4★ Louisville over KENTUCKY - In the L/17 matchups, the tm w/the most rushing yds has taken the Governor's Cup. Louisville has won 5 of 7 trips to Lexington. LTH true frosh QB Bridgewater replaced an inj'd Stein in the 2Q and threw a pair of td's leading Louisville (+5) to a 24-17 win and has started ever since. There have been 7 outright upsets the L16Y overall, LY UL jumped out to a 32-7 lead and up 32-14 sat Bridgewater the rest of the game as it almost seemed UL HC Strong was trying to save his friend's (former UK Phillips) job. After a disappointing opener, the Cats got a feel-good 41-7 (-17) win over Miami, OH LW as they outgained the RedHawks 675-122. QB Smith in his 1st start s/last Sept, was 15 of 23 for 310 yds w/a 3-0 ratio. The top 10 Cards got their 2nd straight blowout win as they beat overmatched EKU 44-7 (-40'). Heisman cand QB Bridgewater is already avg 376 ypg (77%) w/a 9-1 ratio and the 1st string D hasn't all'd a score in the 1H of their 2 gms. The visitor is now 4-1 ATS but UL is the far superior tm and Strong will want to prove who the top team is in the state for the recruits. UL has very few chances to make a nat'l statement this year and we feel they do so here vs an SEC foe. FORECAST: Louisville by 21 over KENTUCKY 3★ AUBURN over Miss St - In '11 despite Auburn being 1-0 and the defending National Champ and having been favored 10 str yrs in this series, MSU was -6 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. We used Aub as a 3★ LPS and they pulled the outright "upset", 41-34. LY Mullen came in 3-12 vs the SEC West with all the wins vs Ole Miss. MSU was -3 at home and dominated more than the final would indicate completely controlling the LOS. Aub got a 100 yd KR td and actually led 10-7 despite being outgained 157-65. MSU had a 388-216 yd edge. Home team has won 3 of 4 while Auburn's won 4 of 5 and 10 of 12. The Tigers are off to a 2-0 start under new HC Malzahn and LW easily cashed a 4★ Key Selection for us in a 38-9 (-10") win over his former schl Ark St. The Red Wolves did move the ball w/422 yds but Aub owned the LOS w/a 301-150 rush yd edge. MSU, playing w/o QB Russell (CS), beat Alcorn St 51-7 (-41'). Bkp QB Prescott was 12-19-174-2-0 and the Bulldogs led 37-0 at HT w/a 308-30 yd edge before cruising in the 2H. Even though it's early in the ssn, this game has huge bowl implications and it's tough to go against the Tigers here as Mullen is 0-5 ATS as an AD L2Y.

FORECAST: AUBURN by 13 over Miss St 3★ Alabama over TEXAS A&M - LY A&M (+13') jumped out to a 20-0 lead and Manziel hit 21-34-309 while rushing for 92. McCarron was int'd twice stopping a streak of 291 passes w/o an int. A&M led 29-17 in the 4Q and Bama got a td with 6:09 left then got a 54 yd pass to the 6 but on 4&gl from the 2, was int'd in the EZ with 1:36 left. A&M's WR Swoop, in a much televised statement when they got off the plane said they "had kicked Alabama's ass". Bama has now won 21 SEC openers in a row SU with their last loss coming in '91. LY the situation favored A&M as Bama was coming off their annual huge game vs LSU, one where they needed a last second td to pull out the win in an emotional effort. TY the Tide are off a bye and a "so-so" performance vs VT as despite covering in a 35-10 win (-21), they were outgained 212-206 and their OL took a lot of flak in the media. Remember LY early in the ssn, the Bama OL gave up 6 sks vs WKU and responded by becoming the most dominant OL in the last 10-15 yrs in CFB. 2★ KANSAS ST over UMass - UMass is 0-2 vs Kansas St losing 38-7 in '03 but only 21-17 (+18) in '09. The Minutemen trailed 18-3 at HT but got an 18/4pl td and a blk'd P td in 1:28. UM punted w/5:41 and KSt ran out the clock. It was Snyder's 1st gm back from "retirement". LW we cashed our Top Weekly LPS on the Wildcats in their 48-27 (-11') win over ULL. Snyder said that his team had their best practice sessions of the entire year and it showed as after losing to FCS NDSt in the opener, the Wildcats jumped out to a 34-3 3Q lead while avoiding their first 0-2 start s/89. QB Waters threw for 278 yds (71%) while bkp Sams also saw PT (63 rush yd and a td). The Minutemen meanwhile are off a crushing loss to FCS Maine as they were dominated in a 24-14 (+3') defeat getting outFD'd 21-14 and outgained 514-265. KSt does have a big gm vs TX on deck but was 6-1 ATS as a HF LY and should FORECAST: KANSAS ST by 45 over UMass be able to name the score here. 2★ Western Michigan (+) over NORTHWESTERN - First mtg. WM has played 9 B10 road gms the L4Y and while they've dropped them all, 3 were by a total of 11 pts (3-6 ATS). LY vs III and Minn they were only outgained by 3 ypg and had a comb 34-32 FD edge. TY they also only lost 26-13 (+28) to MSU in the opener. LW, however they had a shocking 27-23 loss (-28') to FCS Nicholls St. After falling behind 14-0 early, WM rallied to take a 23-21 lead but QB Van Tubbergen threw a int in the EZ in the final min. The Broncos did have a 30-18 FD edge. NW is off a 48-27 (-16') win over Syr as they raced out to a 34-7 HT lead. The Cats did rack up 581 yds but were outFD'd 29-27. Frogs have the D edge (#24-47) which could prove to be the diff but TCÚ is just 1-4 ATS as an ĂF.

Since joining the MW, they are just 3-10 ATS on the blue turf as a HF (did cover LW vs UT Martin 63-14, -35) but TY the MW is all'g them to wear their blue jerseys again. The Falcons are off a 52-20 (+9') beatdown at the hands of Utah St. Boise does have the huge MW gm at Fresno on deck and while they have the huge talent edges (off #56-101, D #61-101) you have to wonder if Petersen and Co. put more emphasis on defending the option this time around? EM comes in 1-1 (0-2 ATS) after we cashed a 3★ LPS against them in a 45-7 loss (+24) to Penn St. EM did lead 7-0 early thanks to a FR td but were dominated afterwards as they were outgained 574-183. Rutgers is off their annual win over an FCS opp as they blanked Norfolk St 38-0 (-40') giving them an incredible 7 shutouts in their L/8 gms vs FCS tms. RB James became the 1st RU player to rush for 3 td's in a gm s/'09. It is the 3rd str yr where EM has faced BCS tms in B2B road gms (2-0 ATS in 2nd gm). Rutgers can name the score but will the number be too

high for our liking as the Knights have a huge HG vs Ark on deck? Stanford by 21 over ARMY - Army is 5-5 SU vs Stanford incl 2 str wins but L/gm was in '79 (17-13).

