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POST DRAFT "A" & "D" GRADES HITTING 82% OVER 3 YEARS!

The Post Draft Issue grades a team's offseason a little differently than most. The grades we put into Power Sweep predict whether a team's record will improve or decline for the upcoming season. We take EVERYTHING into account. Included in the analysis are coaching changes, the NFL Draft, Free Agent signings, Free Agent losses and even favorable or unfavorable schedules. The "A" & "D" grades have been extremely accurate over the years.

We spend a great deal of time and effort making these grades and while there was no list in '11 (work stoppage), here is a recap of the past 18 years as well as '09, '10 and '12.

After a year hiatus due the NFL work stoppage the Post Draft grades returned last season. We released a total of 10 teams which earned either an "A" or "D" grades and while 7 were correct they all improved (or had their record fall) by over 2 games from the previous year and with an average difference of 5.6 games per team. That means in the last 2 "A" & "D" articles we correctly identified 18 of 22 teams or 82%.

These "A" and "D" are a huge help in determining which teams to bet on using the Vegas Over/Under season total. The chart below shows you how each team has performed vs their posted O/U number each of the last 3 years. NO TEAM has gone "Over" their projected wins all 3 years but 3 teams have gone "Under" each season in Dallas, Miami and San Diego. In '10 and '11 the "Over" and "Unders" were split at 16 each but LY 18 teams went "Under", 13 "Over" and one pushed. The numbers in **boldface** below went Over the posted Vegas Totals.

While it's been 8 years since the Patriots won a Super Bowl the fact that they remain one of the elite teams in the NFL is a testament to the HC/QB. NE is known for being a step ahead of the rest of the league in innovation which they'll need TY. After revamping the defense the L2Y, NE has turned its eye towards the WR spot TY. Three of the top 5 rec's from 2012 are gone w/ TE Gronkowski being a major question mark coming off 4 arm and a back surgery. The good news is that NE looks to have its best secondary in years and if LY's 1st RD DC's (Jones/Hightower) develop they should be fine with Jamie Collins bolstering the pass rush. NE has had a very tough time drafting/developing its own WR's due to their complex up-tempo nature (7.4 plays per game LY #1).

Dobson fills the need for a big possession type while Boyce is a speed asset (4.34). Both could see lots of time as while Amendola is quite talented, he's not very sturdy. Harmon is penciled in as the backup SS who'll get to learn the trade from another standout vet in the twilight of his career in Adrian Wilson. NE is unique in that they've had a positive ypg (+55 LY), TO ratio (+25 LY #1) with an Off ypg of less than 15.0 in nine of the L10Y. NE should once again remain on top in the AFC East but look for more of the ground game in 2013 behind Stevan Ridley until the WR corps develops Brady's trust.

The 2012 Ravens are the perfect example of how quality leadership and an established program overcomes hurdles in the NFL. The romantic point of view for LY's team is that they had to overcome a ton of injuries en route to the Super Bowl. However, Suggs was able to play all of the 2H of the season and the playoffs, they had a ton of depth at CB to compensate for the loss of stud #1 CB Webb (20 pbu/5 int in 2012) and not having Ray Lewis for 10 games actually made the interior of the defense more athletic. The key move was when Caldwell became the OC and in Flacco's L/6 full games he avg 8.43 ypa w/a 15-1 ratio and a playoff QBR of 117.2. While BAL has lost a ton of big names this offseason due to the cap, the truth is BAL needed them to move on for cap/age reasons and GM Newsome did a great job of restocking. Dumervil is the big FA pickup and Huff is a quality replacement for Reed at this point in his career. Elam and Brown add some much needed youth to the interior of the defense and Brandon Williams is going to give a big challenge to disappointing NT Cody. Offensively the Ravens have to get some depth at WR as while Torrey Smith's value has skyrocketed as a deep threat, only TE Pitta (61 rec LY) looks like a worthy complement. BAL paid a steep price for Flacco's success in the playoffs and with the changing of the guard its now his team as they defend their Super Bowl crown.

