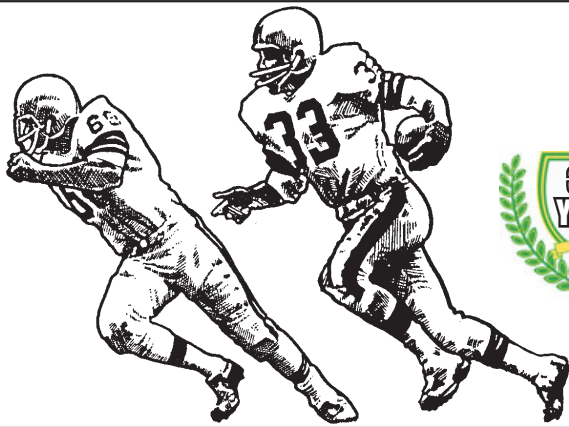

KEY SELECTIONS

4★ WISCONSIN over Indiana - This is one of, if not our favorite, series of all-time. UW was our 5★ College GOY vs Indy in '00 and rolled to a 43-22 win (-6). **LY we again used our 5★ GOY on UW (-7) and they simply delivered the largest GOY cover in Northeast history w/a 62-14 whitewashing covering the game by not 1, not 3, not even 5, but 6 td's!** They finished w/a 605-294 yd edge and they are now 8-0 SU (by 36 ppg) vs Indy and in the L/7 are 6-1 ATS (+240 ypg). In their L/3 gms vs the Hoosiers they have scored 83, 59 and 62 pts and that's not good news for an IU D that is all'g 37 ppg and 519 ypg, which is 145 ypg more than what their opp are avg on the yr. Both tms are off wins playing true to their form TY as UW wore down BYU 27-17 (-9) moving them to 8-1 ATS TY (only non-cover by a 1/2 pt) and they are on a 13-4 ATS run as a HF. On the other side, Indy won a 52-35 (-9) shootout over Illinois piling up 650 yds but did allow 612 and are on a 1-6 ATS run as a B10 AD. Amazingly, this is only Indy's 3rd AG TY as they were beaten by DD's by both MSU/UM getting outgained by 151 ypg. Meanwhile, UW is outscoring their foes by a 39-7 margin at home while outgaining them by 317 ypg! Series, technical, pulse and a mismatch at the LOS all point towards a Badgers blowout here. Add in the fact that we have already cashed three Key Selections on UW this year and you not only have our top play on these pages, you also might be getting another GOY winner!

FORECAST: WISCONSIN by 32 over Indiana
3★ North Carolina over PITT - Met in '09 bowl (in Charlotte) as Pitt won 19-17 (-1). The buy sign has officially gone on for the Tar Heels as they have now covered 4 str gms st'g with the near upset win over Miami on a Thurs Night. LW UNC was playing their 1st gm s/QB Renner had ssn-ending shldr' surg but it didn't matter as bkp Williams recorded a td passing, rushing and receiving to help UNC crush UVA 45-14 (-12). UNC did benefit from an 85-yd PR td and a 62-yd IR td but the outcome was never in doubt. Pitt picked up arguably the biggest win in the Chryst era upsetting ND 28-21 (+3). However, they did benefit from an early ejection of ND AA DE Tuitt while ND had 2 TO's inside Pitt's 5-yd line. In the 4Q, ND's D failed to fall on fmb! by QB Savage then a 45-yd IR set up Pitt at the ND5 and they punched it in for the GW score. After the gm the Pitt ply's celebrated like they had just won the Super Bowl. Now they are in a letdown spot vs one of the hottest tms in the country still needing wins to qualify for a bowl. **Heels make it 5 str covers and 4 straight wins and will we go to them for another 5★ GOY winner like we did in 2005 (16-14, +5 over BC)?**

FORECAST: North Carolina by 7 over PITT
3★ Houston (+) over LOUISVILLE - HC Tony Levine was at UL from '03-'05 and was the ST/OLB ocb the L2Y. These two were CUSA members until 2004 but haven't met since. UH is on their 6th str gm, 3rd AG in 4 wks and are on B2B away vs the top 2 AAC teams. UL is in a nice sked spot off bye and at UConn (FI) with home vs Memphis and a bye on deck. The Cards have rebounded since getting upset by UCF and have won their L/2 gms by a comb 65-13. In their L/gm they did allow a backdoor cover td w/35 left in a 31-10 win over UConn (-27'). UL did have a 369-237 yd edge and while on the surface it does appear Bridgewater hasn't lived up to his extremely high expectations TY, he is still avg 316 ypg (71%) w/a 24-3 ratio. However, they are now facing one of our favorite tms TY in the Cougars as despite a 19-14 loss (+12) LW at UCF, they covered for the 8th time in 9 gms. They had a shot at the outright upset late but 2 passes from the UCF10 fell incomplete incl one just off the hands of their AA WR Greenberry. With all the preseason pub, UL lines have been inflated TY and they have now failed to cover 4 of their L/5 gms. An example of this comes this wk as the tm that beat them at home TY (UCF) was only laying 12 at home to UH. Now, even after the Cougs covered LW, UL is now laying 17 to them. Take the Cougs to the bank for the 9th time in 10 gms!

FORECAST: Houston (+) LOUISVILLE by 7

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ NORTHWESTERN over Michigan - The visitor has covered 3 str and 5 of 6 with NW also covering 4 of 5. LY NW came in off a bye and all'd a deep tipped pass reception w/18 left setting up a UM FG w/0:02 left. They had the game locked up but lost in OT. TY they are at home and again off a bye while UM is off their rival MSU and a HG vs Neb. While the Wildcats come in losers of 5 str gms, nearly every one of them can be explained. In the biggest HG in schl history, they played great vs OSU but fell just short. Then, in a letdown spot vs Wisc the next wk, were understandably destroyed. With RB Mark and QB Colter on the sidelines they lost by 3 to what has turned out to be a good Minnesota tm. They then lost in OT on the road to Iowa. Prior to the bye, despite getting outFD'd 28-16 and outgained 472-326, they also saw victory slip through their fingers as Neb got a 49-yd Hail Mary. They now get a UM tm that is arguably one of the most overrated in the country TY. LW the Wolves lost for the 1st time at home in the Hoke era (20 gms) 17-13 (-6) to Neb. The OL continues to be anemic all'g 7 sks for the 2nd consec wk and Bo Schembechler must be rolling over in his grave as the UM rush off has inexplicably been held to -69 yds the L/2 wks. While both tms are in desperate need of a win, we'll more than gladly back the rested Cats at home against a bruised, battered and beaten UM tm off 2 physical gms.

FORECAST: NORTHWESTERN by 10 over Michigan
2★ ARIZONA over Wash St - These 2 gun slinging HC's have not crossed paths. The L/gm was in '10, UA won 24-7. UA has won a series best 5 str vs the Cougars by 25 ppg. While the HT has covered 4 str (2 vastly diff climates), Wazzu has also failed to cover 4 str at UA and 6 of 8 overall. Wash St does have the situational edge here as this is only their 2nd gm in 4 wks (10 days rest) while UA if off HC vs UCLA seeking revenge for a 66-10 loss and home vs Oregon (revenge for 49-0) on deck. The Cats came up short LW in their bid for revenge in a 31-26 loss (-2) to the Bruins w/the key play being a fmb! at the GL by RB Carey going in for a td in the 3Q. The Cougars have been a shell of their Sept selves. In the 1st 4 gms, the D all'd 265 ypg and they were 3-1 SU/4-0 ATS, however in the L/5 gms they have all'd 604 ypg going 1-4 SU/2-3 ATS! The offense has been inconsistent as the QB's lead the country w/20 int's while the run gm has been non-existent s/the opener avg just 44 ypg (2.6). **This game was actually our College GOY in each of our 1st two seasons with Arizona delivering big wins (-6', 34-17, -7' 45-6). Will we rekindle some old 5★ magic and play on a Wildcat tm outscoring their foes by 17 ppg at home?**

FORECAST: ARIZONA by 20 over Wash St

OTHER SELECTIONS

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 13TH - Ball St at N ILLINOIS - MAC title and BCS implications here. While NI has won 4 straight the visitor has covered all 4. LY NI was -2 on the road and BS led 23-14 in the 3Q. Leading 23-21 BS missed a 24 yd FG (1:26 3Q) and a 33 yd FG (10:55 4Q). NI got a 54 yd td pass w/4:58 left to go up 28-23 then got a 71 yd td run by Lynch with 3:03 left for a 12 pt lead. BS was SOD at the NI4. Cardinals have covered 8 straight as an AD w/4 outright upsets and BS was a 17 pt dog each of their last 2 trips here but only lost by 6 and 3. A Ball St victory would give them the MAC West Title (own tie-breaker over UT/NI) but the Huskies do have the nation's longest home streak at 24 and have won a MAC-record 22 straight cont gms.