Army has not beaten a ranked foe since 1972 (Air Force, 5-2 ATS L/7 all the way back to '99). However, Army has defeated a BCS team each year under HC Ellerson. LW we had cashed FREE comp plays going against both tms as Ball St (-8) was our Early Bird POW (given out every Monday at 1-347-677-1700 on button #9) and cruised to a 40-14 win over the Cadets while San Jose St was our NC Sports Comp College POW (given out every Saturday on button #3) as Stanford failed to cover as a 24 pt HF in a 34-13 win. Naturally, Stanford has large talent edges across the board incl #3-113 on D and they have our #2 set of LB's in the country which should help them vs the option (little exp facing it and don't forget they attend Stan for academic reasons too). However, the situation does favor the Cadets here as Stan is flying across country and playing at 12 EST (9 am local time for SU). The last time that happened they lost to Wake Forest 24-17 (+3) in '09. Stan will no doubt win by DD's and they are 12-2 ATS as an AF L/3 yrs but they do have a big game vs Ariz St on deck and the situation favors Army. WEST VIRGINIA by 35 over Georgia St - First meeting. LY GSU's only game versus a BCS opp was at Tennessee. The Panthers (+48') were outgained 558-263 as GSU had 60 yards on their opening drive and 80 yds on their final drive. GSU started their FB program 2010 & TY are a transitional FBS team. They are 0-2 SU/ATS already w/both losses coming against FCS opp. LW they lost to Chattanooga 42-14 (+10') and were out-rushed 401-30 and didn't top 100 yds of total off until the 4Q. WV is off a 16-7 loss (+21) at OU as their high-powered off is a shell of itself TY w/out QB Smith and WR's Austin & Bailey. On the positive side, the D, after all'g a schl rec 38 ppg LY, is all'g only 16.5 ppg TY. This is a true sandwich gm for WV off their 1st road trip to Norman in 30 yrs with a rivalry gm vs an improved MD tm on deck. In each of the L/2 yrs they have played an FCS opp in between their non-conf rivalry gms (Marsh & MD) and while they won those 2 gms by a comb 97-24, they did go 0-2 ATS failing to cover the 2 large spreads (-47 and -35).

Marshall by 5 over OHIO - These two were both members of the MAC and Marshall was 7-1 SU but just 3-5 ATS vs OU from '97-'04. They have played the L4Y with Marshall winning the 1st 2 by 4 and 1 pt and OU winning the L2 incl here in '11 (44-7, -4'). Despite the 2 schools being just 81 miles apart, the HT is 8-3 ATS. LY Marshall was +6' at home and deserved to win outright. In '11 Cato said he "had his worst game ever" but LY hit 44-65-432 vds. The game was tied at 24 with 4:46 left and MU was driving for the game winning score when they fumbled and OU ret'd it 48 yds and would get a 38 yd fg with 1:37 left for the lead. MU's last drive ended on an int at the 15. TY MU is one of the most improved tms in the country and haven't expended a lot of effort in the 1st 2 wks as they have outscored their 1st two opp by a comb 107-14. QB Cato surprisingly only went 16-28-230-1-1 LW but the MU run gm has avgd 264 ypg (5.5) giving them more balance than what they had LY. After getting blown out by UL in the opener, the Bobcats responded w/a key non-conf win over NT LW 27-21 (-4). They jumped out to a 21-7 HT lead but found themselves tied in the 4Q before they kicked 2 FG's. They did have a 442-299 yd edge. OU is 10-2 SU (8-4 ATS) vs non-conf opp L/3 yrs

but look for the improved Herd to play w/a lot of emotion and pick up a close win.

MICHIGAN by 35 over Akron - First mtg. In the previous 3Y Akron has played 5 BCS teams on the road (0-5 SU/2-3 ATS), being outscored 46-14 and outgained 492-260. UA ply'd before 82K at Tenn and 105K at Ohio St in the L/2Y. Michigan is 31-1 SU vs the MAC w/their only loss coming in '08 hosting Toledo, 13-10 (-16). They are 5-2 ATS vs the MAC. The Wolverines are off a huge win over #14 ND 41-30 (-4) as QB Gardner accounted for 376 yds of total off and 5 td's (albeit a poor decision led to a late ND td). Hoke has now improved his record to a perfect 16-0 at home (10-5 ATS). While it is clearly a flat spot, UM is surprisingly 9-0 SU (6-3 ATS) the game after rival ND. Akron is off a misleading 35-33 (-3') win over FCS James Madison as they were outFD'd 26-14 and outgained 498-356. Both Zip QB's saw action and Col trans Hirschman was more effective w/144 yds and 2 td's while Pohl had 143 yds and 2 td's on 12 more att. While Akron is improved in year 2 under Bowden, clearly, UM can name the score here and keep in mind, they covered a 45 pt spread LY over MAC member UMass (63-13).

INDIANA by 4 over Bowling Green - First mtg and only the 2nd B10 tm BG has played in the L5Y (lost to Mich 65-21, +25' in 11). Indiana is 35-8-1 SU vs MAC tms but have gone just 4-3 s/08 (3-4 ATS). Hoosiers in 3rd gm of 4 gm home stand to start off ssn. LW they were in the rare role of being a DD fav vs an FBS tm (2nd time in 3Y) as they lost to Navy 41-35 (-12') trailing the entire game. While the D all'd 515 yds, QB Sudfeld impressed again going 31-42-363-4-1. The Falcons are off to an impressive 2-0 SU/ATS start as they have dispatched 2 bowl opp from LY in Tulsa/Kent St. LW playing a short-handed Kent tm w/o all-everything RB Archer, BG (-6'), found themselves down 22-17 in the 2Q before scoring the gm's final 24 pts. The key play was a 92-yard td pass in the 3Q to WR Burbrink. QB Johnson has finally given HC Clawson a QB that can make plays as he hit 19 of 25 passes for 357 yds as BG rolled to 576 yds of offense, their most in Clawson's 5Y tenure. Interesting matchup will be the Falcon D (#30) vs Indiana's high-tempo off (#19) but we do like the Hoosiers here coming off a loss. Virginia Tech by 10 over EAST CAROLINA - This is their 6th meeting in the L7Y with EC winning only one ('08) but are 3-1-1 ATS. In their last gm ('11) which was also here EC (+17) struggled with only 112 yds (VT 332) but it was tied at 10 mid-4Q vs the #11 Hokies and EC only lost 17-10. Hokies are 18-2 SÙ in trué road openers (14-6 ATS) but are 1-3 ATS the L/4. The Hokies are off a 45-3 (-42) win over FCS W Carolina. They did get off to a slow start as a 37-yd IR td was their only score of the 1Q before finishing with a 462-162 yd edge. QB Thomas, who was only 5 of 26 vs Bama (several drops), was 17 of 31 for 200 yards but had 2 int's in the EZ ending scoring drives. EC should be well rested off a Thur Night gm w/a bye on deck and this is clearly their A+ gm in the 1st 4 gms of the ssn. The Pirates are 2-0 SU (0-2 ATS) after a 31-13 (-20) win over FAU LW where the Owls got a backdoor cover td on 4&gl w/1:03 left. However, the FD's were even at 16 and the yards were close (312-282). QB Carden is avg 319 ypg (80%) w/a 7-0 ratio. The Hokies do have a large D edge (#6-67) and look for that D and an improved ST's unit (several starters approached Beamer after the Bama gm to play on the unit) to carry the day.

