4★ Wisconsin over MINNESOTA - Battle of Paul Bunyan's Axe. UW has won 9 in a row SU in this series by 17 ppg and are 6-3 ATS. They are also 4-1 ATS (+282 ypg LW) in Minny as Wisc fans travel well here and what better place to do some early Christmas shopping than at the Mall of America? LY we had a 3★ Key Selection on these pages and a 4★ LPS on UW -16' and won easily 38-13 with Minn taking the RS off Philip Nelson giving him his first start at QB. UW had 24-12 FD and 443-245 yd edges. Situational edge to Minny here as they are off a bye playing their FHG (5-3 ATS incl 2 outright upsets in new stad as DD dogs). The Gophers are no doubt one of the surprise darlings of the country TY at 8-2 and winners of 4 str both SU/ATS. However, now they face a bigger, stronger and faster version of themselves as the Badgers come in winners of 5 in a row both SU/ATS. LW we easily cashed a 4★ Key Selection on these pages as they crushed Indiana (like they do each and every year) 51-3 (-24) while piling up 554 rush yds (11.1). They are now avg 308 ypg (7.0) on the year! On the D side, they are all g just 99 ypg (3.1) while Minny's rush D has all'd 202 (5.9) the L/3 wks. The Badgers still have BCS hopes and we're not shying away from a tm that is 9-1 ATS TY w/their only non-cover by a 1/2 pt. They have also owned the series and have cashed multiple key selections. Sound familiar?

FORECAST: Wisconsin by 14 over MINNESOTA
3★ TENNESSEE over Vanderbilt - UT's victory over Vandy in '11 proved costly in '12. In the lockerroom after the game Derek Dooley said basically that the one thing they do every year is kick Vanderbilt's butt. They were 28-1 SU in this series. LY they were a 3 pt dog at VU and Franklin reminded his team often of those comments. VU would roll up their biggest MOV over UT since 1954 in a 41-18 rout and it was the most pts VU had put up on UT since 1923. Vandy just clinched bowl elig for the 3rd str ssn (1st time in schl hist) and it was a misleading gm as they got a frontdoor cover td w/47 left and benefitted from a +4 TO margin. They did start Carta-Samuels at QB (out s/mid-Oct) and he went 19-24-184-0-0. UT, meanwhile is off a bye needing 2 wins to clinch elig. They are at home where they are a much better tm as they are 4-2 (+17 ypg) incl an upset win over SC while they are 0-4 away from home (-215 ypg). They come in off 3 str blowout losses but most tms would lose in the same fashion to the likes of Bama/Mizzou/Auburn. This is a legitimate revenge game for a team that won 28 of 29 and was embarrassed LY. Look for new HC Jones to make winning back the state a priority here.

FORECAST: TENNESSEE by 10 over Vanderbilt
3★ HOUSTON over Cincinnati - These 2 were also CUSA members until '04 but their last game was in '02. The visitor is only 1-5 SU. Cincy is on B2B road (8-1 ATS in 2nd str AG) and this is their 3rd road in 4 weeks and they are 0-1 SU/ATS in trips West of the Mississippi River the L4Y. You would think that after covering 8 of their 1st 9 gms the Cougars would finally get some respect but that again wasn't the case LW as we easily cashed our 7th, that's right 7th 3★ Key Selection this year on UH as they nearly pulled a huge outright upset at Lville losing 20-13 (+17). Cincy was also impressive LW in a 52-17 (+1) win over Rutgers as they had a 619-357 yd edge. Coming into the gm, however, their 9 prev opponents had a combined 17 wins and the best mark belonged to FCS NW St at 5-5. They have still only played our #121 sked and now travel west taking on a UH tm that has already played and covered against the likes of BYU, UCF and UL. We would take all 3 of those squads over this overrated Cincy tm and look for the Cougs to deliver us another winner here.

FORECAST: HOUSTON by 14 over Cincinnati

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Virginia (+) over MIAMI, FL - Al Golden was the Cavs DC from '01-'05. There have actually been 6 outright upsets in this series the L9Y (dog is 7-1-1 ATS). UVA has won 3 in a row SU after pulling upsets and 16 and 14 point dogs in '10 and '11 and LY UVA was -1 and won 41-40. UVA had a 482-420 yd edge and they needed 2 late td's to overcome a 10 pt deficit. UVA went 87/171pt converting on 48.7 2x and got a 10 yd td pass with :06 left for the win. LTH UVA led 17-0 but UM got within 7 w/9:22 left. UVA tk'd UM at their 9 (23 yd pass) on gm's final play to hold on to the victory. Both tms come in reeling as UVA has lost 7 str gms and had the bye to lick their wounds after B2B blowout losses. Meanwhile the Canes after climbing as high as #7 in the polls, have now lost 3 str gms after LW's 48-30 loss (-3) to Duke. In those L/3 gms the D, which was thought to be much improved TY, has reverted back to their 2012 form all g an avg of 44 ppg and 536 ypg and now they are laying 3 td's leaving the backdoor wide open. UVA is 3-1-1 ATS off a bye in the reg ssn under London while Canes are 2-8 ATS as a DD ACC fav.

FORECAST: Virginia (+) MIAMI, FL by 10
2★ NC STATE by 1 over East Carolina - In the last meeting in '10, EC (+7) led 21-0 but needed a FG with 1:04 left to force OT where they won it. EC finishes up on B2B road and has the CUSA East title showdown vs Marshall on deck. NCSt is in an ACC sandwich but desperately needs a win to get some positive momentum for the future under Doeren. EC comes in winners of 4 str gms after a 63-14 (-28) pasting of UAB where they piled up 36-17 FD and 625-354 yd edges. On the other side, NCSt has lost 6 str gms and fell to 0-7 in the ACC for the 1st time ever after LW's 38-21 loss (+7) to BC. BC Thomas st'd in place of Mitchell (CS) and was 22-33-207-1-0 but they were dominated at the LOS getting outrushed 420-35. While it's tough to back a tm that is 0-5-1 ATS in their L/6 gms, NCSt is 11-4-1 ATS as a HD and EC's blowout win over NC earlier TY here gives us some value. We'll gladly back NCSt as a home dog against a non-BCS foe that has a more important gm on deck.

FORECAST: NC STATE by 1 over East Carolina

OTHER GAMES

Wednesday, November 20th - Northern Illinois at TOLEDO - The home team is 5-1 SU but after covering the F/4 the visitor has covered B2B. There have been 7 outright upsets the L11Y. LY NI was looking to clinch a 3rd str MAC title game spot and Jordan Lynch hit 25-36-407 and also ran for 162 on 30 carries. UT led 14-7 at the half but NI had 4 straight 3Q drives totaling 337 yds and won 31-24 (-10). LTH was an amazing 63-60 final and NI won outright as an 8.5 pt road dog. This is the 1st time UT is a conf HD s/09 but NI has covered 9 str on the MAC road. Both tms off misleading gms as LW at the 8:00 mark of the 4Q, UT was leading Buffalo 48-21 but had to hang on for a 51-41 win (-3). Meanwhile, NI at the 8:00 mark was tied w/Ball ST at 27 before scoring 21 str in a 48-27 win (-7). Series says take the home dog here, but NI has won 23 str MAC gms and is on a 22-1 SU run dating back to LY (only loss to FSU).

Thursday, November 21st - Rutgers at UCF - Only prior mtg was the 2009 ST Petersburg Bowl, which Rutgers won 45-24 (-2) with a 380-255 yd edge. RU is travelling here only on 5 days rest off a 52-17 (-1) loss to Cincy where they were outgained 619-357. The D is now all g 514 ypg in their L/5 gms. UCF in a clear flat spot LW barely avoided an upset as they rallied to beat Temple 39-36 (-17), getting a FG as time expired. They still remain firmly in control of the AAC but the BCS pressure is starting to build (0-2 ATS L/2 gms). UCF is 21-12-1 ATS as a HF but Rutgers is 24-11-1 ATS as an AD.

Rice at UAB - The home team is 4-0 SU/ATS and LTH was '09's ssn opener. Rice (+6) trailed 27-3 at HT and never got closer than 17 pts. UAB is playing its 3rd str tough CUSA foe off road trips to MU and ECU (lost by a combined 119-28). Their D is all g 43 ppg and 504 ypg and now will be taking on a Rice tm who has won 6 of their L/7 gms (12 of L/15 dating back to LY) after LW's 52-14 (-14) win over LT. However, the Owls will be travelling here on only 5 days rest and are laying 2 td's on the road for only the 2nd time in a decade.

Unlv at AIR FORCE - LY's 38-35 (+10) win over AF snapped a 5 gm series losing streak. UNLV went into HT trailing 28-17. After the Rebels forced a TO at their own 22 they had 3 straight long td drives (78/5, 80/8 & 63/14pt). They actually outrushed AF in the L/3Q's. UNLV has extra time to prep for the option off a bye but AF is also off a bye (2-8 ATS reg ssn). AF is 7-3 SU (5-5 ATS) in FHG. LTH AF won 45-17 win as after they all'd a td they held UNLV to 90/32pt before a garbage td on the final drive. UNLV hasn't been bowling s/00 and has been sitting on 5 wins for nearly a month w/pressure st'g to mount on HC Hauck. They are just 1-4 ATS as an away fav but did cover earlier TY and AF is on a 3-12 overall ATS run.

