COLLEGE SELECTION TEAM IN CAPS

4★ Florida St over PITTSBURGH - Monday, September 2nd. These two last met in '83, a 17-16 FSU loss. Pitt is 5-1 s/'74 vs Florida St and 13-3 SU in home openers. Second year HC Chryst has 13 ret strs vs just 11 for FSU, which has a first time starting QB on the road. However, Jameis Winston could be one of the breakout players in the country TY as he could duplicate what rFr QB's Manziel (A&M), Hundley (UCLA), Mariota (Oreg) and Golson (ND) all did for their teams LY despite their inexperience. Pitt is a bowl team playing their first ACC game and will be fired up for the national spotlight of a Monday night game. However they are a taking a major step up in competition here. A lot of the Noles' losses in recent years have come on night road games (lost at NCSt LY -17) and they were 0-5 ATS as an AF LY. With that said, most of their lines were inflated LY due to some preseason hype while TY the Noles are flying under the radar as they are not ranked in the preseason Top 10. FSU has huge edges on offense as well as ST and make a statement that they are back as a perennial National Title contender. FORECAST: Florida St by 21

3★ WASHINGTON over Boise St - UW is back in its refurbished home stadium this year after playing LY's games in CenturyLink Field (where Seahawks play). These two just met in the Las Vegas Bowl LY and UW could easily have won that game outright as we had a 4★ on Washington +5 and they were down 2 and int'd at the Boise 32 with 14 left. UW has 18 ret st'rs while Boise has just 9 and UW now gets the game at home. LY Boise only lost to #13 Mich St on the road 17-13 to open the year (+7) but were outgained 461-206. The Huskies are 15-5 SU and 12-8 ATS since 1993 in home openers. Boise figures to be highly ranked, but we feel the Huskies are the stronger team on both sides of the ball, more veteran and playing with revenge in front of an excited home crowd. FORECAST: WASHINGTON by 11

3★ UTAH over Utah St - Utah is playing with legitimate revenge here as they had won the L/12 by an avg of 36-12 (8-4 ATS) but were upset as a 7 pt road fav LY. Utah lost QB Jordan Wynn in the 2Q and Jon Hays, off the bench hit just 12-26-154. Utah trailed 20-13 but got a td with 3:19 left to tie and missed a 52 yd fg on the final play of regulation and USt won in OT by 7. Former USt HC Andersen was the DC for current Utah HC Whittingham but has moved onto Wisc and current HC Wells has no such ties. Utah St is the more veteran team and has played well vs their big brothers (Utah and BYU) going 9-3 ATS since '05. However, Utah has won the last 4 at home vs the Aggies by 21.5 ppg. Since 1991, teams that saw a long series win streak snapped (11 or more) have gotten revenge the next year to the tune of 27-5-1 SU and 20-13 ATS. The Utes reclaim series control here. FORECAST: UTAH by 10

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Florida Atlantic (+) over MIAMI, FL - Friday, August 30th. First meeting between these two schools whose campuses are only 47 miles apart. Miami is 24-3 SU/12-6-1 ATS in home openers while FAU is 3-6 ATS in road openers. The Canes were 5-1 ATS at home LY and have 18 ret st'rs and much better depth. FAU is in the 2nd year under Pelini and has 15 ret st'rs. They were 6-1 ATS as an AD LY including covers against #7 Georgia and #1 Alabama as a large dog. Miami does have a huge game on deck vs Florida and don't draw very well at home in non-marquee matchups. This is UM's best team in recent memory, however they have not been this large of a favorite over a FBS schl s/'07. Expect FAU to play w/a chip on their shoulders as many of their players were passed over by the bigger Fla schls while UM will be FORECAST: Florida Atlantic (+) MIAMI, FL by 21 caught looking ahead to next week. 2★ SMU over Texas Tech - Friday, August 30th. SMU has dropped 14 straight in this series (6-8 ATS). This is the 6th time TT has been their ssn opener in the L11Y. In the last mtg ('10) SMU trailed 34-14 then cut it to 8 (-13') getting to the 50 on their final drive. TT has won their last 3 road openers by 43 ppg while SMU has won their L/5 home openers (2-3 ATS). Both tms have FCS teams on deck and TT returns 13 st'rs while SMU has just 11. Both teams run pass happy offenses and TT has a new HC Kingsbury who is the school's #2 career pass leader. SMU is 6-1 ATS as a HD the L/4 yrs incl 3 outright upsets and we'll call for them to get another here. FORECAST: SMU by 1