However, these two teams look to be going in opposite directions under 3Y HC's as the Terps are one of the most improved teams in the country off to a 2-0 start after LW's 47-10 win (-19) over ODU. What a difference having a healthy QB makes as Brown is avg 278 ypg (76%) w/a 5-0 ratio and WR Diggs already has 277 rec yds (25.2). Conn has had time to stew after a disastrous opener, which saw them dominated by FCS Towson 33-18 (-16'). HC Pasqualoni's seat is as hot as ever and the only thing that could possibly save him is another win over the former HC. However, that is easier said than done as MD has the off (#57-111) and def (#26-71) edges and is playing w/confidence.

PITTSBURGH by 21 over New Mexico - First mtg. HC Davie got his start at Pitt as a GA ('77) and later ret'd as a LB cch ('80-'82). In the L3Y the Lobos have played 4 BCS tms (3 were ranked) on the road losing by 50 ppg (0-3 ATS). Pitt is just 5-11 SU s/'05 after a bye but did go 2-0 ATS in that role under Chryst incl beating #21 Rut 27-6 (-1). It also helps that they have extra time to prep for NM's option which they've prepped this off-season as they face 3 option tms TY (NM, GT and Navy). The Panthers are off a 41-13 (+10) loss to FSU on Labor Day night as we cashed a 4★ Key Selection on the Noles who dominated after Pitt went 80/9pl on their 1st drive. NM is on B2B road gms (2-1 ATS under Davie LY) but do have a bye on deck. After a disappointing opener, the Lobos beat UTEP 42-35 (+6') in OT LW as RB Carrier who only had 54 yds in wk 1 looked like he was back in 2012 form as he ran for 291 yds (7.1) and 4 td's. Clearly the Panthers have the edge here as not only do we like the situation but they were also 3-1 ATS as a HF LY and have a large D edge (#42-114).

WAKE FOREST by 4 over Ulm - First meeting and also first vs a SBC tm. LY ULM played Auburn and Ark on the road. They went 1-1 SU scoring 62 pts and all'd the same. However, they outgained them 480-398 and outFD'd them 29-20. They did, however travel to OU in this year's opener and lost 34-0 (+21") as QB Browning was not 100% and could not use his mobility (488 rush LY). Browning and Co did get a bounce back win over FCS Grambling 48-10 (-41) LW as they raced out to a 35-7 HT lead and outgained them 571-237. WF, meanwhile is off a disappointing 24-10 loss (+3) to BC on Fri Night as they were twice stopped on the GL. The FD's were close at 17-16 but they did lose the battle at the LOS, getting outrushed 191-55. The Demon Deacons are on a current 7-2 ATS run hosting non-conf opp but ULM will be dangerous here as they will certainly not be intimidated by a 31,500 seat BCS stadium after playing in SEC country LY.

Wku by 10 over SOUTH ALABAMA - First meeting. LY South Alabama went 1-3 SU (0-4 ATS) vs SBC foes at home. The avg score was 20-28 (352-434 yds). They were -7 in TO's. The Jaguars are off arguably their biggest win in schl hist beating Tulane 41-39 (+6). After USA raced out to a 28-7 lead, TU came back to lead 33-31 before USA got a crucial 12-yd blik'd P re'td for a td late in the 3Q. They did own 25-20 FD and 465-372 yd edges in the game. WKU is starting with 3 straight away from home and have given a full out effort vs the SEC foes they just faced. After upsetting UK in wk 1, the Hilltoppers were confident heading into LW's gm but 5 TO's in 6 offensive plays turned an early 3-0 lead into a 31-3 deficit in a 52-20 loss (+12) to Tenn. WKU actually outgained Tenn 393-382 but finished w/7 TO's incl 5 int by QB Doughty. S Alabama's first FBS ssn went as expected as many teams looked past them when hosting the Jaguars (SA 4-3 AD) but the Jaguars were outmatched when teams came to visit (SA 0-6 ATS home). Look for more of the same here as WKU is 4-0 ATS as an AF and will want to get LW's bad taste out of their mouths.

Fresno St by 6 over COLORADO - FSU is a perfect 3-0 ATS in their matchups. LY was embarrassing for CU. They were a 15 pt dog and were obliterated by FSU in the 1H. FSU had 2 offensive plays of 90+ yds in the 1Q. At the half FSU had 516-122 yd edge and 8 td's and CU only had 4 FD's. Naturally, it was the most yds ever all'd in the half by CU. CU narrowly avoided the most lopsided loss by a team from a BCS conf vs a non-AQ team when they got a td with 2:58 left to "only" lose 69-14. Fresno was a perfect 6-0 ATS as a HF LY but now are 0-2 ATS TY (inflated lines) despite starting off the ssn 2-0 SU/ATS. LW they faced option-oriented Cal-Poly and the Bulldogs (-28) led 41-3 in the 3Q before CP scored the gm's final 22 pts. A new HC and a completely diff look to the Buffs TY as they are 2-0 after defeating one of the FCS's top tms C Ark LW 38-24 (-13'). The Buffs did trail 24-17 early 4Q before scoring the final 21 points incl an IR td. Six days after catching 10 passes for 208 yds, WR Richardson topped it by catching 11 for 209 and easily leads the NCAA. CU does have the situational edge with a bye on deck while Fresno has the all-important HG vs Boise on deck. New CU HC MacIntyre did beat the Bulldogs 27-24 (+6') in '11 when at San Jose St and was 4-0 ATS as a HD in his L/2 yrs there. Clearly, this gm will be much more competitive TY.