Miami, Oh at KENT ST - This is a visitor series as the road team has won and covered 6 of 8 incl the L/2. LY MU was a 6' pt HD and KS rushed for 399 yds and jumped out to a 28-0 lead and it was 35-10 at the half in their 48-32 win. KS's last game was 11 days ago and this is their FHG (3-0 ATS) for a group of Sr's incl RB Archer and DT Nix that played a huge role in Kent's magical ssn LY but have disappointed TY. Kent is 4-1 ATS as a MAC HF but they did fail to cover as a 17' pt HF vs Liberty earlier TY. While MU is 0-9 SU/2-6-1 ATS TY, they did only lose to UMass and Akron by 7 ppg.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 14TH - Georgia Tech at CLEMSON - The home team is 7-1 SU/6-2 ATS and has won 4 straight and covered the L/3. LY Clemson was playing with legitimate revenge after GT had ended its unbeaten season in '11. While CU got their revenge and covered 47-31 (-10'), the game was closer than the final score. GT led 31-30 in the 4Q but CU got a td with 10:29 left, and a safety with 10:19 left - the first time either team had led by more than a td, 40-31. GT had a 37 yd FG blk'd with 6:16 left and CU went 80/13p! getting a 1 yd td run with :50 left for the frontdoor. Swinney is 13-5 ATS as an ACC HF but in the L5Y Clem has been poor vs GT's rush attack all'g 320 ypg (5.8). Both tms come in off a bye and both have FCS tms on deck.

Marshall at TULSA - Tulsa has won all 4 CUSA mtgs and has covered the L/2. TU was a 2 td+ fav the 1st 3 but was -3' LY on the road. MU had a 572-340 yd edge and we had a 3★ CTOT on Over 68. It was tied at 17 at the half and TU went 69 yds for a td then got a 95 yd FR td, which was the key play, 30-19. MU pulled within a td w/10:49 left but went for 2 and failed. TU went 66/6pl for a td with 8:25 left but MU was SOD at the TU16 with 3:32 left and on their last drive, got to the TU17 down 7 but as 48:6 fired incomplete (45-38 final). In the preseason this looked to be the 1st of 2 possible match-ups TY as they were both favorites in their respective divisions in the CUSA. However, only MU has followed through on those expectations. Tulsa is in a unique role of being a home dog (only 3rd time in 9Y) while Herd are 1-11-2 ATS as AF's. However, Tulsa is just 1-8 ATS this year (MU 6-3). Will the Herd step on their throats or will Tulsa have enough pride for one last rally?

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 15TH - Washington at UCLA - Last met in '10. First game for HC Mora vs his alma mater. He was a walk-on LB/DB who appeared in 2 Rose Bowls and was a grad asst. UCLA has won 7 str vs UW at home (5-2 ATS, 1-2 L/3) but LTH ('09) was -5 and only won 24-23. UCLA is playing a 7th str wk with the P12 South's other top teams on deck while UW is off a bye and home vs Colo. UCLA is in control of their own destiny in the P12 South and are on a 4-1 ATS run as a HF while UW is 2-6 ATS as an AD. However, UW has been the more impressive tm TY outgaining their foes by 134 ypg (UCLA +74 ypg). Winner here jumps the other in P12 bowl positioning.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 16TH - Duke by 3 over Miami, Fla - Miami has won all 8 as ACC foes (4-4 ATS) and UM's been fav'd in each by 17 ppg. However in the L/2 trips to Durham which incl LY UM was -6' and covered by a 1/2 pt (646-583 yd edge) and failed to cover in '10 (28-13, -18). LY UM declared it would not go to a bowl but their win at Duke gave them a share of the ACC Coastal Title. UM led 45-24 and was SOD at the Duke1 with 11:59 left and Duke got a 99 yd td pass. UM led 52-38 and missed a 47 yd FG with 5:14 left. Duke went 70/11pl for a td with 2:32 left converting on 48.5, 3&11 and 48.5 but their outside kick went OOB and UM got 1 FD and ran the clock. UM just faced FSU and VT while Duke is off a bye and a HG vs NCSU. The Blue Devils were in a back and forth gm LW but DB DeVon Edwards stole the show as he had a 100-yd KR td in the 3Q and also scored on B2B IR td's in the 4Q blowing the gm open in a span of :16. The 38-20 win (-10) was misleading as Duke benefitted from those 3 non-offensive td's and was outFD'd 20-12 and outgained 412-321. While Duke comes in flying high, UM, after their 7-0 start has been grounded in B2B blowout losses to FSU/VT as they have been outgained by 220 ypg. LW we went against the Canes on these pages and easily cashed a 3★ Key Selection on VT (+6) as they pulled the upset 42-24 controlling the gm throughout w/26-12 FD and 549-342 yd edges. Duke has lost 9 str home finales by 13 ppg, they also have only one win ever vs UM ('76), but this is a different tm and a different program.

VANDERBILT by 7 over Kentucky - VU was 1-6 ATS vs UK from '04-'10 and was a dog 5 str but VU has been favored the L2Y by 6 and 7 pts, yet delivered 38-8 and 40-0 wins. LY's 40 pt loss to VU was UK's worst in the series s/16 (78 gms) and 1st shutout at home s/'93. Franklin was 11-2 ATS at home his 1st 2Y but is 2-3 ATS TY. Both tms are off misleading finals as the Commodores were outFD'd 26-12 and outgained 344-183 but managed a 34-17 win (+10) over UF thanks to a +4 TO adv that directly led to 21 pts. It was their 1st over UF in Gainesville s/'45 and marks the 1st time in schl hist they beat UGA and UF in the same ssn. We did easily cash our NC Sportline Comp College POD going against the Wildcats LW as Missouri beat them 48-17 (-14) but it should be noted they had a 17-16 FD edge and also had a 37-26-22:34 TOP edge. **Just 3 yrs ago, the Wildcats were 15-pt favorites vs the Commodores and delivered us a College GOY winner. Now they find themselves DD dogs playing a Vandy tm that's due for a letdown off a huge upset win. Will we go back to the Cats here?**

Central Michigan by 3 over WESTERN MICHIGAN - After CM ripped off 5 str wins (4-0-1 ATS), WM has won and covered the L/2. LY CM led 23-14 after 3Q. Trailing 31-28, WM went 67/5pl for a td with 2:51 left to pull and then after a fmb! got a 42 yd td run for a misleading 11 pt win. WM had a chance for B2B road wins but lost 35-32 (-2) in OT at EM LW blowing a 29-21 4Q lead. They have now failed to cover in 6 of their L/7 gms. It used to be an automatic play to go against the Chips when they were on the road under Enos but they have clearly bucked that trend as they are on a 5-0 ATS conf road streak after getting a backdoor td vs Ball St LW in a 44-24 loss (+21). The Chips are in nearly the same situation they were a year ago, sitting at 3-6 needing to win out to get to bowl elig. LY they faced the 3 bottom tms in the MAC in their L/3 and proceeded to win/cover 3 str. Now they get WM/UMass/EM as they should be favored to pull the same run again this yr.

VIRGINIA TECH by 21 over Maryland - Last game came in '09 as VT is 4-0 SU/ATS in the series covering by 16 ppg (+210 ypg). The Hokies are 21-4 ATS in Nov home gms s/'85. LW we wrote that if QB Thomas could play clean, they had a solid chance of pulling off the upset at Miami and he did just that going 25-31-366-2-0 easily cashing a 3★ Key Selection on these pages in a 42-24 win (+6). The Hokies had 26-12 FD and 549-352 yd edges and are now back in the hunt for the ACC Coastal Title. Their D is all'g just 263 ypg, which is 166 ypg less than what their opp are avg. The Terps continue to sit on 5 wins as they have been trying to clinch bowl elig for the 1st time in the Edsall era since mid-Oct. LW they had a great situational edge vs the Cuse but were done in by 4 TO's and lost 20-3 (-5). They are now on a 1-4 SU/ATS run and they have been owned at the LOS in each of their L/2 gms getting outgained 489-163. That's not good news going up against a VT D that is all'g just 95 rush TY and can load the box w/MID's top 2 offensive weapons (WR's Diggs/Long) OFY. Hokies cruise for 2nd wk in a row.

BOSTON COLLEGE by 6 over NC State - The home team is 7-1 SU and a perfect 8-0 ATS. LY the FD's were even at 17 and NCSU only had a 376-322 yd edge and they were -14 at home. Perhaps the key play came with :27 left in the 1H with BC leading 7-3 and they took a chance and was int and ret'd 55 yds for a td. NCSU got a td with 1:14 left in the 3Q then after an int got a td :51 later and held on for the 17 pt win. This is the final HG for BC while NCSU is on 3rd AG in 4 wks. These tms look to be heading in opposite directions as BC comes in winners of 2 str gms and are sitting now at 5 wins needing just 1 more to grab a bowl bid in the 1st yr under Addazio (just 2-10 LY). LW they were in a bad spot, being a large favorite traveling to NMST and playing in altitude while also facing their former OC who knew their strengths and weaknesses. They found themselves in a dog fight tied at 34 in the 4Q but RB Williams came to the rescue w/2 long td runs and finished w/295 (9.8) in the 48-34 win (-24'). NC State, meanwhile has its worst league record s/1959 after a 38-20 loss (+10) to Duke. The gm was very misleading as the Wolfpack had 20-12 FD and 412-321 yd edges but were done in by 3 Duke non-offensive td's incl B2B IR td's late in the 4Q as Duke scored 3 td's in a span of :26. While BC gets to bowl elig, we fade them here as they are 2-5 ATS as an ACC HF and NCSU is off such a misleading gm.

