA's 320-136 rush yd edge. Graham served on RichRod's WV def staff making this a far more friendly rivalry than in recent years and the Cats keep the Territorial Cup in a higher scoring gm.

UT is 16-3 SU in home finales but lost the L/2. Both are fresh off a bye with the hot Horns winners of 4 straight and back in the conversation for a B12 Title/BCS bowl after KSU's loss. B12 pass eff leader QB Ash (235 ypg, 69%, 17-5) has found a go-to guy in deep threat Davis (837, 18.6). The 3 headed monster is avg 202 ypg (5.0) in the win streak with PS#1 Brown returning vs ISU after missing 5 gms. The D has improved as well all'g just 15 ppg in the L/3. The Frogs are in the midst of gm's vs the B12's top 3 tms (KSU, UT & OU). They lost to #2 KSU 23-10 in their last outing providing the template for controlling the Cats who they held to ssn lows 12 FD's and 260 ttl yds. QB Boykin (171, 58%, 14-8) left the KSU gm with a shld'r inj but is expected to be fine here after spending the bye working on the pass gm. TCU's D remains the conf's best holding opp to 98 rush ypg (3.1) led by super frosh DE Fields who leads the conf in tfl. After B2B BCS bowls in '09-'10 TCU could make the claim of being the state's best but the Horns silence that conversation vs the B12 newcomers.

LY NU was -9' and Burkhead ran a schl rec'd 38x's for 160 yds. IA avoided getting shutout for the 1st time in 11Y when they got a td with 3:26 left in the inaugural gm for the "Heroes" Trophy (20-7). Iowa is 11-5-2 ATS at home vs a ranked opp and 14-5-1 ATS in home finales (1-4-1 ATS L/6). The Huskers can wrap up a Legends div title with a win here after LW's 38-14 (-20) win over Minny. NU scored td's on 4 of their 1st 6 poss and held the Gophers to 98 yds in the first 3Q's before putting in the bkps in the 4Q. QB Martinez (220 ypg, 64%, 21-8, 792 rush) became the Huskers all-time leading passer in the process. IA lost its 5th str gm and failed to become bowl elig for the 1st times "00 after a 42-17 loss to Mich (-16"). UI all'd UM to score on its 1st 6 poss and was outgained 513-309 with 159 yds coming in the 4Q. QB Vandenberg did throw for 2 td's for the 1st time 17 (196 ypg, 58%, 7-6), a sharp contrast to LY's 25. RB Weisman had his most carries (16-63) since lowa's last win on Oct 13th. IA has all'd over 400 ypg in 5 straight gms and is being outgained by 190 ypg in the losing streak. We see no reason why that won't continue here.

LW in a huge gm with MAC East implications, BG (-2') lost a heartbreaker at home to Kent St 31-24 as the Falcon D which all'd just 47 total pts in their 6 gm win streak was gashed for 31 pts and 334 rush yds (8.0). Ball St comes in riding high as they have won 5 consec gms SU/ATS after LW's 52-27 (-6') rout of Ohio in which we cashed a Wed Night Marquee on the Over. It was their most pts in a gm s/'06 and 5th most yds in schl hist. The Cards racked up 357 rush yds (9.2!) but they did lose starting QB Wenning to inj (CS) as 5th yr Sr Page accounted for 3 td's in his place. MU's ssn has been a disappointment at 4-7 SU (2-8-1 ATS) and LW, like many of their gms TY, it was closer than the final as MU had a 434-386 yd edge and was trailing just 21-16 in the 4Q before succumbing to CM 30-16 (+5). QB Dysert is MU's all-time leading passer (avg 297 ypg, 63%, 23-12 ratio TY) and this will be an emotional FHG for him. The Cards are avg 213 rush ypg (5.7) and no matter who starts at QB, should be able to take adv of a Miamir run D that is all'g 242 ypg (5.7) and is the 2nd worst in the country. A yr after sitting home for the holidays at 6-6, the Cards most likely clinch a bowl bid getting to 9 wins.

HC Doeren has reversed trend TY as NI was 1-3 as an AF in his 1st yr but is 3-1 in that role TY and they are 6-1 ATS vs MAC. Last Wed NI wrapped up the MAC West w/a 31-24 (-10) win over UT as QB Lynch accounted for 569 of NI's 596 yds. The Huskies have now won 10 consec gms since their loss to lowa in the opener. In a fair world Lynch would get an invite to NY for the Heisman as he is avg 235 ypg (64%) with a 22-4 ratio and leads the FBS in rushing among QB's with 1,504 (7.0) and 16 td's. USF's disappointing ssn continued as coming off a bye they were hammered 40-9 (+6') at Miami. That's not good news going up vs one of the best 1-2 RB punches in the country as Kent's Archer/Durham have both topped 1,000 yds. KSU is having its best ssn in schl hist and is off an impressive 31-24 (+2") win at BG that clinched the MAC East. The sensational Archer was the diff w/241 yds and two highlight reel 70+ yd to runs! While KSU is in a big sandwich with the MAC Champ gm on deck, playing in front of a home crowd will help ease those concerns as these tms look to be heading in opp directions (OU 1-6 ATS L/T, KSU 9-2 ATS TY). Utah 34 COLORADO 13 - LY these two met for the first time in 49 yrs. CU had 26 Sr's that had never won a road game and Utah came in with a shot at winning the P12 Title but we used CU (+22) as the Big Dog POW (+1250 on the ML) and delivered yet another outright upset win! Utah's K Peterson came in leading the P12 in F6's made but had 3 misses incl a 48 yd'r with :02 left in CU's 17-14 win. The Buffs usually stay with tims in the 2H as they find themselves getting crushed by HT but LW the script was flipped as they were losing just 7-0 at HT to Wash but were dominated in the 2H in a 38-3 loss (+21). They were outFD'd 22-10 and outgained 476-141. The Mountaineers lost their 5th straight for the 1st time s/'86, 50-49 as OU hit the GW pass with :24 left. The tms combined for 1,440 ttl yds (WV had 778-662 yd edge) and 4 td's in the final 7:00 as the Mountaineers couldn't stop QB Jones who threw for a schl rec'd 554 yds and 6 td's. WV moved FBS's receptions leader Austin (100, 10.5) to RB to spur their dormant run gm and he had a schl rec'd 344 yds! The D continued to struggle and is now allowing 51 ppg in B12 play. The Cyclones pulled a surprise QB switch on their 3rd series vs KU going to FF Sam Richardson, who hadn't attempted a pass all yr but hit 23-27-250 and 4 td's in their 51-23 win. After a week of distractions, WSU lost its 8th straight gm 46-7 to Ariz St. The Cougars fmbl'd a P snap on their 1st poss which led to an ASU FG and threw 2 early int's as the Devils ran out to a 32-0 halftime lead. WSU avoided the shutout with a 54 yd td pass with :57 left and was outFD'd 32-14 and outgained 561-241. The P12's #1 pass off (329) was held to 240 and now faces the FBS's #9 pass D (174, 52%, 14-15). UW has all of the talent edges but Wazzu has kept it close vs UCLA and Stan TY and could do the same here. Saturday, November 24th

