

4★ FLORIDA over Vanderbilt - UF is now 22-0 SU in this series but VU is 11-8 ATS and the visitor is 12-4 ATS. LY was a "C" game for UF as they had just come off their huge win vs LSU, had SC on deck and kept 3 OL and a DL at home. UF had a 221-94 yd edge at the half but only led 11-7. UF (-9) led 24-14 with 5:22 left. VU got a 22 yd FG with 2:35 left for the apparent backdoor cover but UF got a 70 yd td run by Driskel on an option to get ahead of the spread, 31-17. VU on 48gl from the 3 fired inc. Sked edge you would think has to go to Vandy in this one as UF is off UGA (4-7 ATS) w/SC on deck while Vandy off a bye. However, while this would normally be a clear flat spot for the Gators, they are going to have to win this gm in order to continue their 22-yr bowl streak as they figure to be clear underdogs to SC and FSU. LW they appeared down and out to UGA as they trailed 23-3 at HT. However, after scoring a td to cut it to 23-20 w/14:20 left, they only got the ball 1 more time as UGA ran out the final 8:17. In their L/outing, despite getting outgained 387-198, they got arguably their biggest win in 2 decades upsetting VT 13-10 (+12'). They have now won 4 str gms and believe it or not are still in the race for an ACC Coastal Title. LW NCSt jumped out to a 10-0 lead over NC but couldn't hang on in a 27-19 (+5') loss. QB Mitchell in his 2nd start back from inj continues to struggle hitting 10-22-130-0-2. While it should be noted that Duke is just 1-19 SU in Nov, Cutcliffe is one of the most underrated HC's in the country and has broken many other woeful streaks already. A confident, rested Duke tm takes care of business (6-1 ATS as HF) and clinches its 1st winning ssn s/94.

EAST CAROLINA by 14 over Tulsa - Tulsa has dropped 3 in a row SU all as a fav to ĒC. LTH ('10) was a back and forth gm w/a combined 3 scores in the F/9 drives. It finished with each tm scoring td's on their L/5 drives incl EC (+7 at home defending CUSA champ) getting a 33 yd Hail Mary td pass on last play for the win. Both of these tms came into the ssn w/high expectations but they are heading in opposite directions as the Pirates have clinched bowl elig for the 7th time in 8Y while Tulsa looks to be heading to only its 2nd losing ssn s/04. However, LW both tms had misleading gms as EC shockingly struggled w/FIU getting outFD'd 23-17 as FIU had a 40:37-19:23 TOP edge and EC needed two td's in the 4Q (last w/1:08 left) to pull out the 34-13 win (-24'). Meanwhile Tulsa had a 20-16 FD edge but were done in by 4 costly TO's in their 34-15 loss (-3') to UTSA. Inconsistency at QB continues to be the issue as Green, back from inj, only had 46 yds on 11 completions while frosh Evans has a 1-4 ratio the L/2 wks. On the flip side, Carden has been CUSA's best QB TY w/a 19-5 ratio (74%). While we would usually lean w/Tulsa here considering both tms misleading gms LW, tough to fully back a tm that is 1-7 ATS vs a tm that has a great home edge and still has plenty to play for.

INDIANA by 10 over Illinois - Ill is 4-2 SU/ATS. LY III (-2) had 372-292 yd and 23-14 FD edges plus Indy was just 1-13 on 3rd down. Two TO's set up Indy on drives of 22 and 9 yds (td and FG). The Hoosiers also went 38-out but a late hit OOB gave them a FD and they got a td on a 2Q drive and Indy got the road upset 31-17 (+2). Illinois is 7-1 SU s/81 vs Indy when they dropped the prev seasons' matchup. The Hoosiers are on B2B HG's w/two non-winnable gms on deck (at Wisc, at OSU) while Ill on B2B road and off 4 str losses. Indy is 3-1 ATS as a B10 HF s/'03 but unfortunately for them and their bowl hopes, LW was that loss as they dropped a heartbreaker to Minny 42-39 (-7'). After falling behind 35-13 in the 3Q, the Hoosiers rallied to take the lead w/5:33 left. After UM got at d, Indy drove to the UM 9-yd-line but fmbl w/:25 left. Equally as heartbreaking was Ill's 24-17 OT loss (+11') to PSt LW as they were trying to end their 17-gm B10 losing streak. We had our Totals GOY on the OVER and it was a frustrating loss as the two tms combined for 52 FD's and 900 yds but missed on many scoring opportunities thanks to TO's and penalties. Both of these tms are playing for pride at this point and we'll take the HT who has shown a little bit better balance offensively. Tcu by 10 IOWA ST - HC. The Horned Frogs are 3-1 SU/2-1-1 ATS vs the Cyclones. LY in their first meeting since the '05 bowl, TCU was -7 at home but susp QB Pachall prior to the game. TCU had 24-15 FD and 455-350 yd edges but Boykin (20-40-270) had 3 int and true frosh TB Catalon had 3 fumbles and TCU's 12 gm win streak was snapped. Barnett got his first st of the yr for ISU (12-21-183) and it was the 3rd str yr ISt had beaten a top 25 team on the road. The Cyclones are 4-6 SU/5-5 ATS in their last 10 HC gms, being outscored by just 4 ppg. Both tms come in reeling as the Horned Frogs have lost 3 str gms and ISt is off 3 str losses by 31 pts or more. As much as we respect HC's Patterson and Rhoads, we have not been overly impressed w/their tm's performance in