Marvin Lewis' 10 years with CIN makes him the 2nd longest tenured HC in the NFL despite just 2 Div Titles and no playoff wins in 4 appearances. While he's 1 game under .500, his 79 career wins are a franchise best and LY he led CIN to the playoffs in B2B yrs for the 1st time in 30 years. CIN won 7 of its L8 games LY but only had 1 win vs a team w/a winning record (NYG) that was interested for all 4Qs (BAL rested). This is a huge year for CIN w/ both Dalton and Green in their 3rd years and CIN did a nice job of giving them help w/ Eifert who is their version of Dallas Clark in that he'll be flexed all over the field. CIN is keeping the RB by committee approach w/ Bernard being the change of pace RB and Hamilton (90 rec LY) has a good chance to make noise as a #3 WR TY. Green is well on his way to being an elite WR but Dalton needs another place to go w/ the ball in the passing game (30% of pass att's to Green LY). CIN could have the best defense in the AFC North TY (#6 yds, #8 ppg, #12 def ypp LY). Hunt will get to learn the system TY and is insurance if DE's Johnson (11.5 sks) or Dunlap (6 sks) depart in 2014. Williams fills the need for a young safety that can play right away at either spot and can take over the playcalling in the future. CIN's secondary could get a big boost if LY's 1st RD DC Kirkpatrick (42 snaps LY) can get healthy and contribute. This is arguably the Bengals best roster since 2005 but Dalton needs to make the jump in OC Gruden's 3rd yr here and the AFC North looks to be very competitive once again.

PIT entered 2012 with a renewed focus and a new offensive playbook under Todd Haley and Roethlisberger responded hitting 63% and a 26-8 ratio despite missing 3 games. The downside was the 2nd worst rushing effort in franchise history (96 ypg, 3.7), 7 different OL starting lineups and while the defense finished 1st in yds and 6th in ppg they only had 20 forced TO's and were 24th in def ypp (12.4). The good news is that PIT's OL is the youngest s/56 and it's athleticism and agility along with the addition of RB Bell is promising for the ground game. While WR Wallace departed for greener pastures PIT knew it was coming and had a year to adjust for it. Wheaton gives them a similar big body deep threat WR w/ sure hands (227 rec at Ore St) to develop. Jones finally gives the Steelers a young developmental QB that can step in (in 2014 hopefully) if/when Roethlisberger gets hurt. LY was the 2nd straight year that PIT had less than 40 sks (avg'd 48.6 2008-10) and while Jones will come in as a 3rd Dn pass rush specialist he'll rapidly overtake Jason Worilds for live snaps. With SS Polamalu and FS Clark both on the wrong side of 32 and both backup safeties gone, PIT paid a big price (2014 3rd RD) for Thomas who will need to learn fast TY. The Steelers still have depth issues in the secondary and on the DL but LeBeau's system is so established that a non-Top 10 finish would be a surprise. A healthy Roethlisberger means PIT will always be a Wild Card threat but with a restocked BAL and improving CIN the AFC North title will be a challenge esp w/a uncertain TE Miller.

The Browns finished '12 with 80 sts by rookies with the leading passer, rusher, receiver and #2 tk'l'r all being in their 1st yr. The new ownership wasn't impressed with the slow and methodical approach to grooming the tm and opted for a change. While HC Chudzinski is a nice story the biggest upgrade here is with Norv Turner as OC and Ray Horton as DC. CLE will be much more aggressive on both sides but once again the issue will be how fast yet another cch'g staff can get the roster up to spd. CLE was active but not reckless in FA getting the pass rusher they needed w/Kruger, the DL versatility with Bryant, WR experience w/ Bess and situational depth w/RB Lewis and CB Owens. Weeden has impressed Turner in OTA's and the real QB battle in camp is at the bkp spot between Hoyer and Campbell. CLE's lack of interest in TY's draft is based on a perceived overall weak draft in terms of talent after the Top 10 and with so many young ply'rs they need to see who develops and who doesn't. Mingo is a very lean and fast spd rusher who will groomed liked SF's Aldon Smith was in his rookie yr. McFadden has a size/spd mix best suited for the nickel spot and Slaughter will be a sub-package FS to start. CLE lacks a proven #2 CB, WR Gordon is susp the 1st 2 gms, the TE spot is unimpressive and they take a big step down with TY's special teams unit. Its hard not to agree with the new owner who advised fans to curb expectations in '13.