OHIO ST 35 Michigan 27 - LY was the 1st time s/29 that both tms were directed by 1st yr HC's and UM was -7' at home. Robinson accounted for 5 td's while Braxton Miller overthrew 3 likely td passes and threw for 235 and rushed for 100. OSU led 24-23 at half but lost 40-34 (+7') making them 6-2 ATS in the series but ending their series record 7 gm win streak. UM has dropped its L/2 in Columbus by 30 & 35 pts. The Bucks' luck continued as they moved to 11-0 thanks to a 21-14 OT win over Wisky. A 68 yd PR td helped OSU jump out to a 14-0 lead but the Badgers dominated the rest of regulation with OSU driving into UW terr just once while Wisky drove into Buckeye terr 6x scoring 2 td's, missing a 40 yd FG and fmbl at the 1. After UW hit a td pass with :08 left to force OT, OSU drove for a td and held the Badgers on 4 plays for the win which secured the Leaders Trophy. QB Miller (168 ypg, 57%, 14-6, 1214 rush) was held to a ssn low 145 ttl yds. UM steamrolled a punchless Iowa squad 42-17 piling up a 513-309 yd edge. QB Gardner (278 ypg, 66%, 7-3 in 3 sts) accounted for 6 td's but the big news was his new backfield mate Robinson who ran for 13-98 in his debut at RB. Since Gardner took over UM is avg 440 ypg and 38 ppg vs 378 ypg & 28 ppg under D-Rob. With no bowl gm this is the Buckeyes' Super Bowl and they are playing with legit revenge. Keep in mind no B10 tm has won B2B gms vs the Bucks since Wisky in '03-'04 and since that time OSU is 12-0 SU/11-1 ATS avenging a conf loss.

Vanderbilt 27 WAKE FOREST 20 - VU is 7-4 ATS in non-SEC AG's and the visitor is 8-2 SU in the series.

WF is 6-13 SU (8-11 ATS) in home finales (3 str SU/ATS losses by an avg of 22 ppg). LY WF had a bowl bid locked up and Vandy needed a win to get to a bowl and the tms played like it with Vandy winning 41-7 (-1') on the road with a 481-329 yd edge. WF had won the previous 3 meetings by 16 ppg SU (avg line E). This yr the roles are reversed as Vandy has already locked up a bowl bid while Wake needs a win for Dowl elig. The Dores come in red-hot w/5 str wins capped by LW's 41-18 (-3) domination of in-state rival Tenn, their largest MOV in the series s/'54. Vandy also finished their SEC sked w/5 wins, the most s/'35 and it's hard to imagine HC Franklin being here much longer with new HC jobs opening up daily. WF on the other hand was destroyed 38-0 (+24) at the hands of new #1 ND as they trailed 31-0 at HT all'g 430 1H yds! While we certainly like the situation here for WF, the talent edges (Vandy #56-115 off, #24-66 def

and #29-105 ST's edges) have us backing away from calling Wake for the outright upset win. **LOUISVILLE 24 Connecticut 17** - It's been a series of streaks as UL won 3 in a row SU from '00-'06 then UC won 3 in a row SU and now UL has won 2 in a row. They won 26-0 here at home (UC just 6 plays ran in UL territory) in '10, and LY won 34-20 on the road although UC had a 329-299 yd edge. LY it was 28-20 when UL ret'd the lateral play 34 yds for a td on the final play and the xp was not att'd. The Cards used the bye to regroup after their bubble bursting 45-26 loss at SU. With #1 rusher Perry (705, 5.2) OFY the run gm will now rely on Wright (680, 4.6). The Huskies also had a bye to focus on their final 2 gms which they need to win to go to a bowl. UC won its 1st BE gm prior to the bye hanging on to beat Pitt 24-17 (led 24-0 at half) thanks to their 1st 100 yd rush performance s/Sept 29. The run gm is crucial as QB Whitmer (233 ypg, 60%, 8-14) is among the FBS's int leaders. Quietly the D ranks in the FBS's top 25 in nearly every unit incl ttl yds (296). The Cards have the BE Champ gm on deck next Thursday vs Rutgers and could find themselves looking ahead.

N CAROLINA 38 Maryland 10 - NC is just 1-5 SU in the series and 1-8 ATS with their lone cover by a half

pt and MD has 4 outright upsets in the L/6 (last met '08). MD is 2-8 SU in Chapel Hill. The Heels beat UVA 37-13 last Thursday as they led just 20-13 late 3Q with the Cavs driving to the NC1 where they were SOD. NC drove for 2 td's and added a FG after a fmbl'd KO. NC QB Renner (277 ypg, 65%, 23-7) and ACC's top rusher Bernard (1065, 6.8) make a solid backfield tandem esp compared to MD who started ex-LB Petty for the 3rd straight gm LW (97 ypg, 47%, 5-1) while #1 rusher Brown (382, 4.2) missed his 2nd straight. The result has been 3 losses by a combined 119-37 incl a 41-14 defeat to FSU which officially ended MD's bowl chances after a 4-2 start to the season and the Terps were outgained 397-170. With NC inelig for the postseason they'll want to send their seniors out in style while MD might just want to make it home

ror the postseason they li want to send their seniors out in style while MD might just want to make it nome unscathed after such a tough ssn on the injury front.

VIRGINIA TECH 27 Virginia 17 - VT is 8-0 SU and 7-1 ATS in this series. LY this gm was for all the marbles in the ACC Coastal and UVA was fresh off its upset of FSU but VT (-5) covered by 33 pts in a 38-0 shutout. What a difference a yr makes as last Thurs UVA was officially eliminated from bowl contention with their 37-13 loss to NC to fall to 4-7. The key play happened late 3Q as the Cavs trailed 20-13 but were SOD on 4&gl at NC1 and the Heels would score 17 straight pts. QB Rocco (174 ypg, 62%, 12-9) who has split reps with Sims TY did toss a pick-6. At 5-6 VT needs this to extend their streak of being bowl elig to a 20th straight ssn. The Hokies ended their 7 gm road losing streak by edging ACC bottom feeder BC 30-23 in OT. VT trailed 13-3 at the half but rallied in the 2H kicking the gm tying 42 yd FG with 1:05 left. After VT scored in their OT poss they stopped the Eagles on 4&11. VT has now held the Commonwealth Cup for 2,920 days and extends its streak another 365.

Michigan St 20 MINNESOTA 13 - Minny has now covered 5 in a row in this series going 3-2 SU. There have been 6 outright upsets in the L10Y. The L2Y the Spartans have won by 23 (-24) and 7 (-27') with both at home. It was the only gm all ssn that MSU's D allowed a foe more yds than their season avg. Minny is 11-4 SU in home finales upsetting a pair of B10 foes the L2Y. Entering the ssn it would've been difficult to believe that the tm who needed to secure a bowl bid by winning this gm would be the Spartans while the Gophers are already assured of going bowling. Yet after their 8th gm decided by 4 or fewer pts (3-5), a 23-20 home loss to NW, MSU finds itself 5-6 and on the cusp of staying home for the holidays for the 1st time in 6 ssns under HC Dantonio. MSU led just once at 5-3 with the Cats kicking a late 1H FG while MSU missed a 37 yd'r and then the Cats took a pick-6 43 yds for a td on the Spartans 1st poss of the 3Q to take a 13-5 lead. With it tied at 20 NW drove for a 27 yd FG with 7:30 left but they punted at the NW42 and went 4&out on their final drive. RB Bell (1382, 4.4) ret'd to the gm after being sidelined with a shoulder inj. The Gophers were flattened 38-14 by Neb as they trailed 38-0 and had 98 ttl yds going into the 4Q. Struggling QB Nelson (135 ypg, 51%, 6-4) was lifted in the final period. Both tms are struggling on off but MSU eeks out the bowl invite.