Friday, November 22nd - Navy at SAN JOSE ST - LY SJSJ had to travel across the country and was fresh off their upset of SDSU. They were -2 and shockingly shut down Navy allowing 144 yds while rolling up 388. It was the fewest amount of yards for Navy in 10 years. SJSJ had not been to the Eastern time zone since '03 prior. LSY incl bowls Navy is 0-4 SU/ATS on long trips out West (avg loss by 16 ppg). However, their option offense does get stronger as the ssn progresses and they have won 3 of their L/4 gms (covered 4 of 5). SJSJ is off B2B losses and is still sitting at 5 wins. With unbeaten Fresno on deck, this could be their last chance to make it back to a bowl.

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Saturday, November 23rd

Nebraska by 4 over PENN ST - NU has now won 3 in a row SU in this series as the 2 are B10 regular crossover foes. LTH was PSU's first w/o Joe Paterno on the sidelines and NU escaped with the 3 pt win 17-14 (-3). LY PSU led 20-6 at the half and NU got a td with 10:57 left for a 27-23 lead. PSU fmb'd into the EZ although replay showed it might have been a td, which would have been a key. Later, after PSU was SOD at its own 25, NU tacked on a 33 yd FG w/23 left for the frontdoor cover, 32-23 (-8). Penn St is 19-3 SU/15-6-1 ATS in home finales while the Cornhuskers are 9-15-2 ATS in Nov road gms. LW w/the Big 10 Legends division on the line, Neb simply handed it to MSU as they inexplicably had 5 TO's (many of them unforced). The TO's resulted in 24 MSU pts as the Huskers had 19-18 FD and 392-361 yd edges. While they can't go to a bowl again TY, PST got to 6 wins LW w/a 45-21 win (-21) over Purdue as they had 31-14 FD and 501-264 yd edges. While Neb's B10 hopes went down the drain LW, they can still grab a NYD's bowl and on the road TY are all g just 274 ypg.

Illinois by 6 over PURDUE - PU is 7-1 SU in this series but 4-4 ATS. The HT is 6-3 SU/7-2 ATS and PU has won the last 4 of the series in West Lafayette by 21 ppg. LY IL lost its 5th str Senior Day game but covered as they were actually +6 and IL had a 24-18 FD edge although PU had a 398-333 yd edge. PU didn't get their 1st FD until early 2Q but had a 156-132 yd edge at the half. PU's FHG (2-4-1 ATS) while Illinois is 0-7 SU/2-5 ATS in 'true' Nov AG's. While the Illini D is all g 569 ypg on the road TY, their offense has shown much more life than PU's offense as they are avg 431 ypg away from home while the Boilers are avg just 283 ypg at home (-164 ypg, outscored 32-6 on avg). Both tms come in winless in B10 play as the Illini gave a great effort in a 60-35 loss (+34) to OSU as it was 47-35 mid-4Q. On the other side, PU lost 45-21 (+21) to PST. Difference here is QB play as 4-yr st'g QB Scheelhaase is avg 271 ypg (65%) w/a 17-10 ratio while true frosh Elting is avg 174 ypg (51%) w/a 5-6 ratio. The winner here stays out of the B10 Leaders basement and in Beckman's case, the outcome could determine his fate as HC. The B10's 2nd longest losing streak in history (20 gms for Illinois) comes to an end.

Pittsburgh by 1 over SYRACUSE - For both schools this is the only team they have played on TY's sked continuously s/97 as both were in the BE all those years and now both move to the ACC. Pitt had won 7 in row SU/5-2 ATS incl many wins as LPS for us. LY Pitt was +1 on the road and had a 346-305 yd edge but lost 14-13 (still covered). 3x in the 4Q, Pitt was deep in SU terr. Pitt trailed by 1 but former QB Sunseri took multiple sks and SU ran off the final 4:52 on 10 runs. Cuse are off B2B road while Pitt is playing a 7th consec week. Someone here is heading to a bowl as both tms come in at 5 wins. The Orange are off an expected 59-3 (-37) blowout loss to FSU but the final box score was misleading as they had 13 of their 17 FD's in the 2H. LW we went against Pitt w/a 3★ Key Selection on these pages and the Tar Heels cashed getting a 34-27 win (E). Pitt actually trailed 27-3 in the 2H before rallying, but their PR D did them in as they allowed 2 td's. While it is notable these tms are on the cusp of bowl elig in their initial ACC ssn, they both have been underwhelming as they are both getting outscored and outgained. However, Pitt has the better D (#36-54) and actually has 2 quality wins on the yr (Duke/ND) while the Cuse's best win came in a misleading gm over Tulane.

Temple by 7 over Connecticut - The two have an interesting history as the BE brought in UC and kicked out Temple so the game has always meant a lot to Temple. While the Owls are 3-4 SU, they are 7-0 ATS and have pulled outright upsets the L/2 meetings. LY UC missed an amazing 4 FG's and at home, lost outright 17-14 (-5). At the half UC had a 241-121 yd edge. With 2:56 left and UC up 14-7, they had a 45 yd FG blk'd and TU got a td with :19 left on a drive that was kept alive by 48.3 and 38.13 convs. TU then won in OT after UC missed a 28 yd FG. Huskies on B2B road (2-10 ATS in 2nd str AG) while TU is playing a 2nd str HG after a bye. Despite a combined 1-18 record, these two tms are heading in opposite directions. The Owls have now cashed 6 str gms w/frosh QB Walker in the line-up as has a 15-6 ratio and makes numerous plays w/his feet. LW they came close to pulling off their biggest win in 15 yrs as they dropped a heartbreaker to UCF 39-36 (+17). The Owls led 36-29 late 4Q but all'd 2 big pass plays (1 a td and another set up GW FG). On the other side, the Huskies are 0-9 and have failed to cover 5 of 6 gms under interim HC Weist w/the only cover being a backdoor as a 4 td dog to UL. LW we went against the Huskies w/our almost 5★ GOY and SMU covered 38-21 (-14). Cochran, the 3rd diff st'g QB TY for the Huskies, was 25-42-227-2-2 but the D all'd 450+ yds for the 3rd time in 4 gms. Owls have covered 7 str in series and 6 str TY but we fade them a bit as it is tough to lay over a td w/a 1-9 tm.

OHIO ST by 38 over Indiana - OST has won 16 str in the series, 2nd only to the 23 game win streak (1960-'86). Indy has covered the last 2 as 27' and 18 pt dogs stopping the streak of 6 str OST covers. The Bucks have won the L/6 at home vs the Hoosiers by an avg of 37-10 and are 3-3 ATS. LY OST struggled at times but still led 52-34 with 6:47 left before Indy got a td capping a 74 yd drive with 1:40 left, rec the inside kick and got another td with 1:05 left and were able to attempt another outside kick which OST recovered. The 49 pts were Indy's highest pt total ever vs OST. OST is 5-2 SU/3-4 ATS in home finales s/06 (1-2 SU/0-3 ATS not vs UM). The Bucks have Mich on deck (4-4-2 ATS L/10) while Indy is off a road trip to Madison (3-9 ATS L/12 B2B road). LW we easily cashed a 4★ Key Selection on these pages going against Indy in our favorite series of all-time as they routinely get slaughtered vs Wisc. LW was no exception as they lost 51-3 (+24). We know many of you agreed with our selection as the line moved a whopping 6 pts during the week! While the Bucks have now set a schl-rec w/22 str wins, after B2B blowout wins over PSU/Pur, LW's 60-35 win (-34) over Illinois was a step-back especially on D. They still have an FBS-best 192 1Q pts TY and are avg 49 ppg and 537 ypg. OST is a remarkable 284-0-1 SU all-time when scoring 35+ and now faces an Indy D that is all g 53 ppg and 633 ypg on the road TY. Bucks need another statement win after LW and get one here.

Michigan St by 6 over NORTHWESTERN - The visitor is 9-3 SU/11-1 ATS in this series! LY MSU (-7) still needed a win for bowl elig and had a 419-303 yd edge but blew numerous scoring opp's and lost. In the 2Q, Sparty appeared to break the plan for a td but was ruled down and they were then SOD on 4&1. They also missed a 37 yd FG with :02 left in the 1H and trailed 6-5 despite a 191-128 yd edge. NW got a FG with 7:30 left to lead 23-20 and MSU got it back with 1:29 left but on 4&10 fired inc on a pass off the rec's shoulder pads. Wildcats are 7-1 SU/ATS in their home finales while the Spartans are just 2-9 SU/3-8 ATS when playing in their 2nd straight 'true' away gm. The 2 tms are off misleading finals as MSU was practically handed the Legends div title by Neb LW as the Huskers had 5 TO's (MSU 0) in the Spartans 41-28 win (-6). The 5 TO's resulted in 24 MSU pts. Meanwhile, NW has to be the most snake-bitten tm in the country these L/2 yrs. After coming up just 5:03 short of an undefeated ssn LY, the Wildcats have now lost 6 str B10 gms TY after LW's 3OT loss to Mich 27-19 (-3). NW led most of the gm and appeared to have won it regulation but UM was able to get a FG off just as time expired with players arguably still in motion. In their L/3 gms alone, they have lost 2 in OT and one on a Hail Mary td pass. While MSU comes in on a 6-0 SU/5-1 ATS run, NW is dangerous here and are due for a break or two.