Cincinnati by 3 over RUTGERS - The dog is now 6-1 ATS with 5 upsets. Cincy had won 5 straight but has been upset each of L2Y as a 2' pt AF and a 7 pt HF. The Scarlet Knights' D has held the Bearcats to 3 pts in each of the L/2 gms. LY we had a 3★ Key Selection on these pages on RU +7 and they won outright 10-3 on the road as the Bearcats didn't score until :11 were left. Rutgers is off a bye while UC hosted SMU with a trip to Hou on deck. RU needs 1 win for bowl elig but clearly have not impressed us as of late. Their L/2 HG's featured a blowout loss to Houston 49-14 (-7) as we cashed a 3★ LPS going against them. Then prior to the bye, they should have lost outright to Temple as they rec'd a late fmb! at their 28 w/TU driving. On the preceding drive, they got a 33-yd td pass on 4&10 w/:35 left for the 23-20 win (-13). On a positive note, they should get back RB James here who was among the national leaders in rushing prior to being KO'd after 4 gms. LW we went against Cincy and took SMU as our Underdog POW on these pages and nearly got another outright upset in a 28-25 Bearcat escape (-7'). SMU missed some scoring opportunities in the 1H and could have led into HT. However, Cincy did control the 3Q before the Ponies rallied late. While they have played a very weak late (#121), the Bearcats are outgaining their foes by 166 ypg while Rutgers is -8 ypg but the Knights do have the situational edge here.

UCF by 14 over TEMPLE - First meeting. Temple gets a bye prior to this matchup while this is UCF's only AG in 6 wks and they are off a HC gm against UH w/AAC title implications and have a short wk vs Rutgers at home in 5 days. Weather could be factor as UCF has not played this late in Nov up North in over a decade and it will be chilly for the Florida team. Ever since the Owls made the switch to frosh Walker at QB, it's been a completely different tm. In Walker's 4 starts, the Owls have covered all 4 and led in the 2H of gms against SMU and Rutgers. The loss to Rutgers was unfortunate as they deserved better. Up 20-16 late 4Q, they fmb!d on 4&1 at the RU28, then saw RU go 72/8pl getting a 33-yd td on 4&10 w/:35 left. Defensively, however, they are still all'g 508 ypg! LW UCF beat UH 19-14 (-12) stopping UH at the 10-yd line late in the 4Q. While they are great at home at Bright House, they are just 1-6 ATS as a conf AF incl nearly getting upset at Memphis earlier TY off a big gm vs SC. UCF does have the clear talent edges and while Temple has the situational edge, they did lose to a similar UL tm earlier TY here by 23.

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PENN ST by 21 over Purdue - While Penn St has won 6 in a row SU, the visitor has covered 5 straight. LY PU settled for a 21 yd FG on its opening drive and a 3-0 lead but PSU would roll up 546 yds offense and led 34-3 in the 3Q at Purdue. PU went 49/6pl getting a 2 yd td pass on the final play of the game, 34-9. Small golf clap goes to the Boilers who LW entered the red zone for the 1st time s/late Sept and actually scored not 1, but 2 offensive td's. The problem is they were outFD'd 28-12 and outgained 509-266 in a 38-14 loss (+14*) to Iowa and they have now lost 7 str gms and have failed to cover 5 of their L/6. The Boilers are getting outscored by 26 ppg on the road and are -211 ypg. Penn St, meanwhile, ran into a hot Minnesota tm LW and lost 24-10 (+2*). However, this young tm is now back in the friendly confines of Beaver Stadium where they are outscoring their foes by 15 ppg (+138 ypg) compared to their poor away marks (-19 ppg, -85 ypg). While PSU should be able to get a comfortable win, it should be noted this is only the 4th time in the L/11 yrs they are a 20-pt B10 fav.

SOUTH CAROLINA by 7 over Florida - The home team is 4-1 ATS. LY SC had just played UGA in a huge HG, gone into Death Valley and taken on LSU and was playing their 3rd straight tough game. UF QB Driskel was the first QB this century to throw for fewer than 100 yds but for 4 td's. An amazing stat is that in the 1H, UF had just 29 yds and 2 FD's but led 21-6 although they seemed in control from start to finish. UF was a 3★ Key Selection on these pages and rolled to a 44-11 (-3*) win. TY SC is off a bye (4-1 ATS in reg ssn byes and 7-2 ATS s/06). The Gamecocks have new life in the SEC East after their comeback win over Mizzou in 2OT. Prior to the bye they beat Miss ST 34-16 (-12). The game was misleading however, as they were outFD'd 23-12 but benefitted from 5 Miss ST TO's. QB Shaw even w/all of his injuries has an outstanding 18-1 ratio while RB Davis is one of the best in the country w/1,058 (6.4) and 10 td's. This is their L/SEC gm TY as they have FCS and Clemson on deck (UF also FCS then Fla St). UF is off a very misleading 34-17 loss to Vandy (-10). UF had 26-12 FD and 344-183 yd edges but couldn't overcome 4 TO's that resulted in 21 pts. Murphy who many laughably said was a huge upgrade over st'g QB Driskel now has a 1-4 ratio in his L/4 gms. On the bright side, the D continues to perform well (outside the Mizzou gm) and is still only all'g 268 ypg, which is 170 ypg less than what their opp are avg. While momentum and situation says take SC here, it's tough making them a 2 td favorite over a tm w/a top 10 D off a misleading gm.

FLORIDA ST by 42 over Syracuse - In the L/gm (05) #6 FSU won 38-14. This is HC for the Noles and they have the sked edge off WF w/Idaho on deck while Syr is on 2nd str away and heat and humidity could be a factor as the temps in the Northeast plummeted this wk. The Noles are now 8-0-1 ATS at home the L2Y when laying more than 14 w/an avg cover of 17 ppg. No inflated line is safe for the newly secured #2 Noles this yr as they are fresh off a 59-3 (-34) beatdown of WF forcing 7 TO's while ret'g 2 for td's. It was 3rd time TY they have easily covered a spread of 30 or more. The Cuse, on the other hand, have now won B2B gms and have surprised us a little TY after their 20-3 win (+5) over MD. They were outFD'd 19-18 and benefitted from 4 MD TO's. While their D has all'd just 3 pts in their L/2 gms combined, that came against 2 feeble offenses playing w/o their in'jd playmakers at WR. In gm's against the better tms in the ACC, they all'd 49 and 56 pts to Clem and GT. Now they face a FSU tm led by QB Winston that felt they under-performed LW.

Florida Atlantic by 10 over SOUTHERN MISS - First meeting. It was the same ol' story for SM LW as during their 21-gm losing streak, they have routinely gained yds (357 LW) but TO's (4) resulted in another non-cover as a DD dog losing 36-13 (+17) to La Tech. They have now failed to cover 6 str gms and are an abysmal -18 in TO's. FAU has had 2 byes in the L/4W incl LW. After a tumultuous wk that saw their HC and DC dismissed for drug use, a motivated FAU tm beat Tulane 34-17 (-3). The gm was misleading, however as they trailed 17-7 at HT and benefitted from an almost unthinkable 4 str int's on 4 consec Tulane passes in the 2H. In their L/35 AG's, they have only been favored in 1 of them w/an avg line of +16. Now they are with an interim HC who has never been a HC before and dealt w/a complete game plan going on the road as a DD favorite. While SM's run of futility is among the worst in NCAA history, it's tough to lay pts on FAU in their unique situation here.

Akron by 7 over MASSACHUSETTS - It's hard to say a team that had just 3 wins from 2010-'12 and just one win LY is playing with revenge but Akron is. Bowden had 2 games circled LY as wins. After getting the first they lost to UMass as a 16 pt HF (-3 TO's). UMass had 4 punts pinning Akron inside the 10 (twice at the 1) and also had 4 int and a blk'd punt. Akron had a 427-327 yd edge but UM won outright 22-14. Both teams are off a bye but Akron also has a bye on deck. The Zips have to be thrilled with 3 wins on the ssn matching their combined 3Y total. In their L/gm they got a 16-7 win (-1) over rival Kent and despite what we thought was arguably the toughest sked any MAC tm faced TY, they are a respectable -63 ypg on the yr and are +13 ypg their L/4 gms. UMass has also made some strides TY, but not nearly as much as HC Molnar would like as they are -1-8 and are -167 ypg. It's been a revolving door at QB due to injury and sub-par play as the offense is avg 110 ypg less than what their opp are all'g. Also troublesome is the fact they are all'g 241 rush ypg (5.7) and will be facing RB Chisholm who has 317 yds (6.0) in his L/2 gms. Despite being a better tm on paper playing w/revenge we do fade the Zips a bit here as they have only been an AF just once s/08 pushing as a 7 pt AF 24-17 vs Miami, Oh earlier this year.

EAST CAROLINA by 27 over Uab - EC has now won 6 in a row by 13 ppg. Visitor has covered L/3 with EC going 6-2 ATS L/8. LY EC was -2 on the road and did have 27-19 FD and 600-401 yd edges but the lead changed hands 4x. UAB led 28-27 in the 4Q but EC would get 2 td's to go up 42-28 w/6:53 left and after a UAB td, EC got 2 FD incl a 27 yd run to the 26 and took a knee. Blazers are on 2nd of B2B away and 3rd in 4 wks and played CUSA's other top East tm in Marshall LW losing 56-14 (+24). They have a short week on deck against one of CUSA's best West tms in Rice. HC McGee demoted his DC wks ago and now has gone so far to completely abandon his pass attack on offense to protect his D as they have only attempted 26 total passes in the L/2 gms combined. While they have avg'd 294 rush (5.2) and have held the ball for an avg of 39 min in both of those gms, it hasn't mattered as LW they all'd 12.6 yards per play! Now they face an EC tm fresh off a 58-24 (-16) win over Tulsa as QB Carden continues his onslaught on the EC record books accounting for a schl rec 7 total td's. EC can name the score here as UAB has failed to cover 5 str ATS on the road TY.