Florida St by 35 over WAKE FOREŠT - FSU had dominated this series since joining the ACC as they won the first 15 in a row SU although were just 7-8 ATS. WF actually went on a 4-2 SU/ATS run and the series had 5 outright upsets in the 6 meetings from '06-'11. LY FSU was playing with legitimate revenge as they lost to WF 35-30 as a 10 pt fav in '11. We used FSU as a 4.5★ in Power Plays and it was men vs boys as FSU was -27' and won 52-0. FSU is off Miami (3-7 ATS) while WF is off B2B road w/a bye on deck. The Noles continue to make their case as the best tm in the country as LW despite being a 3 td favorite vs their undefeated rival Miami, they won and covered 41-14 (-21). It was 21-14 at HT, but the Noles easily controlled the 2H and finished the gm w/a 517-275 yd edge. They have now outscored the 3 top 25 tms they have played by a remarkable 155-28. QB Winston did overcome 2 1H int's to go 21 of 29 for 325 yds and remains in the hunt for the Heisman. After 3 str impressive performances WF lost 13-0 (+4') at Syracuse LW. The gm was tied at 0 at HT but most concerning for the Deacons was the loss of their best offensive ply'r in Campanaro, who will be out 4-6 wks w/a broken collarbone. While this line will be very steep, the Noles have proven they can cover TY going 6-1-1 ATS w/an avg line of 23.

MARSHALL by 24 over Uab - The HT is 6-2 SU/5-3 ATS and MU is 6-2 SU/5-3 ATS. Heading into LY, MU had won the last 3 meetings by 20, 14 and 45 pts. LY they were a 3 pt AF. UAB had a new wrinkle, dropping 8 into coverage daring MU to run and held MU to 337 ttl yds while UAB piled up 406. UAB led 24-7 at the half and never by less than 7 in the 2H. They were up 38-24 with 2:50 left and MU got a td with 1:41 left but UAB rec'd the onside kick. MU has the cold weather edge and has now won their L/8 Nov HG's by 18 ppg after trouncing Southern Miss LW 61-13 (-31'). QB Cato finally looked like his 2012 self throwing 5 td passes in the 1H alone as MU raced out to a 28-0 1Q lead and cruised. UAB, on the other hand, is off a heart-breaking 24-21 (+3') loss to MT as after tying the gm w/1:50 left they saw MT drive down the field and get a 18-yd FG w/:03 left. UAB had a 13-7 lead in the 4Q but 2 big plays went MT's way incl a 93-yd td pass and a 40-yd IR td to give them a 21-13 lead. UAB's D is all'g 44 ppg and 480 ypg on road this year while the Herd at home TY have resembled some of the great MU tms of the late 90's as they are outscoring foes 51-9 and outgaining them by 267 ypg going 4-0 SU/ATS. Herd get another dominating win here as they become bowl elig.

MINNESOTA by 1 over Penn St. - PSU has won 4 str over Minn (8-4 overall) and is on a 4-1 ATS run.

They trailed Neb 10-0 early but rallied for a 34-23 win and LW after blowing a 35-13 lead, scored a td, then rec'd a fmbl inside their 10-yd line w/Indy driving late in the 42-39 win (+7'). Now after pulling 3 str upsets they find themselves favored over the Nittany Lions. You do have to give them credit for playing physical B10 FB as they are avg 221 rush ypg (4.7) and LW QB Nelson had a career gm going 16-23-298-4-0. LW's PSU/III gm was very misleading as the two tms combined for 900 yds and 52 FD's (we had our Totals GOY on the OVER) but blew many scoring opp. After jumping out to a 14-0 lead PSt saw III score 17 str before the Lions got a FG to force OT (:41 left). Then after scoring a td, PSt int'd III on their 1st play of OT. While we would like to fade Minny here off 3 str upset wins, it's tough to back a young PSt tm who is getting outscored by 21 ppg (-104 ypg) on the road TY.

LW the Tigers coming off the heartbreaking loss to SC, which could have practically locked up a SEC Champ gm berth, shockingly came out loose and then took adv of a +3 TO margin in a 31-3 win (-11) over Tenn LW. QB Mauk only completed 12 of 25 passes but had a 3-0 ratio while the Vols frosh QB had 3 TO's. UK LW broke their 5-gm skid by overwhelming FCS Alabama St 48-14 (-27') on HC as QB Whitlow threw for 2 td's and added 2 more rushing. While MU is clearly the superior the here, keep in mind UK only lost by 14 to a then-top 10 Louisville tm earlier TY and also went on the road and only lost by 7 to SC (+21')

UVA was a 3' pt HD. A key play happened when UVA on 4&gl at the 1 was SOD with 3:56 left in the 3Q, down
by 7. NC went 97/12pl for a td, then 47/5pl for a td and won 37-13. NC is off rival NCSt (6-12 ATS) while UVA
is playing their 8th str gm and have a bye on deck. The light bulb has officially gone on for the Tar Heels as
after nearly upsetting Miami, they have B2B wins and this tm is starting to remind us of Fedora's 1st tm at S
Miss ('08), which started the year 2-6 before rallying to get to a bowl. LW they fell behind NCSt 10-0 early but
got a 27-19 win (-5'). The same cannot be said for UVA, who continues to flounder dropping their 6th str gm
LW to Clem 59-10 (+18) as they were outgained 610-277 while we cashed a 3' ★ LPS Totals on the OVER.
The UVA D after a strong start to the ssn is now all'g 41 ppg and 513 ypg in their L/5 gms and will be facing
a NC offense that avg's 467 ypg at home. These tms continue to go in opposite directions.

It was the first time EM had beaten WM in consec ssns s/89-'91 and HC Cubit was fired 2 hrs after the game. TY the Broncos come in off a bye (4-4 ATS) and have CM on deck. In their L/gm they got the 1st win of the Fleck era beating UMass 31-30 (+3') as UMass' 2 pt conv w/:22 left failed. On the ssn they are getting outscored by 22 ppg (-110 ypg) and are all'g 243 rush (5.2). Those poor numbers are actually surpassed in futility by the Eagles who are getting outscored by 27 ppg (-166 ypg) and are all'g 265 rush (6.4). EM is off 3 of the best teams in the MAC in OU, NI and UT and were pounded by a combined 170-64. This is another one of our favorite Resistible Force vs Movable Object MAC games this year and while it's tough to take WM here, they did prove to us in their L/gm they are capable of winning on the road and they should be playing w/confidence w/a 1st yr HC while EM is likely playing for a lame-duck staff.