FLORIDA ST by 62 over Idaho - First meeting. In home finales not incl UF, Seminoles are 8-2 SU/6-4 ATS s/93. The Noles do have UF on deck (4-9 ATS prior) while ID is off a bye (3-7 ATS in reg ssn) and comes in 1-9 SU/3-7 ATS after a misleading 59-38 (+14) loss to ODU. That gm was tied at 31 at HT and ODU got the frontdoor cover on a td run w/28 left. While the ID offense has moved the ball, their D is all g 532 ypg (#124 incl 5.3 ypc and 69% completions). The Vandals are 2-13 SU/4-9-2 ATS in Nov/Dec reg ssn gms. LW FSU and Winston didn't allow off-field distractions to bother them as it was ho-hum just another cover for the Noles. They have now covered 4 gms TY when laying 30 or more after their 59-3 win (-37) over the Cuse. That moves them to 9-0-1 ATS at home the L2Y when laying 14 or more w/an avg cover of 17 ppg. While Oregon has laid claim to a pt per minute offense in recent yrs, LW the Noles avg'd 3.2 pts per min as they only had the ball for 18:18. Noles can easily name the score here and we could see the largest line in FBS vs FBS action in history here (Bama -54' to GST earlier TY).

Marshall by 31 over FIU - Only mtg was '11's Beef 'O' Bradier's Bowl. MU won 20-10 (+4) and the 2 tms set Beef Bowl rec's for fewest pts and most punts (16). Sandwich gm for MU here as they are off a road trip to Tulsa and have the CUSA East title gm on deck against ECU. FHG for FIU w/FAU on deck (2-5 ATS prior). Marshall is just 1-12-2 ATS as an AF after failing to cover LW in a 45-34 win (-13) over Tulsa. The key play happened in the 1H w/MU already up 21-0 when an int prevented them from going up 28-0. It was the 1st of 5 TO's as they had 32-20 FD and 619-345 yd edges. It's been a forgettable 1st ssn for HC Turner as FIU is now 1-9 SU/3-7 ATS after LW's 33-10 loss (+6) that saw them get dominated by a fellow 1-win tm (outgained 407-200). They are getting outscored by 28 ppg and outgained by 193 ypg on the yr. Marshall OL coach Mirabal was a 6 yr asst cch at FIU (knows personnel inside and out) and was not happy when Cristobal's coaching staff was fired and said back in the spring he wanted to "stick it to them." Look for the Herd to thunder into next wk's showdown vs EC w/an emphatic win, but we are well aware of their road mark as a favorite.

GEORGIA by 20 over Kentucky - UK has not been fav'd in this series s/77. UGA is 14-2 SU but has been upset twice s/97 and just 8-8 ATS. LY UGA was off a bye with UF on deck and off an embarrassing 35-7 loss to SC while UK had just lost to Ark 49-7 being outgained 533-170 despite that game being called with 5:08 left in the 3Q! UGA had about half the crowd and was a 26 pt fav but surprisingly UK broke a streak of 20 str games w/o a 1Q td by going 84/13pl for a td and a 7-0 lead. UK lost 17-16 in the 3Q. UGA got a td with 7:51 left to go up 29-17 but UK went 75/10pl for a td with 3:59 left and only lost 29-24. UGA does have GT on deck (0-5 ATS) while UK is on B2B road (4-2 ATS w/3 outright upsets). The last 7 meetings the avg score is just 29-25 despite UGA being an avg of -14. LW the Bulldogs suffered one of the most gut-wrenching losses in CFB history as they rallied from a 20-pt 4Q deficit to take a 38-37 win w/1:49 left. Then on 4&18, Aub threw a pass downfield where 2 UGA players collided and the ball bounced up in the air and into the arms of an unknowning Aub ply'r who took it in for a 73-yd td. UK backers are also not thrilled w/LW's outcome as Vandy got a td pass w/47 left for a 22-6 (-113) frontdoor cover. UK had a 17-14 FD edge but couldn't overcome a -4TO deficit. Not much to play for but pride for UGA but 4Y st'g QB Murray and holder of nearly every single SEC career passing record should be motivated to go out on a winning note in his home finale. However, too many pts here to lay w/a UGA D all'g 30 ppg.

IOWA ST by 1 over Kansas - We have been on the winning side in this series 12 out of 13 yrs! While the HT is 12-4 SU in this series, the visitor has actually covered the L/4. While they've lost the L/3, KU is 6-4 SU/ATS. LY KU was +4' at home and Charlie Weis paid for the admission of any KU student w/o a ticket and they came out in new black uniforms. ISU turned to Richardson who had not att'd a pass all year and he hit 23-27 for 257 yds despite not even being listed on the 2 deep in a 51-23 win. KU led 7-3 when Richardson came off the bench. LTH tied 10-10 KU all'd a 63/12pl drive for a 42 yd FG w/4:30 left. Cyclones are 9-13 SU but 14-8 ATS in home finales. LW KU broke their 27-gm B12 losing streak w/a 31-19 upset (+7) of WV. KU dominated the gm much more than the final as they had a 31-7 lead in the 4Q before WV managed 148 yds and 2 td's on their final 2 drives. KU did pile up 315 rush yds as Cozart got the start at QB. LW ISU actually led OU 10-3 but a 91-yd PR td by OU w/1:09 left before HT completely changed momentum as the Sooners scored the gm's final 45 pts. It was the 7th str loss for the Cyclones as they all'd 405 rush yds (9.2) and now face a rejuvenated KU run attack. After breaking the long losing streak can the Jayhawks make it 2 for 2?

MARYLAND by 3 over Boston College - BC is now 6-2 SU/5-3 ATS in this series and the home team is 4-3 SU/5-2 ATS. There were outright upsets in both '10 and '11 by the road team. LY BC was -2' at home and MD was down to their 4th string QB. MD finished with a 337-295 yd edge and Caleb Rowe hit 23-42-342 yds but was int'd 3x and OFY by the end of the game. BC led 13-0 but MD rallied for the lead with 8:47 left. BC went 85/13pl and got a 14 yd td pass w/52 left to pull out the 3 pt win. MD is 8-4 ATS in home finales while BC closes the season on B2B road. Both tms clinched bowl elig LW. The Eagles continue to ride the legs of the nation's leading rusher Williams who re-breaks his own schl record on a weekly basis after piling up 339 yds LW in their 38-20 win (-7) over NCST. The Terps who were stuck on 5 wins for what seemed like an eternity got a huge upset win over VT 27-24 in OT (+15) as Edsall's seat cooled significantly. The key to this gm will be how the MD front 7 holds up as it's been trick or treat TY w/4 gms all'g less than 100 yds and 3 gms all'g 240+ (3 of L/5). These tms are basically even but it should be noted the Eagles are -169 ypg on the road TY.

LOUISVILLE by 24 over Memphis - UL is 7-1 SU but is just 3-5 ATS. In their last meeting ('10) which was also here UL (-17) scored td's on 7 of their first 9 drives. UM was shutout 56-0 (worst shutout loss s/78). Cards have a bye on deck and are 0-5 ATS in their final HG incl getting outright upset B2B L/2 yrs. Mem is on B2B road (8-3 ATS on 2nd B2B AG). The Cards come in off yet another unimpressive win as they have failed to 5 of their L/6 gms. We cashed a 3★ Key Selection going against them as they beat Houston 20-13 (-17). Bridgewater saw his streak of 21 gms w/a td pass end at 21. Memphis, meanwhile is off B2B wins incl LW 23-10 (-1) over USF. The gm was very misleading as it was just 6-3 incl a 4Q before a scoring barrage. The Tigers were outgained 325-242 but benefitted from 5 USF TO's late a 36-yd IR td that sealed the gm. Expect a low-scoring contest w/another lackluster Cardinals' win and for those of you who like dabbling in totals, these two tms are a combined 4-15 to the UNDER TY.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN by 13 over Massachusetts - UM's Molnar was the QB cch here in '06. LY CM was a DD AF (-10) and won on the road 42-21 despite the FD's being even at 18 and CM only having a 344-317 yd edge. UM w/FR QB Doyle, making his 1st start, led 21-14 when CM got a td with 2:21 left in the half to give them momentum. Can't get a much bigger Chip's sandwich with WM and EM (Mich MAC championship). However, they are in the same boat as a yr ago, needing 3 str wins to close the ssn against the MAC's weakest tms. Step #1 was accomplished LW as they beat WM 27-22 (-2). They could have won by more but were done in by 5 TO's. It was nice to see RB Tipton (out most of yr, broken ankle) get his 1st 100-yd gm of the ssn. It's been Heartbreak Hotel for the Minutemen in MAC play TY, as they dropped their 2nd gm by a single pt LW 14-13 to Akron (+7) as the Zips scored a 4Q td for the final margin. Wegzyn/Doyle continue the revolving door at QB going 17-28-151-1-2. After CM went 1-4 ATS as a MAC HF the F2Y under Enos they went 2-0 ATS LY covering by 14 & 9. Look for them to take Step #2 towards getting back to bowl elig this wk.