Ž★ UNDER 61 OHIO ST/Buffalo (OSU by 28) - Urban Meyer is 36-10 ATS in non-conf games incl bowls and LY opened with another MAC team in Miami. They were outplayed in the 1Q but put the hammer on late and rolled to a 56-10 win (-25'). They have won their last 20 home openers (16-3 ATS) but in LY's opener were playing with no pressure off a losing season while this yr they are ranked #2. Buffalo did stand toe to toe with Georgia in the opener LY in the 1H and easily covered in a 45-23 loss (+38). This Buffalo team is bowl caliber with 16 ret st'rs and will try to run the ball on an Ohio St DL that lost all 4 st'rs. Look for the Bulls to have some success on the ground early, which will work the clock while OSU will keep it close to the vest and be hard-pressed to top 40+ pts. While we usually do not get Las Vegas total lines until Tuesdays of game week, the opening week gives us a rare opportunity to include one in our other selections. FORECAST: UNDER 61

OTHER GAMES

Thursday, August 29

SOUTH CAROLINA by 7 over North Carolina - Only 2nd meeting s/91 as SC went into Chapel Hill in '07 ranked #7 & won 21-15 (-7). NC is 1-7 SU and 3-4-1 ATS vs ranked foes and while NC faced just one ranked tm LY, Fedora is 8-5 ATS as an AD. NC rates a slight edge on offense but SC has the D edge led by All-American DE Clowney. SC is 6-0 SU and 4-2 ATS in Thurs Nite openers s/'05 but could bé caught peeking ahead to an all-important SEC matchup vs UGA next week while NC has Middle Tenn and a bye on deck.

MINNESOTA by 14 over Univ - Last year was their first meeting. We used UNLV as the Big Dog POW on the PPH and this was another close miss of the outright upset. UM was -8' on the road and had a 478-275 yd edge but needed 3OT to get past the Rebels. While LY's game totalled 57 pts, UNLV got a 35 yd fg with 2:46 left to force OT at 13-13. UNLV had been 2-17 ATS on the road but was 3-1 ATS as an AD LY. Minny was 2-0 as a HF LY as they started selling beer at the stadium and the crowds were a little louder. Both teams are among the most exp'd in the country with UNLV having 18 ret st'rs and Minny 16. Minny only has NMSt and a FCS foe on deck so they should be fully focused for a team that took them to OT LY.

Tulsa by 1 over BOWLING GREEN - Third meeting but first here. BG is 0-2 with the infamous 63-7 (+5) bowl loss ('07) and a 33-20 (+17) loss in '10. The Falcons have won 12 str home openers vs non-BCS trus (5-3 ATS L/8). Their last home game vs a CUSA team was a win vs Marshall in '10. Tulsa has just 10 ret st'rs but 7 are on offense incl QB Green & RB Watts while Clawson no longer has a young team (17 ret st'rs). Tulsa has the clear edge on offense, but BG has the defensive and ST edges. This one figures to come down to the wire and we'll side with the Golden Hurricane here as they are on a 7-2 ATS run as an AD.

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UCF by 24 over Akron - LY in their season opener and first game under Bowden, we used a 3★ Key Selection on UCF and while AU finished with a 19-18 FD edge, UCF dominated bringing in their bkps with 4:43 left in the 3Q and led 49-7 at that point. AU gained 100 of their yds in the 4Q. Akron is a much stronger team TY with 14 ret st'rs (just 10 LY) and have much better depth with some solid transfers. UCF only has 12 ret st'rs, but has large edges on all sides. The Zips were 5-1 as an AD LY but UCF is 23-13-1 ATS in Bright House and this is their only home game in the first 4 wks of the season.