SMU by 27 over Connecticut - Only mtg '89. SMU has struggled in the role of a conf HF going 2-8-1 ATS through '11 but they did go 2-0 ATS in '12 and were backdoored earlier TY in that role vs Temple. Both teams had byes 2 wks ago and this is a long and unusual trip to Texas for UConn (longest reg ssn trip s/09 when they played at Baylor). It's been a season to forget for the Huskies as they are now 0-8 after their 31-10 loss (+27*) to UL L/Fri. On the bright side, they did manage their 1st cover under interim HC Weist getting a backdoor covering td w/35 left. However, true frosh QB Boyle s/taking over 4 gms ago is completing only 44% of his passes w/an 0-8 ratio and the D is starting to wear down all'g 474 ypg the L/3 after only all'g 348 ypg the first 5. That's not good news facing an SMU tm that is avg 549 ypg and 43 ppg in AAC play TY. Also their QB Gilbert is on fire avg 432 ypg (69%) w/a 13-1 ratio in AAC play. LW we used the Ponies (+7) as our Underdog POW on these pages and they nearly got an outright upset in their 28-25 loss to Cincy. They certainly had their opportunities as twice in the 1H they came up short inside the UC RZ. They are now in desperation mode to get to a bowl. **We have already cashed a 5★ October GOM on the Ponies TY, will we go back to them again here?**

KANSAS by 1 over West Virginia - In the 1st B12 mtg, WV was a ssn best +373 yds in a 59-10 win (-20*). Geno Smith matched a single game FBS record for % comp by hitting 23-24 passes for 407 in his FHG. WV is in unique role of B12 AF as they have been a DD away dog in each of their 4 B12 AG's TY. LW we cashed on these pages going against them w/a 3★ Key Selection on UT (-5) as the Horns pulled out the 47-40 OT win on the road. If you watched the game you would have seen the Mountaineers put forth maximum effort and now they must travel on the road where they are getting outscored by 20 ppg (-159 ypg). KU is struggling at 2-7 but has had their moments early in gms TY before being worn down by bigger, stronger and faster tms. WV is not one of them and we also like the fact that KU is the home dog with the better D (#62-80).

Louisiana by 27 over GEORGIA ST - First meeting. UL's bowl games the L2Y were in domes but this is their 1st reg ssn game in one s/04 (Idaho). Georgia ST is off a bye but UL is off a Thursday Nighter with bye on deck. The Ragin Cajuns are alone atop the SBC standings after escaping w/a 41-36 win (-13) over Troy. We easily cashed a Thurs Marquee going against them as they had to stop Troy on 4&g at the 4 w/2:00 left. It's been a tough 1st yr in the FBS for GSU as they are 0-9 TY and dating back to LY have just 1 win in their L/20. On the bright side, they have been competitive as after failing to cover their 1st 2 gms vs FCS foes, they have actually covered 6 of their L/7 gms. The problem here though is their DL, which was thought to be a strength in the preseason but has been hit hard with injuries and suspension and are now all'g 225 ypg (5.1). They will be pitted up against a UL ground gm that is avg 223 ypg (5.0). We may fade UL a bit here as impressive as they have been in their 7-gm win streak their D has all'd 450 or more yds in 3 of the L/4 gms leaving room for the backdoor. This is also their largest AF role in conf play s/08.

COLORADO by 4 over California - Another pair of 1st yr HC's both out of the WAC. The home team covered all 3 of the L/7 SU/ST matchups. First actual P12 gm that their '11 mtg was a non-conf gm already scheduled prior to Colo joining. LTH ('11) Cal won 36-33 in OT. Cal is 8-24 SU and 10-22 ATS in Pac-12 AG's. Cal is off their FHG, traveling to altitude and has rival Stanford on deck. LW vs USC, they were crushed 62-28 (+17) marking their 10th str loss to the Trojans. They have also lost 14 str gms vs FBS tms by an avg of 25 ppg and are 2-8 ATS on the yr. Colo has fared a little better notching 3 wins TY but 2 of those came vs FCS opp and LW lost their 14 str conf gm (13 by 20+) 59-7 (+28) to Washington. This is only their 2nd time being a P12 favorite but they do have the best ply'r in the field in WR Richardson who has 1,061 yds (17.7) and 9 td's TY. Someone's "0" has gotta go and we'll take the home team.

† Baylor by 21 over Texas Tech - Arlington. 5th straight at a neutral site. TT had reeled of 15 straight wins but Baylor has now won 2 str. TT was favored in all 15 of their wins with an avg line of -17 while Baylor was -3' and -13' the L/2 (fav vs 13-3 ATS). LY BU was -3' and had a 32-27 FD edge but traded a good portion of the game. The two teams combined for 1,241 yds. TT was leading 21-7 and on 3&8 miled at the BU7 with 1:32 left in the half and BU went 93 yds for a td with :05 left to gain momentum. A 45 yd IR td gave BU its first lead, 35-31 in the 4Q. BU missed a 48 yd FG w/0:00 left but won it in OT. Baylor w/skied edge off a bye and Thursday Nighter while TY is playing their 7th str. These tms look to be going in opposite directions as BU is now 8-0 (12 str wins dating back to LY) and have now covered 13 of their L/14 gms after beating OU 41-12 (-16'). They were down 5-3 in the middle of the 2Q, but OU failed to capitalize in the redzone and BU scored 2 td's in the L/minute of the 1H to blow the game open at 24-5. As great as the win was they did lose top WR Reese for the rest of the reg ssn while their top 2 RB's were also banged up (CS). The good news is that 3rd string RB Linwood ran for 182 yds (97 after contact) and Petty is still avg 13.2 ypa w/a 2.1 ratio. While he doesn't get enough credit, DC Bennett is doing a great job with the D as it is only all'g 306 ypg and 15 ppg. TT, meanwhile has lost 3 str gms after a 7-0 start and LW we correctly predicted that the Sr Snyder would out-coach the Jr Kingsbury. However, this week brings a new role for the Raiders as they are huge dogs taking on a BU tm that is off the biggest gms of their careers to date and undefeated pressure is being added each wk.

BOISE ST by 24 over Wyoming - Boise is now 1-9 ATS as conf HF the L2Y with the combo of inflated line and increased competition and the fact these Broncos are not at the same level of the Kellen Moore led bunch. BS is 7-0 SU in this series and they have won the L/3 by an avg of 44-11 but the visitor has covered 3 straight and Wyoming has covered the L/3 here (+35, +12', +23). Boise is off a bye while Wyoming hosted Fresno. LY WY was without HC Christensen who was susp'd and there was 6" of snow cleared from the field before the game. WY had 151 yds on its first 2 drives but just 120 over the next 8 and BS won 45-14 (-14'). BS sat its str's in the 4Q and WY gained 118 yds on 23 plays. Christensen is 15-5 ATS as an AD. As disappointing as this season has been for Boise, they still are sitting at only 1 loss in the conf after their 42-30 (-7) win over Colorado St 2 wks ago. While they were outgained 626-437 and outFD'd 35-20 they did lead 42-17 at one pt in the 4Q. Bkp QB Hedrick has played well w/Southwick out for the reg ssn as he is comp 70% of his passes w/a 7-2 ratio and gives the Broncos some mobility at the pos w/246 rush yds and 6 td's. WY is reeling off 3 str losses and LW after jumping out to a 10-pt lead saw Fresno score the gm's final 48 pts while getting outFD'd 32-14 and outgained 600-296 in the process. Their D has now all'd 6 str gms of 435+ yds and 3 str of more than 500. That's not good news when facing a new high-tempo Boise offense.

ARIZONA ST by 20 over Oregon ST - The home team is 11-2 SU and OSU won LY at home (36-26, +3'). The Beavers are 4-1 SU/ATS in the series. While OSU only won by 10 and the FD's were even at 19, OSU could have easily won by more. ASU, aided by a FR td, jumped out to a 14-3 lead and blk'd a punt for a safety but it was 19-19 in the half. OSU would open up a 36-19 lead with ASU going 77/9pl getting a garbage td with :22 left. Graham said after "we got our butt whipped. They were better than us. Their defense dominated our offense." Graham usually takes care of business at home as he is 9-1 ATS as a CHF dating back to his days at Tulsa but Riley is 13-4 ATS as a P12 AD. OSU is also off a bye and Riley is 9-2 ATS vs P12 in that role. Prior to the bye the Beavers had lost B2B gms as their high-powered offense has avg'd just 13 ppg due to inconsistency at QB as Mannion who had been the nation's leading passer has just a 2-3 ratio in the L/2. LW the Sun Devils rallied from a 12-pt 4Q deficit to beat Utah 20-19 (-7) for their 4th str win as they have a 1-gm lead in the P12 South. While on the road they have been rather mediocre, now they come back home where they are outscoring their opp by an avg of 51-22 (+218 ypg). These tms continue to go in opposite directions.

