After LY's aberration in the series, we look for Tulsa to go back to series domination and we grab some extra value considering how the team's performed last ssn (Tulane 9-4 ATS, Tulsa 3-9 ATS). FORECAST: TULSA by 10 3* † Florida St over Oklahoma St - Dallas Cowboys Stadium. Arlington, TX. This marks the 5th all-time meeting & notably 5th different venue. OSU is 1-3 SU but the L/gm was the '85 Gator Bowl (OSU lost 34-23, +6'). FSU is 20-4 SU/13-11 ATS in road/neutral openers s/'90 but have dropped 2 of their L/4 SU (at #10 OU & #21 CU) and 3 of their L/4 ATS. Cowboys are 9-4 SU/7-6 ATS s/03 in reg ssn non-conf away/neutral gms. Since '99, the Nat'l Champ from the previous yr is 15-0 SU/9-4 ATS w/an avg win of 44-13 in the ssn opener. After yrs of being one of the biggest underachievers in CFB, the Noles are off their 1st Nat'l Champ s/'99 and notably went 11-2-1 ATS. They have 13 ret st'rs and are the most talented tm in the country with their biggest weakness coming at the RB position (still Top 15). They figure to be a DD favorite in every game TY and went 10-2-1 ATS in that role LY. OSU is in their largest underdog role s/'06 here but it is deserving considering they are one of the least exp'd tms in the country with just 8 ret st'rs and the loss of every one of their All-Big 12 performers from LY. Look for the Noles to make a statement on the Nat'l stage as they hope to return to this site at the end of the ssn (Dal host Champ gm). FORECAST: Florida St by 24 3* ULM over Wake Forest - These 2 met LY for the 1st time and ULM was +2' on the road. With ULM

leading 21-13 in the 4Q, WF went 97/11 and got a 23 yd td pass with :03 left but their WR dropped the 2 pt conv and ULM pulled the upset. This is a rare Power 5 conf HG for ULM and keep in mind they almost upset Baylor in '12 losing 47-42 (+7') on a similar weeknight game. WF is 5-20 SU s/'89 in road openers and have dropped 5 str ATS. ULM, meanwhile is 5-1 SU in home openers (3-2 ATS). This will be just the 3rd time in the L/5 yrs that WF will be an AF (1-1 ATS) and they are learning new outputs and extenses 100 km s⁻¹ new systems and schemes under new HC Dave Clawson who inherits one of the least exp'd tms in CFB. Meanwhile, on the other side, ULM has 15 ret st'rs, and HC Todd Berry is now entering his 5th yr and has established a winning program. WF also has a young, small DL (0 ret st'rs, avg 248 lbs) going up against a vet ULM OL (79 career sts, avg 299 lbs). ULM has pulled 6 outright upsets in the L/2 yrs under Berry and we'll gladly take the more exp'd home dog, who will be confident and may even feel slighted knowing they beat this same team on the road LY. FORECAST: ULM by 3

OTHER SELECTIONS

2* Virginia (+) over Ucla - First meeting. UCLA has won B2B road openers but the L/time they won 3 straight was from 1980-'82. UVA is 9-2 SU (5-5-1 ATS) in home openers (6-1 SU/3-4 ATS vs FBS schools). The Cavs do come into the ssn on a 9-game losing streak but return 17 st'rs and bring in a great recruiting class. HC Mike London is on the hot seat and he should be coaching this year with his back against the wall. The Bruins are also exp'd as they return 17 st'rs, incl QB Hundley, their top 4 rushers, 5 of their top 6 rec's and 10 of their top 14 tkl'rs on D. While we think the Bruins are a legit Nat'l title contender, this is their first game in the EST time zone since '09 and the Cavs have the added advantage of it being a Noon EST start time (9am local for UCLA). This is also the largest away fav role for the Bruins since 1998. We'll gladly take the pts with a talented and experience UVA tm that has beaten the likes of Penn St and BYU in the L/2 yrs at home in early non-conf action and will be playing with a chip on their shoulders. FORECAST: Ucla by 14

2* UNDER 65 + Colorado/Colorado St (Colorado by 3) - Denver. 88th Rocky Mountain Showdown, played every yr s/'95. Rams are 6-17 SU s/'87 vs the Buffaloes and are 2-5 ATS L/7 yrs. From '02-'07 the avg MOV was 4 ppg (every gm decided by 7 or less), but in the L6Y the avg is 14 ppg (4 by 14+ pts). When this game is in Denver, CU generally draws about 10,000 more fans. The last 5 times CU lost to CSt, they won the next year. LY coming off a loss to the Rams in '12 (22-17, -6) CU was +3 and won 41-27 w/509-295 yd edge as WR Paul Richardson had 10 catches for 208 yds. CSt had a 74 yd BR td and a 84 yd KR set up a td to stay in the game. CU led 20-10 at the half with a 332-172 yd edge, but CSU got a 2 yd td late 3Q to lead 24-23. CU got a 52 yd fg to go up 26-24 (13:07) and then got a 53 yd FR td to change the momentum and lead 33-24. At 33-27 CU got a 75 yd td pass to Richardson, 41-27 (3:30). TY both tms will look to continue to build off solid '13 campaigns as CU won 4 gms after going just 4-21 the prev 2 yrs and CSt went to its 1st bowl gm in the L/5 yrs. While our side forecast is right at the line, the better play in this matchup is the Total. These two tms have gone UNDER this high number in 15 of their L/17 gms in the series. TY both tms figure to be more run-oriented offensively as CSt gets a Bama trans at RB and CU returns their top 7 rushers. LY's gm was misleading with a couple of non-offensive td's and CU doesn't have the deep ball threat at WR. FORECAST: UNDER 65 OTHER GAMES