Miami, FL 41 DUKE 39 - LY at home UM (-15) had a big game vs FSU on deck but would score on its 1st 5

poss in a dominating 49-14 win and had a 300-106 yd edge at half (467-342 gm). UM's only loss in this series was in '76 (1st gm). In 5 of the L/6 UM has trailed but battled back for the win. Duke has dropped 8 str home finales by an avg of 14 ppg. Since securing bowl elig on Oct 20th Duke has lost 3 straight getting outscored 134-60. After trailing 28-24 going into 4Q the Devils fell 42-24 to GT. Duke never led in the gm and was outFD'd 28-15 and outgained 449-275 as the Devils admitted they had a hard time prepping for GT's speed option (outrushed 330-77). WR Vernon did become the ACC's al-time rec yd leader with 3,520 yds. The Hurricanes blasted USF 40-9 to become bowl elig although there are ?'s on whether UM will self imposed a bowl ban for a 2nd straight ssn thereby handing the Coastal crown to GT. QB Morris (271 ypg, 58%, 18-7) threw

ball to a 2rd stager sain fields in failing the coasta frown to 41. Qb winns (27 Type, 08%, 16-7) lifew for his 3rd 400 yd gm of the ssn just for just the 2nd time in Canes history (Heisman winner Gino Torretta). Both tms rank among the FBS's worst in total D so with 2 underrated QB's whoever has the ball last wins. NORTHWESTERN 30 Illinois 13 - NW is 6-3 SU/ATS in this series. There have been 3 outright upsets the L6Y. LY we used NU (+10) on the road as a 3* LPS and they nearly got the outright upset win. NU had a commanding 28-10 lead in the 3Q but IL got a 1 yd td run with :13 left to pull out the SU win. NW is 6-1 ATS in home finales and UI has dropped 3 str trips to Evanston. The Cats moved to 8-3 by beating MSU 23-20 LW which likely assured itself of a NY's Day bowl bid. NW was outgained 419-303 but took advantage of 4 MSU TO's incl a 43 yd IR to and held on after hitting the GW 27 yd FG with 7:40 left. B10's all-purp yd leader Mark (177 ypg) left early in 1H with a shld'r injury and didn't return while a banged up Colter split time with the resurgent pass QB Siemian who threw for 165 yds. Illinois lost its 8th straight 4

20-17 to Purd which stretched their conf losing streak to 13. The Illini actually outFD'd the Boilers 24-18 but committed 3 TO incl 3 fmbls by embattled QB Scheelhaase (141 ypg, 60%, 4-6). PU led just 6-3 at the half but broke 2 plays of 60+ in 2H td drives to put the gm away. IL HC Beckman has tried to play up this rivalry by refusing to call the Cats by name but "The Team Up North" delivers a little payback.

NC STATE 37 Boston College 23 - LY BC had a 14-3 lead at the half and 192-88 yd edge in the 14 pt

upset as a 2 pt HD with NCSt being int'd in the EZ w/6:43 left and SOD on 485 at the BC28 with 1:10 left. BC coach Spaz was O'Brien's DC here from '99-'08 and the HT is 3-0 SU/ATS in their meetings winning BC coach Spaz was O'Brien's DC here from '99-'08 and the H1 is 3-0 SU/AIS in their meetings winning SU by 21 ppg (cover by 17 ppg). Both tms come in off losses as NCSt was victimized for 754 yds and 62 pts by a red-hot Clem tm. The Pack actually led 24-13 before all'g 42 str pts. QB Glennon is avg 309 ypg but has been inconsistent w/14 int's and is comp just 57% of his passes. The same could be said for BC QB Rettig who is avg 267 ypg but has 10 int's and completes just 56%. BC is off a tough 30-23 OT home loss (+10) to VT where they blew a 10 pt 1 H lead. The Eagles have played much better at home than on the road TY as they are getting outscored 34-16 (-152 ypg) away compared to getting outscored 26-24 (-16 ypg) at home. While NCSt is 4-0 SU/ATS in home finales, we don't think O'Brien will step on the neck former employee who will most likely be coaching his final gm.

TENNESSEE 41 Kentucky 24 - This gm will look different next yr as both HC's have been shown the door (Dooley will not cch here). LY UK finally ended its 26 gm losing streak vs UT, UK (+6) was at home and UT needed a win to get to a bowl. UK was forced to start WR Roark at QB and UT finished with 15-10 FD and 276-212 yd edges but UK got the win 10-7. LW UT was embarrassed by Vandy 41-18 (+3) as it was their most lopsided loss to the Dores s/54. After trailing 13-10 at HT, the Vols were outscored 21-0 and outgained 175-13 in the 3Q as QB Bray was benched for portions of the gm going just 11-29-103-1-2. Dooley was fired immediately after and OC Chaney will serve as the interim here. Thanks to a late ssn non-conf cupcake, the Wildcats got a feel-good 34-3 win over Samford LW in HC Phillips FHG as they snapped an 8 gm losing streak. UK rolled to a 455-102 yd edge incl a dominating 342-(-2) rush yd edge. The Vols are 20-1 SU and 15-6 ATS in home finales and UT won 42-0 (-4') the following yr after their last loss vs UK in 1985. However, it's tough laying a huge number here with so much uncertainty. Wisconsin 24 PENN ST 20 - LY, with a ticket to the B10 Title gm on the line UW pummelled a drained

Lions tm (45-7) in its 2nd straight road gm and 3rd under an interim HC after the Paterno firing as the Badgers finished with a 450-233 yd edge. PSU is 18-3 SU and 14-6-1 ATS in home finales and the SU winner is 11-0 ATS in this series. Wisky is 0-2 SU/ATS in their L/2 trips to State College (avg loss 37-11) and the HT is 5-1 SU/ATS. While a trip to Indianapolis is already booked the Badgers didn't want to back into the Leaders crown but now come into this off of an emotional 21-14 OT home loss to OSU. UW (-2) trailed 14-0 but rallied to tie it on a td pass with :08 left. After the Bucks drove for a td in OT, UW was SOD and they lost despite a 360-236 yd edge. B10's #1 rusher Ball (1417, 5.0) failed to break the NCAA's record for career td's as he had his 2nd lost fmbl in 907 career touches on 4&1 at the OSU2 while attempting to stretch the ball over the GL with 2:46 left. QB Phillips hit 14-25-154-1-0 despite being sk'd 4x in his 2nd career start. PSU (-17) beat IN for the 16th straight time 45-22 as after IU cut it to 28-22 in the 3Q the Lions reeled off 17 straight pts to put the gm away. B10's #1 passer McGloin (279 ypg, 61%, 23-5) set new school ssn passing marks along with #1 rec Robinson (73, 13.5). PSU did lose All-B10 LB Mauti (knee) early on, the 2nd big loss to their front 7 (DT Hill) in the L/3. This is PSU's bowl but the Badgers have something to prove.