Georgia by 3 over AUBURN - Prior to LY the home team had covered 5 straight and AU is home for a 2nd straight. UGA has scored the L/76 pts in this series. LY UGA posted a 38-0 shutout, their largest win in the series s/46 (41-0). It was their first shutout of Aub s/78. UGA had a 323-124 yd edge at the half and led 28-0 pulling QB Murray in the 4Q and at the end had there were more UGA faithful in the crowd than Auburn. Now after being a 15 pt AF here LY and covering by 3 td's plus, they find themselves an underdog. TY UGA is off App St (45-6, -40) and has UK on deck. LW Murray broke one of the last SEC career records remaining as he passed Danny Wuerffel for most career td passes. Kudos to the job HC Malzahn has done on the Plains TY as they have now won 6 str gms (covered 7 str) after their 55-23 win (-7) over Tenn. The gm was a bit misleading as the Tigers benefitted from avg an NCAA-record 44.9 yds on 7 combined KR/PR incl ret'g 2 for td's. There has been a lot of talk about the Tigers rolling into the Iron Bowl at 10-1 but everyone forgets that UGA was a Nat'l Title contender prior to the massive attrition suffered in Oct. After B2B wins and w/a healthy RB Gurley, we'll call for the Bulldogs to quiet the locals.

TEXAS by 3 over Oklahoma St - Not only has the visitor covered 6 straight but they've won 5 of 6 outright. LY's gm had 4 lead changes in the 4Q w/UT going 75/8pl for a GW td w/:29. While OSU only hosted Kansas LW, they are on their 3rd AG in 4 wks (but 2-0 ATS in that role L3Y). While Baylor gets all of the pub, these are the next 2 hottest tms in the B12 as the Horns have now won 6 str gms after their 47-40 win over WV in OT cashing a 3★ Key Selection on these pages and also a 4★ LPS. Their winning formula continues to be surrounded by solid line play on both sides as they have all'd only 2 sks in the L/4 gms while the D has recorded 24 sks in 6 gms under new DC Robinson after only posting 2 in the 1st 3 gms. The Cowboys have also focused on winning the LOS particularly going to the ground gm on offense under Chelf but LW they managed just 359 yds vs KU. Now they face a UT D that has been able to shutdown the run in recent wks and can put pressure on Chelf who is only completing 51% of his passes. Add in the fact that the Horns are a very rare home dog and we say Hook 'Em Horns for another week.

OKLAHOMA by 31 over Iowa St - 14 straight OU wins and in the L/8 the Sooners are 6-0 ATS when laying 22 or under and 0-2 ATS when laying more (lost as 28 and 30 pt fav). In the L/4 at home Sooners have finished with a 301 ypg edge. LY OU was off a loss and we used the Sooners as a 4★ Key Selection on these pages and a 4★ Top Wkly LPS. OU completely dominated the 1H with a 325-84 yd edge but only led 14-6. OU led 35-13 before giving up a td with 6:32 left and OU had a 593-290 yd edge in their spread covering 35-20 win. This is OU's home finale and also the only home game in the last 6 weeks of ssn and they are 19-9 ATS in Nov HG's. Iowa St is playing their 8th straight week all vs top 7 in the B12. LW they nearly pulled out an upset over TCU but all'd a td run w/38 left in their 21-17 (+7) loss. They were outgained 368-253. Now they play an angry OU tm off a blowout loss to BU as they outplayed the Bears for much of the 1H but missed on some scoring opportunities. Stoops is 15-6 ATS off a loss and they need a feel-good win here.

OREGON by 28 over Utah - First conf meeting. Last game was in 2009, UO (-5) beat #18 Utah 31-24. UO went 10-5 ATS as a 20+ pt P12 fav under Kelly. TY Helfrich has picked up where he left off going 2-1 ATS as a big P12 fav and overall is 7-2 ATS vs inflated lines. Utah went 2-7 on the P12 road in their first visit to the new stadiums and this is the only new one they're visiting this year. UO is off only their 3rd reg ssn loss in 4Y (2-0 ATS after both vs Oreg St). L/Thur they trailed Stanford 26-0 before mounting a comeback that fell short 26-20 (-10') as we easily cashed a Thur Night Marquee on the Cardinal. The Ducks had their opportunities in the RZ early but it came down to the LOS and they were dominated getting outscored 274-62 while SU had a 42-34-17-26 TOP edge. The Utes upset that same Stanford tm earlier TY and LW were on their way to pulling another but blew a 12 pt 4Q lead to ASU in a 20-19 loss (+7). As of presstime it is not known whether Ducks QB Mariota will play or not so we will call the Ducks by their usual 4 td's and evaluate the line later in the week.



UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

Over 32 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 214-160. The last 14 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous **OUT-RIGHT UPSET WINNERS (50!)** to the incredible record **INCLUDING 4 TY** including 3 straight outright winners!!!!!! Here is TW's Underdog Play:

NEBRASKA +7 over MICHIGAN ST

In their 3 recent meetings (2 as B10), incl the '03 bowl, NU is 3-0 SU/ATS (+136 ypg). NU won 24-3 (-4) in '11 but LY on the road trailed 24-14 and got a td with 7:02 left and then was SOD with 3:12 left. NU got it back with back with 1:20 left went 80/8pl incl a 4&10 3rd yd pass. A PI on 3&10 gave them a FD to the 5 and they got a 5 yd td pass with :06 left to pull out the win. LY in Mich St games the visitor went 10-1 ATS and this year is 6-3. Both teams just played Mich with MSU hosting them and it is off a bye while Nebraska traveled there LW. The Spartans' D deserves all the credit it receives as it is holding tms to just 210 ypg, which is 178 ypg below their opps ssn avg's. They are also only all'g 43 rush ypg (1.6) and haven't all'd any opponent to top 100 yds TY. They will get their toughest test to date here as the Huskers offense is avg 247 ypg (5.2). Also noteworthy is comparing the improved Neb D, which LW held UM to -21 yds rush (MSU -48) and also all'd just 32 rush yds to Purdue (MSU all'd 66). It's tough to make a MSU tm a td fav here on the road when their offense is still inconsistent and this is the 1st time the Huskers have been a home dog since upsetting OU all the way back in '09. Huskers take command in the Legends!

FORECAST: NEBRASKA by 3 over Michigan St

NAVY by 10 over South Alabama - First meeting. Navy has won 10 straight home finales by an avg of 21 ppg (5-5 ATS). However, the Mids are just 12-21-1 ATS as a HF including failing to cover LW in their 42-28 win (-16) over Hawaii. We did cash our Top Wkly CTOT LPS on the OVER as QB Reynolds ran for a career-high 226 yds and 4 td's. USA last faced the option in '11 (lost 41-10 Cal Poly). Jaguars did have a bye to prep and it was also probably needed to lick their wounds after yet another heartbreaking loss to Ark St 17-16 (-3). It was USA's 3rd 1-pt loss on the ssn and their other 2 losses came by 2 and 7 pts. Navy can wrap up their 11th bowl bid in 12 w/s w/in here but it should be noted that USA is 9-3 ATS as an AD incl 3-0 ATS this yr.

Ohio St by 38 over ILLINOIS - The Illini had a 7-2 ATS run in this series but OSU is on a 5-0 SU/4-1 ATS run, although they have won their last 3 trips here by 10, 11 and 10 pts while being outgained by 40 ypg. LY OSU led just 7-6 in the 1Q but had a dominating 2Q w/220 yds and finished with 567-170 yd and 32-15 FD edges in a 52-22 home win (-27). If there are six Buckeyes' fans will find them which has helped OSU win 9 straight here and cover 4 of 5 overall. OSU went 13-1 ATS as an AF in a 4Y stretch under Tressel and Vegas overcompensated and OSU went 2-4-1 ATS his L2Y. Meyer has now taken that back TY as the Bucks are 3-0 ATS. OSU is also off bye and Bucks are 4-1 ATS off reg ssn byes the L5Y and Meyer is on a 7-1 ATS run overall. In their L2 gms they finally put up some BCS statement wins crushing both PST and Purdue by a combined 119-14 (+427 ypg). Illinois is still searching for that elusive B10 win as the streak has now reached 19 str gms after losing to Indyl LW 52-35 (+9). While the offense is avg 425 ypg, the D is all'g 483 and that's not good news facing an OSU offense avg 566 ypg on the road TY. **We used Ohio St as both a 5★ College GOY (-11 at NW 45-10 win) and a 4.5★ LPS on the B10 road in recent years and both were easy winners. Will we play on them again here?**

NEVADA by 1 over San Jose St - 2 of the 3 new MW HC's match up. Prior to a 3 pt loss in the last meeting (2011), San Jose St dropped the prev 3 by 34 ppg but still covered the L2. Nevada is 9-1 SU in the series. The Spartans 4-gm win streak was snapped LW as we cashed not 1, but 2 plays involving the SDSJ/ SJSJ game. 1st the Aztecs gave us another outright upset winner for our NC Sportsline Comp Underdog POW as they rallied to beat the Spartans 34-30 (+6). We also cashed a 3★ CTOT on the OVER. QB Fales continues his up and down ssn as 2 wks ago we wrote that he looked to have turned his ssn around w/B2B performances vs CST/WY. However, in the L2 gms he's reverted back to his early ssn struggles completing 54% of his passes w/a 4-4 ratio. Speaking of struggling the Wolf Pack will be not be heading to a bowl for the 1st time s/'04 as they have dropped 5 str gms after LW's 38-17 loss (+8) to CST. They did lead the gm 17-16 in the 3Q before the Rams scored the final 22. As much as the Wolf Pack have struggled TY, their home/away dichotomy is quite striking as they are getting outscored by 26 ppg (-206 ypg) on the road but are outscoring their foes by 13 ppg (+88 ypg). Look for them to play loose here and pick up an upset win.