Bowling Green by 24 over EASTERN MICHIGAN - BG is 7-1 SU but EM is 4-2 ATS. LY was the first mtg s/08. EM came in having a comb'd 1,201 yds over the prev 2 games but BG's D held them to 178 yds. BG's D played so well that Clawson used a conservative playbook in the 2H to run the clock and BG still won 24-3 (-15). BG got ahead of the spread with a 23 yd FR td with 6:31 left in the 3Q. BG comes in with 12 days off and EM with 14. LY BG was a MAC fav away from home 3x and covered each of them holding their opp to a COMBINED 17 pts. TY they continued that trend as they smashed Miami 45-3 (-23). In their L/gm, they continued their impressive play w/49-0 whitewashing of Ohio (-9). The Falcons D was dominant limiting OU to just 50 yds and 2 FD's in the 1H while the offense has a great 1-2 punch w/QB Johnson (66%, 14.5 ratio) and RB Greene who has 1,167 rush yds (Anthon Samuel who?). In EM's last gm, a fired up Eagles squad just 24 hrs after their HC was let go for inappropriate language (11-46 record doesn't help either) beat WM 35-32 (+2) in OT. Interim HC Stan Parrish has plenty of exp, but the problem is, he is most known for going 2-30-1 at KSt before Snyder replaced him (also 6-19 at BSt). This is EM's FHG and they should play w/some emotion again and while BG has the MAC East champ gm at Buffalo in 6 days, they can name the score here.

WYOMING by 3 over Hawaii - Last met in '97 with the Cowboys winning the L/5 as WAC foes. WY is 3-10 in home finales (2-8 ATS). Huge edge for Wyoming not only because of climate diff but also elevation diff as UH plays at sea level while WY stad is highest in the country at 7,200 feet. This is also UH's 3rd trip to the mainland in 4 wks. Both tms come in searching for a win as WY has lost their L/4 (1-3 ATS) while UH is 0-10 SU after LW's 28-21 OT loss (+5) to SDSU. UH again played valiantly but now have 4 losses by a td or less TY. This could potentially be the FHG for WY HC Christensen if the Cowboys don't win their final 2 gms. LW they were outgained 524-265 in a 48-7 loss (+24) to Boise. Their D is all'g 569 ypg the L/4 gms while the offense, which started the yr avg 489 ypg has managed just 296 and 265 yds the L/2 wks. Situation and elevation say take the Pokes here, but the Warriors have been scrappy all year.

Wku by 3 over TEXAS ST - First meeting. While WKU is on their 3rd road gm in 4 wks, they are off a bye. Texas ST had a bye prior to LW's trip to Ark St but it did them no good as we cashed a 3★ LPS going against them in a 38-21 loss (+7). The Bobcats were dominated at the LOS getting outruled 328-158 and now face one of the best RB's in the country in Andrews who has 1,407 (6.2). The Bobcats are a much better tm at home than away TY as they are outscoring foes by 9 ppg (+92 ypg) while they are getting outscored by 9 ppg (-185 ypg) on the road. Both tms have clinched bowl elig but w/the SBC only having 2 guaranteed spots, the loser here will be on the outside looking in. Look for WKU to take a page out of ASU's gameplan and run Andrews a ton here (226 carries TY).

IOWA by 8 over Michigan - At LY's B12 media days, 3 UM players talked about how Iowa had beaten them 3 str yrs and the game was very important to them. UM was -17 at home and Devin Gardner threw for 3 td's and ran for 3 more becoming the first UM QB since Steve Smith in 1983 to have that many passing and rushing scores in a game. It was 14-10 mid-2Q. UM extended it to 42-10 after 3Q's and Iowa went 45/7pl getting a 13 yd td pass with 2:12 left for the final. LTH UM (-4), down 8, had a 1&gl at the 3 with :16 left but fired inc 4 str times into the EZ. Iowa is 5-9 SU but 8-4-2 ATS in this series. Hawkeyes are also 15-5-1 ATS in FHG. Situational edge to Iowa as UM is off Mich St and Neb w/OTS on deck (2-4 ATS) while the Hawks come in off a bye (5-1 ATS). LW the Wolverines brought w/ them a lucky rabbit's foot at NW in their 27-19 win in 3OT (+3). The Wildcats dropped nearly 10 possible int's. With just 2:18 left, the Wolverines took over at their own 22 w/no TO's left and proceeded to convert on 4th Dn twice. Then w/the clock winding down they managed to get a 44-yd FG on the final play as multiple players were scrambling and not fully set incl the K. They continue to have protection issues as they have all'd 19 sks in the L/3 gms. That's not good news against a physical Iowa tm that is looking to get a B10 statement win. This line in the preseason had the Wolves nearly a DD favorite now they find themselves deservedly a td dog to what we feel is a better and more rested tm.

Arizona St by 3 over UCLA - UCLA OC Noel Mazzone was the ASU OC for 2Y under Erickson. UCLA QB Brett Hundley grew up near Tempe. LY ASU's DT Will Sutton DNP and UCLA rushed for 212 yds and got the series' 2nd str outright upset win. UCLA led 42-33 with 9:01 left but ASU got a td w/1:33 left to actually take the lead, 43-42. UCLA went 60/12pl and got a 33 yd FG on the final play for the win. LTH ASU was -8' and UCLA pulled the upset 29-28. LA is 8-4 SU/8-3-1 ATS in this series and the home team is 10-3 SU and on an 8-2 ATS run. The Devils are 4-11 ATS prior to Zona and on their 3rd road trip in 4 weeks while the Bruins are 6-3 ATS prior to USC and 7-2 ATS in Rose Bowl finales. While ASU is still a game up in the P12 South standings, the Bruins control their own destiny if they win out. Both tms come off solid wins as UCLA beat Wash 41-31 (-3) L/RI but they did benefit from 4 UW TO's and Huskie QB Price was KO'd late 1H. LB-turned-RB Jack continues to impress w/4 rushing td's. ASU also benefitted in the TO area getting 5 from OSU in their 30-17 (-14'). They led 20-0 in the 2Q but got backdoored w/2:41 left. A win here will send them to the P12 Champ gm. While series and technical edges say take the Bruins, the Devils have been the more impressive tm TY as they are +137 ypg while the Bruins are +64 ypg.

UTAH ST by 4 over Colorado St - This has been a very nice series for us as in their only 3 meetings, we won with a 4★ LPS on Utah St +13 at home in '97. In '11 we had one of our famous Big Dog outright upset winners as CSU (+10) won 35-34 in 2OT and was also a 3★ LPS. LY we used CSU again as a Big Dog Play and they covered (+12) in a 31-19 loss (UST first SU win at CSU s/78). CSU's OC Dave Baldwin was UST's OC the previous 3Y. Utah St comes in off a bye (8-2 ATS reg ssn) while CSU is playing a 7th str and on B2B road (2-11 ATS). They are 3-0 ATS as an AD TY and overall are 3-2 SU/5-0 ATS away from home TY. LW they racked up a 66-42 (-6) win at NM as RB Bibbs had another record-breaking performance w/291 yds and tied a MW record w/6 td's. They have now covered 8 of their L/10 gms and have won 4 of their L/5 as they need just 1 more win to get to bowl elig (play 13 gms). Utah St has rebounded from losing QB Keeton for the yr as they have 3 str wins. Prior to the bye they rallied for a 28-24 win (-14') at UNLV and then benefitted from some ? play-calling as UNLV had a FD inside UST's RZ. We'll gladly back a hot Rams tm getting a td here.

Use by 21 over COLORADO - USC is 3-0 SU/ATS in this series winning by an avg of 44-9 (-19 avg line). LY CU did get inside the USC20 5x but managed just 2 FG's. Matt Barkley set a school record with 6 td passes but CU had a 25-22 FD edge and USC only had a 458-351 yd edge and were not as dominant as the 50-6 (-40') final would indicate. Six CU TO's fueled the rout. Colorado is 14-3 ATS in home finales. USC is in a Stan/UCLA sandwich (9-3 ATS prior to UCLA) but clearly the mood has changed in LA as the Trojans are 2 missed FG's away from being a perfect 6-0 under interim HC Orgeron. LW we cashed a 4★ LPS as USC pulled the outright upset over #4 Stanford 20-17 (+3) getting a 47-yd FG w/1:19 left. QB Kessler has thrived w/o Kiffin calling the plays as in the L/4 wks he is avg 234 ypg (72%) w/a 5-1 ratio. The D, outside of the ASU gm, has been solid all yr and now is all'g 94 ypg less than what their opp are avg. Now they face a CU tm that has to be playing w/some confidence after grabbing their 1st P12 win under 1st-yr HC MacIntyre LW 41-24 (-2) over Cal. QB Liuafu threw for a career-high 364 yds and WR Richardson will test the Trojans secondary. No doubt, USC has the better personnel, but this could be a flat spot.

LSU by 7 over Texas A&M - LSU is 2-0 SU/ATS in their recent meetings winning their Cotton Bowl in 2010 41-24 as a 4★ LPS. LY the situation clearly favored A&M as they were off Ole Miss and LT and focused for this HG while LSU had just played Florida in The Swamp. SC at home (a game they won when feeling like an underdog) and now were playing their 3rd tough game in 3 wks and having to travel. A&M took advantage of the situation and jumped out to a 12-0 lead in the 2Q but LSU made some halftime adjustments and finished with 26-18 FD and 410-316 yd edges. Both tms come into this one off a bye (LSU 4-1 ATS in reg ssn, A&M 0-6-1 ATS reg ssn). Also noteworthy is the fact LSU has covered 6 str gms when the line has been single digits while A&M is 3-10 ATS in that situation. The Aggies have been winning w/offense all yr as they are avg 578 ypg led by Manziel who has a 26-8 ratio (72.5%) but is doing less running TY at 553. Their D, however is all'g 473 ypg and 36 ppg on the road TY. The Tigers are the best 3-loss tm in the country as they are +107 ypg. In their L/gm vs Bama they were tied at 17 before the Tide wore them down in the 2H. The inexperienced D has fared much better at home TY all'g just 284 ypg and 15 ppg. Mettenberger has a 20-7 ratio TY and on the field will be 3 of the SEC's top 4 WR's in LSU's Beckham/Landry (2100+ comb yds) and A&M's Evans (1147 yds, 22.1, 12 td). Expect a lot of pts in this one but we'll take the Tigers who have a large D edge (#23-76) to come up with one more stop.