FLORIDA ST by 42 over Nevada - First meeting, first trip to Florida and first reg ssn game vs the ACC (1-2 SU/ATS L7Y in bowls) for the Wolf Pack. In the L5Y UN is 0-3 SU/ATS on the road vs ranked BCS opp losing by an avg score of 58-12. Seminoles are 22-1 SU (14-9 ATS) in home openers (only loss was to Miami, Fl in '09, 38-34). FSU is also 15-0 SU s/'04 hosting non-AQ opp winning by 37 ppg (9 gms by 34+ pts) and are on a current 6-0 ATS run in that role. FSU cashed us a 4★ Key Selection in wk 1 as they destroyed Pitt 41-13 (-10'). RFr sensation QB Winston even exceeded the hype as he was nearly flawless going 25 of 27 for 356 yds and a 4-0 ratio in his debut. After a blowout loss to UCLA, UN got a 36-7 (-19) win over UC Davis as they rolled to 30-11 FD and 535-296 yd edges. The Noles should be well rested off a bye w/only Bethune Cookman on deck and Nevada opens MW play next week. FSU should roll here and has the huge defensive edge (#7 vs #111).

NEBRASKA by 3 over Ucla - LY was the only recent meeting. Taylor Martinez is from SoCal and passed for 179 and had a 92 yd td run. It was 29-27 when NU was int'd and ret'd 24 yds to the 16 and UCLA got a td pass. NU got a 40 yd FG with 1:38 left but the onside kick was rec'd by UCLA and the Bruins took a knee at the 9. UCLA had 653-439 yd 26-20 FD edges. Bruins come in 1-0 off an early sn bye (beat ASU as 6' pt dog on road LY in that role under Mora). They did hammer Nev 58-20 (-21) in the opener but the gm was only 17-13 at HT. QB Hundley did account for 337 total yds and 4 td's as the Bruins gained 647 yds. Neb, after a near upset loss to WY in the opener beat SM 56-13 (-28) LW and were aided by 2 IR td's in the 1Q. QB Martinez is avg 163 ypg (71%) w/a 6-1 ratio and has 114 rush (5.2). UCLA was 2-0 ATS LY as an AD but Neb is 7-2 ATS as a HF. Neb has this gm circled as in the 1st 8 wks of the ssn. this is clearly their "A" game. Look for the Huskers to get revengel

Georgia Tech by 6 over DUKE - GT is 15-1 SU but 9-7 ATS in this series. Duke had close covers as 10' and 10 pt dogs in '10 and '11. LY the game was 14-14 when GT got a 4&2 td run to go up 21-14. Duke did have the advantage of a bye the week before but the Blue Devils offense could only watch in the 2H as GT held the ball for more than 38:00 in the game with scoring drives of 13, 10, 16, 13, 18 and 6 plays. GT got ahead of the spread with 3:17 left, 42-24 (-13'). TY GT comes in off a bye (only played FCS Elon in a 70-0 win, -46). A year after getting to their 1st bowl s/94, the Blue Devils look just as good if not better off a 28-14 (-4') win over Memphis. It is their first 2-0 start s/'98 but they did lose their QB Boone to a shld'r inj LW and he is out for this gm. However, bkp Connette was highly efficient going 14-21-198-2-0 and the Devils outgained the Tigers 470-237. With Duke more run oriented TY it figures to be a quick game. Look for the Devils to keep it close.

OREGON by 28 over Tennessee - Only other meeting was in Knoxville in 2010. Tennessee (+11') led #7 Oregon 13-3 after an hour long lightning delay but the Ducks exploded for 45 straight points in the final 33 min. First time s/'08 that Tenn's first road game is not vs an SEC foe (at UCLA -7', 24-27 OT) and they have a road trip to Florida on deck (huge gm for Vol fans). The Vols are off to a 2-0 start under new

HC Jones and LW after trailing 3-0 early took adv of 5 WKU TO's in 6 plays to lead 31-3 in a 52-20 win (-12). They were outgained 393-382. The major ? for the Ducks TY was how they would replace HC Kelly and so far, they haven't skipped a beat after LW's 59-10 win (-23') over UVA. The UO off is avg a mind numbing 425 rush ypg while QB Mariota is avg 217 pass ypg w/a 3-0 ratio. The L3Y UO has avg'd 61 ppg home vs non-conf foes. LY's 3 non-conf gms at HT were 120-23 but TY so far it looks like Helfrich is not letting up as they have outgegred their opp's by a comb 59-0 in the 2H which spells doom for the Vole.

Unfortunately they allowed 676 yards and the 66 points they gave up was their most ever in modern history (s/³3). We had a strong 4★ LPS on UT -10 (near Sept 5★) and easily cashed. Only the 3rd non-conf BCS team to visit Austin in 7Y and they lost both prior (-15' UCLA 12-34'10 & -2 #1 Ohio St 7-24'06). Ole Miss' first non-conf BCS road game s/'08. Both tms are among the most exp'd in the country TY. Horns are off road trip to BYU w/revenge gm vs KSt on deck while Ole Miss is off FCS foe and has a bye on deck. A long weather delay plus playing in altitude was not a good situation for the Horns LW. They lost 40-21 (-7) to BYU all'g 550 rush yds incl 259 by QB Hill (2nd most rush yds by a QB in nation L/10 yrs, Vince Young #1). That does not bode well going up against Ole Miss QB Wallace who is also mobile (8 rush td's LY). UT QB Ash also left the gm in the 4Q w/a head inj (CS). LW the Rebs led FCS SEMO St 31-0 at HT before emptying the bench in the 2H in a 31-13 win (-49'). HC Freeze is an amazing 22-7 ATS in his 3 yrs as a HC. Dangerous spot for the Horns but we can't ignore LY's beatdown w/both tms equally improved TY and Horns will be angry after LW's debacle.

USC by 21 over Boston College - BC is 0-3 SU incl a 24-13 (+7) loss in the L/gm ('09 Emerald Bowl) & LTH ('87) lost 23-17. BC has dropped 4 str road openers by 20 ppg and dropped their L/5 ATS. USC is 19-2 SU s/'02 hosting non-conf foes (both losses vs ND) but they are just 2-10 ATS under Kiffin vs non-conf. BC does have an extra day of prep off a Fri Night gm and have a bye on deck. The Eagles beat WF LW 24-10 (-3) as they stopped the Deacons twice at the GL. HC Adazzio has instilled a toughness that BC hasn't displayed the last couple of yrs and they easily won the LOS w/a 191-55 rush yd edge. USC HC Kiffin's seat is as hot as ever after LW's 10-7 loss (-15') to Wash St at home. The Trojans' offense continues to sputter w/out any solid QB play (avg just 113 pass ypg) as they managed just 193 total yds. On the bright side the D is all'g just 15 rush ypg (0.6) which doesn't bode well vs a tm that likes to run it. This is the week we find out how TY's Trojans handle adversity.

lowa by 3 over IOWA ST - The HT is 7-2 SU but 4-5 ATS. In 4 of the L5Y ISU has had a combined 1 offensive td (did score 44 pts in 3OT in '11). LY ISU LB Klein noted how ISU students wore lowa gear around campus, something that eats away at them and the Cyclones are 11-4 ATS the L15Y after Hayden Fry had dominated them prior. LY ISU never trailed & led 9-3 into the 4Q. After all'g a FG ISU forced 2 punts, SOD & sealed the win w/an int at their 24 w/1:11 left. The Hawkeyes come in off a misleading 28-14 win (-24') win over FCS Missouri St. They led 21-0 after 3Q's but thanks to a 28 IR td, only led 21-14 before sealing the gm in the middle of the 4Q. They did have 25-12 FD and 489-197 yd edges. The Cyclones lost their opener to FCS N lowa 28-20 (-9') and were outrushed 228-168 and will be playing w/o their best OL (C Farniok). Clearly, this is lowa St's "A" gm as they are off N lowa and a bye and have a bye on deck but we think lowa gets revenge.