Alabama by 21 over MISS ST - Bama has played MSU more than any other school as they are just 80 miles apart. Domination as the Tide have won 5 straight by 24 ppg with the closest margin being 17 points. They are 4-1 ATS with the loss by a 1/2 pt. Bama is 0-2 ATS after LSU the L2Y. The Tide are 8-3 ATS an AF the L2Y as they travel less players meaning they can't empty the bench like they do at home. Bulldogs are in a tough 3 gm stretch (at SC, at A&M, Bama). LY MSU came in unbeaten and Bama had a big game vs LSU on deck. The Bulldogs came in avg 37 ppg but didn't score until the final minutes. The Tide did lead 24-0 at the half with a 245-97 yd edge. TY the Tide play the Bulldogs after the big effort vs LSU as they turned a tie gm in the 3Q into a 38-17 blowout win (-11). QB McCarron still doesn't get enough credit as he was an efficient 14-20-179-3-0 and the Tide owned the LOS w/a 193-43 yd edge. MSU, meanwhile has outplayed both SC and A&M in B2B wks (53-41 FD and 941-844 yd edges) but have come up short on the scoreboard. **We did use Miss St as a HD as a College GOY in this series and they won for us in 1992. Will we boldly go against the Tide here in a clear flat spot w/in inflated line?**

USC by 4 over Stanford - Since WWII USC has lost 4 str years to 3 teams: UCLA '96-'99, Oregon '98-'01 and now Stanford. In fact since they lost as the largest fav in '07 (-41), they have gone 1-5 SU/ATS with the only cover as a 10 pt dog (was first time USC DD dog s/'98). LY USC was missing its st'g C and SU had a 202-2 rushing edge and a 417-280 yd edge. We used Stanford +7 at home as a Big Dog POW and they delivered yet another outright upset winner for our Big Dogs (4 Big Dog outright upset winners LW, get your Big Dogs TW for just \$9 on your VIP Card). Stanford is off the huge upset of Oregon (Big Dog and Thur Night Marquee Winner) as they led 26-0 before the Ducks rallied. The Cardinal owned the LOS w/a 274-62 rush yd edge and are 10-2 ATS on P12 road under Shaw. This is HC for USC and they are only off Cal with at Col on deck (P12's 2 worst tms). The Trojans are a couple of missed FG's away vs ND from being a perfect 5-0 SU/ATS under interim HC Orgeron as LW they pummeled Cal 62-28 (-17) getting 2 long PR td's by Agholor. While the Cardinal have owned the series, we like what we're seeing from the Trojans and love their situation as many are talking about whether Stanford should be rated higher than unbeaten Baylor/Ohio St at this point. Those arguments become a moot point by Saturday night.

Colorado St by 14 over NEW MEXICO - The home team has covered 5 straight. There have been 7 outright upsets in the last 11 meetings. LY CSU was '31 at home and NM came in banded up. CSU had a 253-58 yd edge at the half and led 17-7. NM went 9/16pl for a 30 yd FG and then 97/8pl and got a 55 yd td pass with 3:12 left to take a 20-17 lead. CSU got a wheel route that went 30 yds for a td to retake the lead 24-20 with 1:23 left. NM got to the 16 yd line but on 3&10, had a man in the EZ, fired late and it was incomplete. CSU is playing a 6th str wk and they are just 1-4 ATS the L6Y as an AF covering vs UH earlier but they were only laying '1. NM had a bye 2 wks ago and is off a Fri night home win vs AF 45-37 (-3) as they beat the Falcons at their own gm outrushing them 451-257. The Rams, not be outdone got a schl-rec 312 rush yds from Bibbs (10.4) and 4 td's in their 38-17 win (-8) over Nevada. It was their 7th cover in the L9 gms and need to win 2 of their next 3 gms to qualify for a bowl (play 13 gms). While they are in a unique role, the Rams get the call here as this is the best tm they have fielded in possibly a decade.

Memphis by 1 over USF - Sixth mtg s/'00 and they were CUSA foes for 2Y ('03-'04). USF won the last mtg in the St Petersburg Bowl 41-14 (-11). USF is off a bye (3-0 ATS at WKU) with SMU on deck. This gm could set offensive FB back several yrs as the Bulls are avg 15 ppg and have failed to score an offensive td in 4 gms. However, their could be a light at the end of the tunnel in frosh QB Mike White who was 26-41-311-2 in his 1st start vs a good Houston tm that has all'd outing. Memphis is 2-6 and is avg just 15 ppg on the road TY. They do have an underrated D in their L/2 less than 300 yds in 5 of their L7 gms incl LW in a 21-6 (-13) win over UT Martin. This is the first time Memphis has been an AF s/'08 but USF is getting outscored by 21 ppg (-145 ypg) at home TY incl a 53-21 loss to FCS McNeese St.

TECHNICAL PLAY OF THE WEEK..... WISCONSIN REVENGE PLAY OF THE WEEK..... USC SITUATIONAL PLAY OF THE WEEK...NORTHWESTERN

RICE by 21 over Louisiana Tech - HC. LY was the 1st mtg s/CUSA foes in '04. Rice was +21 and LT faced just nine 3rd downs all night and converted 6. Leading 21-0, LT fumbled into the EZ for a TB. LT led 35-17 at the half with a 420-221 yd edge. It was 56-30 when Rice got a 4&18, 14 yd pass with 1:32 left for a td and the backdoor cover, 56-37. Owls are off a bye (8-2 ATS under Bailiff). In their L/gm they suffered their 1st CUSA loss 28-16 (+3) at NT. The gm was very misleading as the Mean Green benefitted from a 65-yd PR td and a 55-yd FR td as Rice had 20-13 FD and 355-253 yd edges. They also couldn't punch it in despite having 8 downs inside the NT10 late. They are on a 14-5 ATS run as a HF. LT should be coming into this one w/some confidence winning 3 of their L/4 gms but a closer look at the sked shows their 4 wins have come over an FCS tm and 3 FBS tms w/a combined 2-25 record. Look for them to get outclassed here vs a rested and angry Owls' tm who LY dominated on HC.

KANSAS ST by 17 over TCU - LY was first mtg s/86 and Patterson got to face his alma mater. The ? all week was if KSU QB Klein would win and he did hitting 12-21-145 yds and was their leading rusher with 50 but he was clearly not 100%. TCU held KSU to 12 FD. Prior to the game, #1 Bama went down giving KSU a clear path to the title game. TCU was held to 136 yds in the first 3Q's. KSU led 23-0 in the 4Q with TCU getting a FG w/6:59 left and after a KSU fmbld drove 39 yds for a td w/4:47 left. KSU went 6-1 ATS LY as a HF and is 3-2 ATS TY incl 2 covers as a B12 HF. TCU is on a 2nd str AG but has a bye on deck. It's been 10 gms and we are still waiting to see a single impressive performance from the Horned Frogs and we have a feeling we are going to have to wait until 2014 as they were nearly upset by arguably the worst tm in the B12 LW needing a td w/:38 left to escape 21-17 (-7) over Iowa St. They need to win out to get to a bowl. On the other side, KSU came into the ssn one of the most inexp'd tms in the country, but now like most Snyder tms do, is getting better as the ssn progresses. They have now won 3 str B12 gms by DD's. LW it was good to see veteran Snyder take the young hot-shot Kingsbury to school w/a 49-26 (+2) beating. Look for these tms to continue to go in opposite directions.

MISSISSIPPI by 21 over Troy - Troy has played 3 SEC teams the prior 3Y going 3-0 ATS covering by 11 ppg and outgained all 3. This year that note was clearly bulletin board material when they traveled to Miss St losing 62-7 but it must be noted that the Bulldogs were off a gut wrenching last second loss to Auburn and were 0-2 vs FBS foes needing a win. This week Ole Miss just clinched a bowl earning a 6th win and while they only won by 10 it was a fat and happy 531-389 yard edge. The Rebels now must recoup as their home finale against the SEC East leading Missouri Tigers is on deck. Troy is off a loss, has a bye on deck will be relaxed as they know how to handle this situation as they are only -21 ypg on the road TY having faced Ark St, Miss St, Duke, Ga St and WKU. Wily vet HC Blakeney is 8-3-1 ATS vs ranked teams and while Rebs are #26 he'll have his team thinking they are top 10.

ARKANSAS ST by 13 over Texas St - Sun Belt teams play their money games early and often get banged up by BCS teams. They recover in October and make their run for the conference title. Ark St has the players and program that is thirsty for a 3rd straight bowl and in the last 5 regular season games over the past 3 seasons they are 12-0 SU/11-1 ATS including 9 straight wins and covers. The Red Wolves are also 14-2 SU at home in that span and return home off their worst home loss (16 pts) s/'07. Texas St has been seemingly impressive in their inaugural Sun Belt season at 2-2, but their wins are vs a pair of programs that didn't have FB teams a few years ago and their losses are to ULM (21-14) which ASU just beat 42-14 and on the road to ULL where they got outgained 572-196. Massive home/road difference with the Bobcats at +92 ypg at home and -218 ypg away and now traveling to a hostile competitor who can not only stop the run (3.4 ypc at home) but stops the pass as well (53% comp all'd at home).