ARKANSAS by 6 over Miss St - Little Rock. LY MSU opened the season 7-0 but then had losses to 3 top 10 teams in Bama, A&M and LSU. They were playing their home finale vs a beleaguered Ark tm and were -4' but had a 505-359 yd edge and benefitted from 5 Ark TO's. The 31 pt win (45-14) was their largest in an SEC game s/98. MSU did lead just 17-7 at the half but got td's on 4 of their first 5 poss of the 2H to make it 45-14. The Hogs come in off a bye (Bielema was 5-0 ATS at Wisc but 0-1 here) and it's their FHG (7-3 SU/8-2 ATS). Miss St meanwhile is off 3 top 15 teams in SC, A&M and Bama w/the Egg Bowl on deck 5 days away (4-6 ATS all vs Ark) and is 2-6 ATS as an AD. The Bulldogs did put forth a great effort LW but came up short vs Bama 20-7 (+24) as they caught the Tide in a flat spot off LSU. MSU benefitted from 4 Bama TO's and had a FR td in the EZ. Russell st'd at QB in the place of the inj'd Prescott (CS for both) but then he was KO'd in the 4Q and they had to go to frosh Williams who was 0-5 (2 passes dropped). It's been a tough 1st-yr for HC Bielema who has seen his Hogs lose 7 consec gms, however we like the situation here catching MSU off a solid effort w/a big rivalry gm on deck. Hogs play w/nothing to lose and snap their long losing streaks (SEC 10 str losses).

Oregon by 21 over ARIZONA - Oregon is 12-2 SU in this series winning the L/5 (OU avg 51 ppg, 502 ypg) and the Ducks are on a 2-0-1 ATS run winning the L/3 by 19, 25 and LY by 49. LY's 49-0 final was not indicative of the game as OU only had 25-19 FD and 495-332 yd edges but Ariz on 4&gl from the 4 had a bad snap on a FG, was int'd at the 12, SOD on 4&gl from the 2, had a 31 yd FG blk'd and fmb'l'd at the UO29 all in the 1H. In the 2H they were int'd at the 12, and at that point only trailed 21-0. They gave up a 54 yd IR td, were SOD on 4&1 at the UO14, gave up a 29 yd IR td and had their first shutout loss in the series since 1964. Ducks have the Civil War on deck (2-7 ATS prior, only 6 days away) while Zona is playing a 7th str wk. They do have arch rival ASU on deck (5-10-1 ATS but 4-2-1 ATS L/7). UA is 4-15 ATS in home finales and the Ducks are 11-1 ATS as an AF but UA is 14-5-1 ATS as a DD P12 dog. The Ducks rebounded off the upset loss at Stanford to beat Utah 44-21 (-28) and came away the real winners LW in the P12 as Stanford's upset loss to USC has the Ducks again atop the P12 North standings. UA, on the other hand, is reeling after getting upset by Wash ST 24-17 (-11) and now could be staring at 4 str losses to end the ssn. Ducks have new life and even w/a gimpy Mariota we think this number is fairly cheap.

TULANE by 21 Utep - Since '05, Tulane has been a dog in 8 gms but they've covered 5 of the L/6. There have been 3 outright upsets the L6Y. TU's OC Eric Price was the OC for his father at UTEP from '04-'07 but was running a different offense (NO Saints) here. LY LW we won with a 3★ LPS on TU (+16) as they only lost 24-20 covering by DD. UTEP won without a 2H point for the first time s/96 and at the end TU was SOD at their own 32 with 2:06 left. Tulane was 2-10 ATS as a HF under Toledo and TY they are 1-1 ATS as a HF (cover vs FCS). Green Wave are off a bye while UTEP is playing its 4th road game in 5 wks. After clinching bowl elig, TU has lost B2B gms but nearly pulled off their 6th outright upset in their L/gm but two 60-yd plays by UTSA proved huge in the 10-7 loss (+9). UTEP, meanwhile got their 1st CUSA win under Kugler LW 33-10 (-6) over FIU as they had a 407-200 yd edge. LY's leading rusher Jeffery got 130 yds (leading rusher Jones OFY). However, TW will be tough sledding vs a Tulane D all'g just 116 (3.0) at home TY. The added rest should help ailing TU QB Montana and look for the Green Wave to get back to their winning ways.

STANFORD by 21 over Cal - LW was strange as the game was moved to the middle of the season for the new P12 sked when it's normally played at the end. Jeff Tedford took over in '02 and promptly took control of the series as he went 6-1 SU/5-2 ATS in his first 7 games. The fact that he lost his final 3 vs Stanford, had something to do with the fact that Cal has a new HC this year. In '11 Cal vs #8 Stanford only lost 31-28 and were +17 on the road. In fact, the visitor has now covered 4 in a row (HT 5-16 ATS). LY SU was -3 on the road and finished with a 475-217 yd edge and led 21-3 (which was also the final) and had a 301-84 yd edge at the half. Cal never crossed midfield until late 4Q. The Cardinal are off two huge gms against Oreg and a road trip to USC w/ND on deck. While an archival could never be considered a true flat spot, this clearly is SU's only gm in last month where they aren't playing a top level team. LW we cashed a 4★ going against the Cardinal 9-3' as the Trojans got the outright upset win 20-17. While the Cardinal have arguably played the best 6Q of any tm TY (1st 3 vs ASU/Oreg), in nearly every other gm they have been rather average. Cal is playing their 9th str gm but this is their final game of the year and Dykes first crack at their rival. While it's been a season to forget for the Bears (1-10 SU/2-9 ATS), we think they can keep it interesting for awhile here as the Cardinal could be a little disinterested after seeing their P12 and Rose Bowl hopes go up in smoke in the Coliseum last Saturday night.



UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

Over 32 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 214-161. The last 14 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous **OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS (50!)** to the **incredible record INCLUDING 4 TY including 3 straight outright winners!!!!!!** Here is TW's Underdog Play:

WAKE FOREST +5 over DUKE

WF was 12-0 SU vs Duke. After losing by 24 ppg from '03-'06, Duke had lost 5 gms by 5, 3, 9, 6 and 1 pt. They finally broke through LY w/a 34-27 win (+2). WF is 8-1 ATS off a bye while Duke finishes up on B2B road. Shockingly the path to an ACC champ leads through Durham and no, we're not talking Coach K and the basketball tm here. HC Cutcliffe continues to work his magic after LW's 48-30 win (+3) over Miami. The Blue Devils were down 30-28 in the 3Q but scored the gm's final 20 pts as they tallied a shocking 358 rush yds. While QB Boone moved to 8-0 as a str, bkp Connette accounted for 5 td's. Every wk is uncharted territory for the Blue Devils and this is the 1st time s/'99 that they are a conf AF and in that '99 gm they lost 38-0 to UNC (-3). The Demon Deacons are also no strangers to pulling off home outright upsets TY as they beat NCSt and MD in B2B wks. WF is playing with legitimate revenge, coming off a bye and catches Duke off one of their biggest wins in schl history. The Demon Deacons get our call as our Underdog POW as they also have a better D (#40-74).

FORECAST: WAKE FOREST by 1 over Duke

NORTH TEXAS by 14 over Utsa - First meeting. These two in-state opp's are 304 miles apart. Important for recruiting. North Texas is 7-1 ATS as a HF under McCarney with the ATS L a 34-7 win tx Southern (-40). NT comes in off a bye (4-2 ATS) while Utsa is also off a bye. Both tms have exceeded our expectations TY as Utsa looked like they were heading for a 2-win ssn at best but have managed 5 in their 1st yr of CUSA. They have won 3 str gms but were fortunate to come away w/a win in their L/gm 10-7 over Tulane (-9) as 2 big plays went their way. NT, meanwhile is firmly in command of the CUSA West and have won/covered 5 str gms. We've been writing about Apogee Stadium for a couple yrs now and TY the Mean Green are outscoring their opp 35-13 (+125 ypg). They have also been winning the LOS in CUSA as they are avg a 200-83 rush yd adv. Two overachieving tms but Utsa, very much like what happened in their road trip to Marshall earlier TY (lost 34-10, +14) are outclassed here.

NOTRE DAME by 1 over BYU - The HT is a perfect 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS. LY ND had a 389-243 yd edge with RB's Riddick rushing for 143 and Wood for 114. QB Golsbon DNP with Rees hitting 7-16-117. BYU got a 567/pt drive in the 2Q, the first offensive td the Irish had all'd in 17Q's. After an int, BYU drove 30 yds for a td and a 14-7 lead. ND missed 28 and 40 yd FG's in the 1H and despite a 201-128 yd edge, trailed 14-7. BYU had a wide open WR Hoffman in the 4Q down 3 but the pass sailed inc. BYU punted with 6:10 left and the Irish got 3 FD's punting with :22 left. BYU was int at their own 39 with :02 left. ND in its FHG is 10-3 SU going 2-1 ATS under Kelly. Irish are off a bye (3-1 ATS reg ssn). BYU traveled to Wisc 2 weeks ago and were outmuscled by the physical Badgers but it won't happen here as the Irish have relied on the pass TY (50-50 mix, LY 57-43 run). The Cougars crushed Idaho ST LW 59-13 (-45) as they have won 6 of their L/7 gms and already have wins over quality tms in Texas, GT and Houston. The Irish also have quality wins over MSU, Ariz St and USC but are off 2 of their worst performances of the ssn as they were nearly upset by Navy then lost to Pitt ending any hopes of a return to a BCS Bowl. On paper, BYU has been the more impressive tm outscoring their foes by 13 ppg (+126 ypg) while ND is only outscoring their foes by 4 ppg (+36 ypg) and the Cougars have played the tougher sked (#22-29)! However, tough to take BYU outright here as the Irish tend to play better when the country turns their backs on the them (see ASU earlier TY).