Thursday, August 28th SOUTH CAROLINA by 10 over Texas A&M - First meeting. Both schools will be breaking in new QB's after losing All-SEC/AA Johnny Manziel & Connor Shaw (24-1 ratio LY). The difference is A&M will be starting a true frosh in Kyle Allen on the road while SCar has 5th yr Sr Dylan Thompson who has 3 starts under his belt and nearly 2,000 career pass yds. Aggies are 2-11-1 ATS s/39 in road/neutral openers while SC has won 7 str home openers by 22 ppg (5-1 ATS run) incl LY vs NC, also on a Thur Night, 27-10 (-12). SC has also won 18 str at home (school rec. L/loss vs Auburn in '11) while going 12-6 ATS in that span. The battle at the LOS could be a draw as SCar has one of the best OL's in the country (113 career sts ret) vs an A&M defense that all'd 222 ypg (5.4) a yr ago and two of their proj st'rs coming into TY left the team in the summer. However, on the other side, A&M has 89 career sts ret on their OL while SC must replace #1 DC Clowney and AA Quarles. While experience and technical edges go to SCar here, A&M does have backdoor potential as HC Sumlin always fields a high-powered offense.

+ Mississippi by 10 over Boise St - Georgia Dome in Atlanta. First meeting. This will mark the 6th str ssn Boise St opens in a high profile manner. They are 3-2 SU/4-1 ATS after beating #16 Oregon 19-8 (-3) in '09, #10 VT 33-30 (-1') in '10, #19 UGA 35-21 (-3) at this site in '11, but they have lost the last 2 gms to #13 Mich St 17-13 (+7) in 12 and LY we cashed a 3★ on these pages going against the Broncos as Wash dominated them in a 38-6 win (+3'). This remarkably is the first time Ole Miss has played in the Georgia Dome as they are the only original SEC West tm to never win the division. Both tms return 15 st'rs but a key matchup that favors the Rebs here is at the LOS where they have 135 career starts on the OL/DL (#23 in country) while Boise has just 44 (#126). The Broncos also have a new HC in Bryan Harsin, but he along with his OC/DC are Boise alums and understand the culture. The technical edges are even as Boise is 9-2 ATS vs ranked tms while Ole Miss is 8-2 ATS vs non-conf tms under Hugh Freeze. While the Rebs clearly have the better personnel due to Freeze's outstanding recruiting classes, we'll back off considering this is the first time the Broncos have been a double digit underdog since '08 (beat Oregon 37-32, +10) and they are used to playing with the big boys.



VANDERBILT by 8 over Temple - VU won the only recent gm 43-14 (-34) in '06. This is the 3rd str ssn opening Thur night gm for Vandy. They are 1-3 SU in home openers, but all 3 losses were against Power 5 tms by only 2 ,4 & 4 pts. They are on a 7-1 ATS run in their home opener, are 13-2 ATS vs non-conf tms and have taken care of business as a DD fav going 9-3 ATS. However, most of those records came under former HC James Franklin who is now at Penn St while new HC Derek Mason will be coaching his first gm with one of the least exp'd tms in the country. On the other side is a dangerous Temple tm that finished LY on a 7-1 ATS run with PJ Walker at QB. They were much better than their 2-10 record indicated as they lost 5 gms by a td or less incl a near upset of a vaunted UCF tm (39-36, +17'). The Owls also have some nice ATS streaks going cashing their L/6 as an AD (2 outright upsets) and are 19-6 ATS vs non-conf tms. Tough laying 14+ pts with an inexp'd tm, that lost a great HC and will be taking on a Temple tm that is perfectly capable of the backdor as they avg'd 33 ppg in their L/6 gms LY. The Owls also shouldn't be afraid of playing an SEC tm considering they played ranked ND, Louisville and UCF tms LY and cashed vs all 3.

+ Washington St by 7 over Rutgers - Seattle. First meeting. The Scarlet Knights are 5-4 SU/ATS in road openers but the 4 losses have come by a ttl of just 8 pts (5 wins by 13 ppg). Counting the '05 Insight Bowl, RU is 0-3 SU out West s/'99 but they are 3-0 ATS and LY took a very solid Fresno St into OT before losing 52-51 as an 11 pt dog. The Cougars are 0-6 SU/ATS at Qwest/CenturyLink Field s/'08 (home of the NFL Seahawks) with an avg loss of 44-20. They are also just 4-12 ATS in openers s/'98. A key matchup to watch here will be an explosive Wash St pass attack that returns QB Connor Halliday (4,597 pass yds) and their top 8 receivers from LY going up against a RU pass D that all'd 312 pass ypg (63.5%) and a 31-8 ratio LY. The Scarlet Knights, however, have the adv at the LOS as they return all 5 str's on the OL and gave up just 101 rush ypg (3.1) on D LY. While Wash St was a perfect 3-0 ATS as a HF LY, RU is 17-8 ATS as an AD. While RU has the technical edges here, the mismatch in the pass gm will ultimately give Wazzu their first win over an FBS opp in an opener s/'06.

Friday, August 29th

Byu by 13 over CONNECTICUT - First meeting. BYU is 3-9 SU/ATS in road openers and have lost their L/4 SU/ATS. The Huskies are 9-2 SU/5-2 ATS in home openers but lost to a FCS school LY. The Cougars are the more exp'd tm as they return 14 str's incl dual threat QB Taysom Hill but will be playing w/o RB Jamaal Williams (1,233 rush yds) here as he is susp'd for wk 1. Bronco Mendenhall usually takes care of business as he is on a 16-6 ATS run vs non-conf opp and they are 12-5 ATS as a DD fav but were 0-2 as a DD AF LY and we cashed both a Key Selection on these pages and a LPS going against them in those 2 gms. The Huskies have a new HC in Bob Diaco who spent the L4Y at ND as the DC (Broyles awd winner in '12). In the L2Y his defenses have held BYU to just 14 ppg & 329 ypg (2-0 SU mark). While the Cougars clearly have the edges across the board talent wise, we'll fade them here as Conn is 19-4 ATS as a home dog and Diaco is quite familiar with BYU's personnel after playing against them each of the L/2 yrs.