UTEP by 7 over FIU - What happens when a matchup has a pair of teams that have combined for a 2-16 SU record, a 4-14 ATS record, have been outgained by 17 of their 18 opponents and are each looking for a November win to stop long losing streaks? You look for any small edge. The Miners have been a fav twice this year (1-1 SU/ATS) but this is their largest spread and the Panthers have not been an AD with this small of a line (avg +25 ppg). The recent stats show FIU with the edge but on the season the strength of opponents faced are almost identical with UTEP at -119 ypg and FIU at -192 ypg. Aaron Jones (811, 5.1) also gives the home team a running threat compared to FIU's team which is avg 2.0 ypc. With UTEP only -79 ypg at home and FIU playing in altitude and avg -285 ypg away the edge goes to the Miners.

San Diego St by 14 over HAWAII - This is SDSI's 1st recent trip to Hawaii (05 LTH) and 2nd of B2B away. UH, however is off B2B away incl the 2nd farthest pt ever (Army 100 miles more). LY was their 1st meeting s/'05 and the Warriors first game in Qualcomm Stadium s/'98. UH tried a tactic of arriving late and getting out of town right after the game but SDSI finished with 27-12 FD and 412-173 yd edges and won 52-14 (-21). Both of these tms cashed multiple plays for us LW. The Aztecs (+6) were our NC Sportsline Comp Underdog POW (given out FREE every Tue on button #3 at 1-347-677-1700, 16 outright upset winners L3Y) and they beat SJSJ 34-30. They were down 23-12 entering the 4Q and managed the win despite having the worst kicking gm in the country. The gm also cashed a 3★ CTOT on the OVER. Speaking of cashing LPS Totals Plays, last week UH/NAVY OVER was our Top Weekly Totals Play and it easily cashed in a 42-28 Navy win. The loss did drop the Warriors to 0-9 on the yr, but unlike the other 4 winless FBS tms, they have been respectable going 5-4 ATS and are "only" -93 ypg as their off is avg 427 ypg the last six games. However, on the other side, the Aztecs are winners of 5 of their last 6 games after a tough start and with a win here, San Diego St becomes bowl eligible for a 4th straight yr. Look for more of the same here as Hawaii will play tough but it won't be enough.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 19TH - Buffalo at MIAMI, OH - Miami has covered 3 straight. LY r/Licata made his 1st career start replacing an inj'd Zordich. It was 3-3 at HT but the teams combined for 45 2H pts. MU was +3' on the road and it was the 1st time (s/joining FBS) that UB won a gm in regulation on a FG on the last play 27-24. Two programs heading in opposite directions as downtrodden RedHawks are off Kent last Wed and this is their FHG (1-4 ATS). Meanwhile surging UB is on 2nd str away and 3rd in 4 gms (playing L/5 gms in 5 diff venues). While UB is clearly the better tm, this is a sandwich gm as they are off OU/UT and they have BG on deck for a possible berth in the MAC Champ gm.

Kent St at OHIO - After the visitor won and covered 4 str the L/3 have all been won by the home team. However, Kent is 4-0 ATS. LY a banged up OU team travelled to KS as a 9 pt dog and with a 33 yd IR td KS jumped out to a 21-0 lead w/5:59 left in the 1Q. OU trailed 21-6 at the half despite having a 179-159 yd edge as KS also had a 50 yd FR td 2:00 into the gm. OU was also SOD on 4&1 at the 12 and OU had a 22-15 FD edge. OU has played 7 str wks and this is their 3rd str Tue game. KS is playing their reg ssn finale (earliest of all FBS teams). They did play 6 days ago vs MU but had a bye prior. Flashes will be playing for pride here in RB Archer and DT Nix's last gm while OU is still in the bowl hunt.

4★ Detroit by 7 over PITTSBURGH - Never say never in the AFC North as the Steelers are 2.5 games out of first despite getting only their 3rd win until Nov 10th. PIT would seem to have the situational edge at home for the 2nd straight vs DET travelling for the 2nd straight but non-div home teams in this spot are 14-28-2 ATS. The Steelers wins TY have come when they allowed 6 points to rookie Geno Smith (267 tl yds) and his #30 QBR, 16 pts to Flacco (287 yds) in his career worst season and his #24 QBR and 10 points to rookie Manuel LW (227 yds) with his #28 QBR rating. This week however they face Stafford and his #8 QBR and while the Steelers have failed to cover by 3.5 pts to CIN, by 15 to CHI and by 18 to NE, Stafford easily ranks above all three. As far as the Lions travelling in B2B weeks they had a bye prior to their road win at CHI and have already played B2B road games twice TY winning and covering both.

3★ San Diego by 9 over MIAMI - The Dolphins are out of LW's national glare on MNF and are 1-6 ATS afterwards. Five of the Chargers L7 road trips have been to the East Coast where they are 4-1 ATS with the loss coming in OT vs WAS (1 yd from winning in regulation). Rivers is having a rebound year in their "updated Martyball" offense avg 328 ypg (74%) w/a 9-5 ratio on the road vs 239 ypg (63%) with a 15-6 ratio LY. Avg at best prior to their OL issues allowing 35 sacks in half a season of work (1 every 8.3 att's) Tannehill hasn't truly improved his game prior to TB with just a 6.8 ypa and 11-9 ratio. SD struggled as most teams have trying to keep up with the Broncos offense and playing catch up in their loss but it shouldn't be a concern vs a Dolphins teams that has scored 13 1Q pts their 6 games prior to TB. Dolphins' #25 pass def will be in for a shock as they have faced ONE team that ranks in the top 10 in QBR and that was New Orleans (#3) and Brees tallied 397 yds (77%) with 4 tds. Oh yeah, by the way Rivers is #2 and while he only has a "paltry" 68% comp rate at home he is throwing for 74% on the road.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ BUFFALO by 7 over NY Jets - The Jets return from their bye but Dogs off a bye who won SU as a HD prior are 0-13-1 SU and only 4-10 ATS with a 28-16 avg loss. BUF now has Manuel (155, 56%, 1-1) and Spiller (23, 2.9) getting acclimated although they were shutdown on the road vs a solid PIT defense. One issue to keep an eye on for the Bills is the receiving situation as they were without #2 Woods (349, 13.4) LW and then lost #1 Johnson (423, 11.1) in the 4Q. The Bills D has pickup up the slack for the young offense and they've only allowed 297 ypg the last 4 despite facing a pair of top 10 offenses. The D also LEADS the NFL in combined sacks and interceptions (46) and they'll have continued success vs the Jets who have allowed 31 sacks TY (1 every 9.1 att's). Not worried about backing BUF at home in their inaugural favorites role of 2013 as in their first 4 here they've covered vs NE by 8 pts, vs CIN by 2.5 and beat CAR and BAL covering by 4 and 6. The only non-cover was vs an undefeated Chiefs team which they outgained 470-210!! In Geno Smith's 4 road start he has yet to top 16 FD's in any game and this will make that 5 straight.

OTHER GAMES

Indianapolis at Tennessee - These 2 went into last week far clear of both other AFC South foe and IND leading TEN by 2 games. At halftime the Colts trailed to a 3 win Rams team 28-0 and lost 38-8 while the Titans trailed the winless Jaguars 13-7 at HT and was behind wire-to-wire. The Colts failed another test as a HF making the chalk 0-5 ATS in Lucas Oil but now they travel to face their main competitor and a TEN win would put the Titans 1 back in the division with the tiebreaker. Can Luck keep the series domination alive as the Colts have won 8 of 9 SU as well as making his record 8-1 ATS off a SU loss? Or, can the Titans move to 4-0 ATS on Thursday nights over the past 5 years?

Atlanta at Tampa Bay - The favorite is 4-1-1 ATS and the Bucs are off LW's MNF vs MIA and are either tilted to have snared their 1st win of the year or dejected after losing on prime time for the 2nd time in 3 weeks TY. This is Atlanta's 2nd shot at Glennon who hit for 226 yds (59%) with 2 TD's in the 1st meeting. However, he also had a heathy RB David Martin (47 yds (4.3) and #2 WR Mike Williams (4 rec 8.0) to help spread out the Falcons and both are out here. Ryan meanwhile had 273 yds (77%) with 3 TD's in his first meeting without RB Jackson and WR's Jones and White and while the latter two played LW the team as a whole was a no-show with 100 yds and 5 FD's at HT vs Seattle. Can't see LY's #1 seed falling to the depths of allowing the Bucs their first win but if Tampa Bay is off a win, they were 4-1-1 ATS the game after LY, so we will wait on the Monday Night results in this one.

Washington by 3 over PHILADELPHIA - In this seasons MNF opener HC Kelly unveiled his new offense to the tune of 443 yds and 33 pts in their upset win. That made the road team 7-2 ATS which lines up nicely with the fact the Eagles are 0-12 ATS at home. WAS is off LW's loss to MIN but they still tallied a 433-307 yd edge on a short week. Griffin is improving (3 of 14 qms w/a 86.8 QBR or better) and over the last 2 games RB Morris (130 ypg, 5.1) and WR Garcon (146 ypg, 20.1) are red hot. The Eagles offense has also been on fire the L2W with Foles back in the lineup he's led his team to 542 yds and 49 pts at Oakland and 415 yards and 27 pts in GB. But, now we have a coaching staff getting a second chance vs these schemes and the Giants which allowed PHI 439 yards at home in the first meeting gave up just 201 yards 3 games ago. Lastly, the Eagles are 0-4 SU/ATS at home are getting outgained by 52 ypg in front of their faithful and on the year WAS is +22 ypg vs the #7 sched while PHI is -4 ypg vs the #22 schedule.