Baylor by 4 over OKLAHOMA ST - OSU is 14-2 SU/11-3-2 ATS in this series so they are playing with legit revenge (won 66-24 after other series loss) and the HT is 7-2 SU/ATS. OSU has won their last 7 HG's vs BU by an avg of 26 ppg. LY Baylor had a 615-560 yd edge and did lead 41-27 after a 75-34 td run by Seastrunk with 5:11 left. OSU got a td with 1:16 left but BU rec'd the inside kick in their 41-34 home win (+44). The Cowboys are off the Big showdown vs UT but do have a bye on deck. LW we had our 5★ GOY on Texas (+3) as a rare HD but the Pokes had 2 big plays go their way right before the end of the 1H in their 38-13 win. Play #1 was a sure-fire interception that went through a UT players hands and into the hands of the OSU WR for a td. Then play #2 was a 43-yr IR td w/18 left and a 14-10 gm turned into a 28-10 margin. UT also had 25-21 FD and 389-380 yd edges. Still give credit to OSU who has now won/covered 5 str gms and have positioned themselves w/a chance to win the B12. BU was in a flat spot LW off their big win over OU and were less than 100%. After falling behind 20-7, they outscored the Red Raiders 56-14 the rest of the way as they remarkably got another cover 63-34 (-27), giving them a 14-1 ATS run. It was their 13th consec win and they got it despite playing w/o their top 2 rushers (CS) and their leading rec (OFY). Petty clearly deserves Heisman mention w/a 24-1 ratio and a ridiculous 12.8 ypa (he also has 10 rushing td's!). BU is in uncharted waters here (now #3 in polls) laying nearly DD's to a top 10 caliber OSU tm on the road and keep in mind, the Bears struggled at KSt earlier TY (35-25, -17). We firmly believe the Pokes will take this gm down to the wire.

Middle Tennessee by 20 over SOUTHERN MISS - Only meeting was the '09 New Orleans Bowl (SM lost 42-32, -3). SM had won 7 straight home finales prior to LY (9-2 ATS run). MT is off a bye (5-0 ATS run reg ssn). Just when we thought it couldn't get any worse for the Golden Eagles, LW they were drilled 41-7 (+17) by a FRU td that was an AF for only the 2nd time in 36 AG's. They were held to under 200 yds for the 1st time TY and have now lost 22 str gms and amazingly failed to cover 7 str gms (4-18 ATS during losing streak). MT's ssn turned around on their td pass on the L/play vs Marsh as they have 3 str wins and a yr after sitting home for the holidays at 8-4 in the SBC, are now climbing the CUSA bowl pecking order and only have UTEP on deck. SM lines are starting to get inflated due to their non-cover streak and while we'll call for the final a little under the opening number, by no means are we backing them here as they move to 0-11.

ARKANSAS ST by 24 over Georgia St - First meeting. ASU has won 5 of 6 home finales incl a shutout LY with their last loss in OT in 2010. ASU is 5-3 ATS as a conf DD fav. The hits keep coming for Panthers as in the L/8 wks incl the bye they have played #1 Bama and the top 6 tms in the SBC and are st'g to become a little depth shy. To their credit they have covered 7 of their L/8 gms incl LW in a 35-21 loss (+21) to ULL. The gm was actually tied in the 3Q at 21 before UL put the clamps down. Speaking of controlling the 2H, Arkansas ST found themselves tied at 21 vs TXSt LW at HT but outscored the Bobcats 17-0 in the 2H in their 38-21 win (-7) delivering a 3★ LPS winner. They did put 328 rush yds and that's not good news for a GST tm all'g 229 rush (5.2). While the Panthers have been competitive at home, they are getting outscored 37-9 (-238 ypg) on the road and Ark St is now 13 SU/12-1 ATS w/10 str covers the L3Y down the stretch (L/5 reg ssn gms).

OREGON ST by 3 over Washington - OSU is 7-2 SU/8-1 ATS in this series and after the visitor had won 4 in a row SU/ATS, the home team is now on a 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS run. There have been outright upsets the L2Y by the home dog. LY OSU was -3 on the road and had a 427-293 yd edge but Sean Mannion in his first game back in inj, looked rusty hitting 18-34-221 and had 4 int. UW did have a 170-115 yd edge at the half. After Mannion's 4th int set up UW for a 1 yd td run with 8:19 left and a 17-10 lead, Vaz came off the bench for the Beavers and led them 76/9pl for a td. UW got a 30 yd FG with 1:20 left and OSU was SOD on 4&19 at the UW48. OSU has gone 15-5 ATS the gm prior to in-state rival Oregon and they are 10-4 ATS their L/15 home finales (1 NL). UW is on their 2nd str road game and has the Apple Cup on deck. LW both tms dropped key P12 gms as they Huskies fell to UCLA 41-31 (+3) but more important is the health of QB Price who left the gm w/a shld'r inj (CS). OSU, meanwhile fell behind ASU 20-0 early before getting a td w/2:41 left for the backdoor cover (+14). After st'g the ssn off w/a 30-3 ratio, Mannion has struggled in B2B gms w/a 3-7 ratio and they have now lost 3 str gms. As of presstime there is no line due to Price's status, so we'll call for the HT by 3 and see where Vegas tells us to lean.

Utah by 3 over SOUTH ALABAMA - ULM was -22 LY at home. USA had 72 and 86 yd drives for td's to lead 14-7 with a blk'd punt before the half setting up ULM for a td with :06 left and the lead. ULM went on to a non-covering 38-24 win. ULM was 4-1 ATS as an AF under Berry but are 1-3 ATS in that role TY. They are off a bye after a shocking 42-14 home loss (-3) to Ark St in Browning's final HG. USA is off a trip to Navy where 2 wks to prep for the option did them no good as they lost 42-14 (+5). The 28 pt margin of defeat was a bit surprising as in the Jaguars prev 5 losses on the ssn they were outscored by a combined 12 pts! While ULM does have their archrival on deck, they need this if they have any bowl aspirations and they have played some of their best FB on the road TY upsetting WF, Texas St and Troy. Look for them to make it 4 for 4 vs a USA tm that has failed to cover their L/3 gms all by increasing margins.

Smu by 11 over USF - First meeting. LW the Ponies were our near 5★ GOY LPS and they beat Conn 38-21 (-14'). They are now avg 42 ppg in AAC play and are +85 ypg. They are sitting at 4-5 on the ssn and w/Houston and UCF on deck, this gm is a must win if they want to make a 5th str bowl. LW USF came in off a bye and after frosh QB White had a great performance vs Houston in his 1st start (26-41-311-2-1), he looked more like a true frosh LW going 18-33-198-1-4 incl throwing the game-clinching pick 6 in a 23-10 (+1) loss to Memphis. As explosive as the Ponies have been, the Bulls have been the opposite avg just 14 ppg and are -87 ypg in AAC play. 1st time SMU is an AF in AAC play but they have covered on the road in their prev 2 conf AG's incl cashing us as an Underdog POW vs Cincy 2 wks ago.

FRESNO ST by 27 over New Mexico - The visitor is 4-2 SU/5-1 ATS and Fresno is 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS. Prior to LY they last met in '98. LY FSU was -15 on the road and won 49-32 with a 600-394 yd edge but NM actually led 24-7 with 3:21 left in the 1H. The lost their top 2 QB's Holbrook and Gautsche during the game with injuries. NM had a 295-247 yd edge at the half. FSU got ahead of the spread with 10:57 left and got a td with 6:06 left and NM went 75/11pl for a td with :47 left for the final. Have to feel DeRuyter is upset with LY's NM game (349 yds, 6.8). He spent 10 y as a serv acad D cch the last being in '07-'09 as AF's DC and now he has a bye week to prep. LY Fresno had a late bye prior to option AF and won 48-15 (-16'). TY they also prepped for option vs Cal Poly and were leading 41-3 before the bkps all'd a lot of gbg yds. The Bulldogs still have a BCS bid in their sights at 9-0. The lines in their gms were inflated due to high preseason praise and the fact they were 11-2 ATS LY. After st'g 1-6-1 ATS, in their L/gm the line was finally reasonable at 8.5 at WY and they proceeded to destroy the Pokes 48-10. They have been living on the edge in many gms TY, but are still outscoring their opp by 17 ppg (+130 ypg). QB Carr has an outstanding 32-4 ratio and must be licking his chops here vs a NM D that is all'g 528 ypg in MW play and 67% completions. LW they were run over by CST 66-42 (+6) as they all'd 649 yds. Look for DeRuyter and Co to utilize the bye and cruise to their 10th str win.