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Northern Illinois by 27 over IDAHO - Third mtg s'07 with road dog winning both outright incl in '09 with Vandals as a 15' pt dog (quick fact: NI has won 21 str HG's since that loss to Idaho in '09). Idaho is 3-2 SU and 4-1 ATS vs the MAC. The Huskies are off a bye following their come-from-behind win over lowa 30-27 (+3) in the opener and only have E Illinois on deck. UI is only 2-6 ATS as a HD but this is the first for Petrino. The Vandals are off B2B blowout losses and it doesn't get any easier w/a much improved Wash St on deck. NI has avg'd 46 ppg their last 12 AG's and w/QB Lynch along w/7 other st'rs back on offense, don't look for them to slow down anytime soon. LY NI was an AF of over a td 3 times going 3-0 with avg line of -16 and avg score of 45-16 and should roll in this one despite playing in the unique Kibbie Dome.

† Washington by 9 over Illinois - Last met in 1972. Illinois has lost 10 of 11 neutral/road openers with the avg loss by 17 ppg although they will have the huge crowd edge in this one playing in Chicago's Soldier Field. The Huskies are the more exp'd tm and come in off a bye (only IDSt on deck) after cashing a 3★ Key Selection for us in their opener w/a dominating 38-6 (-3') win over Boise St. Speaking of cashing Key Selection for us, LW Illinois was our Underdog POW (+10) against Cincinnati and won outright 45-17 as their much improved off under new OC Cubit continues to impress after rolling up 522 yds! QB Scheelhaase is now avg 364 ypg (74%) w/a 6-1 ratio. Wash has a huge adv in this one w/QB Price, WR Williams and TE Seferian-Jenkins (back from inj) facing an Illinois pass D that ranked #99 in our PDR a yr ago (63%, 21-7 ratio), lost 3 of their 4 st'rs and has given up an avg of 325 pass ypg TY. UW has the edges on offense (#12-51) and defense (#12-75) but the Illini are playing w/a lot of confidence.

PENN ST by 8 over Ucf - PSU has won both meetings (27-24 -13' in '02 & 37-13 -23 in '04). UCF is 0-7 SU (3-4 ATS) vs the B10. Penn St HC O'Brien coached under O'Leary at GT from '95-'01 starting as a GA and finishing as the OC in 2001. UCF is on B2B road but covered LY in B2B trips up North incl one vs OSU (16-31, +18). PSU was 4-13 ATS the L/3 yrs under Joe Pa as a HF but was 5-1 ATS LY in that role under O'Brien and LW cashed as a 3★ LPS in a 45-7 win (-24) over EMU. True Frosh QB Hackenberg had jitters early in his home debut (fumble snap led to EMU td), but rebounded to hit 23-33-311-1-1 as the Lions had 25-11 FD and 574-183 yd edges. The Knights have looked impressive TY as they have outscored their 1st 2 opp by a comb 76-7 and QB Bortles is avg 264 ypg (70%) w/a 4-0 ratio. Sandwiched between 2 MAC opp, we expect a good effort out of the Lions but we feel UCF is capable of taking this one deep into the 4Q within doubt.

Ball St by 1 over NORTH TEXAS - Only prev meeting was in 2009, which NT won 20-10 as a 16 pt road dog (BSU off 12-2 '08 ssn w/new HC). The Cardinals were outgained 512-309 but still tied it early in the 4Q then missed a FG and fumbled on their L/2 drives. After having no home edge (1-16 SU/5-11 ATS '08-'10), the new Apogee Stad has been much kinder to the Mean Green as NT is 8-4 SU (7-5 ATS). They are coming off a loss to another MAC schl as Ohio beat them 27-21 (+4) as they were outgained 447-299. QB Thompson after a career-day in the opener vs ID, had 2 int's incl one that was ret'd for a td. Ball St continues to cash under the vastly underrated Lembo (18-9 ATS) as LW the Cardinals won 40-14 (-8) over Army as our Early Bird POW that is given out FREE every Monday at 1-347-677-1700 (button #9). Despite being inj'd for most of Aug QB Wenning has looked impressive avg 333 ypg (65%) w/a 5-0 ratio and LW was playing w/out his feature RB Edwards (CS). BSU has the off edge (#63-89) while NT has the D edge (#82-106). BSU is 6-1 ATS in their road opener and look for this to go down to the wire.

opener and look for this to go down to the wire. MIDDLE TENNESSEE by 3 over Memphis - Schools are only 62 miles apart and this is their 12th mtg s/97. It is surprising that MT is actually 4-1 SU and 3-2 ATS in this series. LY MT was a 4 pt road fav but it was not as big a blowout as the 48-30 final would indicate. MT had a 439-399 yd and 27-23 FD edges but Mem had 4 TO's incl 6 fmbls. Mem is just 2-10-1 ATS in their road opener but MT is 3-12 ATS vs non-conf opp after LW's 40-20 loss (+17') to NC. MT was down 23-0 at HT and scored a td w/:25 left to make the final more respectable (FD's nearly even). Memphis is off a 28-14 (+4') home loss to Duke as despite being outgained 470-237, the game was actually tied at 14 early in the 4Q. Both tms have 16 ret st'rs and both have moved up a level to diff conf TY. While MT has the off edge (#88-115), Mem has the D edge (#70-110). We'll give the HT the 3 pts and see where Vegas tells us to lean.

ARKANSAS by 21 over Southern Miss - First meeting. Ark has faced a CUSA team 3 times in the L4Y beating Tulsa, UTEP and in the Liberty Bowl EC (1-2 ATS). At Wisc, Bielema won all 21 at home vs non-conf. Ark was 13-4-1 ATS as a HF the L3Y under Petrino but went 0-5 ATS LY. Bielema was 0-6 ATS as a non-AQ HF the L4Y at Wisky and TY is 1-1 ATS after LW's come-from-behind win over Samford 31-21 (-32'). The Hogs were down 21-17 entering the 4Q but their powerful ground gm wore down the smaller Samford DL to the tune of 333 rush yds as both Collins and Williams have each topped 100 yds rushing in each of the 1st 2 gms. It was the same ol' story for the Golden Eagles in their 14th consec loss LW. Like LY, moving the ball isn't a problem for SM but it's the TO's that have plagued them and LW they had 4 more in the 56-13 loss (+28) at Neb. Gotta think after a 2-0 start, the Hogs will want to continue the momentum but they do have a legit revenge game on deck vs Rutgers and better not take SM for granted.