PITTSBURGH 23 Rutgers 20 - RU is now 5-2 SU (4-3 ATS) in this series. After Pitt won in both '09 and '10, LY RU was +6' at home and gave QB Nova his first start. The gm changed in the 3Q when Pitt brought in Anderson at QB and on his 2nd drive he was in't setting up an 18 yd RU td drive. RU got a 73 yd KR which set up a 14 yd td drive and added a 45 yd IR td for a misleading 34-10 win. There have been 4 outright upsets in the L7Y. The Knights remain unbeaten in BE play after LW's 10-3 upset (+6') of Cincy as we cashed a 3* Key Selection on these pages. Highly touted RB Huggins finally put on his "Big-Boy" pants replacing the inj'd Jamison (CS here) and ran for 179 yds (4.4) while RU's D (#15) is clearly the BE's best. The Panthers come in off a late ssn bye after dropping B2B heartbreakers to ND/Conn as the loss to the Irish came in 3OT's and their 2H rally vs Conn came up just short. HC Chryst has done wonders w/QB Sunseri who has a 16-2 ratio but he still holds onto the ball too long and is prone to being sk'd (28). Keep in mind, Rutgers is in the 2nd of B2B road gms and a win next wk vs L'ville gives them the BE title regardless of this gm. Pitt is notorious to playing to the level of its competition and we wouldn't be surprised here if they pulled the upset.

PURDUE 34 Indiana 27 - PU is now 12-3 SU in the Battle for the Old Oaken Bucket. LY PU was playing with revenge after losing 34-31 at home (-3') in '10 in OT. PU got the cover but only by 1/2 pt (33-25, -7') although the Boilers did have 508-354 yd and 27-20 FD edges. The HT is 9-5 ATS in the series but has dropped 3 in a row both SU/ATS. The Boilers' bowl hopes live on after LW's uninspiring 20-17 win over a hopeless IL team which covered (+7) their 1st gm over an FBS tm since the opener. PU took advantage of 3 TO's and had 2 big plays of 60+ yds to eek out their 1st B2B wins on the B10 road s/'09. Senior leaders QB Marve (18-26-173 1-0) and RB's Shavers (21-99) and Bolden (7-93) have stepped up. IN will stay home for the holidays for the 5th straight ssn after LW's 45-22 loss at PSU as we cashed a 3 \star Totals Play on the Over. The Hoosiers cut PSU's lead to 6 pts in the 30 but were int'd at the Lions16 and SOD at the PSU3 on 2 of their final 3 drives. QB Coffman (239, 61%, 14-8) threw for a career best 454 vs the Lions. The Boilers have big D (#69-112) and ST (#58-82) edges and head back to the postseason and probably save HC Hope's job in the process.

UTSA 28 Texas St 27 - 1st meeting between these two tms who jumped up to the FBS TY and will play in separate conf's next yr (Roadrunners to CUSA. Bobcats to SBC). LW UTSA jumped out to a 20-3 HT 469-424. TSU was able to keep within the number at Navy LW losing 21-10 (+13') as they benefitted from 2 missed Navy FG's in the 2H. While on the surface it looks like UTSA is the much better tm at 7-4 (+1 ypg) while TSU is 3-7 (-126 ypg), keep in mind UTSA has played the #124 sked while TSU has played the #77. Look for this to come down to the wire Look for this to come down to the wire.

UTAH ST 45 Idaho 10 - LY Utah St was -9' on the road and did lead 21-10 at the half but only had a 256 225 yd edge. Tied at 35, ID missed a 44 yd FG with 6:46 left. US got a 4&gl 1 yd td in the 10T and in the 20T ID was int'd at the 2 in USt's 49-42 win. The HT is a surprising 1-5 SU and 2-4 ATS with 6 outright upsets in the L10Y. Don't look for that trend to continue here as an argument could be made that the Aggies are the best non-BCS tm TY after LW's 48-41 OT win (-3') over prev BCS buster darling LT. USt actually led 41-17 before LT made a furious 2H comeback to force OT. QB Keeton outplayed counterpart Cameron hitting 20-34-340 but more importantly had no TO's (Cameron 1st 2 int's of yr). ID is off a 34-27 loss to UTSA as they fell behind 20-3 at HT and is now 0-3 under interim HC Gesser. The talent edges

are staggering for a WAC contest as the Aggies feature two Top 40 units while Idaho is among the bottom 5 in both off/def. Utah St is 10-1 ATS TY with their only non-cover by a 0.5 pt on a backdoor td!

San Diego St 30 WYOMING 26 - LY WY piled up 396 yds in the 1H as a Big Dog POW on the PPH at +18' and they delivered an outright upset 30-27. They led 30-13 but in the 4Q, down 30-27, SDSt missed a 39 yd FG and missed a 27 yd FG with 1:55 left. SDSt is fresh off a late season bye while WY is playing for an 8th str week. The Aztecs can clinch a share of the MW Title with a win here but in their last gm had a misleading 28-9 win (-6') over Air Force despite getting outgained 393-260. Ironically, WY is off B2B 28-23 wins over NM/UNLV and now has won 3 str after it looked like HC Christensen would be shown the door. QB Smith has thrown for 1,237 yds (67%) in his L/4 gms and hasn't thrown an int in 139 pass attempts! WY does have the cold weather and altitude edges and is #1 in the MW w/just 12 TO's lost TY. The visitor is 3-0 SU/ATS in the series but there have been 3 outright upsets in the L5Y which has us leaning with the HT tm here.

ALABAMA 38 Auburn 3 - The Iron Bowl visitor has now won 3 in a row SU and is 2-1 ATS in this series In each of those 3 the winner has gone on to become the National Champ w/a chance to do so again TY as #2 Bama is right back in the mix after LW's shake-up atop the polls. LY Bama was -21 on the road and was even more dominant than the final score indicates. They entered the 4Q with a 309-44 yd edge but fmbl'd in the EZ and Auburn fell on it for a td and Aub ret'd the opening KO of the 3Q 83 yds for a td. Bama delivered a 4★ Key Selection winner 42-14 and ended Aub's 14 gm home win streak. Both tms come in off dominating wins over FCS foes, as Bama won 49-0 (-50) over WCar and Aub picked up its 3rd win of the yr 51-7 (-31) over Alabama A&M. It should be noted that Aub did lose to 2 Top 10 tms Clem/

as ★ INDIANAPOLIS over Buffalo - Love the dynamics of a losing team off a Nationally televised win vs a team with a winning record off a loss on the road to one of the AFC's top teams. Prior to NE the Colts had not only won 4 straight but outgained those foes by 73 ypg while Buffalo has only totaled 281 yards in their 19-14 win vs MIA which is the same team that IND gained 516 yards against. The Colts are now 4-1 ATS at home thanks to Luck's 8-2 ratio and since everything he does is compared to Peyton lets mention. he's exceeded Manning's numbers off a loss already going 3-0 SU/ATS incl pulling 2 upsets. An AD of 7 or less means the teams are fairly even and the Bills have struggled in that role when teams don't look past them as they are 1-4-1 ATS failing to cover the losses by 23 ppg. It's never a positive sign when your defense is ranked #31 allowing 147 ypg (4.9) rushing on the road and 63% completions. It gets even tougher when your offense averages only 339 ypg away from home. 2★ Houston over DETROIT - No concern with the Texans performance LW as it was expected off a SNF at CHI with a short week, travel and another nationally televised game on deck. DET however needed to exert every bit of their energy being off B2B division games fighting for their playoff lives and came up short vs GB. The Lions consider it an honor to play on this holiday but they clearly haven't lived up to expectations as the visitor has knocked them off 5 straight both SU and ATS covering by 13 ppg. DET's offense is ahead of LY's #5 pace but the scoring if off by 5.6 ppg as the run game has struggled especially in the red zone as LY totaled 100+ yds and over 4.0 ypc 5 times and have yet to accomplish that this season. That has added pressure to the OL and in 5 of Detroit's 6 losses Stafford's been sacked 2+ times. The Texans D has 3+ sacks in 7 of 10 games which directly correlates to their pass D which has the 2nd best QBR in the NFL. A 4-6 record off B2B division losses will give the Lions a deflated feeling while the Texans now know after coming back in the 4Q down 2 td's that they are always in every game.