Bowling Green by 3 over Western Kentucky - BG won 41-21 in '07 in the only prior gm as WKU was in their 1st yr of transition to FBS. The Falcons have cashed their L/7 road openers while WKU is 15-3 SU in home openers and have cashed their L/3 openers overall. WKU is 6-2 ATS as a HD but BG counters with a 6-0 ATS mark as an AF. While BG does bring in new HC Dino Babers, he inherits a tm that won the MAC Champ LY and returns their QB, RB and top 2 tkl'rs. They will be changing to a Baylor-style hurry up offense after avg just 70.2 plays per gm LY (#76) and figured to be more balanced offensively after having a 59:41 run/pass mix LY. It is notable that the last BG HC (not incl LY's interim) to drop his debut was Harry Ockerman in 1935 (9-0-1 SU and 4-0 ATS since). WKU also has a new HC for the 3rd str yr in Jeff Brohm but he was here LY as the OC and was able to retain DC Nick Holt so the schemes and systems will not change like most new HC. The Hilltoppers are exp'd (8 st'rs back on off) where BG could be a bit vulnerable (5 st'rs back and a new scheme on D) and we think this line is a little inflated.

HOUSTON by 14 over Utsa - This will be the inaugural gm at TDECU Stadium. LY was their first meeting. UTSA's offense did roll up 493 yds as QB Soza hit 29-40-316. The game was tied 21-21 at the half and trailing 24-21 UTSA lined up for the game tying fg but it was blk'd and ret'd 78 yds for a td. UH dominated from there and had a 5-0 TO edge for the game (also 96-yd IR td) and rolled to an easy 59-28 (-2) win. Expectations are high in '14 for both tms as they are two of the most exp'd tms in the country. UH returns 17 st'rs while UTSA returns 20 and has 19 Sr st'rs. UTSA has pulled outright upsets in both of their road openers while UH boasts an impressive 20-9 ATS mark as a HF and also a 19-8 ATS mark as a DD fav. One of the bigger mismatches favors the Cougs as their QB John O'Korn (28-10 ratio as true frosh) and one of the best WR units in the country led by AA cand Deontay Greenberry will be taking on a UTSA secondary that gave up a 20-8 ratio LY and all'd 341 pass yds (108 more than ssn avg) in LY's gm. UH should be fired up for their new stadium and will come away with an impressive opening win. 5

LV was at home and +10' but Zona got back Ka'Deem Carey in the lineup and he rushed for 171 yds. The Wildcats simply domi-Long you back Na Deem Carey in the lineup and he rushed for 1/1 yds. The Wildcats simply domi-nated the game with 25-10 FD and 478-282 yd edges and led 45-6 at the half. Arizona has won 13 str home openers by an avg 26 ppg (5-4 ATS) and UA has not lost a ssn opener at home s/87. Only time here ('01), UNLV lost 38-21 (+2'). The gm was tied 7-7 mid-1Q but UNLV all'd 24 unanswered until the 4Q (outgained 440-280). The Rebels are 1-13 SU in road openers incl 6 str losses by 23 ppg and are 1-4 ATS the L/5 yrs. It used to be an automatic play to go against UNLV in every away gm but they have now gone 6-2 ATS as an AD L/2 yrs. However, Zona counters with a 9-4 ATS mark as a 20+ to fav, A yr after noticing their 1 st howl s/00 the Rebels ware originated home a howl TV (in wAPP). pt fav. A yr after notching their 1st bowl s/'00, the Rebels were orig banned from a bowl TY (low APR) before a reversal came down later in the summer. A key mismatch here will be a Zona ground attack that avg'd 265 rush ypg (5.3) LY and has 104 career starts back on the OL vs a UNLV rush D that all'd 216 rush ypg (5.0) LY. The Wildcats should come away with an easy win, but we do think there might be an adjustment period for their new QB and RB which has us passing on this large line.

Saturday, August 30th

† Ucf by 1 over Penn St - Dublin, Ireland. Game will be played at Croke Park, a 82,300 seat venue (4th largest stadium in Europe) and last hosted a CFB gm in '96 (ND-Navy). This orig looked like it would be a couple of Irish coaches here with George O'Leary and Bill O'Brien but new Penn St HC James Franklin is not O'Franklin. PSt is 2-1 SU/1-2 ATS in series. They are playing with legit revenge as LY they were -4' at home and trailed 31-17 after 3Q's. Christian Hackenberg hit 21-28-262. UCF led 31-24 when a 3rd down pass was inc but PI gave them a FD and they would get a 36 yd fg, 8:10. UCF had a bad snap on a punt and PS went 25/3 for a td with 2:51 left but UCF ran out the clock Also notable is the fact that this will be UCF's first reg ssn neutral matchup (st'd FB program in '79) The Knights are coming off their best ssn in school history and while they have to replace #1DC QB Bortles, they do have 9 st'rs back on an excellent D. That D will be tested considering Penn St brings back QB Hackenberg and their top 3 rushers but do lose WR Robinson and return just 21 career starts on the OL. UCF has a solid 14-5 ATS mark vs non-conf opp incl a 5-0 mark LY while Franklin was 10-5 ATS at Vandy in non-conf play. Vegas has this one as as a pick-em and we agree as this should go right down to the wire.