Mississippi by 4 over VANDERBILT - Ole Miss has dropped 5 of their L/6 to Vandy incl 3 straight. The last time they opened with an SEC foe was in '03, a 24-21 (-13) non-covering win vs Vandy. LY Ole Miss (-2') had a 458-371 yd edge and appeared in control all game (led 23-6) before UM all'd a 79/9pl GW td drive with :52 left. HC Freeze summed it up by saying "bottom line is they scored td's and we scored fg's". Franklin is 11-2 ATS at home (9-4 SU) and LY almost upset #9 South Carolina in their Thurs Nt home opener. Vandy has a large ST edge while Ole Miss has a good sized edge on offense and a slight defensive edge. We will side with the Rebels to grab a key SEC road win.

FRESNO ST by 11 over Rutgers - Only previous meeting was '08 ssn opener, a Fresno 24-7 win (+3'). FSU has won 13 of 14 home openers SU (L to Wisc 13-10 in '08). The last time the Scarlet Knights traveled west of Notre Dame was in 1999 (at Cal, 7-21, +18'). Rutgers has a slight edge on defense but Fresno has the offense, ST and home field edges and only has Cal Poly on deck. RU has just 10 ret st'rs while Fresno has 16 including QB Derek Carr. RU is 5-2 as an AD but Fresno HC DeRuyter takes care of business as a favorite with a perfect 9-0 ATS mark!

Usc by 24 over HAWAII - USC is a perfect 8-0 SU (3-2 ATS) in this series winning by 35 ppg but UH has actually covered the L/2. When they played here in '10 USC was so thin and banged up that they didn't tackle in preseason scrim and UH rolled up 588 yds offense only losing 49-36 (+21). LY USC got a 75 yd td pass on the first play of the game. USC jumped out to a 35-0 halftime lead with a 328-83 yd edge and even got a 100 yd KR td in the 2H but let up and only won 49-10 (-42). USC was 0-5 ATS as an AF LY but that was as an overrated team that began LY #1 in the polls. This team may be stronger than '12 but is underrated and might have some value especially early in the year coming off an embarrassing bowl loss and a 6-loss season. Hawaii is a much stronger team in Chow's 2nd season going from 9 ret st'rs to 16, but had the shocking loss of their OC prior to fall camp. UH did have 35 & 45 pt home losses to the two toughest foes they faced LY and USC while still a little depth shy, is capable of covering the reasonable line. Friday, August 30th

MICHIGAN ST by 24 over Western Michigan - WMU has dropped the L/8 vs Mich St with 3 gms s/'03 (1-2 ATS). They opened vs Mich St in '10, a 38-14 loss (+23). This is the 19th str yr WM's 1st road gm is vs á BCS tm (0-18 SU/6-11 ATS). MSU has won 14 str home openers by 22 ppg, covering 5 of the L/8. Both teams are off disappointing yrs but WM has a 1st time HC and just 12 ret st'rs while Mich St has 15 ret st'rs including their QB. MSU was 7-0 SU at home in '11 but just 2-5 SU LY (0-6 ATS HF) and Danontio will want to re-establish that home dominance. MSU has the edge on offense and a HUGE edge on defense and they only have USF and Youngstown St on deck. While MSU is hungry and more exp'd, the huge line here has us a little gun shy especially w/an offense that is not known to put up a lot of points.

Saturday, August 31st

WISCONSIN by 49 over UMass - This is Gary Andersen's first game as head man at Wisconsin but he did bring his Utah St team into Madison LY and nearly upset the Badgers. Wisky has a large OL and for years have dominated the LOS vs overmatched tms. They now take on a UMass DL that avg's just 271 lbs. LY the Minutemen allowed 5.3 ypc rush and their offense produced just 266 ypg on the road. UMass was 0-4 ATS in non-conf gms LY, losing by an avg of 49-7 and being outgained 502-212. First game for a new HC who is 6-1 ATS as a 20+ fav, physical domination up front and FCS Tenn Tech on deck. Add it all up and the Badgers lay the lumber (9-4-1 ATS 20+ fav L/3 yrs).