FLORIDA ATLANTIC by 14 over New Mexico St - LTH ('04) was the only prior meeting, NMSt won 35-7 (+7). Aggies led 28-0 into the 4Q finishing w/a 413-277 yd edge. Only 3rd non-conf home game in 4Y for FAU. NMSt is 1-4 ATS after a bye. FAU does have rival FIU on deck (2-6 ATS prior) and as good as they are on the road, they are a miserable 1-11 ATS as a HF. Now they face a NMSt tm that has to be playing w/ some confidence. In their L/3 gms they: broke their 18-gm overall losing streak (vs Abilene Christian), led the SBC's best tm 28-7 before falling 49-35 (+31') and then played w/an ACC bowl tm in BC before losing 48-34 (+24). On the opposite side, the Owls have responded to interim HC Brian Wright as they are off B2B wins and have to be thinking bowl now at 4-6 as they will be heavily favored in their L/2 gms. LW they were a very rare AF (only 2nd time in 36 gms) but managed to beat SM 41-7 (-17) piling up a 368-189 yd edge. While we think the Owls come away with a win here, they are in uncharted territory s/the Schnelbenberger glory days ('07-'08) laying nearly 3 td's to a tm that boasts a high-powered offense.

LOUISIANA TECH by 1 over Tulsa - These 2 were also prev WAC members and the home tm went 4-1 (L/ meeting '04). LY was 4-2 SU/3-3 ATS in series. Tulsa does have a couple of extra days to prep off a Thurs Night gm. In their 45-34 loss (+13) to Marshall they fell behind 21-0 early and w/MU driving to go up 28-0, a key TO started their comeback as they actually led 34-31 at one pt. They were outgained by 274 yds and benefitted from 5 MU TO's. After winning 3 of 4 gms vs the bottom of CUSA, the Bulldogs were dealt a harsh reality LW at Rice getting beat 52-14 (+14'). They still are 4-6 and could win out to get to a bowl while all hope is lost for the Golden Hurricane This is LT's FHG and it's tough to lay pts on the road w/a Tulsa tm that is 2-8 ATS TY. You also have to wonder where their motivation is after blowing a 4Q lead LW.

KANSAS ST by 4 over Oklahoma - Bob Stoops is now 8-2 over Bill Snyder. OU travelled here in '11 and the Sooners were off a loss and despite being #1 and KSI #10 in the AP poll, OU thrashed KSI 58-17. It was close at the half but OU destroyed them in the 2H and finished with a 690-240 yd edge. LY OU was #6 and at home. KS had 5 punts downed I20 and there were 2 key TO's. OU went on an 80 yd drive and settled for a 28 yd FG, 3-0 but was sk'd and fmb'd and KS fell on it for a td in the 2Q. On the next drive, OU had a 2nd & gl from the 1 but fmb'd and KS rec'd. The TO's gave KS a td and took 1 away from OU. The last time OU dropped 2 str in this series was 1996 & '97. LW KSt clinched bowl elig getting a 41-yd FG w/'03 left to beat TCU 33-31 (-11'). It was their 4th str win but it did end their 5-gm cover streak. Only a HOF cch like Snyder can get a 2-man QB system to work so well as Waters had 234 passing and Sams had 109 yds rushing. OU found themselves down 10-3 to ISt late 2Q before a 91-yd td prior to the half gave them momentum. They scored the gm's final 45 pts as Stoops matched Barry Switzer for the most all-time wins at OU. QB Knight did replace inj'd Bell (CS) in the 2Q and ran for 123 yds (12.3) spearheading an OU rush attack that went for 405 (9.2). They are unlikely to find the same running lanes this week, however as KSI is all'g just 122 (3.6) in B12 play.

Missouri by 3 over MISSISSIPPI - First SEC meeting. 4th str HG for Ole Miss who are off 4 str confidence boosting wins but does have the Egg Bowl (8-3 ATS all vs LSU) in the 05 days. MU comes in off a bye (5-5 ATS in reg ssn) and they need to win both of their final 2 gms to grab a spot in the SEC champ gm. Outside of the QB in the SC gm, the Tigers have been a legit top 10 tm TY outscoring their opp by 21 ppg (+106 ypg). QB Franklin will be back here after missing the L/4 gms w/inj but Mauk will get some snaps after impressing (10-2 ratio). The Rebs are actually +124 ypg TY and LW got a dominating 51-21 (-28) win over Troy outgaining them 751-313. They are avg 562 ypg at home and have a shot at moving up the SEC bowl pecking order w/a win here. Both tms are red-hot but we'll take the Tigers for now as they are a perfect 4-0 ATS on the road TY and have slight talent edges on offense, defense and ST's.

WASH ST by 1 over Utah - Surprisingly the home team had been 0-3 SU (-1-2 ATS) in this series. Utah won here 30-27 in '11 (-3'). LY Utah was -12 at home. WSU crossed midfield 3x in the 1H missing a 49 yd FG and were SOD 2x. It was so dominant in the 2H that WSU had to drive 75/12pl getting a 5 yd td pass on the last play to have them avoid the shutout. 49-6. The Cougars have covered their L/2 home finales and are 5-2 ATS in them when not involving LW. Utah is on B2B away and could playing w/o QB Wilson (CS) for a 2nd str wk as Schulz was just 13-30-181-1-1 in the 44-21 (+28) loss at Oregon LW. On the other side, Wazzu pulled a shocker upsetting Zona 24-17 (+11) as their D, which was all'g 604 ypg in their prev 5 gms only all'd 395 and the run gm on offense "exploded" for 101 yds (3.7). Now they are just 1 win away from clinching bowl elig for the 1st time in a decade and you have to feel Martin Stadium will have an electric atmosphere. How will they handle the added pressure is the major question and we'll call for the home tm by a pt for now and check the Utes injury report later in the wk.

Boise St by 3 over SAN DIEGO ST - BS is playing with legitimate revenge here as in the L11Y they've lost a grand total of 5 conf games. LY they gave up a 100 yd KR td on the opening play and at the half had a 176-96 yd edge and led 13-7. They had 5 susp'd players incl their LS and SDSt blk'd a punt to set up a 3 yd td drive for a 14-13 lead. BS failed on a couple of 2 pt conv (one on bad snap) and SDSt was able to run the final 5:35 winning 21-19. SDSt is off a B2B road games incl a trip to Hawaii last week. The Broncos are looking at a division title while the Aztecs have clearly rebounded from their 0-3 start, winning 6 of their L/7 gms (only loss in OT to Fresno). LW they escaped w/a 28-21 win (-5) in OT as they continue to ride RB Muema who has 4 st 100-yd gms. The Broncos have one of the biggest home/away disparities in the country as they are outscoring their opp by 36 ppg (+216 ypg) at home but are actually getting outscored by 6 ppg (-73 ypg) on the road this yr. Take the home dog Aztecs here as this one goes down to the wire.

3★ ST LOUIS by 8 over Chicago - The Rams went into IND prior to their bye with a 3 game losing streak and benefitted with +4 TO's in a misleading 38-8 final. That does however give them confidence which is why teams off a bye that won SU as a dog of 7 or more prior are 7-0-1 ATS. Kellen Clemens has been a more than adequate replacement for the inj'd Bradford as most QB's would struggle in their first 2 starts against the #3 D of SEA and #9 of TEN but the team is actually +51 ypg compared to -93 ypg prior. The St Louis D has really stepped it up all'd 283 ypg its last 4 games while on the season earning an incredible 14.3% sacks at home led by the NFL's top sack duo of Robert Quinn (12 sks) and Chris Long (6.5). CHI also has their #2 under C as Josh McCown led the Bears to win at GB but that was when GB QB Rodgers took all the #1 snaps and was inj'd after one drive. LW Chicago came from behind after the lengthy weather delay vs Baltimore and allowed over 100 yds rushing for a 5th straight game (165 ypg, 5.1). That bodes well for Zac Stacy who has stepped into the featured role rushing for 131 ypg and 4.9 ypc the L/2 at home vs the pair of top 10 D's mentioned above.

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Arizona by 6 over Indianapolis - Bruce Arians now faces the team which he led to an 8-3 record as an interim HC last year. As the Colts OC no one better can help devise a defense to slow Luck who on the road is completing 55% with a 16-15 ratio in his short career. The Cardinals have 5 wins their last 7 games with the losses at SF and home to SEA but they've beaten the teams they should as they are 5-0 SU and 4-0-1 ATS with the line between +3 & -3. The D've had home benefits from the two CB's that can cover man-to-man allowing them to apply pressure (8.7% sks) while still keeping the rush D stout (76 ypg, 3.6). The Colts travel for a 2nd straight week but have extra rest of a TEN win which basically clinched the AFC South. IND has played 3 road games TY with the line between the 3's and while they went 2-1 they've been outgained by 83 ypg. The Card's are now believing in themselves and LW learned a lesson about looking past an opponent as they allowed the Jaguars TD's on their first 2 drives but held them to 9 FD's the rest of the way. The home crowd at Cardinals games is again becoming a factor.

OTHER GAMES

New Orleans at Atlanta (Thursday) - The NFL Network surely thought they had a premier game at the beginning of the season. While the Saints have a 5 game lead over Atlanta they are up by just one game over Carolina. Rarely do you travel to a division foe who was the #1 seed in the playoffs LY and it's not the game you have circled being off Dallas on Sunday Night, hosting SF and a Monday night game in Seattle on deck. On the flip side can the Falcons be competitive as they are 1-7 SU & ATS their last 8 games with the less than impressive 31-23 lone win at home coming vs the now 1-8 Bucs who beat them LW? Grab this Thursday Marquee after noon Thurs on your NC Debit VIP account for just \$12.