+ Ohio St by 17 over Navy - Baltimore. Just the 2nd meeting s/'82, Navy lost the L/gm ('09 opener) 31-27 (+22). OSU led 29-14 w/11:56 left but Navy went 85/1pl & 33/3pl to get within 2. On Navy's potential gm tying 2pt, OSU got an IR for 2 pts and rec the onside. Under Niumatalolo, Navy is a solid 2-3 SU/4-1 ATS vs ranked foes. Despite this game being played just 30 miles away from Annapolis, we expect the Buckeyes to have the slight crowd edge, as few teams travel better and this is their first game in this part of the country in 10 yrs (NC State '04). The Bucks welcome back Heisman cand QB Braxton Miller (24-7 ratio LY) who should feast upon a Navy secondary that all'd 69% completions LY. It's also worth noting the size differential between the two trus as Miller outweighs 6 of Navy's proj st'rs on D while the OSU OL outweighs the Navy DL by 40 lbs per man. While the Bucks do have the best DL in the country, it will be interesting too see if they attack the Navy option or if their future high NFL draft picks play passive due to the cut blocks. Navy QB Reynolds is a dangerous passer (17-4 career ratio) and the Bucks did struggle mightily on pass D LY. While HC Urban Meyer should get his player's attention by showing them tape of Navy's near upset of ND LY, we feel this line is on the money and OSU does have VT on deck.

MICHIGAN by 35 over Appalachian ST - What a way to start off your first season in the FBS as App St gets a rematch 7Y later from "the game" that put FCS vs FBS matchups on the front page. It was a Julian Rauch 24 yd fg w/:26 left and a blocked UM FG att on the final play that gave App St a shocking 34-32 upset over the then #5 Wolverines. It was the first time a FCS team had ever beaten a Top 25 FBS team and the UM program has not been the same since (just 50-38 and haven't been ranked in the Top 5). UM is 21-3 SU in home openers but is on a 7-11 ATS run. UM is 16-0 SU L5Y (11-4 ATS) at home vs non-conf foes. UM HC Brady Hoke comes into the ssn on the hot seat after 2 disappointing yrs, but does return 15 st'rs. App St also has 15 ret st'rs but are coming off their 1st losing season since 1993. They have dropped 6 str vs FBS foes (2-3 ATS) since that fateful gm losing by an avg of 31 ppg. They boast a solid backfield and the most veteran OL in the country (145 career sts), however that experience came at the FCS level. The Wolverines do have a big game on deck vs ND, but we're sure the highlights from the L/time these two played have made their rounds in the UM locker room and they should get a comfortable win.

Troy by 1 over UAB - Troy is 4-1 SU in this series but UAB has covered 3 of the last 4. While the HT is 5-1 SU, the visitor has covered 3 in a row. It has been a tightly contested series with 3 of the L/4 gms decided by a combined 5 pts. In '11 Troy was -17 but trailed 23-14 getting a td w/4:07 left for a 1 pt win. LTH (12) Troy was -6' and led 39-24 with UAB getting a td w/3:44 left to only lose by 10, 39-29. LY Troy was -3' at home. UAB led 31-17 in the 4Q. Troy tied it with 3:17 left to force OT and won it there. Troy is just 3-10 SU in road openers but are 10-3 ATS and while UAB is 13-5 SU s/'96 in home openers, they are on a 3-7 ATS run. Troy returns 12 st'rs from a team that hasn't caught a lot of breaks in recent yrs but they do have to replace the SBC's all-time leading passer in QB Robinson. UAB has a new HC in Bill Clark (from JAX St) and he inherits a 15 st'rs from a team that underachieved LY and saw their HC leave for a OC position, which says a lot for the state of the program and its outdated facilities. We look for this game to come down to the wire like most of the recent meetings, but give a slight edge to the vet Larry Blakeney (24th yr here) while UAB will be adjusting to new systems and schemes. NORTHWESTERN by 13 over California - This is Cal's first trip to Evanston. LY NW was #22 and

-5' at Cal in the opener for both. Both NW QB's were banged up so the Cats did not run a lot of option -5' at Cal in the opener for both. Both NW QB's were barryed up so the Cats of the name of or option and the game was actually tied 27-27 in the 4Q. NU got a fg w/8:49 left then a deflected pass turned into the Cats' Ellis' 2nd pick 6 of the night, 37-27 7:52. Cal got a 37 yd fg and had the ball at mid-field but was int'd and NW went 91/5 for a td w/1:51 left. Cal had 30-22 FD and 549-508 yd edges. NW is 16-0 SU/7-8 ATS in non-conf HG's and has won 7 str home openers by an avg of 23 ppg (4-2 ATS). While the Golden Bears are 6-4 SU s/'04 in road openers they are just 1-3 SU/ATS the L/4 yrs. Cal has dropped 16 str gms vs FBS foes, 14 of them by 14+ pts and incredibly are on a 2-15 ATS overall run. NU has typically been a poor HF as if you take out their outstanding year of 2012, when they went 5-0 ATS, they are 5-18 ATS in s/06. Cal, however, is just 2-7 ATS as an AD and just 3-9 ATS as a DD dog. Both tms are in much better shape than LY as NW returns 17 st'rs and is one of the most improved teams in the country while Cal has 15 ret st'rs and should be improved in Sonny Dykes' 2nd yr. In the end, the Cats have the much better D and we won't overreact to the susp of NW RB Mark here as keep in mind, he didn't play much LY and they do return their leading rusher.

NC STATE by 21 over Georgia Southern - First meeting. Last time GS opened vs a Power 5 school was Georgia in 2008, a 45-21 loss. The Eagles are 0-8 all-time vs the ACC with an avg loss of 39-4. The Eagles are in their 1st yr of transition (not eligible for bowl TY) from the FCS to the FBS and are coming off 4 str winning seasons. LY they made waves nationally by upsetting Florida 26-20 (+28) becoming the first FCS tm to beat an SEC school since 1992. They return 15 strs but do have a new HC in Willie Fritz who had a 40-15 record at Sam Houston St (4-1 ATS vs FBS tms). NCSt is 21-5 SU in home openers but are on a 5-11 ATS run. The Wolfpack come into the ssn off their first winless ACC campaign since 1959, but TY have 14 ret st'rs and bring in a solid recruiting class. This will be ACC campaign since 1959, but in nave in religions and bring in a solid religion, solid in the second second and the the their first time prepping for the option in a couple yrs (haven't played GT s/11) but they do have the 6

extra time in fall camp to do so and have a mobile st'g QB in Jacoby Brissett to give them solid looks in practice. Still, this line is a little steep considering the Wolfpack come into TY on a 0-7-1 ATS run, GS players will be confident after winning in "The Swamp" LY and look for them to try to eat the clock vs a NC St D that all'd 180 rush ypg (5.0) LY.