Washington at DALLAS - DAL continued their "perfect" season moving to 0-4 ATS at home as they trailed Cleveland 13-0 at HT in their 23-20 non-covering OT win. The unsteady offense had totaled over 375 yards 5 times while avg 304 in the other 5. The defense however has been a constant allowing 283 ypg at home but was makes the unit even more impressive the 54% completions they're allowing. RGIII will test that after hitting for 200 yds (93%) with 2 td in the 31-6 win over PHI. When things look bleak after a Cowboys tougher than expected game, the D has stepped it up and the week after their games have totaled a combined 30 ppg. Meanwhile, the Skins L/2 games on the road vs the quality D's of the Giants

and the Steelers they only totaled 35 points.

Turkey Day Play: Under
New England at NY JETS - You can look it with rose colored glasses that any road win is a good thing.
Or, you can be realistic on just how bad your season is when you travel to take on a team that has a 5-20-1 record over the L2Y and you were a 3.5 pt dog. While chaos will continue to follow the Jets, NE has reeled off 6 of 7 wins in the last 7 games. Belichick will also remind his team that NY took them to OT a month ago while also making the defense aware that the 403 yards allowed was the Jets first time in 20 games they topped 400 yards while also being 100 yards over their season avg. We all know Brady is a student of the game and this pupil threw for 258 ypg (57%) w/a 3-3 ratio in his first 3 vs Ryan but has thrown for 309 ypg (68%) w/a 10-1 ratio in his L4 matchups. Pat's accustomed to the limelight yet still enjoy it as they've covered 4 straight away the L3Y in prime time while this looks familiar to 2010 when they beat IND at home and traveled to DET on Thanksgiving winning 45-24. The Bengals are exactly where we love to play against them which is off an upset vs the Giants and off a road win vs a 1-8 squad giving them more false confidence. It's not like we need more reasons to play against them at home but in Bengals non-division home games the dog is 21-6 ATS (78%).

Pittsburgh 16 CLEVELAND 13 - The Browns showed us last week that they have fight in them but learning

how to finish and win is a task not yet accomplished. LW's emotional loss will be tough for this young team to rebound from as they let a 13-0 HT lead slip away but again took the lead with 1:07 left only to allow a 66/8pl drive and a 32 yd FG with :02 to force OT. The Steelers however are off quite a stretch being at the NYG, home vs KC on MNF, hosting BAL on SNF and having a trip to BAL on deck. While we're unable to see how Leftwich did in his first start another week of practice will clearly help. CLE clearly considers PIT their main rival while the Steelers have battled BAL for the division the past several seasons which has led to CLE covering 3 of 4 in this series at home incl winning in '09 as a 10.5 pt HD. This will mean even more to CLE with new owner Haslam having been a PIT minority partner. Rookie Weeden needs the rush attack to throw and in the 6 games the Browns have reached 99+ yards rushing they are 4-1-1 ATS going 1-3 ATS in the others. That matchup

That maching tavors the Steelers who have only allowed that magic number twice TY giving them the leagues #1 overall and #6 rushD. Denver 24 KANSAS CITY 10 - Both of these teams were 1-2 SU & ATS to start the season. There's been a "slight" change in direction since with DEN going 6-1, +109 ypg/32 ppg and KC going winless, -41 ypg/12 ppg. Of course you will now start seeing the Broncos start to pay the price with inflated lines while Vegas will also have to inflate KC's numbers to find Chiefs backers. LW's win over SD makes DEN 3 clear in the

AFC West but as their attention turns towards playoff seedings they also know that they've already dropped head to head matchups with a pair of division leaders. The Chiefs D has been clearly over achieving allowing only 312 ypg at home vs SD, BAL & OAK but LW we saw it start to struggle being on the field an overextended period of time as they allowed a season high 22 FD's and a ssn high at home of 409 yds vs CIN's #17 off. While we often look at QBR's for a player one stat that jumps out is that KC's team QBR is dead last on offense and #31 on defense (18-6 ratio) which should make Manning's (310 ypg, 69% 21-4 ratio LBW) Thanksgiving feast come a few days late. KC may become only the 14th DD div HD (6-7ATS) since 2005 and while we'll call for DEN by 13, we'll stop there if the line gets crazy.

Tennessee 20 JACKSONVILLE 3 - The Jaguars have covered 3 straight in the series holding RB Johnson to 44 yds rushing (3.6) in that span. Johnson has avg'd 130 ypg rush (6.7) the L5 games prior to the bye though and JAX #29 rush def has allowed over 123 yds rushing in 8 of 10 games TY. The Jaguars have been outgained by 191 ypg at home TY while being outscored 31-9. They have been held to 15 or less in 16 of their L27 games with Gabbert only having 2 games TY with 2 TD's. The Jags talked about how their season opening loss to Minnesota in OT inflicted a 2 game hangover so how will they react to blowing a 14 point 4Q lead to Houston LW. TEN rebounded from the CHI debacle by thumping a better MIA defense in Locker's return. While the Titans #30 defense has been vulnerable vs the pass TY (71% 20-9 ratio) the Jaguars lack a big time weapon (Shorts is a slot WR, Blackmon rookie struggles despite LW) to exploit it and we'll call for the road team to get the win here. Check out the perfect 15-0 ATS system on page 8! CHICAGO 21 Minnesota 13 - CHI is off MNF vs SF and its not known how Campbell fared but Cutler (conc) is expected to return. CHI is 5-0 SU/ATS vs MIN with a 32-16 avg score who have held RB Peterson to an

avg of 67 yds rushing (3.4) in the L4 meetings. MIN does have a slight situational edge coming off a bye but avg or 67 yds rushing (3.4) in the L4 meetings. Min does have a siight situational edge coming off a bye but are 4-12 ATS away vs foe w/a winning record. Neither team is lighting it up offensively (MIN #21 CHI #22) but the big difference is in pass D. CHI's #6 pass D has held foes to 59% comp's with a great 8-19 ratio while MIN's #16 pass defense is allowing 64% with a 17-5 ratio. It was thought Caroll's rah-rah attitude wouldn't work but this team is playing excited and after being 8-2 ATS at USC off a bye he's 1-0-1 ATS here with both being on the road.