However, prior to LW's results, Tulane was +11 in TO's on the year while UTSA was -9. In a gm that could be decided on the final poss, that could prove to be the diff plus the fact that Tulane is used to playing in tight gms this yr going 3-1 in gms decided by a 7 pts or less while UTSA is 0-1.

FSU did put together a 92 yd drive for a td with :16 left in the half to lead 35-0 (WY 1 FD not by penalty) and went on to a 42-14 cover. Fresno has a bye on deck but WY comes in off a bye (3-1 ATS in reg ssn under Christensen) and that heightens their altitude edge. The Bulldogs remain unbeaten at 8-0 SU but are just 1-6-1 ATS due to inflated lines after LW's 41-23 win (-20') over Nevada. After jumping out to a 24-7 HT lead, the Bulldogs again saw their huge lead disappear as UN cut it to 8 mid-4Q before Fresno scored the gm's final 10 pts. Fresno did have 32-17 FD and 647-424 yd edges. Prior to the bye, WY was crushed by rival CSt and then blew a 16 pt 2H lead to SJSt which prompted Christensen to fire DC Tormey. TT actually jumped out to a 10-3 lead and reached the KSU 46, 23, 19 and 32-yd lines on 4 drives but came away with a single FG. TT had a 238-143 yd edge at the half but trailed 13-10 and KS dominated the 2H going 75, 20 (after IR), 74 and 70 yds on their first 4 poss then added a 37 yd IR td to lead 48-17 in the blowout. TT is 24-4 SU/20-8 ATS in home finales but has dropped 2 str allowing 50 ppg. Both tms come in on streaks but in opposite directions as the Wildcats are off B2B DD wins while TT is off B2B losses. LW Kansas St beat lowa St 41-7 (-17) and had a 448-249 yd edge while TT never could overcome an early 21-3 1Q deficit losing 52-34 (E) at home to Oklahoma St. This marks one of the biggest discrepancies in age difference as the young hot-shot Kingsbury (34) takes on the wily oi' Snyder (74). We'll lean with the vet here as Kansas St is 18-5-1 ATS in B12 road/neutral cms.

MISSISSIPPI by 14 over Arkansas - Ark is 8-4 SU/ATS in this series but the home team is 8-3 ATS. LY Ark (-6) at home had a 464-355 yd edge. UA led 10-0 in the 1Q when QB Tyler Wilson injured his hip and it impacted on his play. Ark did have a td called back for an illegal formation in the 3Q which QB Wilson and HC John L. Smith both argued vehemently that they had illegal formation. It was tied 27-27 when UM went 64/7pl getting a 31 yd FG on the final play to win. WASHINGTON by 28 over Colorado - These two met in '99 and '00 and showing the difference in Buffs FB between now and then, CU was favored in those meetings by 3' and 4' and suffered outright upsets in both. In P12 play, CU has been +16 and +21 and lost by 28 and 35 pts making UW 4-0 SU/ATS in this series. In those 2 P12 meetings, UW has had a 591-205 avg yd edge. LY Keith Price had 5 td's to 5 diff rec's tying a school rec. The game was played 10:30 am Seattle time, the first time they had kicked off before night all season. L4Y UW is 5-1 SU and 6-0 ATS after a bye while CU is on P12 B2B road (2-2 ATS but 2 outright upsets as 20 pt dogs). UW does have a Friday night gm vs UCLA on deck. After 3 str losses, the Huskies got a feel-good 41-17 win (-29') over Cal prior to the bye while CU is playing a 7th str wk after losing to UCLA 45-23 (+28') LW. The gm was misleading as the Buffs had a 26-18 FD edge but a TO on a KO after a UCLA td all'd the Bruins to

job MacIntyre is doing, they are outclassed here by a fresher Huskies squad.

Arizona St by 10 over UTAH - ASt has won 9 str but there have been just 2 recent meeting and ASt has dominated both winning 35-14 (-3') at Utah in '11 as our "Almost 5★" (#2 pick on 5★ Sat) and LY 37-7 (-6') at home. ASt had a 24-10 FD edge and 512-209 yd edge and Taylor Kelly threw for a career high 326 yds. It was 31-7 at the half with a 352-145 yd edge. The Sun Devils are on B2B road (3-13-2 ATS) while Utah comes in off a bye (6-4 ATS reg ssn) and is also 7-3 ATS as a HD. ASt is 2-8 SU/3-7 ATS in Nov/Dec AG's. Utah's new co-OC is Dennis Erickson who ASt fired just 2 yrs ago and he has good knowledge of his ex-team and some motivation. While motivation, situation and technical edges all favor the Utes here, the reality is ASt, outside of the 1st 3Q's of the Stanford gm, has played like a borderline top 10 tm as they have 3 str wins by 4 td's plus and are outgaining their opp by 172 ypg despite playing the #17 sked. LW they put the "ASt can't play well on the road in the cold" worries to rest by crushing Wazzu 55-21 (-10'). Utah, meanwhile is off B2B losses as QB Wilson continues to struggle (not 100% vs USC) and has just a 14-14 ratio on the yr. ASt continues their march towards a possible P12 South Title while Utah could be sitting home for the holidays for a 2nd yr in a row.