SOUTH CAROLINA by 13 over Vanderbilt - SC has won 4 straight in series but is only 2-2 ATS. In fact the 2 SC covers were only by 2.5 & 2 pts. SC also lost 4 straight ATS at home in this series before winning the LTH (Vandy just 5 FD's, 77 total yds). Vandy knows how to play with them as LY they opened up the season on Thursday night. Vandy led #9 SC into the 4Q but after allowing a td they were held to only 1 FD in their final 2 drives not getting past the SC43 with a controversial non-call on pass interf on 4th down on the last drive. SC is off a 41-30 loss (+3') to UGA (SC was 5-1 ATS off a loss but 0-2 ATS LY). The Gamecocks managed 454 yds of offense, but the D has some serious issues. They all'd 536 yds to the Bulldogs, had cchs getting into it on the sidelines, Clowney has clearly underachieved to the pt he is calling out the defensive schemes while offensive-minded HC Spurrier says he wants a hand in the D this week. After a last second loss to Ole Miss in the opener Vandy got a 38-3 win (-47') over Austin Peay. The Dores led 38-0 at HT before backing off as they had 21-6 FD and 442-139 yd edges. While Vandy is dangerous here, we think the Gamecocks bounce back

OKLAHOMA by 21 over Tulsa - The Sooners have won 6 str in this instate series by 38 ppg (4-1-1 ATS). In the L/gm ('11), Oklahoma (-24') led 30-0 and 47-7 w/11:52 left. In fact, Tulsa gained 25% (100) of their yds on their L/2 drives. That was a 4.5★ winner for Power Plays newsletter (just \$50 for 2013 weekly email version if you're a Power Sweep sub, call 1-800-654-3448). Sooners are in their 3rd str HG and have a bye on deck. LW they beat WV 16-7 (-21) as rFr QB Knight 10-20-1-2 was benched in the 4Q for Bkp Bell as they tried to run the clock. The Sooners did manage 316 rush yds and their much improved D has all'd only 7 pts all year. Tulsa after an embarrassing 34-7 loss (+3') to BG in the opener rallied from 10 pts down in the 4Q to beat CSU 30-27 (-10') hitting a 34-yd FG on the final play. They did have 22-9 FD and 427-286 yd edges. OU's biggest mismatch comes on the line of scrimmage as the Sooners have our #5 OL in the entire country (avg 6'5" 310) while the Hurricane have 4 new starters on the DL (avg 6'3" 269) and have given up an avg of 208 rush ypg this year. Tulsa does have a bye on deck but is out-classed here.

Ohió St by 17 over CALIFORNIA - In their only recent meeting Cal travelled to OSU as a 16 pt dog LY. Cal trailed at the half 21-7 but dominated the 3Q. OSU had 0 FD's and it was tied 28-28 when OSU got a 72 yd td pass and Cal would miss 3 FG's and had a td called back on pen. Cal on the road had 22-14 FD and 512-412 yd edges in a 35-28 loss. RB Bigelow had 160 yds on just 4 carries. The Buckeyes are 2-3 away vs BCS teams losing the last 2 SU/ATS (Miami '11' & #1 USC '09). Meyer is 32-9 ATS vs non-conf opp (2-4 ATS here). This is the Bucks' "A" gm for 1st 4 wks of ssn (home gm vs Wisc 2 wks away) and they are off a 42-7 (-28) win over SDSt as bkp QB Guiton led them most of the way (career-highs 19-28-152-2-1) as Miller left the gm in the 1Q w/a sprained MCL (CS). Guiton is a 5th yr Sr and does have plenty of exp filling in for the oft inj'd Miller. Cal is off an FCS foe but had to expend some effort as they gave up 434 yds in the 1H to Portland St in a 37-30 (-27') win. Frosh QB Goff has already thrown for 935 yds in Dykes' pass-happy off, which is the most yds by a QB in his 1st 2 gms in more than 10 yrs. Regardless of whether Miller plays or not, the Bucks have the talent edges (off #7-69, D #10-63) and Cal is just 2-8 ATS as a HD s/'03. You have to figure there will be a lot of Scarlet & Gray in the crowd w/a rare trip out West (1st s/'09 counting bowls).

USF by 7 over Florida Atlantic - USF is 3-0 SU (1-1 ATS) in the series. In the last meeting (10) FAU (+21') lost 31-3 but was only outgained 291-208. They were -3 in TO's & had a punt blk'd and ret'd for a td. We have had a great pulse on FAU already TY, cashing a 2* Selection in Wk 1 as they covered as an AD vs Miami, then LW they cashed as our Thur Night Marquee on them again in a big AD role vs EC. However, it did come via a backdoor cover as FAU scored a td on 4&gl w/a minute left. USF after a shocking 53-21 loss (-20') to FCS McNeese St in the opener, played better LW but still fell to MSU 21-6 (+23). QB Eveld was a pathetic 6-25-66-0-1 while the Bulls managed only 155 yds albeit against one of the top D's in the country. The technical edges favor FAU as USF was just 4-12 ATS as a HF under Holtz, and Taggart was just 3-7 ATS in that role at WKU (0-1 here). FAU is now 8-1 ATS as an AD under Pelini. The situation does favor USF though with a bye on deck while FAU is on 3rd straight road gm, although they are no stranger as they covered in that role last year vs #1 Bama (+49, 7-40) and opened the '11 season with 5 straight road gms covering 2 of the last 3 in that stretch. The Tigers have looked impressive TY especially on off under new OC Cameron as LW QB Mettenberger set a schl rec w/5 td passes in a 56-17 win (-34) over UAB. Mettenberger wasn't the only bright spot as WR Beckham had 231 all-purp yds incl a 60-yd PR and a 100-yd missed FG ret'd for a td. Kent is off a 41-22 loss (+6°) to BG as they all'd the game's final 24 pts. Star RB Archer sat out the game and you have to think a road night gm in Death Valley is not the best place to bring him back. Kent is 0-6 SU/1-5 ATS away vs BCS teams +17 or more points w/an avg score 7-33. "Our goal is to win the MAC," said

Haynes and you have to think he will focus on the more winnable games.