SAN DIEGO 31 Baltimore 24 - One team, Baltimore is #16 & #27 on off & def while the other, SD is #22

#7. The Ravens have been outgained in 5 straight games by 92 ypg while SD has outgained 4 of their L/6. The public continues to give credit to the "vaunted Ravens D" that has been a top 10 unit for 10 relative to the best example we can give you on this aged and injury beleaguered unit is that into this season they allowed over 26 FD's ONCE in 105+ games yet they have already allowed that 4 times this season. San Diego handled Baltimore 34-14 LY at home and does so again.

NEW ORLEANS 27 San Francisco 24 - As the calendar turned to October the Saints were 0-4 incl 3

losses as a favorite while SF was 3-1 SU/ATS and all was right in the Bay. Fast forward to mid November and we'll officially call it a turnaround as the Saints won 3 straight and 4 of 5 while the 49ers are 2-1-1 with the tie coming at home as a 13 pt HF. The Saints have clearly utilized the Dome as a powerful edge and even in this seasons' trying times as they knocked off SD and Philly in prime time and took care of the NFL's final unbeaten. This week their sights are set on revenging "The Grab" as they were :09 away from the advancing to the NFC Championship when Alex Smith hit Vernon Davis with a 14 yd pass. SF is in a tough spot having hosted Chicago on Monday Night and playing on a short week with an early start. All 3 West Coast teams that have faced this situation TY have faltered in Arizona at GB (+10, 17-31), Oakland at Miami (-2, 13-35) and Seattle at St Louis (-3, 13-19). Meanwhile the riddle that is PHI has lost 6 straight and are 1-9 ATS despite being ranked in the top 14 in both offense and defense. Can Philly possibly turn it around? The Monday Night Magic and Marquee are both available after Noon EST gameday!

Miss St 30 MISSISSIPPI 27 - Mullen is now 3-0 SU (avg 34-18) and ATS in the Egg Bowl and made this rivalry a priority when he was hired. LY MSU's 28 pt MOV over Ole Miss was the school's largest win over Miss since 1919. UM was playing its final game for outgoing HC Nutt but MSU (-17) won 31-3 with a 317-202 yd edge. MSU had a 252-65 yd edge at the half and led 21-0. UM had won 5 in a row SU at home in the series but lost LTH 31-23 (+3) and the fav here is 9-0-1 ATS in Oxford. Both tms are having solid ssn's as LW the Bulldogs stopped their 3 gm slide w/a 45-14 (-5") win over mistake prone Ark while Ole Miss, which is clearly a much better tm under 1st yr HC Freeze, is off its 2nd of B2B heartbreaking losses. The tins are evenly matched as UCLA has the off edge (#17-47) and SU has the D edge (#5-33) and for right now we'll call for the HT by 3 and wait to see how Bruin HC Mora, Jr handles it.

Byu 41 NEW MEXICO ST 3 - LY in their 1st ever meeting BYU (-22') at home won 42-7. TY both come in off of losses to SJSt. NMSt (+20') fell 47-7 at home 2W ago (bye LW) while BYU (-2') lost on the road 20-14. The Aggies were outFD'd 18-15 and outgained 504-220 while the Cougs held the FD (24-17) and

20-14. The Aggles were outroot 18-15 and outgained 304-220 while the Cougs field the PD (24-17) and ydg (422-364) edges but were -2 TO's incl a fmbl by QB Nelson driving for a td in the final minutes. NMSt QB Manley is avg 237 ypg (65%) with a 14-10 ratio and his top target is Biletnikoff semifinalist Franklin (66, 17.2, 9 td). However, BYU ranks #22 in our pass eff D (184 ypg, 58%, 10-9 ratio), the highest rated tm NMSt has faced TY. Nelson is avg 223 ypg (59%) with a 13-12 ratio. His top 3 rec's all stand at least 6'3" and could present matchup problems vs our #112 pass eff D (259 ypg, 61%, 21-4 ratio). UO had built a 14-7 lead but all'd SU to conv on 4&1 and get a td on the next play to tie it with 1:35 left. UO gained 0 yds and att a 41 yd FG (Maldonado just 1 att prior to gm) but it dinked off the crossbar. SU hit a 37 yd FG for the win. OSU's Mannion got his 1st start since late Oct and hit 24-34-325 as the Beavers rolled Cal 62-14 LW. It was the 2nd most pts vs a conf foe in schl hist and highest pt total vs Cal ever as OSU tallied 35-17 FD, 559-332 and +3 TO edges. UO's #1 off can score quickly, but this fired up OSU squad has our #13 D, has taken on a tougher sked (#2-51) and will have a loud home crowd which FORECAST: OREGON ST 31 Oregon 30 means we're calling for the outright upset here.

TECHNICAL PLAY OF THE WEEK......EAST CAROLINA SITUATIONAL PLAY OF THE WEEK.....TEXAS TECH

FRESNO ST 37 Air Force 20 - Last met in '00. The situation really favors Fresno as they are fresh off a late ssn bye which also gave them extra prep time for the option and AF is off its home finale and playing a 10th str wk. The Falcons beat Hawaii 21-7 but failed to cover as a 22 pt HF. They had 0 pass att instead relying on the FBS's #2 rush off, putting up 338 yds and accepting a bid to the Armed Forces Bowl after the gm. FSU does rank #73 FBS in run D all'g 164 ypg (4.1) with 17 td's. The Dogs are pumped up for this one as a win captures at least a share of the MW title (1st conf title s/99) with QB Carr calling it, "the biggest gm I've ever played in." FSU is 5-0 SU/ATS at home TY as Carr is avg a superb 341 ypg (73%, 19-3) with the Dawgs winning by 31 ppg (avg 49 ppg, 540 ypg). AF ranks #110 in our pass eff D (179 ypg, 65%, 11-8 ratio). Can't go against a red hot 10-1 ATS FSU squad (only loss to Boise) especially with a Falcons tm that is 2-5 ATS vs conf foes TY and 8-14 in that role the L3Y.

OKLAHOMA 41 Oklahoma St 34 - OU had won 8 in a row SU in this series (6-1-1 ATS) heading into LY. LY OU was a banged up tm and QB Jones hadn't thrown a td pass in the previous 2 gms. OSU wrapped up its first conf title s/ 48 and was trying to impress the pollsters to land a spot in the BCS Title gm. OU had 5 TO's and OSU won 44-10 (-3') with the Sooners questioning their tmmates efforts in the 2H of LY's gm. OSU has lost 4 str trips to Norman by 33 ppg! OU comes into this after a last minute rally to avoid the upset vs WV (+11') 50-49 as Jones threw for a schl rec'd 554 yds and 6 td's incl the GW 5 yd'r to Stills on 4&3 with :24 left. The Sooners all'd a program rec'd 778 yds to the Mountaineers incl a schl rec'd 344 rush yd (16.4) to FBS rec leader Austin who played RB for the 1st time TY. OSU (-9') won a 3★ LPS for us with their 59-21 win over TT. With the score tied at 7 in 2Q OSU erupted for 28 straight pts on 3 long td passes and a 24 yd drive set up by a blk'd P. Chelf hit 11-21-229-3-0 in his 2nd start and Walsh, who had been previously announced OFY (leg) came back to direct the GL offense and scored 2 td's. With a B12 Title and BCS bowl shot on the line expect OU to play with a lot more effort than they did LY and the Sooners are 6-1 ATS in home finales.