NAVY by 17 over Hawaii - In the last meeting ('09) Hawaii (+9') trailed 17-10 but shutout Navy in the 2H and won 24-17. UH all'd only 117 yds in 2H. Hawaii is on B2B road gms (0-6 ATS) off road trip to Utah St and will stay on the mainland here instead of travelling back and then all the way across the country. Niumatalolo was an '89 UH grad lettering 3 yrs as a starting QB and was part of UH's 1st bowl squad in '89. Midshipmen are 4-9 ATS the gm after ND. LW Navy gave the Irish all they could handle in a 38-34 loss (+16') as they played flawlessly not being called for a single penalty (ND backers sigh) and also didn't commit a single TO (+2). They did get SOD on their final drive at the ND31. The same can't be said for the Warriors as they are now 0-8 after LW's 47-10 (+24) trouncing at the hands of Utah St. After QB Schroeder threw 3 more int's UH is now -10 on the ssn as their QB's have just a 16-19 ratio on the yr. One advantage they do have in this gm is they avg nearly 300 ypg through the air and will be taking on a Navy D that allows 69% completions. UTEP, however, is playing their 3rd str AG, which is only the 3rd time that's happened in the L/19 yrs (1-1 SU, 1-1 ATS, 1 cover was by a single pt as 29 pt dog). The tms come in on opposite ends of the confidence spectrum as UTEP has lost 6 str gms both SU/ATS while NT has won 4 str SU/ATS. LW NT became bowl elig for 1st time s/'04 w/a misleading 28-16 win (-3') over Rice. The Mean Green were outgained 355-253 and outFD'd 20-13 as they benefitted from a 55-yd FR td and also a 65-yd PR td. UTEP meanwhile, couldn't even cover a ridiculous 47' pt spread at A&M LW in a 57-7 loss as the tms even combined for 0 pts in the 40. Sullivan who is filling in for the inj'd Showers was a miserable 9-17-71-0-3. While NT is in uncharted waters being a 3 td fav over a FBS foe for 1st time s/'03, it's tough to go against 2 tms that are featured in our Streakers section on the Front Page.

OKLAHOMA ST by 31 over Kansas - OSU is 8-1 SU/7-2 ATS in this series. The HT is 1-4 SU, 2-3 ATS. LY the story of the game was a driving rain with Gundy saying after the game that they could not take advantage of plays down the field that they thought they could get due to the rain. OSU had a streak of 22 consec games with 30+ pts snapped but Gundy said KU's def front won the LOS. OSU led 20-0 in the 4Q but KU went 65 yds for a td with 10:45 left, then 73 yds for a td with 8:52 left. KU was SOD at the OSU41 with 2:42 left. Only HG in 4 wk stretch for OSU and they have the crucial gm vs TX on deck. The light bulb could have finally gone off for the OSU offense w/50+ pt showings in B2B gms incl LW's impressive 52-34 (E) road win at TT which has the Pokes fully entrenched in the race for a B12 title. B2B tough road gms for KU off 35-13 loss (+27) to TX as they have now lost 26 str B12 gms. Gundy is 25-14 ATS as a DD fav while KU is 21-38 ATS as a DD B12 dog. OSU rolls.

Incl LWs impressive 52-34 (E) road win at 11 which has the Pokes fully entrenched in the race for a B12 title. B2B tough road gms for KU off 35-13 loss (+27) to TX as they have now lost 26 str B12 gms. Gundy is 25-14 ATS as a DD fav while KU is 21-38 ATS as a DD B12 dog. OSU rolls.

**Usc by 17 over CALIFORNIA - LY USC was -15 and won 27-9 although QB Barkley only hit 22-34-192 with 2 int. Cal was off their big effort vs Ohio St the prev week. USC has dominated this series winning 9 in a row SU by 18 ppg (7-2 ATS) and USC had a 488-250 yd edge 1 wk after having their unbeaten season end. At the half they led 17-3 and had a 293-98 yd edge and sk'd Cal's QB 9x. Cal is 7-4 SU/6-5 ATS in home finales and are playing for a 7th straight week. While they have lost 12 straight gms to FBS foes, after 12 straight non-covers, they have managed back-to-back covers and only lost by 5 to Ariz last week, 33-28 (+16). USC is on back-to-back road (4-12 ATS) and this gm is sandwiched between two huge gms vs Oregon St and Stan but are 4-0 SU/ATS on the road vs Cal. If K Heidari could have made a couple of FG att vs ND the Trojans would be a perfect 4-0 under interim HC Orgeron as LW they got their 2nd str impressive DD P12 win beating OSU 31-14 (+4) as we cashed a Friday Night Marquee on the UNDER. The win also ended an 0-10 ATS streak away from home while Cal ironically ended an 0-8 ATS streak at home LW. Tough to lay a lot of pts here with the banged-up Trojans but on the bright side, their lack of depth could mean the starters get extra reps.

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UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

Over 32 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 213-160. The last 14 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous OUT-RIGHT UPSET WINNERS (50!) to the incredible record INCLUDING 4 TY including 3 straight outright winners!!!!! Here is TW's Underdog Play:

SMU +10 over CINCINNATI

First meeting, however Tuberville faced SMU in his first ssn at TT (Red Raiders won 35-27, -13') and also won 2 matchups vs the Ponies while HC at Ole Miss (2-0 ATS). Cincy has extra time off a Wed Night gm vs Mem but SMU is off a bye (4-1-1 ATS reg ssn). The Bearcats have looked impressive in their L/3 wins incl having 25-15 FD and 437-232 yd edges in the 34-21 (-2') win over Memphis LW. OB Kay has been efficient comp 73% w/a 14-5 ratio. Speaking of impressive, the Ponies offense came into the ssn w/much hype under the tutelage of the Jones/Mumme combo. After a tough opening sked (#45), SMU has avg'd 48 ppg and 582 ypg in AAC play thanks to possibly the nation's most improved QB in Gilbert who is avg 448 ypg (66%) wan 11-1 ratio the L/3 gms and vs Temple, he had 635 total yds, 7th most by a QB in NCAA hist. While Cincy is 6-2 this year, their 5 wins over FBS opp have been over tms w/a combined 3-36 record (#125 sked) and they have not faced an offense anywhere near the level of SMU. Look for a lot of pts and when you consider Jones/Mumme's exp, there may not be a better tm equipped to handle a shootout than the Ponies. FORECAST: Smu by 1 over CINCINNATI