MICHIGAN by 24 over Central Michigan - HC Enos was Mich St's starting QB for 2Y beating Mich as a Sr here. He also cch'd at MSU the 4Y prior to here. These 2 met in '03 (UM #4) and '06 (UM #10) w/CM dropping both by an avg of 43-12. Michigan had just 1 more win than CM did LY and both were in bowls. CM was plastered by Mich St 41-7 (+19') but did upset B10 member lowa 32-31 (+14'). CM is 1-9 ATS as an AD while UM is 7-5 as a HF under Hoke. However, UM has a huge home night game vs ND on deck while CMU has a FCS foe. Expect an all-out effort from the Chips w/a HC that is familiar with the Big House.

NC STATE by 13 over Louisiana Tech - 1st meeting. In the past 2 seasons the Bulldogs have traveled to Illinois, Virginia and Ole Miss and have come away with wins. They also lost at Miss St in OT and vs Texas A&M by just 2 pts (5-0 ATS). That was under coach Dykes and now Holtz inherits just 7 ret st'rs while NCSt's new HC Doeren inherits a bowl caliber team although with just 10 ret st'rs. NC State is 20-10-1 ATS at home s/'08. The Wolf Pack only have Richmond and a bye on deck so they can put a lot of effort into Doeren's 1st home game and they will be focused with LT coming off a 9-win season.

MARYLAND by 24 over Fiu - Fourth meeting in the L8Y. UM is 3-0 SU (1-2 ATS) incl a 42-28 (-12) win in their L/gm ('10). The game was tied 21-21 late 3Q, then UM scored 14 str & after FIU cut it to 7, the Terps got another to w/4:00 left. UM is 14-1 SU (4-5 ATS) in home openers with 7 str wins by 16 ppg. MD came up 2 wins short of a bowl but should be one of the most improved teams in the country this year as they were down to a LB playing QB their last 3 games of '12. FIU has a new HC and just 8 ret st'rs and while Edsall is 2-5 as a HF here, he was 20-12-1 ATS as a HF at Conn (also 6-1-1 ATS as a DD fav) and is now in his 3rd year.

IOWA by 4 over Northern Illinois - LY this game was played at Soldier Field. If you take away QB Jordan Lynch's QB draw which went 73 yds for a td, lowa had a 268-128 yd edge and 23-11 fd edge but they trailed 17-9 in the 4Q. The Hawkeyes had fd's at NIU's 16, 23, 17, 3 and 26 but didn't score a td until late. Trailing 17-12 after a poor punt, lowa got an 11 yd PR and drove 24/3pl for a td with 2:15 left and NI was SOD at it's own 24. The season went in opposite directions after that with NIU ending up in the Orange Bowl and Iowa missing a bowl for the first time s/07 and going 4-8. They've played 3 times s/06 with NIU losing by 10, 13 and 1 pt. The Hawkeyes have won 12 straight ssn openers but are 0-4 ATS L/4. This is a Big Ten team that will play an "A" game against a MAC foe with only Missouri St on deck. It will also be Northern's "A" game with a bye on deck and no other big game until 4 wks from now. lowa has the better defense and the home edge and we side with the home favorite looking to bounce back from a poor season.

NOTRE DAME by 35 over Temple - 1st meeting. LY in ND's undefeated reg ssn the avg MOV away from South Bend was 23 ppg while 5 of 6 gms at home were decided by a td or less. Temple has gone 0-4 (2-2 ATS) away vs ranked teams losing by 26 ppg and outgained by 237 ypg. Temple has a 1st time HC that is switching up the offense trying to incorporate more passing into a team that has lived on the ground. He will be doing so against one of the top D's in the country in perhaps the most storied place in CFB. While ND has not had a winning season as a HF in 11 yrs, Kelly is 4-1-1 ATS in openers and 3-1 ATS as a 20'+ pt fav here.