While HOU wasn't especially active in FA their moves could have big impacts as the release of Walter means that 1st RD DC Hopkins is inked in as the #2 WR and that LY's DC's of Posey and Martin have some work to do. A healthy Ed Reed is a big leadership upgrade for the secondary and Swearingin will get a full year of learning from one of the best FS ever. Lechler's run of 5 straight yrs w/a 40+ net avg ended LY due to injury and he should be a big boost to LY's #14 spec tms unit. Brennan Williams will be given every chance to win the RG spot on a team that emphasizes the power run game w/ Foster. A team can't have enough pass rushers and Montgomery and Tevardo Williams will be paced into the defense and add much needed depth. HOU gets a tough run w/ BAL, SEA, SF, STL and KC before their bye and host NE and DEN in December. HOU should snare a 2nd str AFC South Title and how they fare vs the elite TY should be very telling for Schaub.

IND was rather active in FA working the 2nd tier market and while they added a lot of names many have some sort of injury questions coming in (Cherilus, Bradshaw, DHB, Landry, Walden). 1st RD DC Werner will be the #3 OLB learning from Mathis but his ability to cover is a question. Luck may have set the rookie record for passing yards but it came at a price as he was sacked/hit 157 times (25% pass att). Thornton and Holmes will provide depth TY and challenge for starting spots on the interior of the line in 2014. IND traded the 4th RD DC in 2014 for Hughes who has the versatility for hybrid schemes that Pagano prefers. IND does get a tougher sked TY and after 3 road games in a 4 week span w/ games vs SF/SEA they square off vs DEN prior to their bye week then get HOU afterwards.

TEN moved quickly by picking up the best OL in FA w/ BUF's Levitre and the best OG in the draft with Warmack to shore up the interior and give Locker a sense of protection and RB Johnson somewhere to run. TEN executed a rare trade up to snare WR Hunter who is expected to step into Britt's spot in 2014. Gooden will be the top backup LB at all 3 spots and Wreh-Nickel will compete for time at nickel CB for the #27 pass def that gave up 31 td's LY. Most of TEN's moves in FA were to add depth and experience as Greene will be the 3rd round RB, Walter the veteran possession WR but losing TE Cook is a big loss of talent. With an aging owner spending lots of money this year this is a "win or else" season for both Locker and HC Munchak.

If DEN's 1300 yd Off improvement were from a RB he would have finished 7th in the league and the 172 pt improvement over 2012 was 39 pts less than what KC scored as a team LY. They and HOU were the only teams to finish in the Top 10 of Off/Def in both yrs and scoring LY but DEN has improved its talent base even with Dumervil departing. Welker is a massive upgrade over Stokley and his defection from NE weakens a key AFC foe making the 11/24 game even more interesting. Dumervil's loss is offset some by Phillips who is set as a situational pass rusher at this point but DEN also bolstered its secondary with Rodgers-Cromartie and Jammer who shifts to FS. Keep in mind DEN only pulled in 16 int LY and their -1 TO's is something to note. Adding Vasquez at RG shores up one of the few question marks on offense and all 5 OL starters are essentially in their prime. DEN upgraded the interior of the DL with Knighton who was with DC Del Rio in JAX and 1st RD DC Williams will step right in alongside him in a heavy rotation. Montee Ball was a workhorse back at Wisconsin and while he's the #1 RB by default with the release of McGahee, he only has 59 career college rec's which makes him a 3rd Dn liability. Manning is another year removed from his neck injury and has arguably the deepest receiving unit in the NFL. The Broncos sked isn't a cakewalk opening with BAL followed by the NYG and having an interesting 3 game stint with KC/NE with a road trip to HOU in Dec. This is an all-in season for DEN as they play for homefield advantage.

Dinged by inj's LY at Cal, WR Allen is a good value in the 3rd RD and should bully his way up the roster. Williams is a developmental nickel DB for a secondary that will have 3 new str's. The huge ? will be where the pass rush will come from TY for support. SD has a tough open to 2013 vs HOU and 2 long road trips East with a very tough Dec sked as well. Faced with a lot of transition TY the Chargers look to be out of the playoffs once again.