TEXAS A&M 44 Missouri 27 - This B12 matchup....err we mean SEC matchup features two tms heading in opposite directions and may be the 1st time we've ever seen conf foes play at one HT's stad 3 str yrs due to B12/SEC sked quirks. Since a 51-14 road win by A&M in 1999, MO is now 5-1 SU and 4-2 ATS in this series and in those six meetings, there have been 4 outright upsets (3 by MO). In '10 the Aggies were -3' and lost outright 30-9 in a gm MO led 23-0 at the half. LY just as A&M (-10) had done all year, they blew a DD lead as they led 28-14 but would lose 38-31 in OT. LW we cashed a 3★ Small College Play against A&M (-39') off their huge upset of Bama and after jumping out to a 47-0 predictably put it on cruise control and gave up 4 str td's to the FCS's #3 tm SHSt. It's amazing to us that had Bama rallied to beat A&M, no one would be talking about Aggie QB Manziel for the Heisman but now he stands as possibly the front-runner as the nation's #2 to tal offense leader. With a bowl bid on the line and playing w/renewed confidence after a road win at Tenn, MO disappointed us LW in a 31-27 loss (-5) at home to Cuse. The Tigers did play w/o arguably their best player in DT Richardson (susp'd) and for what seems like the 100th time TY, QB Franklin left the gm w/an inj (CS) and Berkstresser (4-8-85-0-1) had to QB most of the 4Q. While MO again needs a win to make its 8th consec bowl, a win here could put A&M in a BCS gm as the Aggies hit the 10 win mark for the 1st time s/98.

Tulsa 26 SMU 23 - SMU is 0-4-1 ATS in home finales and just 4-15-1 ATS in Nov. LY SMU was playing its 3rd str top CUSA team in a row and 2nd str on the road. TU was -2' at home and dominated in a 38-7 win with a 451-265 yd edge. Tulsa punched its ticket to the CUSA Title game with a 23-21 (-1) win over UCF LW, finishing with 26-14 FD and 461-235 yd edges. QB Green (193 ypg, 54%, 13-8 ratio) threw for a ssn high 3 td's, all to top rec Garrett (52, 13.2, 8 td). The three-headed monster of Douglas (817, 7.2, 6 td), Watts (767, 6.2, 3) and Singleton (636, 4.2, 18) pace the ground gm. LW SMU was upset 36-14 (-3) on the road at Rice being outFD'd 23-16 and outgained 423-317. QB Gilbert hit just 15-27-214, his 3rd straight gm under 250 yds pass (237 ypg, 54%, 13-13 ratio) and he now takes on our #30 pass eff D (247, 59%, 15-10). RB Line is the SMU run gm as he has 1,126 yds (4.8), more than 8x's the ydg of #2 (QB Gilbert). The fav is 3-7 ATS and SMU is 11-5 SU/ATS (6 of 8 covers) in the series and a perfect 4-0 ATS when playing with revenge. The Mustangs know they need a win here to become bowl eligible and TU could be caught looking ahead to next week. **FLORIDA ST 27 Florida 10** - UF was 6-0 SU, 5-1 ATS and amazingly the L5Y this once close rivalry has

now been decided by 33, 30, 21, 24 and 14 pts. From 2007-'09 UF won the 3 games by an avg of 42-14 and were +260 ypg. The L2Y UF lost on the road 31-7 but were only outgained 333-276 and LY UF actually had 184-95 yd and 11-7 FD edges but lost 21-7. HC's Fisher and Muschamp even purchased a house together when both were asst's but expect no love lost here as both of these tms especially the Noles are back in the Nat'l Title chase after I W's shake-up. This will be the 1st time s/00 that both come into this gm ranked in the Top 10. As of presstime it is not known whether UF QB Driskel will start (missed LW) but Brissett does have some exp dating back to LY (1st st came in Death Valley). On the other side FSU QB Manuel is avg 253 ypg (69%) with a 21-6 ratio and LW the Noles clinched the ACC Atlantic w/a 41-14 (-31') over MD as their #1 total D all'd just 27 yds and 3 FD's in the 1H. Both tms feature top-notch D's and ST's bút the real mismatch is on off where FSU is avg 43 ppg TY, while UF is avg just 18 ppg the L/4 gms and that came against the likes of Mizzou, ULL and an FCS tm LW. Keep in mind FSU is just one bad half away (NCSt) from being the #1 tm right now and we think they make an emphatic statement here against one of the SEC's best.

SAN JOSE ST 45 Louisiana Tech 41 - LT has now won 5 in a row SU in the series by 15 ppg but are 1-3 ATS traveling here. Both come in off of drastically different results. LT (+3') was thinking BCS as they rebounded from a 41-17 deficit mid-3Q to force OT vs USt. After a USt td LT only gained 7 yds and lost 48-41 despite a 37-27 FD edge (outgained 646-629). QB Cameron threw his 1st 2 int of the yr but still has an outstanding 28-2 ratio (335 ypg, 69%). RB Dixon (1161 rush yd, 6.0, 26 td) is #1 FBS in scoring. LT's D has been suspect though as they have our #123 ranking incl our #114 pass eff D (336 ypg, 60%, 32-9). SJSt is flying high after upsetting BYU 20-14 (+2') at home LW for their 5th str SU win. The Spartans jumped out to a 20-0 lead after their 1st 3 poss then relied on the D which forced 3 TO's and 4 sks incl the final sk/fmbl as BYU was driving for a td in the final minutes. QB Fales is avg 359 ypg (74%) with a 12-3 ratio at home TY and his top target, Grigsby (66, 15.8, 9 td), leads the WAC with 103 rec ypg in conf pl. Spartans have our #58 D and #51 pass eff D (205 ypg, 57%, 14-12). Two 9-2 SU tms but SJSt is riding a 3 gm ATS win streak while LT has 4 straight ATS losses. MEMPHIS 30 Southern Miss 23 - SM is 16-4 ATS in the series and Memphis is 5-14 ATS in their home

finales. LY SM (-36') at home needed a win to wrap up the CUSA East Title. At the half SM had a 386-55 yd edge and led 34-0 and would cruise to a 44-0 win. SM has won the L/3 by an avg score 40-14. UM pounded UAB LW, 46-9 (+9') winning B2B gms for the 1st time s/'08 and 1st yr HC Fuente definitely has his tm making some strides. QB Karam hit 14-16-147 with a 3-0 ratio and Hayes (461, 4.7, 4 td) broke the 100 yd mark for is +50 ypg and we like the Warhawks to continue their march to their first bowl berth in schl hist.

UH (-34') would erupt with 35 pts in the 2Q, 24 in the 3Q and 14 more for a 73-17 rout. UH is now 9-0 SU/8-1 ATS in the series with their only non-cover being in '10 here when they won 42-23 (-19'). Tulane has been outgained in the L10 by an avg of 217 ypg. The Cougs battled back from a 31-10 HT deficit LW at Marshall to tie it at 41 with 1:18 left in the game. However, MU drove 37/8pl and hit the GW FG with :07 left for the 44-41 (-3') win. UH was outFD'd 37-23 and outgained 665-430. QB Jones, in his 1st start, did hit 31-44-316 with a nice 5-0 ratio and should get the start again here as they build for the future. TU dropped to 2-9 LW with a 28-23 (+10) loss to EC. QB Griffin hit 36-57-293 with 2 td's and surpassed the TU career rec'd for comp's but it was not enough as TU was outgained 387-302 (did have 22-20 FD edge). Rice is 6-3 SU and 8-1 ATS in the series and they have a Series and they have avg // ppg the L/1. The Owis come on 3 str wins and have charace at a bown after LW's surprising 36-14 (+3') rout of SMU where they had a 423-317 yd edge and benefitted from +2 TO's. The star of the gm was K Boswell (Groza semifinalist) who hit 5 FG's incl 3 from longer than 50 ydsl Meanwhile, the Miners were able to thwart a late comeback from SM as they pulled out a 34-33 win (-3') with an int on a 2 pt conv in the EZ. They have started QB Sullivan in the L/2 as his mobility (98 yds LW) gives the offense an added dimension. UTEP is 5-8 ATS in home finales but the HT is 9-3 SU and 8-4 TS in the series and we think the Miners spoil the Owls bowl hopes here.