Nebraska by 24 over Florida Atlantic - The Owls lost 49-3 (+23') in their only visit to Lincoln ('09' FAU was outgained 490-368 (+1 FD) and lost the TO battle 3-1. FAU did miss a FG and were SOD 2x's. FAU is 1-8 SU s/05 in road openers w/the win by 1 pt (UAB in 10) and the avg loss by 33 ppg as they are on a 2-6 ATS run. They are however, 5-1 ATS the L/2 yrs as a 20+ pt dog and 6-2 ATS overall vs non-conf opp. The last time the Husker's lost a home opener was way back in 1985, 17-13 vs #17 FSU as they are 28-0 SU/15-9 ATS since and have covered 8 of their L/10. The Huskers are 7-1 ATS as a 20+ pt fav but failed to cover a large spread in their home opener LY vs Wyoming 37-34 -30') as we cashed a 3★ LPS going against them. Both tms have 11 ret st'rs and come into the ssn with high expectations as the Huskers are fresh off a bowl upset of UGA while FAU is off 4 str wins to close LY. They do have a new HC in Charlie Partridge as Bo Pelini will be taking on the school that fired his brother mid-season LY and it will be interesting to see if he shows no mercy. Overall, the Huskers have the large talent edges, but this line is too big for our liking as FAU has a respectable D that finished in the Top 10 in the NCAA in pass D LY and held the likes of Miami, ECar, Marshall and Auburn to 33.5 ppg. Boston College by 14 over UMASS - BC is 18-5 SU in the series and has won 7 str (s/'79) incl a

45-17 (-9) win in the L/gm ('11). While BC has dropped 5 str road openers by 22 ppg (0-5 ATS), this will have more of a neutral setting as it will be played at Gillette Stadium, just 25 miles away from campus. In fact, the Eagles could actually have a 2:1 crowd edge in this one as UMass avg'd just 15,830 at home LY and are 92 miles away from their home campus. UM has been shutout 5x's as a The Minutemen do have a new HC in Mark Whipple who was the HC here from '98-'03 and remarkably took over a 2-9 tm and led them to the IAA Nat'l Champ in his 1st ssn. His rebuild project maybe a little tougher the second time around as they are off B2B 1-11 seasons and have been outscored by an avg of 24 ppg. Speaking of rebuild projects, BC HC Steve Addazio will have his hands full TY with just 9 ret stirs as they return just 12.8% of their offensive yds from LY (#128) after losing their leading passer, leading rec and the NCAA's leading rusher LY in Andre Williams. One area where the Eagles should have a large adv is at the LOS where their OL returns 78 career sts and will be taking on a UMass defensive front 7 that returns just 2 st'rs from a tm that gave up 216 rush ypg (5.4) a year ago and are flipping back to a 3-4. Eagles should pick up a comfortable win but we'll back off considering their inexperience especially at the skill positions.

Marshall by 20 over MIAMI, OH - Miami is 30-11-1 in the series but LY was the 1st gm s/'04 (MAC foes). The home team is 7-2 SU and ATS in this series. LY the most surprising number was the fact that the game was tied at 14 at half as Marshall finished the game with a 34-9 FD edge and on 5 of their first 6 2H poss went 65/8, 70/10, 66/8, 46/10, 70/6 for to's and led 52-14. The Herd are 7-1 SU/ ATS in the series s/'98 but lost 45-6 (+12') the LTH ('03). They have dropped 14 str road openers by 24 ppg (3-11 ATS) while the Redhawks are 2-8 ATS in home openers and overall are on a 6-17-1 ATS run as they have lost an NCAA-high 16 str gms. TY they do have a new HC in Chuck Martin (ND OC L/2 yrs) who won 2 Nat'l Titles as HC at Grand Valley St. He inherits 15 ret st'rs and brings with him 3 ND transfers led by QB Andrew Hendrix. On the other side, expectations are at the highest in Huntington in more than a decade as the Herd are fresh off a 10-win season, return 14 st'rs led by QB Rakeem Cato and figure to be favored in all 12 of their games TY. However, the Herd are a much better home tm (outscored opp's 53-13 LY) than road tm (34-30 avg score) and are notably just 1-8-1 ATS as an AF under Doc Holliday. While the Herd do have huge talent edges (off #20-126,

Add #34-119), we'll back the large home dog who should play with a lot of enthusiasm.
NOTRE DAME by 21 over Rice - ND is 4-0 all-time incl a 54-11 win (-31) in the L/meeting ('88) vs Rice. ND is 14-4 SU/9-9 ATS in home openers (3 of 4 losses by 7 pts or less) but have failed to cover each of their L/3 under Kelly. The Owls are 5-17 SU/11-11 ATS in road openers (5 wins were by just 4 ppg). They are 3-0 ATS as a 20+ pt dog in the L/2 yrs (also 6-1 ATS as AD) while ND is traditionally a poor HF (16-28-2 s/05). The Irish do have 12 ret st'rs and figure to be stronger than LY especially on the offensive side with the return of QB Everett Golson (suspd LY). The Owls are off a CUSA champ son but they must replace their QB, RB and top 2 tkl'rs on defense. They do have the situational edge here as they have a bye on deck while the Irish have a big night home game vs UM on deck. With that in mind along with the technical edges, we'll back the Owls but the Irish will still get a comfortable win.