Notre Dame by 17 over PURDUE - ND has won 5 in a row SU (by 12 ppg), is 4-2 ATS and the visitor is 6-3 ATS. LY was a great situation for PU catching ND off their trip to Ireland and the Irish did lead 17-10 when Golson was sk'd and fmbl'd back at their own 15 with 3:24 left. PU got a td with 2:22 left and Rees led ND 55/12pl for the GW 27 yd FG. LTH ND outgained PU 342-92 (28-0) in the 1Q and 3Q. The Irish are off their showdown vs Michigan (3-0 ATS) but each of the L/11 yrs, the opp in the foll'g gm was Mich St. A yr after fielding one of the best D's in the country, ND has shockingly had some major woes TY as after all'g 25 FD's and 362 yds to Temple, they all'd 25 FD's and 460 yds to Mich in the 11 pt loss. QB Rees is avg 330 ypg (61%) but threw 2 costly picks LW. The Hazell era has not gotten off to a good start as after losing 42-7 (+10) in the opener, LW PU escaped w/a 20-14 (-17) win over Indiana St as despite jumping out to a 17-0 lead, the Boilers were outgained 295-284 (FD's even). ARIZONA by 24 over Utsa - First mtg. UA is 17-6 SU (8-3 ATS L/11) in non-conf reg ssn gms since the

Pac-10/12 went to a 9 gm conf schedule. This will be UTSA's first road game vs a BCS team and 2nd str BCS opp after never playing one prior. LW the Roadrunners got a backdoor cover vs OSU as they trailed 42-7 after 3Q's before scoring 4 td's in the 4Q (last w/1:14 left). They did manage 504 yds and 31 FD's but gave up 605 yds. LW the Wildcats were aided by the return of AA RB Carey (171 yds) and jumped out to a 45-6 HT lead. They crushed UNLV 58-13 as a 10' pt AF and the powerful Zona ground gm is avg 352 ypg TY. Zona has a bye on deck, hasn't expended much effort prior while UTSA will be worn out already in wk 3 after facing option (NM), then fast-paced OkSt and now getting a team that does both.

UTAH by 1 over Oregon St - The home team is a perfect 4-0 SU and 3-1 ATS in this series. LY Utah did have a 307-226 yd edge but OSU (-10) jumped to a 14-0 lead and held on. They had their lowest yd'g total in a victory since they kicked 6 FG's vs Wash in '05. OSU got ahead of the spread with a td with a 67/7pl drive for a td with 7:41 left. Utah on 4&9 from the OSU18 was sk'd w/3:10 left then on 4&4 was int'd at the OSU35 with 1:18 left. Utah is 0-2 ATS gm before BYU s/joining the P12 (were 5-0 ATS prior). The Utes cashed a 3★ Key Selection for us in wk 1 over Utah St and followed that up with a dominating 70-7 win over Weber St LW. Oreg St, after a shocking loss to FCS E Wash in week 1, bounced back w/a 33-14 win over Hawaii. The game was tied at 14 at HT before Oreg St dominated the 2H. The Beavers did finish w24-15 FD and 508-239 yd edges. This is OSU's road opener, they are 0-2 ATS as an AF L4Y and Utah won 27-8 (-5) here in '11. The winner here takes a major step towards a bowl in 2013.

UNLV by 7 over Central Michigan - These two last met in '94 when UNLV lost in the reg ssn (35-

23) but won the rematch in the LV Bowl (52-24, -5). LY the Rebs went 2-5 SU (5-2 ATS) at home but outscored their opp 29-28 getting outgained by only 2 ypg and 1 FD/gm. LW, however, they were destroyed 58-13 (+10') vs Arizona (down 45-6 at HT) and you have to wonder if the players will start tuning out their HC Hauck who looks to be on the way out after 3 str 2-win seasons and a disappointing start to TY. The Chips lost both their QB and RB in wk 1 and LW were down 21-7 (-2') to FCS NH but rallied back to win 24-21. They did get a 97-yd td pass to tie it in the 4Q then kicked a 27-yd FG on the final play for the win. QB Rush was 19-32-326-3-0 in his 1st start. CM has made just 1 non-AQ road trip since '07 losing 38-37 (+14) at Navy in '10. Technical edges to UNLV as CM is 1-9 ATS as an AD, while Hauck is 12-6-1 ATS at home. One final chance for the Rebs to get some momentum heading into conf action and we think they do so here.

ARIZONA ST by 6 over Wisconsin - ASU has outscored their past 3 Big Ten opp in Tempe 141-42 after beating III 45-14 LY as a 4 pt HF. Badgers had won 10 str road/neutral openers by 13 ppg (4 vs BCS) until LY in Corvallis (lost 10-7 as 7 pt AF). UW is 1-2 SU vs ASU but won the L/gm 20-19 (-12) in 2010. UW's last & only trip to Tempe was in 1968, lost 55-7. LW in their opener ASU crushed FCS Sacramento St 55-0 (-37) w/27-6 FD and 523-167 yd edges. QB Kelly picked up where he left off LY as he was 23 of 31 for 300 yds and a 5-0 ratio. Wisc has yet to allow a single pt TY as they have outscored their opp 93-0 in new HC Andersen's 1st 2 gms. RB Gordon who may have been the best RB on LY's tm (despite playing along side the Doak Wălker winner Montee Ball) already has 284 yds (12.9). Both do have important configms on deck, but will want to make a nat'l statement. It should be noted that Andersen was an exceptional 14-2 ATS as an AD at Utah St and this one figures to go into the 4Q in doubt. ASU only beat 1 FBS team that finished with a winning record LY but we feel this year's team is stronger and they finally get that marquee win.

The Brees/Payton combo started right where they left off with 357 pass yds and an impressive 74% comp with an even more impressive 10.2 yds/att. The Tampa trip has been a favorite of Brees' as LY he threw for 377 (73%, 4-1) while the Saints have won & covered 3 of 4 by 16 ppg. The Bucs are making a "slight" step up in competition after allowing Geno Smith to throw for 256 yds and 63%. The Bucs struggled with costly penalties LY (#11 LY w/102) and are still playing undisciplined with 13 accepted penalties vs the Jets including 5 FD's. The Saints offense doesn't need extra help but it'll just make this cover easier.