UCF 43 Uab 19 - LY UCF came in motivated as they were off 3 losses but UAB finished with a 501 331 yd edge with their 501 yds the best any offense put up on UCF all year. UAB led 23-14 in the 4Q despite being int'd in the EZ twice. UCF rallied to take the lead with 5:02 left but UAB went 71/14pl and got a 40 yd FG with :21 left for the win. UCF is 7-2 SU in the series and playing with legitimate revenge and is 5-1 SU/ATS in home finales. The Knights lost an opportunity to host the CUSA Champ gm as they lost to Tulsa 23-21 (+3'). They were outFD'd 26-14 and outgained 461-235 as QB Bortles (13-31-169-1-0) shockingly was outplayed by counterpart Green (21-34-252-3-1). With East rival EC continuing to win, UCF needs a win here to lock up a CUSA Champ berth and it couldn't get any better than a UAB tm off a demoralizing 46-9 loss to Memphis at home (that's right Memphis!). Prior to that gm, we had been impressed with the Blazers under 1st yr HC McGee but clearly they are overmatched here

vs an angry Knights tm off a loss, playing w/revengé at Bright House! USC 28 Notre Dame 27 - USC has flat out dominated this one time rivalry. They are 9-1 SU and 7-3 ATS and

have outgained the Irish by 165 ypg. In their lone loss, USC was playing w/out Barkley (inj'd) and they missed a wide open rec for a td late and lost by 4. LY was a great situation for ND as they were off a bye, having their first night game in 21 yrs but USC had a 443-267 yd edge and won 31-17 (+9'). The key play of the game occurred when bkp QB Crist fmbl'd the snap at the SC2 and USC ret'd it 80 yds for a td (the dreaded 14 pt swing). At the start of the ssn, many could have predicted that this gm would have Nat'l Title implications but very few would have had ND coming in at #1 (1st time s/93) and USC at 7-4 but that is the case here as USC stumbles in off a 38-28 loss (-5) to cross-town rival UCLA, a gm they battled back from a 24-0 deficit but QB Barkley did take a hard hit late (shld'r) and DNR. His avail as of presstime is unknown so the Trojans could go to bkp Wittek who will still have the nation's best WR in Lee (1605 yds) to throw to. ND is off a 38-0 (-24) win over Wake as they jumped out to a 31-0 HT lead and cruised in the 2H. QB Golson continues to improve and threw for a career-high 346 yds (317 in 1H) while ND's D is still #1 in scoring D all'g just 10 ppg and just 9 td's all year! USC is 12-4 SU/ATS in home finales. The Coliseum has been a House of Horrors for ND tms coming in w/Nat'l Title hopes and we think the Irish are the next tm that succumbs to undefeated pressure.

HAWAII 21UnIv 20 - LY UH was on their its str road game and had stayed on the mainland during the wk. UH (-17') fmbl'd the ball 4x and lost 40-20 and were outgained 365-290 with UNLV covering by 37' pts! As you would expect the HT is 7-2 SU/ATS in the series and UNLV is 4-15 ATS on the road under Hauck and is playing a 12th str wk and UH is playing with legitimate revenge. LW in a terrible spot on a road trip off a short wk UH hung in w/AF in a 21-7 loss (+22') but were outgained 338-162. UNLV had a chance to finish at 4-4 in MW play but lost LW to Wyom 28-23 as QB Herring filled in for the inj'd Sherry and went 22-36-268-2-0. The FD's were even at 22 and after a hot ATS streak where the Rebs had covered 5 str, Vegas has adjusted to the HT tm and UNLV is 0-2 the L/2. Sherry again is ? here and we were impressed withe Warriors effort LW and will call for them to snap their 8 gm losing streak here.

WKU 27 North Texas 17 - NT DC Clint Bowen is in his 2nd year but in '10 was the WKU DC. LY WKU on the road drove 77/8pl for a td with 2:47 left for a 31-14 lead and NT got a 4 yd td pass with :46 left in the 31-21 (-1') WKU road win. WKU had a 483-322 yd edge. NT is 4-1 SU vs WKÚ winning their only 2 trips to KY by an avg 19 ppg. The Hilltoppers after a promising 5-1 start, have not been the same since blowing a 28-7 lead to ULM several wks ago as they have dropped 3 str gms incl LW 31-27 to ULL. NT is off a 42-16 (+10) loss to ULM as we cashed a 3★ Small College Play against the Mean Green. QB Thompson has been inconsistent with a 13-12 ratio (57%) and has found life difficult w/o leading rec Chancellor. While the tms rate similar on off and ST's, WKU has the D edge (#51-90) and has outgained foes by 166 ypg at home TY.

MIDDLETENN 37 Troy 34 - Troy is 6-0 SU and 5-1 ATS in the series and the visitor is 5-2 ATS. LY MT got

a rare cover as they were +12' on the road and had a 582-479 yd edge and down 38-35 they were int'd at the T17. LTH Troy had leads of 21-0 & 35-7 in the blowout. LW we cashed a 4★ LPS on MT as they got a 20-12 road win at USA as they finished w/a 445-338 yd edge. QB Kilgore continues to make good decisions w/a 16-4 ratio TY and RB Parker has clearly picked up the slack with star RB Cunningham being OFY as he has racked up 303 rush yds in the L/2. Troy is off a 41-34 loss to Ark St despite QB Robinson's best efforts (26-35-417-1-0). While the Troy off is avg 612 ypg the L3W the D is all'g 600 ypg! Troy HC Blakeney always puts a priority on MT and we expect a high scoring shootout here.

LOUISIANA 41 South Alabama 17 - First meeting LW we cashed a 4★ LPS going against USA as they fell to Middle Tenn 20-12 getting outgained 445-338. Now they must travel to one of the SBC's toughest venues against a surging ULL tm. One week after a heartbreaking loss to Florida, UL rallied back from a 27-17 4Q deficit as QB Broadway got a 14 yd td run w/:38 left for the 31-27 win (-4'). The Cajuns got the win despite a -3 TO deficit but they did have an impressive 582-415 yd edge. Even with 6 wins already, ULL needs more to secure a definite bowl bid as their fans had to impress bowl committees LY w/their turnout. We think they cruise here as they have huge edges on off (#49-121), D (#76-103) and ST's (#49-121) and USA players could be peeking ahead to their Hawaii trip on deck.

Ulm 30 FIU 23 - LY ULM was -1' at home and had 25-17 FD and 356-340 yd edges. FIU, thanks to a 9 yd IR

Fundamental handi capping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