The Raiders have opted to use 2013 to pay for their salary cap sins and honestly have a weaker roster than the 2008 Lions. OAK gambled and lost a 1st RD and 2nd RD DC on the Palmer trade largely due to a lack of talent at WR (departed TE Myers had 79 rec LY) and abysmal play at CB. OAK now steps into 2013 with potentially 8 new starters on defense, the worst QB and WR units in the NFL and 1st RD DC Hayden missed virtually all of the OTA's due to health complications. Most of OAK's FA pickups are on 1 or voidable 2 year contracts with just 32 ply'rs under contract for 2014 when they'll have over \$50 mil in cap space. The good news is that they have gone back to a power blocking OL style for McFadden and they have the makings of a decent OL with Watson challenging for the RT spot. However their highest drafted WR is 4th RD DC Jacoby Ford who's coming off a foot inj. It won't be a surprise to see QB Wilson start 4 or more games TY simply to evaluate him. The Raiders are essentially an expansion team staring at the top pick in the 2014 Draft next May.

The Chiefs single-handedly proved the saying that the most important position on the team is the QB. They only led on 8% of their offensive snaps in 2012 but sent SIX players to the Pro Bowl showing the talent that was wasted. That said there is a ton to like about the 2013 team starting with Andy Reid as HC. Reid needed a new venue after 13 sns w/ PHI and KC needed a proven offensive-oriented HC. Acquiring Alex Smith for a 2nd RD DC may be pricey but in his L/25 starts he has a 31-10 ratio w/a 20-5 record vs KC's 8-20 ratio LY. Avery is a pure slot WR to complement Bowe and Fasanos is a solid grab for a 2-TE set. Smith and Robinson team w/ Flow-ers and Berry to give the Chiefs a secondary that can hold their own vs DEN's 3-WR sets. KC settled on Fisher as the 1st overall pick due to his athletic potential and now have a robust OL that should open big holes for RB Charles. Kelce and Davis are good depth players who can develop into seeing significant snaps while Johnson will be groomed for a '14 job as KC retains the 3-4 while adding more aggression to the scheme. We fully expect KC to compete for a Wild Card spot TY and the grade backs it up especially with their toughest road game being against DEN.

WAS paid a high price for the rights to RG3 when they outbid CLE and while it's only one season it looks like it was the right move. Griffin became the 1st rookie QB to win an outright berth to the Pro Bowl since Marino as he led WAS to their 1st NFC East Title since 1999. What makes that even more impressive is that the Redskins were 2nd only to GB in terms of starts lost to injuries. Much of Griffin's success though is due to the fantastic rookie season of Alfred Morris who stunned the league with over 1,600 yds rushing including 200 (6.1) that buried the Cowboys in the season finale. Griffin is on target (ACL) for TC where he'll be eased into the lineup. Also OLB Orakpo is 100% and WAS should make strides in Haslett's 3rd season. Defensively the Redskins were very limited in the secondary and Amerson is a big ball hawking CB intended to combat the Cowboys/Giants weapons in the passing game. Thomas and Rambo have a good chance of making noise coming in as backup safeties as SS Meriweather's health is shaky after LY's knee injury and SS Doughty is good but not a big play maker which Haslett's scheme needs. WAS was severely limited by an NFL penalty on their FA moves with the offensive additions being mainly for depth and the only major FA pickup is Biggers as a nickel CB. The Redskins also have a tougher schedule TY with teams who have a full offseason to prep for Griffin/Morris as they travel to GB, DEN, MIN and ATL. They do get a nice 3 game home stand in Dec vs SF, NYG, KC before taking on the Falcons but fans need to show some patience early on in 2013.

Picking up Nassib shows the Giants are finally interested in pushing David Carr for the #2 spot at this point. Hankins and Moore are sorely needed high rotation players who will backup solid FA pickups Patterson and Jenkins who came over from PHI in FA. The Giants will basically have 3 new starters at LB with Connor taking over at MLB but at some point they need to add drafted quality to the unit. Aaron Ross returns from his 1 yr vacation at JAX to shore up LY's #28 pass D but Mundy at this point is just a backup safety. We are concerned with Pierre-Paul's (dropped from 16.5 to 6.5 sk LY) back inj as he may land on the PUP to start the yr. They get a tough start w/ DAL on SNF then DEN to open the year foll'd by KC/PHI/CHI just as they get used to new coaching staffs. Coughlin and Manning will keep the Giants competitive.