DETROIT by 17 over Tampa Bay - This is the Lions first role as a DD fav since Dec '11 and prior to a Thursday game they are 7-15 ATS incl SEA vs TEN earlier TY. TB may have the #18 pass def but prior to facing a depleted ATL team LW they allowed 297 ypg (66%) w/a 7-2 ratio with just 5 sks in 103 pass att's. After 5 sks vs a beat up MIA/ATL OLs at home they now have to travel to Ford Field where the Lions outgained foes by 119 ypg (3rd TY) while scoring 32 ppg. TB may have avg'd 177 ypg (4.7) rushing the L3W but SEA was in look ahead, MIA was distracted and ATL doesn't have the players to run the defense right now. TB is actually down to their 4th and 5th string RB's and now face a Lions team allowing 49 ypg rush (2.2) the L4W. After facing Romo, Cutler and Roethlisberger the L3W this is a step down for DET vs Glennon who is short receivers outside of Vincent Jackson (20 rec 14.1 L4W). Look for DET to take advantage of the Bucs to keep momentum going for a game that could put them in control of the NFC North.

HOUSTON by 6 over Jacksonville - Let's start this write-up as we have every other Texans game saying Houston has dominant stat edges here with the #8 and #2 units vs JAX's #32 and #29. LW's line climbed to Houston -10 as OAK was starting rookie UFA Matt McGloin whose entire body of exp was vs the NYG in relief (7-15) and all he did vs the leagues then #1 D in yards was take home a 28-23 win. Chad Henne was again asked to do too much in LW's loss to ARZ as the run game totaled 32 yds and 2.0 ypc but he's probably thrilled to make this trip as HOU has already allowed ssn highs in points scored vs OAK, ARZ and STL all in the last 5 games. LW's vs Oakland's #22 pass D Keenum was 12-of-25 and was then replaced by Schaub who finished going 13-of-24 (comb 51%). With HOU posting 8 straight losses and going 1-6-1 ATS it's the Jag's who seem red hot splitting their L/2 games SU and covering B2B games on the road.

Minnesota at Green Bay - The Packers are 6-1 ATS hosting the Vikings. They could be fielding Tolzien again who had 339 yds (71%) but 3 ints vs the Giants LW. At first glance GB has the situational edge at home for the 3rd time in 4 games but road teams off the long trip to SEA are 12-5 ATS since 2003. GB's #21 pass defense is woeful TY with 7.8 ypg allowed with an 18-4 ratio. GB's 4 ints have come at the expense of Griffin in his 2nd game TY, the inconsistent Dalton, the just outright bad Weeden and an erratic Eli Manning. There is a chance that Rodgers could return here to knock off the rust prior to the big DET game on Thursday. MIN is likely to be making their own QB change as Ponder was benched after 2 ints gave SEA 14 pts for Cassel. There is simply too many unknowns at the most important positions in the game (along with some GB secondary injuries) to make a call right now.

KANSAS CITY by 3 over San Diego - SD has made a good living vs the Chiefs winning 9 of the L11 SU, covering both matchups LY scoring 37 and 31 pts. Therefore it's not a surprise that this is the 1st time KC has been favored in this series S1/05. Both teams are in tough spots as this is the 3rd road game in 4 weeks for SD after having flown to MIA where they are off another close loss that they had a realistic chance of winning at the end. The Chiefs are off perhaps a season making win vs DEN or perhaps off a confidence rattling loss and either way they are still only 2-9 ATS as a HF and have the DEN rematch on deck. Without the KC results lets compare both teams coming into LW and over the previous month the overrated Chiefs are -66 ypg vs the #29 schedule while SD was -8 ypg vs the #21 schedule. It's clearly time to play against a KC D that was ranked in the top 10 prior to the Broncos with their last 6 foes having team QBR's of #29, #23, #17, #28, #16 & #31 before DEN's #1 ranking and SD's #3 ranking here. If KC is off a loss they are the 4th team since 2009 to go 8-0 or better teams went 1-3 ATS after their first SU loss incl 0-2 ATS failing to cover by 24 ppg when the disappointing loss was at home.

Carolina by 7 over MIAMI - This may very well be a letdown spot for CAR after rolling ATL, getting a signature win vs SF on the road and hosting NE on MNF. Still, they are 9-3 ATS on the road and have a huge matchup advantage with their defensive front 7 vs MIA minus their LT/LG and their swing OT as well. The Panthers had the #22 offense prior to NE but in 6 of the 7 previous games that they outgained foes it was by 107 ypg. CAR had only allowed two games over 100 yds rushing TY holding foes to just 69 ypg (3.5) in the rest and are 11th in sacks TY (1 every 10.5 att) which is bad news for MIA who is 32nd in sacks allowed (1 every 8.9 att). The Dolphins have battled especially at home and showed heart off a disappointing MNF loss and BWL's win moves then back to .500. They also have a 3-2 record at home and even in their 2 losses here to BAL and BUF they were by a combined 5 points. The Panthers are 2-4 ATS as an AF the L2Y and have been upset in all 4 losses. They did win and cover their last effort in that role here in Florida beating TB (-3, 31-13) but that could have very well been aided by being on Nat'l TV.

CLEVELAND by 3 over Pittsburgh - It's been 10 years since CLE was favored over PIT and the Browns and while CLE was an early 2' pt fav the line may tighten after the Browns loss to CIN and the Steelers win vs DET. This is where the Steelers role as a public team clashes with the talent on the field as they are just 6-15 ATS on the road. Yes the Steelers have the #14 defense but they have only logged takeaways in 5 games TY while the Browns D is #5. PIT may have better the QB but CLE has better WR, much better OL, healthier defense and DC Horton who used to be PIT's LB coach before going to ARZ. The Browns had played the tougher schedule (#13 vs #25) are outgaining foes by 12 ypg compared to Pittsburgh's +3 which is a disappointment considering the QB edge they have. Vs the 4 common foes the Steelers are -28 ypg with only one road game while the Browns are +16 ypg with 2 on the road. We'll call for the home team by a FG and don't expect as big a PIT crowd here as usual.

BALTIMORE by 7 over NY Jets - The Jets offense seemingly got a boost with the return of Santonio Holmes while the defense seemingly got a boost with Ed Reed who is essentially the #3 safety. This all added up to getting outgained 313-267 in a loss vs BUF. Geno Smith is still the QB (for now) as Matt Simms made another appearance in relief of a 8-of-23 with an 0-3 ratio performance. Now the Jets and their 289 ypg and 15 Fd/gm offense travels for a second straight week vs a fired up Ravens squad which led 10-0 LW before a 2 hr delay and an OT loss. Both teams have the same basic defenses but Flacco is at home, Smith (ribs) isn't 100% and the Ravens defense should get Ngata back for this. We'll side with the home team that is 15-6 ATS as a non-div HF with a vastly more proven QB here in a physical matchup vs a rookie QB on the road with a team that is 2-8 ATS as a NDIV AD.

Tennessee by 1 over OAKLAND - Despite being -88 ypg on the road so far the Titans have covered all four games including outright wins at PIT and STL. The Titans are clearly frustrated with their 1-5 record the last 6 games as they are only getting outgained by 14 ypg but are -6 in TO's. They how travel to face OAK and Matt McGloin making his first home start after an incredible game at HOU (197 yds 56% 3 tds) leading them to 341 yds vs the NFL's #2 D statistically. The Raiders D hasn't gotten the credit they deserve as they've allowed over 24 points just twice and that was DEN's #1 offense and PHI's #4. If ever a game was ever to be decided by one stat this may be the one. The Titan's are 4-1 SU and 4-0-1 ATS when rushing over 28 times in a game (135 ypg) and 1-4 ATS when not. OAK meanwhile is 4-0 SU/ATS when allowing under 100 ypg rushing and 0-6 SU (2-4 ATS) when allowing over. We'll call for the road team by 1 and wait and see what the line will be during the week.

Dallas at NY Giants - DAL (-3) won a wild shootout vs the Giants 36-31 in their season opener on SNF thanks to 6 takeaways which they converted into 24 pts. The Giants were still able to move the ball with a 478-331 yd edge and the Cowboys are expected to be without defensive MVP Sean Lee (hamstring). While DAL gives up yards in chunks (482 ypg the L7) they are also lead the NFC with 22 takeaways and are 7-0 ATS on the road off a bye. The Cowboy's have been no-shows on the road TY getting outgained by 176 ypg but this is one of Romo's favorite trip as in his last 4 games here vs the blue helmets he has throw for 309 ypg, 75%!! and a 12-3 ratio. The Giants clearly thought the season didn't start until Oct 15th as they were 0-6, lost their first 5 ATS, were outFd 147-111 and were -16 TO's. Since then they are 4-0 SU, have held those 4 teams to 254 ypg and are +5 TO's. The point that must be brought up is that in this win streak the Giants faced a quartet of QB's incl Josh Freeman in his first start for a new team, Matt Barkley who replaced an inj'd Vick in the 2Q, Terrelle Pryor and Scott Tolzien playing his 2nd game ever and first start. While the Giants are 3-9 ATS as a division host there is clearly something brewing after 4 straight wins and we'll pass on this one for now until we gather more information with both teams now chasing the Eagles for the NFC East lead.