Notre Dame by 7 over PITT - These 2 have met in each of the L5Y and the games have been decided by 3, 5, 6, 3 and 3 pts. The dog naturally is 7-0-1 ATS the L8Y with 4 outright upsets and the visitor is 3 SU/7-1 ATS. ND is 15-4 SU (12-6-1 ATS) vs Pitt s/88. LY ND was playing with the pressure of trying to stay unbeaten and also playing the week after their big win over OU and were in a letdown spot. ND actually had 34-13 FD and 522-308 yd edges but there were numerous times in the game it appeared their undefeated season had ended. Pitt led by 8 when ND was int'd in the EZ with 4:34 left. ND got it back with 3:03 left and got a td and 2 pt conv with 2:11 left which forced OT. ND got a 47 yd FG to tie after 1OT and then fmbl'd in the 2OT but Pitt barely missed a 33 yd FG and then ND won it in the 3OT. Both tms have to be glad to be playing pro-style offenses as they both have faced option in each of the L/2 wks (ND off AF/Navy w/bye on deck and Pitt off B2B AG Navy/GT). LW we liked the fact the Irish had just seen the option the wk before and they had easily covered 5 str vs option tms but had to hang on for dear life in a 38-34 (-16') win. By the end of the gm their D was a MASH unit as they were playing w/o 3 st'rs coming in and lost 3 more during the gm via chop blocks. Pitt didn't fare well in either gm vs option as LW we cashed a 4★ Key Selection on these pages going against them in their 21-10 loss to GT as they were outgained 360-228. As usual, ND has the talent edges but this is a dog series.

TEXAS A&M by 21 over Mississippi St - Prior to LY these two last met in the Independence Bowl in 2000 which was played in a snow storm. LY MSU was off their loss to Bama and at home. It was the first top 20 matchup in Davis Wade Stadium s/'01. A&M was -7 on the road and flat out dominated the 1H. A&M had a 368-87 yd edge and led 24-0. 4th straight HG for A&M w/bye on deck while MSU is on B2B road (7-2 ATS) off SC. LW we went against the Bulldogs as our NCSportsline Comp College POW and they lost to SC 34-16 (+12). It was a misleading gm, however as the Bulldogs had a 23-12 FD edge but couldn't overcome a -5 TO deficit as SC scored 20 pts off their TO's. A&M despite laying 47' to UTEP found a way to cover in a 57-7 wind despite Manziel only playing a little more than a half (accounted for 6 total td's). Miss St is just 2-8 ATS as an AD and we'll take the Aggies at home to cover their 3rd str gm.

Boston College by 24 over NEW MEXICO ST - First meeting. NMSt HC Doug Martin was the BC OC LY and should know the players strength and weaknesses. Including bowls BC is 1-8 SU (5-4 ATS) in away/neutral non-conf gms. Very rare road gm vs a non-BCS school as BC is 0-2 SU, losing at Army LY 34-31 (-7) and at UCF 30-3 (+7') in '11. NMSt will host 2 BCS schools TY after only hosting 2 in L/11Y and are 0-3 SU but 2-1 ATS covering vs #22 Oregon St in 01 and #13 Cal in 05 before losing to what has turned out to be a pretty good Minnesota tm TY. LW arguably one of the most shocking scores came when 30-pt dog NMSt led UL 28-7 in the 2Q. While they eventually lost 49-35 (+31'), it was one of their better efforts of the ssn. BC comes in off a 34-27 (+4) upset win over VT as BC backers will no doubt put VT QB Thomas on their Christmas Card list as he accounted for 4 TO's and gift-wrapped the Eagles 17 pts. BC was outgained 446-289 but did win the LOS w/a 196-55 yd edge. Now they will be facing a NMSt D that is all g 312 rush ypg (6.9!). While we usually favor the gritty Addazio here who likes to smash inferior opponents, we fade them a bit as they are off a misleading upset win while playing a rare game in altitude and this is only non-ACC gm the last 6 weeks.

Utáh Št by 10 over UNLV - USt is now 4-1 ATS in this series. They were an underdog in the first 4 but were -20' at home LY. They only had a 21-19 FD edge but a 564-304 yd edge. USt had a whiteout at their stadium and wore white pants, jerseys and helmets. LV settled for 24 and 26 yd FG's in the 3Q and only trailed 20-13 with USt getting a 74 yd dump pass for a td, a 65 yd screen pass setting up a td and got a safety with 5:20 left to get ahead of the spread. UNLV is playing for a 5th str wk while Utah St only plays for a 2nd str wk and both have a bye on deck. After losing 2 str gms after the Keeton inj, the Aggies have rebounded nicely w/B2B blowout wins/covers incl LW 47-10 (-24) over Hawaii. Garretson became the first frosh to pass for 300+ yards for USt s/85. UNLV is just one win away from their 1st bowl s/00 but LW were dominated at the LOS by SJSt in a 34-24 loss (+4') as they were outrushed 312-86. That's not good news facing a USt tm that ranks among the most physical in the MW. However, UNLV is 10-5-1 ATS as a HD and is getting 12+ here.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE by 17 over Fiu - The home tm had won 5 in a row SU (4-1 ATS) but the visitor is now 3-1 SU/ATS. MT is 5-2 SU/4-3 ATS. FIU won here in '11, 31-18 (-8). LY FIU got back Jake Medlock at QB after he'd missed a few games and he hit 24-38-380 yds. FIU was +2 and on the last play of the game, appeared to get a td for the win but it was ruled down at the 1 and not overturned. FIU blew a 20-3 lead and trailing 27-23 converted on 4&10 from its own 20 and drove 80/9pl for a td with 1:00 left but MT got a td with :36 left before FIU was stopped on the 1 although WR Wright said, "I know I got it over the plane but you cannot leave it in the refs hands." MT has a bye on deck and has renewed life after B2B last second wins over Marshall (td pass on final play) and UAB (FG w/:03 left). Now they can clinch bowl elig over a FIU tm that is 1-7 TY but has covered 3 of their L/4 gms incl LW in a 34-13 loss (+24') to EC as they actually had an incredible 40:37-19:23 TOP edge. While MT has the superior tm, playing w/confidence, we fade them here as they are 1-5 ATS as a DD fav and we like what we've seen from the Panthers as of late.