VIRGINIA by 1 over Byu - 4th meeting but last met in '00. The Cavaliers (+7) defeated the Cougars 45-40 in Provo in 1999 and the following ssn BYU (+6') downed UVA 38-35 in OT at Scott Stadium. The Cavs are just 2-10-3 ATS at home but have 16 ret st'rs while BYU has just 12 and host Texas next wk. BYU has the defensive edge but the offenses are even. Both teams are poor in this situation as the Cougars are 2-7 ATS the last 9 yrs in true road openers while UVA is 2-6 as a HD. This is a big game for Virginia as they have Oregon on deck, come in off a 4-8 season and can't afford to open up 0-2.

† Alabama by 17 over Virginia Tech - Georgia Dome in Atlanta, GA. Rematch of the '09 opener also in Atlanta when #5 Bama knocked off #7 VT 34-24 (-6'). Bama has won 11 straight ssn openers incl vs BCS foes #8 Michigan (41-14, -13' LY) and #9 Clemson (34-10, +4' '08). In their previous meeting VT actually led 17-16 into the 4Q in a game where there were 7 lead changes. While it was a competitive game Bama did have a 498-155 yd edge vs a VT tm that finished #10. Bama is nearly a 3 td favorite here and just beat ND in the Title Game 42-14 and will have the crowd edge here in Atlanta. They may hold a little back with a huge game vs Texas A&M next (2 wks) as that was their only loss LY. Both offenses struggled in their spring games partially because two of the best D's in the country were on the field against them and we we'll take that VT defense to keep them in the game.

TROY by 2 over Uab - UAB was 4-2 SU and 3-3 ATS in this series from '02-'10 but Troy has won the L/2 SU. The HT is 4-1 SU (3-2) ATS. LY Troy RB Southward ran for a career-high 204 yds but UAB QB Jonathan Perry hit 18-33-317. UAB got a td with 12:15 left but missed the 2 pt and trailed 25-23. They were int at the Troy 31 and Troy got a 25 yd td pass with 6:53 left and rec'd a fmbl at the 13 getting a td on the next play for a 39-23 lead. UAB went 78/8pl for a td with 3:44 left, which helped them give them the yardage edge for the game. Troy is just 2-10 ATS as a HF and has just 9 ret strs while UAB has 16 incl QB Brown and RB Reaves and we'll take the Blazers getting more than a FG here.

CINCINNATI by 10 over Purdue - Only previous meeting was a Cincinnati 19-14 (+8) loss in 2001 which was also the last time the Bearcats have dropped a home opener. Purdue is just 1-6 SU in road openers (4-3 ATS). This is Tommy Tuberville's home opener and with a B10 road game on deck it is important to win this one. He has 13 ret st'rs including a veteran OL. Purdue has a new HC in Darrell Hazell and will have to find replacements for their leading passer, rusher and receiver from LY. Cincy is the stronger team on Off, Def and ST's and has the coaching and home field edge as well. Cincy expects a sell out and that would be just their

22nd in Nippert Stadium history (built in 1924).

† Kentucky by 6 over Wku - LP Field Nashville, TN. Kentucky is 3-1 SU winning their first 2 meetings by 38 and 35 pts but in '11 here, only won by 11 and were outgained 234-190 (-16'). LY WKU was +6' on the road and UK's QB Maxwell Smith threw 4 ints while WKU jumped out to a 17-0 lead. UK trailed the entire game but drove 77/12pl and got a 22 yd td pass with :24 left to force OT. Each team scored a td in OT and WKU got a trick 2 pt conv for the 32-31 outright upset. It is rare for an SEC team to have an "A" game vs a Sun Belt foe but this is it. New coach Stoops is trying to excite the fans and a loss here would deflate his balloon. WKU also has a new HC in Bobby Petrino who was the head man at L'ville where he went 4-0 SU and 3-1 ATS vs the Cats so this game is just as important to him. However, we like UK to start off the Stoops era w/a much needed win.