Injuries crippled the Cowboys in 2012 losing a whopping 71 starts but still they managed to make the season finale vs WAS an all or nothing game. Overcoming the limitations that come with the #31 rush off (3.6 ypc) Romo led DAL into that all or nothing game but once again self-destructed with the game on the line. After their 3rd straight year w/o a playoff berth HC Garrett has been stripped of his playcalling duties and DAL dropped its attacking 3-4 and welcomed Monte Kiffin and his 4-3 scheme. DAL was limited in FA TY due to cap limits which forced them to give Romo an extension that many (including DE Ware) have criticized. They were still able to add LB Durant to pair with stud LB's Lee and Carter. A big part of the 2013 plan is a healthier roster and with their targeted players off the board the Cowboys traded down for Frederick to upgrade the position that had 3 different starters LY. Frederick is also a bit bigger than most C's (6-4 312) and it won't be a surprise to see more between the tackles work for RB Murray TY. Receiving TE Escobar follows the league trend to 2 TE offenses and DAL does need to find an eventual successor to Witten. The Cowboys prefer bigger WR's all around and Williams is a big play threat for the #3 spot. DAL has had an urgent need to upgrade at safety for 2 yrs but Wilcox is a small-school project who needs time to develop. WE aren't sold on them finding a pass rush outside of Ware and DAL still has one of the weaker OL in front of an often inj'd RB which tempers the grade.

Barkley has the accuracy Kelly demands but his arm strength in PHI weather is something to watch. DT Logan gives the new DL a needed size boost as a rotational player. PHI is the Wild Card for the NFC East as they have tons of vet talent and we aren't forgetting the success of other recent Pac-12 HC's in the NFL.

Coming off a 15-1 season and having scored the 2nd highest (560) amount of pts in NFL history the Packers looked ready to dominate once again in 2012. McCarthy's plans to run the ball to take the pressure off the passing game went up in smoke when RB Benson sustained a foot inj vs IND. From there Rodgers took over and led the team on a 9-2 run w/a 29-4 ratio in that span. However, the weak run game and a depleted LB corps saw them beaten by SF for the 2nd time LY making TY's opening day game vs them even more interesting. Making LY's 11 wins more impressive is that they were the most injury depleted team in the league and their return to health is why the team, with the 8th most cap space in the NFL was a non-player in FA. While they did lose big names like Driver, Jennings and Woodson their age and injuries the LY has allowed GB to groom their replacements as they went along with live snaps. With the exception of the OL the Packers have a good draft history and they addressed their major issues here. Depth has been a major issue on the DL the L2Y and 1st RD DC Jones is an immediate starter on a unit that values aggressive pass rushers. When the leading rusher has less than 500 yds a makeover is needed and GB revamped the spot w/ Lacy and Franklin. Lacy is a big power runner w/ injury and work ethic issues while Franklin is a speed asset although neither are exp'd receiving backs. After getting sacked 51 times LY McCarthy was determined to improve the OL depth and Bakhtiari and Tretter could see significant snaps as the entire OL is being shifted around. GB looks to be a key player in for the NFC Championship race once again and keep in mind they also get back LY's 1st RD DC after he played just 200 snaps LY.

Despite a 10 win season Chicago released Lovie Smith not b/c they had missed the playoffs for the 2nd str yr but due to their inability to develop and protect Jay Cutler (148 sks 56 gms). While still highly effective, the Bears D (#5 def, #3 ppg) was also st'g to show signs of age and CHI was very tight vs the cap. While some were surprised by the hiring of CFL HC Trestman he has an excellent reputation wrk'g with QB's and was the QB/OC with OAK from '01-'03 when they were relevant. CHI will have 3 new OL starters and while 1st RD DC Long has great NFL lineage and upside his 5 career starts at Oregon are a major concern. Losing Hall of Fame LB Urlacher is a big blow but he wasn't the same player he used to be. Second RD DC Bostic will compete with former DEN MLB DJ Williams who at this point is an athletic upgrade over Urlacher but it remains to be seen how they fit alongside new SLB Anderson in a new scheme. DET believes he's another JPP but he had the benefit of being the #3 DE as a rookie with the NYG and Ansah is set to start. DET took a big hit with the loss of both st'g OT's and neither projected st'r (LT Reiff/ RT Fox) have live snaps at their spots. Adding to this is that Warford is exp to start at RG and FA pickup Bush may not get off to the fast start DET is hoping for. Depth is still an issue at WR though Burleson and Broyles are expected to be ready for the ssn. DET earns our only A+ grade and their special teams unit will determine how far they go.