ULM by 5 over Arkansas St - The home team is 7-1 SU/5-3 ATS in the series. ULM had covered 5 in a row but ASt has now won 3 in a row SU/ATS. LY the game was tied at 17 and ULM did finish with a 24-22 FD edge but AS had a 534-443 yd edge and led 45-16 before ULM got a td with 2:35 left. ULM was playing w/ŏ QB Browning. ASt is on B2B rŏad (3-7 ATS) while ULM has a couple extra days to prep off a Thur Night gm and have a bye on deck. It's clear that QB Browning has been the heart and soul of the ULM program the L/2 yrs as his unexpected return this yr (was orig thought to be OFY) has rejuvenated what looked like a lost ssn. LW we saw great value with that revitalized ULM offense going up against a Troy tm that has been a pure OVER tm the L/2 yrs and easily cashed a 3★ Totals LPS on the OVER (covered by 26 pts!) in ULM's 49-37 win (+3). On the flip side we also cashed a 3★ Totals LPS on the UNDER in LW's ASt/USA gm (covered by 31' pts!) as the Red Wolves picked up a hard-fought 17-16 win (+3'). QB Kennedy was an efficient 15-17-136-0-0 while adding 65 rush as Ark St snapped their 6th str non-cover streak. Winner here stays in the hunt for a SBC champ and while we like what we have seen from ULM the L/2 wks, keep in mind ASt is 9-0 SU/8-1 ATS on the SBC road the L/3 yrs.

LOUISIANA TECH by 14 over Southern Miss - They played a pair of nail bitters in '10 and '11 which LT lost by 3 total pts but covered both as a dog. Their last mtg was the ssn opener and LT (+11') had only 13 FD's but led in the 4Q. They all'd a 56/11pl FG drive w/2:19 left and lost. SM is on B2B road while LT comes in off a bye. The Bulldogs finally have a little bit of momentum winning 2 of their L/3 gms albeit vs the likes of UTEP/FIU who have a combined 2 wins but now they face a SM tm here whose futility streak is now at 20

TENNESSEE by 1 over Auburn - Auburn has won 5 str in this series but their last meeting was 2009 Aub is playing for the 6th str wk and the Tigers have not fared well playing B2B conf road games as they have dropped the 2nd game 5 straight times SU (2-3 ATS). UT has a bye on deck. Willie Martinez has foll'd Tommy Thigpen from AU to UT. Both of Gene Chizik's assts will be D cch's for the Vols in '13 so they know the Auburn personnel inside out and have an ax to grind. LW Aub got another misleading win as they beat Ark 35-17 (-7') despite being outFD'd 25-18 and benefitted from +3 TO's. Meanwhile Tenn is off B2B road blowout losses to arguably the Top 2 tms in the SEC so far TY in Bama/Mizzou. Now they are back in the friendly confines of Neyland Stadium where they are 1 play away from being 5-0 SU there TY. While the Tigers have been on of the surprise darlings of the country this year, we think they are living on borrowed time and the Vols have already proven earlier TY, they can pull an outright upset here.

UCF by 7 over Houston - In their last meeting (10), after trailing 20-3 UH (+2) took a 24-23 lead, but then UCF pulled away. The LTH ('09) UCF (+4') upset #13 Houston and it was their first ever win over a ranked foe. UCF comes in off a bye where they are 2-0 ATS this yr while UH is playing a 5th str week. These have been two of our favorite trns TY as UH had six 3 ★ Key Selection winners on these pages before their 7-0 ATS run came to a halt LW in a 35-23 (-18) win over USF. While UCF is getting all the pub, the Cougars are still very much alive in the race for the AAC Champ and BCS berth as their only loss came by a single pt in non-conf action. However, this marks the 1st of the toughest B2B road trip that any tm plays this yr in AAC play as they have L'Ville on deck. UCF is 6-1 SU/ATS TY and all they have done is pull off an upset win over Penn St, lose by only 3 to SC, upset a Top 10 L'Ville tm on the road and in their L/gm easily cashed as our Early Bird POW (given out FREE every Monday on button #9 1-347-677-1700, 70% winners TY) beating UConn 62-17 (-24). While it's Bright House, where UCF is 26-13-1 ATS all-time, tough to lay DD's vs a UH tm that is 7-1 ATS TY and outscoring its opp by 20 ppg away from home (+111 ypg).