MARSHALL by 21 over Miami, Oh - Last met in 2004, when Marshall was a member of the MAC (33-25 Herd win, -7). Marshall is on a 6-1 SU and ATS run in the series while Miami is

of BCS conf transfers and QB Cato back. Miami underachieved LY and loses their QB Dysert and #1 WR Harwell, their 2 best players. Miami's 6 road losses LY were by 25.5 ppg and Treadwell is 1-5 ATS as a 2 td dog. Look for the Herd to get off to a "thundering" start.

† Oklahoma St by 14 over Mississippi St - Reliant Stadium in Houston, TX. This is a legitimate neutral gm with both tms being the same distance from Houston. Last meeting was in '99, a 29-11 (-3) MSU win. LY Miss St faced 4 ranked foes and lost by an avg of 23 ppg with the closest loss by 14 (0-4 ATS). OSU does have 15 ret st'rs vs 12 for MSU. The Bulldogs do have a large ST's edge but are just 1-8 ATS as an AD while OSU is 11-4 ATS as an AF (but 0-3 LY). While both teams were 8-5 LY which would make you knee jerk to the SEC dog, we side with the favored Cowpokes as they are a Top 10 talented team vs a Miss St team that will struggle to get back to a bowl.

OKLAHOMA by 24 over Ulm - LY ULM took on 3 teams from BCS conf and were 3-0 ATS in those losing by 3 and 5 SU and upsetting Arkansas (+30'). Oklahoma does have their Big 12 opener on deck vs WV who they only beat by 1 LY. OU has large edges on offense and defense as well as on ST's. ULM is 0-8 SU vs the B12 losing by an avg score of 47-15. ULM is a much more exp'd team with 17 ret st'rs (OU just 11) and they will be confident after LY's success vs BCS teams but none of those 3 finished ranked while OU will. OU is also breaking in a new QB, but will need to have him gain confidence and the last time they opened with a first time starting QB was 2007 and they beat North Texas 79-10.

SOUTHERN MISS by 10 over Texas St - First meeting. S Miss figures to be one of the most improved tms in the country and this is new HC Monken's 1st HG. They are coming off a winless season and need to open with a strong victory, especially with Nebraska, Arkansas and Boise St on deck. LY the Bobcats also started the season off on the road versus a CUSA team and pulled the huge upset beating Houston 30-13 (+36'). TXST had a 444-326 yd edge. SM has 13 ret st'rs while TXST has 15. Can't lay too many points with a tm that was 0-12 LY but SM is more talented and this will be an "A" game effort.

TEXAS by 45 over New Mexico St - Aggies are 0-4 vs Texas, each loss by at least 30 pts. L/gm was the '03 opener, NMSt lost 66-7 (+29). The Horns are the most exp'd team in the country but are just 8-14 ATS as a HF and have 3 huge games on deck vs BYU, Ole Miss and K-St. They did shut out NMexico 45-0 LY (-39) a team that beat the NMSt by 20 pts. The Aggies are a much improved team but in the L5Y they are 1-6 ATS vs ranked non-conf foes with an avg line of +36.7.

TEXAS A&M by 21 over Rice - Last met in 1995 when both were in the SWC. Texas A&M has a large game vs Alabama in 2 wks but only has FCS SHSt on deck. A yr after becoming the first ever frosh to win the Heisman, the Johnny Football saga continued with an eventful off-season that currently has him being investigated by the NCAA for illegal autograph signings. The last 4 yrs A&M has faced 4 current CUSA tms and are a perfect 5-0 (4-1 ATS) with the avg line of -17 and winning by a 45-14 avg. This is the Owls best team since 2008, a 10-3 squad which went 9-4 ATS. Řice does have 19 ret st'rs (just 9 lett lost) and beat Air Force in LY's bowl 33-14 and have a bye on deck. If Manizel plays, expect a line around 28, which means we lean with the focused Owls playing w/out distractions to stay within the number.