+ Alabama by 24 over West Virginia - Georgia Dome Atlanta, GA. 5th game played here for Bama since '09 (4-0 SU, 3-1 ATS) and the first meeting between these two. Bama HC Nick Saban has lost his L2 gms of a prev ssn twice while at LSU and Alabama. In both cases he went on to win the Nat'l Champ the following yr. The Crimson Tide have won 12 str ssn openers by 25 ppg and they have covered each of their L/6 openers by 10 ppg despite playing 3 Top 10 tms. Expectations are high as always in Tuscaloosa as while they lose 3-yr st'g QB McCarron, new st'r Jake Coker will have the best collection of RB/WR talent in the country at his disposal. On the other side, WV HC Dana Holgorsen comes into this ssn on the hot seat as WV has suffered their worst B2B seasons s/'94-'95. TY they do return 13 st'rs and unlike LY have a lot of exp at the skill positions to run Holgorsen's offense. While the Tide have the talent edges across the board, we will fade them here as they have had trouble defending spread teams recently. This is also the 2nd largest underdog role for the Mountaineers s/'03 and they are perfectly capable of delivering the backdoor.

GEORGIA by 13 over Clemson - 64th meeting. LY the series resumed for the 1st time s/'03 and the situation greatly favored CU as UGA had the game of their season on deck vs SCar while CU only had SCar St on deck and were at home before a pumped up crowd. As it was, UGA had a 545-467 yd edge on the road and the key play was when UGA had a 1&gl at the 5 but settled for a fg, then had a bad snap and did not score which would be costly as they lost by 3, 38-35 (-2'). TY UGA has a bye before playing SCar, have the more exp'd team, are playing with revenge and taking on an inexp'd QB making his first road start in a hostile environment. The Bulldogs also have a healthy RB corps, have 8 stirs back and a great new coord on defense (just 3 stirs back in '13) and QB Hutson Mason got a jump start to this ssn by playing the last 2.5 gms of LY with Murray. Meanwhile on the other side, Clemson has to replace their all-time leading passer and receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher. Look for the Bulldogs to get their revenge and win by DD's. KENT ST by 3 over Ohio - KS is now 5-2 SU/6-1 ATS. There have been 3 outright upsets the last 6

years and 7 upsets L13Y. The visitor is 9-5 SU/10-4 ATS. LY KS was down 13-10 until they got a td with :31 sec before HT. They would go on to dominate the 2H w/a 381-34 yd edge scoring on all 5 poss en route to a 44-13 win (+6). The Golden Flashes are 11-2 SU s/'01 in home openers but most of those came against FCS opp as they are 0-2 SU/ATS vs FBS foes. Ohio last opened a ssn w/a MAC opp in '01, losing 31-29 (-6) vs Akron. LTH OU lost 28-6 (+9'). KS led 21-0 just 9:01 into the gm thanks to a 50 vd FR td & 33 vd IR td (OU DN score in the 2H). OU is 5-11 SU L/16 road openers but are 5-3 SU/ATS L8Y. Both tms are relatively inexp'd as Ohio loses their all-time leading passer in QB Tettleton while Kent St loses RB Archer and DT Nix. The diff is Kent has QB Colin Reardon back and RB Trayion Durham led the tm in rushing with Archer missing several gms. Look for the Golden Flashes to get an early ssn conf win.

UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

Over **32 years** this play has been a reader favorite hitting **214-162**. The last 15 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous **OUTRIGHT** UPSET WINNERS (50!) to the incredible record INCLUDING 4 in 13 including 3 straight outright winners!!!!! Here is TW's Underdog Play: Årkansas +21' AUBURN

There have been 8 outright upsets the L13Y and the HT is just 4-8 SU/ATS. LTH Ark won 24-7 (+7') with 8 sks and 5 TO's although it was just 10-7 in the 4Q. LY AUB only had a 366-346 yd edge and Ark had a 25-18 FD edge. The key to the game came in the 1H where Ark had 2 drives that consumed 30 plays, 134 yds but they trailed 13-3. They would go onto lose 35-17 (+7'). There has been a lot of bad blood between these two HC's as Bret Bielema has criticized Aub's style of play (fast-paced). Also keep in mind, Aub HC Gus Malzahn is in the Ark HS HOF and spent the majority of his life in Ark. This will be the first time Ark opened its season on the road since 1999, when the Razorbacks beat SMU 26-0 (-14) in Dallas. Ark is 2-8 SU/ATS in road openers while Aub has won 8 str home openers (L/3 by just 4, 3 & 7 pts) but they have failed to cover 4 str. The Tigers are fresh off their shocking SEC Champ ssn and actually come into the ssn on an incredible 11-gm ATS win streak. On the other side, the Razorbacks come in on a 9-gm losing streak but showed improvement at the end of last season incl a near upset of LSU (lost 31-27, +26) in the finale. They have a great 1-2 punch at RB in Jonathan Williams and Alex Collins that will be able to eat some clock vs an Aub run D that did allow 162 rush ypg (4.6) LY. Series and technical edges clearly favor the Hogs and we'll be more than happy to grab a 3 td SEC dog that likes to run the FB in an opener. Also notable is at presstime, the length of Aub QB Nick Marshall's suspension in this gm is not known, but we would still back the Hogs regardless even if Marshall plays the entire gm. FORECAST: Arkansas (+21') over AUBURN

OKLAHOMA by 35 over Louisiana Tech - First meeting. 6th str ssn LT begins a ssn away from Ruston (2-3 ATS). The Bulldogs are 2-14 SU in road openers (won at ULL in '03 & at UH in '12) and are on a 3-7 ATS run. LT didn't face a ranked foe LY and has dropped 14 str by 25 ppg (7-7 ATS). While they are on an overall 8-15 ATS run vs ranked opp, they are 5-1 their L/6. OU is 26-2 SU in Norman openers (both losses vs TCU in '96 & '05) and have cashed 6 of their L/7. Under Bob Stoops, OU is 87-5 (95%) at Memorial Stadium (losses to KSU, ND, TT, TCU & OkSt) and have gone 30-17-1 ATS as a HF recently (haven't been a HD s/'00). The Sooners come into this ssn with high expectations as they return 14 st'rs and could even add Mizzou trans WR Doria Green-Beckham (elig unknown as of presstime). On the other side, LaTech comes in with little fanfare after a 4-8 ssn but they are much better off in yr #2 under Skip Holtz as they return 13 st'rs (just 7 LY). While the Sooners clearly have the talent edges, this is the 2nd largest favorite role they've had in the L/6 yrs vs FBS foes. We think they may be getting a little too much love after LY's finish while Holtz has been known to be a solid performer as a dog dating back to his EC days.