ARIZONA by 3 over Ucla - The home team is an outstanding 9-1 ATS in this series (7-2 SU). UA won 5 in a row SU by margins of 7, 21, 14, 8 and 36 (4-1 ATS). LY AU was off their big upset win over USC and got into the rankings at #25 and had a few too many people patting them on the back. The final score sums up the game as UCLA was only -3' at home and won 66-10 with 36-18 FD and 611-257 yd edges and at the half, UCLA had a 371-83 yd edge and led 42-3. The Bruins held Arz to their lowest yd'g of the ssn. LTH UCLA (+5) faced an interim HC and the gm had a bench-clearing brawl. UCLA trailed 42-7 at HT being outgained 431-187 as they all'd 6 str 1H td's. LW the Bruins after B2B losses to top 10 Stan/Oreg got a much-needed 45-23 win (-28') but they were outFD'd 26-18. The Wildcats are also off a noncovering win as they beat Cal 33-28 (-16). Winner here stays in the running for a possible P12 South Title and we lean with the home-town Cats due to series history and the fact they are outscoring their opp 36-12 (+102 ypg) at home TY while UCLA is getting outscored 29-25 (-59 ypg) on the road.

ALABAMA by 11 over Lsu - LSU was 7-1 SU in this series from '00-'07 but Bama is now 4-2 SU the L/6. No gm in CFB has had more impact on the Nat'l Title race in the L/couple of yrs than this one and Saban is 4-3 SU/3-3-1 ATS vs Miles. In '11 #2 LSU travelled to #1 Bama and pulled a 9-6 upset as Bama was done in by blown FG's. Bama got revenge in the National Champ game. LY LSU was at home, off a bye and deserved to win. They had a 435-259 yd edge and even held the ball for 39:15. Bama led 14-3 at the half but the Tide fumbled at the LSU10 and LSU went 90/7pl for a td and the lead, 17-14. LSU missed a 45-yd FG with 1:34 left. Up to this point, McCarron had been 9-22-93 yds but hit 4-5-72 on the final drive and Bama, without any time-outs, got a td with :51 left to pull out the 21-17 win. Both tms come in off byes like the LTH but Bama has clearly been the more impressive tm as they are 8-0 and after their D took a lot of flack for the A&M gm, has all'd exactly 2 offensive td's combined in the L/6 gms. On offense, the Tide are well balanced avg 211 rush (5.9) and 252 pass. LSU has not been consistent on both sides of the ball this year as while their offense was humming along early in the yr, the D all'd 3 str gms of 430+ yds. Then in B2B gms vs UF/Ole Miss, the offense stalled. QB Mettenberger after having a 15-2 ratio the 1st 6 gms only has a 4-5 ratio in the L/3. Tough to lay a lot of pts w/such a heated rivalry so we'll call it near the number but we do expect the Tide to pull away late.

SAN JOSE ST by 1 over San Diego St - From '97-'05 they met 3 times and SDSt won by an avg of

29 ppg. Surprisingly, SJSt which has been an underdog in 2 of the last 3 ('06, '12) has won 3 in a row SU winning 31-10 in '06 and 35-10 (-6') in '08 and last year was a 3 pt road dog and the lead changed hands 4 times in the 4Q before they came out on top 38-34. They were our NCSportsline Complimentary Underdog Play and they pulled the outright upset (get your free Underdog Play this week at 1-347-677-1700 on button #3 on Tuesday). SJSt comes in winners of 4 straight gms after LW's 34-24 win (-4') over UNLV. QB Fales had been red-hot in the previous 2 wins but the Spartans went to the ground gm outrushing UNLV 312-86. SDSt has rebounded from their 0-3 start as they have won 4 of their last 5 gms with the only loss coming at the hands of unbeaten Fresno in OT. LW HC Rocky Long followed suit getting another win in the NM/SDSt series (12 str) and another non-cover (1-11 ATS) in the Aztecs 35-30 (-14) victory. While SJSt has the offensive edge (#51-90), SDSt has the D edge (#67-87). SDSt is 7-3 ATS as an AD and this one figures to go down to the wire much like last year.

Tuesday, November 12th - Ohio at BOWLING GREEN - The visitor is actually 6-1 SU/5-2 ATS and

there have been 4 outright upsets the L7Y. LY BG was a 3 pt road dog and we used them as our Wed Night Marquee. OU drove 72/11pl on their opening drive and 95/14pl on their opening drive of the 3Q, both for td's but would get 77 yds the rest of the game. OU also botched 4 punts setting up BG for great field position and the Falcons delivered a 26-14 outright upset winner. OU had won the previous 3 SU.

Both tms are off Tues Night road gms. Winner here stays in the race for the MAC East Title. **Buffalo at TOLEDO** - UT and the HT are 3-1 SU but UB is 3-1 ATS incl covering 3 str. LY UT was -7' on the road and while paid attendance was 10,658 there were only about 400 in the stands counting the marching band. UT came in 7-1 and was being outgained on the yr while UB came in 1-6 on the yr but was outgaining their foes. This time UT had a 412-372 yd edge on a rainy day and Fluellen rushed for a was outgaining item loes. This line or had a 412572 by degelor a rainy day and it defined in a career-high 228 yds. UB got a td with 14:40 left to pull within 5, punted 2x then finbl'd at their own 18 with 1:48 left but still covered. UT is only off lowly EM but does have an all-important HG vs NIU 8 days from here. While playing in opposite divisions of the MAC, this gm is key for bowl positioning for both tms.

4★ NEW ORLEANS by 13 over Dallas - What happens when you have a team that is 18-3-1 ATS vs non-div foes hosting a team that is 5-16 ATS off a SU win? What if the host had a QB avg 361 ypg, 72% comp, 9.4 ypa! with a 14-2 ratio at home? What if that QB now got to face the leagues #32 pass D? Let's add one more scenario. What if the host now has a new DC that took the #31 scoring D from LY and has them ranked #4 TY. Then, that same DC has this game circled as he was fired by their opponent and was made the scapegoat despite having one of the most injured units in the NFL. Well, the team is New Orleans, the QB is Drew Brees, the DC is Rob Ryan and the opponent that he went up against every day in practice is the Dallas Cowboys. The fiery DC has the Saints among the sack leaders with 22 the L/5 gms and when Romo and Company have been sacked 4 or more times, which has occurred 14 times since '09, the Cowboys are 3-11 SU and they've failed to cover the 3 games they won. NO let us down here LW but with Payton 18-3 ATS off a SU loss they deserve to be hack

ATS off a SU loss they deserve to be back.