CHICAGO by 1 over Baltimore - The issues on the Ravens offense is centered on the OL. LY after 9 games the Ravens were avg 105 ypg (4.3) on the ground and had only given up 19 sks on the year (1 every 16.5). TY after switching to a zone blocking scheme and fielding 3 new starters they are down to 73 ypg (2.8) rushing and 30 sacks (1 every 11.5 att's). It's not a surprise that after 9 games Rice has only gained 25% of LY's 1143 yds rushing and Flacco hasn't been very comfortable (59% 6.7 ypa). CHI's OL is drastically improved with 111 ypg rush (4.5) and just 14 sacks with Cutler's 1st injury being a freak event. The Bears problem is that their defense has been hit with injuries up the middle and are allowing 129 ypg (4.5) which is Rice's big chance after facing CLE and CIN the L2W. There's still value playing against the Bears after their 3-0 start. They've gone 2-5 SU and 1-6 ATS with the only cover vs a Packers team with the second most important player in the NFL out with an injury and the non-covering win vs an 0-5 NY Giants teams in which they needed a +3 TO margin to beat.

CINCINNATI by 3 over Cleveland - The Browns come out of their bye in second place and now face a team they beat 17-6 earlier this year and also held them to a season low 266 yds. They are also only 1.5 gms behind this rival for first and a win puts them 3-1 in their division and that type of energy with a new coaching staff and go a long way. Campbell is the 1st CLE QB w/ B2B 100 QBR games since mid-2007 but he'll get a formidable test vs CIN who has surrendered just two 100 QBR games all year despite their injuries. The difference with this vet under center is that he knows there is no time to hesitate in OC Turners WC offense (278 ypg, 74%) and most importantly when you have a now legitimate elite D (#4) do not turn the ball over (5-0 ratio). The Bengals will clearly be motivated playing with revenge and off an OT loss to rival BAL but part of the reason they are 3-9-1 ATS as a div fav is that HC Lewis calls a very conservative game plan. In fact in the last 5 Y CIN is 14-13 SU vs the AFC North and has NEVER beaten a division rival by over 10 points no matter what the spread.

HOUSTON by 3 over Oakland - Up until last week in HOU games all you had to do was bet against the team with the yardage edge and you were 8-0 ATS. Well vs ARZ LW they lost and failed to cover and also got outgained 332-235. The Texans management already started fresh with Keenum and it didn't help, now they are without RB Foster for the year and how many Ls is it until players you would never expect to not give 100% do just that. While we'll still call the Texans situation mind-boggling we'll back the Raiders by default as they outgained KC, PIT and PHI by 26 ypg and was only outgained by 38 yds vs the Giants while holding the Steelers, Eagles and the Giants to 248 ypg!

Arizona by 8 over JACKSONVILLE - The Jag's showed the enthusiasm we expected and wrote about LW out of their break with a 29-27 upset at TEN. While we expected a valiant effort don't be fooled as they were outgained 362-214 and had a 19/3pl TD drive, a def TD and was 3 of 12 on 3rd down. All that win does is slow/stop the inflation of the Vegas line and keeps JAX a single digit dog which is a role they don't perform well at (6-21 ATS). Now they also face a team that is rested with a bye prior to HOU and doesn't have the pressure of allowing a teams first win. ARZ's Ariens certainly is familiar with the Jags as he led the Colts to a 27-10 win LY while QB Palmer also led OAK to a win over them as well. The Cards are an

AF for the first time in 2Y but they've outgained STL, TB and SF on the road TY and are 7-0 ATS when the line is 6 or less. While there is a new HC in JAX the poor drafting and losing mentality over the past few years is a major reason why the Jag's are 0-7 ATS off a SU win.

SEATTLE by 19 over Minnesota - The Vikings have a little extra rest to prep whomever will start at QB with Ponder (shoulder) status in doubt. SEA is off their revenge game vs ATL and they got a knockout punch early cruising onto HT with a 316-99 yd edge and never getting challenged in the 2H. The Seahawks were without Cr Unger and RT Giacomini LW yet still rushed for 211 yds (5.0). The Vikings offense seems to have exploded avg 29 ppg their last 3 games but, can you say misleading, as they totaled 243 yds vs GB and faced a pair of D's ranked #30 and #31 the L/2. SEA has paid the price for their success laying 14.5, 12 and 18.5 their last 3 home games and while they failed to cover the last 2 they had a Thursday division road game as well a playoff revenge road game on deck. Now, they have a bye on deck and in the last 2 seasons SEA has covered both games by an avg of 18 ppg and this is the game they targeted for the debut of Percy Harvin.

NEW ORLEANS by 9 San Francisco - The Saints are off LW's SNF vs DAL and face ATL next on Thursday. This is not a letdown spot with this being the 4th meeting in as many years and SF covering 3 straight including the 2011 Div playoff win. SF found itself in a bar fight vs CAR LW and while OLB Aldon Smith (susp) returned in a 3rd Dn role they may be without TE Vernon Davis and FS Eric Reid (concussion) and DE Ray McDonald (ankle) here. Partially due to Aldon Smith's absence the 49ers pass rush (21 sks 21st) hasn't been overly formidable TY which is a concern with Brees and his 14-2 ratio prior to LW at home. SF's reliance on the run game and stout defense is fine but it's not a good matchup vs an elite passing QB and Rodgers put 333 yds (57%) with a 3-1 ratio on them in Wk 1. Yes, IND's Luck is an ascending player he doesn't have the pellets that Brees has and the other QB's SF has faced lead pass offenses in the bottom half of the league. Kaepernick has only avg'd 195 ypg (59%) with a 9-6 ratio on the road career-wise. We'll call for the home team by 9 here and wait for the line and SF's injury report to come out.

NY GIANTS by 3 over Green Bay - This is the 4th meeting in 3Y with the Giants covering 3 straight KO'g GB out of the '11 playoffs and slamming them 38-10 as a 3 pt HF LY. 1-5 ATS on the road the Packers are starting Scott Tolzien who was bumped up to the active roster LW. Pressed into duty vs PHI, Tolzien was ok (280 yds 62% 1-2) but having a 3rd string QB air it out 39 times wasn't ideal. On 4 drives into the SF red-zone they were held to 2 FG's, int and SOD. The Giants are getting healthier with the return of RB Brown (115 yds 3.58) who added a needed speed asset on the ground. The Giants have won the yardage battle in 3 straight and overcame Mannings pick-six vs OAK by holding foes to an opposing QBR of 55.5 or less in 3 straight. The inexperience of Tolzien will allow the Giants to focus on keeping RB Lacy (103 ypg 4.3) under control and GB's #20 pass def is misleading as they have given up a 17-3 ratio TY with just 1 int since Wk 4. We'll be cautious on what we lay with NY.

Kansas City at Denver - How often has the overwhelming preseason and current SB favorite had a record of 8-1, yet are looking up to someone in the standings?? Well the Broncos are doing that obviously out of their HC. On the opposite sidelines is Any Reid who has won EVERY game SU off a bye with the exception of LY with the out-of-sync Eagles but it should be noted that 8 of the L/9 games that Reid has coached off a bye have been at home. This first flex game of the season is the exact reason that clause was invoked and you can pick up the winner on your VIP Debt Account.

New England at Carolina - Rematch of SB 38 in which Tom Brady won the MVP and Cam Newton was 15 years old. TY the Patriots season started with 431 yards at BUF and new go-to WR Amendola had 100+ yds rec. Injuries and being Gronk-less kicked in and the only other game a WR had 100+ yards was vs Atlanta when NE totaled 448 yds. NE avg'd just 294 ypg the other 6 prior to Pittsburgh when they had a rec's healthy and totaled 610 yds with Gronk, Amendola and Thompson all topping 100+ (combined 395, 21.9, 4 td's). Now they matchup vs a Panther D that has allowed (249 ypg) their last 7 games and has allowed 9 ppg at home.

NM took their 2nd 3Q drive 58/6pl for a 38 yd fg, 17-10 then NM9 went 3&out but offsidess on the punt gave them a FD they would continue on a 91/16pl drive for a 30 yd fg, 17-13 (10:28). NM then went 97/8pl and got a 55 yd td pass to Pressley with 3:12 left to take the lead, 20-17 (3:12). CSU went 76/6pl and converted on 4&2 then got a 30 yd TD pass with 1:23 left to go back up 24-20 (1:23). NM25 went 59/10pl getting down to the CSU16 yd line but on 3&10 their pass into the EZ was batted away incomplete.

BUFFALO (-3) 27 Miami, Oh 24 - BU opened with a 46/7pl drive for a 46 yd fg. The next 5 poss were punts. BU went 52/9pl to the 28 but was int'd at the 11. After each team punted, BU's P was tk'd at their own 18 and MIA got a 29 yd fg 3-0 (6:38). BU went 25/5pl for a 49 yd fg, 3-3 (4:42). BU fmbld at their own 29 but MIA on 4&9 fired incomplete. At the half BU did have a 150-83 yd edge and a 7-6 FD edge in a 3-3 game. MIA went 3&out to open the 3Q and then BU went 75/8pl 9:45, MIA 73/9pl 4:08, BU 70/13 (13:40) all for td's, 17-17. MIA fmbld at the BU35 and BU converted on 4&8 with a 12 yd pass and a roughing the passer and went 65/8pl for a td, 24-17 (5:36). MIA went 75/15pl and on 4&20 they got a 22 yd pass to the 5 and a td with :22 left but BU ret'd the KO 47 yds to the MIA35, gained 5 yds and got a 47 yd fg on the final play.