PURDUE by 10 over Western Michigan - PU is 3-0 SU/1-2 ATS in the series. In the L/gm ('11 Bowl), PU (-1') trailed 15-10 after a 74/12pl drive w/7:00 2Q, but ret'd the KO 99 yds and never trailed again. PU, up just 5 did rec a fmbl (after 53 yd run) at their 24 w/1:50 left. The Broncos are playing a Big Ten opp (L/win in '94 at Miami, Oh 28-25) and they are on a 1-6 ATS run. They did cover as a 4 td dog at Mich St LY (26-13) in their road opener. Both tms are coming off 1-11 seasons and feature 2nd yr coaches that figure to be better off TY with much more exp'd teams. With so much similarity and just slight talent edges for Purdue (off #101-121, def #99-114), we'll row the boat here with the Broncos as it is tough making a

FLORIDA by 31 over Idaho - First meeting. The streak now stands at 24 str ssn opening wins for the Gators as all have been at home. However, they have failed to cover 4 of their L/5 openers incl each of their L/2 as we cashed our Underdog POW LY on these pages going against them in a 24-6 (-23) win over Toledo. LY was UF's worst ssn s/79 (0-10-1), however the following yr the Gators rebounded to the streak indication of the streak indication of the streak indication. while the mark incla bowl win and this year we feel they could easily do the same with 14 ret strs and a healthy QB Jeff Driskel. Idaho is 0-7 SU vs current SEC tms with an avg score of 40-13 (0-3 ATS L/3 yrs). In the L2Y the Vandals have played 5 Power 5 conf schools on the road and have lost all 5 SU/ ATS by an aug score of 62-8. However, the Gators are 1-5 ATS as a 20+ pt fav under Will Muschamp and just 3-8 ATS as a HF. We'll again side with the dog here as the Vandals return 17 st'rs and have a

lot of incoming Juco's and won't be that intimidated considering they played at FSU LY. USC by 21 over Fresno St - 4th meeting and the schools just played in LY's LV Bowl. USC (-6) never trailed and led 35-6 at HT w/a 321-154 yd edge. They held Fresno's QB Carr to just 29-56-216. USC had won 15 str home openers until LY when they were upset by Wash St 10-7 (-15'). They have now dropped 4 str home openers ATS but all of those came under former HC Kiffin and TY they have a new HC in Steve Sarkisian who cashed us a 3★ on these pages LY with his Huskies getting a home opening win over Boise St 38-6 (-3'). He inherits a tm with 14 ret st'rs and are better off scholarship wise compared to the last couple of years. On the other side, Tim DeRuyter has done a fantastic job here boasting a 20-6 record the L/2 yrs but will have to replace the school's all-time leading passer. They are 18-10 ATS as an AD and have the ability for the backdoor but we think this line is about right considering what we saw in LY's bowl game.

MISSISSIPPI ST by 24 over Southern Miss - SM has won 10 of L/14 but this is the first gm s/'90 (lost here 13-10, -5'). The Bulldogs are 4-1 ATS in home openers under Dan Mullen and are 12-6 ATS as a HF the L/4 yrs. The Golden Eagles are 1-11 SU in road openers incl 9 str losses by 20 ppg and have dropped 4 str ATS. One streak that is over for the Golden Eagles is their 23 gm overall losing streak that they ended in LY's regular ssn finale. TY they return 16 st'rs and should be much improved in HC Jeff Monken's 2nd year. On the other side, the Bulldogs also have 16 ret st'rs incl QB Dak Prescott and 9 of their top 11 tkl'rs. They finished LY with 3 str wins/covers and expectations are high coming into this season. Those expectations, however, have inflated this line a bit as this is their 2nd largest role as a fav vs a FBS tm in the L/2 yrs and they failed to cover the 1st one by DD's vs S Alabama (30-10, -34). Look for the Eagles to make it respectable here.

Washington by 17 over HAWAII - The series is split at 2 games apiece and there have been just 2 recent meetings. In the L/gm ('11) UH lost 40-32 (+5'). UH trailed 21-0 into the 2Q but cut the deficit to 31-26 w/13:42 left. On the next drive UW went 70/7pl for a td. UH did cut it to 6 w/1:39 but had a XP blk'd (ret for 2) & their onside K failed. LTH ('07's ssn finale) UW lost vs undefeated #11 UH 35-28 (+13). UW led 21-0 after 1Q but were outgained 468-268 (outscored 35-7) the L3Q's. The Huskies are 1-11 SU/5-6-1 ATS their L/12 'true' road openers (lost 6 str by 19 ppg). They do have a new HC in Chris Petersen as he inherits 14 ret st'rs but does lose QB Price, RB Sankey and their top rec. LY's bkp QB Cyler Miles is susp'd for this gm and making his first career start will be Jeff Lindquist. It's been a tough start to the Norm Chow era going just 4-20 in his 1st two yrs but they are notably 10-5 ATS in their L/15 gms and covered vs Pac-12 opp's USC and Oregon St a year ago. LY's team was also much better than their record indicated as they suffered 5 losses by a td or less. Vegas clearly has respect for the Rainbow Warriors and we think they may have overcompensated for the susp'd Miles and may have overlooked the fact the Huskies are the most exp'd Power 5 tm at the LOS TY with 218 career starts. **TEXAS by 24 over North Texas** - NT has dropped all 9 (all in Austin). In the L/3 ('02-'06), NT has been outscored 148-7 & outgained on avg 432-123. The Mean Green are 2-17 SU/7-12 ATS in road openers incl 0-15 SU/5-10 ATS vs Power 5 conf tms. UT has won 14 str home openers by 39 ppg but are just 1-4 ATS their L/5. The Longhorns are starting a new era with HC Charlie Strong and while he originally inherited a tm with 15 ret st'rs, he has dismissed 6 players since spring and suspended at least 3 other key players. While many of those players were not stirs, it will certainly effect their

On the other side, NT is off arguably their best ssn at the FBS level but HC Dan McCarney will have his hands full with just 9 ret st'rs incl a DL that has 0 st'rs back and will be facing a TX ground gm with a 1-2 punch of Malcolm Brown and Johnathan Gray. Originally, we were leaning towards the Horns in this one as they figure to be sky high in Strong's debut, but NT is 6-0 ATS vs Power 5 tms the L/4 yrs and we'll pass with all the suspensions.