3★ HOUSTON by 16 over Tennessee - Don't mind either situation with the Texans off Monday Night. If they are off a loss they are 5-0 ATS at home in non-Dec games covering by 15.1 ppg. If they are off an expected win they'll be out to show their AFC South foes who are the kings of the division as they are 8-1 vs their div at home the L3Y with the non-cover vs JAX in a NBC/Thanksgiving Day sandwich. Saf Reed should be back which will help contain CJ who only ran for 70 (2.8) vs PIT and despite him topping 1,200 LY the Titans still only avg'd 298 ypg and 16 FD's/gm on the road. B2B road games are tough enough but LY the week after traveling to PIT every team rushed for under their avg/gm and totaled an eye opening 3.4 ypc. TEN QB Locker finished LY hitting only 52% on the road with a 6.1 yds/att, and a 6-7 ration and LW's 11-20 for 125 yards shows not much s changed. The Texans have won & covered their L/3 home openers by 15 ppg and make it 4 str today.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ Detroit by 12 over ARIZONA - The Lions have been lacking a RB to help take the pressure off the QB and Reggie Bush answered the call totaling 191 yds on 25 touches (7.6). His presence allowed the OL to keep Stafford clean only taking one sack against vs a Vikings DL with 94 sacks the L2Y. There was an offensive sighting in St Louis LW and for those Arizona fans that didn't recognize it, it was their Cardinals. Carson Palmer may be hailed as a savior as he led ARZ to 25 FD's which is the first time that's happened since 2009 when Kurt Warner outdueled Aaron Rodgers making his first play-off start winning 51-45 in OT in the Conf semi-finals. The 33 year old was under pressure vs the Rams getting sacked 4 times and getting hit 5. Now it the Lions turn to up the pressure as Nick Fairley has taking a leadership role on the DET DL with 1.5 sk, a tfl and 2 qbh LW. Lions like the Rams excepts they have a superior QB, RB and receivers.

NY Jets at NEW ENGLAND - I'm sure most of you thought that both of these teams would win on FG's in the final 5 seconds. NE has now dropped 3 straight to the NYJ incl here LY as the Pats were -10 but needed OT to win by 3 (Jets 403-381 yd edge). NE continues to under perform as a DD favorite going incl LY and are now 3-8 ATS since '10. It's Belichick against another rookie QB but will he play it close to the vest or go for an impressive TV win? This Thursday Night Marquee is incl in all the packages on page 8. PHILADELPHIA by 10 over San Diego - Both are off Monday Night'rs so we've yet to see either perform. What we do know is the Chargers faced a physical Texans D and now travels across country, with an early start, facing an offense with expected brake neck speed. SD QB Rivers is clearly not of fan of long road trips to the NE as in LY's trips to CLE, PIT, NYJ he threw for 173 ypg & 51%. We also know that SD's secondary is among the worst in the NFL with 3 new starters incl both CB's. Having to make decisions vs the mobile Vick will can be disastrous without having experience working together. Special home opener with the Eagles going 0-8 ATS at home LY. Look for Kelly to follow suit from the previous HC's from College who covered by 38 (Carroll +3, 31-8), 10 (Harbaugh -5', 33-17), 8 (Schiano +2, 16-10) and 8 LW (Marrone +10, 21-23) in their first home game.

BALTIMORE by 7 over Cleveland - The Browns "new era" began LW in disappointment as the Turner off was grounded, QB Weeden looked like he took a step backwards and RB Richardson was not used much after the 1st drive. BAL is coming off an embarrassing loss to open the NFL ssn but has 3 extra days of rest. CLE allowed just 20 rush yds LW (0.9) but the secondary was torched and BAL needs to get Rice/Pierce (ttl 58 2.8 vs DEN) going while Flacco had 362 pass yds and is 8-0 vs CLE. DIV teams are 1-6-1 ATS after allowing 40 or more in Wk 1 and CLE has covered 3 str at BAL but the Browns are 1-14 SU on the road while the Ravens have won 7 str home openers covering the L/2 by 27 & 24 pts. With the entire AFC North at 0-1 and HOU on deck the Ravens are in dire need of a win and they get it vs a rival.

Indianapolis by 6 over Miami - Both are off opening wk wins but the Dolphins are playing in B2B road gms while Indy stays at home for a second str wk. LY IND hosted MIA and won 23-20 (+1', +151 yds) with Luck passing for a career high 433 yds (rookie record). LW the Dolphins run gm was nonexistent (20 yds 0.9) but QB Tannehill picked apart the CLE secondary even with #1 option Wallace having just 1 grab. IND after a 14-0 lead needed a 19-yd Luck td run w/5:20 left to avoid the upset vs OAK. The Colts are on a 8-3 ATS run at Lucas Oil while the Dolphins are 1-4 SU/ATS on the road. IND should get the job done here as LW they allowed 171 ypg (5.2) and now faces a weaker set of RB's and less mobile QB.

Carolina by 6 over BUFFALO - Both were home dogs LW against playoff teams and each took a lead into the 4Q. Both were also outscored 6-0 in the final stanza and while Buffalo may see it as a moral victory Carolina certainly doesn't. The other mail difference is that Newton faced the leagues #1 scoring D from LY while Manuel faced the league's #25 overall. Newton went 6-2 ATS away LY and brings a duel threat QB to the field after BUF faced the pocket-happy Brady LW.

ATLANTA by 7 over St Louis - Rule #1 when handicapping is to play a well coached team with a veteran QB off a loss. ATL under Mike Smith epitomizes that phrase as the Falcons are 18-4 ATS off a SU loss. Now, put them against a team off a come from behind division battle that has just 8 wins their last 41 games away from home. The Falcons had the unenviable task of taking on the ultra-energized Saints and with the noise in the Superdome it limited Ryan's ability to audiblize. Now ATL can use the full talents of RB Jackson who practiced against this Rams D for the L9Y. This week it's time for the Falcon fans to show how load they can be which is a main reason ATL is 13-4 as a non-div HF while also winning and covering 4 straight home openers by 11 ppg. Also remember rule #1.

GREEN BAY by 10 over Washington - The Packers have the advantage of facing a mobile QB for a second str wk but are at home and WAS is off a short wk playing on MNF and we are uncertain if RG3 will be 100%. GB lost LW in SF and haven't started a ssn 0-2 since McCarthy's 1st yr at the helm in '06. The Packers are 26-2 SU/20-8 ATS at Lambeau while the Redskins are 13-7 ATS as a AD under Shanahan. GB is 10-5 ATS as a non-Div HF and LW after losing their opener (vs SF) they stomped CHI by 18 on a short wk as 4' pt fav. The Packers def also will be more focused after a 2Q mistake LW they mat have caused the defeat.

Minus Peterson's 78 yd run on his 1st play of the game he was held to 15 yds (0.9) on the ground afterwards. After Trestman's halftime adjustments Cutler hit for 172 yds 79%) w/a 1-1 ratio but look for the intensity to fade a bit after the new HC's first win. CHI now has to face an elite RB after holding CIN's below avg group to 63 yds (3.0) with Peterson rushing for 263 yds (5.3) in LY's meetings. It's a lot to ask for a new HC off his 1st win

DEN went 3-0 SU/ATS after the bye on the East Coast LY and have OAK on deck in a MNF event. Win or lose vs DAL the Giants will be primed to avoid embarrassment with the hype going on here and this is also their only home game for Sept. Without knowing the SNF results though we'll call for the road team by just under at TD and wait for the line.