ARKANSAS by 14 over Louisiana - Last met in '02. Arkansas had won 28 in a row vs the Sun Belt until they were upset by ULM LY (-30'). This is Bielema's first home game and they only have Samford on deck. Ark should also be well prepared as they had just 4 wins LY while UL was 9-4 and won their bowl. UL will come in confident as LY they almost beat #7 Florida in "The Swamp" and the Gators were so relieved they charged the field after the win. UL has a slight edge on offense but Ark has the big D edge. After LY's upset this will be an "A" effort gm for the Hogs against the SBC.

AUBURN by 14 over Washington St - First meeting was in '06, a 40-14 (-14) #4 Auburn win. The Cougars have lost 7 str road openers by an avg of 42-15 (1-6 ATS). They are coming from the Northwest with low humidity and now playing in Alabama in August and teams struggle in that situation. Auburn will be sky high for Malzahn's home debut, especially coming off a rare losing season. They have 15 ret st'rs including all 4 st'rs in the secondary to combat Mike Leach's pass-happy attack. Auburn does have Malzahn's former school on deck while Wash St has a road trip to USC. Tough to lay DD's with a team that avg just 18.7 ppg LY but Auburn's offense should be one of the most improved in the country. However, the line is a little to steep for our liking.

NORTH TEXAS by 21 over Idaho - The Vandals are 1-12 in road openers (only win in '09 at NMSt, avg loss by 27 ppg) but are on a 8-3 ATS run. These 2 were SBC foes and NT won the last 4 meetings by an avg of 34-18 (but Idaho +47 ypg) although they last met in '04. Idaho will play this year as an Independent so new coach Petrino has a tough situation with just 10 ret strs and no real shot at a bowl. NT moves up to CUSA and has McCarney's best team yet with 17 ret st'rs. Idaho on the road LY lost by an avg of 51-12 (-243 ypg) while NT was +74 ypg in Apogee Stadium (-23 ypg road). Idaho kids also have not experienced the type of Aug heat that they will deal with here in Texas.

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Over the past 31 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 208-155. Over the last 14 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS (46!) to the incredible record INCLUDING 3 more LY! Here is Week One's Underdog Play:

TOLEDO (+) over FLORIDA

Toledo over FLORIDA - This is Toledo's 1st meeting vs an SEC school. LY Florida hosted Bowling Green and were actually outFD'd 22-14 in their season opener, only winning 27-14 (-29). The Gators had a poor bowl game vs L'ville and will want to get that taste out of their mouth but do have a big rival in Miami, Fl on deck. Toledo is 3-0 ATS vs tms from the Big 5 conf's losing by 7 to Arizona in OT LY, almost upsetting #15 Ohio St in '11 and beating Purdue 31-20 in '10. The Rockets are also 9-3 ATS as an AD while UF HC Muschamp is 1-6 ATS as a DD favorite. Florida has a large edge on defense but the offenses and ST's are close. We like the technical and situational edges here and the Rockets even have a shot at the outright upset.

† Penn St by 8 over Syracuse - MetLife Stadium East Rutherford, NJ. Last met in 2009. This used to be an Eastern rivalry with Penn St going 23-3 SU since 1967 and they won the last 4 by 23 ppg. Both tms won 8 gms LY but Syracuse did have the benefit of bowl practices. Penn St is a much more veteran unit than LY when they had just 6 ret st'rs as they now have 14 while Syracuse has just 12 and a 1st time HC. Syr does have a large ST edge but Penn St has the edge on offense and an even bigger edge on D. We will side with the stronger PSU team.

NEBRASKA by 21 over Wyoming - Wyoming is 0-6 vs Neb with '11's game the first s/'94. That game was called the most anticipated in UW history hosting the #9 Huskers. UW trailed just 14-7 at HT but all'd the next 17 pts and NU covered 38-14 (-21). The Huskers have an explosive offense while WY only checks in among the bottom 1/3 in our rankings. Pelini opened up 10-15 ATS as a HF but is 7-1 since. Dave Christensen, however is a super 15-4 ATS as an AD. We can't trust Neb here laying nearly 4 td's with a shaky D that all'd 27.6 ppg LY and returns just 4 st'rs on that side of the ball.