NEW MEXICO by 6 over Utep - The HT had won 5 in a row SU (4-1 ATS) from '99-'07 but the visitor has won the last 2. There have been 3 outright upsets the last 4 years and UTEP is 5-3 SU but 4-4 ATS LY NM had an advantage of a game under their belt, taking on UTEP in the debut of Sean Kugler as HC UTEP was -6' at home. The gm was tied 5x's. NM up 7 all'd a 70/14pl td drive w/1:19 left. In OT NM got a 21 yd td run (on 3rd&6) while UTEP was SOD at the NM4 on 4th&1. UTEP is 3-15 s/71 in Albuquerque but won LTH 38-20 (-15) vs NM ('10). Gm was tied 14-14 after NM ret a blk'd fg for a td but UTEP would score 24 str until a NM 100 yd KR td w/3:24 left. UTEP is 4-20 SU/9-15 ATS in road openers. LY the fav won & covered the L/11 Utep games. NM HC Bob Davie inherited a tm that had gone 3-33 prior to his arrival and has got them to 7-18 his first 2 yrs. TY will be the first time s/'06 that the Lobos are back to 85 scholarships. On the other side, UTEP is in much better shape with 15 ret st'rs. Slight technical edge to NM who is 4-1 ATS as a HF under Davie while UTEP went 0-6 ATS as an AD LY. However, these tms look similarly improved to LY and with that gm going down to the wire, we'll call for it to happen again.

+ Lsu by 4 over Wisconsin - 3rd all-time gm (3rd different venue). LSU is 2-0 incl a 27-7 win in the L/ meeting ('72). This will mark the 4th time in the L5Y the Tigers will open w/a neutral setting. They are 3-0 SU/2-1 ATS w/an avg win by 10 pgp playing Top 20 tms in all 3. The Tigers have won 11 str ssn openers (7-4 ATS) while UW has won 16 str ssn openers (7-8-1 ATS) but has gone just 1-4-1 ATS the L/6 yrs. However, they were a fav in each of the L/16 as this will be their 1st ssn opening gm vs a ranked tm s/'97. Wisconsin is 0-2 vs LSU but the L/gm was in 1972. UW has won 31 of 33 reg ssn gms vs non-conf FBS tms (only losses in '12 at Oregon St & LY at Arizona St) while LSU has won an incredible 45 str reg ssn-gms vs non-conf opp. Both tms are relatively inexp'd as LSU became the first tm in SEC history LY to have a 3,000-yd passer, a 1,000-yd rusher and two 1,000-yd receivers and TY all 4 de-part. Meanwhile UW has only 3 st'rs back on defense but do have the Big 10's best OL and RB Melvin Gordon. LSU is 16-5 ATS vs ranked tms while Wisc is 8-3-1 ATS as a SD dog with 5 outright upsets. Whichever young unit steps up (LSU off, UW D) could go a long ways in determining the outcome.

Sunday, August 31st TENNESSEE by 7 over Utah St - First meeting. The Vols have won 19 str home openers (13-6 ATS) but have dropped their L/3 ATS. Shockingly, UT has not drawn more than 100,000 to a home opener s/07 which was the last time they won more than 7 gms in a ssn. On the other side, the Aggies have lost 16 str road openers but they are 5-1 ATS their L/6 gms and their L/4 losses all came by 7 pts or less despite playing 4 Power 5 conf tms. Vegas clearly has respect for the Aggies here as they have enlisted them as only a td dog in SEC country and the biggest question will be if their QB Chuckie Keeton really is 100% after suffering an ACL inj LY.

BAYLOR by 31 over Smu - BU has won 10 str (L/loss in '86) and have also cashed 9 str in the series. In the L/gm ('12) BU won 59-24 (-7) but only had a 106 yd edge (-2 FD) as 3 SMU TO's resulted in 21 pts. The Bears are opening up a brand new McLane Stadium as they closed out Floyd Casey in style winning (by 39 ppg) and cashing (by 21 ppg) in 10 str HG's. The Mustangs are just 1-16 SÚ s/97 in road openers and are 3-13-1 ATS. While Baylor cruised to a 14-1 ATS mark mid.'12-mid '13, Vegas may have overcompensated their lines and they dropped 3 of their L/4. Is their still too much line inflation for Baylor games especially against a SMU tm that is capable of pulling the backdoor and sees themselves in their largest underdog role s/'08?

Monday, September 1st

Miami, Fl at LOUISVILLE - These two just met in LY's Russell Athletic Bowl. UL (-5) trailed 2-0 1Q but scored the next 36 into the 4Q (Bridgewater had a career high 447 pass yds). This will be UL's inaugural ACC gm (1st time opening ssn w/a conf opp s/'73). UM suffered a 31-7 (+4) setback the LTH ('06). UM was 9-0-1 vs UL coming in but has now dropped 2 str. Miami is 3-6 SU/ATS their L/9 road openers but have won B2B. This will be the 9th str yr UL opens their ssn at home (6-2 SU/3-4 ATS). While it's tough to get the image of LY's bowl beatdown out of our minds, UL does have a new QB and new HC while Miami, FI also has some uncertainty at the QB spot.