ATL made a slight upgrade with the release of Abraham and the addition of Umenyiora who is younger and a better run defender at this point and they may also pickup Richard Seymour as a situational rusher later. Having lost 2 of their top 3 CB's in FA the Falcons drafted Trufant who will start at RCB and Alford who will compete for the nickel CB role. Trufant has a nice size/speed (6-0 4.38) mix but he'll be sorely tested in a division w/ Brees, Freeman and Newton. Goodman will see lots of work as a rotational DE to take the focus off Umenyiora. Tolilolo is blocking TE who knows his role in 2-TE sets. ATL was ready for the retirement of McClure when they drafted Peter Konz in the 2nd RD LY but the release of Clabo makes the RT battle in TC very interesting to watch. The Falcons are one of the most balanced and dangerous teams in the NFL offensively but their lack of a proven pass rush with rookie CB's is a big concern. ATL's sked is much tougher with two sets of 3 road games in 4 weeks in the 2H of the year as they take on the AFC East and the NFC West.

Lacking a 2nd RD DC, the Saints made an interesting pick with Vaccaro who can play both safety spots for a unit that gave up a 31-15 ratio LY. At the worst Armstead will be the swing OT but NO may be asking for trouble if they put the small school prospect at LT out of the gate. NO traded two 4th RD DC's for Jenkins to give them a huge (6-4 360) 3-4 NT to help shore up the run gm. The Saints have a glaring lack of pass rushing 3-4 OLB's here and their sked is loaded with big play QB/WR combos which is going to be an issue for a brand new D. NO also has a brutal 4 RG's in a 5 wk stretch in late Nov at ATL, SEA, STL and CAR. With Payton back, he alone will be a huge benefit and while there are a slew of other changes, they'll show improvement.

The schedule is favorable this year getting SEA, NYG, STL and NE at home with a long trip to SF being the toughest. However, the Panthers have massive concerns at CB as they are essentially starting nickel CB's and this is the biggest problem facing HC Rivera this year.

Despite the big name additions on the DL the Seahawks are going to be thin at the DE spot with the uncertain status of Clemens (torn ACL) and the 4 game susp of Irvin to start the year. Being able to add Winfield who despite his size is an elite CB in run def makes the Seahawks secondary arguably the most complete unit in the NFL TY. The Rams are clearly taking the long-term approach to rebuilding their roster with the treasure trove of picks they acquired. With the mutually classy departure of RB Jackson the Rams will be one of the youngest offenses for 2013 as Bradford enters his fourth year and first with the same OC. Fisher pulled no punches in noting that Bradford's struggles were due to the lack of talent around him. Adding TE Cook was a shrewd move as he was very underutilized at TEN and he is primed for a breakout year here. Even at 80% of what he was, adding Long makes 2 spots better as it shifts Saffold out to RT. Adding teammates Austin and Bailey gives the WR spot a big injection in terms of chemistry and playmaking, both of which were sorely lacking. Their impact in a division loaded with superior defensive talent may not really show until 2014 though. Ogletree is a 'tweener LB/safety who won't lack for snaps with the increasing value of TE's in today's NFL. Center Wells is in the twilight of a successful career and Jones will come in as interior depth this year to learn the ropes with the intent of taking over full-time in 2014. The Rams non-division home slate is manageable but their trio of back-to-back road games (Atlanta/Dallas, Houston/Carolina, San Francisco/Arizona) is pretty tough. STL's biggest weakness is the large amount of new moving parts on offense in 2013 which is compounded by the loss of Jackson and they may take a step back with their move in the NFC West not coming until 2014.

He'll be helped out by a healthy Mendenhall, giving a big boost to a position that was a non-factor LY. Arizona is tweaking its 3-4 and will have 3 new starters in the secondary. The Cardinals are also shoring up the OL with Cooper at LG (more pulls and traps) and Watford at RG. Minter is a very nice addition at LB and is a dark horse Def Rookie of the Year candidate. Mathieu is the nickel safety and will assume some PR duties as well. We'd give ARZ a higher grade if not for being in arguably the toughest division in the NFL this year.

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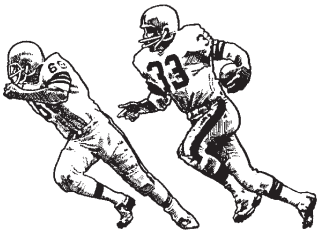