NEW MEXICO by 4 over Utsa - First meeting. The Lobo's snapped a 4 gm home opener losing streak LY w/a 66-21 win over FCS Southern (-22). UTSA was 5-1 ATS on the road LY but NM was 4-2 ATS at home. UTSA has 18 ret st'rs while NM has just 10 with rival UTEP on deck. The Lobos finished #5 in the NCAA avg 301 ypg rush (5.7) while UTSA limited opponents to just 108 ypg rush (3.3). Both tms were 2-0 SU vs common opp LY with NM winning by 17 ppg and UTSA by 14. The tms are close talent wise but we like the Lobos to get off to a solid start much like they did LY (6-2 ATS F/8).

Georgia by 1 over CLÉMSON - Clemson's last shutout loss came when these two last met in '03 and Georgia has now won 5 in a row. This one figures to be an offensive shootout with UGA and Clem both having Top 15 offenses and there are 4 Heisman contenders playing in UGA's QB Murray and RB Gurley while Clem has QB Boyd and WR Watkins. The Tigers do have the more veteran defense with 6 ret strs vs 3 for UGA, but the teams are close on that side of the ball. The situation favors the home team as Georgia has an even larger game on deck vs South Carolina while Clemson has an FCS team and a bye the next 2 weeks. LY Clemson did host SEC member SC and while they led at the half, they lost by 10. The SEC went 5-1 SU/ATS vs the ACC in reg ssn games LY and outside of the come-from-behind bowl win vs LSU, the Tigers have struggled against SEC tms.

† Lsu by 6 over Tcu - Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, TX. First meeting s/1968 (10-7 LSU win). The Tigers have won 10 straight season openers (6-4 ATS) with 6 coming against BCS tms including #3 Oregon, #18 NC and #15 ASU. TCU is a solid 13-4 SU (9-7-1 ATS) vs non-conf BCS schools. TCU is in a good spot here in Texas with a more veteran team than LY, however they have lost 2 ret st'rs this off-season incl their leading tackler on D and their All-American DE Fields is also susp'd for this one. LSU got hit harder than any other team with NINE players leaving early for the NFL, but still actually have 12 ret st'rs, the same as LY. Patterson is 2-7 SU & ATS vs Top 15 tms during the regular season and Les Miles is 8-3 ATS in that same role the L3Y. We will side with the big game hunter Miles with his SEC team vs a tm that was in the MW just 2 yrs ago.

UCLA by 20 over Nevada - First meeting. Nevada had lost 13 straight road openers SU until they upset Cal outright as a DD dog LY. The Bruins have gone 15-4 ATS in their home openers since 1994. UCLA is more exp'd while Nevada breaks in a new HC but does have QB Fajardo returning. UCLA has the edge on offense and a huge edge on defense. Fitzgerald is just 4-7-1 ATS as an AF and Power Plays is leaning with Cal so we side with the HD (you can download Week 1 of the Power Plays newsletter for free at ncsports.com). EAST CAROLINA by 21 over Old Dominion - 1st meeting. EC only beat FCS App St 29-24 in '09 but LY was -17 and won 35-13. E Carolina is 6-1 SU/ATS in home openers incl beating WV and NC with the only loss to VT. ODU is 4-0 in road openers since the FB program resumed play in 2009. Both teams run pass-happy offenses and ODU is led by QB Heinicke who threw for over 5,000 yds with a 44-14 ratio LY but is taking a step up in competition. EC should be one of CUSA's top teams this year w/18 ret st'rs and McNeill is 6-4 ATS as a HF. Sunday, September 1st

Ohio at LOUISVILLE - First meeting s/59. The Bobcats have played a BCS team on the road each of the L5Y (incl AP #2 & #3). While they are 0-5 SU, they've only been outgained 373-332 and outscored 31-19 (3-2 ATS). The Bobcats were having a fine season last year until injuries gutted them but they still beat ULM in the bowl, 45-14 (+7).