3★ Detroit by 9 over CHICAGO - The Lions off a bye with the Bears off a MNF game vs GB and div fav's in this scenario are 6-2 ATS. The Lions (5-1-1 ATS vs CHI) have a big edge with their #5 offense vs the Bears #26 defense on a short week but Detroit is a slow starter with 34% of their 217 pts coming in the 4Q TY. This is backed up by Stafford's 84.7 QBR in the 1H of games TY vs 107.4 QBR in the 2H with a ypa almost 2 yds better in later stanza (1.8). Why is this brought up? Higher powered offenses generally take 1.5Q to get up to speed after a bye week and the Bears D just faced Rodgers and is on a short week. Prior to GB, the Bears only had 9 sks TY (1 every 25 att's) which is dead last vs 41 LY (8th 1 very 14.4 att's). Now they get a Lions team that has only allowed 10 sks (#1, one every 33.8 att's) with 5 coming in their loss to GB who were off a bye week to prep. While we don't know how Josh McCown fared on MNF we'll side with the Lions to pull away in the 4Q and clearly they will not feel bad about laying on a beating vs a Bears team that into TY had beaten them 9 of the L/10 times.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ Denver by 14 over San Diego - John Fox will miss the next several weeks but off a bye and with Peyton Manning running every practice year round as a HC would, at both Indy and here, so don't expect any change in routine. Can compare to Indy LY as the Colts went 5-1 ATS the F/6 after Pagano took his leave. Fox has instilled an attitude that first and foremost you beat division foes and on the AFC West road the Broncos are 6-0 SU and 5-1 ATS (loss was -10, 17-9) while at Carolina he was 8-0 SU and 7-1 ATS as a div AF. Manning's record setting pace won't be slowed against a Chargers D which has played the #31 schedule prior to LW. They allowed 500 yds to WAS and previously faced offenses ranked #32 (JAX), #26 (OAK) and #12 (IND). There is also no better QB off bye as Peyton is 7-0 SU & ATS with the avg cover by 12 ppg. Also expect solid improvement for the Broncos D as Von Miller (#3 in sks LY w/18.5) returned for his first action TY vs Indy and after using that game to get up to speed he got a sack vs Washington and held the Skins to 266 yds, a ssn low, 244 yards less then SD and 150 yds under their avg.

PHI's 104 (3.3) rush def over the L5W is very misleading as prior to the Raiders they faced the Giants and their bad OL twice, Dallas minus RB Murray and the Bucs who are...the Bucs. Philly went back to Foles LW and the offense which avg'd 240 ypg and 5 ppg the prev 2 games got back on track putting up 28 pts and 328 yds in the 1H, but that adds value here! It all comes down to a B2B road trip vs a winning franchise that is 3-0 ATS as a HF TY and 21-7 the L5Y vs a new HC and a new offense playing only their second winning team on the road (+10' vs Denver, 20-52).

PITTSBURGH by 6 over Buffalo - Just 2-9 ATS as a non-div fav the Steelers are in a good spot at home vs Buffalo who was exploited by NO two weeks ago and found themselves in a very physical matchup vs KC LW. In the three games prior to NE, PIT all'd 157 ypg (61%) 1-4 ratio as they've inserted youth to make the scheme faster. OC Haley is doing all he can to get RB Bell (56 ypg 3.5 ypc) up to speed to protect Roethlisberger and an OL that is only scraping out 3.5 ypc TY. BUF's ability to pressure will be huge here (#6 sks 1 every 11.6 att) but they've allowed a 12-3 ratio the L5W as foes have figured out the scheme. Look for the Bills to rely on a finally healthy Spiller (116 yds 9.7 LW) to try to control the tempo but we'll take DC LeBeau and while he's not coaching the "Steel Curtain", Pittsburgh is still only allowing 258 total ypg and 3.1 ypc rushing at home.

Baltimore went into their bye with 4 straight games all decided by 3 points or less, losing 3 of them, and then trailed wire-to-wire at Cleveland. Cincy comes into Baltimore with a 2 game lead but if they are a fav they are 0-6 ATS as div-AF the L7Y. If Vegas makes the Ravens the chalk they are just 3-8-1 ATS as a div-HF. The Ravens offensive woes (#20) can be blamed on the OL which is allowing 9.9% sks/att at home and only opening holes for 2.5 ypc. They've faced a brutal trio of D's (Cle #7, Hou #1 & GB #11) but Cincinnati brings in the #8 D whille having he best scoring D of the group. It must be noted that the Ravens are still the Super Bowl champs and are dangerous. On the other side of the ball Dalton has progressed as hoped, from his rookie year (58%, 6.6 ypa), to his second season (62%, 7.0 ypa) to TY (65%, 7.8 ypa) as he's led the Bengals to the most or 2nd most yards TY vs Pittsburgh, Buffalo, Detroit, the NY Jets and Miami. We were unable to see the enigma that is the Houston Texans off a Sun night game but they went into it as the NFL leaders at +113 ypg despite playing the 2nd toughest schedule. The guess here is that if HOU lost they may stick with Keenum who has reenergized the local fan base as a local hero and had in his first start in arguable the toughest venue for a new QB threw for 271 (60%) with NO interceptions. However, off a win on Sun night you have a team that is only 2 games out of 1st, hasn't allowed over 20 FD's in ANY game, is all'g 268 ypg and would hold the tie breaker with the team above them. The Cards came into this year 1-8-2 ATS as a HF and did cover their only role as one TY vs ATL.
